Summary: Boba Fett holds court.



The episode opens with a landscape shot of the surroundings of the late Jabba's Palace on Tatooine. Several interior shots are captured including the barbican, Jabba's throne room and the empty band stage. In a separate chamber, Boba Fett is submerged inside a bacta pod.

He experiences flashbacks of watery Kamino and Tipoca City, followed by a grieving Boba cradling the helmet of his fallen father Jango Fett at the Petranaki Arena on Geonosis. In another flashback, Fett struggles within the digestive sys-

tem of the sarlacc. Turning on an inbuilt sensor inside his helmet, he sees the remains of a stormtrooper. Fett retrieves an oxygen unit from the stormtrooper's armor before punching a hole through the sarlacc's gut. He then fires a flamethrower. Fett then climbs out of the sarlacc onto the sands of the Great Pit of Carkoon, which is littered with the wreckage of Jabba's sail barge Khetanna. A weakened Fett climbs out the pit and lies on the desert ground.

Later that night, Fett is discovered by a party of Jawas, who strip the armor from his body. They also take his jetpack. Fett awakes but one of the Jawas knocks him unconscious with a blaster. The Jawas return to their sandcrawler.

The following day, a group of Tusken Raiders stumble upon the unconscious Boba Fett. One of them turns him over with his gaderffii stick. Seeing the burnt and weakened Fett, they bind his hands with a rope. One of the Tuskens gives him a drink from a gourd. The Tuskens ride back to their clan with Fett bound behind a bantha. Fett is forced to walk through desert heat and sand and eventually collapses from exhaustion. They drag him through the sands to their encampment.

Fett is bound to a wooden post and guarded by Tusken sentries. Several adolescent Tuskens beat him with gaderffii sticks, knocking him unconscious again. That night, Fett awakens at his post. Seated nearby is a captive Rodian with red skin. The two watch a nearby fire, where a massiff rests. Fett struggles with his ropes, which draws the attention of the massiff. The massiff lunges at Fett and a fight breaks out. He knocks out the beast and uses its sharp teeth to cut his bonds.

Fett asks the Rodian if he wants him to cut his bonds. A Tusken sentry intervenes but Fett overpowers him, knocking the gaderffii stick from his hands. The Rodian cries, alerting the rest of the Tusken clan. Fett flees into the desert with the massiff in hot pursuit. The creature catches up with him and he fights it with his stolen gaderffii stick. The Tusken catch up with him and watch. The beast returns to its Tusken masters.

A showdown between the Tusken and Fett ensues. One of the Tusken approaches him with a gaderffii stick. After sizing each other, the two break into a duel. The Tusken knocks Fett to the ground but Fett rises to his feet and fights back. The Tusken knocks him down a second time but Fett is still determined to continue the fight. The Tusken beats him repeatedly. The other Tusken surround him with one kicking him to the ground. Fett slips into unconsciousness.

In the present, Fett is woken up by Fennec Shand. Fett wakes up and suspends his "healing session." The bacta pod's doors open and he climbs out of the machine. As a droid fetches him a towel, Fett tells Shand that the dreams are coming back. Shand reminds him that they are expecting guests who have come to pay their respect. Droids dress Fett in his Mandalorian armor. Fett dons the helmet himself.

In Jabba's former throneroom, an Aqualish delegate speaks in the Aqualish language and presents a box of credit chips. The droid 8D8 retrieves the chips. When Fett asks what the Aqualish said, Shand explains that he said something about friendship. Fett says that they really need a protocol droid. 8D8 presents Dokk Strassi, the leader of the Tatooine Trandoshan family and the protectors of Mos Espa's city center and its business territories. Fett recalls that he used to work for Dokk.

Dokk addresses Fett as the new daimyo. Fett says that it is a pleasure to be welcomed to Mos Espa by Dokk, who presents 8D8 with a rug. Dokk wishes that Fett may never leave Mos Espa before walking away. Fett confides with Shand that the Trandoshan's compliment sounds like a threat.

The next guest is Mok Shaiz, the Mayor of Mos Espa and its surrounding plateaus. The guest corrects that he is the Mayor's majordomo. Shand recalls that the Mayor was coming to pay tribute. The majordomo apologizes for the "understandable" misunderstanding in the Mayor's correspondence. Fett extends his greetings and appreciation for the Mayor's tribute. The majordomo clarifies that this was another "understandable" misunderstanding and says that the only tribute that he bears is the Mayor's heartfelt welcome, which he expresses in his stead. When Shand asks if he brings no tribute, the majordomo reiterates the Mayor's heartfelt welcome and claims that he has been drawn away by pressing matters.

Shand warns the majordomo that if he had showed the same insolence to the late Jabba, the Hutt would have fed him to his menagerie. The majordomo apologizes. Fett tells the majordomo to tell the Mayor that he is here now. The majordomo replies that he knows and raises the matter of tribute. Shand explains to Fett that the Mayor wants Fett to pay him. Fett replies that he is the crime lord and that the Mayor of Mos Espa is supposed to pay him. Shand wants to kill him but Fett disagrees, saying that the majordomo works for the Mayor.

Shand tells the majordomo that Lord Fett allows him to leave unmolested. The majordomo apologizes and says that he will convey Fett's sentiment to the Mayor. The majordomo warns Fett and Shand that they will receive another delegation in the future. Fett tells Shand to keep an eye on Mok.

8D8 then has a unidentified character bring in two Gamorrean prisoners, who had served Jabba and then transferred their allegiance to the late Bib Fortuna. They did not surrender even after their patron was killed. 8D8 says that they were captured alive as a tribute to Fett and says that their tortured squeals will send a message to potential challengers to his throne. Fett says he does not torture. 8D8 counsels his master to show strength in order to win acceptance as a daimyo. Complimenting their loyalty to their previous bosses, Fett offers to spare the lives of the Gamorreans if they were to serve him. The Gamorreans bend the knee and submit to Fett. Shand warns him that this is a "bad idea."

Fett and Shand later travel with their two new Gamorrean bodyguards to Mos Espa. Shand chides Fett for not letting them carry him on a litter. Fett says that he doesn't want to be carried around like a "useless" noble. Shand explains that is a sign of power and that people in Mos Espa are used to seeing the Hutts being paraded around the streets. Shand says that things would have gone a lot smoother if he had accepted their ways.

At a cantina, Max Rebo and a Bith musician perform. Fett and Shand enter the bar with their

Gamorrean bodyguards. An astromech droid asks if they are here for drinks. Shand replies that they are here for business with Madam Garsa Fwip. Two Twi'leks ask if they would like their helmets cleaned while they wait for Garsa. Shand declines but Fett allows them to take both their helmets in order to accept their ways.

Madam Garsa Fwip turns out to be a female Twi'lek with olive skin. She welcomes them to the Sanctuary and asks if they would like any of their sundry offerings. Fett says maybe another time and gets down to business. Garsa asks if he would like his Gamorrean guards to be given refreshments while they are sequestered. Fett replies that it won't take long and offers to do it here. Fett introduces his Master Assassin Fennec Shand and explains that he has replaced Bib Fortuna.

Garsa apologizes that she did not see his litter, prompting Fett to say that he prefers to walk on his own two feet. Fett explains that he is here to introduce himself and reassures her that her business will continue under his watchful eye. Garsa thanks him for traveling to The Sanctuary and says that he is always welcome, granting Fett ownership. The Twi'lek attendants return their helmets, with Shand remarking that Fett's helmet looks "shinier" than hers, being full of credits.

While departing The Sanctuary, Fett tells Shand that Jabba had many vassals and that they have a lot of ground to cover to keep his empire intact. Shand offers to cover the rounds on her own, saying that Jabba rarely left his chambers. Fett replies that Jabba ruled by fear while he intends to rule by respect. Shand counters that in difficult times, fear is a surer bet.

The two are then ambushed by six crimson-clad figures armed with plasma pikes and energy shields, who surround them. Fett instinctively fires a rocket, whose blast is deflected back by an energy shield, knocking both helmets loose—the credits in Fett's helmet fly everywhere to be picked up by bystanders. A fight ensues, with Fett and Shand barely holding their own before the Gamorreans come to their aid, breaking the circle created by the ambushers and providing the respite Fett and Shand needed to regain their balance and the upper hand.

Together they dispatch three of the attackers, leading the other three to attempt to escape. Fett fires a rocket at one, disintegrating and partially blowing up a rooftop. The other two who had climbed to the rooftops ahead of their disintegrated compatriot are chased by Shand, who retrieves her helmet on the way to the wall. As she reaches the rooftop, Fett tells her to capture them alive, before telling the Gamorreans to get him back to the bacta pod.

Shand chases the two survivors across the rooftops, all performing feats of acrobatics and athleticism. She finally reaches them but is forced to dive off a rooftop to escape a counterattack, allowing the two to continue their escape. As they round a corner, they come face to face with Shand, who has gained the lead. She disarms the two, before knocking one off the rooftop to his death and capturing the other.

Following the assassination attempt, Fett is put into the bacta pod by one of the Gamorreans, where he experiences another flashback into his past following the rescue of Han Solo. Following his unsuccessful escape attempt, Fett is woken up by a young Tusken and led away by his bound hands, with his feet chained to the captive Rodian who follows. Together with a domesticated massif, they trek across the desert and make a slight detour after seeing smoke.

They peer over a sand dune to see a homestead, with several beings beating a man, painting a symbol on the walls of their homestead before getting on speeder bikes and riding off.

Moving on, the trio come to a stop, where the Tusken gestures for the two captives to dig, searching for a gourd filled with liquid; a source of water. The Rodian finds one before Fett, who takes a drink. Fett soon finds one for himself. Before he can drink, the Tusken child takes the gourd from Fett, pouring it out for the massif to drink with some spilling onto the dry sands of Tatooine.

Continuing to dig for the gourds, Fett tells the Rodian that they could have both escaped had he kept his snout closed. Fett says that if he can get to Anchorhead, he can get them offworld. Fett grumbles about strangling the Rodian and feeding him to the watchdog. The Rodian returns an insult in Rodian, which Fett can understand.

While continuing their dig, the Rodian discovers a large scaly mass under the sands. Excavating the mass, it stirs to live to reveal a large three-clawed hand, grabbing the Rodian's arm. More arms come out of the sand before the entire beast reveals itself as a six legged reptile capable of standing on its hind legs. Grabbing the captives, the creature starts attacking, with the massif counterattacking before being thrown away by the creature, which then kills the Rodian. Fett is

held up and the Tusken stabs the creature's foot, resulting in the creature throwing Fett and hitting the Tusken, causing him to hurtle onto the sands.

The creature turns from Fett and goes after the Tusken adolescent. However, Fett runs up the creature's back and wraps the chains around its neck and asphyxiates the creature. Fett's actions earns him the respect of the adolescent Tusken. The Tusken, Fett and the massiff return to the Tusken camp with the creature's head as a trophy. Their return sparks a celebration among the Tusken clan, with the adolescent Tusken regaling his people with stories of the battle with the reptilian creature. The leader of the camp wordlessly hands Fett a gourd out of gratitude, which he drinks.

Summary: Boba Fett faces new challengers on Tatooine.



The episode opens with a high angle shot of the rocky desert landscape outside Jabba's Palace. The camera zooms in on an armed Fennec Shand leading the captured assassin into the vacuous castle. The two walk through the giant blast gates into the throne room where Boba Fett holds court. Fett demands to know who sent him and what were his orders. The two Gamorrean guards and 8D8 stand in the background.

When the assassin refuses to speak, Fett orders one of the Gamorreans to behead him. Before the Gamorrean can slit his throat, the prisoner curses him in Huttese. Fett chastises the prisoner for being ungrateful that they spared his life. 8D8 explains that the prisoner is from the Order of the Night Wind, an assassin for hire. 8D8 says that there is no way the prisoner will talk, adding that he fears no man. Fett and Shand express disagreement.

Shand suggests that the prisoner will fear the rancor and presses a button that activates the trapdoor to the rancor's den. As the gates below open, the assassin panics and tells Fett and Shand that he was sent by the mayor of Mos Espa. He begs for his life. However, Shand reveals that the rancor's den is empty and decries the assassin. The only creature in the rancor's den is a small mouse. Shand suggests to Fett that they visit the Mayor.

Fett and Shand lead the captured assassin through the streets of Mos Espa, accompanied by the two Gamorreans. Their presence is noticed by several Trandoshans, who eye them. The group walk inside the town hall where Fett tells the City Hall clerk that he is here to see the Mayor. When the receptionist asks if he has an appointment, Fett responds that he found one of his "stray pets" and that he is here to return it to his master. The receptionist tells him to wait but is overruled by the Twi'lek majordomo, who apologizes for the lack of pomp.

The Majordomo claims that the Mayor is indisposed for the rest of the week but Fett forces his way into the Mayor's throneroom. The Ithorian mayor Mok Shaiz demands an explanation for Fett's unscheduled visit. The Majordomo reminds Shaiz that Fett is the new Daimyo. Fett

demands to know why the Mayor sent the assassin to kill him. Shaiz explains that the assassin is a member of the Order of the Night Wind. When Fett asks the Mayor if this is an admission, one of the Mayor's guards shoots the assassin.

With the Majordomo translating, Shaiz says that the Order of the Night Wind are not allowed to operate outside Hutt Space and thanks Fett for turning him in. He orders his guards to bring him his reward. Fett replies that he is not a bounty hunter but Shaiz says he heard otherwise. Shaiz remarks that Fett sits on the throne of his former employer, prompting Fett to respond that Bib Fortuna was not his employer. Shaiz clarifies that he was referring to Jabba.

Fett replies that he will take his payment as belated tribute. He adds that the Mayor should remember that he serves as long as the Daimyo of Tatooine decides. Shaiz asks Fett to consider who really sent the Night Wind assassins and claims that he has no motive for killing Fett. Shaiz tells Fett that he serves at his pleasure. Fett warns him that he is not a fool and those who have crossed him no longer breathe. As advice, Shaiz warns Fett that running a family is more complicated than bounty hunting. Shaiz tells him to go to Garsa Fwip's Sanctuary to get an idea of what he means.

Fett and his entourage visit Garsa's Sanctuary, which is full of droids and patrons. Taking off his helmet, Fett meets with Garsa, who offers him a table. Fett explains that Mayor Mok Shaiz sent him here on the pretext that there is something that he should know. When Garsa gives a nervous look, Fett remarks that she is sweating like a gumpta on Mustafar. Garsa explains that the "Twins" have laid claim to their late cousin Jabba's bequest. Fett replies that he heard the Twins were preoccupied with Nal Hutta to bother with Tatooine.

The cantina grows silent as they hear drums beating in the background. Fett, Shand, and the Gamorreans walk outside to see a procession carrying two Hutts on a litter. As the litter approaches Fett's entourage, the Hutt brother tells Fett that they have business to discuss. Fett replies that this is his territory, prompting the Hutt brother to reiterate that this is Jabba's territory and now theirs. One of the drummers presents a tablet stating the Hutts' claim to Tatooine.

Fett rejects their claim, stating that he is the Daimyo of Mos Espa. The Hutts laugh, with the brother asking if this is so. An armed black Wookiee known as Black Krrsantan, who is armed with a heavy blaster, approaches Fett and his entourage. Fett is not intimidated, stating that these are not the death pits of Duur, and that he is not a sleeping Trandoshan guard. Fett replies that Mos Espa is his territory and tells them to go back to Nal Hutta. The Hutt sister speaks in Huttese. Her brother replies that Fett has upset his sister and that he is more patient than her, who wants to kill him.

As Shand and Krrsantan load their weapons, Fett explains that Jabba gone and that his former majordomo Bib Fortuna usurped his territory. Since Fett killed him, all that belonged to Fortuna now belongs to him. Fett says that they will have to kill him for it. The two Hutt siblings speak. The Hutt brother says that bloodshed is bad for business and that this matter can be dealt with later. He wants Fett to sleep lightly.

As the drummers beat their drums, the two Hutts withdraw. Black Krrsantan growls at Fett before walking away. Shand tells Fett that they will have to get permission to kill them since they are Hutts. Fett suggests that the matter is settled but accepts that it is not yet over.

While Fett is resting inside his bacta tank, he experiences a flashback of his time with the Tusken Raiders. While a bantha plows the desert, he learns how to wield a gaderffii stick from a Tusken. The older Tusken teaches him to hold the stick properly before parrying. She knocks the staff out of Fett's hand before telling him to practice again. He asks the Tusken to show him. Other Tusken search the desert sands for gourds.

While the two are practicing, a massiff finds some prey in the desert. The prey scurries into the desert with the Tusken's massiff hounds in pursuit. A Tusken kills the unidentified prey with a rifle. The massiffs feast on the creature. An animal's roar is heard in the background. The Tusken take up position as an armored hovertrain approaches. Blaster bolts from the armored train take out a bantha and several Tusken Raiders. The train then rides away into the desert. Several Tusken are killed and wounded by the gunners. Fett watches the Tusken attending to their wounded and dead.

Later that night, the Tusken cremate their fallen. Fett himself carries the remains of a young Tusken youth. His parents fling his remains over a fire. Fett is visibly troubled by the plight of the Tusken Raiders. He drinks from a black melon and watches several speeder bikes passing

their encampment. Fett speaks to the tribal Elders, vowing to stop the train with a rifle and stick. He promises to be back by morning. The Chief is skeptical Fett will succeed but lets him leave on his quest.

Fett travels to Tosche Station, which is frequented by several Nikto miners. Among the patrons are Camie Marstrap and Laze Loneozner. One of the Niktos snatches food from their table and drinks one of their drinks. Laze says "This is not right", prompting the Nikto to ask if he said something. Laze once again says "This is not right". The Niktos grab and restrain Laze and Camie. One of the Niktos beats him with a stun baton. However, they are interrupted by Fett.

Fett walks into the cantina armed with a gaderffii stick and rifle. The Nikto miners fetch melee weapons and attack Fett. Fett disarms one of his attackers. A second miner shoots at him but Fett shoots him first. Laze and Camie take the opportunity to leave. Fett fights the remaining Nikto miners, wounding and killing some with his gaderffii stick. He hurls one more through a window before stopping to drink. Fett then exits the cantina and inspects their speeder bikes.

The following day, Fett leaves Tosche Station with several speeder bikes in tow. He returns to the Tusken Raiders' camp. His arrival initially unnerves the Tusksens, who grab their rifles and go into defensive position. The Chief realizes that it is Fett and tells them to stand down. The Chief welcomes Fett, who tells them that the bikes are a gift for them. The Tusksens attempt to dismantle the bikes but Fett tells them that he will teach them to ride so that they can stop the train.

Later, Fett teaches the Tusken Raiders how to operate the accelerators and brakes, likening the bikes to a bantha. A young Tusken tries out the speeder bike but reverses. Fett then leads the Tusksens on their first ride. The Tusksens initially struggle but learn how to operate the bikes. He also trains them how to leap from bikes and to signal using a mirror. Fett also teaches them how to accelerate their speeder bikes through the desert. The Tusksens get better with handling the bikes and leaping from their vehicles. Fett also continues practicing with the gaderffii stick and learns how to knock the weapon out of his opponents' hands.

A Tusken sentry spots the approaching hovertrain. The Tusksens grab their weapons and jump on the speeder bikes. Others take up position in the desert. As the Tusksens in the trenches exchange fire with the Pyke gunners, Fett and other Tusksens riding speeder bikes pursue the train. A Tusken signals to other Tusksens lying in the hills. Hidden Tusken snipers shoot several of the gunners. Some of Tusksens on bikes manage to board the train but face resistance from the gunners. Some are killed.

Fett rescues one and uses a grappling hook to latch onto the hovertrain. He also kills one of the Pyke gunners. They jump across carriages and fight several of the emerging sentries. As they approach the train engine, the Pyke guards take up position and fire on the advancing Tusksens, taking down some. A Tusken rams her bike into one of the carriages, damaging one of the connectors. However, she fails to split the train's carriages. The driver droid accelerates the engine, causing the hovertrain to accelerate rapidly.

Still, she manages to board the train and proceeds to fight the Pyke gunners onboard, killing and throwing out several. She takes out the lead Pyke gunner and his companions. Realizing that the Tusksens are winning, the driver droid fires up the engine, causing a blast to knock off one of Fett's Tusken allies. Fett fights with more Pyke guards near the train engine. In the process, one of the Pykes is blasted by the engines and thrown to the ground, crushed to death by the carriages.

Fett forces his way into the train engine where he orders the driver droid to stop the vehicle. The spidery droid instead jumps out into the desert. Fett struggles to stop the train but finds the brakes. He uses his gaderffii stick to disable the ship's engines, causing it to brake in the desert. The Tusksens shout in victory before proceeding to loot the train of weapons and merchandise.

Several Tusksens guard the surviving captive Pyke gunners and guards. Fett demands to know who is the leader. The leading Pyke stands up and removes his mask. He asks Fett if he is going to kill them. Fett replies that it depends on how he answers his question. When Fett asks if he is carrying spice, the Pyke leader asks what he means by spice. Fett asks if he is carrying sansanna spice from the slave mines of Kessel. The Pyke leader asks what does spice look like. Just then, two Tusksens discover a crate of spice.

Fett replies this is not looking good for him. The Pyke leader says that they assumed that Tusksens were uncivilized raiders and says that they were just trying to protect their route. Fett replies that the Dune Sea is no longer free for the Pykes to pass since the Tusksens claim the

territory as ancestral ground. He says that if they want to pass, a toll has to be paid to the Tusksens. He warns that any death dealt by traveling trains will be returned ten-fold. Fett orders the Pyke leader to return to the Pyke Syndicate with these new terms and adds that their lives are a gesture of their civility. He tells the Pykes to walk single file in the direction of the high sun, explaining that it will lead them to Anchorhead by sunset.

When the leader protests that they will be killed, Fett reassures him that he will be traveling under the protection of the Tusksens and that no harm will come to them. When the Pyke leader protests that they will die of thirst without the water car, Fett promises that they will each be given a black melon, stating that they will survive on its milk as these people do. The Pykes leave while the Tusksens plunder the water cart.

Later that night, the Tusken Chief explains that since the oceans of Tatooine have dried up, they have stayed hidden. He says that the other tribes have survived by killing. Fett replies that they shouldn't have to hide since they are warriors. The Tusken Chief replies that the offworlders have machines. Fett reassures him that they now have machines and that they know every grain of sand in the Dune Sea.

The Tusken Chief gives Fett a gift, stating that he is a good guide. The gift turns out to be a lizard in a basket. The lizard climbs into Fett's nostrils. The Chief explains that the lizard will guide him from inside his head. Fett's vision becomes blurry and his body convulses. He finds himself walking through the deserts of Tatooine and sees a vision of trees and oceans. There are creatures with red eyes. Fett also experiences flashbacks of climbing out through the maw of the sarlacc as well as his childhood on Kamino, watching his father leave on the Slave I. The vision ends with him emerging while the ocean roars.

The following day, Fett returns to the Tusken camp, where he is greeted by the young Tusken youth he befriended and his massiff. Fett is greeted by the Tusken Chief and his followers. The lizard emerges from his nostrils. Fett remarks that he thought it was part of the dream. The Tusken Chief asks him to show him a branch. Fett presents the branch from his night journey to the Tusksens. They lead him inside a tent where Tusksens clothe him with Tusken robes, scarves, and bandages.

The cloaked Fett emerges from the tent and faces his Tusken friends. The young Tusken walks beside him and the two head into the desert towards a wrecked site. One of the Tusken forges the branch into a new gaderffii stick. Fett helps him to carve the weapon, which is also heated in an oven. Pieces of metal are added to the gaderffii stick, giving it an armored plating. The metal is dipped into an oven.

Later that night, Fett presents his new gaderffii stick to the rest of the clan. He parries with the other Tusksens, who gather before a camp fire. They dance around the fire.

Chapter 3: The Streets of Mos Espa

Summary: Boba Fett must deal with two very different threats.



The episode opens with a B'omarr Order Brain walker skittering across the rocky desert outside Jabba's Palace on Tatooine. 8D8 briefs Boba Fett and Fennec Shand about the businesses that were under the protection of the "name that should not be spoken off. Fett tells him that he can name Jabba the Hutt, which the droid obliges. Fett reassures the droid that the Hutt is dead and that he cannot hurt him. 8D8 explains that he was concerned that his new master would feel insulted.

Fett is surprised and asks why. When 8D8 replies that Fett felt threatened, Fett expresses annoyance. 8D8 apologizes but Shand tells him to get back to business. 8D8 explains that following the "sail barge disaster", there was a power vacuum. Bib Fortuna assumed Jabba's mantle. Under Master Bib's watchful eye, Mos Espa was divided among three families. The Trandoshans took the city center while the Aqualish took the Worker's District and the Klatoonians took over the starport and the upper sprawl. Since Master Bib did not have Jabba's power, he relied on uneasy alliances to preserve his tribute and title.

8D8 also reveals that Bib has been lining the pockets of Mayor Mok Shaiz. When Fett asks where does that leave them, 8D8 explains that everyone's waiting to see what kind of leader he is. When Fett asks about the assassins, Shand explains that the Mayor has no power and believes that someone else is behind that play. Fett asks if it is the Hutts. Shand asks Fett if he wants her to ask around. Fett thinks that they should wait.

Shortly later, one of the Gamorrean guards informs Fett and Shand that one of his vassals seeks an audience with him. Despite the lack of appointment, Fett allows the visitor to enter the throne room in order to find out what is going on. The visitor turns out to be Lortha Peel, a water-monger in the Worker's District. When 8D8 asks what is his petition to Lord Fett, Peel explains that nobody respects him. 8D8 takes offense but Fett allows Peel to speak.

Peel explains that ever since Lord Fortuna's death, the streets of Mos Espa has turned into chaos. Fett replies that this is new to him. Peel vouches that this is true and says that he is insulted on Fett's behalf at the disrespect that these "urchins" are showing him following the

assassination attempt. Shand says that they will look into it and waves for the Gamorreans to escort Peel out.

Peel then talks about his petition. He explains that a street gang of youths has been stealing his inventory, something that has not happened under the previous Daimyos. Peel says that he is insulted on Fett's behalf. Fett asks if his inventory is water. Peel agrees and explains that he broker sales on behalf of the vapor farmers. Fett says that he grew up surrounded by water, prompting Peel to say that Tatooine was once covered entirely in water.

When Fett asks about the gang, Peel explains that they are half man and half machine, stating that they modify their bodies with droid parts to make themselves even more deadly. Peel petitions Fett to purge the streets of Mos Espa of this "scourge" in return for doubling his tribute.

Later that night, Fett, Shand, and their Gamorrean bodyguards walk through the streets of Mos Espa. They walk past two Jawa merchants. They approach a group of youths chatting by a fire. Fett demands to know where they got their water. A female named Drash replies that they stole it. Fett replies this is a crime. A male named Skad replies that Peel charges exorbitant prices. Fett tells them to farm the water themselves.

Drash tells Fett to return to his palace. Fett warns her to watch her tongue, reminding her that he is the Daimyo of this district and vows to bring order. The girl dismisses him as a crime boss. Skad asks Fett why he allowed the water-monger to charge them a month's wage for one week's worth of water. The girl adds that they don't have any wage. Fett replies that they live in the worker's district and that they should be working. The girl replies that there is no work and tells Fett to look around. Fett approaches the gang and removes his helmet. He tells the youths that they will instead work for him. He warns that they better fight as good as they talk.

Lortha Peel is upset that Fett has not punished the youths, claiming that they stole from him and that he is letting them off. When Fett asks how much they owe him, Peel replies that they owe 1,300 credits for water. Fett tells Shand to give him back 500 credits. Peel protests but Fett tells him to take the money and consider the matter resolved if he wants to continue to do business in his territory. Fett suggests that he can move to Mos Eisley if he doesn't like it. Fett also warns him to cut his prices.

Fett tells the youths to gather up their gear and follow him. Shand backs him up and the youths depart on their speeder bikes. Peel walks away.

Outside of Jabba's Palace, a Nuna is captured by a winged creature, which is in turn swallowed by a Worr. Inside Fett's bacta tank, he experiences a flashback watching his father Jango Fett depart on the Slave I in Tipoca City. The younger Fett gazes into the skies.

The scene then moves on to Fett riding a bantha among his Tusken Raider clan. The Tusken watch him with a sense of respect. Fett rides into the desert into Mos Eisley. He asks two Jawas where the Pykes do their business in Mos Eisley. As the Jawas jabber in their language, Fett rides on his bantha through the town, past spikes of stormtrooper helmets. A boy also leads three DUM-series pit droids.

Fett tethers his bantha outside a building guarded by two Pykes. Fett states that he has business with the Pyke Syndicate. The Pykes admit him into the building. Fett walks down the stairs and meets with the Pyke leader, who has received his message. The Pyke leader explains that protection arrangements are all part of doing business in the Outer Rim Territories. Fett says that he will take payment and be on his way.

The Pyke replies that he has spoken with his superiors on Oba Diah, who are unwilling to pay protection to more than one party. Fett replies that he is collecting on behalf of the Tusken of the Dune Sea. The Pyke leader responds that the Kintan Striders have already collected protection money for the same territory that he lays claim to. Fett replies that they don't need to pay protection to that speeder bike gang since the Sandpeople far outnumber them. Fett says that the sands have belonged to the Tusken since the oceans of Tatooine have dried.

The Pyke leader says that they are willing to do business with either party but that they do not want to be taken advantage of by paying money to both. The Pyke tells Fett that he hopes he understands. Fett vows to resolve this and says that he will not hear from the Nikto sand flyers again. The Pyke says that he looks forward to their partnership.

Fett rides across the Dune Sea on his bantha to return to his Tusken camp. As he approaches the encampment, he notices flames in the distance. Fett walks on foot to the Tusken village only to find that the clan has been slaughtered. He discovers burnt tanks and several fallen banthas. While surveying the destruction, he finds the remains of Tusken lying on the ground. Fett also

recognizes the marking of a gang that he had encountered earlier on Tatooine. Fett cremates the remains of his Tusken friend before recovering his Gaderffii stick. After paying his respects to the dead, Fett rides away on his bantha.

Fett is woken up from his sleep by the Wookiee Black Krrsantan who drags him out of the bacta tank. Fett fights back but the Wookiee gains the upper hand and throws him around. Black Krrsantan also strikes him with his paws. Fett grabs a melee stick and fights back but the Wookiee throws him around. Black Krrsantan lifts him up. Fett attempts to poke his eye but Krrsantan bites him. Before the Wookiee can finish off Fett, the female youth he recruited stabs Black Krrsantan from behind.

The youths surround the Wookiee. One of them hurls electric nunchuks around one of his arms but Black Krrsantan brushes it off. The youths shoot at him but their blasters bounce off his half hide. Fett hits the Wookiee but Black Krrsantan brushes off his attack. The two Gamorreans attempt to intervene but the Wookiee charges at them and jumps on top of them, pushing them down the stairs. They fight in the throne room. Krrsantan throws one of the Gamorreans to the ground and bites the other.

Before he can finish them off, the youths converge on the Wookiee. Shand then appears and tells the youths to stay back as she activates the trapdoor, causing Black Krrsantan to slide in. The Wookiee tries to hold on with one his paws but Shand dislodges his paw with a knife, causing the Wookiee to fall down into the former rancor's pit. Shand tends to the wounded Gamorrean while Fett arrives. Fett tells Shand to get the wounded Gamorrean into his bacta tank. Fett and his forces watch Black Krrsantan growling from his cage.

Later, an R5-series astromech droid serve Fett and Shand food for a lavish banquet. Fett dismisses the droid to aid with the patrol. Shand tells him that he is the head of the family and he should enjoy the trappings. Fett replies that he needs to respond because everyone is watching and waiting for him to make the next move. Shand advises him to have some food but Fett says he has to send a message.

Shand replies that he already did. She explains that his enemies sent Black Krrsantan to kill him and that the Wookiee is now locked up in his dungeon. Shand advises Fett to show his hand. Fett replies that these are Hutts and that waiting will only give them the opportunity to strike again. 8D8 interrupts the banquet with news that "the Twins" have arrived with a gift. Shand smirks.

Fett orders that the gates of Jabba's former palace be open. He and Shand walk out to meet the Twins, who are being carried on a litter by several servants dressed in white and red. The Hutt brother says they have come to apologize. The Hutt sister admits that they sent Black Krrsantan to kill Fett. The brother claims they are sorry and offers a gift as restitution. This gift turns out to be a bound rancor, which is being carried on a repulsorlift sled. The creature is accompanied by a human rancor keeper.

Fett tells them to clear off Tatooine in return for considering a truce. The Hutt sister agrees but for a different reason. She tells him that there is something he should know. The Hutt brother explains that they had been lied to since Jabba's territory was promised to another criminal syndicate. When Fett asks who it was promised by, the Hutt sister explains that it was promised by Mayor Mok Shaiz. The Hutt brother says that the pair will be returning to Nal Hutta since the Hutts do not want war. The sister says that war is bad for business.

A Gamorrean guard leads the bound Black Krrsantan. Fett offers to release the Wookiee if they renounce all claims to Jabba's legacy on Tatooine. The Hutt brother says that they are leaving Tatooine and advises Fett to do the same. The sister describes Tatooine as a worthless rock and proposes selling the Wookiee back to the gladiators. The Hutt brother describes the Wookiee as their tribute to Fett. The Hutts depart with their entourage.

Fett orders the Gamorrean guard to release the Wookiee while Shand points a gun at him. Fett speaks to the Wookiee, telling him that he has no hard feelings and states that it is just business. Fett advises Black Krrsantan not to work for criminals in the future. Black Krrsantan growls in Shyriiwook before running away. Shand asks Fett to consider if releasing Krrsantan was a good idea. Fett replies that they had to choose between releasing or killing him. When Shand asks if he believes what the Hutts are saying, Fett responds that he has no reason to believe them. He reasons that they will benefit from their enemies fighting one another.

Shand offers to arrange a meeting with the mayor. She describes the rancor as "quite" a gift. The creature is housed in the lair of Jabba's former rancor Pateesa. Fett asks why the creature

just lies there. The rancor keeper explains that the rancor is depressed and explains that they emotionally complex creatures. When he asks why it wears binders, the keeper explains that the creature is a calf bred for fighting. The keeper explains that he saved this creature for himself to train. He adds that it imprints itself on the first human that it sees. Now that Fett has arrived, he will begin its training.

Fett asks for permission to approach the rancor. The keeper says that rancors are peaceful unless they are threatened. Fett strokes the creature, prompting the keeper to notice that he likes it. Fett decides to spend more time with the rancor. The rancor keeper encourages him, saying that rancors can become very loving. Fett had assumed that they were bred to fight. The keeper explains that they are powerful fighters and that is what most people know.

He explains that the creatures form strong bonds with their owners. The Witches of Dathomir were said to have ridden them through the forests and fens. Fett says he wants to learn how to ride this rancor, saying that he has ridden beasts ten times its size. The rancor keeper warns that it will take a tremendous amount of discipline. He agrees to begin the lesson today.

The rancor keeper tells Fett to stand before the creature while he removes the harness from its mouth. Fett makes eye contact with the creature, which also makes eye contact with him. Fett approaches the creature and strokes its chin while making eye contact with him. 8D8 interrupts with news that Mayor Mok Shaiz's office says that he will be unavailable for the next 20 days. Fett tasks the rancor keeper with feeding the rancor a whole ronto carcass in the ladder. He senses that the creature is hungry. Fett tells 8D8 to inform Shand to suit up since they will not be waiting for an appointment. The rancor keeper reassures the rancor that Fett will be back.

Fett, Shand and the gang of youths ride to the Mayor of Mos Espa's office to confront Mok Shaiz. Fett and Shand walk inside the office and meet with the majordomo. The majordomo explains that the Mayor's schedule is quite complicated. Shand warns him to be careful with his next words if he wants to breathe. She fingers her blaster. The majordomo offers to rearrange his appointments and retreats into the mayor's office. The majordomo locks the door to the throneroom.

Fett and Shand follow only to find it empty and deserted. The two rejoin their gang of youths. The majordomo flees in a landspeeder and Shand sends the youths after him on their speeder bikes. They chase the majordomo through the streets of Mos Espa. They avoid a protocol droid but knock over a repulsorlift cart being drawn by an astromech droid. As the pursuit continues, the majordomo's speeder whacks a pit droid and topples a stand full of fruits. He also topples more objects including a tank of water.

Led by the female youth Drash, the youths outflank the majordomo. Two of them scrape his landspeeder. As the pursuit continues, a male youth rides his speeder bike through two pedestrians carrying a painting of Jabba before crashing into a picnic table. The majordomo slams into a droid rickshaw carrying two Bith passengers, terrifying them. Drash manages to ride her bike over a building before landing on the majordomo's landspeeder. He crashes into a stand full of jogan fruits. Fett and the youths converge on the Majordomo.

The Majordomo reveals that the Mayor is working with the Pykes and that he has gone. Fett asks if he is. Later, a starliner carrying several passengers including a large entourage of Pykes lands at Mos Espa's spaceport. One of Fett's youths Skad is watching the Pykes and rides his bike to a hologram station. He tells Fett and Shand that he saw a dozen at least. Fett thanks him for his good work and tells the youth to keep an eye on them.

Shand confirms that the Pykes arrived on the starliner. Fett thanks the youth for his good work. He tells them to keep an eye on them. Fett quips that it is just an expression, noticing the youth's cybernetic right eye. The youth tells him that he doesn't have to be sorry since he paid a lot for his cybernetic eye. Shand tells him to let him know what he sees. Shand warns Fett that these are just the first wave and that they are going to war. Fett vows that they will be ready.

Summary: Boba partners with Fennec Shand.



The episode opens with Boba Fett immersed inside his bacta tank, where he experiences flashbacks of his past. Wandering the deserts of Tatooine on bantha-back some time after the loss of his adopted Tusken clan at the hands of the Kintan Striders, Fett rides to the late Jabba Desilijic Tiure the Hutt's palace to investigate the last place he left his ship, the Slave I. Peering through the scope of a cyclorifle, he sees a few Nikto guards and couple of Gamorreans passively patrolling the perimeter.

Heading back to the bantha, he sighs and informs her that there are still too many guards, and he heads back out into the dunes. Sitting at a campfire under the stars, he shares his dinner with his steed until he notices the shooting of bright flares in the distance. When the two arrive at the site, Fett finds an unconscious and dying Fennec Shand.

Fett rides with Shand hitched over the bantha's rump to a mod parlor on the outskirts of Mos Eisley, where he sees a group of cyborg youths hanging around outside the entrance. He carries Shand into the building where the mod artist of the shop is at work on another youth. The Mod Artist turns to Fett and snarks that he is too old to be in such a place, to which Fett tells him that Shand requires modification. Rebuffed for not having an appointment, Fett then drops a plump bag of coins onto a table and stresses that Shand is about to die.

The mod artist agrees and replaces the area damaged by a gut shot on Shand's body with complicated cybernetics. Fett watches the surgery procedure. Near the end of the operation, Fett asks if he plans to close the operated area, but out of pride for his handiwork, the mod artist leaves it open and the technology viewable.

Shand awakens painfully, after being taken back out into the desert and left to come-to near a campfire. As her vision sharpens, she notices Fett tending to the fire and the bantha sitting comfortably nearby. With difficulty, she props herself up onto an elbow as Fett cracks a black melon open. He places it near her and tells her to drink, but she first asks him what happened to her. Fett informs her that she was dying, but that he had also saved her life. She looks around suspiciously and then down to her own torso, only to notice the writhing cybernetics in the place that used to be her gut area.

Demanding to know what Fett has done to her, he tells her about the mod parlor at Mos Eisley, which was the best he could do for her considering the circumstances. He then reminds her to drink from the black melon, mentioning that it will aid her recovery. Raising it to her lips, Shand recoils in disgust at the smell, but after Fett reassures her that although it takes some getting used to and that one can also crave it after a time, she manages to drink from it.

Fett recognizes her as the Master Assassin, Fennec Shand of the Mid Rim, to which Shand assumes that her bounty is higher with her alive. Fett confirms this, and although Shand immediately offers him more than double the price on her head, he tells her that he is not after money. She asks him who he is, and although he answers honestly, she dismisses this and reminds him that Boba Fett is dead. Fett agrees with her that he indeed was left for dead on the sands of Tatooine, just as she was. He tells her of how the Tusken had rescued him and accepted him into their tribe. He says that he tried to help them only for them to wind up dead after he attracted the attention of a gang of Nikto speed bikers.

Shand expresses her disbelief that mere speed bikers could have defeated the Sand People, but Fett changes the conversation and tells her that he wants her help to recover his Firespray-class gunship. Shand sighs, buffing some sand from her clothes and asks after its location. When Fett tells her that the ship is in Jabba's palace, she informs him that Bib Fortuna has taken over the place. She asks him why he does not simply ask for the ship's return, since it is his property, and Fett reveals that he may not like the response since he is less persuasive without his armor. Shand has Fett assure her that if she helps him, her debt to him would be considered repaid.

Fett and Shand travel through the Dune Sea on Fett's bantha. As night falls, Shand uses her gunsight to scout the grounds of Jabba's palace. She confirms that Fett's starship is there and asks how many guards are there. Fett is unsure and says that the guards rotate whenever the gates open. Shand sends one of her drones to take a closer look. The drone travels into Jabba's palace through a vent and flies through the hallway, avoiding a Gamorrean and Nikto guard.

Continuing its search, the droid floats through the corridors. Two alien guards travel down a stairwell while the drone flies out. Meanwhile, Fett bids his bantha farewell, telling the creature that it served him well. He tells the female bantha that he is going to miss her as she licks him. He tells her to go, find other banthas and make baby banthas. He tells her that she is free to roam the Dune Sea.

Shand questions Fett's decision to free his bantha until he has retrieved his ship. Fett replies that he is determined to reclaim his ship or die trying. He promises Shand that she will be free soon. When Shand asks what are his next plans, Fett replies that he will find his armor and kill that "bloated pig" who double-crossed him and take his throne. Shand asks if Fett wants to head a Gotra, which he is keen on doing.

Shand notes that Fett is a bounty hunter. Fett says that he is tired of working for idiots who are going to get him killed. Fett says that Tusken took him in and made him part of their tribe. He says that he decided to leave hunting behind. Shand replies that people like her don't get a choice. Just then, the drone returns and provides them with a holographic map of the Slave I's location as well as the layout of Jabba's Palace. Studying the display, Fett observes that there are too many guards, who are represented by the red figures. Shand suggests timing their patrol and going in quiet.

The two breach Jabba's palace through the sewers under the cover of night. In the kitchen, a chef droid and sous-chef droid are at work preparing food including a hot bubbling cauldron with a creature inside. As Fett and Shand come up through the drain, the chef notices the noise and asks what was that. The sous-chef droid assumes that the noise was caused by rats. The chef droid sends the sous-chef droid to find it while he contacts the rat catcher.

The sous-chef droid approaches the drain but Fett knocks him down using the gutter cover. The chef droid brandishes six knives with his six arms. However, Shand slices his head off from behind with a knife. Fett says that nobody sounded the alarm. Shand replies they should get to the hangar. They hear footsteps approaching, which turns out to be an LEP-series rat catcher. Fett and Shand attempt to sneak away but the droid notices them and flees.

Fett pursues the droid through the kitchen while Shand watches the door. As the droid scurries, he overturns several pots. He flees under a shaft beneath the oven but is cornered by Fett and Shand. Fett grabs the LEP droid and asks if he knows whom he is, prompting the droid to sob. Fett tells the droid that he is Boba Fett, prompting the droid to press a button deactivating itself in fear. Fett drops the droid in a rubbish bin and moves on, with Shand following.

The two reach the hangar where the Slave I is stored, passing a pair of GNK-series power droids. Two Gamorrean guards enter the hangar but Fett and Shand subdue them in a brief fight, knocking them out. The two complement each other but klaxons ring. Several armed guards storm the hangar and Fett and Shand are forced to hide among the drums and machinery. A gun battle breaks out. Shand tells Fett to make sure the ship can still fly while she holds off the other guards. Shand takes out two of the guards while Fett climbs into the Slave I's and powers up the ship.

As more guards converge on the hangar, Shand blows up a GNK-series power droid, causing an explosion that scatters several guards. She shoots four more guards while Fett powers up the ship. As reinforcements arrive, the Slave I's engines come to life, scattering the guards. Shand climbs aboard the Slave I's gangplank. As a Gamorrean guard charges at the Slave I, Fett tries to lift up the ship into flight mode, scattering machinery and unnerving Shand who demands to know what he is doing. Fett replies that they need to get the gate open but that he can't see anything.

Shand fights the Gamorrean guard on the hull of the Slave I. He hits her but she kicks him back and throws him off. As the Slave I ploughs through concrete structures, Shand fights a Nikto guard, who had climbed onto the ship's hull. Fett finds that the ship's guns are jammed. As Shand finds the Nikto, she tells Fett that she has an idea and tells him to close the ramp. Fett reluctantly complies and says he hopes that she knows what she is doing. Shand throws the Nikto guard off the ramp and enters the ship.

She then fires her blaster at one of the controls for the gate, causing it the door to crash and giving an opening large enough for the Slave I to escape. As dawn approaches, the Slave I flies into the skies of Tatooine. Aboard the cockpit, Shand tells Fett that they should stick to the plan next time, to which Fett is confused about Fennec planning to stick around for a "next time". As she settles down in the co-pilot seat, Shand asks about the ship's condition. Fett replies that the Slave I is in good shape but a little rusty. Shand suggests seeking the services of mechanics on Mos Eisley. Fett prefers to do the repairs himself, believing that it is advantageous that people believe he is dead.

Fett reminds Shand that her debt has been paid and asks where she would like to be dropped. Shand asks where he is headed, prompting Fett to reply he has a few scores to settle. Shand decides to go for the ride. The Slave I blasts off into the skies.

Later in the day, the Kintan Striders ride their speeder through the desert wastes of Tatooine. Just then, Fett and Shand catch up with them aboard the Slave I, blasting them from the air with laser cannons. Several bikes are destroyed and their riders killed or scattered. Fett uses a rocket to take out the lead bike. He then flies the Slave I away. He and Shan make eye contact before heading to the Great Pit of Carkoon, where the charred wreckage of the sail barge Khetanna and a cargo skiff lies.

Fett tells Shand to hang on as he slowly brings the Slave I above the sarlacc pit. He tells Shand that this was where he had been locked away for several years. Shand initially responds with disbelief, believing that the armor has dissolved inside the sarlacc's digestive system. The sarlacc is still alive, with several sharp horns lining its maw. As the Slave I descends into the sarlacc's maw, Fett says he can't see a thing. Shand warns him to be careful.

He shines a searchlight into the creature's mouth but finds no sign of the armor. Just then, the sarlacc awakens and latches onto the Slave I with its tentacles. Shand tells him to shoot it. Fett uses the ship's laser cannons to blast at the creature but the sarlacc is strong and attempts to drag the Slave I down. Shand unbuckles herself to flip a switch that's just out of her reach, releasing a seismic charge. The charge is lodged in the engine housing, but is jostled into the maw of the sarlacc, which swallows it. As Shand yells "fire in the hole," the seismic charge devastates the sarlacc, forcing the creature to release the Slave I. The Slave I is able to break free. Fett is grateful but warns her not touch his ship's buttons in the future.

Later, Fett climbs back out of the sarlacc pit after having rappelled down on a rope in one last attempt to locate his armor, while Shand pulls on the rope. After returning from the sarlacc, he tells her that he found nothing but junk. Shand warns that Fett is burning and that he is not safe inside the creature. As she pours water on his head to cool his body down, Fett tells her that his armor is not in there. Shand opines that the armor has served its purpose by saving him from the acid. She recommends that he use a bacta tank. Fett pours the remaining water from the bottle on his head.

In the evening, Fett captures a scurrer for the two to share. The two hunters sit around a fire. When Shand questions his ambition to form his own house, Fett asks how many times she has been hired to do a job that was avoidable. He says that if only the crime syndicates took the time to think, they could have saved many lives. Shand responds that their kind would then be out of work. Fett replies that he is tired of "their kind" dying because of the idiocy of others. He says that they are smarter than them and that it is time they took their shot.

Fett says that if he is going to start a house, he needs both brains and muscles, which Shand has. Shand says it is tempting but replies that she is an independent contractor. She does jobs for him but values her freedom. Fett claims he can offer her something that no client has ever offered: loyalty. He offers to give her a cut of the success and pledge his life to protect hers. Shand replies that living with the Tusken has made him soft. Fett disagrees and says that living with them has made him strong. He reasons that you can only get so far without a tribe.

As Fett rests in his bacta tank, he experiences another flashback of Bib Fortuna greeting him in Jabba's palace. Fett shoots him dead and throws his body off the throne. Fett then claims Jabba's throne while Shand sips from a drink behind him. As Fett awakens, he presses a button draining away the clear bacta from the tank. A servant droid hands him a towel as Fett emerges. The droid congratulates Fett, telling him that he is completely healed.

Shand then asks about the scars on the inside. Fett replies that they take longer before turning his attention to the Mayor's majordomo. Shand replies that the prisoner is singing like a Yuzzum but reports there is no sign of the Mayor. As Fett summons the droid to fetch his armor, Shand tells him that the "Mods" are combing the streets of Mos Espa for the fugitive mayor. Fett wants to show his face in town but Shand thinks he should rest. Fett replies that power hates a vacuum before walking away.

At the Sanctuary cantina, a gambling droid serves several Trandoshan patrons, who celebrate their win. Black Krrsantan drinks by the corner, watching the Trandoshans menacingly. He growls at them as his modified "knuckle dusters" flash. Krrsantan picks a fight with the Trandoshans, hurling one to the ground and flinging one against a plant near the entrance. Fett walks into the cantina as the fight breaks out.

Black Krrsantan hurls the other Trandoshans against the furniture. One Trandoshan hurls a glass mug at his head, prompting the Wookiee outcast to choke him. Garsa Fwip intervenes, telling Black Krrsantan that he has made his point. She tells him that she remembers his years in the Pit, remarking that she has never seen a more impressive display of martial prowess. She flatters the Wookiee, describing him as a legend who drew crowds of thousands. She says that his knuckle dusters were more feared than blasters and that he has met every challenge and won every trophy. Fwip opines that it would be dishonorable for him to dismember the unfortunate Trandoshan.

She tells the Wookiee that those days have passed. What was once celebrated in the blood lust of the arena is now regarded with horror and cruelty. Fwip tells him that he does not need to prove he is a champion because everyone knows it. Since he has run up a significant bar tab, she convinces him to release the Trandoshans in return for wiping his debts off the book. Black Krrsantan considers before letting the Trandoshan go but not before ripping out one of his arms. This horrifies the patrons including the gambler droid.

Black Krrsantan pays a horrified Fwip his tab before walking past Fett. Fett says that it was worth a shot. Fwip tells Max Rebo and his band to play calming music. Black Krrsantan leaves the Sanctuary but Fett approaches him with a job offer. The Wookiee looks at Fett menacingly.

Later, Fett and Shand host several local crime bosses at a banquet in Boba's palace. Shand explains that Jabba once sat on that throne but that his reign ended in a ball of fire above the Dune Sea, with Bib Fortuna taking his place. Shand reminds them that they were once captains under Jabba but left his family when Fortuna claimed to be the heir. She describes Fortuna as a terrible leader with no right to the throne. Shand recalls that they each tried to take his place but were thwarted by his guile and treachery. Black Krrsantan, having now accepted Fett's job offer, is also present among the guards and looms over the captains.

Shand credits Fett with removing Fortuna and promises that they can again accrue wealth and power if they listen to Fett. Fett says that he may sit on the throne but claims to have no designs on their territory. He says that he doesn't expect any tribute or quarter and won't give any in return. Fett says he is here to make a mutually beneficial proposal. He explains that Pyke Syndicate are mustering troops in Mos Espa and have slowly absorbed Tatooine as part of their

spice trade. They have bribed the mayor and are draining the planet of its wealth.

A Trandoshan captain named Dokk Strassi says that they make much money through the sale of spice in their territory. A Klatooinian captain asks Fett why he deserves to be the Daimyo and what prevents them from killing him and taking what they want. Just then, Fett's rancor roars and sticks its claws through the trapdoor's gaps, startling the guests and the LEP droid who runs away. Fett calms the rancor by sharing a piece of meat. He calms his guests and invite them to sit down.

Fett proposes that the crime lords can benefit from cooperation instead of fighting. An Aqualish named Master Garfalaquox asks what is Fett proposing, with 8D8 translating. Fett replies that he is proposing that the crime families of Mos Espa join in a defensive alliance against the Pyke Syndicate. The Klatooinian captain counters that the Pykes have only threatened Fett's territory and questions why they should spill the blood of their ranks for a feud between Fett and the Pykes. Strassi concurs.

Fett vows to fight these enemies alone and to vanquish those interlopers that threaten their planet. He vows to make the streets safe again so that all of them can prosper. Fett says that all he asks for them in return is that they remain neutral if the Pyke Syndicate reaches out to them to betray him. The crime lords discuss Fett's proposal. Strassi says that Fett's proposal acceptable. Garfalaquox concurs with the terms. The Klatooinian captain abides. The crime lords, Fett, and Shand drink a toast.

Later that night, the crime lords depart Boba's palace. Fett and Shand watch from a balcony. When Shand asks if he trusts them, Fett replies that he trusts them to work for their own self-interest. Fett reasons that his deal is a lot better than what the Pyke Syndicate would offer. As the crime lords depart on their vehicles, Fett opines that they may be stubborn but are not foolish enough to realize that the Pykes want to take over Tatooine. Fett says that they must prepare for war.

When Shand asks how much they have in reserve, Fett replies that they have plenty while admitting that they are short on muscle. Shand says that credits can buy muscle if you know where to look.

The episode opens with several Klatooinian butchers working in an abattoir, where animal flesh hangs. The Mandalorian bounty hunter known as Din Djarin strides into the abattoir, walking past several Klatooinian workers. He enters into a makeshift office where he states that he is looking for Kaba Baiz. When one of the Klatooinians asks what makes him think he is here, Djarin presents a tracking fob.

When the alien asks why he wants Kaba Baiz, Djarin replies that Baiz knows someone with a lot of money. The alien asks who but Djarin says that his only business is to bring in the target. One of the Klatooinians says that if he sees him, he will let him know. However, Djarin replies that he sees him now before presenting a hologram image of Baiz. The Klatooinian denies that he is Kaba Baiz.

Djarin tells the other Klatooinian butchers that he is going to give them the opportunity to walk out the door, adding that he has no quarrel with them. Baiz replies that the others are not going anywhere and believes that he has the upper hand. Baiz attempts to negotiate with Djarin. Djarin replies that he can either bring him in warm or cold. One of the Klatooinians bites Djarin's hand but the Mandalorian hunter fights him off.

More Klatooinians converge on him but Djarin fights them off as well. The Klatooinians fire blaster bolts but Djarin unsheathes the Darksaber, which he uses to cut down several opponents. But the Darksaber is a hard weapon to wield, and during the struggle Djarin accidentally wounds himself in the leg while pulling the saber from an impaled thug. Two of the Klatooinians attempt to restrain him while Baiz prepares to shoot him. However, Djarin breaks free and uses the Darksaber to cut down his captors. Baiz charges at him while shooting but Djarin stabs him with a Vibroblade and pins him down to the desk. He then slices Baiz in half with the Darksaber, slicing through the table as well.

One of the Klatooinians runs out into the abattoir. Several Klatooinians gather outside the office as Djarin emerges with Baiz's head in a bag. Djarin tells them that their boss is dead and that he is here to collect on his bounty. He tells the Klatooinians that he has no trouble with any of them. Djarin explains that there is a pile of New Republic credits in there that he has no right

to. He offers them the loot if they let him pass. The Klatooinians clear a path for Djarin before heading into the office to claim the credits for themselves. Djarin walks out of the abattoir with a limp.

In space, the camera depicts a the ring world of Glavis floating in space before zooming in on Djarin walking through the streets of the city with Baiz's head. Djarin enters the turbolift with a Caskadag inside. The lift takes Djarin up a hallway, which leads to a meeting room. An Ishi Tib compliments Djarin for his fast work. Djarin remands his reward and the information that he promised. The Ishi Tib asks why he is rushing business but Djarin insists on getting straight to business.

The Ishi Tib invites Djarin to dine with him and his associates. Djarin asks where is the closest shaft to the sub-strata. The Ishi Tib insists that Djarin sit and feast with them or he will reveal nothing. The Mandalorian replies that he can keep his reward, adding that there is a bounty on Baiz. He warns that if he doesn't give him the information, someone else will. The Ishi Tibe relents and tells Djarin to head down to Kolzoc Alley by the heat vent towers. Djarin sighs and prepares to leave.

The Ishi Tib urges Djarin to sit because he has another job for him. Djarin turns down his offer, telling him to put it on ice. Djarin walks back to the hallway and takes a ride down the turbolift. He turns to his burnt left knee. Djarin walks out of the lift down a hallway. He walks under a railway bridge. Djarin activates his inbuilt scanner. Through the ultraviolet scanner in his helmet, he finds that the walls are lined with several mythosaur markings.

Following the trail, Djarin enters a hatch which leads down a stairwell beneath Glavis. Following the trail, he encounters the Armorer, who tells the other members of the tribe to tend to him. Paz Vizsla tends to Djarin's leg injury, saying that he did not know if he would see him again. Djarin thanks Vizsla for saving him on Nevarro, as he shudders in pain. Djarin apologizes for the Tribe's sacrifice. Vizsla responds that there are only three of them left. Vizsla applies bacta spray to Djarin's wound and remarks that they will put him back to work soon enough.

The Armorer asks to see the weapon which had caused the wound. Djarin reveals to them the Darksaber. Per her command, Vizsla brings the weapon to the Armorer. Alluding to the ancientness of the blade, the Armorer mocks the Galactic Empire's measly thirty-year existence in comparison to the Mandalorians' ten thousand. The Armorer asks if Djarin knows of the Darksaber and its significance. He recalls its name and that whoever wields it can lead all of Mandalore. The Armorer clarifies that the Darksaber must be won by Creed in battle.

The Armorer tells of a legend where one warrior is to defeat twenty, thereby bringing the multitudes to fall before it. However, she warns, if the saber is not won in combat, and/or falls into the hands of the "undeserving", the Darksaber will become a curse unto the nation—"Mandalore will be laid to waste and its people [will be] scattered to the four winds".

Djarin rises to his feet with difficulty and states that the hilt is of a quality of beskar that he has never seen before. The Armorer explains that the Darksaber was forged over a millennium ago by the Mand'alor Tarre Vizsla. She explains that Tarre was both Mandalorian and Jedi. When Djarin says that he has met a Jedi, the Armorer responds that he has then completed his quest. She invites him to join their coven in order to rebuild. They all state "this is the way." Djarin and Vizsla assemble the smelter. When Vizsla asks how he obtained the Darksaber, Djarin replies that he defeated Moff Gideon. Vizsla asks if he killed him. Djarin says he spared Gideon, who was sent off to the New Republic for interrogation. Djarin says that Gideon will face justice for his crimes.

Vizsla opines that death would have been a fitting punishment for his atrocities. The Armorer agrees, saying that the blood of millions of Mandalorians is on his hands. Djarin says that Gideon will be executed for his crimes by a New Republic Tribunal. The Armorer replies that we will see. She then talks about the songs of the past prophesying of the rise of the Mythosaur to herald a new age of Mandalore. She opens a cupboard which leads to a cabinet containing several beskar sticks.

The Armorer asks Djarin how he obtained the beskar spear. Djarin explains that he obtained it from a Jedi and says that he used it to defeat Moff Gideon. The Armorer says that the beskar spear can pierce beskar armor and that its mere existence puts the Mandalorians at risk. She opines that Mandalorian steel is meant for armor rather than weapons. Djarin requests that she forge the spear into armor. The Armorer picks up the spear and opines that the Darksaber is a more noble weapon for Djarin to wield.

The Armorer puts the beskar spear on top of the smelt. Djarin takes a seat and asks if she is familiar with Bo-Katan Kryze. The Armorer describes Kryze as a cautionary tale while pouring liquid from a tube into a container. Kryze wanted to rule Mandalore based purely on blood and the Darksaber. The Armorer points out that it was gifted to her and not won by Creed. Kryze was born of a mighty house but lost sight of the way. The Armorer says that her rule ended in tragedy, stating that Kryze lost her way while the Mandalorian people lost their homeworld.

The beskar spear is melted down. The Armorer says had their sect not been cloistered on the moon of Concordia, they would not have survived the Great Purge. In a flashback scene, TIE/sa bombers bomb the cities of Mandalore with atomic weapons. The Armorer says that those born of Mandalore strayed from the path. Eventually the Imperial interlopers destroyed all that they knew and loved in the Night of a Thousand Tears. TIE bombers bomb Sundari, causing an atomic explosion and firestorm. KX-series security droids and Viper probe droids then scour the ruins for survivors.

The Armorer says that only those who walked the "Way" escaped the "curse" prophesied in the Creed. Though their numbers were scattered to the winds, she opines that their adherence to the Way has preserve their legacy for generations until they can return to their homeworld. When the Armorer asks what she should forge, Djarin suggests something for a foundling. The Armorer replies this is the way. Djarin then adds that he wants the beskar forged into something for Grogu. The Armorer replies that Grogu is no longer in his care and is back with his kind.

Djarin replies that he wants to see him and make sure he is safe. The Armorer says that Jedi must forgo all attachment in order to master the ways of the Force. Djarin replies that the Jedi code is the opposite of their creed, which emphasizes loyalty and solidarity. The Armorer asks what she should forge for Grogu. She melts and beats the beskar into links of chain.

Later, the Armorer practises sword-fighting with Djarin, who wields the Darksaber. Djarin jumps of the platform, prompting the Armorer to warn that he is fighting a blade. Djarin resurfaces and says that the Darksaber is getting heavier each minute. The Armorer reasons that this is because he is fighting against the blade. She says that he should be fighting his opponent and tells Djarin to stand up. Djarin rises to his feet and continues parrying with the Armorer, who knocks his helmet. She fights back with her tools.

Gaining the upper hand, the Armorer tells Djarin that he is too weak to fight against the Darksaber and cautions him not to fight against it. She tells him that he cannot control it with his strength. Djarin wants to try again but the Armorer warns that persistence without insight will lead to the same outcome. She warns Djarin that his body is strong but that his mind is distracted. Djarin claims the is focused but the Armorer says that the blade says otherwise. Djarin thinks that the blade belongs to someone else, a sentiment shared by Vizsla who says that the sword was forged by his ancestor, the founder of House Vizsla.

Djarin says that it now belongs to him. Vizsla replies because Djarin won it in combat. Vizsla vows to win the Darksaber from Djarin. The Armorer asks Djarin if he agrees to this duel. Djarin accepts Vizsla's challenge. The two men face each other and put aside their jetpacks. Djarin unsheathes the Darksaber while Vizsla wields a dagger and an energy shield. Vizsla attacks Djarin first, bashing him with his weapons. Djarin fights back and destroys Vizsla's dagger.

Despite losing his weapons, Vizsla is able to stand his ground and throws Djarin off the bridge. He then hurls Djarin against a wall. Vizsla grabs the weapon and states that fate has brought this blade back to his clan. Vizsla vows to end Djarin but the Mandalorian is able to dodge his bigger opponent. They fight around a tubular device. Djarin gains the upper hand and holds Vizsla's throat at knife point. The Armorer orders an end to the duel.

She asks Vizsla if he has ever removed his helmet. Vizsla confirms that he has never removed his helmet. She asks if his helmet has ever been removed by others. When Vizsla says no, she says that this is the way. She then asks Djarin if he has ever removed his helmet. Djarin is silent, prompting the Armorer to state that by creed he must vow. Djarin releases Vizsla before confirming that he has removed his helmet. The Armorer responds that means that he is no longer a Mandalorian.

Djarin begs for forgiveness and asks how he can atone. Vizsla tells him to leave, calling him an apostate. According to Creed, one can only be redeemed in the living waters beneath the mines of Mandalore. Djarin replies that all the mines have been destroyed. The Armorer replies that this is the way. Djarin departs with the Darksaber and Grogu's necklace. He exits through the hatch he came earlier and walks alone through the streets of the ring city.

Djarin heads to the spaceport where "Flight 1020" is departing for a non-stop flight to Tatooine. An RX-Series pilot droid tells Djarin that no weapons are permitted aboard the flight. Djarin replies that he is a Mandalorian and that weapons are part of his religion. The droid responds that weapons are not allowed on commercial flights. He suggests that Djarin speak with his supervisor, who can book him on tomorrow's flight. Djarin places his blaster pistol, Whistling birds, bandoliers, pliers, and even the Darksaber into a check-in luggage bag. He warns the droid that he knows everything inside before climbing aboard the gangplank.

The passenger liner departs into space. Din Djarin rests in the passenger lounge while looking out a window. An astromech droid whistles past. A Rodian child in the seat at front of him waves to him but the child's mother tells her son to leave him alone. Djarin looks at the cloth containing Grogu's necklace.

The passenger liner lands at Mos Eisley's spaceport on the planet Tatooine. Several passengers disembark. An RX-series bell droid welcomes him to Tatooine. Djarin retrieves his check-in luggage, which contains all his weapons intact. The droid wishes him a pleasant stay on Tatooine and hopes to see him again.

At Peli Motto's Hangar 3-5, a womp rat grabs Peli Motto's BD unit. Peli and her droids including three DUM-series pit droids, a WED-15 Treadwell droid and R5-D4 pursue the womp rat. She and Peli argue about democracy. Peli closes in on the womp rat within the storehouse. The womp rat grabs her and attempts to drag her away. However, Djarin shoots the creature dead. BD emerges from hiding while Peli introduces Mando to her droids.

She asks Djarin if he is here to slay a dragon. Djarin replies that he received her message that she had found a replacement for the Razor Crest. Peli confirms that she has found the ship, stating that this is what she does. She asks if he has cash, which he confirms. She counts the money and tells the droids to make themselves useful. When Peli asks about Grogu, Djarin replies that he returned him to his "own kind." Peli grumbles, saying that she could have made money from "that thing" by opening a petting zoo.

Peli leads Djarin into a hangar where a starship is covered under tarpaulin. She removes the tarpaulin to reveal a modified N-1 starfighter. Djarin asks where is the Razor Crest, prompting Peli to clarify that she never said she had a Razor Crest but rather a replacement for the ship. Djarin is disappointed with the condition of the ship and tries to walk away. Peli tells him that this is an N-1 starfighter, handmade for the Naboo royal guard and commissioned personally by the Queen of Naboo. Djarin thinks that the ship is a piece of junk.

When Djarin asks for his money back, Peli says "no skin off my dip-swap." She tells the droids to bring Djarin his money. While waiting, Peli tells Djarin to hear her out over the N-1 starfighter. She says that she was still working on the ship when Djarin arrived, adding that it has a story. She discovers a nest of scurriers. Peli tells Djarin about the difficult she had in sourcing parts for a ship made during the time of the Galactic Republic. She offers to incorporate custom modifications that will make the starship faster than a fathier.

Peli tells Djarin that since this ship was made before the Empire, she is off the grid. Peli adds that the N-1 cruiser can also jump into hyperspace without a docking ring. Peli convinces Djarin to let her put the ship together before he makes a decision to cancel the purchase.

Later, Djarin works with the BD unit to restore the N-1 starfighter. The droids shines a light on the undercarriage of the ship. Peli returns with a turbonic venturi power assimilator, which she says will make his ship the fastest in the Outer Rim Territories. When Djarin asks where she got it from, Peli replies that she got the power assimilator from the Jawas. Djarin asks where they got the technology from. Peli replies that Tatooine is a "garden of many bounties" and that she gave them a list of parts. When Djarin inquires, Peli says that she practices a policy of "don't ask, don't tell." In return, she lets them pick parts from her dumpster.

Peli introduces Djarin to her Jawa associates. Djarin asks that if he gets them a list of parts, will they help him. Peli converses with the Jawas in Jawaese. She tells Djarin to make a wish list and the Jawas will see what is available. Djarin replies that he is looking for mainly bolt-on aftermarket speed modifications. Since the starship is hand-built, he reasons that they will need a vintage hyperware that can fit into this antique ship. Peli advises him not to worry about the shape and size and tells him to get the parts that he needs. Peli reassures him that she has dated a Jawa and knows what she is doing. She sends the Jawas to find the parts.

Peli and Djarin continue work on the ship while the pit droids help with the refurbishment. While working on the ship, she chats with Djarin, observing that he is always in a hurry. Peli

admits that she has never left Tatooine, describing herself as a local "gal." Djarin observes that their vapor manifold is missing but she opines that Djarin does not need it. Peli replies that she has fabricated the intake charger to ensure that it doubles his output coefficient. Djarin replies that it will blow the shaft out of his motivator block. Peli replies she is reinforcing his compression housing, which she shows him how to access by pressing a red button.

Peli uses a MPH power droid to help charge of the ship. Djarin thanks BD unit for his help. Peli asks if Djarin is interested in how she got the N-1 ship, prompting him to reply that he is interested in a ship similar to the Razor Crest. Peli grumbles that this ship is harder to come by than a Razor Quest. Working together, Djarin, Peli and the droids begin covering the N-1's hull. The Jawas return with a cryogenic density combustion booster.

Djarin asks where they got it from. The Jawas explained that they stole it from a Pyke spice runner that was refueling. Djarin thinks that this was a gutsy move given the fearsome reputation of the Pyke Syndicate. Peli tells Djarin that the Pykes control the spice trade and rule Tatooine through terror. Even law enforcement are afraid of them. Djarin thanks the Jawas and pays them. Peli thinks Djarin is spoiling them before installing the combustion booster.

The silver N-1 fighter leaves the hangar. The pit droids drive it out into the open. Peli is impressed with their workmanship. When Djarin asks what happened to the astromech socket, Peli replies that she removed it since she was aware of his earlier aversion for droids. While Peli reprimands the droids for their foul language, Djarin inspects the N-1 fighter and opines that the ship is ready. Peli agrees and allows Djarin to start up the ship.

He climbs into the cockpit and attempts to fire up the ship. The first attempt falters but Djarin pours in more juice at Peli's prompting. Djarin opines that the ship is overpowered for its size but Peli reassures him that it is safe. Djarin takes the N-1 fighter into the air. He engages the ship's forward drive and flies above Mos Eisley. While Djarin flies, Peli tells him that he is used to flying a gunship but to treat the new ship like a starfighter.

He accelerates the ship's engine and flies through several rocky formations. Djarin tells Peli that the ship is fast. While he is testing the N-1 starfighter's maneuverability, Peli tells him to point his navigational disposition between Tatooine's twin suns, which will lead him to Beggar's Canyon. Djarin also tests the ship's handling, which he likens to a railspeeder. After travelling through Beggar's Canyon, Djarin takes the ship into space.

Djarin flies beside the space liner. The Rodian child he encountered earlier notices the starship and stares out the window. Djarin flies circles around the space liner before descending back to Tatooine. He is soon intercepted by two New Republic X-wing starfighter. The pilot Reed asks Djarin to run his beacon for him. Djarin asks if he was doing anything wrong. Reed replies that he is not allowed to fly that fast near a commercial ship and that he is also operating without a beacon. He tells Djarin that he needs him to run one for them.

Djarin apologizes and transmits his beacon. Reed observes that his engine model doesn't match his power drive. Djarin replies that he just built the ship and was taking her for a test flight. He says that he hasn't been able to update his registration. Reed requests that he transmit his title tabs. Djarin says that his transmitter is not working and offers to return to Mos Eisley to get it fixed. Reed tells him to relinquish his flight controls for remote-control access. The second New Republic pilot Carson Teva tells Reed to cancel that order since they can let Djarin go with a warning this time.

Djarin thanks Teva and says he will take care of the matter. Teva notices his voice is familiar and asks if he used to fly a Razor Crest. Djarin replies that he has the wrong guy. Teva responds that the Razor Crest surfaced on a transponder log on Nevarro in an incident involving Imperial remnants. Teva says that he is "connecting some dots" and asks Djarin if he minds answering a few questions. Djarin instead powers away and hurtles towards Tatooine.

Reed asks Teva how did Djarin jump without powering up his hyperdrives. Teva points out that Djarin was using his sublight thrusters. Since Reed can't detect Djarin on their sensors, Teva thinks they should let Djarin go to avoid filling reports all day.

Djarin returns to Peli's hangar and tells her that he is impressed with the ship. Peli is pleased with the performance of the J-type pulse engines. She tells him that an "old friend" of his dropped by. Not trusting the person, Peli had locked her out and engaged the hangar security system. When Djarin asks what her name was, they hear Fennec Shand's voice on the intercom. Peli is surprised, believing that the hangar security system was activated.

Shand manages to scale the hangar's walls and climbs down using several pieces of machinery. While Peli is scolding her droids, Shand asks Djarin if he is looking for work. Djarin is interested and Shand tosses a bag him of credits, saying that the pay is good. When Djarin asks what is the bounty, Shand explains that Boba Fett would appreciate some muscle. Djarin returns the bag, saying that it is "on the house." He agrees to the job offer but says that he will first have to visit a "little friend."

Summary: Mysteries are explored and Boba Fett learns new information.



The episode opens with a wide shot of several moisture vaporators. A group of Pyke Syndicate couriers meet beneath the vaporators. The Pyke courier says that it is all there. A Pyke guard replies that they will leave the spice and take the credits back to Mos Eisley and that the rest will follow. The Pykes are confronted by an elderly human man named Cobb Vanth who asks if they know where they are.

One of the Pykes reaches for the blaster in his holster but Vanth urges him

to think it through. Vanth offers to give them the benefit of the doubt and say that they are lost. He warns that everything beyond them are the Mos Pelgo territories. He shows them his stripes, which indicates that he is the marshal of those territories. Vanth tells the Pykes that he is in charge of the folks in the Mos Pelgo area.

He tells them that he didn't see what was in their chest, so no laws were broken as far as he is concerned. Vanth gives them the opportunity to load up their wares and to go back where they came from. However, the Pykes reject his offer for them to walk away peacefully. They reach for their blasters but Vanth is prepared and shoots three of them down. He gives the fourth one the opportunity to surrender.

Vanth tells the fourth Pyke enforcer to tell them that he is aware of the Syndicate and tells him to take credits back with him. He warns that anyone getting lost running spice through Mos Pelgo again will be lost forever. He tells the the Pyke to unload his chest and leave, and to consider it a fine for trespassing. The Pyke says the contents of the chest is worth more than his town. Vanth replies that he will consider retiring. He watches as the Pyke mounts the landspeeder and leaves with a Camtono of credits, leaving behind the chest and his fallen associates. Vanth inspects the chest and finds that it is full of spice. He tips it over, letting the desert winds ferry it away.

Din Djarin's modified N-1 starfighter exits hyperspace above a green forested world. He flies the ship into the planet's atmosphere, flying above lush mountains. The ship's console buzzes. On the ground, R2-D2 guides Djarin's ship to a flat area besides a river with brown water. R2-D2 beeps in binary while Djarin climbs out of his ship. Djarin greets the R2-series astromech droid and tells him that he is looking for Luke Skywalker, and has come to see the child Grogu.

R2-D2 beeps before leading Djarin down a path into a forest of bamboo-like plants. An ant droid skitters past them. Exiting the forest, they find several ant droids assembling a stony structure. R2-D2 converses with the droids. Djarin asks if this is where they are. R2-D2 enters into hibernation, much to Djarin's frustration. He instead speaks to the ant droids, telling them he is looking for Skywalker. The droids instead assemble a makeshift bench while Djarin asks if anyone is here or alive. The ant droids continue their work.

Elsewhere on the green forested world, Grogu meditates with Luke Skywalker in a meadow. Grogu notices a passing frog and uses the Force to levitate it into his mouth. Skywalker appears to be deep in meditation but awakes to find Grogu about to swallow the frog. He convinces Grogu to let the frog go. The frog dives into a stream. Skywalker returns to his meditation and stretches out of his right hand, causing the frogs to levitate out of the ponds. Grogu watches with awe before Skywalker lets the frogs go.

He invites Grogu for a walk through the bamboo forest. Skywalker tells Grogu that he reminds him of Yoda, adding that Yoda was small like him but that he had a huge heart and that the Force was strong in him. Skywalker recounts that Yoda once said that "size matters not." He explains that Yoda spoke in riddles and asks if anyone spoke like that back at Grogu's home. He asks Grogu if he remembers his home. Grogu remains still with a sad expressions.

Skywalker asks if Grogu would like to remember and rests his palm on his head. Grogu experiences a vision of Jedi defending the Jedi Temple against the 501st Legion during the Jedi Purge. Grogu witnesses Clone troopers gunning down his defenders. They advance towards him before all fades out. When Grogu emerges from the flashback, Skywalker warns him that the galaxy can be a dangerous place. He promises to teach Grogu to defend himself. The two reflect on the nearby hills.

Meanwhile, Din Djarin is resting on his bench when he is startled by Ahsoka Tano. Tano explains that she is an old friend of the "family." When Djarin recalls that Tano said that she would not be training Grogu, Tano clarifies that Master Luke is training him. Djarin asks what she is doing here, prompting her to ask him the same question. Djarin tells her that he is here to see the kid. Tano explains that is why R2-D2 led him to her. The astromech droid beeps in binary.

When Djarin asks about the place, Tano replies that it is nothing now but that one day it will be a great school. She adds that Grogu will be its first student. When Djarin asks how Grogu is doing, Tano replies that he is doing fine. Djarin insists on seeing him, prompting R2-D2 to turn his head. Tano invites Djarin to accompany her on a walk through the bamboo forest.

Tano recalls warning Djarin that his attachment to Grogu would be difficult to let go off. Djarin explains that Grogu was a Mandalorian foundling in his care and that he just wants to make sure he is safe. Tano responds that there is no place in the galaxy safer than being with Luke. Djarin questions Tano's decision to let Skywalker train the Child when she wouldn't. Tano exhales sharply and explains that it was Grogu's choice, adding that she does not control the wants of others. Djarin responds that it his choice to go and see him.

Tano agrees to respect Djarin's wishes and motions to a hill where Skywalker is seated with Grogu. Djarin says alright. Tano asks him to consider if he is doing it for Grogu or just for himself. Djarin replies that he just wants to give him a beskar armor, which he explains that belongs to Grogu by right. Tano suggests that Grogu may be a Padawan now. Djarin reasons that this armor will protect him regardless of whether he chooses the Jedi or Mandalorian paths. Tano asks Djarin to consider letting her deliver it to him.

Djarin replies that he came all this way to see Grogu. Tano understands that Grogu misses him a great deal but warns that seeing him will only make things more difficult for him. Djarin acquiesces to Tano's offer and hands him the beskar armor. He asks Tano to make sure that Grogu is protected.

Meanwhile, Skywalker carries Grogu in a backpack and places him down in the middle of a clearing. Skywalker asks Grogu to jump but Grogu is shy. Skywalker encourages him to bend down and to feel the Force flow through him. Grogu tries again. Skywalker senses he is trying too hard and counsels him to do instead of try. Skywalker carries Grogu in a backpack through the forest, leaping over rocks, a bison, and several stumps.

Skywalker also climbs a bamboo tree and shows him the landscape ahead. He tells Grogu that there lies a wider world out there and to feel the Force all around him. The two meditate as the wind blows. Skywalker tells Grogu that he will find balance through the Force.

Later, Skywalker takes Grogu to the riverside. While Grogu rests on a branch, he tells him to concentrate. Grogu struggles to levitate and slowly begins taking small steps. Later, Skywalker parries with his blade while Grogu meditates in the bamboo forest. He eyes Luke's green lightsaber with curiosity. Skywalker introduces him to a training remote, which he explains will test his reflexes. He places the training remote on the ground beside Grogu.

Grogu rolls it, thinking it is a ball. Skywalker demonstrates how the training remote works by activating it. The training remote fires a laser beam, causing Grogu to jump out of the way. Skywalker encourages to get back up. Grogu spends the day leaping from rocks to rocks in the river, dodging the training remote's lasers. Skywalker watches the training exercise while Tano joins him. She is impressed with Grogu's progress.

Grogu later uses the Force to hold the training remote in suspended animation before causing it to short circuit and fall into the river. Grogu squeals while Skywalker praises him. Tano says that Skywalker taught him well. Skywalker replies that it is more like Grogu is remembering his previous lessons than he is actually teaching him. Tano observes that sometimes the student guides the master.

Skywalker notes that the Mandalorian was here. Tano explains that Grogu and Djarin share a strong bond and that Djarin brought him a gift. She shows Skywalker the red cloth containing the beskar armor. Skywalker admits wondering whether Grogu is committed to being a Jedi. Tano says that Skywalker is just like his father. When Skywalker asks what he should do about Grogu, Tano counsels him to trust his instincts. Grogu rests on a rock.

When Skywalker asks if he will see her again, Tano replies perhaps and bids that the Force be with him. Skywalker reflects on the beskar armor and Grogu resting on the rock.

Din Djarin flies the N-1 starfighter back to Tatooine, into the hangar of Boba's Palace. A Gamorrean guard greets him with an axe as he climbs out of the starfighter. Djarin explains that he is here at the request of Fennec Shand. The Gamorrean grunts in Gamorrese.

In a briefing room, Shand briefs the mods, Boba Fett, Black Krrsantan and Mok Shaiz's majordomo about the mobilization of Pyke Syndicate forces. Mok Shaiz has fled offworld and Shand believes that the storm is about to break. The majordomo claims it was a scheduled vacation but a Gamorrean growls at him. Shand shows a holographic map of where the Pykes are gathering based on "whispers."

The three crime families of Mos Espa are willing to lay low and let the Pykes stake a claim on their territory. She introduces Din Djarin the Mandalorian. Shand says that Djarin and Krrsantan will provide enough experienced muscle to serve as enforcers. She compliments the Mods for surveying the streets. Shand recognizes that they lack the numbers to help out in a full-out war and says that they need reinforcements. Djarin offers to help recruit reinforcements.

Later, Djarin circles a sandcrawler carrying the skull of a krayt dragon in his N-1 starfighter. Several Jawas watch and chatter in Jawaese. He lands his starship in Mos Pelgo. Djarin is greeted by deputy sheriff Scott, who tells him to park his ship elsewhere. Djarin responds that he has business with Cobb Vanth, who agrees to meet with Djarin. Vanth explains that Scott is new and a bit jumpy. He takes an interest in Djarin's N-1 starfighter.

Djarin remarks that he hasn't seen Vanth since he has given up his armor. Vanth says he is more careful and asks about Grogu. Djarin replies that Grogu is back with his own folk. Vanth observes that both of them have lost something they are fond of. Djarin offers to buy him a drink at the cantina. Inside the cantina, Djarin tells Vanth that he needs him to lead a garrison since his people are good fighters and that there is enough money to hire them.

Vanth explains that his people do not want to fight ever since they have taken out the krayt dragon. Djarin replies that Mos Pelgo may be safe for now but that they are part of the same planet. Djarin says that they need good people to fight or the spice is bound to come through these parts. Vanth says that as long as he is here this is not a problem. He asks why his people should risk their lives for Boba Fett. Djarin reiterates that Mos Pelgo might be good for now. A Weequay reminds Djarin that the town is now called Freetown, adding that it suits them better.

Djarin reminds Vanth that he fought alongside the citizens of Freetown and that they are brave people. He explains that Boba Fett's forces are outnumbered by the Pyke Syndicate and that they need their help. The Weequay responds that the town wants no part of the city folk fight. Djarin asks Vanth if he agrees. Vanth replies that the two of them are even. Djarin asks if Vanth is still someone who won't back down in the face of bullies. Vanth remarks that he likes Djarin's big smile, which lets him get away with anything.

Djarin says there is no easy way to ask for a favor. Vanth says that things are tough in Freetown but that he will see what he can do. Djarin later leaves in his N-1 starfighter. Vanth tells the Weequay to assemble all the men and women of fighting age for a meeting in the town hall. The Weequay thinks this dispute between Fett and the Pykes is not their problem but Vanth tells them that the people may change their minds after they hear what he has to say.

Vanth sees a lone figure with a hat approaching Freetown from the desert. Sensing trouble, Vanth tells a woman named Jo to have the people evacuate inside. When Jo asks if something is wrong, Vanth says he hopes not but that is better to err on the side of safety. Vanth walks out to confront the stranger while the citizens evacuate. Deputy Scott asks what is going on but Vanth says he will handle it. He tells the Deputy to head inside while he faces down the stranger, who turns out to be a Duros bounty hunter named Cad Bane.

The stranger addresses Cobb Vanth. Vanth asks who he is. Bane replies that whatever Fett is paying him, they will match. He tells Vanth that all they have to do is to stay put and stay out. Deputy Scott says the Marshal is not for sale. Vanth sighs and asks the stranger for his name. The stranger faces Vanth with his red eyes, warning him to be careful where he sticks his nose. Vanth asks if he is threatening him.

The stranger replies that that Boba Fett is a cold blooded killer who worked with the Galactic Empire. Vanth tells him to tell the Pykes that this planet is closed for business since it has seen enough violence. The stranger remarks that Vanth should have never given up his armor. The two men face each other while the Deputy eyes the situation nervously and reaches for his blaster. A shootout breaks out with Bane shooting Vanth and gunning down Deputy Scott several times.

As Vanth lies on the ground, Bane says that Tatooine belongs to the Pyke Syndicate. As long as the spice is running, he says that everyone will be left alone. The stranger walks into the wilderness while the townsfolk attend to the wounded Vanth. The Weequay watches with concern.

Meanwhile, two Pyke enforcers visit Garsa Fwip's Sanctuary cantina. They sit at a table and are served by a protocol droid. The Max Rebo Band plays while two Twi'lek staff offer to take their helmets for a clean. The Pykes brush them aside before leaving the cantina. The protocol droid warns them that they have forgotten their Camtono. The Camtono turns out to be a bomb and damages the cantina.

At Skywalker's newly built Jedi Temple, Skywalker presents Djarin's gift to Grogu. He unwraps the red cloth, revealing a beskar chain shirt. Skywalker explains that the Mandalorian wanted him to have the chain shirt, which he lays on the carpet. Before Grogu takes it, Skywalker tells him that he will give him a choice.

He shows Grogu Yoda's lightsaber and offers it to him. Skywalker tells Grogu that he must choose only one. If he chooses the armor, he will return to Djarin. However, Skywalker warns that he will be giving into attachment for those that he loves and forsaking the way of the Jedi.

If he chooses the lightsaber, Skywalker promises that he will be the first student in his academy and that he will train him to be a great Jedi. Skywalker says that it will take him many years to master the ways of the Force and that he may never see the Mandalorian again. He explains that a short time for Grogu may be a lifetime for someone else. Grogu coos while he considers choosing between the two objects and the paths they entail. Skywalker asks Grogu which does he choose.

The episode opens in Mos Espa, at the bombed out remains of the Sanctuary. Boba Fett is there with Fennec Shand. Soon, they are joined by Din Djarin and the Mods. Din tells them that he spoke to marshal Cobb Vanth of Freetown and that they will assist in exchange for the end of the spice trade — terms Fett agrees to. Though initially wanting to barricade within the Palace, the group decides to await reinforcements and the Pyke Syndicate from the Sanctuary when the Mods refuse to leave.

Meanwhile, Cad Bane arrives in Mos Eisley to report back to the Pyke in charge of the Syndicate's Tatooine operations and the deposed mayor of Mos Espa. Bane assures them they needn't worry about Freetown getting involved. Mok Shaiz expresses relief and asks if there is anyone else they need to take care of, citing the Tusken Raider tribe Fett used to be part of. The Pyke boss affirms that they are all dead, as the Syndicate slaughtered them and pinned the deed on the Kintan Striders in order to get rid of both groups at once. When Shaiz requests that damages to Mos Espa be kept to a minimum, the Pyke boss responds that it will take extreme force to remove Fett and his people from the Sanctuary, where they have holded up. Bane responds that he has an idea to draw Fett out.

A red-decaled X-Wing approaches Mos Espa and begins to land at Peli Motto's hangar. Assuming it's a New Republic officer, she instructs her droids to hide various things around the pad. As she moves to greet whoever is within, the hatch opens and reveals Grogu. The piloting astromech, R2-D2, asks where Djarin is, to which Motto responds that he's not here, as he has a job in Mos Espa. Despite Artoo's protests, she pulls Grogu out to catch up and give him a snack, noticing that he's wearing chainmail beneath his robes.

In the ruins of the Sanctuary, Shand tells Fett and Djarin that their people are in position to keep an eye on the Syndicate's next move and avoid surprises: the two Gamorrean guards at the star port, Krrsantan in front of city hall, and the Mods in the Worker's District. Despite their measures, 8D8 reports that someone has arrived to meet with Fett. They take up position as Fett

exits to meet with the visitor, Bane, who claims to be there to negotiate on behalf of the Syndicate. Fett refuses, even once Bane reveals that he interfered with Marshal Vanth, and states he will only negotiate directly with the Syndicate's head.

Bane reveals it was the Syndicate that murdered the Tusken tribe, not the Nikto speed bikers. This nearly goads Fett into the first shot, but ultimately is convinced by Shand to stand down and begin the battle on their own terms. Before he leaves, Bane claims Fett has gone soft with age. Fett responds that everyone does.

Once he's gone, Drash calls in on the comms and reports that the locals have turned on them despite the treaty previously established. Fett attempts to touch base with Krrsantan, who is fighting the Trandoshan family in the city center but grows overwhelmed by sheer numbers. The Gamorreans try to contact Fett, but are pushed off a cliff by the members of the Klatoonian family.

With few options remaining, Fett confirms with Shaiz' majordomo the location of the Syndicate's base in Mos Eisley — the Desert Survey Office — and sends Shand to confront the Pyke Syndicate's enforcer. On the way, she manages to assist the Mods by sniping down the Tatooine Aqualish family who had them pinned, allowing them to retreat.

The Syndicate begins to move into position around the Sanctuary. Djarin refuses to leave despite the odds, as it would go against his creed; Fett does the same, on the basis of honor. The Twi'lek majordomo volunteers to go out and try to speak to the Pykes and negotiate for their freedom and surrender on Fett's behalf, as he studied on Coruscant and specialized on civic council negotiations. Fett agrees and writes out his terms on the majordomo's pad.

The majordomo emerges before the Pyke soldiers gathered in front of the Sanctuary and reads out the terms Fett wrote out, which are revealed to instead be a threat statement. Before the majordomo can be executed, Fett and Djarin soar in on their jetpacks and begin to gun the Syndicate down.

With the advantage afforded by their Mandalorian armor, weapons and surprise strike, Fett and Djarin take down many of the Syndicate on their own. However, the numbers prove to be too much even for them and numerous blaster shots slowly begin to take them down.

Unexpected reinforcements arrive in the form of the people from Freetown in a large armored speeder. Djarin apologizes for what happened to Marshal Vanth and tells them they didn't need to come— the Weequay bartender Taanti explains that they did. The surviving members of the Mods arrive, as well as an injured Krrsantan, and together manage to drive the Pykes back.

Before celebrations can start up in too much earnest, Djarin warns them of trouble. Two Scorpenek droids approach, unable to be stopped even by Fett's missiles due to powerful deflector shields. The armored vehicle they'd been using for cover is destroyed, forcing them, the Mods, and Krrsantan to flee.

Fett and Djarin attempt to take the Scorpeneks on, to little avail. With instructions for Djarin to protect the others, Fett leaves for further reinforcements. While Djarin is able to gain the attention of one droid, the other continues to pursue the troops.

Motto arrives via droid-driven cart and calls out to Djarin, but is quick to turn around upon spotting the Scorpenek, allowing him to hitch a ride and forcing it to give chase. The Mods and Freetown garrison are forced to hole up in the ruins of a house— Drash and Jo make their way to a nearby rooftop in order to snipe the Pyke Syndicate members and distract the Scorpenek.

Motto reveals the reason for her arrival had been to deliver Grogu to Djarin, and the two reunite. The droid manages to shoot the cart down, forcing the three to take a stand, but a distant roar distracts it. It's revealed to be a rancor, ridden by Fett from the Palace. The rancor faces off against the Scorpenek and manages to severely damage its shielding, allowing Djarin to approach from behind and break inside with the darksaber. He makes it to the top of the droid, slicing off one gun turret, but is knocked off. Before it can crush him, Grogu uses the Force to pull out a bolt from the droid's leg, causing it to collapse and giving Fett's rancor time to finish tearing it apart.

With one Scorpenek down, Fett and the rancor arrive to rescue the others. The remaining Pykes are sent into retreat under fire from Motto, the Freetown garrison and the Mods. Fett and the rancor fight off other Pykes, but Bane arrives and scares the rancor with fire from his vambraces, causing it to throw Fett and flee. The two square off.

Bane admits he doesn't understand Fett's motivations; Fett states that he won't abandon the city and its people, as they are his. Bane tries to goad Fett by mentioning the Tusken, to no

avail, but points out that despite his age, he's still faster, armor or not. With swift shots, Bane takes Fett down and pins him to the ground, calling him a killer just like his father was. He rips Fett's helmet off, but before he can shoot Fett knocks him away with his gaderffii stick. The tides now turned, Fett fells Bane and impales him, leaving the Duros mercenary dead on the street.

In the rest of the city, the rancor continues to rampage. People shoot but Djarin calls them to stand down, as they're only riling it up further. Handing Grogu to Motto for safety, Djarin tries to take control of the rancor by landing on its back and taking hold of the chains. It instead throws him off and, after being unable to eat him due to his beskar armor, throws him to the ground.

Grogu escapes from Motto's grasp to stand before the rancor, placing himself between it and the fallen Djarin. Using the Force, he calms it down and puts it to sleep before curling up beside it and doing the same. The majordomo helps Djarin to his feet as the people cheer.

In Mos Eisley's Desert Survey Office, the Syndicate enforcer announces that their retreating forces will arrive from Mos Espa shortly so they can leave. The various faction leaders object, as they had a deal with the Syndicate, but the Pyke leader points out that half his people have been gunned down or eaten by a rancor. He breaks the terms, as he'd been promised conditions on Tatooine to be "hospitable". Blaster fire interrupts before they can argue further, sending the group on high alert.

Before anything can be done, the guards and faction leaders are shot down from above. The Mok Shaiz attempts to flee, only for the Ithorian to be caught by a noose and hung. The leader of the Syndicate fires blindly into the darkness and tries to approach a window before Shand appears and stabs him. With the opposition's leaders destroyed, she exits via the front door.

The scene returns to Mos Espa. Fett and Shand walk the streets, which the townsfolk are working together to fix and clear. Many stop to bow and greet him, all of which he returns. Fett laments having to move his right arm, but states his bacta tank is in use when Shand tells him to take a soak. Shand points out that he should be glad they bow to him, rather than shooting at him. A group of children offer them Meiloorun fruits, one of which Fett accepts. Krrsantan and the Mods meet up with the duo in the street.

Djarin's starfighter departs from a planet, Grogu in the small pod seat built into the ship. He taps the dome of the seat, which Djarin responds to with a negative. Grogu repeats this several times, until Djarin finally agrees for what he says is the last time— he flicks a switch, causing the ship to accelerate rapidly as Grogu squeals.

Cobb Vanth is seen in Fett's bacta tank, still alive. A figure turns and reveals himself to be the Mod artist who saved Shand's life previously, tools in hand.
