Summary: A new courthouse drama that follows the chaotic, hopeful and sometimes absurd lives of its judges, prosecutors and public defenders, as they work with bailiffs, clerks and cops to get justice for the people of Los Angeles amidst a flawed legal process.



The episode starts with Lola Carmichael on her last day as lawyer before starting her new job as a superior court judge of LA county. Her friend and colleague Mark Callan meets with her and tries to convince her not to take the job. As they head to court for the trial of Daphne Rivas, arrested for multiple parking tickets, Carmichael becomes outraged at the bailiff officer for bringing her to court with no trousers on.

She confronts the man which causes him to angrily snap and pull a gun out. Just as he is about to shoot the judge, Bailiff Officer Luke Watkins shoots him.

Lopez, a defence lawyer present during the incident, later meets with him and thanks him for what he did.

Carmichael's first day as Judge finally arrives as Judge Benner gets her up to speed with everything, including who she appointed as her judiciary assistant — Sherri Kansky. This doesn't please Carmichael at all as stern Kansky filed a complaint against her previously.

Carmichael makes her way to the courtroom for the first time but unfortunately trips on the steps leading to her chair. Daphne, the same woman arrested on the day of the shooting, is back but this time for residential burglary and Lopez is her appointed lawyer. However, Daphne claims not to have done it and Lopez also reveals that she's pregnant. The prosecutor has advised her to

take a plea bargain as if she went to trial she could get 4 years. As Daphne is adamant that she wasn't even there, Carmichael refuses to accept the plea and decides to take the case to trial.

The day of Daphne's trial arrives as the prosecution questions Detective Leyland about the arrest. Leyland explains that she saw Daphne outside the house and that she ran off when she issued the warning.

During a recess, Officer Luke speaks to Lopez about some inconsistencies on Leyland's testimony and is concerned that she may be lying. After these revelations, Carmichael decides to adjourn the trial. Mark later takes the stand and Charlie puts him on the spot when asked if his father is involved with organised crime. However, Mark manages to later cleverly destabilize Brooke and he wins the case.

Judge Benner then introduces herself to Chief Of Police Jack Heely who tells her that if she ever encounters any problems with his people, to call him straight away. After he leaves, Judge Benner advises her that Jacqui Leyland is a very important detective in LA and if she gets accused of perjury, this trial will throw every case she ever worked on into doubt and could destroy more than one career.

As the trial resumes, Carmichael decides to go against Benner's advice and finds Daphne not guilty. After the trial, Detective Leyland comes to confront Carmichael about the case, but the judge stands her ground. Leyland explains that as a woman she is under pressure and scrutiny to make sure she doesn't make any mistakes, ending the conversation with a stern warning.

As she leaves her office, Carmichael sees Daphne waiting for a bus. She tells her that she found out her mum has a criminal record before the episode ends with Mark visiting his dad and punching him square in the face.

Summary: When an ICE agent pursues a defendant in Lola's courtroom, she must fend him off while determining the appropriate sentence for the offender, an undocumented immigrant, whose crime was warning people of a grocery store selling spoiled goods.



The episode begins with Lopez discussing her insomnia with Mendez while Carmichael struggles to be accepted by her fellow judges. Today's case is a grocery store assault. Leo Guerra, accused of violently resisting arrest, denies the charges but as he begins explaining what happened, a man in a black coat enters the courtroom. He explains that he's Agent Sal Soto from US immigration. Panicking, Guerra jumps over the stand and tries to escape. Carmichael puts her foot down and stops Soto from going any further and as the bailiff catches Leo, the judge calls for a recess.

Meanwhile, Callan has a case of his own, this one involving Maya Lambert who's accused of stealing a car. With the witness suddenly changing her story and the case dismissed, Callan confronts the defence lawyer, Amy Quinn, and accuses her of bribing the witness. Lopez meets with Leo soon after who explains the harsh conditions he escaped from while living in Nicaragua. He tried to seek asylum in the US but wasn't able to due to the new rules.

Callan then talks with the head DA, Thomas Choi, about the case and how he believes Maya's father has bribed the witness. Seeing how adamant Callan is, Choi decides to have one of his investigators take a look into it. Callan decides to meet with Maya to get to the bottom of things and, using his personal issue with his own father, Mark asks Maya to tell the truth. He promises her full immunity in exchange for testifying against her dad. Under the watchful eyes of her father, she leaves the room, but not before Mark tells her to think about it.

Meanwhile, Carmichael meets with agent Sal Soto and after discussing immigration, she warns him if he steps foot in her court again, she will charge him with contempt. Katie, the

prosecutor attorney, relays to Emily that they're dropping the charge and that her client is free to go. She protests though, especially given Leo will be sent back to his country and face grave danger. Both lawyers decide to talk to Carmichael about the issue they face. Knowing she was influenced by Soto, Carmichael speaks to Katie about doing the right thing and convinces her to carry on with the trial.

Lopez speaks to Guerra about his options; one of them being to plead guilty. He'll get 4 years and while in prison he can try to apply for asylum in a different country. Not given much choice, he reluctantly agrees to it. Maya meets with Mark again where she admits to the crime and asks for community service. After telling her that he once lied in court for his father, Mark manages to convince Maya to testify.

Back in Guerra's trial, Lopez announces that her client is now pleading guilty. Unable to make a decision, she calls for another recess. As Lopez gets a call about Leo's girlfriend, Kimani, being detained in the same store, finds out from the store owner that he was the one who called immigration on Leo. As the trial starts again, Lopez asks to file for a mis-trial and shows the judge food from the store, severely out of date. She suggests to only charge him with non-violent misdemeanor, which will give him a shorter sentence and a chance for him to find asylum. Both lawyers then agree to the new agreement; he will remain in custody for 3 months.

Maya arrives in court ready to testify against her dad. Mr Lambert's lawyer tells the judge that he will plead guilty and promises the court that he'll change and do some community work. However, Judge Bennet sees right through him and sentences him to two years in prison. The episode then ends with Callan and Carmichael talking about their day and sharing some touching and funny moments together.

Summary: Lola presides over her first trial concerning cybercrimes, after two friends fight over a deleted avatar; Mark discovers life without Lola around is going to be lonelier than he thought; Luke is set to be honored at the Valor Awards.



This week's main case is an online felony — Andrea Monroe is accused of cyber hacking and theft in a popular online game. During the trial, the first witness, Doctor Malachi, claims to have identified Monroe through her IP address. However, Lopez soon manages to get him to admit that the IP address could have belonged to someone else.

While out running, Luke is suddenly arrested by the police, however as they reach the police station they realise they have the wrong man. Meanwhile, Callan

tries to persuade his boss to let him defend Soraya Bayani, a woman who was threatened and almost run over by a man who told her to "go back where she came from". Choi agrees to the defence, but not before telling him it's a lost cause.

Luke goes to see Carmichael and apologises for being late, explaining his reasons why. She asks him if he wants her to do something about the agent in question, but he refuses, believing it wouldn't change anything. Carmichael decides to visit Callan at his flat to ask for his help understanding the online game, Skyrise, from her case. While there, she finally meets Callan's girlfriend Ria. After briefly talking about his upcoming case, Callan starts showing Carmichael the game.

The next day, the victim, Jenny Cartwright, is on the stand but has trouble answering questions about the game and her avatar. Carmichael suddenly has an idea and suggests she testify as Errk, her avatar. As Errk, she accuses Monroe of killing her character. Cartwright's lawyer, Driscoll, is not happy with Carmichael's methods and threatens to report her.

Callan's trial is up next and after hearing the testimony from the manager, Soraya is nowhere to be seen. Callan finds her outside though but she explains that she's too scared to face her assailant, Shane Spradlin.

After a recess, Carmichael offers to discuss the case informally and off the record, wanting to see if they can reach a fair agreement for everyone. Andrea agrees to it straight-away and starts talking to her old friend. She admits that she was jealous and missed her which is the reason she killed the avatar. After Cartwright accepts her apology, Carmichael gives her 36 months' probation and 200 hours community service due to financial implications to Cartwright, which both parties agree to.

Callan meanwhile, gives his closing statement in his trial too. He manages to prove Shane wasn't trying to park but trying to run her over instead. Having won the case, he decides to visit Soraya to tell her the good news.

In the evening, everyone attends an award ceremony for heroic services including the policeman, Agent Murphy, who arrested Luke. Before giving a heartfelt speech, Luke confronts Murphy and tells him to be smarter. The episode then ends with Lopez and Luke sharing a nice moment at a diner.

Summary: Lola officiates her first nuptials on 'Wedding Day,' an annual event when couples flock to the Hall of Justice to be married free of charge. Also, Lola and public defender Emily Lopez are torn between civil laws and the laws of a higher power when it seems they must allow Phoebe, a nun with a shady past, to go to prison for a criminal act against the church that she believes is morally right.



During the first trial of the day where a young Nun is accused of theft, a groom rushes in and asks Carmichael to marry him and his bride as she's just about to give birth. After successfully marrying them, we cut to Mark who's going to court against Amy Quinn, the defence lawyer of Margot. She's accused of conning dozens of men by making them pay for very expensive meals.

After the interruption, the trial of Sister Phoebe continues with Sister Miranda on the witness stand. She explains that

Phoebe comes from the street and has always been a very generous person. We also find out that she had an argument with the priest as she believed the collection money should be given to skid row. However, after Lopez questions her further it becomes apparent that sister Miranda might be the one who stole the collection money.

Lopez speaks to Phoebe who refuses to admit that Sister Miranda is guilty. She then reveals that she has saved her from the street but also that she's very sick and wouldn't last long in prison. Lopez then meets with Sister Miranda, asking her to confess and return the money so they can stop the trial.

While Lopez speaks to Lola about her upcoming divorce, Callan returns to his trial and summons Detective Perry to the stand. They discuss how Margot has been luring men and dining with

them at expensive restaurants, but running off before the bill arrives. Unfortunately, Callan ends up losing the case but not before managing to get Margot banned from all the prime restaurant in town.

Back to the sister's trial, Lopez calls Phoebe to testify, determined to prove her innocence. After talking about Sister's Miranda's kindness, she pleads guilty and insists that she's the one that took the money. Lopez protests and asks for a recess where she meets with sister Miranda and finally admits that it was her who stole the money to give to the poor. However, it was Phoebe who insisted on taking the fall.

Meanwhile, we also see Carmichael dealing with the aftermath of the sentence of a poor man, Owen, accused of selling marijuana without a licence. After finding out how much the court fees were going to be, she manages to find a way around it to make the sentence a little fairer. After talking to Lopez, Carmichael delivers her sentence: she finds Sister Phoebe guilty but because she returned the money, she will reduce the charge to misdemeanour and give her 100 hours community service with a 12 months' probation. The episode then closes out with Judge Bennet finally arriving to marry every couple in a group ceremony.

Summary: Lola contends with a fame-hungry defendant, personal assistant Olivia McLeland, and a circus-like courtroom while presiding over a celebrity's murder trial that forces her to find peace at Sherri's home after she's chased by paparazzi.



The media are all over the courthouse for the trial of Olivia McLeland, accused of murdering her reality-TV boss Hayley by forcefully administering heroin. Callan and Kansky warn Carmichael about defence lawyer Price as he doesn't seem to follow the rules. The trial starts but Carmichael has trouble keeping her courtroom quiet as the case has attracted a lot of media and online attention.

Meanwhile, Callan and Lopez meet with her client, Billy, accused of second degree robbery. Callan proposes a plea

bargain: a reduced sentence in exchange for the location of the stolen goods and if he testifies against his cousins. After agreeing to the plea, they all head to Billy's house with the police in order to search the place. They're suddenly interrupted by his grandmother though who threatens Billy for betraying his family.

After listening to Price misinterpreting the case to the media, Carmichael returns to court, intent on continuing with proceedings. Price's first witness confirms that Hayley was a heroin addict before shocking everyone and showing a video of Hayley, high on drugs. During another recess, Bennet warns Lola about Price's methods and tells her this case could end her career.

Billy tells Lopez that he doesn't want to testify anymore as he's scared of his grandma, prompting him to suggest another deal, this time with no jail time. As the day ends, Carmichael finds out that her address has been leaked online. Kansky invites her to stay in her house and after the initial awkwardness, they finally bond over Kansky's past. After helping Lola deal with Price's behaviour, they receive a text from Judge Bennet that Hayley's video has been leaked.

After Lopez manages to convince Callan to give Billy no jail time, Callan heads to see his boss about the new plea bargain. He relays the threats he received and suggests a 3 year probation while Lopez and Luke later go on a double date with a jury member and his wife.

The next day, Price continues his theatrical shenanigans. This prompts Carmichael to threaten him with filing a complaint and taking it to state bar. Choi then interrogates Olivia and after a few questions, she finally admits to the crime, explaining that she felt that she had no choice; she was caught stealing and didn't want to go jail but was also jealous as Haley was throwing her life away.

As the day draws to a close, Carmichael confronts Price about his behaviour in court and reiterates the importance of justice and the people he defends. The episode then ends on a touching note with Lopez helping Luke find a quiet place to study and finally sharing a kiss with him.

Lopez then decides to try pleading for misdemeanour instead to get a better sentence. As the trial resumes, Lopez gives an emotional speech about Jax and how their safety became threatened. She explains that they shouldn't be trialled for a felony as they didn't act with malice.

While waiting for the jury's results, Rosie meets Mark in his office to clear the air. He apologises for sending her to prison, but she understands he was just doing his job. The verdict is in and the Jury find Jax guilty of misdemeanour, which is what they were hoping for. The episode then ends with Mark meeting with his Dad for drinks, trying to build bridges and with Lola and her mother bonding and trying to get to know each other better.

relationship while Emily is now getting ready for her day but is very tense as she is the defence lawyer of the boyfriend, Aiden, in the domestic abuse case. As she heads into work, she meets with Aiden who claims that he was acting in self defence.

Mark and Luke prepare for the trial too while Sam has her first day in court that same day for the arraignment case Amy is the defence lawyer in. As the trial starts, Sam struggles while Amy interrogates the police officer who conducted the search of the house. She manages to prove that the officer was harassing him while Sam is unable to oppose her findings.

Meanwhile, Emily and Mark clash in the hallway about their domestic abuse case. During trial, Emily seems to struggle to stay calm and acts quite harshly. She explains that she walked away but he pushed her from behind. Emily gets up to start her interrogation but she stumbles and almost collapses.

Later on, Lola meets with Amy and Sam. She warns Amy about how she has been acting but Amy defends her client. At the same time, Aiden admits to Emily that he pushed Molly. This angers her and she asks him if he'll plead guilty as she storms out.

Lola and Mark meet on the stairs to discuss their day and cases. They talk about Amy and Rachel working together before moving to Mark's argument with Amy. Lola then heads to give her ruling and decides that the search was harassment and grants the motion to suppress. The case is dismissed and the man is free to go. Lola then speaks to Sam and tells her she did well.

In the evening, Lola calls her husband and tells him she misses him and wants him to come home. Unfortunately, he tells her he didn't get the LA job.

The next day, we find out that the jury of the domestic abuse case is in deadlock and Judge Benner declares a mistrial. Mark promises Molly they will do a retrial while Emily decides to remove herself from the case. Mark then apologizes to Amy and they make up. The episode ends with Emily returning home and breaking down completely. Thankfully, Sara is there to comfort her. Luke later joins them and they eat, which is where the episode ends.

The episode starts with Mark getting ready to go on a ride along with Detective Webber while in Emily and Sara's house, Ben leaves to have breakfast with his mother. Sara then accidentally picks up Ben's phone thinking it was hers and starts talking to his mother, who has no idea they are dating.

Lola discusses her marriage with her father and wonders if she should move to DC. During their ride along, Mark and Webber witness a car swerving to avoid a pedestrian. Webber comes out to make sure he is okay but as he seems drunk and suddenly tries to lunge for him, the

detective has to tackle him and uses his taser. The police later arrive and question Mark about what happened and what he saw exactly.

In the courtroom, Emily is surprised to see Daphne Rivas, an old client. Her client today is Jordan Woodley, prosecuted for murder. Emily explains to her that the prosecutor has made an offer and reduced the charge to manslaughter so she will get 11 years. She is charged for killing someone during a robbery and the evidence against her is certainly strong. Jordan suddenly reveals that she doesn't remember that fateful night but tells her she is on board with the deal.

Just before the trial starts, Emily looks at the case and notices that Jordan just agreed with the police questioning her but never actually explained what happened that night. She then

decides to stop the trial and asks for some time. Emily speaks to Jordan who reveals that she is an alcoholic and often has blackouts resulting in acting out and doing crazy things.

The judges later all have a video conference to discuss the current situation and possible solutions, especially as the conditions in prison are appalling. This prompts Lola to have the idea to start doing the trials online.

Emily video calls her client Kurt, who is charged with hijacking his brother's car. He wants to know when his trial will be as he insists he is innocent. She explains that trials have been pushed back by 60 days which upsets him as he explains that his girlfriend is pregnant and wants to get out. She then calls Mark who is the opposition lawyer in the case and proposes to file for misdemeanour as she believes it to be a family feud since they are brothers. Mark doesn't agree though as he believes Kurt is guilty and assaulted his sibling.

Lola organises a video conference with Sherri, Sara, Emily and Mark regarding Kurt's case. It is also the first time Mark appears as a lawyer in a case with Lola presiding as judge. Emily

wants to file for early release but Mark is opposed to it as Kurt has a prior assault charge on his record. Since they can't agree, Lola suggests doing an online trial and tells them to speak to their bosses and clients about it.

Later in the day, Emily sets up a video call for Kurt and his girlfriend. They have an emotional exchange while Lola calls Mark and they have their usual talk on the stairs. Since it is their first trial together, they set some ground rules to make sure they both act professionally.

In court, Lola is in her chair, the are people against Jessie Frost who is present with his attorney, Rachel Audubon and Mark Callan is there for the people. Meanwhile, Emily is speaking via her computer to a client from prison who is afraid of getting coronavirus and Emily tries to calm her down and tell her she is working on getting her out.

Vanessa Johnson shows up at Lola's office for the law clerk position, Lola tells her it was supposed to be a virtual meeting. Vanessa says she was waiting for three months for this interview, she wasn't going to miss it. Lisa walks up and asks if Vanessa is the new law clerk. Lisa welcomes Vanessa, even though Lola didn't say she was hired and says she expects big things from her.

Back to the night of the protest, Lola tells Mark that the teenage girl didn't deserve the way she was treated, and neither did her. Back to the case of Jessie Frost, he tells his attorney he came out of his car with his baseball bat because he was afraid for his life. Emily has a brief meeting with Luke's love interest. It is uncomfortable for her. Meanwhile, Lola sees her baby in ultrasound with Robin by her side. They talk about her being zip-tied and

on a curb at the protest. The man from the protest sends Emily a photo of her and Luke sharing an intimate moment in the alley. He was working the protests and avoiding her while she was telling him she will wait for him.

In court, the teen appears to become angry and is taken out of the courtroom while his ex is on the stand discussing his anger issues. His parents meet with Amy after. They discuss his possible medical condition as he could have CTE.

Luke heads to see Mark talk about a possible plea deal with the case. Mark thinks that isn't an option given that this kid is just another white athlete's privilege. Luke reminds him that they have been through a lot but they need to work it out, those nights of protests and what happened to Lola, and not in the case. But on their own time.

going against her ex-boyfriend Luke who was working with the prosecutor. This was one of the rare few times these former lovebirds were going against each other and the two of them have decided not to make it awkward.

Luke is a clerk in the District Attorney's office. This meant that the courtroom was cleared so that only Darius and Rafael were there with Luke's friend August Fox. Fox spoke to both boys. He got them to see each other's point of view and they even bonded over their shared experiences.

The restorative justice thing was working until Rafael said the wrong thing. He was also couch surfing because he was homeless and he was thinking of how to make his life better when he came up with the idea to rob someone. This offended Darius. Lola asked her team in the courtroom for their help only they couldn't help her because they were helping their new judge with his cases.

Another situation in which justice was denied was when Mark was forced to make a deal with Deputy Peter Rachel. Rachel is going to serve jail time. He won't serve the full sentence that he should be serving for shooting an unarmed man and the man had only agreed to accept the sentence because he felt bad for shooting Omar Aziz. Aziz wasn't pleased, though. He was angry about what happened to him and he wanted someone to pay. He even wanted Mark to pay for the role he played in Aziz going to jail. And so all around, justice and what it meant was very fluid to various people.

Mark was told to take the win because eventually, he'll have to take the hits too with the sheriff's department.

Luke talked to Emily about his problems and she helped him to feel lighter.

Lola's husband ended up helping her in finding the young Dionne Richardson and Lola feels

a lot better knowing that Diann was getting the help she needed.

Finally, Lola is back in the courtroom but she's returning to a hive of personal and professional subplots all competing for space. Perhaps chief among them is the case she's presiding over, in which Amy is representing a woman at the center of a swatting incident that ended in tragedy. It's hardly a cut-and-dry affair, with particular emphasis on how the case in question must be judged on its own terms separately from whatever (alleged) traumas a perpetrator might have undergone in the past (not to mention a cautionary tale not to implicitly trust people you meet online, much less on Xbox Live).

Just the kind of thing this show loves.

But arguably the more interesting stuff is happening elsewhere. Amy being shoved to the forefront of the case is a reminder of the lingering issues between her and Mark, and thus her and Rachel. They're able to reconcile, in a kind of testy way, but apparently, once the pandemic is over they have a date in the boxing ring. That's one way of settling things. There's still the matter of her secret marriage, but that'll do for next week.

While we're on the subject of relationships, there's also Emily and Luke to consider, especially after what happened last week. The latter has decided to own his feelings for her and stick around

until Emily has worked through her situation with Joaquin, who finally appears on video call in "Love's Illusions", though doesn't take the news that Emily kissed Luke particularly well. Who will she choose? I think it's pretty obvious at this point that she'll end up with Luke, but I'm willing to be surprised.

Luke has a lot on his plate, too. As well as his relationship woes he's also troubled by a witness statement he filed years prior having not really witnessed anything; he's ashamed of his blind trust in someone he respected, which is only complicated by the fact that he and Mark now have the go-ahead to take on McCarthy.

Even Sarah gets her own little subplot, having witnessed a potential act of child abuse that might jeopardize her relationship with Judge Benner. That's left unresolved, but we'll have to see how it shakes out.

Luke and Emily advise Moon not to testify, but she's tired of looking like a crazy radical. Emily urges her to reconsider since she's still trying to convince the university to let her graduate.

When she takes the stand, she admits she's been fighting the building since her freshman year. The site is sacred. She's very powerful as she explains most kids don't see their ancestors dragged down the street or children murdered at school.

Everyone was affected when Moon admitted she learned in school that a beautiful mission was built there in the 1700s. However, she only recently learned that it was created by her enslaved ancestors, so she's not remorseful.

Lola tells Andre everything is over between them. He's forced to accept that finally.

Everyone showed up to the cocktail party for Mark's promotion. When Mark returns home, he finds his father beaten up on his porch. He owed money and was involved with the Russian mob.

The mob wants Mark to throw a case, but Vic cautions him not to.

Amy and Ness meet with Mia, who says she hasn't done anything wrong. She needed an abortion because she just started nursing school, and she used a fake ID because she was scared.
