Summary: As the mission launches, Emma finds her mettle as commander tested by an onboard accident, a divided crew and a family emergency back on Earth.



In the opening moments we meet Emma Green during a debriefing on the moon's lunar base. She's uncomfortable recapping a crisis moment to Dr. Putney that occurred earlier. For now, we only see it through dramatic moments intercut into the scene. Her superior wants to know how she's feeling, but Emma would rather prepare for the launch to Mars.

Two weeks earlier, Emma and her husband, Matt, attend their daughter Lex's soccer game. Instead of taking the shot, she passes her goal-making opportunity to a teammate, who misses.

Matt and Emma encourage Lex to take the shot next time as they make their way to a press conference ahead of Emma's big mission. It's an option for the press, and viewers, to meet the Atlas crew.

Aside from Emma, the team is composed of representatives from multiple nations across the globe. Dr. Kwesi Weisberg-Abban is the only team member to have zero space experience, but he is a leading botanist looking forward to growing life on Mars.

Misha Poponov is a Russian cosmonaut, the most experienced of the crew.

Next to him is Lu Wang, one of the world's finest chemists and a woman of little worlds. Finally, from India comes accomplished pilot, Ram Arya.

Asked about the families they'll be leaving behind when they embark on this three-year mission, Emma reveals her husband is also a trained astronaut. Unspecified health reasons have

forced him to retire, but he will serve as the mission's chief engineer from Mission Control on Earth.

Back at home, Emma, Lex, and Matt enjoy a family dinner on the patio beneath fairy lights. Lex brings up a question asked by one of the journalists. Is it true there is a 50-50 chance she won't survive the trip? Matt tries to reassure Lex that will not happen, but Emma is more honest about the risks involved with space travel.

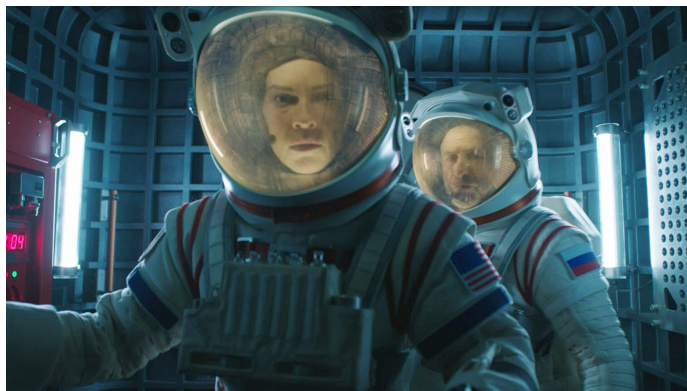
She visits Lex in her bedroom later, gifting her a sterling silver bracelet with three charms, for the earth, the moon, and Mars. Emma tells her the string woven between them represents her making her way back to Lex.

Then she shares a moment with her husband as he plays the piano. Matt confesses that each day she launches is the worst day of his life because, for a moment, he has to wait and see if her shuttle will fail to launch, blowing her to pieces. It's why he wanted to hide the reality from their daughter. Still, he believes Emma is a hero, and he would have gone in a heartbeat if the doctors would have let him.

Summary: When a ship malfunction threatens the voyage before it's barely begun, Emma works with a wary Misha on a high-risk repair operation.



The episode begins with the Atlas crew adjusting to their mission to Mars. They video chat with people from around the world and we meet Lu's husband and son.

On Earth, Lex wakes up at Melissa's house after spending the night with them while her father remains in the hospital. We meet Melissa's daughter, Cassie (Felicia Patti) who Lex used to play with as a kid. Lex is eager to get to the hospital to see her dad.

Matt's nurse checks on him, he can't seem to feel anything below his waist, but she doesn't give him any answers, only says his doctor will be in soon to go over his neuro vitals.

Back in space, Emma begins deploying the various pods and devices to get the ship settled for the long journey to Mars while George and Darlene watch from Earth. The gear includes solar panels, sleeping pods, and other technical details. Gravity is restored to the crew quarters.

Everything seems to be going according to plan until they get a mechanical malfunctioning error regarding solar panel Zvezda, which is not fully deployed. All they can do for now is wait for Ground to issue instructions, but Misha is confident they need to go outside and fix the issue themselves.

Emma calls Matt, likely to discuss the mechanical issues, but she happens to patch in just as Dr. Madigan arrives to go over the vitals. Matt could have mobility issues because the stroke temporarily cut off the blood supply to the part of his brain that controls his lower half, particularly his lower left side. He'll need to prepare for months of occupational and physical therapy.

Regarding the solar panel, Emma and Misha compose a plan alongside Ground to fix it.

A surly Misha continues to act dismissively toward Emma and her position as commander, even as they make their official plan. Ram demands that Misha try and be more respectful toward Emma. Misha snaps at Ram, saying that he has no idea what he has had to sacrifice to be there.

In a brief flashback, we see Misha with his wife and daughter, Natalya. He constructs a puppet and Natalya is ecstatic over his creation. We briefly saw Misha with a few puppets in the first episode, too.

Ram patches Lu into a call from Mei Chen (Nadia Hatta) at Ground. She says China's directors need to speak with her. In reality, Mei wants to check in on Lu. Based on their brief conversation, the two might have feelings for one another. Someone at Ground keeps a watchful eye over Mei, which is interesting.

Misha, too, makes a call before the EVA. He contacts his now-estranged daughter, Natalya (Olena Medwid), who is now all grown up with children of her own. Misha wants forgiveness for something before he makes the spacewalk, I assume in case he dies. Natalya brusquely forgives him, although, by her tone, you can tell she doesn't mean it.

Continuing the theme of every one contacting their loved ones, Emma reaches out to Matt. He reminds her that in space, all that matters is her and Misha. They need to trust each other and their instincts, no one else. They'll know what's right.

"Tell me you love me when you get back inside."

She makes one final call to Lex, who has returned home for the first time since she had to call 911 for her dad, even though she lies to her mom and says she's at her friend Annie's.

Before Misha and Emma make the spacewalk, they must go through the decommission chamber. Inside, Emma reminds him that all they have out there is each other. Even though Misha doesn't trust her, he's going to have to learn how for this to work.

As they slowly make their way down the length of the shuttle tethered together, the entire world, including Matt and Lex, watch with bated breath. But before they can reach the panel, they're told to pause as Lu notices there is an electrical hazard ahead.

To get to where they need to go, Emma asks Misha what his plan is, whatever it might be, she'll follow it. She knows this is his area of expertise and they don't have time to wait for Ground. Misha volunteers to form part of a long tether and throw himself to the panel. Emma says no, she'll go.

She makes it to the joint and notices one of the cables got stuck on the back of the panel's hinge. To fix it, she'll have to move to the opposite side of Zvezda and the only way to do that is to untether herself so she can get the leverage to float to the edge and flip around. It's extraordinarily risky, but they don't really have a choice.

It's a nailbiting moment as Emma let's go and floats to the edge. Thankfully, she makes it and manages to fix the hinge. To get back to where she needs to go, Emma is forced to put her entire trust in Misha as he reaches for her hand and tells her to untether her suit so he can pull her back. For a moment, Misha is the only thing anchoring Emma to the panel and preventing her from floating off into the abyss.

As the retreat back to safety, Emma issues the order for Ram to launch the panel, and they watch as Zvezda finally makes a successful deployment.

In the airlock, Emma asks Misha what he said in Russian before they initially headed out. He says he asked his wife's spirit to watch over them. Then he warns Emma she might eventually have to give up her family for this job. He speaks from experience.

Another flashback shows his wife's funeral. Misha was unable to return home before she died. He begs his daughter's forgiveness and she makes him promise never to leave again. Obviously, he breaks his promise, which might be why he yet again asked Natalya's forgiveness earlier in the episode.

As Episode 2 comes to a close, the crew make a toast to Emma and Misha for their success. But Ram isn't pleased. For one, he doesn't understand why Misha seems to think he's the only person who has made sacrifices to get there. As for Emma, he's upset that he vouched for her to Darlene and then she went and did something so reckless.

"We need you alive."

In the final moments, Emma tucks herself into bed and imagines that Matt is there, too, spooning her and keeping her safe while "Into the Mystic" by Van Morrison plays in the background.

Summary: A staff change at Mission Control upsets the usually unflappable Lu, and the fallout undermines Emma's command. Matt encourages Lex to return to school.



The episode predominantly focuses on the love story between Lu and CAPCOM Mei. As mentioned in my previous recap, one of the Chinese directors appeared to notice the communications between Mei and Lu. She finds a note in Mei's desk and recognizes the calligraphy as Lu's.

Realizing the relationship between the two women is more than platonic, she takes measures to reassign Mei to a new job, cutting off her only avenue of contact with Lu. Homophobia is still rampant in the world, particularly in China. And

since Lu will be the first person to step foot on Mars, she has been hailed a hero there.

The Chinese directors at NASA are putting immense pressure on her to remain perfect. It's not unlike the pressure her husband is putting on her son — who is scolded for earning a 98 instead of a 100 on a math exam.

Lu surprises them both when she encourages him to draw more comics simply because it makes him happy. Some part of her wants her son to feel the way she does when she's with Mei.

Jack Willmore is called to replace Mei as the Atlas CAPCOM.

When Emma learns Mei has been reassigned, she informs her team. Lu is obviously shaken by the news, although no one on the Atlas crew understands why until later. During a poker game between Misha, Ram, Kwesi, and Jack (via video chat), Jack lets it slip that Lu and Mei were rumored to have had an intimate relationship.

Ram is utterly disrespectful in his response, while Misha and Kwesi think it's inappropriate to discuss.

Later, Lu tries to convince Misha to help her hack the comms to open a private line to Mei. He tells her he won't help her cheat on her husband and rather cruelly lets her know that everyone aboard the Atlas is aware. Lu immediately assumes Emma is responsible for outing her and scolds her in front of the crew.

Once Emma learns what happened, she confronts Jack, coolly reprimanding him for both outing Lu and undermining her authority by sowing discord through the crew. Jack later tries to make amends for his mistake by finding a way to create a private channel for Lu and Mei to chat.

Emma and Lu seem to make an improvement in their relationship as Emma consoles Lu after the truth spreads and gives an hour to say goodbye to Mei, as they will be unable to communicate again until the trip is over.

Throughout the episode, we get to see how Mei and Lu's relationship formed. It started two years before when Mei started helping Lu practice her English. She would take her to a karaoke bar to sing and it slowly made Lu more confident and fluent in the language. In turn, Lu started teaching Mei calligraphy.

Regardless of what people believe, Mei and Lu never even so much as kissed. They were undeniably in love with one another, but Mei refused to disrespect the vows she made with her husband, despite admitting they had no love or passion between them.

During their final phone call, Mei and Lu wish each other tearful farewells and Mei promises to wait for Lu past the mission, past the parades and glory that will follow, and even until Lu's son grows up.

The ring Mei keeps with her is a cherished keepsake with an inscription that reads, "women hold up half the sky," a saying Mei said to Lu to grant her strength before gifting her the jewelry. By the episode's end, Lu has stopped hiding it and put it on a chain around her neck.

On Earth, Matt tries to encourage Lex to go back to school and return to her normal life, but she's having a hard time leaving him behind at the hospital. Emma realizes Lex is trying to be her in her absence. She's attending all of her dad's doctor's appointments, befriending everyone at the hospital, keeping track of his medications, etc. They worry it's too much stress for her as a teenager.

Eventually, Matt tells Lex she has to stop postponing school and she returns alongside Cassie. Her friend Annie immediately greets her and all of her school friends are nice to Lex and welcoming of Cassie. But it's hard for Lex to focus on the daily drama between their friends as she remains distracted worrying about her dad.

Lex later admits to Matt that she's afraid when she's gone something bad will happen to him. He comforts her, saying what will happen to him will happen regardless of whether or not she's there. It gives him the strength to see Lex being brave and going to school. He wants her to be happy and have her own life, that's vital to him.

Speaking of Matt's recovery, while Dr. Madigan believes he will likely make a full recovery in his upper body, or close to it at least, the doctor has doubts that Matt will ever walk again. When he told Matt his recovery would last a few months, he meant he would only need to stay in the hospital for a few months. His actual, overall recovery will take years and he might not ever be back to the way he once was.

The moment he tells Emma this, she goes into fix-it mode, calling that diagnosis premature and promising to contact the doctor.

But Matt tells Emma he doesn't need her to fix this right now. All he needs is his wife to be there for him. Will he walk again? It's too early to tell right now, but obviously the possibility is going to push him even harder during recovery.

Summary: Emma puts herself in harm's way when Ram unwittingly endangers the lives of everyone on the Atlas. Matt must make a wrenching decision about his future.



The episode opens with a manic Ram makes his way through the ship looking for something as his eyes go wide, and he inches closer and closer to the airlock while speaking to people that aren't there.

He's in the midst of a hallucinogenic spiral of some sort, triggered by his high fever. When he breaches the door close to the airlock, an alarm goes off, and the crew rushes to his side. Ram has with mono, which is incredibly contagious.

The entire crew begins a course of antivirals, and each one dons preventative

gear, including masks and gloves.

Emma is the one who decides she will risk infection by administering Ram's antivirals and taking care of him. She feels it is her duty as the commander. Despite her insistence, Ram tries to make her promise him she'll shoot him out of the airlock if he doesn't recover. He's terrified of getting someone else on the crew sick. He fears someone dying because they get infected by him.

At one point, Ram panics in his half-sleep-half-wake daze and falls out of bed, seriously wounding himself. A deep cut in his back causes him to bleed heavily. Again, Emma steps up to take care of him and stitch the wound. She orders the rest to stay behind. But none of them listen to her. Ultimately, all of them enter the room to help Ram. It's a mark of how far this crew has come on this journey.

Even Misha — who was most against getting close to Ram — comes in at the last second to staple his wound shut, much to everyone's chagrin. Poor Ram. But hey, it does make the injury stop bleeding.

Through flashbacks and a discussion with Emma, we learn Ram's fears stem from an incident that happened when he was a child. He became deathly ill, and his brother Rohit refused to leave

his side. Tragically, Rohit caught Ram's illness and did not recover. According to him, everything changed between him and his family after Ram died.

That's why he and his remaining family members are so estranged. They even told Ground that the only conditions they would want to hear about Ram's status in space are his death.

At the end of the episode, Ram tells Emma that all of this, coupled with his brother's story, has made him realize if he can find a woman who stands by him as Rohit and Emma did, he will never let her go.

Lex starts acting like a typical television teenager. She lashes out at Dr. Putney — who is both her and her mother's therapist — after she discovers her mom told him she recently got a C on a science exam. It's not like Lex to get anything less than an A, and Emma grows concerned she might be struggling with everything going on between Emma being in space and Matt still in recovery.

During a phone call with Emma at school, she even accuses her mother of caring about nothing but school. Before they can have much of a conversation, the signal dies out. A boy named Isaac Rodriguez overhears the convo and tells Lex where she can find a better signal in the future. He has some experience with long-distance phone calls as his father was in the military and frequently went overseas.

Obviously crushing on Isaac, Lex and Cassie google him later to learn more. Lex discovers his father died overseas. Instead of attending her rescheduled science exam, she blows it off and finds Isaac in the parking lot. He's busy loading a dirt bike into the back of his pickup truck.

I'm guessing that Lexi feels a bond to Isaac after learning he lost his dad. He has likely dealt with some of the things she's going through right now. She asks him if she can tag along to wherever he's headed. The two spend a normal, fun afternoon riding dirt bikes together.

Matt is inching closer and closer to a hospital checkout date and is eager to return home with Lex. He meets some fellow patients during group therapy and even confesses to having his first erection since all of this happened. While he's still working on regaining full use of his left hand and walking again, if Matt passes his upcoming tests, he can go home, although he will continue physical therapy for years to come during outpatient sessions.

Everything is ready to go when Matt has a one-on-one conversation with a fellow patient named Travis Parker who wound up bucked off a bronco and received long-lasting damage because of it. Travis advises Matt to fail one of his tests so they can see he's improving, but not enough to go home. Matt is in one of the world's best rehab centers. Why give that up so soon when he hasn't reached his ideal recovery spot?

Travis warns that when he leaves, he'll be getting less PT, only an hour a day or so — he's heading toward "plateau city." The way he sees it, they're part of a system, so they need to learn how to work it to their advantage. Of course, they're ready for Matt to go home; it costs thousands of dollars to keep every patient there a day longer than necessary.

He even demonstrates the progress he's made with his hand, adding it would not have happened had he left. Matt seriously considers taking Travis's advice. Even Emma encourages him if he thinks it's the right thing to do. His only concern is Lex.

When he tells her his plan, she tries to seem supportive, but then she blows off her science exam right before Matt is due to take his own tests. It serves as a sign to him that his daughter needs him more, and he passes his tests with flying colors. He's going home early, after all.

Summary: As Christmas approaches, the crew prepares to make their final calls home before communication grows spotty. Matt and Lex adjust to their new normal.



Christmas is approaching and the Atlas crew must prepare to say their goodbyes to loved ones as their continued distance from Earth means the signal will grow increasingly spotty. For the next two years, their primary communication with their home will only be via text and email.

It's also time for each member to receive a medical exam from Ram to ensure they're still in good health. Poor Kwesi is a bubble of anxiety and other moderate ailments, each attributed to his first adjustment to space. Perhaps the most con-

cerning of all, however, is his foot. A sizable chunk of his heel falls off while he's draping tinsel around the shuttle.

Ram assures him some atrophy is normal. He's not overly concerned with anything concerning Kwesi's health, not the same way he fears for Misha. Given his frequent space flier miles, Misha has begun experiencing a severe case of space blindness. Emma gives him a direct order to complete his exam because he doesn't want to accept reality.

While no one has gone completely blind from it before, and their eyesight usually restores upon returning to Earth, Ram warns Emma that no one has ever traveled as far or for as long as they have.

Misha is more concerned with perfecting a puppet show to perform for his grandchildren during their final video chat. He even gets Kwesi to act as his co-star. When the time comes, the puppet show is a touching and beautiful send-off for his kids and a veiled message to his daughter Natalya. The story about a dog who is meant for space all along feels very similar to Misha's.

After, he gets emotional while talking to his daughter, finally apologizing for sending her away to live with her aunt and uncle as a girl while he left to be a cosmonaut. He says he struggled with suicidal thoughts after his wife died and didn't feel competent enough to care for his daughter. As we watch Misha beg for her forgiveness, it's hard not to cry, especially when Natalya tells him she doesn't know how to forgive him.

It's even worse when you remember that this could be the last time they speak if Misha doesn't make it back to Earth. That's something they all have to grapple with as they say their goodbyes, especially Emma. Saying her farewells to Matt and Lex is incredibly difficult for her. She's struggling to accept the years she'll miss of Lex's life.

When she gets back, she'll be a senior in high school. Emma tries to give her advice about everything she can think of, from boys to the adults she needs to trust and listen to. Lex finally confesses to her mom that's both sad and angry that being her mom wasn't enough for her.

Emma says she's happy that Lex could admit that and tells her she has a right to be upset. When the signal drops, Emma retreats to her quarters to be alone for a while. Lu eventually knocks to tell her that Misha is getting Kwesi drunk off his homemade vodka and feels embarrassed at having interrupted Emma at a vulnerable moment.

It winds up being a good thing, though, as Emma asks Lu's advice on coping with the distance from their families. Lu says she has to keep looking forward, to think about the fact they'll be the first people to step foot on Mars.

"You're looking in the wrong direction, Emma."

The end of the episode is a sweet ending as the crew take syringe shots of Misha's vodka and celebrate Christmas in their unorthodox way. Kwesi even gives everyone a surprise Hannuakha gift in the form of genuine greens! They're delighted to have real food for a moment, even if it is just a few leaves of spinach.

Matt returns home from the hospital, and both he and Lex have a difficult time adjusting to their home with all its changes. Wheelchair ramps and a hospital bed have been added to make the house more accessible for Matt. Regardless, he's intent on making Christmas as normal as possible, including decorations and their traditional smoked brisket.

Lex and Matt are tiptoeing around each other, both trying to be strong for the other. Matt tells Lex it's okay for her to be mad or sad; whatever she feels is valid. He doesn't want her to bottle things up inside, and Lex tells him the same thing. Matt needs to take his own advice, though. We see Matt's exterior crack on Christmas Eve when he can't sleep and goes into the garage to get decorations to finish the tree off the top shelf.

Inching out of his chair more and more as he tries to grapple the box with a golf club, he fails to retrieve it and collapses to the ground. His mounting frustration results in him recklessly beating the wall of shelves. The one good thing about him being in the garage in the middle of the night is he hears Isaac's truck pull up and drop Lex off.

He's able to greet her by opening the garage door as she stands there looking guilty. Isaac invited Lex to Midnight Mass, a tradition for his family. Over Christmas dinner the next day, unable to stand the idea she might have ruined Christmas, Lex apologizes for sneaking out, just before Emma calls.

Ultimately, Matt and Lex stop by Melissa and Cassie's Christmas party with their leftover brisket, and it looks like maybe, they might be taking a step in the right direction.

A Little Faith

Summary: Tempers flare on the Atlas over a water-system glitch and an act of betrayal. As Matt works on the ship's issue, he accidentally meets Lex's new friend.



The water system aboard the Atlas causes the entire crew to work together and find a fix quickly before the threat grows dire. Misha is the best choice as an engineer who knows the ins and outs of the shuttle better than anyone else on the team. But with his waning eyesight, there is some fear of putting him in charge of things.

Since he has been spending more time in his pod, his eyesight has begun improving steadily, but Emma mandates he get another eye test before they let him start

messing with the prime system. The plan is to replace its heart with parts from the backup system to get things up and running smoothly again.

Misha pays his eye exam with flying colors, which immediately seemed suspicious to me, and for a good reason. Half-way through his work on the system, Misha realizes the damage is more severe than anticipated.

The "arteries" are also damaged; they must repair them. The problem is, Emma and Kwesi notice something is off with Misha's eyes when a single screw bypasses him, and he doesn't see it.

The problem with these machines is they are very delicate and full of thousands of tiny bolts and screws. They cannot risk losing a single one. When Emma presses Misha to explain, he admits that he memorized the eye exam chart by heart. It's a serious betrayal of the team's trust, but Misha argues that he only did it because he knows how to fix it by heart. He claims he could do it with his eyes closed.

Emma is not willing to risk that; she puts Ram, who is a surgeon, in charge of stripping the prime to beef up the backup machine instead. Tempers flare between the team as they grow frustrated. Kwesi is the one who eventually snaps and gives everyone some perspective. If they want to fix it, they need to have faith in each other.

Through their combined efforts, they manage to get the backup machine running, but the problem is, there is no 100% guarantee it can get them the rest of the way to Mars. The backup is not producing as much as it should be — which was already significantly less than the prime.

They will have to start going on emergency rations to make it work. Kwesi has to make the most significant sacrifice. They cannot use any extra water to sustain the garden.

Each member finds themselves in the gardening room by the episode's end. Understandably, they find peace surrounded by the smell of growing plants. It's a lingering comfort reminiscent of Earth. According to Kwesi, the plants will likely die within a week without water, so they try to enjoy their time with them while they can.

Kwesi's parents died in Ghana. Orphaned as a child, he was adopted by a loving couple and brought to Europe. It was his adopted father that got him interested in gardening, teaching him everything it takes to nurture a bud to bloom. It was also his adopted parents who taught him about faith and religion, although they were never pushy or overbearing about it.

As a kid, Kwesi had doubts about God, wondering why his parents died if God existed. Over time, he began to appreciate the Jewish faith and how it sculpted his perceptions and gave him hope during difficult times.

Sadly, his father passed away when he was still relatively young. Gardening helps keep that connection alive, especially as he had a difficult time adapting to England, and he tells Emma that gardening with his dad felt them both feel at ease.

On Earth, Matt is determined to go back to work. Unfortunately, Darlene and George don't think it's a good idea for him to return to his previous job as chief engineer for the Atlas. He's deemed too emotionally involved in the case.

Plus, god forbid something happens to him again, it could be damaging to Emma, who almost gave up the mission when he had his stroke. Nothing will deter Matt from trying to help the team solve the water system crisis, however.

His dedication to studying the schematics causes him to drive his car into a ditch while it's raining. Lex and Isaac, who just finished dirt biking (Lex is a natural), take a detour to pick up Matt, so he doesn't have to wait for the tow truck.

It's a little awkward for him to meet Isaac like this, especially since Lex has never told her dad about him, but it goes okay. When they get home, Matt launches into an interrogation to learn more about the 17-year-old boy spending time with his daughter. He finds out that Isaac's father, who was an army medic, died when his humvee hit an IED.

After Matt goes inside, Lex apologizes for not telling her dad but worried he'd forbid her from seeing Isaac due to his age. It would be easier to talk to her mom. Isaac asks if she misses her, and Lex says yes, but that it must be more challenging for Isaac, whose father is unreachable.

"I still tell him things in my head, I've told him all about you," he tells Lex.

They share a kiss, and I'm guessing their first. Inside the Green house, Lex talks to her dad about Isaac for the first time. He thinks he's a friendly kid and tells Lex he wants her to feel comfortable talking to him about this kind of stuff, about anything. All he asks is that she doesn't rush into anything and that she promises not to ride one of the dirt bikes in Isaac's pickup.

Hiding his concern, Matt recommends writing back to her Mother. Eventually she does just that and opens up about how she feels about Isaac.

After sleeping for an extended period of time, Emma awakens with newfound clarity and sends an email back home. She apologises for her behaviour and promises to do better.
