Summary: Following his uncle's mysterious death, Alex Rider begins a quest for answers that leads him into a dark world of secrets and espionage. He comes to realise that his uncle wasn't the man he thought he was and that Alex himself is expected to follow in his footsteps.



The episode begins with a man named Yassen driving into a car park and, with a briefcase in hand, setting to work assassinating the target above — which happens to be a man named Michael Roscoe. Controlling the elevator remotely, Michael falls down the empty shaft and plummets to his death.

We then cut forward and meet our main protagonist, blonde haired Alex Rider, who talks to his friend Tom about an upcoming party at school. Unfortunately, Tom has his phone confiscated prompting him to convince Alex to use his "particular set of skills" to break in

and get it for him. Although he's successful in his mission, Alex's caught by the teacher and it prompts Uncle Ian to arrive and pick him up.

That evening at dinner, Alex gleefully shows a video of Parker pranking his Father but it gets Ian thinking, especially given Parker was taken away to a boot camp in France not long after and returned a very different boy. Midway through researching, their nanny Jack reveals that she's passed her degree and now, she's not going to be around to help anymore. When she leaves, Ian also leaves on "work business" but not before checking in with Alex and asking if the school Parker was sent to was Point Blanc. When he leaves, Alex heads to the party.

Ian meets his contact from Russia, who happens to be Yassen, with his work associate Martin. Unfortunately Martin double crosses him and holds a gun up to his friend's head. After mention-

ing the "Varna File", Yassen sighs and apologises, subsequently killing Ian and shooting Martin in the shoulder to make it look like an accident.

When Alex returns home, he learns the bad news about his Uncle and the police reveal he was involved in a head-on collision. Only, this is obviously a cover and as "members of the bank" arrive, Mrs Jones is given the task of speaking to Alex.

Visiting him at home, Alex asks Mrs Jones about Point Blanc but gets nowhere. Even worse, he also learns that no hospital in the area has records of Alex's Uncle being brought in. When Tom arrives to offer his condolences, Alex has an idea and decides to use an app to trace the last known location for the phone — which happens to be the warehouse Ian was killed.

Alex heads down to the location with Tom and learns first-hand that powerful forces are covering this up. After recording an incriminating video, Alex races off after a black car that may hold answers.

Alex is eventually held up at gunpoint by a man named Crawley, someone who happens to be working with the British Special Forces. Obviously, Ian was not working for the bank and after some contemplation, the group inform Alex about the truth. After asking whether he'll join them, Alex rejects the call to action and walks away.

In the morning, Immigration Services arrive to take Jack away while Child Protection also enter, forcing Alex to pick up the phone and agree to work with the Special Services. It turns out the officers inside the house were all part of a plan to get Alex involved. As he grabs his jacket, Alex heads out and gets in the car with Alan Blunt, which is where the episode ends.

Summary: Still reeling from the revelation that his uncle was a spy for the British Government, Alex is kidnapped and interrogated by an unknown group of paramilitary agents. It will take all his hidden skills to turn the tables on his captors.



The episode begins with Alex arriving at the Special Forces headquarters where he learns more about what his Uncle was doing. He was getting close to the Russians in a bid to learn what their moves are on the global stage. In order to get intel on Point Blanc and what goes on there, the Forces need to send a troubled teenager to infiltrate the school; that teenager being Alex Rider.

Back home, Alex deflects Jack's questioning and heads to school. Once there, it turns out everyone knows what happened with his Uncle and his love interest

Ayisha offers her condolences for his loss. Midway through class, Alex is called out by the Principal where he finds a man named Geoffrey Daniels waiting for him, posing as a "grief counselor".

Sighing, Alex agrees to talk to him but it turns out he's actually working on Alex's side and reveals the truth about what happened that night with Ian — and how Alan Blunt let it happen. Alex hears the man out, despite his reluctance to trust him, as Daniels reveals he wants to shut Alan's department down. Before he goes, Geoffrey tells him to be careful and to watch his back.

While Alan Blunt visits David and invites him out for a drink, Alex heads home but on the way is hit by a van and bundled inside. When he wakes up, Alex's dragged to an interrogation room and questioned by a man named Wolf. He has one question for the bloodied boy — who was Ian working for? Unfortunately things go badly for Alex when he doesn't give the right answers, prompting the group to begin torturing him with loud heavy metal. He remains un-phased though, singing to blare out the guttural roars.

Wolf and the group continue to torture Alex, changing tactics from music to water which pounds on him from above. The group turn on Wolf though, telling him it's not their job to

torture kids but as they turn their attention away from the monitors for a second, it's just the opening Alex needs and as we cut back and see he stole a paper clip earlier in the episode, he uncuffs himself and slips away.

On the road outside he's stopped by Daniels in his car who also happens to be working with Wolf and the others. Alex scoffs in disgust, asking them all if he's passed the test until Mrs Jones arrives and tells them all to stand down. Taking Alex away in her car, they ride away while back at the office, Jones confronts Alan Blunt given she was supposed to be his handler.

In the wake of this, Wolf confronts Mrs Jones and asks her about Point Blanc. She has no answers though while back in the office, Daniels briefs Alan Blunt over a new holographic technology that was used within the elevator shaft to make it appear like the lift was there when it wasn't. This leads them to the assumption that the Russians are involved, given it's their sort of advanced technology.

Meanwhile, Yassen visits Martin who confirms the North Korean story has worked and the organisation have been fooled for now.

In the morning, Alex agrees to help Alan but only because he wants to find those who killed his Uncle. His new cover story has him adopt the alias of "Alex Friend" for when he arrives at the Academy and he'll be living with David and Caroline at their estate to help sell the believability of this.

As we cut across to Point Blanc in France, a man named Dr Greif smiles "This one will be just perfect," He says as the Alex Rider file sits on the table.

Summary:	Alex is thrown into the unfamiliar world of the ultra-rich as he struggles to perfect his cover identity, but risks alienating his best friend Tom by keeping the mission a secret.



The episode begins with Alex heading back to school but remaining distant with Tom, especially given his upcoming assignment for the Forces. Back home, he tells Mrs Jones that she needs to give Tom's phone back before they go but he remains untrusting toward the organisation.

As the cover story is put into action, Jack and Mrs Jones work together to test Alex's credentials and after quizzing him on his story, he's given a makeover. Back at school he's invited to a film night with the girls and Tom but as Alex leaves, a

text comes in regarding the mission and he's forced to lie to Tom and bail, beginning to fracture their friendship.

Alex arrives at the Friend Estate after further briefings surrounding some of the students at Point Blanc. David and Caroline are none too happy with the arrangement of Alex staying with them though, calling it irresponsible but agreeing to do this one last time.

Alex soon settles into the role of living with his new fake-parents but when their daughter Fiona returns home early, it puts a spanner in the works. At the same time, Tom goes on a mission to try and find his friend, eventually leading up to the estate posed as a pizza delivery man and forcing Alex to admit the truth about what he's doing. With the duo finally on the same page, Tom takes his leave.

Later that evening Fiona invites her friends over, including Rafe, who subsequently encourage Alex to join them in the morning for a "walk around the estate". Alex suspects something afool though but turns up nonetheless. Not long after, he's shot at prompting him to rush through the forest as Rafe and the others stalk him. Gathering his bearings, Alex learns what they're doing

and conceals himself in the bushes until they walk past. He springs the element of surprise on them, hitting Rafe in the nose and throwing his shotgun in the bushes before walking away.

Meanwhile, Alan and the others contemplate whether Martin Willby is telling the truth or not. That evening, they tell him to go home as Martin frantically discusses the fake Korean shooter.

Eva Stellenbosch arrives at the estate and interviews Alex while Mrs Jones and the others watch from afar, praying that he makes it in. After a tense few minutes, Alex passes the test and as the episode closes out, Alex is flown to the remote Point Blanc in France as Dr Greif watches him arrive.

We begin the episode in Point Blanc as Alex is forced to hand over his phone and belongings. After a brief, ominous warning about the perils of this remote area, Eva introduces Alex to the various members of the academy and it turns out there's only 6 of them — hand-picked by Dr Greif himself with the message of "Quality not quantity."

Back in London, Martin Wilby rings Yassen and tells him they need to move. Sensing that things are spiraling out of their control, Yassen in turn phones his contact and tells her they have a prob-

lem.

In Point Blanc, after being shown their rooms by the different students, Alex is tested physically by Eva before sitting and eating dinner with the group. Not long after, Alex decides to make his presence felt there and he starts blaring loud music as one of the boys, James, causes the kitchen to foam up as the rave around the place. Kyra meanwhile, remains distant and refuses the engage with them.

Eva inevitably catches them in the act though and after tasking them to clean up, Alex is taken before Dr Grief. When he leaves the Doctor's office after a stern talking to, an alarm blares as Alex believes someone is watching his every move from afar; someone who isn't a student there.

Meanwhile in London, Jack meets Mrs Jones and requests information on Alex. She refuses to give her any though but Jack does mention the Russian contact Ian was on the phone to before he left that night. Because of this, Jones and Alan Blunt piece together that Martin isn't

being wholly truthful while Martin starts to hack into restricted intel. Eventually Martin makes his move and heads over to see Jack, apologizing about what happened with Ian.

Unfortunately, Jack spills the truth to him about what Alex is up to and when Mrs Jones calls to tell her to keep quiet, it's too late as Martin bolts from the room. Sensing he's been compromised, Yassen confronts Martin and stabs him before leaving the double-crossing agent in a heap on the floor.

Back at the school, Dr Greif briefs the group and discusses removing 99% of the people from the world. However, he's interrupted by Laura's constant coughing and she's told to go down to the infirmary. She's reluctant to go but does eventually leave. That evening, Laura doesn't show up for any of the activities and it starts to ring alarm bells for Alex as he wonders what's going on. Even worse, a bizarre encounter with Sasha leaves him frazzled as she scoffs and tells him he "should have enjoyed it while he had the chance."

That evening, Alex brushes his teeth in his room but realizes he's been drugged. As he collapses on the ground, he's rushed down to the infirmary by Dr Greif who decides that he's "ready", which is where the episode ends.

The episode begins with Alex waking up after his ordeal and not remembering anything. As he sits with the others eating breakfast, he relays his dream and Kyra chimes in and reveals she had the exact same visions. Laura returns from her absence too, completely different from before and sitting with the twins as they talk cryptically about how she's feeling.

Meanwhile in London, Jones and the others sit and try to work out the connection Martin had in all this, believing it may lie with the school in Point Blanc. As

they set to work uncovering what's going on, Yassen lurks in the shadows and starts to track down Alex.

Back at school, Steph (the girl who threw up at the party in episode 1) awkwardly talks about an upcoming party with Tom. After stumbling his way through the conversation, he heads into class where it turns out Yassen is waiting outside talking to the teachers, watching Tom with interest.

At the Special Forces headquarters, Smithers and the others manage to trace a number that leads back to the shadowy forces at work and by using vocal tones matching Martin, phone through. Only, the number disconnects and this prompts Yassen to receive a call informing him about updating security protocols. Grief also receives a call too.

Alex, Kyra and James realize the group are being changed, one by one, and set to work breaking into Greif's office to learn more. The first step to do this is learning the key code and although they get the numbers and trace the code to the date Hitler was born, Grief's earlier phone call means they're forced to speed up their plans.

Despite managing to break in, they hit another snag when they realize the phone needs a physical key-card. At the same time, down in the basement, Greif speaks to Eva about killing Dr Baxter once he's served his purpose.

In Manhattan, Parker delivers a speech about controlling the empire his Father had and as Jones catches wind of the speech online, she realizes that this controlling and changing is part of what Point Blanc is doing to students.

Yassen meanwhile, breaks into Greif's office and sits waiting for him. He hands over the photo of Tom and Alex, quizzing him over who exactly Alex is and sowing seeds of doubt in his mind. On his way out the door, Yassen runs into Alex and after a frosty encounter, takes his leave.

In London, Alan meets Parker and sees first-hand that something isn't right and feeds this back to the group. At the same time, Alex, James and Kyra put into motion their plan of breaking out and stealing snowmobiles. Unfortunately, James is stopped on the way out and forced to follow Eva, subsequently missing from action.

In the middle of the night, Alex breaks out with Kyra and they start to get to the bottom of what's happening at Point Blanc. They find security footage of their rooms, and understand that Dr Greif is watching their every move. Out in the hallway, Dr Baxter meets Greif and Eva who both thank him for his work... and stab him in the chest, which is where the episode ends.

At school, Tom receives a strange phone call and races off, believing this to be his calling. Only, it's actually Mr Langham who brings him before Parker. He immediately receives a frosty reception and gets straight to work questioning him surrounding Alex Friend. Realizing he's in hot water, Tom attempts to leave are in vain as he finds himself caught in a very difficult position.

Kyra meanwhile, remains stuck inside the facility, hiding in the basement and waiting for Alex's signal. When the guards finally find Alex, they watch from afar as he's rushed to hospital where Eva follows to make sure he's dead. As the monitor flat-lines, Eva leaves but it turns out to be a big set-up by Jones and the others to trick her into thinking Alex is dead.

Back at headquarters, Smithers briefs Alan Blunt about Parker and how he's

clearly undergone multiple surgeries. Realizing he's not the real Parker, they contemplate just who the man they have in custody really is. They don't have to wait long though, as a feed is set up remotely with Alex and Jones to discuss what they've learned.

Alex reveals that Greif cloned himself and then surgically enhanced all the different copies to make them look like the kids at the school. These kids were handpicked as children to wealthy families across the world with the plan being infiltrating each of these families, killing the parents and then controlling the global economy through these different companies. This also reinforces the face masks found at Point Blanc.

While they try to work out what to do with this information, Alan interviews Parker again and reveals he knows what's really going on. As Parker speaks up but remains cryptic, it's just what Smithers needs as he uses the same vocal tech from before to fool Greif into believing Alex and the others have been completely dealt with.

Meanwhile, Alex is briefed by Wolf and his squad who work together to infiltrate the building and rescue Kyra and the other kids. As they break in, the soldiers subdue the clones and despite a quiet operation to begin with, things soon escalate into all-out carnage as Greif works to destroy the evidence on his computer.

Wolf approaches him in his office though, holding the man up at gunpoint, while down in the basement Eva and Alex fight until a fire breaks out. As flames engulf the lab, it ignites and explodes as it hits liquid nitrogen. Upstairs the clones are brought to their knees while the real prisoners are freed. On the way out, Kyra watches her clone who smiles at her ominously.

With Greif captured and Alex returned home, Alan Blunt tells him he's failed and that Greif's experiments are over. Only it certainly isn't the end of what happened to Ian Rider, as Greif reveals he wasn't part of that operation, going on to mention an ominous shadowy organization overseeing what's happening. As the episode closes out, back at Point Blanc another Alex Rider walks away from the wreckage of the basement. Unfortunately, Alex now has a clone to contend with.

That's enough of a connection for Alex, who goes to Craystar's London office to meet with him. Tom sets off the building's fire alarm to lure Roper outside, where he explains he was Ed's friend from university, and that whatever is going on with Cray, it involves Feathered Serpent 2 — apparently, he has been obsessive about it and its impending launch and hasn't had the time to be focusing on anything else, much less a criminal conspiracy.

But what does the game do? Not in terms of its mechanics and such, but what is Cray planning with it? Alex wants to get a look at its code to find out, but there's only one copy of it outside of Amsterdam, and it's being offered up as a reward for the press event that Cray is putting on. With all of Craystar still unable to track down the elusive K7, Alex volunteers to impersonate him and play for the code.

There's only one problem with this plan, though it's admittedly a big one — Alex has no idea how to play the game, and he only has a matter of hours to learn under Tom, who isn't

particularly good himself. Still, they start from the beginning and register Alex as K7. This, though, sends a ping to presumably the real K7, who immediately traces his IP address. More on this soon.

The undeniable highlight of "Serpent", though, is Alex impersonating an elite gamer, ingratiating himself amongst some famous streamers and other high-profile guests, and trying to blag his way around Cray's leading interrogation. In a stroke of incredibly good fortune, Cray wants K7 to play the latest build of Feathered Serpent 2 in a highly advanced augmented reality setting, which basically means Alex gets to be an athletic archer rather than a gamer, which he's much better suited to. When Cray becomes shocked and worried by his abilities, he turns up the system's haptic feedback to dangerous levels, risking stopping Alex's heart outright, which only wins him more fans amongst the audience as he continues to ping digital arrows at digital monsters. Eventually, Alex fires an actual bit of metal piping into the servers, which kills the lights, and in the brief moment of darkness he makes off with the copy of the game, which is dangling above the arena as a prize.

When Alex was entering the building before all this, by the way, he started getting anonymous texts from the real K7 telling him he was out of his depth. And while he's making his escape at the end of "Serpent", he starts getting more, guiding him through the building. Eventually, he hooks up with the real K7, who's Kyra from the first season. Alex is happy to see a familiar face, while at the same time Cray shows his face to someone who recognizes it — Yassen Gregorovich.

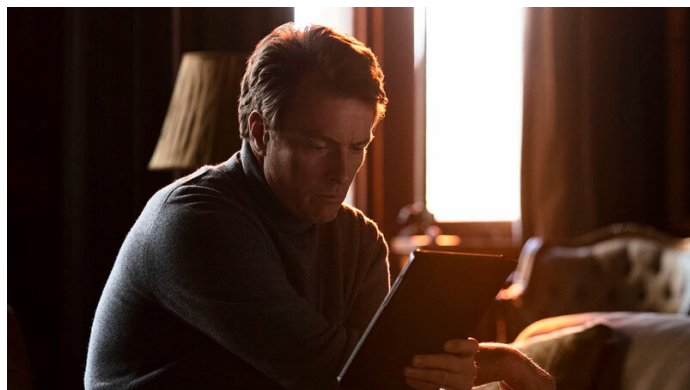

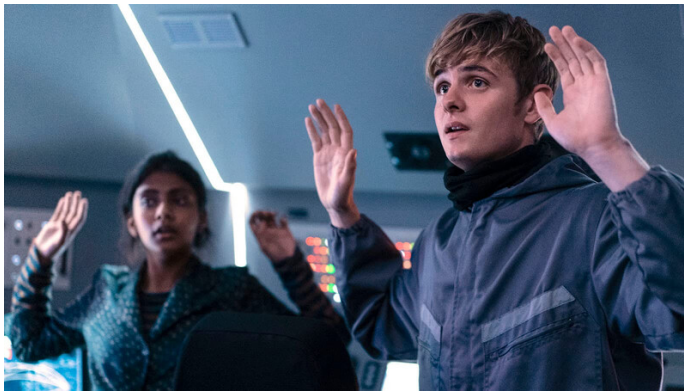

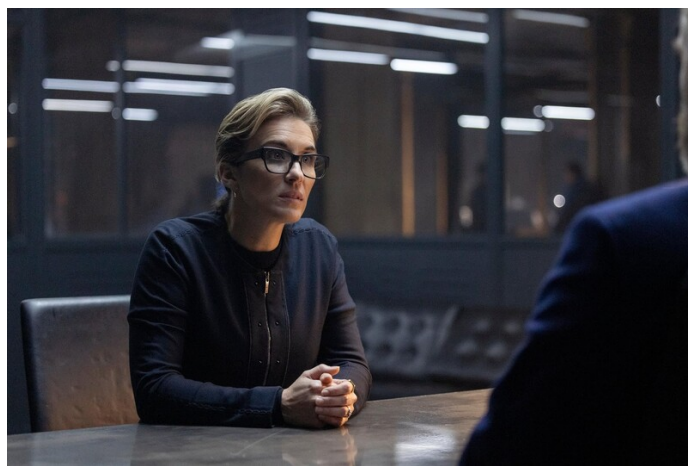

Nile attacks Kovacic and sets explosives to blow up the ship in five minutes. Alex tries to save Kovacic but is caught by Nile, who offers to take him to Julia if he wants to learn about Scorpio and his past.

Julia offers Alex a chance to join Scorpio, as she believes Alex has the skills to become the best of them. Scorpio could be your home, Julia says.

When Alex tries to escape, Julia reveals a heartbreaking truth: John Rider was not killed in a plane crash as the department claimed but was actually shot dead by a sniper, who happened to be one of the department agents. This revelation shocks Alex. In the end, Alex decides to join Scorpia and will be trained by none other than Yassen.

Blunt makes it clear that until they figure out what the Invisible Sword weapon is, nobody is safe, especially those who threaten Scorpia. Jones also visits Jack Starbright, asking about Alex.

She doesn't want to talk to Alex or know where he is; she just wants to know if Alex is okay. Jones is heartbroken that Alex couldn't become a permanent part of MI6, but in a way, she is relieved because this way Alex will stay away from danger. She has no idea that, at this very moment, Alex is inside the tiger's den. Meanwhile, Kyra and Tom are also trying to find Alex. Following Tom's advice, Kyra tries to locate Alex's call mast data.

Syl visits Alex in his room and tries to lift his spirits, saying he's doing very well in training as a newbie. She takes him to meet other trainees, like Alyona and Oleg. Alyona was forcibly separated from her family and taken under Scorpia's wing, specializing in stealth, whereas Oleg's parents perished in a drone strike.

However, the meeting was actually a setup. Their intention was to beat Alex up, claiming he's a weak link and will drag them down if he doesn't improve. However, Alex changes Syl's perspective of him during their next two training rounds.

Julia learns that Max has started to liquidate his assets, leading her to believe that he is planning to leave the criminal world. Nile also informs Julia that Kyra and Tom are still investigating and is told to deal with them. Nile finds them at their apartment and warns them to stop snooping around or else he can change Alex's status from alive to barely alive.

Nile orders them to return to London immediately. They take a taxi to the airport but change their minds right before boarding the plane.

The forensic report on the football team's deaths reveals that they all perished due to simultaneous cardiac arrest. Smithers suspects foul play involving Cyanide poisoning, but no traces were found in their systems. Could it be that they inhaled the poison instead?

Smithers makes a breakthrough in the investigation, discovering trace amounts of gold in the players' bloodstream. Individually, gold is harmless, but when paired with a dangerous partner,

like cyanide, it becomes deadly. Further searching leads to a shocking find in the players' locker room—a liquid-to-gas diffuser containing cyanide-laced gold traces designed to target the heart tissue. Once the trigger is activated, everyone who has been exposed will drop dead.

On another front, Kyra and Tom locate Alex's cell in a remote area outside the city. They witness Alex welcoming Max, who turns out to be the same man Alex encountered on his first day in Malta. Inside, Max confronts Julia, advising her to stop the invisible sword operation, which would result in the deaths of millions, including innocent children. It's revealed that Julia is using the project for revenge. When Max threatens to leave Scorpia, Julia hints that he will be missed, suggesting she may have darker plans for him.

Julia lays out a high-stakes challenge for Alex, which requires him to break into a heavily fortified safe to retrieve its contents. If successful, she promises to reveal more about his father, John Rider. But failure means Alex must continue his training. Alex and Yassen arrive at the location, unaware that Kyra and Tom have been trailing them.

cyanide nanoparticles. Before he can process this news, the Madam Secretary arrives and announces the suspension of the department. Alex is taken into custody, but Jones and Cawley rebel, helping Alex in his escape.

Alex contacts the emergency number provided by Julia, requesting immediate extraction after his escape from custody. Julia agrees and swiftly dispatches her operatives and tasks Nile to personally interview Alex to verify his story. Nile interrogates Alex, probing to see if he's telling the truth or merely sceptical.

With Julia's laptop in their possession, the Department gains access to all the information about Scorpia's bases and operatives, and it's only a matter of time before they track down and arrest everyone involved.

Jones submits her resignation letter, hoping to live a normal life. However, Blunt refuses to accept her resignation and instead steps down himself, appointing Jones as the new head of MI6. Jones meets Alex and returns his father's service medals, which were taken from him before he went undercover.

Jones also prods Alex to return to university to complete his education, telling him to come back when the world needs saving again.
