Summary: Emergency responders must try to balance saving those who are at their most vulnerable with solving the problems in their own lives.



Abby explains that there are two types of emergencies. The first emergency is the kind everyone has every day – their life. In her case, she's a recently single 42-year-old taking care of her mother, who has late-stage Alzheimer's. She describes the second kind of emergency as the one that comes without warning and the one that no one wants to have – car accident, fire, robbery, etc. She explains that's where she comes in, as she's a 911 dispatcher and the actual first responder.

After Abby gets the calls, she reports them to the proper departments: firefighters, paramedics and the police. Bobby is

the fire captain of the Los Angeles Fire Department. He has a good crew of hard workers including Evan, the cocky hotshot who likes to get women by flaunting the fire truck, Howie, the guy who is dating someone he met through a cop and firefighter dating site, and Hen, the only female on the crew.

Bobby goes to confession every week, as a reminder of how easy it is to go down the wrong path. He tells the priest he hit rock bottom, abusing drugs and alcohol, and was put on leave. He's been back on the job for 18 months, and doesn't want to fall again. However, he explains that people do need ways to cope when they are in his line of work.

Athena is a field sergeant with the Los Angeles police. She's no nonsense, and seems to have a love/hate relationship with the fire department. Her home life is not stable, as her husband recently came out to her and decides to tell the kids he's gay as well.

There are a bunch of calls that Abby directs to Bobby and Athena. The first is a report of a baby crying in an apartment building wall. At first, Bobby and the crew don't believe the caller, as he's high and they don't hear anything. Bobby is the first to hear the cries, and they realize that someone must have flushed a baby down a toilet. As they work to knock the wall and free the infant from a pipe, Athena shows up to investigate who would have flushed the newborn.

The paramedics resituate the baby, and Evan runs out to the ambulance. Meanwhile, Athena is able to locate the teen mother of the child, and rushes her out to the ambulance too. Evan is adamant that the mother not accompany them, and Athena starts to throw a fit. Bobby steps in and allows the mother in the ambulance. Everyone arrives to the hospital safely, but Athena has words with Evan after they drop the patients off.

The second call is about a woman who is being suffocated by her pet snake. When the crew arrives, Howie is freaked out by the numerous snakes in the home. They reach the victim, who is losing air quickly. As the team debates how to best rescue her, Bobby tries to untangle the snake to no avail, as it just gets tighter. Evan takes matters into his own hands and kills the snake, releasing the victim. As he checks on the victim, he flirts with her.

Later on, Bobby tracks the fire truck and finds Evan on the roof of a building hooking up with the snake victim. He fires him on the spot, as this is the second time in two days Evan has been caught using the fire truck to hook up with women. Evan tells Bobby he thinks he may be a sex addict, but Bobby says he needs to leave his personal troubles at home, as they can't risk precious seconds when on the job.

The last call is one that puts Abby in the driver's seat. A 9-year-old calls when she hears people break into her home. Abby keeps her on the line to try and get her location, as the girl just moved their with her family and doesn't know the address. Once they get a town and street, Athena is dispatched, but can't find the home. Abby suggests using sirens to pinpoint the location, but Athena doesn't want the suspects to know she's there. She calls Hen, who sends Evan with a fire truck. It's a risk, but the clock is ticking.

Abby is able to hear the fire truck sirens, but unfortunately, the child reveals her location in the home and the suspects see her. They hear the sirens too and panic. Abby gets one of the suspects on the phone, and lures him out of the home with the promise to let him escape. Of course, Athena is waiting outside for them. She's able to catch one, but the other gets away on a motorcycle. Meanwhile, the child is reunited with her mother, who is waiting with Evan at the fire truck. The suspect pulls a gun, but Evan uses the fire hose on him, allowing Athena to make an arrest.

Abby is still on the phone with Evan, who tells her everyone is okay, and the suspects are in custody. He commends her good work, and says she's the real hero, which makes her day.

Back at the firehouse, Bobby gets a call from Athena who is singing Evan's praises. Bobby doesn't immediately offer Evan his job back, but once Evan says he understands the importance of the job, Bobby tells him to suit up.

Summary: A night at an amusement park takes a deadly turn when a roller coaster malfunction leaves lives hanging in the balance. Abby is relieved after getting some help taking care of her mother and tentatively reaches out to Buck, who is struggling with the "life or death" nature of the being a firefighter. Meanwhile, Athena and Hen respond to an unusual home invasion and a couple's dispute leads to a dramatic rescue for Bobby.



The first 911 call is regarding an incident at a state fair. Two guys are on line for a roller coaster. One, Devin, is scared to ride, but his friend, Chad, convinces him to go. The lap bar doesn't close properly because Devin is larger than Chad. When the ride gets going, Chad flies out, and then the roller coaster stops upside down. Devin is left hanging on the lap bar, while everyone else is locked in tight.

The firefighters arrive and confirm that Chad is dead. However, Bobby tells Buck to let Devin think that Chad is alive, so not to spook him even more. Buck urges Devin to grab his hand, but Devin is more concerned about all of the cam-

eras filming him from below. Devin then looks Buck in the eye and lets go, falling to his death.

Back at the firehouse, Buck can't seem to get Devin out of his head. He asks the crew how to handle losing a victim. When Athena arrives, she tells him that he'll learn to let things go. She adds that the reason they wear a uniform is to be able to take it off, which is a symbol of letting go. She assures him he'll get through it.

As a result of climbing the roller coaster, the media is calling Buck a hero, but he doesn't feel like one. He heads to the funeral for Devin, where he confronts Devin's sister, who just makes him feel worse.

At another call where a window washer's cable breaks, Bobby tells Buck to take the ladder up to the victim, while he goes to secure the cable on the roof. However, Buck hesitates and suggests he go up to the roof instead.

After the call, Buck opens up to Bobby about how when he tried out for the Navy SEALs he didn't make it because he would have needed to turn off his emotions, and he can't do that. He adds that he wants to be the tough guy and help people. He asks Bobby about the first victim he lost, and, of course, Bobby can remember every last detail about her. Bobby then gives Buck the number of the department trauma counselor, and says he needs to talk to someone.

The therapy session takes a turn though, as Buck gets his groove back and hits on his therapist. They sleep together, which seems to cure Buck, and that just upsets the therapist.

Seems the therapy session helped Buck, as on the next call he does a distraction maneuver with Bobby to stop a man from jumping off a building. He thanks Bobby for pushing him. Then, Devin's sister shows up to see Buck. She apologizes for yelling at him at the funeral. She then tells Buck that Devin has tried to kill himself before. She thought he was better, but he started isolating himself recently. She begged his friend Chad to get him out of the house, so they went to the fair. She fears that she is the reason Devin is gone. Buck tells her that it's neither of their faults, as some people just don't want to be saved.

Meanwhile, dispatcher Abby is starting to get her groove back, when a new nurse for her mother arrives. Nurse Carla is friendly, and really good at taking care of Abby's mother. One night, after Abby's mother goes to sleep, Abby and Carla get to know each other and share a glass of wine. On television, they see an interview with Buck about the roller coaster incident. Abby remarks that Buck looks like he needs someone to talk to, so Carla urges her to call him. She does, and Buck is relieved that someone is asking how he is.

A few days later, during a dinner out, Carla suggests that Abby call Buck again and ask him out. She does again. However, the call gets a little weird. First, Buck asks how old she is, as she keeps calling instead of texting. Then, when she asks him out, he goes into how he has issues and he fears he'll mess things up with her. He explains that he won't go out with her because he likes her. He tells her that talking to her makes him feel good and safe, and he doesn't want to lose her. So for now, he suggests they just talk on the phone until he can get his life in order. This, surprisingly makes her happy, even though he won't meet in person.

And Athena is still dealing with things at home. So much so, that she seems distracted on the job. During a call of a dog attack at a home, she rescues the man who called 911. However, after he gets treated and sent home, she realizes that the man was a burglar, and that's why the dogs attacked him.

Later, at a therapy session with her husband, she says she's willing to stay married, but remain celibate. Unfortunately, even though he does love her, Michael tells her that he's met a man. She's devastated, and takes her frustration out on the dog attack victim when she finds him and arrests him.

Unfortunately, though, both Michael and Athena are too distracted to realize that their daughter is embarrassed and upset about their marriage ending. When Athena arrives home that night, she goes to her daughter's room and finds her unresponsive on the floor with empty pill bottles next to her.

Summary: Bobby and his team respond to an emergency at a children's birthday party that leaves lives hanging in the balance. The crew jumps into action after one of their own is involved in a devastating accident. Athena tries to cope with a tragedy that hits way too close to home and Abby is confronted with a life-changing decision for her mother and makes a connection with Buck.



The first 911 call involves a 10-year-old's birthday party. The father is trying to impress his son with a circus-themed party. As the Santa Ana winds threaten to ruin the party, the father eagerly joins his son and his friends in the bouncy house. Of course, he's too heavy and the winds are strong. When the bouncy house detaches and blows away, the father falls out and the house gets stuck on a cliff.

The fire department arrives, and Bobby puts people to work. Most everyone gets to go down the cliff for the rescue, except Chimney, who is tasked with running the wench. Surprisingly, all of the victims survive. But Chimney seems upset with his assignment.

After the rescue, Chimney goes home and pretends to cook a meal for his girlfriend he found on the responders dating site. She asks him about the bouncy house rescue and gets all hyped up. After dinner (which Bobby prepared and Chimney just heated up) Chimney proposes to his girlfriend. She doesn't say "yes," but she doesn't say "no" either. Instead, she reveals that she had been engaged before, but she cheated on the guy a

week before the wedding. She tells Chimney that she has commitment issues, and doesn't want to hurt him. She asks for a few days to decide.

Obviously upset, Chimney heads to the firehouse for some comfort. Hen and Buck offer advice, while Bobby makes faces in the corner. When Chimney asks what's up, Bobby tells him that it's probably for the best, as he feels she's not right for Chimney. Of course, Chimney blows up at him, accusing him of judging everyone else, but not opening up about his own life. Bobby tells Chimney that he is not himself around his lady and that his relationship is based on lies. Chimney storms out of the firehouse.

On the highway, Chimney drives a bit recklessly, but manages to avoid hitting a concrete barrier. Unfortunately, the truck he is avoiding plows into the back of Chimney's car, leaving him paralyzed with a rebar through his head.

The department shows up and realizes that Chimney has no idea what happened to him. He knows that he was involved in an accident, but he doesn't know about the rebar. Eventually, they decide to move him, while still in the car, to a flatbed truck to transport him to the hospital. Buck wants to go in, but Bobby reminds him that their job ends at the hospital doors.

During surgery, there's bleeding on his brain along with some complications and the doctors are forced to put Chimney in a medically induced coma. A few days later, Bobby goes to see Chimney's girlfriend Tatiana, who hasn't visited him in the hospital yet. He urges her to come to the hospital, as doctors will be taking him out of the coma. She tells Bobby that she can't force something she doesn't feel. She's worried about playing the part of the loving girlfriend when she doesn't love Chimney. Bobby explains that he's not asking her to love Chimney, but rather, give him some hope to fight to survive. She tells Bobby she can't.

Later, Bobby, Buck and Hen go to see Chimney who is resting. Bobby takes his hand, while they all talk to him. Chimney doesn't open his eyes, but manages to communicate by squeezing Bobby's hand and giving a thumbs up, giving his buddies hope that he'll be okay.

Athena is forced to call 911 when her teen daughter, May, overdoses on some of her old medication. She tells her son to call their father as she heads to the hospital. While she paces the floor, Michael shows up. They try to figure out what happened and who is to blame, but decide to just be strong until they find out what's going on with their daughter. And then Michael's boyfriend shows up. He explains that they were having dinner when he got the call about May. Athena is not happy, but she doesn't cause a scene.

When May wakes up, Athena and Michael are by her bedside. Michael apologizes for causing May stress. She tells them it wasn't her home life that caused her to take the pills. She says she's being bullied by a group of girls at school, who repeatedly tell her she's useless. May tells her parents that she feels useless and alone, but Athena assures her that she's strong and independent.

CPS shows up and says Athena and Michael need to leave so they can talk to May alone. Athena explains to Michael that CPS needs to assess the situation to determine if the home is safe for the child who hurt him or herself. May doesn't want to be left alone, but the CPS worker tells Athena that she needs to do her job. Athena doesn't like it, but she and Michael leave to go home without May.

A few days later, Athena heads to the school to track down May's bullies, but she doesn't do anything crazy. She just stalks them, which is probably for the best since she's a police officer.

911 operator Abby is having a tough time too. Her mother continues to get worse. During a birthday party for her mother, Abby's brother Matt and his family show up. Matt tells Abby he put their mother on a waiting list at a memory care facility. Abby assures him that she's doing fine taking care of their mother. He tells her she looks tired and it doesn't all have to fall on her. Abby is insistent that her mother stays with her.

Later, Abby questions herself. She calls her buddy Buck, who is on a call to rescue Mexican immigrants trapped in a hot truck. She opens up about her mother and wonders if it's okay if she puts her mother in a home. Buck tells her that though he doesn't know much about the situation, he does know that the only thing that matters is family.

As a plane is coming in to land, it looks like it hits turbulence. The hydraulics have been knocked out, meaning the pilot and co-pilot have no choice but to crash-land. Those not buckled in are thrown around the plane, and a couple who decided to join the mile-high club are trapped in the bathroom by a stray trolley.

While at the firehouse, Buck decides to ask Bobby about his book. It's full of names that Bobby has saved, but there's room for 148 names. Buck is curious what it means, but Bobby responds by threatening. Before it can go any further,

the firehouse is called out to the site of the plane crash, where they will need to work with the Coast Guard to get any survivors.

There are survivors, but there's only about four minutes until the plane sinks. Hen hears the calls from the couple stuck in the toilet, but the trolley is preventing them from getting out. The parents turn up to the police station angry at the personal vengeance, but Athena doesn't have time to talk to them. When a call over the radio comes in about a passenger on board another flight causing havoc, Athena decides to tackle that situation.

When Athena gets to the flight, the situation isn't quite what she expected. A man has been duct-taped to his seat by airport police for allegedly causing a disturbance and assaulting an officer. One of the passengers caught it all on camera, showing that the incident escalated quickly and that the airport policeman was the one at fault. After hearing that the CEO of the airport ordered for all passengers to remain on the plane for eight hours, she puts them all "under arrest" to get them in her jurisdiction so she can get them off the plane.

Athena is called into her captain's office after the case over the situation with Laila. While the captain empathizes, she has no choice but to put Athena on restrictive duty.

Abby has her own situation to deal with. As the plane went down, a passenger called Dale Marks called 9-1-1. Knowing the calls were recorded, he knew he'd be able to get a message to his pregnant wife in case he didn't make it out alive. It's a beautiful and heartfelt message, but he's suddenly cut off.

After seeing the crash on the news, Abby makes a call to Buck for help in finding Dale. Unfortunately, he didn't make it out alive. Abby arranges for Dale's wife to come to her desk to hear the recorded call.

In the end, the team goes back to their lives, reeling from the difficult night. Bobby returns home to an empty house, with daydreams of what he would tell his children. Hen and Buck get to his home when he doesn't answer his phone, where they find him passed out on the bed. Hen makes a point that all she knows is that he's in recovery, but there's an empty whiskey bottle on the bed, ending 18 months of sobriety.

As Buck and Hen make it clear that they're going nowhere, Bobby finally breaks down and asks for help. Bobby's secrets are finally starting to come out.

Meanwhile, Abby returns home, where Carla is still around. Carla makes a point of staying to help, but Abby wants to be alone. Her mom complains about being too hot, and Abby promises to turn the thermostat down but falls asleep on the couch. When she wakes early in the morning, her mom is gone from the bed and is missing.

Later, Hen tells her wife about the situation. Her wife is not happy, obviously, and is worried about their son if Eva is out of prison. Though Hen tells her that Eva has changed, her wife is not convinced.

In her time of need, Buck comes to Abby's rescue. Her mom is still missing, so she sends a group text of the missing person flyer, and Buck immediately calls her. He offers to come over and help, and then after they find her, they can go back to just phone conversations again. When he arrives, Carla is, of course, smitten, but Abby is just distraught. He explains that he lost people close to him, and he fears that if he gets close to people again, he may lose them. Then he offers to cook everyone a nice meal and finally introduce the real Bobby to everyone. And Hen is happy to hear it.

Hen, Athena and Chimney get to the house, but there's no sign of a man outside. As Chimney calms the woman down, Hen realizes the woman saw the reflection of a man inside the house — as she found footprints. Athena suggests the woman stay with someone else, so she

delivers one baby, the second woman delivers her own baby, as she says it's her fourth, and the third woman needs to go to the hospital for an emergency C-section.

The last call that Buck and Bobby go on is probably the grossest thing I have ever seen on television, and I watch *The Walking Dead* and *American Horror Story*. They are called to a home of a gay couple, and one man is complaining of severe cramps, to the point where he thinks a monster is inside of him. His partner tells Bobby that the man has had the pain for a week, and insists it's just gas or an upset stomach. They get the man in the ambulance, and on the way to the hospital, he freaks out that something is crawling on his leg. When they roll him over, there is a tapeworm coming out of his buttocks. Bobby wants to wait to they get to the hospital to remove it, as he doesn't want to touch it, but Buck goes ahead and pulls it out — all almost 7-feet of it.

One of the calls that Abby gets is from a woman, Kathy, who says a man is trying to get into her house. Unfortunately, the man makes his way into the house and kills the woman, all while Abby listens. She can't seem the shake the call, but she agrees to do her job and works with the homicide detective. After the detective listens to the call, he tells Abby that they have a suspect in custody, and it's the woman's ex-husband. When he leaves, Abby does a little digging and finds older 911 calls from the victim. She realizes that when her ex-husband was trying to break in, the woman was a little more calm, and would use his name. On the call where she's killed, she's more panicked and doesn't use the man's name.

Aethna tells the woman she doesn't want to hear her lies, so eventually she admits she has an addiction to stealing packages.

In the last call, a man with his family at the zoo decides to throw pine cones at a tiger to get better pictures. While he's in the bathroom, he hears a commotion and comes out to find people running out of the zoo and then hears the tiger behind him that got out of its cage. He calls 911 and then races around the zoo trying to hide from the tiger. Eventually though, the tiger wins and tears the man apart. As the team tends to the tiger's trainer, Hen hears the victim's name and realizes he's a dentist who made the news for killing a lion on a hunting trip.

During a blood drive at the firehouse, Chimney asks Bobby to donate, as he's two pints short of his goal. After telling everyone he's basically afraid of needles, Bobby eventually gives in. A few days later, the hospital calls and says he needs to come in right away, as they found something in his blood.

Freaking out, Bobby heads to see his priest. He explains that in the ledger he keeps are 148 names. They are the names of all of the victims he's lost. He explains that he has to save 148 people before he can die. The priest realizes Bobby is talking about suicide, but Bobby explains that he needs to balance the ledger before his time is up, and he fears if his blood results come back as cancer, he won't have a chance to do that.

At the hospital, the doctor tells Bobby that he has a very rare blood type that can help pregnant women and babies with Rhesus disease, which can be fatal. He's in disbelief, as the doctor explains that he can sign up for a program to donate regularly and help billions of babies. Later, at the firehouse, Chimney is doing research about Bobby's blood type and is very impressed. However, Bobby is in a bad mood. He then explains the whole 148 thing to him. He adds that even if he can help babies, they aren't his babies. He says that God's punishment isn't his eventual suicide, his punishment is having to stay alive to help other people.

Chimney then takes Bobby to a hospital's NICU where he introduces him to a little baby girl getting a blood transfusion with his blood. The child's father wants to thank him in person, and Chimney tells Bobby that perhaps all these babies are his children, as they are a part of him. Bobby realizes that having this blood type is a blessing, not a curse.

Aethna struggles to keep it together for the sake of her family. However, when Michael suggests his boyfriend meet the kids, she flips out. Eventually, she talks to the kids who tell her that her staying with their father and trying to be a big happy family is hurting them. They say they'd rather have the truth than pretending to be something they're not.

After a long shift, Aethna comes home and tells Michael she wants a divorce now before she keeps on hating him. Later, at a bar, a guy hits on Aethna, and it seems she likes her new freedom.

And while Aethna's relationship ending is probably a good thing, Hen's relationship is in real trouble. Hen takes Aethna's advice and works up the courage to tell her wife, Carol, that she slept with her ex Ava. However, when she gets home late, Carol tells her that Ava is suing for custody of their son, claiming Hen and Carol's home isn't suitable for a child. She claims the proof is because Hen slept with Ava. Carol is disgusted and leaves. At least for the night.

Things aren't looking up for Hen. I really hope she can work things out with her wife. I like her character and I want good things for her. I'm glad Aethna worked up the nerve to ask for a divorce. She realizes that in the end, it will best for everyone, specifically the children.

He calls 911, and the team is sent out to stop the truck driver from turning on the compactor. The first truck they stop, however, is not the right truck. Athena finds the right truck, but the compactor has been turned on already. The truck driver stops it, and the team climbs into the truck to rescue the man.

After the call, Hen and Athena grab lunch where they chat about their personal lives. Hen tells Athena about the

situation with her ex suing for custody, and Athena reveals she's getting a divorce and has already met someone, who wasn't just a one-night stand.

The second call involves a mother and her teen son leaving a therapy session. As they get into the elevator, she is berating him about getting his act together. As they argue, the elevator suddenly breaks and drops rapidly before crashing in the basement, which is flooded. The team arrives, with Hen and Buck heading down the elevator shaft to pull up the victims. Buck gets the mother out of the water-filled elevator first, but as he preps the second victim, the elevator starts to fall again due to the weight of the water. Buck manages to get the second victim to safety before pulling himself out though.

That night, Athena goes on her second date with the man she met at a bar. As they are hooking up, he starts to role-play while she's still in uniform. He explains that he likes a strong

woman who can take control, and she's into it. She pulls out her handcuffs and leads him to the bed. However, she freaks out when he handcuffs himself to her around the bed, as the keys are in her belt across the room. Embarrassed, Athena calls Abby at 911 to have her call Hen. Hen heads over, expecting something bad, but bursts out laughing when she sees Athena in her awkward predicament. She goes to unlock Athena, who stops her and says just leave the keys on the nightstand. Hen leaves, but not before taking a selfie to embarrass her friend.

The last call involves two brothers who are the ultimate hoarders. The one brother gets trapped and crushed by his own booby trap, so the second brother, who is blind, calls 911. When the team arrives, they realize there is no safe way to get into the home. They get the second brother on the phone, who guides them through a tiny tunnel in the front of the house, and then talks Chimney through how to disarm a saw booby trap. Once inside, Chimney clears the way for the rest of the team. They all have to empty the house of all the junk before they can reach the victim, who has a compound fracture on his leg. After realigning it, they take him and the blind brother to the hospital for treatment.

After the graveyard shift, Abby and Buck go on a proper second date, where he has scheduled a hot air balloon ride, but it gets cut short when Abby has to leave because her mother is having a bad episode. Buck confides in Bobby at the station that he doesn't think he's ready for a relationship with all the baggage. Bobby explains that all of the feelings Buck has for Abby don't come for free. He suggests instead of trying to save Abby and pull her out of her situation, that he join her and be by her side to support her.

On their technically third date, Buck asks how Abby's mother is, so she goes into her long-winded story about how she's getting worse. Eventually, she gets to the point that she shouldn't be dragging anyone into her situation, so she's letting him off the hook. He tells her that he wants to be with her and he's not going anywhere.

Later that night, Abby wakes up and finds that her mother has passed away in her sleep.

Athena goes on her third date, where the bar man has cooked a fancy dinner for her. When he suggests going on a long weekend getaway to his home in Big Sur, she lets him down gently, telling him she's not ready to jump into anything serious. She says he's too good to be someone's rebound.

Hen, on the other hand, has a different sort of "breaking up" to do. She heads over to her ex Eva's apartment to find out what exactly she wants, because she knows it's not their son. Eva tells Hen she wants her back. She wants to be a family again. Hen tells her she'll never go down that road again because she knows Eva will just break her heart all over again. She storms out telling her that she won't win the fight for their son.

And in a different sort of ending, we find out where the victims end up, with Abby explaining that people are basically creatures of habit. The homeless man leaves the shelter he's staying in to sleep on the streets. The elevator victims find an apartment for her son, so he can be on his own. And the hoarders are back home, boarding up their house again.

During the first call, both a husband and wife call 911 on each other. The wife claims the husband is acting crazy, and the husband claims the wife isn't acting like herself. When the team arrives, the woman, who is speaking with a British accent, says her husband is going mental. Athena notices the woman has the hiccups and she says that she woke up with them along with a migraine. The husband says that his wife threw a picture frame at him. He then tells them that his wife isn't British, she was born in Brooklyn, and that she woke up with the accent all of a sudden. Athena then realizes that the woman is having a stroke, so the team rushes her to the hospital.

Back at the precinct, Bobby is taking selfies and setting up an online dating profile. Of course, the crew comes in and pokes fun at him, claiming his profile is dated. But they are happy he wants to start dating again. The jokes are interrupted by a call though.

During another call, the victim has just purchased a motorcycle and can't wait to show it to his son. However, he never makes it home. During his first ride, the man is thrilled to catch the attention of a female driver. He's so distracted though, that he slams into a truck, and the force of the impact cuts him in half. Yes, the man is cut in half. When Bobby gets on the scene, Athena tells him they can only make him comfortable and that he's still alive because his body must be in shock. The man has no idea what's happened. He gets a call from his son and tells him all about the motorcycle. Bobby is in tears as the man says his last words to his son and dies on the street.

Athena goes after Bobby, who leaves the scene. He apologizes for being unprofessional, but she says it can happen to anyone. She offers her support, so he asks her to come to church with him. While there, he explains he goes often because it's quiet and he can pray and confess. He asks her to pray with him, so she does.

Later that night, Bobby is getting ready for a date. Chimney is thrilled for him. At the restaurant, Athena shows up as his date. They are both dressed up, so I imagine it's not just a friendly work dinner.

During another call, Hen and Chimney arrive at a psychic's business to find a man dead. The woman claims she was reading his palm when he passed out. However, as they zip the man's body up, we, the audience, can hear the man say he's not dead!

At the morgue, we can still hear the man as he worries about the medical examiner taking photos and eventually takes out a bone saw. Suddenly, the man wakes up, which obviously scares the medical examiner, who passes out and the saw lands on his leg. Chimney and Hen show up to take care of the medical examiner, and they are shocked to see the man they declared dead, alive. He explains he has narcolepsy with cataplexy, and this is the third time he's been declared dead by accident. When they ask why he's not wearing a bracelet to inform people of his disease, he says he doesn't want people to know because each time he dies, he wakes up a completely different person and understands how precious life is.

The narcolepsy victim gets Hen thinking that she needs to make things right with her wife Karen quickly. She confronts her in a parking lot, as Karen won't take her calls. Karen listens to Hen apologize, but gets upset when Hen begs her to come home. Something must have clicked though, because by the end of the episode, Karen is moving back in.

Meanwhile, as Buck is comforting Abby, he keeps getting confronted by random women who claim they've been talking to him online and then get ghosted. When one of the women confronts him in front of Abby, she obviously gets upset. Buck immediately thinks Chimney is behind the random women, but Chimney just laughs. He explains that another woman came by the firehouse with the same story. After some digging, Chimney says he found out that someone created a fake MySpace profile for Buck and has been catfishing women ever since the roller coaster rescue. Chimney also mentions that he set up a date with that woman before he helps Buck track the IP address of the suspect.

Maddie prepares to go on a date with Chimney but as he is walking to her home, he is stabbed by Doug. He then enters Maddie's house and knocks her out.

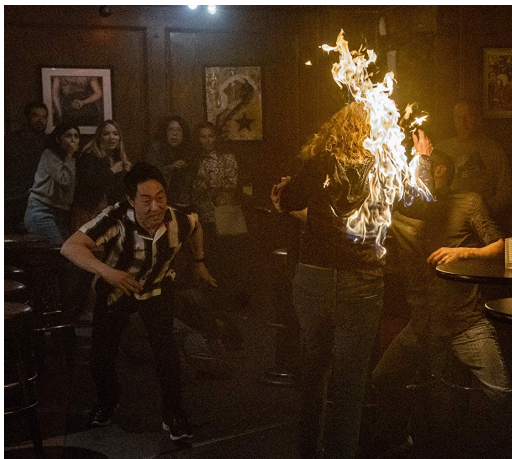

While patrolling the streets, Athena encounters the captain of station 136 whose arm is pinned underneath a vehicle. She uses a pair of shears to cut amputate his arm.

Buck arrives at the VA still looking for Christopher and runs into Eddie. While trying to explain to him what happened, Eddie spots Christopher alive.

Sometime later, a memorial has been erected for the victims of the tsunami and those still missing.

Eddie asks Buck to continue looking after Christopher.

Josh starts talking to a man online, and the two meet for a movie that is playing in a graveyard. When his date steals him away, he's brought to another man, and Josh is ambushed by the two.

The men make off with his keys, phone, and wallet, but Josh refuses to follow-up with the police due to embarrassment.

After apologizing to Christopher's teacher, Eddie has a hard talk with Christopher about his limitations due to having CP. Later, he, Buck, and Eddie take Christopher skateboarding with a skateboard designed for him.

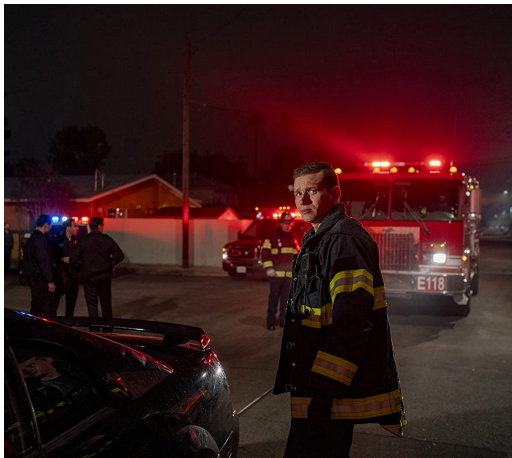

Eddie makes it to Christopher's show and tell to talk about his silver star back in the present day.

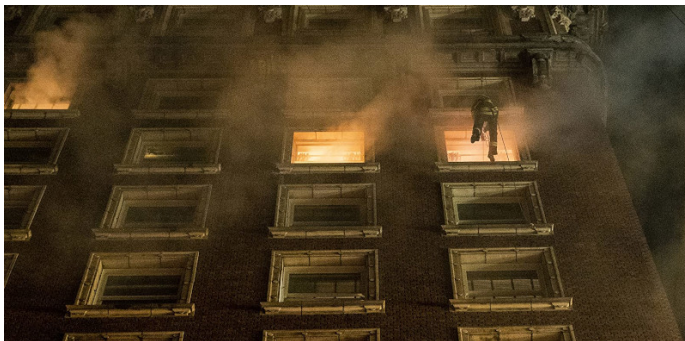

A cyclist rides past a water and power worker, who is telling his wife on the phone about the microquakes they've been experiencing and to not worry about them, they're small. Uncle Buck comes up behind Chim and he tells his roomie that he should be bickering with Maddie in his own kitchen. Chim says he's being cautious and they're not bickering, they're bantering, playfully.

Buck leaves to get ready and Maddie tells Chim he's not wrong. She moved in with him so they can be together, but "hello, global pandemic." They need to be safe. Maddie mentions they can take precautions like everyone else. She feels a kick and shows Chim her growing baby bump. Albert tells him the baby kicks every morning, like clockwork. Maybe the kid likes coffee. Chim says the kid is the size of a mango, the mango doesn't get a say. "Yeah, well, Mango misses Daddy." Chim says goodbye to Maddie and their baby since he has to get ready for work. Maddie is feeling sad that Chim isn't with her, while Albert tries to comfort her.

Athena picks up her badge and gets flashbacks of that horrifying and brutal attack she went through. Bobby stands at the door and tells her that Michael and Harry are on video chat. Michael is then soon joined by David, the doctor that he met at the end of the previous season (good job, Michael!), who wishes Athena a great first day back. When it's just Michael, Athena tells him she's ready to go back to work. At least they're not putting her on patrol right away, desk duty. Athena didn't tell Michael but she has a pretty good idea who did. As Michael and Bobby are talking about May, Athena shuts the laptop. Athena doesn't like that Bobby is talking to Michael about her behind her back, but Bobby says they were worried about her. She assures him she's okay, she's ready to go back. "How do you know that?" "Because I know myself." Between the virus and the protests and the fires, Bobby says the year has been nonstop for everyone. Athena tells him it's alright, she's just going to be shuffling paperwork for a while, she promises.

One hour before the dam break, we are finally reunited with everyone's favorite LA firehouse, COVID precautions and all. Bobby talks to Hen about Athena, saying he doesn't know what to do, she's not ready. Michael has seen her go through rough patches but never like this. Hen tells Bobby that what happened to Athena was devastating, it made her question everything — her ability to do her job. It can't be easy for a woman who counts on nobody but herself. Hen isn't saying that Athena doesn't need him, or her or Michael. She's just saying this particular thing, Athena has to figure out by herself. If she knows Athena, she's tired of talking about it. In her mind, there's only one thing left to do. "Get back out there."

Athena's first day back at the LAPD is in full swing and she sits down with Captain Maynard to go over the new protocols and get a quick briefing. Maynard asks Athena how she's doing, not being on the street, and Athena tells her she'd like to ease her way back in. Maynard was surprised when she got Athena's call. Athena getting beat up may have not been the end of the world but everything that's happened since feels like maybe it could be. "Now you sound like my daughter."

Speaking of which, May is not going to USC, but rather, taking a gap year. "9-1-1, what's your emergency?" Maddie is training May to be a 911 Dispatcher and she asks May if she's sure that she wouldn't rather be in college, instead of sitting at a screen, which is basically what college is now. Maddie sees her point and sits down at the monitor, telling May that it's "Duet Day." "I'm lead singer, and you're gonna play the keyboards." Meaning Maddie will talk while May types.

Another microquake is felt all over the city, but Bobby says that didn't feel micro to him. Meanwhile at the Call Center, Josh tells everyone that one was a little bigger and calls will be coming in. "Prepare for the deluge." A DWP worker is right in front of the cracking dam, just praying that it won't do what he thinks it will. "Come on, 2020, don't do me like that." Because it's 2020, the dam breaks, creating a massive landslide. Janell, the cyclist, is on with Linda and is soon cut off. Linda tells Josh that Janell said the dam broke. A city bus is also hit by the landslide, crashing right into an office building, several stories up.

The 118 arrive at the building, all looking up and seeing half a bus just dangling on the side of it. "That does not go there." At the Call Center, Josh tells May that Duet Day is canceled, he wants her to tap into the general line, eavesdrop on as many calls as she can. Listen for streets that are flooded out and put them on the board. (Anyone else get a flashback of Maddie's first day as a Dispatcher during the earthquake in season 2?) The 118 are slowly, but surely, making their way up to the crash sight in a silent, but hilarious, elevator ride, courtesy of elevator music. The crew puts their masks on after discussing where in the world all of that water will go — "out to sea" — and when the doors open, they come face-to-face with the front of the bus and a messed up office space. Bobby, Hen, and Chim leave the elevator while Buck and Eddie stay behind to go up further. "Hey, at least it's not a tsunami, right?"

Understatement of the year, Chim tells a businesswoman who got hurt there's been an accident. Bobby, meanwhile, is trying to calm down the bus passengers, who all want to get off. He notices the bus moving as they're getting up and tells them to not move. Dream Team Buck and

Eddie are up on the roof and Buck gets ready to head down the side of the building, soon landing on the bus. He finishes securing the bus and he notices someone else, Keith, under the vehicle. Bobby tells Eddie he needs the bus to rock back a little bit so the front end lifts up so they can get to Keith. Eddie tells him the bus is already secured to the building, but Bobby needs it to move and he tells Eddie to put it on the heavy wench. In the meantime, they get everybody off the bus, they let it rock back and then, they pull Keith out from underneath. "As plans go, it is one."

Hen, being the resident medical expert and future doctor, leads triage on the bus and lets the others know what injuries the passengers have. Bobby tries to talk down passenger CJ, who is nervous. Bobby tells him he knows how he feels. Those people that CJ loves, they're hurting. "And when someone you love is hurting, it's scary." He knows because he's scared too, but he knows he's going to get through this because he's not alone. They can ride this out. Bobby tells Eddie to move the bus as he and CJ hold onto the bars. Chim and Buck safely pull Keith out and he gets taken to the hospital. Eddie moves the bus back to where it was, however, he asks Buck if everyone is off, he thinks the bus is venting fuel. Buck runs towards the bus to warn Bobby but it's too late and the thing explodes. Buck gets back on the bus to try to find Bobby and he sees him, covering CJ, both of them okay. "I'd like to get off the bus now."

Athena's desk duty is getting much more exciting than she thought it would be. Maynard comes in and tells Athena she got a call from the Emergency Operation Center. They think those microquakes might have damaged more than just the dam. They're worried (rightfully so) about a landslide, east of the reservoir, which is all residential. Maynard will need more boots on the ground, people to knock on doors, and someone to supervise the scene. She knows Athena said she wanted to ease in, but she needs her back out there.

Maddie gets a call from Janell, who is trapped somewhere under ground thanks to the water from the dam break. She can't be that far if she's got signal, but she's trapped underground. The same ground they just told them is about to tumble down the side of the hill. Maddie tells Josh if they don't get to her in time, she'll be buried alive. Maddie keeps talking to Janell, and Janell tells her about losing her husband to COVID. She promised him she would start riding. "For him. Ride or die." Maddie's losing her, she's trying to keep her talking. Janell's almost giving up, but Maddie tells her things will get better, because she is still there, and so is Janell. It's not her time. Janell manages to open a beaker box and flips a switch so they know where she is. She finally gets saved.

Athena, though still shaken up, arrives on scene and meets up with other officers. They managed to get most residents evacuated, however, one person won't even come to the door. Neighbors say somebody lives there, but nobody seems to know who. Athena tells the officers she'll wrap it up there and they leave. Athena talks to the woman, Sylvia, who acts like she's getting ready to leave per a neighbor that doesn't even know her. Athena asks her when the last time she went outside was and Sylvia tells her she hasn't been outside for seven years, it's not safe out there. Athena tells her it's her first day back in six months. She was injured, line of duty, took some time to heal. She lied to her husband, her captain, even herself. Sylvia says she lies, it's like a game she plays with herself, that someday she will go out there, and then she never does. The hill is about to come down on itself and take her with it. "Maybe I should let it." Athena tells her she got up and put on makeup, she's still in the game. At the Call Center, Maddie, Josh, and May see the motion sensor on Mount Lee, Hollywood Hills. Their comm towers are up there, and so is Athena. Josh brings up cameras on the Hollywood Sign, which looks like it's moving. Just as Sylvia is about to leave her house, it comes tumbling down, along with the sign.

Summary: In the aftermath of the dam break, massive mudslides wreak havoc throughout Los Angeles. Bobby, Hen and Eddie rush to save hikers endangered by the falling of the Hollywood sign.



The episode opens with a news report showing the flooding, destruction, and devastation caused to the Hollywood Hills area by the mudslide. Seemingly oblivious to the incoming danger, a group of three people are hiking their way up to the Hollywood sign for a photo op. 9-1-1 continues to offer up incredibly relevant social commentary as an argument breaks out, spurred on by the fact that Caleb didn't even ask Dylan before asking Katie to move in with them in a pandemic-fueled decision. Moments after Caleb and Katie snap their coveted selfie, the earth begins to shake and the Holly-

wood sign starts to fall.

Meanwhile, Sylvia's house has come to rest in a dangerous spot along the side of the mountain. Sylvia, being agoraphobic, makes a comment that this is why she doesn't leave the house — bad things happen. Athena, however, is quick to remind her that they hadn't even left the house yet. The two find themselves in a tricky position, stuck inside the remains of the house without Athena's radio or either of their cellphones.

The 118 are working with other members of the LAFD to look for survivors, and Bobby, Hen, and Eddie take off in search of the Hollywood sign hikers (and Chimney has already entered full dad joke mode — "I guess they should have bought a vowel").

Over at the 9-1-1 dispatch center, May recognizes Athena's patrol car in the helicopter footage on the news and convinces Maddie to page her over the radio. When she doesn't respond, Maddie has to remind her that they all have people they love out there, and the best thing they can do for them ... is their job. May clearly isn't convinced, because she proceeds to try her mom's cell (to no avail).

Chimney and Buck are making their way down a street where the mudslide has completely covered most houses up to their roofs. They stop when they hear the nearby sound of a baby crying and end up digging a baby monitor out of the wreckage. The problem? The baby is nowhere in sight.

Bobby, Hen, and Eddie find the Hollywood sign's elusive missing H, which Caleb and Katie are hanging off of. Dylan, on the other hand, has found himself trapped in quicksand.

As Buck and Chimney attempt to figure out how they're going to find the baby, they realize that the baby monitor is causing interference on their radios, meaning that they can follow it to the source. Find My iPhone is so 2019, 2020 is all about Find My Baby. As they amble around waiting for the sound of the interference to get louder, the two begin to bicker over the fact that Chimney is still living with Buck instead of going home to Maddie. Chimney argues that he's just trying to keep Maddie and their child safe in the midst of the pandemic, while continuing to voice his self-doubt over the type of father he'll be.

Back at Sylvia's house, she and Athena have begun crawling their way up through the house. They finally locate Athena's radio, and she pages Maddie at the dispatch center. May listens in beside her nervously as Maddie puts a rush on sending a unit out to rescue them. Unfortunately, the house begins to shift, and Sylvia slides downward.

After a helpful delivery of plywood, Bobby, Hen, and Eddie attempt to rescue Dylan from the quicksand. They're fighting against the clock, because he's sinking deeper and deeper by the minute. As Bobby and Eddie attempt to gather more tools to get Dylan out, Hen finds herself in the middle of a dramatic love triangle confession.

As Chimney is lowered down into the chimney of the house where the baby supposedly is, he tells Buck that in the future, this will be the story of how he got his nickname. You can fool them, but you can't fool us, Howie ... we'll figure it out eventually! Chimney finds who he assumes to be the mother of the child, but she's deceased. He then spots a crib and finds the baby, who is thankfully alive and no more than a few days old. Then, in a truly wild twist, terrified shouts can be heard from behind a locked door. Chimney breaks it open to find that perhaps he doesn't feel too terrible about the fate of the other woman, because she's been keeping four pregnant women locked up in the room in order to steal and sell their children as a part of an illegal adoption ring. One of the women is the mother of the newborn baby outside the door. And although nobody is injured ... one of the women is in labor.

At Sylvia's, Athena manages to find her in the newly-shifted wreckage, but she's trapped underneath a piece of the house. As Athena pages the dispatch center to get an ETA on the backup units, Sylvia urges her to go and save herself. May then learns a tough lesson about her new job when, speaking as her daughter and not as a 9-1-1 dispatcher, she tells Athena to get out of there. Maddie pulls May from the floor, instructing her to take a break.

Buck rescues three of the girls from the house, while Chimney takes care of the one that's in labor. The two have a very eye-opening conversation as Chimney realizes how terrifying, dangerous, and lonely it can be when a pregnant woman doesn't have a partner or support system.

Athena, never one to give up, finds a bar to use as leverage to help free Sylvia. She learns that the reason Sylvia won't leave her house is because she and her sister were in a car accident. She was the one driving, and she survived, but her sister wasn't as lucky. Sylvia gave up on herself and life. Athena reflects back on her attack and the way that she, too, blames herself.

We switch back and forth between two scenes of courage, strength, and determination — Chimney talks the girl through delivering her baby as Athena and Sylvia work together to pull her out from under the wreckage. Both teams are successful in two powerful moments of triumph.

At the dispatch center, Maddie goes to find May, who recognizes that she lost herself in the heat of the moment. She promises that it won't happen again, and Maddie puts her back to work.

Chimney, Buck, Eddie, and Hen reconvene in the aftermath of their respective rescues, but Bobby is still working. He's now up in a rescue helicopter, surveying the mud-ravaged neighborhoods from up above in search of Athena. Meanwhile, Athena and Sylvia have finally managed to make their way out of the house, but Athena's flashlight beam is too weak to be seen from

the helicopter. Athena spots her patrol car nearby and runs over to flick on the lights, which quickly manage to catch Bobby's attention. After the helicopter touches down, Athena pages the dispatch center to confirm that rescue has arrived, and Maddie lets May take the call. Though the moment is emotional for all involved, May holds herself together as she speaks to her mother professionally as a true 9-1-1 dispatcher this time.

Back at home, Athena is surprised to find that Bobby, Michael, May, and Henry have put together a small barbecue to celebrate her first day back at work. Athena tells May that nobody will fault her if she wants to stop being a dispatcher after what she went through working through the mudslide. After all, she still doesn't seem to be too impressed with her daughter's decision to take a year off of school. May argues that she took the job because of her mom — on top of Michael's brain tumor and everything else that happened that year — and she makes it clear that she isn't planning on quitting.

Maddie arrives at home and is annoyed to see that Albert's left his bags on the floor. She calls out to admonish him and heads into her room to change. When she walks out, she realizes that it was Chimney in the shower, not Albert. Chimney admits that he got carried away with all of his worrying, and he seems to have realized that it was finally time to come home. It's better to be scared together, after all.

Michael and Athena have a bit of a heart-to-heart in the kitchen about her ex-husband's new boyfriend before he takes off, leaving Harry to spend some time with his mother for the night. Later, David texts Michael to let him know that he just pulled into the garage and the two carry out their post-work domestic COVID routine. Michael starts up the shower, hangs a laundry bag in the doorway, and puts on a mask. David strips down in the doorway and takes a shower while Michael puts his scrubs in the washer. Then, Michael places dinner on the table as David walks out into the kitchen.

At the Diaz household, we finally get to see Christopher, who's cuddled up in bed with his dad. Carla is video chatting with them and she's telling Christopher a bedtime story. When she realizes that both Eddie and his son have fallen asleep, she bids them goodnight before hanging up.

Karen and Nia wish Hen luck on her first day of orientation for medical school, which — COVID strikes again — is taking place at her kitchen table via video chat. Maddie and Buck appear to have swapped house guests; Uncle Buck and Uncle Albert are now living together in his apartment while Maddie and Chimney enjoy being reunited. Buck's phone rings, and he excuses himself from the conversation. Maddie calls out after him to stop being so secretive about his new "lady friend."

Buck hurries up to his room and answers a video call on his tablet, and we finally learn the secret identity of his "COVID crush." Buck addresses the older woman that appears on the screen as Dr. Copeland, and we finally realize that this isn't a crush after all ... Evan Buckley is talking to a therapist. Given Buck's questionable history with therapy in the past, on top of everything else he's been through, it's not surprising that he'd want to keep this to himself now that he appears to truly be taking it seriously this time. Buck then says something quite interesting — he's starting to think that Dr. Copeland might be right in her observation that he hides his true feelings from others. We're coming up on the arrival of the Buckley parents and the long-awaited episode "Buck Begins," so hopefully we'll get more of an explanation on what's going on with Buck soon enough.

Summary: The 118 race to save a man under siege by his high-tech smart home, and a yoga teacher who has lost her vision. Athena hunts down a bank robber disguised by Covid protocols. The 118 prep an out-of-state mission.



The episode opens with a man, Anthony, in his smart home powered by Hildy, which is malfunctioning. The house is set to 34 degrees, the coffee machine overflows, and loud music blares. He jumps in the shower, where Hildy sets the temp to 99 degrees. However, the camera cuts to his ex-girlfriend, Justine, logged into his Hildy system and causing the malfunctions. She turns the water temperature to 140. Anthony slips and knocks himself unconscious. Justine calls 9-1-1, where Maddie asks questions and she confesses

she's logged into the system.

The 118 arrive, where Bobby simply rings the smart home doorbell and Hildy lets them in. Everyone is creeped out by its ability to recognize them. Anthony is still unconscious with first or second degree burns. Maddie keeps Justine on the line to collect additional information, typing "possible cyberstalking." Buck mentions that any kind of smart device means someone can spy on you. Eddie comments that maybe he won't buy that smart coffee maker he wanted now, and Hildy pops his face on the screen, "Hello, Eddie. Here are some popular coffee makers. Would you like to hear the reviews?" Eddie is freaked out and they quickly load Anthony up. Maddie dispatches the LAPD to the woman's address, where Athena has a little chat about Justine's digital activities.

At home, Bobby and Athena suspiciously eye the new robot vacuum May bought them. It bumps into Athena, then a lamp, repeatedly ramming it until it falls over, so Bobby (hilariously) puts it outside. Athena tells Bobby that May will be on real calls, and she's still not happy with May's choice, believing that it's because of her. Or, Bobby suggests, May told Athena she's doing the job to protect her because she knew Athena couldn't argue back or yell about it. The robot repeatedly yells, "I am stuck" so Bobby walks over, looks annoyed, and asks Athena for her gun.

It's dissection time in Hen's medical training. She and a few trainees are around a cadaver as the instructor walks them through makes their first incisions. Trainee Luis is so shaky he can't do it, and Hen's other lab partner, Sydney, brusquely pushes Luis aside to do it herself. She gets half a cut in before fainting.

At Maddie and Chimney's, Chimney builds the crib while Buck finishes baby proofing the house, at least until he starts suggesting sensors on the windows. "I just don't want to underestimate the curious interiority of my nephew." Maddie reminds him they don't know the sex and discovers Buck put childproof cabinet locks on the top cabinets. Maybe overkill, definitely adorable. Chimney asks if Buck's girlfriend has seen this side of Buck, and this is when Buck confesses he doesn't have a girlfriend. The woman he's been talking to is actually a therapist, and it's not for work, it's for himself. Chimney reassures him therapy is not a big deal, but Maddie seems worried and Chimney jokes parents should start therapy funds instead of college funds.

In class, Hen speculates with Luis that their cadaver died of heart failure when Sydney walks in suggesting they look at his chart. When Hen tries to ask why she's not at a hospital, Sydney rudely says the paramedics are "medical Uber drivers. Their opinions don't count." Hen is clearly annoyed. They move on, Sydney stepping up to make the next incision and she realizes the cadaver has a port scar. He died of cancer. Hen tries to help when she seems upset, but Sydney shuts her down again.

At home, Buck answers a knock on his door to find Maddie. He just left her house so he's surprised, but she says she wanted to talk more about his therapy, thinking he might not be comfortable sharing things in front of Chimney. He tells her there's nothing to share. She called him sad and lonely, and it stuck with him. He sought help, because even after he said his piece to Abby, he still felt that way. He's open and vulnerable with Maddie, a side of Buck we don't usually see. She asks if he's talked with their parents and seems relieved that he hasn't. She's extremely worried about something. He seems to strike a cord with her though.

A man in a ball cap and face mask robs a local bank, where the clerk is unable to give any descriptive information because of the mask. On the scene, Athena and two officers check the security footage, where she's able to read the license plate on the getaway car, so dispatch puts an APB on it. Not long after, Athena arrives on scene where the driver is handcuffed and says he didn't rob the bank. He's a rideshare driver, and Athena says he was the getaway car. He supplies the information for the man who ordered the ride, and Athena (with backup) arrives at his home to make the arrest. The man tries the run and is dumb enough to call a second rideshare in an alley behind his home. The LAPD pulls up and arrests him.

Later that night, Buck hangs out with Eddie and Christopher. He and Chris are battling playing a video game when Eddie disconnects the whole device. After the coffee maker incident, Eddie is still wary of technology, because everything he looks at gives him ads for coffee makers. Chris asks to go to Buck's to play games, and Buck wants to give in, but Eddie gives him a look and Buck redirects telling Chris they might have to play old school games like Scrabble now.

Chimney wakes to find Maddie crying in the living room. She's scared about being a parent because every decision they make will affect the child and who they become as a person. She doesn't want to mess up their child the way her parents messed up her and Buck. (Seems like Buck's comment really struck a nerve.) Chimney reassures her she won't be like her parents, they are going to make mistakes but their kid will know how much they love them and will understand.

Hen finds Nia chasing Denny around, having colored on Denny's face while he slept. "I make Denny pretty," she says. Denny runs to answer the door and in walks Dierdra, the social worker. As they chat, another knock sees Sydney on the doorstep. Nia takes Dierdra to her room, Denny goes to clean his face, and Hen reprimands Sydney for showing up unannounced. Sydney asks her to tell Dr. Langford everything between them is fine. She's on his radar in a bad way and doesn't want to look bad. "Because it's all about you," Hen says and Sydney again talks down on Hen's career shift at 40 and Hen's inability to juggle her busy life. Hen tells her to leave and

slams the door.

At the station, Chimney and Buck see the Texas volcano and wildfire on the news before Chimney asks Buck about his parents. He's worried about Maddie, and Buck tells him their parents weren't abusive, they were emotionally absent from their lives. "I just figured they liked each other more than they liked us." Chimney asks about some dark, Buckley family secret but Buck assures him they were just the usual dysfunctional family.

Hen swings by Athena's house to vent about the social worker and Sydney. Hen shares that the things Sydney said are the same things the voice in her head tells her. She can't do everything, and she's tired of having to prove herself. Athena reminds her she doesn't have to, she's already formidable. Athena says maybe Sydney's got more going on than they know and tells her to think of her as a patient.

At home, Maddie calls her mother and gets in an argument about finding out the baby's gender (and gives us an idea of how the elder Buckleys are). Maddie pushes past it and asks if they've spoken to Buck. She says he's in therapy, and is cut off by her mom, then responds, "No, it's not like that. He doesn't know anything. But maybe he should." Then, "I don't know Mom. How do you tell somebody that you've been lying to them for their entire life?" It seems there is a life-altering family secret that Buck doesn't know and Maddie is scared of what that truth will mean for him.

A woman does a guided meditation with her Hildy, and as she sits up she loses her vision. The 118 arrive on scene and rule out blood pressure and medicines. As they talk, Eddie spots a worm in her eye and they discover she's been instructing goat yoga, where she was exposed to face flies which lay eggs in eyes. Hen removes all the worms (there are a lot), her eyes clear, and she asks if rabbits have worms. Hildy chimes in, asking if she wants that searched and Eddie panic yells, "No!" at it.

In the lab that night, Hen finds Sydney already there. She says Sydney makes her feel like she's going to fail before she's even tried, and always feels like she has to prove herself.

While they chat, Hen spots a patch on her arm for hormone replacement therapy, which can cause all the symptoms she's seen. Sydney finally shares that she carries the BRCA1 gene mutation, and six weeks before classes she had a double mastectomy and surgery to remove her ovaries and fallopian tubes. Both her mother and grandmother died before 35, so she's determined to graduate and live beyond 35. Hen understands that drive, and it seems a new friendship might be on the horizon.

Eddie hears a knock at the door and finds a large box on the doorstep. Inside he finds a coffee maker with the note "A gift from Hildy". As he panics, Christopher picks up the phone and says, "We got him." Buck and Chris pranked Eddie, and it's the cutest thing we've ever seen. Also, now Eddie has his new coffee maker.

Chimney anxiously welcomes Maddie home, telling her that he wants to be there for her. She's unwilling to share whatever has her worried, and they sit down to watch the ultrasound together. As they watch, it's revealed Maddie didn't watch anything at her doctor's appointment and together they discover they are having a girl. The emotions weigh on Maddie, and she finally tells Chimney she wants to get something off her chest, but Chimney isn't the one she's been trying to protect by keeping this secret.

May arrives home and tells Athena and Bobby that she stayed after work for a counseling session that's required because of her age and record. Bobby says there's no shame in therapy, and Athena reveals that she stopped seeing her therapist. Bobby is less than thrilled, but she tells him it was to prepare her for going back to work and now she has.

A news anchor details the raging fire in Texas and the need for additional aid. At the station, Buck and Eddie are packing up to head to San Angelo when Hen arrives to join them on the trip. They pack up and roll out.

Buck, Chimney, and Albert get the place ready for the parents to come and soon it's time. Maddie answers the door as Buck gets ready and they come in, bearing gifts for their new granddaughter. Chimney introduces himself, saying it's nice to finally meet them. He and Albert lead

Maddie is at Buck's and she tells him about their parents coming and Buck doesn't understand how she's just now telling him. Buck was in Texas and Maddie wasn't completely sure they were coming. Margaret and Phillip to the couch, as Maddie and Buck stand next to each other in agony. "We got this." "United front."

Phillip tells Buck that Maddie told them he's been seeing a therapist. Buck tells them there's nothing to be worried about, it's that the job can be stressful. It's good to try to get a clear head. Margaret admits that she and Phillip went to see a therapist. After all this business with Maddie and "the husband who shall not be named," they felt like there were some things they needed to work through. Maddie's shocked that her parents went and talked to a therapist about her problems and Phillip says it wasn't as if she wanted to talk to them about it. Buck had to call to tell them that Doug was dead. "Well, I didn't want you to find out on Dateline." Chimney is going to start bringing the food and rinks into the kitchen and Albert helps so they can leave the Buckleys alone. But Buck decides to help to get away. Margaret tells Maddie that Buck looks good. After her call she didn't know what to expect. He seems fine. Maddie thinks he's better at that than they think. Seeming fine.

May comes into the Call Center and Josh tells her it's a big day. He walks her over to a desk and May realizes it's not the training desk. "Congratulations, graduate." Today, May flies solo. He tells her to trust her instincts, trust herself. Josh leaves and May gets started. Most calls are fairly simple, non-emergency. Until May gets a call from a guy named Stan, telling her she sounds nice. Maybe she can help him. He asks if she knows why people lie. "Like, they say they care, but they don't." May says she doesn't and Stan tells her someone needs to teach them a lesson. He's going to teach them a lesson. May motions Josh over so he can listen in, Stan saying he's going to blow their lying heads right off. May tells Stan he sounds upset, maybe she can help. Stan says she can't help, he just wanted to make sure everybody understood. This wasn't an accident, he knew what he was doing. "And they all deserved it." Deserved what? Stan's sorry he buried the lead, telling her his name is Stanley Whitworth, "and I just planted a bomb."

The 118 pull up to a building after May and Josh dig around on Stan's social media and find out where his first job was. They're being told they've already started evacuating but they need to shut off gas and power as a precaution. Bobby tells Eddie he's on electrical and Buck to go up the street to shut the gas off at the main.

Eddie tells Bobby that the power's out but he just got word that a janitor might have had an asthma attack and collapsed in one of the stairwells. Bobby sends Chimney his way and Chimney heads in. The bomb squad arrive on the scene and Bobby tells them the building is almost clear, no sign of any explosives yet. Chimney gets to the stairwell, passing Eddie on the way, and asks him if he found the asthma guy. He checked the main stairwell, no signs of anyone. Chimney suggests the garage underneath and tells Eddie he'll check it out. Eddie will clear the rest of the lobby and make sure nobody's in the elevators. Chimney finds a guy, telling him he needs to get out of there and somebody said he was having trouble with his asthma. He's a paramedic, has some basics. If not, he can get him to the ambulance where he can help him. Chimney is cut off by the sight of the bomb, and the guy holding a trigger. "No one can help me now."

Over radio, Bobby tells Chimney he has the bomb squad and asks if they're clear. Chimney doesn't respond and Bobby keeps telling him to come in. Stan tells Chimney if he blows this, the mezzanine goes. Then the whole building. Chimney's going to take his word for it. Bobby keeps trying to get him to respond, as Chimney continues talking to Stan. He understands he's an expert on this kind of thing. Stan had to disguise himself as the help just to get in there. After he gave them two decades of his life, they kicked him to the curb. And now he's going to make them a pile of rubble on that same curb. Eddie comes down, telling Chimney the squad's moving in. Chimney says they'll be out in a minute, indicating Eddie to not come any closer. He tells him to make sure everyone clears out, and Eddie notices the trigger. Eddie leaves, saying he'll let the Cap know. He runs out the building, telling everyone Chimney is in there with the bomber.

After having it bottled up inside him, Chimney tells Stan the Buckley family secret. He tries talking him down and Stan starts coughing. Chimney gives him an inhaler, but hitting him with a pipe before doing so, knocking him out. "We all got problems, Stan." His doesn't give him the right to blow up innocent people, or him. Chimney gives the all clear, thanking Stan for listening to him.

Margaret is glad everybody's okay and Phillip mentions it seems they all have very dangerous jobs. Maddie tells them not really, most of the time it's just run of the mill. And Chimney says that Stan wasn't a bad guy, he just needed someone to see him. "To understand how much pain he was in." It still seems very risky, from what Phillip hears, Buck spends quite a lot of

time in hospitals. "From what you hear?" They could've come, seen for themselves. They're not good with hospitals, he gets it. Margaret says she's not good at seeing her children in them, he doesn't know. Phillip asks Chimney where he put the box they brought and he grabs it. Chimney brings over Maddie's baby box. Margaret thought Maddie might want some of these things for her little girl someday. Buck didn't know they had these and asks when he gets his. Chimney sees the tension and tells Buck he's not even grown up yet. They're probably still adding stuff to it. Maddie looks through the box, surprised her parents kept all of it. They never gave up hope that she would come to her senses.

They never gave up hope? Maddie tells her brother to not do this, but united front. Their parents didn't even go to her wedding. Margaret says Maddie was making a terrible mistake, they told her that. People make mistakes. "Doesn't mean you give up on them. But you did." Maddie married Doug and they cut her off. At the time, Phillip says they thought it was for the best. They swear they didn't know what was going on. They didn't know he was hurting her. Buck tells his parents they should have known. They were right there in the same town. How could they not know? Buck says it does track because they barely knew what was going on with their own kids when they were under the same roof. Maybe they never gave up. "You sure as hell gave up on her. You gave up on both of us."

Buck gets up to leave, but not before telling his parents that the reason he's in therapy is because he's spent his entire life feeling a constant disappointment. And they want to talk about their jobs? They think his job is dangerous? "I have walked through fire every single day of my life because of you. That is why I am in therapy. Because nothing I ever did was good enough." They tried but Buck never made it easy on them. Were Buck and Maddie supposed to? They were kids. Margaret tells Buck she doesn't know what he expected them to do. "Love me anyway." After Buck leaves, Maddie goes to her room in tears.

At the firehouse, Buck is angrily punching a punching bag as Eddie just watches. Two dinners is all it took and he is 12-years-old again, trapped between his sister and his parents. And now he's planning his awkward apology. What does Buck have to be sorry for? Did he say anything that wasn't true? Buck says no, and Eddie tells him maybe he could've come at it a little differently but if that's how he feels, how they made him feel, he has every right to say so. Buck tells Eddie he doesn't need any more therapy. "I just wanna hit things." Eddie's been down that road, he doesn't recommend it. Buck's phone rings, Maddie calling him again. She's worried about him.

Maddie asks Buck if he's okay and he says he's embarrassed about the way he went off on their parents. He doesn't have to defend her, she can take care of herself. Buck tells Maddie she shouldn't have to, not from their own parents. But he's sorry. He knows she's trying to fix things with them, not just for her, for him too. He shouldn't have to carry the weight of their mistakes. He deserves better than that. Maddie tells her brother he has never been a disappointment.

Buck brings out Maddie's baby box, saying this was a surprise. He never knew their mom and dad were so sentimental. Maddie says they used to be different, happier. She stops herself, saying maybe they weren't. Your age takes things on differently as a kid. As Buck is looking through the box, he spots a picture of a little boy, assuming it to be him. Maddie tells him that's not supposed to be in there and Buck tells her it's selfish that no baby pictures of him are allowed in her baby box. Buck notices the house in the picture does not look like their house and looks at the back to see when it was taken. July 4, 1988. "This can't be right. I wasn't even born yet." Buck sees his sister's expression and asks her who the kid is. "That's Daniel. He died. He was our brother."

Summary: The 118 race to save the lives of workers trapped in a five-alarm factory fire. Maddie reveals a painful family secret that causes Buck to confront his childhood and answer why he is the daredevil he is today.



1996 — Maddie is teaching Buck how to ride a bike without training wheels. At one point, Buck goes crashing to the ground ... hard. Their parents are angry and upset as they come running outside to see what happened. The situation sours even further when Margaret sees that Buck was riding Daniel's bicycle and she heads back into the house, on the verge of a meltdown.

Present Day — Maddie tells Buck that when he was born, Daniel was seven, and he then died a year later from juvenile leukemia. He became sick right after the bicycle photo was taken and spent the next three years in and out of hospitals.

The gears are spinning in Bucks head as he notes the fact that he was born in the middle of all of that, of Daniel being sick. He says that he's surprised that the doctors didn't try a bone marrow transplant, but Maddie says that neither her nor their parents were a match. The final puzzle piece clicks into place in a sad moment as Buck says, "They couldn't find a match, so they made one. Me." Buck was a savior sibling. And he was indeed a match, but the cells didn't graft, and Daniel had a relapse. Buck leaves as Maddie tearfully apologizes for not telling him sooner.

Phillip and Margaret are unhappy, to put it lightly, to find out that Maddie told Buck the truth. We learn that the Buckley family chose to move after Daniel's death because of the heightened judgement they had been receiving for the circumstances surrounding Buck's birth.

1996 — We get a glimpse into the Buckley parents' grief as Phillip pleads with his wife to defend his decision to keep the bicycle, "I just wanted one thing to remember him by," and Margaret

responds, "We live with the reminder every day. Staring us right in the face." (My heart is breaking for Buck right now.) After Maddie patches her brother up, Buck is happy to find out that their parents seemingly aren't mad at him after all. In fact, his father tells him that he's going to take him to the store to get a new bike.

A montage follows of Buck throughout his childhood years in 1996 and beyond, pulling off various stunts, getting hurt, and then receiving attention from his parents as a result of his actions.

Present Day — At the station, Buck has recounted everything he's learned about Daniel and then also discussed his daredevil tendencies with Eddie, Hen, and Bobby. He tells them that his behavior was the only way he could get his parents' attention, sadly. We're reminded of how important the bond between the 118 is as they pick up on Buck's detached, casual attitude toward the situation and offer words of comfort: "Hey, that's not on you." — Eddie; "Daniel wasn't their only son. You matter too, Buck." — Hen. Chimney then arrives at the station and asks Buck if they can talk in private, but Buck brushes him off.

2004 — Maddie and Buck are in her Jeep, and they pull up in front of a house. When he asks his sister where they are, Maddie tells him that they used to live there. Right when she's about to tell Buck the truth about Daniel, her phone rings with a call from Doug. Buck asks her why Doug always has to know where she is and what she's doing, but she brushes him off and tells him that it just means that he cares about her. In that moment, Maddie decides not to tell Buck the family secret after all. Instead, she tells him that Doug was accepted into a medical school in Boston, and she'll be going with him. Buck is bewildered as he responds, "You're leaving me?"

Present Day — Maddie shows up at the station to talk to Buck because he's not answering her calls. Buck doesn't want to hear it though, he thinks Maddie has just come to make herself feel better. He spent his life believing it was he and Maddie versus their parents, but that's not how it looks or feels to him anymore. Their conversation is cut short as the station is dispatched for a five-alarm fire in an industrial complex.

The team arrives at a hand sanitizer factory that's engulfed in flames. In another timely nod to COVID-19 this season, we learn the building was originally a perfume factory, but they converted their business once the pandemic hit.

2004 — When Maddie drops Buck off at home, Phillip and Margaret storm out of the house. Doug called and told them about Boston, and they're not pleased. Buck argues that they should congratulate Maddie because she's going to nursing school. They rebuff him, and he angrily takes off on his bicycle.

2012 — The scene quickly transitions to an older Buck tearing through the neighborhood on a street bike, only to go crashing right into an SUV backing out of a driveway.

Present Day — Buck and the other firefighters on the scene head into the burning building, and they soon come across a group of people bunkered down in a room waiting to be rescued. Meanwhile, Bobby calls out over the radio that they're down two firefighters on the other side of the factory. Buck decides to go and assist them.

2012 — After getting patched up from his crash, Buck heads over to the hospital Maddie works at (she and Doug have moved back into town). He tells Maddie that he got himself kicked out of college because he blew his tuition money on bike modifications and keg parties, and now he really can't go home after this latest incident on top of all that. He asks his sister if he can stay with her and Doug, but Maddie declines. Buck believes that it's because Doug hates him, unaware of the full extent of the abuse that's going on behind closed doors. Buck continues to break our hearts as he tells Maddie that their parents think he's a total loser.

Present Day — A message comes over the radio that all teams are being ordered to evacuate the factory. Buck argues over the fact that one person still has not been located. The Incident Commander makes it clear that Buck is to evacuate immediately, but Buck — being Buck — doesn't listen and continues his search.

2012 — Buck goes home after all, and Margaret is on the verge of tears as she scolds Buck for being reckless. At the time, Buck doesn't understand why her emotions over seeing him a bit

banged up and in a sling are so over-exaggerated, but now we know it's because of Daniel. He just narrowly avoids telling them the truth about the whole college debacle when Maddie pulls into the driveway to rescue him.

She eventually pulls over and tosses the keys to the Jeep to Buck and tells him she's giving him freedom, a way out of there and away from their parents. She encourages him to go as far away as he can and be happy. Buck tells Maddie that he knows things aren't okay with Doug and, though she's reluctant at first, eventually convinces her to come with him. "Just you and me against the world." Later, Buck arrives at the hospital to pick Maddie up for their getaway. Her co-worker gives him a letter that she left for him, stating that she couldn't leave with him after all. Buck angrily storms out of the building.

Present Day — Buck has found the last victim, Saleh, who ended up lost due to the amount of smoke in the building. The two are attempting to find a way out, but things aren't looking too great on that front. It only gets worse when a forklift explodes as they're trying to cross a gantry and they go flying.

2012 — Maddie arrives at work one day to find that Buck has sent her a postcard from Georgia. He's been traveling up and down the East Coast, picking up odd jobs. A fun montage follows, in which Buck continues to send her postcards from all of his travels: he became a mixologist in Virginia Beach and learned how to surf; he started working in construction in Florida; a desert rat in Arizona; a Navy SEAL in California; a dude ranch in Montana; Oregon; and eventually a mixologist in Peru.

2015 — After experiencing most of Buck's travels through the narration of his postcards and a couple of photos, we're finally treated to an actual sight indeed — bartender Buck with highlights, a tan, a cheesy button-up shirt, and a puka shell necklace (and he was even a "fun fact nerd" back then, too). It seems that a conversation that he had on that particular day is what then led him to Los Angeles.

Present Day — Unfortunately, a vat fell top of Saleh's legs during the explosion. Buck tries moving it with no luck. Bobby, Hen, Chimney, and Eddie reconvene outside to find that Buck is missing.

2017 — Buck arrives for his first day of work as a probationary firefighter with the 118. The mystery around the nickname "Buck" is finally revealed — there were three other Evans in his class, so they began calling him Buck.

Present Day — Buck continues to try and free Saleh. He manages to get ahold of a fire extinguisher to put out the fire that's in their immediate vicinity. Frustrated yet refusing to give up, Buck rigs a pulley to attempt to move the vat once more. He cries out in desperation as he pulls as hard as he possibly can. 9-1-1 has a knack for having beautiful and emotional music cues, especially in the "Begins" episodes, and this is one we won't soon forget: "So Far" by Ólafur Arnalds. As the music swells, the rest of his team finally rushes in to help him.

Outside afterward, Buck seems tired and defeated. And even though his relationship with his biological parents may not be the best, we're reminded that he still has parental figures like Bobby and Athena in his life as they (along with Hen) give him a pep talk.

Later, after getting a clean bill of health, Buck returns to the station and Eddie tells him that his parents are waiting for him upstairs. In a very important moment, Buck's parents tell him that they never blamed him. Buck was born to save someone ... and now that's what he does for a job, every day. And he finally gets to hear something that he's needed to hear for a very long time — his parents are proud of him.

Chimney approaches Buck afterward and finally bridges the gap in the latter's understanding as to why Maddie didn't run away with him in the first place. He's been angry about it for so long, but he had no idea that Doug had just given her a terrible beating to show what would happen if she left him.

Maddie is surprised to find Buck standing in the doorway behind Chimney when he comes home from work. The two finally reconcile, and Buck asks Maddie to tell him about Daniel. And although their parents sadly didn't make a baby box for him, Maddie shows him that she saved all of his postcards. When she left Doug, she only had two suitcases ... and everything that mattered the most was inside of them. The episode ends with a beautiful and heartfelt montage

of moments between the Buckley siblings over the years. No matter what happens, Buck and Maddie will always have each other.

The episode kicks off with a highly unusual opening, even for 9-1-1, with Athena and assisting officers in hot pursuit of the engine 118 fire truck that is clearly not slowing down for anyone. With that we flash back to earlier in the day at the firehouse where Buck and Eddie are double checking the equipment on the truck. Chimney and Hen give him some grief about it (he was a little bit of a nightmare with a clipboard before) but he as-

sure them that Buck 3.0 is much improved. His parents agreed to go to some therapy sessions with him, and he feels like he's grown beyond his self-proclaimed Buck 2.0 era. He turns to ask a new probie about his first shift. The probie says it's been quiet and Buck, Hen, and Chimney immediately panic at the Q word. Of course, the sirens blare and they are off on what the trio deem to be a jinxed shift thanks to the probie.

On the way to their call, the team explains to a skeptical Eddie that they are doomed by the EMS gods to a shift full of strange and often dumb calls. He thinks they're acting ridiculous, and Hen shares that the last time Buck said it (the gods took it out of context, he swears!) they had 36 calls (a house record), and Buck ended up trapped in a room where the fire suppression system went off and he was covered head to toe in the foam the system releases. They arrive to the fender bender call (that's not weird, says Eddie) which was caused by a rapper, Izzy Chainz, who is duct taped to a billboard promoting his new album (that's weird!). Buck makes his way onto the ladder to get him down while Hen and Chimney tend to the young woman and older man in the accident. As a crowd gathers, Buck tries to talk Izzy down, and makes sure to ask the

important questions, "Are you wearing anything underneath that?" He's not. Buck tells him he's going to regret that later as teams on the ground get the jump cushion into place. Athena tells Bobby that Izzy's story checks out, which makes everything legal. They can only control traffic until he comes down. Bobby fills her in on the morning panic over the jinx, telling her he doesn't believe it but the team does, which makes them "get squirrely"

Meanwhile, a firefighter dressed in gear from the 147 helps Ana Flores (Christopher's teacher), who has a severe burn from her coffee. The firefighter gives her ice for it. Moments later Eddie notices her and correctly tends to her burn (bandages and keeping it dry, not ice!) as she tells him about the firefighter. Ana also shares that she has a new job, vice principle at a different school (which removes any conflict of interest for that potential budding romance we saw last season). They part ways after he fixes up her hand. Over at the billboard, the tape starts to release and Izzy falls straight onto the jump cushion where all the tape falls off as he jumps around yelling to the crowd.

The crew arrive back at the station where they are just about to dig into Bobby's mac and cheese (we'd like that recipe please!) when the alarm sounds again. From here a hilarious montage of odd calls ensues as Queen's "Don't Stop Me Now" plays. They rescue a cat (and a man) from a tree, report to an accident, help a woman whose head is stuck in a mascot lion head (she proceeds to barf on poor Buck), an octopus stuck on a woman's head, and more. These are interspersed with the team back at the station desperately trying to eat the mac and cheese (or anything at all really), which is eventually completely burnt as it's left in the oven. Buck hilariously drinks coffee straight from the pot at one point.

At yet another call, Eddie tells Buck about his conversation with Ana earlier in the day. Inside the party store, a clown is trapped under several large tanks of helium, one of which is opened. Buck and Eddie try (and fail) not to laugh at Bobby, Hen, and Chimney, who all have very high pitched voices thanks to the helium (thank you to whichever writer came up with this). As they help move tanks, their laughter gets higher until they too sound like squeaky chipmunks. Fresh off a boring call, Eddie ridicules them again for believing in a curse as they all climb into the truck, when a live power pole falls onto the fire engine trapping them in their own truck. At the dispatch center, Josh finds out the team is stuck and gets a text from Chimney asking about breaking curses. Meanwhile Hen argues the semantics of a curse verses a jinx until another firehouse arrives. Of course, before they help, they stop to take pictures of the 118. Bobby isn't amused.

Back at the station later that night, Eddie finds Bobby in the kitchen and Hen, Chimney, and Buck reading ("Medical, babies, women," Hen clarifies for him) and Buck asks Eddie what Ana's love language is. Everyone's interest is immediately piqued and Eddie unwillingly (thanks, Buck) fills them in on Ana and her new job. Before he has to share more, he's saved by the call bell. They arrive on scene to a house fire in a man's garage, where Bobby attempts to take over the garden hose from the homeowner until everyone can get set up. The man is panicked over the fire, and Bobby asks him what's inside. Just as the man tells him it's old files, the garage erupts as fireworks (\$10k worth of fireworks, according to the homeowner) ignite. Eddie needs help with the hose and calls for a nearby firefighter wearing a 147 helmet to assist. It's Brian, the same one we saw treat Ana that morning. As Brian leaves, Eddie tells him about the wrong injury dressing that morning. Bobby shows up to help, and Eddie tells him the 147 firefighter already assisted but Bobby assures him that's impossible, that fire station was damaged thanks to the mudslide and no one is there.

Back at the station, Eddie and Bobby look at a photo of the 147, and Eddie confirms that the man helping him was not the Harmon in the picture. Bobby guesses he could be a criminal using it as a way to get into people's homes, but Eddie thinks the guy genuinely wanted to help. The conversation shifts to Bobby giving Eddie some sage advice explaining that he'll never get back the piece of himself that Shannon took with her, but he will begin to heal slowly. It's an emotional moment between the two, and Eddie thanks him for the advice.

An employee at Jim's Burgers answers the phone as a mother and son exit to eat outside. Just as they sit down, the same man throws a chair through a window and begins screaming for everyone to get out, prompting the mother to call 9-1-1. Athena and the 118 arrive on scene, where she asks Larry to explain everything. He tells her he received a call from the fire chief telling him the restaurant had a gas leak, and he needed to bust all the windows to save everyone. Athena isn't happy that he asked literally no other questions (can we blame him though?). Bobby

and Buck confirm there's no gas leak, and Bobby comments about yet another person pretending to be LAFD. At that moment he spots Brian (the fake firefighter) in the crowd and when Brian runs, Buck chases after him. Now, we'd normally expect Buck to catch up and tackle anyone on the run, but he's in full gear so we'll let it slide that Brian not only outruns him, but steals the 118 fire engine in a bid to evade the police. Hen and Chimney finally got their food, but at what cost?!

Athena jumps in her car and calls for backup as she follows the truck in the same chase that opened the episode. A five-alarm fire comes across the radio, and everyone piles into the ambulance, Buck hilariously having to lay on the gurney to make room. On their way to the call, Eddie talks to Brian over the radio, appealing to his desire to do good and help others in distress. Eddie tells him that they need his help again, and he can help save lives by taking the fire truck to the five-alarm fire. It takes some persuading, but Brian ultimately agrees. On scene, he jumps out and tries to make a run for it, but he doesn't get far. Brian is arrested as the 118 assist with the fire.

Back at the station Buck, Chimney, and Hen rejoice that the shift is over and things will go back to normal now. Bobby offers to take everyone out for breakfast, and they agree, all except Eddie who already has plans. At breakfast, Bobby fills everyone in on Brian. He found the 147 firefighting gear in the debris from the mudslide, cleaned it off and passed himself off as a firefighter by using a scanner to listen to their calls. He was even responsible for the fake LAFD fire chief call, having believed there was an actual gas leak. Just as they dig in to their breakfast, a nearby person drops to the ground and they jump into action (and so the jinx continues?). Meanwhile, Eddie meets Ana for breakfast, both clearly a little nervous but excited to be there. They settle in to order food and catch up.

At Hen and Karen's, there's a knock at the door and it's Hen's mother, Toni, completely surprising her daughter. Hen tells her mother they're in the middle of a pandemic, she can't just show up at people's houses. "You're not people. You're my family." Toni says she's settled in her new place, an Airbnb right in the neighborhood. until she can find something of her own. Hen asks how long she's staying and Toni says she's moving back. Denny shows Toni his room and Hen and Karen are still processing the news. It's great. Is it?

Athena drops Harry off at Michael's and Athena notices all of the windows that were not there before, getting a perfect view of the haunted Hotel Cecil. As Athena recalls, Michael was not on the best of terms with the Homeowner's Association. Harry tells Athena that Michael is HOA president now. "Well, if you can't beat 'em, join 'em." Now that he has more time, Michael felt like he would take a more active role. Athena sees the telescope, asking what it is. "Dad's other new hobby: spying on the neighbors." Athena takes a peak, saying it's an interesting view. Michael tells her who knew that people watching could be better than TV? He shows her multiple people he's been watching and their daily habits, making up names for the neighbors.

Athena tells Michael he is watching a lot but he says that Harry's got a handle on the home-schooling so he doesn't need him hovering over him as much. And David is back to doing his surgeries again. Athena wonders about Michael's work and he says it's at a standstill. Not a lot of calls for new shopping malls or office buildings, maybe never again. Michael says it's not just that, he made a list. When he found out about the tumor, people told him he should have a bucket list. Ended up being a short list, because the only thing he ever cared about was his kids and preparing them to be without him. But he got better and he's still better. When Michael got news that the tumor was shrinking, he created a new list. Of things he wanted to do, places that he wanted to see. Athena gets that he hasn't had a chance to do any of it. Instead, Michael just sits there and looks at the world from a distance.

Michael is doing more people watching that night, seeing "Slim" with more trash bags. May calls him wondering what he's up to. Michael tells her he's working around the house, doing laundry and making dinner soon. May asks him what he's making, suggesting she can come over. Michael gets the idea, wondering if her mother put her up to this. May says no, she had a free night and she thought it'd be nice to spend it with her dad. Michael notices Slim washing his hands, wondering if that's blood on them. He tells May he has to go, he'll talk to her later and he hangs up. May tells Athena she thinks he's on to them and Athena says they have to go to Plan B. Plan B isn't a what. It's a who.

Later, Bobby is at Michael's for dinner and Michael tells him to thank Athena for forcing him to bring dinner over. Bobby says she didn't force him, but she did think Michael needed someone to talk to. She mentioned his new hobby. Bobby starts to walk over to the telescope as Michael tells him it's really just a way to pass the time, considering how much he has of it lately. "But, you know, there is something weird going on across the street." Bobby is looking through the telescope, wondering if he means the guy with all the women young enough to be his daughters. There is so much foot traffic, Michael points out. Younger women, olden women, a few men, in and out all the time every day. He's seen some of them with bruises and a couple of them have bandages. Bobby's still watching, telling Michael he thinks the guy is giving them money. Personal injury attorney, underground boxing instructor? That still doesn't justify all the trash, Michael says. What about the trash?

Athena is over at Hen's for dinner and afterwards, Hen tells Athena her mother is spoiling the kids rotten and Athena says she's their grandmother. She thinks that's Toni's contractual obligation. Athena asks if it's really been that bad having her back in town. Honestly, Hen says it's been kind of nice. She goes to check on the coffee that Karen and Toni are preparing and Hen overhears them talking. Karen is telling Toni about Hen putting her hand inside a man's chest — Fast Hands Hen. Soon to be Dr. Fast Hands Hen. Guess Karen knows where she got that from. Toni asks if she's okay with medical school, they have a good, stable life there. "You don't worry that it might be a mistake?" Isn't Hen a little too old? Karen doesn't think so, and the program Hen is in is accelerated. Hen goes back to the living room, having heard enough. Athena tells her she looks like she just got run over "by a bulldozer."

As Michael and Bobby are still spying, David comes home, turning on the lights. Michael and Bobby tell him to turn them off and he does and the two get back to watching "Slim." David comes over to them, wondering what's happening. Bobby thinks Michael's onto something here. David tells him they talked about this and Michael says it's too much trash. "Everyone has too much trash." The guy lives alone, all manner of folks come in perfectly fine and Michael says they leave battered and bruised, so whatever's going on over there isn't innocent and it probably isn't legal. Bobby suggests all that trash is him dumping the evidence. Michael wishes there was a way to see what was inside of those bags. Jokingly, David says they could always look through the dumpster. Michael and Bobby think that is a great idea, pointing out where the dumpsters are. Bobby tells Michael to stay there, keep an eye on their shady friend. He tells David they are going to need surgical gloves.

With sneaky jazz music playing in the background, Bobby and David make their way to the dumpster across the street. The music, which sounds like it's from a buddy/cop comedy, paired with Bobby and David going through the dumpster and Michael just watching them gives a somewhat serious scene a comedic feel to it. Bobby and David start sifting through the trash as Michael keeps an eye on Slim, who leaves to take out more trash. Michael calls Bobby but Bobby lost his phone and then he tries to call David but he left it in the apartment. Bobby finds his phone, noticing Michael tried to call them and tells David they should call off the search. David

thinks they found what they were looking for. Used surgical supplies. Bobby calls Michael and Michael tells him they need to get out of there, he's coming downstairs with more trash. Bobby and David leave, carrying a trash bag, and Bobby tells Michael it looks like Slim is operating some sort of illegal surgical suite out of his apartment. Michael doesn't answer and when the two get back to the apartment, he's gone.

David looks through the telescope, finding Michael in Slim's apartment. Michael sees surgical scissors, blood, hearing some clattering behind a door. He opens it and finds a woman on a table, like she's prepped for surgery. She wakes up and tells Michael to please help. Michael calls 9-1-1, telling the Dispatcher there's a woman and she's hurt, bleeding pretty badly. He begins to tell her where they are but he gets knocked out.

Michael comes to and he's still in the room, though David is now by his side. Athena tells Michael that is nothing compared to what she's going to do to the three amateur detectives. Michael asks Athena if the woman is okay as David is checking him out. David wonders what woman and Michael says the woman that was on the table, she was right here. David tells him there wasn't any woman when he got there, nobody at all, just Michael, unconscious. There was a woman there and she was not okay, Michael says. She looked dead and she asked for his help. Athena tells him they're checking all the cameras out on the street. Michael describes her and Athena tells him to give her a minute.

At the apartment, Bobby tells Michael there's no word from Athena, she keeps checking the cameras but it's just their fake doctor leaving the building with a bag. Athena said it was a pretty small bag, however, Michael remembers there was no bag. The woman; he saw her clothes and her shoes, but there wasn't any bag. She didn't have anything, not a wallet or a phone, just a keychain. But no one saw her leave the building. "Because she lives in the building." Bobby calls Athena and soon, multiple units are checking the building, knocking on every door. She knocks on a door, but there's no answer and she realizes this is it. They knock it down, and Athena spots the woman sprawled out on her couch, bloody. David checks her out and she's soon taken away in an ambulance. Athena calls Michael, telling him they got her.

Hen is angrily putting dishes away and Karen tells her that whatever she's mad about, she's pretty sure it's not the mugs' fault. "My mother." Karen tells her they should talk about her and Hen says that woman turns the world upside down wherever she goes. "And we just have to hold our collective breath and wait for the storm to pass." Hopefully it heads back to Nevada soon. Karen asks if she's talked to her about why she's here, Karen thinks it's something she isn't telling them. Hen tells Karen her mother's not somebody that holds back, bringing up the fact that Toni asked Karen if she thought Hen was too old to be going to medical school. Hen's not sure what's worse. "That she doesn't believe in me or that she thinks she has the right to judge." Karen tells Hen that Toni is just worried she's taking on too much responsibility. "From the woman who doesn't even know the meaning of the word?" Karen just thinks with her dad gone, she just probably felt like she had a lot to make up for. That's what Hen thought this was. Her moving back, these past few days, Hen really felt like they were fixing what was broken between them. And now, it just feels like another scar.

The next morning, Hen gets a missed call from Karen but she walks through the front door with Denny and Nia. Karen asks if she's talked to her mom and Hen tells her not since the other night. Nia mentions they saw her by the park and Denny says they wanted to say hi but she was sleeping. Denny and Nia leave to wash up and Hen asks Karen where her mother was sleeping. Hen finds her mother sleeping in her car and she gets in. She and Toni talk about everything, and soon, Toni comes home, officially moving in. "Our neighbors help us define and redefine our concept of family."

Summary: The 118 are called to the tarmac when a flight attendant reaches her limit with her flight's passengers. Athena discovers that quarantine has pushed a couple to their breaking point. Buck reconnects with an old flame.



The episode opens at an airport, where a plane full of passengers is impatiently waiting for their turn to disembark. One thing soon leads to another and — already paying homage to the episode's title — the lone flight attendant left to keep the people on the plane busy truly reaches her breaking point. She exits the plane via the evacuation slide with a bottle of champagne, and one of the airport workers rushes over to slow down her drunk and graceless tumble. In what's certainly one of the more gag-worthy accidents, the 118 is called to help dislodge the cork from the bottle from the worker's throat.

Oh yeah, and this is the same guy they pulled out of the jet engine in season 3, episode 10.

Later, Eddie and Ana are in the middle of a riveting date ... in which she's teaching him math for Christopher. He eventually has to bail, because he promised Christopher he would be home in time to tuck him into bed. Eddie arrives at home to relieve Buck from his babysitting duties, and we learn that Buck may not have the best track record with bedtime stories. (A kid in a

rotisserie? Think of it as a cautionary tale.) When Eddie goes to say goodnight to Christopher, his son immediately tries to figure out who exactly his dad had dinner with, but Eddie's lips remain sealed for the time being. Buck heads back to his apartment afterward, and he's perplexed to find a bra hanging out of a laundry basket in the living room. An awkward moment ensues as Buck discovers that Albert and Veronica have been "Netflix-and-chilling."

Maddie and Chimney are video chatting with their doctor, and a wrench is thrown into their birth plans. The ER has been overwhelmed, which means that there's no guarantee that she will be the doctor that's there to deliver the baby when the day finally comes. The idea of delivering their baby ... in a mask, with a doctor she's never met, without Chimney in the building ... is pushing Maddie over the edge. Her solution? A home birth.

Taylor Kelly has returned, and she's reporting on a crazed gunman that has found himself trapped on a rooftop (much to the homeowner's chagrin). As the negotiation tactics are further drug out over a period of 6 more hours (anyone feeling some nostalgia for the Spongebob time-cards?), Buck commiserates about his tragic love life with Taylor, Chimney shares his home birth worries with Hen, Eddie discusses his dating woes with Bobby and Athena, and the 118 make bets how this rooftop debacle will ultimately play out. And props to Taylor, because when Buck explains that after therapy and working on his issues with his parents, his next step is meeting someone and starting a meaningful relationship, she smiles as she reminds him that his life is nothing but meaningful relationships thanks to the people he works with. The fed up homeowner finally climbs up on the roof himself and shoves the gunman to the ground. Back at Buck's apartment, Albert apologizes for the awkwardness with Veronica and invites him to come for dinner on Thursday night. Buck then proceeds to invite Taylor.

Athena comes to the dispatch center to have lunch with May, and they're both concerned to find how irritable Maddie appears to be with the 9-1-1 caller she's speaking to. Athena sits down with her and the two have a heart-to-heart as Maddie explains her concerns about the upcoming birth situation, and Athena shares her own experiences with her pregnancies.

At the Wilson household, chopping carrots while talking on the phone almost results in disaster for Karen. Thankfully, her finger remains intact, and she has Hen (and the adorable little doctor in training Nia) on-site to patch her up afterward. Karen then tells Hen that the conversation she had been in the middle of was with the social worker; she wants to come see them because Nia has been in their care for almost a year, and it's time to discuss permanent placement.

Athena responds to a noise complaint, in which a house's alarm system has been going off repeatedly, and she eventually comes to find that the woman attempted to kill her husband and trapped him inside of a wall. It's definitely a shame that their divorce didn't get finalized pre-COVID.

Eddie decides to finally broach the topic of conversation that Christopher has been bugging him about, and he tells his son that he has a girlfriend. Christopher doesn't take this well; he throws a salad bowl to the floor and storms off to his room. Meanwhile, dinner at Veronica's crashes and burns almost immediately after Taylor's arrival. Buck didn't quite tell Taylor that his invite was for a double date. After a failed attempt at small talk, Taylor excuses herself. Buck runs out after her, and Taylor is upset as she lets Buck have it, calling him out on the way he handled the situation.

Eddie video chats with Ana to fill her in on the disaster with Christopher. She's understanding, offering that they can take a break if needed, but Eddie's not quite ready to throw in the towel yet. He goes to check on Christopher and is panicked to discover that he's missing. His phone begins to ring from under the covers of his son's bed — it's Buck. He frantically tells Buck that he needs help, but his best friend cuts him off as he tells him that Christopher used his phone to call an Uber to bring him to his apartment.

Over the years, we've watched a wonderful relationship develop between Buck and Christopher, and this next scene is a beautiful culmination of the trust that's been built between them (not to mention that it speaks volumes that Christopher would go to Buck in the first place in this situation). Christopher opens up to Buck as he talks about the fact that his father has a girlfriend now and explains that it's not only the loss of his mother that hurts, but the fact that he feels like he's lost almost everyone that's important in his life now due to the restrictions of the pandemic. He doesn't want to lose anyone else. Buck reassures Christopher that he'll see his grandma, his friends, and Carla again, but until then ... he's still got him, because he's not going

anywhere.

Chimney is uncomfortable to find Maddie's intense home birth set up waiting for him in the dining room in the morning, and he finally tells her that he can't do it. The amount of time to the nearest hospital — 13 minutes — is too much of a risk if something goes wrong. Seeing how distressed Chimney is, Maddie agrees to a hospital birth.

Taylor is reporting from the scene at a hospital that will need to ration care because it has reached full capacity due to COVID-19, and she almost begins to cry on camera as she's overcome with emotion. She then learns that the hospital freezer broke, and they have 600 doses of the vaccine that have been thawed and must be distributed within two hours. She makes a quick phone call to Buck, and the 118 (and Athena) rush onto the scene. They get to work delivering the doses, and they even assist in setting up and running vaccination stations (and Michael gets his vaccine!) Despite the overwhelming feeling of being helpless while surrounded by so much tragedy, Taylor is relieved that they were able to pull off a miracle.

Ana arrives at the Diaz household, and Christopher is all smiles as he gives her a hug. Meanwhile, Maddie and Chimney are in good spirits as they prepare her hospital bag. Albert returns to the apartment and informs Buck that he broke up with Veronica.

In the final moments of the episode, Hen comes home to find Karen sitting with the social worker. The mood in the room is tense, and Diedra informs Hen that Nia's birth mother wants to pursue reunification. They have to give Nia back.

Summary: Athena and the 118 race to save lives after a drunk driver causes a deadly pile-up on the freeway. Maddie goes into labor. Hen and Karen are devastated as they prepare for Nia to be reunited with her birth mother.



The episode opens with Maddie jolting Chimney awake with possible contraction pains. After a moment she decides it's nothing, and goes back to sleep. Thus begins a montage of 42 week pregnant Maddie doing everything in her power to bring on her labor while Chimney watches in horror at her tactics. She chugs a quart of hot and sour soup, tries exercise, eats pineapple and drinks raspberry tea, but nothing is working. Maddie is still very pregnant the next day as Albert drives them to the hospital at the posted speed limit much to Chimney's dismay. However, she's only experiencing Braxton Hicks contractions and is sent home.

Meanwhile, Karen and Hen take Nia to her scheduled meetings with her birth mother. Nia cries as she's carried away from them and Hen is very upset. Hen tells the social worker, Deidra, that they want to meet the birth mother but Deidra says that's not allowed. Hen is concerned about whether the woman is capable of caring for Nia and wants to fight to keep her. Deidra tells them it's normal to feel this way but the reunification is the purpose of foster care and they will continue to check on Nia after she returns to her mother's care. Hen is upset that Karen seems calm about losing Nia.

May arrives to the dispatch center just as she receives a Facebook friend request from Laila Creedy, the very bully who caused her suicide attempt. She's so distracted she slams into Josh who asks if he should respond on her behalf but she says she's going to ignore it. In the break room, Linda and Maddie visit about her pregnancy and their night shift. Maddie shares that they

don't have a name yet and Linda regales her with the tale of her brother's birth. Their parents didn't have a name for him yet either, and their mother was so overcome with emotion in the delivery room that she named him after the doctor, Norman. His name is Norman Bates. Maddie texts Chimney in a panic saying they need to have a name ASAP. At the station, Chimney asks Buck and Eddie if they have any name suggestions. Eddie says they should wait to meet her, that's how they knew Christopher's name. Maddie isn't happy with that idea. Chimney restocks the ambulance as he talks to Bobby, yelling for Hen to come help even though they just did this.

Maddie takes a call from a terrified child, Jacob, who says his mother isn't responding. They are driving and she seems lost but won't answer his questions. Maddie has him put her on speaker but the mother only mumbles and looks confused as she continues to drive with Jacob in the backseat growing increasingly scared. The woman slams into cars next to her, managing to correct enough to enter the freeway. But she's going the wrong direction and Maddie calls for officers to respond. Calls begin to flood in reporting the vehicle going the wrong direction. Cars swerve out of the way, but she slams head on into an airport shuttle bus. Vehicle after vehicle crash into each other with explosions, causing a huge pile up. Jacob and his mom are both unconscious as Maddie continues talking to him.

The 118 respond to the scene where dozens of vehicles are involved, many on fire. Athena also reports to the scene, where she finds Bobby directing the crew to be wary of vehicles until airbags have been deactivated. There are three casualties so far and a dozen injuries. They approach the original vehicle where Buck and Eddie are doing scans and trying to get inside. They have heat signatures so believe there's at least one person inside. Athena tells them about Jacob and they jump into rescue mode, breaking out the heavy equipment to get to him. Jacob is unconscious but alive. The mother comes to as Hen tends to her and is confused by what happened. Athena finds a nearly empty bottle of alcohol in the floor board, answering everyone's question as to how this happened. She was driving drunk. Athena snaps, "How many people have to die tonight because she was drunk and stupid?" The comment seems to hit Bobby hard. Chimney gets Jacob out of the car and onto a gurney for transport. Bobby check in with everyone as the teams continue to pull victims from vehicles. He finds Renfrow talking to a victim in a car but as Bobby approaches the airbag explodes, severely burning Renfrow and the driver. Bobby and Buck manage to pull the man out.

In dispatch, Maddie takes a call from a diabetic person stuck in the traffic caused by the pile up but she can barely making it through a sentence because of her contractions. Sue notices that she's in labor and sends Maddie to the hospital even though she wants to finish her shift.

On the scene, Athena confirms what hospital the drunk driver will be taken to, she'll be placed in police custody. Sue announces on the radio to the 118 that Maddie is in labor and headed to the hospital. Everyone congratulates Chimney and Bobby tells him to go meet his daughter. Athena offers him a ride, she's headed to the same hospital anyway. At the hospital, Chimney heads upstairs as Athena offers him some advice, "If she tells you to shut up, shut up." As Athena begins to leave, she overhears a man yelling at a nurse. His wife's room is listed as secure and he's unable to see her. Athena steps in and informs him that she's in custody because she was the cause of the pile up. The man is shaken and says his wife swore she wouldn't drink and drive with Jacob in the car. Outside, he calls the children's hospital to confirm his son is still in surgery. He tells Athena that he believed she would stop drinking once Jacob was born. Finding out that Jacob made the 9-1-1 call is the final straw for him, and he breaks down.

Meanwhile, Chimney arrives just as Maddie is ready to push. Maddie asks for her breathing beads and Chimney tries to call Albert who has the baby bag but he doesn't answer.

In dispatch, May takes a call from a victim still trapped in his car after the pile up. May tells him the teams are on scene and he should see them but he says he can't. That's when it's revealed that the victim is Albert. He's bloody and trapped in his car upside down.

In a flashback one minute before the crash, Albert drives along as he sees the oncoming car. He calls 9-1-1, swerving to avoid it and gets hit, rolling his vehicle several times. The call goes dead only a few seconds after it connects.

Sue informs the 118 that there is still someone trapped, but Bobby says they've cleared the scene. May calls him back, and realizes it's Albert Han. She tells Bobby she thinks it's Chimney's brother, and Buck asks her what his voicemail message said, confirming that it is Albert. We flash from the team's search to Maddie and Chimney in the hospital who is about to deliver the baby. As she pushes, Bobby realizes calls began before the accident and they figure out Albert

is three exits back. Maddie pushes as everyone jumps into the firetruck and they race to the exit. Maddie pushes again as they find Albert unconscious in his car. In the ambulance, Albert is hemorrhaging and Hen begins compressions when his heart stops. Maddie gives a final push and the baby is born, but Albert still isn't responding. Just as it seems like he won't make it, his pulse comes back. Maddie and Chimney are handed their new baby girl. "She's perfect," Maddie says.

The next morning, Josh announces to the dispatch floor that the baby is 6 pounds, 1 ounce and they all applaud. Linda, Josh, and Jamal plan to go for drinks and invite May along but she's still underage. She also has the notification about Laila again. Sue tells her that Albert arrived alive and is now stable. Relieved, May heads home. Buck arrives at the hospital with their baby bag. Chimney asks about Albert and Buck looks heartbroken as he realizes he has to tell him about the crash.

Hen arrives home to find Karen has packed Nia's suitcase for her overnight stay with her birth mother and is cooking pancakes. That's the final straw for Hen who had a terrible night and she and Karen argue about Karen's apparent lack of fight for Nia. Karen informs her she wants to keep Nia but this is their job as foster parents and she's choosing to hold on as long as she can. She asks Hen not to make her hold on alone and Hen seems to relent.

Chimney sits by Albert's bedside and tells him about the baby's birth and that he's a dad now. He jokes that they'll name her Albertina or Alberta, thinking he'd get Albert to wake up. When he doesn't, he begs Albert to wake up.

Just as Chimney bows his head after asking Albert to open his eyes, he does. Albert mumbles that it hurts and Chimney smiles and says they have plenty of time. He can rest easy, Albert is awake.

Home from their shifts, Bobby tells Athena that Albert is going to be ok and asks about Jacob. The surgery was a success and he's going to live, Athena says the mother was lucky too and the father had no idea the mother was drinking again. Bobby is clearly upset, Athena apologizes for her comment at the crash site and he tells her she wasn't wrong. He says he's exactly like that woman, then heads out to an AA meeting. At the front of the room, he shares that he thought he could balance life between being an alcoholic and living his life. But he knows life will always try to pull you down and being at the bottom isn't the end. You can find the clarity to pull yourself back up. As he says this, we see Jacob wake up and his mother handcuffed to her hospital bed. Eddie gives Christopher a hug in their kitchen while Hen and Karen hug Nia before she leaves for her stay with her birth mother.

Maddie and the baby video chat with Buck from their living room as Buck wishes he could meet her now. They have to wait a few weeks but they can meet soon. As Chimney sits down, Maddie says goodbye to Buck. Chimney marvels at the fact they are allowed to leave without filling out the birth certificate with a name. That's when Maddie confesses that she actually did name her at the hospital, her name is Jee-Yun Buckley Han, after Chimney's mother. Maddie spoke with his stepmother who kept wishing his mother could see the baby, and Maddie just knew that was her name. Chimney loves it.

Summary: The 118 responds to a series of calls dealing with parents and their children. Chimney and Maddie adjust to life with their newborn. Hen and Karen are emotionally shattered as Nia is reunited with her birth mother.



It's morning and Nia is getting ready to be with her birth mother. Denny gives her a blanket, telling her he didn't like it when she took it off his bed, but he wanted her to have it so she remembers him. Denny proceeds to give Nia her stuffed unicorn as he knows he's her favorite. Nia asks Denny if he can play later with her but Denny doesn't think he can, which makes Nia sad. The social worker reminds Nia she's going home to her mommy and Nia wonders if Denny's coming with her. Not this time. Nia hugs Hen and Karen as they cry. Hen asks Nia what her unicorn's name is and Nia says Denny. "For... for big brother." He'll look after her just like

a big brother. Still sobbing, Hen tells Nia to always remember that they love her. Nia tells Mama Hen she loves her too and gives her a kiss on the cheek. Nia walks out with the social worker, telling Hen and Karen she'll see them later. Hen begins to tell her otherwise but Karen interrupts her and tells Nia they will see her later.

New mother Maddie is telling new father Chimney that he's going to be late if he keeps watching her. Not wanting to leave baby Jee-Yun, who is laying in her crib, Chimney asks Maddie if she's sure she's going to be okay on her own. Maddie assures him they'll be fine. As if on cue, however, Albert's falls down in a nearby room. Chimney checks on his brother, who is on the ground. He was trying to get something off the shelf and he lost his balance. Chimney wonders why he didn't ask for him or Maddie. Albert mentions they already have a baby to take care of. "You don't need two." What they don't need is Albert hurting himself because he's too stubborn to ask for help. He should be better. Albert points out the accident was weeks ago. The doctor said there would be lingering issues, Chimney reminds him. Balance being one of them. "You just got to be patient. And quit trying to do stuff on your own. Let us help."

The next day, Chimney finally gets home after a long shift and immediately plops onto the air mattress. Maddie comes into the living room with a crying Jee-Yun and Maddie is frantic. Jee's been fussy all morning and she cries every time she's put down. Maddie gives Jee to Chimney and leaves for her first day back at the Call Center. Soon after, Chimney is struggling to take care of both Albert and Jee-Yun. Running back and forth. There's a knock at the door and it's Mrs. Lee. She comes bearing soup. Mrs. Lee goes over to a crying Jee and realizes she's hungry. Chimney was just making her a bottle and Albert's lunch, though he might need to make her another one. Mrs. Lee offers to feed the baby while he and Albert eat. She just wanted to see if the two of them needed any help. That's sweet of her, Chimney says, but he thinks they've got it under control. Mrs. Lee looks at the schedule on the fridge, mentioning they are busy. They are but Chimney and Maddie are making it work. They don't want to lose a second with Jee-Yun by leaving her with strangers. Chimney realizes what he just said and Mrs. Lee says she wouldn't want to overstep. Chimney takes Jee-Yun back and he tells Mrs. Lee that's not what he meant. Mrs. Lee and Albert leave as Jee-Yun is crying in Chimney's arms.

May gets ready to stay with Michael and she asks Harry to pass her phone to her. Harry, though, checks her phone, rather than passing it and notices that Laila liked one of her Instagram posts. That mean girl that May went to high school with. Athena wonders why she's talking to her and May admits Laila reached out to her a couple of weeks ago. Out of the blue saying she wanted to apologize for what happened. "And you told her, 'Got to hell.'" May confesses she met her for coffee and heard her out. That's it. Athena mentions Laila trashed her reputation on social media, said terrible lies about her and that's it? No big deal? May feels like she at least owed it to her to listen. "You don't owe her a damn thing." May brings up that Athena did arrest her, or did she forget that part? Athena didn't forget a single thing about that... incident. She can't believe May didn't tell her about this. May never knows how she's going to react these days. She tells her mother she's always worried about her — she doesn't like her job, and apparently, now she doesn't like her friends. Athena asks May what she's doing, letting this girl get back in her head again. May says Laila's changed, she's changed. So she's giving her a second chance. What's wrong with that? "Because the last time you were friends with that girl you tried to kill yourself!" May just walks away after that.

Later that day, Athena gets flashbacks to when she found May and riding with her to the hospital. She keeps trying to get a hold of her but it keeps going to May's voicemail. Bobby comes out, telling Athena it sounds like things got pretty heated. "That girl hurt my child. All bets are off." Laila's lucky all Athena did was arrest her. She's sorry if she can't just forgive and forget. Bobby says they were kids, they barely knew what they were doing. Oh, she knew what she was doing, Athena tells him. She doesn't get it. Why would May want to have anything to do with her after what she put her through? Bobby doesn't know, but he does know that Athena sometimes doesn't agree with May's decisions. She didn't want her to take a job at the Call Center, she wanted her to go to college. Athena didn't want May to take that job because it's emotionally taxing. May's been keeping up with her counselor sessions, it seems like she's handling it. Bobby says she's practically an adult now. Athena doesn't have to like her choices, but they are her choices. If she says she's fine talking with Laila, maybe Athena will just have to trust that she is. "That's the mistake I made last time."

Athena trusted May was fine and she almost lost her. She was right there living under her roof and she didn't know what was going on. Athena was so wrapped up with her and Michael and the divorce that she didn't even realize what was going on with her own daughter. Bobby says she was a teenager at the time and it's their whole M.O. in life not to let their parents know what's going on. When it happened, Athena assumed it was because of she and Michael splitting

up, "but it was about something I had absolutely no clue about." Bobby tells Athena she has to forgive herself. Does she know how many suicide calls he's been on where nobody had any idea? She can't take on that kind of blame. "I'm her mother. I should have known something was wrong. But I missed it." Athena's scared May hates her right now. But she's more scared she's going to miss it again.

Karen's pacing back and forth and she tells Hen she thinks she did a bad thing. Ultimately good, but still bad. She found Nia's birth mother. The two of them are at a nursing home and Karen tells Hen her name is Evangeline Gonzalez and she works there as a nurse's aide. Hen wonders how she found her, and isn't that completely against the rules? Karen may have hired a private investigator. She had to know. The not knowing was killing her, was killing Hen. She had to know if Nia was going to be okay. Evangeline is a single mom struggling to make ends meet. She got evicted and ended up living in her car with Nia. People saw her and they called child services, who placed her with them, temporarily, while she got her life back together. That was January and then the pandemic hit. She's been at the facility since June, the residents love her. And there's a day care down the street. She goes over on her lunch hour to eat with Nia every day. "Nia's gonna be okay." Karen tells Hen they did the right thing and Hen notices Karen wants to do this again. She loves Nia and she will always miss having her in their lives. But knowing that she's with a mother who loves her, that they helped to give them a second chance, she's so proud of them for that. "It's gonna hurt like hell every time we do this." And they're going to love them like their own and then have to let them go. But Hen guesses they can take it.

May tells Michael she's just tired of always fighting with her mother. She doesn't think she can handle anything. But Athena knows May has a good head on her shoulders, Michael says. She's just being protective and he can't say he blames her. May tells Michael he didn't act like a lunatic when she told him Laila reached out. And he wasn't the one that found her, either. What difference does that make? Michael admits that when Harry called him that day, he said that she was sick, that she and her mother were going to the hospital. By the time he got there, he found out what really happened. "It was all so... just confusing and scary." But May was alive. She wasn't when Athena found her. She wasn't breathing. "She thought you were dead. And she blamed herself for it." They were her pills, pills that Michael told her to throw out. They both said a lot of things because they were scared. Then they got passed it. Michael says they realized what was the most important thing, and that was just being there for her. Not all this blame and guilt. It was pointless. He knows May thinks that her mom is made of steel. She's not. "And I'll never know what she went through when she found you," and Michael's kind of grateful he never will.

At the Call Center, May goes through the LAPD archive and finds the call from that night. It's Athena telling the dispatcher that her daughter's overdosed and she thinks she's dead. Soon, her heart's beating and Athena tells them to hurry. Athena has to do rescue breaths by mouth until paramedics arrive. Athena apologizes to May for not being there before but she's there now. "Please, don't leave me." Later once home, May apologizes to Athena for not realizing what she went through and thanks her mother for everything.

Mrs. Lee ends up taking Albert in, telling Chimney he can stay with them as long as he likes to give the two of them their space. Life can be pretty boring when you're both retired. Jee-Yun starts crying and Mrs. Lee tells Chimney they're available any time he and Maddie need a night off. Mrs. Lee takes Jee while Chimney has to go pack and he tells his daughter Grandma's going to hold her. The statement shocks Mrs. Lee, but Chimney says his mother would be so grateful to her. That she took in her kid after she was gone and loved him. "You finished the job she started." Chimney's not sure he ever said thank you for that. "We're family. Nothing to thank me for."

Summary:	The 118 rush to the site of a hit-and-run that leaves a familiar face in critical condition. Athena investigates the case of a missing woman last seen in a casino. Josh recalls an emergency that led him to become a 9-1-1 operator.



The episode opens with what appears to be a sweet moment — Sue's husband goes out of his way to buy flowers for her at the supermarket — but it quickly turns to disaster when she's hit by a car (and the driver flees without a second thought). The 118 respond to the call and they recognize Sue as Maddie's boss as they assess her current state; she's alive but she has a severe head injury, amongst other things.

At the Nash-Grant household, May drops some big news on Athena and Michael: she wants to move out. And Athena is shockingly okay with it. Meanwhile, at the call center, Josh, Maddie, and Buck speculate if there's more of a story behind Sue's hit-and-run. Josh then mentions how important Sue is to the cell center and that he owes her his life. We flashback to 2006. Josh, who's working as a freelance stenographer at the time, shows up at an office building for his latest gig. He works late into the evening and at one point the fire alarm begins going off, so he calls 9-1-1 — it's Sue on the other end of the line.

Buck and Taylor Kelly are out for lunch, and Buck shares his concerns about the mystery around Sue's hit-and-run in hopes that Taylor will help spin a news story out of it. At the call center, Josh updates the staff on Sue's status, and it's clear that the situation is really affecting him.

Athena responds to a 9-1-1 call, which leads her to begin looking into a curious case about a missing girl. Back at the cell center, the staff tune in to Taylor's news report, which she's running with the headline "Local hero struck down" in order to garner public interest. Josh and Sue's husband Don panic at the hospital as she's rushed to emergency surgery. Back to 2006, Sue stays on the line with Josh as he attempts to escape the smoke and flames of the burning office building with an injured woman on his back. The LAFD eventually arrives (Chimney included!) and rescues them both.

Athena shares her frustrations with Hen about the missing girl case, floored that the officer assigned to the case decided to utilize a "wait and see" approach. Hen, like Bobby and Michael, is equally surprised to learn that Athena didn't push back when May asked to move out. Later, Athena and her fellow officer begin their own investigation into finding out what happened to Tracie, starting off by questioning her employer. Ever observant, Athena manages to pull some new details out of Tracie's co-worker: she went to the casino to play poker the night she went missing. After reviewing the security footage, they find that a man at the table slipped something into Tracie's drink, and then they left together. As they observe the car that the two left the parking garage in, Athena suddenly realizes that it matches the description of the car that hit Sue.

Elsewhere, Taylor and Buck meet up at the scene of the hit-and-run, and she shows him the security camera footage that she obtained of Sue getting hit. They attempt to figure out why Sue was running toward the car before it hit her. Just before they can go check the dumpsters nearby, Athena shows up on the scene and squashes their dreams of becoming amateur detectives. They find Tracie's purse and ID in the dumpster. Later, Buck thinks back to the words Sue was trying to say after the accident, and they manage to figure out the license plate number of the car that hit her.

Taylor puts out another news report with the latest update on the now interlinked stories of Sue's hit-and-run and Tracie's kidnapping, which includes the identity of the man who committed both crimes. Reports of sightings of the car flood in at the call center. They eventually trace it to a container yard, where they find Tracie drugged inside of a shipping container. At the call center, Josh is on the line as they search for the kidnapper (Patrick), and he expertly helps the police set up a perimeter around the container yard's maze. He warns the 118 to hide inside of the container just as Patrick circles back and begins shooting at them, and then the police are eventually able to catch their suspect.

Back in 2006, Josh arrives at the call center to thank Sue for saving his life, immediately enveloping her in a hug. We finally learn how Josh came to be in his current occupation, as Sue explains some of the finer details of the job to him. At the hospital in the current day, Sue is awake and alert, and Josh is relieved as he returns to visit her. We then see exactly what happened the night of the accident: Sue was sitting in her car on the phone with Josh when she noticed Tracie (looking far from okay) inside of Patrick's car as he got out to throw her things in the dumpster. Tracie's mom arrives at the hospital to see her daughter.

After doing some thinking, Athena sits back down with May to discuss her plans to move out. She provides her with a list of acceptable neighborhoods, what to avoid, and a list of conditions. The episode ties up with Taylor showing up at Buck's apartment to celebrate, and Sue returning to work to enthusiastic support from both her staff and a host of first responders over the radio.

Summary: When a famous mystery writer dies, Athena, Bobby and the 118 respond to the chaos caused by a city-wide manhunt for buried treasure the author left behind.



The episode opens with a father/daughter duo on a nature hike, the girl pointing out various trees as the father trails behind. He catches up to the girl who has found a message in a bottle. Upon opening, it reads "Help, I'm trapped on a cliff! Call 9-1-1." Of course they do, and Maddie dispatches air fire rescue and the 118 to locate the stuck person. Chimney and Eddie go up in the helicopter with air rescue, and Eddie is lowered down on a rope to assess the man's injuries. He tends to the man's broken ankle while the hiker tells Eddie he's been on the cliffside for

five days and hopes he can stay despite the ankle. He even asks if there are willow trees nearby. Assuming the man is delirious, Eddie gets him harnessed, and they are lifted back to the waiting ambulance. The hiker continues to rant about being close to finding a buried treasure and yells about no one else taking it. Back at the firehouse, the team watch the local news where Taylor reports on the recent death of Hollis Harcourt, a famous author who buried \$5 million dollars worth of treasure and left behind clues on where to find it for his fans.

Together, the team read the (bad) poem and Buck begins to say it would be exciting, but everyone agrees to go hunting for it would be dangerous and stupid. Bobby points out that the

attention the poem is getting will likely mean more odd rescues. The team disperses as Taylor calls Buck and divulges that Harcourt's assistant confirmed the treasure is real. This prompts Buck to propose they partner up to find it, for the good of the city of course.

Meanwhile at the station, Athena finds several detectives watching the news report and points out they should post officers at Harcourt's grave as people are likely to try digging there first. She also believes that a treasure is going to send the city into a frenzy, and she's proven right as "One Way Or Another" plays over a montage of various treasure hunters ending up in sometimes dangerous, sometimes hilarious situations. Athena reports to a scene where hunters are fighting with metal detectors, and the 118 finds a treasure hunter trapped under a bear statue at Griffith Park. At the dispatch office, they cross off Griffith Park on a marker board. Dispatchers have started taking bets on where it could be, and Jamal is now out \$20. As Taylor reports from outside the hospital on six hospitalizations, a pregnant woman runs on camera declaring it's all a hoax. Her husband was almost killed, and people need to stop. The 118 arrive to find a man trying to dig right on a gas line, and they narrowly find cover before the huge explosion.

Eddie and Buck clean the firetruck together when Eddie points out all their cases are individuals. Buck says people are greedy, and Eddie thinks two are better than one and asks if Buck wants to treasure hunt with him. Of course Buck has to divulge that he's already agreed to hunt with Taylor, which leads them to a meeting at Buck's where Taylor says Buck has to give Eddie half of his cut, because she won't split it three ways. She already promised half of her cut to her cameraman. Agreeing to the four way split, they pour over a map with pins of possible locations. They need to narrow it down. At the firehouse, Eddie and Buck make small talk with the new probie, Ravi, to get additional locations out of him and narrow down their search. Hen and Chimney see the alliance and form one of their own to out hunt Buck and Eddie.

Josh crosses off the Observatory from the dispatch board when a call comes in to rule out that option. Linda had her bet on it because of Harcourt's fifth book, *Stabbed Beneath the Stars*. The 118 respond to another odd call where a man is being attacked by a colony of ants. They use the water hose to spray them off and treat his reaction to the bites. In the ambulance, Hen and Chimney interrogate the guy to find out why he chose to dig there.

Athena arrives home to find Bobby "making breakfast." As she rounds the corner commenting she's tired of the treasure hunting fools, he's coming back inside. She finds a huge whiteboard of clues; Bobby has treasure fever too. Bobby gives Athena the full presentation of his ideas, and she asks why he's suddenly into this. He says he wanted to get trust funds for the kids and maybe buy a new house but promises he won't do anything reckless to find it. He thought they might like to retire, but that's not in Athena's plans. She won't retire until she's forced, she tells Bobby.

A girl, Keisha, checks herself and her boyfriend, Richie, into River's Edge Cabins, another clue. She tells the worker she thinks this might be the weekend (i.e., a proposal is on the way). He congratulates her, and the couple head out to dig without the man knowing. While Richie digs, Keisha talks about them calling "the schemes" quits if they find the money. He pays her no mind, but then the owner starts to yell at them to quit digging up the ground. Richie hands her the shovel and tells her to keep going, but as he walks away the ground gives in and Keisha falls into the hole. The 118 arrive to discover she's fallen into the septic tank, and she's in danger from the gases. Buck repels in to save her and has to be dropped in quickly when she falls and almost drowns in the sewage. In the ambulance, Keisha tells Richie she's ready to marry him, she doesn't need the money or the adventures. He informs her she has been his adventure, he's already married. She kicks him out of the ambulance.

Athena arrives at Harcourt's (the dead author) home. The alarm has reported a break-in, and Harcourt's assistant, Jeremiah, is also on the scene but says he didn't go in. Inside Athena slowly clears the home until she finds the one and only Hollis Harcourt very much alive in his own home. Jeremiah storms in and is furious that Harcourt faked his death and also left him out of the will. He storms out. Athena threatens to arrest Harcourt, but he points out he didn't do anything illegal. He merely told his publicist to release a statement. This has all been an elaborate plan to help him buy some time until his next book deadline and to help him find inspiration for the story that's causing serious writer's block, *Gutted in Glendale*. He asks her not to tell anyone he's alive, but she says if she happens to run into some curious reporters, she's going to tell the truth.

At the station, the crew discuss the new revelation that it was all a ruse. "Every emergency on

the news was another chapter for his book," says Bobby. He believes Harcourt never buried any treasure, he just said so to get his research.

Taylor and Buck commiserate over getting duped with a drink. Buck points out that it was like a big adventure for them, and Taylor says they were so close. Buck agrees but he's not talking about the treasure. Taylor calls Harcourt lazy but says that's unfair, he did jog. Meanwhile Bobby is taking down his treasure hunt board as Athena reads the poem. As she's reading it, a look crosses her face, and she tells Bobby she knows where the treasure is.

Bobby and Athena go to Glendale Narrows where Athena believes the treasure is. As she explains the various clues, Hen and Chimney show up with med kits, and Buck and Eddie also appear. They each figure it out in their own way: Athena because of the upcoming novel title, Buck because of Taylor's comment about Harcourt jogging, and Hen? Karen wrote an algorithm. They agree to split the treasure between them and deduce it must be on one of the islands. As they look over the bridge at the islands, they spot none other than the probie, Ravi, already digging it up. He hauls it up, opens the truck, and reveals nothing. It's already gone. Angry, the whole team drives to Harcourt's house only to discover the gates open and front door ajar. Athena goes in alone, being the only one with a badge and gun, and finds smashed glass in the front hall. Further in, she finds Harcourt's lifeless body.

Taylor's back at it to report his real death this time, as the team is lined up out front and interrogated by Romero. As they watch the security footage, they see a delivery driver arrive before Harcourt's death, only she's heavily pregnant and not in an official vehicle. In fact, Athena recognizes her from the news report; she's the one who ran in screaming that her husband was almost killed.

In an interrogation room, she tells Romero the whole story. She went to Harcourt's place to confront him, because her husband was injured trying to find the treasure for their baby and now he can't work. She wants him to make it right, but he tells her too bad and tries to push her out. She shoves him into a table and a vase shatters which makes Harcourt angry. She continues to smash vases until Harcourt clutches his chest and falls to the ground with 9-1-1 already on the line. She picked up the phone as she watched him die but didn't say anything to the dispatcher. She dropped the phone and left. Outside, Romero and Athena discuss that she technically didn't do anything wrong, she just watched him die.

The next morning at Bobby and Athena's, everyone (including Taylor) talk about what happened to the money. Eddie and Bobby think it was always an empty chest. Taylor however says the assistant said he saw the treasure with his own eyes, so he must have been in on it. Athena says Jeremiah was just as shocked as she was when they discovered Harcourt and then pieces together that he was furious about being left out of the will and he must have been the one to bury it in the first place. He went back for the treasure and left for the Maldives yesterday.

Outside, Taylor tries to pitch a follow up to her network, but she tells Buck they think no treasure is a better story. Buck hints that he thinks they make a great team even though they didn't find the treasure. Taylor answers, "It was fun. I'm glad we're friends," putting an end to any hints of a deeper relationship between the two.

Summary:	The members of the 118 make calls to save a bridezilla at a disastrous wedding and a mother trapped on her balcony. Hen plays medical detective when her mother falls ill. Athena uncovers a secret Bobby has been hiding.



The episode opens with two women in a darkened room, one hooked up to a lie detector machine while the other drills her with questions about her secrets. That's when someone charges into the room, and it's revealed the interrogator is a bride-to-be, getting married in just a few hours. Her mother interrupted the questioning to get the other girl to make up. The bridezilla walks out to the prep room where wires crisscross the floor, and she yells about which bridesmaid has been trash-talking her wedding plans. When no one confesses, she drags the lie detector

machine into the room and hooks it up to the nearest socket causing a power surge, electrocuting herself and catching the room on fire. The 118 put out the fire while Chimney and Hen check on the bride. Hen insists she go to the hospital while she continues trying to find the snitch. The mother confesses to being the online snitch, and the bride sends her out which is when she sees her dress has been completely burnt. "Good luck with the wedding!" Eddie calls as the team exits.

Hen and her fellow med school students study in her living room as her mother, Toni, heads out to a farmer's market. Toni cringes in pain from her back just as she's leaving, and Hen notices she's sweating with a possible fever. Toni waves her off and promises to take Ibuprofen. Meanwhile at Athena's, May, Harry, Athena, Michael, and David play charades as Bobby charges in late from "lunch with a friend." He quickly makes his way to their bedroom saying he just needs to change and shower. Athena thinks it's odd but lets it go.

Toni peruses the various booths at the farmer's market when she suddenly collapses. Bystanders quickly call 9-1-1. Hen arrives at the ER to find Toni awake in a bed. The doctor tells her that Toni's heart rate and blood pressure suddenly dropped. Hen tells the doctor about her earlier back pain and possible fever; however, the doctor brushes her off with a quick "Stay off WebMD!" and discharges Toni.

Eddie rearranges the pillows on the couch yet again as Ana and Christopher watch. Ana tells him it looks fine as they hear a knock on the door. They open it to welcome in Carla who is finally able to visit in person for the first time in a year. Christopher is ecstatic, and they sit down to dinner. As Ana and Chris head to the kitchen, Carla and Eddie visit about her absence with her father and how Ana fit into their family. Eddie says it's easy being with her, and Carla tells him to "be sure you're following your heart, not Christopher's." That's when Ana and Chris come in with not one but two birthday cakes to make up for missing Carla's birthday twice!

At the dispatch center, Maddie is dead on her feet as she chugs coffee. She tells Sue that Jee isn't sleeping, and it's the way she cries that's hurting Maddie. No matter what she tries, nothing calms her down. Maddie takes a new call: a young boy calls about his mother who has fallen through a balcony floor. He says he's sick and can't leave the apartment to check on her. The 118 arrive to find the mother's legs have been cut up, and she in danger of the whole balcony giving way. Buck and Bobby make their way to the balcony below where Buck asks the neighbor if they can borrow the balcony for a bit. He welcomes them in after yelling up to Sheila who screams a hello back. Eddie takes the ladder up to Sheila and puts the rescue harness around her to secure her. She reassures her son she'll be ok, and Eddie waves a hello. Sheila jokes about being a single mom and having no one to pull her out of the balcony floor. Eddie tells Charlie he's a hero for calling 9-1-1 so quickly and lets Chimney and Hen in the door. Eddie and Buck pull her out of the floor and onto a gurney, where Hen assesses she'll need to go to the hospital. Sheila objects because Charlie has an autoimmune disease and can't go to the hospital, so Eddie volunteers to stay with him until she gets back. With that, they head out.

Athena gathers the laundry at home when she notices a smell from the basket. She fishes out Bobby's shirt and sniffs it. At Michael's, she tells him the shirt reeked of bourbon. Michael defends Bobby, but Athena says she's worried about a relapse, plus Bobby has been acting strange. Michael thinks she should talk to him but, she's worried about how it'll sound.

Eddie and Charlie FaceTime with Carla and Christopher who joke about Eddie's cooking abilities, when Charlie accidentally knocks his drink over. Eddie grabs paper towels from a cabinet filled with medications including eyedrops. Charlie tells Carla and Christopher about how he's not allowed to go to school, they move around a lot, and are always going to see a new doctor. He doesn't know what kind of doctors are assessing him, and Eddie asks about Sheila's work. Charlie says they get donations from fundraising pages, which is when Sheila arrives home. She comments that Charlie has a sensitive stomach, but he assures her he feels fine.

At the station, Hen calls to check on Toni who hangs up on her for it. Hen tells Chimney about their bad hospital experience, and he suggests a specialist. Hen wishes she had some idea of what was wrong first, and he reminds her she has the perfect people to bounce ideas off, her classmates. Back home, the trio sit with Toni and ask her a barrage of questions as they slowly compile possible options (and then rule most of them out). As Toni stands to leave, she collapses again. Hen notices she's got a fever and a possible aortic aneurysm, so they rush her to the hospital again.

Chimney arrives home to hear Jee still crying. He goes in, and Maddie quickly hands her off to him. She tearfully tells him it's the way she cries like she's in pain and Maddie can't help her. Slowly, Jee calms down for Chimney which causes a few tears from Maddie who rushes off to take a shower.

Sydney quickly distracts the front desk person at the hospital while Hen takes Toni directly back and tells the nurse they need an electrocardiogram to verify Toni's possible condition. Hen is commanding, and the nurse quickly jumps into action to follow her orders. Afterward, the same

doctor from Toni's earlier visit sits with Hen to confirm Hen's diagnosis. Toni is being prepped for surgery, and the artery can be grafted. Hen points out that Toni would have died because of the doctor's negligence. He apologizes for missing it but points out "we caught it in time" and that should be the focus. Hen points out she has to make huge calls in the field with minimal tools, but here in the hospital he had everything at his disposal and still got it wrong. She tells him he needs to start believing patients when they say something is wrong.

Eddie and Carla help Christopher pack up some toys he wants to send to Charlie. Ana calls them into the other room. She looked up Sheila and Charlie's donation page and thinks there's something wrong with Sheila. Ana shows Eddie and Carla three different pages for "Sheila and Charlie" that all have different names in different cities around the country. Eddie tells Carla that Sheila never said what was wrong with Charlie, and Carla says they could be doctor shopping. There's a chance Sheila is lying about everything. They read through the comments on the donation pages that call Sheila a liar, scammer, and suspect she's making Charlie sick.

Athena finds Bobby doing the dishes after dinner and proposes a stay-in date night as both kids are out of the house. Bobby says he's tired and wants to crash, and Athena asks if everything is ok. She knows he has meetings, but she wants to be able to help him with that part of his life too and offers to go to a meeting with him, perhaps the one tomorrow. Bobby quickly says he doesn't have one tomorrow, but she could come on Saturday, so she agrees and he heads to bed.

Sydney brings Hen a coffee as the doctor gives her an update. It's good news: Toni is going to be ok. Toni wakes to find Hen in her room, and Toni tells her she's proud to have Hen as her daughter. She's the one who saved her life, and she tells Hen to keep going no matter how tough things get. The world needs more doctors like Hen.

Buck and Chimney arrive for their shift early to find Eddie already there. He fills them in on what they discovered about Sheila and Eddie, believing she has Munchausen Syndrome by Proxy and is poisoning Charlie with the eye drops he saw in the kitchen. Chimney confirms that could cause all the symptoms and never show up on a toxicology screening unless they are looking for it specifically. Suddenly, Eddie gets a phone call from Charlie who says he thinks he did a bad thing. The camera pans to Sheila lying on the floor, clutching her throat.

Athena calls Michael from her car to confess she followed Bobby. He went to a meeting even though he told her he didn't have one today. As they talk, she sees Bobby talking with a woman with an ankle monitor — the very woman who caused the pile up a few months prior. Bobby spots her in her car.

Buck, Eddie, and several other paramedics arrive at Charlie and Sheila's apartment to find Sheila not breathing. They attend to her for tetrahydrozoline poisoning. Charlie confesses to Eddie he sees her putting drops his food all the time, and he wanted to see what would happen so he put it in Sheila's food, too. Buck tells the other paramedics that Charlie will need the same treatment. Meanwhile, Chimney calls Maddie to tell her about the case as Maddie puts Jee down for a nap. Chimney says he's almost glad Sheila fell so that Charlie will be safe and far away from her. Maddie comments it's as if he's better without her, and Chimney agrees: "Some people just aren't meant to be parents." This seems to resonate with Maddie who almost starts crying. Maddie seems distant as they hang up.

Bobby confronts Athena about following him to his meeting. She recognizes Rachel, the drunk driver, and Bobby tells Athena he's trying to help her. The bourbon on his shirt had been Rachel's; she fell off the wagon and called for help. Athena doesn't understand why he kept it from her, and Bobby says he didn't feel he needed to tell her. Athena doesn't tell him half her decisions and they argue about the power differential in the relationship. Bobby feels like Athena doesn't trust him with anything, and he questions whether their marriage is working at all. "We're not partners, because that's how you want it."

Outside the apartment building, Charlie and Sheila are loaded into separate ambulances to go to different hospitals for treatment. Eddie explains this to Charlie as Sheila yells for her son. Buck says Charlie is lucky he met Eddie, and a paramedic offers Eddie the option to ride with Charlie to the hospital. Eddie starts to agree, but a gunshot suddenly echoes. Eddie is shot through the shoulder, and blood splatters all over Buck who stands frozen in shock. Eddie collapses to the ground. A second shot is heard, barely missing Buck as Buck is tackled to the ground behind the firetruck. Panicked people run everywhere looking for cover as the shooter continues targeting the first responders. Buck and Eddie maintain eye contact from under the firetruck as Eddie slowly bleeds out with no one able to get to him. His eyes close as he passes out, and Buck can

only watch.

Summary:	In the aftermath of the shooting, Athena and the 118 are on high alert when a sniper is targeting members of the LAFD. Meanwhile, Maddie makes a life decision.



The episode opens immediately where the previous one left off. As bullets continue to rain down on the LAFD, Buck manages to shake himself out of the shocked stupor that he found himself in after Eddie was shot. He crawls under the firetruck, frantically yelling for Eddie, and grabs his arm and drags him underneath to safety. Buck hoists Eddie up into the firetruck as the rest of the firefighters pile in, continuing to dodge bullets from the sniper, and they race to the hospital. Eddie is still alive, but he's lost a lot of blood, and Buck is barely holding it together as he hovers over him. As the doctors and

nurses wheel Eddie into the hospital, a fellow firefighter asks Buck if he's okay. The man walks away and Buck says, "No."

Athena, having heard about the shooting, arrives at the scene and tells Detective Denver that she wants to assist. Meanwhile, Buck walks out of the hospital to find Taylor waiting for him. He tells her that he needs to go and see Christopher, and she insists on giving him a ride because he doesn't have his car there. Buck's hands are shaking.

Chimney fills Maddie in on how Eddie's doing—he's going to be in surgery for the next few hours—and while they're talking, Maddie tells him that another firefighter has been shot elsewhere. Athena and Denver watch the footage from the latest shooting and surmise that the sniper is specifically targeting firefighters.

Buck arrives at Eddie's house to find Christopher sitting in his room. Kneeling down in front of him, he tells Christopher that his dad isn't coming home tonight because he got hurt at work. Innocently, Christopher asks if he was hurt in a fire, and Buck takes a deep breath as he goes on to explain that someone hurt Eddie on purpose. Christopher asks Buck if his dad is going to be okay, and Buck—sniffing, with tears running down his cheeks—reassures him that Eddie is a fighter. But based on his red-rimmed eyes and the broken look on his face, Buck needs someone to reassure him of that as well. And thus a text message from Bobby arrives in a timely manner, informing him that Eddie is out of surgery and the doctors say it went well. Relief appears to wash over Buck, and he begins to sob into his hands beside Christopher, who puts an arm around him to comfort him.

As Athena and Denver try to scope out where the sniper is operating from, we learn that the 118 will be wearing bulletproof vests on the job for the time being, and the LAPD will have additional officers working every shift now. Ana sits by Eddie's bedside in the hospital as he sleeps, and we see that Buck has been staying at Eddie's to take care of Christopher. The 118 continues to respond to calls, but with extra safety precautions now, like a SWAT team escort complete with ballistic shields. Athena and Bobby sit down and have a serious talk, reflecting back on how he felt when she nearly lost her life after the attack. She also shares why she made the choice not to quit afterward. Elsewhere, Carla arrives at the Diaz household to find Christopher and Buck eating breakfast and has a chat with Buck.

The 118 responds to a dangerous call, in which a construction worker is pinned by a cable incredibly high up on a crane. With the way he's bleeding out, which they can see from the safety camera, Hen and Chimney estimate that he doesn't have much time left. And SWAT is still too far out, so they don't have a means of protection. Buck, being Buck, takes it upon himself to perform the rescue, Bobby's authorization be damned. Completely exposed and risking his life, Buck climbs up the crane's ladder and manages to rescue the victim without trouble. Afterward at the station, Buck approaches Bobby because he hasn't said a word to him. Bobby tells him that he's accepted the fact that Buck will never be the guy that thinks before he acts, but he also calls him out on his deliberate choice to make himself a target. Bobby assures him that what happened to Eddie wasn't his fault, and Buck laments that he was just the guy standing there who couldn't do anything to protect him.

Taylor is hanging out with Buck at his apartment as he packs a bag of clothes to bring to Eddie's house, and she begins to needle into him about the reckless choices he made that day. She kisses him, but then apologizes afterward and blames it on the wine. Buck suggests that they should talk about it, but she leaves instead. Before Buck can stop her, he gets a call from Ana: Eddie is awake. Buck rushes over to the hospital, and he sits down at Eddie's bedside as he video chats with Christopher. When Eddie asks Buck if Christopher is doing okay, Buck tells him that he's doing better than he is, and admits that he lost it when he told Christopher that Eddie got shot. He apologizes, but Eddie assures him, "You were there for him when I couldn't be. That's what matters."

Athena and Denver arrive at the station, and Chief Pate informs them that they've discovered that the sniper's bullets belong to the LAPD. A SWAT team arrives at the household of Kenneth Malone, a former SWAT long rifleman who was fired six months ago after he accidentally shot a hostage.

At the dispatch center, Maddie tells Sue that she's decided she's quitting because she feels like she's failing Jee-Yun. Sue watches her with sympathy as Maddie explains the troubling symptoms that she's experiencing, and Maddie gets defensive when she thinks Sue is going to tell her she should talk to a counselor, but Sue merely asks her to make sure she talks to Chimney about what's going on.

Athena begins questioning Kenneth, who tells her that he wasn't fired from his job, he quit.

And what's important to him isn't clearing his name for what happened, but learning to live with his mistake. He assures her that they have the wrong guy. Meanwhile, May takes a 9-1-1 call from a man named Ethan who's trapped in a fire. The 118 arrive at the scene, no longer wearing bulletproof vests as a result of Kenneth's arrest. However, Athena and Denvers discuss the fact that Kenneth's gun was found buried in his yard, and they both agree that they don't think he's the sniper after all. But the ammo was his ... so who had access to it?

The 118 is ordered by the LAPD to evacuate the burning building, but Bobby continues on and rushes into a room because he thinks that he's found Ethan's body on the ground. It turns out to be a mannequin. As he looks around in confusion, a man steps out from behind him and shoots him. Athena arrives and informs the 118 that the man who called in the fire isn't a victim, he's the sniper. He was Kenneth's partner. After Kenneth quit, the LAPD realized that Ethan was a problem and they removed him from duty. Inside, Ethan demands that Bobby call the rest of the firefighters back into the building. The Captain refuses.

Despite Buck and everyone else's protests, Athena insists that they suit her up in firefighter gear so that she can go inside and rescue Bobby. Armed with her gun, she goes in alone. Ethan stalks around the room, telling Bobby that the gunman from the prior hostage situation was only alive because firefighters saved him from overdosing multiple times. LAPD has a sniper on a rooftop, but there isn't a clean shot through the smokey window. Athena steps into the room, walks through the flames with her gun raised, and she shoots Ethan. Bobby stares in amazement as the armed firefighter removes their helmet and he realizes that it's his wife. Later, at the hospital, Athena tells Bobby that Ethan didn't make it. Bobby remarks that Athena literally walked through fire to save him.

Taylor shows up at Buck's apartment. Buck tells her that he didn't chase after her because he's spent a long time feeling like he isn't enough, and he doesn't want to do that anymore. So if Taylor doesn't want him ... She smiles, tells him she does, and kisses him.

Chimney finds Maddie despondently laying on the couch, and she informs him that she quit her job. She also admits that she feels like she's losing her mind, and she needs help. Meanwhile, Hen, Karen, Hen's mother, and Denny are at the park when Nia comes running over to them. She runs around giving hugs to Momma Hen, Momma Karen, and Grammy, and then runs over to see Big Brother Denny. Nia's mother is at a loss for words, and she expresses how awkward she feels to finally be meeting her daughter's foster parents. She thanks Hen and Karen, and they invite her to sit down and have lunch with them.

Buck walks into Eddie's hospital room to tell him that the nurse is getting his medication and discharge paperwork ready. Eddie beckons him to come over, because he's been meaning to talk to him about something. He goes on to tell Buck that after the well collapsed on top of him, he began to wonder what would have happened to Christopher if he didn't survive. So he went to his attorney and changed his will.

EDDIE: Someday, if I didn't make it ... Christopher would be taken care of. By you. It's in my will. If I die, you become Christopher's legal guardian.

Buck, stunned, questions whether Eddie needed his consent for that. Eddie tells him that he could refuse, yes, but he knows that he wouldn't. Buck confirms as much as he replies, but then goes on to inquire about Christopher's grandparents, the rest of his family. Eddie reminds him that after Shannon left, all of them tried to guilt him into giving Christopher to them. That's not what he wanted then, and it's not what he wants now.

BUCK: If it came to that, wouldn't they fight for him?

EDDIE: I don't know. Maybe. Probably. But no one will ever fight for my son as hard as you. That is what I want for him.

BUCK: Well, you said you did this last year. Why are you just telling me now?

EDDIE: Because, Evan, you came in here the other day and said you thought it would have been better if it had been you who was shot. You act like you're expendable. But you're wrong.

We end on a voiceover from Bobby as we pan through a dinner at the Grant-Nash household, Chimney comforting Maddie, Eddie and Buck arriving at the Diaz household for a surprise welcome home party for Eddie, the Wilson picnic, and a certain new firefighter completing his exam.

Summary: A series of ransomware threats leads to an overabundance of emergencies for the 118, including a medevac helicopter crash at a hospital and an air-traffic control tower system failure. Meanwhile Athena must revisit her traumatic attack when the case of the realtor serial rapist goes to trial, Eddie suffers a health scare and Maddie's postpartum depression worsens.



The episode opens on a deserted Hollywood Boulevard, by the TCL Chinese Theatre, the Dolby Theatre, El Capitan, Hard Rock Cafe. Cars are abandoned, paper on the streets. As the 118 makes their way through the street, they start passing some zoo animals. Birds, emu, a giraffe, monkeys on the Chinese Theater, wolves running around the Hollywood and Highland Shopping Center, camels in the center, and an elephant that knocks over a Starline Tours ticket booth.

The episode then takes us a week prior. Maddie seems to be doing a little better, now that she has Chimney to help. Maddie's

oversleeping, which means that Chim gets to have some breakfast with Jee-Yun. She's seeing a therapist, planning lunch dates with Josh. Chimney, being the caring boyfriend and father of her daughter, knows how tired Maddie has been lately ever since they switched her to the duloxetine. He offers her help but Maddie tells him it's not his job, though making sure she and Jee are happy and healthy is his most important job. Chimney's not sure he knows how to not worry. Maddie promises she'll talk to the doctor.

Maddie has overslept once again, as she wakes to a call from Josh about lunch. Luckily she's running behind schedule and totally missing her doctor's appointment. Josh briefly mentions the self-aware cell phones, then the airport was it and now it's the apocalypse. Maddie has no idea what's going on and after getting off the phone, she turns on the news and tells baby Jee that daddy's going to be pretty busy.

What started off as a somewhat harmless string of alerts turned into something much bigger. The 118 got alerts for an earthquake, tsunami, mudslide. Even though they don't feel anything and the bell at the firehouse isn't going off. And evidently, Hen is calling 9-1-1.

Meanwhile, the call center is getting hit with 9-1-1 calls that are mostly accidental. Josh assures the staff that they didn't get hacked. It's due to a phone provider. Much of the call center deals with emergency calls that aren't really emergency calls, until one woman who called a couple times on accident calls with a real emergency this time: Her GPS went haywire and she ended up driving into the water and she's sinking, fast. Luckily, the 118 come to her rescue, with the help of May who was on the call with the woman, though this is only the beginning of the attack.

Taylor figures out that the navigation app's last update was two weeks ago, which means that there was no bug and the company lied. Karen, when at a get together at Karen and Bobby's, figures it was a ransomware attack, courtesy of a guy she knows that works at that navigation company, GoGo Anywhere. Multiple other states have been hit. Denny and Harry come out to the dining room to tell everyone their game just froze and it won't even load. Cell phone carriers, GPS navigation, and now video games? What's next?

The ransomware attack continues, this time it's at Air Traffic Control at LAX. The staff start to lose contact with the planes, and all radar is lost. One of the planes comes back online, though there's still no radio. According to the radar, the plane is on a collision course for the tower. It's headed right for them. Everyone in the tower braces for impact, but it never comes. They get confirmation that all the planes have landed at a nearby airport. After the 118 come to take care of a few of the staff, the computers start back up but, not for long. As a virtual slot machine comes up on the screen, with the words "YOU LOSE" and an automated voice saying to give him 25 million dollars if they want their system back.

As the court house is the latest to be attacked, Athena tries to follow Jeffery out into the streets. Traffic lights, cars, ATMs, are all going nuts. There's multiple explosions on the street and everyone is running around in a panic.

Willing to lend a hand, the 118 helps out at the hospital, because boy do they need it. Soon, the entire city experiences a blackout.

The Realtor Rapist, Jeffery Hudson, returns, as Athena and some of his victims testify in his trial. He even has a fan club, which is disgusting. Before the trial gets started, Jeffery fires his attorney, Lila, as he wants to represent himself. The victims are not too keen on being questioned by their abuser, though Athena tells them they are all stronger than he thinks. They soon get the news that the judge is going to allow Jeffery to represent himself, so Athena reminds the women that he can't hurt them.

The lawyer, Decker, also tells them Jeffery filed a motion to suppress all evidence found at Studio Self Storage. Athena reminds him those trophies are all that they have linking Jeffery back to his victims. Not only is the judge considering this but she let him call his first witness: Athena.

Athena wakes up to a sound outside and she grabs her gun from the safe. She searches the house, but as she makes her way back to bed, Jeffery shows up and starts attacking Athena. Just as he shoots her, Athena wakes up. Later that day, Jeffery questions Athena about that night at the storage facility, and her being put on restrictive duty for misconduct. Athena justifies her actions, but he still wants the evidence to be suppressed as it was obtained from an illegal search by a "rogue cop with a history of misconduct."

Continuing with the trial, everyone's phones start going off, even though most phones were

already off. Prisoners, led by guards, come into the courtroom, as the system said it was time to bring them up. The prisoners are fed up, as they want their day in court, and they start attacking. The guards get them quickly, though and the courtroom is cleared. However, Jeffery made it out during that brief stint of chaos. As everything is getting chaotic by security, Jeffery slips out and escapes.

At the police department, Athena breaks the news to two of the victims that Jeffery escaped. She suggests to them that they don't go home. They should stick with friends, family, she'll let them know when it's safe. Meanwhile, Detective Ransone talks to Jeffery's former lawyer, trying to get any information on his whereabouts. Athena comes into the room, asking about his "fan club" and if there's any chance one or more of them would shelter him. Any of them in a heartbeat, Lila says.

Athena and Ransone split up to check out the girls from the fan club. However, they all seem to be clean. A little psychotic, but clean nonetheless.

Jeffery shows up to Lila's house, still upset with how badly she treated him. He wonders if she has any cash and leads her outside, though before Jeffery has the chance to take her, Ransone shows up and arrests him. He tells Athena the great news and it's like she can breathe once again. She calls the girls and tells them the news, though as she does, Lila comes up behind Ransone and slits his neck. She and Jeffery, who is in the police car, smile at each other.

While Eddie, Ana, and Christopher are looking at new suits for Ana's sister's baby's christening, Eddie starts to feel a little woozy. Ana is with Christopher and Eddie collapses. She runs over to him as Christopher can be heard in the background calling out for his father. Ana tells someone to call 9-1-1.

At the hospital, Eddie is told by Dr. Salazar it wasn't a heart attack, but it was a panic attack. Christopher brings up the fact that Eddie got shot and Ana tells Salazar about what happened. While the sniper is dead and Eddie's not, the doctor suggests it's repression.

Salazar gives Eddie an informative pamphlet that outlines what he needs to do if he experiences any symptoms again and though he's reluctant to take it, he ends up doing so.

While bringing patients into the ER, Eddie passes Dr. Salazar who is surprised to see him back to work so soon. Buck, ever the concerned best friend, looks at Eddie, who tells Salazar he's good.

While helping out at the hospital, Buck looks back at Eddie and wonders about why that doctor asked if he was okay. Eddie tells him that he wasn't feeling well so she checked him out. Buck is grilling him about having a heart attack, not having a heart attack, he's just worried.

Summary: The 118 springs into action when a city-wide blackout and a record heatwave causes mayhem in Los Angeles. Chimney confides in Hen about Maddie's condition and Athena's worst nightmare comes true.



Detective Ransone ends up in the hospital for five days thanks to Lila's attempted murder and 'rescue' of Jeffrey Hudson. When he wakes enough to write, he asks for Athena, who confirms Hudson is on at large. For five days, he's been free, and they waste no time starting the manhunt. At Lila's house, they find her dead body but no Hudson. Athena is inside his mind enough to know that he won't flee the city.

Athena makes the call to keep watch on the victim's homes but not inform them about Hudson's escape. When she visits Ransone again, he reminds her that she was also a victim. Someone should be stationed at her home as well. Michael has opened the house to the neighbors (since they have power), and it's revealed

Hudson is there playing a game with Harry.

Athena races home to find the house dark and Michael and David cleaning up. As the power kicks on, they realize Harry isn't there. Hudson kidnapped Harry and is using Ransone's badge to bypass security checkpoints.

Understandably Chimney tries to check in with Maddie throughout the blackout, and the stress ultimately leads him to confide in Hen about her postpartum depression. Hen reminds him that Maddie needs him to be her partner, not her doctor, and to focus on loving and supporting

her. Meanwhile, at home, Maddie bathes Jee-Yun and nearly falls asleep beside the tub. Jee actually slips beneath the water for a few seconds before Maddie jerks awake. She rips Jee out of the tub and sobs as she holds her apologizing repeatedly. Maddie rushes her to the doctor, but Jee is perfectly healthy. It's clear Maddie feels immense guilt over what happened, and I'm sure this will only add to her ongoing struggle with her depression.

With Buck's help, Eddie verbalizes the true cause of his panic attack. He's not ready for how fast his relationship with Ana is progressing. From the misunderstanding of Ana as Chris' mother to one this episode of the new probie thinking she is Eddie's wife, Eddie feels like they are rushing faster than he's ready for. However, Buck asks him what he plans to do. Eddie's answer? He plans to stick it out. Not exactly a romantic declaration there, Eddie. Buck tells him that you can't simply "stick it out" in a relationship. He cites his own history of being "the Ana" in a relationship where he knew the other person wasn't all in and tells Eddie it's painful and cruel. If Eddie isn't in love with Ana (even though Chris loves her), he needs to talk to Ana about it. Eddie doesn't act on the advice, but it's obvious Buck's words stick with him.

As the blackout continues in LA, the 118 get up to some hilarious antics and crazy calls as usual. The episode opens with a dramatic rescue of two paramedics trapped in a helicopter on top of a hospital. Everyone, including the heart they were transporting, is saved!

While at the station, someone decides to give Buck a clipboard again, and he's in charge of the portable phone charger units. Chimney has to threaten him just to get one, "Give me a charger, or Uncle Buck will never see his niece again." Unsurprisingly, Buck relents.

We also see the culmination of the zoo call! The 118 arrive at the LA Zoo to treat an animal attack where Buck is put on "animal control," which he, of course, takes seriously. Inside the store, Bobby and Hen find the victim of a vicious alpaca attack. Hen lures it away with chips as Bobby drags the man to safety.

Summary: As the citywide blackout continues to cause mayhem in Los Angeles, Athena races to save her family from a tragedy. Meanwhile, Eddie must make a difficult choice about his future and Maddie makes a life-changing decision.



The opening of the episode takes us back through the series of events that eventually led to Jeffrey Hudson kidnapping Harry. A scene of Jeffrey in the hospital after the season 3 showdown, which is later further confirmed by Athena, reveals that his entire quest for vengeance is seemingly based on the fact that she... shot off his junk. Yep. Serves him right.

Jeffrey allows Henry to call Athena, if only to further antagonize her, which he succeeds at doing. Desperate to get her son back, Athena tries — to no avail — to convince him to let Harry go and escape while the blackout is still going on. But he doesn't want to make a deal with her. (And as if Athena would actually let him escape.) Unwilling to remain sitting ducks during the search, Athena and Michael take off on their own

to try to track Jeffrey down.

Harry manages to escape from the trunk of the car when Jeffrey makes a pit stop to get paint. Although Jeffrey finds him (oh Harry, why didn't you run further?!), so does a woman who's out for a walk with her dog. As Jeffrey begins manhandling Harry into the backseat of the car, he flashes Detective Ransone's badge at the woman to appease her.

However, Harry cries out for her to record what's happening, which is exactly what she does. She uploads the video online, and May finds it. Although this won't lead them directly to Harry, it helps give them a better idea of where to search.

After sealing Henry up in the wall of an abandoned house (and using the paint to try to hide his tracks), Jeffrey thinks he's being smart by luring Athena into the PPZ — the People's Protection Zone, an autonomous, police-free area the size of eight city blocks that have been taken over by a large group of people. However, this plan backfires when Athena enters the area under the guise that she's a citizen on the run from a cop. The video of Jeffrey waving around Ransone's badge pretending to be a cop begins to circulate amongst the group, and they quickly chase him out of the PPZ.

Athena manages to corner Jeffrey in an area where the 118 surprises him by blocking his exit with their firetruck. He makes a move to point his gun at Bobby, who's sitting in the driver's seat, and Athena doesn't hesitate to shoot him down, killing him. It's a decision that she immediately regrets when she realizes that he's the only person who knows where Harry is.

Back at the station, they pour over the items that Jeffrey was carrying to try and find a clue as to where Harry could be. They end up tracing a pair of keys back to a housing development that Jeffrey's work was refurbishing before the job was shut down and abandoned due to the pandemic.

The 118 and the Los Angeles Police Department roll up to the housing development with a parade of cars and sirens, quickly working to search the area inside out. Buck finds a can of paint outside, which alerts them to start looking for wet paint on the walls, and they eventually find where Harry was hidden. As Athena and her family's nightmare finally comes to an end, power across Los Angeles is also restored.

Harry may be home safe, but he's not out of the woods yet. The series held on tightly to the aftermath of Athena's trauma from season 3 until now, so it's to be expected that we'll also see the fallout of Harry's own dealings with Jeffrey. As the episode comes to an end, we see Michael and Harry sitting in the living room watching the news. Michael is surprised that he's still awake and asks him if he wants to talk about what happened. He doesn't... but he certainly doesn't look okay.

As the 118 clocks out from what might be their longest shift ever, Buck is surprised to see that Eddie isn't rushing home to see Christopher. Eddie remarks that he's not looking forward to going home and talking to Ana, who's been staying at his house and taking care of Christopher during the blackout.

As Eddie, Ana, and Christopher sit together at the table eating breakfast, there's an awkward beat when Ana notes that they need to clean up the kitchen, and Eddie suggests that she should go home first. He then follows her out of the room and drops a four-word bombshell on her, "We need to talk."

Christopher loves Ana, and he thought that he could come to love her, too. But he can't do this anymore. After his panic attacks, that much is certainly clear. Ana, shaken, goes to say goodbye to Christopher.

After the power comes back on, Maddie calls Chimney, but it goes to voicemail because his phone is dead. It seems like she wants to tell him something in the message, but she changes her mind. She packs up Jee-Yun and says that they're going to see Chimney at work.

Chimney comes home to find that Maddie and Jee-Yun aren't there. He receives a call from the station and arrives to find that Maddie did indeed show up, but she left Jee-Yun there. Ravi gives Chimney a tablet, on which Maddie has recorded a heartbreaking, tearful message telling him that their daughter isn't safe with her. She's better off without her...

Summary:	The 118 arrives on the scene after a truck crashes into a high school homecoming parade. Athena and Michael try to help Harry in the aftermath of his kidnapping. Bobby gives Chimney advice regarding Maddie.



Chimney obsesses over Maddie leaving to the point of making farfetched claims to Buck, who checks in on him. Chimney even calls off work because his head isn't in the right place to be on calls. Both Buck and Albert check in on him and try to ease his fears, but nothing helps. As he sorts through bills, he uncovers Jee's ER visit, and the pieces of the day before Maddie left start to fall into place. Chimney finds the doctor who treated Jee at the hospital and emotionally unloads everything going on. He's wracked with guilt

over not checking in on Maddie more during the blackout and is sick with concern knowing she's suffering from postpartum depression.

The doctor tells Chimney Jee's bathing incident, and Chimney goes to Buck with this news only to realize Buck's too calm reactions. Buck knew Jee almost drowned, Buck knew Maddie was leaving, and Buck didn't tell Chimney anything. In a moment of betrayal and rage, Chimney punches Buck and storms out. Buck confides in Eddie about everything, who tells him there was no winning for Buck in this situation. He wanted to help Chimney and Maddie.

Meanwhile, Chimney loads up Jee in the car, intent on tracking down Maddie. He calls Hen to tell her the plan, but she's already outside to check if he wants company on the road trip. He declines the kind offer and promises to be safe.

Athena and Michael take Harry to therapy, hoping to help him work through the psychological effects of the kidnapping. He's been staying with Michael, but the therapist wants him to go home. Harry's distant when Athena and Michael talk with him at dinner, and Athena is hesitant to force him to come home as suggested by the therapist. It's clear she doesn't feel home is safe yet and spends a night scrubbing the house down. It seems Harry isn't the only one struggling to cope. Athena breaks down when talking to Bobby. For her, all the good memories are overshadowed by Hudson taking Harry.

Harry's silence throughout the episode brings a stark reminder that the parent/child relationship can sometimes enter rocky territory, but a sibling bond is often just the outside perspective needed. May brings ice cream and talks to Harry about her day, about their parents, and about the kidnapping. Harry finally opens up. He's mad at them for hovering and with some teasing from May, he also says he's mad at them for not stopping the kidnapping. May offers some sage advice, "Don't bottle up your emotions and put on a happy face for other people. That never works, and it will never make you feel better."

Claudette Collins arrives at the dispatch center and takes her first call back as the other dispatchers watch, enthralled by her efficiency. It's a complex call as she oscillates between the child caller, the EMTs, and the police to save the child from the suspect. The whole thing goes perfectly, and we learn a little more about this new, very confident character. Claudette doesn't wear her uniform shirt so as not to look "lame," then promptly steals May's coffee and fully dismisses her as a serious dispatcher. She's one efficient dispatcher though.

Claudette reprimands May during the big call of the episode for estimating a time with a caller. These first encounters have May feeling like Claudette doesn't like her. She tries to smooth things over as Claudette leaves for the day, who is again fairly dismissive once again.

The major call of the episode sees a delivery truck driver's brakes fail, sending him careening into a high school homecoming parade. His truck slams straight into the Mustang on which two teenage cheerleaders, Michaela and Cassie, are riding. Claudette effectively takes over the mass injury event as the 118 arrive on scene. Eddie and Hen treat one of the two girls, who mumbles "Makayla" when Hen asks her name. The other girl, presumably Cassie, is dead on the scene, and Makayla's parents rush to the hospital to be with her.

Bobby and Buck focus on Mr. Foster, a science teacher trapped under collapsed bleachers and suffering a possible spinal injury. It's slow going as Buck cuts through the metal surrounding the teacher; the team must be careful not to further damage any internal injuries. Things aren't helped when the overturned truck nearby begins to smoke.

The truck was hauling chlorine gas and is now on fire and dispersing chlorine throughout the area. They rush to get a mask on the trapped teacher and finally free him from the wreckage while working to put out the fire. Thankfully they are successful on both fronts.

After the call, Eddie and Hen are finishing up paperwork at the hospital when Makayla's parents find them and thank Hen for saving her life. Cassie's parents arrive and are understandably distraught. Eddie offers to take them to see their daughter. In the morgue, Cassie's body is uncovered only for the parents to realize that's not Cassie. The girl is actually Makayla. Hen chooses to break the news to Makayla's parents herself. It's a devastating moment as the two sets of parents break down together.

Summary:	The members of the 118 face an awkward rescue call when they arrive on the scene of a man who has over-exerted himself exercising. The team also must save the life of a groundskeeper whose chainsaw cut into him and race to an explosion at a retirement community. Meanwhile, Athena has an extreme reaction to Harry's new behavior. Then, Hen and Eddie, as well as Buck and Ravi, have rocky starts to their new partnerships, and May receives an emergency call from a suicidal teen, while continuing her uneasy work relationship with Claudette.



The episode begins tonight with Evan "Buck" Buckley coming down the stairs, confirming that Howie "Chimney" Han did message him, asking him not to text him any more and now Maddie Kendall isn't speaking to him since he told Chimney where she was. He confesses that work is weird because everyone is avoiding him and the subject and everything is off, like they are blaming him for Howie leaving town. Taylor Kelly admits that a similar thing happened to her in the newsroom, saying that maybe he should

consider that not everything is about him.

A man in the neighborhood seems obsessed with the Narcissus program, watching the commercials and even receiving pamphlets in the mail. He spots billboards about is everywhere, replaying the slogan over and over in his mind so he begins to do the workouts pushing himself over his limits. The trainer on the DVD encourages him to slow down but he refuses until he gets extreme belly pain and goes to the washroom, where he is in excruciating pain and cannot move, forced to call 9-1-1.

Eddie Diaz and Henrietta "Hen" Wilson arrive on scene with Bobby Nash pounding on the door, informing them that LAFD is there. They break down the door, finding their patient stuck in with his abdomen on his legs. Hen rules out a stroke and there is no sign of trauma. Hen asks if he can feel the pressure from her touch but Craig says there is so much pressure to look good and explains the Narcissus program he started.

Meanwhile, Buck is showing Ravi Panikkar how to put the tools away properly but he plays with the gurney and it folds up, unable to open it again. Back inside, Craig reveals he did over 300 pushups and they need to administer medications to relax his muscles. Buck reminds Ravi to stay focused because if he doesn't people will die. Craig comments on how jacked the EMTs are and wants to know which workout they do.

Athena Grant is at the spa with her daughter May Grant when May feels her mother is fishing for information on Harry Grant. May says she hasn't talked to Harry but refuses to work for Linda because Claudette Collins is working. She confesses that everyone likes her but she thinks Claudette doesn't like her because she is always giving her a hard time. Athena doesn't think it is okay that she is harassing her; wondering if she needs to have a talk with the woman, May says she doesn't need her mommy coming to her rescue.

Bobby goes to Harry's school where they know Harry has been through a significant trauma but he has been ill tempered and they are past the point of understanding and now he is being suspended for a week. It is revealed that Harry punched out a student. Bobby walks with Harry to the parking lot, he is surprised because the Harry the principal is talking about is not the Harry he knows and thinks he needs to reconsider his language and needs to talk to his parents. Bobby denies his request to stay at the firehouse as Bobby insists Harry is going to tell his parents what is going on himself.

May walks onto the floor of the call center to her desk, Claudette watching her.

Randall and Dante are loading up the carts to do their gardening but because of the heat he suggests they split up to get the work done. Dante cautions Randall about the ladder hitting lower branches but he blows him off, saying he can't hear him.

May takes a 9-1-1 call with the caller first moaning. Claudette tells May to ping the location as it is a cellphone. Claudette takes over the call, which makes May upset. Claudette calls the fire department sending them to the location, informing the caller that help is on the way. Bobby and his crew scour the park, calling out to the patient, suddenly Claudette hears Eddie's voice and they locate their patient by the ladder, he cannot speak because he has a chainsaw blade lodged in his throat. Hen says the blade is preventing him from bleeding out as Ravi leaves the scene so he doesn't vomit everywhere. They rush the gurney over and are able to load Randall onto the ambulance as Dante beats himself up about separating. Hen tells Buck they are going to drive very carefully. Claudette tells May there is no shame in asking for some help, better than having someone die on her watch.

At home, May tells Harry about the call; feeling she didn't even get her chance to save the guy. Harry thinks his sister should stand her ground but she doesn't want to take advice from someone who got suspended from school. Bobby arrives with Athena and Michael Grant, who want to know why he hit someone and want to help him. Michael tells Harry he needs to be respectful but he blurts out that he went through all the trauma because of his parents — his dad just stood there and let it happen and Jeff did it to him because of his mother; but she was too busy being a cop to protect him. He says Athena is a terrible mother, all she cares about is being a cop. Athena slaps Harry and he runs out the door with Michael right behind him.

Athena sits with Bobby, not able to comprehend that Harry would say that. Bobby feels that was Jeff talking, not Harry. She thinks she is a monster because she hit him. Bobby thinks they need to give Harry time to heal as this is not about Jeffrey anymore, it is about Harry. He encourages her not to let Jeffrey live in her head but she confesses it is hard to do, especially since it feels like he is winning.

Buck is shouting for Ravi in the firehouse as Hen chastises him for his behavior. Buck says he is only there to show him how to disassemble the chainsaw. Hen walks into Bobby's office to see if anyone is there and pretends to leave, but catches Ravi coming out from under the desk. He lies to her about why he was there but she doesn't buy it. He needs a break and she laughs says she will protect him from Buck and his chainsaw. Ravi says Buck used to be nice but now he is a drill sergeant from hell. Hen says Buck is going through a lot as he feels his family is slipping away from him and now he is worked the 118 is slipping too but she encourages Ravi to

push back.

At the retirement home, the women are talking about jewelry and asking their spouses to buy them beautiful things. Louis, who works there, is asked to go check the foul odor that is coming from the basement. The seniors wonder what is down there, not even knowing there was a basement. Beverly reveals it is a chemical scent but really foul. Felix goes with Louis to check it out. Felix opens the doors to the chapel and when Louis turns on the light the spark causes an explosion. His wife who is upstairs, wonders what Felix has done.

Everyone from the 118 arrive at the retirement home as Bobby explains to everyone the explosion happened in the chapel as Hen wonders if someone pissed off the big guy. Buck tells Ravi which equipment to grab. Beverly tells them about Louis working for them and how Felix was insistent about going down but she has no idea why. They quickly find Louis as some work on putting the fire out. Felix is found under one of the pews as Louis is loaded onto a gurney with a wooden spike through his chest.

Hen attempts to hold pressure on his chest when he starts to profusely bleed. Buck yells at the probbie to give him more water but he stops saying these chemicals can react to the water as Bobby tells Hen they have a potential second fire and they need to get out. Using fire extinguishers they get the fire out, but they spot the chemicals and feel it is someone's experiment. Once outside, Bobby says it is now a crime scene, Felix is high on pain medications and reveals that it is his, how else was he able to afford the jewelry. His wife says it is not all about the bangles and the diamonds, asking if they all know how expensive it is to live in a place like this and she had no choice but to turn to a life of crime. Bobby thinks she should have found something a little less explosive.

Buck finds Ravi at the back of the truck, saying he saved the day with the CO2 call and he feel Ravi is now ready.

Buck calls Maddie but is unable to leave a message as her voicemail is full and no longer accepting any more messages. He calls Howie who has his voicemail saying he is unable to talk to anyone unless it is Buck and to stop calling him. Buck holds the phone and then shouts for Ravi but Bobby calls him for dinner. Buck arrives just in time to hear how Ravi fixed the gurney he turned into a taco and can disassemble a chainsaw in under a minute. He apologizes, thinking he is sitting in Buck's seat, but he says he is good.

Buck tells everyone there that he really loved being part of the 118 these past 5 years and they mean so much to him and he has decided to put in for a transfer. He really thinks Ravi is ready to fill his spot and Eddie can replace Chimney. He says it is up to Captain on who is replacing Eddie. Hen thinks Chimney is coming back but Buck feels everything is broken and his fault. Bobby pipes up and says he is the one who told him to go; Eddie says he was the one who said it was the right thing to do as Hen reveals she even offered to go with him. She is positive Chimney is coming back and with Maddie and Buck will be right there, where he belongs.

Claudette is on a call when May gets a call from a teenager who says she knows she is being recorded. Her name is Lisa Barker, giving the names of people who voted against her. She admits her parents are at work. May learns Lisa is planning on hurting herself. There is an almost empty bottle of pills beside her, there are kitchen knives. She cries about how her entire team hates her. She was never good enough for her parents and everyone are bullies to her. She feels she shouldn't have called and that May doesn't really care and that she is probably wishing she got a different call.

May insists that she is there for her, saying she knows how she feels. Claudette says she is making this call about her and being dismissive about her feelings but May blurts out that when she was 14 she took a bottle of pills but her mother found her and saved her. Lisa drops the phone but within a minute the fire department arrives and finds her in the bathroom, as May knew exactly where she was. Claudette looks at her, confessing that she knows she rides her pretty hard but it is because she can see that May has the potential to be great. May says thanks as Claudette tells her she isn't great yet!

May uses her phone to watch Claudette socializing with the other operators, she walks over and tells Claudette that she is in her way. Claudette moves over so May can take her desk back. Buck gives Ravi props for his good work as Ravi feels honored that Buck picked him to fill his shoes but he likes being himself.

Athena meets with Michael and the counselor; both admitting they don't know what to do anymore. Michael saying that hitting him isn't a solution. Athena finds out that they want her

to see another therapist and asks Michael if this is his doing. He reminds her that they swore they would never hit their kids and promised they would never raise their kids the way they were raised and she hit Harry.

Buck comes home to Taylor, who prepared a beautiful dinner, saying all of this is just for him. He says she is right about Chimney leaving and it turns out that he got to talk to everyone before he left and got to say goodbye. She hugs him. Meanwhile, Athena tells Bobby what transpired at the doctors. Bobby feels Michael should have just talked to her, but she thinks Jeffrey would be pleased to know that his plan is working even better than he ever could have imagined. Bobby doesn't want her to give up on herself and on Harry. He promises to be right by her side as she loves her family and won't stop fighting for them. Bobby assures her that Harry knows she still loves him and will find his way back. She allows Bobby to comfort her.

Harry is on his tablet, reading an article about his mother getting away with murder but he is forced to put it down as his father demands him to come to dinner. Buck receives a call from Maddie, forcing him to explain that Howie is looking for her. She says that Howie sent her a video of their baby starting to crawl. Buck wants her to tell him where she is so he can come get her. She reveals she is safe but not ready to come home yet. He hears bells ringing in the background, but she quickly says she loves him and hangs up. He tells Taylor that he believes she is safe but he thinks he knows where she is.

Summary: Responding to a fire at a prison, Bobby and the 118 find themselves trapped in a deadly riot.



Freddie Vaughn arrives for work at Jamestown State Prison, and he's all smiles until he finds out that his first job of the day is to take the inmate Mitchell for a walk. He's the only guard that he likes, after all. All is seemingly innocent until they return inside and pass by a group of prisoners, at which time another inmate makes eye contact with Mitchell before stabbing Vaughn. A riot ensues.

Josh takes the 9-1-1 call at the dispatch center — it's a code yellow. The inmates have begun to take control of mul-

multiple cell blocks, fires are burning, and the situation is critical. This is not a drill.

Those fires aren't going to put themselves out, so the 118 arrives on the scene to take care of it amid the ongoing riot. They're escorted into the building by guards and quickly get the fire under control, but getting out proves to be a bit more difficult. They find two injured inmates as they turn to leave, and although the last remaining guard that's with them wants to leave them behind, the 118 refuses.

The group splits up, and Eddie and Buck carry one of the inmates outside to the ambulance. Two guards arrive shortly after to escort them to the hospital. Meanwhile, Bobby, Hen, and Ravi have no choice but to bring the other inmate to the prison's infirmary.

Upon laying the badly injured victim on the table, Dr. Cochran is quick to point out that the man is not an inmate at all ... that's Freddie Vaughn. Which means the other injured "inmate" that Eddie and Buck were carrying is probably also a guard ... so two prisoners are on the loose.

Just as Bobby radios over to Buck and Eddie to tell them to turn around and come back to the prison, the "guards" pull guns on them and reveal themselves. One of them is Mitchell.

In a flashback, we learn that Mitchell picked up a knife that was hidden in the sand on the ground when he "dropped" his apple earlier during his walk. After starting the riot, he and his accomplice, Dominic, found a quiet place to swap uniforms with the guards that they had incapacitated.

They make Buck pull the ambulance over on the side of the road so they can fully take control. Mitchell finds a photo of Christopher while rooting through Eddie's wallet, and in an attempt to gain some emotional leverage, he casually makes a comment about his son while reading off his home address. Though Eddie manages to stay calm, this sets Buck off, and he ends up getting smacked in the face with a gun.

Dominic and Mitchell remove the tracking device from the ambulance before leaving, which completely throws off dispatch and the police. Mitchell sits in the back of the ambulance while Dominic drives, and Eddie attempts to keep the injured guard alive with Buck's assistance.

Dr. Cochran remarks that the blade hit Vaughn's splenic artery, so they're going to need to sedate him to help ease the pain. However, Bobby wants to wake him up, because he may be the only person that can help them find a way to get out of there. The security pod won't be of any use, because the inmates are currently attempting to breach it. Though he's clearly in an unbelievable amount of pain, Vaughn manages to get out the word "gas."

And thus a plan is formed — Ravi will disguise himself as a prisoner and turn the HVAC back on and Bobby will go get nitrous oxide, which they'll put through the vents to calm the inmates down. The plan is a success, and Bobby makes his way back to the infirmary to find all of the inmates stumbling and giggling in the hallways.

We haven't heard much about Hen's journey in medical school lately, but this episode finally dives back into her new career path. Dr. Cochran's hand was injured when they were trying to keep the inmates out the infirmary, and he convinces Hen to "be his hands" while they perform surgery on Vaughn. As to be expected, Hen gets the job done.

Near the end of the episode, Hen reveals to her teammates that she's finally decided that she wants to go into general surgery.

Eddie and Buck are surprised to find that Mitchell and Dominic have taken them to a hospital. Mitchell tells Buck to help Dominic escort the injured guard inside. It's oddly quiet inside of the hospital, which makes sense once the room is swarming with police. The police also surround the ambulance, but Mitchell leans out of the doors and proclaims that he has a hostage — Eddie.

Earlier, Athena and Captain Maynard had looked into both Dominic and Mitchell's files. While Dominic didn't seem to have any promising leads, they learned that Mitchell has been on death row for 18 years, and he's recently been writing letters to his ex, Savanna. She had testified against him, so they tracked her down. In the process, they learned that Mitchell's son is in the ICU with congenital heart failure.

Inside of the ambulance, Mitchell tells Eddie that he came to the hospital because he wants to donate his heart to his son. Savanna arrives at the hospital, and Athena explains that Mitchell has been waging a tireless campaign to attempt to save him. He wants to be executed so he can have his heart, but death row inmates can't do that.

Eddie has always been a cool and collected character in tense situations on the job, which can be chalked up to his time in the army, and this episode is no different. Although he's being held hostage, he not only stands his ground in the back of the ambulance with Mitchell, but he actually manages to convince him to turn himself in. Eddie explains that Buck's girlfriend Taylor is a reporter, so they can spin a story to help get an exception for him to be a donor. But Mitchell doesn't want anyone to know who his son's father is, because he wants a better life for him.

Before they exit the ambulance, Eddie promises Mitchell that he will help him. He will fight for his son as hard as he'd fight for Christopher. Mitchell follows him out, and he quietly tells Eddie to promise that his son will never find out that he was the donor. And then he turns the gun on himself. Buck hears the gunshot from inside of the hospital, and he panics as he runs outside screaming Eddie's name. But the man on the ground is Mitchell.

Athena and Captain Maynard debate over what to do in the wake of Mitchell's death, because Athena wants to just let him donate his heart to his son and they can figure out the rest later. But it's way above their paygrade ... there's no way Mitchell will be pardoned for a triple homicide, even posthumously.

Athena has an idea, though: what about a commutation? Their request is granted, and Mitchell's son successfully receives the transplant that saves his life.

Summary: The members of the 118 race to rescue a man who claims he was carjacked, shot and buried alive. Then, they arrive at a home where the owner thinks her roommate is a ghost, Hen receives a visit from the past and Athena and family are concerned that Harry is still haunted by visions of Jeffrey.



This episode kicks off with a very unusual call for May. A man is buried alive, and the 118 must race to find him before he suffocates. May works with the 118 (Buck using a very cool sound sensitive tool) to detect the man screaming underground. From here, things only get weirder. Never one to miss a dramatic moment, Taylor is on scene reporting. Over the course of the episode, she and Detective Ransone butt heads as they both try to figure out who is responsible, chasing their own versions of the story to hunt down the culprit. Ransone discovers the buried man put a hit on his wife (who found out because said hit man fell in love with her and told her the truth), so they retaliated and tried to kill the husband instead. Obviously, things went very wrong. At the end of the episode, Buck confronts Taylor for trying to confront the murderer (that's the cops' job, says Buck) and they get in a little tiff about her drive to uncover the truth. As Buck sleeps, she looks at an ongoing case on her laptop and is rather emotional. It seems there might be a ghost or two in her past as well. What truth isn't she sharing?

It's been a bumpy few years for Hen and Karen as Eva made a threatening reentrance into their lives, Hen started medical school, and they became foster parents. This week saw Hen's own past ghosts return to haunt her again when Eva arrives at the station "to talk" (a.k.a., she's one of her 12 steps). Eva informs her she's moving away and asks for Hen's forgiveness. Hen

doesn't give it to her, and Karen is less than pleased with this information when Hen tells her. In a brilliant moment of healing, Karen confronts Eva herself, and she's able to express her fears and gain closure when it comes to Eva who reminds her that Hen loves her more than Eva. Eva might be a soft spot for Hen, but it's nothing compared to the love she holds for Karen. With that, Karen creates a romantic night with candles for just the two of them (complete with fire extinguishers under the bed just in case, of course) and tells Hen she wants to look forward now, not back.

Harry has continued to struggle with the trauma of his kidnapping and the lingering feeling of seeing Hudson haunting him everywhere. He's only opened up to May (and very little at that), but has a breakthrough this episode. His therapist reminds him no one wants him to "move on" from the trauma, they want to help him confront it and process it. So, in typical teenager style, Harry takes the concept of confronting Hudson literally and runs off back to the house where he was kept. As he stares into the very spot he was hidden, he crashes through the floor. His first call is the Athena who races off with Ransone to the house. There, Harry gets to see Athena in action mode, and she reminds him that he will always come before the job. He's momentarily alone with Ransone after an EMT checks him out, and they have a great heart-to-heart. Ransone's trauma has been very similar to Harry's, and he helps him feel seen and heard. It's with Ransone's advice that Harry decides he's ready to return home, to Athena and Bobby's house.

After Chimney hit the road with Jee to find Maddie, we've had precious few updates on how that search was going. This week, Chimney arrives in Boston in search of Maddie. Though he's there on a hunch based on distant church bells in Maddie's call, Hen hilariously points out there is an exact replica of said church and bells in California. While in Boston, he saves a baby in a parking garage until EMS arrives and he reconnects with Eli Cobb. They grab a beer and catch up on each other's lives. Eli offers some sage advice, that Chimney should take care of himself so he can be there for Maddie. Her inner demons will only make her feel worse if he shows up looking this rough. It's a sweet moment that helps him gain some perspective on everything, and the writers also take this moment to let us know they haven't forgotten that we still don't know how Howie became Chimney.

Summary: Bobby and the 118 race to save lives after an explosion rocks the hospital where Dr. David Hale is performing surgery. Meanwhile, Michael makes a life-changing decision.



It doesn't feel like it was that long ago that Michael met David in the elevator at the hospital. And now it's almost as if the two of them are ready to take the next step. Though when they see the news of a hurricane hitting Haiti, David breaks the news to Michael that he is going there to help with relief efforts. People have reached out and asked him to. Michael doesn't take the news lightly since he'll be away for two months at least, maybe longer.

That in turn makes Michael make the announcement to Athena, Bobby, and the kids that David is going to Haiti to help and before he does that, Michael wants to propose. He realized that not only can he not spend two months without him, but he doesn't want to spend the rest of his life without him. May and Harry are happy for their father, as well as Bobby and Athena. But how does he propose? Cue a montage of Athena, May, and Harry trying to help Michael pick out an outfit, a ring (or a watch).

Michael arrives at the hospital, ready to propose and change his life. But once he gets out of the car and starts walking towards the entrance, there's an explosion.

Like most major emergencies on 9-1-1, we are being taken back in time to an hour before the explosion. David is getting ready to head into surgery, trying to assure a worried wife that he's going to take good care of her husband; an elderly patient, Rupert, is officially cancer free so he

rings the bell; a little boy bumps into a janitor's cart and knocks over some chemicals. And this is where it gets a little rocky.

David begins surgery. The little boy, Parker, meets his new baby sister but he doesn't know exactly what to do with her, so he goes with the nurse as she does some tests on the baby. The janitor cleans up the spill as another nurse places some tanks in the medical storage closet. Though one drops on the ground because she fell, and when she tries to close the door, there's an explosion.

Multiple units, including the 118, are called to the hospital as it was a multi-story explosion. The 118 arrive on the scene and they start helping with evacuation, starting with the nursery.

The Call Center, meanwhile, is getting bombarded with calls. They have a white board set up with local hospitals and available beds, keeping tallies.

Michael is getting checked out but all he wants is to know where David is. David, meanwhile, is still in surgery. He's refusing to close up and not evacuate until someone tells them otherwise.

Buck is in the nursery, carefully handing each baby to Eddie, who then hands it off to the next firefighter and so on down the ladder. Because seeing Buck with babies is basically all we really need. With the babies doing well, Bobby sends Hen and Ravi for evacuation assistance in the east corridor. A guy on a gurney stops Bobby and wonders where his kids are, his baby. His daughter wasn't in the nursery, she was with his son, Parker.

Meanwhile, Hen and Ravi find Rupert but he won't leave until he finds Callie, the nurse.

Parker is still in the maternity ward and he sees the nurse who was taking his sister for tests dead on the floor. Baby Sofia is crying, surrounded by debris but she's alright. Parker immediately takes her in his arms and yells for help.

Parker goes into a patient room and calls 9-1-1. Claudette tries to help him and he tells her they're in Room 318. Buck and Eddie are on the move. Parker puts towels under the door, per Claudette's advice, but the smoke is still coming in. He pours water on the towel that was in a pitcher and the line is cut off.

Buck and Eddie make their way to the floor but the fire is fully engulfing the halls. The two of them spot fire extinguishers and make their way through the corridor and it's too much. Room 318 is gone.

Back on the ground, Eddie is near panic attack thinking about the little boy and his sister. Buck gives Eddie advice but it doesn't work out too well. However, Lydia gets a call from Parker, wondering where help is. She radios for Eddie and tells him about Parker. Eddie realizes Parker was in the wrong room as he's looking at his reflection in a sideview mirror, seeing "118" come out as "811." 81E.

Buck and Eddie finally get to the room. Both Parker and the baby are fine. They are both soon reunited with their parents.

Ravi and Rupert find Callie under a shelf, but her pulse is strong. They get Callie onto a gurney and Rupert can hear the ceiling collapsing so he pushes Hen and Ravi out of the way, risking his life and dying in the process.

After getting back to the tents, Ravi can't let go of the feeling that he was supposed to save Rupert, not the other way around. Hen assures him he did everything he could.

Ravi and Hen find Callie and tell her that Rupert didn't make it. And they wouldn't have either if it wasn't for him. They give her a letter that was found on Rupert and Ravi reads it. A final goodbye.

David is still doing surgery and still refusing to leave, despite the fire breaching the fire door and entering the oncology ward. They don't have much time. He tells his team of doctors and nurses to evacuate as he's staying with the patient. But they want to stay too.

Athena finds Michael in the parking lot and although Michael is fine, David is still in the burning building. There's a complication during the surgery so it takes a little longer for him to finish up.

Michael and Athena search the tents for any sign of David but no luck. They bring Bobby over and Michael pleads with him to check on David. The lights go out in the OR.

Bobby tells David that Michael wants to be his husband, and he's standing outside the hospital waiting to propose. David has to finish and Bobby does his best to give him 12 minutes. He goes over the radio to tell all available units to respond to OR Five for "defend in place." The 118, including three other units, head over to OR Five.

Outside, the patient's wife is desperately waiting for her husband. Athena and Michael take her hands and pray, as do surrounding citizens in the parking lot as the LAFD grab everything they can to block the door with a blazing fire before it. It's a beautiful scene with the LAFD, the citizens, and David and his team. Bobby hoses down the fire and it's just a matter of time before firefighters walk back out the doors.

Michael rushes to David when he sees him and the first thing David says? "Yes."

Later on during dinner, Michael announces to everyone that he's decided to go with David to Haiti. While he can't save lives, he can help rebuild one. Athena still loves Michael, she always will. She's happy for him but she is going to miss him. A montage of some of Michael's greatest hits come across the screen, as it's Michael's official send-off.

Sitting down on the engine, Ravi tells Hen he gets why Rupert did what he did. He spent practically his entire childhood in hospitals. Those doctors and nurses become your family. Chemo on the weekends instead of soccer tournaments but he was cheered on just the same. He gets why Rupert ran back into the building.

We finally got the start of a backstory for Ravi and it would be something to get "Ravi Begins."

Summary: Bobby and the 118 race to the rescue when an abandoned oil well erupts and causes a massive sinkhole in downtown LA. Athena investigates a 30-year-old cold case involving a casino robbery. Buck fears his relationship with Taylor might be ending, and Hen meets a man from her mother, Toni's, past.



The episode opens with a woman, Gabi, who's taking her driving test with a proctor named Chloe. While Chloe initially tries to maintain a professional demeanor, she begins to warm up to Gabi as the other woman talks about breaking up with her girlfriend and making the decision to move to LA.

Out of nowhere, an abandoned oil well underneath the road erupts and causes a sinkhole to open up right underneath their vehicle. The 118 responds to the call. While Gabi is okay, Chloe is a bit worse for wear. The two may have only just met, but the connection between the

women is clear as Gabi frets over Chloe and refuses to leave her side. Later, during a romantic montage featuring some of the show's couples, we see Gabi waiting for Chloe to wake up in her hospital room.

The 118 respond to a call where a man electrocuted himself while attempting to charge his car battery, ending up on his back in his driveway. The man, Clive Wexler, takes notice of Hen's nametag while she's checking him over, and he says, "Antonia Wilson? What year is it?" He explains that he and Hen's mother, Toni, were good friends a long time ago. He doesn't go into detail, and neither does Hen's mother when she asks her about him later.

Eddie and Buck begin to speculate with Hen as to whether Clive is a long lost love of Toni's, so Hen sets up a surprise lunch date between them. Clive is waiting at the restaurant with

roses, but Toni leaves shortly after she sees him. Later, she explains to Hen that she and Clive had an affair while she was still married to Hen's father. Despite her shame, Hen is more than understanding, given her parents' rocky relationship.

Toni tells her that she was going to run away with Clive in 1978, but she stood him up, and she hasn't seen him since. Hen does the math and realizes that her mother didn't want to leave because of her. She leaves Toni with Clive's number, and the two finally reconcile and go for a long overdue drive.

Athena gets a call about a robbery at the Fairwell Casino ... but she's about 30 years too late. Back in 1987, someone on a motorcycle walked into the casino, drew a gun on the dealer, and walked out with 1.2 million dollars in chips. They were never caught. However, someone just tried to cash in one of the stolen chips that morning.

Later, Hen's mom — who used to be a dealer at a casino — mentions to Athena that they would never have that many chips at a table unless a special request was put in. With that freshly planted seed of suspicion in mind, Bobby begins to pour over the old security footage. Then, he and Athena take a trip to the casino to act out a more PG version of their new role playing hobby to see if they can figure out the inconsistencies that they saw on the tape.

The two come to the conclusion that the person who entered the casino for the robbery was a different height than the person who left. Athena pays a visit to the man who tried to cash in the stolen chip and learns that it belonged to his uncle, who was a regular at the casino at the time of the robbery. He gives her a photo of him that he found, and the woman that's the current manager of the casino is standing next to him. They had been dating at the time, and she was a blackjack dealer. Better late than never, Athena solves the case, coming to the conclusion that it was an inside job.

Buck notices that Taylor has been acting weird and distant toward him. He tells the 118 that he's worried that the inevitable breakup is coming, thinking back on his dating history with Ali and Abby. Bobby chimes in that Buck's problem is that he needs to figure out how to talk to Taylor, tell her how he's feeling, and find ways to reconnect.

Buck does exactly that when Taylor evasively tells him that she's going out of town for a couple of days. We learn that the news article she was looking at in a previous episode — "Local doctor proclaims innocence after murder conviction" — was about her father, who is in jail for killing her mother. Initially, the coroner ruled her death as a suicide, but the police later came for her father eight months later when suspicion arose after further investigation. While the first jury was split on their feelings, the second jury convicted him. Taylor has complicated feelings on the matter, because he's her father. Now, he's up for parole, so she's going to travel to Oklahoma to help convince the jury that her dad is a good person.

Even though she tells Buck not to come with her, she finds him at the prison waiting for her. Taylor tells him that she couldn't do it, because she isn't sure if her dad deserves a second chance. He was angry with her, and Buck comforts her. Back in LA, they find common ground in the fact that they both have complicated family dynamics, and in sharp contrast to what Buck was initially thinking early on in the episode, they both say "I love you" for what appears to be the first time.

And he even remembered the oat milk.

Summary:	The members of the 118 are called to a series of emergencies around Christmas Eve. Then, Eddie struggles with an emotional Christopher.



The episode opens with a wife calling her husband only to discover he's at this holiday event with an entirely other family. The timing cheater gets hit by trolley as he makes a break for it rather than accept he's been caught by his two wives. It's peak comedy as they argue while he lays on the ground. The trolley driver won't get out for fear of the women, the 118 tries their best to ignore the shouts. The next day, Athena gets to break up their continued fight at the hospital. She reminds them they need to put this aside for their kids. They rally and realize they both deserve better than Arthur

the cheat. Athena's final line to Arthur? "Bigamy is still a crime in all 50 states, you might want to ask Santa for a lawyer."

In another office, Melina tries all day to ask out her work crush, and as the day ends he finally gives her a gift. She gets up the courage to give him the gift she bought, tickets to Philharmonic Orchestra. He doesn't answer and she tries to back away, falling into the opened elevator doors and landing on top of the elevator. On scene, Bobby is furious at the maintenance man for poor safety measures. But it's revealed he froze because he hates the Philharmonic and confesses he's had a crush on Melina. He rides with her to the hospital.

Dispatch deals with a repeat non-emergency caller, an elderly Mrs. Lange who calls every year at the holidays. When May learns of the caller, Athena drops by for a visit to remind her that misusing 9-1-1 is a crime. Mrs. Lange shares that she messed up on her daughter's wedding day 12 years ago, but Athena reminds her it's never too late to reach out.

The 118's final call finds a father backing into a parking spot underneath their upstairs apartment. He takes out a pole, collapsing half the structure on top of his car. The 118 extract him with the jaws of life and Hen checks his vitals as Eddie is faced with watching the man's wife and son worry if he'll live. The building is red tagged and everyone living in it is forced to evacuate on Christmas Eve. With the Red Cross en route, the 118 must leave behind dozens of now homeless residents.

It's anything but a happy holiday in the Diaz home. Eddie decorates the tree while Christopher supervises and quickly becomes more than a little demanding. He's clearly stressed over getting every detail right and Eddie is unsure why. Carla arrives and as they talk Chris wakes up screaming from a nightmare about Shannon.

At the station when Eddie tells him, Buck reminds Eddie that Chris misses his mom and that's not Eddie's fault. It's obvious Eddie is grappling over his guilt of not doing the holidays right for Chris. Later, a broken gingerbread house is the final straw for Chris who fully breaks down. When Eddie suggests they make a bigger one next year we get to the crux of Christopher's emotions, "You could be dead next year." He's lost one parent and is terrified of losing Eddie.

Eddie begins to struggle with fact his line of work causes Chris so much stress, and Carla reminds him that his job is important and the love of the job is also important.

The funniest storyline of the episode goes to Buck and Taylor stressing over their gifts for one another. Buck has never had to give a Christmas gift to a girlfriend before and he talks over ideas with Hen and Bobby while the 118 take in donated gifts. Bobby says he got Athena an engagement ring on their first Christmas (Buck quickly shoots that down). He tells him he might give her a back up generator and we're very thankful Hen and Bobby are there to tell him that's a horrible idea. While they collect gifts, Taylor takes Bobby aside and asks him if Buck would like either of the sweaters on her phone. Neither of them know what to get each other.

At the final Christmas party, they exchange gifts. Buck pulls Taylor behind the Christmas tree and she opens her box. He's given her a gold bracelet with a distress beacon in it, so he can save her any time she might be in danger. Help is just a click away. Taylor decided on a sweater for Buck.

Throughout the episode Bobby and Athena prepped for their big holiday party, but the cancellations slowly trickle in. First May due to work, then Buck and Taylor thanks to Buck missing Maddie, Chimney, and Jee. With fewer and fewer attendees, an idea arrives on Christmas Eve.

The team was clearly heartbroken to leave behind the displaced families after their final call of the night. With far too much food it was perfect for Bobby, Athena, and the 118 to bring Christmas to the families. Christmas morning the 118 and family set up a huge Christmas celebration in front of the motel complete with decorations, food, and gifts.

True to the heartwarming holiday episodes from 9-1-1 this one leaves us with a montage of happy endings for all the calls we met. Mrs. Lange reached out to her daughter who is on her doorstep, grand kids in tow, on Christmas morning. Arthur's wives celebrate Christmas together with their children around the tree, they all have the same smile. Melina and her coworker go on a Christmas date together.

The final moments of the show do deliver a heartbreaking blow. After Eddie struggles for days over Christopher's fear and distress, he announces at the Christmas party that he will be leaving the 118.

Summary: The 118 "speed" to the rescue to save a family whose pick-up truck has been rigged with a pipe bomb. Eddie has a rough transition into his new job, Buck makes an impulsive relationship decision.



A montage gives us a look at what Eddie has been up to since leaving the 118, including his morning routine with Christopher and his new job at the call center. He is the LAFD Liaison and also posts updates on the LAFD Metro Twitter, sending out press releases and more. The montage shows Eddie doing the same thing every single day, and each day he gets more and more tired of it.

While having dinner with Christopher, Buck and Taylor, Eddie tries to avoid talk surrounding returning to the firehouse.

However, it doesn't last long as Buck immediately knows something is wrong.

Buck knows that Eddie isn't happy, despite him saying he likes what he's doing. But it's not what he's supposed to be doing. Eddie is still a firefighter, and Buck needs to move on.

After Eddie helps on a call, Josh finds him and tells him that while he did a good job, he could have come to him with his concerns. Eddie is a liaison, not a dispatcher. He tells Eddie to never highjack calls again, and Eddie apologizes.

Christopher wakes up to find Eddie in the kitchen, contemplating his life choices. He tells his dad that he misses being a firefighter, and of course, he's right. While Christopher said it was scary, Eddie is brave, and he can be brave too.

The following morning, Eddie shows up at Bobby's house with a form requesting his transfer back to the 118. Eddie is ready to come home. Bobby is trying to understand what's changed,

and Eddie admits it's been a rough few months. Bobby talks about his wellbeing, and Eddie just wants back on the job. He is just concerned for Eddie, wanting him to talk to someone, but Eddie isn't listening. He just wants his job back, not a mental health check. Eddie says he can go to another house, and Bobby mentions that if he's looking for a recommendation to not come to him. Eddie doesn't like that Bobby has essentially turned on him after everything he's done for him and tells him to go to Hell.

A family is driving along the freeway and receives an ominous call about a bomb in their truck. If they drive below 55 mph, the bomb will go off. The unknown caller mentions personal things about their lives, so the dad calls 9-1-1.

Athena is dispatched, as well as the 118 and 147. Since they can't defuse the bomb, as it's under the car, the 118 and 147 drive beside the truck on either side and match its speed. Buck and Ravi go on top of the firetruck, and the 147's Lucy Donato does the same on her truck. Lucy jumps on the back of the pickup, and Buck does the same.

With the ladder extended, Buck and Lucy slowly start to get the family out of the pickup. Back at the call center, Eddie watches it all go down on the news, and he realizes something. He gets on the call and tells them that there is likely a pressure sensor somewhere. Eddie asks the driver to look around for anything that looks out of place, and sure enough, there's a pressure switch by the gas pedal. And they don't have much time, as they are heading right into construction.

The mom offers to switch places, the boys have their dad. She doesn't have the best mother-in-law, and Athena mentions how her mother treated her husband pretty similarly, until he asked her for help so she can feel needed. The mom gives in and gets out of the truck. Lucy, however, goes back in with some rope and tools and the dad comes out, with Lucy following behind. Once all are safely on the ladder, the truck drives into construction and seconds later, explodes.

Athena responds to a call about a man's front yard being filled with junk and useless items. Though soon, it turns into something more. Coincidentally, the family involved with the car bomb lives across the street. The mother tells Athena more about "Trash Can Kurt" and how they offered to clean up and filed a court order for him to clean up, but nothing worked. Athena starts putting the pieces together about the car bomber, that he knew things about them, where they lived. It was almost as if he lived right across the street and was looking in.

Athena has the mother go inside and lock the doors. She pursues Trash Can Kurt, along with a few other officers. When she opens the door, the house is filled with trash and trip wires. She slowly makes her way through the house and pushes some boxes forward and on to Kurt. The bomber suspect is in custody.

After making the daring rescue, Lucy hangs out with the 118 and other firefighters at a bar, sans Eddie who makes a quick getaway after seeing his friends so happy. Buck and Lucy are soon left alone and playing pool, getting to know each other more and drinking margaritas. Buck tries his hardest to avoid getting into an Uber with her and Lucy admits she likes seeing him squirm. The two of them get closer and Lucy kisses him, and Buck kisses back.

Hen and a drunk Buck take an Uber together and Buck explains what happened with him and Lucy. At first he says that he said no and that he has a girlfriend and walked away, but then feels guilty and admits to what he did. Hen initially tells Buck to be honest with Taylor, but then she retracts it and says that unless he plans on kissing Lucy again, no harm no foul. However, knowing how bad of a liar Buck is, Hen changes her mind and tells him that he needs to tell Taylor.

In the morning, Buck begins to delicately tell Taylor about him and Lucy, noting that things have been great between them and he would never intentionally do anything to hurt her. Instead of admitting what happened, Buck blurts out that he thinks she should move in with him, and Taylor says yes.

When Buck tells Hen, she is less than enthusiastic, knowing that once they live together, they will have nowhere to run separately.

Bobby is struggling to find replacements for Chimney and Eddie that won't be for just a day or two, going over numerous personnel files.

One replacement that hasn't been working out too well, at least for Hen, is Jonah Greenway. Hen had made a joke at a call that Jonah's nickname is Monday, since he won't last longer than a day, so Jonah makes the same joke and mentions he's more of a Tuesday when he comes back the following day. He also tries to call Bobby "Cap" but he is Hen's Cap, and Jonah is just the temp.

Hen tries to discuss the situation with Bobby until they're interrupted by Buck, who voices his concerns about Eddie. His transfer is supposed to be temporarily, like Chimney, he's supposed to come back. Hen mentions they are both coming back. Buck mentions that he had dinner with Eddie, and he just seemed different.

Bobby tells Hen to just give Jonah "Monday" a chance, and Jonah tells Hen that he's just nervous because of the 118, working with Hen, it's the assignment everyone wants. Hen admits he's a very good paramedic, but it's not about him. She just misses her best friend, and Jonah can't replace that. Jonah is going to try to earn her respect and not replace Chimney.

At home, Athena finds Bobby once again looking through the personnel files, it's like Bobby is a matchmaker. Three months of blind dates and still no match, at least no one that Buck or Hen approve of.

Athena, being Athena, once again gives Bobby some wise advice, noting that the 118 wasn't always perfect. Bobby built that magical and special team, and he's going to do it again.

At the firehouse, Bobby makes an announcement that Jonah is officially the 118's new paramedic. Buck tries to be a better Buck and look on the bright side, though that changes when Lucy is also welcomed to the 118.

Summary:	Chimney is determined to find a missing Maddie amongst the chaos of St. Patrick's Day.



The episode opens with a flashback to six months ago when Maddie nodded off for a moment and accidentally let Jee-Yun slip under the water while giving her a bath. It was an accident, but it terrified Maddie to no end and left her wracked with guilt. Previously, we knew that Maddie had dropped Jee-Yun off at the station and left Chimney a video message saying that she needs to leave.

Now, we learn what really happened. Maddie drove out to a beach and sat there in the sand for a while, looking absolutely

broken. She eventually walked out into the water fully clothed with no intentions of coming back to the shore. However, when her thoughts turned to Chimney and her daughter, she swam back to the surface, gasping for air. She wanted to survive.

Three days later, Maddie makes her way to Massachusetts Regional Hospital in Boston, which is where she trained to be a nurse. During an evaluation with a doctor, Maddie talks about her recent suicide attempt and the fact that she's had depression on and off since the death of her brother, Daniel.

During her stay at the hospital, Maddie finds out that she is suffering from postpartum thyroiditis, which can be addressed with hormone therapy. She cries in relief, because she hasn't been able to understand what's been wrong with her ever since Jee-Yun was born. They move her to the outpatient program at the Women's Center. Maddie begins attending group therapy and becomes friends with Kira, a woman trying to get sober after receiving a DUI while driving with her son in the backseat (who she can't see until she proves that she's not a danger to him).

At this point, Chimney's road trip to find Maddie has begun, and he's sending her video updates of Jee-Yun via email. Maddie calls Buck to ask him why Chimney is in Utah, and Buck hears the Old North Church bells in the background (which is how Chimney knew where to find her).

As seen earlier this season, Chimney managed to run into an old friend and coworker — Eli — when he arrived in Boston. He ends up staying in his basement so that he can continue to search for Maddie in the city. Chimney puts up missing posters at the hospital, and a nurse suggests that he try the Women's Center, because they specialize in postpartum depression. Chimney spends months sitting outside on the bench across from the doors with Jee-Yun every day, waiting for Maddie to come out.

Eli convinces Chimney to put himself to work while he's in the city instead of sitting outside of the hospital every single day, which is how he finds himself working as a volunteer medic at Boston's St. Patrick's Day parade... and he thought Cinco de Mayo in Los Angeles was wild.

Meanwhile, Maddie and Kira's friendship hits a roadblock when Maddie announces that she's ready to go home during a group therapy session. Kira is drunk, and she's also worried because she has a supervised visitation scheduled for that afternoon. Maddie brings her to the hospital to try to help her sober up, and Kira notices the missing poster that Chimney hung up on the bulletin board. She's furious, because all this time she thought that they were in the same boat, when in reality Maddie could have gone home any time she wanted to. And yet Kira can't see her son. She leaves, telling Maddie that she doesn't need her anymore.

As they make their way down the street through the parade festivities, Chimney admits to Eli that this is the best that he's felt in a year. However, they're soon interrupted by a man with an axe lodged into the back of his head thanks to an axe throwing incident.

Maddie is frantically searching for Kira when she receives a call from her phone. It's a bartender at a pub, and he tells her that he thinks her friend needs some help. They carry Kira outside when she gets there, and Maddie suspects that she's beginning to aspirate. The bartender calls 9-1-1, and luckily there's an ambulance nearby... which just so happens to have Eli and Chimney inside of it. Eli rushes over first, and Chimney follows shortly after. Both Chimney and Maddie are stunned when they see each other... cue the waterworks.

After bringing Kira to the hospital, Maddie finds Chimney waiting for her outside. He knew that if he waited on that bench long enough, he would finally find Maddie walking out through those doors. Chimney begins to tell Maddie that what happened with Jee-Yun in the bathtub was an accident, and she shocks him as she says that trying to take her own life wasn't. Maddie explains the details of her suicide attempt to Chimney, and she tells him that she got out of the ocean for him and their daughter, and she came to Boston to get better. She assures Chimney that what happened wasn't his fault, but Chimney still feels responsible, because he should have taken the warning signs more seriously. They both agree that they need to be honest about what they feel and what they want moving forward. And what does Maddie want right now? To see her daughter.

Chimney brings Maddie to Eli's to see Jee-Yun, and she immediately freezes when she sees how big she's gotten. Maddie doesn't want to hold her, because it's been so long, and she knows Jee-Yun doesn't like strangers. She begins to sob as she realizes how many of her daughter's milestones she has missed over the course of six months.

Later, she goes to the hospital to visit Kira, who now has to go back to detox, followed by another 60 days of outpatient. The two have a heart-to-heart as Kira reminds Maddie that she can still be there for all of the other important moments coming up for Jee-Yun; she needs to forgive herself.

Chimney arrives at the place Maddie is staying at with a crying Jee-Yun in tow. Things are awkward for a few moments until Maddie says that she wants to try something. She begins singing to her, and she settles down. Jee-Yun then makes her way over to Maddie and says, "Mama." Maddie tells Chimney that she wants to go home.

Summary: Athena investigates a robbery at a gas station that takes an unexpected turn when the would-be victim turns the tables on her assailant. Meanwhile, Bobby and the 118 race to rescue a novice diver who panics while in a shark cage, and a house sitter terrified of spiders. Then, Eddie reaches his breaking point, Chimney returns to the 118 and Maddie shares some news with Buck, who realizes he has to come clean with Taylor.



The 118 arrive to find a shark diver suffering from decompression sickness and unlikely to survive until the helicopter arrives. Fast on her feet (and going on experience), Lucy suggests they make a hyperbaric chamber in the field. The team rushes the diver to a nearby fish place and commandeers a freezer. Drilling a hole and using oxygen tanks, they stabilize the diver and slowly decrease pressure saving his life. As air transport arrives, the instructor comments he has no idea why the diver freaked out. The diver manages to whisper he has a shark phobia; diving was immersion therapy. While on the call, Buck is extremely formal with Lucy, and pretty much everyone notices.

Taylor and Buck work on compiling their things when Taylor notes that maybe the new firefighter needs a couch. Buck is more than awkward as he tries to act nonchalant about Lucy, but if Taylor notices, she doesn't let on.

While Taylor is gone, Maddie and Jee swing by for a visit where we get much-needed Uncle Buck content and the Buckley sibling chats we so missed. Buck fills Maddie in on the kiss with Lucy, who suggests he come clean about it. Not wanting to keep secrets, Buck decides to come clean with Taylor, who is obviously angry that he chose to ask her to move in one day after it happened. She leaves for a night but ultimately returns ("You made sure I couldn't leave") for a

hard conversation. Taylor isn't mad about the kiss; she's upset that it influenced Buck's decision to ask her to move in because of his fear of abandonment. She reiterates that she isn't going to leave, and he doesn't need to be afraid.

Finally back in LA, Hen meets up with Chimney at his place, and Maddie visits Buck to catch up on everything that's happened in the last six months. Sadly on the way home from Boston, the couple both realized they've grown apart and decided it was best to end the relationship. Of course, they'll share custody of Jee, but Maddie is now on the hunt for her own place and jobless. Back at work, Chimney finds things much different with Eddie gone and two new team members. He's also nervous about Maddie's first few times alone with Jee and constantly checks his phone. He arrives home one night to find Maddie avoided giving Jee a bath, obviously still upset over the last time she was in that room.

Only a few nights later, though, Maddie goes into the bathroom alone and quietly works through the trauma of what happened. She's about to accept it and realize she's not the same person and in a much better place. Chimney finds Maddie giving Jee a bath when he comes home, both girls smiling and laughing together. Though they are no longer a couple, there are clearly no hard feelings between Chim and Maddie.

A middle-aged woman begins to pump gas when a man points a gun in her face and demands her purse. She calmly refuses, and when he insists, she yells back that she feels no fear. He'll have to take the purse. He steps closer, and she sprays first him and then herself with gasoline, kicking away the gun. She produces a lighter and threatens to set them both on fire as the gas station attendant arrives and begs her not to take the whole block with her. She apologizes and suddenly drives away. On the scene, Athena finds it odd the woman apologized and fled when she wasn't in the wrong, so she heads to her home, where she finds a very worried sister. The woman, Pauline, arrived home smelling of gas, showered, and left before telling her sister anything. She relays the odd personality changes as well as a change in Pauline's voice to Athena.

Meanwhile, the 9-1-1 call center receives several calls about a jumper who turns out to be Pauline. She herself calls, and, as the 118 arrive, she tells Josh she climbed on the tower hoping to feel some kind of fear. Learning of the caller, Eddie (still at the call center and going through it) overhears the woman's conversation with Josh.

Buck and Ravi try to sneak up behind Pauline and pull her back, but Buck knows they are too exposed, and she might see them. Athena arrives and relays what she learned from the sister. Hen recognizes the various symptoms as symptoms and tries to talk her down by explaining the disease that can cause someone to stop feeling fear. All Pauline hears is that she's broken, and she begins to step forward. Buck and Ravi are able to grab her just in time.

Eddie continues with his therapy sessions, though is unwilling to share a deep dive into every trauma he's suffered. The therapist suggests they go back to his first trauma. The helicopter crash while Eddie was serving in the military, where he saved several of his fellow soldiers. They discuss fear, what Eddie is afraid of (but he won't say it), and later Eddie overhears the call with the jumper, who doesn't know how to function without fear.

Later that night, Eddie makes a call to his old comrade. Meanwhile, Chris is playing video games in his room when he hears loud crashing and yelling from Eddie's room. He tries to investigate but hears Eddie screaming, and the door is locked. In a panic, Chris calls Buck, who races to their house immediately. He calms Chris as best he can, then breaks down Eddie's door when he doesn't answer. He finds the room utterly destroyed and Eddie sitting at the foot of his bed sobbing. "They're all dead," is all he can say. Gently, Buck tries to calm Eddie down. After putting Chris to bed (or at least calming him down somewhat), Eddie whispers to Buck he didn't mean to scare Chris. They sit at the dinner table, and Eddie tells him that part of his therapy is to reconnect with some of the people he served with, so he called those that he saved from the helicopter attack. In doing so, he discovered they have all died. One in combat. One in a car accident. And one via suicide just last year. The realization sent him over the edge, and he broke down. Buck finally asks him what he's afraid of. "That I'm never going to feel normal again."

Eddie and Christopher talk about therapy and how exhausting it is to talk about things that are scary. And eventually, Eddie will feel better.

Eddie meets Frank for therapy, opening up about the helicopter crash and doing his job to save people. It's not his fault he couldn't stop the chopper from crashing. Eddie comes home to Buck, who was watching Chris. Eddie wonders if what they do is worth it, if it's just random.

With Chimney back at the 118, Jonah leaves for his new position at a different firehouse. And it's so nice seeing him and Hen working together again.

Lucy and Jonah catch up (literally since Lucy brought a baseball glove she found in her locker). She has been all over the news after saving a woman falling from her balcony, but she

doesn't like that so many reporters have been wanting to interview her. Jonah brings up how Lucy took a shot every time she came on the news after the freeway rescue, noting how she relished in her heroics. Lucy doesn't understand since anyone could have caught her. It doesn't make her special.

Back at the firehouse, Buck tries to comfort Lucy, telling her not to let it go to her head.

Lucy ran scenarios through her head about not catching the woman. She's trying to figure out a way she could have saved her that doesn't involve luck. Buck tells Lucy about the roller coaster incident in season 1 and how it affected him, all of the what-ifs. The woman didn't die because Lucy caught her. Lucy's luck could change tomorrow. So you take the win.

Following a call, Lucy and Hen take a kid to the hospital, where they are greeted by the woman Lucy saved, who is the trauma surgeon. Buck wonders if she feels any differently about catching her now, but Lucy says that that woman got to live. Doctor or not. Hen wonders how many people they've inadvertently saved by saving someone else.

Maddie brings in a crying Jee-Yun to the doctor's and soon to the emergency room. Maddie fears for the worst since leukemia is in her family. Chimney tries to bring up other options, but being a mother, Maddie is worried.

Chimney and Maddie are worried out of their minds over Jee, and they have a conversation that proves that no parent is perfect. Chimney once slammed a car door on Jee's hand by accident.

The doctor finally comes out and confirms that it was intussusception (an obstruction of the intestine), and they were able to get the intestine back to where it's supposed to be without surgery. Jee has a clean bill of health, and it's all thanks to Maddie bringing her in when she did.

A call involving a stop sign, foolishness, and dumb kids leaves Athena in a state of shock. A kid gets run over by a car after trying to steal a stop sign, and Bobby can sense her worry, which she passes off as adrenaline. What really gets to her is that the thief is a kid, a dumb, stupid kid. His friend tells Athena they were collecting signs for a scavenger hunt, and Athena tells him that two people, including his friend, almost died because of him.

Athena stayed up all night playing a card game she used to play in her rookie days. She can't shake the feeling that Harry has the same shoes as the boy who got hit. Bobby tells her that Harry's a good kid, but even good kids do dumb things. He assures Athena that the boy is going to be okay, and she lets out a massive sigh of relief.

Buck takes Eddie and Chris to an equine therapy program. An employee takes Chris on a tour, leaving Buck and Eddie to talk it out. Buck tells Eddie about a rule they had at the 118 before he joined. Don't go past the glass doors. They bring someone to the ER, hand them over, and that's it. Buck tells Eddie that their job is always to save the person in front of them; they aren't supposed to know what happens next. That got him thinking about the day Eddie got shot.

That wasn't even their call since they were only there for the kid, Charlie. Buck wonders if Eddie ever thinks if things had been different if they hadn't saved him. Maddie drops Jee-Yun off at Chimney's place, and she comes across a pile of photos that Chimney had printed out from his adventures with their daughter while she was gone. He was trying to document everything for Maddie, but seeing how many milestones she missed makes

The episode opens with a girl, Selene, who is showing off what appears to be her new house in a livestream for her followers. However, when she's showing off the sauna, the house begins to shake from the construction that's taking place on the property. She falls and is immediately knocked out as she hits her head. Her followers dutifully begin flooding the 9-1-1 call center with reports, though nobody actually knows where she is. Eddie and May team up in order to put the clues together, and they're able to find her par-

her upset. She visits Buck, and she tells him that she's afraid of repeating what he went through during his childhood with all of the secrets and problems in their family. Buck reassures her, reminding her that Jee-Yun isn't the first kid that she raised ... he was.

There are plenty of other moments that Maddie will get to enjoy with Jee-Yun, though. Near the end of the episode, when Chimney gets home from work, he and Maddie both get to witness their daughter feeding herself for the very first time. Chimney is quick to pull out his phone to record it, but Maddie tells him that he doesn't need to, because they're both there to see it.

Athena is at May's apartment, and her daughter asks her if she ever wonders what her life would be like if she didn't become a police officer. May tells her that she heard from USC, and she's running out of time for her deferral. She needs to decide what she wants to do, or she'll lose her place there. She likes her job at the call center, but she's not ready to give up on the idea of attending USC.

Hen and Karen's night out for dinner may have been a bust (which ended with their car getting broken into and Karen's purse and wallet being stolen), but Karen seems to be on a mission. As they get ready for bed, Karen brings up another idea for something fun that they can go do. Concerned about Karen's sudden obsession with getting out and trying new things, Hen asks her what's going on. Karen explains that her co-workers make her feel old. They're all much younger, and they go out almost every night. They're making the most of their lives. Meanwhile, Karen feels like she didn't get to have fun like that when she was their age, and she thinks she missed out on a key part of life.

Later in the episode, Hen receives a fraud alert on her phone. They cancelled all of Karen's stolen credit cards, but they forgot about Hen's card that was in her wallet as well. Rather than calling it a night, Karen hops out of bed, and they go to the club where the card was last used. They manage to get ahold of the woman's ID from the bartender as they request to close the tab that's under Hen's card, and they walk around the club in search of the thief. Sue informs them that everyone is evacuated other than senior dispatchers, and Bobby quickly confirms May is safe. It's then that Sue realizes she's left May and Claudette in the quiet room, so Bobby and crew jump into rescue action.

The day before the fire breaks out, May once again butts heads with Claudette. A high speed chase breaks out and May suggests the officers take an alleyway to cut off the fleeing suspect. Claudette tells her "not now" and dismisses her expertise. However, when that exact scenario is needed, Claudette informs officers of the cut off and casually says, "Seemed like the obvious choice" when congratulated by a colleague. May is furious she didn't get the credit and says as much to Bobby and Athena the next morning.

May has finally had enough of Claudette, and a heated argument breaks out on the floor. Claudette constantly belittles May, and May is angry she isn't a team player. Sue takes them

The 9-1-1 Call Center is in the midst of system upgrades in both going paperless and the new fire suppression systems. Things go horribly wrong when the independent contractor, Carson, doesn't hook things up properly and the system experiences a power surge and sparks a fire. The room, which consists of a system that sucks the oxygen from the room to suffocate the fire, activates with Terry in the room. Eddie busts his way in and realizes one room is already engulfed in flames.

off the floor to the new quiet room which is meant for anyone who needs a breather (or for two dispatchers who need to work their differences out). She leaves them in the room to calm down with the intent to return. However, when the fire breaks out, she forgets the women are in the room and only realizes when Bobby asks about May. Inside, May and Claudette both notice the room is warm, and May points out the floor is too hot on one side. She opens the door to find the hall engulfed in flames.

Upon seeing the raging fire, Claudette begins to show immense fear. It's only after May jumps into action and asks for Claudette's jacket that she learns why. Claudette has burn scars on her back; she was in a fire at some point in life. While they wait for help to come, Claudette comments on how burning bodies smell like cooking meat and boiling blood smells like copper. However, May keeps a level head, and when she realizes help is just on the other side of the wall, she uses Claudette's own words and severe attitude to pull her out of her panic. The women get up just as Bobby comes through the wall. If May's day isn't rough enough, the ceiling collapses on her and Bobby as Bobby throws himself over her at the last minute. Thankfully, everyone is ok, and only Claudette needs minor treatment for smoke inhalation.

While not officially back at the 118, Eddie is thrust into the center of a call when he discovers a fire at the Call Center. With the fire suppression system and alarms down, Eddie calls a mayday over the radio system, prompting the evacuation of all but essential personnel. With everyone outside (except the five who remain on the floor to field calls), the 118 arrives. Bobby asks about May, and when Sue realizes she is still in the building, Eddie immediately grabs the extra set of turnout gear and races into the building alongside Bobby. Throughout the entire rescue operation, Eddie never misses a beat and proves that he might just be ready to rejoin the 118. He and Buck also find and save Carson who is still trapped with a nasty broken leg in the basement.

Now that he realizes just how much he is meant for this job, perhaps he'll dedicate himself a little more to completing his required mental health assessments so he can really get back to work!

Chimney takes Albert to view potential apartments, and Albert tries to tell him he's questioning his career as a firefighter. Chimney dismisses him and tells him he's still just finding his way in the field and will be great at it. Later, at the Call Center, Chimney takes Albert up to the roof with him where they and their team will vent the fire. However, things go south, and Albert very nearly falls into the fire when the room collapses underneath him. Thankfully, Chimney pulls him back up. It's not until the Call Center that Chimney finally understands what Albert was telling him. Albert confesses he didn't want to disappoint Chimney, and Chimney admits he liked Albert looking up to him. Ultimately, he tells Albert that he loves and supports him and he will find a job that lets him be 100% himself. Sadly, this means we'll probably see much less of Albert.

The most shocking moment of the episode happens at the hospital when Claudette is wheeled in with no pulse and Jonah doing compressions. She's been down for 12 minutes and the ER doctor confirms her death. He casually says, "I can usually save them," to Hen before walking away, and she finds his tone more than unsettling. She knows that Claudette was fine before being loaded into the ambulance, and now she's beginning to wonder about Jonah. Hen suspects he could be what is known as an Angel of Death, a criminal offender who intentionally kills or nearly kills an individual in their care. Their motivations are typically for the power they feel over another's life and/or the attention they garner from others for saving a life. If Hen's suspicions are correct, Jonah may well be a serial killer if Claudette is only his latest victim.

The episode opens on a school bus, with a little boy drawing pictures depicting the French Revolution getting picked on. The bus driver has a heart attack at the wheel, making the bus swerve, hitting stop signs and cars until it rams into a gazebo. The kids go out the emergency exit, and the little boy does CPR, saving the driver's life. People praise him, calling him a "hero." He makes the news, receives the key to the city, and a check for \$50,000 for college. Thanks to the check, we find out that the little boy is Jonah. In

the present, he's still taking pictures, and he's asked by a woman what's it like to be a hero.

Following Claudette's funeral, Hen is still feeling uneasy about how it happened. She lets Chimney in about what she thinks, noting that Claudette was fine after the fire, then she coded, then she was dead. Hen tells Chimney about the spider call and how the guy coded after she left him with Jonah. She admits to looking through Claudette's medicine cabinet at the post-funeral reception, and she had high blood pressure. Chimney believes her. There could be something more behind it.

During a call, Hen and Chimney sneak into Bobby's office to look for the paramedic transfer forms Jonah submitted for Claudette and Perry, the spider bite pet sitter. Chimney suggests

logging into the computer and looking up Jonah's personnel file. Hen reads through the forms, where it describes Jonah pushing some drugs to restore normal rhythm. Meanwhile, the personnel file on Jonah states that he's only been with the LAFD for 14 months, and before that, he was in Chicago, Miami, Dallas, and Denver.

The team comes back from their call, and Hen and Chimney try to act natural through the firehouse when Lucy and Ravi stop them. In the car, Hen starts to feel bad about the whole situation, but Chimney tells her that she might be right, so they have to find out before Jonah hurts anyone else.

Hen catches Karen up on the Jonah situation, telling her that a guy at the 122 told her that he and Jonah were responding to a fender bender. Nothing major. But when he left Jonah alone with the driver, he was in full arrest when he returned. He died on the scene. Hen has yet to have any concrete evidence, so Karen talks her in to continue looking.

Hen meets with Chimney and tells him that people like Jonah always have an origin story. She shows him an article about little Jonah saving the bus driver. Once the attention goes away, Chimney figures he misses the adulation. So much so, he'd tried to recreate the experience over and over again. A malignant hero. He can only bring people to the brink of death and save them so many times until people get suspicious, so he moves towns and does it all over again. Jonah's been hiding in plain sight.

The two show up at Buck's place to talk to Taylor. They ask to see her footage from the Call Center fire. Buck and Taylor try to get more information from them, but Hen and Chimney are staying vague about it. The four watch the footage of Claudette and Jonah, and Hen spots a drug that Jonah is giving her, but they're not sure which drug it is. Off the record, Hen and Chimney tell Buck and Taylor about Jonah. Buck's not sure what to believe, trying to come up with reasons. Taylor thinks the reason is that he's a serial killer.

Hen and Chimney show the footage to Bobby and Athena, who are trying to understand the situation. It's not so much an angel of mercy killing; Hen thinks it's more complicated than that. Jonah is bringing people to the point of death and using his skills to bring them back.

Despite promising Hen and Chimney their conversation would be off the record, Buck finds out that Taylor has been digging into Jonah's past. He doesn't want her to do the story because then Jonah will know they are on to him, and it's also horrible. Buck tells Taylor that Bobby will do something, but she wants to do something. He reminds her that she said off the record and to promise that she won't run the story. She promises, but the look on her face says otherwise.

Bobby receives word from the chief that they have opened an investigation into Claudette's death. Jonah's been put on light duty pending the results. Hen breathes a sigh of relief, and Athena warns her to be careful. Who knows what Jonah will do.

On the drive home, Hen gets a call from Jonah. He doesn't think she gave him a chance to prove himself. To show her what he's capable of.

Hen calls Karen and tells her to get out of the house. She's worried Jonah's going to do something. He sounded jealous. Karen realizes that she isn't the one Jonah would be jealous of. Hen goes to Chimney's apartment, but no one is there. She begins to text him, but Jonah comes up behind her and drugs her, knocking her out.

Hen wakes up to a beeping sound and an unconscious Chimney on a table. Jonah tells her he's doing this because he can, having gotten medical equipment and drugs over the Internet. The real answer is that Hen gave him no choice. They're supposed to be on the same team. Jonah gives Chimney some adenosine to stop his heart despite Hen begging him not to. Hen tries to reason with Jonah to let Chimney go, but Jonah gets the "wrong" idea and stops his heart again. He shocks Chimney a couple of times, and his pulse is going again. As Jonah talks to Hen about needing a new partner, Chimney slips his hand out of the cuffs and presses a button to make it sound like he's flatlining. Jonah goes over to the table, and Chimney shocks him. Chimney slowly and painfully gets up, falling to the ground, and lets Hen free.

In the aftermath, Jonah is arrested as Lucy and Ravi watch on. Bobby wants to get in there, but Athena tries to stop him. "Tries" being the keyword, as Bobby successfully goes over to Jonah

There's a newscast about Jonah with the headline "Paramedic serial killer captured." And, of course, Taylor is the one reporting on it. Buck tries to call her, but it goes to voicemail.

In the hospital, Hen and Chimney are doing fine, though they will be staying a little longer for observation. Karen rushes over to Hen, relieved that she and Chimney are okay. She admits she was preparing herself for the worst-case scenario. Karen breaks down, telling Hen she didn't know where she was or if she'd even make it out alive. Hen assures her that everything's fine.

Eddie tries to get ready to go to Texas, anxious about seeing his family for his dad's retirement party. Buck tries to give him advice seeing that he's also from a screwed-up family, but Eddie tells him his family is not screwed up. Just his dad. He'll get in, get out, grab some cake, and say congratulations. Eddie's plan is basically to avoid speaking to his family for the most part and hang out at the hotel.

Eddie arrives in Texas, and Abuela, who now lives in Texas, greets Eddie. She tells him that his mother has been doing all the cooking, she insisted, except for the tamales that Abuela made. Eddie tries to talk his mother, Helena, into taking a break, but she doesn't want to. Ramon, Eddie's dad, tells him he should visit more, but Helena says that they can make some trips out West now that he's retired. Eddie barely speaks to his father, and when he does, it's a snappy comment.

At Ramon's retirement party, things for the Diaz family seem to be going well ... that is until Ramon tells Eddie he was thinking about including a story about him in his speech, about how the car was a wreck when Eddie's sister Adriana was born. Eddie tried to drive Helena to the hospital when her water broke, but Ramon didn't quite see it that way, and Eddie hasn't forgotten. It's revealed that Ramon wasn't really the best father Eddie grew up with, not being there for the family that much. Ramon collapses, and Eddie brings him over to a table. Eddie finds some medicine on him and makes his dad take it — Nitroglycerin. Helps open up his blood cells for circulation. Ramon admits he has three stents in his arteries. He didn't tell anyone because of pride.

Ramon is back to feeling normal, and Eddie admits that he recently had a panic attack. Ramon figures he didn't say anything because he didn't want to seem weak.

Ramon tells Eddie he tried to set a good example and never understood why he was so angry with him, why he was punishing him. Eddie thinks he was punishing himself more, but he's tired of being that guy. He's going to be better for Christopher and himself. Ramon suggests they can both be better. He doesn't want to miss out on any more of his son's life.

Summary: Another day in the life of the 118, as its members race to rescue a cliffside wellness retreat guru after his followers turn on him. Then, they respond to an emergency call at an upscale hair salon. Meanwhile, Maddie contemplates returning to work, Eddie and May make decisions on their future, as do Buck and Taylor, and the 118 gathers for a surprise wedding.



The episode opens with a group of people on a retreat who become angry when they learn there are hallucinogenic mushrooms in the tea that they've been served. The instructor ends up running off of a cliff, and by the time the 118 arrives on the scene, everyone is high as a kite. Buck appears to be put out when Bobby volunteers himself to go down for the rope rescue, as it's normally something the younger man would be assigned to. Due to the weight of the firetruck, the ground begins to crumble beneath it while Cap-

tain Nash and Lucy begin their descent. The truck goes careening over the side of the mountain, but nobody is hurt.

Back at the station, Buck is panicking because Chief Alonzo interrogated him in his office, asking where Taylor gets her information from and if he's one of her sources. He apologizes to Bobby for letting him down, because Taylor promised him that she wouldn't run the story. Later, Buck gives Eddie a hand patching the holes in the wall in his bedroom, and he laments over

being the guy that always needs to fix everything. Buck admits that he needed to get out of the house because he and Taylor are still avoiding each other. Eddie warns him that he can't keep his anger and resentment bottled up.

Chimney and Maddie go out for lunch to have a chat, but their wires seem to have gotten crossed along the way. He mistakenly assumes that Maddie wants to tell him she's ready to date other people, but in reality, she simply intends to announce that she's ready to go back to work. When Chimney gets home afterward, he finds Albert (who has quit his job at the fire department) stressing over a career aptitude test.

Maddie reports for her first day back on duty at the (temporary) dispatch center, and she texts Chimney after completing her first call. This raises more than a few eyebrows amongst the rest of the 118, who are with him in the firetruck, especially when Buck's text from Maddie arrives second. Everyone then proceeds to start bothering Buck about his own relationship problems, and Bobby accidentally learns about what happened with Lucy in the process.

As the Wilson family sits at the dinner table, Hen's mother Toni, and her partner Clive announce that they're getting married. Toni asks her if they can get married right there in the backyard, and Hen is thrilled, but Karen ... not so much. Her wife stands up and walks away. Hen finds Karen in the other room, and she explains that she's angry because Toni skipped out on their wedding, which was also in their backyard. Hen has forgiven her at this point, but Karen is still furious on her behalf because she saw how hurt she was. Karen goes to speak with Toni, and the two share a tearful embrace.

9-1-1 has a knack for giving audiences emergencies with heartfelt stories, and today's episode was no exemption. The 118 is called to the scene of an accident where a pregnant woman and her husband were hit by a truck when they were pulling out of their driveway on their way to the hospital. They're transported in separate ambulances, and while the woman and the baby appear to be okay, Chimney is concerned about the man's state of mind. He doesn't know what year it is ... and he doesn't remember his wife. He doesn't even know that he's going to be a father. He's lost his memory. Later, at the hospital, his wife comes to find him and reassures him that they'll get through this together. She settles down beside his bed and tells him the story of how they met.

After all of their time spent avoiding each other, Taylor is surprised to find Buck sitting on the stairs of the loft waiting for her when she gets home. She tells him that she's sorry that he was upset about her story, but she neglects to actually apologize for her actions. If she didn't break the news, someone else would have. She reminds Buck that he knew who she was when they started dating. Buck thought he could learn to live with it, but he's realized that he can't. And so finally, Buck and Taylor call it quits.

Eddie pulls May (who has finally decided she's going to school after all!) aside at work to ask her how Bobby is doing, and she tells him about how oddly he was behaving when she arrived at the house the other evening to find him standing in the kitchen with a broken glass. Taking matters into his own hands and once again showing off the great strides he's taken through therapy, Eddie goes to see Bobby, and the two have a heart-to-heart. Eddie implores him to understand that what happened with Jonah wasn't his fault. If he's going to keep blaming himself for it, he also needs to give himself credit for all of the people he's saved, too. After Eddie leaves, Bobby dumps the bottle of alcohol that he brought home down the sink.

Hen and Karen are confused when Buck, Eddie, and Chimney all show up for the wedding. However, it appears that Toni was hard at work behind the scenes making alternative plans for the day. She tells them that she decided to delay her and Clive's wedding. Instead, Hen and Karen will be renewing their vows, and this time she'll be there to witness it.

The episode ends on a lighthearted, happy note all around as we see a montage of each of our main characters: Maddie and Chimney grab lunch, Eddie and Chris share a father-son moment, Taylor amicably returns her apartment key to Buck, and Bobby surprises Athena by telling her that they're going on a cruise. And in the final moments, we pan to Station 118 as the team gets ready to head out on a call ... and Eddie Diaz comes sliding down the fire pole.

Summary:	A blimp's engine catches fire, The 118 rescues victims both inside and outside a packed stadium. Bobby and Athena drop off May on her first day of college and discuss honeymoon plans, while Maddie and Chimney go to couple's therapy.



The episode opens with a major emergency! Two blimp pilots headed for the Cal-Am Bank Stadium suddenly lose control. Their engine explodes and the elevation wheel is disabled. The blimp is unable to miss the stadium and crashes into the top, precariously perched on the scaffolding as it teeters back and forth.

Buck and Hen shut down the power lines as Athena heads into the stampede of exiting patrons. Athena finds the young girl whose "wires" are actually a pump for her heart. With the pump malfunction-

ing, Athena goes in search of the girls' mother finding her just in time. She's able to reconnect the new device to save the girl's life and both mother and daughter are reunited outside the stadium (as they're loaded into ambulances).

With the fire on the blimp out, Eddie, Chimney, and Buck rescue the pilots. Chimney safely gets the co-pilot down but the blimp's delicate balance is thrown as Eddie enters to assist the pilot. Buck takes him down the ladder just as the blimp teeters dangerously, but Eddie is able to jump onto the ladder.

At the station, Lucy lets Bobby know via video chat she'll be out for 4-6 weeks with a broken foot thanks to her seven year old niece which leads to the reveal that Bobby asked Lucy to fill in

as interim captain while he's away on his honeymoon. Later that night as Buck cooks for Eddie and Christopher, Buck vents about being annoyed that Bobby passed him, Eddie, and the rest of the team over. Christopher hilariously points out that Buck doesn't even have a couch, how does he think he can run the 118. It seems Taylor took her couch back when they broke up!

Several days later, clipboard Buck returns as he inventories the ambulance like he's running for election. Hen isn't having any of it when he tells her the fluids are low. "Per my report," says Buck, the windshield fluid is down to only 3/4 full. It's a final straw for Hen who snatches the clipboard and heads to Bobby's office to demand he name a replacement. He tells her that she's actually his pick, but he didn't want to overburden her. Hen tells him it's not a burden and she accepts the role while he's away. Bobby has to break it to Buck who is fairly upset at being rejected, but Bobby ensures him he's going to be a great leader he just needs more experience first. Bobby tells him to take stock of his life and find what makes him happy and the rest will follow.

With Eddie and Christopher at his house again for game night, Buck studies the empty space where his couch was. Rather than get another couch, he chooses to move his familiar and loved leather armchair to that spot instead.

Meanwhile, Maddie lands at Chimney's after a plumbing emergency forces her out of her apartment. She's ready to call a hotel but Chimney offers to let her stay with him, they're family after all. Naturally, Josh is already shipping them and pushing Maddie to open up and tell Chimney what she wants. She takes that advice on their next movie watching night, and indirectly tells Chimney she'd rather two people who struggled get their happy ending. He reaches out to test the waters and the end up wrapped in each others arms (and Chimney's bed).

Unfortunately, Chimney runs away to his next shift the following morning and Bobby gives him a hard time for it. Maddie is obviously upset and when Chimney returns that evening they finally have a talk. Maddie tells him she's not leaving their family, she wants them all together. She takes his hands and promises him she's done running. He promises the same.

May is finally ready to head to college though she's second guessing herself having taken a year off to work and get her bearings. However, she's committed to "the full college experience" and Athena reminds her she's going to be ok. With that, Bobby enters and we learn he's quite the Type A trip planner, having all their honeymoon cruise time planned out. However, when Athena catches up with Hen later she tells Hen she doesn't mind indulging him. She knows he's trying to show her a good time. Meanwhile, Hen is swamped in class work and regular work as she tries to balance everything.

A father and son are golfing, or rather the son is being taught to golf, when he takes a truly terrible shot right into a shredder. As his father stands by he reaches into the machine and his club falls hitting the on switch. His hand is only cut up a bit, but the machine pulled off his ring and flings it out the other side and right into his father's chest.

The 118 responds with Buck taking charge (in an effort to prove himself as a choice for interim captain), wrapping the scene in caution tape as Chimney and Hen evaluate the father. Luckily, his rib stopped the ring puncturing the lung and they're able to get him in the ambulance quickly.

A local car dealer runs a competition wherein the person who can stay touching a car the longest wins said car. With two contestants left the woman begins screaming. After evaluation, Eddie believes she in kidney failure but the woman won't go for treatment because she needs the car. Bobby tries to compromise with the dealer, asking him to pause the competition for them to get treatment but he refuses. They must be touching the car at all times. With that logic, Bobby sends an all too happy Buck to retrieve the saw and cut off part of the car to take with them. With a rev of the motor, the dealer finally relents.

The episode closes with Bobby and Athena Facetimeing Athena's mother as they get ready to leave for their honeymoon. Bobby is in his very loud Hawaiian shirt, Athena has her bags ready to go and they are just about to tell her goodbye when she hears an engine rev. She drops the phone as Bobby and Athena see the phone fall and a car crashes into her house.

Summary: The 118 race to the rescue when a structure collapse at a "happiness convention" traps people under rubble. While on FaceTime with her mom, Athena's father suffers a stroke and crashes through the wall of his house. Hen stretches herself too thin with test prep and her new responsibilities at the 118, while Maddie tries to help a new recruit get his bearings at the call center.



Benjamin is in his yard watering his plants and minding his business. But his nosy neighbor, Gary, mentions through his kitchen window to remind Benjamin that California is currently in a drought and he should curb his water usage. Benjamin reminds Gary that he is watering his yard during the allowed hours and gets back to it. But once he fends off Gary, Benjamin notices something: his planter box isn't level. One corner is sinking into the ground. Suspecting gophers, ants, and other kinds of vermin, Ben-

jamin spends the next several days utilizing all types of traps, trying to kill whatever is underneath the soil. But nothing seems to work; his planter box has sunk even more.

One morning, his wife is in the bedroom, and there is an explosion outside that blows in the sliding glass door and throws her across the room. She calls 9-1-1, and the 118 are dispatched to help. Upon arrival, the team learns that Benjamin has caused the explosion in his latest attempt to rid his yard of vermin, a la Bill Murray in *Caddyshack*. And we all learn pretty quickly that the only vermin underneath the soil is named Gary. Apparently, there is a tunnel that exists between Gary's house and Benjamin's house because he and Benjamin's wife are having an affair. Benjamin's wife explains that this was the only way they could successfully carry out their

affair because Benjamin has cameras all over the property. And the "tunnel of lust," as Chim calls it, has now collapsed, thanks to Benjamin's explosive idea.

The 118 successfully rescue Gary from the collapsed tunnel, and they then arrest Benjamin for attempted murder once he admits that he suspected his wife was cheating on him with Gary.

With Bobby out of town, Hen is acting as interim captain of the 118. She spends nearly all of her time either studying for her 3rd-year med school exams or doing paperwork at the station. It becomes clear pretty quickly that she is burning the candle at both ends, with every minute of her day scheduled for a class, work shift, or study break. Stacks of flashcards are everywhere for her to constantly review her schoolwork. We see Hen grabbing some sleep time in the fire truck in between calls, and then we see her rushing to class in her fire gear and being called out by the instructor for arriving late.

At one point at the station, Chim asks her why she took on the role of captain when her 3rd-year exams are right around the corner. She tells him that the assignment is only for a week, and she can handle it. At home, Karen has similar questions for Hen, and she is terribly worried that Hen isn't getting enough rest with everything on her plate. Hen tries to calm her nerves as well, with claims of "I can handle it" and "It's just a few more days."

The time has arrived for Hen to take her exams that will determine if she can continue into her 3rd year of medical school. She pores over every question in the booklet and fills out the bubbles on the Scantron. But soon, she seems to become confused. She starts erasing and then changing some answers while her classmates finish up and leave the room. Eventually, Hen is the last one left, and time has expired; Hen has to turn in her exam.

On the way home, Hen is clearly sleepy and cracks open her window to let the cool air keep her awake. But it isn't enough: she drifts off at the wheel and is startled awake at the sound of a car horn. She swerves out of the way of oncoming traffic and comes to a stop in the middle of an intersection, blessedly unharmed.

Several days later, Hen gets a call from the medical school. We don't hear the conversation, but we see Hen walk into her house. Karen greets her and reminds her that Denny's robotics meet was earlier. Hen curses at herself for having missed it. She then seems to have the beginnings of a panic attack and slumps down into the chair. Karen rushes over, and Hen tells her that she failed her exam.

Later, after taking a several-hour-long nap, Hen admits to Karen that she fell asleep at the wheel the night of her exam and that she's been running herself ragged, trying to study and be captain of the 118. Her instructor told her that she'll need to repeat her second year of school, and she doesn't see any way she can do another year. Karen tells her that she has to choose: either she is a doctor or a paramedic. She cannot be both any longer because her family needs her safe.

At the station, Hen sees Buck reading a book. He tells her it belongs to Bobby. Concerned that he might be struggling with sobriety, he explains that Alcoholics Anonymous touts the belief that if someone is at ease, then all their fear will fall away. He tries to get some wisdom from Hen, asking her if she is at ease. She explains to him that she is clearly not at ease.

Later, the International Happiness Symposium is being held in the city. Three lifelong friends arrive and check in at the front desk. Frankie gets Ronny, Angelo, and Lev their badges and some pamphlets and gets to know the guys a little more. They've known each other since they were in sixth grade and used to be in the school band together. Frankie then walks off to grab some more chairs.

As the friends are walking through the crowd of people, trying to decide which panel to attend first, Lev hears cracking sounds coming from the walkway above their heads and sees a fissure start to form in the concrete. He then sees the huge structure start to collapse and yells for everyone to get out of the way.

When the 118 arrive, we see that there are several dozen injured persons, and the three friends are all buried underneath huge slabs of concrete. They're all conscious, but it's a race against time to get them out. After some maneuvering, Ronny and Angelo are successfully removed out from under the slabs. But the slab that's fallen on Lev is going to need more manpower to remove it, so Buck stays with him to talk to him and monitor his vitals.

"Why a happiness convention?" Buck asks Lev. Lev tells him that he has been trying to figure some stuff out in his life. He talks about how he has spent his whole life doing everything he was supposed to: a wife, kids, a nice house, cars, and weekends at the beach. And since he's retired,

he's realized his nice life is nothing more than a 40-year blur. "What was the point of ... any of it?" Lev asks no one. This catches Buck's attention.

Then, Frankie, the worker who helped the friends earlier, calls in to the 9-1-1 call center and tells Noah that he is completely buried and is scared no one will find him. Noah relays to Hen about Frankie, and Hen locates him pretty quickly. When Frankie is safely on a stretcher, Lev asks Buck if they saved the kid. He says they did and that he is next. Lev says, "It's ok. I got what I came for," and he flatlines. Buck and Hen frantically remove the large concrete slab from Lev, and Buck starts chest compressions. But Hen knows they're too late and calls the time of death.

Back at the station, Buck is struggling with what he encountered earlier. He asks Hen what she thinks Lev meant when he said that he "got it now." What good does it do to learn the secret of happiness, only to immediately die and not be able to share it with anyone? Hen tells Buck that perhaps, the fact that he learned it is what they should focus on. "What do you think is the secret to happiness?" Buck asks Hen. Hen responds, "Some answers you gotta find on your own, Buck."

Bobby and Athena arrive to the Florida hospital where her father Samuel is in a medically induced coma. Beatrice is unharmed, but she is having a very difficult time accepting the reality of things. The doctor explains that Samuel experienced a stroke, and his prognosis is uncertain. He doesn't know if Samuel will even respond to treatment. Beatrice takes offense to this news and tells the doctor not to take that tone with her. Bobby calms down the situation and explains that everyone just needs to be patient for the time being.

Back at her parents' house, Athena sees that their car is still lodged in the side of the house. She asks her mother why she hasn't had it removed yet, and she tells Athena that Samuel can do it when he comes home from the hospital. Athena tells her that it isn't clear if he is even coming home, and if he does, he won't be in any shape to do physical labor. This upsets Beatrice, who argues with her daughter about her husband's health. Bobby again cools down the situation and suggests that he and Athena stay at a hotel and out of Beatrice's hair.

The next day, Bobby and Athena survey the damage done to Samuel and Beatrice's house. Athena mentions their family friend who is a handyman, who can help with the larger construction needs. Later, Junior arrives, and Athena tells him that he isn't the Franklin she was expecting. Junior says that his father is mostly retired now, but he can handle anything they throw his way.

After meeting Bobby and looking over the damage, Junior mentions reframing will be needed. Bobby asks him about building a ramp and making things more accessible before Samuel gets home. Beatrice overhears this and becomes upset again. She doesn't understand why anything needs to be changed at all and accuses Athena of talking about her father as if he were already dead. When Athena tries to explain, Beatrice then accuses her of wanting to fix up the house to sell it out from under her. Bobby then tells Beatrice to stop talking to Athena that way and to go cool off.

When Beatrice leaves the room, Athena apologizes to Junior for having to witness that. Junior says he understands and that parents become set in their ways when they get older and turn back into children. "We end up parenting our parents." Later that evening, Athena reveals that Junior's comment has been on her mind. She tells Bobby, "You know the worst part about having to parent your parents? It's knowing that you're that much closer to losing them."

Athena arrives back at the hospital to visit her father, and Beatrice is there. Athena sits next to her mother, and she sees Beatrice has a stack of letters that her father wrote to her while he was serving in Vietnam. Beatrice tells her that he wrote her a letter every single day. In their 57 years together, they have never let a day go by without some form of communication with each other. "Until now," Athena guesses. Beatrice tells her daughter that she isn't scared of the possibility of Samuel not being able to walk or clothe himself. What she fears the most is that he won't be able to speak. She tells Athena that she needs to hear his voice just one more time. She cries and collapses in Athena's arms.

On her way back to her parents' house, Athena is confronted with dozens of police lights flashing outside. She runs up to the house, where Bobby meets her. He explains to her that while he and Junior were working on the reconstruction, a body was discovered. We then see a callback to the 7th episode of the second season, "Haunted," when Athena is telling Hen about the time she decided to become a policewoman. A little girl had gone missing in their neighborhood,

snatched right out of her bed. The only thing the police found was a hair barrette out in the middle of the woods. She tells Hen that she promised herself that when she got older, she would become a police officer and would find the girl.

Back in the present time, we see a cop carry an evidence bag past Athena with a single hair barrette in it. Athena knows whose body has been discovered. "Tanya Kingston!" she says.

Beginning in 1977, we start off in a family's home, Athena's home. Athena's dad comes home smelling like a "greasy mechanic," seemingly a bit sketchy ... Later that night, Athena awakes to a frantic knock at the door. A mother is looking for her daughter, Tanya, not knowing where she is. Athena overhears everything and watches it all go down, but her dad orders her to go back to her room. She is terrified and not able to go back to sleep. Soon, she can hear sirens and search parties going on.

As Athena plays hopscotch with her friends, a police car rolls up with Tanya's older sister, Joanne, but the reunion with the mom is not very happy as she's been getting into trouble. Athena walks over to the officer and confronts him for not working hard enough to find Tanya. She walks over to Tanya's window, where she was snatched from, and Samuel comes up to her. He warns her that sometimes she shouldn't let curiosity get the better of her and to be careful.

In the present, Athena's outside her dad's hospital room as detectives gather samples. All of that aside, the doctor tells them all that he is improving and could be out of his coma soon. Detective Dixon comes out, and Beatrice berates him. Dixon wants Athena and her mother to take some statements, but Athena is reluctant.

Athena and Bobby return to the house and see Junior and his father, Reggie Senior. She asks Reggie what he remembers from that night and afterward since she was so young. He tells her

that anyone could have put that girl in the foundation. Coincidentally, the Florida room where Tanya's body was found was a project that Samuel kept putting off but had a sudden change of heart. He asked Reggie to build it the day after Tanya went missing.

Athena wakes up in the middle of the night to find Bobby in her dad's office looking through some of his things to get more insight. She doesn't like that Bobby is looking through it and grabs everything to put it away. Athena wants to be the daughter, not a police officer, no matter how much she wants to solve the case. Bobby asks Athena what she's afraid of, and she admits she's afraid that he could have done it.

Athena and Bobby go over that night and the details of it. She can't get over the coincidences between her father coming home late and looking and smelling dirty and Tanya's kidnapping. Athena's concerned that her father might have had a life outside the house that she knows nothing about. He's her hero.

The couple checks out Tanya's house, looking run-down but still the same. Joanne comes out and wonders what they're doing. She pulls out a gun and aims it at Athena, calling her the daughter of a murderer. Bobby grabs Joanne and manages to get the gun away from her so Athena can talk to her. Joanne says she has no family left and hesitantly gives in.

Joanne takes Bobby and Athena to her and Tanya's old room, still looking the way it was since Joanne put a padlock on it. Athena notices the flower box outside the window, indicating that that's the window she was taken from since it's crooked and looks like it's been stepped on. Bobby, however, points out that it's been stepped on more than once. Joanne used to sneak out of that window and confesses she and Tanya both snuck out that night.

Joanne sneaks out, but Tanya quickly follows behind. Tanya gets to a bonfire that Joanne is at, and Joanne is not happy. Tanya threatens to tell their mom if she doesn't get to stay and also doesn't get a beer. Joanne promises to take her to the movies if she stays for only 30 minutes, and Tanya obliges.

Soon, Joanne loses sight of her sister and assumes she went home. After hearing a car come by, Joanne decides to go home since it's getting late. Unfortunately, when she's back in her room, Tanya isn't there.

In the present, Joanne mentions she never told the police or her parents what happened. If she hadn't snuck out that night, Tanya would still be there. A police car comes up, and Joanne tells Athena and Bobby they were trespassing.

Detective Dixon arrests Athena for interfering with an active investigation. Joanne apologizes to Bobby for getting Athena in trouble, and Bobby tells her that she can hold her own. After Bobby tells her that Athena will likely tell the detective what she told them, Joanne tells him that the car they heard that night was a car they had never heard before.

Athena tells Detective Dixon what Joanne told her, and Dixon brought up that he has three girls of his own who never wear their barrettes to sleep, so he figured as much that she wasn't taken while she was asleep. So far, there is nothing in the forensics that match her father's DNA, and when she goes through how Tanya was put in the foundation with the cement, or rather, how the cement was doused on top of her, she comes back to Reggie Senior.

Bobby finds Reggie's truck, realizing that he had heard that sound that Joanne was describing from his truck. Athena calls Bobby to tell her it was Reggie, and Bobby tells her the same thing. He needs to warn Joanne.

Athena tries to figure out how Mr. Franklin would know that Tanya was at that party, and she realizes that Junior is the only other one at the house. Meanwhile, at Joanne's house, Junior comes up behind her and aims a gun at her.

Junior takes Joanne outside and prepares to kill her to make it look like a suicide since all that guilt has been building up inside her. In the past, at the party, Junior runs up to Tanya as she's about to leave, and he offers to drive her home. They stop at a field and drink beer, but Tanya starts to get nervous, especially as Junior touches her and grabs her. She runs away from him.

In the present, Bobby takes down Junior and they fight. Joanne grabs the gun and pulls the trigger, but Junior gets away. Athena goes after him, running through the fields. In a parallel, Tanya is running away from Junior in the same field of trees. Tanya runs out of breath and Junior catches up to her, strangling her. Athena catches up to Junior and hits him over the head as Detective Dixon runs up to them and she handcuffs him.

Athena and Detective Dixon watch Reggie Senior in the interrogation room, and she interrogates him. Dixon comes into the room with a box of evidence. Junior didn't stop at Tanya Kingston. Reggie tells them Tanya was just an accident. But it was six girls, and the police aren't done searching.

Athena talks to Joanne, who may be ready to finally move on for a fresh start. She assumed that everyone had forgotten and moved on with their lives. Athena says she never forgot.

Samuel finally wakes up, and Beatrice had just finished catching him up on Tanya. He says it's in Athena's nature. She's just glad to have him back.

Buck meets up with an old roommate and his wife after a vague phone call and is caught off guard when the couple asks him to be their sperm donor. He's hesitant but is also on a "year of possibilities" kick wherein he will say yes to the opportunities that come his way. After the lunch, the roommate visits him at home to again explain why they want Buck. He knows Buck's character and knows he has a good heart, something that is more important to them than just picking physical features or an aptitude for

sports or smarts. It's a huge decision, and not one Buck takes lightly, but after a drunken conversation with Hen and thinking it over, he ultimately decides to be their sperm donor.

After Bobby's return, thanks to a call from Karen, Hen is ordered to take some time off. She ends up back at the firehouse just for "some noise" pretty quickly and is again ordered home by Bobby. She doesn't enjoy the silence and calm around her and is more than thankful when Buck arrives unannounced to talk through his roommate's sperm donor request. The duo breaks out the vodka and take shots as they talk through it. Hen breaks it down for him and says it comes down to if he can know that he's a father and walk away from the child. After fielding a hilarious call from Bobby on the dosage for a tiny patient, Buck tells her the mental math skills are impressive and that she'd have made a great doctor.

After sobering up, Hen knows what she wants and approaches her instructor to ask for a second chance. She tells her that while she bombed the test, she has years of field experience

and knows without a doubt she can be an incredible doctor. The instructor agrees to take her on a practical exam alongside her with real patients to evaluate whether Hen will be allowed back into the program without repeating the previous year.

Eddie is more than a little surprised to get a call from Chris' school informing him that Chris has been skipping Science Club in favor of hanging out with his friends at the park alone. He grounds Chris for lying and forces him to the club, where Chris refuses to participate. Eddie picks him up early and gets the silent treatment all the way home. He talks this over with the 118 and his father, who all remind him that Chris is at the age where he is starting to want some independence from his father. Eddie needs to trust him to help Chris know he can trust himself, which leads to a heated but heart-warming conversation between them. Though he is grounded, Eddie wakes up to Chris playing games with his friends online. Chris calls him a bully and tells him he doesn't need Eddie protecting him all the time. Eddie tells him he's not sure he knows how to stop protecting, and together they work out a way to let Chris have some space. Eddie asks that there be no more lying between them but understands Chris wants to have time with his friends alone at the park. They agree, but that won't start until Chris' new additional week of grounding is finished.

With Bobby returned to the 118, the crew gear up for an overdose call in the aftermath of a frat party. The crowd is panicked, including the main female who takes them to the patient ... the patient who has four legs and a fur coat. The tiny dog named Hoover accidentally ingested a pill, and his little heart rate is weak. With no one sure of the correct dosage for the medicine that can help, Bobby calls Hen, who is day drinking with Buck. Hen does some mental math and saves little Hoover.

Bobby scoops up the little dog and informs the college kids that Hoover will be visiting a vet and then taken into protective custody, aka he'll be living with Bobby and Athena. Athena learns about this when she returns home, and though she's not thrilled, she doesn't give an outright no. Perhaps the 118 will have their own four-legged mascot now!

The 118 arrives on the scene of a crash involving two vehicles and a bicyclist. The cyclist suffered a broken leg and informs the crew that the driver hit him then swerved into the other vehicle. Chimney finds the driver unconscious and smelling like a liquor store but jumps to action when he finds a pulse. Unable to open the door, he's in the passenger seat when the driver suddenly wakes, sees the flashing police lights, and takes off driving again with Chimney inside. Ever the hero, Buck jumps on the injured biker's cycle and races after the car while two other cop cars also join. Listening to the radio traffic, Buck is able to head off the car and stops in the middle of the road. At night. In front of a drunk driver. The man barely sees Buck and slams the brakes in time, but it works, and Chimney is thankfully unharmed.

Maddie takes the brunt of emotions this week when she gets a frantic 9-1-1 call from a little girl asking for help from her abusive father. The father has found her and her mother and is attempting to break into the room. The little girl can't remember where the address is, and thankfully, Noah has the idea to look for recent noise reports from callers. This helps them find the correct address but not before Maddie has to heartbreakingly explain to the girl that when her father finds her, the safest option is for her to go with him. The girl agrees, but when she sees her mother bloody on the floor, she fights. She's able to get free and run out the door right into the waiting rescue.

After the call, Maddie finds the girl and her mother at the hospital. She brings an immigration lawyer with her who will help the mother, an undocumented immigrant, to get her green card and get her away from her abuser. While it was an emotional call for Maddie, the happy ending was worth it.

Chimney and Maddie have hired a nanny to help them with Jee-yun, and it's a struggle relinquishing control for both of them, understandably. Magda (who prefers to be called a Household Manager) does her best to make sure Jee-yun's environment is as germ-free as possible. And this includes demanding that no one wear shoes indoors, not allowing Jee-yun to go anywhere that is heavily trafficked by lots of people (which includes just about everywhere), and spending hours deep cleaning the kitchen.

At first, Chimney and Maddie assume they're just being typical overprotective parents of their first child, having a very difficult time watching Magda leave with their daughter. But as time passes, they realize that they have begun tip-toeing around in their own house, hoping not to upset the level of cleanliness that Magda has instituted. At one point, Chimney and Maddie have dinner together in the bathtub of their locked bathroom, so they won't cross paths with Magda. By the end of the episode, Maddie has made the decision to send Magda home ... permanently. Chimney is clearly relieved, and the family of three celebrate with a blanket picnic on the living room floor.

A woman is home alone asleep, when a loud noise from downstairs wakes her up. She believes her house is being burglarized, so she calls 9-1-1. Josh gets her information and dispatches the police, and he instructs her to stay where she is. But the woman, Sharlo, is adamant that she

needs to leave the house. Josh pleads with her to stay in the bedroom so she won't cross paths with the intruders, but Sharlo runs downstairs into the kitchen in a panic. Josh hears Sharlo encounter something that makes her scream, and the call is disconnected.

The 118 arrive on scene and find Sharlo unresponsive but alive. She eventually wakes up and tells them that she encountered not a human, but a monster. Buck searches the house to try to figure out what happened, and he eventually detains the suspect — a raccoon with a sweet tooth who is hiding out in the pantry.

The next day, Maddie receives a call from a man who says his house is being broken into. Unfortunately, the intruders realize that someone is home and rush to find who is there. Maddie hears the horrifying events unfold over the phone: the man who called for help is discovered by the intruders and is shot. The line disconnects.

We learn later that the man will survive and is doing well. But everyone is surprised to learn that this home invasion took place at the same home where the raccoon was apprehended; Sharlo's husband Samir is the man who was shot!

At the police station, Romero tells Athena that he believes the home invasions are all connected, but he's not sure how. As they pore over the case files, Athena notices a common thread: all homes are in affluent zip codes, and all cases involve a 9-1-1 call. Every home invasion took place when the homeowners were sure not to be there, because they were in the hospital after making a call for medical assistance. And knowing each 9-1-1 dispatcher is going to ask lots of questions on each call, including security passcodes, they realize that someone at the dispatch center must be informing the intruders when a house will lie empty.

At the dispatch center, Maddie helps Athena and Romero by reviewing the 9-1-1 calls of all the homes that have been burglarized. She sees nothing that ties them together, but she then realizes that, whenever a 9-1-1 call is accessed in their system, a note is made about who pulls the call. Maddie tells them that the same person accessed all of the calls that involve the burgled homes. And that person was her.

This confuses everyone at the dispatch center, until Noah approaches Maddie in the break-room. Maddie is noticeably upset, and she tells Noah that there is a good chance that she'll be fired, because her credentials were used to access those files. It doesn't matter that she's actually innocent; the fact that she lost her password and allowed someone else to use her login information is reason enough for her to lose her job. Noah tells her that isn't right or fair. Maddie just says that she wishes she knew who had access to her password.

In a shocking twist, Noah comes clean to Maddie and admits that he is the one who's been using her credentials and passing along the information to the intruders. He explains that his stepfather owes money to some bad people, and he had no other way to raise enough money in time. So he learns that a home is going to be empty because the owner is in the hospital, and he passes along the address and security entry information to the intruders, who steal expensive jewelry.

As soon as Noah ends his confession, Maddie shows him that she had been wearing a mic. Athena and her squad enter the breakroom to arrest Noah. He tells them that the intruders are on their way to another home right now. Athena and Romero rush to the location and are able to arrest them as soon as they break in to the house. As they put the intruders in the back of a squad car, we see Noah being led out through the dispatch center in handcuffs.

May comes home for a brief break from school. And while she's there, she meets her newest family member, Hoover. May seems surprised that Athena allowed this, considering she's allergic to dogs. While Athena reaches for a tissue before her next sneezing attack, Bobby says that he thought she just had a cold. May then begins to sneeze, and Bobby quickly realizes that he can't put them through this anymore and has to find a new place for Hoover as soon as possible.

While Hen and Karen are having breakfast, Bobby knocks on their door and explains the situation to Hen. Before Hen can dissent, Denny sees Hoover and immediately falls in love. Hen knows she can't get rid of Hoover now.

But on the morning of Hen's practical exam, Karen goes downstairs to make breakfast. She suddenly screams, which leads Hen to rush downstairs to see what's going on. She encounters their living room filled with shredded pillows, torn furniture, and trash strewn about. Hen wonders if they've been burglarized. Karen points to the baseboards, which have been heavily chewed, and says, "We weren't burgled. We were Hoovered."

Hoover's next stop is at Eddie's. He gladly takes the dog from Hen, knowing Christopher will love having a pet. But we later hear Christopher yelling in the kitchen. When Eddie runs in, the floor is covered in trash, cereal, flour... everything that is in a kitchen is on the floor. "I thought Hen was exaggerating..." Eddie says to himself.

Next, Eddie knocks on Chimney and Maddie's door. He starts to explain the situation, but Magda interrupts and tells everyone that dogs are very unsanitary and he has no place in their home. She shuts the door on Eddie.

At Buck's place, Hoover barks so loudly and incessantly that Buck's landlord has no trouble reminding him that dogs are not allowed, and that Hoover must leave immediately.

Fortunately, Hoover ultimately finds a home. At the end of the episode, we learn that Athena has sent Hoover to live with Sharlo and Samir, the home invasion victims from earlier in the episode. Hoover will provide a sense of security for Sharlo while her husband is away on business trips, and Hoover will have plenty of opportunities to protect them all from sweet-toothed raccoons.

Hen has been given a second chance at her medical school exams that she bombed earlier. Her supervising professor invited Hen to follow her on her hospital rounds, and Hen's performance would decide whether or not she would be moved on to her third year of medical school.

At the surprise of just about no one, Hen performs beautifully. She offers medical advice and diagnoses with each patient she visits, and she does so correctly. Hen performs so well, in fact, that she is invited to look in on a surgery that she herself helped determine was needed.

Later, Bobby and Athena host a barbeque at their house to celebrate Hen passing her practical exam with flying colors. All of the 118 are there, and the champagne is flowing. Toasts are made, and Hen is overcome with emotion and memories of her times with each firehouse member. But the toasts sound a lot like goodbyes, with everyone telling Hen that they will miss her around the firehouse. It's understandable that, once Hen becomes a full-fledged doctor, she won't be able to work at the 118 anymore. But this scene shows the weight of that realization hitting everyone like a ton of bricks. Hopefully, Dr. Henrietta Wilson won't ever be far from the 118, and we'll get to see her on our screens in future seasons.

Karen finds Hen's resignation papers, realizing that she still hasn't turned them in. Hen tells her that once she turns them in, it will make it real that she's no longer a firefighter. She promises she'll go that morning.

Deidra from the foster home visits, telling Hen that she heard about her situation from Karen and has taken them off emergency placement. She drops off a binder with information on outreach events since they can't foster anymore, and the statement confuses Hen. With Hen starting her third year of medical school, it's a demanding schedule, and then her residency.

Outside Karen's lab, Hen and Athena work to save Alvin, one of the scientists, and Hen is going all paramedic, even trying a few different ways to get a breathing tube in, and of course, she's successful.

Karen takes Denny to work at her lab for a school project, and she gives him the grand tour, so he can take pictures and write down what his mom does and what goes on at the lab.

Someone tells Karen that when he tried to extract a sample in the high-pressure tank, he got shocked when he opened the valve. Karen says they have to stop using it until the techs get a look at it, but unfortunately, they're too late.

With the coolant system disabled, Karen tries to warn Hitu about a sample she's putting into a machine, and there's an explosion. Hen was on the phone with Denny when it all went down.

Athena shows up on the scene after getting a call from Toni so she can keep Hen from doing something foolish. The two help a man in the lab who made his way outside and is not looking too hot. Athena grabs a paper and pen so he can write something down. "Coolant, danger, warn them."

As Buck and Karen make their way out, Karen hears a faint cry for help, even though Buck says they already cleared the floor. She grabs Buck's flashlight and goes towards the source of the sound, as does Buck, and they find a man on the ground behind a desk.

Athena, meanwhile, tells Bobby about the man, Alvin, and his note. Karen realizes that it's the clean room. She warns Bobby to go to the clean room lab and make sure nobody opens the door. With the coolant system disabled, there's no control on the combustion systems inside the device.

Bobby saves another firefighter captain just as she opens the door, and sure enough, there's another explosion, but they're both safe.

Karen finally comes out of the lab, seemingly okay but bloody. Unfortunately, Karen's breathing is a little off, and she starts hyperventilating. She's not sure she knew that her life was going to change, and she never considered the reality if she became a doctor. Being a firefighter, Karen's wife, that's what matters to her. Hen is sure about being a firefighter.

The 118 have a very rare reoccurring patient in Felisa, a troubled Hollywood starlet, and her over-eager assistant Alexis. Desperate to overcome her bad luck and difficult past by cleansing her energy, Felisa lets Alexis talk her into purchasing a \$20,000 bracelet said to have been recovered from Pompeii. Happily believing it will turn her luck around, Felisa dons the bracelet (one she promised her online following she'd do an unboxing for) and is almost immediately struck by "bad luck" in the form of her large iron chandelier

falling on her. Cue the 118 arriving on scene and having to cut the chandelier in half in order to move it. As they do so, Felisa tells them about the bracelet's background and its "good luck." Alexis hovers about, worried over Felisa and the bracelet as they are taken to the hospital.

Just when she's sure that was a fluke, the 118 arrive on the scene of a spa accident. A woman was accidentally covered over the face with wax, and Eddie recognizes the bracelet on her wrist. Hen is able to clear her airway, and they, once again, whisk Felisa to the hospital. In all the chaos, her bracelet falls off into the back of the ambulance, causing some hilarity back at the station. Chimney refuses to touch it as Eddie continually ridicules the team, but the moment he snatches it up, a fellow firefighter falls behind them. He's hurt from the fall, and Bobby realizes he's slipped on a puddle of gas. The entire station is evacuated. Perhaps Chimney and Hen are right about the curse?

Felisa and Alexis visit a crystal shop as she searches for something to cleanse her energy. The woman steps into the back to bring her some jade and citrine pieces, but Felisa spots a large amethyst piece while waiting. Alexis begs her not to climb a ladder and heads to find the shop owner. Of course, Alexis doesn't wait, but she's no longer the unlucky one. Just as she climbs the step stool, Alexis comes stumbling from the back, gasping with a stab wound by some crystal. She falls to the ground, and the owner finds Felisa screaming for her to call 9-1-1. She does so, but as Maddie takes the details, all three of them pass out. The 118 arrive with gas masks only

to find two familiar faces. Eddie and Chimney revive Felisa outside and get the details, but it's the owner who tells them the crystal that stabbed Alexis. It's a chemical compound, combined with stomach acid, which created a toxic gas. With one mystery solved, Alexis is rushed to the ER.

After Athena looks into the bracelet, Eddie takes it upon himself to warn Felisa at the hospital while Alexis is still unconscious. He tells her that the bracelet she bought for \$20k was actually bought off a random website by Alexis for \$11k, but Felisa is reluctant to believe it.

Felisa leaves the hospital after Eddie's warning, convincing herself she can take care of herself without help. As she pulls out, she notices a car following her. After some evasive maneuvers, she calls 9-1-1, who put a call out to all nearby officers, including Athena, who recognizes Felisa's name. She responds but not before Felisa, in her haste to get away, hits the back of an asphalt truck that empties the hot materials onto her car, trapping her inside with the deadly fumes. Athena arrives and has the man under arrest, but the 118 rush to get to Felisa. They barely manage to save her in time, but thankfully they free her.

All is revealed by Athena when interrogating the man. He is the one who sold Alexis the fake bracelet. When he found out that Felisa was a celebrity and his fake artifact business would likely be in jeopardy, he knew he had to get the bracelet back. He tried to intercept it at her house, at the spa, where he knocked the wax over, and at the crystal shop, where he confronted Alexis and accidentally stabbed her when they fought. His final attempt was to follow Felisa home, but it led to his arrest. Perhaps he is the one that was cursed!

Eddie is a little more than just anti-supernatural; he's suspicious that Alexis might be manipulating Felisa. He visits Bobby and Athena, where he tells them about a psychic who took advantage of his Abuela after his Abuelo passed. Her grief drove her to spending all her savings on this woman's messages, so Eddie is understandably skeptical. "My mother has costume jewelry that looks better than this," Athena observes as Eddie fills her in on the details he gleaned from Felisa.

Following his conscience, he tells Felisa about it at the hospital, which ultimately results in the arrest of the man who stabbed Alexis. Eddie also invited Felisa to meet him and Christopher at the beach. She agrees and finds him relaxing while he watches Christopher play. Eddie tells her that after the tsunami, he knew the fear of the water would only grow if they didn't return to the pier and the water, so he chose to face it rather than give it power of them. Now, they relax at the beach together and make new memories. Felisa sees the wise move of it, and in Eddie's own way, he helps her to understand that she can make her own way in life without letting her past actions dictate how she lives.

After agreeing to be Connor and Cameron's sperm donor, Buck is faced with a series of problems every time he visits the clinic. In an effort to start his friend's family off "on the right track," Buck has decided to sleep more, eat better (meaning green smoothies), and even chooses to go celibate. He lets it slip to Hen because it's taking so very long (four whole weeks) for him to actually be able to make said donation at the clinic.

He visits yet again, but the place has a power outage, and they ask him to come back in yet another week. While he's managed to keep his decision from the team, that goes down the drain when the couple shows up at the firehouse after finding out he has yet to donate. They are stressed and worried he might have changed his mind and doesn't want to tell them. Buck blurts out over Cameron's worry that he's still planning to be their sperm donor; there's just been a few hiccups. Of course, the whole team has gathered on the balcony above to eavesdrop, so that cat is out of the bag now.

He finally has another appointment and is on the way when his car suddenly dies. Buck is just 1.8 miles (according to his phone) from the clinic with 10 minutes to spare, so he does what any dedicated friend (and one who is feeling a little on edge) might do and sprints to the clinic. Sweating and panting, he eagerly tells the nurse he's two minutes early and desperately asks if he made it in time. She's utterly perplexed and tells him yes as she hands him a cup and a magazine to escort him back.

Tyler is trying desperately to satisfy his boss's every whim while planning for a large corporate meeting. The boss, Gavin, is not happy with anything: where the guests will be sitting, the shape of the tables ... nothing Tyler does is good enough. Gavin tells Tyler over and over again to fix it. While most people have to deal with similar situations at their work, we see that Tyler has a very difficult time dealing with Gavin. With every interaction they have, Tyler fantasizes about killing Gavin, whether it be through electrocution, pushing him out of a window, or something else as equally imaginative and frightening.

One morning, Tyler has arrived with everyone's coffees. When Gavin drinks his (after loudly complaining that Tyler took too long to deliver it to him), he begins to choke on the coffee and ultimately collapses to the floor unresponsive. When other workers in the office notice what's happened, Tyler quickly realizes that this isn't a fantasy he's envisioning, but rather real life. His boss is dying ... was it Tyler's fault?

The 118 arrive, along with Athena, who is there to talk to Tyler after hearing his concerning 9-1-1 call about possibly killing his boss. Upon arrival, Tyler admits that he constantly fantasizes about killing Gavin, because he is so hard on him. Tyler then tells Athena that Gavin has a significant allergy to dairy, and he's afraid he gave Gavin the wrong coffee, although he might have given it to him intentionally. While Athena is questioning Tyler, Bobby and Chimney determine that Gavin suffered a heart attack and was not poisoned with milk. Athena tells a grateful Tyler that he won't have to be arrested for murder after all.

Later in the episode, Tyler hands Gavin his notice to leave the company. He also hands him a letter of recommendation that he requests Gavin sign. "He's a real life saver?" Gavin asks

incredulously. Tyler reminds him that he's the one who called 9-1-1 when Gavin collapsed. Gavin signs the letter, and Tyler is free.

This week's episode starts out at the local Renaissance Faire, where the townsfolk are dressed in their best early century garb, practicing their swordplay and jousting moves while eating a seemingly endless supply of turkey legs. Two sisters are running through the crowds, one who is enamored by the goings-on of everything and the other who is ... not. The older sister, Harriett, is trying to convince her sister Dottie that girls don't need to rely on knights in shining armor to rescue them and that they don't have to be damsels in distress. To prove this, Harriett dresses up in a knight's suit of her own, complete with head-to-toe armor. Unfortunately, a family of bees is residing in the armor, and Harriett begins to get attacked.

The 118 arrive to assist and find an unconscious Harriett on the ground. After spraying the area with a heavy foam to drown the bees, Chimney and Hen realize that Harriett is so swollen from the stings, that her armor cannot be removed. So Buck begins to saw off pieces of the armor so Chimney can start an IV, and Harriett eventually regains consciousness.

As they are carrying Harriett to the ambulance, Hen overhears Dottie tell her sister that she was right: after seeing Hen work so hard to save Harriett, she knows that girls can totally be heroes, too.

Later, Hen and Buck are at the Faire, and Buck wants to outfit Jee with her own sword and shield. Echoing Dottie's words from earlier in the episode, he tells Hen that he wants Jee to know that she doesn't need to rely on anyone but herself and that she can be her own hero.

Chimney and Maddie have realized that their apartment is just too small for their growing family. Jee needs her own room, and her parents need a little more privacy. They bring Jee to Uncle Buck's apartment for the day so they can go house hunting. Maddie seems a little concerned at first leaving her with Buck, only because he doesn't realize what an energetic busy-body she has become. But he tells her not to worry and that everything will be fine.

Approximately 2.3 microseconds after Maddie and Chimney leave, Buck's apartment is in a total shambles, thanks to Jee's redecorating talents. In a precious and hilarious montage, we see the destruction take place: every square inch of toilet paper is now everywhere in the apartment except on the toilet paper roll. Every piece of food, every crayon, practically everything that Buck owns is where it shouldn't be. Fortunately, Maddie and Chimney eventually return from their (unsuccessful) house-hunting trip and rescue Jee from Buck. Or rather, Buck has been rescued from Jee.

May has returned home from school during a brief break. She has also brought Darius with her to dinner at Bobby and Athena's. Darius is visiting from Stanford and is considering transferring to USC later in the year. He explains to Bobby and Athena that his parents think there are "too many distractions" at USC (read: May) and is unsure what his plans are for the moment.

A few days later, Hen is having drinks with Athena and is asking how things are. Athena tells her that she's concerned for May; she's doing well in school, but she seems to still be having trouble "fitting in." Hen reminds Athena that May has something practically none of her cohorts do: real-world experience dealing with life-and-death situations. May is more mature because of that. Athena says that she wants May to realize that her experience isn't something that should hold her back — her experience is in fact her superpower.

One night, May and Darius visit some friends from school. In the house that seems to have about a dozen roommates, everyone greets everyone, and drinks are passed around. But there is one guy, Erik, who seems to have no interest in getting to know anyone. He is upset that there are people there he doesn't know, and he storms out of the room. A few days later, May arrives at the house to meet with Darius. He isn't there, so she lets herself in and runs into Erik again, who is still sitting on the same couch, fuming that his silence has once again been disrupted by someone he doesn't know. May tries to make nice with him, asking him about his major. Erik tells her that he isn't a student, because post-secondary education "... is a myth propagated to keep young people too distracted to see what's really there," which apparently is nothing at all. When May calls his beliefs "bleak," he again storms out of the room and hides in his bedroom.

When May sits down, she notices that Erik left a notebook on the floor. She opens it to read it and learns very quickly that it is some sort of manifesto detailing plans of destruction. She runs outside and immediately calls Athena, who tells her to stay away from Erik and wait for her to get there. Unfortunately, Darius arrives and sees a very upset Erik looking for this notebook. He accuses May of stealing it, and Darius tells him to calm down. Erik then grabs Darius by the

throat and threatens to harm him.

Erik calls May using Darius' phone and tells her that she needs to return his notebook; otherwise, he will kill Darius. May starts to talk to him and asks him what is really the matter. What does the notebook mean? Erik tells her that it's about the "female conspiracy" to keep men down, and he needs to do what he can to right it. Meanwhile, Athena and the police are trying to locate Darius and Erik inside, so they can enter and rescue Darius. May keeps Erik on the phone and, in an attempt to reveal his location, she tells him that the house is surrounded by SWAT and that he should look out the window to see for himself. When he does this, Darius makes a break for it, and Athena and her squad are there with guns drawn on Erik. He is arrested, and Darius is saved.

May's experiences with life-or-death situations is her superpower, indeed!

The episode starts with a flashback to 2018, or, to be more exact, season 1, episode 4, following the plane crash when Buck and Hen find Bobby in his apartment. After the incident, Bobby went to an AA meeting, where Wendall tries to talk to him. He asks if he has someone to talk to, offering to help Bobby find his way back.

It's December 2018, and Bobby has told Wendall about proposing to Athena. Wendall thinks it's impulsive since he's only been seeing her for less than a year.

Bobby expresses his love and adoration for Athena, saying that now that he's found her, maybe he's found a piece of himself again. At the very least, Wendall wants Bobby to promise to slow down, and it'll be a long engagement (though we all know how that turned out).

Bobby thinks back to when he found Wendall in the field and the rehab owners, and he's still going over the case. He tells Athena that reports came back on Wendall, and it said he overdosed. So the cops are closing the investigation into Winding Path. However, Bobby's been thinking about the girl Athena and May met, Tamara. He thinks he should talk to her since May's been making progress. Unfortunately, Athena says that after May brought up Wendall, Tamara shut May down and cut off all conversation. Bobby figures Tamara could talk to him.

Bobby meets with Tamara at the flower shop she works at in the hopes of getting her to open up about Wendall. Tamara admits he didn't die in the field. She let him in, just like Bobby, but she pulled him down with her. They met before Winding Path, and Wendall only checked himself in to help her. He knew something was wrong with the place and was trying to prove it. Tamara tells Bobby to drop it.

Bobby and Athena go over what they know, and Athena suggests it was an undercover sting. She brings up a report of a camera purchased the week Wendall died. It's worth looking into.

Bobby lets Athena know how much he appreciates her despite Wendall not being her sponsor, and Athena tells him they're family. And he's not the only one who misses him.

While Athena hasn't had any luck tracking down where the camera came from, she suggests that since Wendall didn't have any evidence of a camera on him, it was a camera that was placed at Winding Path.

Bobby gets a call from Tamara, who sounds high. She talks about Wendall and how she doesn't have any friends. Bobby offers to get her, and Tamara starts slurring her words, telling Bobby it's too late for that and she's sorry about Wendall. She passes out.

Bobby gets to Winding Path, trying to find Tamara. Trey and Carrie tell him that Tamara isn't there, and Bobby punches Trey and then sets off to find Tamara. He finds her on the ground in a room with a needle beside her. Bobby tries to get Tamara out, who says that Wendall died in that room after promising to take them down, but they got to him first. Bobby tries to find the camera, but the smoke alarm goes off, and the place is in flames.

Bobby gets Tamara out, but then Carrie and Trey point him out to the cops, framing him for the fire. Trey says that Bobby's truck reeks of gasoline, and Carrie brings up Bobby's family to add more fire.

Bobby's interrogated, as it does not look to be in his favor. Athena is brought in to help corroborate Bobby's story, and she and Detective Phelps talk to Tamara, who admits everything. She met Wendall at an AA meeting and told him about Winding Path and her suspicions. Wendall was determined to stop Carrie and Trey, so he checked himself in. Tamara smuggled the camera in by way of flowers, telling him where to put the camera. Carrie was on to them, however, and she catches the two in the office.

Wendall tells Carrie it was his fault, and he heard Winding Path was the place he could go to to take the edge off. Carrie gives him a needle, talking him into taking it in the office instead of his room. He injects himself, and Carrie confronts Tamara in the hallway. When they go back into the office, Wendall's dead, and Carrie blames Tamara. The couple drags him out into the field, pours gasoline on him, and lights him on fire.

Tamara tells Athena and Phelps that Carrie lies about everything. At home, Bobby tells Athena that Wendall would have done it regardless because that's who he is. He wanted to help.

Bobby and Athena watch as Carrie and Trey are taken to the police station. While being interrogated, they basically throw each other under the bus, blaming the other for what happened and what they really did. Carrie used Tamara as bait to lure Bobby to the facility, and it was Trey's idea to burn the place down. It's discovered that this isn't the first time the two operated a dirty rehab, and it was previously under different names.

Bobby meets Tamara at the flower shop, who is doing a lot better, even more so with an actual job. Tamara's grateful for Bobby and Wendall for helping her. Knowing it was supposed to be Wendall's 10th anniversary of sobriety, Bobby speaks at the AA meeting, honoring and celebrating Wendall and talking about how he saved his life and how there's a light at the end of the tunnel. He knows Wendall is still with him. He tells the group that if anyone feels the burning desire to use to know that they are there to help.

Athena tells Bobby that Wendall would be proud of him, and before leaving, Bobby speaks to a guy sitting at the back, right where he would sit when Wendall first met him.

Buck is back on the mend after his newest near-death experience, and he tries to convince Maddie, who is restocking his fridge, that he's fine. She reminds her brother that he actually died (but it was only for three minutes). Turning the tables, Buck expresses his worry for Maddie with her job, the new house, Jee. She shouldn't be running over to his place all the time. He promises he can take care of himself. Maddie gets ready to leave, and Buck mentions how appreciative he is of her.

Another visitor shows up to Buck's, and this time, it's Hen checking up on him. Smelling Maddie's pot roast, Hen stays for lunch. Afterward, Buck wonders if he passed Dr. Wilson's exam, and she diagnoses him with ungratefulness with a slap on the head. Buck admits that his cardiologist has just been ordering more tests and scans, and he's been waiting for her to say whether he's okay or not okay. He feels fine, but he also felt fine before he got struck by lightning.

Connor is Buck's next visitor, checking in on him (with brownies). Buck keeps the conversation on Cameron and the baby, and then Connor brings it back to him. Josh knocks on the door this time with Sudoku, worried that he got his time wrong. Maddie later assures Josh that he didn't ruin anything since Buck was on to her way before he got there. As Chimney tells Maddie

that it seems Buck is taking his recovery seriously, Maddie gets a text from a friend saying that Buck was out by the time they showed up, but he did leave a note.

Buck visits Eddie and immediately makes himself comfortable on the couch. Just as Eddie brings out a couple of beers, Buck's fast asleep. When he finally wakes up, he finds Eddie in the kitchen, who admits he drank both beers. Buck asks Eddie what he remembers about being shot, and Eddie admits he thought this was it until he woke up in the hospital. Eddie wonders if he's allowed to ask Buck how he's doing, and Buck confesses he doesn't know. Eddie says he's going to feel a lot of different things since he died. He found the best way to process is to allow yourself to feel it.

Buck meets with Dr. Salazar, who brings good news with his tests: he can return to normal activities, including resuming full-time employment as early as next week. While Buck is relieved, he still can't shake the feeling of his experience, so he asks the doctor about it and the patients she's seen. It's different for everyone. She says water finds its own level, and people do, too. Even if it's in a different country.

Buck tells Maddie to stop trying to fix him, and Maddie admits she felt alone when she was sick because she didn't want to be a burden. She doesn't want Buck to hide. Buck says he has a checklist that he runs in his head when he wakes up to make sure he's still alive. He's just processing everything.

The first teen, Sherry, is a little jumpy when it comes to the flames and the stylist drops the torch into the trash, igniting the whole thing. The salon sprinklers go off and Sherry begins screaming as the water hits her skin. The 118 arrive to find Sherry on the floor from her allergic reaction to water causing serious injury to her hands and face. Her mother arrives just as they are treating Sherry and she rides with her daughter to the hospital.

Dispatch receives a cryptic call from a husband regarding an embarrassing injury to his wife. The 118 arrive to find the woman in pain. The man begrudgingly explains they were having intimate time and he'd purchased a "for her" pleasure toy but it somehow came off. Hen listens

to the woman's abdomen and determines it might have moved to her bladder. The woman is in extreme pain every time she moves so they carefully load her up and take her to the ambulance. She's less than happy with the way their evening has gone.

While on the case at the gym, everyone notices that Buck is able to do some very impressive math in his head. Everyone at the firehouse begins quizzing him and he makes some quick cash off the sudden ability to do complex mental math. Later while Eddie and Chris visit, Eddie does some googling and learns that some people have new mental abilities post traumatic incidents such as lightning strikes and concludes that must be why Buck is suddenly a math wizard. His searches also note that these gifts sometimes disappear after a few weeks. Eddie seems to get a bright idea for those mental math skills and takes Buck to a secret but low stakes poker game with some higher ups including the fire chief.

Eddie meant it when he said this was low stakes poker, and the winnings are dolled out in cuts of meat. Buck won't be needing to shop for quite some time.

Later, Buck and Chris make cookies for his class together but the recipe is in metric. Buck is able to do that mental math conversion as well before he decides to just google a new recipes. It's a fun bonding moment between the two as Chris is constantly impressed by Buck's sudden skills with math.

Maddie is running late to work when she suddenly hears a knock at the door. Outside she finds a woman, Carol, who says she's a neighbor from the house with the pink mailbox and wanted to welcome Maddie to the neighborhood with muffins. Carol barges her way in the door and notices Jee's toys. She makes a point to say her son and Jee are close in age and they should set up a play date. Summary: A series of freeway car accidents leads to a catastrophic overpass collapse that endangers the lives of civilians and members of the 118.



The episode opens up with Lucy in a medic helicopter calling a Mayday to dispatch, telling Maddie that the 118 were on a bridge when it collapsed.

Three hours prior, it's a normal day. Buck is still housing Kameron and trying to talk Connor into patching things up and telling her how he feels; Hen and Karen are focused on their family, Denny, and their foster kids who keep the place a pigsty and keep running around, as Chimney and Maddie are both trying to get used to the fact that they are engaged.

At a meeting at the firehouse, Bobby starts by congratulating Chimney on the

engagement, then goes into weather preparedness and the update, but he's finding it hard to keep everyone on track; even Hen shows up late as he's talking about keeping everyone present. He ends the meeting and doesn't even get to the weather update he planned, which was just a moderate marine layer.

A mother and daughter are on a road trip, but the daughter, Jo, keeps crying, and the mother comforts her. She gets up to make an espresso, and they come across an accident on an overpass. While they stopped in time, another car hits them, and the van flips. The 118's alarm goes off, and at the same time, a truck driver struggles to stay awake as the overpass continues to build up more cars.

The 118 arrive on the scene, immediately getting to work and separating to help victims. They work to get the mother and daughter out. Chimney and Hen manage to pull Jo out while Mallory is unconscious. Chimney calls for an air ambulance, and Jo is worried about her mother.

Meanwhile, Chimney and Eddie help Mallory, who is now awake, but has a likely spinal injury that is likely temporary. Mallory admits Jo isn't her daughter but her best friend's daughter. They were on a trip to honor her memory.

They get Mallory out, and she promises Jo she isn't going anywhere. Mallory is taken into the helicopter, and the crew gets back to work. Eddie returns to the van to check on the propane stove, and the truck driver crashes into a pillar under the bridge. The entire 118 going down with it, as Buck just barely misses being crushed by the ambulance, and Bobby goes down the bridge.

Like the beginning, Lucy tells Maddie about the collapse, saying that the entire 118 is down. Maddie tries to get her composure and requests additional units, including Athena. Buck is on top of the ambulance, which is being held up by the van. Hen is unconscious, Ravi is on the ground, Eddie is in the van with some broken ribs, and it could be pancaked by the ambulance any second; Chimney is impaled in his abdomen, and the only one not responding is Bobby.

Buck carefully tries to get to Hen and Chimney, who is "alive but not great." Hen comes to and immediately tries to clean up Buck's face. Buck updates her on the situation, including that Bobby is MIA. Ravi throws over some rope so they can secure the ambulance, and Hen checks on Chimney, who is making jokes. Jo is on the gurney, okay but scared, and he asks her to unbuckle herself and help him. Though any slight move rocks the ambulance. Chimney takes out a bar that was impaling him, and he starts bleeding. He has Jo get some trauma dressing so he can bandage the wound and some morphine. Hen wants to go back to help, but Chimney has her stay up front.

Bobby, meanwhile, is alive but crushed by debris. He tries to call out on the radio, but there's nothing, as the radio's cord is broken.

Maddie continues with her trying to get more units even though Josh tells her that she's too close to it since it's the 118, but she persists, and Josh asks how he can help. Athena arrives at the scene, and Hen, now acting captain, updates Athena. Buck and Ravi secure the ambulance, and Buck gives the gear to Hen. Buck then propels down to the van, and Eddie can barely move. Once Hen is out of the ambulance, she struggles to not collapse but keeps focused and works on getting Jo and Chimney out.

Buck gets the van's doors open and pulls Eddie out as Athena frantically searches for any sign of her husband. She finds the truck driver dead. Bobby is still trying to find some way to let his team know where he is, and someone finds him. Some may recognize him as the athlete, Jeff, from the earthquake who got seriously injured. Athena gets to Bobby, thanks to Jeff, and while it seems like almost everyone made it out alright, Hen starts puking, concussed. The ambulance starts creaking, and the van falls, and soon, the ambulance's back doors open. The gurney and other supplies fall out, and Chimney is barely hanging on.

Buck races to Chim and grabs the rope, getting him down to safety, as Maddie listens at the Call Center, relieved when Buck tells Dispatch. As Chimney gets taken away in a gurney, Athena's able to go on her radio to let people know where they are. Buck and Hen get to the container, but it's blocked. They get help from some workers to lift up the container, and they finally get to them. Jeff is okay and helps Buck and Ravi lift a rock to get to Bobby, who is still pinned but conscious. The crew successfully pull him out, and once on the gurney, he assures his team and Athena that he's fine. Athena calls over Jeff to introduce him to Bobby and to thank him, but Jeff immediately recognizes Bobby from the earthquake, and by the looks of Bobby's face, he remembers him too.

Finally at the hospital, the team is admitted, Maddie rushes to Chimney, and the 118 are soon released, except for Bobby and Chimney. Maddie and Athena bond over their loved ones, and they are the worst patients. The news covers the collapse, and they talk again about how crazy it is that no one died, and for the most part, everyone is okay.

Back at the loft, Kameron starts having contractions, telling Buck she felt something like it earlier, but it wasn't as bad. Her water breaks, and she's freaking out, saying that it's too early. Buck tries to calm her down and calls the paramedics, but the baby is coming now. He grabs towels and other supplies, and Natalia shows up. He asks her for help so he can check on her and she can stay on the phone with the paramedics. On the couch, Buck delivers the baby as Natalia holds her hand. Kameron keeps saying she wishes Connor was there, but he assures her they will call him after. The baby arrives, it's a boy, and he is perfect. For a second, Buck seems like he wishes that was his baby.

Connor meets Buck and Kameron at the hospital in the maternity ward. He tells Buck that he will repay him, but Buck just wants him to love the baby. Buck tells Natalia that the baby should be able to go home in a few weeks, if not sooner. This is a little weird for Natalia since she's usually there for the end of life, not the beginning. She asks Buck how he's doing since she saw his reaction. He says that was always the deal, and when Natalia asks him why he did it, it's a simple answer. "Because I could."

Buck realizes that Natalia came over even though she said she wasn't speaking to him, and she admits she was a little hard on him. She likes him, and she wants to try again. Buck says she likes her, and the two kiss.

Chimney returns to the firehouse and sees someone else's name over his name on his locker, so he rips off the paper. He finds Ravi, who tells him that everyone's upstairs. Chimney gets to the roof, where the crew is just sitting on lawn chairs for meditation. Bobby keeps everyone calm and at peace because they definitely need it after what they've done. He wants everyone to let go of past traumas and focus.

Chimney and Maddie later figure out wedding details. Christopher talks Eddie into calling Marisol, who was also looking at his number for two hours, and she asks him on a date. He celebrates before being all cool again. Hen gets home to find Karen on the phone, and Karen tells her that a grandmother in her '70s was going to take care of a baby girl, but she can't, so she's going to Hen and Karen. After a few months, if the grandmother doesn't want her, they have the chance to adopt. Buck has the couch cleaned, and he and Natalia sit out on the patio, talking and kissing. He asks her to pick out a new couch with him.

On the roof, the sirens go off, and they get back to work. The season ends with Bobby and Athena finally going on their long-awaited honeymoon cruise.

The kidnapers armed themselves and they took over the boat.

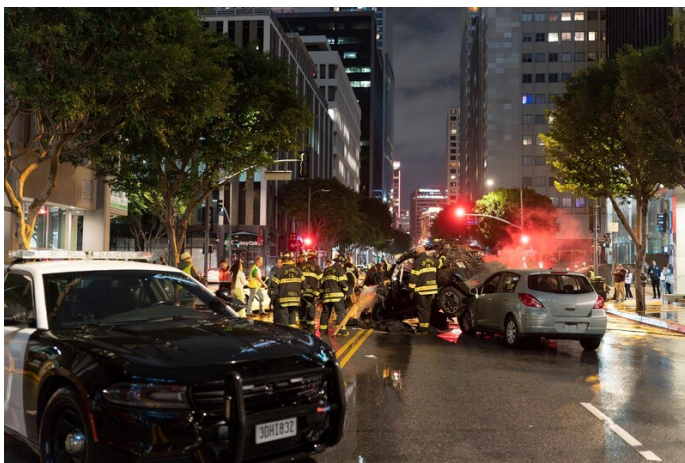

After extinguishing the fire, they only find a severely burned Catherine inside, with the male passenger and baby missing.

Athena, the 118, and other officers search the ground, and an unburned pacifier is found, meaning the baby exited the vehicle before the crash.

Hen, Karen, and Denny have dinner at their house while Mara sleeps, as she struggles to sleep through the night. Denny tells them that Mara has a baby brother named Tyson, who Hen and Karen did not know about. Mara isn't sure where he currently is.

Eddie, Chris, and Marisol go out for ice cream, and while walking down the street, Eddie spots a woman in a boutique who looks like Shannon. He becomes distracted by her but moves on with Marisol and Christopher down the street.

Hen talks to Mara, reiterating that they are all there for the young girl. Mara says that she misses her brother, and "they" took her.

Athena and Romero go to dispatch to see Maddie, informing her that the man in the car with Catherine couldn't have been her husband as he was working in Alaska. The police believe she may have a boyfriend.

The three listen to the 911 call, and Maddie walks out. In talking to Josh, she tells him she's mad at herself for assuming things on the call.

Hen and Karen call Diedra over and ask why they weren't made aware Mara had a sibling. Diedra says it wasn't her place. She explains that Mara's mother had an affair, and Tyson's father didn't know about him until after Mara's mother passed away.

Hen and Karen tell Diedra that they want Mara to have a relationship with her brother, and Diedra gives them the name of a place she sends new parents to.

Maddie visits Catherine at the hospital and chats with her nurse Amir. She also promises a comatose Catherine she'll bring her baby home.

Eddie returns to the boutique where he previously saw the Shannon lookalike but struggles to go inside until the woman asks him what he's shopping for. The two look around the store together, and she introduces herself as Kim.

Hen and Karen go to a mommy and me class where they see Tyson with his father, Vincent, and Vincent's partner. After approaching the couple and introducing themselves, Vincent makes it clear he's not interested in Tyson reuniting with Mara.

At home, Maddie re-listens to Catherine's call before Chimney comes to sit with her. He asks her to speak about who that woman is in the car. She then realizes something she missed from the call and calls Romero.

Romero takes the call at Catherine's apartment, where he and Athena are talking to Catherine's mom. They find the yellow nightgown the man on the phone mentioned to Catherine while in the car, and then Romero leaves the apartment.

Athena receives a call from Romero shortly after from the apartment building next to Catherine's. He's standing in a bedroom that looks directly into Catherine's bedroom. They believe Catherine may have had a stalker.

Eddie daydreams about a time when he and Shannon were in bed together, and he told her he believed it was time for her to come back into Christopher's life while sharing a meal with Marisol.

Athena, Romero, and Maddie convene and discuss the stalker being a man named Kyle, a handyman working on the vacant apartment across from Catherine's. Maddie then calls Kyle's sister, who tells him that his wife and child are hiding from him, and he moved to Los Angeles for a fresh start.

At the hospital, Bobby reunites Catherine with her baby. And Amir seems to recognize Bobby's last name.

Vincent's partner drops by Hen and Karen's home with Tyson. When he sees Mara, he immediately remembers her.

Eddie drops Chris off at Buck's house, as Buck and Christopher believe he's going on a date with Marisol.

Eddie is then shown waiting at a restaurant, and then Kim shows up as his date.

Bobby speaks at an AA meeting, where he talks about gratitude and feeling like he doesn't deserve the life he has now.

After he's finished, Amir gets up to speak about being in an apartment fire ten years ago in Minnesota. He says he became a nurse to help others, but seeing someone from the past has put him back into a place where he's filled with rage again.

In 1981 Minnesota, a young Bobby Nash sits with his mom and brother, Charlie, as his father, Tim, gets an award for bravery in firefighting. At the after-party at their home, Bobby's mom ques-

tions Tim's drinking, which he ignores. Bobby then gives his dad a homemade scrapbook he made for him titled 'My Dad The Hero.'

After Bobby's mom follows after her eldest son, who doesn't get along with his father, Tim lets Bobby have the rest of his drink, which Bobby throws up on the floor.

When Bobby returns home after the AA meeting, he's pleased to see May home, and he, Athena, Harry, and May have dinner together.

That night, Athena wakes up alone in bed and finds Bobby in the dining room on the computer. He shows her a picture of Amir and his wife, who was the 57th victim of the apartment fire.

He tells Athena about what happened at the meeting and tells her that he needs to make amends with Amir.

Bobby goes to the hospital to look for Amir and discovers from a nurse that Amir has already moved on, as he's a traveling nurse and was taking a month off to help at a migrant encampment. He discovers Amir helps an organization of relief workers who help migrants.

Bobby tells Athena he's going to Jamcumba to talk to Amir.

Once Bobby arrives in Jacumba, he asks someone working for The Safe Path Project about Amir. She tells him Amir was out looking for a pregnant woman but hasn't returned in two hours.

A truck pulls up with the pregnant woman and a man with a severe laceration on his abdomen. Bobby helps them both, discovering that the man jumped out of a moving car driven by coyotes.

Bobby then travels to the desert to look for Amir.

In 1981, the Nash parents are arguing, and Bobby's mom, Ann, tells him that they're leaving, but Bobby chooses to stay with his father, even after Tim slaps Charlie during the ensuing argument.

Bobby sees a truck on the side of the road and pulls over to find a man dead inside. He travels further and comes upon a smoking truck, which looks to belong to the Path Project. He sees blood on the ground and follows it into an abandoned diner. Amir then comes up behind him and holds a knife to his throat before Bobby tells him who he is.

Amir tells him he got shot in the shoulder, and Bobby discovers he was responsible for the dead man in the truck who was firebombing his vehicle.

Bobby helps Amir stabilize his arm, and as they're reading to depart, a cartel comes armed with guns and descends upon the diner.

Bobby and Amir make it out of the diner and hide in the desert.

In Minnesota, Bobby prepares dinner for himself and his dad, complete with making his dad a drink. Tim realizes he missed work, having no idea what day it is, and Bobby tells him he called in sick for him.

Bobby watches from afar as the cartel leaves the diner, and he and Amir talk about why Bobby's out there. Amir says he doesn't want anything from him and that he came to the meeting to size him up and figure out how he's able to carry on after the pain he caused.

Amir tells Bobby where to go to get help and then reluctantly allows Bobby to help him up before the two walk together.

In Minnesota, Bobby calls 911 as the oven is on fire, and he can't wake his dad up. Firefighters come to put it out, and Tim gets mad at Bobby, telling him that if he gets fired, it's his fault.

Having walked miles, Bobby and Amir reach a road where they can flag down a truck. The man, Herman, says he's a rancher and offers to take them to his place to get help.

While in the car, Bobby sees a picture of Herman with the man who shot Amir. Herman takes a call over the radio in Spanish, and Amir tells Bobby that the cartel will be waiting at Herman's house when they get there.

When Herman tries to pull out his gun, Bobby wrestles him over the steering wheel, causing the truck to crash.

In Minnesota, Tim tries to get into Bobby's bedroom to apologize, but the door is locked. Bobby then puts his headphones in, while Tim goes into the living room and trips, hitting his head on the coffee table.

Bobby pulls Amir out of the truck and puts together a sheet pulley as he pulls Amir's body through the desert until his body begins to give out.

In the past, Bobby finds his father's dead body.

The relief workers, along with migrants, find Bobby and Amir and get them to the hospital. Athena comes to get Bobby, and Fernanda tells them how they found them in the desert. She also says Herman survived the crash and was taken to another hospital under police custody, as he's willing to flip on the cartel.

Bobby finds Amir in the hospital and tells him he doesn't expect forgiveness, as he can't erase the damage he caused. Amir says every time he helps someone he's trying to save his wife, and he wonders who Bobby has been trying to save all these years.

In the past, after Tim's body is taken away, the firefighters offer to stay with Bobby until his mother arrives, but he declines. After they leave, he goes into the kitchen and pours himself a drink.

Bobby and Athena were able to disarm Spencer. They put him under arrest. They got Dennis treated. He was going to make it. He'll survive long enough to testify at trial.

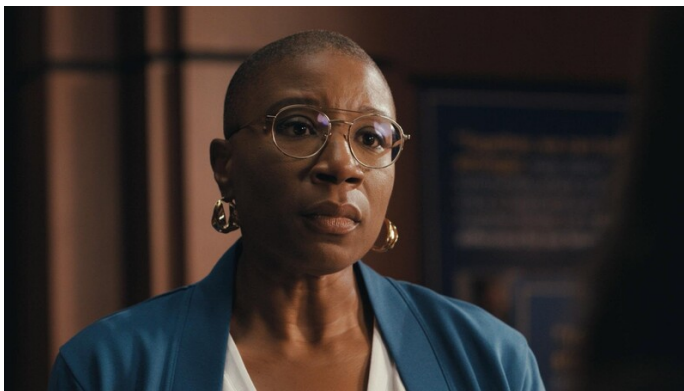

Summary: When it finally looks like Hen and Karen may get their foster license back, they are hit with another obstacle. Meanwhile, the 118 races to the aid of a Cheerleader involved in an infield collision.



The episode opens with Buck and Gerrard golfing, which is super normal and not suspicious at all. Gerrard explains to Buck that everyone at the 118 is soft and that it's "better to be feared than loved," which historically is always correct and never a horrible misjudgment.

Then, Gerrard breaks the news to Buck: he'll need him to pick someone to fire from the 118. While this feels like it could be avoidance from Gerrard, it's pretty clear that Gerrard thinks he's helping shape Buck, as if Buck isn't a fully

grown adult.

Elsewhere, Bobby and Athena are still on the house hunt. They had to pause so Athena could land a plane, and she says nothing they've seen so far feels like home to her.

Because of this, Athena comes up with a great plan: have Michael, her ex, send over blueprints from the house he built for her that just tragically burned down. As expected, Bobby isn't incredibly thrilled with rebuilding a home his wife's ex-husband made for her.

Hen and Chim find out that Olivia Ortiz has decided to enter the mayoral race. If you need a refresher, Ortiz is a councilwoman and mother of the man who died while driving under the influence in season seven.

Throughout the end of season seven, she worked tirelessly to make Hen's life miserable, including taking her foster child, Mara, away from her. According to Ortiz, she's launching the "Eyes and Ears Program," which will "hold first responders accountable."

Gerrard explains this for us: the 118 has been chosen for a pilot program where first responders wear body cameras — like police — during their interactions with the public. Even Eddie, who was in the army, was shocked and confused about this new initiative.

On cue, we're called to the first emergency; a cheerleader has collided with a footballer and ended up with an open book fracture, AKA a broken pelvis in several places. Eddie is the only person who's ever seen this injury in person, so he takes the lead on this scene.

Eddie takes charge and ensures everything goes well until Weston, our victim, is raised onto a gurney, where he can feel his lower extremities and give a big thumbs up. Stunning! Emergency over!

Wes starts coding, and Eddie, Hen, and Chim rush into the ambulance to get him to the nearest hospital. In the ambulance, Eddie performs a REBOA: a resuscitative endovascular balloon of the aorta. If Eddie punctures Weston's artery, Weston bleeds out. If Chim runs over a bump and Eddie inserts the thread incorrectly, Weston bleeds out. There are not incredibly good chances going for any of them right now.

But, alas, this is 9-1-1, so Eddie and Hen get the balloon in, Weston comes back to them, and he survives with minimal injuries. As he's fading back into consciousness, Weston calls Eddie 'dad,' which throws Eddie into an existential crisis.

When they arrive at the hospital, Eddie almost immediately leaves Hen and Chim to "start paperwork," AKA crying in the bathroom. Hen voices that he probably misses his son, seeing as Christopher still lives in Texas with his grandparents.

Cut to: Hen and Karen in the courtroom requesting their foster license be reinstated after it was removed when Mara was taken from them. At first, it's going seemingly well until the opposing lawyer brings out photos of HenRen, Madney, and the kids hanging out in a public park together.

Hen goes on to tell the judge about how Ortiz is framing her, and though we don't see the judge's reaction, we can assume it's not very kind as she then sets a no-contact order for HenRen and Mara. If a woman potentially adopting a child was in a courtroom yelling about how a councilwoman was framing her, I fear I would also recommend that the child not be placed with her. She admittedly seemed a bit erratic.

In a last-ditch effort, Hen visits Councilwoman Ortiz at her offices. She explains that despite Ortiz being hurt because her son is gone, Mara shouldn't have to face the same fate. Councilwoman Ortiz, a certified sociopath, tells Hen that maybe Mara needs to learn early how to go on without them.

Then Ortiz drops the bomb that she's old friends with Gerrard. She's why he got the position at the 118, and Hen is why Gerrard is at the 118 in the first place — to break her like Ortiz was broken after her son died.

This brings us to the best part of the episode: members of the 118 stopping in at Bobby's house and venting, ranting, or getting advice from him. Hen reveals that this entire Gerrard situation was because Ortiz was trying to get back at her. Buck tells Bobby about how attached Gerrard has become. Eddie expresses frustration at their victim's father not wanting to be in his life. Chim tells Bobby he must return to the 118.

Athena arrives at the hospital in response to a call about a man who's been attacked by a pit bull. Except this man has clearly not only been attacked by a pit bull. We get an absolutely wild reveal that the animal who attacked him is actually a tiger, and the 118 is dispatched to the scene where they must repel down a building and into a window to tranq the tiger before it kills the landlady who entered the apartment after hearing who she thought was the tenant inside.

After his discussion with Bobby, Eddie sees Weston's father and tells him why he thinks he should be in Weston's life. He explains that it's not too late and that he doesn't want other people to end up where he and Christopher are. Later, when Weston's father does show up at the hospital as Wes is being discharged, there's a beautiful moment where Weston's mom turns to Eddie and mouths, "Thank you."

After speaking with Bobby on the Hotshots set, Gerrard decides to visit Councilwoman Ortiz. They discuss why Gerrard was placed at the 118, and Ortiz states that they should shutter the

118 to make budget cuts. Gerrard is, of course, all for it and agrees on the condition that he's made fire chief when Ortiz wins her mayoral seat.

Except, gasp, Gerrard wasn't all for it! At the next city council hearing, Hen plays the footage from Gerrard and Ortiz's conversation during the meeting since Gerrard was recording it on his bodycam. After all, Ortiz pioneered the Eyes and Ears Program, so now "everything on there is public record."

As the episode ends, there's a beautiful montage featuring a group hug between Eddie, Buck, Chim, Hen, and Bobby; Mara being brought back to Hen and Karen's home; and Bobby explaining to Athena that he loved her house because he was there with her—and they decide to use the lot and build something that's just theirs.

Also, Ortiz dropped out of the mayoral race because, duh.

Summary: The 118 is once again working on the spookiest night of the year and missing out on all the tricks and treats. Meanwhile, Buck's Halloween decorations become a little scarier than he had hoped.



The episode starts with Hen, Karen, Mara, Denny, and Jee dressing up as the "Wizard of Oz" gang for Halloween. After Chim and Maddie take several (hundred) photos, Hen and Karen are seen discussing Hen possibly getting this year off for Halloween in the kitchen. Karen thinks it will be necessary for Mara to have Hen there for her first Halloween, and Hen agrees to ask Bobby about it.

Athena is on the other side of things, lecturing high schoolers about the dangers of not only driving drunk or high —

but driving at all on Halloween. In the middle of the talk, two teenage girls are seen giggling to themselves on their phones, completely disregarding Athena. The teacher simply tells Athena she isn't alone, and since she doesn't speak "sigma," she shouldn't worry too much.

Later, the 118 is setting up for the Fire House Haunt Fest, and Bobby says it took place at the 126 last year, which is very sneaky and adorable 9-1-1: Lone Star Easter egg.

They've got ghosts, spiders, lights, and streamers when Buck brings out the pièce de résistance: an old dummy he got from a movie studio down the street from his apartment. Bobby fears the children may think it's too scary, but Buck is convinced this is just what they need.

We get a sequence where children outsmart the 118 during the Haunt Fest, with Hen and Chimney dressing as a killer doctor and Jason Vorhees, respectively. Eddie plays a wolf that the children roll their eyes at, and Buck is a cowboy with a suspiciously familiar mustache. There's also Cap Dracula: Bobby in a vampire costume, charming at least the audience at home watching, if not the audience at the firehouse.

Then comes the first twist of the episode: the body Buck brought as decoration is an actual dead body. Buck accidentally snaps the body's arm off and sees tendons, freaking out when he realizes it's actually a man. 911 is called, duh, and Athena shows up with her team to haul the body off, but not before a sweet moment between her and Bobby, where they exchange "home safe" goodbyes.

Here's where we arrive at the first emergency: a father, trying to celebrate Halloween with his two daughters, gets a massive pumpkin stuck on his head. Bobby instructs Buck to find something to ease the constriction around the man's neck, and we're gifted one of the most ridiculous parts of this episode: Buck walking into the room yelling, "Lube flying in!"

Quickly after, we find out that Dad bought the pumpkins a while back, and the bacteria in the pumpkin is starting to cause a reaction, restricting his breathing and swelling his head and face. After an intense moment where they use a buzzsaw to get him out of the pumpkin, he is safe and apologizing for the mess he's made.

Buck tells him not to worry about it and promptly slips on the pumpkin guts, dislocating his left shoulder. Because of this, Buck ends up in the hospital having his arm reset.

Tommy arrives at the hospital while Eddie sits beside Buck's bed, flipping through a magazine. Naturally, Tommy thinks Buck is joking when he begins telling him about a curse he believes he's become part of. Because he ripped off Billy's left arm (the real-dummy dead body, if you'll remember), Billy is coming after him and injuring him in the same way. Tommy and Eddie laugh about this, and Buck sits in the hospital bed, perplexed and upset.

At home, Hen explains to Karen that she spoke with Bobby about getting Halloween off, and he gave her an unfortunate ultimatum: either she gets the night off to be with Denny and Mara, or Chim gets the night off to be with Jee. As a result, both Hen and Chim end up agreeing to work.

Over at Buck's, Tommy is trying his hardest to get Buck to relax and heal, but Buck is not having it. Instead, he intends to discover everything he can about Billy Boils, the Not-Real-Real Dead Body he found. In the morning, Buck wakes up to boils on his face. Eddie comes over and treats Buck's boils, laughs at him again about the "curse," and bets Buck five dollars the boils will be gone by his next shift.

Their shift begins, and they spend most of the time dealing with minor incidents until Maddie receives a seemingly innocuous call about a principal finding a paper bag of... fecal matter... on fire on his porch. Maddie scolds him for calling 911, dispatches the 118 to extinguish the fire, and moves on.

The 118 treats a zombie who was decked in the face, Athena unloads a literal clown car full of drunk clowns, and Josh is dressed up as who we can only assume is off-brand-didn't-get-the-rights Ted Lasso — deep sigh.

After some hijinks, Josh gets a call from the principal from earlier stating that two students egged his house, and he's chasing them — in his car. Josh asks them to stop and slow down, as a crew is on their way when the call cuts out after a loud crash.

The 118 arrives on the scene to find, you guessed it, the two teenage girls from Athena's class, unhurt and begging the team to help the victims of this accident. We learn that not only did the driver crash into a house, but he's got a child pinned to the house. Chim spots Jee and Mara on the scene, and that's when we find out the child is Denny.

In a heart-shattering sequence, we witness Buck and Eddie building a structure to hold the roof while Bobby wenches the car out, as Karen and Hen try to save their son. At first, Denny feels leg pain, and we can all assume his leg is broken. Then, though, he starts having stomach pain, his blood pressure is no longer detectable, and they lose Denny's pulse.

As Hen does CPR, she's told the blood Denny needs for a transfusion is fifteen minutes out, and she improvises. Denny and Karen share a blood type, and despite Chim's warning that it's incredibly risky to do an in-field blood transfusion on a child, both Hen and Karen are deadset on saving their child. After a few heartwrenching seconds, Denny's pulse returns, and he wakes up to greet Hen and Karen before he's taken to the hospital.

At the hospital, members of the 118 and Tommy sit in the waiting room awaiting an update from Hen or Karen. Hen then texts the group chat —consisting of Bobby, Athena, Buck, Eddie, Hen, and Chim — that Denny will be okay, and he wants the team to stick around and sign his cast. In the middle of this, Buck claims he's figured out how to break Billy's curse on him. Cheers all around.

Hen and Karen circle back to Hen not being around for the kids as much as she'd like. After this scare, Karen ensures Hen that she's there for the important moments. Karen states that during the moments they feared they'd lose Denny, all she could think was, "Thank God you were at work."

The girls from the crash and Athena's class arrive at the hospital to give Denny their Halloween candy, which is sweet, but a man did, in fact, die. Athena brings them back to the school and presents with them, this time, about the dangers of being reckless on Halloween.

As Buck stands at Billy's final resting place, he gives a voiceover speech about the importance of family, loved ones, and being there for each other. There are clips of Athena at the school, Maddie and Chim flipping through Halloween pictures, and Mara signing Denny's cast.

Near the end of the voiceover, Buck says his most prominent line: "I can't imagine anything more painful than going through life alone," as Eddie packs up his decorations and looks longingly at a photo of himself and Christopher. Buck tells Billy that he's not alone anymore, apologizes for messing with him, and leaves the cemetery with his boyfriend (which he calls Tommy for the first time tonight!) in tow.

Tommy was Buck's first gay relationship. He knew Buck wasn't ready to settle down yet because Buck hasn't come to terms with everything about being gay. Tommy broke up with Buck. He did it because he didn't want to get his own heart broken. And now Buck was once again single.

And Eddie was finally leaving his depression behind him thanks to some advice from Father Bryan.

The episode begins at a jewelry shop that's being robbed by several people with guns in masks—except, wait, it's a sting! Everyone in there is a cop, including Athena Grant herself, in a leopard-print jacket that really, really takes over the screen.

While Athena chastises herself for missing out on getting Flash Rob—which is an insane name for an online personality who encourages people to rob banks, by the way—he runs, and she chases him, pulling a hamstring along the way.

Elsewhere, Maddie and Chim join Buck for dinner, where they learn that

Buck has turned to baking as a coping mechanism instead of texting Tommy whenever he wants to. He's made several loaves of bread, baked Alaska, and even baked brie, Maddie's favorite... except when she's pregnant, of course.

Maddie denies wine earlier, claiming that her trainer wants her to lay off the booze, but Buck is far from stupid when it comes to his sister, and he figures out pretty quickly that she's pregnant. While Maddie tries to tell Buck they didn't tell him because it was so early, Chim is more to the point, stating that he's a blabbermouth, which isn't wrong.

After Buck tells them he's so excited for them and that this is the best news, they have a small group hug that is so ooey-goey it could've rivaled a chocolate chip cookie straight from the oven.

Over on the Hotshots set, a stunt gone wrong requires the 118 to help a stuntman who's passed out. He's hanging from a truck's ladder, a la one Evan Buckley in season six.

Eddie and Buck wake him up and get him to the ground safely, but not before Vincent Gerrard greets them and then promptly runs away to get Brad a latte.

Brad, of course, is ecstatic to see Bobby and relatable. As he hugs Bobby tightly, we're still unsure how to feel about Brad. Do we like him? Hate him? Trust him? We'll see, I suppose.

After Athena pulls her hamstring and limps around without a crutch, she meets with her boss, Elaine. She informs Athena that she'll have a probationary officer working with her from now on.

Athena is, of course, resistant, but Officer Sparks was top of his class at the academy. He's incredibly eager to work with the sergeant who's led the station in arrests for 104 consecutive months. As much as she protests — Elaine doesn't give her much of an option. She's a mentor now.

At the firehouse, Bobby lets Buck make lunch. Eddie and Hen interrogate Buck over why he's suddenly so into baking. After Buck sees Tommy typing in their chat, Eddie and Hen take his phone and play keep-away until Fire Chief Simpson confronts them.

Good news, though! He's not there to berate the 118. He's here because Brad has all but demanded that Bobby return to the Hotshots set and abandon his firehouse. The Chief is inclined to agree because they give so much money to the department. Thus, an idea is born: make Gerrard nice so Bobby doesn't have to work on a television set.

Athena and Sparks are on their first outing; Athena's teaching him to be aware of his surroundings at all times. He's diligently taking notes, but by taking notes, he's missing out on his surroundings.

Athena asks him about why he's in this profession. Sparks tells her he wants to become a cop because his father abused him and his mother. He's never seen his father as scared as the night the neighbors called the cops on him. He realized that night how much power cops have and acted on it—an immediate red flag for Athena.

She tells Hen as much as they drink together (and Athena rests her injured leg). Hen tries to tell her that it's completely normal and expected to have some wear and tear, but Athena thinks she's just jabbing at her age.

In the end, Hen implores Athena to "get over yourself, and then follow your instinct." And thank goodness she did, but more on that later!

On day one of the "teach Gerrard to be nicer" plan, Bobby heads to the Hotshots set. He tries to encourage Gerrard to learn people's names, jobs, and associations. In a surprising turn of events, after Brad brushes Gerrard off, Gerrard cries to Bobby about loving this job and hoping that Brad doesn't take it away.

Athena gets to work the next day, and Sparks surprises her by telling her that he's found some seemingly helpful information about Flash Rob. With this info, they head for the trucking company that seems to be featured in the videos.

After the supervisor points out Flash Rob/Caleb, he runs for his truck, and Sparks jumps onto the back of his truck as he drives away. Athena quickly follows behind, orders roadblocks to be put up, and tries to get Sparks off the truck.

Shockingly, he refuses, instead climbing atop the truck until he can dive in from the side. This forces Flash Rob/Caleb to stop, and Sparks can arrest him. He gets applause from the officers waiting at the roadblock. And then thanks Athena for the assist.

As Athena tells Elaine that she thinks he's a time bomb, he overhears and accuses her of only saying this because he's younger and faster than her. Athena tells Elaine to believe them when people show you who they are and exits the room, demanding that Sparks no longer work with her.

Maddie and Chim, looking for a date night, utilize Uncle Buck for the night and drop Jee off to bake with her favorite uncle. There's a cute albeit small scene between Buck and Jee, and this breakup has somehow turned into a good thing.

Brad and Bobby go to dinner—courtesy of the LAFD, according to Bobby—and it's a nightmare from beginning to end. Brad demands an intricate drink, and when it's delivered wrong by a very kind waitress, he insults her to the point of her crying.

While people are filming on their cell phones, Bobby demands that Brad apologize to the waitress. Brad gets right up in Bobby's face and asks, "Or what?" and Bobby doesn't miss a beat before saying: "I'm gonna kick your limey ass!"

Talented, brilliant, incredible, show-stopping, spectacular, never the same, totally unique, and completely never done before.

As we near the end of the episode, Officer Sparks and his new mentor, Officer Vargas, are making a routine stop that turns into a 911 call as this person is a "sovereign citizen."

She claims she doesn't need a license plate, and while Officer Vargas agrees, he explains that he just needs paperwork from her to get this done and over with. Sparks asks if he can try to talk her down. As she gets more disobedient, he smashes her window open. He then attempts to drag her out of the car while her daughter is in the backseat.

After she refuses to exit the vehicle, Sparks shouts, "Taser!". And, you guessed it, instead removes his gun from his holster and shoots her. Athena immediately jumps into action. With her quick thinking and med kit, she can get the woman to breathe again before the ambulance shows up.

Athena, at the deposition, and with a crutch, wishes him luck and tells him to tell the truth. Then, she asks Elaine if she'll assign her a new probie. She has the wisdom to teach some of the younger generations what she knows without necessarily having to give anything up.

Back at the firehouse, Bobby interrupts Buck, Hen, and Eddie, watching the now-viral video of Bobby threatening Brad. He wanes about not wanting to work with Brad. Then, Brad shows up behind him and tells him his character on Hotshots has been put into a coma.

Brad explains that Bobby threatening him "blasted the entitlement out of me like a truth enema" and that he needs to study Bobby at the firehouse by shadowing him.

The alarm goes off; Brad enters the firetruck and fin.

It wasn't until he mentioned Jayna that she thought differently. John said he doesn't want to hurt Jayna. He wants to save her or so he claims. He thinks killing her would help her find God. John was a monster. Only Maddie couldn't call him that. She didn't want to risk him hurting Jayna. She pretended to empathize with him because

she overheard in the background someone was trying to yell with a gag in their mouth.

Jayna was real. She was being held prisoner. Maddie didn't want to get her killed and so she tried to tell John that if he left now without Jayna that she wouldn't send the cops after him. She was lying. She was hoping he'd fall for it. He nearly did, but he wasn't stupid. He knew they were tracing his call. The cops showed up at the location they thought was his and it turns out nothing was there. John sent them to a nearby location to see if Maddie was lying or not. She proved she was lying when the cops showed up.

He has a track record for being interested in underage girls. This John Doe's victims were all underage girls as well. The detective suspected he was killing them so that he wouldn't hurt them. There was just one problem with bringing him in. Braeburn couldn't talk to him without evidence. He filed a complaint against her. And if she goes back to his place without evidence, it was considered harassment.

The cops chose to instead send in Athena. Athena spoke to Bullock's girlfriend. She got his new address and they were too late to arrest him, but he wasn't there and John Doe called 911 again. He kept calling until he got Maddie. He talked to her. He admitted he was Bullock. He admitted he killed the other girls. He was a serial killer and so Maddie talked him into killing himself. He told her he had a gun. She didn't want him to use it on Jayna. She told him that he has to kill the monster inside of him. No sooner did Bullock kill himself that the cops found him. And they found Jayna.

Jayna was found alive. She was going to be alright. She wasn't harmed in any way and she just wanted to be with her mother. With Bullock dead, Jayna was safe. Summary: Following Maddie's mysterious 911 call, Chimney returns home to find his daughter alone and Maddie nowhere to be found.



The episode begins with Chim and Buck arriving at Chim and Maddie's after Eddie's going-away dinner. Ready to give some of their leftovers to Maddie, their excitement quickly turns to dread as they realize Maddie is not home, despite Jee-Yun being in bed.

As Chim tries to call Maddie and Buck finds her wedding ring, we get our first actual glimpse of Maddie. She's got her hands bound, lying on a dirty mattress in Detective Amber Braeburn's basement. We see Amber arguing with herself about

what to do with Maddie. She chloroforms Maddie again, leaving the viewers just as in the dark as Maddie.

Hen has shown up at Chim's place. She and Buck start calling local hospitals and police stations to see if anyone's heard anything about Maddie. They haven't. Once Eddie shows up, Hen devises a plan: send Eddie and Buck on the lookout around the surrounding neighborhoods, while Chim and Hen call Athena.

The four of them working together is bittersweet, given that Eddie is supposed to be leaving for Texas soon. More on that later, though.

Back in the basement, Amber is utterly convinced that Maddie has her suspicions about her and has already told someone about them. Obviously, Maddie didn't, but Amber isn't exactly seeing reason at the moment. Athena interrupts by calling Amber. She rushes into the station, where Chim, Bobby, and Athena are filling out a missing persons report.

While the entire episode is shaped as a psychological thriller, this scene is the one that solidifies it. The camera pivots on Amber, the music intensifies, and the audience helplessly watches as Amber gets information from Athena and Chim that she can use against Maddie.

While Chim tells Amber about Maddie's post-partum depressive episode, Amber instantly turns it on Chim, explaining Maddie's previous 911 call in which she (thinks she) convinced a man to kill himself. Then, Chim drops the P-word, telling Amber that though he let this off of the missing persons report. Maddie is just past her first trimester of her pregnancy.

Spencer and Choi lean on each other during this unknowing face-off. The acting between them leaves little space to remind you that this is, in fact, a network television show.

After Athena tells Bobby that she's now starting to suspect that Richard had a partner, we head back to the basement, where Amber is getting a syringe ready for Maddie. She tells Maddie she's going to stage her suicide by dosing her with Fentanyl. Maddie, ever the quick thinker, convinces Amber to let her write a suicide letter to Jee, buying her enough time for a small break to come through.

Buck and Eddie are out looking for Maddie when Buck finally hits a breaking point. He expresses his frustrations to Eddie that everything was going right with his life—Maddie was pregnant, and he and Tommy were together—and then it fell apart. Tommy dumped him, Maddie has been taken, and Eddie is leaving and acting like nothing here matters to him. Buck tries to apologize, and Eddie placates him by saying they've been up all night and not to worry about it.

Chim arrives home to Hen, Karen, and the kids playing games, unaware of what's going on around them. Karen offers her support to Chim, telling him he's family. It reminds us that Hen, Karen, and Chim are a little family of their own within the 118 family.

Elsewhere, Athena and Detective Romero visit the morgue to speak with the coroner about Richard's cause of death and whether it really was suicide. There, they learn he was heavily drugged, and it's more than likely that his suicide was staged.

The two head to the hospital to visit Jayna to ask her about being kidnapped and whether or not she remembers someone else with Richard. She does tell them there was a woman there sometimes, but she'd assumed it was another victim, even though she sounded older than Jayna.

Maddie finishes her note, and as Amber reads it, she muses, "If my mother loved me half as much as you love her, maybe we wouldn't be here right now," which is such a deep-sigh moment, as 911 still hasn't gotten out of their habit of beating context clues to death. One could assume that if you're a serial killer, there are some mommy or daddy issues, but 9-1-1 must spell it out for you.

As Maddie tries to convince Amber not to kill her, we re-meet John from the original 911 calls, who we learn is actually named Peter. He's one of Amber's personalities, and he's the more timid, do-gooder. Peter tells Maddie that he can't keep fighting Amber off. Maddie convinces him to give her one more chance to prove that she's on his side and that she'll help him.

Athena and Detective Romero realize that Amber is unreachable at the moment. They move ahead in questioning Isabelle, Richard's girlfriend from the prior episode. They accuse her of being his accomplice, and though she isn't terribly reliable for being with him in the first place, they're able to rule her out as the killer as she spent the entire night before at a casino playing blackjack.

While Amber/Peter tells Maddie she'll have another chance, she finds Jayna at the hospital and tells her she's being discharged. Visibly confused, Jayna hesitates. Ultimately, she goes with her because you're supposed to be able to trust cops, especially as a young white woman, especially after being kidnapped.

Chim sends Hen and Karen home and brings Jee to bed, taking a moment to watch her and sob, which is heart-wrenching. Before he can fully process anything, though, there's a knock on the door. It's Hen with Mara, who tells Chim that Jee mentioned she heard someone crying and speaking with Maddie last night.

At the dispatch center, Detective Romero asks Josh to pull up a 911 call from 25 years ago. In his and Athena's research of similar cases, he's found that a 911 call was placed wherein a 14-year-old girl had escaped after being kidnapped, held, and tortured for several weeks. The kicker? She had a lethal amount of chloroform in her body.

Listening to the 911 call finally reveals that the 14-year-old is Amber Braeburn, which puts together the pieces for Athena and Detective Romero. They ask Josh for her address to finally rescue Maddie. Mara's reveal kickstarts something in Chim because when Athena asks Josh for Amber's address, he reveals he's already given it to Chim five minutes before the two walked in.

In Amber's basement, she introduces Maddie to Jayna and demands that Maddie talk her out of killing Jayna. In the middle of this, Chim shows up at the door, and Maddie kicks it into high

gear. With Amber's back turned, Maddie screams the most pleasing horror movie scream and lunges at Amber, attempting to stop her from reaching her husband. The two tussle, and then we get the most shocking moment on 9-1-1 to date: Amber slits Maddie's throat.

The gore in this moment—and in the future—indicates that 911 is not afraid to keep toeing the line, to keep trying new things. It's as displeasing and upsetting as it is exciting and breathtaking. The casualness with which Amber does it, and we're expected to move on, gives the episode yet another kick.

Upstairs, Amber greets Chim and offers him a cup of water. In the middle of this, Athena calls Chim and explains what's going on, reminding him to remain calm on the phone. He turns his back to Amber, which is the first thing you shouldn't do if you're learning that you're alone in a room with a serial killer, and is face-to-face with a gun when he turns to face her again.

Surprise #2 of the night: Maddie is alive! And she attacks Amber with the hammer she found earlier! Collapsing immediately, Chim calls 911 and demands they send someone for his wife while begging Maddie to stay with him. As Amber stands back up and re-aims her gun at Chim, there's a gunshot, blood splatter, and silence. Athena's arrived to save them, just in the nick of time.

We finally get some light in the episode when Chim goes to see Maddie, who is beaten up and covered in bandages, but survived. Chim tells her she's okay, and there's the implication that this will be a long road ahead. When Maddie asks about the baby, Chim tells her he's doing okay. It's a boy!

The final part of this episode centers around Buck and Eddie as Buck helps Eddie finish packing up for Texas. They stand outside after putting boxes in the moving truck, and it's a little awkward. Eddie thanks Buck for "helping me get back to him [Christopher]," and Buck is clearly torn.

Then, Eddie tells Buck that despite him not thinking so, that Buck matters to him. Buck gives him protein-filled cookies for the ride and demands that Chris get some, too, before they hug and exchange goodbyes.

Summary:	The 118 responds to a call at a mega-church, where Bobby runs into his estranged mother. Meanwhile, Buck is looking to expand his social circle now that Eddie has left.



The first emergency the 118 is called to is at a mega-church, where a self-proclaimed "faith healer" by the name of Sister Ann is performing a healing for a large crowd of followers. However, in the middle of her service, the churchgoers begin dropping like flies.

Not long after, our favorite crew of first responders arrives at the scene. The crowd has seemingly lost their minds, and as the rest of the firefighters attempt to evacuate the building, Bobby figures out the cause to be carbon monoxide poi-

soning after learning there are gas generators being run inside the building. After clearing everyone from the church, they then notice a woman hanging off the giant cross atop the roof.

Ravi and Chimney attempt to secure the structure while Buck starts trying to coax her down. She hesitates to take Buck's hand, reminiscent of the rollercoaster emergency back in the first season, but with Sister Ann's words grounding her, she finally obliges.

After the 118's work is done, Ann approaches Bobby, who has been acting cagey throughout the emergency. It's revealed that the two know each other, seemingly on a first-name basis. The conversation is tense, and the rest of the crew picks up on it.

Noticing their confusion, Bobby drops the bombshell that Sister Ann is his mother.

All we know about Bobby's mother comes from last season, where we saw in a flashback that she and Charlie, his older brother, left Bobby's abusive father while Bobby chose to stay. Not long after this, his father died, leaving Bobby to blame himself.

After this shocking revelation is revealed, Athena admits she was under the impression that Bobby's mom wasn't still alive due to the fact that he never talks about her. While overseeing the construction of their new home, Bobby tells her it's because he doesn't want anything to do

with his mother. He explains the last time they had spoken was before he married his first wife, and after the tragic fire that took her and his kids' lives, she only sent a half-hearted letter in the mail. Despite this, Athena tries to convince him to mend his relationship with her, alluding to the fact that a higher power may be the reason he was called to the church.

Later on, Charlie shows up at the firehouse to talk to Bobby. We learn a bit more about his life as they exchange updates, and it seems like he's spent the better part of his adult life parading around with their mother. Bobby boasts about his marriage with Athena and his step-kids, and their relationship seems much less strained than Ann and Bobby's. Charlie invites him and Athena to lunch with their mom, and Bobby considers the invitation. Charlie also notes that their father would be proud of him, which strikes a chord. In case anyone's forgotten, their father was also a firefighter.

Under the impression that Ann is the one who invited them to lunch, Bobby and Athena show up to her hotel room before they go out. Charlie lets them in, and Ann introduces herself to Athena, who is cordial to her mother-in-law. They begin to strike up a conversation, but it's made tense when Athena brings up the fact that they're building a new home, and Bobby notes that their old house was burned down. His mother makes a jab at his starting of the apartment fire, which admittedly made me clutch my pearls a bit.

It's clear at this point that Bobby is irritated, and rightfully so. When Ann begins to strike up more conversation with Athena about her work in the church, Bobby is quick to get defensive when his father is brought up. He accuses her of walking out on them, and all plans of lunch are squashed when it's revealed that Charlie was actually the one who set everything up.

In a stunning monologue performed by Peter Krause, Bobby tells his mother that although he's worked hard to forgive the people in his life and move on, she's someone he doesn't think he'll ever be able to forge a relationship with again.

Later on, the 118 responds to an emergency that brings to light how Bobby's mother may feel about her situation. After this, Bobby returns to the church his mother has been setting up shop in to apologize. He watches her deliver a powerful speech about how she is a fraud, and that the "healings" she initiates truly have nothing to do with her. Suddenly, before he gets the chance to reconcile with her, she faints onstage.

At the hospital, Bobby and Athena wait for news on his mother's condition. Bobby comes to the realization that the resentment he had been holding for his mother came from a place of misunderstanding. Bobby talks to Charlie, who lies and says this has never happened before, which he knows isn't true. It's then that Charlie tells him their mother has terminal cancer.

He explains that Ann didn't want Bobby to know she was sick, but that after the church call, he took it as a sign that perhaps he should know. After telling Bobby that their mother would like to see him, Bobby comes into her room. He says he knows about the cancer and tries to convince her to stay in L.A. for treatment, but she insists that it's too far along and there's nothing that can be done. The pair share a very touching and tender moment together, full of apologies that they both clearly regret saving until that moment.

Bobby voices what he's come to realize, which is that, "Sometimes all you can do is save yourself."

Meanwhile, this episode also focuses on Buck's attempts to adjust to a life without Eddie.

We open on an overwhelmed Buck surrounded by movers as they help him get his things into his new home. He shows up at his sister Maddie and her husband Chimney's door, asking to sleep at their place. Maddie only opens the door wider — a silent Buckley sibling moment that shows us how much they love each other.

However, the hole Eddie's absence leaves isn't only at home. While on the mega-church call, Bobby mistakenly keeps calling Ravi "Eddie", which is bound to stir up some emotions on Buck's end.

Before getting ready for another night at Maddie and Chimney's house, Maddie tells Buck that he can't keep avoiding sleeping in his new place forever. The issue, according to Buck, is that it still feels like Eddie's house rather than his. We can see how this would be difficult for someone like Buck, who lived in the apartment of his girlfriend who left him to travel the world long after she decided not to come back. He admits to Maddie that he's having a hard time without his best friend, and she implores him to do something he probably doesn't want to: make new friends.

Sure enough, Ravi gets dragged into Buck's search for a connection equivalent to the one he has with Eddie. At the firehouse, Buck approaches him and attempts to make small talk, which

Ravi takes with a grain of salt. He then asks if Ravi wants to hang out, and the whole scene is awkward in just the right way. On seeing his coworker's hesitancy, Buck points out that it also took him a while to warm up to Eddie, to which Ravi questions how long. "Almost a whole shift," is Buck's meek response. Mind you, Ravi's been at the station for four years.

Ravi ends up at a bar with Buck anyway, only to be subjected to his drunk rambling about Eddie. Fed up after multiple rounds of shots, he goes to retrieve some beer and runs into none other than Buck's ex-boyfriend, Tommy.

Bringing him over to talk to Buck, Ravi manages to make his escape now that he is distracted. With nothing better to do, Tommy and Buck begin to catch up. Buck recounts Maddie's abduction and Eddie's departure, to which Tommy reveals that Eddie stopped talking to him after he dumped Buck. He then says he's recently moved into a new place, and asks if Tommy wants to come over.

This leads to them sleeping with each other, but not before Tommy breaks their make-out session to ask if Buck is living in Eddie's house. In the morning, it seems as though the two are willing to get back together and give their relationship a second go. That is where they're heading, but then Tommy says he isn't worried about Buck breaking his heart because the "competition's out of the way." If you just did a double-take, so did everyone else.

Confused, Buck presses him on what he means before realizing he's referring to Eddie. Yes, they went there. Buck immediately grows defensive, finding it absurd that Tommy would think such a thing. His argument is that Eddie is straight, to which Tommy doesn't seem convinced of. After a flustered slip-up from Buck that upsets Tommy, he leaves.

As he often does, Buck turns to Maddie with his dilemma. She asks if there's a possibility that he is in love with Eddie, to which he insists he isn't. "It wouldn't be so crazy," she tells him. I didn't say it, she did. Although it could be a case of denial, Buck has trouble even conceiving this possibility, shutting it down but admitting that his absence is still hurting more than he anticipated and that living in his house is making it harder.

He realizes that he hasn't unpacked his things because that would make the fact that Eddie (and Christopher) aren't coming back all too real. After admitting this, and the fact that he only slept with Tommy as a distraction so he wouldn't feel alone, Maddie tells him that maybe he needs to learn how to be alone again. This seems to be a common theme for Buck.

However, he takes it in stride. His last scene of the episode seems to be some kind of new beginning, with him accepting the fact that he's on his own and embracing it. He unpacks his boxes and settles onto his couch and into this new chapter of his life.

This episode ends with a brief lead-in to the 9-1-1 and *Doctor Odyssey* crossover, which lands Athena back onto a cruise ship after her and Bobby's scare last season.

She gets called as backup to detain a suspect at Long Beach, only to pull her cruiser right in front of *The Odyssey*. While we don't see any of what she gets up to on 9-1-1, she's clearly dismayed at the sight and is in for a wild ride.

Archie has a heart-to-heart conversation with Hen at 118. He tells her that he feels invisible to those around him, which

Hen understands. Earlier that day, she had arrived at 118, where none of her co-workers remembered it was her birthday. However, she offers him some advice, saying that he must move on and do something for himself.

In El Paso, Eddie Diaz is still working on his relationship with Christopher and finding ways to bond with his son. One of the scientists, Roz, is extracted by Buck through a perilous ventilation tunnel, but the maneuver leaves him locked outside as the lab enters automatic quarantine.

Inside, an unexpected blast renders Bobby, Chimney, Ravi, and Hen unconscious. When they wake up, Hen is seriously injured with a collapsed lung, and Chimney has lost his protective equipment, exposing him directly to the virus.

With Hen's life at stake and Chimney out of commission, Bobby has to conduct emergency surgery under Chimney's instruction. Maddie, leveraging her nursing experience, offers valuable input to secure Hen's safety.

Even as Bobby manages to stabilize Hen, the win is fleeting. Chimney starts to cough, then abruptly coughs up blood and gets a nosebleed — classic symptoms of viral infection. The scene is heart-wrenching, not only for viewers but also for the team, who can see the clock ticking away for Chimney.

Adding insult to injury, the only person who can assist, Moira, has disappeared with the only antiviral known to exist. Roz divulges that the cure is gone, and Buck finds the antiviral room empty. Moira never had any plans to remain; she fled, putting everyone within the lab in danger.

With Chimney infected, Hen recovering, and Bobby, Ravi, and the rest of the crew still stuck in a sealed lab, the stakes couldn't be higher. The army, under Colonel Hartman, is racing against time to get back in, but whether they'll make it in time is another story.

The man's sister is the woman whose baby died in the fire we saw occur in the opening flashback, and she's landed behind bars as she's convinced her baby didn't actually die that night.

Athena and the man sit down over coffee, and he explains to her that his sister had managed to put her life back together eventually, after the loss, but that all changed recently. We learn that he helped get his sister a job at his catering company for a young boy's birthday party, a boy who just so happened to share the same birthday as her deceased son. After meeting the boy, his sister became convinced that he was her baby, which eventually led to her arrest. He came to the 118 in hopes of speaking with someone who was there the night of the fire to get answers, and Athena offers her assistance.

After speaking with the man, Athena goes to meet with his sister, Mia, and she tells Athena about meeting the young boy at the party and discovering that he had a birthmark that was identical to the heart-shaped birthmark her son had on the inside of his wrist. She then tells Athena how the boy's mom happened to go to the same prenatal yoga class as her, and that there were rumors the woman had miscarried when she stopped coming to the classes.

Athena is convinced by the woman's theories and throws herself into the case as a distraction from facing her grief. As she processes the case with a make-shift investigation board in what was to be her and Bobby's dream house, Bobby appears to her and challenges the investigation she's piecing together. Athena tells him to go haunt someone else if he won't be helpful, to which he asks her why she isn't busy planning his funeral. Athena claims they don't need her to plan things, but this woman needs her help. She tells Bobby that she knows he would help the woman to which he reminds her that she knew him, past tense. As she goes to respond, Bobby is gone, leaving her alone in the room.

turns out that there were no remains found in the fire, but the woman's husband and brother kept the truth from her. When Hen comes to check on Athena, she finally breaks down in a moment that was truly gut-wrenching as Athena processes her anger in Bobby's decision to leave her. All I can say is Angela Bassett, go get your Emmy because that performance was flawless.

Looking to get answers, Athena runs some DNA tests, and they reveal the boy is not the woman's son and has the difficult task of telling her that her baby truly did die in the fire all those years ago. Before she leaves, the woman tells Athena about Bobby visiting her in the hospital after the fire. His words stuck with her — how he said he lives each day believing he'd one day see his kids again.

After closing the case, Athena returns home, where she's surprised by May and Harry, who have come to check in on their mom. As they sit to enjoy lunch, Athena tells the pair that she's finally found the perfect final resting place for Bobby.

With that, it's time to officially say goodbye to Bobby.

As we see a glimpse of Karen consoling Hen, we see Eddie return to join his 118 family in helping to lay Bobby to rest. As Buck, Eddie, and Ravi get ready for the funeral, Buck gets a call from Maddie and goes to find Chimney, who is drinking his way through his grief. Chimney is dealing with survivor's guilt and blaming Bobby for keeping them in the dark and deciding for everyone how things were going to go. Buck manages to talk him down.

The episode draws to a close with an emotional funeral fitting for a beloved captain such as Bobby. The well-attended funeral brings together Bobby's family and friends, as well as many within the community, both in the LAFD and the community, to mourn his death. After the final alarm is rung, we watch Bobby's casket get loaded on top of a firetruck as Buck then hangs Bobby's jacket and helmet on the truck.

The funeral proceedings take us through the streets and eventually to the airport, where it is loaded for flight.

Turns out the final resting place Athena found for Bobby was alongside his children in St. Paul, reuniting him with his children.

Summary: Following an earthquake, the 118 races to the scene of several unusual fires and must figure out their cause before anyone else is hurt.



The episode opens on everyone at the 118, including Eddie and Ravi, back when he was probie, gathered for a meal — including Bobby. At the 118, the captain says, we work as a family, support each other as a family, and eat together as a family. He's recalling when they delivered all those babies back in Season 1 and ... Buck's really just sitting alone at the table, remembering.

Buck's been doing psychological assessments of everyone's grief level (Eddie got a 12, Hen a 17), and Eddie's worried

about him spending all his time worrying, he shares with Hen and Karen. Eddie admits that he couldn't remember when he last spoke to Bobby after he got the news; it was a text exchange about slow cookers. When Karen remarks on him still being in Los Angeles, Eddie admits he hadn't planned on staying this long but it's nice being home and spending time with his Aunt Pepa after her stroke. Hen and Karen don't let him get away with calling Los Angeles "home," with the latter pointing out there might be an open spot at the 118 soon for a paramedic with Hen offered the captain position. Hen agrees he should come back, whether she takes it or not, but he's gotten a job offer from a fire department, too — in El Paso. He hasn't told Buck.

Buck goes to confession — Welcome back, Father Brian, if only we saw his reaction to Bobby's death — and Googles the steps of it on his phone. He's trying to get a message to his friend whom he'd go to for advice, and while people always talk about feeling a loved one's presence, he hasn't

yet. Once the priest leaves him alone, Buck gives talking to Bobby a try: "Cap, Bobby, you were wrong. You said I'd be okay, and I'm not. And they don't need me. I keep on trying and I reach out, but everyone is just spinning away. We don't talk, we don't even eat together. Everything is falling apart, and I don't know how to fix it. So I need you to — I need you to come back here and I need you to tell me what to do. I need you to give me a sign because..." He's getting emotional when an earthquake hits.

By the time Eddie walks into Buck's/his old house, his best friend has found out about the job offer in El Paso. (Hen told Chimney she wanted to throw him a surprise BBQ, and Chimney told Ravi, who then asked Buck if he should bring a gift.) Both get emotional and both lash out, driven by the anger in their grief. Buck thinks everyone's been tiptoeing around him because they think he's too fragile to accept the truth, and Eddie argues he wouldn't have been happy for him and instead makes it all about him and "the trials and tribulations of Evan Buckley, a tragedy in 97 acts."

Eddie says Buck has been spiraling since the funeral, but he's not the only one who lost him. They all did. "You never asked what it was like, waking up, in the middle of the night, to that news," Eddie shares, as a flashback shows just that moment and then him sitting on the floor, crying. "Sitting alone in the dark, trying to keep it together, so I don't scare the crap out of my kid. And when he woke up, I had to tell him another person he loved was dead." Bobby saved his life, and Eddie will always wonder if he could have made a difference if he was there. Buck asks if he doesn't think he did everything he could to save him, but Eddie doesn't know, because he wasn't there. He walks out, and the next morning, Buck finds the blankets folded on the couch and a note, "Went to the airport."

So, Buck's surprised when he gets home later to find Eddie there. He thought Buck could use some cheering up, so he went to the airport to pick up his son, Christopher. Buck and Christopher share a sweet hug and condolences about Bobby's death before Eddie reveals more of his family there: Aunt Pepa! She, too, greets Buck with a hug, and she's the one Buck opens up to.

"Bobby was our center," he says. "Without him, everything feels off-balance, kind of like the gravity is gone, you know?" Pepa tells him that after her stroke, she was afraid because she couldn't move her hand and thought her life would never be the same, but thanks to a lot of prayer and occupational therapy, she's accepted that life is change and it's unavoidable.

Meanwhile, Athena is all on board with Hen being the 118's new captain — it's the best thing for everyone, as she sees it — but the paramedic/firefighter still thinks of Bobby as Cap. He'd want it for her, his widow adds. But Hen isn't sure if she wants it and points out Athena turned down a promotion herself (to lieutenant, which would've meant more paperwork than protect and service). But things get awkward when Chimney walks in, having taken his daughter and Hen and Karen's kids to the movies, and Athena is very obviously not happy to hear or see him.

When Maddie arrives home, it's to find Chimney putting together a crib. He tells her about Athena and the conversation he and Bobby had about the captain looking after Maddie and the kids when he thought he would die. Chimney knows that Bobby must have known at that point he was infected and thinks he decided to sacrifice himself because he reminded him he had a kid on the way. Maddie points out that even if that's the case, Chimney had no idea that Bobby had been exposed and wasn't trying to manipulate him. She'll be forever grateful for him saving Chimney's life. As much as Chimney wants to take care of Athena like Bobby would have with Maddie, it seems impossible for now.

That is something that both Chimney and Athena agree on, as the latter opens up to Karen — 9-1-1 is giving us so many pairings/groupings we've wanted over the years, so can Eddie and Maddie please be next? — when she brings by a housewarming gift: a framed photo of the 118 from Hen and Karen's vow renewal. Athena doesn't blame him, she stresses, and she knows it's not fair, but she still sees Bobby, who's not here, when she sees the man who is, Chimney. "You're grieving, so fair can go mind its own damn business," Karen assures her. "We just want to be there for you, Athena. You don't have to do this alone." For now, Athena decides, she and Chimney will just be professional. Karen just makes sure she knows that when people ask about the same photo she gave her in their house, she doesn't say Hen's coworkers but rather, "That's our family."

Meanwhile, that earthquake causes a crack at the Los Angeles Headworks Reservoir Southeast Division. It upset an underground gas pocket, leading to methane bubbling up from water

with explosive results. That includes calls at the dentist, and a woman's bathroom when her tub blows up. The 118 is called to a multi-story structure fire at a commercial building, with Gerrard still around as captain and very complimentary. With their water resources limited, and with the 118's idea for a hose relay, directed by Maddie, they're able to put out the fire before it becomes too dangerous as it encroaches on the area where lithium-ion batteries are stored (which would result in a toxic blaze).

With Gerrard passing out satisfaction surveys, Chimney can't wait for Hen to be back in charge, but his ride-or-die reveals she's turned down the job. She doesn't want to be the captain, she explains. She's not good at telling people what to do because she tells them what to do then steps in and does it herself. She'd rather be a hands-on paramedic, then go home and be hands-on mom and wife and she thinks Bobby would understand that.

Finally, the set-up for the finale emergency comes during Athena's call. She encounters Graham the Cart Cop again as he's now going after people in his building for shirking and leaving their clothes in washing machines after they're done. Just as she's left after being called about him again, there's an explosion in the building in front of her and it collapses. Athena gets out of her car and radios in for help.

Summary:	The 118, still reeling from their recent loss, is dispatched to a mass casualty event after a high-rise apartment building collapses. Then, Athena and Chimney have to work together to save a familiar face.



The episode takes us back before the high-rise collapse to show a mother reluctantly moving her daughter into the building. As they admire the view of downtown LA, cart cop/laundry police Graham ditches Athena to return to the laundry room in hopes of helping Donnie find his girlfriend's lost intimates. Those five people, along with a man trapped on the ninth floor, are who the 118 sets out to rescue post-explosion. But before they get the call, they throw Eddie and Christopher a firehouse goodbye party.

Eddie accepted the job offer to join a new firehouse in El Paso, but he's not the only one leaving. Captain Gerrard is returning to Hotshots, which got picked up for another season. And Buck shocks everyone by revealing he put in for a transfer out of the 118, because "it's just a number now." I touch on this in a prior piece, but since Buck's hallway collapse immediately following Bobby's death, the way he processes his grief seems a bit out of character, considering Bobby was like a father to him. He's undoubtedly gotten stronger and shown so much growth throughout the seasons, but I admittedly hoped for more of an on-screen reaction or a more vocal examining of emotions ahead of Season 9. In a recent interview, Stark himself said, "The way I've always interpreted it is, [Buck's] tried to step into the Bobby role. Not by any means captain, but in the sense of, they're going to need somebody to say, 'We've got to get through this.'" So for Buck's response to this devastating loss to be coldly abandoning his family rather

than letting his facade fall in a unifying show of vulnerability feels a bit disappointing. And the lack of reaction from the team? Why isn't anyone communicating?

Before the 118 arrives on scene, Athena finds Donnie and Graham pinned by concrete in the laundry room and sends Donnie's girlfriend for help as Graham applies pressure to his wounds to keep him from bleeding out. After Hen and Chimney save the mother/daughter duo, Donnie's girlfriend requests backup for Athena, and Chim eagerly volunteers in hopes of getting some much-needed Athena face time. Shortly after he arrives to the laundry room, another explosion cuts off their exit. Meanwhile, Buck and Ravi get trapped with a resident on the ninth floor as the structure grows increasingly unstable.

As Eddie packs for the airport, Chris calls his attention to the TV, where the news reports the collapse and notes first responders are stretched thin. Instead of catching his flight, Eddie puts on the turnout gear the 118 gifted him before his big move and heads to the scene to lend a hand. When he arrives, Buck and Ravi seem doomed since the ladder can't reach them, but after thinking "What Would Bobby Do?" Eddie comes up with a Plan B. "If Bobby taught me anything, it's that we always have a choice!" Eddie heads to a nearby building's rooftop with a line gun, shoots a rescue line over to his pals, and they slide to safety, with Buck barely making it out of the wreckage. The scene is one of the episode's most moving, with Eddie not only risking his life and prioritizing his 118 family over his new job, but keeping Bobby's spirit and lessons alive in the process. When Buck arrives safely, he stares in awe of Eddie and his quick thinking. After Eddie explains, "I thought if Bobby was here, what kid of crazy stunt would he be yelling at Buck for pulling?" a grateful Buck earnestly replies, "Nah. This one was all you." As mentioned in my Season 8 finale wishlist, I was praying for another major Buck/Eddie scene, and though this one tugged at the heartstrings, I was still left wanting a much deeper interaction between the two.

With Athena and Chimney still trapped, the 118 heads to the laundry room to successfully rescue them. The team gets Donnie to safety first, assuming Graham's situation is far less dire. After freeing him from the rubble, however, they learn he had a piece of rebar through his body the entire time he helped save Donnie. Athena takes the reveal and it undeniable parallels to the bio lab tragedy incredibly hard. "I knew I was dead, but Donnie needed help more than me," Graham explains, putting Bobby's thought process into perspective and prompting Athena to snap, "So you just sacrificed yourself?!" As the team looks around at each other, viewing Bobby's sacrifice through a whole new lens, Graham says, "it was the right thing to do" and loses consciousness. Knowing Athena needs a win — and he does too — Chimney orders the team to cut Graham free and do everything in their power to save his life. While they couldn't save Bobby, and the possibility of Graham's rescue seems too far gone, the group needs hope. And they find it, thanks to Chim.

After bringing Graham back from the brink of death, Athena and Chimney get their long-awaited makeup scene, with Athena turning to Bobby for help breaking the ice. After Chim says the rescue is a team effort, she replies, "That used to make him crazy. Bobby. He always said you never gave yourself enough credit, but he knew that you were a smart, talented, capable paramedic, and a great leader. He'd be so proud of you." It's been a rough Season 8 road, and though I still don't agree with Bobby's death and am confident there were far less drastic, damaging ways to create more story for the series and its characters, Athena's speech and using this finale emergency as a vehicle for better understanding the 118's loss did bring a few tears to my eyes. Bassett and Choi impressed, as usual, I only wish they got more time to chat.

When Gerrard finally leaves the 118, Chimney sees the team prepare to part and resume their personal grief journeys, so he stops them in their tracks. "This is our firehouse. This is the 118. And it's not just a number. It's us! Things are never gonna be the same again, cause Cap is gone. But leaving won't change that. It won't make you feel any less sad. It just means that you'll be sad all alone." It's taken Chimney time to realize, but he knows Bobby would have sacrificed himself for any of his teammates, because that was the job. "This team, we are his legacy. So we can miss him, and we can mourn him, and we can even curse his name, but we are not going to disrespect him by throwing away what he built right here." Chim tells everyone — Buck and Eddie included — he'll see them on their next shift, and just in case his speech doesn't cement him as Bobby's best successor, Hen replies, "Copy that, Cap. I mean, Chim!"

Reversing course, Athena puts her and Bobby's dream home on the market as a way to help her move forward. Eddie and Chris move back home and Buck embarks on the search for a new apartment. Hen and Karen finally adopt Mara. And everyone gathers at the hospital to welcome

Maddie and Chimney's baby boy.

Athena walks down the hospital hallway to meet her loved ones. The new baby is introduced as Robert Nash Han and the season officially ends with Athena cradling him, saying, "Hello, Bobby."
