Summary: Forced into mandatory retirement, Ben goes to a small coastal town in Mexico to finish construction on his ex-partner's fishing cabin and in the process, crosses paths with a young woman who needs his help.



The episode begins with a group of Mexicans en-route to the US border. They're stopped, however, by a gruff, bald man called Ben Clemens approaching and drinking all their water. As he walks away, the trio of Mexicans watch him leave in confusion.

We then cut back 5 days earlier. This hard-nosed wanderer happens to be a US border patrol guard. He bursts into a shop and demands to use their toilet, despite not being a customer. After doing his business, he stakes out the place and

waits for the owner to leave. When he does, Ben sneaks back in without a warrant and finds a hidden tunnel in the bathroom leading 30 feet underground.

After calling for back-up, he uses a shard of glass to view round the corners and witness human trafficking first-hand. Ben saves the day, taking out the thugs and saving the refugees. Clemens wants to do more but the police are happy to leave it as it is, sending him back to the station.

It turns out Ben is retiring and not happy about his party. After 32 years of service he'd rather just go out peacefully. Anyway, he eventually heads home and starts getting used to life away from being a border guard.

While out at home depot, a polite Mexican asks him if he needs help and Ben immediately recognizes him as a man called Alvaro. He grabs the guy and calls his former work colleagues,

telling them to break protocol and send this boy back. When he receives an abrupt no, he leaves the man cable-tied to the fence.

Grumpy Ben Clemens then heads down to Mexico and immediately throws his American muscle around, tuning out the Mexican music on the radio and refusing to engage with the locals. At least to begin with anyway. It turns out his partner was Mexican, a guy called Javi who's no longer with us. In fact, Ben intends to head down and help fix up his caravan.

With fragmented knowledge of the language, he heads to the cafe and mentions Javi's name to the barmaid, Silvia. She immediately recognizes it and walks away. As we soon find out, she used to be Javi's partner. Anyway, Ben's food arrives just as his ex-wife rings, promising her he'll be there for their daughter's birthday party.

Tensions are immediately hostile though when a group of men, led by a shadowy thug called Dante, show up at the bar. As they take off, we hard cut to the border as Ben begrudgingly buys a necklace from a nearby vendor.

He eventually makes it back to America and heads up to Katie's party. After drinking a Budweiser, he eventually greets his daughter Katie, who's very different now. She has a tattoo and is smoking. Ben hands over the necklace he bought for 7 dollars as a present and eventually agrees to get involved in this family photo. It's obvious though that Ben is very much an outsider now (ironic given his previous job.)

After the festivities Ben makes it back to Mexico, and more specifically the café from before. There, he sees poverty first-hand but instead mentions borders being put up "for a reason."

On his way back, Ben finds a woman stowed away in the back-seat of his car. She pleads with him for help in heading back to the United States. He refuses to do so and instead takes her to the local police station. Unfortunately this is the wrong move as that same gang from before follow him up the road. They shoot his tyres and confront Ben about Maria being in his car.

The next day though, Maria shows up at Javi's caravan asking for help. As she passes out on the floor, Ben quickly calls Garrett and asks him to sort out asylum for the girl "by the book." Only, things take a turn for the worst when two Mexicans show up and knock Ben to the ground, clearly looking for Maria. This girl eventually shows her face and kills one of the men. Outside, she shoots the other one dead.

Realizing they're not safe, and seeing as Maria is now technically a murderer, Ben decides to leave the caravan with Maria. With police hot on their heels, they take a detour and head off along the hillside instead.

We then cut back to the present as Corre (going under the alias of Maria now) heads out into the wilderness with Ben. Unfortunately they get a flat tyre and are forced to walk 27 miles North to Bisbee. En-route, Ben leaves a voicemail for Garrett asking for help.

Back in town, Sylvia is confronted by Dante and his gang. It turns out Maria is pregnant and he's the Father, which explains why he's after her. Despite trying to teach Maria some English, three men riding motorbikes distract them as the duo are forced to continue on without leaving footprints.

Both Maria and Ben hide out and seize their opportunity to sabotage their bikes. Afterwards, the pair begin walking again through the desert where Maria encourages Ben to cover up his neck. Trigger happy Ben then shoots a beer can rattling in the wind, believing it to be a person.(what if this was just an innocent bystander?)

Anyway, the Mexican gang members notice the can and realize they're on the right path. They eventually fire some warning shots but despite there not being anywhere to go, Ben and Maria soldier on.

off with it prompting Ben to chase him up an alleyway.

Despite telling the boy to stop, as he puts his hand in his pocket, Ben shoots the boy in cold blood. It turns out he was trying to reach for his phone. Ben kills again. (That's five dead bodies on his watch now, for those who are keeping count!) Javi and Ben decide to frame the entire incident and make it so the boy fired on the officer first.

Back in the present, Ben awakens in Javi's caravan. Throwing on his clothes, he bags a lift into town from a minibus that rocks up. Unfortunately he's being watched by Diego's men and thinks twice about phoning home.

In Guerrero, Southern Mexico, we catch up with our bad guys at the Zamora Family Ranch. Eventually Ben comes to a decision and rings Frank anyway, asking for his help. Given he's mixed up with the "wrong people", Ben tells him he's in danger from the Sicarios who were filming Katie in the bedroom. After telling him not to go to the police, Ben tells Frank to get rid of his phone and take a plane up to Canada after paying for the tickets with cash.

Ben eventually leaves and heads up the road where he finds all the Mexicans mourning the two men he murdered. Ben is completely incredulous to the event though as he runs into Sylvia. He tells her to leave and get out of town but instead she shifts the blame to America, especially given they are the ones who are buying up all the drugs. Anyway, the pair head back to her café where Silvia hands over money from the till for Ben to take.

When Ben heads home, he gets working on setting the foundations for the new house again... but not before another cheeky shot of Budweiser on the table! Frank phones and tells Ben he's on the plane out of town. On the back of this, Ben finds Javi's old gun stashed inside the caravan. This gun, if you remember, is the same one Ben and Javi planted on the poor Mexican they shot dead in the past.

Ben then holds a gun up to the police officer at the funeral and forces him to drive. Ben believes he's dirty and berates him for sending Maria back to the gang after asking for help.

It turns out Ben has a private jet ready and asks the officer to hand over his gun and wallet. As he gets onboard, the private jet flies up... and back down again into Dante's territory. He takes him up to see Diego at the vineyards and after some pleasant wine tasting, they walk together to a car that happens to hold Frank, tied up. He's not in Canada after all.

Frank sadly gets shot dead by Dante, much to Diego's annoyance. As the Mexicans walk away, Ben is told to wait for their call for his upcoming job. It looks like Ben won't be getting out of this situation any time soon!

The episode begins in Boyle Heights 2010 as police stop a trio of teens as they're graffitizing a wall. These crooked cops take them to a gang leader who begins beating them down. As we skip forward in time, we see that these boys are actually the same trio who are working for Juan Diego.

Back in the present, Diego, Dante and the others rock up in Guerrero, South Mexico where Dante is reacquainted with his old friend, Saulo. The acquaintances are short-lived though, especially when

Diego mentions trucks coming into Mexico. He forces Dante to hold a gun up to Saulo's head and encourages him to fire. While he doesn't pull the trigger, it does rattle his nephew enough to learn his lesson — never go above the chain of command.

Ben heads back to America and reaches the meeting point; the alleyway he killed the Mexican kid. Ben is none too happy but he doesn't get time to think this over as he's given a new job — to break Juan Doe out of detainment.

When Ben returns home, he finds Maria there waiting for him. Given Garrett didn't have anywhere else to take her, she's been hanging out at his apartment. As Ben doesn't speak Spanish, he tells Garrett to sort out alternate accommodation.

Unfortunately that's the least of Ben's problems when he learns Diego has sent his men up to keep an eye on him. First port of call — deal with Frank's car. With Ben supervising, he's forced to push Frank's car into the lake after taking out any identification.

He tells Dante no more games and brings him into the cartel business. Diego then takes Dante out trick or treating. When he comes back with candy, he and Damasco come to blows over the harsh life lessons he gives.

Back in the present, Ben leaves a note on the back of Holly's business card, presumably for Homeland Security. He then

heads up to the vineyard and talks to Damasco. He needs to go to San Diego and bring the guns back to him. In order to get permission, he needs to go through Diego.

Ben eventually heads up and speaks to Diego, asking for permission to take Frank's body back with him to give Katie and Jill closure. Diego refuses, although he does grant Ben permission to go back and see his family. Before that though, Diego introduces Ben to his whole family — including his cousin, Silvia.

Ben walks away, unhappy with Silvia given she's part of the family, and heads back to America. Jill is beside herself with worry and Ben tries to do his best to console her. Only, with Frank gone it's hard for Ben not to feel guilty. That guilt turns to suspicion though when Katie mentions Javi heading out with cement a while back, claiming the house was "nearly done."

Ben follows clues left behind from Javi to an abandoned warehouse. He manages to break in through the front gate, learning the combination for the lock from Javi's papers, and begins looking around. In fact, he finds a tunnel leading deep underground nestled in the middle of a broken down bus.

With shell casings lining the floor, Ben ditches the glass shards this time and just heads straight in. Unfortunately he comes across a locked steel door that just won't budge. However, what he does find is a bag holding a severed head. Is this Javi? Well, as he heads back up to the surface, Ben's held at gunpoint by Dante's righthand man.

It seems as if these tunnels lead straight into Mexico as Ben rocks up in front of Dante in the next scene. He mentions the gun shipment Javi was supposed to move and it gets Dante thinking, believing a coup is going down within the family. For now, he lets Ben go.

Ben Clemens is arrested when he shows up at the Border Patrol office and taken away in handcuffs. While this is going on, Dante approaches Damasco and asks about the guns. In fact he and Damasco butt heads over the guns, with Dante giving him an ultimatum — tell Diego about the guns or he will.

Back in the US, Ben eventually finds himself in the company of Holly. She questions him about the dead Mexican Sicarios, his hand in freeing a Mexican cartel boss and stealing a truck too. She has a lot of evidence against him but Ben claims not to have anything to do with the two dead ICE agents.

Anyway, he then offers himself up as an informant to help Holly take down the Mexicans. With Ben given a lifeline, the series ends on a cliffhanger...
