Summary: After returning from the war, SSR agent Peggy Carter finds herself forced to return to her position as a glorified secretary. However, weapons developer Howard Stark soon offers her a chance for excitement when he asks Peggy to secretly find out who is framing him for the sale of his weapons technology.



Steve Rogers tries to pilot the plane away from New York and has no choice but to crash it. He talks to Peggy Carter of the SSR on the radio and tells her that he has no choice. Steve then puts a photo of Peggy on the dashboard and takes the plane down.

New York City, 1954 — Several months later, Peggy is in her apartment making a cup of tea. She catches a newspaper article about Howard Stark being investigated about a weapons sale, and remembers him flying her and Steve on a mission. Peggy then checks the injuries on her shoulder and remembers her time

with Steve and Howard testing weapons. As she dresses and water her plants, Peggy's roommate Colleen O'Brien comes in, complaining that she's feeling sick, and says that the factory where she works let ten women go after ten GIs returned. Colleen wonders if Peggy is going on a date, but Peggy says that she isn't. She secretly packs her gun and leaves.

Peggy makes her way through the streets to the telephone company that serves as a cover for the SSR. One of the operators, Rose, lets Peggy through a secret door into SSR proper. An alarm goes off and Peggy's superior, Roger Dooley, tells her to man the phones. Peggy calls Rose and has her redirect all calls to the briefing room, and then goes with Roger.

The SSR agents watch a newsreel on Senator Webster questioning Howard about whether he stole military-grade technology to enemies of the U.S. Howard denies having done so knowingly. Once the reel runs out, Roger says that six pieces of Howard's technology have turned up in enemy hands. The hearings have concluded and Howard didn't show for them. Roger orders

them to find Howard and squeeze him, and puts Agent Jack Thompson in charge. Peggy objects, saying that Howard is no traitor, and Roger tells her that the war is over and it's time for the professionals to handle the tough jobs.

As the agents leave, one of them, Ray Krzeminski, insinuates that Peggy knew a lot of guys during the war. Another agent, Daniel Sousa, takes offense and tells him to apologize to Peggy. However, he backs down when Ray challenges him. After everyone else is gone, Daniel limps out on one leg and Peggy tells him that she'd rather handle it herself... but thanks him for the effort. Agent Jack Thompson comes in and tells Peggy to do some filing for him, and she snaps at him. Undeterred, Jack leaves her with the file and goes.

Later, Peggy is eating at an automat and reading a newspaper article about Captain America. The waitress, Angie Martinelli, notices and says that she saw the hero once at a USO show. She notices that Peggy is feeling down, and Peggy explains that she's feeling at loose ends since the war is over. Angie assures her friend that she has talent and that she'll get her chance eventually. A customer complains and Angie goes over to deal with him. Peggy gets some food and when she comes back, she finds a note asking her to meet in the alley in five minutes. When she goes out, a man named Edwin Jarvis steps out of the shadows and says that she's coming with him. A car lights up its headlights, and Peggy punches Edwin and tries to go back inside. The door is locked and Peggy runs down the alleyway and drives her gun. She shoots out the tire and it crashes to a halt, and Howard opens the door and asks if she missed him.

Edwin drives them off and Howard explains that he's being set off. He kept his "bad babies" in a vault in his office, and a month ago he was in Monaco and someone drilled into the vault and cleaned it out. A couple of weeks later they started showing up on the black market. Howard figures that the Senate would believe he set it up to avoid attention. He needs someone on the inside, and Peggy is the only one that he trusts. She doesn't want to be a traitor, but Howard says that it's her chance to prove herself... and she's the only one who can stop whoever stole the weapons.

Edwin pulls over on the darks and Howard tells Peggy that he's going overseas to look for some of his technology. A formula for a high explosive is hitting the market in the day or two and Howard wants Peggy to handle it. He explains that Edwin is his butler and will help Peggy however he can. Once Howard leaves by boat, Peggy goes up to Edwin, who gives her his card so she can reach him. When he wonders what she's planning next, Peggy says that she's going to work.

The next day, Peggy goes to SSR HQ and spots Daniel with photos of Howard on his desk. In the photos, Howard is on a boat with a girl. Peggy says that Howard hates the water. Jack is in the office with Roger, and Daniel says that Jack got word of a club owner named Spider Raymond trying to sell one of Howard's inventions. He doesn't know where, and Peggy takes his coffee cup over to the pot. She then takes coffee into the conference room where Jack is briefing two of his agents. As she drops off the coffee, Peggy gets a glimpse of the files. Roger objects to Peggy being in there, but Jack says that she might learn things. Peggy asks for a days off, citing "lady's things," and Roger hastily grants her request.

That night at Spider's club, the Martini, the owner meets with the seller, Leet Brannis. Spider wants to know what Brannis has to sell, but Brannis refuses to answer. The owner pays him off for the file on the explosive and Brannis goes out through the club. Peggy is in the crowd, wearing a blonde wig, and sees Brannis and his bodyguard go. A drunk hits on her and she quickly turns him down, and then spots more men going up to see Spider.

Once they go upstairs, Peggy approaches the guard and hints that she's a prostitute. He lets her pass and she goes into Spider's office and says that she has some friends interested in buying the formula. Peggy offers to search him, and Spider says that it isn't on him and then grabs Peggy and kisses her... unaware that she's wearing drugged lipstick. Peggy then uses a device in her wristwatch to open Spider's safe and finds a glowing bomb inside. She calls Edward, who is at home, and tells him that they've weaponized the formula. Edward checks Howard's notices and warns Peggy that the explosive has reached peak vitality. If the shell is cracked open then it will generate an explosion 500 yards in diameter. It can be rendered inert with a combination of sodium hydrogen carbonate and acetate. Howard also left a note saying not to touch the core to the containment ring. Edwin's wife Anna calls to him, and he hastily hangs up.

Jack and his two men arrive at the club and a bouncer sends a man up to warn Spider. The guard arrives and sees Spider unconscious, and Peggy knocks him out with a stapler. Once she



hides the guard in the closet, Peggy goes downstairs past another man wearing a green suit, who has been watching everything. She tries to slip out but the SSR agents are between her and the door, so she grabs the drunk from earlier and dances with him.

Spider wakes up and realizes that the bomb is gone. Green Suit is there and Spider asks for a chance to fix it, but Green Suit shoots him.

On the dance floor, Jack looks toward Peggy and she has her partner dip her. Once Jack moves on, Peggy goes out through the kitchen.

Jack and his men go to Spider's office and find him dead on the floor.

Green Suit goes outside and sees Peggy drive away.

Peggy arrives home and discovers that Colleen is still home sick. Colleen is happy to see that Peggy is dressed for dancing and then rolls over and goes to sleep. Peggy grabs the proper chemicals from the kitchen, takes them to the bathroom, and mixes them together. She then carefully removes the core and douses it with the chemicals, rendering it inert. As Peggy pours herself a drink, she hears something outside. She goes out to investigate and finds Colleen dead.

Green Suit steps out of the closet, gun drawn, and Peggy spots him in the mirror. She attacks the killer and as they struggle, Peggy catches a glimpse of a three-pronged blood-red scar on his neck. She finally throws him out the window and he runs off. Peggy then sits on the bed next to Colleen's body and breaks into tears.

The next day, Edwin meets Peggy at the automat. She assures him that her name wasn't on the lease and no one can connect her to Colleen. Peggy blames herself, admitting that she screwed up and got her friend dead as a result. Edwin hands her a handkerchief and assures her that she's a credit to her profession. Peggy wonders if it was worth it, and Edwin warns her that they won't know until the job is done. Peggy figures that they have to trace the bomb, and Edwin says that he knows just the man.

Edwin takes Peggy to Stark Industries to speak with Dr. Anton Vanko. Vanko confirms that there is only one factory, Roxxon, which could have manufactured the bomb. The scientist confirms that the bomb is still emitting low levels of vita-rays, which Penny knows all about. She goes to the SSR and pulls the file on Project Rebirth: the project that turned Steve Rogers into Captain America. Daniel comes in and sees her, and realizes that she's up to something. He jokes about his missing leg and turns to go, and Peggy tells him that he's one of the lucky ones. Once Daniel leaves, Peggy finds a vita-ray detector in the bottom of the box and takes it with her.

That night at his hotel room, Green Suit uses a concealed radio to send a message to his superiors warning that he's been compromised and Peggy has seen his face. His superiors give him permission to terminate her and tell him to complete the mission at all costs.

Peggy and Edwin drive to Roxxon and discover that there are armed men at the gates. She tells the butler to stay in the car and uses rubber clothes to climb over the electrified fence. Peggy then uses the detector to home in on the vita-rays, knocking out a guard who goes past. She makes her way to the main laboratory, where a scientist is constructing another vita-ray bomb... with Brannis.

Edwin spots a truck pulling up and calls Peggy on the radio. The scientist and Brannis hear the call, and the scientist draws his gun and goes to investigate. Peggy blinds him with a hand-held gadget and then goes after Brannis, who has the bomb. She catches up to him as he runs to a truck parked outside, but Brannis opens the back to reveal dozens of similar bombs. Peggy can't fire for fear of hitting them. Brannis opens his collar, revealing a scar like Green Suit's, and then speaks via an electronic device. He explains that he's an independent businessman selling weapons. Peggy demands to know who Green Suit is, and Brannis says that he doesn't have a name anymore. He tells Peggy that Leviathan is coming and they'll tell her who they are soon enough... and she won't like the future that's coming.

Brannis throws the bomb on the ground and warns Peggy that she has 30 seconds, and then drives off in the truck. Peggy runs off and calls to tell Edwin to bring the car around. The guards open fire on him but Edwin drives through the gate and heads for Peggy. She leaps aboard and tells him to drive as fast as he can. The butler drives back out through the gates just as the bomb goes off. The wave spreads toward them and Edwin just manages to outrun it as the energy wave implodes, destroying the factory.

Later, Daniel is meeting with Roger when Jack comes in and tells them that the bouncer at the club saw a blonde at the club the same time that Spider was killed. The club photographer

took a photo of the woman on the dance floor. Daniel gets a call and tells them that the Roxxon factory apparently blew up, and the men head out, leaving the camera behind.

The next day at the automat, Peggy and Edwin meet. Peggy assures the butler that he did well, and Edwin goes to check Howard's files on any mention of Leviathan. As he goes, the customer from the other day berates Angie. He slaps her on the butt as she goes, and Peggy comes over and jabs a fork into his artery. The agent describes how quickly he'll bleed out if she stabs him, and suggests that he find a new place to eat... and tip generously.

As Peggy leaves, Edwin secretly watches her and reports to Howard that she was an excellent choice. He assures his employer that he doesn't think Peggy will have any suspicions at all.

Summary: Peggy closes in on the thief who took Stark's bomb formula, only to discover that he is part of a worldwide conspiracy group calling themselves Leviathan. Meanwhile, SSR discovers evidence tying Stark to the destruction of Roxxon.



Roxxon Motor Oil is presenting a radio episode of the Captain America Adventure Program. Peggy is at the automat listening and asks Angie to turn the radio off. The waitress notices that Peggy is going through the classifieds for an apartment, and tells her friend that an apartment opened up in her apartment building. As they talk, Peggy sees an obituary about Colleen and passes rather than endanger her friend.

Peggy goes to Howard's penthouse and Edwin explains that Howard wanted her to stay there. The butler explains that it's a private residence, and Peggy accepts for

one night once she sees the master bedroom. He then tells her that he found no mention of Leviathan, and Peggy has confirmed that there are no New York patients recorded with the throat scars in the last three years. She figures that they're from out of town, and set out to find the milk truck that Brannis drove off with the bombs.

At his hotel room, Green Suit reports to his superiors that he's proceeding as instructed and trying to track down the thief, Brannis. His superiors warn Green Suit that they're growing impatient.

As Peggy ushers Edwin out, he asks her again to go with her. She refuses, explaining that she can use the vita-ray detector to find the truck. Edwin warns that she might prove conspicuous but Peggy quickly gets him out.

Green Suit's superiors tell him to track Brannis. The mute killer then goes through an address book and tracks down a mobster. He tortures the man, showing him a card with Brannis' name. The mobster says that he doesn't know anyone named Brannis. Green Suit then asks him about

another of Howard's inventions, nitramene. The mobster says that he didn't want to buy it but Gino DeLucia would. Green Suit confirms that he has Gino's address and then kills the mobster and walks out past the man's dead wife.

The next day, Peggy goes to Daisy Clover and poses as a health inspector. She tells the foreman that she has a court order to inspect his factory. Once the foreman leaves her alone, Peggy scans the trucks with her vita-ray detector. She finds nothing but notices that one of the trucks is missing. The foreman says that one of the drivers, Sheldon McFee, uses it to commute and has been out sick the last two days.

Roger, Jack, and Ray go to the SSR basement where the imploded remains of the Roxxon factory are stored. The chief agent figures that some of Howard's missing technology is responsible, and tells Ray to pry it apart while he and Jack pay a visit to Roxon.

At the SSR, Peggy gets Sheldon's address and notices Daniel placing bets on the horses. She gives him a recommendation and then asks Daniel to cover for her. A technician drops off the photo from the club and Daniel explains that it may reveal the identity of the mystery woman with Spider. Before Daniel can check the photo, Ray calls him over to take apart the imploded factory. Daniel locks the photos in his desk drawer and goes, and Peggy goes to Roger's office and makes a call to Edwin. She tells him to dispose of Howard's car because it's traceable due to the vita-ray radiation it absorbed makes it traceable. Peggy then says that she has a lead on the driver, but says that there's something at SSR HQ that she needs to take care of first.

Jack and Roger meet with Hugh Jones, the CEO of Roxxon. They share a drink and Roxxon explains that Howard cuckolded him with his wife. Hugh claims that Howard wanted to buy the factory from him and then destroyed it. The agents assure Hugh that they're not investigating him, and the CEO says that his sources tell him that Howard was working on a formula for nitramene that would cause the kind of damage that wiped out the factory... and involves vita-rays.

At SRS HQ, Peggy waits until the coast is clear and then uses a lockpick to pick the lock on Daniel's desk. The phone on Daniels' desk rings and Daniel, coming back, goes over to answer it. Peggy hides in the leg well and then crawls back to her desk, and Daniel tells her that Roger is calling. She takes the call and then goes to check the Project Rebirth file on her superior's orders.

Once she has the files, Peggy takes it to Hugh's office. Roger informs her that anyone near to the blast was hit with vita-rays, and they're scanning all of Roxxon's employees on the theory that it was an inside job. Peggy is ordered to scan the female employees. She goes to the bathroom and scans herself, confirming that her wristwatch is irradiated.

Once she throws the watch away, Peggy and Jack scan the employees. She recognizes one of them as the scientist from Roxxon who was working with Brannis to manufacture the bombs. Jack confirms that he's clear, and Peggy suggests that they scan the clothing, which would remain tainted for a longer period. The scientist runs for it, and Jack and Roger go after him. Peggy confirms where the stairwell to the front lobby is, goes down, and trips the scientist with a briefcase.

At SSR HQ, Jack and Roger interrogate the scientist, Miles Van Ert. They try to convince him to give up his superiors, and give him until Roger leaves the room. Miles refuses to talk and Roger goes. As Jack beats him, Roger, Daniel, and Peggy watch through the two-way mirror. Roger tells Peggy that she shouldn't have to see the beating and gives her the night off.

At the automat, Peggy waits for Edwin. Angie calls out to tell her that she's found an apartment for Peggy. It's perfect, and right next door to Angie. Rather than endanger her friend, Peggy turns the offer down and meets Edwin as he pulls up. They drive to Sheldon's address, listening to the Captain America radio show, and Edwin admits that he was pleased that Peggy called him. The butler assures Peggy that he disposed of Howard's car, and Peggy says that they only have so much time until Jack gets the same addresses from Miles.

Jack beats Brannis' name out of Miles, but there's no immigration records on him. Daniel calls Daisy Clover to get Sheldon's address, and Roger figures that Miles and Brannis are working for Howard. The dairy company finally gives them the address and the agents head out.

Green Suit kills Gino as the man tries to sell the nitramene to his buyers.

Peggy and Edwin pull up to Sheldon's house and spot guards outside. She tells Edwin to go home to his wife, saying that she has her own ride home. Peggy approaches Sheldon's milk truck and finds the bombs in the back. Inside, Sheldon tunes the radio to the Captain America

program, and Peggy goes inside and subdues the man after a brief fight. Unfortunately, she knocks Sheldon out so that he can't answer her questions.

As Peggy handcuffs Sheldon to a chair, Brannis arrives and tries to start up the milk truck. The agent goes outside and draws a gun on him, and Edwin steps out to reveal that he stayed after all... and removed the truck's carburetor. Irritated, Peggy tells him to put it back and then questions Brannis. She says that the SSR will protect him if he provides useful information, and Brannis says that Leviathan is the organization he used to work for. They sent him to rob Howard's vault, but then he went into business for himself. Leviathan only wanted one thing from Howard.

As Edwin goes to get Sheldon, Brannis says that he wants protection in return for more information. The butler returns and tells Peggy that Sheldon escaped, and they take off in the truck. Peggy has Brannis drive at gunpoint to Manhattan. Green Suit drops off a bridge onto the truck as it passes and then fires through the roof. Peggy climbs out and fires, but Green Suit shoots back and she loses her gun. Edwin fires Sheldon's shotgun through the roof, forcing Green Suit to duck.

As Jack and Roger arrive at Sheldon's house, they see the man running down the road, still handcuffed to the chair.

Peggy climbs up on the roof and fights with Green Suit, while Brannis speeds up. A stray shot hits Brannis in the shoulder and Edwin takes the wheel, just as one of the bombs fall off the rack and onto the floor.

Jack and Roger drive Sheldon back to NYC and tell him that they know Brannis paid him off to use the milk truck. They want to know who handcuffed Sheldon to the chair.

As the milk truck approaches a curve, Peggy pins Green Suit's hand to the roof with a knife, and he drops his hotel key. She grabs Edwin and Brannis and throws them clear, and the truck goes off the cliff and into the water. It explodes, and Jack and Roger see the explosion in the distance. On the road, Edwin reports that Brannis was mortally injured in the fall. Peggy asks him where the rest of the stolen weapons are, but discovers that his voice synthesizer is broken. She asks him to help stop Leviathan, and Brannis draws a broken heart in the dirt before he dies. Sirens sound in the distance, and Peggy wipes out the symbol and then heads for the car with Edwin.

Later, Jack and Ray clean up the crash site. Jack figures that someone is one step ahead of them. An agent finds woman's footprints near Brannis' body and they figure it's the blonde from the nightclub. Daniel finds Green Suit's hotel key on the road.

Back at Howard's penthouse, Edwin treats Peggy's injuries. He says that she's fortunate that he ignored her instruction, and says that she can't remove herself from the world that she wants to protect. Edwin warns Peggy that no man or woman can carry the weight of the world on their shoulders. When Peggy says that Steve could, Edwin says that she was Steve's support and has to let others help her.

The next day, Angie takes Peggy to the Griffith Hotel building and introduces her to the women staying there. The waitress assures her friend that the owner, Miriam Fry, is a pussycat. Miriam interviews Peggy and is impressed with her references, and says that the hotel is a place for proper young women. The owner expects proper dress and proper behavior at all times. Peggy assures her that won't be a problem.

When Peggy arrives at SSR HQ, she finds Daniel and the others going over photos. However, it turns out there are no clear shots of Peggy. Daniel figures that she can't stay out of sight forever, and promises to locate the mysterious blonde eventually.

As Ray goes through the debris from the imploded factory, he finds the license plate that was torn off of Howard's car.

She looks it up in a book of symbols, and then hears a noise from outside and draws a gun on the climber... and discovers that it's a soldier, Jimmy. He says that his girlfriend Molly Bowen lives there, and Peggy directs him to the next window over.

Jack and Ray go to Brannis' hotel room in a rundown part of town and search the room. They find a number of fake IDs and the typewriter with a trans-

mitter attached.

The next day at the Griffith, Peggy is having breakfast with the other women when Molly comes down and admits that she had a late night. Peggy says that she's too busy with work right now. Angie asks her about Edwin, and Peggy insists that the man is just a colleague. As she gets up to go, Miriam tells her to wait and reminds everyone that men are not allowed above the first floor. She then evicts Molly, who begs for a second chance. Miriam refuses and assures the others that the building is impenetrable. Once she leaves, Peggy tells Angie that she doesn't believe it and goes off.

At SSR, Ray and Jack tell Roger what they have on Brannis, including the fact that his voice box was cut out. He was Russian, but died two years ago in the Battle of Finow in Germany. The lab technicians have identified the typewriter as a long-range transmitter. As Jack goes to run Brannis' photo past his contacts in the embassy, Daniel comes in and says that they've identified the license plate from the factory wreckage to Howard. Roger tells him to find out who the driver was.

Edwin slips out of his house to join Peggy when she shows up at his doorstep. She says that she wants to see how someone penetrated Howard's impenetrable vault. They go to the main

house and Edwin explains that a thunderstorm knocked out the alarms on the night of the robbery. They're interrupted when Daniel and Jack knock at the door. Edwin answers it while Peggy hides, and they tell the butler that they found the bumper of the car. Edwin points out that he reported the car stolen several days ago, but Jack says that they have more questions and Edwin has no choice but to go with them.

At SSR HQ, Peggy arrives as Ray tries to get someone to cover for him that night. She then goes into the observation room with Roger and Daniel, as Jack interrogates Edwin. Roger figures that Edwin was driving the getaway car. Meanwhile, Jack questions Edwin about the dead man who were selling Howard's weapon technology. Edwin insists that Howard is innocent, and Jack glances back at the two-way mirror. He then points out that Edwin was charged with treason, and suggests the charges were dropped because Howard paid a bribe. Edwin received a dishonorable discharge and Jack threatens to release the information to Immigration. When the agent threatens to tell Anna, Edwin warns him to keep his wife out of it.

Peggy goes back to her desk and Ray asks her to take his shift. She ignores him, gets a file, and goes back to the observation room and says that she needs Roger's signature. Once Roger signs it, Peggy takes the stolen-car file on Edwin and leaves. Jack leaves and meets with Roger outside, and Peggy listens as the director tells Jack to focus on Anna. As they go in, Peggy interrupts and apologizes for taking the report. Taking advantage of the interruption, Edwin says that he's leaving and tells them to contact Howard's lawyers if they want anything else from him. Roger chews out Peggy for messing up the interrogation. She has no choice but to apologize for ruining Jack's work, and Roger orders her out.

Back at the hotel, Peggy dresses for a mission. Angie arrives at her door and she quickly puts on a robe and hides her equipment. The waitress sits down and tries to talk, and suggests that they have a drink and share notes about their crappy days. Peggy begs off and Angie takes offense, figuring that she's getting a brush off. As she leaves, Miriam introduces them to their new resident, Dottie Underwood. Angie goes to her room and Peggy wishes Dottie luck.

Later, Peggy goes to Howard's mansion and asks Edwin if he has anything else to tell her. He says that he doesn't and they go to the vault. They climb down the hole into the sewers and Peggy realizes that Edwin has climbing equipment. As they drop down, Peggy says that she doesn't need to know the details of his past. She figures all Brannis needed to do was use a raft and float the stolen items down the flooded sewer tunnel.

At SSR HQ, Jack leaves Ray and Daniel on night shift. Ray figures that Daniel is sweet on Peggy, and says that no girl is going to settle for a one-legged man after having Captain America.

In the sewer tunnels, Peggy finally tells Edwin that she needs to know his past if they're going to work together. He finally explains that he traveled with a general and met Anna in Budapest before the war. She was Jewish, and the general refused to grant her a letter of transit so Edwin stole one and forged his name. They arrested Edwin and Howard used his influence to get him cleared and Anna out of Budapest. They hear the river ahead, and Edwin says that Anna doesn't know about his current activities for Howard. They come to the rivers and spot a nearby boat, and Peggy spots the broken heart symbol on the smokestack.

Emerging from the sewers, Peggy and Edwin drive to the docks. They realize that someone is still aboard and Edwin borrows a gun from Peggy. As they approach the ship, a man watches from the shadows. The duo goes up the gangplank and down into the hold, and find a pile of crates. Peggy opens one and finds a device that Edwin explains is a muscular contractor. As she goes to call it in, Edwin points out that she can't report the stolen equipment without blowing her cover. All she can do is place herself under suspicion, and Edwin warns her that they'll only tear her down. He tells Peggy that she has to clear Howard's name from the shadows. After a moment, Peggy tells Edwin to call it in from across the street and let Daniel get the credit.

At SSR HQ, Daniel takes the call and Edwin, faking an American accent, gives the agent directions to the ship. When Daniel starts to ask question, Edwin quickly hangs up. Meanwhile, Daniel and Ray head for the ship.

A huge man, Jerome Zandow, enters the hold and charges at Peggy. He knocks her to the floor and she loses her gun, and he tells her that it won't make a difference that she's a woman. They fight and after a vicious struggle, Zandow pins Peggy to a crate and chokes her. Edwin attacks him from behind, distracting him long enough for Peggy to use the contractor on him. Zandow's muscles contract, snapping his arm bones, and Peggy knocks him out with a pipe. Sirens sound and Edwin says that they have to go and leave Zandow behind.



Daniel and Ray arrive and find the unconscious man and the stolen weaponry. Ray figures that they're set for promotions, but Daniel points out that someone is setting them up. They call in their colleagues and haul out Zandow. Roger wonders why Zandow was just waiting there with the stolen weapons, and tells the agents to get it back to SSR HQ ASAP. As Ray drives Zandow back in the lead car, the strongman asks if the "English broad" was working with SSR. They come to a train crossing and Ray is forced to stop. A car bumps into them and Ray goes back to complain, and the driver shoots him dead. He then kills Zandow and drives away.

The next day, Peggy arrives at work and finds the operators crying. Rose tells her that Ray was killed. The agents are all stricken silent as well, and have left a wreath at Ray's desk. Daniel tells her that it reminds him of the war, and Jack explains that a professional killed Ray and Zandow. As Daniel vows to find the killer, Roger comes out and tells everyone not to forget that Howard is ultimately responsible for Ray's death. He tells them to get him action plans within the hour and goes to call Ray's wife with the news.

That night, Peggy goes to the automat and sits down at the counter. When Angie comes over, Peggy asks if she could tell her friend about her day. Angie agrees and Peggy explains that one of her co-workers died suddenly. She admits that they weren't close and the man was a jerk, but he was good at his job. Angie asks what she can do, and Peggy asks if she still has the bottle. The waitress agrees and says that she'll clock out and they can go back to the hotel.

However, Peggy soon discovers that Howard has an ulterior motive. Meanwhile, Daniel tries to track down the mysterious blonde woman, while Dottie reveals an unexpected side to her personality.



At a rail yard, two smugglers working for Otto Mink tell Jarvis that he'll get the package when they get their money. As their friends stand guard outside, Peggy takes them all out. Inside, the smugglers demand another \$100,000 for their silence. Jarvis tells them that he only has \$50,000, hits a secret trigger on the case, and hands it over. When one of the smugglers opens it, he's gassed unconscious. Peggy arrives and knocks out the other one, and they go to a nearby railcar containing the package: Howard, playing pool. He figures that Mink would hold them up for more money, and fig-

ured Jarvis and Peggy could take care of the smugglers, and then knocks an approaching one out with a pool ball.

As they drive through town, Peggy wonders why Howard took the risk of coming back to the city. As they approach Howard's penthouse, Peggy has Jarvis pull over and points out two SSR agents watching the building. She has Jarvis drive off and Howard says that nobody knew that he owned the building. Peggy warns him that the SSR will uncover all of his accounts and corporations, and reluctantly gives Jarvis directions to the Griffith. Howard knows about the place... and Miriam.

Peggy and Howard sneak in through the basement and she sends him up in the dumbwaiter. Miriam comes in and complains about the hours that Peggy keeps as a telephone operator. Peggy claims that she was doing her laundry, but Miriam insists on escorting her to her room.

At SSR, Roger shows Jack a report on the Battle of Finow where Brannis allegedly died. It's redacted and the general responsible died a month ago. As for Green Suit's typewriter, the lab techs have confirmed that it sends signals. Roger says that Colonel Ernst Mueller led the Nazi regiment that overran Brannis and his men, and is scheduled for execution in two days. The SSR head is going to Germany to find out what Mueller knows and leaves Jack in charge until he returns.

Miriam escorts Peggy to her door and assures her that she'll protect her from her own impulses. The landlady reminds her about her laundry in the dumbwaiter, and is surprised when there's actually laundry inside. Once Miriam leaves, Peggy looks into the dumbwaiter shaft but hears one of the girls, Lorraine, laughing in her room. Realizing who she's entertaining, Peggy knocks at the door and Howard comes out, saying that Peggy is his cousin. In Peggy's apartment, Peggy gets ready for work while Howard explains that he's heading for Rio in three days and wants to know what the SSR has obtained. She wonders why Jarvis isn't there, and Howard shows her a camera-pen that he brought her.

When Peggy arrives at work, Jack calls everyone over and reminds them about Ray's death. He says that none of them will be resting until they find the killers, and calls them into his office one at a time for their assignments. Daniel tells Peggy that he's going to the public phone that the anonymous caller used, hoping he'll get some prints. Before he can go, Jack calls Daniel in and tells Peggy to take lunch orders.

Peggy goes to the lab and takes scientist Alex Doobin's lunch order. As he shows her some of the equipment they recovered from the ship, Peggy takes photos with the camera-pen and quickly leaves.

At the docks, Daniel is lifting fingerprints from the phone when he sees two bums playing cards. He comes over and pays them a nickel for what they know. One of them, Frank, angrily says that he doesn't talk to cops and takes a swing at Daniel. Daniel knocks him down and handcuffs him.

The smugglers report to Mink and tell them that Jarvis brought a girl... and five or six men to beat them up. Mink kills one of them and the other one says that Howard called the woman Peggy. His employer kills him anyway, saying that he'll take care of Howard and Peggy.

Peggy returns to her apartment and Howard emerges from a neighboring room belonging to Helen.

Daniel brings Frank in and the agents sarcastically applaud. Jack wonders what he's doing, and Daniel says that the bum may have seen something at the wharf.

Peggy develops the film, just as Angie knocks at the door. Howard says that Peggy should go and he'll look through the rest of the photos, and asks her to bring something back for him.

Daniel talks to Frank, pointing out that their fellow soldiers. He talks about how everybody applauded when he went to a diner, and they did it because they felt guilty he had lost his leg. Daniel assures Frank that nobody cares about either one of them, and Frank talks about how he lost his wife and his job. He still refuses to talk to cops. Daniel goes outside where Jack is watching, and insists that Frank is a witness. He's sure that Frank saw something, and Jack considers.

At the dinner, Peggy slips food into her sweater, and Angie assures her that they all do it. When the agent goes back to her room, Howard tells her that all of his inventions are in the SSR lab... and she needs her to steal one back. All of them are inactive but one of the, the Blitzkrieg Bomb, shuts off all the lights in a city. However, he never figured out a way to undo the effects. Howard has a mockup and needs Peggy to substitute it before someone pushes the button and shuts down New York. As Peggy meets Jarvis downstairs and they drive away, unaware that Mink is following them.

As Daniel continues questioning Frank, Jack comes in with food and Scotch. Frank perks up at the sight of food and Jack offers it to Frank in return for information. The bum immediately says that there was a fancy-dressed man with a woman who got on and off the boat before the police arrives. He doesn't recognize the disguised Peggy from the club photo, and says that the woman had dark hair. Jack gives him the Scotch and leaves.

At Nuremberg Prison in Germany, Roger enters Mueller's cell as they prepare to hang him. Roger offers to help him escape if he tells him what happened at Finow.

As they drive to SSR, Peggy realizes that Jarvis is nervous. She wonders if Howard is planning to use the Button himself, and Jarvis insists that he isn't as he tugs nervously at his ear.

As Roger makes conversation, he removes his wristwatch and opens a compartment to reveal a cyanide capsule. He tells Mueller that the Nazi can have a painless death in return for information, and Mueller says that there was no Battle of Finow. When he and his men got there, they found bodies piled high and ripped apart. Roger isn't convinced, but Mueller assures him that if he had killed the Russians then he'd take credit for it. The SSR head gives Mueller the pill and leaves... and offers another breath mint pill to the guard.

In the interrogation room, Jack admits that Daniel found a witness. Peggy is passing outside as Jack says that during the war he just did what need to be done. He asked Daniel where he lost his leg, but Daniel ducks the question and leaves. Meanwhile, Peggy goes to the lab and finds the Button, and switches in the fake. She then enters a storage room and examines the Button, and then pushes the single button. Inside is a small vial of a reddish fluid.

As Peggy goes out in the hallway, an agent comes out and she ducks into the interrogation room. Jack asks why she's working there when all she does is take lunch orders. He notices that she's nervous and says that she's hiding something. Jack then says that no man will ever consider her an equal, and Peggy sarcastically says that she can always come to him for the truth and walks out.

Mink follows Jarvis and Peggy back to the Griffith and spots a deliveryman at his truck. Meanwhile, Peggy confronts Howard and demands to know what's in the vial. He finally tells her that it's Steve Roger's blood, and Peggy punches him in the drawer.

Mink enters the lobby with flowers and tells Miriam that they're for Peggy and he's her boyfriend. When Miriam starts to question him, Mink leaves.

Peggy is furious that Howard lied to her, and Howard admits that he learned from an early age to lie to get what he wants. He was one of the lead scientists on Project Rebirth, and he got one vial. The government is almost through their supply, and they won't give back the blood even if Peggy clears his name. Howard believes that the blood holds the cure to untold diseases. When Peggy accuses him of planning to sell the cure, Howard is shocked and Peggy says that he always finds a way to make a buck. She made a pledge to be as honorable as Steve was, but she forgot that playing corporate spy. Peggy goes out and tells Howard to be gone when she gets back.

Mink climbs up the air shaft and approaches Peggy's apartment. Dottie comes out of her room and Mink draws his gun, telling her to go back to her room. Staring at the gun, Dottie says that she wants it, leaps forward, and snaps Mink's neck in one perfect move.

On the street, Jarvis approaches Peggy as she goes to the SSR with lunch. She asks if he knew what was in the vial. Jarvis says that he and Howard both respect her, but Peggy is unimpressed. Once she moves on, Jarvis approaches a shoeshine stand and sits down next to Howard. He tells his employer that he's tired of apologizing for him and the whole thing stinks.

At SSR, Peggy hands out the lunches while Daniel studies the club photo of the mystery woman. He finally colors in the hair with a pencil. Meanwhile, Roger returns and tells Jack what Mueller told him, and suggests that Brannis and Green Suit took the identity of men who died there. Jack found a plane that landed at an airfield near Finow the day after the supposed battle... and Howard was on it. Intrigued, Roger figures that they've got a conspiracy.

That night, Peggy returns to her room and turns on the radio to cover the noise. She then pounds on the wall, unaware that Mink's body is underneath the bed.

Roger looks over the board with the photos from the club.

Dottie is examining Mink's gun when Dottie knocks at the door and tells her that it's dinner.

Peggy puts the vial container in the hole she's pounded in the wall, and then covers it up.

As Roger goes over the photos of Brannis, the typewriter starts typing on its own as it receives an incoming message.

Summary: Peggy requests assignment to Jack's mission to Belarus and gets it when she provides the Howling Commandos as backup. Meanwhile, Roger reaches out to Jarvis, and Dottie pays a visit to Peggy's apartment.



**Russia, 1937** — Several dozen young blonde girls are released from the barracks beds that they're handcuffed to, and then fed. One girl, Dottie, gives her friend Anya some stolen bread. They then go to a classroom and watch *Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs* to learn English.

Afterward, they learn martial arts under the strict tutelage of a matron. Dottie and Anya fight, and Dottie is ordered to snap Anya's neck... which she does.

**New York, 1946** — Dottie gets up in the morning, goes through a strict regimen of training exercises, and then meets Peggy at the automat for breakfast. Peggy con-

templates the card that Jarvis gave her and listens as Dottie talks about how she wants to tour the city. She finally says that Dottie should avoid the tourists traps and talk to the normal everyday people, and Dottie says that she sounds just like Captain America. Dottie then "accidentally" knocks Peggy's purse on the floor, and helps her pick up the contents. She secretly takes Peggy's apartment key and then leaves.

As Peggy buys a newspaper from Pete the vendor, Jarvis approaches her and admits that Stark is often thoughtless and arrogant, but is a good man despite that and had a good reason for having Peggy get Steve's blood. Peggy doesn't believe it and complains that Stark is using both of them, but Jarvis responds by noting that the SSR are wasting her talents sending her to take lunch orders.

She tells the butler that she'll make them change their minds about and goes on her way.

At SSR HQ, Daniel tells Peggy that the typewriter picked up a transmission and they brought in a cryptographer to decipher the message. The two agents go into the conference room and discover that the cryptographer hasn't had any luck. Peggy volunteers, pointing out that she can read Russian and the message is encrypted in Russia. She deciphers it and says that it's a series of map coordinates, and a message saying that the exchange will take place in Belarus, Russia in two days' time. Leviathan will purchase a prototype reactor in return for payment. Roger has heard of rumors of Leviathan, a Russian organization that was buying weapons after the war to fight the Allies. Much to her disappointment, Peggy deciphers the last part of the message... which says that Leviathan is buying the reactor from Stark. Jack figures that it's their chance to capture the industrialist once and for all.

Roger tells Jack to take agents Mike Li and Rick Ramirez to Belarus and capture Stark. Peggy speaks up, saying that she's best qualified for the mission and insists on going. Roger talks to her and Jack privately and Peggy outlines her qualifications. Roger leaves it up to Jack as the mission commander, and he points out that they don't know what they're getting into. Peggy explains that she was in the area when she fought in the War, and Roger points out that if she gets killed or gets someone else killed then he'll be blamed either way. Peggy mentions the Howling Commandos and Roger calls what he thinks is her bluff, saying that if she can get them on the mission then she's in. Peggy walks out and Roger irritably tells Jack that he has no time to put up with his crush on Peggy. Peggy comes back and tells them that she's made a call, and the Commandos will meet them on the Russian border. Realizing that he has no choice, Roger tells both agents to get ready.

Jack goes to the men's locker room and finds Peggy there. She points out that they don't have a lady's room in the HQ itself and goes in to change. Li and Martinez object to Peggy's presence but Jack tells them that it's not his call. As they dress for the mission, Daniel arrives with files on the area, and Jack sends him over to Peggy's side of the locker room without telling him. The young agent quickly looks away, but not before noticing two bullet wound scars on Peggy's right shoulder.

As the team heads for Russia, Peggy notices that Jack is nervous, and he admits that it's his first jump. When she tells him that it'll be fine, Jack irritably says that she's not his mother. They make the jump and touch down, and then head for the border. The Commandos are waiting and get the drop on them, and then introduce themselves: Dum-Dum Dugan, Junior Juniper, Pinky Pinkerton, and Happy Sam Sawyer. Dum-Dum warns Jack that the Russians are expecting them on the border and Jack agrees to take the Commandos' trucks on an alternate route.

As the trucks drive toward the rendezvous, Dum-Dum sits with Peggy and she gives him a bottle of bourbon that she smuggled in. They share a toast and Peggy explains that their mission is to capture Stark as he sells weaponry to Leviathan. Neither one of them believes Stark is guilty, and they figure that it's a trap. When Dum-Dum lights a cigar, Peggy snaps at him to put it out and Dum-Dum says that he misses Steve as well.

At SSR HQ, Roger is leaving for the day and tells Daniel that he's going home to his wife. Agent Yauch brings Daniel Peggy's file, and the young agent confirms that she has two bullet wound scars. He then gets out the photo of the mystery blonde at the club... who has the same scars.

The Commandos camp for the night and they exchange stories about yeti in Tibet. She asks Jack for a story from his time in the Pacific theater, figuring that he did something important to earn his Navy Cross. Jack reluctantly tells them that six Japanese soldiers snuck into his camp while he was on watch, and he killed them before they could kill his fellow soldiers. Impressed, the Commandos give Jack a beer and he toasts them.

Instead of going home, Roger meets a reporter at a bar. The reporter tells the SSR head that his editor killed the story about the slaughter at Finow, because it implicated Stark and the U.S. Army in the cover-up that followed. Stark was there after the massacre along with one-star general John McGuinness. McGuinness didn't want Stark there and Stark ended up punching the general. The general beat Stark up and then resigned, and a few weeks later, Stark broke off all ties with the army. The reporter notes that Stark was declared a wanted man a short time after that, and figures that the two are connected. He warns Roger that he doesn't have the whole story, and Roger promises to get the truth.

The group arrives at the rendezvous and finds an old factory. Jack wants to split the group up into four teams, but Peggy suggests that two teams would be safer. The senior agent reluctantly



agrees and they split up. Jack takes Sawyer, Pinkerton, and Ramirez in on one side, while Peggy, Dum-Dum, Li, and Junior go in via the other. As they search the building, Peggy's team finds what seems to be an American school room. Li sets off the projector by accident and Peggy confirms that it's used to teach Russian how to speak English.

The team hears a girl crying and investigates, and finds the barracks room. They find a 10-year-old girl, Eva, hunched over in a corner. Dum-Dum approaches her and tries to befriend her. Eva smiles but then pulls a knife and stabs Dum-Dum in the chest. She then grabs his gun from its holster and shoots Junior, then crawls out through a ventilator shaft before Peggy can stop her. Dum-Dum prepares to toss a grenade in, but Peggy stops him from hurting a child. He confirms that he's unharmed because of his Kevlar vest, but there's nothing to be done for Junior.

Jack's team run in when they hear the gunshot, and they figure that Leviathan knows that they're there. Dum-Dum takes Junior's dog tags and says that they need an exit out, and Peggy tells him, Pinky, and Ramirez to find it while she and the others continue searching for Stark.

In New York, Roger finds Jarvis and asks him about the fight between Stark and McGuiness. Jarvis says that he doesn't know about it, and Roger gives him his card and asks the butler to call him anytime if he wants to tell Stark's side of the story. He realizes that Jarvis figures that it's a trap and assures him that he just wants to get at the truth.

Peggy and her team find a Leviathan soldier on guard duty and Sawyer shoots him dead. The soldier was guarding a cell with two Russian prisoners, and Sawyer stands guard while Peggy tells the prisoners that they're the good guys.

Dottie breaks into Peggy's apartment and notices that she's wedged a piece of string in the inside lock. She searches the place and finds the photos Peggy took of Stark's weapons at the SSR lab. Intrigued, Dottie studies them for a moment and then puts them back.

She then goes to Peggy's dressing table, sits down, and pretends to be Peggy. She then leaves, putting the string back in the lock to make sure Peggy doesn't realize she had an intruder.

One of the prisoners, Ivchenko, explains that he's a psychologist. The other prisoner is Nikola, an engineer, and Leviathan has been using Nikola to decipher a schemata that they bought. Nikola only sees the world in scientific terms, so Leviathan captured Ivchenko and has him anchor Nikola to reality. Nikola speaks up, saying that the schemata is for a photonic amplifier. Jack asks if Stark is there, and Nikola irritably says that Leviathan wouldn't need him if they had the industrialist.

Sawyer warns that more soldiers are coming. Peggy and the others break Ivchenko and Nikola out and run down the hallway to the basement. The two sides exchange fire and Li is killed. Nikola says that he knows what to do, grabs a gun, and puts it to Sawyer's head. He then calls to the Leviathan soldiers, saying that if they let him go then he'll give them the Americans. Ivchenko tries to get through to Nikola, telling him to focus, and Peggy threatens to shoot the engineer if he doesn't drop the gun. Apparently realizing that it's hopeless otherwise, Ivchenko shoots Nikola dead.

As the Leviathan soldiers move in, Peggy and Sawyer run low on ammo. Peggy yells at Jack to get Li's ammo pack, but he freezes in place. Dum-Dum and his people blast through the wall and take out the remaining Leviathan soldiers. Peggy tells Jack to snap out of it and he finally gets moving. She covers the rest of the team as they get to the trucks and pull out, and then runs up and leaps aboard as they escape.

The team goes to the airfield and the Commandos say their goodbyes. Dum-Dum asks Peggy if she wants to join them, but she says that she has to return to the States and convince the SSR of Stark's innocence. She invites Ivchenko to come back with her and he agrees.

Once the plane takes off, Peggy asks Jack if he's all right. He admits that she saved his life back at the factory, and then tells her the truth about his Navy Cross. The Japanese soldiers were coming in under a white flag to surrender. Jack didn't see the flag and opened fire, killing them. Afterward, he buried the white flag so no one would know what he did. Jack admits that he can't stand people thinking that he's a hero when he isn't, and Peggy notes that he's finally told someone the truth.

In her apartment, Dottie handcuffs herself to the bed and then goes to sleep.

At SSR, Jack and Peggy tell Roger what happened, and Jack gives Peggy credit for the success of the mission. Peggy insists that Stark wasn't there and doesn't believe he's tied to Leviathan, but Jack isn't convinced. Roger congratulates Peggy, who leaves his office and notices Daniel

staring into space. He says that he was up late worrying about them, and congratulates Peggy on the mission. Much to Peggy's surprise, Jack invites her out with the other agents for a drink. He asks Daniel as well, but Daniel says that he has work to do. Once the others go, Daniel takes out the night club photo and studies it again.

**Russia, 1944** — Dottie removes the hoods from four men who are tied up. General Fyodor comes in and congratulates them on having been selected to join Leviathan. He invites any of them to speak if they want to decline the opportunity, and one man says that his family needs him. Fyodor has Dottie kill him with a knife and says that his family will be joining him shortly. He asks one of the other men—Ivchenko—if he wants to decline.

**The Present** — Ivchenko tells Roger, Jack, and Peggy what happened to him, and explains that Leviathan has been ac-

tive since World War I. Stalin has been developing weapons so Russia can be the most powerful country in the world. Peggy realizes that the girl they found was a human weapon, trained to be an assassin. Ivchenko admits that women are often overlooked and taken for granted. He doesn't know the specifics and when Peggy tries to question him further, Roger escorts her out and tells her to let him finish the interrogation. Peggy warns that one of the Russian women may have killed Krzeminski because he was shot with a low-caliber Russian gun. She suggests that Howard was manipulated by a woman, and asks Roger if he thinks the industrialist is involved with Leviathan. Roger considers and then tells her to run down the lead, stunning her into silence.

At the automat, Angie is rehearsing dialogue for the play that she was auditioning for. One of the customers, Esther, congratulates her. Angie then gives Peggy her new key because she lost the original. She admits that an actress career may not be for her, and Peggy says that they'll talk about it more that night. Edwin comes in and sits at the booth next to Peggy, and Angie gives them their privacy. Peggy says that they are still working toward a common goal, and Edwin tells her that Roger spoke with him. The butler admits that Howard visited Finow and began

construction of his vault shortly after the massacre. Edwin has been unable to reach Howard and Peggy asks for a list of all the women Howard has been with in the last six months.

Dottie goes to a dentist's office across from the disguised SSR headquarters. Once she confirms that the dentist is alone and still taking applicants, Dottie closes and locks the door. Daniel goes to prison and meets with Sheldon McFee, Brannis' man. He offers to get his sentence knocked down to three months if he can identify the woman who tied him up. Sheldon agrees and confirms from a photo that the woman is Peggy. When Sheldon wonders who she is, Daniel merely says that she's not who he thought she was.

Peggy and Edwin go to a jeweler and the clerk shows them the bracelet that Howard gives to every woman he dates. The clerk hands them the list and Peggy crosses off those that are publicly established.

The dentist tells Dottie that he's looking for someone who is willing to go the extra mile, and puts a hand on her leg. She grabs him and shoves him down into his dentist's chair, gags him, and starts drilling.

Edwin drives Peggy to check the remaining women on the list. The butler warns that he is usually the one who has to send them on their way when Howard is done with them. Peggy explains that she needs to see their wrists because the girl in Russia had scars on her wrists from when she was handcuffed to the bed. Edwin reluctantly goes with her and they talk to woman... after woman... after woman. Most of them slap and kick Edwin. Next on the list is Ida Emke, a dancer he met at a charity event.

Roger has Ivchenko go over the schemata, but Ivchenko reminds the SSR head that he's a psychiatrist, not an engineer. They take a break and Roger pours out drinks, and Ivchenko realizes that Roger is having trouble at home. Reading the signs, Ivchenko figures that Roger is having problems with his wife.

Dottie prepares a sniper rifle and draws a bead on Roger's office.

As Roger takes a drink, Ivchenko opens the window to admire the view. He opens the window and Dottie prepares to kill him. However, she sees him making hand motions and then writes down the message. Ivchenko needs more time to get the items, and tells Dottie to kill Peggy.

Edwin and Peggy go to Ida's apartment but she doesn't answer the door. Peggy goes in and finds mail lying on the floor, and empty drawers. A boy approaches Edwin in the hallway and the butler claims that he's an exterminator. Meanwhile, Peggy checks the bed and finds handcuff scars on the bedpost. She goes out and tells Edwin that Ida is the woman they're looking for, and tells Edwin to check with the owners and meet her back at the automat.

At SSR, Roger tells Ivchenko that his wife Loretta cheated on him while he was overseas. Meanwhile, Yauch gives Jack a report and comments that Ivchenko has been with Roger for a long time. He points out that it's different than how Roger usually handles things, but Jack tells him not to worry about it.

Ivchenko says that he lost his wife and children during the War and tells Roger that it's not too late to save his family. He advises him to focus on the good times and slowly hypnotizes him. However, Daniel comes in and interrupts him, saying that he has something that can't wait.

At the automat, Peggy meets Edwin. He says that Ida always paid on time, and Peggy admits that she hasn't turned anything up. She notices that everyone is leaving the automat and realizes that the SSR are evacuating the place to minimize civilian casualties. Peggy spots the SSR agents in the room and tells Edwin to block the front door. She then attacks the agents while Edwin knocks out the man at the door and holds it shut until he can jam it with a door. They run out but find Jack waiting for him with his gun drawn. He explains that they've tied her to Brannis and warns her that she has no choice but to surrender. Peggy apologizes and then knocks him out, and tells Edwin that she needs to get Steve's blood from the Griffith and they'll meet later.

As Peggy runs for the street, Daniel steps out, gun drawn, and orders her to surrender. She insists that there's more going on than he understands, and says that Daniel won't shoot him. Peggy walks past him and Daniel tells her not to run because he'll know it's true. She apologizes and keeps going.

At SSR, Roger mobilizes his agents to hunt down Peggy while Ivchenko looks on. Roger ushers Ivchenko to a conference room and says that he has to take care of some business, and leaves Yauch to make sure the psychiatrist doesn't leave the room.

Once Jack recovers, Daniel points out that he couldn't outrun Peggy. They admit that neither one of them suspected Peggy, and head to the Griffith.

Ivchenko begins analyzing Yauch and offers his assistance in helping the agent prove his worth. He begins hypnotizing Yauch using his ring.

Peggy goes to her room at the Griffith. In the lobby, Jack and Daniel confront Miriam and find out Peggy's room, and go upstairs despite her objections.

In her room, Peggy removes the sphere from the hiding place and hears Miriam outside as she follows the agents up. They burst in seconds later and find no sign of Peggy. As they search the place, they're unaware that Peggy is outside on the ledge, several stories above the street. She inches her way to the next window and almost falls when some of the stone breaks away. Angie opens her window and wonders what Peggy is doing there.

Before Peggy can answer, the SSR agents knock at the door. Angie lets them in and they question her about what Peggy. The waitress claims that she saw Peggy on her way out and doesn't know where she was going. When she sees Jack at the window, Angie breaks into tears on cue to distract them. Jack comes over and Angie sobs into his shoulder. Daniel and Jack finally leave and have their team escort Miriam to her office, and continue their search for Peggy.

Angie lets Peggy in through the window and tells her friend that she knew she didn't work at the phone company.

Ivchenko hypnotizes Yauch into showing him where Howard's weaponry is locked up, and then commands Yauch to take him there. Yauch refuses, explaining that they're in lockdown, and Roger is the only one allowed in the lab. Ivchenko has Yauch show him the exits, and then commands him to go to his favorite bar, drink a bourbon, and then walk out into traffic.

Angie calls his brother to have him drop a car off so Peggy can get out of town. They share a hug and Peggy promises to tell her friend what is going on some day. As Peggy heads downstairs, Dottie finds her and gives her a hug, and then kisses her on the lips. Peggy realizes that Dottie is wearing her drugged lipstick, and sees the bruises on Dottie's wrist before she passes out.

As Dottie takes out her knife, Jack and Daniel arrive and order her to play back. Dottie plays innocent as Daniel confirms that Peggy is unconscious. Jack handcuffs her and the agents lead her out to their car. As Peggy recovers consciousness, she looks back and sees Dottie among the girls watching her.

At SSR, Peggy tells Roger that she can explain everything. He ignores her and Jack and Daniel take her away.

Angie knocks on Dottie's door, saying that Miriam wants everyone downstairs. She gets no answer and discovers that the door is unlocked. Angie goes inside and discovers that Dottie has left and taken everything with her.

In the interrogation room, Jack handcuffs Peggy to the table and Daniel shows her the photo from the club. They have the sphere with the blood, and Roger tells them not to go easy on Peggy as he leaves.

**Russia, 1943** — A surgeon calls Dr. Ivchenko to surgery, explaining that they need him to numb a man's pain. They're out of anesthetic and need Ivchenko's help. If they don't amputate the wounded soldier's leg, he'll die. Ivchenko agrees and regresses the soldier, Private Ovechkin, to before the war where he was playing chess with his mother. Ivchenko says that he must focus and can stay there as long as he wants. Ovechkin feels nothing as they amputate his leg.

**Three Years Later** — Daniel questions Peggy as Roger and Ivchenko walk. The

SSR agent lays out the case against her, and she asks if he thinks that she killed Krzeminsky. Daniel figures that it was a performance and says that he had her back for six months while she sold him out. He tells her to explain the vial, and Peggy says that he's wasting time when a trained killer is out there. In the observation room, Ivchenko notes that Peggy is an excellent liar.

Daniel goes to get some coffee, while Jack tells Roger that Yauch is dead, hit by a truck. He wonders why Ivchenko is there, and Roger assures Ivchenko that he can stay. Ivchenko says that he'll go rather than be a distraction, and Roger tells Jack to take Ivchenko back and then come back to continue the interrogation.

Roger, Jack, and Daniel continue bombarding Peggy with questions. Jack figures that something doesn't add up given that she saved his life in Russia. Daniel figures that she's involved with Howard and Jack suggests that he hung Peggy out to dry. Peggy insists that Howard isn't the man they want and she's been conducting her own investigation. Roger says that they were investigating Howard and asks her about the sphere. Peggy refuses to explain and says that she knows nothing about Finow, and tells them to look for Dottie.

Dottie is shopping for a baby carriage and tells the clerk that she's taking it with her. The clerk gets her a blanket and notes that she doesn't look very far along.

Jack tells Peggy that the deal he offered is off the table. He warns her that Roger will have her beat her, but Peggy isn't intimidated.

Edwin enters the operator's room and asks Rose to let him see Roger. He says that he's been there before for questioning, and says that he has the signed confession of Howard Stark.

The agents bring Peggy to see Edwin per his request. Edwin says that Howard has decided to come clean and admitted that that he robbed his own vault and sold his weapons tech. Once Roger agrees to Howard's terms to release Edwin and Peggy, Howard will turn himself in. Roger refuses to release them until he has Howard in custody, and Edwin agrees. As he goes, Roger tells Peggy that she's out of the SSR.

Peggy packs up her things from her desk and goes back to the conference room. Once they're alone, Edwin admits that he panicked. The confession portrays Peggy as a seduced woman, and Peggy admits that she didn't think Howard was so noble. Edwin hesitates and Peggy realizes that Howard didn't write the confession. He explains that Howard never returned his calls so he panicked and forged the confession. Peggy points out that when Howard doesn't show up, they will both be hanged.

In his office, Roger calls his wife Loretta and says that he has always wanted the best for her, and wants to talk to her at dinner. Ivchenko listens and once Roger is done, says that the call sounded fruitful. Roger thanks him for his advice.

Edwin suggests that they lure an agent in, but Peggy warns that it won't work. She sees Ivchenko in Roger's office, signaling out the window, and realizes that he's communicating with someone. Across the street, Dottie takes down the message. Peggy recognizes the Morse code and translates it as "Prepare for evacuation" in 90 minutes, and realizes that Leviathan is coming.

Peggy approaches Roger and says that she wants to make a confession. She tells him that Howard's confession is fake but she'll give them the truth. In the conference room, she says that he found the stolen weapons and called Daniel to let him take the credit, because she knew they would never acknowledge her. When Roger wonders why she's confessing, she says that she needs them to believe her about Ivchenko. Roger defends Ivchenko and Daniel wonders why she didn't come to one of them. Peggy says that they all ignore her, and says that there's one more thing. She opens the sphere and reveals the last sample of Steve Roger's blood. Peggy admits that she kept it because she wanted a second chance at keeping Steve safe.

Roger, Daniel, and Jack discuss the situation privately and Daniel says that he believes her. Jack figures that Daniel is carrying a torch for Peggy, but Daniel points out that he's the one who brought her down. Roger doesn't trust her, but he trusts Daniel and tells Jack to investigate the building across the street while he watches Ivchenko.

Back in his office, Roger asks Ivchenko to close the window. As Ivchenko does so, he notices the agents going across the street. He then hypnotizes Roger again, getting him to describe the perfect dinner with Loretta. Roger tries to resist but Ivchenko tells him to enjoy it because afterward they have something important to take care of.

Jack, Daniel, and the other two agents take the elevator up through the neighboring building. They split up and Jack admits to Daniel that he believes Peggy. He tells Daniel to shoot to kill if they find the woman.

Roger takes Peggy and Edwin to the interrogation room and then draws a gun on them. He then locks them in and breaks the key off in the door.

Dottie spots Daniel and quickly closes the door. He hears her and goes to investigate.

Roger takes Ivchenko to the lab and tells Doobin and his scientists that Peggy stole the sphere and they're shutting down the lab for an inquiry. Doobin vouches for everyone there, but Roger cuts him off and repeats his order. The scientists leave and Ivchenko tells Roger to get him Item 17 from Howard's collection. While Roger searches, Ivchenko finds a quilted vest and says that it's something he's heard only whispers of. Roger finds the crate with Item 17 and Ivchenko opens it to confirm it's what he wants.

Dottie emerges from the dentist's office and sees Daniel's shadow in an adjoining hallway. She walks past and he orders her to freeze, and then spins and kicks the gun out of his hand. They struggle and Dottie knocks him down, but Daniel manages to grab his gun. Dottie runs onto the stairs and one agent cut her off, but she drops down the stairwell, bouncing from railing to railing. Another agent is waiting, and Dottie drops down in front of him and smiles.



Ivchenko has Roger escort him to the elevator and asks for the package containing Item 17. Roger hesitates and Ivchenko has him focus again. He then gives Roger the vest and tells him that his family is waiting.

Jack finds the dead agent and calls it in.

Ivchenko walks outside and Dottie picks him up in a car. She says that they've been compromised but Ivchenko says that it's irrelevant. He tells Dottie that they need to test the item, and assures her that the SSR will soon be too busy to worry about them.

In the interrogation room, Peggy and Edwin realize that no one is coming. They pick up the table and smash the one-way mirror, but they realize that they're still handcuffed to the table. Jack comes in and Peggy asks where Roger is.

Roger hallucinates coming and finds his son making a birdhouse in his kitchen. Loretta wonders why he's there early, and Roger says that he needed to see her. He admits that he screwed up and let a man in custody walk out. Loretta asks what he's going to do, and Roger says that he doesn't care. He just wanted to come home, and asks Loretta if he can come home. Loretta takes his hand and they kiss.

Jack and the others find the entranced Roger in his office, wearing the vest which is glowing red. Roger goes to the door and Edwin, recognizing the vest, tells everyone to get clear. He explains that it's the prototype for a new source of armor and doubled as a heat source. Locking the armor activates the self-sustaining battery. The energy source is powerful and flawed, and quickly overheats. Peggy goes to get the scientists.

At the lab, Peggy and the others confirm that the blood is still there. They start searching the crates to find out what Ivchenko took. Doobin confirms that Item 17 is gone, and Edwin admits that he has no idea what it does.

In the theater, the people start coughing and then go berserk, attacking each other.

An usherette takes a husband and wife who are running late to the theater. They find the door bolted and when they open it, they find the theater filled with corpses.

Peggy tells him that he went berserk and explains what happened, and Daniel says that he wanted to kill everybody under the influence of the gas. They go back to the SSR and Jack is briefing his agents. Ivchenko took ten canisters of the gas, and Peggy figures that Ivchenko plans to use them on a specific target.

Much to everyone's surprise, Stark and Jarvis come in and Stark says that Ivchenko is targeting him.

Jack arrests Stark and demands answers, and Stark shows them a box full of his files on the gas. It's named Midnight Oil, and that he created it as a sleep preventative for the Army. It caused psychosis instead and Stark took it out of circulation. However, General McGinnis took the gas and research, then used it against the Russians at Finow and they tore each other apart. When Stark explains that the gas causes symptoms of asphyxiation, Peggy figures that Brannis and Green Suit suffered the effects and then Ivchenko performed laryngotomy procedures on them. According to the files, Ivchenko is actually Johann Fennhoff, a Russian psychiatrist specializing in hypnosis. They figure he hypnotized Roger into helping him, and Stark offers to act as bait to lure Ivchenko out of hiding. Jack agrees and says that they need to have a public press conference.

Dottie drives to a private airfield and disposes of the mechanic and charge when he warns that it's private property. While he waits, Ivchenko hears a radio broadcast announcing a major break in the Stark case. When Dottie comes back, she's surprised when Ivchenko tells her that they're going back to New York.

As Stark prepares for his public appearances, Peggy brings him a standard bulletproof vest. He says that it's junk and goes to the lab with Peggy to get his own equipment. Peggy points out that he's risking his life and wonders why, and Stark says that it's the only way to lure Ivchenko out before he releases the gas. He explains that he's trying to redeem himself after Peggy accused him of only thinking about himself. When Peggy leaves, Stark quickly grabs the vial of Steve's blood and goes after her.

Jack soon holds a press conference outside and declares Stark innocent. As SSR agents scan the crowd, someone fires a shot from an adjoining hotel. Jarvis takes Stark to a police car and tells the officer inside to get his employer to SSR headquarters. As the car drives off, Jarvis spots two unconscious policemen nearby and realizes that it's a trap. In the car, a hypnotized Pike tells Stark that Ivchenko wants to see him.

While Jarvis tells Daniel what happened, Peggy and Jack go up to the hotel room that the shots came from. They discover a gun rigged to automatically fire, and realize that it was set to go safely above Stark's head. Peggy figures that it was a diversion, just as Daniel calls over the radio to tell them that Stark has been taken.

Stark tries to bribe Pike but the hypnotized officer ignores him.

As they go back to the podium, Peggy warns Jack that Ivchenko must have a fate worse than death planned for Stark. Jack wonders what could be worse than the movie house massacre, and figures that it was just a test. They pass several soldiers on the street heading to Times Square, and Peggy realizes that Ivchenko plans to unleash the gas at the VE celebration.

The police find Pike's car and Daniel and Jarvis arrive on the scene. Pike is slumped over the wheel and there's no sign of Stark.

Ivchenko drives his car while Dottie sits in the back seat with Stark and says that they spent a nice weekend together. When he doesn't remember her, Dottie pistol-whips him.

Daniel finds a witness who describes Dottie's car, and the last report shows it heading out of town. Jack returns to warn the others that the city government won't call off the celebration so they can't evacuate. When the SSR agents confirm that they've shut down all of the public airports and private airfields, Jarvis sheepishly admits that Stark had a second vault that the SSR never found out about. The butler figures that Ivchenko plans to use one of Stark's private airplanes to incriminate him.

Six months earlier, Stark takes Dottie to the vault: a private airfield filled with his high-tech vehicles.

At Stark's hanger, Dottie ties Stark up and he still can't remember the name she used with him. Ivchenko explains that he and his brother were at Finow when McGinnis released the gas. He only survived because he found a gas mask, but was forced to watch his brother and the others kill each other. Ivchenko blames Stark, saying that he understands that Stark feels guilt and remorse, but doesn't let them cloud his vision of a better world. As he talks, Ivchenko hypnotizes Stark, telling him to focus and think of the one thing that he would change if he could. Stark imagines himself on an airfield next to a plane, receiving word that Steve Rogers is alive. Peggy arrives carrying Steve's shield and asks Stark to bring their friend back alive.

Peggy, Jack, Daniel, and Jarvis arrive at the airfield just in time to watch Stark take off in the plane. Daniel warns that Stark will arrive at Times Square in ten minutes, and they figure that they can get through to Stark and break Ivchenko's spell if they can reach the millionaire on the

radio. Peggy says that they'll need to take a plane after Stark to shoot him down over the water if he fails. Jarvis confirms that he's the only one there who can fly a plane, and Peggy tells Jack and Daniel to get the plane ready while she looks for Ivchenko.

Upstairs in the airport radio room, Peggy finds Ivchenko with Dottie, talking to Stark over the radio. She orders them at gunpoint to surrender, but Dottie gets close enough to disarm Peggy and the two women fight.

As Jarvis prepares to take off, he admits to Jack that he's never shot a man before. The SSR agent tells him that if Peggy succeeds than Jarvis won't have to.

Dottie draws her knife and attacks Peggy, who manages to hold her off. She goes for the radio and tries to reach Stark, but Dottie knocks her away and tells Ivchenko to run. He leaves and Dotty beats Peggy, saying that she was jealous of women like Peggy until she realized that she could be anyone that she wanted. Peggy manages to kick the Russian killer out through the window, and Dottie falls onto a plane two stories below. Peggy then warns Jack and Daniel that Ivchenko has escaped. As they look for him, Peggy gets on the radio and tries to get through to Stark, but he insists that he's going to rescue Steve.

Jack and Daniel split up to search the hangar, and Ivchenko ambushes Jack and knocks him unconscious. Daniel arrives and orders Ivchenko to surrender, but the psychiatrist tells the agent that he won't shoot an unarmed man because he's too virtuous. As Daniel advances on Ivchenko, hesitating, the Russian offers to help him overcome the pain of being half a man.

Stark tells Peggy that Ivchenko showed him how to bring Steve back.

Ivchenko continues trying to hypnotize Daniel, saying that he knows how Daniel feels about Peggy and that he can convince her to love him. Daniel apparently falls into a trance and Ivchenko tells him to shoot Jack as the other agent wakes up. However, Daniel knocks Ivchenko unconscious and removes the earplugs that he used.

Stark says that he's done talking to Peggy, as Jarvis arrives in the other plane and says that he has his employer in his sights.

With time running out, Jarvis asks Peggy if he should take the shot. Peggy tells him to wait until she tells him, and Stark says that he sees Steve ahead. He explains that Project Rebirth was the one good thing that he did for the world, and Peggy says that they both loved Steve... and they both have to let him go. After a moment, Stark asks Peggy if Steve was good before he got hold of him. Peggy says that he was, and Stark snaps out of his trance. Peggy then goes down to the hangar floor and discovers that Dottie survived the fall, and escaped despite her injuries. Daniel and Jack take a gagged Ivchenko away, while Stark lands and complains about how Jarvis was planning to shoot him. He thanks Peggy for stopping him and she says that Dottie escaped but will undoubtedly turn up again.

The next morning, Peggy returns to the SSR and receives a round of applause from her co-workers. Jack and Daniel asks if she'll be staying on, and Peggy tells them that she just came to get her paycheck. Senator Walt Cooper arrives with his Secret Service entourage and congratulates Jack on stopping Ivchenko. Jack says that he only did what needed to be done and doesn't mention Peggy's contribution. Once they go into Jack's office, Daniel threatens to tell Cooper and the President about what Peggy did. Peggy stops him, saying that it doesn't bother her and that she doesn't need anyone else's approval because she knows what she did. Daniel finally asks her to go out with him for drinks, but Peggy says that she has to meet a friend. As Daniel turns away, Peggy looks at him and smiles.

Later, Jarvis takes Peggy and Angie to one of Stark's private penthouses in the city. Jarvis explains that Stark has offered it to them for as long as they need a place to stay. When Angie goes to call her mother and share the news, Peggy asks Jarvis if he's relieved to be back to his normal duties. He says that he is, but assures Peggy that it would be his honor to help her if she calls upon him. Peggy thanks him and wonders where Stark is, and Jarvis explains that he's negotiating with the SSR for the return of his technology. Stark plans to destroy all of it, sure that no government—even his own—can be trusted with the advanced weaponry.

Jarvis then gives Peggy the sample of Steve's blood, and admits that Stark isn't aware of what happened to it. The butler tells Peggy that he may owe Stark, but the millionaire doesn't own him, and he trusts Peggy to do what she has to with the blood.

Later, Peggy goes to the Brooklyn Bridge, takes out the vial, and pours the blood into the river. Crying, she says goodbye to Steve.

A prison guard takes a muzzled Ivchenko to his new cell and locks him in. Ivchenko's cellmate—Arnim Zola—tells Ivchenko that just because one vision is destroyed doesn't mean that the psychiatrist can't find another. He offers Ivchenko pencil and paper and says that he knows all about his cellmate's work, and suggests that they collaborate. Ivchenko hesitates and Zola points out that they're in an American prison... and America is the land of opportunity.

Summary: Peggy is reassigned to LA to help new bureau chief Daniel with the case of a deep-frozen corpse. . . and the freezing temperatures are contagious. Meanwhile, Jack's patron informs him that the SSR's days are numbered.



Dottie, dressed as Peggy, enters a bank and draws a gun on the teller. The men with her draw guns and order everyone to put their hands up. Dottie woman tells the teller to give her the key to safety deposit box 143, well aware of the hidden alarm. They open the vault and one of Dottie's men goes inside... and Peggy knocks him out. She aims a shotgun at Dottie and informs her that she's under arrest, and the teller draws a gun on Dottie as well. In the main room, all of the "customers" and "employees" draw their

guns and explain that they're the SSR.

Dottie kneels to put her gun on the floor, and then kicks the teller and ducks as Peggy fires. She then attacks Peggy and the two women fight in the vault. When Peggy tries to grab the discarded shotgun, Peggy hits her in the head with a bag of coin and handcuffs her.

**Los Angeles, 1947** — Daniel pulls up to Echo Park where a crowd has gathered. The detective in charge, Andrew Henry, introduces himself and explains that another murder has taken place where two women were killed two years ago. Andrew leads Daniel to the lake... where a large part is frozen over. On the shore is a large chunk of ice with a woman frozen inside.

At the New York City SSR headquarters, Jack Thompson and two of his agents watch through a one-way mirror as Peggy confronts Dottie in an interrogation room. Dottie isn't impressed, and Peggy removes her handcuffs and says that she isn't afraid of her. She shows Dottie a lapel pin that was the only thing in Box 143 and asks why the Russian agent wanted it, and Dottie tells her that they both know there are currencies stronger than money.

Daniel calls Jack and congratulates him on capturing Dottie. The new LA chief tells Jack about the dead woman and asks for additional staff. Jack looks at Peggy and says that he has just the agent for him. He calls Peggy out and tells her that she's done with Dottie. Jack says that Daniel asked for Peggy and she's heading out on the next flight to LA. Peggy warns Jack not to let his insecurity undermine their investigation, and Jack irritably says that he'll interrogate Dottie.

Peggy soon arrives in LA and finds Jarvis waiting for her. Jarvis accompanied Howard to LA on business concerning a defense contract, and he explains that the flamingo in the car, Bernard Stark, is the newest addition to the manor menagerie. As they drive through LA, Jarvis explains that Howard is busy with his newest hobby: a motion picture studio. Jarvis is glad to ferry Peggy around and warns that LA isn't a civilized town. Desperate, Jarvis finally admits that he's been bored and would like the adventure of accompanying her.

They drive to the Auerbach Theatrical Agency where the SSR operator, Rose, is auditioning two dancers. When Peggy comes in, Rose dismisses the dancers and then takes Peggy into the file room. The cabinet slides away to reveal a secret passage, and Peggy goes to the main office. He's surprised to see her there and quickly covers. Peggy wonders why he didn't return her calls, and Daniel admits that sometimes the time difference felt like a lifetime. Andrew comes in with boxes of old case files, and figures that the press will soon be calling him and help find the killer. Peggy suggests that the frozen lake and the body are unrelated, and the trio heads out.

At the SSR morgue, the body is radiating extreme cold. The SSR lab tech, Henry Meltzer, says that he doesn't have an autopsy report because the corpse is frozen solid even with the heat lamps. Her stab wounds are consistent with the two women who were murdered two years ago, and her shoes are switched which matches the killer's MO. Meltzer doesn't know if the body caused the lake to freeze, and turns off the lights... and the corpse glows in the dark.

Once the team has chiseled runs into a scientist, to open the body, the SSR lab tech Dr. Samberly examines it and says that whatever frozen substance is in the body isn't ice. He figures that the radiation is caused by uranium, meaning the victim was near a particle accelerator. Samberly informs them that there is one in Pasadena at Isodyne Energy. The trio goes there and the receptionist is less than helpful. Peggy asks to use the restroom and Daniel flirts with the receptionist while Peggy bumps into a scientist, pickpockets his badge, and slips into the secure area. She runs into a scientist, Jason Wilkes, who assumes that she works there and takes her to his lab. Jason distills a pink liquid and invites Peggy to taste it, explaining that it's ethanol. It tastes like wine, and Peggy realizes that Jason is a genius. She asks if Jason knows the victim and he says that she's Jane Scott, a particle physicist. Peggy convinces Jason to say that Jane had a close relationship with Isodyne's owner, Calvin Chadwick. The receptionist comes in and escorts them out. Jason gives Peggy his card and his personal number, and asks for her number. Peggy avoids giving it to him.

Back at the SSR, Daniel confirms that Calvin's office is stonewalling as well. Andrew has a sketch of a man seen near Echo Park two years ago and he looks nothing like Calvin. Peggy discovers that Calvin is going to be at the horse racetrack that afternoon at Santa Anita. Andrew insists that a wealthy industrialist who is running for Senator is no murderer, and suggests that they use the press to get the word out. Daniel tells him to have at it, and then privately tells Peggy to check out Calvin at the track.

Jarvis drives Peggy to the tracks and provides her with a covert outfit picked out by his wife Ava. The flamingo is walking on the lawn, and Jarvis apologizes for not being able to confine it. When they arrive at the Jarvis home, Ava hugs Peggy and insists on kissing Jarvis on the mouth for several seconds. Once Jarvis leaves, Peggy admits that she was expecting someone less outgoing. Ava provides her with an outfit and a combined garter-holster.

At the track, Calvin and his wife-actress Whitney Frost-are posing at the track with their winning horse. Peggy tells Jarvis to distract Whitney and he leads her off, claiming to be the head of Stark Productions. Meanwhile, Peggy says that she's one of Calvin's advocates and turns on the charm. She mentions that Jane is her friend and Calvin abruptly moves off. Peggy asks if he's aware that Jane is dead, and says that she's with the SSR. Meanwhile, Jarvis fumbles through an explanation of his new movie and wants to cast Whitney as a spy. Peggy asks for a complete list of employees at Isodyne Energy. He agrees... if Peggy gets proper clearance. He collects Whitney and Peggy leaves with Jarvis.

When Peggy returns to the SSR, Andrew catches up with her and Daniel as they go to the

morgue once the autopsy is complete. They go to the morgue, and find Metzger frozen solid. He falls over and shatters into a million pieces.

Jack enters the interrogation room holding a stick, and Dottie asks where Peggy is. He tells her that Peggy has moved onto a new case, and Jack takes out a carrot and a stick. He explains that he and his boss had a routine, but Dottie's friends killed his boss.

Jack then removes the handcuffs and says that he's not afraid of her, and Dottie pins him to the floor with a table. She tells him that he needs Peggy as the agent come in and subdue her.

Jarvis brings Jason to the SSR and Peggy shows him the team cleaning up Metzger. The scientist says that he can run tests to see what happened. Daniel talks to Peggy privately, while Andrew goes to a drinking fountain to get some water. The water freezes out of the spout just as Jason comes in to get some water.

Daniel tells Peggy that the official autopsy report shows that the woman died due to an unknown toxic substance. The killer stabbed Jane to make it look like she was another victim of the Lady of the Lake killer, when she actually died of the same thing that froze the lake. Only the police knew about the killer switching the shoes, and they go to find Andrew.

Jarvis is out polishing his car when Andrew leads Jason out at gunpoint. The detective punches Jarvis unconscious and tells Jason that he's going to fix him as he gets him into his car.

Jack questions Dottie about the pin, and she asks what Jack will give her in return for information. She wants deportation but settles for prison. FBI agent Vernon Masters comes in with two men and informs Jack that he'll be taking custody of Dottie. The other men take Dottie away and Vernon suggests that he and Jack have a drink.

Daniel and Peggy rive after Andrew, and Peggy tends to Jarvis' bruised jaw. They catch up to Andrew's car on the side of a bridge, and discover that the inside is frozen. Neither man is inside, and Peggy spots a card on the seat. She realizes that Jason left them a clue and gives Jarvis a gun with orders to wait for the police.

Andrew leads Jason under the bridge and insists that he didn't kill anyone. He explains that he takes money to clean up other people's messes. Andrew made it look like the Lady of the Lake killer was back to revive the case and get his resources back. Sirens sound in the distance, and the police open fire. Jason runs off and Peggy grabs him and drags him aside, and then radios to the police to stop firing so they can take Andrew alive.

A frost-covered Andrew catches up to Daniel and trains his gun on him. When the detective pulls the trigger, he discovers that the gun is frozen. Peggy arrives and says that they can help him, but Andrew warns that he won't last. A rookie arrives and shoots, claiming he didn't have his radio, and Andrew shatters into pieces.

At a bar in NYC, Vernon assures Jack that he still supports him. He got him the job at the SSR, and tells Jack to play the long game. With the war over, the SSR is becoming irrelevant. The government is restructuring the Department of War and Jack needs to consider where he's going to end up. Jack admits that he wants to continue working for the government, and Vernon explains that Dottie was stealing from some important men. Those men know Jack stopped Dottie, and Vernon promises that they'll reward Jack suitably for his help.

As the EMTs clean up Andrew's body, Peggy apologizes to Jason for endangering him. Jason figures that it requires exposure to contaminated blood, and promises to get a written report to Peggy of what Andrew told him. Before he goes, Jason invites Peggy to dinner and dancing in return for saving his life. She says that she doesn't associate with persons of interest in a case, and Jason is flattered that she finds him interesting.

The rookie who killed Andrew drives up to Calvin on the street and tells him that the job is done. Calvin hands him an envelope full of money and the rookie drives off. Whitney emerges from the shadows and they both figure that they've cleaned everything up once Calvin endangered everything with his affair.

Peggy and Daniel return to the SSR, and they figure that the case isn't closed. She suggests that they have a drink, and Daniel says that he can't but asks for a rain check. He goes to his car where a woman—Rose—is waiting for him. They kiss as Peggy watches from the window, and Jarvis pulls up and honks for Peggy.

At Isodyne, Jason goes to a secret lab and watches a black substance inside of a glass container that ebbs and flows in mid-air.

At the Stark estate, Peggy finds Jarvis weight-lifting. He explains that he's been pursuing a physical regimen since their adventures in New York. When Jarvis realizes that Peggy isn't taking him seriously, he invites her to take him down and keeps poking her in the shoulder until she finally throws him down. When she offers Jarvis her hand, Jarvis pulls her down and leaps on top of her... just as Ana comes out. Jarvis explains that his wife has been his sparring with him for the last 12 months, and Peggy asks

Jarvis to provide her with a ride to the office.

Daniel and Rose walk to the SSR, and she wonders when he's going to tell Peggy about his girlfriend Violet. They come in and find Peggy and Violet chatting with each other. Violet's grandfather is from near Peggy's hometown, and Violet invites Peggy to join her and Daniel for dinner that night. Once she leaves, Peggy tells Daniel that SSR agents are getting Jane's body from the city morgue so that they can have their scientists analyze it.

As the agents take the container with the corpse to their van, a man steps out and shoots them.

Calvin goes to an expensive restaurant and the concierge tells him that the gentlemen are in the meeting room. The industrialist braces himself and then enters a secret room, and tells the men that he didn't know a meeting was scheduled. Among the Council members is Hugh Jones, head of Roxxon Oil. They order him to sit down and say that as the Council, they have decided that it's time to shut down the Isodyne Program and dispose of all assets. When Calvin objects that he wasn't consulted, the Council points out that the Program has yielded no results and the government is now investigating. Calvin insists that they're in possession of the greatest discovery of all times, and insists that the substance is priceless. Unimpressed, they say that the decision has been made and tell Calvin that the woman's body is being taken care of and they'll

clear out the laboratory that night. Hugh assures Calvin that his primary focus should be the Senate race, and Calvin seemingly agrees with them.

The next day, Daniel and Peggy are called to the abandoned truck. Jane's body is gone and Daniel is sure that it was a professional hit. A search warrant for Isodyne comes in and they go to the company. Workers are putting up a radiation warning sign, and the receptionist says that there's been a containment leak. Jason is going by and vaguely confirms the story, and Peggy promises that she's going to find out what's going on. She advises Jason not to get involved in the crossfire, and the scientist quickly leaves.

As they go, Peggy tells Daniel that Roger slipped her a note asking to meet her alone later. at the Dunbar Hotel.

Inside Isodyne, Jason waits until a man comes through a secure door, and then slips in before it closes. Inside, Jason removes a film reel from a cabinet and slips away... unaware that another scientist is watching him.

At the SSR, Daniel confirms that the Dunbar is a hotspot for the colored crowd. He wants to go with Peggy as backup up and refuses to take no for an answer. As Daniel tosses his jacket on a chair, a case holding an engagement ring falls out. Peggy sees it and she apologizes for Daniel for breaking up his dinner date, and asks him to apologize for Violet. As she goes, Peggy says that she's very happy for him.

At her cottage, Peggy is trying out dresses when Ana comes in. As she picks out dresses, Peggy talks about how interesting Jason is and is happy to be interacting with someone outside of the SSR. Jarvis offers to drive Peggy but she declines, and he takes her to one of Howard's car. The butler demonstrates the car's special features, including a tracking device.

Peggy arrives at the Dunbar that night and finds Jason at the bar. He tries to make small talk, asking where Peggy grown up, and she points out that two men are dead and Jason looks explicit. The scientist explains that corporate lawyers reminded him that he was doing classified work and threatened prison. He wants to know more about the woman he's trusting, and Peggy talks about how she grew up in Hampstead outside of London.

Whitney is filming a scene for her newest movie. The director calls cut and then calls a makeup artist to get rid of the lines around her face. He casually dismisses her as an older woman and walks away.

Peggy talks about how her friends left her in the headmaster's bedroom, and Jason figures that he can trust her. A singer starts performing and Jason invites Peggy to dance. She joins him on the dance floor and asks if Calvin killed Jane. Jason says that the industrialist didn't do it—deliberately—but is sure that Calvin would kill to cover up their research. He warns that things are bigger than Peggy or even Calvin knows, and says that the best way to explain is to show Peggy. They leave, unaware that the man who killed the SSR agents, Rufus Hunt, is following them.

Whitney goes back to her dressing room and Calvin says that the Council is scrapping the zero matter program. She's angry that Calvin's affair endangered their work, and that he didn't stand up to the Council. Calvin warns that the Council is scrubbing the lab that night, and figures it's better if he get elected Senator. Whitney nods in agreement and apologizes for losing her temper, and assures her husband that he'll make a wonderful Senator.

Jason has Peggy drive to the Griffith Observatory and he talks about how after the War, Isodyne was the only company that would give a colored man a job as a scientist. Jason figures that he'll still have the view from the observatory even after he betrays Isodyne.

Inside, Jason runs the film he stole and explains that Isodyne was researching atomic energy. One explosion they conducted generated a strange black anomaly. It pulled everything nearby into itself, and it's never been seen since. Isodyne called the substance left behind zero matter, and Jason wonders if it's more dangerous than anything that they've ever seen.

The killer and his men flatten Peggy's tires and then enter the observatory.

Jason theorizes that the zero matter is always drawing energy into itself. He figures Jane made physical contact with the specimen, and his job was to build the magnetic containment that held the zero matter. Jason suggests that the matter might be extraterrestrial, and Peggy suggests that they go to Isodyne to steal it. The killers break in and open fire, and Jason leads Peggy out the back. When they get to the car, Peggy triggers the tracker on Howard's car.

Ana is watching Jarvis chase the flamingo around the yard when she hears the tracking signal and calls her husband in.

Peggy tosses Jason a gun and tells him to cover her while she hotwires a nearby car. Once it's running, Jason joins her and they drive off. The killer pursues in their car while Peggy and Jason realize that the killers managed to hit their engine block. Jason has Peggy pull into an alley and kill the lights, and the killers unwittingly drive past them. Peggy finds a lapel pin in the stolen car and realizes that it's the same one from the deposit box in New York. They get out and start walking.

Daniel goes to collect Violet, who is talking with Rose. As they leave, Jarvis calls and tells Daniel that he's received an SOS signal from Peggy at the observatory. Daniel agrees to meet Jarvis there and turns to his disappointed girlfriend.

Peggy and Jason find a phone booth and go to a diner nearby to get change. The owner assumes that Jason is threatening Peggy, and tells her that she's going to have to buy something to get change. She reluctantly does so and discovers that the phone doesn't work. Peggy figures that the killers are working for Isodyne, just as a car pulls up. Peggy grabs Jason and shoves him up against the phone booth, and confirms that it's not the killers. Her and Jason stare at each other for a moment and then they kiss.

Jarvis and Daniel return from the observatory and tell Rose that they found nothing. Daniel goes into his office and starts hitting things, and Rose tells Jarvis that Daniel has special feelings for Peggy. After a moment, Daniel comes out and tells the agents on duty to secure the observatory and check out the Dunbar. He has Rose put out an APB on Jason and tells Jarvis that they're going to Isodyne.

Peggy and Jason drive to Isodyne and enter the building. They hear people in the lab and Jason goes to get the zero matter while Peggy takes on the workers. In the lab, Jason rigs a portable containment unit to draw off the zero matter. Whitney comes in and Jason wonders what she's doing there.

Peggy poses as a lab assistant and gets close enough to the workers to attack them.

Jason warns that the lab isn't safe, and Whitney tells him to put the specimen in a case. She insists that she's the only one who knows what it's capable of and draws a gun.

Peggy takes out the workers.

Jason refuses to hand over the container, and figures that Whitney was going to kill him anyway. He also figures that she won't shoot him and destroy the container, and knocks the gun out of her hand. They struggle and drop the container. It shatters and the dark matter starts pulling everything in as they run. Peggy hears the implosion and runs inside, and finds a huge hole in the side of the lab.

Later, the SSR secure the company. A shell-shocked Peggy comes out and tells Daniel what happened, and he confirms that she's okay.

She says that Jason died in the explosion, and Daniel tells her that she has to go home. Jarvis is glad to drive her home.

The next morning, Daniel drives home and finds Violet waiting for him. He tells her that he's all right and apologizes for missing their dinner, and Violet says that she's proud of her boyfriend. Daniel tells her to call him when she finishes work and they'll make up for lost time. Violet kisses him and says that he loves him, and Daniel says that he loves her, too. As Violet gets in her car, Daniel takes out his wedding ring for a moment and then puts it back in his pocket.

At the Stark estate, Ana brings Peggy whiskey. Ana understands how Peggy felt about Jason after knowing him for a few days, since Edwin rescued her from the Third Reich after they only knew each for a few weeks. She's sure Jason felt the same way about Peggy.

Calvin knocks on Whitney's door and asks what happened. Inside, Whitney is sitting in the darkness as veins of darkness spread across her forehead.

Summary: Isodyne frames the dead Jason Wilkes as a Communist spy, but Peggy insists that he's innocent and tries to clear the scientist's name. Meanwhile, Jack flies out to LA to shut down the SSR's investigation into Isodyne thanks to the influence of his friend Vernon.



Peggy arrives at Jason's house in suburban LA. The press are waiting and ask Peggy if Jason is a suspect in the explosion at Isodyne, Daniel has her escort inside and the press ordered back. The SSR have found nothing from Jason's notes about zero matter, and Peggy blames herself for Jason's death. She reminds Daniel that the tie pin is their only lead, and it's just like the one Dottie tried to steal. Daniel hasn't heard back from Jack yet and Peggy figures that he hasn't gotten anything from Dottie. She notices a hollow spot in the floor, and she and Daniel find an envelope below. There's a

one-way ticket to Moscow, a Russian passport, and \$50,000 inside. Agent Baker reports that he found a Tokarev under Jason's mattress, and figures that it's the same gun that was used to kill the agents moving Jane's body. He figures that Jason was an assassin as well as a spy. Peggy figures that Isodyne planted the evidence where they could easily find it.

On a western movie set, the Rawhide Kid faces off against the sheriff. Howard calls cut to point out that Peggy and Jarvis are in the shot. Once they move, Howard calls cut for lunch. He insists that the Rawhide Kid was a real person, and they show him the film of the Isodyne atomic explosion. She explains about zero matter and Howard says that it doesn't exist in the real world. He recognizes the pin as belonging to the Arena Club, and says that all of their members are white men. It's a social club for LA's rich and powerful, and they've been trying to recruit Howard for years. Peggy explains where they've found the pins, and figures that now she knows where to start looking.

Whitney checks the black mark on her forehead in her mirror, and when she touches it, it absorbs into her skin. She quickly covers it over with her hair as Calvin comes in. The newspapers

are reporting that Jason is a Russian spy, and Calvin wonders why Whitney isn't at work. She says that she was feeling ill but she's better now, and asks what he would think if she wanted to retire after the election. Calvin doesn't want her to do it before the election, insisting that it can't overshadow his election, and assures her that once they go to Washington she can retire.

At the SSR HQ, Daniel is angry that Isodyne has leaked the story about Jason to the press. He and Peggy go into Daniel's office and find Jack there. He says that he's going to clean up their mess and shows Peggy her modified file saying that Jason is a Russian spy. Jack suggests that people might get the idea that Peggy is a Communist, and A points out that Dottie was stealing from the organization they're investigating. He tells her that the investigation is concluded and asks for her signature on the statement.

Peggy refuses and Jack signs for her. She tells him to watch the Isodyne film, but Jack refuses and Peggy storms out. As she leaves, her keys levitate off her desk.

Peggy and Jarvis go to the hotel where Howard has set up, and Jarvis explains that all of the women there are "production accountants". Howard staggers out and Peggy wants to plant listening devices in the Arena Club. When he points out that the club is women-only, Peggy assures him that she has a plan and takes away his drink.

Jack is watching the Isodyne film of the dark matter explosion when Vernon arrives. Vernon thanks Jack for coming out to the coast on short notice, and Jack assures him that the report on the Isodyne explosion will be very inconsequential. The FBI agent explains that Jason stole sensitive information from Isodyne and wants Jack to help recover it. He tells Jack that he'll know what the materials when he sees it. When Jack says that the SSR are not in the habit of handing over key evidence, Vernon reminds him of their early talk about a breach of national security. If the wrong people get hold of the material that Jason stole then it would be disastrous for the U.S. Jack assures Vernon that if the SSR has it then it's in the right hands, but tells Vernon that he'll let him know if he finds anything.

Howard and Jarvis go to the Atlas Club and the host, Torrance, explains about the members' financial background. Howard demands his drink and complains that the club is too calm, and Jarvis scouts out possible break-out points. Meanwhile, Howard complains about the lack of women and has Jarvis usher in a group of women. Torrance objects but Howard steamrollers over him, and Peggy slips in during the confusion.

Peggy goes in the back and plants the listening devices.

Jarvis joins the bartender behind the bar and shows him how to make Howard's favorite martini. Torrance calls for security.

Peggy enters the library and hides as several men leave through a secret door. Among them is Calvin. Once they leave, Peggy enters the hidden conference room and finds several newspapers about Calvin's rival Anderson resigning due to a sex scandal... the next day. She hears someone coming, hides underneath the conference table, and plants a bug. The bug emits feedback and Peggy quickly smashes it. A guard comes in, having heard the noise, and looks around. He then calls security and warns that they might have a breach, while Peggy crawls behind a chair and uses the damaged bug to set a piece of cloth on fire.

The guard smells the smoke and goes over to investigate, and Peggy slips out the door behind him just before it closes. A guard calls to her and comes over, but Jarvis finds Peggy and claims that she's one of Howard's women. They go out and tell Howard that it's time to go, and he quickly leaves.

Later, Jack complains that Peggy broke into a private club and reminds her that the case is closed. She tells him about the newspaper and how the Atlas Club had the newspaper made as a warning to Anderson. Jack warns her that it's a serious accusation, and Peggy admits that she had to leave the evidence behind and the club security destroyed the bugs. She insists that they have to dig deeper, and says that Jack is a coward burying the truth in the hopes that he'll come out a hero. Jack tells her to go back to New York and Peggy storms out. Daniel goes after her and says that Jack is right, and Peggy is letting Jason's death cloud her reasoning. As they argue, the objects on Peggy's desk float into the air. Peggy figures that she's contaminated with zero matter and Daniel can't touch her.

At Howard's manor, Howard examines Peggy and confirms that she's infected with zero matter. He discovers that the temperature around Peggy is 7 degrees cooler than the rest of the room. Howard says that she isn't contaminated with zero matter and he has a way to stop the gravitational disruption around Peggy. He leads the others to his lab and explains that they've

discovered a way to record all visible wavelengths on film. Howard sprays the area near Peggy and Jason appears. He's intangible but able to speak once Howard coats Jason's vocal cords.

Jason explains that he's been shadowing Peggy since the explosion. Howard doesn't know if he can make him whole, and Jason thanks him for getting him that far. The scientist explains that Whitney showed up when he was getting the zero matter sample, and she knew more about the substance than he did. As Jason explains that he took the brunt of the explosion, Jason fades out as the emulsion wears off.

Howard sends Jarvis to get the ingredients he needs to permanently make Jason tangible. He points out that Jarvis and Peggy make a good team, and tells Jarvis to let him know if he'll need a new butler. Peggy and Daniel come out and Howard promises that he'll keep working until he restores Jason. She then asks Daniel to find out how Whitney knows so much about zero matter, and figures that she's still alive. Meanwhile, Peggy is going to "poke the bear." Peggy goes to see Whitney at her studio and asks her about the incident at Isodyne. Whitney points out that Jason was a Communist, and claims that she doesn't know anything about Isodyne's work. Peggy says that a security guard saw her at the lab the night of the explosion, and Whitney says that he was mistaken. The agent says that things aren't what they seem, just as Whitney's director Kenneth comes in and says that they need her on set.

Vernon meets with Jack at the SSR, and Jack hands over the reel. Jack claims that he didn't watch it, and Vernon assures him that he's doing the right thing. He tells Jack that he's doing a great service for the U.S., shakes Jack's hand, and leaves.

Peggy returns to Howard's manor and discovers that Howard has brought Jason back. Jason and Howard are working together to work out a way to restore Jason's corporeal stuff. Jason admits that he's not sure what happened to him, and Peggy points out that he's managed to impress both her and Howard.

Daniel is going through the files when Jack comes over and looks at the file he's pulled. It's harmless, and Jack wonders if Daniel left New York because of his broken romance with Peggy. Daniel says that he's engaged and Jack offers his congratulations, and offers to buy Daniel a drink. When Daniel takes a rain check, Jack heads for the airport.

Whitney tells Calvin about Peggy's visit and insists that they have to do something about her. Calvin offers to call his friends in the War Department, but Whitney warns that won't be enough and says that Rufus should take care of her. Her husband warns against it, and Whitney breaks into tears and says that Peggy threatened her. The actress says that she'd hate if the Council noticed, and Calvin agrees to call Rufus immediately. Once he leaves, Whitney drops the act.

Later, Peggy is at the manor working a bag as Rufus secretly watches her. Jarvis comes out and asks Peggy if there's anything he can do to help, and Peggy insists that she's fine. Once he leaves, a masked Rufus comes up and garrotes her. Peggy manages to fall backwards into the pool, taking Rufus with her. She gets free and climbs out, and Rufus hits her and draws a knife. Jarvis comes out and attacks Rufus, who easily knocks him down. The butler manages to hold him off and Peggy grabs her gun and shoots at Rufus. He runs out and Jarvis goes over to make sure that Peggy is all right.

The next morning, Peggy visits Jarvis and finds him improving the security measures. She drops in on Howard and Jason, who are still working on a cure. Howard says that he's off to Peru to find an expert on gravitational physics and leaves. Jason tells Peggy that Howard invites him into his home without a moment's hesitation, and Peggy apologizes for sending Jason into his lab. He points out that it was his work, and figures that it's better him than her. Jason is going to leave to protect Peggy, and she insists that he needs them... and they need him as an expert on zero matter. The scientist agrees because he figures that Peggy doesn't want him to leave.

Peggy goes to the SSR HQ and shows Daniel the garrote marks. She admits that she missed the flight back to New York, and Daniel explains that he found a file on Isodyne's scientist, Agnes Cully. She's an expert on radiation and her work made Isodyne rich during the War. "Whitney Frost" is Agnes' stage name, and she's the brain behind Isodyne.

At the Atlas Club, Jack tells Vernon that they have plenty of time before his plane leaves. Vernon introduces Jack to Calvin, who thanks Jack for his help. Calvin is reading the newspaper that Peggy described to Jack, and Jack notices it. Vernon offers a toast to Calvin, who is now running unopposed.

Kenneth visits Whitney and says that the studio wants to replace her with a younger actress.

He explains that he threatened to walk if they went through with it, and they folded. Whitney thanks him and hugs the director, and he holds her tight. When he tries to kiss her, he pulls away her hair and sees the black mark. The director demands to know what happened, and Whitney grabs his hand.

The zero matter consumes him and then pulls itself back into Whitney's body, and she stares at the mark in the mirror.

Summary: Peggy and Jarvis abduct Rufus, and Peggy interrogates him about the Council of Nine. Meanwhile, Whitney works on controlling her new-found power, and Vernon pays the SSR a surprise visit.



**The Past** — A young Peggy is playing as a knight, saving the damsel from the dragon. Her brother Michael snatches her sword away and holds it above her head until Peggy knocks him down. Their mother comes over and break up their fighting, and tells Peggy that one day she'll have to behave like a lady.

**Now** — At the Stark estate, Peggy is eating as Jason works as best he can despite the fact that he's insubstantial. He explains that he doesn't have any sense of his body, but says that it's worth it if he's with her. They move closer but then pull apart, and Jason explains that

they're looking at the plans for a fast-neutron reactor. Three years before that, Agnes Cully-Whitney Frost-patented a reactor a thousand times more powerful. Jason warns that Whitney defies categorization.

A maid, Mabel, brings Whitney a package. Mabel sets it down and says that something is moving in there, and Whitney dismisses her.

She then opens the box to reveal a cat of white rats.

Jarvis joins Peggy in their car outside of Calvin's campaign headquarters and says that Calvin is inside but there's no sign of Whitney. Peggy is reading a movie magazine that notes that Whitney has disappeared, and figures that exposing her is the key to exposing everything. Calvin comes out and gets in his car, and Peggy notices that the driver-Rufus-has the same wound that Peggy inflicted on the assassin that came for her. Jarvis drives off after Calvin's car.

In the suburbs, Peggy calls Grace and then tells Jarvis that the car is registered to Rufus Hunt, who was discharged during the war for black market profiteering. He is currently head of security at the Arena Club, and Peggy suggests that they subdue Rufus. Jarvis gets an idea, pulls into an alleyway, and takes a tranquilizer rifle out of the trunk.

**Brockton OK, 1920** — A young Whitney is fixing a radio. Her mother Wilma comes in and complains about the mess, and warns that "uncle," Bud Schultz, is coming by any minute. She's surprised that Whitney has fixed the radio, and tells her daughter to clean up and be sweet to Bud. As she goes, Wilma says that Bud takes care of them. Bud comes in and kisses Wilma, and then asks Whitney what she's doing. He takes away her pencil and tells her to smile, and Whitney says that she's thinking. Once Bud goes into the next room, Wilma angrily tells Whitney to be sweet. The girl says that she doesn't like Bud, and Wilma tells her to stay out of her hair for a couple of hours before going to the bedroom. Whitney turns up the radio so she won't hear Bud and Wilma together.

**Now** — Whitney turns off her radio and checks the black spot on her forehead. She then picks up on one of the rats, concentrates, and nothing happens. Calvin knocks at the door, and Whitney puts the rat back in the cage. Her husband comes in and Whitney says that she's running her lines. Calvin says that her director Kenneth is still missing, and worries that it'd be terrible for his campaign if Kenneth turned up murdered. He asks Whitney to wear a dress for that night's photo session, and assures her that she'll be the most beautiful First Lady. Once he leaves, Whitney locks the door and takes out a rat. She concentrates and this time the dark matter consumes it and reenters her hands. Looking in the mirror, Whitney realizes that the black spot has grown. She takes out some makeup and starts to cover it over.

Jarvis pounds on Rufus' door, claiming to be the police. Rufus hastily dresses and goes out the rear... and a waiting Peggy shoots him with a tranquilizer dart. He doesn't drop and they fight. Rufus tries to strangle Peggy, and she manages to grab another dart and jab it into his arm. The assassin goes down and Jarvis locks him in the trunk. Rufus wakes up and jabs Jarvis with a dart before Peggy knocks the killer out... and Jarvis goes down.

Peggy drives back to Stark's manor and finds Daniel there. He says that Jack called and approved her vacation days, and Peggy tries to get rid of him. Daniel says that he has more information on Whitney, and Peggy takes the files and says that she'll read it. He figures that she's trying to brush him off, and notices a sleeping Jarvis in the car. Peggy claims that he's drunk, and Daniel hears Rufus pounding in the trunk. She finally admits that she has a man there. They go inside and Daniel complains that Peggy committed a felony. He's also unhappy that Peggy didn't bring him in, and Peggy says that she had to give him plausible deniability. Daniel insists on helping her, and Peggy says that she's going to kill Rufus.

Later, Daniel questions Rufus while Peggy looks on. Rufus refuses to say anything, and describes how the Japanese tortured him but got nothing. Peggy prepares a syringe and tells Rufus that they're not going to torture him because they don't have time.

**Bletchley Park: England, 1940** — At the code department, Mr. Edwards talks to Peggy privately in his office. He offers her congratulations on her wedding proposal, and gives her an envelope from the Special Operations Executive. Churchill has created it himself, and needs field agents. They need women who won't draw attention and are recruiting Peggy, and Edwards says that it's a privilege. Peggy says that she's not meant to be in the field, and Edwards says that it's her chance to strike a major blow for king or country. After a moment, Peggy says that she'll discuss it with her fiancé but doesn't think she's cut out for that kind of work.

**Now** — Peggy jams the syringe into Rufus' neck and explains that she injected him with a virulent strain of malaria. She'll warn that it will be fatal in 20 minutes, and will return in 10 minutes to give him the antidote if he talks. Peggy and Daniel leaves, and Peggy explains that Stark's formula generates cold. As Rufus yells for them to come back, Peggy makes tea.

**Brockton OK, 1928** — A teenaged Whitney is working on her generator plans in the kitchen. Wilma has found out that Bud is cheating on her, and tells her to get out by the next day. Once he drives away, Wilma goes back inside and complains that Whitney could have been nicer to Bud.

Whitney says that she doesn't like him, and Wilma tells her that the science program won't take a girl. The girl says that she'll get away from Wilma, and Wilma drags her to the mirror and says that her face is the only thing that will get her anywhere in the world.

**Now** — Calvin calls Whitney and complains that she's late for the photo shoot. She claims that she's not feeling well and hangs up on her husband... and the black spot has spread further on her forehead.

Daniel tries to get Rufus to give up a name, and he finally gives them the names of Thomas Gloucester and Hugh Jones. He figures that his superiors will kill him and they destroy what they can't buy. Peggy prepares to smash the antidote, and Rufus says that the Council of Nine records their meetings, and the tapes are at a storage room in the club.

Jason has Jarvis write out his equations, but realizes that he's at a dead end. In his incohesive state, he sees dark matter forming on the chalkboard. Daniel and Peggy come in and explain that they're going to get a judge to give them a warrant for the Arena Club.

The agents go to the SSR and brief a team on how they're going in. A team of FBI agents come in with Vernon, who tells them that the War Department is auditing the SSR. Daniel has no choice but to agree.

Once Vernon and Peggy are alone, Vernon says that it's safer to be seen as a team player. Peggy insists that the Council of Nine is involved with assassination and market manipulation. Vernon demands to see her source personally, and Peggy refuses to give up Rufus' independence. He points out that she's a non-American spy, and says that she is going to have to work hard to stay out of the coming trouble. Peggy says that she'll manage, and Vernon warns that her friends may not be so lucky.

**Hampstead, England, 1940** — Peggy meets with her fiancée Fred Wells and her brother Michael at her engagement party. She mentions that they asked her to be a spy, and Fred assures Michael that they turned down the offer. Michael is surprised that Peggy did so. Michael figures that she wants a life of adventure, but everyone has drawn her dreams out of her. He says that Peggy still has time to change her mind, and insists that she is meant to fight. Angry, Peggy walks away.

**Now** — Daniel catches up to Peggy and admits that the judge is in the Council's pocket. He warns that the Arena Club has removed any incriminating evidence, and Peggy tells Daniel to stay there and protect himself. He got the same speech from Vernon that the man gave Peggy, and assures her that he's in it with her. Daniel has Jane's tissue sample from the autopsy, and they go to the estate to talk to Rufus. Daniel cuts him free and says that the Council is onto them, so they have to eliminate him. Rufus tells him to finish him off. Daniel pulls the trigger and the revolver jams, and Rufus punches him and runs. Once he's gone, Peggy emerges from hiding.

Rufus goes to Whitney's home and demands to see Calvin. Peggy and Daniel listen in on the bug that they planted on Rufus, and Rufus pours himself a drink, refusing to tell Whitney anything.

**Hampstead, England, 1940** — Mrs. Carter prepares Peggy for her wedding, and the SOE letter is on the dresser. A man pulls up and delivers a message that Michael has died in the war. Later, Peggy takes off the wedding ring, picks up the SOE letter, and leaves.

**Now** — Peggy notices Jason staring at the chalkboard. He says that it feels like something is pulling him away, and it would be easy to let go. Peggy says that Michael told her that she was meant to fight, and she believes Jason is the same. She tells him to hold on and reaches out to him... and Daniel notices.

Calvin returns home and Rufus tells him what happened. He claims that he didn't tell Peggy anything, but Whitney doesn't believe him. Rufus admits that he gave up the names of two of the Council, but warns that Calvin will protect him or he'll tell the Council what Calvin is up to. Whitney closes the drapes and tells Calvin that she has something to show him. She chokes Rufus and the dark matter consumes him. The bug goes dead and Peggy and the others have no idea what happened.

**Hollywood, California, 1934** — Whitney arrives in town and goes to the theater. The ticket lady recognizes her and wonders why she's back, and Whitney says that she comes to escape from her trouble. Whitney doesn't have enough money for a ticket, and the ticket lady gives her a free ticket.

As she goes in, an agent named Ned Silver sees Whitney and assures her that he could get her work as a model or an actress. Whitney says that it sounds interesting.

**Now** — Whitney stares at her hands and the blackness spreads further across her head. She tells Calvin that was her fixing another of his problems, and her husband wonders what she is. Whitney says that she's whatever she wants and smiles.

He invites her to the lamp and shows her the tissue sample from Jane's autopsy. Jason holds his hand to the jar and a piece of zero matter breaks off and moves to his hand. He moves his hand and the sample follows it, and Jason says that it's calling to him. The zero matter penetrates the side of the jar and enters Jason's hand. when Peggy instinctively grabs him, she discovers that he's solid for a moment. Jason recovers and tells Peggy that knows where Jane's body is.

Jarvis brings a map and Jason points to a location on it, and says that the body is calling to him. Peggy confirms that the location is a county cold storage building, owner by Thomas. Jason figures that he could cure himself with the zero matter in Jane's corpse, and Peggy tells the two men that they're going to steal Jane's body.

Violet returns home and discovers that the front door is open. She goes inside and grabs a baseball bat, and discovers that Daniel has set the table for dinner. He's dozed off on the couch waiting for her, and Violet wakes him up. Daniel says that he hoped to surprise her, and Violet explains that she had to cover an extra shift. She goes out to get coffee, and Daniel searches through his coat and then the curtains for the engagement ring. Violet comes back and Daniel says that he lost something. When she offers to help, Daniel takes her hands and says that he got through his physical therapy because of her. He finally admits that he lost his engagement ring for her, and Violet starts searching for it... and then says yes and kisses him.

Calvin is lying awake in bed next to Whitney, who is mumbling in her sleep. He finally gets up and gets some clothing, and turns to find Whitney behind him. She says that she needs his help.

The next morning, Jarvis lifts Peggy up to the facility vent so she can pry it open. She goes in and then pulls Jarvis up. They crawl through the shaft to the vent leading to the cold storage

room. As Peggy prepares to climb down, Calvin and Whitney enter the room. Whitney goes to Jane's corpse in a sealed container and says that it wants to be let out. She has Calvin open the case, and then touches the body. The zero matter enters her arm, and after a moment Whitney pulls away. Peggy watches as Whitney tells Calvin that she needs an atomic bomb.

Back at Howard's estate, Peggy and Jarvis tell Jason what they saw. Jason figures that Whitney plans to replicate the original atomic explosion that unleashed the zero matter. To succeed, Whitney must set off the bomb in the same location to open the rift.

Jason insists that they can't let Whitney do it, and the two remaining Roxxon warheads were put in storage after the original test.

They have no idea which Roxxon facility is housing the warheads, but Jarvis admits that Howard has kept up on Roxxon activities. He knows of one highly-security facility a few hours outside of LA. Jarvis warns that the only way in is via an elevator that requires a special key, impossible to duplicate. Any attempt to bypass the door will kill them.

Calvin tells Whitney that they can't steal the warheads, and Whitney insists that if they get more zero matter than the Council will answer to them. She insists that the plan will work and tells him to imagine what they could do with a large sample of zero matter.

Once they do, Calvin would get the respect he deserves. Calvin asks how they'll do it, and Whitney says that it's time to lean on their connections.

Peggy arrives at the SSR office and finds Daniel telling the other agents about his proposal to Violet. She offers her congratulations and then talks to Daniel in private. She explains that she needs to sneak into Hugh's office at Roxxon, and Daniel says that the lab has something new. They take some pie to Dr. Samberly to bribe him to loan them the memory inhibitor. Samberly demonstrates how to place it to the temples of the subject, making them forget the last two minutes. Their tests on an assistant, Jerry, have been highly successful except for the chance of brain damage.

At Roxxon, Peggy calls away Hugh's secretary and goes in, disguised. She's going through the file cabinets when Hugh comes in. He finds the disguised Peggy vaguely familiar, and Peggy says that she just started there. Hugh tells Peggy that he's going to lunch and they can crunch numbers later. Peggy goes into his desk and starts searching.

and Hugh remembers where he saw Peggy and goes back to find her searching his office. He starts to call security, and Peggy uses the memory inhibitor on him. Hugh start flirting with her again and Peggy tells him that he needs to get to lunch. Once he goes, Peggy starts searching again. Meanwhile, Hugh remembers where he saw Peggy and goes back to his office. She uses the memory inhibitor on him again and knocks him out. She realizes that Hugh is wearing the key and start searching him. He wakes up and she uses the memory inhibitor again and again, and again. Peggy finally locates the key in Hugh's belt buckle, and zaps him one more time before going. Hugh staggers out as his secretary returns, sees his unbuckled pants, and figures he had a nice lunch.

Calvin and Whitney go to a restaurant to meet with Joseph Manfredini, Whitney's former boyfriend. Whitney offers Joseph major construction contracts in return for some men to move equipment. She assures Joseph that she doesn't need guns, just men who can be discrete. Joseph says that he needs assurances that his name doesn't appear in the newspaper. When Calvin hesitates, Joseph calls a bodyguard over and starts beating him, screaming that he's undressing Whitney with his eyes. Once Joseph is done, he catches his breath and returns to the table. He then asks if they have a deal, and Whitney agrees.

Jarvis, Peggy, and Jason go over the plans of the Roxxon facility exterior. Daniel is practicing defusing a mock bomb, and Jason points out that one misstep could destroy all of Los Angeles... just as Daniel accidentally drops the mock core. Jarvis doesn't have any plans of the inside, and Daniel admits that they have no idea who they can trust inside the SSR. Peggy points out that there is one person that they can trust. She and Daniel go back to the theatrical agency and Peggy insists that they can trust Rose. When Daniel points out that Rose doesn't have any field experience, Peggy insists that they can trust her with their lives. Rose knocks out an auditioning act, and then waves to Peggy and Daniel.

Later, Peggy, Daniel, and Rose go to the SSR lab and look for equipment they can use. Samberly comes in and Peggy assures him that his memory inhibitor works. He irritably complains until Rose starts flirting with him. Samberly immediately agrees but warns that the equipment are prototypes and he needs to go with them. When the others agree, Samberly points out that

Daniel said that he could use his expertise in field operations. Daniel finally agrees and Samberly starts packing his equipment. When Peggy wonders how Daniel knows Samberly isn't a Council spy, Daniel points out that everyone hates him. The team heads out and Jarvis goes to get the car.

That night, the team pulls up to the Roxxon facility in a van. Rose and Samberly go over to the fence, claiming to be a couple, and say that they're lost. Samberly awkwardly plays along but the guard tells them to leave. Rose says that they should leave, and Samberly tosses a device over the fence. The guards see it just as it shocks them unconscious. Jarvis and Daniel drag the guards out of sight, and notice that they're wearing expensive shoes.

The team gets into the elevator using Hugh's key. When they reach the bottom, they find an unconscious guard and realize that Whitney has already arrived. Samberly goes into the circuit room and accesses the security system. He unlocks all of the doors, and they spot one room with extra security.

Whitney, Calvin, and the two men that Joseph supplied search every room for the bombs.

As the team heads through the corridors, Samberly picks up Whitney's people on his motion sensor. Rose says that she has it and confronts one of the men. He comes at her with a knife and she punches him.

Peggy and the others find the room with the warheads, and Samberly detects someone coming toward them. Samberly tries to relock the door, and ends up locking Jarvis in the room with the warheads. The scientist can't get it open, and Peggy tells Daniel to talk Jarvis through the procedure while she deals with their opponents. Once she leaves, Daniel tells Jarvis to calm down and then walks him through the procedure.

Peggy attacks Joseph's second man.

Jarvis opens one of the warheads, puts on the protective gloves, and starts removing the core. Meanwhile, Samberly admits that he's not doing well. Rose returns and tells him to calm down, assuring him that he's the smartest person in the building and he's got it.

As he works, Samberly starts to invite Rose to dinner and she tells him to focus on opening the door.

Following Daniel's instructions, Jarvis puts the core in the case they brought along and starts working on the second warhead.

Peggy finally knocks out her opponent and radios to Daniel that she's going after Whitney. She follows their voices to where Calvin and Whitney are arguing about whether to stay.

Rose asks Daniel if he wants her to back Peggy up, and Daniel says that they have to focus on getting the bombs out.

Peggy confronts Whitney and Calvin, and Peggy says that the SSR can fix Whitney's condition. She says that she doesn't want to be fixed and reaches for Peggy, who ducks her grasp and punches her. Whitney barely notices.

Samberly gets the door open and a stunned Jarvis walks out. Daniel tells Rose to get the others out and goes to find Peggy. He calls to Peggy that they have the rods on the radio, and Whitney hears him. Furious, she grabs Peggy's arm, and Peggy manages to break her grip just in time. The effort knocks her back over a railing, and she grabs the remains of the railing. Whitney walks over and knocks her hand loose, and Peggy falls down and lands on a block of rebar. Daniel arrives and tells her to stay calm, while Whitney and Calvin escape.

The team takes Peggy to Violet's house and warn that a hospital wouldn't be safe. Violet takes charge and puts the team to work.

Daniel stares at Peggy, concerned, and finally goes to get linens. Violet pours antiseptic on Peggy's wounds as the agent screams in pain.

At home, Whitney tells Calvin to call Hugh and convince him that they need uranium to run the test. Calvin finally snaps and says that he won't put himself in a ridiculous situation again where he may die. Whitney tries to calm him down, but Calvin points out that he's now at the mercy of an underworld mobster. He blames Whitney, pointing out that the mission was a discovery. Whitney grabs him by the throat and tells Calvin to watch his tone, and then releases him and walks away.

After Violet does what she can, Daniel calls Samberly and Rose and assure them that Peggy will be okay. Peggy wakes up and Daniel tells her that they've secured the uranium rods. As Violet listens from the door, unseen, Daniel says that Peggy scared him getting hurt. The nurse interrupts and says that Peggy's bleeding is under control, and she needs to rest. Jarvis comes

in and helps Peggy out to the car. Once they're gone, Daniel thanks Violet for her help. She says that Daniel didn't tell her that he ran away from New York to get away from Peggy. Violet figures that Daniel is in love with Peggy, and asks him for the truth.

Calvin looks in on his sleeping wife, and then calls an emergency meeting of the Council. He insists that they're going to want to hear what he has to say.

Jarvis tucks Peggy in and tells her to get some rest, as Jason looks on. Once the butler leaves, Jason says that the place zero matter comes from is dark and painful. He puts off saying how he knows, and Peggy turns on some music. It's playing Jason's song from the club, and he suddenly fades out of sight.

Peggy suggests that he build a containment unit like the one he built for the zero matter at Isodyne, Jason points out that he doesn't have a material form to contain, and Peggy suggests that she replicate what happened when he touched Jane's tissue sample. However, there's only one place left to find zero matter.

Whitney is in her dressing room talking to her mirror, and Calvin comes in and asks if she's okay. His wife says that she isn't, and points out that everything has gone wrong since the containment unit shattered at Isodyne. Calvin tells her that he's arranged for a meeting between Whitney and the Council of Nine to rectify his mistakes, and insists that she is the one who has to explain the importance of zero matter. Everyone will be in attendance at the fundraiser at the MacArthur grand Hotel, and Whitney hugs Calvin and thanks her.

At the Stark estate, Jarvis checks Peggy's wound as Ana looks on. Once he's done, Peggy says that she's going to the lab. Ana points out that she should be resting, but Peggy says that the job needs finishing. In the lab, Daniel greets Peggy and she realizes that he looks terrible. She asks if anything is the matter, but he refuses to answer the question. Peggy says that Jason is losing his foothold on reality, and they need to get a sample of zero matter. She plans to get the sample from Whitney at the campaign fundraiser, and Howard has received two tickets. Daniel points out that Peggy can barely walk and Whitney knows both her and Jarvis.

Rose is on a flight home, and Daniel points out that they can't trust anyone else at the SSR. He says that they need a highly skilled unknown face, and Peggy realizes that there is one person.

Later, a psychiatrist, Dr. Wexford, comes to see Dottie for her psychological evaluation. It's Peggy in disguise, and Peggy dismisses the guard. Once they're alone, Dottie realizes that

Peggy is injured. Peggy says that no one connected with Leviathan has asked for Dottie's release, and Dottie figures that Peggy is going behind someone's back because she needs her help.

Jason talks Ana through making the containment unit, and he worries that so much can go wrong. He describes the danger that Dottie and Jarvis will face, and assures her that everything will be fine. Jarvis comes in and asks his wife for his cufflinks, and says that he has a lot of responsibility leading a mission. Ana drops the components, upset, and excuses herself.

Peggy shows Dottie the Atlas Club pin and asks why she was trying to steal it, and Dottie suggests that it's more than a pin. She refuses to say anything more, and Peggy promises to help negotiate Dottie's deportation in return for her help. Dottie immediately agrees, and warns that Peggy can never be prepared for her to run. Satisfied, Peggy gives Dottie a device to get through the door, and tells her to follow her out. Once the guard lets her out, Dottie opens the device and works out that it's two halves of a magnet. She uses them to open the door and finds the guard drugged unconscious. Dottie makes her way out and runs into an alleyway... and Daniel is waiting for a net gun. He shoots a charge of electricity into the net, and Peggy gives Dottie one more charge shot for good measure.

Back at the estate, Dottie wakes up and finds herself tied to a chair beneath a hairdresser. Peggy explains that they will put a diamond choker on Dottie, and it's equipped with a tracking device. If Dottie tries to remove it then it will inject a neurotoxin that will kill her in 35 seconds. Jarvis comes in and asks Peggy what type of firearm he'll be carrying. Peggy says that he won't have a gun because Dottie would take it from him, and points out that Dottie has already stolen Jarvis' wristwatch. He asks for a knife or a sword cane, and Peggy turns on the hairdryer so that she and Jarvis can have a private conversation.

Whitney is making herself up for the fundraiser and finally tells Calvin that she can't go. The crack on her face is growing, and Whitney warns that she can't be seen in public. Calvin finds a veil for her to wear, covering the cracked side of her face, and assures her that she looks wonderful. Whitney admits that she's nervous and thanks Calvin, and promises to thank him properly later.

Peggy shows Dottie a magazine with Whitney's photo on it, and says that she's the target. Dottie is more interested in Jason, but Peggy says that Dottie will obtain a blood sample from Whitney without attracting attention. She tells Dottie not to let Whitney touch her, and gives her the vacuum extractor. Peggy and Daniel will monitor the operation from a surveillance van outside, and will stay in contact via concealed two-way radios. She sends Jason out and tries to touch him, and discovers that he's intangible.

Later, Peggy and Daniel pull up outside the hotel in the van. They establish contact with Jarvis, who has his radio hidden in his glasses. He's dancing with Dottie, and they spot Whitney and Calvin across the dance floor. Jack comes in and Dottie tries to go over to him, but Jarvis quickly pulls her back. Meanwhile, Jack and Vernon meet with Calvin, who promises Jack more money and resources. Vernon says that Jack led the team that captured Dottie, and Whitney flirts with him.

Jarvis finds an isolated spot and tells Peggy and Daniel what Jack is doing. He wants to abort the mission, but Peggy says that it's their only chance. Jarvis agrees and discovers that Dottie has slipped away.

Vernon and Jack talk privately, and Vernon points out some of the powerful men attending the fundraiser. He says that they're starting to know Jack's name, just as Hugh comes over. Hugh remembers Jack coming to his office and disrupting things, and Vernon says that Peggy broke into the Roxxon facility. Jack assures the two men that he didn't know about the operation, and Vernon sends Hugh away. He then warns Jack that Peggy is disobeying his direct orders, and tells him to get her under control if he wants to impress Hugh and the others.

Jarvis finds Dottie, and Peggy tells Jarvis to keep Jack occupied while Dottie gets the sample. The butler irritably tells Dottie to follow instructions and she mock-salutes him. They spot Whitney heading for the powder room and Jarvis tells Dottie to follow his lead.

Jack is at the bar and a woman, Melody, flirts with him. Jarvis comes over to Jack as Dottie goes after Whitney, and explains that Howard is a contributor. Jack asks where Peggy is, and Jarvis claims that she's at the estate. Skeptical, Jack goes to check the perimeter and Jarvis asks if it's a good idea for Jack to cause an uproar at his employer's party. Jack insists that he serves the federal government, and insists that once Calvin is elected then they'll work together. Jarvis warns him that he's out of his depth, and Jack sarcastically gives him butler tips.

Dottie bumps into Whitney and apologizes, fiddling with her broach. Whitney says that she didn't feel a thing and leaves, and Jack and Peggy get static over the radio... since Dottie has removed the hidden radio and put it next to the running faucet.

As Dottie heads out, she hears Hugh and the others approaching and cusk into their conference room. She hides in a wardrobe as the men come in. Calvin escorts Whitney in and she says that she was wrong about zero matter. Whitney tells the Council that the discovery is about power, not energy, and removes her veil to show the crack in her face. She then opens a hat box and takes out a rat, and absorbs it into her body.

Thomas says that they're all in agreement on how to proceed, and Calvin tells Whitney that she was perfect. Security men come in and use restraints collars on Whitney, and she realizes that Calvin betrayed her. Concentrating, Whitney transmutes the two men from a distance and absorbs them, and then kills Thomas and half the council. As Hugh and the survivors stare at her, Whitney advances on Calvin and says that she trusted him. She kills him and then turns to the remaining Council members and tells Hugh that she needs unrestricted access to all Roxxon facilities. He immediately agrees, and Whitney tells him to inform Vernon that she's now in charge. The actress then says that she kept them alive because they can contribute to her plans, and she will give them unlimited power as long as they remain loyal to her. Hugh speaks up and says that he's looking forward to their collaboration. Satisfied, Whitney adjourns the meeting.

Jarvis slips away and goes looking for Dottie. Peggy prepares to go in, saying that she'll improvise, but pops her stitches trying to open the door. Daniel helps her sit down and tells her that she'll have to put her faith in others.

Once Whitney and the Council leaves, Dottie emerges from the wardrobe and looks at the sample she took. She walks out and comes face-to-face with Vernon and his men. He tells them to capture Dottie, and she runs for it.

Peggy mentions that she'll need another appointment with Violet, and realizes that something is wrong. Daniel finally says that Violet broke off the engagement. Jarvis listens on the radio as Daniel says that he messed up. Peggy wants to tell Violet that she's making a mistake, and Daniel finally tells her that Violet broke it off because she thinks he's in love with Peggy. The British agent blames herself for messing up Daniel's life, apologizes, and takes his hand. After a moment, they start to kiss... and then van shakes. The radio is knocked off on the floor, breaking, and Jarvis realizes that he's been cut off.

Peggy and Daniel go outside and find a dead man on the top of the van. Upstairs in the hotel, Dottie is fighting the second man and takes him down. Jack comes up behind her and knocks her out... unaware that the sample syringe is laying nearby.

Jarvis joins Peggy and Daniel, and gives them the sample that he recovered. Daniel explains that the receiver to track Dottie was destroyed, and Jarvis warns that can't get back in because the hotel escorted him out. The guests are leaving, and Peggy reluctantly admits that they have to go.

Hugh breaks the news to Vernon and tells him to get the package to Whitney immediately. Once Hugh leaves, Vernon complains to Jack that Peggy messed everything up. He knows that a disguised Peggy released Dottie, and tells Jack that he's going to have to take Jack out. Jack refuses to kill her, and Vernon says that they can't turn her into a martyr. He needs Jack to discredit her so her work becomes invalid. Jack warns that present a whole new set of problems, and Vernon figures that Peggy has something on Jack. He tells Jack that the only way to fight leverage is with leverage, and warns that if Jack can't find a way to take Peggy down then he'll have to question whether to promote Jack. Jack says that there is no question, and Vernon leaves.

Peggy and Daniel return to the lab, and Jason studies the zero matter sample. Peggy says that they'll have to start work on the containment unit later because their first priority is finding Dottie. Jarvis comes in and says that Jack is there. Daniel warns Peggy that she shouldn't go, but she says that she can handle Jack.

Once Peggy changes into a bathrobe, she meets with Jack. He asks her about her Wexford identity and Peggy feigns ignorance. Jack says that he knows what she's doing, and orders her to come back to New York with him. Peggy refuses and Jack warns that she's in too deep. She insists that she won't lose betting on what she knows, and Jack warns that she will lose and she'll never see it coming.

Whitney checks briefly on Dottie, who is locked up in a crate, and then leaves.

Summary: While Peggy and Jarvis go to rescue Dottie from Whitney, Whitney initiates a plan of her own while securing her position as the new head of the Council of Nine.



Guards escort a veiled Whitney to a press conference outside the studio, and she announces that Calvin and several of his friends died in a boating accident. Peggy and Daniel are watching from the crowd, and Whitney sees them. She insists that she will come through the tragedy stronger than ever, and then goes back into the studio. As they walk away, Peggy figures that something happened at the Council meeting, and Dottie is still alive. She believes that Whitney will conclude that Dottie is more use to her alive

than dead, and will try to use Dottie against them if she can. As Peggy goes to check on Jarvis, Daniel says that they talk about... things. They awkwardly agree and to do so later.

Dottie watches as Vernon lays out torture instruments. She assures him that he has nothing that can get her to talk, and he explains that he learned torture techniques from a German interrogator. Dottie says that she's pulled out her own teeth, nails, and hair, and tells Vernon that he's wasting his time. Angry, Vernon demands to know what Peggy is looking for, and Dottie points out that he's afraid of Whitney. He injects Dottie with truth serum, and she just smiles.

At the Stark estate, Jason instructs Ana on building the containment unit. He briefly fades out, and Ana points out that it's happening more frequently. Peggy arrives and asks Jason how he's doing, and he deliberately lies, claiming that he's doing grant.

Jarvis finishes repairing the transponder, but it doesn't pick up the locator on Dottie's necklace. Peggy figures that she's out of range and suggests that they get to a higher elevation. Jason doesn't see the point in rescuing a Russian spy, but Peggy points out that Dottie is her responsibility. The scientist suggests that they activate the kill switch on the necklace, and explains that he's facing much worse than death. After a moment, Jason apologizes and says that he's not thinking straight, and they go back to work.

Dottie easily resists the truth serum, and Vernon tells her that he read about how she was tricked into helping a crazy Russian against Howard. He points out that Stalin isn't the forgiving type, and figures that she's dead to Russia. Vernon points out that Peggy would see Dottie hung if she could arrange it. Joseph comes in and tells Vernon that his presence is requested. Vernon

has no choice but to meet with Whitley. She says that she has another task for Vernon, and he wonders why Joseph is involved. Whitney says that Joseph is providing security for the Council, and they follow her orders. She reminds Vernon that his orders are to find the uranium rods that Peggy stole, insisting that she needs the rods from the original test. When Whitney lifts her veil to take a drink, she reveals the growing crack on her face. As for Dottie, she says that she'll talk to her.

Dottie is working at her bonds when Whitney comes in. Whitney says that she's no longer an actress and removes her gloves, and Dottie pretends that she's broken. When she says that they're in the same boat, Whitney says that they're nothing alike and says that she disabled the track in device on the necklace. She then grabs Dottie throats, and Dottie screams as zero matter spreads through her body and wells up in her throat. Whitney releases her grip after a moment, and Dottie tells her that she got a sample of the zero matter for Peggy. She says that Peggy wants the zero matter to restore Jason to normal, and Whitney tells her that she's still useful to her as she starts removing the necklace.

Jason enters the containment unit and Jarvis turns it on. Peggy releases the zero matter sample onto Jason's hand, and he turns solid. Writhing in pain, he falls to his knees and puts his hand down... and realizes that it's solid. Peggy reaches into the containment unit and takes Jason's hand... and he kisses her. After a moment, he says that it's a long time coming and Peggy assures him that it's okay. Jason asks for food and Ana goes to make him a meal. As they talk, the transponder activates.

Peggy calls Daniel and tells him that Dottie is in a town called Newhall. Vernon is in Daniel's office, and Daniel pretends that he's talking to his mother. Peggy realizes that Vernon is there and Daniel quickly hangs up. Vernon then says that Peggy has stolen uranium on SSR's watch, and tells Daniel that he needs to find it.

Peggy tells Jarvis that Daniel won't be coming, and Jarvis suggests that the signal is a trap. She immediately says that it is. They go out to the car and Jarvis picks up a non-lethal concussive device, the Jitterbug. He demonstrates that if they stand behind the device, they'll be protected when he activates the device. Ana hears the commotion and comes over, and hugs him. Jarvis wonders if everything is all right, and she assures him that it is. He assures her that Peggy can handle whatever comes up, and wonders if Ana wants him to go. She says that she can tell that he needs the adventure and permits him to go, and Jarvis promises that no harm will come to him. Ana tells him not to make promises that he can't keep, and he leaves with Peggy.

Daniel wonders why Roxxon is coming to them after 48 hours, and says that he can't make any promises about recovering the uranium.

Vernon suggests that Daniel accept the rewards for cleaning up the Roxxon robbery, and Daniel merely says that they'll do their best. The two men shake and Vernon leaves.

Peggy and Jarvis drive to the Chadwick ranch in Newhall, and Jarvis hints at Jason kissing Peggy earlier. She steps on the brake and tells Jarvis to say what he wants to see. Jarvis says that he was just making conversation, and Peggy says that she indulged Jason.

The butler points out that Peggy blushed, and that she has a connection with Daniel. He overheard Daniel talking about his broken engagement, and assures Peggy that he never thought she was toying with two men. However, Jarvis points out that she now has two suitors and doesn't envy her position, and Peggy insists that she never intended to encourage either man's affections. The butler says that he's not surprised, and Peggy admits that she is. She doesn't know what to do, and after a moment Jarvis drive son.

That night at the Chadwick ranch, Jarvis slips inside the compound. A guard orders him to stop, and Peggy knocks him out from behind. More guards come over and Jarvis triggers the Jitterbug when they get close enough. It fails to activate and Peggy drops her gun. The guards take Peggy and Jarvis to the basement where Dottie is being held.

Jason is enjoying Ana's Hungarian cooking from inside the containment unit. They share a toast to Peggy and Jarvis' safe return.

The guards tie up Jarvis and Peggy, and Dottie points out that Peggy risked her life to rescue her. Peggy and Dottie both work one hand free, and Dottie points out that if she gets free first then there's no telling what she'll do.

Jason asks Ana if she's all right, and she explains that Jarvis didn't tell her about his adventures with Peggy. Now she misses the lie, and then asks Jason what he's going to do next. A Jason

doesn't know what he'll do and warns that he's ten years away from discovering the secrets of zero matter.

Jarvis tries to work out why the Jitterbug didn't work, and Dottie asks Peggy what she's going to do with her once they escape.

Peggy says that she'll put her in prison, and promises to deal with Vernon. Dottie warns that the rot goes deep in the SSR, and Peggy's idealism will get them all killed. She claims that Vernon got the information from her. Jarvis works himself free first, and realizes that he entered the wrong code. The Jitterbug goes off outside, and Jarvis realizes that he entered the code for delayed detonation.

Jarvis gets Peggy free and she leads Dottie out. Dottie moans in pain and Peggy wonders why they weren't interrogated. She realizes that Whitney is the one who tortured Dottie for information, and Dottie says that the trap was meant for Jason, not Peggy. A guard gets up and Jarvis clubs him under the head. Realizing that Ana is in danger, Jarvis picks up the guard's gun and orders Dottie to move.

Ana goes to get another bottle of wine, just as Whitney breaks in and sets off the alarm. She shuts off the alarm and Ana assumes that it's a malfunction. Whitney then goes into the workshop and admires Howard's plans. Jason asks what she's doing there, and Whitney walks over to the containment unit. She admits the unit and points out that the two of them are fascinating in their own special way. Whitney wonders where Jason goes if he's no longer contained, and then says that she's there to get the uranium core.

She reaches for Jason, extending dark matter, but he starts to pull it out of her. Whitney breaks the connection just in time.

Jarvis drives back to the Stark estate at full speed. Dottie admits that she's never seen Jarvis scared before.

Whitney wonders how Jason did what he did, and he says that he has no idea. He steps out of the containment unit, still fully solid, but Whitney warns that it won't last for long. She asks him to come with each other so that they can help each other understand and control the zero matter. Jason warns that it's a force for destruction, and Whitney says that Isodyne hired Jason because he was a colored man. She says that she wants to change things for women and coloreds that have been held back. Joseph comes in and Whitney introduces him to Jason. She tells the mobster that Jason will be accompanying them, and Joseph distracts the scientist while Whitney knocks him out from behind.

Daniel calls Ana and asks if Peggy and Jarvis have returned. When she says that they haven't, Daniel says that he'll be right back.

Ana sees Whitney and Jarvis leaving, and goes after them.

As Daniel heads for the door, two masked men break in and beat him.

Ana confronts Joseph and Whitney, and tells them to let Jason go. Joseph takes out his gun, but Whitney stops him and says that it's not necessary because they're not monsters. She says that she's going to help Jason get answers about his condition, and warns that Peggy will come after her. Peggy and Jarvis pull up, and Whitney shoots Ana in the stomach to slow Peggy down. As she and Joseph drive off, Jarvis runs to Ana and calls for help.

Peggy drives Jarvis and Ana to the hospital, and puts an officer in charge of Dottie who is locked in the trunk. The doctors take Ana to the operating room and Peggy claims that it was a robbery gone wrong. The doctors have them wait outside, and a man calls for help. He says that an officer has been shot, and Peggy goes outside to discover that Dottie has escaped, leaving her necklace behind.

The next day, Daniel staggers into the SSR HQ. Vernon asks if he has any leads on the uranium theft, and Daniel says that they may never find the material. The older man says that Daniel needs a nice long rest, and he'll take over SSR operations for the foreseeable future. When Daniel objects, Vernon shoves him back and goes into Daniel's office.

Peggy calls in and is connected to Vernon. She recognizes his voice and immediately hangs up. Peggy sits down with Jarvis, who says that Ana is still in surgery. The doctors won't say if Ana will pull through, and Peggy takes her friend's hand.

She calls out that she's home from class and Jarvis quickly hangs up. As Jarvis joins her in the kitchen, he explains that he was talking to Howard's newest associate, Peggy Carter. He's surprised that Howard respects Peggy, and assures Ana that Peggy won't interfere with their lives in the least. Ana tells him not to make promises that he can't keep.

**Now** — Jarvis is in Ana's room and tries to tune in the radio. When he can't, he smashes it and Peggy ushers him over to a chair. She assures Jarvis that Ana is recovering, but Jarvis points out that the doctors can't even say if his wife will wake up. Meanwhile, she's going to go home and bring Jarvis a change of clothes so that he'll look like himself when Ana wakes up.

Jason wakes up and discovers that he's handcuffed to a pipe. Whitney is there and says that he'll lose mass in two minutes. She admits that she's studying both of them, and asks where he goes when he disappears. Whitney says that she'll let Jason go if he answers her questions, but then figures that he's stalling for time until either he fades through the handcuffs or Peggy will rescue him. Jason says that he's hoping to vanish and not come back, but Whitney doesn't believe him. She suggests that they work together examining each other, and asks if he hears the zero matter's call. Jason confirms that he hears it as well, and Whitney transfers some of her zero matter to him.

Daniel is waiting outside of Howard's estate when Peggy pulls up. She tells him what happened, and then notices that Daniel is beaten. Daniel explains that Vernon had him beaten, and that he's looking for the uranium rods. Peggy figures that it's best that they give the rods to Whitney and goes inside. She says that she needs Whitney to think she'll trade the rods for Jason, and Daniel suggests that they contact her through Joseph because his men were at Roxxon. As

Peggy changes clothes in the next room, Daniel explains that Joseph and Whitney used to be an item.

Later, Peggy and Daniel walk into Joseph's restaurant. Joseph is making supper for his mother Nonna in the kitchen, and doesn't notice Peggy and Daniel knocking out Joseph's men. They finish them off and Joseph realizes that they have company.

Jack is in London, drinking with British agent Nick Driscoll. He finally asks Nick if MI4 found the thing he was looking for. Nick says that the file is fully redacted, and says that he knows why Jack is really there: to take down the most commandoes in a bar fight. Nick goes into the bar and Jack quickly walks around the corner. He checks the file and finds a reference to Peggy being involved in a civilian massacre.

Peggy and Daniel have lunch with Joseph and Nonna, and Joseph denies everything. He admits that he had a relationship with Whitney until she dumped him for Whitney, and the agents say that they need Joseph to get a message to Whitney. Nonna complains that they're there, and Daniel points out that a man Joseph turned state evidence against is getting out in a week. Joseph says that it's a lie, and Daniel points out that the man doesn't know it. Nonna grabs a knife and tries to stab Daniel, but Joseph restrains her and sends her out of the kitchen. Once they're alone, Joseph agrees to deliver the message.

Jason goes over Whitney's notes and she insists that she can control the zero matter. Jason says that he wants it gone, but Whitney insists that it's a gift rather than a curse. She tells him that if he accepts it then he can control it. Whitney suddenly hears the voice again and tells Jason that if he listens then it will guide him. As Jason starts to listen, Joseph comes in and Whitney tells him to wait. She has Jason shut everything else out and embrace what he hears, and then asks Joseph what he wants. Joseph has her kiss him on the cheek and then says that Peggy wants to trade Jason for the uranium rods. Whitney smiles and tells Joseph to tell Peggy that she has a deal.

At the hospital, Jarvis holds an unconscious Ana's hand and talks to her. He promises that he'll protect her until his dying day if she'll wake up, Ana wakes up and tells him not to make practices that he can't, and Jarvis goes to get the doctor after he kisses her. He then calls Peggy and says that he'll keep her updated, and thanks her for her support earlier. Dr. Choi comes out and tells Jarvis that there was a great deal of internal damage. He admits that there was some damage that they couldn't repair, and Ana will never be able to have children. Choi says that Ana doesn't know yet, and Jarvis says that he'll tell Ana himself.

Jarvis goes back to Ana and lies, saying that Choi told him that she would be fine. She realizes that he's holding something back, but Jarvis insists that she's perfect.

Peggy and Daniel call Samberly to the estate and he shows them the fake uranium rods that he created. She asks Samberly to disassemble Jason's containment unit and get it on the truck. Jarvis arrives and says that Ana is at the hospital. Peggy explains that they're going to get Jason and Whitney, and tells him to go back to his wife. He demands to know what Peggy has planned, and insists that he's coming with them to make sure that Whitney pays for shooting Ana. Howard's telex goes off and prints design specifications. They show it to Samberly, who says that Howard wants him to build a machine. Samberly realizes that it's a cannon that fires high-energy gamma photons, and figures that it could eliminate zero matter... and possibly kill Whitney. He says that he can build it but isn't sure how long it will take, and goes to work. Jarvis volunteers his services as a drive since Samberly isn't available.

As the trio leaves, they find Jack waiting for them. He asks Daniel and Jarvis to give them a moment alone, and then shows Peggy the file and says that now he has something on her. If she comes with him back to New York then he won't say anything. She wonders if Vernon put him up to it, and points out that he's trying to discredit her. Peggy insists that the report is a forgery, and insists that she wouldn't betray Jack's trust. She tells Jack that he's better than that and leaves.

Whitney joins Joseph at the garage, who assures her that she's more beautiful than the day he met her. He says that the mark on her face is power, and that's what makes her beautiful. He removes the veil and tells her that she should never have to hide it from the rest of the world. As Whitney starts to kiss Joseph, Peggy and the others pull up in a truck. Joseph's men bring Jason out, and Jarvis backs the truck up to the garage. Peggy and Daniel are in the back, and Jason tells Peggy not to make the trade. Whitney demands to see the rods, and Peggy brings the case out. Joseph uses a Geiger counter on the rods and confirms that they're legitimate, and

Whitney's men hand Jason over. As he goes, she reminds him that in less than a minute he'll have to confine himself in the containment unit again.

Joseph's men drop the case, spilling out the rods, and Whitney realizes that they're fakes. Jarvis rives away and as Joseph's men open fire at them and then follow them in their car. In the back, Jason gets into the containment unit and Peggy explains that Howard sent specifications for a gamma cannon. The scientist warns how dangerous they are, and insists that they have to destroy the rods. Daniel says that the rods are safe, and Peggy realizes that Joseph's men aren't closing in on them. Jason leaves the containment unit and grabs Daniel's shotgun, and demands the rods. She refuses and tells Jason that he'll have to kill her, and Jason prepares to shoot her. He asks Daniel where the rods are, and says that he knows how Daniel feels about Peggy. Daniel says that the rods are in the wall safe at the SSR lab, and Jason phases through the truck wall. Peggy has Jarvis pull over, and they watch as Jarvis gets into the pursuing car.

Jack meets with Vernon and shows him the file on Peggy. He says that he's worried that the file is too good to be true, and Vernon says that it doesn't matter as long as it's official. An officer comes in and says that there's an urgent call from a woman, and she knew Vernon's access code. Vernon asks Jack to step out and takes the call, and Jack secretly listens in on another line. It's Whitney, telling Vernon to bring her the uranium rods.

Vernon goes to the lab and opens the wall safe. Jack steps out of the shadows and says that he won't let Vernon take the rods.

Vernon admits that he's underestimated him and comes over, and Jack tells him to stop and flashes his holstered gun.

Peggy and Daniel enter the lab a few minutes later and find Jack in the lab. He has no idea why he's there, and they realize that someone used the memory-wiping device on him. Daniel confirms that the rods are gone, and Jack remembers that he was on the phone.

They go back to the bullpen and finds Jack's handwritten coordinates on a notepad. Peggy figures that they can find Whitney there.

Jack goes into his office to get his shotgun, and Daniel and Peggy suggests that he stay there in case Vernon returns. When Jack realizes that they don't trust him, he says that he's with them instead of heading out with Vernon. Peggy agrees to take him along, and Daniel warns Peggy that Jason is now a hostile, not a hostage. He figures that Jason is desperate and they need to set their personal feelings aside. Peggy tells him that Daniel let his personal feelings get in the way by telling Jason where the rods were, and figures that Penny would have let Jason shoot him if the situation was reversed.

Samberly arrives at the cover office and meets with Rose. H assures her that the gamma cannon will work and warns that the mission will be dangerous. Jarvis comes in and asks for a moment alone with Rose. Once Samberly leaves, Jarvis asks rose to look after Ana while he's gone. She agrees, and Jarvis gives her Ana's favorite things from a case, including a bundle of papers. Rose wonders how long he'll be gone, but Jarvis refuses to answer. She sees the papers and hugs him, and promises that she'll keep Ana safe, just as Peggy, Jack, and Daniel come through.

The team drives out into the desert to the coordinates. Jack figures that Whitney has a 90-minute lead on them. Peggy notices that Jarvis appears distracted, but he insists that he's fine.

Whitney is preparing to set off the same bomb that opened the rift originally. She gets in the car with Jason and assures him that when the rift opens, the two of them will absorb the zero matter that comes out. Jason worries that he's thrown away everything for nothing, but Whitney says that they both know it will work because the whisper in their heads say it will. With that, she orders Vernon to detonate the bomb.

As Peggy and the others approach, a blast wave from the bomb approaches them.

Jason and Whitney drive toward the rift.

When the dust clears, Peggy and Jarvis see the rift in the sky and realize that they're too late.

Whitney and Jason drive up to the rift and get out. It's pulling m matter, and only Jason hears the voice. He drifts off the ground into the rift, and Whitney is furious that it isn't her.

Somberly sets up the gamma cannon and admits that he isn't sure if it will close the rift. Jarvis asks about Whitney, and Peggy says that they have to close the rift first. Whitney tells them to wait because she needs Peggy to control Jason because he has what she needs. With that, Joseph's men knock Peggy and Jarvis unconscious.

Daniel and Jason join Peggy, who sings about how both men are a nice distraction but it's up to her. Everyone asks Peggy what she's going to do, and a tuxedo-wearing Jarvis interrupts to tell her to wake up and Rose punches her.

Peggy wakes up and finds herself tied up in the back of a truck with Jarvis.

Jack, Daniel, and Samberly wait and wonder if Peggy and Jarvis are coming back for them with the vehicles. A SSR car drives toward them, and they realize that it's two of Vernon's men, Vega and Blackwell. Jack says that he has a plan.

She frees herself, Peggy unties Jarvis as he wakes up. She doesn't want to hear his explanation for why he shot Whitney, and Jarvis insists that she deserves to die. Peggy tells Jarvis to finish untying himself and checks the truck for a way out of their predicament.

Vega and Blackwell pull up and discover that Daniel is training a gun on Vega. Daniel tells them that Jack is under arrest, and the agents turn their guns on Daniel and Samberly. Jack says that Vernon sent the agents to shoot whoever fired the gamma cannon. Vega admits that he's supposed to kill Jack as well, but Jack insists that he followed Peggy out to the desert to stop her. After a moment, Vega and Blackwell lower their guns and put Daniel and Samberly in the car. When Daniel objects, Jack punches him in the gut.

Once Jarvis unties himself, he and Peggy try to get the back only to discover that their chains are shut. Peggy removes her bullet and reveals a hotwire gadget. She uses it to burn through the chains, and then tosses Jarvis out onto the road. Peggy jumps out as well and orders Jarvis off the side of the road. He points out that they're in the middle of the desert, and Peggy says that they start walking. Jarvis complains but has no other options so he follows after her.

Whitney and the others drive back to LA, and Jason wakes up in the back of Whitney's car, his eyes a solid black. Jason says that he's not well, and Whitney asks him what he saw in the rift. The scientist says that he just saw blackness, and Whitney wonders why he came back. After a moment, Jason's skull shrinks to its normal size. He warns them that they can't take him to a populated area, and tries to get out. Whitney says that Jason needs a lesson in doing what he's told, and Joseph's thugs drag him out. They open the back to show Jason their hostages, and realize that Peggy and Jarvis have escaped. Joseph kills the truck driver for his failure and then turns the gun on Jason and orders him back in the car. He tells Whitney that he'll send some men back to find their missing hostages and they drive off.

Peggy and Jarvis continue across the desert and Jarvis points out that they haven't seen anyone. She says that she isn't interested in his opinion, and Jarvis says that he won't apologize for doing the right thing. Jarvis points out that she saved Dottie to assuage her conscience and Ana paid the price. He snaps at her that everyone around her dies, and then apologizes. Peggy stops and tells Jarvis that he's begged her to bring him along on her missions, but he knows nothing of loss and his wife will survive. She starts walking again, and Jarvis tells Peggy that Ana can't have children because of her injuries. Peggy goes back and apologizes, and Jarvis admits that nobody knows, including Ana, because she's married to a coward who can't tell her the truth. He apologizes for shooting Whitney, and Peggy assures him that there's no need to apologize. They hear a truck approaching and realize that it's Joseph's men.

The truck pulls to a stop and finds Jarvis tending to an unconscious Peggy. He says that Peggy collapsed, and one of the thugs take Jarvis to the truck while the other one starts to pick up Peggy. Peggy knocks him out and then takes his gun and captures the other man. They leave the two thugs off and Peggy tells Jarvis that he needs to be with his wife.

At the SSR, Vernon comes to the cells and finds Jack watching Daniel and Samberly in a cell. Vernon demands an explanation for why they're still alive, and Vega says that they were following Jack's orders. Jack tells Vernon about the gamma cannon and says that their prisoners can repair it. He points out that Vernon can use the gamma cannon on Whitney, and Vernon sends Vega out. Once they're alone, Jack says that they fix the cannon, take it to Whitney, and shoot it at her. Vernon wonders if Daniel will cooperate, and Jack points out that Daniel's career is on the line. Daniel admits that he'll stay quiet if they take down Whitney because she's too dangerous to stay free, and Samberly eagerly pledges his support. Jack tells Vernon that he's with him whether he wants Daniel and Samberly to live or die. After a moment, Vernon says that they'll do it Jack's way. Once Vernon leaves, Jack releases Daniel and Samberly and says that it went as well as could be expected. As for punching him in the desert, Jack says that he had to sell it.

Joseph takes Whitney to a waste-management facility, and she assures him that it's perfect. She kisses Joseph and they go inside.

Joseph's men have set up the lab equipment from Isodyne, and tied up Jason to a gurney. Jason insists that he's not safe and can't fight it much longer, and Whitney says that he doesn't have to fight it. She plans to take the zero matter from him, and then rams a large syringe into Jason's chest.

Peggy enters the SSR and strides into Vernon's office. She punches him and demands to know where Daniel and Jack are. Daniel and Jack run in and stop her, and Jack says that Vernon is an integral part of their operation. They take her to the lab where Samberly is working on the gamma cannon, and Peggy warns that they can't trust Vernon. She wonders what happens once Vernon eliminates Whitney, and Vernon says that he won't kill her because he doesn't have to.

He has dirt on all of them, and he'll take down anyone who tries to take him down. Daniel is okay with using Vernon to take down Whitney, and Vernon figures that Peggy will play ball. He warns that Whitney is demanding the gamma cannon, and Samberly warns that he needs another hour. Jack volunteers to go and tell Whitney in person.

Whitney is unable to extract any zero matter from Jason. Joseph suggests that they give Jason a break before his heart gives out, and Whitney reluctantly agrees. Jason warns that the zero matter will kill her, just as Jack arrives. He introduces himself and explains that he volunteered to come. Jack turns on the charm and Whitney tells Joseph to back off. He tells Whitney that she can deal with Jack herself and leaves with his men. Once they're gone, Whitney demands the gamma cannon. Jack says that it's at the SSR undergoes repairs and he's there to buy time to get it fixed. He admits that Vernon plans to use the gamma cannon on Whitney, but he has another idea. Jack offers to bring Whitney the cannon and Vernon, and in return he gets a seat on the Council.

Later, Jack meets the others and says that Whitney bought it. Peggy figures that he's up to something, and Vernon is surprised that Jack got out alive. Daniel and Samberly bring the cannon components, and Samberly explains how to fire the cannon. Jack and Vernon drive off in the truck, and Peggy and Daniel get in their car to provide escort. Their car doesn't start, and Jack doesn't respond on the radio. Daniel confirms that the fuel line is cut. They find Samberly talking to Rose and tell him what happened, Samberly says that Jack told him to secretly turn the cannon into a bomb. They realize that the bomb will kill everyone, including Jason, and the bomb is on a remote trigger. Peggy confirms that Samberly can build a jammer to block the trigger, and Rose tells him to get going.

At the hospital, Jarvis fusses over Ana. She asks where Peggy is and if Jason is safe, and Jarvis ignores her questions and suggests that they take a holiday. Ana points out that he hates holidays, and Jarvis finally tells his wife what is happening. She wonders why Jarvis isn't helping Peggy, and Jarvis says that he's there because Ana needs him. Ana points out that she has doctors and nurses, but Peggy only has Jarvis. She orders Jarvis to render any assistance that he can, and Jarvis agrees. Once he does, Ana asks what else he's not telling her. Jarvis braces himself and then tells her the truth.

Peggy, Daniel, and Samberly get to the plant and confirm that Whitney's people have the cannon. Samberly is unable to get the jammer to work, Peggy slips inside to rescue Jason.

Inside the plant, Jack and Vernon deliver the cannon to Whitney. She says that she's going to take the zero matter from Jason.

Vernon goes over and activates the cannon.

Peggy slips into the plant and finds. He tells her to leave, warning that he can't hold it back for long. Jason says that he doesn't deserve her help, and says that everything he did was of his own volition.

Vernon aims the cannon at Whitney, but she shuts it down. Jack draws a gun on Vernon and says that there's been a change of plans.

Jason warns that something cataclysmic is happening to him, but Peggy refuses to abandon him. She helps him toward the door, but when she goes through, Jason locks it behind her and says that he's ready for it to be over. He tells her to go and runs back.

Somberly finishes the jammer, and Daniel looks for Peggy through the binoculars.

Vernon warns Jack that he's making a mistake, but they can still walk out together. Jack says that he appreciates everything Vernon has done for him, and he's learned that he should never let a good opportunity go by. He leaves Vernon to Whitney and says that they have a lot to talk about. Once Jack goes outside, he gets clear and activates the trigger. Nothing happens, and Jack realizes that Peggy is responsible. He finds Daniel and tells him to shut down the jammer, just as Peggy arrives. She insists that Jason is innocent, but Jack says that he's doing what needs to be done. Jack warns that Jason is more dangerous than all of the others put together, and tells Samberly to shut down the jammer. He draws a gun on the scientist, and the man quickly turns it off. Jack prepares to activate the trigger, and Peggy aims her gun at him and tells him to put it down.

Whitney lets the zero matter start consuming Vernon, who insists that Jack doesn't have the power to help her. He sees the trigger light on the cannon and realizes what the others did, and tells Whitney that they got her. She releases Vernon and goes to the bomb, just as Jason staggers in and the zero matter explodes from his body.

Jack tells them that the detonator is still armed, and they go inside. There is zero matter on the floor and the gamma cannon is intact. They find Jason buried in the rubble, and he realizes that he's all right.

They figure that Jason expelled the zero matter from his body, and he gets to his feet. The zero matter moves across the floor toward where Whitney is buried in the rubble. She absorbs the zero matter and says that everything is where it belongs. Whitney advances on them, and Peggy says that they have to move because bullets won't stop Whitney.

The team heads to the car and discover that it's gone along with Samberly. Whitney comes after them and says that she knows where they're going. Jarvis and Howard ram her with Howard's car, and Samberly pulls up and apologizes for getting turned around. Everyone gets into the cars and they drive off as Whitney recovers.

The team returns to headquarters and Jack gets Vega to give up all of the agents on Vernon's payroll. In the lab, Jason describes what he felt in the other dimension, and it felt like nothing. Howard is disappointed that there was nothing there, and Jason explains that zero matter consumed everything there. It will spread to their world by "infecting" it through Whitney. Howard confirms that Jason is clean of zero matter, and Jason admits that with everything he's done, he's not sure that he can go back to his old life.

Whitney is in her room putting paper on the wall. Joseph comes in and suggests that they get something to eat, but Whitney says that she is going to open the door for the zero matter and this time it will stay open. When the mobster puts a hand on her shoulder, Whitney brushes him off and warns him not to touch her when she's working. She goes back to work writing down formula on the paper, and Joseph leaves. He meets with his mother Nonna and wonders what to

do now that Whitney is rejecting her. Nonna tells him to make Whitney mind her manners, but Joseph says that something has hold of Whitney. He insists that he loves Whitney, and Nonna tells her son to make a deal with the devil.

At the Stark estate, Howard, Jason, and Peggy are having lunch outside. Jason warns that even if they use the gamma cannon to separate Whitney from the zero matter, the zero matter will still be on Earth. Howard suggests that Jason create a new containment unit and they take the zero matter to Stark Labs, and Peggy points out that Howard is only in it for himself. Joseph brings Jarvis out at gunpoint, and then Howard and Joseph share a laugh and hug. Jason explains that Joseph helped Whitney capture him, and Joseph admits that it was wrong. He holsters his gun and says that they're all worried about Whitney. They have lunch and Joseph asks them to save Whitney. He insists that the zero matter is changing her, but Jason insists that Whitney is consumed with a lust for power.

Joseph explains that Whitney is writing down formulas and preparing to open the rift, and Jason figures that she figured out a way to do it without an atomic explosion. Peggy suggests that they have to end it once for all by opening the rift, knocking the zero matter out of Whitney, and send it back to its point of origin. Jason warns that isn't that easy, and Howard suggests that they steal Whitney's research and use it. Joseph warns that Whitney never leaves her room, and Peggy tells him that she'll have to give Whitney a reason to.

That night, Joseph goes to Whitney's room and finds her muttering over the formula. She tells him to leave her alone, and Joseph says that he needs her help getting some information out of one of his guys. Whitney realizes that he wants her to be his muscle, and she says that she'll help him. Joseph goes out and gestures Peggy and Daniel back.

Joseph brings one of his men, Hank, into the study and tells him that he'll make it up to him. Whitney comes in and Joseph accuses him of working for his rival. Hank denies it and Joseph punches him, and Whitney offers to use her powers on Hank.

Peggy and Daniel enter Whitney's room and take photos of the formulas. As they work, Daniel takes a photo of Peggy as a souvenir for her. He says that he's glad they got to work together, and Peggy doesn't know what to say.

Joseph keeps beating Hank, who swears that he isn't a traitor. Whitney says that she's going back to work, and Joseph asks her to scare Hank with the zero matter. Exasperated, Whitney reaches for Hank. He says that he's cooperating with the Feds because they threatened his family. Joseph is shocked to realize that Hank is actually a traitor. Whitney heads back to her room, and Joseph goes after her.

Peggy and Daniel hear Joseph calling to Whitney, and Daniel pauses to change one of the formulas. The agents get out the window just in time as Whitney comes in. She tells Joseph not to interrupt her again and goes back to work.

Back at the SSR, Jason, Samberly, and Howard examine the formula and arguing about what to call the machine Whitney was creating to open the rift. Howard warns that the design is incredibly complex, but they don't know how to stop more zero matter from coming through. Peggy flatters the three men and they come up with the idea of using x-rays to contain the zero matter. They need a large empty space, and Jarvis suggests that they use the Stark Acres studio. Jason says that Whitney will sense what they're doing and they go to work.

Later, Rose helps the scientists with their work and Howard flirts with her. As they work, Jason apologizes to Daniel. The agent asks Jason threatened Peggy instead of him, and Jason says that he realized that he knew Daniel would fold because he would have.

Meanwhile, Peggy asks Jarvis how Ana is feeling. He says that his wife is fine and she can come home in a day or two, and Jarvis tells his friend that he and Ana had a good cry about her losing her ability to have children. When he says that Ana is stronger than him, Peggy assures him that he may be the strongest of them all.

Jack comes in and offers his help, and Peggy suggests that he get their dinner orders. After a moment, Jack agrees. He goes back to his office to place an order by phone, and then checks Vernon's case. Inside is an Atlas Club pin like the one that Dottie stole, and Jack discovers that it's a key.

The next morning at the studio, the team sets up their equipment. Jason draws a no-go zone 20' from the generator, and warns that when the rift closes, anything within the zone will be sucked in. Howard turns on the generator and a contained rift opens.

In her room, Whitney senses the rift opening.

As they wait for Whitney to arrive, Howard practices his drive. Samberly checks the x-ray generators, and Jack asks Peggy what her gut tells her about him. He figures that Peggy will turn him in for siding with Vernon, and Peggy says that Vernon took advantage of Jack's ambition. She tells him that he's a good man at heart, and Jack gives her the pin key. He says that they'll have to figure out what it opens... together.

Samberly is adjusting the generator and Whitney comes up behind him. She walks past him to the rift, and Samberly screams. Peggy hears him but the scientist doesn't respond on the radio. Daniel spots Whitney heading for the rift and warns the others. Whitney approaches the rift and Howard fires the gamma cannon at her. The zero matter leaves her body and enters the rift, and Whitney screams in frustration. Jack handcuffs her and takes her to the car with Daniel, and Howard tells Peggy that the radio controller isn't responding. Howard suggests that they use the manual override to shut down the generator, but the crank is on the device.

Whoever shuts it down will be in the danger zone when the rift closes. Peggy volunteers, but Howard says that it's his device and his design flaw. Jason, Jack, and Jarvis all volunteer as well... but Daniel ties a power cable around his chest and goes in.

The team watches as Daniel approaches the generator. The cable is just long enough, and Daniel struggles to turn the crank. Peggy suggests that they detonate the gamma cannon inside the rift, and Jack warns that Samberly took the explosives out. Jarvis runs off, and the matter in the zone starts rising into the rift. The cable comes unanchored and Peggy grabs it. The others grab her, and Daniel hangs in mid-air. He tells Peggy to let go but she refuses.

Jarvis and Samberly drive up and Jarvis says that they'll drive Howard's hover car into the rift with the gamma cannon inside.

Howard tells Samberly to get the core out of the gamma cannon, and Jarvis puts it in the car's front seat. He then lights the gas tank and starts the engine, and the car flies into the rift. The core explodes and the rift closes, and Daniel drops to the ground.

Peggy and Daniel look at each other for a moment, and then Daniel passes out.

Later at the Stark estate, Peggy and Howard argue over what to do with the technology. Jason comes in and Howard says that he expects him in the office the next Monday. The scientist explains that he's starting a new project and wants Jason to head it. Peggy offers her congratulations, and Howard goes for a swim. Jason asks if Peggy is heading back to New York, and she says that dwelling on what might have been is no way to live. The scientist points out that they never had more than half a dance, and figures that it's better than nothing.

Jarvis brings Ana home as Peggy prepares to leave. She says that she thought Ana might not want to see her after what happened, and Ana hugs her. Jarvis offers to take Peggy wherever she's going, but is shocked when Peggy says that she's already called for a taxi.

The agent says that Jarvis should stay in his wife, and he goes inside. Ana begs Peggy to let Jarvis take her or she'll never hear the end of it. When she calls to Jarvis, he runs right out.

In an insane asylum, Whitney imagines Cal returning and promising that together they'll reunite her with the zero matter. Joseph watches from the door window, holding roses, and the orderly warns that Whitney will just use them to claw her face open. The man lets Joseph in, and he calls to his beautiful girl.

Jarvis drops Peggy off at the SSR HQ, and she says that she has paperwork to finish. He points out that Los Angeles has agreed with Peggy, and wonders if she has to grow back to New York. The butler admits that he has grown fond of certain elements of the city, but Peggy says that her life is in New York. Jarvis suggests that she might need one compelling reason to stay.

In the SSR office, Daniel and Peggy finish closing the case. He points out that Peggy's actions at the rift were ill-advised and reckless, and she risked the world to save his life. Peggy is stricken speechless for a second, and then kisses Daniel.

Jack is at his hotel room packing to leave when there's a knock at the door. He answers the door... and a man shoots him in the chest with a silenced gun. He takes Vernon's files and leaves.
