

Summary:	The Jedi pursue a suspect after a shocking crime.



The episode opens with a veiled Mae Aniseya entering a settlement on the planet Ueda. She speaks to a Kubaz pedlar, who tells her about the whereabouts of a Jedi in return for cash. Mae enters a cantina full of beings of various species. She walks up to a cloaked Jedi Master Indara, telling her that they have unfinished business. In the presence of the other customers, she dares Indara to attack her with all her strength. Several individuals respond with laughter and derision until Indara raises her hand.

Indara is unwilling to fight Mae but the younger woman is belligerent. When Indara responds that the Jedi do not attack the innocent, Mae disagrees and assaults several customers, starting a brawl. One of the alien customers tries to draw his blaster out of its holster but Mae slams a billiard table into his path. Indara grabs Mae's hand from behind, prompting Mae to fight her. Indara dodges Mae's blows, prompting Mae to draw her dagger.

Mae attempts to stab Indara with the dagger but the Jedi uses her height and combat skills to fend off Mae's attack. Mae takes a female hostage at knife point and hurls her downstairs. Indara calls for help via comlink before using the Force to cushion the woman's fall. Indara pursues Mae upstairs where the fight resumes. Indara uses the Force and her combat skills to fight off Mae's knife attacks, cornering her against a wall. Following a third round, Indara grabs her knife and disarms her.

Indara rips off Mae's mask and recognizes her as someone she knows. She demands to know what Mae is doing here, prompting Mae to say that she has come to kill her. Mae uses the Force to hurl Indara against a wooden wall. She then hurls a pair of blades at Indara, who uses her lightsaber to cut and scatter them. Mae draws her final dagger but Indara advances, warning her that this is a fight she cannot win. Mae counters that a Jedi does not pull out their weapon unless she is going to kill. Mae secretly pulls out another dagger.

She distracts Indara by hurling a dagger at the alien barkeeper, prompting Indara to use the Force to stop the blade in mid-air. While Indara is distracted, Mae stabs her in the chest. Mae watches as the Jedi Master succumbs to her injuries and walks away. She approaches the alien barkeeper and retrieves her dagger. She considers killing him but changes her mind after seeing his child.

Elsewhere in space, meknek Osha Aniseya wakes up in her cabin and chats with her droid PIP droid. Shortly later, a red alarm rings, summoning them for work. In the corridor, she chats with another meknek named Fillik, who tells Osha that she missed out on a trip to Nar Shaddaa the night before. Osha says what she does in her free time is none of his business. When Osha asks about what emergency they are responding to, Fillik explains that the shield generator needs repairs. They walk past two Neimoidians. When Osha says that the Trade Federation doesn't use shields, Fillik suggests that is why it needs to be repaired.

The two mekneks exit the airlock and head to the shield generator. The impatient Neimoidian Captain regards the mekneks as disposable, prompting another officer to respond that their cargo is not. Osha reminds the Neimoidian officers that they can hear them over the comm. Osha quips that Fillik is disposable but she is not. Fillik finds that the emitter duct is not connected to the field projector. Osha proceeds to weld it back together with the help of her PIP droid. Fillik reports that the pressure gauge is spiking, which explodes.

Osha is about to attend to the leaking gauge but is haunted by childhood memories of her and Mae being separated from their parents during a calamity. Fillik reminds her to stop daydreaming and she returns to work. Osha extinguishes the fire just as a Jedi starship circles the Trade Federation starship. Fillik asks Osha if those are her friends.

Jedi Knight Yord Fandar and his Padawan Tasi Lowa enter the bridge. They tell the Neimoidian captain that they are looking for a former Jedi named Osha Aniseya. Another officer responds that they are a cargo ship and do not carry passengers. Fandar says that the Jedi have information that Osha is working as a meknek, who does freelance outer ship repair. The officer denies hiring mekneks but Fandar raises his hand and gestures to insinuate he is preparing to use a mind trick. A female Neimoidian officer responds that Osha is bunking at Bunk 23 on the sub-level of the ship.

The two Jedi head downstairs to find Osha. Osha recognizes Fandar and is pleased to learn that he has passed the Jedi Trials to become a Jedi Knight. Fandar remarks that Osha has chosen to settle in the Corporate Sector, which is far from Coruscant. When Osha about the purpose of his visit, he taps his lightsaber. After Padawan Lowa enters the bunk, Fandar advises Osha to take a seat.

Lowa asks Osha how long she has been a MekNek. Osha says since she left the Jedi Order six years ago. Lowa types her answers into a datapad. Osha says she left the Jedi Orders but found that her skills were not transferable and took up a job because she needed a pay check. When Lowa asks Osha when she joined the Jedi Order, Osha says she joined when she was eight years old and says that Fandar knows that. Lowa responds that a major concern about admitting her to the Jedi was her age while Fandar adds that she had been mourning at the time of her recruitment.

Osha replies that the circumstances of her recruitment were unique but that the Jedi High Council had made the decision. Fandar recalls that Osha had lost her entire family including her mother, her sister and her entire village in the fire before Master Sol recruited her. Fandar says that attachments to loved ones are the most difficult to let go. When Osha asks why they are here, Lowa responds that a Jedi was murdered on Ueda last night. Fandar adds that the Jedi Master was Indara.

Lowa says that the suspect matched Osha's description. When Osha asks if they think that she killed Indara, Lowa asks where was she last night. Osha says that she was on this freighter last night and asks why she would kill Indara. Fandar responds that Master Indara had advised the Jedi Council to discontinue her training. Osha responds that leaving the Jedi Order was her hardest decision but insists that it was her decision. Osha denies murdering Master Indara.

Shortly later, the barkeeper enters Osha's bunk and identifies her as the assailant who murdered Indara and destroyed his bar. Fandar says that it doesn't matter what he thinks. The two Jedi escort her down the corridor where a burly red droid waits to escort to a ship bound for Coruscant. Osha tells Fandar and Lowa that they are making a mistake as she enters the prison transport. The prison transport disengages from the Federation starship before jumping into hyperspace.

At the Jedi Temple on Coruscant, Master Sol instructs a group of youngling initiates including Osha how to meditate, likening it to the ocean. He tells them to tell him what comes to their minds. Just then, Master Vernestra Rwoh enters the room. Two of the younglings liken the Force to balance and life. A dark skin human girl likens the balance to an expanding fire. Master Sol responds that the Force is like a fire or ocean, something that they must respect.

He dismisses the younglings for lunch before speaking with Master Rwoh, whom he addresses as an old friend. Rwoh describes Sol as a compassionate teacher. Rwoh has memories of Sol as a small child. Rwoh informs Sol of the death of Master Indara and tells him that they have detained his former Padawan Osha Aniseya as a suspect. Noticing Sol's shock and sadness, Rwoh remarks that she underestimated her attachment to Osha.

Sol recalls that Osha was a devoted Padawan and sees no reason for her to kill Master Indara. Rwoh says that the evidence against her is strong. Sol responds that he and Indara saved Osha from a terrible fire on Brendok, and that she saw them as their protectors. Soo believes that there must be some mistake. Rwoh and Sol agree to keep the matter secret since their political opponents could use it against them should the news become public knowledge. Rwoh asks Sol if he will support pursuing justice for the murder of Indara in this matter. Sol agrees but sighs in private.

Aboard the prison ship, Osha speaks with her fellow inmates. One of her fellow inmates has been restrained by a parasite known as Dybbuk due to his violent tendencies. She speaks to two of her fellow inmates, who ask if she actually killed a Jedi. They are planning an escape and invite her to join them. Osha asks where they are escaping to since they are traveling through hyperspace. The human inmate proposes overpowering the droids and escaping in escape pods. Osha says that she has faith in the Jedi, prompting the alien to tell her to enjoy prison.

A third cyborg convict transmits a signal that causes the pilot droids to shut down, bringing the prison ship out of hyperspace into an asteroid field. A tentacled prisoner takes out the warden droid by beheading it with its tentacles. Several prisoners flee in an escape pod but they abandon Osha due to her unwillingness to take part in the escape attempt. The prison ship is left floating in space above a planet. Osha uses the Force to retrieve her PIP droid, who had fallen out amidst the tumble.

She uses PIP to unlock her cell and then frees the paralysed prisoner from his Dybbuk. The prisoner however flees into an escape pod, leaving Osha behind. Osha screams in fury as the prison ship descends into the planet's atmosphere. She fastens herself to a seat and braces for impact. The prison ship crashes on the frozen world of Carlac.

Meanwhile on Coruscant, Padawan Jecki Lon informs Master Sol that Master Rwoh is requesting her presence at the detainment level. In private, Lon asks Rwoh why he keeps old Holopics of his former Padawan Osha, saying that it encourages sentimentality and nostalgia, which lead to attachment. Sol responds that past memories can serve as lessons and that if they don't meditate on the past, they are doomed to repeat their mistakes. Lon finishes the final sentence.

At the detainment level, the recaptured prisoners from the prison ship claim that the "Jedi killer" orchestrated the escape. Master Rwoh briefs Sol about the situation. Rwoh speaks to one of the prisoners and asks him what happened to the young woman. Under the influence of Sol's mind trick, the prisoner tells her that she helped him but he betrayed her and took the last escape pod. Rwoh responds that it still doesn't clear Osha for Indara's murder. When Sol asks if there are any life signs on Carlac, Rwoh responds that the Republic has dispatched probe droids to survey the wreckage.

Sol requests permission to go to Carlac and bring back Osha himself. Rwoh does not think that Osha survived but Sol insists as a means of taking responsibility for his failure. Rwoh permits Sol to assemble a small team but tells him to be discreet. Jecki Lorn accompanies Master Sol for the manhunt but is not keen about bringing Yord Fandar along. The two walk into Fandar's quarters where he is changing. Sol tells him that they will be leaving in five minutes. Lorn tells Fandar to put his clothes on. The three depart the Jedi Temple on a starship.

Back on Carlac, Osha awakes in the snow-covered wreckage of the prison ship, which has crashed at the foot of a mountain. Osha sees another figure and follows the shadow. Osha encounters her long-lost twin sister Mae before experiencing a flashback of the fire on Brendok. The younger Mae tells her that the two of them are inseparable as twin sisters. Inside a vision of their childhood home, Osha in her younger form communes with her lost sister. When Osha asks Mae is she killed Indara, Mae confirms that she killed Indara and says she will kill them all, her eyes turning jet black. Osha awakens with Pip in the snowy wreckage of the prison ship. Osha speaks with PIP, saying that the droid would not believe what she just saw.

Meanwhile, Lorn asks Sol about Osha. Master Sol explains that he was stationed on Osha's

homeworld of Brendok 16 years ago when her sister Mae started a fire that killed her entire family. Osha was the sole survivor and he took her as his Padawan. Sol clarifies that Mae was Osha's twin sister. Fandar is surprised to learn that Osha was a twin. Lorn notices that there is no mention of Mae in the Jedi files and asks if Mae is the true killer. Sol believes that Mae is dead, having witnessed her supposed death. The Jedi depart for Carlac in a smaller shuttle which exits the larger Jedi starship.

Osha sees the approaching Jedi ship and hides. Fandar and Lorn inspect the wreckage. The former believes that nobody survived the landing while Lorn disagrees. Sol thinks scavengers are at work and leads the group outside. Osha flees through a network of tunnels that leads to the edge of a cliff. The three Jedi follow her and corner her at the edge of the cliff.

Osha pleads her innocence but slips and falls over the edge. Master Sol uses his Force powers to levitate her and PIP to safety. Sol is relieved to see her. When Osha tells him that Mae is alive, Sol says he believes her but tells Osha that she needs to come with them. They leave the cliff together.

Elsewhere, Mae walks along a rocky shore as a male voice talks about the Jedi living in a dream, which they believe everyone shares. He says that those who attack the Jedi with weapons fail since steel and laser are no threat to them. He says that an acolyte kills without a weapon, adding that the acolyte kills the dream. Mae approaches a distant dark figure who wields a red lightsaber.

Summary:	An assassin strikes again, but this time the Jedi are there to attempt capture.



The episode opens with a wide landscape shot of a port on the planet Olega. At the Olega Jedi temple, an alien vendor pulls a cart. A brown-skinned human girl hurls a fruit at the temple's door. A gatekeeper droid tells the street urchin to stop playing pranks and to leave. While the girl distracts the droid, a veiled Mae Aniseya plants a slicer device on the gatekeeper droid which hijacks the droid, causing the gate to open. Mae gives the urchin a token before entering the Olega temple.

She walks through the temple's corri-

dors until she reaches a chamber where a bearded Jedi sits in silent meditation. Mae introduces herself to the meditating Master Torbin, saying that they have unfinished business. She dares the Jedi to attack her with all his strength but finds that he is unresponsive. She finds that he is protected by an invisible force field that she cannot penetrate. Mae finds that her knives cannot penetrate Torbin's Force field. Mae hides when a Jedi enters the room, responding to an intruder alert.

On Carlac, Osha Aniseya awakes to find Padawan Jecki Lon struggling to restart the ship. She advises Lon to repolarize the power couplings. Lon listens to her advice and the power couplings begin repolarizing. When Lon asks if Osha is a pilot, she responds that she is a Meknek. Lon says that being a MekNek must be dangerous work and thought that only astromech droids work outside. Osha remarks that she is better company and more flexible than a droid. When the PIP droid expresses its disagreement in Binary, Osha adds that Pip is also very flexible.

Master Sol enters the engine room. When Jedi Knight Yord Fandar protests against not restraining Osha, Sol questions if he still believes that Osha killed Master Indara. Fandar is open to Osha's claim that Mae killed Master Indara but assumes she is untrained. Sol counters that Osha has not trained in six years. Fandar is open to considering the "twin theory" but speculates that Osha and Mae are working togther. Sol counsels Yord not to let fear affect his judgement.

Sol then enters the cockpit to update Master Vernestra Rwoh via holoprojector about the situation. He tells Rwoh that he believes Osha's sister Mae has resurfaced after 16 years and is responsible for the murder of Master Indara. Rwoh is open to the twins theory. She informs

Sol that a suspect matching Osha's description broke into the Olega Jedi temple. Since Osha is in Sol's custody, Rwoh reasons that the suspect is Mae. When Sol asks if she would like him to investigate or to return to Coruscant, Rwoh tells Sol to investigate the Olega break-in and to bring Osha with him since she could be an asset.

Sol orders the other Jedi to set a course for Olega. When Fandar protests, Sol reiterates his authority and says that Osha is coming with them, believing she can help. Fandar disagrees but Sol responds that the Jedi agree with him. Fandar reluctantly complies with Master Sol's orders and the Jedi shuttle takes off, leaving behind the snowy world of Carlac.

On Olega, Mae enters a shop and meets with a man named Qimir. Qimir asks where she was last night. Mae replies that she was out there risking her life. Qimir tells Mae that he killed the man who owns the shop and that he is blending in. Mae tells Qimir not to sample the merchandise. When Qimir asks if she managed to kill the target, Mae says that she tried but could not lend a single blow. Qimir suggests searching for his weakness but Mae says that she could not land a single blow, describing Torbin as impenetrable.

When Mae asks Qimir to make her a poison using bunta, Qimir is reluctant. When Mae argues she is running out of time, Qimir counters that she is running out of Jedi. He adds that if she thinks a sleeping monk is tough, it will be tougher defeating a Wookiee. Mae says that she has two more Jedi to kill and that she will kill one of them without a weapon and please "The Master." She adds that she will need to do it her way. Qimir says that he needs a drink but agrees to help.

While concocting a drink, Qimir says that everyone has a weakness. The Jedi justify their galactic dominance through peace. Mae finishes off by saying that "peace is a lie." Mae says that Torbin thinks he has found peace and suggests that Mae gives him "absolution." He drops some bunta into a vial of yellow liquid, which turns green. Before leaving, Mae warns Qimir that it would not bode well for them if she told the Master about their conversation. Qimir agrees.

Aboard the Jedi starship, Osha introduces her PIP droid to Master Sol. When Sol asks what is the droid, Osha attempts to explain that she was trying to sync the droid to his ship in order to gauge the vessel's fuel levels. Sol however is asking about her tattoo. Osha explains that she got in in CorpSec during a crazy night with some of her Meknek crew. When Osha remarks that he wouldn't have approved of her tattoo, Sol says it is not his business. He asks Osha if she believes that Mae was behind Indara's murder. Osha thinks this is the only plausible explanation despite both of them seemingly seeing Mae perish.

Osha reassures Sol that what happened that night on Brendok was not his fault. Sol replies that he has also made peace with the tragic events on Brendok. Osha accepts that Sol had been trying to teach her to make peace with the past but that she was not a very good student. Sol responds that perhaps he was not a very good teacher. Over the intercom, Fandar tells them that the are approaching Olega.

Outside the Olega Jedi temple, Master Sol informs the local Jedi Master that he is investigating whether the recent break-in is linked to another investigation. Sol is accompanied by Lon, Fandar and Osha. The Olega Jedi Master explains that someone spotted a hooded intruder and alerted him. They search the temple but found nothing. Just then, the Olega Jedi Padawan approaches with the female street urchin from last night. He explains that the gatekeeper droids caught the child loitering around their portcullis.

Lon speaks with the child and asks if she activated the security droid. The child nods and explains that someone paid her to do it. When Lon asks who it was, the child mistakes Osha for the intruder but says she had a hood on. Pip beeps in Binary. When Sol requests to speak with Master Torbin, the Olega Master says that he has not spoken to anyone for over ten years. Sol responds that Torbin will speak to him because he is a friend.

Inside Master Torbin's chamber, Mae approaches the meditating Jedi with her vial of poison. She tells the meditating Jedi that she knows why he took the Barash Vow, believing that it would give him the peace that he sought. As the Force field warbles, Mae says that his past still haunts him. Mae offers Torbin the choice of confessing his crime to the Jedi Council or receiving the forgiveness he seeks from her. She places the vial of poison on the floor.

As Sol and the others approach Torbin's chamber, Mae tells him to face the past. Torbin exits his meditative state and descends to the floor. He opens his eyes and tells Mae that he has been waiting for her. Before drinking the poison vial, Torbin begs for forgiveness and tells Mae that they thought they were doing the right thing. Meanwhile, Osha sees a manifestation of a younger Mae and separates from the main group. Fandar shadows her. As Sol approaches the chamber, he senses a disturbance in the Force. Shortly later, Mae enters the room only to find Torbin dead.

She gazes up at the open, circular ceiling and believes that Mae escaped through that way. Shortly later, the Olega Jedi Master enters and confronts her with his blue lightsaber. Osha pleads her innocence. When Lon demands that Osha explain herself, Fandar speaks up for Osha, saying that he followed her when she broke off and confirms that Master Torbin was dead when they arrived. Osha thanks Yord for defending her. Lon and Sol deduce that Master Torbin drank the poison willingly. Osha recognizes the poisonous substance as bunta from her homeworld of Brendok.

The Jedi set up a surveillance of Qimir. Watching from a balcony, Fandar proposes that Lon serve as lookout while he enters the shop and confronts Qimir. He also suggests stunning Qimir and bringing him in for questioning. Lon instead proposes that they send Osha to impersonate Mae and speak with Qimir. They propose recording the conversation in order to get a confession from Qimir. Master Sol commends Lon for her plan. When Sol hands Osha a blaster, Fandar protests but Sol counters that she used to be a Jedi. Sol asks if Osha is ready. Osha says she is ready and uses her PIP droid as a recording device.

After borrowing a cloak, Osha enters Qimir's shop. Qimir is surprised to see "Mae" back so early and asks if she is alright. He asks if the poison worked and senses that she is acting strange. The Jedi who are listening decide to make a move. When Qimir asks if "Mae" killed Master Torbin without using the poison, Osha confirms that he took the poison and thanks Torbin. Qimir remarks that Osha looks exactly like Mae. Osha then raises her blaster at Qimir. Fandar, Sol and Lon enter the shop, surrounding Qimir.

Lon tells Qimir that they know that he supplied Mae with the poison that killed Master Torbin, and that they have recorded his confession. Qimir attempts to shift blame onto Mae. Sol says that if he cooperates, they will consider letting him go with a warning. Qimir pleads with them not to wipe his mind. Sol asks Qimir about his relationship with Mae. Qimir claims that he is her supplier. He claims that he started off as a gun runner for the Hutts but has become a supplier.

Fandar and Sol asks if Mae has a master and if someone is training her. Qimir says he is ignorant of the matter and that all he knows is that Mae wants revenge on four Jedi. Sol orders Fandar to set up a perimeter and keep an eye out for Mae. He tells Jecki to get to the ship. Sol tells Osha that he is coming with her and that they will return tonight.

Later that night, Fandar watches the perimeter, keeping an eye out for Mae. He communicates with Lon via comlink. Fandar is skeptical of the plan but Lon tells him to stick with the plan. Sol waits in an alleyway with Osha. Osha wants to confront Mae but Sol insists on confronting the rogue Force user alone. Osha reminds Sol that he brought her here. Sol says he did not realize that Osha is still angry with Mae. Osha says that Mae killed her family and destroyed her life. Sol advises Osha to let go of her grief.

When Osha says she wants justice, Sol warns her about the danger of revenge. Sol says that he could not save Mae and asks Osha to give him another chance. Osha reminds Sol that Mae wants to kill four Jedi stationed on Brendok 16 years ago. These Jedi were Indara, Torbin, Kelnacca and Sol. Osha warns Sol that Mae wants to kill him. Sol tells Osha to have faith in both Mae and him.

Later that night, Fandar spots Mae and relays the information to both Lon and Sol. Sol confronts Mae outside the shop, saying that she survived and killed Indara and Torbin. Mae hurls a dagger near Sol's feet. She then removes her hood and charges at the Jedi Master, who grabs her foot. Mae advances on Sol with her arms and legs. Sol defends himself and counters her moves. During a break, Sol questions Mae why she is attacking him without a weapon. Mae resumes her attack and unsuccessfully attempts to retrieve Sol's lightsaber.

Sol surprises her from behind and manages to snatch her knives, disarming her. Sol tells Mae that she has misunderstood the Jedi arts and that her Master has failed her. Sol demands to know who trained Mae. Mae responds by launching another attack while Fandar watches. Meanwhile, Osha uses her PIP droid to eavesdrop on Lon and Fandar's conversation. She learns that Sol is trying to find out who trained Mae. Sol uses the Force to levitate Mae a few meters from the ground. Using a Force probe, he remarks that Mae's master has taken great pains to conceal her identity even from her.

Mae tells Sol to get out of her head and relaunches her attack. As Mae reaches for a hidden dagger, Sol tells Mae that he senses her feeling for her sister. Mae responds that her sister is dead but Sol reveals that Osha is alive. Mae thinks Sol is lying and hurls her dagger at him. Fandar

uses the Force to catch her blade and backs Sol up, saying that Osha lives. Mae attempts to flee but is cornered by Fandar. Jecki arrives in her starship and hovers over Mae. She tells the rogue Force user that she is under arrest and orders her to surrender.

Despite being cornered, Mae escapes by summoning a sandstorm that blinds her Jedi pursuers. Master Sol orders the Jedi to stop Mae before she reaches the city gates. Osha listens to their conversation. Mae bumps into a speeder. When the driver attempts to help, she knocks him to the ground and commandeers the vehicle. Osha confronts Mae with a gun. Mae recognizes Osha and is surprised to see her sister is alive. Osha fires a stun bolt which misses, allowing Mae to flee. The other Jedi soon arrive.

Following the unsuccessful capture attempt, Master Sol contacts Master Rwo via holoprojector. Master Rwo has convened a meeting of the Jedi Council to discuss the threat of the trained outsider. Sol says that they know where Mae is going next but Rwo responds that they do not make decisions without meaningful discussion. Rwo tells Sol that she expects him back on Coruscant.

The following day, Mae confronts Qimir for selling her out to the Jedi. Qimir says that he can make amends by getting them out of the city to the planet Khofar. He explains that it is the forest retreat where the Wookiee Jedi Kelnacca lives. Mae tells Qimir that Osha is alive. The two then flee just as they are spotted by the local Jedi.

On the forest world of Khofar, two scavengers stumble upon what appears to be a crashed starship. They intend to salvage a hyperdrive. One of them spots a sign in an unfamiliar language but the other doesn't know. The two scavengers are confronted by Kelnacca who uses the Force to seize their blaster and break it apart with his bare arms. The two scavengers flee as the Wookiee approaches his dwelling, which is made from starship parts built into a tree.

Summary:	On a mysterious planet, the tragic journey of two sisters begins.



On the planet Brendok sixteen years earlier, a younger Verosha Aniseya ("Osha") is meditating in a forest grove beneath a bunta tree. She admires a butterfly-like insect. Her sister Mae-ho Aniseya ("Mae") finds her meditating. When Osha says the bunta tree is beautiful, Mae replies that the tree is dangerous. Osha responds that only its fruit is dangerous. Mae uses her Force powers to suspend the insect until Osha tells her to let the creature go. When Osha questions her violent tendencies, Mae counters by asking why she al-

ways has to run off.

Osha is not keen on doing the Ascension but Mae insists it is only a ceremony. Osha agrees to accompany her sister back. While walking through the forest, they reaffirm their connection as twins, stating that they are always one despite being born as two. While walking a circle and interlacing fingers, they make a vow about being there for each other. The twins are interrupted by the Zabrak Mother Koril, who chastises them for leaving the fortress walls and venturing into the woods. When Osha protests, Koril says that the rules are for their safety. Koril leads the girls back to the fortress. A younger Jedi Master Sol watches from behind a tree.

Later, the sisters and Koril enter a mountain fortress populated by females of various species. The two sisters want some spice creams but Mother Koril initially refuses as punishment for leaving the fortress. She relents and says they can have it after the ceremony. Their Mother Aniseya overrules Koril, saying that her girls must have sweet treats. She tells the girls to meet in the common room for training.

In private, Koril complains about the girls running away but Aniseya responds that nobody saw them escaping. Koril also tells her that the Jedi offworlders have moved inland. Aniseya thinks their coven is safe from the praying eyes of the Jedi. Koril is concerned about Osha frequently running away and thinks Aniseya is being too lenient. Aniseya responds that it is normal for a child to test boundaries. Koril says that the twins are not normal children.

Later at a coven meeting, Aniseya teaches about the coven's belief in a "Thread" connecting all things. She conjures a thread of thin energy with her hands and uses it to summon a blue fruit,

which she passes to the girls. Osha snatches it. While some call the Thread the Force, Aniseya counters that they believe that the Thread is not a power that can be wielded. She says that if you pull the Thread, it changes everything. She emphasises that the Thread is tied to one's destiny and that it binds them to others.

Aniseya gets two of her followers to volunteer for a demonstration. They attempt to block her telekinetic approach but Aniseya easily scatters them. She talks about the upcoming Ascension tonight, saying that more power will be displayed. Osha and Mae squabble in the background, prompting Aniseya to discipline them by using the Thread to push them to the ground. Aniseya then asks the two sisters to practise their powers with her. Despite some difficulty, Mae manages to deflect Aniseya's telekinetic push. Osha shelters behind her sister. Koril warns Osha that she expects more from her.

While the twins leave for their room with a chaperon, Koril gazes at a generator. In their room, Mae tells Aniseya that Osha is nervous about the Ascension ceremony tonight. Aniseya speaks to Osha directly. When Osha says she does not want to go to the Ascension, Mae says this is how they become witches. Osha is unsure about becoming a witch but Mae is insistent. Aniseya gets the sister to hold hands together, explaining that the Thread tied them together before they were born. She tells them to love each other. Mae encourages Osha.

Aniseya explains that Ascension is about walking through fear and sacrificing a part of yourself, the power of many instead of the power of one. She warns Osha that the galaxy is a place that does not welcome women with special powers like them.

Later that night, members of the coven gather above a deep crater in a mountain under two crescent moons. While getting their hair styled for the Ascension by two handmaid witches, Osha and Mae talk about spice creams. Mae sees Osha drawing in her notebook. Osha objects when Mae hides it. When Mae complains about Osha hiding things from her, Osha says she sometimes wants to spend time alone doing things herself. Mae insists they are one but Osha says they are separate individuals. The two sisters are the only children in the community. Osha is curious about the wider galaxy outside Brendok but Mae believes that everything they need is here.

As the two moons align with the dotted perimeter lights of the mountain fortress, Koril leads the other witches in a ceremonial dance. Aniseya walks through the group and explains that they will perform a ceremony that they have not performed since their exile. She says they were hunted, persecuted and driven into hiding by those who considered their magic unnatural. Facing extinction, they were blessed with a miracle. After looking to Koril, she signals for the coven to make way for Osha and Mae to enter the ceremony.

The witches kneel before the sisters. Mae is eager but Osha is nervous. Aniseya holds the two girls' hands under the aligned twin moons. The witches then begin chanting about the power of one, two and three. As the coven chant and dance, Aniseya asks Mae if she will follow the ways of their coven and protect their legacy upon her death. Mae promises she will. Aniseya then conjures a purple light and places her hands on Mae's head, forming a tattoo on her left side. Aniseya tells her to ascend and Mae joins the rest of the coven.

Aniseya then turns her attention to Osha, asking the same question that she asked Mae. Osha hesitates before answering in affirmation. Before Aniseya can continue the ceremony, two witches interrupt with news that the Jedi have sliced the platform and will be here soon. Aniseya tells Koril to hide and protect the children among their cloaks. Several coven warriors prepare their bows and arrows but Aniseya orders them to stand down, insisting on non-violence.

Jedi Master Indara enters the courtyard, flanked by Sol, Padawans Torbin and Kelnacca. Indara introduces herself and her colleagues to Mother Aniseya. When Koril accuses them of trespassing, Indara apologizes saying that they believed that their planet was uninhabited. Aniseya voices skepticism. Indara says that the Jedi mean them no harm. Aniseya counters that the Jedi have come armed and unannounced. Osha is curious about the Jedi but Mae tells her to remember Aniseya's warning. Osha ignores her and peers through a gap in the witches' cloaks.

When Aniseya asks what they want, Indara looks at Sol. She expresses concern that the coven is training children in violation of Republic law. Aniseya responds that they are outside the Republic's jurisdiction. Koril denies there are children in their coven. Kelnacca cranes for a look around the coven before grunting in Shyriiwook. Sensing movement, Indara invites the children to come out, saying that they mean no harm.

Sol sees a glint of gold from Osha's cloak. Osha walks through the crowd and approaches Sol. Sol kneels and the two introduce themselves to each other. Indara asks Osha if they can meet

her sister. Osha looks to Aniseya, who gives a permissive nod. Osha points upstairs as Mae exits the crowd. When Indara asks where is their father, Aniseya replies that they have no father. Sol notices the Ascension marking on Mae's forehead, which was not on her this morning.

The witches accuse the Jedi of wanting to take their children. Sol disagrees. As the witches react with hostility, he prepares to draw his lightsaber in combat. Indara calls for restraint and Sol gently shows his lightsaber to Osha. He allows Osha to feel his lightsaber. Sol invites Osha to be tested and trained as a Jedi. Osha looks to her mother Aniseya for permission. Mae looks at him and the other Jedi warily.

Aniseya stares at Torbin, causing his eyes to turn black. Sol snatches his lightsaber back from Osha while Kelnacca growls with terror. Torbin begins gasping for breath. Aniseya demands that the Jedi leave in return for restoring Torbin to his right mind. Osha asks her mom for permission to take the Jedi test. Indara reminds Aniseya that Osha has a right to take the test. Aniseya releases her grip on Torbin, causing his eyes to return to normal. Aniseya reluctantly arranges for Osha to be brought to the Jedi encampment for testing the following day. When Indara asks about Mae, Aniseya reluctantly acquiesces. The Jedi exit the courtyard.

Aniseya asks Koril to gather her advisers while Koril sends the children to bed. Later, Aniseya meets with her advisers. Koril advocates killing the four Jedi but others urge caution, fearing the retribution of the Republic. An old witch proposes instead that the girls should take the test but fail in order to avoid conflict with the Republic and keep the twins in the coven.

Summary:	Racing to the next target, the Jedi head to a new world as they close in on the clever assassin.



The Wookiee Jedi Kelnacca walks through the forests of Khofar to his shelter. Inside his shelter, Kelnacca chops meat and adds them with herbs into a pot of stew. On the wall of the shelter lies three concentric circular symbols.

At the Jedi Temple on Coruscant, Padawan Jecki Lon and several other Padawans train with sticks under the tutelage of the bearded Jedi Master Lakshay. Lakshay drills his students in the arts of combat, reminding them to maximize their defenses without the need to

strike. Osha Aniseya watches from outside the class. As a beacon chimes to mark the end of classtime, the master dismisses his class. Before leaving, Lakshay asks to see Daro and Rena's opening stance before they leave.

Osha speaks with Lon, telling her that she has come to say goodbye and thanks her for helping her to find her sister Mae-ho Aniseya and helping to clear her name. Osha is relieved to learn that her sister is alive. Lon says that she figured that Osha would stay until they have captured her. Osha replies that Mae is now the Jedi's problem and says that she is not a Jedi. Lon sends a playful wink when Osha asks if she will miss her. Lon says Osha cares about Mae and mourns the years of separation. Osha accepts that someone needs to find Mae. She plans to leave Coruscant but promises to meet up with Lon the next time she returns.

Later, a twin boom starship with separate compartments lands in a clearing on the planet Khofar. Mae and Qimir unload supplies from several rectangular bins. Mae prepares to depart but Qimir advises her not to go alone while understanding her desire to find the elusive Kelnacca. When Mae asks if Qimir traveled into the forest at the behest of their master, Qimir replies that he risked his life to help her. Qimir tells Mae that she needs him and offers her a flask. While Osha is alive, Qimir says that this does not change her arrangement with the Master. Osha says that they should get going because they only have three hours of sunlight left. The two cross a footbridge leading into the forest.

At the Jedi Temple, several Jedi in white and gold robes gather around a hologram of Mae in combat. A female Jedi Master named Holden says that Mae is fast but weak since her emotions guide her combat movements. Ki-Adi-Mundi observes that Mae displays skill while Master Sol

says that someone has trained her. When the female Jedi asks who, Sol replies that Mae doesn't know the identity of her master but fears him. Holden wonders if they are dealing with a splinter Order or something worse.

When a male Jedi warns that Mae could be come a major threat, Sol replies that she is not disciplined. Master Vernestra Rwoh counters that Mae eluded him and killed two Jedi Masters. The hologram displays three images of Indara, Torbin and Kelnacca, with the former two marked in red. Rwoh says that Mae is targeting Sol and these three Jedi because they were stationed on her homeworld of Brendok when she was a child. Rwoh believes that Mae was taught by a Jedi based on her observation of Mae's movements in the hologram.

When Ki-Adi-Mundi suggests informing the Jedi High Council, Rwoh advises against it because the High Council would be obliged to inform the Galactic Senate, which would lead to scandal and mistrust. Rwoh advises the Jedi to deal with this matter themselves. She orders Master Holden to extract Kelnacca from his post on Khofar and intercept Mae. When Holden asks what to do if Mae doesn't come peacefully, Rwoh says that they will be expecting violence. She adjourns the meeting and exits the room.

Master Sol follows Master Rwoh into the corridor and pleads with her. Rwoh asks why he did not tell her that there was a chance that Mae survived sixteen years ago following the incident on Brendok. Sol explains that he saw Mae fall and presumed that she had perished. In the presence of the other Jedi, Sol pleads that Rwoh allow him to bring Mae into custody. Rwoh disagrees due to his emotional and personal connections to Osha and Mae. Sol says that Mae's objective is not solely her own. Rwoh agrees, opining that Mae is part of a larger plan by her master. She thinks that it is something to tip the scales. Sol warns that if Holden kills Mae, the knowledge of her master will be lost to them. He says that Mae will not surrender without getting something in return. Rwoh asks if they have something she wants, prompting Sol to nod.

While walking through the forest, Qimir and Mae discuss her master's command to kill a Jedi without a weapon. Qimir asks if this means she can engage in unarmed combat while using her lightsaber to disarm them. He asks if that is cheating since he reasons that she failed to carry out this order during her previous assassinations and attempts. Mae responds that she didn't fail to kill Indara and Torben. Qimir counters that she killed them her way and did not follow her master's command to the letter.

Mae asks Qimir what kind of deal he made with the master. Qimir denies making a deal with the master and says that he collects people. When Mae asks if he has seen his face, Qimir says she knows he hasn't. They reach the edge of a towering forest, which Qimir describes as a perimeter. Mae is unhappy that her sister Osha is with the Jedi and asks Qimir what she was like. Qimir says that Osha seemed not to have understanding of her situation and that she was attached to a particular Jedi master. Qimir's face darken, prompting Qimir to say they should continue their hike. The two assassins continue their hike over a narrow ridge.

While Osha is walking through a hallway in the Jedi Temple and chatting with Pip, Sol calls out to her, saying that Jecki had told him that she had left. Osha apologizes for leaving without saying goodbye. Sol asks Osha to accompany him on his mission to hunt Mae. Osha asks if Sol is recruiting her back to the Jedi Order before concluding that he needs her help to find Mae. Sol explains that he needs her help to find Mae, explaining that when he told Mae that Osha was still alive, her eyes softened. Sol says that Mae has the potential to become a different person.

Sol explains that the Jedi will only allow him to hunt for Mae if Osha comes along for the mission to find Mae. Sol says that he doesn't want to harm Mae and believes that there is still good in her. Osha replies that Mae is a murderer. Sol counters that she is still her family. Mae reflects silently and agrees to come but says that she will not wear a civilian robe.

While traveling through hyperspace, Osha is dressed in a grey civilian outfit. Aboard the Jedi starship, Jedi Knight Yord Fandar briefs Osha and several Jedi including Lon. He says that the Jedi Order stationed Master Kelnacca on Khofar but that nobody has heard from him for over a year. Kelnacca has not responded to any of their transmissions. Pip attracts the attention of a small furry alien. Annoyed, the droid sprays water at the furry alien. Osha apologizes before asking Lon about the identity of the alien. Lon explains that the alien's name is Bazil and that he is with them. When Fandar asks if Osha has any questions, Osha says that she doesn't have questions and says his briefing was comprehensive.

The Jedi starship exits hyperspace and undocks from its rear hyperdrive and engine unit. The Jedi ship descends into the forested world of Khofar. Amidst a fog, the Jedi starship lands on a grassy clearing. Later, Jecki Lon speaks to a humanoid alien through a translator droid, explaining that they are looking for a Wookiee Jedi. Sol and the other Jedi wait nearby. Fandar notices that Osha is having a blaster in her holster and requests that she returns the object, describing it as a property of the Jedi Order. Osha says it is hers but Fandar insists.

Before the argument can escalate, Lon returns from her meeting and reports that the locals say that Kelnacca ventured into the forest and never returned. Sol looks into the far distance into a forest below the cliff. He tells the Jedi that he can sense that Kelnacca is inside the forest. When Osha asks how they can find him, Sol explains they have a tracker. Fandar hands a sample of clothing with Kelnacca's scent to Bazil. Bazil leads the Jedi through a narrow pathway down a hill into the forest.

During the walk, Osha asks if Fandar can understand what the alien Bazil is saying. Fandar replies that he can, because he spent his free time learning a more nuanced alien language than the Shyriiwook most Padawans study. When Osha asks if Fandar is upset about having to join the mission, the Knight responds that he is only concerned with her safety. The two hang back as the other Jedi proceed. Osha tells Fandar that Sol believes that Mae can be saved. Fandar responds that Sol thinks that Mae will listen to her. Osha warns that if Mae is unwilling to listen, Fandar needs to be prepared to stop her. Osha says that she won't be able to kill her and says that she can't hesitate a second time. Fandar is sympathetic to Osha's concerns but thinks that Sol brought Osha here to face herself.

Elsewhere, Mae and Qimir reach a gully at the end of their path. They find their path obstructed by a giant tree. The two go around a structure, wading through ferns and plants to reach an opening under the tree. This leads them into thicker forest. Meanwhile, Bazil leads the Jedi party through a section of the forest where the trees have big lumps growing on their trunks. Bazil says that there is something rotten about these trees, with Fandar translating. Master Sol advises the Jedi party to keep their volume down to avoid trouble.

Osha touches one of the lumps until Lon tells her to move. After she moves, the lump is revealed to be a large scaly predator. She sees slime where the lump was and sees movement in the trees. Osha calls out to Sol. The Jedi look up and see a giant moth-like creature known as an Umbramoth approaching her. Sol draws his blue lightsaber and faces down the descending winged Umbramoth. He slices through the creature with his lightsaber. Osha notices that the creature was drawn to his lightsaber. Sol says the umbramoth was drawn to the light and tells the Jedi party they have to keep moving. Osha and the Jedi party leave the forest section with the hibernating moths.

The Jedi then hike through the tunnels created by the giant trees. Fandar leads the group, followed by Osha and Lorn. Osha says that she could sense the creature and regrets that it died during their encounter. Lon replies that it is an honor for something to transform into the Force. Lon notices that Osha has experienced more death than she has. Osha says she struggles to accept with death and the resentment from her separation from her sister. Lon reassures Osha that they are defined not by what they lose but rather what they survive. She touches Osha's arm and says she has gone through a lot.

There is a landscape shot of the mountains and surrounding forest. Qimir leads Mae through the jungle, saying that Kelnacca's hut is ten minutes away. Mae sits on a rock, saying that she has to rest since she is fighting Kelnacca. She tells Qimir that her confrontation with Kelnacca is not a test, recalling the master's words that "your final lesson is one you teach yourself. You will kill a Jedi without a weapon." Mae struggles with the notion of having to skill someone without a weapon due to the Jedi teaching against attacking those who cannot defend themselves.

Qimir reassures her that her test is not impossible. As Mae drinks from her flask, she surmises that her test is impossible and fears that the Master will kill her for failing it. When Mae accuses Qimir of not caring for her, he offers to get her some water. He tells Mae she needs to rest since she is losing her nerve. After Qimir leaves, Mae looks at her surroundings and resumes her journey.

As dusk approaches, the Jedi find that their guide Bazil has disappeared. Fandar grumbles about the reliability of Bazil before updating Sol about the situation. Meanwhile, Qimir hears Mae's cries and runs to help her. He steps on a booby trap and is caught in a rope trap that leaves him hanging by his leg from a tree. As Mae resurfaces from the trees, Qimir calls for help. Mae tells Qimir that she doesn't need to follow her master's commandment to kill a Jedi without a weapon because Osha being alive changes everything. Mad says that she is loyal to Osha and not Qimir's master.

When Qimir asks what she is doing, Mae replies that she intends to surrender herself to Kelnacca and the Jedi Order. Qimir says that the Jedi will put her in prison. Mae says they won't after she tells them what she knows. When Qimir warns that the master will kill her, Mae says that he will have to kill her first and doubts that he will be able to navigate through the jungle without a guide. Mae tells Qimir that he has outlived his usefulness to her.

Meanwhile, the Jedi reach a grove but find no sign of Bazil or Mae. Sol gazes at a tropical foliage in the distance. When Osha asks, he says it is nothing. Osha asks why Sol did not let her confront Mae. Osha thinks she will be able to face Mae but Sol tells her that she is going to face her last. He says that once they have gotten Mae safely to the ship, he will explain everything.

Elsewhere, Mae sees Kelnacca's hut in the distance. As she approaches the hut, she trips over several pods which release an orange pollen. As the dust settles, she encounters the guide Bazil. Mae greets Bazil but he squeals in fear and shock, attracting the attention of the Jedi. Mae runs past Bazil and heads towards the hut. Sol leads the Jedi towards the location of Bazil's cries. Fandar tells Osha to wait from behind.

Mae enters Kelnacca's hut as the Jedi approach. Inside the hut, she finds the Wookiee Jedi slumped in front of a console. As she approaches Kelnacca, she finds him dead with a lightsaber gash across his chest. Mae realizes the master is here as night settles on the hut. As night falls, the Jedi surround the space between the two lanterns at front of Kelnacca's hut. Osha watches from behind.

Sol demands that anyone inside the domicile come out with their hands raised in the name of the Galactic Republic and Jedi Order. Fandar demands that Mae surrender. Mae gazes nervously through a hole in the door. Soo turns his back towards Osha as a dark shape settles behind his former Padawan. The other Jedi turn to face the stranger. osha turns to gaze at a dark, cloaked figure wearing a helmet with a granulated jaw guard. As the stranger approaches Osha, Sol and Fandar demand that the figure stand down.

Mae watches nervously from inside the hut as the helmeted figure studies Osha and draws its red lightsaber. In response the Jedi draw their lightsabers and charge at the stranger. The stranger uses his Force powers to flick Osha away with a single hand movement. He then hurls the Jedi away, stirring up a cloud of dust.

Summary:	In a dense jungle, the Jedi are put to the test when they confront a rising darkness.



The episode begins with a high angle shot of Verosha Aniseya ("Osha") lying on the forest floor surrounded by leaves and ferns. She checks with Pip, who has survived the fall. Making her way back to Kelnacca's shelter, she stumbles upon a deceased human Jedi. In the trees nearby, she sees the mysterious Master fighting several Jedi including Yord Fandar. The Master strikes down Ithia Paan before shorting out two lightsabers and parrying with Fandar. He wounds Fandar before killing three Jedi. The Master then

turns his attention to the imobilized Fandar, who wields his yellow lightsaber in self-defense.

Seeking to save Fandar, Osha fires on the Master with her blaster set to stun. The stun bolt bounces off the Master. Fandar tells Osha to run. Inside Kelnacca's shelter, Mae-ho Aniseya ("Mae") retrieves Kelnacca's lightsaber. The Master pursues Osha through the forest and hurls his red lightsaber at her. Jedi Master Sol however deflects the red lightsaber with his own blue lightsaber, causing the blade to slice several nearby trees. Osha and Sol are joined by Fandar. Sol orders Osha to evacuate with Fandar back to their ship.

While Sol makes a stand against the mysterious Master, Fandar, and Osha catch up with Bazil. Osha tells Fandar they have to go back but Fandar reiterates that Sol has given him an order and warns her that he doesn't want to subdue her. The Master addresses Sol, who asks who he is. The Master says that he is surprised that Sol does not recognize him, prompting Sol to sense that he is familiar with his adversary. The Master engages in a lightsaber duel with Sol. During a break, Sol says that the Master carries a Jedi weapon but is no Jedi.

Mae exits Kelnacca's hut but is ambushed by Padawan Jecki Lon. The two engaged in hand to hand combat. Using the Force, Lon hurls Mae inside Kelnacca's hut before attempting to arrest her. However, Mae fights back. Lon attempts to force magnetic binders around Mae's hands while stating that Mae is under arrest for the murders of Master Indara, Torbin, Kelnacca, and her own family. Mae screams and breaks free of her captor and engages in a second round of fighting. She throws daggers at Lon, who dodges her blades.

Meanwhile, the Master parries with Master Sol. During a break, Sol says that the Master trained Mae and demands that his adversary reveal his face. The stranger is unwilling to let Sol read his thoughts. When Sol asks what Master fights his face from his pupil, the Master throws back the question before resuming the fight. Elsewhere, Lon fights Mae in the forest. Osha wants

to help Lon but Fandar insists on following Sol's orders. Sol loses the Master and searches his surroundings.

Osha asks Fandar about their mysterious enemy. Fandar admits he doesn't know but observes that their opponent does not follow the rules of combat and lacks a methodology to his movements. Fandar says that their enemy is capable of telepathy, which leads Osha to recall her late mother Aniseya's ability to get inside a Jedi's thoughts. Fandar leads the way but finds Bazil has disappeared.

Elsewhere, Mae traps Lon in a headlock and attempts to stab her in the neck. However, the Padawan breaks free and pins her down. Lon retrieves Kelnacca's lightsaber. Sensing movement, she crouches and fends off an attack by the mysterious Master. The Padawan clashes with the Master, who knocks her to the ground. The Master tells Mae that she can learn from Lon, whom he describes as a loyal pupil. The two resume fighting and Lon's green lightsaber short-circuits. Lon manages to adjust her lightsaber and also draws a second green lightsaber from her holster. She fights the Master with both blades while a handcuffed Mae flees into the forest. The Master destroys one of Lon's lightsabers before pursuing Mae.

Later, Osha and Fandar enter the section of the forest inhabited by umbramoths. Osha tells Fandar to switch off his lightsaber to avoid attracting the giant moths. Fandar reluctantly switches off his blade while staring at a tree bark where an umbramoth has rested. The two walk slowly. Meanwhile, the Master catches up with Mae and condemns her for wanting to betray him. When Mae begs for forgiveness, the Master chides her for being weak and then cuts through her binders, freeing her hands. Before he can strike Mae, the Master is attacked by both Sol and Lon, who engage him in a lightsaber duel. Mae takes advantage of the situation to flee but is pursued by her Master, who also fights off the pursuing Jedi.

Osha hears Mae's voice echoing through the Force. She wants to go back despite Fandar's objections. Just then, Mae senses movement and shines her torch at the trees above. As umbramoths circle, she runs back towards the direction of Kelnacca's hut and tells Fandar to run. Meanwhile, Sol engages the Master in hand to hand combat. Lon interrupts the fight and engages in a lightsaber duel with the Master. She manages to unmask the Master but he ignites a second red lightsaber and stabs her through the torso three times. In her final moments, Lon gazes at the face of her adversary while Sol shouts in horror.

Sol finds himself facing an unmasked Stranger. Sol is distraught by the death of his Padawan Jecki Lon. The Stranger notices Mae nearby. She tries to flee but the Stranger hurls his cloak at Sol and then uses the Force to levitate Mae towards her. He holds her in a choke-hold before confronting a shocked Mae, who did not realize that the Stranger and the Master are the same person. Sol attacks the Stranger with his lightsaber but the Stranger takes Mae hostage. He taunts Sol for attacking him while his back was turned.

Sol scowls before dropping his lightsaber. When Sol asks the Stranger what he is, the Stranger replies that he has no name before adding that the Jedi might call him a Sith. Sol asks the Stranger why he is risking discovery. The Stranger replies that he wears a mask. When Sol asks what the Stranger wants, the Sith replies that he wants freedom before kicking Mae. He says that the Sith want the freedom to wield power without having to answer to the Jedi. The Stranger says that he wants to train an acolyte. Since Mae went back on their deal, the Stranger vows to kill everyone including Mae. The Stranger says that it is the Jedi who make the rules and the Jedi say that Sith like him cannot exist. He vows to kill everyone who has seen his face.

Before the Stranger can deal with Sol and Mae, he is ambushed by Fandar who has grabbed his cortosis helmet. Osha has also joined them. Fandar recognizes the Stranger from their earlier encounter on Olega. Taking advantage of Fandar's shock, the Stranger gains the upper hand. After fighting him in hand to hand combat, the Stranger kills Fandar by breaking his neck with his hands. Osha manages to stuns Mae from a distance. An enraged Sol fights the Stranger in hand to hand combat. The two opponents are evenly matched. Sol gains the upper hand and attempts to strike the Sith down with his lightsaber.

However, Sol is interrupted by Osha. The Stranger takes advantage of the interruption to sow doubt in Osha about her former Jedi Master. Sol counters that the Stranger is twisted by darkness. The Stranger responds that he has embraced his darkness and asks Sol what he has done with his darkness. Sol steps away from the Stranger and deactivates his lightsaber. Just then, Pip senses movement in the trees above and alerts Osha. When Osha calls out to Sol, the Jedi Master says that the Jedi do not attack the unarmed. This prompts the Stranger to taunt Sol about the perceived legalism of the Jedi.

Osha tells Pip that she loves him before sticking him onto the Stranger's back. The droid acts as a beacon for several umbramoths, who surround the Stranger. The Stranger cuts down a few with his lightsaber but the others carry him away into the forest. When the two are alone, Osha asks Sol why she can't trust him and asks what he did in the past. Sol promises to explain but is stunned by Mae.

As dawn reaches the jungle and mountains, Osha approaches her sister Mae. When Osha asks what she has done, the acolyte responds that she did what she had to for Osha and their family. Osha counters that Mae is selfish and blames her for all the lives lost tonight. When Mae counters that the Jedi got what they deserved, Osha responds that the Jedi were more like family than Mae ever were. Mae asks if Osha has forgotten their roots as witches. When Mae says that the Jedi invaded their home on Brendok, Osha reminds her that she started the fire and would have perished if not for the Jedi.

Mae responds that the Jedi have brainwashed Osha and turned her against her own sister. Mae offers to help Osha return to herself. She embraces Osha and reaffirms her love for her. She begs Osha to choose her over the Jedi. Tears streak down Mae's face. Mae says that they both survived and only have each other. However, Osha breaks free of Mae and holds her down in an armlock. Osha denounces her sister as a criminal who must pay for her crimes. Osha says that she has come to arrest Mae for her crimes. When Osha says that Mae followed a false master, Mae counters that Osha is also following a false master.

She breaks free of Osha and holds her down. When Osha begs Mae to leave Sol out of this, Mae counters that Sol has led her into a life without purpose and family. The two sisters begin fighting. Mae uses her Force powers to knock Osha onto the ground. She slowly approaches her unconscious sister and chides her for not being able to block with her Forcer powers. She retrieves a lightsaber and cuts off some of her own locks to imitate Osha.

Meanwhile, the Stranger breaks free of both Pip and the umbramoths. He walks into the forest. The Tynnan scout Bazil scurries past, tracking the scent of something. Later Mae, who is impersonating Osha, tends to Sol. When Sol asks where Mae is, the imposter claims that Mae has fled. "Osha" offers to help Sol to their ship. The two Jedi travel back to their ship, which is parked near a settlement of humanoid aliens. Mae stares at the jungle one final time before following Sol aboard the Jedi starship. They are followed by Bazil, who sniffs her scent.

Back in the forest, the Stranger retrieves his helmet and cloak. He walks past the bodies of the fallen Jedi. Gazing at the unconscious Osha, the Stranger remarks that even in the revelation of their triumph, one can see the depth of their despair. He wraps his cloak around Osha before tending to her.

Summary:	On a distant island, unsettling questions about identity and destiny
	arise.



Verosha Aniseya ("Osha") awakes on a makeshift bed inside a cave with a pool. She finds that the wound on her waist has been bound with a bandage. A pot bubbles nearby. Osha helps herself to a bottle. She notices a small critter known as a Skura scurrying on the cave floor. Osha retrieves one of Mae-ho Aniseya's ("Mae") daggers and pulls on her clothes.

Exiting the cave, she walks along a safety railing overlooking a remote seaside with nearshore islands. Osha finds herself on a remote moss-covered island

while the Stranger's starship Exile II is parked on a nearby island. Osha walks along the stony shore. A family of Skura forage among the rocks. Osha looks as the Stranger walks across the rocky shore.

On the jungle world of Khofar, Jedi Master Sol takes his Polan-717 Jedi transport into the skies. He turns on the transmitter and contacts the Jedi Order, using "Emergency Code Zero." Sol reports that his entire team has been killed. Meanwhile, Mae walks through the ship where she finds the cabin where she and Osha did their Jedi test several years ago. Bazil eyes Mae suspiciously while Sol records a message to Master Vernestra Rwoh on an holoprojector, explaining that his team was ambushed by a much larger threat.

Mae enters the cockpit with a hidden knife. Having difficulty sending his transmission, Sol tells "Osha" to man the ship while he resets the receiver. After Sol exits the cockpit, Mae takes the starship into space. Sol climbs down into the cabin where he grieves over a computer. After meditating, Sol switches on the computer and exits the cabin.

Bazil attempts to reactivate Pip. When that fails, he goes to the work bench and attempts to match PIP to several power plugs. He finds the appropriate power plug, causing Pip to awaken.

Osha follows the Stranger to a rocky pool where he begins to undress. She sees a long scar sliding down his back. The Stranger wades into the pool and proceeds to scrub himself. Osha notices his lightsaber among his belongings. The Stranger senses her presence through the Force and asks how does it feel. Wielding the lightsaber, Osha adopts a combat stance and orders the Stranger not to move.

The Stranger flatters Osha about her lightsaber handling techniques and asks if she left her lightsaber behind when she left the Jedi Order. The Stranger gives her the choice of not joining him but says he will like his clothes back. Osha wields the lightsaber in combat stance as the Stranger climbs out of the pool. He invites her to consider the ethics of killing him when he is unarmed and vulnerable, as opposed to in the heat of battle.

The Stranger says he cannot read her thoughts but that her anger betrays his thoughts. While the Stranger dresses, Osha asks why he brought her to this island. When Osha asks if she is his prisoner, the Stranger counters that she is the one wielding a weapon. When Osha asks if he killed Sol, the Stranger says no. When Osha asks if he killed Mae, the Stranger says no but adds that Osha seems to be more concerns about Sol than her sister. The Stranger deduces that Sol was more than a teacher to Osha, and points out the singularity of the master/apprentice relationship.

Above Khofar, the Polan-717 Jedi transport docks with its hyperspace transport ring. Sol enters the cockpit and hugs Mae, believing her to be Osha. Sol thanks Osha for saving him and says that the Stranger corrupted her sister. Sol says he challenged him and vows to make things right by telling the Jedi High Council everything. Mae asks about everything just as the holoprojector activates. A Jedi tells the crew of the Jedi ship that they are ready to transmit. Just then, the ship experiences a power failure. At Sol's request, Mae agrees to try and restart the ship's systems.

Meanwhile at the Jedi Temple, Senator Isedwa Chuwant tells Master Rwoh that Senator Rayencourt has gathered enough support for an external review of the Jedi Order. Chuwant warns that his colleagues will vote in favor of an external review of the Order. Rwoh is concerned about Rayencourt's campaign of fear against the Jedi. Chuwant reassures Rwoh that the review will probably come out in favor of the Jedi since they have always been transparent with the Galactic Senate. Chuwant describes Rayencourt as an ambitious Senator grasping for power.

After terminating the holoprojector, Rwoh faces Mog Adana, who tells her that the Jedi have received a distress call from Master Sol in the Outer Rim Territories. Adana tells Rwoh that Sol appears to have lost his entire team. Rwoh tells Adana to resume communications with Sol but the younger Jedi reports they have lost contact. Rwoh orders Adana to prepare a rescue team to travel to Khofar immediately. When Adana asks how she knows where Sol is, Rwoh replies that she sent him there.

While walking along the stony beach, Osha questions the Stranger, who confirms that he was a Jedi in the past. When Osha said that she has never heard of him, the Stranger replies it was a long time ago. Osha asks why the Stranger brought her here. The Stranger throws the question back at her before remarking that everyone seems interested in her. Osha warns that Master Sol will be looking for her and that he is strong in the Force.

The Stranger disagrees that Sol's strength lies in the Force and counters that it is her strength in the Force. He says that someone ought to teach her to harness her strength in the Force. Pointing to his starship, the Stranger suggests she swim to the vessel if she wants to reach it before sundown or she could wait for the tide to go out. The Stranger continues walking and asks if she is hungry. Osha turns her neck to stare at the ship before continuing her walk.

Meanwhile, Mae enters an engine room aboard the Jedi transport. She looks clueless at the jumbled array of control panels and cooling fans. She finds Pip charging in a power plug. Bazil approaches her from behind. After gesturing at her, he grabs her leg. Bazil stomps on her foot and runs with a flash light. An engine valve shoots grease at Mae's face, causing her to squeal. Mae resets Pip to factory settings and attaches Pip's head to a droid body. She tells the reprogrammed droid to check on the ship's power systems.

Back on the unknown island world, Osha follows the Stranger back into the cave. She asks what did he mean when he referred to her strength in the Force. The Stranger says that he mean exactly what he said. Osha recalls the Jedi teaching that strength in the Force is something that requires constant training or else it will fade. The Stranger responds that the Jedi teach there is only one way to access the Force and that if Force wielders do not do it their way it fades. Stranger stirs soup in the pot.

The Stranger tells Osha that there is another way to use the Force. Below the surface of consciousness are powerful emotions such as anger, fear, loss, and desire. Osha responds that is the path to the dark side. As the Stranger puts a piece of food to his mouth, he replies that is semantics. When Osha confronts him for murdering her friends, the Stranger admits to killing Jedi for threatening his existence. When Osha adds that he killed Yord Fandar, the Stranger reminds her that Fandar did not hesitate to turn her in for a crime that she did not commit. When Osha adds that she killed Jecki Lon, the Stranger says that the fight was inevitable. He

adds that Osha would have had the same relationship with Lon that she had with Master Sol, which he describes as one-sided.

The Stranger asks Osha why she loves people who can only go so far. He offers Osha a bowl of soup. The Stranger says that Osha has more potential that the Jedi realize. Osha says that she is not her sister Mae and that she is not as easily corrupted. She exits the cave to the rock outcrop and stares at the sea. The Stranger follows her and reminds her that she is still holding his lightsaber. He says that she stayed here to do something. The Stranger dares Osha to stab him with his own lightsaber.

Osha counters that a Jedi does not attack the unarmed. The Stranger grabs her and asks why she still thinks of herself as a Jedi despite them rejecting her. Osha counters that she willingly left the Jedi Order. When the Stranger questions her motives, Osha demands that she let him go. The Stranger says that she is feeling pain and anger, which define her identity. The Stranger says that is why the Jedi threw her away. When Osha disagrees, the Stranger asks why she is not a Jedi repeatedly. Osha shouts that she failed and ignites the Stranger's lightsaber. She uses the blade to trap him against a rockface. As she stares at him fiercely, the Stranger says that he understands. He explains that he lost everything but adds that is when one becomes "truly free." After staring at the Stranger's face, Osha withdraws the blade and switches it off.

On Coruscant, Master Rwoh arrives at the spaceport in field dress where she meets up with Mog and other Jedi including a Selkath. Mog says he has not heard from Master Sol but says that their team is ready to depart in 20 minutes. Mog is concerned that Rwoh is accompanying them and warns that people can get nauseous during hyperspace travel. Rwoh counters that she does not get sick but finds it unsettling. When Mog suggests that Sol's team's casualties are due to the planet's uncharted environment, Rwoh reassures him that he does not need to take it personally and says that she hopes it is alright with him. The group approach a parked starship.

Back on Master Sol's ship, Bazil moves through an access conduit with a torchlight. In the floor above, Mae notices the lights shining through the floor grates. Master Sol calls to her and she follows him into the bunk quarters. Mae tells Sol that she ran a diagnostic on the ship and that she will have to restart the systems, which she estimates will take five minutes. Sol meditates and regrets not sensing the Stranger's true intentions when they first met him on Olega. Mae says that desire can cloud a person's mind and only see what you want to see. Mae says that the Stranger fooled them all.

Sol notices that "Osha" has found her Pip droid, which beeps in binary. Sol notices that "Osha" has a loving relationship with Pip even though he is a machine. He rises from his bunk. Mae says that she has always been like that even when she was little. Sol agrees. Pretending to be Osha, Mae says that she had to lose a lot of herself in order to become a Jedi, even if she did not know it at the time. Sol apologizes, prompting Mae to say how could she feel it any other way. Sol sighs. When Mae asks if Sol has told her everything that happened on Brendok, he replies that she was very young. Mae replies that she is not very young now and asks him to tell her the full story.

At that moment, the ship's lights and systems reboot. Sol lowers his head while Mae walks away and heads to the ship's cockpit. Mae speaks to the comms and asks if anyone can hear her. Master Rwoh responds on the comms. Before Mae can continue, Sol stuns her with a blaster. He is followed by Bazil. Sol recognizes Mae as an imposter posing as her sister Osha. Master Rwoh tells Sol that help is on the way and tells him to leave the transponder on. Sol switches off the comms unit and activates the hyperdrive lever, causing the Jedi transport to jump into hyperspace.

Moments later, a silver Jedi starship with red markings exits hyperspace and descends into Khofar's atmosphere. After speaking with the locals, Mog informs Master Rwoh that an umbramoth colony hatched last night and terrorized the local settlement. He speculates that if the Jedi had been near that colony, that could explain the large number of casualties incurred by Sol's team. Rwoh accepts this as a theory. The Jedi trek down the hill into the jungle below.

Back at the Stranger's cave, Osha has a bowl of soup while the Stranger repairs his damaged helmet with an electrical tool. When Osha asks if he made the same pitch to Mae, the Stranger admits that he made the mistake of thinking that she wanted more than just revenge. He says that he thought Mae wanted what he wanted, prompting Osha to probe further. The Stranger explained that he wanted the power of two. When Osha asks about how he got that scar on his back, the Stranger says it was caused by someone who threw him away. Osha asks if it was his Jedi Master who was responsible. The Stranger changes topic, explaining that his helmet was made from cortosis. Cortosis is both lightsaber resistant and ideal for serving as material for a sensory deprivation headpiece. When Osha asks if cortosis blocks out all their senses, the Stranger confirms this is the case, saying it allows one to get closer to the Force with discretion. The Stranger invites her to try out a cortosis headpiece. Osha still does not trust the Stranger but he encourages her to learn to trust herself. The Stranger walks away with his box and tool, leaving Osha to gaze at the cortosis headpiece on the table.

Meanwhile on Khofar, Master Rwoh and her landing party reach Kelnacca's shelter where they find the remains of Sol's team including Lon and Fandar. Rwoh and Mog find more Jedi remains within a forest clearing. She also finds the site of the Stranger's Force push against the Jedi. Mog reports that there is no sign of Osha or Mae and speculates that they must still be at large. Mog believes that the opponent the Jedi were fighter was capable of generating an explosion and taking on several Jedi. He describes their opponent's power as extraordinary but his skills as erratic. Mog says that their opponent's sole aim was to leave no survivors.

An umbramoth dives at them but Rwoh uses her lightsaber whip to kill the creature by slicing it in half. Rwoh notices that the fallen Jedi were killed by a lightsaber and asks Mog what it tells them. Mog surmises that a powerful Jedi has fallen. Mog asks if she thinks that Master Sol is responsible, which Rwoh describes as an extraordinary accusation. Mog asks who else would have the power to slay so many Jedi. When Rwoh remarks this is something to tip the scales, Mog asks why Sol would send them a distress signal. Rwoh says it is time to get back to the ship and that they should prepare the bodies for burial.

Meanwhile aboard Sol's Jedi transport, Mae awakes to find herself restrained on a medbay table. She finds Sol sitting in the lounge area. Master Sol tells Mae that he has no intention of harming her. He tells her that they need to find her master and save Osha. But first, he says that the two of them will need to talk. Sol says that he has spent the past 16 years thinking of what he would say to her if they had the opportunity to meet. Sol tells Mae that she is going to listen.

Back in the Stranger's cave, Osha approaches his cortosis helmet, touching its scars and scorch marks. She notices a vein of cortosis nearby. After studying the helmet, she slowly dons the helmet and breathes deeply. The meager light through the narrow eye slits slowly fades out.

Summary:	A bitter truth is revealed.



Sixteen years earlier, Sol and his fellow Jedi Master Indara, Padawan Torbin, and Kelnacca survey the vegetation on the planet Brendok. Sol collects a sample of a bush and stores it inside a metal container strapped around his back. Later, Master Indara activates a different type of scanner on top of a post. While she checks her datapad, Kelnacca surveys the grass with a long instrument. Sol collects a sample of water from a nearby stream. While Kelnacca roars, Torbin collects a sample and drops it into an ana-

lyzer machine.

Later that night, the four Jedi sit beside a camp fire. Kelnacca has cooked a meal but Torbin is reluctant to eat. Master Indara counsels her Padawan that it is unwise to refuse a Wookiee's cooking. Torbin grumbles about being sick of eating Nuna legs and says that he wants to go home to Coruscant. Indara is sympathetic but reminds Torbin they are on a mission. Torbin grumbles that they have spent seven weeks on Brendok without finding anything worth reporting.

Indara explains that Brendok was reported as lifeless a hundred years ago due to a hyperspace disaster. However, the planet is thriving. Torbin grumbles about investigating vegetation on Brendok, prompting Indara to tell Torbin not to let his anxieties get the better of him. Torbin does not understand the purpose of their mission on Brendok. Sol explains that they are looking for a vergence on the planet. Indara explains that a vergence is a concentration of Force energy centered around a location. Sol thinks that a vergence can create life on a plant and that it is worth studying and protecting. He believes that this is a noble mission that is important to the Jedi.

The following day, Kelnacca explores the forest with his scanner. While Torbin drops more samples into his analyzer, Indara speaks with Sol, lamenting that her Padawan is too distracted to understand the significance of the vergence. She is also unsure about whether the vergence triggered the explosion of life on Brendok. When Sol remarks that Torbin is distracted and unbalanced, Indara reminds him he was disturbed and tells him not to confuse his feelings with Torbin's. Indara says that she does not tell Torbin answers to ease his mind but rather to seek the answers for himself. When Sol sighs, Indara says that is why she has a Padawan while he does not.

After Kelnacca calls to them in Shyriiwook, Indara decides that the four should split up. Indara asks Sol to follow the river and to explore the Northlands, which have not been explored. They agree to meet back at camp. Sol heads to the Northlands on a speeder bike. After parking his bike, Sol is drawn to a bunta tree around stone ruins where he witnesses two human children Mae-ho Aniseya ("Mae") and Verosha Aniseya ("Osha"). Sol witnesses Mae using the Force to trap a butterfly until Osha tells her to stop. He hears the two children arguing before walking into the forest. Sol witnesses Osha and Mae reaffirming their relationship with each other. He also catches sight of Mother Koril chastising the children for running off into the woods alone. Sol contacts Master Indara with a comlink, telling her that they are not alone.

He follows Koril and the twins to the gate of the Brendok fortress. There, he watches Koril unlocking the gate and ushering the children inside. Sol waits for the three to disappear inside before attempting to unlock the gate himself. After unsuccessfully attempting to unlock the gate, he climbs the mountain fortress and uses a catwalk to enter Fortress common room. Watching from a crack, he watches Mother Aniseya training the twins in the arts of the Force. He sees Mae defending Osha with her Force powers. Hearing a sound on the catwalk, Koril investigates but sees no one. Near the top of the mountain fortress, Sol witnesses several witches engaging a ritual.

Later that night, Sol reports his findings to Master Indara and the other Jedi. Sol thinks that the Force cult he encountered are witches. When Torbin asks if the witches are Nightsisters, Kelnacca growls. Indara says that they do not have all the information and adds that Nightsisters do not raise younglings or train them. Sol says that the witches do not treat the girls like children. Indara thinks that they should return to the ship and seek guidance from the Jedi High Council. Sol is concerned for the girls' safety and tells Indara that the witches are preparing them for a ceremony tonight. Fearing that the girls are danger, Sol insists that they act fast rather than consult the High Council.

The four Jedi travel on two speeder bikes towards the witches' mountain fortress. Reaching the gate, Kelnacca rips a panel from the wall. Torbin recognizes the gate as hosting an old platform elevator and thinks that the mountain fortress was once a mining site. Under Indara's orders, Kelnacca slices the elevator's controls. Indara wants to investigate alone but Torbin insists on accompanying her. Indara disagrees, saying that the witches might take the presence of multiple Jedi as a threat. When Sol counters that there are over 50 witches, Indara responds that there are 50 witches and two children. Sol insists that they go as a team and Indara relents but warns them to be vigilant.

The four Jedi enter the lift, which takes them up to a corridor consisting of sharp-edged metal panels with three triangular lights in yellow and green. They enter a courtyard where the find the warrior witches standing down with their bows and arrows. They find the rest of the witches clustered together on the steps amidst a fog. Master Indara introduces herself, Sol, Torbin, and Kelnacca. Mother Aniseya responds that the women in the coven are under her protection while Koril denounces the Jedi for trespassing.

Indara apologizes for the intrusion and says that they thought Brendok was uninhabited. While Aniseya expresses disbelief that the Jedi could not sense their presence, she uses her telepathic powers to toy with Torbin's mind. He finds himself alone in the courtyard. Mother Aniseya reads his mind, recognizing him as a Jedi Padawan and the son of paupers from the planet Bonadan. Apparitions of Aniseya speak to him, telling him that he has traveled so far only to be trapped and describing him as a strong and good Jedi. Aniseya senses that Torbin has natural desires that he suppresses and asks if he desires to escape Brendok. She offers to help him.

During the trance, Indara asks Osha if they can meet her sister Mae. Aniseya toys with Torbin, playing on his desire to return to Coruscant. She offers to grant him his desire. Aniseya tempts him with the desire until he gives in and says that he wishes to return to Coruscant. This causes Torbin's eyes to turn black and he falls to his knees. Torbin's trance-like state unnerves the other Jedi. Aniseya warns the Jedi to leave in return for restoring Torbin's mind. Amidst the confrontation, Osha begs Aniseya to let her take the Jedi test. Indara backs Osha up. Aniseya releases Torbin and agrees to send scouts to bring Mae and Osha for testing at the Jedi's camp the following day. The Jedi depart under the watchful gaze of the witches.

Aboard the Jedi starship, Master Indara tends to Torbin, who is still shaken from the telepathic attack. Master Indara is pleased with Sol's idea about testing the girls since it would buy her time to consult the Jedi Council. Sol confides that he feels a special connection with Osha. Indara is concerned about the idea of testing the twins and thinks that Osha is too old to join the Jedi Order. When Sol says that he feels that Osha is destined to be his Padawan, Indara takes him by the shoulder and warns that her coven will not let her leave. She describes the coven as insular and strange.

Sol is concerned about Osha's well being, saying that they marked her sister Mae with ceremonial markings. Indara responds that ceremonial markings are customary in many galactic cultures. Sol recalls that Osha did not have one and opines that she is not safe. Indara says they cannot be certain that Osha resisted receiving the marking. Sol says that it is the duty of the Jedi to protect Osha and believes that Osha wants to leave with them. Indara cautions Sol not to mistake his desires for what Osha wants. Indara walks away, leaving Sol with a weighty expression.

The following day, Torbin meditates outside the Jedi starship. Opening his eyes, he sees Koril leading the scouts and the twins towards the Jedi starship. Torbin accompanies Mae aboard the ship while holding a syringe. He collects a sample of blood from her arm after she consents. In the medbay, she is greeted by Indara and Sol who have prepared a Jedi test for her. Indara tells Mae that she must divine what images appear on the testing screen. This prompts Mae to ask them what they want her to do.

Sol holds the screen to his face and asks Mae to tell them what she sees. Though the screen shows a wampa, she tells them that she sees a starship. When the image of a loth-cat appears, Mae says she sees a castle. When the third image of a power droid flashes, Mae says she sees a planet. Sol eyes her with disappointment. Before the fourth image appears, Mae claims she sees a necklace, prompting Sol to say that the image has not appeared yet.

After Mae asks if she can go home, Indara questions her about the ceremony the Jedi saw last night in the witches' fortress. Mae says that it was an Ascension ceremony. Indara asks if she liked it, prompting Mae to nod. Indara says that the ceremony was very beautiful and remarks that Ascension must be very powerful for Mae to receive such a marking on her forehead. Mae adds that her Mother Aniseya explained that the Ascension ceremony means Osha and her will lead the coven, following in their Mother's footsteps. When Indara asks how children can be expected to lead a coven, Mae says she doesn't know.

Misunderstanding her mother's words, Mae says that her Mother said that "everyone must walk through fear" and that "everyone must be sacrificed to fulfill their destiny." Indara thanks Mae for the explanation before allowing her to leave. After Torbin escorts Mae out, Sol tells Indara that Mae was instructed to fail the test. He seeks her permission to try a different approach with Osha. Following Mae's revelation about the coven's beliefs, Indara relents.

During Osha's test, Sol reassures her that there are thousands of other children like her in the Jedi. He tells her that she must have the courage to say what she wants. While Indara makes eye contact with Torbin, Osha tells the Jedi that she wants to be a Jedi. Sol tells Osha that she must then have the courage to tell her coven the truth. Indara permits Osha to continue the test. While Sol holds the screen to his face, he asks Osha to tell them what she sees. Osha says that she sees a planet, which Sol says is correct. Indara watches the test with a concerned look.

Later, Indara instructs Torbin to run Mae and Osha's blood samples. She tells him that she has contacted the Jedi High Council for advice. While they await a response from the Council, she tells Torbin and Kelnacca to continue with their fieldwork. After Torbin leaves, Sol tells Indara that Osha passed. She says that she will meet him an the camp once the Council has responded.

That evening, Kelnacca prepares dinner at the camp site while Torbin and Sol wait. Master Indara exits the starship. She explains that the Jedi Council will not sanction bringing the twins to Coruscant or separating them from their coven. Torben says that the witches are dangerous, citing their telepathic attack on him. Sol responds that Indara can sense that the twins are not safe. Indara responds that the Council says they have interfered too much with the coven already. When Torbin asks if the Council will let them return, Indara gives a negative answer, prompting Torbin to sulk. Sol offers to speak with the Council but Indara says that they have made their decision already.

When Sol protests that Osha passed the test, Indara counters that he coached her and warns Sol not to form an emotional attachment to the child. Sol angrily denies that he is attached to

Osha, saying that he wants to do what is best for her. Indara disagrees, saying it is not up to him. Just then, Torbin returns with a datapad containing the twins' blood test results. He notices that their M-count is unusually high, making them very Force-sensitive. He says that the girls are not twins because they have the same symbiont. Sol and Indara conclude that the twins were artificially created by tapping into a power dense enough to split one consciousness into two bodies.

Sol says that only a vergence can create that kind of power. Believing the girls are in danger, Torbin climbs onto a speeder bike despite Sol's warnings. Torbin replies that the twins are proof that the Jedi Council needs of the vergence they were looking for. He says that this is their ticket home. Indara sends Sol on the remaining speeder bike to stop him while she and Kelnacca will follow in their starship.

Meanwhile at the Brendok fortress, Osha and Mae fight, prompting Mother Aniseya to tell Mother Koril to bring Mae out. Soo weaves through the forest on his speeder bike. In the witches' common room, Osha tells Aniseya that she wants to be a Jedi. Aniseya hugs her daughter and promises to discuss the situation with the other witches. Before leaving, the mother and daughter reaffirm their love for each other.

Elsewhere, Koril drags Mae out into the courtyard. She gives Mae permission to stop Osha from going to the Jedi and warns her that the Jedi will not warn her before they attack. In a brief practice session, Koril attempts to strike Mae with her staff but Mae uses her Force powers to deflect her attack. Koril encourages Mae to give into her anger.

Back in the common room, Ensigns Rane and Eurus object to Aniseya's decision to release Osha to the Jedi. Aniseya counters that Osha has chosen to go and says that they should respect her daughter's decision. When Rane objects to sacrificing their future, Aniseya counters that her children are their future and insists on respecting Osha's wish. A dark skinned human witch reminds Aniseya that she may be a mother but she is also their leader. Aniseya chooses to be a mother first.

Meanwhile, a furious Mae smashes the elevator control panel with a pipe. She tells the other witches that nobody can get in or out. Koril backs her up and orders the other witches to arm themselves for an impending Jedi raid. On the ground, Sol catches up with Torbin outside the elevator at the base of the fortress. Torbin tells Sol that the elevator is jammed.

Meditating through the Force, Sol hones in on Mae telling her sister Osha that she cannot leave the fortress since they are stuck here. Soo leads Torbin to the fortress wall. After finding a handhold, he tells Torbin that he needs his help to rescue the girls and that he cannot let the witches get into his head again. As the two prepare to climb the mountain, Mae locks Osha inside their room before picking up an oil lamp.

Indara and Kelnacca approach the fortress in their starship. Unable to land, Indara convinces Kelnacca to descend from the starship in order to stop Torbin from inflaming the situation. As Koril prepares the witches for the Jedi raid, she tells Aniseya that the Jedi have breached the fortress again. Aniseya objects to using violence but Koril is unwilling to let the Jedi take their children. Mae sets Osha's journal on fire. The fire gets out of control after Mae drops the oil lamp, causing the flames to spread to a circuitry panel on the wall. As the fire spreads, Mae calls for help.

Meanwhile, Torbin and Sol reach a mountain plateau near the perimeter of the fortress. As the Jedi reach the courtyard, the face Aniseya, Koril and several armed witches lining a catwalk. Aniseya chastises the Jedi for returning. Sol says that they have come with noble intentions. When Aniseya asks if they have come to seek permission for the twins to be raised by an institution, Sol asks her where the twins came from and how they were created. As the archers aim their arrows at the two Jedi, Torbin backs away. Aniseya warns that the Jedi's noble intentions could lead to the destruction of their Order.

Torbin reaches for his lightsaber but Sol stops him. Just then, Mae interrupts the confrontation and asks for help. Soo mistakes her for Osha and calls out to her. Koril prepares to hurl her spear while Torbin ignites his lightsaber. Aniseya uses her powers to morph into a black smoke, which also envelopes Mae. Reacting instinctively, Sol slashes the black smoke with his lightsaber, causing Aniseya to return to her physical form. As Aniseya succumbs to her wounds, Mae cries out in despair. A dying Aniseya tells Sol that she was going to allow Osha to follow the Jedi, honoring her daughter's wishes.

As Mae tends to her fallen mother, Sol sees the ascension mark and realizes the girl is Mae.

Koril tells Mae to run. While Torbin fends off the scouts' arrows with his lightsaber, Koril attacks Sol with her staff. He finds off her blow but doesn't fight back with his lightsaber. Struggling with guilt, Sol refuses to fight her but holds off her staff when she launches a new attack. The fire caused by Mae triggers several explosions throughout he mountain fortress.

Meanwhile, Osha manages to escape her room through a tunnel. She hears the explosions above. Koril uses her powers to cause herself and the archers to disappear. Her voice can be heard taunting the Jedi. When Torbin counters that his mind is fortified, Koril reveals the Wookiee has not fortified his mind. A possessed Kelnacca, who has blackened eyes, ignites his green lightsaber and approaches his Jedi comrades menacingly. The witches in the common room including Elder Naasa conduct a ritual to possess Kelnacca's mind, which causes their eyes to turn black as well.

Kelnacca attacks Sol and Torbin with his lightsaber and Force powers. Using the Force, he hurls Sol against a wall. Kelnacca then chokes Torbin while trapping against a wall. He attempts to strike Torbin with his lightsaber but the younger Jedi fends him off with his lightsaber. During the struggle, Torbin's face is scratched by the Wookiee's claws. Sol manages to distract Kelnacca, causing him to let go off Torbin. The two engage in a brief lightsaber duel before Sol disarms Kelnacca's lightsaber. Following a tussle, Kelnacca attempts to strangle Sol under the influence of the witches' telepathic spell.

Indara comes to Sol's rescue and jumps on top of Kelnacca. After knocking him to the ground, she uses her Force powers to counter the telepathic powers of the witches. She drives them away from Kelnacca's mind, causing the witches to collapse. Kelnacca blinks as his eyes return to normal. While Indara tends to the Wookiee, she sends Sol to rescue the twins. Inside the mountain fortress, Osha and Mae are separated when the generator explodes, causing the walkway to split in half.

Sol runs into the tunnel and the common room. He attempts to keep the walkways from collapsing. Lacking the strength to hold both sides up, Sol lets go off Mae's side and focuses on Osha. Mae falls into the depths of the mountain's interior. Osha's side collapses but he manages to grab her wrist before she falls.

Later aboard the Jedi starship, Kelnacca paces outside the medbay while Sol attends to Osha, who has been connected to a respirator. A scarred Torbin apologizes to Master Indara. Indara tells Kelnacca to contact Coruscant while she speaks with Torbin and Sol, telling them that she warned them not to interfere. Sol says that he wanted the twins to be safe and attempts to leave. Indara grabs his arms and the two tussle until Torbin tells them to stop.

Following a tense moment, Torbin asks Indara what they should tell the Jedi Council. Indara says they will report that Mae burned down the witches' fortress, causing the deaths of everyone inside. When Sol insists on facing the Council, Indara warns against retraumatizing Osha by taking away her dream. She asks Sol to consider why he made his choice before facing the Council. At that moment, Osha calls for her mother and Sol tends to her. When Osha asks where she is, Sol tells her that she is on her way to Coruscant. He tells Osha that Mae started the fire.

Summary:	Confrontation and revelation await.



The episode opens with Verosha Aniseya ("Osha") inside the Stranger's cave, meditating with the Sith's helmet as the Stranger himself smiles. When Osha begins convulsing, he panics and attempts to use the Force to remove the helmet. In the physical world, his eyes turn black. With difficulty, he manages to remove the helmet.

After regaining her composure, Osha tells the Stranger that she experienced a vision of her sister Mae-ho Aniseya ("Mae") killing Jedi Master Sol. Mae had

a lightsaber in her hand but she did not use it. The Stranger tells Osha that she saw a vision of the future and thinks that Mae can kill without a weapon. Osha says that the future is not fixed and that she can change it.

The Stranger turns around and says that he will be leaving aboard his starship. Osha asks where he is going and adds that he knows where Sol and Mae are. The Stranger says that they will then go together.

Meanwhile, Master Sol takes his starship Polan GX-8 above Mae's homeworld of Brendok. While Mae lies bound on the medbay bed, Sol tells her that he will contact Master Vernestra Rwoh and tell her to meet him on Brendok. When Mae asks why, he explains that there is a vergence on the planet. Mae secretly activates Pip. He plans to use Mae and Osha to prove the existence of the vergence on Brendok.

When Mae confronts him about the murder of her mother Aniseya, Sol responds that Aniseya's death was an accident. Mae then asks why he did not tell Osha the truth and instead scapegoated her. Sol blames Mae for starting the fire and says she locked everyone inside the Brendok fortress. Mae counters that Sol and the Jedi invaded their home, saying that everyone died because of the four Jedi. Mae secretly uses Pip to unlock her restraints.

Sol responds that the Jedi were justified to intervene and says that his biggest regret was failing to save them both. He tells Mae that she and Osha are not twins or sisters. Before he can explain further, Mae uses Pip to unlock her remaining restraint and stings Sol in the chest with Pip's stun gun. Mae flees into the corridor with Bazil tailing her. With Pip's help, she reaches the escape pod section before Sol can recapture her. Mae escapes in an escape pod with Pip and heads towards Brendok.

Sol rushes to the cockpit and detaches Polan GX-8 from its Hyperspace transport ring. Mae takes the escape pod into an asteroid belt around one of Brendok's moons. Soo pursues her

through the asteroid belt. He uses the targeting computer to close in on Mae's ship. Bazil enters the cockpit and rips out several wires, causing it to lose control and collide with Mae's ship. Mae's ship hurtles through an opening in the asteroid belt towards Brendok. Her ship descends into the planet's atmosphere, hitting a peak and rolling down a mountain.

Back at the Jedi Temple, Padawan Mog Adana informs Master Rwoh that Senator Rayencourt has come to visit her. Rwoh is annoyed that Adana allowed the Senator into the control room. Rayencourt apologizes for his intrusion and asks about her recent travels. Getting to business, he says that he has heard that Rwoh is running a murder investigation without reporting it to the Galactic Senate. Rwoh says that she is keeping the investigation internal for the moment and does not see a need to report it if there is larger threat.

When Rayencourt asks how she can know there is no larger threat, Rwoh acknowledges that all the victims are Jedi. Rayencourt inquires about multiple victims. Rwoh says that she is close to apprehending the suspect. When Rayencourt asks if the suspect is a Jedi, Rwoh says that is very close and thanks him for his concerns.

As she turns away, Rayencourt asks if she dislikes him and that his campaign for an external review of the Jedi is a personal vendetta. Rwoh admits disliking him. Rayencourt opines that the Jedi are a massive system of unchecked power, posing as a religion. He disparages the Jedi as a delusional cult who claim to control the "uncontrollable." When Rwoh counters that the Jedi do not control the Force, Rayencourt says he is referring to their emotions. While the Jedi project an image of goodness and restraint, he says that it is a matter of time before one of them snaps. He wonders who will be strong enough to stop him.

Rwoh responds that Rayencourt's opinion is not shared by the rest of the Senate. Rayencourt understands that most of his colleagues cannot imagine a galaxy without the Jedi. When people look up to heroes, they do not have to face what is in front of them. Rwoh asks if that is all before using the Force to unlock the door. Before leaving, Rayencourt warns Rwoh that he has reported her lack of transparency to Supreme Chancellor Drellik. He may invite her to a tribunal for an update. Rayencourt says he wishes that she would have her suspect in custody by then. He gives a disdainful farewell before departing.

While a family of Skura forage on a rocky shore, Osha and the Stranger cross a stony causeway to the Stranger's starship. The Stranger questions Osha's unwillingness to reveal their destination. Osha counters that they will go together or not go at all. When the Stranger asks if he gave her the impression that he is a fair person, Osha reminds he that he made a deal with her sister Mae and expected her to uphold it. She says that is fair and so is trusting her to take them to their destination.

The Stranger asks if Osha would consider being his student but she declines. When he says that it is her last chance, Osha says she is not her sister. The Stranger is impressed, saying Mae made that deal without thinking about it. She lets the Stranger take the lead and holds back before following him. After the ship departs, a cloaked, thin figure with orange, glowing eyes watches menacingly from an opening on the rocky shore.

Meanwhile, Master Sol has parked his starship in a clearing near the Brendok fortress. After activating the transponder switch, Sol exits the starship and raises his hand before walking away. He has a haunted look on his face. Bazil watches from the cockpit.

Meanwhile on Coruscant, Master Rwoh uses a transmitter to tell someone she needs to get in touch urgently. The respondent replies this is highly irregular but he will see what he can do. Padawan Mog Adana informs Rwoh that they have managed to track down Master Sol, who has turned his transponder beacon back on. When Adana tells her that Sol is on Brendok, she sighs and her eyes shift knowingly. She tells Mog to prepare her starship for departure and to gather several Jedi Knights without raising alarm. When Adana asks if she is expecting a conflict, Rwoh replies that she is seeking to implement a resolution.

Elsewhere, the Stranger's ship Exile II descends into Brendok's atmosphere. Osha and the Stranger sit in separate cockpits of the twin boom body. Osha flies the ship, not allowing the Stranger to operate it. She deactivates the controls and tells the Stranger that there is a landing site near the witches' fortress. Based on a topographical map on the ship's computer, she learns that Sol is already at the Brendok fortress.

Reaching the top of the fortress, Sol spots the Stranger's ship flying past an obelisk. He walks into the abandoned courtyard and searches for Mae. He is haunted by memories of his role in killing Aniseya in the presence of Mae. He walks into a dark corridor.


At the base of the Brendok fortress, Osha and the Stranger reach the elevator. Osha proposes repairing the elevator instead of climbing. The Stranger asks if she is sure before disappearing, his voice echoing. Sol walks through the common room to the generator annex. He stares at the twisted remains of the broken walkway. Haunted by the memories of that fateful night, Sol walks away as voices echo in the background. Shortly later, Mae climbs out of the pit with Pip. Mae visits her fire-scorched former bedroom. Back at the base, Osha hotwires the elevator, restoring it. The door slides open.

Meanwhile, Sol continues his search for Mae, calling out her name repeatedly. While pausing in a hallway, he is confronted by the Stranger, who thanks the Jedi Master for leading him to her. The Stranger dons his cortosis helmet and wields his lightsaber. Sol ignites his blue lightsaber in self-defense.

The two engage in a lightsaber duel. The Stranger drives Sol towards the bridge where the scouts were stationed. Sol jumps out of the bridge and uses the Force to cushion his landing. The Stranger also uses the Force to cushion his landing. In the courtyard, Sol warns the Stranger that he will destroy him if he must. The Stranger taunts not if she gets him first before activating a second red lightsaber.

He launches a second assault on Sol, who dodges both blades. Sol manages to knock the shorter red lightsaber out of the Stranger's hand. The Sith acolyte attempts to retrieve his weapon with the Force but Sol launches a counter-offensive and kicks the Stranger in the chest. While Sol reactivates his lightsaber, the Stranger retrieves his second lightsaber and launches a renewed attack. He hurls his lightsabers like boomerangs at Sol. Sol uses the Force to dodge the Stranger's attacks and push the Stranger towards the edge of the courtyard. Qimir uses the Force to retrieve his longer lightsaber and launches a third assault.
