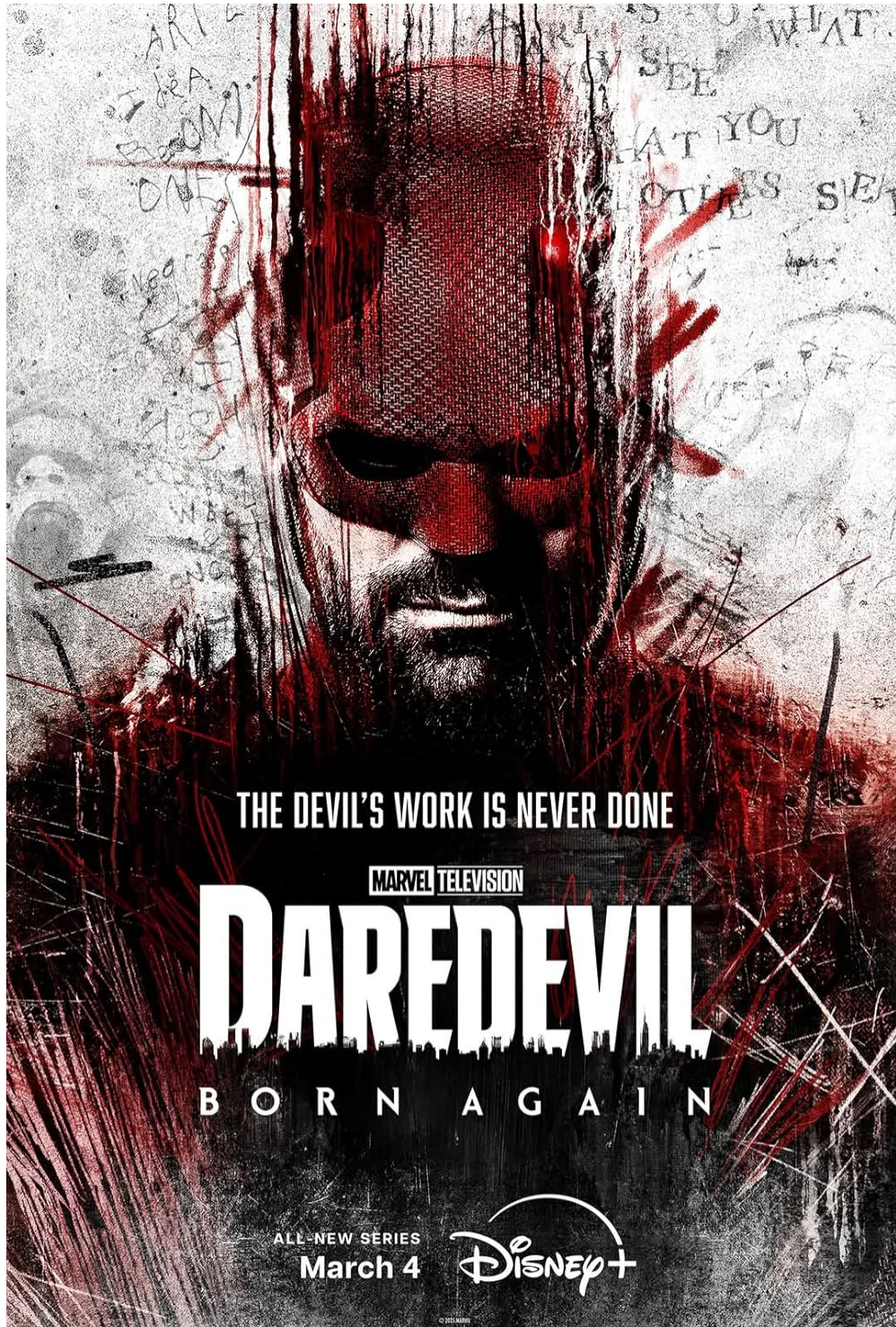

Summary:	Longtime rivals Matt Murdock and Wilson Fisk try to leave behind their darker alter-egos to serve the people of New York, only to have their pasts catch up to them.



The episode begins with Foggy, Karen and Matt leaving the office, reflecting on the dark times ahead. 30% of the force have retired and many of the old faces are gone, including Cherry who's in the process of celebrating his retirement.

The trio show up at Cherry's retirement party, where he's downhearted given the flurry of heroes like Daredevil and White Tiger taking over Hell's Kitchen and making them (the cops) irrelevant. Things quickly turn awry though when Foggy receives a call from Benny

requesting help. He's at Foggy's place and it doesn't take long for us to see Daredevil make an appearance.

When he races to the apartment, it leaves Foggy and Karen vulnerable, and the former winds up shot by Bullseye. Daredevil returns and squares off with him but the damage has already been done with Foggy.

Daredevil and Bullseye trade blows all the way up the building to the rooftop, where an enraged Daredevil, who hears Foggy's heart stop and pass away, is overcome with rage and despair, throwing Bullseye off the roof. He survives, somehow, but it doesn't mask the pain he's feeling. When he removes his mask to cry, Cherry happens to be there and see his identity.

We then cut forward one year later, where we see that Matt has hung up the cape and decided to play on the straight and narrow for good.

Karen is barely speaking to him now, wanting to distance herself from him, grieving in her own way. She's also not particularly happy that Matt just became a shell and completely ignored him for weeks after Foggy's death.

This tragedy runs deep and it seems the cracks could potentially be too deep to fix. One thing is for sure though, Daredevil is not making a reappearance for the foreseeable future (or, well, for a few episodes anyway I'd imagine). Matt is putting his faith in the court system, as Bullseye is sentenced to life.

Bubbling in the background of all this, there's a race for a new Mayor in town. Wilson Fisk is the frontrunner and most likely candidate to take over, making a desperate public plea to try and help fix things. This certainly rattles Matt though when he finds out.

Vanessa continues to run the Fisk criminal empire in her husband's absence, keeping a tight ship with the five families. When Wilson Fisk himself shows up in town, fresh off his little stint in Echo, he soon makes his presence felt. Vanessa isn't exactly warm with her greeting, pointing out that he just galivanted off while recovering, leaving her to pick up the scraps. However, she's certainly been busy and made the business bulletproof in his absence.

Speaking of businesses, Matt has also done well for himself here, with a new law-firm called Murdock & McDuffie. His partner is Kirsten McDuffie and she's sharp as a tack. However, Matt is concerned, given the rumblings of Fisk and how he could well win the Mayorship by a landslide. Matt is still good with the ladies, evidenced by Kirsten setting him up with a cheeky date with her pal Heather.

Back at the office though, it's down to brass tacks. Cherry is there and he's concerned about Fisk. Matt though believes he could well be turning a corner. Well, until Fisk calls out for the "treatment" for vigilantes in town.

Matt shows and the pair wind up having a chat in Becky's Diner, right in the heart of Hell's Kitchen. Fisk gets right down to brass tacks and explains that he didn't kill Foggy. As for Matt, he reinforces that he's no longer Daredevil, or a "vigilante" as Fisk calls him. Regardless, a threat (or a caution as Fisk calls it) is made by Matt, warning him not to step out of line, because if he does, and turns back into Kingpin again, then Daredevil will come out to play. Conversely, should that happen then Kingpin will come down hard with the full force of the law.

It doesn't take long for Wilson Fisk to win the Mayorship. There's no build-up to this though, but this outcome immediately sees people cheering on the streets and Matt Murdock very concerned over what the future of his city looks like.

Summary:	Matt Murdock gets a new client who's more than he claims to be. Fisk learns the power of optics.



The episode starts on New Years, with Wilson Fisk giving a speech to the city about how they're sitting on a powder keg. He's intent on turning New York into a safe, police-controlled state free of vigilantes like Punisher and Spider-Man. He's also doing the rounds, but it's tedious work. His assistant, Sheila, explains that this is necessary to set the tone for his Mayorship and it's very much make or break for his agenda.

However, there is a rift between the city's more traditional voters and Vanessa, given she's "resisting the narrative". Fisk explains he has work to do with his wife but it's clear this friction could be his undoing. Fisk isn't exactly playing by the old rules of previous Mayors, evidenced by a simple case of filling a hole in the road by bypassing bureaucratic red tape.

Meanwhile, Matt overhears commotion at the police station, coming from an interrogation room where Hector Ayala is being held. Earlier in the episode, he wound up in a scuffle with officers on the subway, and when one of the men was struck by a train, Ayala immediately became public enemy number 1. The thing is, Hector Ayala is actually White Tiger, one of the superheroes we saw earlier on in episode 1 fighting on the CCTV cameras.

He's been stitched up here, as he was trying to help what looked like a mugging. The officers were dirty and gaming the system. Matt knows Ayala is hiding something (his secret identity) but the case has piqued his interest and he decides to take it on himself.

Unfortunately, taking on the hard cases like this — especially against a cop killer — has the adverse effect of painting a target on his back as the cops are not happy about his involvement. Well, at the first hearing things don't go to plan. The judge immediately overrules anything Matt has to say and sides with the prosecution. This one's going to trial.

In the midst of this, we also meet a plucky young journalist called BB. Her uncle happens to be Ben Urich, one of the straightest journos out there, and a figurehead from the original *Daredevil* series

She's convinced there's a story with Fisk, given the police are tight-lipped about his extra-curricular activities in the past. Furthermore, Police Commissioner Gallo is poised to retire in wake of Fisk's Mayorship, which rings alarm bells for her.

Unfortunately, should that happen then it puts Fisk in somewhat of a bind because the officers, as we know, stand by their own, and will wind up protesting against him by standing down. If he loses the cops, he'll lose the city.

Fisk shows up to see Gallo, who happens to be at Vance's (the dead cop's) funeral. Gallo doesn't mince words, calling him a monster and a thug. He's certainly in no mood to talk, but all of this could cause the Kingpin to snap in the wake of this.

Gallo shows at the Mayor's Office and drops his resignation on the desk. However, the old Kingpin comes out to play, and he threatens Gallo with blackmail material; if Gallo doesn't play ball, his wife and son will die. Gallo concedes but tells Fisk to be careful what he wishes for.

When Matt does some digging and finds out that his client is White Tiger, he stands by his actions, believing the people need a hero and he's just doing what's right. This is a tough case and with Ayala at Riker's Island, which obviously is no cakewalk, it's unclear how long he'll be able to hold out.

Matt makes his claim to the judge, bringing up White Tiger immediately and how it's not relevant to the case given he wasn't wearing his costume, nor graced with special powers at the time of incident. The Judge agrees, marking a tiny win which could be enough to turn the case in Matt's favour.

Meanwhile, Vanessa and Wilson Fisk attend couple's therapy, overseen by none other than Heather. Vanessa explains that when Wilson left, she managed to pick up the business and it absolutely thrived under her stewardship. Profits were way up and things were good. However, their personal life? Less than fulfilling.

As the episode closes out, Matt shows up to see Nicky Torres, a key witness in the Hector Ayala case and someone whom Cherry has managed to track down. Now, Torres saw exactly what happened but unfortunately, time is of the essence.

Matt shows at his apartment and forces the kid out the fire escape because Powell, the shady cop involved in the subway incident, heads over to Torres' place to kill this key witness. When Matt is held up against the wall, Powell shows off his forearm, where he sports a Punisher tattoo.

Matt allows himself to be beaten down, but when one of them holds a gun up to his head, Matt snaps. He fights them both off, and knocks them out. Blood is stained across the apartment, including Matt's, and he screams to the heavens.

The episode starts with Matt heading in to visit Hector, who's behind bars. Matt promises to get him out no matter the cost, but it's not going to be easy.

Meanwhile, Kingpin continues his strained relationship with Vanessa. Of course, she's not happy that he's back given she's the one who has been running his business better and made it "bulletproof". As they sit and eat lunch together, Sheila arrives. She reports that there's been a double homicide about a mile down by Red Hook Port. Vanessa believes this is as a result of nobody helming the business right now, but Fisk has

Sheila get Chief Gallo and his men on this to resolve the conflict.

Fisk tries to sort the gangsters out from afar, paying off what's owed between two of the family heads, but Vanessa is not happy about being left out in the cold here.

Elsewhere, Officer Powell confronts Matt and threatens going to Judge Cooper regarding his unethical way of dealing with this case. However, Matt more than holds his own. As we reach the court trial itself, Powell is on the stand and has an elaborate statement regarding what happened on the platform. All of this is wrapped up with a glossy look at his esteemed police record.

When Matt cross-examines him, his smoking gun here is obviously Nicky Torres, the man who witnessed everything. He's been working with the PD as a confidential informer since the

90's and actually directly with Powell and his partner, Shanahan, too. He walks right into a trap and claims he doesn't know him, but some of the officers in attendance are actually Punisher fanatics and this is not going to be a cakewalk to get him to court.

Cherry has the unenviable task of needing to bring him in, but when he's stopped by the side of the road, it turns out it's a decoy and Torres is brought in by another officer. Now, Nicky Torres does make it onto the stand, where he brings up that he's a confidential informant. Unfortunately, he's clearly been rattled and he lies in court, claiming he was home the entire time.

Without Torres, Matt's entire case is hanging by a thread and they don't have a lot to go on. The only solution here is to put Hector on the stand, let him testify and tell the truth about what went down and let the jury decide.

Hector speaks his side of the story, including how Torres was being beaten down, alongside his need and desire to save people. In front of everybody, Matt undermines the Judge and brings out the White Tiger mask, telling the courtroom that Hector is a hero. Cooper is not happy and everything is hanging in the balance now.

Hector is not happy either when Matt speaks to him that night back at the cell, but Matt shrugs off what he's done, reinforcing that he just wanted to win and this was the only card left to play. However, if Hector is acquitted, Matt tells him he can no longer be the White Tiger.

Matt and Kirsten bring in eye-witnesses that attest to White Tiger's credentials and good-nature. Meanwhile, the prosecution bring up Shanahan's gruesome fate and the strength of officers and police in general. Which way will the jury swing?

Finally the verdict comes in and Hector is found not guilty on all charges. The cops are obviously not happy, while news of this reaches Wilson Fisk too, who knows that this could spell trouble for keeping the police in line. As the episode closes out, Fisk reinforces that these vigilantes are dangerous, and as White Tiger heads out once again, Fisk has him assassinated and shot dead. By who? Well, it looks like it may well be Punisher!

The episode begins with Matt getting the lowdown on Hector's body from the Coroner. However, Angela shows up and she's obviously grief-stricken over losing her family. She finds it hopeless, believing the police are behind this, but Matt promises they'll find his killer.

Meanwhile, BB is out partying but they're a bit disappointed that Daniel is being responsible and doesn't want to stay out longer. He does open up about Wilson Fisk though, including how he believes in Fisk's plan to overhaul the city

and bypass Unions to make things better. In fact, Fisk's plan here extends out to destroying Red Hook port and renovating the entire place. He sees it as a black eye on the city and wants to get things moving but of course it's not as easy as that, there's a lot of red tape bureaucracy to overcome.

In the midst of this, we cut to the riveting therapy sessions of Vanessa and Fisk. Heather probes Vanessa about Adam, with emphasis on what she found so appealing about him. It makes Fisk very uncomfortable, obviously, but she justifies it by claiming that he went away and left her.

Eventually they circle around to the big question here — are they staying together or leaving one another? While they ponder this, Heather speaks to Vanessa privately after the session and asks whether she's safe in the marriage, believing Fisk could be abusing her. Vanessa smiles and tells her that everything is fine.

At the prison, Matt shows up and takes on a new client called Leroy. Apparently he's been charge with petty larceny, specifically through stealing five boxes of Fiddle Faddle from a bodega. The CCTV footage already incriminates him so it's a bit of a lost cause, but at the court he runs into Officer Powell. He accuses the man of killing Hector, but he seems to be telling the truth when he refuses to indulge this line of questioning, given his heartbeat doesn't rise.

As for Leroy, he's not happy about the outcome and justifies why he's been stealing. Still, it doesn't change that he's going to remain behind bars for a bit after breaking the law.

While the Mayor does the rounds, a small hiccup sees the group pencil off a meeting thanks to BB's latest article calling him a union buster. This is Daniel's fault for speaking to BB at the club about Fisk's latest plans. He immediately owns up and apologizes profusely, and Fisk is understandably angry. Given how open he is though, Fisk doesn't smash his face in a car door like he did to the Russians in season 1, and lets him live for another day.

Elsewhere, Matt finds the bullet that killed White Tiger and eventually traces it back to Frank Castle, thanks to a skull logo on the side of a bullet. Yep, Punisher is in town and Frank goads Matt into facing Foggy's death and to fight back, because otherwise it's going to eat him up inside. Although Bullseye got life behind bars, Punisher doesn't see that as justice, but of course Matt refuses to go down that path again.

As the episode closes out, Fisk has Adam imprisoned, while we see who the big bad is this season. It's Muse.

Summary:	When a serial killer terrorizes the streets of New York, the city needs a savior.



The episode starts with Matt praying at home. Why is he not at a church? Well, his girlfriend Heather doesn't pry on it but instead turns the focus on Matt's kidnapping shindig. She's researching vigilantes and she wants to interview one, hinting that she could sit down with Punisher or Daredevil in the future.

As for Fisk, he heads into his office and finds Luca there waiting for him. He's not happy with the deal that's been agreed, with 1.8 million needing to go to Viktor as per the prior agreement. He

warns Fisk to stay out of things and refuses to give up the money. So as punishment, Fisk decides to add 1 million in tax to his bill.

In his office, Fisk is approached by a guy called John, who works in sanitation. He's been there for 35 years and eventually gets down to brass tacks. The murals popping up over town are made out of human blood and it's not exactly easy to wash off. It also looks bad for Fisk's city plans too, especially when we learn that this is the work of Muse, with words like "vigilante justice" and an artistic piece showing Kingpin's dual personalities. Fisk decides to switch up the protocols and not let on that the police are cracking down. At least for now.

That night, it's time for a big fundraiser, with Fisk chewed out by numerous individuals over his current plans in office. Fisk takes it on the chin and just grins through it, especially when he's

warned that the people in this room are very powerful individuals that could ruin him completely with a single phone call.

At the office, Angela shows up to see Matt. She points out that Hector was investigating a string of kidnappings before he passed and believes he was onto something. Angela wants someone (ie. Daredevil) to finish his work and that, of course, falls to Matt Murdock. The kidnappings were all close to the closed down Q line, but given the cops killed Hector, she's loathe to go to them with this intel. She calls Matt out for twisted morality and not helping the little guy, before eventually leaving.

That night, Cherry shows up at the office and he's pretty rattled. He admits that there's a serial killer out there, having killed off over 60 people so far. This is Muse's doing and once again we're told that the murals have been painted with his victim's blood. Cherry wants Matt to let this go, warning him over donning the mask once more.

Given the vigilante is also mocking the police here, Fisk decides to use this to his advantage. Specifically through creating a new task force that have special powers and privileges, including no body cameras. He brings in Powell and his associates to spearhead this Anti-Vigilante Task Force.

While the gang head out on the hunt, Angela unfortunately decides to head out and investigate herself. When Matt receives a worried call about her not heading home, he decides to bring Daredevil out once more. And with it, comes the dodgy CGI rooftop jumping again.

As Matt heads out on the hunt, Muse takes Angela's blood before fighting with Daredevil. At the same time, Fisk heads in to see Adam in his cage. The two fights occur simultaneously, with both Daredevil and Fisk coming out on top. In the midst of this, Angela regains consciousness, while Muse manages to slip away.

The episode starts with Fisk looking out his window, seeing the city churning with fear. He's determined to get to the bottom of the bloodied murals and finding Muse before he strikes again. However, when he learns Daredevil is back on the streets too, having saved Angela, he realizes he needs to step up his gameplan.

Fisk is pissed, given Matt completely destroyed his enterprise and now that he's donning the mask once more, he could undermine everything he's been working on. However, Buck reminds Fisk

that he has more power and authority, and indirectly hints that the Kingpin could come out of hiding. As for Fisk, he contemplates using his skills and cunning to take out "any threat to the law". That being, of course, Daredevil.

Vanessa heads onto the streets and speaks to Luca, telling him to play nice and keep things ticking over. He broaches the idea of a "change" coming, hinting at Vanessa usurping her husband's business.

After her ordeal, Angela recovers in hospital while Matt takes a shower with his girlfriend. Heather knows that he didn't head out to work and is concerned. She contemplates whether this might be relating to self-harm but Matt shrugs off the concerns and admits he's going through a crisis of faith. Furthermore, he's also struggling to see what's real and what's fake. Heather wants him to fight for her, interpreting his words as their romance being fake, trying to renew his spirit.

At work, Cherry immediately confronts Matt about getting involved in the Muse situation as Daredevil. In response, Matt wants Cherry to reach out to his contacts and find Muse so they can figure out where he's going to strike next. Cherry refuses to get involved though.

When Angela awakens in hospital, Matt is there to see her. She reveals that Muse was quite the chatterbox and kept talking about his sketches, including how amped he was about them.

Fisk uses his resources and tries to discover the identity of Muse. He settles on a troubled man called Bastian Cooper, with a litany of "issues" from his past. Bastian attends therapy and also happens to be good at taekwondo. The profile certainly fits for this Muse character and he eventually reveals himself, throwing his therapist, Dr Glenn, into the wall.

Daredevil shows up at Muse's lair, looking for the same information we've already figured out, but he grows spooked when Powell shows and catches him off-guard. Matt immediately knocks him out and takes off, realizing that one of his paintings is of Heather and that's Muse's next target.

Muse finds Heather and despite initially being scared, when she hears the cops approach, she changes tact and riles him up, calling Muse a coward. This is all to give Daredevil time to show up and fight with him. During their skirmish, Heather eventually grabs a gun and shoots Muse dead.

When Powell's taskforce arrive and look over the devastation, word reaches Kingpin that Daredevil was in the building. He spins the story that Sergeant North and his taskforce are the real heroes here and pulled the trigger, stopping this dangerous vigilante.

While Daniel propositions BB with an opportunity to join the right team, Matt looks after Heather at the hospital. As for Vanessa, she decides to take Luca up on his offer after all, giving her husband's address where he's eating dinner alone. However, Buck is waiting in the shadows and he kills Luca. Seems like Vanessa and Fisk are on the same page after all, then!

Meanwhile, Fisk's Red Hook project looks set to pick up in a big way. He thanks Vanessa for all of her help and for building while he was away. Fisk is also pleased that she's decided to collaborate with him in taking out Luca and keeping their stranglehold on the city.

At the same time, Heather is struggling to deal with the fact she killed Muse. Matt reassures her that Daredevil saved her but she doesn't see it that way. Heather believes she saved herself and that Daredevil was just out for himself. A knock at the door ends this conversation, as Buck shows up to see the good doctor.

Matt is rattled when he finds out that she's the therapist that's been helping Fisk. Furthermore, she's been invited to a formal event to celebrate the Red Hook Project. Matt's pleas fall on deaf ears though, but Heather wants him in attendance with her, which he reluctantly agrees to.

At work, Kirsten reveals the news about Poindexter but he wants to talk to Matt. Turns out Fisk moved him into general population.

While he deals with this, Matt is spiralling, having a crisis of conscience and exasperating that all they're doing right now is "babysitting chaos".

Matt speaks to Cherry next and at the bar, has an epiphany. He realizes that the night Foggy died, he knew he was going to win his case with Dumb Benny. As a result, he was silenced. His murder was planned by someone.

Fisk brings Vanessa to Adam, and she sees first-hand that he's kept in a cage. However, Fisk struggles to hold back tears and explains that he's doing this for them. Guess that Native American reservation and crying in Echo did a number on the Kingpin, huh?

Anyway, Vanessa eventually kills Adam and Kingpin promises never to leave her again. Furthermore, Fisk's Task Force seems to be exerting its will across the city. Vigilante crime is down 30% since being deployed despite the ACLU filing 13 different lawsuits over excessive force.

Fisk promotes Daniel Blake up to Deputy Mayor of Communications in the wake of all this. Fisk tasks him with working closely alongside the City Council and turn them to their favour.

Matt shows up at the prison to see Bullseye and demands to know the truth. He's convinced that Fisk hired him to kill Foggy and silence him but Bullseye refuses to reveal if this is really the truth or not. When he leaves, Bullseye also manages to escape the prison.

While this is going on, the big formal event goes ahead with the Task Force watching on. Matt shows up too and locates Kingpin but Heather interjects before he can confront the Mayor. She talks to Matt about his distant behaviour but he's not really listening to her, given Kingpin is in the midst of a big meeting about the Red Hook project. He threatens the City Councilman into giving up extra funds, and also has his Task Force throw their weight around to set an example to the press attempting to get a juicy story.

However, one reporter than he seems to be going under the radar is BB. She corners Commissioner Gallo and asks questions about the Task Force. He's quick to wipe his hands of responsibility though, pointing out that this is all Fisk and he's not any part of it.

He also goes on to mention Ben Urich and how Fisk was the main suspect in his murder. BB explains that she intends to try and take Fisk down and hands over her card to make this happen. However, the Task Force are certainly watching her.

As the dancing begins, Matt realizes that he's not safe here with Heather and tries to enact a plan to get them out of here. However, with Bullseye having escaped from prison, Matt realizes that it was Vanessa responsible for having Foggy killed all along. He forces a dance with her and in the midst of this, Bullseye shows up with a sniper, up on the balcony in full view of everyone. Despite there being a ton of armed guards standing around the room nobody sees him.

In fact, as a gunshot rings out, Matt takes a bullet for Fisk, in his bid to try and protect Heather. Bullseye doesn't shoot again though, and watches the carnage. As Matt bleeds out on the ground, Heather stands over him.

The episode begins with a year back from our current timeline. Vanessa shows up to see Bullseye while he's behind bars, intending to strike up a deal with him. Fisk has been out the picture for a while here and she's got him released to do her a favour. Specifically, killing Foggy.

Back in the present, Matt is recovering in hospital. Heather is here along with Kirsten and while the former sits in the corner and throws shade at Matt, Kirsten tries to recall what happened on the night of Foggy's death. Foggy obviously had a

big case he was working on, and he was on the verge of filing a motion to dismiss. Matt realizes that these documents could hold a crucial key to taking down the Fisks, and he needs to see these documents, believing Foggy was working on something to take down the Fisk empire.

Heather continues to chew him out, believing she should wait until Matt's recovered a bit before returning. She gives him a patronizing kiss on the cheek and leaves.

Speaking of villains, Fisk is leaning into the Kingpin persona and after the attack on his life, he wants the city in lockdown but there's obviously pushback to this. He wants everybody who's not completely loyal out of the operation, while he also speaks to Buck in private after. He confirms Matt is recovering but Fisk wants to take advantage of this and have him "suffer an accident" while lying in his hospital bed.

Gallo speaks to Sheila and tries to convince her to see sense and push back against Fisk.

Daredevil comes out to play when the power goes out in the city, escaping from his hospital bed when he senses something awry. He manages to make it all the way back home again, where Frank Castle is waiting for him. He's received a call that changed his mind and he's back in the game now. He asks why Matt took a bullet for Kingpin but he shrugs and simply replies "that's a good question".

Some of Fisk's taskforce show up and a big fight breaks out. Cole — the man who killed Hector Ayala — is the last man standing and he's pinned to the wall with a knife. Daredevil contemplates whether to make him pay, with Punisher urging him to, well, punish him.

When a grenade goes off in the apartment, Punisher and Daredevil jump out and onto the car below. They both walk away with barely a scratch on them and eventually find Karen. She drives up to them and encourages the two to get in. They drive over to Punisher's lair, where Karen patches Matt up while Frank stitches himself.

Turns out Karen was the one who phoned Punisher, bringing him into the game before hopping on a plane herself and getting involved. The pair do eventually leave but Karen reiterates that Punisher does care and can't believe he's not fighting anymore. Frank shrugs them off, wishes them well and encourages them to leave.

Karen and Matt head on in to find Foggy's old case files. They uncover a Red Hook Charter from 1855. Within these documents it confirms that Red Hook is actually a free port, exempt from the jurisdiction of the city — and the country for that matter. With a new complex being built there by the Fisk, it would allow the Mayor to launder money and basically build their own city within a city.

Outside, there are "fiery but mostly peaceful protests" and the Taskforce certainly take advantage of that. Punisher inevitably gets involved too when he hears the radio chatter, and he systematically begins taking out the Taskforce members. Unfortunately, he's soon overpowered and taken out the game.

Tied up and put before the Taskforce jury, all of which sporting the Punisher sigil, Powell takes the front and listens as Frank lays into them all, calling them clowns and a joke.

Speaking of taking people out the game, Fisk has his way with Gallo. He pops his head like a grape and makes sure the rest of the Taskforce stay in line. As for Daredevil, he and Karen contemplate the best move of dealing with Red Hook but right now, it seems an impossible task. However, Matt intends to take the city back and that comes from creating an army.

In the morning, Heather shows up to see Fisk. She decides to work with his administration, and given we've known her to be a villain all season long, she ignores Matt and decides to join him. As for Fisk, he delivers a press conference and claims that Gallo has "resigned". He's decided to enact his Safer Streets initiative too, with a curfew of 8pm and he's going to enact martial law until they've got their streets safe.

While Kingpin works to keep everybody who disobeys him under lock and key, including Frank Castle, Matt works to rabble together anyone he can to his rebellion so they can retake the city from Kingpin.

During the mid-credit scene, Punisher chats up the guard and manages to convince him to hold his hand out and shake. Naturally, Punisher breaks his arm and, presumably, bust his way out.
