

When he leaves, after a rather embarrassing moment of fumbling with the sheets, the pair get back to business. This is Jonathan and his partner, Sasha, who head off sightseeing in Venice together. Unfortunately, their trip is interrupted by a horrible accident, as Sasha needs to go back home.

Jonathan ends up on his own, and very few people are willing to converse

with him. He writes back to his mum, updating her on what's happening. He heads to the beach alone, where he first locks eyes on Catherine by the water. He snaps photos of her, marvelling at her beauty.

We then cut forward in time to the Royal Television Society. Catherine Ravenscroft has just won a big award for her outstanding work. She eventually heads home with her husband, Robert, whom we learn enjoys the finer things in life, and is somewhat of a wine connoisseur too.

Catherine receives a package, which holds a book inside titled "The Perfect Stranger". It's dedicated to "my son, Jonathan" which happens to be the kid we've been seeing flashes of throughout the show so far. Furthermore, there's a disclaimer reading "Any resemblance to persons living or dead is not a coincidence".

Catherine is spooked by this book, burning it in the morning. Robert rushes out and reassures her, telling her she has nothing to be guilty about. He thinks this is to do with their 25 year old layabout son, Nick, being kicked out the house and no longer being coddled. However, there are darker things hidden under the surface here, which are still unsaid at this time.

Meanwhile, we meet a stuffy teacher called Stephen Brigstocke, who's not exactly enthused with his work. Oh how the mighty has fallen; he used to be a respectable teacher and even won

the Most Popular Teacher award several years running. That's all changed now and although we don't see what he's written for a child's essay notes, it's clear it's not anything good.

Part of this stems from Stephen's wife, Nancy, passing away. Since then, he's been struggling and drifting through life. He donates some of her things but can't bring himself to get rid of her pink cardigan. Which he decides to wear himself instead.

Under the wardrobe, he finds a handbag with more of Nancy's stuff, including lipstick, a locket and photos from Venice of Jonathan's trip. Only, it's not just these photos. There are also others of a blonde naked in bed and in provocative positions too. Apparently, Stephen has known this person for a while but quite how, remains a mystery.

Something happened to Nancy though, and she became obsessed with Jonathan. She has a shrine set up for him in her room and inside her locked drawer, there's some deodorant, a cigarette... and a manuscript of some sort. This is that Perfect Stranger book we saw earlier on.

Stephen is well aware that the book was written for Catherine, which backs up the earlier scenes with Catherine getting jittery and worried over the book. Here, we learn that Catherine and Robert met back in uni, and she knows that his façade of being the protector of the family is not actually the truth here. In fact, Catherine is more protective of him. This is why she's more determined than ever to keep her family in order.

That is a job made all the harder by Stephen showing up at the store and immediately approaching Nicholas, asking about vacuums. All of this is just a ploy though, and he has no intention of actually buying anything. Instead, he slips an envelope in front of the register, addressed to Nicholas. He chuckles as he walks away, believing this is going to be "an easy catch".

Next, Stephen makes copies of Jonathan's photos and drops them off at Robert's workplace. Now, apparently Catherine only really met Nancy once, and it comes off the back of Jonathan's funeral. She's not happy that Catherine never showed up and even worse, she lied to the police about his death too.

Nancy has terminal cancer and she wants to meet Nicholas. Apparently he owes his life to Jonathan but Catherine is adamant she doesn't want to get into this. At work though, Catherine focuses on the next steps. She realizes that Stephen Brigstocke is the man responsible for trying to upend her life, and her assistant, Jisoo, contemplates whether to run a smear campaign against him, branding the guy as a paedo.

Stephen drops off the package for Robert, who ends up seeing the photos first-hand of his wife, and he's rattled. Robert realizes that this version of Catherine is unlike the woman he's known all this time, and her unbridled sexuality stirs both his anxiety... and his desire. Now, the pair were actually married back when these photos were snapped, but Robert left to return home midway through the trip. He left Catherine and Nicholas behind, and the reality of their situation is clear to see. Everything is going to change now.

Catherine is obviously unaware of all this, as she sets the table ready to make dinner for her and her husband. In the midst of this, she's also been tiptoeing around her mother's condition, knowing that she's deteriorating, but Catherine pushes this to the back of her mind when Robert doesn't reply to any of her messages.

Robert instead heads over to see Nicholas, deciding to go out for dinner. When he arrives at his son's flat though — which he hasn't seen for the past 3 months — he's shocked at the state of it. The place is disgusting and inevitably, he blames Catherine for pushing him away.

That night, Robert returns home with the photos and confronts his wife about everything. He's not happy and he's incredulous when she starts to play the victim. Because of course she does.

The episode begins with Robert driving away, hurt by Catherine's infidelity which has destroyed their entire life. He's drinking too and refuses to indulge her calls. Catherine struggles to get through to her husband and can't explain to him that she hid all of this specifically to protect Nicholas.

Robert sleeps in his car and wakes up to a monstrous number of messages from Catherine. He can't drive to work after drinking all night so he takes the bus to work instead. There, he begins to see

things very differently, including those who are on the bus with him and whose lives may be different to his own.

He doesn't go to the office though, and instead hunkers down in a quaint cafe and decides to read through the Perfect Stranger book. He knows that this is based on real life now and through flashbacks, we see how that has all come about.

Here we see Jonathan still alive, and helping out Catherine and a young Nicholas. He's invited inside their hotel for a drink with her while Nicholas is asleep upstairs in bed. She promises to meet Jonathan by the bar for a drink as a way of thanking him.

Catherine seduces Jonathan, touching various parts of her body while not caring that he has a girlfriend. She mentally stimulates him... and then leaves Jonathan the key to her hotel room, encouraging him to come join her.

Given she never apologized to him in her carefully crafted voicemail, it only makes him more determined to get back at her.

We then cut across to Stephen Brigstocke in the past, who's shocked when the police show up. They break the news about Jonathan's death, which crushes both him and Nancy. Jonathan drowned and apparently it was an accident while he was away in Italy. The pair are required to head out and formally identify him, and that means a trip to Italy before the body is released.

Nancy is shocked, and tellingly the visuals here are really cleverly done. The colour drains out of the frame, leaving mostly dull tones. The pair arrive as requested and there, they find Jonathan and identify him. His face isn't swollen and there seems to be a mark on his arm; some sort of puncture wound.

They check the room he's staying in and this is where Nancy discovers the film reels. However, she hides it from Stephen. They do discover the exact spot of where Jonathan was killed though, which happens to be the same beach that he met Catherine. When Nancy finds out that she just left after hearing about Jonathan's death, she wants to see her immediately.

The pair hold hands while in the water, allowing the waves to lap over them.



Nancy does perk up a bit whilst going through Jonathan's belongings though. She finds a ton of photos of her, and realizes how much Jonathan adored his mother. This is in complete contrast to Catherine though, who pawns off her son to a random couple in Italy so she and Jonathan can hook up.

After their lovemaking though, Catherine gets spooked when Jonathan becomes clingy. He wants to fly with her and has already got his ticket. As the pair end up fighting, Catherin decides to sleep on the beach. Now, this reckless move sees Nicholas head out on his little rubber dinghy into the water, all alone. He brings up the messages on his answering machine too, and informs Jisoo that Catherine is a killer, in a roundabout way anyway.

He leaves and his demeanour changes once more, imitating a grenade thrown over his shoulder in a sickeningly amusing moment. The worst thing though is how quickly Catherine's friends

The episode begins with Nicholas dumped outside the A&E department after taking heroin. As he's brought in for treatment, Catherine arrives back home. She finds the place a mess, and wakes Robert up. She's frazzled after the earlier call with Nicholas sobbing, and they both remain desperate to get to the bottom of this. Catherine though, has interpreted this as Nicholas knowing everything about the alleged affair.

Catherine and Robert's life turns upside down when they receive the call,

bringing them to the hospital. Nicholas has had a stroke, causing neurological damage. The pair are shocked, trying to find a solution. After being saved once already, Catherine is worried that lady luck may not shine on him again.

Meanwhile, we see more flashbacks with Nancy and Stephen, They receive a call from Sasha's mum, Emma. She brings up how Sasha is back in London, claiming she and Jonathan had a big argument. Apparently the story about her aunt dying is a work of fiction. Nancy constantly complains about the fridge... which is something Stephen hasn't fixed, even in the present timeline. It also explains the humming and why that's significant.

With the damage done, Stephen works to try and erase all his fingerprints online. He deletes Jonathan's Instagram account and answers Robert's call about Nicholas. Stephen can't help himself and manages to obtain the location where Nicholas is in hospital. Catherine is there and she receives a call from HR, pointing out she's being signed off from work for a week for her behaviour. She eventually hangs up, knowing her life is in tatters and everything will be different from here on out.

Around this, we have a very different tale surrounding Jonathan interwoven through the story. This time, from Catherine's perspective. She's alone, wanting to spend time with Robert but finding their relationship completely cold and somewhat indifferent.

On the beach, she wipes sand from inside her bikini but when she looks up, she finds Jonathan on the beach watching her. She doesn't know when he snapped photos but Catherine feels she hasn't done anything out the ordinary. She smiles at him but admits that there seemed to be some sort of connection. She can feel his eyes on her from behind when she walks away.
