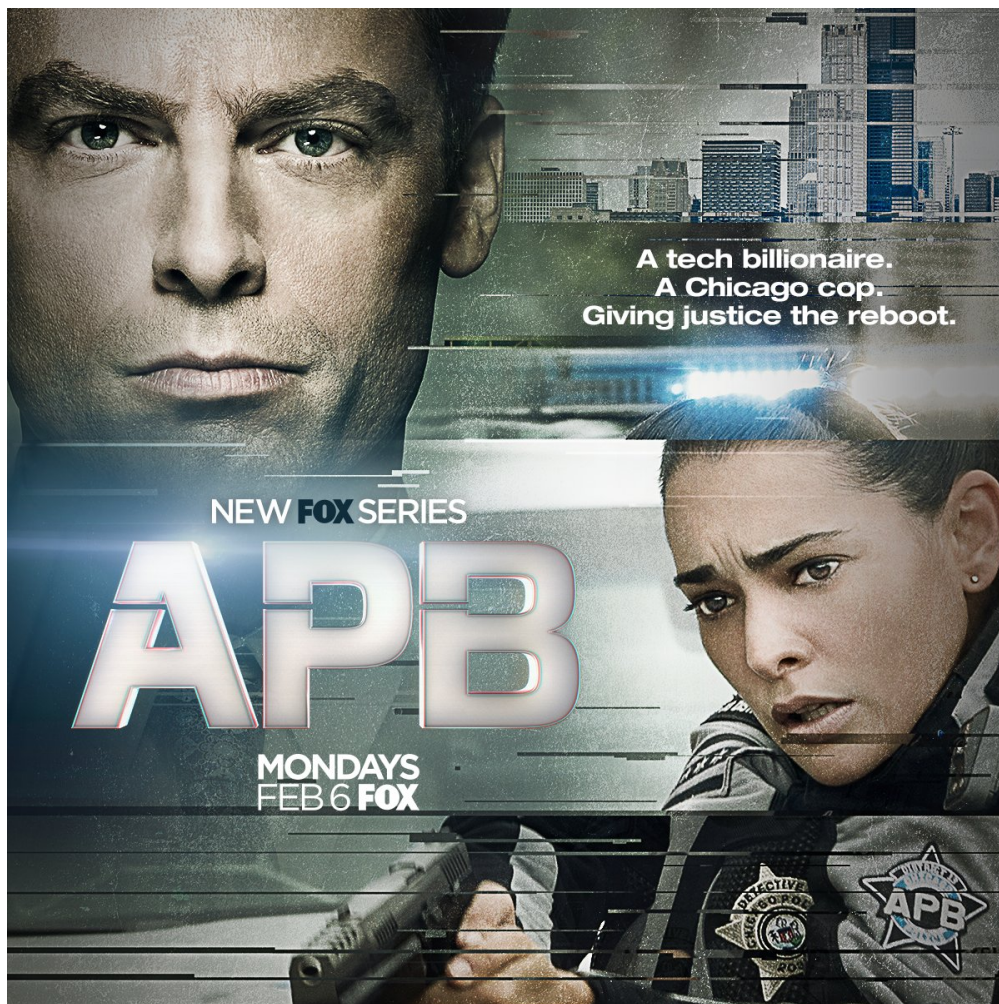

Summary: To avenge a friend's murder, a tech tycoon makes a deal to buy a troubled police precinct in Chicago in this drama, which begins with billionaire Gideon Reeves' pitch to city leaders to introduce cutting-edge technology to fight crime, a notion that street-savvy Detective Theresa Murphy is willing to try even though her colleagues don't think it will ever work, and just might make a bad situation worse.



Gideon Reeves was a genius. He had created a multi-billion dollar empire at the age of sixteen and he was always inventing something new. However, Reeves could also be reckless and no one knew that better than his lawyers. Reeves would apparently get an idea in his head and just couldn't wait to show it off though unfortunately his idea of showing his new creations off would be to frighten if not terrorize potential buyers. Summary: After a pharmacy robbery causes the injury of a child, Gideon develops the idea for electronic motorcycles to help in tracking down suspects. Murphy discovers a plot to can Gideon's program and it's coming from someone she knows well.



The episode opens with Chicago abuzz with telephone noise, all due to Gideon Reeves' new APB App. Gideon himself then struts through the streets of the Windy City before smashing a window to show the world how quickly police response times are thanks to his aforementioned app. The app isn't ending all crime, however, as we see a pharmacy held up shortly thereafter.

Back at the 13th District HQ, Gideon is talking with the precinct about his new plans and procedures for them. His speech is interrupted by a report of the above mentioned robbery and soon Gideon and Detective Theresa Murphy are on the case. They tear through the

streets with abandon in pursuit of their suspect until a young girl his struck by the robber and Murphy and Reeves must end the chase to tend to her.

Detective Murphy deduces that their pharmacy robbery suspect has a long history of similar crimes. After recovering the perp's mask at the last crime scene, the police set to tracking him down with the help of Zingo the police dog who makes his first appearance on APB. Zingo is quickly on the trail, all too quickly in fact when he gets caught in an explosion caused by the perp setting fire to his getaway car.

Gideon combs through the charred car for clues and finds none. That is until Detective Murphy realizes the recent mods to the vehicle may lead back to an illegal racing ring she's been

investigating for a while Reeves and Murphy then question the mechanic that did the modifications and find out that the name of the robber and hit and run driver was Jed Baxter.

Meanwhile, Brandt wrestles with Zingo's injuries-hopefully non-fatal-and Reeves hires on Pete in law enforcement, an engineer who is quickly expanding Reeves' arsenal of hi-tech gadgetry. What seems like the entire 13th then sets out to find Jed Baxter and soon Cobb does exactly that. Baxter is then chased by Cobb and Murphy while Reeves pilots a drone soaring high above them.

Murphy pulls over to attend to another of Baxter's hit and run victims while Reeves tails Baxter through the winding subterranean tunnels of Lower Wacker Drive. The drone begins to lose reception and crashes into a pylon as Baxter makes his getaway. To increase their chances of conducting safer car chases, Detective Murphy gives Gideon a quick primer on how criminal drivers think on the way to dinner at her house.

Reeves and Murphy's family bond over the meal and it is revealed Gideon is somewhat of a local boy, hailing from Evanston, a near suburb of Chicago. Gideon must cut dinner short when Murphy's son Mateo gives him the idea to use motorcycles to go after Baxter. Gideon and Dan quickly set to work on creating the bikes and Goss and Brandt volunteer to use them to track down the bastard that almost killed Zingo. And a little girl, too.

Baxter then shows up on the APB's radar and Goss and Brandt are off like a shot on their still experimental motorcycles that-according to Pete, formerly known as the wrestler "Block Head" go from 0-60 in 2 seconds. The bikes quickly show their advantages to cars as they zip through small areas and easily avoid pedestrians. As the officers of the 13th make chase, Goss and Brandt deploy spike strips via their new rides. Brandt then gets some revenge in the name of Zingo with a well-placed taser shot and the gang at the 13th District HQ celebrate.

Reeves and Murphy visit the girl struck by Baxter and they are happy to see she is recovering, likely thanks to Gideon hiring new doctors for her. He explains that while he can't promise that things like this won't happen again, he is trying. The daughter and her mother thank him and from there Reeves bring the newly retired Zingo to see Brandt. Zingo's early retirement is due to his new hi-tech prosthetic courtesy of Gideon Reeves and Brandt and Zingo couldn't be happier at the turn of events.

Murphy's ex-husband then informs her that he is the head of the Mayor's task force to root out just what is exactly is going on in the 13th District.

Summary: Robbers kill a security guard who, as a former police officer, uses the APB app before he dies. Meanwhile, Gideon works on improving the investigation room; and Murphy suspects someone in the state government is keeping an eye on the precinct.



The episode opens with Gideon Reeves chatting it up with Dr. Sanjay Gupta about the finer points of privatized policing at a fancy party. Detective Murphy then swings by, in full uniform, with the news that her ex-husband will be heading a task force to come after the both of them and the rest of the 13th. Gideon is explaining that he won't let any lawyers stop him from making the impossible possible when Detective Murphy gets a notification that her mentor was recently shot in a robbery attempt.

Gideon and Murphy quickly make chase, but are only quick enough for Murphy to see her fallen former mentor, Link Richards, being carted away. The rest of the 13th is able to capture one of the five suspects and bring him back to HQ. There, Murphy views her mentor's final moments via the APB app's video and she notices the robbers only took eight grand in merchandise without even going for the more expensive items in the safe. As Gideon does his best to unravel that mystery, Ada Hamilton gives him a run down of the statistics of a young boy, Marshawn, in danger living with an abusive and criminal father. She asks Gideon to step in and do something due to statistics showing the child or someone else in the household will likely be hurt or killed soon, but Gideon explains statistics are not proof and he can't do anything just yet.

Meanwhile, Captain Conrad, Gideon, and Murphy attempt to make charges stick to the one suspect they have in custody with the little evidence they have. Gideon then continues to expand the arsenal of tech for APB by retrofitting a feedback chair formerly used on pilots to be used on suspects at the 13th. Ada stops by Marshawn's house only to find his father loudly yelling at his mother and Marshawn having lost faith in the APB app's ability to keep him safe after their previous appearance on APB.

Murphy then conducts an interrogation of the suspect in her mentor's murder while using the newly adjusted feedback chair. Gideon monitors the suspect's reactions in real time and helps Murphy guide her questions so she can zero in on what will get the suspect to break. Although they get the suspect close to spilling some info, they fall short of an actual confession and quickly begin looking into the information and places they got from Murphy's interrogation.

Gideon hopes to have Ada help him install video monitors in the interrogation room to trick the suspect into thinking they're getting closer to actual evidence, but Ada is tailing Marshawn's abusive father. She video chats a fellow hacker and asks him to "shut down" Marshawn's father. Murphy returns to the interrogation room where she shows the suspect live feed of the investigation into the perp's former haunts and hideouts. As the suspect's vital signs spike and fall, Gideon and Murphy direct their testimony and the actions of the police to stoke the fires of the suspect's nerves. They quickly play on the suspect's fear of getting busted and trick him into making a deal with them.

He confesses and explains their target wasn't the jewelry store where Murphy's mentor was working at all, but rather an armored truck. Unfortunately for the police, the suspect doesn't have all the information needed to catch the other perps. He does give up the address of their hideout and soon the 13th are in pursuit. Ada won't be manning the controls of any drones during the chase, however, as she watches Marshawn's father fail in his attempt to buy a pack of cigarettes after she froze his assets. She provokes him into hitting her and is pleased to hopefully get Marshawn's father off the streets for a longer period than the last time he was picked up. Back at the 13th HQ, Marshawn's mother confronts Ada about getting her husband arrested when Marshawn explains she was just

quite a bomb making lab behind. Gideon calls in his new state-of-the-art crime scene investigators that produce results far faster than anything Murphy has ever seen before. Together, they deduce that where the suspects are likely to strike next and the 13th readies themselves to stop them. Murphy realizes the location they believe the suspects will be at isn't the location of the armored truck heist, but rather their planned escape route.

The heist then goes down, suspects' gun blazing and bomb in tow. Murphy is the only officer in the vicinity and does her best to stop the robbery, but is overpowered by the firepower of the perps. Ada then contacts her hacker friend to make an untraceable call that sets off the criminals' bomb and saves Murphy and the guards from certain doom. The 13th then swoops in to clean things up while Ada is left wondering how she will be expected to repay her hacker acquaintance for his help this time.

The episode ends with Detective Murphy renewing her commitment to the 13th as well as Gideon's APB program while Ada watches the explosion she was responsible for causing. Gideon looks on and one wonders where the line will be drawn going forward for their police work.

Summary: Brandt's mission to catch criminals selling armor-piercing bullets goes awry; A task force led by Murphy's ex-husband threatens Gideon's future.



The episode opens with Detective Theresa Murphy and Nicholas Brandt down Tico, an informant who has procured armor piercing bullets from a supplier known as Hunter. Murphy tests out the ammunition and sure enough, it is effective even against the highest levels of tech and body armor in use in the newly revamped 13th District.

Back at the 13th District HQ, Gideon Reeves is praising all of his recent upgrades to the police force-especially the coffee-when Murphy gives him the news from the previous episode of APB that the Mayor's office and Murphy's ex-husband will be cracking down on the 13th. Mean-

while, Captain Ned Conrad and Brandt argue over moving forward with their sting operation on Hunter to get the armor piercing bullets off the street. Captain Conrad believes they can't successfully go undercover since any wire would be found, so Gideon decides to invent a new form of surveillance to ensure the meet goes off without a hitch.

This invention combines near-microscopic cameras usually used in medical procedures with a hi-tech jacket essentially made of wires. This solves the problem, but at a cost of over two million dollars-pocket change to Reeves, but likely out of the budget of most other police departments. Brandt heads out on his undercover mission while his fellow cops watch from afar. Murphy gives him her St. Michael necklace, the patron Saint of cops, to keep him safe and Brandt then meets up with Tico and a skeptical Hunter.

At the 13th HQ, Reeves and Co. wait for the surveillance footage of Brandt's undercover op to be transmitted to them. They must wait seven minutes in between transmissions, however, due to the limitations of Reeves' newly invented camera-jacket. At the scene of the meet, Hunter grills Brandt about Tico's-and Brandt's-involvement in a theft of ammo from Hunter. Seven minutes later, when the cops get the footage, Murphy and Goss swarm the area of the meet, but find only tire marks and the St. Michael necklace Murphy gave Brandt.

Conrad, Reeves, and the rest of the team then must continue to wait in increments of seven minutes to track Brandt's whereabouts. Unfortunately, Ada is unable to get a bead on them, but Conrad overhears the sound of an elevated train in the background. From this he deduces Hunter has taken Brandt somewhere along the El's lines and Murphy and Goss quickly make chase.

Meanwhile, the investigation into Reeves and APB continues. Murphy's ex-husband Scott calls Officer Reyes for questioning to evaluate his opinion on the APB tech. He asks Reyes to literally take him to where he was shot and the memories instantly cause Reyes to lose his composure. At the site of Reyes' shooting, Scott pushes Reyes to relive the event and after being overwhelmed with memories, Reyes tells him to back off. Reyes eventually asks Scott that he needed to change some aspects of his story, specifically that the tech wasn't responsible for his injuries, but rather his own inexperience.

Ada, Reeves, and Captain Conrad soon find a photo of what they believe to be Hunter's car, but then realize they're too late. As they begin to take control of the traffic lights, they realize Hunter is off the roads and at a warehouse where he is roughing up Brandt with a baseball bat. While Hunter threatens Tico and Brandt, even going so far as to shoot one of his fingers off, Gideon and the 13th do their best to track him down. They narrow it down as far as they can, but no dice. Gideon then realizes that to locate him, they need another cell phone tower and Gideon quickly cobbles together a mobile tower out of a StingRay.

Tico finally confesses to robbing Hunter and gives him the location of his stolen guns. Hunter pushes Tico to reveal how he even knew the location of the guns and why Brandt knows anything about him. Under pressure, Tico finally spills that Brandt is a cop. Hunter then kills Tico and begins to question him about everything the cops know about him.

Brandt tells Hunter he's there on behalf of Hank Ryder, but Hunter shows no signs of recognition. He demands Brandt tell him something he wants to hear lest he bludgeon Brandt with a baseball bat. At that moment, Gideon's mobile cell tower finally gets a location on Brandt and all available units swarm the scene. Murphy realizes Hank Ryder was shot through a loading dock door and Brandt is sending a message that they need to enter the warehouse another way. Hunter's sidekick Virgil does his best to dissuade Hunter from killing Brandt, but Hunter sees no other option.

Gideon spies another way into the warehouse with his drone and soon Murphy and her crew are storming the warehouse. Murphy tosses in a flash bang grenade and they make short work of Hunter and Virgil, incapacitating them both with their APB tech weapons. One rousing speech by Gideon later and the episode comes to a close.

Summary:	Gideon and Martinez want to employ a new technology to help their case after a man's extreme actions for justice are called into question; the assistant State Attorney continues his interrogation of getting about the 13th District.



The episode opens with a tense moment at an ATM. As a young woman makes a transaction, a man appears behind her in a hoodie, his hand on a gun in his pocket. The woman quickly wraps things up and is off safely, but the ATM isn't so lucky. The man in the hoodie approaches, pulls a gun, and fires shots into it after holding up a sign that says he needs to speak with Gideon Reeves.

Meanwhile, Gideon Reeves and Captain Ned Conrad are still dealing with the Mayor's investigation of the 13th. Reeves

is frustrated that the Mayor would let politics and grudges get in the way of putting criminals away, but that is unfortunately their reality. Captain Conrad tells Gideon that they need a win so big that even the Mayor can't stand in their way or spin it.

Gideon then meets with the man who shot the ATM earlier. The man explains that his daughter Mya was a student at the University of Chicago when she started to experiment with drugs. She then had a stroke and her father wants to do something about Hi-town, a synthetic heroin/meth combo that is causing accidental overdoses all across Chi-town. Mya's father explains that he's an MIT Grad like Gideon and while he understands he'll have to pay for shooting

that ATM, it would be worth it if Gideon would go to his house to review the evidence he's collected.

Conrad then gives Cobb and Reyes a special assignment that involves looking for fugitives in Chicago. The captain wants to use a new method invented by Ada to track down probable fugitives in the district. Using Ada's method, the Captain tracks down an individual that has only existed for seven years and thus may be an alias used by a fugitive. Conrad then sends Cobb and Reyes off to investigate the man in hopes of finding a big fish that will get the Mayor off their case. When Cobb and Reyes go to the "fugitive" Mr. Walker's residence. He quickly makes like a fugitive and runs, but Cobb and Reyes quickly make chase. They're no match for Mr. Walker who manages to lose them in traffic.

Gideon and Detective Theresa Murphy then goes to investigate the evidence Mya's father collected against the drug ring pushing Hi-Town. According to Detective Murphy, he's got a good start. A "good start" isn't enough for Captain Conrad, however, and he cautions them against taking on an uphill battle instead of going for an easier win. He then tells Murphy to give Gideon a closer look at the drug trade on the streets of Chicago. She takes him into the field where she shows him the many people involved in a drug deal, including the 12 year old boy actually holding the drugs. She explains that this chain of people makes it hard to prosecute anyone, but Gideon sees that as a challenge and notes that they're all touching the same money at least.

Gideon then adds to the gadgets and tech we've seen thus far by coating bills with dust that will hopefully leave a trail to the people in charge of the drug ring. He then gives all of the Officers glasses that will see the residue from the bills as glowing yellow and send back the info live to the APB. Ada soon narrows down the possible center of the ring to a house in Bridgeport belonging to a man named Marcos Cruz who has been indicted twice, but never convicted, for drug trafficking. Gideon then tells Mya's father that they found Marcos Cruz, the man responsible for Hi-Town, and they'll be going after him. He goes on to explain that he negotiated with the bank so they would drop the charges for damaging the ATM.

Cobb and Reyes continue their pursuit of the fugitive Mr. Walker by going to his work where he's never missed a day. While Walker isn't there, the man's boss tells them he may be at a park where he feeds the homeless three times a week. Cobb reads this as the man selling drugs in a park and they're off to investigate.

Murphy and some of the 13th then head to Bridgeport where they attempt to arrest Cruz. While they come up empty in the house, they find about 50-60 kilos in a shed. Unfortunately, Cruz announces the shed isn't his, but rather his neighbor's and the police don't have a warrant for that property. The police are then told by Theresa's ex, an assistant District Attorney, that this evidence won't hold up, even though Cruz' neighbor was a 90-year old man with no real knowledge of the shed. Gideon then tells Mya's father that they can't make the charges against Cruz stick.

As Cobb expounds on what filth Mr. Walker likely is, they find the fugitive giving medicine and food to the homeless. Turns out, the man was indicted in the '90s for stealing expired AIDS medicine and giving it to needy patients. He explains he's not a criminal, but rather just trying to help people. Cobb then calls in that they found the fugitive and explains his story to Bernie, the dispatcher. She shows no sympathy and tells him if the Captain told them to bring the man in, then they should bring him in. Reyes then tells Cobb that they should do a perimeter check and Cobb agrees while everyone exchanges knowing glances.

Theresa and her mother then discuss her ex and how he is going after the 13th. Theresa's mother questions what Gideon thinks about it and shows a fondness for the billionaire as possible romance is hinted at. Just then, Mya's mother calls with news that Mya's father left cryptic messages before disappearing. Gideon and Theresa then do their best to hack the man's computer in an attempt figure out where the man could be, especially when they were the ones responsible for getting him out of prison. They are able to get into the man's computer and deduce roughly where he may be.

Murphy, Goss, and Brandt then descend on the location with Gideon watching via his drone. At first they're hesitant to go into the pitch black hideout, but with a few simple adjustments to the glasses they wore earlier they are able to see through the dark with ease. They see Cruz about to kill Mya's father and Brandt stops him, but Cruz then takes Mya's father hostage. With few options to diffuse the scenario, Gideon decides the best course of action is for Murphy to shoot through the wall. He then shows Brandt's feed to Murphy and she figures out where to aim

from a pipe running above the room. She fires a shot through the wall that incapacitates Cruz and saves Mya's father.

Gideon then tells the Mayor that they took down Marcos Cruz' cook lab and arrested him for kidnapping and attempted murder. He asks the Mayor if he should tell the press they are working together or if he should tell them the truth. The episode then ends with the assembled press learning that, according to the Mayor, the APB is running smoothly with the full cooperation of City Hall.

Summary: Gideon's dad is in trouble and turns to his son for a helping hand. Meanwhile, Brandt and Goss follow a lead on a grand-theft auto case that they hope will expose the mastermind behind it.



The episode opens with a local tough named Vinny and his muscle showing up to shake down the father of Gideon Reeves at an OTB in the Windy City. The elder Mr. Reeves does his best to talk his way out of a situation he's gotten himself in through gambling, but eventually uses a well-placed trashcan to the head of one of Vinny's goons to get away for the moment. Meanwhile, at the 13th District HQ, Gideon is busy testing some of his newest tech when he's interrupted by Captain Ned Conrad with the news that

Gideon's father has stopped by.

Gideon's dad tells Detective Theresa Murphy that while he's been involved with gambling, he had no idea he was working for a criminal: Leo Moretti. He appeals to his son and Detective Murphy to help him wear a wire to bust his criminal boss. Gideon is very skeptical of his dad's true intentions, but Murphy feels that the prospect of capturing Moretti is too good to pass up since no other criminal informants are willing to go undercover with him. After a little convincing, Gideon cautiously agrees to let his father help.

Out on the streets, Goss and Brandt are on patrol when they get a notification about a woman with a bat. They arrive on scene to find a woman shouting that a man stole her car along with two others. Brandt and Goss diffuse the situation and give the woman a ride to work, but she remains steadfast that her new neighbor is a car thief. Brandt and Goss then go to the suspect's house in hopes of finding him and make chase, but the perp loses them after boosting yet another vehicle.

Back at the precinct, Brandt endures the mockery of his fellow officers for losing the car thief earlier, but redoubles his efforts to find the perp. They are then notified of a sighting of the perp and a car chase ensues. They box the suspect in only to find out he is a school aged boy with developmental disabilities. Goss offers him the chance to sit in their squad car and he explains that he was merely stealing cars others didn't properly take care of in order to add them to his collection. When the kid refuses to show them to his collection, Brandt offers him the opportunity to drive there and the kid agrees.

As Murphy and Reeves try to work out Gideon's father's undercover operation, Gideon becomes suspicious when his father asks for \$25,000 to trap Moretti. He agrees to go forward, but then must devise a minuscule and durable device to track his father's movements to keep him safe during the sting. After outfitting a watch to replace the "lucky" one Gideon's father usually wears, Gideon's dad is off to visit Moretti at a seedy club. He sweet talks the gangster into thinking he's got buyers for his stolen diamonds. The two then make a deal to exchange the diamonds for \$500,000 the next day.

Murphy is worried for Gideon's father's safety going forward, but Gideon doesn't trust his father after years of being scammed by the man. She tells him that CI work is very dangerous and advises him to speak with his father and work things out between them. Captain Conrad later agrees with this sentiment as Gideon and he discuss the operation and keeping Gideon's father and five-hundred grand safe. Shortly thereafter, Gideon realizes his father has already absconded from the station with the five-hundred thousand in tow.

Everyone is impressed with the ingenuity of Gideon's father as he managed to make it out of a locked cell and GPS devices and Gideon thinks his father has merely ripped him off again. Detective Murphy believes that Gideon's dad is using this as his shot and redemption and may still be trying to pull off the undercover op. Gideon then attempts to track down Moretti by using a fleet of drones in order to find his father.

After the car thieving kid agrees to Brandt and Goss' deal, he shows them to his "collection" of cars. The boy's mother comes in and is shocked by the revelation that her son has been stealing the vehicles. She is fearful of her son's future and appeals to Goss and Brandt to let him go. He explains to Goss that there is no car he can't steal and she wonders aloud to Brandt if the boy's skills might be valuable in a car theft class they teach and as a mechanic. The boy, Luke, then comes on board with the APB for 36-months of working after school in yet another instance of the police showing mercy.

Gideon deploys his battalion of drones to follow the many cars Moretti uses to confuse the police. Gideon personally controls all of the drones as the rest of the 13th looks on and follows the cars on screen. As the chase begins to falter due to the devices following four separate cars, Murphy narrows it down to one car based on the nervousness of the driver. Her instincts turn out to be right and the crew at the 13th has a location on the deal between Moretti and Gideon's father.

They watch from afar as Gideon's father holds the deal in an old zoo Gideon claims his father knows well since he used to always sneak him in there as a child. Gideon's dad then attempts to talk Moretti into accepting \$400,000 instead of the \$500,000. He warns Moretti that upsetting his diamond buyers may get messy and Moretti begrudgingly accepts the offer. Detective Murphy and the 13th then move in and capture Moretti and his goons. Gideon's father has disappeared in the commotion, however.

Later, Murphy offers her sympathies to Gideon who was again duped by his father. They stop by Gideon's childhood home where Gideon shares with Murphy the fact that his mom passed away when he was in high school. She left him money to attend college, but his father gambled it away and Gideon paid his own way through MIT after building and selling a rocket. Gideon's father then calls him from a tropical island and tells Gideon he is proud of him and what he has become in spite of his fathering. He goes on to tell Gideon he loves him before tossing his phone away and vanishing.

Summary: Gideon opens a nerdcon as the station goes back to basics. While at the nerdcon a threat is revealed on Gideon's life by a hacker who impressed Gideon. Brandt and Coss track a suicidal student, while secrets are revealed.



The episode opens with Gideon Reeves welcoming the attendees of the Windy City Tech Summit via hologram. He explains to the crowd that he is dedicated to changing the world and the way people look at things before bringing out the chairman of the board of his company, Lauren Fitch. There is a flirtation between the two and it is revealed they've known one another since college. Lauren tells Gideon that he is losing copious amounts of money with his project at the 13th District and they need the Windy

City Tech Summit to go off without a hitch if the company is going to survive.

Back at the 13th, Captain Ned Conrad briefs his officers before giving Det. Theresa Murphy a murder file to investigate with the help of Ada. Ada is hesitant to go to the scene since she feels she doesn't look, dress, or act like a cop and she is soon unnerved by the sight of the crime scene. Meanwhile, Brandt and Goss are out on patrol discussing the pros and cons of the tech we've seen thus far—namely the omnipresent drones—when they get a notification about a student that may be suicidal. They arrive and find only the words "I'm sorry" scrawled in a notebook, but no sign of the student.

Ada does her best to hack into the murder victim's computer and e-mail accounts and finds that the man was selling an all-access wristband to Gideon's convention when he was likely

robbed and murdered. At the Tech Summit, Lauren continues to pressure Gideon into taking on new ventures to establish new revenue streams for the company she sees as failing. Ada and Murphy then arrive at the Summit with the news that someone is planning on killing Gideon Reeves.

Gideon takes the threat in stride, but Captain Conrad and Detective Murphy are far more serious about it. Lauren goes back to the 13th with Gideon and questions him about the amount of tech used in the HQ that she never received property requests for. In the interrogation room, Murphy and Ada question an "online ticket broker" who facilitated the sale of the Tech Summit wristband that led to the murder earlier in the day. The broker explains that he has no idea who was who online, but the man who tried to buy the ticket was often posting about Gideon Reeves stealing ideas from his mind and so on. The broker then offers to get Murphy a copy of the wristband that was stolen so that they could track down the killer.

Goss and Brandt then investigate the missing suicidal student, Evan, by going to speak with his parents. While the boy's father stonewalls them, his mother gives them the name of a friend of the boy's where he may be staying: Jackson Barrett. They go to Jackson's house looking for Evan and Goss realizes that Jackson is Evan's boyfriend. Goss tells Jackson she understands their situation since it took a long time for her to introduce her first girlfriend to her family as well. Jackson explains that he is not "out" yet with his sexuality and that is why he has been so secretive with regards to his relationship with Evan. He gives Goss the info on a secret Uber account he and Evan used and Goss and Brandt head off to track Evan down.

Gideon and Co. then attempt to find his potential killer by tracking the use of the stolen wristband. Unfortunately for them, the man used his own tech to disguise himself from all security cameras when scanning into the conference. They realize that they must scan everyone's wristband in order to find the killer, but Murphy tells Gideon they don't have the manpower to do so. Gideon explains he is going to do some of his patented engineering to the cameras in the rooms so that they scan every wristband at once while everyone is distracted by his speech.

While Gideon gets to work on that, Lauren and Murphy spar over Gideon's intentions with the 13th versus other business prospects. Lauren implies that Gideon's interest in the 13th may be fleeting and Murphy is riled by the thought. Gideon then gets his cameras rolling and scanning all wristbands and finds someone in an orange hoodie he believes to be the potential killer. The suspect runs off and Murphy gives chase, cornering the suspect in a stairwell and realizing the suspect is a woman.

Murphy discovers the woman was just trying to score some free swag with the upgraded wristband the killer ditched. As Gideon watches the events unfold from the precinct ("Bones" style according to Reeves himself), Lauren does her best to distract him with what she believes to be his actual business and dismisses his ability to help the police. They then realize the killer has killed a security guard and is likely still on the premises with a weapon ready to murder Gideon. Lauren then realizes they have the technology on hand to scan the entire crowd for weapons during Gideon's keynote address.

Goss and Brandt then find Evan on a rooftop threatening to jump. Goss attempts to talk the boy down and tells Brandt to call the boy's father. Goss explains that is the person the boy needs to speak with most and Brandt tells the boy's father to "man up" and deal with who the boy loves since he is in danger of losing him. Evan won't let Brandt or Goss approach with the phone, however, and Brandt then has another idea to handle the situation. Since it wouldn't be an episode without an appearance by its hero a Drone, Brandt has a drone fly up an iPad so Evan can FaceTime with his mother and father. They plead with their son to come home and he does.

Gideon installs the portable weapons scanner in the rafters of his conference and then readies himself by putting on Murphy's bulletproof vest. At first he balks at the idea of her not wearing it, but she explains she won't be the one on the business end of a gun. Gideon then steps out onto the stage in front of an enormous crowd of "Gideonites." Gideon gives his speech on the topic of "risk" as Ada and Lauren run their weapons scans and find the killer in the crowd with a gun. The man does manage to fire off a shot, which is absorbed by Gideon's bulletproof vest, before he is immediately subdued. Gideon then rallies the crowd in a cheer for the men and women of the 13th District for saving his life.

Back at 13th HQ, Brandt and Goss are doing paperwork when Goss asks Brandt if he'd like to talk. There is a moment when Brandt is about to say he never knew Goss was a lesbian, but he

chooses to invite her out for a bite to eat before broaching the subject in a friendlier way. Murphy then approaches Gideon about the other projects Lauren told her he abandoned in the past. He explains that he's always chased the biggest problem to solve throughout his life and he has found the hardest challenge of his life in the 13th. He assures Murphy he isn't going anywhere and after being pressed on his relationship with Lauren, he only tells Murphy it is complicated.

Cut to Gideon's bedroom where he and Lauren are sharing a tryst and their thoughts with one another. Lauren tells Gideon that the attempt on his life only showed how useful Reeves tech truly is along with the viability of what he's done with the 13th. Lauren goes on to tell Gideon that his idea for privatizing policing is genius and the episode closes with Gideon pondering what the future will be for his APB program and if it will end up being what he had hoped for.

Summary: After another fire hits one of the gang-run buildings, Murphy and Gideon find out that the cause is much worse than an act of gang retaliation. Meanwhile, Goss is unsure about Brandt's old service buddy, after he's accused of assaulting a customer at the bar where he's a bouncer. Goss seeks the truth and Gideon is faced with an important decision.



The episode opens with a familiar home security commercial. While the commercial seems real, it is actually for Reeves Security and, more specifically, a nationalized version of the APB app called APB Prime. Gideon and Lauren then discuss the pros and cons of moving Reeves Industries further into the private security sector. The two are then interrupted by Captain Conrad who needs Gideon at a crime scene.

Detective Theresa Murphy and Captain Conrad explain to Gideon that a gang

war has set off a series of fires in the 13th Precinct. They ask Gideon to speak with the Mayor about investigating and stopping the gang war and he agrees, but not before heading in to grab a sample from the crime scene. Gideon explains that if he can discern the accelerant he can program the police cars set up with APB tech to find and locate the chemical.

Goss and Brandt then take a witness statement from an individual who said he was assaulted at a club the night before by a bouncer. The man is quite frustrated by Brandt's lack of interest in his case and Brandt explains to Goss he both knows the bouncer and thinks they have better things to do than investigate the man's claims. Goss nevertheless pushes forward on the investigation.

Gideon calibrates the police cruisers to detect the accelerant and they find a possible arsonist in Canaryville. They find only a nail salon and a few other innocents, however. Then, Detective

Murphy gets a reading on her cruiser and she checks things out. She finds a tag from one of the gangs used in the fire wars and realizes the building itself is on fire. Murphy then races through the building pounding on doors and telling everyone to evacuate. When she is almost overcome by fire, Gideon and Ava use the advanced APB tech of Murphy's bodycam to see through the smoke and flames to a way out of the building. Once outside, Murphy finds a young woman from Honduras who has been displaced by the fire and invites her to stay with her.

Goss and Brandt then head to The Cellar Door, the bar where the assault victim claimed he was attacked by the bouncer, Brandt's friend Vic. Vic claims the man got rowdy on the dance floor, was attacked by a woman's boyfriend, and then Vic merely tossed him out. Goss and Brandt then attempt to check the security footage, although Vic tells them it likely won't show anything.

Back at Murphy's, Theresa is sharing her clothes with the young woman from Honduras and it seems she may suspect the woman knows more about the arson than she lets on. At the 13th HQ, Gideon discusses branching out into private security with Ada. Ada tells Gideon he sounds like Lauren with all the talk of privatized policing and believes if he moves forward with expanding the APB program, it could turn the nation into a police state. Murphy then shows up with a theory that perhaps it isn't the gangs behind the arson war after all.

Murphy and Gideon then head off to have dinner with Andre, the gang leader, to talk about who has been starting the fires. Andre explains arsons aren't the way they usually do things, but he has to respond to protect his people. Murphy pleads with him to wait a day to retaliate since she believes the fires were not gang related and Andre agrees. Gideon then gets help from Pete to recreate the fire from Theresa's bodycam in an immersive 360 environment. Theresa then realizes the fire came through the heating ducts in the apartment and was almost certainly not started by the warring street gangs.

At The Cellar Door, Vic asks Brandt to help him get a spot on the police department when he finds out Goss has a friend in the personnel department. Goss ignores Brandt's call, however, as she installs a small camera pointing at the alley door where Vic claims there is no camera coverage. Brandt then goes to Captain Conrad for help in getting Vic hired, but Captain Conrad says he won't move forward while Vic is under continued investigation by Goss. Brandt is irked at first, but Goss simply asks him to trust his partner and if Vic doesn't have anything to hide, her hidden camera won't reveal anything. Later, Goss and Brandt watch from a distance as Vic bounces patrons from his bar. Brandt is ready to call it a night when a customer gives Vic lip and Vic brutally attacks him. Goss and Brandt then rush over to stop and arrest Vic.

Theresa and Gideon then track down an HVAC company that has had access to every building where the arsons took place. The owner balks at giving Gideon employee information, so Gideon buys the entire business for a half a million dollars. Murphy then digs through the files while Gideon looks on until she finds the name of a Duke Johnson who was a supervisor at the buildings that burned. As they track down Duke, Gideon discusses privatized policing with Murphy. She tells him that the people who need help the most are the ones that can't pay for it. Gideon explains he has shareholders to answer to and Murphy tells him she herself is a shareholder and while she wants him to make money, she doesn't want him to do it by selling badges.

Gideon and Theresa then roll up on Duke Johnson who is loudly listening to ultra-conservative radio before he attacks Gideon. He and Theresa then scuffle, but Johnson makes his getaway after injuring Murphy's foot. Gideon realizes that the man left his phone behind, however. Ada and Gideon are able to deduce from the phone's location history that Duke is likely in an old warehouse.

Murphy and some of her fellow police arrive at the warehouse Duke Johnson has been staying in to find racist propaganda all over as well as arson materials. Duke attempts to trap Murphy in a blaze before making his getaway, but the man is quickly captured. As Murphy is trapped in the fiery warehouse, Gideon calls into action the true hero of APB: the drone. Gideon explains that this isn't just any ordinary drone, this is the TK421: a drone that uses concussive charges to extinguish flames. Gideon uses his expert drone-piloting skills to maneuver the drone into the burning warehouse and blasts an exit route for Murphy who makes her escape.

In the holding cell at the 13th, Vic explains to Brandt that he blacks out when people come at him. Brandt tells his friend he'll talk to the prosecutor about his service record and to see if they can get Vic some real help. Brandt then apologizes to Goss for not listening to her and the two continue to bond.

Back at Murphy's, her young house guest watches the news detail the 13th's capture of the

arsonist who was stoking the fires of a gang war. She tells Murphy she too may wish to be a police officer one day before Murphy heads out to watch Gideon's speech to his shareholders. Gideon announces Reeves Industries will be rolling out APB Prime to the thunderous applause of his shareholders. Theresa walks in and takes her seat as he begins to detail their subscription or pay-as-you-go options for the app, he falls apart and explains he won't be moving forward with the app. He then details the actual crime statistics in Chicago and tells the crowd that all that matters to him is getting those numbers down, not making more money at the moment and the episode draws to a close.

Summary: An FBI agent seeks Murphy's help when he learns his informant's life may be in danger. Gideon not only assists Murphy with the investigation, but makes a decision that could make or break his company. Meanwhile, the past comes back to haunt Ada.



The episode opens with a lone boat floating in the darkness on what is likely Lake Michigan. The boat has two passengers and when one goes below deck, the other-Jesse-make a phone call to the FBI. It turns out he has been working with the FBI and believes the boat ride may be his last as he believes his secret has been discovered. He tells his handler at the FBI his fears and then a struggle ensues between Jesse and the boat's other passenger with a gunshot ringing out in the night.

At Detective Theresa Murphy's, Theresa and her family start the day with Theresa's daughter asking about the "birds and the bees" while Theresa's mother pressures her to ask Gideon out on a date. Charlie, the FBI handler from the opening scene, then shows up at Theresa's door asking her for help.

At the 13th District Headquarters, Gideon angrily watches news coverage of his recent financial issues with Reeves Industries and realizes Lauren is trying to take his company from him. Murphy interrupts and takes Gideon to meet with Charlie, who it turns out used to work for the 13th. Charlie explains Jesse has been working to take down Louis Benoit, one of Chicago's most notorious drug dealers. Charlie tells Gideon that he fears Jesse may have been killed since a fisherman spotted a boat on fire miles away from shore and there has been no other sign of Jesse. He pleads with Gideon to help him search the crime scene with his APB tech as he believes it is better than what the FBI has and the frozen lake presents many complications for a search.

Gideon agrees and he and Pete bring out a new piece of Reeves-tech: a space submarine designed to explore Europa, Jupiter's moon. As Pete shows Charlie how to operate the submersible, Gideon discovers that Charlie and Murphy have more of a relationship than he realized. She tells Gideon Charlie broke up her marriage, but their relationship is not current.

Gideon then maneuvers the submarine from his control room back at the 13th and, after slicing his way into the sunken ship with the submersible's laser, discovers that it was not Jesse that went down with the ship to Lake Michigan's icy depths, but rather Pasquale, the other passenger on the boat that tried to kill him. Charlie realizes that Jesse likely won't last long on the streets with assassins after him and Gideon convinces him to let the 13th and all of his tech help find Jesse since it is a case in their district.

Ada then must meet up with Danny, the man whom she owes a favor for previously helping her save the day. They meet on the Clark Street bridge at noon and he reveals to Ada that he knows the phone call she had him place caused an explosion that killed a criminal. Danny explains that Ada has inspired him to stop bad guys as well, namely Gideon Reeves. Danny goes on to say that he believes Gideon is creating a police state and tells Ada to put a backdoor into the APB system so that Danny may monitor the wolf (Gideon) who has been put in charge of watching the sheep (the good people of Chicago). Ada doesn't want to comply, but Danny threatens her with going public about the phone call she had him make.

Murphy and Gideon discuss the dangers of searching for Jesse and accidentally flushing him out where Benoit's people can get at him. Gideon then decides they must get Benoit off the streets first in order to find Jesse safely. Murphy and Gideon then show up at a fancy restaurant where Benoit and his thugs are dining with a warrant to arrest him. Ada then does her best to track down who she believes is Jesse and soon Charlie and the officers of the 13th are racing off to bring him in safely.

As the hunt for Jesse rages on, Captain Conrad interrupts Ada as she is about to insert the backdoor device into the APB program. He is not there to capture her, however, but rather to give her a dozen jelly donuts as a thank you for all of the work she has done around the 13th and to make up for the donuts that are often gone by the time Ada arrives for the day. This causes her to have a change of heart and she abandons her plans to install Danny's backdoor into the system.

Ada then calls Goss and Brandt to inform them she just got an anonymous call about Danny-who she calls DV8-and tells them he's a hacker up to some seriously bad stuff. She asks Goss and Brandt to go check him out and they head over to do so. When they show up, they find only a tower of computer drives and equipment. Goss realizes DV8 is watching them from afar as he sets off the self-destruct sequence on his computer tower. Later, back at the 13th, Ada gets a call from Danny who threatens to bring down her, Gideon, and the entire 13th.

As Murphy and Charlie frantically search for Jesse in Millennium Park near the Cloud Gate sculpture (or "The Bean" as it is colloquially known) and they come up with nothing. Gideon insists that he is right on top of them. Murphy then realizes that they are actually on top of Jesse and she and Charlie descend into the parking garage below the park. A brief chase on foot ensues and Murphy catches Jesse.

Murphy and Charlie then talk to Jesse. He explains that he had no choice but to kill Pasquale, but he won't talk since Charlie failed to protect him last time. Murphy tells Jesse that if they can find him, Benoit will too and they take Jesse to an FBI safe house.

Lauren then shows up at the 13th to discuss the events of the previous episode. She chides Gideon for not putting his shareholders first and tells him his company will fail if he doesn't take the reins of his company and give up on the 13th. She tells him that the board will likely be voting to remove him, but he seems to remain committed to the APB program and keeping the people of the 13th safe.

Murphy then follows Charlie as he escorts Jesse to the safe house. The two are sharing a pleasant conversation when a van full of Benoit's thugs pulls in front and begins firing on them. Murphy radios back to the 13th, but since she is so far out of the city there is little help Gideon can offer her as even the vaunted Drone is too far to save them. Jesse is hit by a bullet and Charlie and Murphy retreat into an empty warehouse where they continue to take on heavy fire.

As Theresa and Charlie are holed up taking cover, Charlie begins confessing his feelings for her while Gideon listens from afar. Gideon then realizes that they may be able to remotely access the police cruiser to save the day. Charlie and Murphy then run out of ammo just as Gideon

takes remote control of Murphy's cruiser. He crashes into the warehouse and drives in front of Murphy, Charlie, and Jesse. As Jesse and Charlie get into the cruiser, Murphy grabs the shotgun inside and takes out both of Benoit's thugs with a couple of well placed shots.

Back at Murphy's, Charlie interrupts Theresa regaling her daughter about the birds and the bees. He tells Theresa that Jesse is doing fine and Benoit is being charged and should be going away for a very long time. He then tells Murphy that there is an FBI application with her name on it. Despite the better pay and hours, Theresa turns down the position to see things through with Gideon and the 13th.

Gideon then shows up at the 13th just as Benoit is being led away by police surrounded by throngs of reporters. After Benoit is driven off, the reporters turn their attention to Gideon. He begins telling them of Lennon and McCartney, Hall & Oates, England Dan and John Ford Coley. He likens these partnerships to Reeves Industries partnership with the FBI as together they will be unstoppable just as the performers were. He goes on to say that he will be supplying the Feds with new toys, or specifically hand-me-downs from the 13th.

Inside, Gideon celebrates the fact that he will retain control of his company, but realizes Lauren has left him. Ada then enters with the news that she must quit immediately and a confused Gideon refuses to accept her resignation to no avail. He attempts to stop her, but Ada-knowing of Danny's vendetta against her and Gideon-runs off and the episode draws to a close.

The episode opens with our heroes receiving an APB message about a gang assault. When Murphy responds to see Andre and his cronies beating up a man, they break it up and learn that a girl in the neighborhood was raped. "When something like this happens, I handle it," Andre proudly proclaims. Nevermind that he's beating up a guy just because he found the victim, a girl named Kayla Braun, and claims to not have seen anything. This vigilante style investigation is going to leave a lot of pretty banged up

people in the 13th District if Murphy and Gideon can't figure something out soon.

Last week we saw Ada leave the 13th District PD due to her old colleague DV8 blackmailing her after proclaiming his intention to take down Gideon and his "police state" he's creating. When Ada left, Gideon didn't accept her resignation, so he comes to her home after she'd been avoiding his calls. He tells her that he wants to fix her problem but she still insists he can't. Before anything can be resolved, Gideon gets a text from the APB app and has to go. This is only the beginning of Ada's troubles though, as DV8 takes control of her car remotely and almost kills her. "You picked your friends, now you've made your enemies," he tells her. She smashes her own window and climbs out.

Turns out only a few people have even downloaded the app in the neighborhood the Green Street Kings control. Nobody on the streets is cooperating with the cops either, and even one of Gideon's drones gets shot down. Gideon and Murphy want to bring Andre in to see if they can't get him to cooperate, but Conrad insists that every time the cops go to Andre, it sends a message that he's in charge, not them. Gideon calls it a temporary strategic partnership.

Once Gideon convinces Andre it is in his best interest to work with the police on this, he coughs up footage from everyone in the neighborhood of the block party Kayla attended immediately preceding her rape. Gideon enters all the footage into his nifty 360 degree panorama machine, so they can stand and look at what exactly went down, see if they can spot Kayla and who maybe who talked to her last. They are able to see a man who Kayla seemed upset with, pulling her arm away from right before she left. Murphy pins him as Carls Wells and when they talk to him he tells them he didn't do it (of course) but he saw Kayla talking to somebody in a brown car. When they go back to the panorama they do indeed see a brown sedan drive by. There are no plates, though. Could this be their rapist?

Ada gets a tip from an old professor of hers and Danny's (aka DV8) that he is working for a hacker collective called Command Alt out of an old Peoria meat packing plant. He suggests if she gets something they don't want shared, she can keep Danny at bay. She heads there and is able to plant a camera and also tap into their files and copy a ton of incriminating evidence. It doesn't take long for Danny to realize what's happened but Ada gets out just in time.

Gideon and Murphy show Andre the brown sedan hoping he'll know who it belongs to. He does and they go to a man named Kevin, who swears his probation officer confiscated his vehicle weeks ago. Andre says all this time they were looking at his people to catch the culprit and it turns out it's one of their own. When they take it back to the station, it checks out. Vince Yardley, the probation officer, did in fact take Kevin's car and has been working in the 13th District. When they go to apprehend him, they lose him. Now the cops need Andre's help. Conrad himself goes to speak with him and tells them to send a message out to his people, his own kind of APB app. Once he does, Yardly is quickly spotted and the cops and Andre get to him at the same time. Gideon convinces him not to kill the rapist vigilante style and go to jail; his people need him. Andre hands over the suspect.

Ada returns home to find DV8 in her apartment waiting for her. She tells him that she stole his client's information and has evidence of money laundering and tax evasion. The Feds might want to hear what he's been up to. He threatens to kill her but she wisely set up the info to auto-send unless she stops it. DV8 promises this isn't over and leaves.

Serial rapist caught, Gideon is feeling dangerous and decides to give back to the community. He builds a community center called Kayla's Place, which has a ton of new computers and Scotty Pippin as a basketball coach. Andre doesn't like it, seeing as how community centers aren't good for drug sales. But the people need to know that the police are there and part of this neighborhood. turns out Kayla's gonna have a long recovery but will be okay.

Gideon finally returns to Ada's to finish their conversation. Ada says she's ready to come back to work. "See you Monday," he says. They hug it out. Reveal: they are on camera, and DV8 is watching from a camera he planted in her apartment!

Summary: Gideon's life is in danger, so Conrad sends him home to get away from District 13, but Gideon and Murphy become trapped in his secret lab when the men who are after Gideon find him, and Murphy soon realizes why he's a target.



As we know from past episodes, Ada's old friend/nemesis DV8 has a bone to pick with her employer Gideon. He thinks Gideon is intruding on peoples' rights to privacy, calling him a "technocrat" and saying he is looking to construct a police state in Chicago. This week begins with five tough looking guys meeting in an old abandoned warehouse. They are spoken to through a speaker hanging on the ceiling, and the person speaking to them uses a voice modulator so as not to be recognized. The men were called to-

gether to do a job, but as one of them notes this isn't just any job, word is they are going against the cops. A gun mounted on the ceiling quickly guns him down and the voice asks if anyone else wants to haggle? Nobody does.

At the station, Murphy calls Gideon in to check out the latest APB calls, which he complains about—why should the man in charge be called for every little thing? But as she points out, these aren't just any APB calls. Gideon himself is the target. And there is a masked man in a video using the same voice modulator we heard earlier saying "I am coming for you." There's also been chatter around town that something big is being planned for today. Captain Conrad tells Gideon he's sending him home, as it's better to err on the side of caution and keeping Gideon at the station puts cops in danger. Conrad sends Gideon away with Murphy.

Brandt and Goss are out responding to calls and keeping their eyes peeled for anything suspicious. The whole masked villain in a video isn't sitting well with Brandt. He served in Fallujah and the last time he saw a video like that it was Islamic terrorists. He doesn't understand what kind of person in the States would do this.

Gideon takes Murphy to his penthouse home outside the city, where Cuban music plays when they walk in. Gideon explains he has a "smart home" that recognizes faces of people he knows and plays music/displays images to their taste. Gideon also introduces her to Gertrude, the first robot he ever built. Murphy wants to see the security system he has, and it's an impressive one. The whole house is wired, and security cams work on a neural network figuring things out for themselves.

Meanwhile, back in the 13th district the APB app is going off about some suspicious activity in the City Services building. The station sees video of six masked individuals carrying backpacks into the building. Brandt and Goss respond and arrive to see a bunch of backpacks lined up in a row inside the building sitting unattended. Conrad calls in the bomb squad and the building is evacuated. Goss and Brandt keep an eye out for who could be behind this. Sitting at the station Ada says to herself "Is it you, Danny? Tell me you're not behind this."

At Gideon's penthouse, Murphy asks if he's expecting a delivery. She watches on the security cameras as guys in masks and automatic weapons raid the front porch. Not good. When they try to call for back up Gideon quickly finds the phone lines are down and the signal is being jammed. They only have one option seeing as they are on their own now: hide. Luckily, Gideon has a sort of safe room. There is a secret lab behind a library book shelf that he and Murphy escape to. They try to send a message via internet from there but the wireless and fiber optic connections are all down. That's when the drilling of the door starts. How can they get a message out for help? Well, there is some one else in the house: Gertrude.

Gideon is able to use the "guts of his smart home" to send a signal to Gertrude and get her outdoors and outside the range of the signal jam. As he's crossing his wires and working his Gideon magic to pull this off, Murphy asks why Gideon has a secret lab to begin with. Gideon suggests they save the philosophical discussion about research transparency for later. He finally gets a signal to Gertrude but one of the masked men is coming straight for them. Murphy suggests cuing up the Cuban music to distract the guy and it works. Gertrude gets outside, gets the signal 99% sent, when one of the masked men break it. Did it transmit? We don't know.

It's time to start considering negotiating with the men who have nearly drilled through the door. Gideon says he knows why they're here. There's something he didn't tell Murphy. From this secret lab he's been working on a sort of surveillance tactic. Essentially, he's stealing data to identify criminal patterns, based on peoples private info, social media, etc. Murphy points out that this is completely illegal. "We're supposed to protect people when it's hard, not when it's easy," she says. They can't let the criminals get their hands on this. They need a weapon. Gideon has an idea "but you're not gonna like it," he tells Murphy. He has a huge battery and if he puts enough charge in it, it will explode, torching everything... even them.

At the station, Pete gets a diagnostic request from Gertrude and asks Ada about it. Ada realizes that Gideon and Murphy are trying to get in touch with them! Also, it turns out the bombs at the City Service building were all fake and it was just a distraction. Conrad orders cars to rush to Gideon's, now!

As promised, Brandt and Goss get there first and they bang on the door, interrupting the drilling of the secret lab door. Gideon and Murphy can see them on the security cameras and know they are walking into an ambush. Gideon once again sends a message through Gertrude, but can only put nine characters on her screen. Murphy suggested "3AMBARDEN" which Goss recognizes as military code for three armed men with assault rifles in the den. They go in, get the jump on the bad guys just as Gideon's battery bomb blows. Miraculously nobody dies, and all the men are apprehended. Gideon and Murphy are safe. The secret lab and Gideon's illegal surveillance device with it.

They question the men at the station but Ada says it's not necessary; she knows who is behind it. Ada. She clues them in to her hacker friend DV8 and how he had blackmailed her. Gideon is hurt she hadn't told him, saying she thought she handled it. She says she's willing to resign, but Murphy tells her they are past that; she's looking at jail time. That's when Gideon is called into the main room. The hackers hacked past their firewalls and a live video is up. A masked man tells him that they are going to start waking up this city to Gideon's little fascist nightmare, even if it kills them. Then the villain takes his mask off and its... DV8, as anybody who has watched the show should have known long ago. "Mask off, gloves off, game on," he tells Gideon. "Come and get me." Gideon tells everyone he's got a new plan.

Summary: Gideon is blamed for recent terrorist attacks, so he and Conrad must work quickly to find the real culprit, but Danny's technological skills continue to disrupt the city and leave Murphy, Ada and the rest of the squad struggling to stop him.



Last week we left off with Ada admitting that she knew who was responsible for trying to have Gideon killed. DV8 is an old college friend of hers. They came up together in the hacking world, and earlier this season she secretly called on him to help her with something that resulted in him pressing the button that killed a man. A bad man, but still it was unfair of Ada to put that on him; that would piss anyone off.

Murphy stays on Gideon and Captain Conrad about Ada being arrested for withholding information that could have gotten officers killed, thus making her practically complicit in DV8's crime. But

they convince Murphy to back off a bit as they will need Ada to keep others alive. DV8 is back at it already, and he's tapped into Chicago's transportation grid.

They find this out a little too late. Captain Conrad has led a charge of policemen out of the station down to where DV8 is supposed to be having a meeting with some of the nefarious criminals that helped him execute his crimes last week (they get this info from Murphy interrogating the man they captured). On the way there, Conrad is just telling everyone to keep their eyes peeled when he is slammed by a car coming through the intersection. Turns out DV8 has hacked the

transportation grid and collisions are happening all around Chicago. I believe he even spells the name DV8 in green lights on the grid, which seems a little comic-book villain-y but to each his own I guess.

Ada can't fix the transportation grid because DV8 hard-wired something into it at the transportation building. Earlier in the episode we saw him casually murder the one night guard at that building. Goss and Brandt are on it. They get there and head to the roof where all the circuitry is. They don't have time to call for an expert but they locate the device and after getting zapped by some wires, Brandt is able to pull it off. The grid is fixed and they are able to pinpoint where DV8 is working from. He's on a train heading out of the city!

Murphy, Gideon, and a couple officers rush to the train and, predictably, DV8 gets the upper hand there as well. Ada is in the process of hacking into the railway system to help when two FBI officers show up demanding that she come with them for aiding and abetting a terrorist. Conrad (who has a couple broken ribs but still reports back to the station) staves them off as long as he can until they physically grab Ada. She wrestles herself away and pushes the last button she needs to, making the train abruptly stop, and in the moment of thrown balance Murphy is able to get the upper hand on DV8.

However, he has one last surprise. Mayor Selgado has used this whole fiasco as political leverage to oust Gideon Reeves from the 13th District, who has been embarrassing him ever since he stepped in there. DV8 set up some sort of end game at City Hall, where Selgado just happens to be making his speech about asking Reeves to step down. Murphy and Gideon rush there but it's too late. Selgado is gunned down at the podium by a robot gun that was somehow set up on an adjacent building without anyone noticing. Gideon takes it out while Murphy checks the mayor's pulse. She shakes her head. "We're too late," she says.

"No. We're just beginning," says Gideon.
