Summary: Two teenagers from very different backgrounds find themselves burdened and awakened to newly acquired superpowers while falling in love.



The Past — Tandy as a young girl is struggling in her dance class, and waiting alone on the sidewalk for her someone to pick her up. Tyrone as a boy caught up in the troubles of his older brother, whose friends are preparing to steal back a car stereo. Wanting to help his brother, Tyrone steals the stereo while the older boys aren't paying attention. Once Tandy's dad picks her up, there's mention of her mother being at home and on some sort of pills.

Tyrone and his brother go on the run when they're caught by the police. This results in the wrongful shooting of the older brother at the hands of one of the officers. Simultaneously, Tandy's father is on the phone about a rig exploding. As the vessel on the water goes under, Tandy and her father crash into the harbor. Tyrone jumps in after his brother at the same time, leaving the two children in the water along with whatever caused the rig explosion. Another burst of power occurs and hits both kids, likely giving them their powers. There's some solid symbolism here as Tyrone is saved by a mysterious light, and Tandy by a random darkness. They grab each other as the opening title card appears.

Present day — Tandy walks into a club. She picks out a rich guy sitting in a VIP section and makes a connection. Meanwhile, Tyrone is called out by his basketball coach during halftime of their game. He tries to defend himself, but it doesn't work. Tandy flirts with the guy and convinces him to take her back to his uncle's house for a more private party. As it turns out, Tandy's interest was all a work. She drugs the rich guy and, along with her real boyfriend, steals all of his stuff. Tyrone, now in the second half of his basketball game, is done being pushed around. Once an opposing player knocks him down, in a clearly dirty play, Tyrone takes a swing and starts a brawl. He can really pack a punch, though. Gotta give the kid that.

Tandy's story gets even sadder when gets "home." Her boyfriend drops her off at what he thinks is her house, but she walks across the street to an abandoned church once he's out of sight, and holes up in a room she's made for herself. She snorts a pill she stole from the rich guy. Tyrone is equally alone in his own room, even though his parents are just downstairs. It's clear that there are still difficult feelings in that household leftover from his brother's death. Both teenagers, trying to escape their current situations, put on their headphones and pass out.

The past — Tandy watches as a group of men from Roxxon (the show's evil corporation who used to employ her dad before he was killed) tear apart their living room. They say that the company believes Tandy's dad went rogue before his death, and that the explosion is his fault. The company has basically screwed over the family to cover something up, and Tandy's mom turns to drugs as a result. Back in the present, Tandy is disappointed that she and her boyfriend didn't make more money. They're planning on robbing a party in the woods later on. A girl at Tyrone's private school gives him her number and tells him to go to the very same party.

Tandy goes to her mom's house, which is technically where she's supposed to be living? She pulls a duffel bag from the vent and puts all the valuables, cash, and pills she stole into it. Meanwhile, Tyrone gets to the party and immediately seems out of place. This isn't really his scene, that much is clear. Tandy "accidentally" bumps into him and spills her drink. They flirt a bit and exchange names before Tandy walks off to get some towels. When Tyrone goes to buy a beer for the girl that brought him to the party, he realizes Tandy stole his wallet and takes off after her. The chase leads the duo into a graveyard, and ultimately introduces their powers. When they touch, Tandy's hand begins to glow brightly and causes a blast that sends them both flying. Tyrone's hands are emitting some sort of darkness.

In a moment of clarity, Tandy asks if Tyrone is "that kid from the beach." When they touch again, their powers ignite and Tandy disappears in the light, leaving Tyrone on his own. Whatever happened in the water that night has kept them connected somehow. This leads Tandy to an inquisitive conversation with her boyfriend (who we now know as Liam). She brings up the night of the accident, and she believes that some kind of miracle, or angel's hand saved her.

Tyrone goes home and falls onto his bed, wrapping himself up in a dark sheet. When he wakes up though, he's not in his bed at all. Tyrone gets up, with the sheet billowing off him like a cloak (because symbolism), and looks out over New Orleans from the roof of the Roxxon building. In a flashback, Tyrone's family is told by an officer that his older brother's body was found at the bottom of the water with drugs in the system. They're lying about the police shooting him, saying that his body was in "no shape to look for bullet holes" and that no officer fired a weapon. Tyrone describes the cop that shot his brother but he's told that there is no one in the department matching that description. But when teenage Tyrone walks down the stairs from the roof, who does he see getting into a car across the street? That old cop, of course.

Tandy is surprised by her mom's appearance at home and forgets to put her duffel bag away. When her mom touches a cut on her hand, Tandy flashes back to a good memory from childhood, where her mom and dad were together and well. Her powers keep appearing, but she isn't sure how to control them. Of course, like all parents in this genre, Tandy's mom thinks something is wrong with her.

We finally get the first real glimpse at Tyrone's relationship with his parents when his mom tells him that the school called and said he never showed up. He blows up a bit and tells her off because she's afraid of losing him, no matter what he does. They have a friendly moment at the end of the conversation though, and it seems like things might be looking up. But when he goes to bed, Tyrone's powers do that thing again and he wakes up in the trunk of a car. Meanwhile, Tandy is approached in an alley by the guy she robbed, and he brought some other guys with him.

Tandy wakes up on a beach next to Tyrone after the accident. She gets up and runs away while he's still asleep.

Present day — The rich guy pins her up against a wall and tries to assault her. The trunk opens on Tyrone and he finds himself in the middle of a drug deal. The driver of the car is the cop he's been looking for, and he manages to flee the scene without getting caught. Tandy, who's scared for her life, is up against a wall but she refuses to give up. Without knowing it, her hand produces a dagger and it extends into the rich guy's stomach, stabbing him and setting her free. When she looks at the dagger in her hand, it disappears. Tyrone runs into an abandoned building and the cop finds him. When the man chokes Tyrone, the room gets dark, and he remembers the night of his brother's shooting. Tyrone takes off and disappears into a black tarp, waking up back in his own bedroom. He's accompanied by a bullet that the cop shot at him, but he's not hurt.

The past — Tyrone wakes up on the beach, alone, trying to figure out what happened. Teenage Tandy tries to produce a dagger again, but she can't do it. Instead, she wraps up in the black hoodie that she got from Tyrone all those years ago.

Summary: Tandy and Tyrone come to grips with their new powers. Tandy's past catches up with her and Tyrone becomes obsessed with revenge.



The episode begins with a shot of a car with a "just married" bumper, that's been totaled, pinned up against a tree. In the city, a detective investigates the murder of Tandy's assaulter in the alley. Both Tandy and Tyrone are on their own, trying to figure out how their powers work, but neither one is having any luck reproducing the effects of the previous night.

Tyrone has breakfast with his family and his dad asks him about basketball, saying he may lack worth ethic and can be "all over the place" sometimes. He knows Tyrone is going to see his coach for the first time since the fight at the game.

Tandy panics and tells her boyfriend about stabbing the guy the night before. He's talking about taking her to the "dry cleaners," which we learn later is a place that creates fake IDs and papers. Tyrone lets the audience in a bit when he's talking to his counselor/priest about the fight, and says he doesn't take the pills he's prescribed (and doesn't drink) because he wants to always have complete control. The power probably doesn't help that. He asks whether or not finding the cop could solve a lot of his anger. Tyrone has another exchange with the girl who took him to the party.

The following montage shows the detective looking through the rich kid's phone, Tyrone leaving school and looking for the cop, and Tyrone's mom getting out a gun to find a rodent that's been going through their trash. The detective then brings in two of the rich guy's friends for questioning, and Tandy arrives at the dry cleaners to get a new ID to get out of town. It's going to cost her about \$11,000 to get what she needs. It's a lot of money, but the rich guy is in I.C.U. and she wants to be gone before he wakes up.

Tyrone fell asleep while on the lookout for the cop. He wakes up to texts from all of his teammates and realizes he's late for the first practice since his fight. The coach has been making the rest of the team run as punishment, and as you can imagine, they all hate Tyrone for it. Meanwhile, Tandy goes back to her mom's house to find her with a new guy. They found Tandy's duffel bag and stole everything out of it, spending the cash she had and taking the pills.

At the dry cleaners, Tandy and Liam have only scrounged together \$5,500, and they need more. They see a man in a tux at the shop, and Tandy gets a plan together. They follow him to an expensive wedding and decide to crash it. Tandy's plan is to rob the cash bar, steal the tips from the wedding planner, and get out with the envelopes from the gift table. The detective after Tandy now has a sketch of her and she's asking around.

Tyrone is all alone in the gym, and he does all of the sprints that his teammates had to do without him. When he finally goes into the locker room, some of the other guys show up, beat him, and lock him in an equipment cage. At the wedding, Tandy is feeling her powers at the wedding reception, and she has a vision of what a wedding with Liam could look like. Of course, she panics and hides out in a bathroom, where an older woman gives her some sound advice. When Tyrone breaks out of the cage, he's on a warpath, and goes back after the cop. After almost getting caught, he goes back home and asks his mom how she can keep everything together. He's finally starting to realize he needs help, and she tells him to turn his pain into positive energy. When Tyrone hugs his mom, he has a vision of a grocery store where he sees himself and his brother as kids, followed by a vision of their mother looking at both of their graves.

As it turns out, the woman in the bathroom was the wedding planner, and Tandy stole the money from her purse. Tandy and Liam leave with the money, the envelopes, and the newly married couple's getaway car. It's the same car from the beginning of the episode. While they're changing into their normal clothes at the dry cleaners, Liam tells Tandy that he knows she's living in the church. He assures her that he can help her, and that they can handle life together. Tandy tells him that "there is no we" right before she leaves.

Tandy starts to drive the newlywed car out of town. As Liam walks home, he's arrested by the detective that has been following Tandy's trail throughout the episode. Liam calls her and tells her that he got arrested and needs her help, but she hangs up the phone and continues to drive. Tyrone busts into the cop's house and points a gun at him. However, right as he fires, the black curtain behind him swallows him up. He appears on the road in front of Tandy's car, and the bullet goes through her windshield. She swerves to avoid him and the episode ends.

Summary: Tandy is on the run as Detective O'Reilly closes in on her, but the detective may not be after her for the reasons Tandy thinks. Tyrone is desperate for answers and turns to Evita and her Auntie Clarisse, a Voodoo priestess, for help.



The episode begins with a 3D printer printing the base of some object, it appears to be feet.

Tandy wakes up from the car crash that was hinted at the beginning of last week's episode. Her head is bloodied and she's approach by a person who says she might have a concussion. We see the person is Ty and Tandy still wants nothing to do with him. He tries explaining that he was trying to shoot Detective Connors but he was mysteriously teleported to her. An upset Tandy leaves the scene of the crash before the authorities arrive.

Detective O'Reilly arrives at the hospital to question Tandy's attacker. She confronts him about the scratches on his face, which she says appear to be defensive wounds. After O'Reilly asks why his pants were unbuckled, he refuses to take any further questions.

Tandy arrives at her mother's house to wash up from the accident. She's washing the blood of her head when Melissa walks in the bathroom to talk to her daughter. Melissa finds out that Tandy is bleeding from her head and the two start arguing when there's a knock on the door: it's a Detective O'Reilly. She says she's looking for Tandy but Melissa says she hasn't seen Tandy in weeks in the hope of throwing the detective off Tandy's trail.

Melissa's boyfriend Greg, who also happens to be a lawyer, wakes up from a nap and tells O'Reilly that she can't enter the residence without a warrant. It's then O'Reilly tells Melissa and Greg that she believes Tandy has been the victim of an assault. When Melissa turns around to ask Tandy, she discovers that Tandy has left the house.

We Tandy board a bus to leave town. She's apparently suffering from a headache and falls asleep. When she wakes back up, she discovers that the bus she was traveling on is completely empty. She gets off the bus to see a vision of a young version of Ty dribbling a basketball.

We see the 3D printer continuing the print something. By now, it looks like the lower half of a human figure has been printed.

In what's an apparent flashback, Ty's arriving on the scene of Tandy's crash after the wedding.

The next day, Ty goes to speak with Father Delgado, but he's out of the office. Ty starts praying about his deceased brother Billy, but Evita overhears and walks in. She invites Ty to go on a voodoo tour after school that day. During the tour, Evita talks about voodoo being able to remove curses and she speaks directly to Ty. After the tour, Evita shows Ty around her family's voodoo shop. They talk about their beliefs and she leads him into her aunt's living quarters to introduce the two to each other.

Auntie Chantelle, as Evita calls her, is a voodoo practitioner and she sits Ty down to examine him. She tells him there are two options for him to open his mind. There's a bath you can take with certain ingredients or he can get a concussion — both will open up his mind enough so he learn more about what's going on.

Ty gets the ingredients for the bath and puts it all together. After a moment of taking deep breaths, he falls asleep and seemingly enters a separate plane of existence. He starts off in his house but when he opens the door, he walks out onto the roof of the Roxxon Corporation building. There, he sees a young Tandy in her ballet costume.

Tandy's still having her vision of Ty playing basketball but this time, Billy walks in and starts playing with him. The Johnson's are approached by Billy's friends that wanted Billy to steal back the radio. In Tandy's vision, however, Billy decides to stay with Tyrone while playing basketball instead of having anything to do with the radio.

After Billy shoots the ball, Tandy's teleported to a foggy swamp. She sees a table of various objects on it and then sees Tyrone dressed in 1700s attire walk up to the table and pick up a gun. He uses the gun to shoot Detective Connors and is soon tackled by riot police. The vision repeats but except this time, Tyrone picks up a rope instead of the gun. Instead of shooting Connors, Tyrone uses the rope to hang himself.

The vision repeats again and a frustrated Tandy tries telling Tyrone that he can't keep doing the same things over and over without consequence. This time, Ty picks up a pair of handcuffs and arrests Detective Connors.

Back in Ty's vision, Tandy starts performing her ballet recital but she trips and falls into a puddle. A broken wire is running through the puddle and Tandy is seemingly electrocuted. Ty's teleported elsewhere within his vision and sees a makeshift boardroom in the middle of the swamp. Current day Tandy is standing outside of the boardroom and inside is her father, mother, and several businessmen. The first time around, the businessmen begin waterboarding Tandy's father. The vision repeats but Tandy tries running away. She gets stuck in mud. The third time, Ty seemingly gets through to Tandy and she uses her dagger to break through the glass of the boardroom.

The vision quits and Tyrone's by himself in the swamp. He walks up to two massive doors and opens them up.

We see Tandy's vision again and she walks into an office where a young Tyrone is sitting amongst a bunch of crumpled up checks written to him from Billy.

In Ty's vision, he's finds himself inside a chapel after opening up the doors. There, a young Tandy is performing communion with her presumed attackers but instead of bread and wine, she's handing at pills which kills the men after they take them. Ty notices a stained glass window on the wall at the same time Tandy notices a stained glass window on the wall of the office.

When the two reach out and touch the wall, they both wake up from their respective visions.

Detective O'Reilly is getting in her car when Detective Connors knocks on her window. She rolls the window down and he hands the ID of Rick Cotton — Tandy's attacker — to O'Reilly. Connors explains to O'Reilly that they found the ID on a dead homeless person. We find out that Connors — or his cohorts — framed the homeless person as the attacker of Rick Cotton so that he wouldn't be implicated in the attempted rape of Tandy.

O'Reilly's phone rings and it's Tandy calling. She wants to talk.

Ty and Evita are walking down the street after Ty wakes up. She asks if Ty got the answers he was looking for but Ty admits that while he didn't find the answers, he now knows how to find them. The two chat and Evita reveals that she made a wish at the tomb of Marie Laveau on their voodoo tour earlier. Knowing what the wish was, Ty pulls Evita in and kisses her.

Tandy and O'Reilly talk and the Detective reveals the status of her case. O'Reilly apologizes for the scenario and an upset Tandy leaves the car.

The 3D printer finishes printing the figure and we find out it was Auntie Chantelle printing a voodoo figure of Ty.

Tandy enters the church she's been staying in and she's confronted by Ty, who found out her whereabouts. He tells her they need to talk.

Summary: Tandy and Tyrone come face-to-face as the two are able to sit down and talk. Meanwhile, Otis reveals a secret side of himself and Greg seems to be onto something with Melissa's case against Roxxon.



The episode picks up immediately following last week's episode with Ty and Tandy talking in the church that the latter has been staying at. Tandy agrees to talk with Ty so that they can figure out what's going on with their powers.

Ty begins talking about the voodoo cleansing bath he took. Tandy, the skeptic, has a hard time of believing what he went through. She starts to warm up to the idea when Ty starts describing Tandy's childhood. He also name drops Roxxon, saying he saw Tandy's father tortured and murdered time and time again within his vision.

The next day, Ty gets into a quick argument with his parents. They want him to eat breakfast with them but he's in a hurry to leave the house.

Tandy goes back to her mother's house and they talk about Detective O'Reilly's visit earlier in the week. Tandy tells her mother that O'Reilly got the wrong girl, not wanting her to know the truth. Tandy then begins questioning her mother about her father's position with Roxxon. Melissa explains to her daughter that her husband was completely innocent of any wrongdoing with the Roxxon oil rig explosion. The two then argue about Greg's role in their relationship.

At school, Ty and Evita look at developing pictures in the school's dark room. The two start kissing.

A flashback to the previous night with Ty and Tandy at the church. Tandy reveals to Ty that she also had visions but of Ty's brother getting shot by a policeman.

Tandy's talking to Greg about his intentions with her mother.

Tandy explains to Ty that sometimes when she touches people, she can see their heart's desires.

Back in the kitchen, Tandy and Greg are working on dinner when Tandy brushes Greg's hand. She she's Greg's wants include being a happy couple with Melissa and including Tandy in their family.

The next day, Tandy goes to visit Greg at his office.

The church flashbacks continue and Ty and Tandy continue their conversation. Tandy tries convincing Ty to find out more information about his brother Billy's killer, but Ty doesn't like the idea of going to the police station to try finding out more information.

Present day, Ty makes it look like his bike has been stolen after he cuts it's chain. Tandy and Greg talk about Roxxon's role in her father's death. The two begin to work on building a case against Roxxon.

Ty gets to the police station to report his bike stolen. He starts filing a report with a policeman, but after the cop leaves his desk to get a form, Ty gets too nervous and decides to leave the precinct.

Ty returns home where he's confronted by his dad. Ty apologizes for his actions earlier in the morning and his father brings up the fact that his bolt cutters are missing. Otis grabs his son's bag and finds the stolen bolt cutters. Otis gets upset, telling Ty that Billy's downfall started with him committing petty crimes by cutting chains.

Back in the church, Ty tries explaining his powers to Tandy. The two realize that Ty's powers ultimately protect Ty and guide him to where he needs to be. Tandy realizes their powers started the night they touched in the graveyard.

Present day, Otis has taken Ty somewhere. Otis orders his son not to speak unless spoken to. The two get to a cookout where several people are gathered. Otis starts singing a chant and it's revealed the group is made up of the Wild Red Hawks of the Ninth Ward. After a tense situation with the group's chief, Otis is welcomed back into the group.

At Greg's office, Tandy has Roxxon files spread out all over the floor. Greg reveals he's going through a divorce. He tells Tandy that he wants to pursue a relationship with Melissa because they always laugh at all the "dumb shit."

At the church, Ty and Tandy begin testing their powers to see how close they can get without the powers going berserk. They eventually touch each other and they're tossed to separate ends of the church.

Greg, Melissa, and Tandy are having dinner when Greg's phone rings. It's his estranged wife. Melissa encourages him to take the phone call. Greg leaves th table to grab the call and he has an abrupt conversation with his soon-to-be ex-wife. Melissa gets upset at the call and leaves the dinner table early.

Ty is at the Wild Red Hawks' house and he sees his brother Billy's obituary hanging on the wall. The group's leader sees Ty and tells him that Billy was training to be the group's Spy Boy. Ty starts examining the group's regalia hanging in the closet and Otis explains the bead work on the cloaks is a way for the group's members to express themselves. Ty focuses on a navy and black cloak.

Ty and Tandy are laying on their backs at church, talking about the people they've talked to about their powers. Ty admits that he has yet to tell anybody. Tandy says didn't mention anything either. They both admit they would have told the members of their families that have been killed.

Ty brings the cloak he found out of the closet and he sees the beadwork on it is unfinished. Otis runs over and tells him to put it away. Ty mentions that he wants to finish it and his father gets upset, asking why he chose it. Ty says the cloak spoke to him and Otis reveals that it belonged to Billy. Ty tells his father that he wants to finish it in Billy's honor.

Tandy talks to her mother about Greg. The two have apparently switched positions on the case. Tandy thinks Greg is a nice guy while Melissa now wants nothing to do with him after he took his wife's call.

Otis is teaching Ty how to sew the beads onto the cloak.

Tandy's on her way to Greg's office when she notices he's frantically running around putting away files. The water delivery lady in Greg's office pulls out a gun and shoots Greg in the head, killing him. She then lights Greg's office on fire to get rid of the evidence. A panicked Tandy runs away from the scene.

Back at the church, Ty admits to Tandy that he feels that he has to be perfect. He's afraid of messing up and disappointing his parents — he thinks that he has to live two lives: his and

Billy's.

Tandy returns home after witnesses Greg's assassination and she overhears her mother on the phone leaving Greg a voicemail apologizing for her actions. We hear it's her sixth voicemail she left him. Tandy starts crying at the door.

The next morning, Adina walks down the steps and Otis and Ty are speaking about his father's time as a Spy Boy. Adina walks down and asks the two why they're so giddy and the two don't reveal they've reconnected with the Wild Red Hawks.

At the church, Ty and Tandy get into an argument after Tandy reveals she has suicidal thoughts. Ty thinks she's too selfish and they argue. He mentions that if she's so selfish to kill herself, she should just do it. Tandy then reveals that when she saw Ty's wishes, she saw him committing suicide by cop over and over.

Sometime later, Tandy is at the pier. She ties her hands behind her backs and jumps over the edge in an attempt to end her life. She eventually floats to the top of the water and we see that she formed a dagger to cut herself free.

Ty returns to the police station and he asks to speak with Detective O'Reilly.

Tandy returns to Gregg's office to survey the damage. She creates a dagger to cut through his safe and finds out that he protected all of the Roxxon files.

O'Reilly is researching the death of Billy when her cop boyfriend shows up. Her boyfriend explains the department's previous struggles with dealing with drug dealers. He says the dealers

started getting put behind bars when Connors took over the cases. Her boyfriend appears suspicious of what O'Reilly is getting at.

Ty returns home and overhears his mother talking to somebody about Roxxon. Roxxon is apparently a client of his mother's. Ty approaches his mother with a picture of Billy and his friends. Ty asks where Billy's friends ever went because Tandy says he might be able to find his powers out that way. Ty's going back to hang the picture on the wall when he's transported to a warehouse.

He's soon approached by Duane, one of Billy's friends in the picture. The two talk and it's revealed that Duane owns the business they're in. They two share memories of Billy.

Tandy returns to her church with the information she printed off from Ty's school. She's starting to lay out all of the papers across the floor. She starts searching some of the Roxxon people on an Instagram-like app. Tandy puts on the school uniform she earlier stole and goes to an apparent escort agency for an interview.

Tandy goes through the interview and gets the job. She asks to work as an escort at a gala Roxxon is hosting later that night.

Prior to the basketball game, Evita approaches Ty and the two talk about their relationship. Ty gives her his letterman jacket and the two kiss.

Tandy arrives at the gala just as the basketball game starts. Ty takes a shot and a ref blows a whistle, saying Ty was fouled. You can tell Ty wants to speak up to the ref about how he wasn't fouled but he takes the free throw and drains it.

At the police department, O'Reilly is questioning Tandy's former acquaintance Liam, who's upset Tandy has yet to show up. Ty continues noticing the ref being unfair to the opposing team.

At the gala, Tandy tries looking for the people she's been researching. She finds one of the guys and starts walking towards him.

Ty dives for a ball at the game and it ends up being a jump ball. When the ref goes to grab the ball, Ty accidentally brushes his hand and in the vision, the ref is being stabbed by apparent mobsters. The ref is apparently rigging the game. Ty loses sight of the basketball and when he returns to his current state, the basketball is teleported to the gala, nearly hitting Tandy.

The next morning, Ty and Evita wake up and the latter leaves. Ty puts on a shirt and he transports to Duane's business. Duane is arguing with a person that we soon see is Detective Connors. Duane's successful business is a front for drug trafficking with Connors.

At the church, Tandy's looking over a blueprint of the oil rig that her father created. She touches her dad's signature when she starts looking for other papers in search of something. She picks up one article featuring a biologist. We then see that biologist filming another commercial for Roxxon and she claims she's trying to save the world.

Evita and Chantelle are continuing the reading. Chantelle says she "has an itch" and wants to dig into the story behind Ty. She thinks something big is about to happen.

Ty goes to the church and is soon greeted by Tandy. Ty tells her the story about the run-in with Duane's drug dealer. Mina and Tandy are wading through the water when the latter attempts to ask about Mina's father. We find out that the pair's fathers used to work together at Roxxon.

O'Reilly and Connors are driving along when they find some of the drug dealers O'Reilly had been investigating. They enter a foot pursuit with the group.

After talking for a while, Mina starts opening up. She let's Tandy know that Roxxon isn't drilling for oil. Rather, they're drilling for a mysterious substance that burns ten times hotter than oil. The two are approached by Mina's superior at Roxxon, who orders Mina to go research a valve that's failing.

Connors catches one of the dealers and it happens to be a guy who works for Duane. Connors lets him go.

Tandy stabs him and he's knocked unconscious. The two realize that in this vision, people can see and hear them.

After breakfast, Otis mentions to Adina and Ty that he's thinking about having the Red Hawks over so that they can finish their Spy Boy costumes. There's a knock on the door and Ty answers,

it's Tandy. After much reluctance, Ty lets her in and Ty's parents walk out into the entry way. Tandy reveals it's the anniversary of her dad's death, which coincidentally is also the day Billy died, and Tandy invites Ty over to her house later that night.

Tandy runs out of the house and we see that she stole Ty's mother's purse to get her Roxxon ID badge.

In another flashback, we see Tandy immediately after the crash steal somebody's phone in an attempt to call her home.

At the police precinct, Detective Connors calls O'Reilly over to help identify the "runner" from the shooting scene the night before. We see the police sketch depict Ty.

At the Johnson household, the Red Hawks show up with their suits to finish the bead work. Roland is talking to Ty about the difference between cloaks and capes when Otis comes across Billy's cloak and takes it into the kitchen, where he starts crying over it.

Ty receives a text from Detective O'Reilly, who says she's outside. Ty goes outside to confront her about showing up at his home and she warns him to lay low, especially after Connors identified him at the scene.

Another flashback, but this time we see Tyrone wandering the streets after the crash. He comes across a voodoo tour, which is coincidentally being lead by Auntie Chantelle.

Present day, Ty begins working on Billy's cloak while Tandy retrieves her father's documents.

Ty calls O'Reilly and tells her that he has a plan. He's going to make up a shirt that looks like the shirt Billy was wearing on the night he was shot in an attempt to "haunt" Connors. Ty asks O'Reilly if they can trust her boyfriend, who's in the room, and after she says they can, Ty puts on Billy's cloak and says he can control his powers through it.

In the flashback, Tandy arrives at her household and finds her mother unconscious on the couch and she calls 911.

Present day, Tandy uses Adina Johnson's ID badge to sneak into the Roxxon building.

Ty puts on Billy's cloak and sneaks up behind Detective Connors. Connors, who's already on edge from it being the anniversary of Billy's shooting, notices his gun is missing. Ty touches Connors neck, showing him a replay of Billy's death, and whispers "You killed me" in his ears.

At Roxxon, Tandy tracks down Scarborough and holds a dagger to his neck.

O'Reilly and Connors meet up and the former says that she has a lead on the suspect in the sketch Connors had done earlier. The two are walking down the street when Ty teleports into the middle of the street. Connors asks O'Reilly if she sees him and O'Reilly plays dumb, so that Ty's "haunt" plan works. Connors chases Ty and they end up down by the dock where Billy was shot.

Connors tries shooting Ty, but Ty keeps using his powers to escape the shots. After he runs out of bullets, Ty approaches Connors and pretends to be Billy. Pretending to be a ghost, Ty convinces Connors to admit to his actions and a subsequent cover-up.

After the admission, Ty steps back and asks O'Reilly and her boyfriend if they got that, and they step out from the shadows revealing they recorded the whole thing. O'Reilly places Connors under arrest.

At Roxxon, Tandy has tied up Scarborough and is questioning him about the rig. Tandy shows him her father's plans and remnants from the oil rig. She then confronts him about the assassination of Greg. After hinting that her father was a bad man, Tandy draws another dagger on Scarborough. Nervous, Scarborough tries to convince Tandy to let him go, saying that he'll give her and her mother enough money for the rest of their lives but Tandy refuses. Upset, she leaves the building.

O'Reilly and her boyfriend are talking about Ty at the precinct and O'Reilly mentions that she's seen plenty of powered people since she's from New York. She then asks her boyfriend if he's ever heard of her friend Misty, hinting at her time working alongside Luke Cage's Mist Knight (Simone Missick).

Ty and Tandy meet near the waterfront and Ty's excited because he was able to get a confession out of Connors. While she's not happy that she wasn't able to get a confession from Scarborough, she is relieved that she scared the shit out of him. Melissa walks up and the three begin hosting a memorial for their respective lost ones.

Ty and Tandy touch hands and they're transported into another vision where they see Tandy's old front door in the midst of the woods. They walk into the door and Tandy asks Ty whether it's a fear or a memory. Ty suggests he thinks it might be a little of both. The two enter an auditorium and slides of Tandy's parents flash on the screen.

Tandy walks towards the screen before slicing it in half. She walks through and sees a black and white scene between her parents where Melissa accidentally spills coffee on Nathan's papers and he slaps her.

The three let go and return to the main timeline, where they release a lantern into the sky.

In another flashback, Melissa advises Tandy to never rely on anybody, hinting at Nathan's long term abuse.

Present day, Tandy calls Peter Scarborough and tells him that she'll take the money.

Flashing back to Ty, we see him watching a talk between his parents where his mother admits she doesn't seem safe in their house.

At the church, Tandy hides money underneath a statue.

O'Reilly returns home to find her boyfriend's murdered corpse stuffed in the fridge.

The episode starts with Auntie Chantelle performing a voodoo ritual. Eventually she gets to her final location and notices a Roxxon pipe in a nearby alleyway.

At school, Evita's in Father Delgado's class and he's talking about heroes and what makes somebody heroic. As he's talking, we see a shot of Tandy burning a picture of her father.

At O'Reilly's house, police are investigating the murder of Fuchs. As the police carry the body out, O'Reilly notices blood on an umbrella by the door and upon further inspection, she finds a pipe under the couch which was used to bludgeon

Fuchs to death.

Ty's with his parents at the police station and they're informed that the police department is opening the case back into Billy's death due to Detective Connors' video-taped confession. As they're walking back to their car, Ty yells at his parents because they didn't believe him all these years.

Chantelle returns home to a worried-sick Evita as we find out her aunt has been gone overnight. Chantelle starts going on a rant about how Roxxon is going to destroy the city and the only thing that can stop Roxxon is the Divine Pairing. Chantelle begs Evita to ask Ty for more information.

Tandy's at a man's house. There, she drugs him and reads his hopes. While doing so, Tandy has a monologue where we find out that using her powers, she can now steal their hopes and desires, and the feelings felt in their visions.

We get a montage of the Johnson's leashing out in various instances. Ty gets into a fist fight at school and Adina yells at a superior at work over a press release about drilling in the gulf.

Tandy is called to Mina's house, where she agrees to go to brunch with Mina and her father Ivan.

Ty is called to Father Delgado's office. Delgado explains that ever since Billy has died, Ty has continued battling a war — he advises Ty to change his attitude.

At brunch, Tandy seems cloudy — as if she's hungover from the previous night's events. She starts panicking and gets from the table. Mina follows her into the kitchen and asks Tandy if she'd like to work for her at Roxxon. The two go to shake hands, and Tandy's transported into Mina's consciousness. There, we see Mina examining flowers — Tandy touches Mina again and takes her energy. It appears Tandy's abusing her powers as if it's a drug.

O'Reilly is drinking heavily at a pub.

Tandy gets back to the police station to bail Liam out with the money she received from Scarborough. While waiting, Tandy notices the water delivery person that shot Greg walking outside.

Delgado returns to his office and warns Ty he's close to expulsion.

Tandy takes Liam to the church she's been living in and tells him that the truth about her living situation. She begins to talk to Liam about marriage, and Liam confronts her about her "happy thoughts," realizing something is amiss.

In Delgado's office, he and Ty argue. Ty tries to leave and Delgado won't allow him, saying if he does, he'll be expelled.

Tandy touches Liam and goes into his dreams. Ty swings a punch at Father Delgado and the two begin fighting. Eventually Delgado puts Ty in a chokehold trying to calm him down and Ty is teleported to his fears.

In Liam's dreams, we see him getting married to Tandy. In Father Delgado's fears, we see him hit and kill a little girl in a drunk driving accident.

Tandy goes to touch Liam in her dreams when everything starts shaking and just then, Ty realizes a door in Delgado's fears. Ty goes through it and walks into the vision Tandy's in.

The interaction in the vision startles both of the protagonists and they each wake up from their subsequent visions. Delgado orders Ty to leave his office.

O'Reilly's still at the pub when Connors walks in and gets a drink. He toasts Fuchs and O'Reilly takes a billy club off the wall and hits Connors over the head with it. The two fight and Connors nearly knocks out O'Reilly while the other cops stand by and watch.

After leaving Delgado's office, Ty's almost instantly approached by Evita who says she can help out. Their conversation is interrupted by Tandy, who orders Ty to stand out of her head. Evita warns Tandy to leave alone and the two fight. Tandy touches Evita's skin and goes into her hopes to see Evita as a doctor.

At the Johnson household, Adina finally opens up to Ty about Billy's death. Adina expresses her frustrations on Ty coercing the confession from Connors, she reminds him that even if cops murder black men on camera in this day in age, they still get away with it.

The two continue talking as the cops and SWAT teams arrive at their house. Over the loudspeakers, they accuse Tyrone of murdering Fuchs. Adina orders Ty to sneak out of the house.

Tandy gets to her mother's house and we see that Melissa's being held hostage by the water delivery assassin. Tandy hides around the corner and as she looks down at her glowing hands, the episode ends.

The episode begins with Aunt Chantelle narrating a scene of members of the Choctaw tribe and goes into the explanations behind the sacrifices some of the tribe's members needed to make.

At the Bowen household, Tandy confronts the hitwoman. Tandy's able to distract Scarborough's hired hand long enough for Melissa to grab a knife and stab her in the shoulder. After a quick tussle, Tandy draws a dagger and slashes the gunman on the leg, causing her to leave the house. Tandy tells her mother to go to the Mister Money location, where a gentleman can help her hide from Rox-

inside and rescues Mina, who's hiding from her rabid coworker. Tandy knocks the attacker unconscious and explains "The Terrors" to Mina and their origin from the oil rig explosion years ago. Mina starts brainstorming ways on how to disable drilling for the dark matter, but she informs Tandy that they need access to Roxxon HQ.

Ty's wearing his cloak and sneaking around at a parade when he's spotted by a police woman. He begins running away when he's stopped by Detective O'Reilly who's trying to help him get away. Just then he's surrounded by cops and refuses to use his powers to get away, instead offering himself up for arrest with no struggle.

Chantelle narrates another fight, this time in the colonial ages. She explains that two brothers were the divine pairing at one point.

Ty and O'Reilly are both arrested and taken into the station.

Tandy and Mina hop in Mina's car and begin their journey to the headquarters of Roxxon.

Ty and O'Reilly are taken into the evidence locker instead of a holding cell and the latter explains that they're not officially booked because the corrupt cops are more than likely going to harm them. With just one cop standing watch over the pair, Tyrone goes into a monologue on how it's the cops duty to protect them. Eventually Ty's able to convince the cop that the corruption he's partaking in is wrong. As the cops about to release them, another walks in and tells him that Detective Connors has arrived and is putting the station on lockdown.

Tandy and Mind arrive at Scarborough's office and he's busy destroying computer hard drives. Scarborough goes to leave his office and he's greeted by Tandy and Mina in the elevator. In the post-credits scene, O'Reilly emerges from the water and appears to have some kind of teleportation powers.

The episode begins with the return of Ally Maki's Mina Hess, who is working on an experiment with some rats, testing the materials from Roxxon that were involved in the explosion. After a couple of failed trials early on, a surge of electricity causes the current rat to clone itself. This helps explain what happened to Brigid/Mayhem, but Mina gives a little more insight later. The long and short of it is: The clone of the original is usually very hostile and seeks to murder its predecessor and take its place. Yes, this

does sound like the plot of *Us*. No, I'm not upset about it.

A lot of the episode moves back and forth in time, showing what Mayhem was up to in the months between the Season 1 finale and the Season 2 premiere. Brigid spent some time in the hospital after her accident and Mayhem paid her a visit early on, seemingly to kill her. However, she soon decided that it was more important to find and kill Detective Connors, so she lets her other be for now. She then went on the hunt for Connors (who we know is trapped in Cloak's void) and along the way, stumbled into the sex trafficking ring that Brigid, Tyrone, and Tandy have been trying to stop.

Those three characters spend their time in the present trying to track down Mayhem, which Brigid is very good at doing since they share the same memories. This chase eventually leads them to one of the trafficking hubs where several young women are being held captive. (The first ring they find has already been torn apart by Mayhem, who kills the men and saves the girls, leading Tandy to believe maybe she isn't so bad.)

Tandy, Tyrone, and Brigid save all of the girls from the gang and are trying to make their escape, when they're suddenly interrupted by Mayhem who starts slaughtering all of the criminals.

She's about to shoot a teenage boy, who was working with the gang, but Tyrone intervenes. His darkness starts spreading around the room and he sucks Mayhem into the void.

In the final scene of the episode, Mayhem wakes up in the void. Blackness all around, except for an old gas station in the distance. She walks over to find a fridge by the door, and inside sits Brigid's dead boyfriend, exactly as she found him when he was killed by Connors. This time however, he wakes up and smiles at Mayhem.

The lock in Andre's mind has opened. The door reveals a glowing applause awaiting Andre. Andre's music has spread throughout the city.
