The episode starts with a man, Mr. Ferguson, running through the hospital hallway as Sam chases him. He tells Sam that he doesn't want to die on the table, and she tells him that Dr. Griffith is working on him and he'll be fine, he's one of the best. As she does this, Dr. Griffith pulls up in his car to the hospital. Sam tells him she had heart surgery and she was nervous too, showing her scar. Sam gets the man to walk back to his room.

Sam next enters the OR, stating he's prepped. Caleb, Lex, Joey, and Isan are also in there scrubbing in. Dr. Griffith walks in and brings the team down a bit

saying he sees a lot of "weaknesses" in them. He tells Sam she's supervising the doctors and she's above them in knowledge, rank, and skill and to act like it.

The team is working on the surgery, and Dr. Griffith changes something mid-surgery that would heavily impact the patient. Sam challenges him, and he brushes it off.

Caleb and Sam are in the elevator, and once the doors close we learn they are more than coworkers. Sam complains to him about Dr. Griffith, and she says she's going to take the offer to Cleveland. Sam then finds Dr. Griffith and she tells him she's made a decision about her future before she gets notified there's a 10-car pileup coming in. The doctors rush to where the patients are coming in. There's a man standing in the corner who looks suspicious. As Dr. Griffith is talking to another man, a gunshot is heard and Dr. Griffith drops to the ground when he's shot. This is where we see Sam call him "Dad" and runs to him. The episode next picks up six months later from the attack with Sam arriving at the hospital with a voiceover and states she steps up as interim chief. The Chief Medical Officer (and Sam's mother) also says she's earned it. We see Sam start to take over the department and go through the day.

Sam's in the elevator getting ready for her speech and meets Malcolm Kingsley, part of the family who is helping fund areas of the hospital... and who she just insulted without knowing saying these events are full of "boring, rich donors." The two walk to the event where Sam's mom arrives, saying her dad, Rob (Dr. Griffith's first name), also known as "Griff" is waking up. We find out he's been in a coma the entire time. Sam tells him she was promoted to the chief in his place.

Malcolm arrives in Sam's office to her playing the piano. Sam learns he works there as the new director of finance. Malcolm asks about her dad, and she says he's doing well. He says he's there if she needs to talk before leaving.

Next, we see Rob going through physical therapy as Sam's mom, Vivian, is there. He wants to get back into surgery, and she tells him he needs to be proctored and he's months away. He asks for Sam to do it and for Vivian to ask her. Sam agrees to supervise him.

Sam sees a patient, Julio, who seems to have an infection, and she notices he has a swollen lip. She asks him about it, but he refuses to answer. Next, we see the rest of the team giving updates on him and ask how he lost a tooth. His wife says, "trust me, he deserved it."

Rob "Griff" walks in, and Sam tells him his proctorship has not started yet. He gives his advice and keeps undermining Sam. He suggests Lupus, and Sam goes to order the test for them, but Griff says he already did. The results come back and it is indeed Lupus, making Griff right. Sam asks about the patient's tooth being knocked out and finds out that he cheated on his wife and she hit him.

As the team is talking about the sore, Griff is obnoxious and keeps overstepping Sam.

Next, Lex, Caleb, Joey, and Isan are out at a bar where Caleb says Griff will get his job back and Sam's helping him. Isan says to Caleb sarcastically that he should tell Sam that and that it will really help them get back together. The rest of the team gangs up on Caleb saying that he was her boyfriend and he knows how much Griff put her through. Caleb says she puts up with it for the same reason they all do, because he's the best.

Malcolm arrives in the lab to see Sam. Malcolm says he was going to ask her to dinner but he heard she doesn't leave the hospital so he'd have to visit her there. Sam gets a beep that her patient from earlier is coding.

The team reassembles to talk about Julio, and Sam and Griff are at odds again, this time with the team backing the procedure Griff wants to do. Sam tells Lex, who followed her, that they're missing something and the procedure is invasive. Lex tells her she's emotional and it's clouding her judgment. Sam tells Lex she thought her best friend would have her back.

Sam stares at the medical board and says they're looking in the wrong place. Sam shows that something else is going wrong and that Lupus doesn't go after muscle, the team realizes they're missing something.

Sam sits with Julio's wife and tells her she needs her help. The wife says that he came home from Rio with the sore on his lip and he confessed he cheated on her. Sam bursts into the breakroom where the team is saying there was a parasite that Rio de Janeiro had an uptick in. Sam diagnoses him with Chagas disease, and the Lupus diagnosis was just another symptom. Griff tells Sam it's too late and the family needs to say goodbye.

Sam confronts Griff, saying he needs to start respecting her. Griff says Sam needs him. The episode skips to Sam venting to Vivian about her dad. Sam says she hoped he changed but he hasn't. Vivian says something broke in him since the accident, but the accident she refers to sounds like a car accident which caused the need for Sam to have heart surgery.

Sam arrives at Lex's house to apologize and brings wine. Lex is acting weird, and Sam asks if she has company. Lex says she wanted to tell her and that it started before the shooting... and Griff enters from around the corner. Lex says "we" should have told you, before correcting herself and saying "I" and that there is no "we." Griff tries to interrupt, but Sam leaves and tells him to find someone else to proctor him.

Vivian and Griff are talking, and Vivian says she has to uphold the chain of command and she can't force Sam to proctor him. Vivian scolds him for being with Lex, and that she's Sam's best friend. Vivian tells him to make it right with Sam and to be her father. Vivian ends up taking his badge.Sam goes into a meeting with the team and differs from her father and lists all of the good things about them, including calling Lex a brilliant doctor who she needs on this team. Sam is not giving up on Julio and is doing everything she can to save him. Caleb asks about second chances, and Sam giving him one. He's interrupted because they received a notification for a transplant for Julio. The team goes into surgery to complete the transplant, and they realize the heart is too small.

As Griff is leaving, Vivian calls him and he goes into the OR as Sam asks him about the heart. Sam asks about a surgery that's rare but that Griff has done. She asks him to talk her through it. Griff suits up and talks her through the surgery. They wait a second and then they see the heart start to beat, completing a successful transplant.

Afterward, Sam goes to see Griff who is staring out of the hospital windows. The two talk, and they have a tough conversation about Griff not being there for Sam.

Sam wants griff to see a mental health professional to rule out PTSD, but Griff is afraid Tina Kingsley will find out. The solution? They go to Sam's stepdad, Pyne — someone they can trust. Griff doesn't want to talk about his feelings about the shooting, but Pyne keeps digging. Pyne asks about how Sam felt after Griff's shooting, and she talks about knowing what it's like to feel helpless, comparing it to Griff's situation in

her childhood accident.

Little by little, we finally get a little more information on Sam's childhood accident in a flashback. After the accident, Griff never made it through the door of her surgery, and he felt helpless and carried lots of guilt. Griff is still blaming himself for Sam's accident. Pyne doesn't think the shooting is causing Griff's symptoms, but he can't rule out that Sam's accident didn't. He wants to talk to him more, but Griff doesn't want to. Pyne threatens that he'll have to submit a referral for a mental health evaluation if he's seeming unfit to perform duties, trying to get him to continue to unpack his trauma.

Vivian finds out Tina is raising questions about griffs competency and gets upset with him, imploring him to go to therapy and figure out what's going on. She tries to convince him to go to therapy and tell Sam what REALLY happened concerning the accident — whatever that means. He refuses and storms out.

Convinced by Sam eventually, they go to therapy. What really happened and is messing Griff up inside is revealed. In a flashback, we see Vivian kept Griff from going into the hospital after the accident... because Griff was drunk. Sam, visibly upset that Vivian knew and that neither of them ever told her anything, abruptly leaves.

In another therapy session with Pyne, Griff reveals that's why he's been sabotaging his and Sam's relationship, the guilt he was feeling due to keeping that secret from her, and due to his actions. He was self-sabotaging their relationship as a form of penance.

Tina Kingsley is breathing down the Griffith's necks. She's scouting new candidates for the chief job and poking around to see what's up with Griff, as she doesn't believe he's ready to return as chief after watching him drop that scalpel last episode. Cue Malcolm.

Vivian apologizes to Malcolm for using him to pitch the clinic proposal to his dad. Malcolm is still invested in the idea though, so he wants to go around his dad and pitch it to his mom. Vivian is wary, knowing it'll stir up drama, but Malcolm is adamant. He goes to Tina, who knows she's only being asked because his dad said no. She agrees to help him if he finds out what Griff is hiding since he and Sam are officially over. It doesn't go over very well when he inquires; Sam sees right through him, citing he's never asked about Griff before.

In exchange for completing this favor, Tina digs into why Lakeshore doesn't want to approve the proposal: the land Malcolm and Vivan want to build on would be expensive. She offers to help him out by giving him some land she owns downtown and tells him to work on a new proposal.

Malcolm and Sam confront each other in the elevator. Malcolm says he's not doing Tina's dirty work; he's the one wondering if Griff is truly okay and fit to work. He tells Sam that if Tina's worried, she won't be the only one asking questions about Griff's competency.

Byron is upset when he learns of Malcolm going behind his back. He can't believe Malcolm is acting like he forgot everything Tina put them through. Malcolm states he wouldn't have had to go around him if he had heard him out and should be proud of him for getting the land and moving towards closing the deal. Byron says it won't come without a price and angrily storms out.

Donna has a raffle of goodies from a gift basket that was sent to the surgical team as a thank you. The contest? Guess how many tongue depressors are in a jar. Donna suggests Sam bid in order to win a couples massage that was in the basket, but Sam informs her she'd need to be a part of a couple to do that. Caleb and Sam have a short and earnest but stilted conversation about her and Malcolm breaking up, Sam teasing that Caleb's not actually sorry about it though he says he is. She says she's not ready to confront Caleb's feelings just yet.

After the events of the revelatory family therapy session with Pyne, Sam seeks out Caleb to tell him his method of helping others didn't take her out of her head like she thought it would. She said she needs something... stronger. Caleb catches her drift and tells her to lock the door even though Sam tells him she can't get emotionally involved. The two begin to kiss passionately before the screen cuts out.

Amy, a patient who's three years sober, comes in talking about feeling ill and claims a previous doctor told her she needed a bypass. She randomly feels ill and starts throwing up blood. During a procedure to fix her gastrointestinal issues, they see that her liver is failing. They assume that this is due to alcohol use. Caleb wants to be there to help Amy, saying helping others is a way for him to focus on staying sober. Her sister Gretchen denies that Amy's been drinking, but Amy seems inebriated as everyone is discussing what could be wrong. Gretchen pulls a breathalyzer out her purse which reads as .09 after Amy blows into it. She storms out, saying that with all she supported Amy through, she could deal with a relapse, but not any more lies. Still seeming rather inebriated, Amy insists she hasn't been drinking and tries to go after her, but Caleb and Sam stop her. She's obviously in physical and emotional in pain as she's lowered back into the bed).

A stray comment Caleb makes about winning a bottle of Cristal in the raffle and how they still ferment it the same way as they did when the brand was founded leads Sam to realize any probably has auto-brewery syndrome; Amy's stomach could be turning sugary and starchy foods into alcohol. Amy is getting progressively drunker (BAC up to .11) despite being on watch and not drinking. The team orders an endoscopy. Before the procedure, Amy gets rowdy and triggers Griff's symptoms of tinnitus and light sensitivity. Sam tells him again he needs to go to therapy, comparing Griff to a patient not taking their medicine. Amy's sister comes back.

The results reveal the culprit isn't endogenous fermentation. Caleb wants to start her on antifungals to rule out some other possibilities. It works and it's confirmed that Amy was infected with candida, a fungal yeast that was causing the fermentation inside her body. Caleb goes to tell Sam and discovers her angrily playing piano after finding out about Griff and Vivian's secret in therapy. He wants her to go with him to deliver the good news to Amy and refuses to leave until she agrees.

Dr. Shah still isn't confident since his patient's death earlier in the season and it's showing during rounds. He's answering questions slowly or not at all even though he's studied, succumbing to self-doubt. On a neuro rotation, an Indian patient requests Isan, who believes it's because the patient thinks he speaks Hindi. In the surgery, in which the patient is still awake — the doctors are mapping the brain, testing boundaries of speech areas on the brain for a later excision procedure —, the patient tells Isan he requested him because Isan reassured him and was kind when he was nervous. That's the kind of doctor he wanted in his surgery. Isan catches the patient's lip twitching and tells the neurosurgeon she's reached the patient's boundary of speech on the brain, a critical discovery so that his functioning won't be impaired later on. The patient offers to teach him Hindi phrases as he keeps talking so they can continue to map the brain. Dr. Shah's confidence seems restored.

The tumor is successfully removed. The patient thanks Isan for helping him. In turn, Dr. Shah thanks him for helping restore his confidence through a rough patch.

To help, Caleb has Sam pretend that he is her dad, and after some convincing, she agrees. She gets all of her anger out, and it's not just on her dad but also her mom. She doesn't like that Vivian covered for him after the accident and kept this secret from Sam for

20 years.

Sam has yet to talk to Vivian, especially since she's still at a conference, and Sam is ignoring her calls. In the ER, Sam tells Lex that she doesn't know if she'll be able to get over the DUIs, and Griff hiding it from her for so long.

Griff tries to talk Sam into talking to Vivian, but she'd rather not. However, amid a storm, Sam can't get a hold of her. She's worried and pissed off at the same time.

Meanwhile, Griff tries to help out in trauma, but Sam wants him to get supplies since he's still in treatment for PTSD. She can't advance his proctorship until he completes his solo surgery. Sam won't budge. Griff apologizes to Sam but she still won't listen to him.

The chaos begins in the ER as a kid, Kevin, is brought in after getting hit by a bus that skid off the road. Unfortunately, Kevin isn't the only one to come into the ER thanks to said bus. It crashed after it hit him, and there are more passengers than there are rooms. Thanks to the storms, there are not enough people to help, and the crash was during a shift change.

From the crash, a woman, Carla, is brought in, and she is not happy. Her fistula for her dialysis was damaged, and it doesn't help that she missed the last three sessions due to her

grandson being born. Meanwhile, Dorothy, the bus driver, is also brought in with some glass in her knuckles and a contusion from the steering wheel. After finding a femur fracture, Sam and Lex reduce it manually, but Dorothy did not react to the pain.

When Lex walks past Carla, Carla tells Lex that she should be in jail for attempted homicide. Though not Lex, Dorothy. Carla mentions that roads have nothing to do with Dorothy's driving. She was asleep at the wheel. Sam and Lex have no idea what's wrong with Dorothy, but they find an Air Force tattoo and suggest she has head trauma. In truth, Dorothy has bipolar disorder.

Joey and Lex are at a crossroads when Joey's patient needs water for dialysis, and Lex's has massive pelvic bleeding. Lex suggests Joey use the water tanks in the wellness center, and he will figure out how to sterilize it since it's just like heart surgery.

While Joey is able to get Carla water for her dialysis, Lex discovers that all of Dorothy's tests are negative, except for a pregnancy test. Just as Lex is about to do an ultrasound to find out what's really going on with her, she goes into hemorrhagic shock. And they are running short on blood.

Meanwhile, Carla's heart is starving for oxygen because she waited too long.

CT is backed up so Kevin is unable to get to imaging. Kevin's parents are on the phone, who are stranded at a deli. Kevin says that his chest hurts and when Sam listens to his heartbeat, there's nothing. Sam checks his pulse and it's there. When Griff listens, they both figure it's Dextrocardia. His heart is on the wrong side of his chest.

With the thoracostamy, Kevin's heart is shifting back to his left side. But because of it, his arteries became tangled and he's going to need surgery. Kevin doesn't want to have heart surgery, he wants to go home. Just as Griff gets ready to walk his parents through the procedure, the Wi-Fi goes out because of the storm.

Griff keeps Kevin company and talks to him about the surgery and dying and at first, Griff says that he won't do the surgery. But it makes Kevin give in and tell him he won't die. Griff gives in himself.

Sam and Griff disagree on a solution for Kevin, and they settle on repairing the dissection with a dacron graft since it'll be a shorter procedure and a lower risk, with most of the valve will be repaired. But Sam will be prepared for anything.

A state of emergency is declared, and all roads are closed. So not only are they short on staff, they will soon run short on blood. Sam figures they have to start allocating their resources according to need. Every elective surgery in the OR is canceled, and Sam gets an inventory at the blood bank. They will not quit until the storm does.

Sam goes upstairs to the overflow and it's crowded. Donna's not alone however, since Malcolm is helping out. Malcolm asks if she needs any help and Sam mentions the blood shortage.

Blood and staff are not the only things the hospital falls short of. Soon, the pipes are discovered to have frozen over.

Thanks to the bridge collapse, blood has to be rationed since no one can deliver more. Malcolm comes up with the brilliant plan that there are blood donors in the hospital — a blood drive. Caleb volunteers to help, and they all get to work.

Kevin wakes up from his surgery, still in the OR since the power is still out. Sam finds Griff in the OR with Kevin, who stayed there all night, and the power finally comes back on. Griff doesn't know exactly why he pushed her away, but maybe it was because he was punishing himself.

Griff says that Kevin had a tough night, but Sam was never that alone. He begs his daughter to talk to Vivian.

Dorothy is now fine and had a teratoma that caused her brain issues. She blames herself for the accident, but Lex tells her it was not her fault.

hospital as well as him. She informs him she doesn't want his reputation tarnished; she wants him to leave quietly. Her stake in Griff saying siyonara? It will make the hospital easier to sell ... come again?

After some digging, Malcolm and Byron, who's returned, discover the sale is contingent upon Dr. Jack Hendricks, an unknown cardiothoracic surgeon, being implemented as the chief of CT. Something's not adding up. Rumors about Jack Hendricks and the hospital sale start circulating around, and everyone is on edge.

Griff does some digging, and Vivian tells Sam about Dr. Hendricks ... who is very much a nobody. Never having practiced in the state and running a department a third of the size of Lakeshore's, it seems that the equity company looking to buy is run by the doc's aunt. Ah, good ole fashioned nepotism. Vivian and Sam make plans to tell Malcolm.

Malcolm confronts Tina, who seems more concerned about getting revenge on Byron for allegedly shorting her in the divorce settlement than looking out for the hospital employees and mending her relationship with Malcolm. Storming out, Malcolm runs into Caleb, who's looking for Sam. After Caleb asks if an obviously distressed Malcolm's okay, Malcolm blows up on him, stating they're not friends — revenge for Caleb blowing up on him after interrupting a conversation with Sam, perhaps.

When Malcolm recounts his conversation with his mom to Sam, Sam is understandably shocked and wonders if Tina's lying about her reasons. The two reasons that she could be getting some sort of kickback payment for brokering the sale and plan to dig to find evidence.

Malcolm finds that Tina's been getting "consultant fees" for all of her sales help, and running the money through the foundation in order to hide it to boot. Malcolm brings it to Byron. Malcolm apologizes for not trusting Byron and letting him down, but Byron says he's proud of Malcolm for being a good man who sees the good in others. He didn't let him down by thinking Tina could change. They plan to try and stop the sale.

At the board meeting, after Byron discloses Tina's involvement, the board votes to decline the sale and take disciplinary action against Tina at a later date. The meeting starts to adjourn, but in comes Griff, just having heard a conversation from Sam talking about how keeping his secret was negatively impacting her life. He tells the board how Tina was able to put the deal in motion — by lording his secret over his head. As Sam and Vivian watch in awe and something akin to horror, Griff tells the board about his DUI to free his family of the pressures the secret has put on them.

Malcolm and Sam cheer each other up with a wholesome conversation about how the crazy events of the day went. Sam goes to see Caleb, who was one of many putting out feelers for a new job in the event of a sale and had been contact be Harvard Memorial for recruitment. He asks Sam if she was even concerned that he was thinking about moving halfway across the country. She isn't ready to weigh in on his life-changing decision like he wasn't ready to in the very first episode before Griff was shot. The two part frustrated, and Caleb applies for the Boston Memorial job.

Griff and Vivian celebrate stopping the sale and Griff coming clean with the board with a drink. Vivian says that day, Griff was acting like the man she married, not the one she divorced. Griff jokes about hoping his key card to the hospital works in the morning. Vivian takes his glass and tells him they should worry about tomorrow tomorrow. The two gravitate towards each other before falling together, sharing a passionate kiss. Lex sees everything through the window, obviously shocked and distressed, before the screen goes black.

Joey has reverted to early-seasons Dr. Costa in terms of the toxicly competitive attitude he was sporting. He's bitter about Tim cheating and channeling his anger into beating out Isan since the events of the last episode. Speaking of Joey and Isan, the two residents are bumping heads in a major way, with conflict at every turn. It comes to a head after an argument as the two start grappling before being separated by Sam. Fussing at the pair, Sam makes it clear the pair are going to work together on this case, as she's not losing another resident.

Despite this, the two continue to fight, with Joey making comments about Isan's patient dying on the table and Isan making comments about Joey's failing relationship. Isan is worried about the possible sale of the hospital, with Joey having put in his head that other places won't take him in the wake of his patient's passing.

The two continue to fight, culminating in Sam laying into them when they start arguing in the OR, threatening to kick them out of the surgery and her program if they keep it up.

Returning to the ER for her second day after transferring her specialty to trauma, Lex finds herself working with the big boss, Dr. Nicholas Vega, an abrupt man who knocks her down a peg after she questions him in the heat of the moment during an emergency procedure. Vega makes her fill out the patient's discharge paperwork, and right as he leaves, he collapses outside. Vega blames her.

Back in the ER, Lex catches that the patient has swollen ankles and thinks it might be heart disease. They wheel him up to imaging. Dr. Kace stands up for Lex, telling Vega that she respects the hierarchy and just wants to help. The patient passes out in the scanner. Lex rushes to help him. Back in the ER bay, the patient passes out again when a woman walks past with a crying baby. Lex theorizes loud sounds are triggering extreme vertigo in the man and causing vasovagal syncope. The first time he passed out, it was around their newborn grandchild; the second, after hearing a piercing ambulance siren. The problem appears to be in his ear. They discover a small bone in the man's ear is eroded and call for an ENT. He's going to be fine.

After leaving the patient, Vega talks about having a mentor early in his career that made snarky comments about needing praise and didn't dole out praise very often. Lex comments that it sounded like Griff to which Vega confirms it was. But Griff called and recommended Lex with high praise. Vega tells Lex if she's half as good as Griff says, she'll make it in trauma.

Lex seems to have mixed feelings. She's grateful to Griff but is still going to lay into him when she gets off shift. Lex thanks Kace for helping her get through her shift. He asks for her help in return, revealing HE was the guy Tim hooked up with.

Chloe, a young woman with cystic fibrosis, is getting a living lung transplant (a lobe) from her long-time neighbor and friend, Yolanda. However, during pre-op procedures, the team notices Yolanda has a fever, meaning they can't operate. Chloe is worried she won't get her transplant. Later Yolanda's fever has gone down ... too much. She's hypothermic.

Meanwhile, Chloe has to be put on a vent, which she's terrified of, as most CF patients don't come off it once they get on. Caleb and Sam try and troubleshoot what's causing Yolanda's symptoms. The only "risky" thing she's done lately is make out with a guy she didn't know at a party her roommates threw for her when they found out about the lung transplant match. Yolanda has a seizure. They've ruled out mono and MRSA and plan to check for STDs and meningitis. Isan and Joey are still fighting while taking care of the patient, and Sam is fed up.

After Yolanda sneaks into Chloe's room, the team learns from a guilt-fueled monologue that Yolanda took ecstasy at the party — something that wouldn't show up on a regular tox screen. Thinking the MDMA withdrawal has led to serotonin syndrome, the team sets out to run some tests and hopefully get the surgery back on track.

In surgery, while transferring the lung lobe, Isan and Joey get into it again, and Sam finally lays into them both, threatening to kick them out of her rotation and the ER. Isan also realizes the rumors about Dr. Hendricks were true after a stray comment from Griff and storms out, saying Sam lied to him.

Scrubbing out, Griff overhears Sam telling Caleb that lying is her new normal, between covering up the sale from Dr. Shah and keeping Griff's secret. Cue him storming into the board room and starting the cascade of events disclosed above. The surgery is ultimately successful.

Lex tells Griff that they are over because she saw him with Vivian. Griff tries to explain himself, but Lex won't hear it. Sam tries to get Griff to tell her what's wrong with Lex, but he pushes it off like he doesn't know. But he's more so asking her to keep personal and professional separate.

Unfortunately, Asher puts two-and-two together from two empty wine glasses, and the guilty look on Vivian's face and figures that she and Griff spent the night together. News slowly spreads and reaches Donna, who tells a very curious Caleb and Joey.

When Sam catches up with Joey and Caleb, it's clear that there is something wrong. Joey tells her that Griff shouldn't be chief because they are not following him after what he did to Lex. They both are hesitant to tell Sam, and after a quick look at Donna, who returns it, we cut to Sam confronting her parents.

Sam tells Griff that the residents don't want to follow him since he hurt their friend, but given that Sam is still technically the chief, Griff tells her she should get them in line. Vivian tries to

explain to her daughter after Griff leaves, but Sam cares about helping her mother professionally, considering Lex did not deserve this.

Griff later admits to Lex that what they had was good and he blew it.

Lex doubled down on them and it cost her her friendship. She says she's the one who blew it. Asher confronts Griff and tells him he shouldn't have slept with his wife. He's spent enough time with Griff to know what's behind those walls. He knows the truth. He knows what Griff really is; a petty, weak, insecure "little man clinging onto things he has already lost."

The hospital board has made their decision on Griff and the accident, and he is cleared. There was no disciplinary action against him, considering he was not on shift; there was no arrest or police records. No need for further action. Unfortunately, the relief doesn't last long.

Vivian gets a call from the board as they have been discussing her role in the accident since she was on duty that night. When she took the paramedic's report, Vivian violated her terms of employment. They are required to take action. Vivian has been relieved of her duties as CMO.

The board is set to formally review the case at the next staffing session in a few months. Griff offers to call Byron to see where he stands on this, and Sam volunteers to gather signatures and letters from every department head in the hospital. Now that Griff's proctorship is done, Sam says he can run the department since the vote is next week and it's about to be official.

The board makes one more decision, and that is revoking Tina Kingsley's seat. Her replacement? Malcolm. He knows the place, the finances. He told them it should be him, and the board agreed. Malcolm's first order of business is helping Sam get her mother back. If he can finally get the clinic approved, he needs Vivian to see it through. Sam happily gives Malcolm the letters she got on her mom's behalf to give to the board.

The board will hear Vivian's case on the condition that the interim CMO signs off on her appeal. The interim CMO being Rhonda, who was gunning for Vivian's job. Sam asks for Rhonda's help, but she is less than willing. She says that Vivian abused her power for too long. It's time for a change.

Griff doesn't take long to transition back into his old position, telling Caleb to prepare for rounds instead of "reclining like a renaissance nude." Sam tries to call Isan, who took a personal day, and Griff snatches the phone from her and tells him that if he doesn't want to be there, there's a long line of people waiting to take his place.

Lex comes in and tells Griff that he doesn't care about people's feelings. The new chief is the same as the old chief.

Griff is using his chief powers to good use as he bumped a patient to the front of the line for radiology. Something even Sam never did.

After word gets out about Griff and Vivian, Joey and Caleb don't want to work with him. Following the confrontation with her parents, Sam tells the residents that her father hears their concerns and that he hopes that they can put aside their personal differences and respect his authority "for the greater good." When Sam sees that they are still not on the same page, she sends Joey down to the ER so he can keep an eye out for Lex in case she needs someone to talk to.

Kace is worried about Tim and Joey's relationship, regretting the time he spent with Tim since he didn't know they were together. Lex doesn't want to get in the middle of this, but knowing what happened doesn't help.

Now with Joey in the ER to keep an eye on Lex, Joey makes it his mission to find out who Tim cheated with. Lex tries to tell him that knowing who Griff cheated with doesn't help, but Joey says it'll help him. Since Tim told him it happened at a work party, Joey starts to investigate and round up a list of suspects.

After needing a CT consult for a patient, Griff is the one who comes down to the ER, much to Lex's dismay. As if that wasn't enough, Joey finds out that Kace is the one who Tim cheated with. Joey takes Kace's stethoscope since it's something that belongs to him, and Lex takes it from him and gives it back to Kace. Kace thinks that Lex told him and Joey feels betrayed knowing that she knew. Joey tells Lex that he's just as evil as Kace is, but Griff tries to defend her. Lex doesn't like him defending her. Griff clears his throat, and Vega is standing by the counter, seeing it all go down. He kicks Joey out of the ER and he tells Griff where the patient is.

The next schedule comes out, and Lex is not very happy with it. She tells Vega that was not her drama he saw, though she was able to keep her personal life in check. And if he had any idea how hard that was, he might appreciate that she still gave it everything she had. Lex is now back on nights, and after hearing her out, Vega asks for her preference and tells her that Kace can have nights.

Caleb finally tells Sam about him applying for Harbor Memorial after a doctor who works there comes out to interview him for the residency program. He admits that it feels like they're going backwards with Griff in charge again.

After getting some solid (and punny) advice from Malcolm, Sam realizes she needs to change things instead of waiting for them to change. Unfortunately, Caleb takes that same advice and asks Sam for a letter of recommendation for the Boston job. He and Sam are likely over.

It was a successful day for Sam after doing a surgery involving the Griffith technique, and Rhonda wants her to do interviews for medical journals. In return, Rhonda will talk to the board about Vivian. Griff doesn't like the fact that she's stealing his technique like she stole his job. Things are never going to change unless Sam changes them. She tells Griff she's taking the department back.

Sam visits Lex with a bottle of wine to be there for her friend. Their friendship would have never gotten stronger if it wasn't for him. They sit and talk and sip wine and listen to Sam's interview like the two best friends they have always been.

Meanwhile, Joey finds Tim sleeping in the ambulance, still not knowing what to do. He closes the doors and admits that he's still angry. However, he immediately starts making out with Tim.

Griff listens to Sam's interview, her officially deciding to take back the department, and he throws a glass towards the camera.

Tanya White comes in with shortness of breath and she gets tired easily. Sam comments on Tanya's painted nails, and she mentions that underneath, they look like they're dirty even when they're clean. Griff asks if she has cracked nails, and she does. Sam tells her that what looks like dirt could be something called "splinter hemorrhages." Debris thrown from inside the heart that collects in the extremities, usually caused by a mass.

After taking Tanya to imaging, it's found out she has atrial myxoma. Also known as the Loch Ness monster of tumors. The tumor is getting riskier to remove, so Griff suggests the Griffith technique. A theory about a technique. Cryoablation, liquid nitrogen. It kills the tumor while avoiding the risk of taking away too much tissue. It's never been done, so Caleb figures they can try to replicate the surgery in a virtual environment to do many trials.

Griff has yet to master the Griffth technique, though the pressure might be on after he talked to a medical journal about the patient. Sam tells her father that he is the problem. The department is falling apart. Griff tells Sam that she stepped aside because he is the better chief. And what he says goes.

Tanya's tumor grows even more to block her tricuspid valve, and it's going to keep growing unless they get it out of there. While in surgery, Sam decides to go with the Griffith technique instead of the traditional procedure, as she was able to master it a few times in the SIM lab. And it's a success.

Brian Jenkins, an 11-year-old with blunt chest trauma after a skateboarding accident, is brought in. Brian's brother, Cameron, tells Lex and Kace that he wasn't skateboarding but instead either running or climbing. His heart rate is spiking, and whatever happened, it did not come from climbing a fence.

After the LV fails to work, Vega has no choice but to take Brian to surgery. Lex tells Cameron and their mother that out of all the kids they see, his brother is the only one she's ever seen without so much as a scraped knee. She doesn't think Brian fell. She knows Cameron is trying to look out for Brian, and she bets that's hard with their dad gone. But she needs him to tell her what happened.

Turns out the boys were vaping, and Cameron thought Brian was having an allergic reaction. He has a genetic condition. Vega's running tests to confirm, but Lex thinks it's what killed their father. Griff puts Brian on a temporary assist until his heart recovers.


