Summary: In the aftermath of a joyous wedding gone awry, the bride goes missing in South America and the military men in her family vow to find her.



The episode begins in the forests of Colombia. Dr. Amber Chesborough and two of her compatriots are held at gunpoint by rebels. The screen goes black as shots go off.

Cut to 6 months before this incident and it's Amber's wedding. She is getting married to Prince, who is in the same unit, "Echo 3", as her brother Alex (a.k.a., Bambi). She has the jitters and asks her bridesmaid to call Bambi in. When Amber asks him if she is making the right decision, Bambi cites their love as the main

catalyst. It will ensure that happiness always remains in the marriage. His words help but Amber also reminds him of his added duty to make sure he brings Prince home at any cost from "flyaway" missions they complete.

Prince comes from money. His father attends the wedding with a younger partner, with no sign of his mother in the picture. Amber's mother is a drug addict, which is why she took up the study of Alkaloids to find a cure for drug addiction. She joins the festivities and boldly asks

Bambi to look after Amber. Bambi also meets Roy Lennon, ex-New Zealand team, at the wedding. The celebrations are in full flow as Amber and Prince enjoy their time on the dance floor. Echo 3 team is almost drunk when Drifter, their leader, receives a call for a "flyaway" the next morning.

They have a mission to rescue a hostage but Drifter allows Prince to have the night. Amber is disappointed when she learns the news but understands Prince has to go. The hostage is a journalist. The terrain is a difficult one as the snow has covered most of the hills, making it difficult to stabilize the "bird" (the plane). As Prince starts descending using a rope, the terrorists who are holding the journalist, start firing. To prevent the bird from being in the firing line, Prince is forced into jumping on land so that it can go to a safe space. Drifter and Bambi refuse to leave Prince hanging and the team descends some miles down the hill to retrieve their man.

The terrorists come out to meet their enemies and bring the journalist with them. While a handful unwittingly approaches the team directly, some others stay back to man the machine guns. Another group goes to intercept Prince. Seeing that they are coming directly to them and Prince is in the opposite direction, Drifter and Bambi make the decision to hold their positions and ask Prince to stay hidden. One by one, the team starts taking out the terrorists, who are not as trained as them. They retrieve the journalist and then head toward Prince.

The group that had left to follow Prince's trail catches up with him and injures his leg. He is able to fight back and kill a couple but there is still one left. Drifter goes out to meet the terrorist handling the machine gun and shoots him down. Unknown to him, there is another fighter hiding in the bushes, who fatally shoots Drifter. Bambi is caught between a hard place and a rock. On one hand, he has the option to retrieve Drifter. On the other, he can go to Prince to save him as he is injured too.

Bambi first calls out for Drifter on the comms but the leader shows courage and sacrifice by not responding. He is still alive but somehow feels Prince has a better chance of getting saved. Other members of the team cannot aid Bambi, and he has the tough decision to abandon Drifter and save Prince.

Even so many weeks after the incident, Prince is reeling with the aftereffects. His struggle and guilt are internal, as he feels he is partly responsible for Drifter's death. Amber tries to console him and make him realize he could not have done anything else, but Prince grows aloof. She asks Bambi to intervene and talk to him. At dinner that night, Prince takes offense when Bambi mentions that Drifter's kids have taken after him and are doing well. They have a fight. In the shouting, Bambi tries to explain to Prince that Drifter knew the risks he was getting into and there is nothing any of them could have done to save him.

Prince is "hypotheicalizing" and needs to stop. He fights with Amber when she does not take his side and the two are almost about to engage in hate sex when Prince gives Amber a "beacon", something that will allow him to track her in the forests of Colombia, as they have no cellular signal. Amber takes offense and goes out for a run. At a RedX (science convention), she explains her theory of using alkaloids to develop a cure for drug addiction. She is going to Colombia to investigate the local ecology for clues.

Her mentor in the lab, Arthur, says to her that with her grasp on alkaloids, she can be the next "Timothy Leary". She meets the team in Colombia and starts her research. In one of the rituals where the mind is forced to remember and confront past memories and traumas, she remembers her childhood. A few weeks later, Bambi and his mother discuss Amber. She hasn't called him in a while and he is getting worried. She asks him to go down to the forest and bring her back, as she stereotypes the local culture.

In the next scene, we see the men from the beginning come to confront Amber and the others. While the local scientists dismiss them as town people, they seem a bit more threatening. They question the expedition's motive and despite seeing the authentic letter that gives them permission, they still turn the equipment upside down. Although everything seems fine, they take offense when they find the beacon that Prince had surreptitiously put in Amber's backpack. We cut to the first scene in the episode Amber praying at gunpoint.

Prince calls Bambi and they discuss options to rescue Amber as he feels she is in danger. He tracks the location of the beacon to the foot of the hills. Bambi reveals to Prince that Amber needs to be sterile as she is doing some fieldwork for Mitch and the Agency. She is a subcontractor but not an officer. Prince is outraged when he learns she works for the CIA. Bambi then proceeds to mock Prince's life of excesses and they fight.

Bambi receives a call from Langley, informing them that she and two other scientists have



been taken by an ELN guerrilla group. The others have been executed but she is okay. Prince and Bambi decide to rescue her.

Summary: At the American embassy in Bogota, the men run into bureaucracy. They find an ally in a powerful banker and embark on an impromptu mission.



The episode starts in Colombia and we meet another of our protagonists. Her name is Violeta Matiz, a hugely popular and respected journalist. Her meditation session is interrupted by her daughter, who wants her hairbrush.

Ernest, Violeta's husband, has been contacted by Prince's father to help out with the kidnapping. He asks for her help to see if any sources of hers could help them in the right direction.

In the forests, we see the rebels transporting Amber to a secured location. "Secured"

is not in the sense of the word or military norms but a crowded area that singularly belongs to the rebels. They have spotters and allies covering an entire stretch, making it an almost impenetrable fortress in the local authorities' minds. They are currently positioned in Bogota. Violeta meets with the Senator associated with FARC, who confirms that a younger version of their organization has taken her hostage.

But, the deal is strictly transactional. All the rebels want is a ransom for Amber. The journalist then proceeds to meet with Enrique, a local leader of FARC and someone in a position to make final decisions. He is offended by the proposition and veiled threats of the military attacking his base. Violeta leaves with valuable information and transmits it to Ernesto. Bambi and Prince arrive at the US Embassy and first meet with the head of security Amick Dunn. But the real operator of the place is the Chief of Station, Natalie Foster.

Although Prince's tone is derisive at first, Natalie turns out to have a handle on the situation. She is in full control through a small room she operates in the basement of the embassy, keeping the CIA and Colonel Pereira together in the same room. They have in fact also located the

whereabouts of Amber and have got the information that the kidnapping is a business deal. They report the same status of the neighborhood as completely hostile to the armed forces to Prince and Bambi.

But as it turns out, there is indeed a problem. The rebels who have captured Amber have found the beacon Prince put in her bag and identified it as military-grade equipment. They suspect she might be associated with the DEA or the CIA and has come to the forests to spy on her. Amber tries explaining what it is but they do not seem convinced. One of the men from the rebels is sent to the University to talk to their young leader, Graciela, who runs the resistance from that place.

Although she hesitates to talk to Amber at first, she agrees to do so when she sees an opportunity to prove her mettle to the higher-ups. Prince is still of the opinion that they should attack themselves and rescue her. But Bambi asks him to be calm. When Graciela and her girlfriend talk to Amber, they decide not to release her for money and pull off the deal. Violeta reveals that she has been kidnapped before with her sister but unfortunately, her sister was killed in the crossfire.

Natalie informs the American duo of the rebels' decision and Prince wastes no more time in procuring the guard and weapons to strike them that night. Fortunately for them, Amber is spending the night on the terrace, which is easily accessible from the outside. But when the duo reaches the spot, they find her gone. A member of the rebels comes upstairs to meet them but retreats when they allow him to go.

The entire neighborhood now knows that they are in the area and unites to hunt them down. Pereira has his snipers positioned in a triangle. He asks to protect the "purples" (Americans) and kill the "tangos" (Rebels). The two Americans now have to make it out of the place and do so by killing the untrained rebels on their tails. Some criminals from the most wanted are dead but a younger child, whom we saw earlier with Amber, is also killed when he picks up a gun.

Summary: Prince uses his media savvy to pressure the American and Colombian governments to own the mission, setting off a chain reaction in the jungle.



Amber is taken hostage by the rebels and taken to their camp in the forests. They are not accepting ransom anymore and see her as a high-value target that can further their aspirational political ambitions. Prince has taken matters into his own hands and leveraged an interview with a local media network through his influence and connections.

Indirectly, they insinuate that the American and Colombian governments are not doing enough to save his wife, who is only an innocent scientist. This is

not taken lightly by all accused parties, including the CIA and the Colombian army. The General no longer entertains Prince and Bambi's requests to be involved with the mission.

Also, the mission the army was planning has now gone fruitless owing to Prince's antics on television. At a fundraiser for Wasala Foundation, Prince tries to bribe the General with a paid position in Haas Industries, an endeavor of his father's, and he agrees to greenlight an operation. Periera expresses his disappointment to Bambi with what happened. They broke his trust, according to him. Violeta Matiz airs an interview with Bambi on a national scale that both the rebels and Amber listen to.

Graciela is of the opinion that bringing Matiz to the camp will give them national attention. They already have leverage in the entire dealings and Matiz's intervention will only validate their cause. It could usher in a real change and maybe even oust the current government. Her girlfriend reluctantly agrees. Matiz makes an overnight journey into the camp blindfolded. The Commandante meets with her and asks her to help them identify the real purpose of why Amber came to Colombia.

Matiz meets Amber and says she does not care even if she is an agent. She will help her get out of this. Amber's response coincides with a montage that shows the Colombian army and the American duo getting ready to ambush the camp. Actually, Bambi did the interview to tail Matiz and gain her confidence. She has led them to the camo and Amber says "they will kill them all". When Violeta gets ready to leave, the Commandment orders the soldiers to take her captive too and puts her with Amber.

They soon start moving out as Pereira's men start to take their positions. The rebels head toward the river and try to escape via boats but the army intercepts them. Periera has also spread snipers in the forest and when one of them gets a clear shot on the Commandment, Periera greenlights the kill. The army feels that they have the upper hand as the rebels are surrounded from all four corners but the rebels have a surprise waiting for them.

Graciela's girlfriend texts one of their associates in the city "it is time" and the man escapes the pub placing a bomb there. Moments later it goes up in flames and Periera gets orders from the top to withdraw their position and allow the rebels a pass-through. The rebels threaten to unleash more bombs throughout the city and more civilian casualties force the government's hand. The rebels rejoice as the American duo watches on helplessly.

Pereira requests the General to give him an opportunity to make things right and have another go at the rebels with a team of volunteers. The General says he has his unofficial permission and Periera's intelligence tells them that the rebels are traveling via road through slow transport vehicles. Bambi takes his position on the ridgeline with a couple of other snipers and Prince handles the fort on the ground. The trucks finally arrive, as anticipated, and Bambi shoots the driver of the front truck.

The other trucks are forced to stop and the snipers start taking men out as they take positions in the bushes. After a while, the rebels come up with a new plan. They decide to use sheets to cover themselves so as to confuse the snipers about who is under the covers. Prince is forced into action on the ground to manually check the sheets. He finally finds Amber and shoots down Graciela's girlfriend. Unknown to him, a rebel was hiding in the back of the truck and wounds him. Graciela and other reinforcements soon arrive to push back the soldiers.

Prince lies on the ground; a screaming Amber watches in horror as she is taken away, and Bambi anxiously awaits facing the tough situation as he descends the ridgeline. The screen goes black and signals "the end of Part I".

Summary: Bambi loses the guerilla's trail and reacquaints himself with whiskey. Prince recovers from his wounds and starts putting the mess behind him.



The episode opens with a scene of the dead bodies of rebel troops who were killed by the Colombian military. Graciela is mourning the death of her girlfriend, Fami. She decides to kill Amber and make an impact instantly. She commands the troops to climb a cliff, forcing her to jump off. Amber shakes and trembles with the sense of impending death. But eventually, Graciela changes her mind and travels to a distant facility to keep Amber.

On the other hand, we see Prince alive but suffering in a hospital in Atlanta, Georgia. After getting shot in the back, he is getting treatment and recuperating from the shock of the events. He reminisces about holding Amber in his arms and almost saving her from the horrible guerilla troops. He is conflicted between his love for Amber and his distrust after knowing that Amber is a special-status CIA agent.

Bambi is with the Colombian military when they reach a dead end and can't go any further. The Venezuelan jurisdiction hinders them from traveling into the facility, so the military turns around, but Bambi decides to stay back. He stays there for recon and observes the places for some time. Being an experienced soldier, he focuses on the vehicles that go in and out of the facility. He spots a truck of a fisherman, Javi, and contemplates his next steps.

Meanwhile, Bambi gets a call from Mitch at the CIA, who informs him that the government is hesitant to help them as their hands are tied. Bambi urges Mitch to do something and threatens

to kill him as well. This causes Mitch to be stuck between his oath to the job and his personal allegiance to Amber and Bambi. The rest of the episode navigates Prince's inner turmoil as he strays away from his path. We also see Bambi cleverly thinking of ways to protect his little sister and get her back home safely.

Following his treatment and hospitalization, Prince arrives at the Haas Global office for a meeting with his father and a senator. We instantly know that Prince has stepped into familiar territory as he knows the employees and knows his way around the office. In the meeting, Prince and Reese, a Company employee, are witnessed exchanging glances. This points to the fact that they have known each other intimately. With Amber out of the picture, Reese thinks she has a chance to get Prince back.

Reese finds Prince extremely attractive. She sends a picture of herself to Prince. Provoked by the attention, they flirt on the text and eventually meet up at Prince's house. Their chemistry is clearly visible, but Prince shuts the thought out by saying that the time isn't right.

Seems like Reese touches a nerve when she says that she understands he is scared. They begin making out, but a switch inside Prince turns off again. He backs off, making his inner conflict clear to the audience. Reese talks about Prince's injury and his personal loss. Prince implies that he knows about Reese's ulterior motives. Ultimately, Reese charms her way to Prince as he gives in and lets her pleasure him orally.

Prince talks to his dad about being pulled in two different directions while the latter visits him in the hospital. He knows his wife, Amber, and feels like she is the purest soul on earth. But at the same time, he feels betrayed as Amber lied to him about working for the CIA. Prince's father recalls his favorite lines from a poet who says to know when to stay and know when to run.

Prince faces this agitation throughout the episode and deals with his intrusive thoughts. He announces at the Haas meeting that he will soon run for a senator seat. His father rejoices and can already see Prince on his way to being a Presidential candidate. The senator attending the meeting is a good friend of Prince's father and pledges her support instantly. She nudges Prince to capitalize on his wife's situation to get sympathy and support.

The truck that Bambi spots getting into the Venezuelan Facility is Javi's. He is a fisherman who also runs a bar with the help of his sister. Slyly, Bambi talks his way to the sister and gets her to trust him. He shares his childhood anecdotes with her and gets in a fight purposely so that she can save him. With this, he furthers his connection to Javi, who is more closed off and lonesome.

Eventually, he makes a deal with Javi to fish for him and help Javi sell the fish in a local market. They earn considerable profits as Bambi and Javi share drinks and stories on the job. Bambi has ulterior motives for being friends with Javi. Considering the latter's business acts like a transportation service for the facility, Bambi hopes to go there under Javi's trust and in disguise. This is why he earns his trust and works with him to build rapport. Javi's business will allow him to get closer to Amber and eventually save her.

Javi brings a freshly caught payara fish to the base where Amber is being held. Tommy, a high-ranking bureaucrat for the guerillas, talks with Amber about her situation. He makes their position clear: they know that Amber is a CIA agent and want to hold her as a prized possession.

In the conversation, it is also revealed that the man Bambi killed (we saw a flashback in the last episode) was not Amber and Bambi's father but their mother's abusive boyfriend. Amber holds her ground well and Tommy is forced to

retreat.

He then visits the house of the leader of the guerillas and proposes an idea. Tommy says that they should set up cameras and record Amber saying vile things about America and its disillusioned institute of democracy. His idea is quickly dismissed. Before leaving, Tommy had told the workers to put Amber "on the program". We then see her being kept in jail and forced into moving into a restricted area with guards all around. She meets Hildy, a German prisoner in the other cell.

Hildy has an undiagnosed mental illness but she does not recognize it. When Amber sees Hildy moving about freely, she asks her how do the guards allow her. Hildy replies that her contribution to labor ensures this. Amber starts contributing in whatever capacity she can towards various chores in the facility. Her work is appreciated and she seems satisfied living with the locals there doing the work and having her freedom.

She and Hildy grow close in the process. Amber plans an escape from the base via a small opening in the roof. Every day, bit by bit, she breaks the hole wider in order to be able to get out. Amber has flashbacks to the moment before she was taken by the arriving soldiers and does not know yet if Prince is alive or not. In a game of Hildy and Amber each telling the other the truth of their lives, Amber surprisingly admits that she does not love her husband.

He looks down upon her and has already thought in his mind that Amber is dead. That is why he has not come with his cavalry to rescue her. Tommy's idea of recording her for a bigger impact is accepted by the higher-ups and he returns with the cameras to the base. Amber is dolled up but is difficult to follow Tommy's script. Tommy, after several failed attempts, forces her to lie on camera and follow his word on the threat that he will place her in the male prison, where her safety will be grossly in danger.

Amber is left with no choice but to comply and says on video whatever Tommy asks her of against America and its values. She breaks down after he leaves for a small break. Hildy rebuffs Amber's claims that she will escape from the place as Hildy feels Amber will not be able to kill the soldiers. She still tells her the way out regardless. Behind the helicopter pad, the guards leave an ATV that Amber can use to take the path down to the waterfall.

From there, Amber has to follow the river that flows down into the Amazon and that is her way out. The day of the reckoning has come and Amber is ready to escape. Hildy stays in bed, not wanting to leave and Amber goes alone. Her plan goes superbly as the guards and rebels are busy having a party. She does not kill the soldier who is on duty, just as Hildy predicted, and takes the ATV into the jungle.

The guard ultimately alerts the others of the escape and they put their vast resources to track her down. As Amber keeps going through waterfalls, the guards get closer with sniffer dogs. In one of the waterfalls, Amber badly hurts her head and has a concussion. She finally reaches a river and finds a fisherman in his boat. After waking up, she discovers that the boat is empty and that the soldiers are waiting for her at the shore.

She is taken back to the base. Tommy is livid and gathers all the rebels and the workers in the middle. To pay for her treachery, he orders Hildy out of her cell. Despite Amber's pleadings to kill her instead, one of the guards kills Hildy right in front of everyone, sending Amber into a state of shock.

Prince desperately wants Amber back. Meanwhile, in Columbia, Bambi drinks his sorrows away. He has completely drowned in the bosom of alcohol. So much so that he does not even notice Prince and Mitch approaching. While he

sleeps outside, Javi's sister looks out for him from the inside. Mitch and prints try to convince Bambi to join their plan but he says that he has a plan of his own and if the duo is not interested in helping him then they can go back from where they came.

As Mitch distracts Bambi, Prince prepares a dose to make him unconscious and they forcefully put him in the car. They drive up to a hotel in Medellin, Colombia, where for 2 days they keep Bambi strapped to a bed to drain out all the alcohol from his body. Bambi is not himself and for the plan that Mitch and Prince have come up with he needs to be at his full fitness.

After he is back to his old self, Prince starts explaining the place where Amber is kept. It is a facility which is a cocaine shipping hub. It is controlled by a Venezuelan minister called Tariq Marwan. He is the bearded guy we saw Tommy go to in the last episode. Tariq has the complete authority to redirect the army and secure Amber's release.

Mitch and Prince's plan is that they will abduct Tariq's brother Momo, who is a deejay. They're looking for a straight trade-off. The duo have been watching Momo for a while now. Momo's body Guard picks him up every day at 10 AM for his yoga class. But the plan is not to hit him near his apartments as there are a lot of CCTV cameras on the route and his bodyguard always switches up the routes.

Mitch has identified an intersection some blocks away where the congestion is manageable and that is where they will hit the car. Mitch uses a high-tech drone to make sure that Momo and his bodyguard are the only 2 persons in the car and that the car does not have any extra armour.

But their plan is spoiled after 2 cars collide at the intersection. Bambi's desperation gets the better of him and he gets out of the car just evading the cameras to clear the path. Bambi and Prince have a discussion as to what to do next. They have just missed their window but Prince says they must push on whereas Bambi says that they should stop and try again the next day. Momo is trying out his tunes in a nearby stadium but Bambi says that getting him in that place would be too dangerous. They should not risk it. The 2 men then have a casual heart to heart where they come clean about the various things on their chests. Bambi says that they were unprepared for the ambush that happened in episode 4 where Prince almost got killed. He says that they were never in control of the situation and were lucky to barely escape unscathed. Prince admits that he cheated on Amber & says that it was just an affair. Bambi also apologises for not revealing what Amber did for the agency.

Mitch comes up with a plan to abduct Momo and the plan would go something like this. Either one of Prince or Bambi will put the laxative that Mitch has put in a small bag that he will throw over the fence in Momo's drink. Prince and Bambi try to keep up with Momo as he goes into a press conference but the area is highly secure and he always has security guards around him. The only way possible after a security guard gets suspicious & starts following them around is to neutralize him or abandon the pursuit. Prince once again takes the lead & they lock him up in a room.

Bambi poses as an insurance guy and distracts Momo & the bodyguard. Price puts the laxative in Momo's drink. The medicine works & they take advantage. Even though the guard is neutralized Momo is wary. When the duo spots him getting intimate with his girlfriend, they look for private places & find them making love. Outside, Mitch neutralizes an ambulance driver & waits for the duo to come in with Momo. They eventually bring him out & drive away.

Mitch goes to Caracas, Venezuela to meet with Tariq. The minister knows exactly who Mitch is. The CIA veteran just tries to ask for Tariq's mercy but soon his tone changes as Tariq starts giving him a lecture about morality. she gives Tariq his brother's ring & demands that Amber is released the next time Mitch visits Tariq. If that doesn't happen, he will get Momo's head in a bag.

Momo is still kept in the city where the agency trio are staying as Echo 3 episode 7 starts. They perhaps would have wanted to keep him someplace secure.

He begs for his life, like any normal man would do. He offers money to them to beg for his release but they are unmoved. Bambi feels that connecting him with his brother would be a good ploy. It would bring a sense of urgency owing to their emotional bond. But he is facing difficulties to do the same. After almost two

episodes, we finally see Violetta again.

The journalist looks broken from the inside. She was rescued but the time she spent in captivity has rendered her psychologically inept. Quite innately as a journalist would react, Violetta is red-faced when she spots Bambi and Prince being shown on the news as the abductors. She cannot believe their hypocrisy in advocating peace and practising violence on the streets, no matter on whom it is effectuated. Violetta is back in the biz and straightway has a meeting with the Colombian supremo.

He assuages her fears that the city is going out of control and expresses his apologetic stance on what happened to her. She is direct with her questioning and straightaway gets to Prince and Bambi's supposedly "freehand". According to Violetta, it does not paint Colombia in a positive light. Because of what these two are allowed to do, the country feels hostage to the US. The President holds his nerve and she leaves without a very clear response. But deep down, Violetta knows that the US intelligence agency holds all these politicians captive with some dirt on them.

Natalie makes a comeback too in this episode after going radio-silent after episode 2. Like the expert agent she is, Natalie offers to aid Violetta with her story despite being in cahoots with the duo. She has basically come to make sure the journalist is not able to make any moves on them. Another pivotal character — Bambi and Amber's mother, Maggie — makes an appearance in the episode. . She goes to Colombia without any prior notice. Bambi explains the situation to Maggie, who is fearful of what might happen to Amber.

But she does not express her insecurity to anyone else. She internalizes this trauma and goes for a wash in the bathroom. There is a third person with Prince and Bambi, Roy, who guards Momo in their absence. He is alone and the sound is too loud for him to hear Tariq's men barge in with guns. Both Roy and Maggie are unable to gauge their arrival but the former expertly manages to kill two of them. Unfortunately, the final one gets him. And instead of taking Momo while he can, the third gunman goes to the washroom and is shot dead by Maggie, who shows immense expertise and is suave in how she evades the situation.

The duo return and Bambi sees his terrified mother pretending nothing happened. He is shocked to see what she has done and now is determined to get her back to the States. Realizing the close escape could have as easily gone the other way, they decide to relocate Momo and drive outside the city. Prince comes clean about his father. It always seemed there were issues between the two and Prince accepts that he looks to his father for validation and approval of his life choices. One of them was marrying Amber but now he truly loves her. Violeta gets a professional blow when the CIA blocks her article.

She feels stifled and it is not fair to her mojo as a journalist. Momo is unable to conjure any hope for himself after seeing that there is no one around to save him. Like the agency always does, Mitch informs the duo that they might have a vested political interest. They might not be willing to help Amber as much as the duo thinks they would. It is also convenient to mention the scene in episode 4 when Mitch emotions the rescue mission to his boss. His reluctance is the agency's.

Tariq is still unconvinced that any harm will come to Momo and disregards the requests to release Amber. Despite Tariq's high-handed response, Bambi controls an angry Prince and reminds him that Momo needs to be kept alive until they get Amber. But after their heated conversation, Bambi gets the sense that this swap is not a great idea and they must do it themselves.

A new development in the story is Natalie and Bambi's previous relationship. He personally requests her to help him in the mission. He wants her to immobilize the Venezuelan government's cocaine headquarters (where Amber is kept) in the country and give him and Prince enough time to make the rescue attempt. Natalie is pushed into accepting the task when Bambi says he will declare war on the agency if the mission does not go through.

All he gets is 48 minutes to make it happen. There will be no communication between them and the army during this time. That is their window and Bambi is ready. Prince too tries to conjure support from locals and we might see another black op mission in the next episode.

We also get to see Amber and Prince's meet-cute at a party and their subsequent meeting with Bambi.

On the other hand, Prince and Bambi get ready for their last resort attack on

the facility. After letting Momo go, they set up a space with Mitch to gather weapons and men. Javi, the fisherman, joins their plan as the inside man to keep an eye on the facility's operations. Javi informs Prince and Bambi that Tomas plans to execute Amber soon. This hastens their plans, and Prince and Bambi prepare for the most crucial fight of their lives.

Furthermore, we see Maggie, Amber and Bambi's mom, make her way to New Mexico. She goes to meet Eric Haas II (Prince's father) at his head office. After the employees deny her entry, Reese comes to her rescue. She requests her to wait and connects her with Haas over a video call. Ultimately, Maggie informs Haas of Roy's death and the fact that their kids are on a warpath. She expresses her fear that Prince and Bambi are in danger and will stop at nothing to get Amber out.

Consequently, Haas sends reinforcements for his son and Bambi to Venezuela. He sends bags full of military-grade weapons along with experienced hit men for the attack. Mitch urged them

to wear Colombian flags on their uniforms so that it's easier to get them out. Following a succinct introduction, Prince and Bambi get down to business as they brief the team on the mission. The team of experienced men has only 48 minutes to get Amber out. They make a rousing speech to ignite a fire in the soldiers. The eventual repercussions of their plan and action form the climax of the exciting episode.

Tariq seems to be at the center of the whole conspiracy to keep Amber hostage at the facility. As Momo and Javi also acknowledge, he is the true boss of the whole operation and has the power to do whatever he wants. After Momo comes back to him safely, Tariq feels that he has the gringos in his pocket, and he is free to do as he pleases.

Tariq, Momo, Tomas, and the President meet for drinks in the evening. They talk about the impending revolution and the turn of power in the country. As Tariq suggests that he is a non-violent man, Tomas instigates him and shows his true face to everyone. Tariq attacks Tomas and becomes violent in the blink of an eye. As things settle down, Tariq goes outside with Momo and Tomas. Without any delay, two men on a bicycle come by and shoot Tariq to death.

It is later revealed that Prince and Mitch ordered their men to take Tariq off the board. Thus, they clear their path for the attack as communication channels will be blocked as well. This sequence of events shows how a man's life can end in an instant. No matter how powerful or intimidating one is, death can take them away at any time. Tariq's power or influence couldn't save him and neither could his security team. On the contrary, this also seems to be Prince's way of avenging his wife's kidnapping and the subsequent torture she faces.

Toward the end of the episode, Prince and Bambi have a heartfelt conversation about their thoughts. Bambi asks Prince the reason why he joined the military forces. Prince is rich and affluent as one hopes to be, and Bambi wonders why he gave that away to be a part of the army. Prince reveals he did so because of Bambi as the latter inspired him to make something of his life.

Moved by the confession, Bambi reveals the truth behind their first expedition after Prince's wedding. When they went against the Taliban and rescued hostages from the snow-clad mountains, Bambi saved Prince and let Drifter (their friend and leader) die. Bambi confesses that he did not have enough time to save both Prince and Drifter, so he chose to save Prince instead. Prince and his unit are able to neutralize most of the guards. When Bambi reaches the cell, Amber is nowhere to be seen. The team looks around but to no avail. The brother and the husband have contrasting reactions to this news when Bambi communicates with Prince. While the former feels she is kept somewhere else, Prince seems defeated. But all of it seems to be very subdued since the American units are well-trained and exhibit their professional standards. They keep eliminating the locals without prejudice to preserve themselves. Under heavy firing, Prince spots a cell with women. To his disappointment, Amber is not in that place either. Bambi feels that it is too early for them to expect the old Amber. The road back to normal life will be tough and Prince will have to be with her every step of the way. The situation in Venezuela is playing out as expected. The Venezuelan government has totally disowned any involvement and instead blame neighbouring Colombia for these attacks.

They are construed as terrorist actions but Violeta is keenly tracking the situation. The Colombian leadership do the same as their Venezuelan counterparts and tries to exploit the situation for political gains. Without caring for either country's people, they have left permanent scars in their tracks.

She threatens them to leave the country and never come back. But we see the dichotomy in perspectives right in the next frame when Violeta discusses the matter with Ernesto, her husband. His position in the superstructure sees the situation from an economic standpoint. Quite shockingly to Violeta, in his evaluation, he feels that this situation can help the business and bring them a lot of funds. The delicate situation will be a boon for the fledgling finances but they will allow it to go on.

As most soldiers do after their violent actions, Prince gets moral hiccups about what he did. Even though it was all for his wife's concern, he still ended up killing those who had nothing to do with the conflict. Bambi comforts him and in their insolence, Amber rushes out of the room. The pair try to follow her trail and Bambi finally reaches her in the church. Amber uncharacteristically claims that she does not want to go back home and wants to stay in the country. A shocked Bambi can only helplessly watch and can hardly recognize his headstrong sister.

But he is not prepared to give up. He gives many examples of what her life was like before captivity and how she braved all the horrors. It is time for her to come back to being Amber and leave the scars behind. Amber seems to respond to his impassioned pleas but still seems shaken. Bambi soon realizes that they cannot stay out any longer and must find shelter. Prince is busy arranging a flee attempt from the place and Mitch too has flown in to make sure everything goes smoothly. What we see next involves a high level of detailing and stealth movements by our American trio. They move through a busy marketplace to guise themselves. The locals are too afraid to speak out and even though they feel threatened, none of them reports the ensuing Colombian army. They have shoot-on-sight orders for the Americans and they must tread carefully.

But how could we have gone through the finale without a shootout? That is what happens next as Bambi and Prince encounter soldiers from the Colombian army. It is intensely shot and wrapped up quickly as the trained agency professionals show their prowess. They reach Mitch, who is waiting for the rescue charter. Amber is delighted to see him and hugs him with a wide smile. They are almost there, Prince quips, as they take to the air.

The plan is that they will land at an airstrip and then go back to San Diego. When matters get more relaxed at the island, Prince turns his attention toward Amber. He must now do everything to be with her and get Amber back on track. But Amber delivers a blow to his aspirations as she claims she can never be the same again or love Prince.

That is why she wanted to stay back or decide either way to start anew. Their relationship seems to be over from how Amber defiantly rejects his advances. Bambi is only an audience to the entire thing. We do not get definitive answers from the story as every protagonist grapples with the events of the last week and how they have forever changed their lives.
