

Summary: September 17, 1864. New York City is still recovering from the Draft

Riots of 1863. In Five Points, the worst slum in the country, Detective Kevin Corcoran of the New York City Metropolitan Police Department's Sixth Precinct finds himself investigating the murder of a young girl that hits uncomfortably close to home. As the investigation heats up, detectives Corcoran, Francis Maguire, Andrew O'Brien, and old comrade, Doctor Matthew Freeman, must navigate the slums of Five Points

and the mansions of Uptown to search for the child's killer.



The scene opens in New York City in 1864. A man watches as he waits inside a shack for someone. A girl hears a revolver and wakes up. He gives her an egg. The stranger asks the girl's name. She says that her name is Annie. She is on the run. A man watches and Annie asks if the stranger would like her to pleasure him. He tells her no and reminds the girl that she is only a child. Suddenly there is a gunshot and the man leaves the protection of the shack. He walks around and comes upon the bank robbers. He is

joined by two other Coppers, as they are called. The man kills one of them and tells the others to drop their weapons because they are the police. However, they don't and are killed. Corcoran tells O'Brian and Maguire to get as much as they can before the Sergeant gets there.

Sergeant Burns comes up and Corcoran gives him a nice new pocket watch. Burns dismisses Maguire and calls Corcoran, Boyle, a rude slur. The Captain comes and Burns says that Detective Corcoran stopped them. The Captain congratulates him and tells him to put the money in the wagon. Annie watches and can't believe that Corcoran is a Copper. Later at a bar, it is full of men

singing. Corcoran and Maguire go in. Corcoran comes in to visit Eva. He kisses her. In another room, Maguire is 'busy' with a prostitute named Molly and afterward, Molly talks about Corcoran and Eva. She asks if she reminds Corcoran of his wife Ellen. She asks if she will come back to him and Maguire says that Corcoran is his friend and not to talk about his wife the way she is. Maguire apologizes for his behavior and tells her not to talk about Corcoran's wife.

Back in Corcoron's room, Eva gives money for Corcoran's Captain. O'Brien goes into the room and tells them that they have a dead body. Corcoran and O'Brien go to find a dead body in the street. It is Annie. Corcoran takes Annie to Matthew and Sara's house. Matthew is the coroner and a black man, which is bad at these times. Corcoran wants to know how she died. He says that it will cost and says that it will be ready tomorrow. Corcoran gives him \$10 to rush it. Sarah comes out and they excuse themselves. Maguire says that they should go to the bar again, but Corcoran wants to go to the docks. The next day, Corcoran and Maguire go to the poor and tell them to alert them if they find a locket. One of the men says that it is the same old story. Julius, the servant, tells Corcoran that he is instructed to meet with Robert Morehouse. He meets him and Winfred, an acquaintance of Morehouse, is there. Morehouse brings up how Corcoran got himself a badge for saving his life. Winfred tells Corcoran that he knows him from boxing and would love to have him as a referee. Morehouse says that the ship that Corcoran always is asking for is docking any day soon.

Later at Matthew's place, Mathew says that the girl raped after she was killed. Corcoran says that she offered to pleasure him the other day. Matthew says that someone cleaned her up and hit her in the head with a hard object. He tells Corcoran that it is moving day and that he can't find out what killed Annie. He thanks Matthew and takes Annie's body. He walks down the street to see Annie in front of his eyes. He looks at the dead body and it is an identical match. He chases her down and shows her the body of the girl. She screams and runs away. The guy who was trying to get with Annie asks him what he is doing. Corcoran says that he is a police officer. Later that evening, Morehouse goes to a whorehouse lead by Madam Contesa. Bill greets him at the door. He goes inside and is welcomed. Morehouse takes off his prosthetic leg.

The next day, O'Brian and Maguire are digging a grave for the girl and bury her. Corcoran says that they need to find Annie and he stops by the grave of his daughter. Corcoran finds Annie and she screams. He tells her that he is not there to hurt her. He takes her to Eva and Molly and she tells them that the girl was her sister, Kate. She says that she escaped from the Contesa and Corcoran asks who the man was. She cries and Eva tells him to leave it alone for now. Morehouse and Winfred talk politics and Winfred's wife, Elizabeth knows what she is talking about. They joke and laugh. Eva tells Corcoran that she will be back in a week and he tells her that she is the only girl he wants. At Matthew's and Sara's house, Matthew says that he has to do something before they leave. He has to do something for Corcoran.

Later that night, Bill tells him that he has no need to come in. Corcoran says that he wants to question the death of a little girl. Bill tells him that she probably had it coming. Corcoran drags Bill's body to an underground area while Matthew tries to find out what the girl was struck with. Corcoran strips Bill of his clothes and beats him for information. He tells him that he didn't kill a girl. Matthew goes to Corcoran later and tells him that Kate was killed with a walking stick. He finds out that Bill is not his guy and apologizes to him. Bill says that they are going to hang him for it anyway. Corcoran goes up to the can maker and he doesn't want to give names. However, when Corcoran puts a gun to his head, he says that it is Winfred's cane. Corcoran gets the cane and Elizabeth sees him take it. Corcoran takes the information to the Captain and he tells him that he and Burns will take over the investigation from now. Burn makes a snide comment and uses the slur, Boyle again. Corcoran walks out thinking that justice has been served.

However, the next day, he gets into Morehouse's place and the Captain says that Bill admitted to killing Kate. Corcoran laughs. Morehouse says that Winfred wanted Corcoran released, but his father saved him. Winfred asks of Annie and Corcoran lies and says that she is in the covenant with the nuns. Corcoran goes to Annie and tells Molly that he needs to be alerted of any interest into Annie. Corcoran goes to visit Bill and he says that it is alright that he is going to hang because he has Liver problems and only has a year to live. Corcoran says that he doesn't like that the wrong man is hanging. He tells Corcoran that he is fine with this. Corcoran gets home to find Elizabeth there. She tells him to promise that Kate's murder will be avenged.

Summary: September 21, 1864. Corcoran receives a lead on a figure from his past

who may have information about the loss of his family. What he learns does little to ease his mind and only raises more questions. Meanwhile, Annie Reilly's pursuers become brutally violent in their search for the child, forcing Corcoran and his team to come up with a plan for her safety. In the mansions of Uptown New York, Robert Morehouse strives to please his father, Norbert, who wishes to purchase the entire Five

Points.



The scene opens with Corcoran and Maguire asking the townspeople about the locket that Corcoran is looking for. He asks them about Tangos McCarthy. Corcoran exits the place and finds Julian, the Morehouse servant waiting for him. He says that Robert is looking for him. Meanwhile Robert and Winnie Haverford are talking about the Irish and how the emancipated slaves are going to flock there. Robert brings up his father being a tyrant. Corcoran gets there to find Winnie Haverford meeting with Robert there.

However, it turns out that Winnie invited him. Winnie asks about Annie and Corcoran doesn't say anything. Winnie tells Corcoran that they are not done, but he says that they are. He leaves and goes to Annie, who is in the hotel with Molly and Maguire. He tells Annie that they will guard her until they could find another place to hide her. He leaves and Maguire tries to get fresh with Molly. She tells him that she will 'reward' him later and says that they have to keep Annie safe first.

Corcoran goes to the Nunnery and Sister Agnes Clare tells him that he needs to pray for help. He ignores that and leaves. At the Morehouse home, Robert tells Winnie that they will do something. Norton, Robert's father comes in and finds out that Robert cut his profit by thirds. He tells Winnie that he wants to buy Five Points and leaves. Robert tells him that Norton feels that they are going to have a benefit to buy Five Points and put who they want to live there. Robert says that they need someone else to buy the properties with their money. In another

town, Mathew Freeman calls out to his wife Sarah and tells her that she needs to be able to go outside. She says that she saw a white man and got scared. He sees that she has a gun and tells her that she can protect him with her pistol. She hugs him. At the church, the reverend thanks the Haverfords for rebuilding the church for the many black children. Winnie tells the Reverend that he feels good helping. Elizabeth doesn't see it that way.

Later, Molly goes up to Corcoran and tells him that Tangos is in town. That night, Corcoran sees someone breaking into Tangos' home. His wife yells at him and Corcoran is there to beat him up. They fight and his wife yells for Corcoran to kill him. Corcoran asks about his wife and he says that he didn't do anything with it. He says that Helen, Corcoran's wife, left with a man. He says that he would have killed his wife too if he had killed Maggie, Corcoran's daughter. The next day, Maguire asks Corcoran if he believes Tangos. He says that he does and that he made sense. Norton meets with Winnie and asks about the progress of the purchase of the church. He tells Norton that he is close and will buy it for \$100,000. Robert comes in drunk and asks Winnie how the search for Annie is going. Winnie tells him that he would give him a beating if he wasn't Norton's son. At the bar, a man comes up to Molly asking for Corcoran. She has him pay her for information, but tells him that she doesn't know where he went to. She asks if he wants a kiss and he tells her that he doesn't want one.

Robert and Elizabeth talk in the hall and she asks about Corcoran's past. Robert tells her that he lost his wife and daughter. He is still searching for his wife. Robert suggests that Elizabeth buy the church under the nose of his father and her husband. She likes the idea. Corcoran is reading a letter when three men come into his room. They ask where Annie is and he doesn't tell. They beat him up and break his leg. Corcoran manages to stab the leader in the thigh. He grabs the gun and tells them to get out. The next morning, O'Brian and Maguire get to Corcoran's and he calls for Freeman. Maguire goes to his home and breaks in. Sarah hides behind the curtain and is ready to shoot when Freeman comes in. He tells him that Corcoran needs him. He gets there and helps him with his leg.

The man who asked Molly where Corcoran was comes up and introduces himself as John Riley, Annie's father. He comes in and Corcoran doesn't give him correct information on where Annie by telling him that he doesn't know where she is. He tells O'Brian that he could take him to his grave. Maguire points out that Riley is a liar from the drink he took of the alcohol that he has never had before. Elizabeth goes to the Reverend and says that she wants to surprise her husband. He agrees. Corcoran asks Annie about Riley and she tells him that Riley is her husband and says that when she was 10-years-old, Riley says that he can marry her. She says that the Contessa said that the men would be nice. She cries and tells him that she doesn't want to go back to Riley. He says that he promises that he won't. Corcoran says that they need to move Annie. She says that she will help him and tells him that he needs to kill Winnie. She reaches on his private parts and he says that he doesn't want her to do that, but doesn't tell her to stop.

Later, O'Brian tells Riley that he is her husband and that he forced her to marry him. They tell him to get out of town. At the Contessa, Molly tells her that Corcoran told her to send her there. The Contessa pays Molly \$100 for Annie. At the Morehouse home, Norton tells Winnie that he failed him. He tells him to leave. Robert asks him if he is having a bad night. Robert goes into his father's office and tells him that he was the one who bought the church for only \$90,000. He offers him a cigar. Freeman gives Corcoran some medicine for his broken leg. At the Contessa, she gets Annie ready to 'service' a man. Maguire tells the police sergeant that there is a death of a rich woman. Winnie gets to the Contessa's and enters the room where Annie is. He starts to undress when suddenly, Corcoran tackles him. He tells Annie to kill Winnie. She does. Annie gets the Contessa and Corcoran stabs her too. He tells Annie that this will all be in the past. He jumps in the back of a cart where Freeman is there. He takes Corcoran home.

The Sergeant and Maguire are going to the home when they hear Annie crying. They find Winnie and the Contessa dead. Freeman gives Corcoran more medicine and leaves. Corcoran hallucinates Maggie is in front of him. The Sergeant comes to Corcoran's home with the doctor and says that the Captain believes that someone had to do something with the death of Winnie and the Contessa. However, they rule out Corcoran when the doctor says that he wouldn't be walking. They leave and Maguire and O'Brian dance. They laugh. Elizabeth is in mourning and Robert tells Corcoran that Winnie is dead. He says that Elizabeth is going to adopt Annie. Maguire says that he needs a 'proper' place in society and gestures to his privates. They leave Robert and Corcoran alone and Robert says that he knows that Corcoran killed Winnie, but he won't tell.

However, he warns him that Norton thinks that Corcoran is too smart. He tells him that Freeman, Corcoran and he need to be careful. Corcoran hallucinates that his daughter is there by his side.

Summary: September 26, 1864. Racial tensions in Five Points come to a head as

the body of an Irishman is discovered lynched and hanged. While all evidence points toward a black pastor as the murderer, Corcoran has doubts. As the people of New York cry for a hanging, Corcoran is forced to question every piece of evidence with the help of Doctor Matthew Freeman. The Morehouse family attempts to capitalize on the situation by eyeing new parcels of land in the Points that may become available if the city panics. Meanwhile, the search for Corcoran's missing wife unexpectedly lands in the hands of Eva Heissen – though Corcoran is

entirely unaware..



The scene opens with Elizabeth thanking Corcoran for helping her husband and is sad that Winfred is dead. Later, Robert says that they have to get Corcoran back into the ring. Elizabeth shows Corcoran a painting and he is clearly embarrassed. Elizabeth says that Winfred wouldn't allow her to hang it because it looked like her. Elizabeth asks why he didn't kiss her hand. He says that he didn't know that he was allowed to. She asks if he wants to kiss it and he says that he does. She leaves and Robert has Corcoran join them

for drinks. Matthew meets with Reverend Garland and tells him that the children will be fine. Two men, Dermot and Jerry, shout from outside calling him a racial slur. Garland tells them that he wanted to rent a horse from them and they refused. He is told that they won't rent to a colored man. They tell Garland that they burnt down the last orphanage and will do the same to this one. Matthew comes out with a shotgun and fires it into the air. He tells them not to harm the children.

Corcoran goes to see Eve and she asks what Elizabeth wanted. He says that it is nothing and says that she wanted him to kiss her hand. She asks him if he did and he says that he didn't. She then proceeds to orally pleasure him. At that moment, the Sergeant gets escorted to Dermot O'Conner's body. The next day, Corcoran says that Dermot was dead even before the noose was

around his neck. Jerry comes up with Maguire and says that Garland is the culprit. The Captain tells Maguire to take Jerry to jail. Corcoran goes up to Garland and tells him that he is under arrest. At Matthew's home, he is smiling and says that time has come to have a child. She says that she has Matthew to bring her happiness.

Corcoran comes up and tells him that he needs to know how Dermot died and says that Garland is arrested for the murder. A boy runs to Elizabeth's home and tells her that Garland was arrested. Matthew examines Dermot's body and says that he was killed by a needle. Corcoran says that Dermot was part of the mob that burned down the church and that Garland could have done it for revenge. Matthew tells him to be careful and blames Corcoran for being racist and he calls him on it.

Molly goes to Schwarz's jewelry and sees the locket that Corcoran has been looking for. Dermot's daughter yells in the streets and causes the crowd to agree with her. The Captain says that they need to do something. The Sergeant says that they should just hang Garland now. At the whorehouse, Eve sees the locket around Molly's neck and tells her to give it to her. Molly says bought it for \$7 from Schwarz. Eve rips it off her neck and tells her not to tell Corcoran about it. Corcoran, Maguire and O'Brian search Garland's home and find a bloody rag. They go to visit him and Matthew is there. He tells him that he is trying to tell Garland not to take the blame. Corcoran shows the rag. They take it to Matthews and he shows Corcoran that the blood is Ox blood like Garland said it was.

Later, Maguire gets in to a emotional Molly and she tells him to hold her. Corcoran asks the masses about the locket and O'Brian says that he has a message with perfume. It is from Elizabeth. He goes to visit her and sees the painting that she showed him. It is a naked woman. Corcoran says that she needs to ease up on the rose water and she apologizes. She brings up that Garland needs to have fair treatment and he says that he will. She says that he is not what he seems and Corcoran is about to kiss her hand when Annie interrupts them claiming not being able to sleep because she keeps hearing men's voices. Maguire meets with Robert and Robert tells him that Maguire is going to buy the stables with his money for a commission. He agrees. Maguire asks the butler how could it happen and he welcomes him. The next day, Jerry is interrogated and Corcoran questions him. He says that Dermot's daughter could have killed him, but Jerry says that she wouldn't do it. He gets the information he needs.

Corcoran goes to Dermot's daughter and she tells him that Jerry and she were in bed with one another. Corcoran knows that she is lying. Schwartz tells Eve that the locket was originally pawned by Madam Grendle, the abortionist. Elizabeth meets with the elite and is told that she needs to stop supporting Garland. She excuses herself and tells the women to do the same. At the funeral home, Corcoran, Maguire and O'Brian are told that a black man tore Dermot's clothes off. Matthew inspects a man named Jasper and Bessie asks if Garland will hang for this. She says that one Negro is better than the other. Matthew leaves and realizes that Bessie's place is really close to the stables. Matthew goes up to Corcoran and tells him about Bessie and how he feels that she has something to do with Dermot's murder. They go up to Jasper and find the needle that was used in the murder. Jasper tells Corcoran that Bessie will be mad like before. He says that Bessie was mad at Dermot for not paying for the tailoring that she did and says that Bessie ran and is not coming back.

They go to Garland and he tells them what Bessie did. He says that he told him that he was innocent and Corcoran says that they have to get Garland an alibi. At the whorehouse, Eve and Corcoran get 'busy' and Eve asks him what he would do if he found the locket. Corcoran says that he would find Ellen. He says that he wants to know why if she says that she doesn't want to be found. Corcoran goes up to Robert and tells him that he needs an alibi for Garland. Robert tells him that Garland was with him at the time of the murder. Corcoran pretends to have forgotten this and thanks him. The Captain, Sergeant, Maguire and Corcoran meet with Dermot's daughter and tell her that her father hung himself. Maguire says that he is buying the stables from her and Jerry can live somewhere else. She agrees. Corcoran is shocked with Maguire's offer. Jerry is released from jail and Garland walks into the church with Matthew.

Corcoran later goes to Elizabeth who claims to be reading Dicken's latest novel. She says that she is most grateful for all that he has done. She kisses his cheek. Matthew takes Jasper to his home and tells Sarah that he is going to be living with them. She accepts the new guest and feed him some soup. Eve goes to see Madame Grendle and finds her dead. Corcoran and Maguire go to the scene and Eva says that one of her girls needed her service. Corcoran goes home and finds

Annie there. She tells him that she is attracted to him and he tells her that she doesn't need to offer herself to men anymore. She says that she understands. He takes her to the coachman and tells him never to bring her to him again. Annie apologizes.

The scene opens with O'Brian talking about how Maguire is going to ask Molly to marry him and says that Molly is not the married type. Suddenly a prosthetic leg flies through the whorehouse window. It is Robert who is in an argument. Molly goes up to Eva and tells her that she needs to give the locket to Corcoran. Eva tells her that she knows that Molly lied to her about Madam Grendle. She tells her to not tell Corcoran that she ever had it. She tells her that she won't. Corcoran is drinking when Molly comes in and Corco-

ran says that they can't do this again. He sees that she has the locket. She tells him that she got it from Schwarz. She tells him that he can relax now that he has the locket and proceeds to undress. The next day, Corcoran tells Maguire that Molly gave him the locket and says that he wants to know what Schwartz knows.

Matthew has his Uncle Marcus come visit him. Marcus says that Sarah is beautiful and Matthew says that Marcus was undefeated in Boxing. Marcus says that he is going back to Africa, the Promised Land. He says that he is going to Liberia to create a name for him. Annie is trying to behave like a lady with Elizabeth's help, but says that she wants to go back to Eva's. She says that is the last place she will go. Corcoran talks to the townspeople and asks about

He has her try some Opium and it calms her down. They look at one another and she kisses him. He kisses back. At the same moment, Maguire waits outside a building and watches a light turn out.

Maguire goes to the Coroner and says that he needs the bullet from Mary's body. He tells him go find a salon. Maguire stick his gun in the doctor's mouth and says that he will be back tomorrow for it. Later, Kennedy comes over to Robert's and tells him that he needs the money for

their associates. He tells him to come back later for it. The voting continues and O'Brien gives free drinks to rig the votes. Eva tells Corcoran that Annie has some strange ideas in her head. Robert gets to his office and Corcoran is there. He asks about the business venture involving Greek Fire. Robert brings up how Corcoran intimidating Elizabeth and says that Elizabeth cares for Annie just like he does and says that he can't threaten an innocent woman. He tells he understands and then asks about the Greek Fire. Robert tells him that he is involved with people and tells him that he will wait to know more and will give it a consideration to tell him.

Byrnes and Corcoran go to the place where Mary's body was and then go to the doctor. He gives him the bullet that Maguire threatened him about. McLean's wife gets back and Maguire is about to take her gunpoint, but sees an officer. He retreats. Corcoran goes to Sim and asks about McLean's gun. Corcoran goes to up to Maguire and says that he has been lying to him. Maguire says that he is taking too long. Corcoran restrains him and Maguire says that he needs to see the man who killed Mary. Corcoran allows it. They see McLean and Maguire catches him first and kills him. Corcoran asks why he did that and he says that he ran. Maguire says that they solved the case. Corcoran tells O'Brien that something doesn't sit right with him and says that he will have to talk to McLean's wife about this. She tells Corcoran that McLean has been up in Buffalo for a while. She tells Corcoran that Mary had a ledger and that she was blackmailing him.

Sybil asks O'Brien about the telegram and O'Brien says that it is nothing. However, she is not convinced. Norbert talks with Elizabeth and they get the news that Lincoln won the election. Elizabeth thanks Norbert for his hospitality and says that despite making Slavery abolished, the people won't think so. Robert tells Elizabeth that he talked to Corcoran for her. On the road, the wagon carrying the Greek Fire has to stop. Robert stabs the wagon and points it out to Kennedy. They run off and the wagon explodes. The next day in the New York, the city is desolate. Annie tells Corcoran that she added Rose Water to Corcoran's clothes. He tells her to get out of his wife's clothes and says that she is to go to school. Byrnes goes up to Corcoran and tells him that Maguire went to Earle House, the home for Batty women. Corcoran asks the front desk where Maguire went to and she is not willing to give information. He fights off the guard and asks the woman why Maguire was there. She says that he was there to see his wife, Mrs. Maguire. She shows Corcoran to her, but Corcoran recognizes her. It is his Ellen! He asks her if she recognizes him. She doesn't say anything and he shows her the musical pocket watch. He tells her to remember him and she turns her head away. Corcoran puts his head on her lap and cries.

In a stirring monologue, Ellen recounts what she can remember through the haze of her nervous breakdown. She and Frank were sleeping together and she became pregnant. She went to Madam Grindle and had an abortion, paying with the locket Corcoran had given her. She heard a baby cry during the procedure.

Realizing her abortion was more of a murder, Ellen was haunted by the baby's cry. She was in bed with Frank when little Maggie walked in. She screamed for her father, Corcoran, and Ellen went to grab her. In her rattled mind, though, she confused Maggie's cries with the dead baby's cries. She pushed Maggie away.

The little girl smacked her head on the door frame and died.

With this confession, Ellen sinks to the floor, crying. Corcoran also falls to the ground, unsure what to do now that his quest is over.

In other stories, the confederate terrorist who Morehouse successfully foiled last week is back. He blackmails Morehouse's father into joining the cause.

Elizabeth, she of the beautiful dresses, wears a fantastic white-fur trimmed gown as she meets three actors. They are the dashing Booth brothers: Junius Brutus, Edwin and John Wilkes (!!).

Also, Sarah cooks a full Thanksgiving dinner.

Corcoran, rattled by Ellen's confession, agrees to help, but needs to find someone to watch his ill wife. He goes to Eva, who's all, 'Seriously?! Again?!' But

she can tell Corky is rattled.

Annie again makes an inappropriate comment about Corcoran to Eva. This is the final straw and Eva finally sets Annie straight. Yes, bad things happened in her past, but if she doesn't shape up, she won't have a chance at a better future. Thank you, Eva!

Morehouse and Corcoran's plan works and they catch the terrorists in the act. Morehouse thinks the case is closed but Corcoran thinks it was too easy.

Corky is right: Kennedy has figured out how to make his own Greek fire and the plot is on. Corcoran, Morehouse and the coppers band together to go to all the hotels and put out the fires.

The premiere begins with Corky letting off some steam with a nice vigorous jog in an empty field. A sweet, innocent deer runs right up to him, looking all cute and cuddly. It's all quite lovely until some random old haggard woman shoots it dead with her rifle and begins butchering it right there in front of him. What a way to make the reality of his life come rushing back into view. Can't poor Corky have anything nice?

The first order of business is to save the brothel-owning Eva from the new

criminal of the week, Buzzie Burke. He doesn't do a very good job of that, however. Corky interrupts Buzzie as he carves his initials into Eva's back, only to be beaten to the ground like a limp rag doll. That is one of the refreshing things about this show, however: The hero is not very good at saving the day, although he tries really hard.

The Sixth Ward has a new boss: General Brendan Donovan. He gets started by roughing up a few of his own men in order to get his point across; they are the police, and they need to start acting like it! No more debauchery and shoddy work – at least not in public.

Corky, the only man who seems to truly believe deeply in his work, appears to be happy with the change. There's also a bonus in it for him or any other copper who can catch Buzzie Burke.

Corky's search for Buzzie Burke doesn't start well: He and his men accidentally capture and beat up poor old Bug-Eyed Boyle before realizing they've got the wrong man. Gotta love those nicknames.

But Corky didn't have to search far. Buzzie's got Corky's wife fish hooked on his finger right on Corky's own couch. He labels Corky as "pretty" right before forcing him to hand over his gun and drop to his knees. As mentioned before, Corky is not very good at saving the day, as his own orphan ward saves the couple by smashing a pan over Buzzie's head before he can blow off Corky's pretty face.

Francis kills Buzzie Burke soon after his arrival to the same prison cell. Then a judge sets Francis free after evidence of his murders goes missing. Corky is there to witness the play unfold and has trouble believing his eyes. Now he's got to contend with his greatest nemesis free on the streets, once again.

The coppers also have a new case at hand, involving two missing teenage boys. The search has just begun but will continue in the next episode.

Meanwhile Ms. Haverford is marrying Robert Morehouse. Robert is a good guy for the most part, but he's a one-legged drunk who is completely blinded by Haverford's wiles. Although she is some sort of British double agent – siding with the South to defeat the North and throw New York into chaos – Morehouse just goes along with his goofy grin, none the wiser.

realign his allegiances and fend for himself.



Five Points appears to have a serial killer targeting teenage boys. Detective "Corky" Corcoran enlists the help of his good friend Dr. Matthew Freeman to learn that the two dead kids they've stacked up so far have been drugged. There are five more missing, and it's up to the coppers to find them.

"Copper" has never had much in the way of comedic relief, but this episode is a happy exception. Corky found that the killer has most likely been preying on boys in Eva's new bar, which she's taken

over from Buzzie Burke – who had carved his initials into her back – after he was killed in prison.

In order to catch the killer, Corky and his men attempt to dress up one of their patrolmen as the type of kid the killer seems to be interested in. An actor attempts to train the officer in the art of acting for the purpose of going undercover, but he fails miserably – and hilariously. After his "deplorable" performance (as the exasperated actor puts it), Corky uses him anyway because, well, he's the only copper who looks the part.

The plan actually works, even though it's an indirect path: The undercover Irish boy decoy sets his lure to capture a potential suspect, but the suspect immediately moves on to another boy who looks more promising. Corky and O'Brien, Corky's detective partner, spot the man dropping drugs into the kid's drink during a distracting random bar fight, and the coppers run up to pull him outside right away.

They pull the drugs out if his pocket and prepare to arrest him when the bar fight spills onto the street, and Corky gets knocked to the ground. Although their suspect gets away, Corky seems to be confident that they can catch him now that they know who he is and are able to obtain his name.

When a news reporter threatens to run the story of the missing and murdered boys, Donovan blackmails him. The reporter has his own juicy secrets to hide, so Donovan gives him a choice: good or bad news. In other words, the news can be good if the reporter sits on the story a bit longer, once the coppers catch the killer without the interference of a news report that will send him running for the hills – although Corky may have already failed on that front. The news will definitely be bad, however, if it's all about the reporter's personal life.

Now that Maguire, Corky's ex-friend and ex-copper, has been released from prison after evidence of his murders has gone mysteriously missing, he decides to turn to a life of crime. His first step is to sign on with a group of criminals called The Druids. The first order of business in his new job is to coerce a shop owner into paying double his normal amount for a stack of counterfeit bills. When the man argues, Maguire sticks a lit cigarette up the man's nose. Yikes!

Sara Freeman has had a hard time shaking the lynching of her two brothers in the city and prefers living out on the outskirts. When Matthew's mentor decides to move out of Five Points for health issues, however, Matthew agrees to take over the practice to fulfill his vow to heal people. Sara is terrified at the prospect and the challenges Matthew will face as a black doctor with a lot of business in the city.

Historical figure Frederick Douglass comes to Sara's rescue, inspiring her to become a strong woman. A conversation with Douglass leads Sara to announce to her husband that she is no longer afraid of the city and will be supporting him in his new practice.

The episode finishes with flashes between two husband and wife relationships: the Freemans, who have just solidified their love and respect for each other; and the Corcorans, who may never get past the tragedy of losing their daughter. The Freemans, therefore, have some wild lovemaking to do, while Ellen Corcoran initiates an awkward encounter with her husband that results in him turning to a needle full of morphine in his arm.

It's actually a great idea for the worst criminals of society, but the realistic visuals are enough to make you sick. Be forewarned.

Dorman finally comes clean: He has

been recruiting for the Union Army, but he swears it was his partner who killed two boys when things got out of hand. The other boys are still being held somewhere and have not yet shipped off to war.

Corky follows clues until he finds the location where the boys are being held. He begins freeing them when a familiar face pops up: McGrath, some of the boys' own father! Corky was right to distrust him the first time, since he had never told Corky a single true statement. Too bad he wasn't the one to stay in the "suite." Instead, he gives McGrath the same choice he gave his own sons: lose his life on the spot or out on the battlefield. Of course, he chooses the latter.

Sara Freeman puts on a brave face after she moves back to her old home with her husband. Unfortunately, she's got a perfect view of the lamppost where her two brothers were hanged for simply having a dark skin color.

Rather than fall apart and beg to move back to the outskirts, she runs outside with an ax and attempts to bring down the dreadful symbol of horror by herself. When she is unable, her

husband Matthew joins in. Several other men who suffered the same disgusting bigotry join in, until the thing lay on the ground with its dim light flickering. The broken and toppled lamppost is now a new symbol of strength.

It's wedding day for Mr. Morehouse, but his best man is off chasing bad guys. He decides to have the man standing nearest to him fill in for dear old Corky so he can get on with what he believes to be the best day of his life.

Of course, Elizabeth has just been putting on a show, having been partly responsible for the plan to burn New York to the ground and give the South the win in the war. Her conscience finally intercedes when she decides to become a drugged-out lump of guilt. She confesses her sins to her new husband, hoping for forgiveness. She seems to have forgotten that Morehouse exiled his own father for his involvement in the plot.

Corky finds his friend later at Eva's good old-fashioned bar and whorehouse, where Morehouse is lying drunk in bed with a prostitute. He's a bit confused by the sight, wondering what could have happened on the way from the wedding to the bedroom, where Morehouse and Haverford had been spending most of their time before marriage. He doesn't get any answers but knows that it must be bad. So Corky decides to keep Morehouse company by bunking with him for the evening so he doesn't have to experience the shame of sleeping with a prostitute on his wedding night.

The former prostitute child Annie is probably the only person who thoroughly enjoyed the wedding, having stolen expensive jewelry from an unoccupied room of the mansion. She's not so happy later, however, when she overhears Corky flirting with his wife while preparing dinner. Annie has been truly damaged by her life before Corky took her in. She wants to replace both his dead daughter and his wife. Mrs. Corcoran should always keep one eye on Annie to avoid any "accidents."

His boss gives him just such an assignment in order to prove his worth: kill a copper. He does just that, effortlessly plunging a knife into someone whose death he would have avenged had he still been a copper himself. Now, it is Gen. Donovan who vows to avenge the death by gathering every copper in his jurisdiction to find the man who killed one of his own.

Next, Corky pulls himself away from searching for the cop killer, when he spots Annie running from home and decides to have a talk with his wife about it. Ellen is furious after having found the newly married Elizabeth Morehouse's diamond necklace, which Annie stole at the

wedding.

Corky walks in right after the fight – which contained hitting and kicking on Annie's part and the threat of murder by stabbing on Ellen's part. Corky immediately takes Annie's side, informing Ellen that she just doesn't understand how to deal with the child. When Ellen calls her a tramp, he smacks her across the face.

Corky isn't so nice to Annie either. Her first instinct is to lie about what happened, and Corky has had enough with her. After ensuring that Corky's obsession with Annie stems from righteousness rather than a sickening taste for young girls, it's Donovan who must set Corky on the right path. He explains that Corky's focus on righting one wrong that may not be fixable may only serve to make matters worse. That has definitely been the case, and so Corky vows to work for the greater good, as Donovan requests, even if it may involve some tough personal decisions.

As Corky deals with personal issues, O'Brien gets the job done. As he beats up Billy Murphy – who was assumed to be Phinbar's murderer because he is a known cop-hater – Billy's daughter cries out for him to stop. The daughter spills the beans about a new gang that prints counterfeit money out of some "dive" and had threatened to kill her and her father if they said anything.

Donovan suggests the coppers close down all the dives in town in order to weed them out. But it is one of the counterfeiter's own jealous men who goes straight to the coppers to tell them that it was Maguire who plunged the knife into Phinbar. Maguire and his new crime boss had humiliated the man earlier because of his light-hearted, joking attitude concerning the cop murder.

O'Brien has a hard time believing his ears until he finds Maguire carrying counterfeiting plates. O'Brien asks him point blank whether he committed the murder but leaves his answer a mystery until Corky gets back in the game, having just made his promise to work for the greater good. It is indeed Maguire who takes his deserved punishment for the murder.

She even took the name Annie Corcoran and told them that Corky was her father, which causes Corky to beam with both pride and sadness. He is prideful that she finally listened to him and sad that she will no longer be around. Corky is on his own now.

Lastly, Francis comes by after everyone else has left. This man who helped cause the rift between Corky and Ellen is also a tremendous, if dishonest and cruel, ally. He still loves Ellen, but he loves Corky even more. He would kill or die for Corky, which means that there's very little Corky can't accomplish with Francis as his partner.

Kennedy sets a fire in his cell in order to kill a guard and escape. As Robert goes to watch the preparations for the hanging, Kennedy is at his home, attempting to defile his wife. The conniving Elizabeth plays along, promising to help him escape, until Robert rushes home after learning what happened. The couple does some dual-conniving to drug Kennedy and drag him back to his death sentence, finally finding some relief in watching him hang for his crimes.

Freeman attempts to save the poor people who have been dying from the bacteria-laden well water, but he makes a horrible mistake that results in the death of a child. Apparently, they do not yet know about blood-typing, as he attempts to save the girl with healthy blood from a reluctantly giving patrolman. That story will be continued in the next episode.

Donovan really wants that aqueduct contract, so he decides to become "flexible" in his "negotiation" tactics. That means having Francis torture the poor guy who stands in his way until he signs off on it. So it looks like Donovan will have his aqueduct, which will serve more than two million people.

Things really go awry when someone suffocates Jack with a pillow, putting Eva in danger of hanging for murder. Donovan becomes more interested in protecting Eva once he learns that the baby she is carrying is his, but it is Kevin who she wants to sleep with – which she does right there in her cell, with the danger of anyone walking in at any moment!

Donovan had just killed Theresa, the witness that could eventually tie him to other murders, in the previous episode. Without the forensics of the modern world, it's going to be nearly impossible to prove that Donovan did it, especially when he's got people paid off in every corner of Five Points. Francis is feeling particularly guilty, as the parents believe he had been tasked with protecting her.

Corky finally learns the depth of Donovan's deception when he seeks the help of his good friend Robert Morehouse. Robert

did not know of his own dirty dealings with Donovan, including the buying out of Eva's Paradise "Saloon," until he saw his father Norbert's documents.

Robert obtains additional documents for Corky, detailing Donovan's buying of land throughout the area. All deals are hidden through third parties, such as those through the Morehouses. Donovan intends to build his aqueduct right through, tearing down all the property he has bought up and displacing scores of people.

There's not much Corky can do, other than kill Donovan. That wouldn't be very copper-like, but it's the only option when faced with an unbeatable criminal. Well, there's also the option of dying. So, Corky decides to play a little game of Russian Roulette with Donovan.

Corky lays out five guns, and only one of them has a bullet. He also has a gun that he stole from Donovan's desk, so he can always shoot Donovan if he refuses to take the risk of shooting himself. When they finally pare down to the final two guns, they each grab one and point them at

each other. Donovan's is empty. Will Corky shoot Donovan with the last gun? We'll have to wait until next week to find out.

Matthew is beaten by the shop owner whose window he broke. The racist man who hurled epithets at his dear wife and mother-in-law gets his due when Corky and O'Brien trash his business and smash a bottle over his head. Capt. Sullivan also suggests levying double the taxes on the man.

Matthew doesn't want their help, however. In fact, it only serves to anger him until Sara has a little heart to heart with him. Matthew is becoming unstable because he is allowing his anger to fester. She reminds him that he's no longer a slave and has the right to confront his attacker.

The confrontation is one of the top scenes of the series. After a long argument, Matthew finally agrees with the shop owner on one thing: He is not the shop owner's equal. No, because Matthew is smarter and stronger than that growling "mangy little dog."

The superb exchange is followed with bitingly sarcastic moment in which Matthew offers the man a salve for the wound inflicted by Corky. He tosses the container at the man's chest, allowing it to drop to the ground. He gives the man two choices: use the salve or "don't, and let it rot." Matthew doesn't much care either way, but at least he vented his anger while also performing his duties as a physician and giving the shop owner a taste of his own medicine.

Elizabeth is drugged out of her mind when Norbert enters with a tub of cold water and begins dunking her head into it. He then gives her an ultimatum: stop using drugs or indulge elsewhere. She finally cleans up, at least for the short term. It's too soon to tell whether she will stay on track.

With his wife finally sober, Robert offers an apology. He has made his share of mistakes and cannot continue to be angered by her betrayal when he has done the same sorts of things in the past. It's time to forgive her. As Elizabeth suggests, perhaps they can finally have some time when they are both happy with each other at the same time.

release Eva from prison for questioning, saying it's under Donovan's orders. Sullivan has never had reason to distrust Kevin before but notices that something is off with him.

Kevin quickly makes his way to Eva, waits for a slowpoke to sign the paperwork, then takes her off to Robert's place. He then asks Robert to go through all the paperwork to find proof that Donovan was a scum bag and heads off to hide at Mrs. McGrath's house.

What Kevin doesn't take into consideration is that someone saw every step that he took, and the information gets back to Donovan's men. With their power, influence, and willingness to maim, torture, and pay large sums of money to get what they want, the whole town is looking for Kevin.

The men finally locate Booth, but he has already been captured and killed by their fellow soldiers. Robert had hoped to bring Booth back alive, and he proceeds to lose his mind over the issue as his half-leg becomes infected. Matthew needs medical supplies quickly!

The only place Matthew knows to look for supplies is at his previous "owner's" plantation. Matthew takes what he needs from the disgusting plantation owner, who stands nearby creating "art" that consists of a comparison between a deeply scarred black man's back and his own daughter's "perfect" white skin.

The place holds ghosts and painful memories for all three men, as this is where Robert and Corky accidentally shot an innocent white woman, whom Matthew had known since she was a child. She had still been alive and in pain, begging for Matthew to kill her. He did as she wished, suffocating her with his bare hands, sobbing over her lifeless body.
