Summary: After lifelong best friends Hap and Leonard lose their jobs, a seductive figure from Hap's past resurfaces with a shadowy plan to score some major cash. Meanwhile, a menacing pair descends upon the duo's hometown.



In 1968 Texas, a pair of wounded bank robbers tear down a highway in a car full of cash, police cars in hot pursuit. The getaway driver steers off the road and manages to shake the cops, but accidentally plunges the car into a river. One of the robbers manages to escape the sinking vehicle before succumbing to his injuries and passing out as cops close in.

Twenty years later, Hap Collins and Leonard Pine trade friendly banter while working as rose-field pickers before their

boss informs them they've been laid off. After Leonard blows off steam uprooting a few rose-bushes, the two pals go grocery shopping, stretching their limited funds and food stamps as far as possible.

Hap and Leonard's skeet shooting session is interrupted by the unexpected arrival of Trudy Fawst, Hap's ex-wife. Leonard warns Hap not to let her break his heart again before she greets the men. Hap invites Trudy inside for coffee and reminds her that she "gave [Leonard] hell" for enlisting to fight in Vietnam. Trudy seduces Hap and they go to bed together.

The next morning, Hap and Leonard spar with boxing gloves until Leonard lays Hap out with a roundhouse kick. Hap reveals to Leonard that Trudy has asked him to join her in recovering the lost money from the river seen in the opening flashback. Trudy is unhappy that Hap brought Leonard in on the deal without asking her, but explains the plan: her most recent husband, Howard, was incarcerated for environmental terrorism. While there, Howard met the surviving bank robber from the flashback, who told him the money's approximate location and offered to split it fifty-fifty. The robber was killed in prison.

A police officer drops off Leonard's cantankerous and homophobic Uncle Chester, who calls Leonard an offensive slur on the ride home. When Hap has Chester alone for a moment, he warns the old man not to denigrate his nephew's sexuality again.

When Chester finds his home vandalized by young neighbors, Leonard beats the largest member of the group, warning the men to leave Chester be.

Hap and Leonard stock up on weaponry and speculate about Howard's motives.

Hap, Leonard and Trudy drive to the compound where Howard is squatting. They're greeted by Howard's henchman Chub.

Trudy introduces Howard to the guys and explains Leonard's presence (as well as his potential value as a trained military diver). Howard is friendly but both men are put off by their host's hippy-dippy, overly familiar manner. The team's final member, the intimidating, heavily-scarred Paco, introduces himself as well.

Howard bores Hap and Leonard with a lecture on the evils of the capitalist establishment, trying to talk Hap into chipping his share into an unspecified idealistic venture. Hap declines and the exchange gets heated, with Hap mockingly holding the unspoken fact of the previous night's intimacy with Trudy over Howard's head. Howard throws Hap for a loop by revealing that Trudy already told him about the encounter and that he himself doesn't believe in sexual possessiveness. A disgusted Hap twists Howard's arm behind his back violently til Howard cries uncle.

Hap drives out to a roadside in the middle of the night and recalls a childhood memory: his father pulling over to help an African-American motorist stranded with car problems in heavy rain.

A policeman approaches a sporty car parked inexplicably in an empty lot, blasting disco music. The passenger, Soldier, unnerves the officer from the get-go, and when the sounds of muffled struggling come from the trunk the cop orders Soldier out of the car at gunpoint. Soldier's partner, Angel, sneaks up behind the cop and slits his throat. As the officer bleeds out, Soldier tells him, "I'm looking for a man named Paco."

Summary: Enticed by Trudy, Hap and Leonard begin their search for the lost loot with new compatriots Howard, Chub and Paco. Leonard receives distressing news about his Uncle Chester.



A pair of kids out hunting scare each other with ghost stories before stumbling upon the mutilated corpse of the policeman Angel killed behind some trash cans. The boys run off, screaming.

Hap wakes Leonard at the crack of dawn, hoping to slip out to the river and track down the sunken car before the rest of the crew gets up. Howard, Paco and Chub surprise the pair by returning from an early morning jog and Howard insists on his men accompanying Hap and

Leonard to the river.

A traveling bible salesman shows up at Howard's compound, entering through the gates Hap accidentally left open. Paco throws him out.

The team heads out toward the river, but Paco turns Howard's van around to find an alternate route after spotting a police roadblock ahead. Chub explains that Paco is a fugitive, wanted for his involvement in "the Mechanics", an unusually violent ecoterrorist group.

When they reach the riverside, Hap and Paco and Leonard and Chub split up into pairs (at Paco's insistence) to search for possible routes to the water. Leonard abandons Chub after getting fed up with the man's ham-fisted comments on Leonard's race and sexual orientation.

Meanwhile, Hap tells Paco he knows he wasn't just any old terrorist, but rather the famed leader of the Mechanics, thought to have been killed during a bombing. Leonard catches up with the two and the group doubles back to help Chub out of a pit of mud, laughing at the mess.

Trudy encounters Soldier and Angel while working at the diner. Soldier picks up a glass of water for Trudy after a rude patron intentionally knocks it to the floor, but unnerves her with his unnaturally cheery demeanor.

Having dinner back at the compound, Howard complains about Hap and company's failure to find the bridge that marks the cash's location. Trudy defends Hap, pointing out that he's only been searching for a day.

Leonard's Uncle Chester suffers a heart attack at home alone.

Hap reveals to Leonard what Howard's sources didn't realize: the bridge isn't over the river itself, but rather at a nearby tributary creek. The pair get up even earlier the next morning and set out for the creek alone. After hacking their way through the overgrown woods, Hap and Leonard find the bridge, but discover that whatever body of water once ran underneath has long since completely dried up.

Leonard gets word of Chester's condition and heads back home. Hap and Trudy bid him good luck. Leonard visits Chester in the hospital but finds him unconscious. He flashes back to a childhood memory: Chester comforting him as a boy with the body of Leonard's father being wheeled off in a body bag. Returning home, Leonard is joined by a sympathetic ex-boyfriend who keeps him company for the night.

Meanwhile, Trudy tells Hap she's a few steps ahead of both him and Howard on the sunken car, having realized that a decade-past flood shifted the course of the river and its tributary and pinpointing the treasure's possible location. The two exes head out on their own in the middle of the night and search the water from a boat.

Howard wakes up, looking for Trudy, and discovers the revised map.

Hap catches a license plate on a fishing hook, implying that the car is just below. As Trudy and Hap celebrate, their boat is attacked by a large alligator. The pair panic, swim for the shore and run for their lives. They make passionate love in the woods once the chase is over.

Summary: As the group closes in on the stolen money, Hap, Leonard and Trudy revisit their pasts. Loyalties are tested within the gang during a fateful gathering at Leonard's house.



In a flashback to the Vietnam era, a younger Trudy watches Hap open the induction letter drafting him into the military and asks him what it is.

In the present, Howard, Paco and Chub discover Hap and Trudy sleeping on the riverbank and wonder aloud if the pair planned to recover the money alone. When the two wake, Howard brandishes the fished-up license plate and asks where the sunken car is.

Back in town, Leonard reluctantly accepts the care and cooking of his ex, Raoul.

Meanwhile Howard tries to sell Hap on his plan to use the cash as start-up money to fund an activist group. When Trudy appeals to his humanitarianism, Hap seems to consider the idea.

After they argue, Raoul tells Leonard that he cared for Chester while Leonard was away and discovered that the old man was subsisting on cat food.

Hap calls Leonard to tell him they need him for his diving abilities... and his guns, in case of more gator encounters.

Hap and Trudy briefly flirt, reminiscing over the previous night, before Leonard shows up.

Hap and Leonard take off for the river. On the way, Leonard lectures an obviously nostalgic Hap on the foolishness of potentially reawakening his youthful idealism. Hap remembers meeting with a recruitment officer who warned him he'd end up in prison if he refused to serve, move to Canada, or become a conscientious objector.

The guys find their way impeded by a police roadblock. Hap places a call reporting suspicious characters in a nearby lot and the cops clear out to investigate, opening the path.

An apparently single woman returns to her home and cats to find Angel and Soldier lying in wait. Angel beats the woman to death with her telephone while Soldier explains that the pair just needed a place to hide out... and that Angel, whom he calls his girlfriend, "just loves kitties." Soldier and Angel make out over their victim's corpse.

Leonard dives while Hap stands guard with a rifle in a boat. After Leonard resurfaces from an unsuccessful attempt, Hap explains his interest in Howard's ideas and then makes a dive of his own.

Under water, Hap seems to hallucinate yellow birds flying by as he swims. The less experienced diver is so startled when he discovers a corpse inside the car at the river bottom that he inhales water. Up on the surface, Leonard grows antsy as Hap seems to take too long to emerge. When a gator skims the surface Leonard panics, readying his gun and shouting for Hap.

Unconscious, Hap flashes back to Trudy encouraging him to make a statement by going to prison for his beliefs and promising to publicize his sacrifice.

Leonard rescues Hap, who reveals he found the car. Back at the compound the gang celebrate and, seeing that Angel and Soldier's latest murder will drawing even more police attention to the area within the day, decide to go back out for the money that night.

Several members of the gang dive and eventually Leonard finds the lockbox. Returning home, they find that the bible salesman Paco turned away has tipped off the police about their presence and the compound is surrounded by cops. Hap volunteers Leonard's house as a temporary hide-out much to his partner's chagrin.

The gang celebrates more by sharing some joints as Paco and Howard crowbar the boxes open. Hap flashes back once again to his declaration of intent to refuse to serve and resulting imprisonment.

After indulging in a few puffs of a joint, Hap tells Trudy he's decided he doesn't want to join the cause after all.

Paco and Howard discover that one of the boxes has leaked, ruining its contents and cutting their haul in half.

Paco, Howard and Chub confront Hap and Leonard at gunpoint and tell them they're keeping all the cash.

Summary: After counting the money, the gang discovers there's not enough for their cause. Paco suggests buying cocaine in bulk to flip so they set off to meet Paco's drug dealer, which leads them to an abandoned office where an unexpected duo await.



In a flashback, Trudy tries to pen a letter to Hap in prison but gives up. She attempts to free the pet bird the couple once shared, but when it declines to fly out the window she drowns the little pet in the sink.

In the present day, Howard apologizes to Hap and Leonard for the deception, explaining that he and the others really didn't plan on cutting the pair out but discussed the option as a back-up plan in case the haul was smaller than expected.

Hap asks if Trudy knew about the plan and she confirms that she did it for the cause.

Howard and his men force Hap to dig a hole at gunpoint and buries the money. While Chub guards Hap and Leonard, he lets slip that the gang plans to spend the money on a large quantity of cocaine. Leonard's outraged reaction draws the rest of the gang in, at which point they defend their plan. Hap and Leonard mock the gang's naivety until Howard gets frustrated enough to duct-tape the two together and leave them outside.

Trudy confides to Howard that she has started second-guessing the plan. Howard reassures her that they should stay the course.

A visibly upset Chub tries to apologize to Hap and Leonard but Leonard rejects his sympathy and tells him that his collaborators don't respect him. Hap asks Chub if he and Leonard are going to be killed. Chub claims that Howard said they were to be released the next day, but Paco ends the conversation by telling Chub to beat it.

In a flashback Trudy finally writes to Hap in prison, telling him she's moved to San Francisco and joined an activist group, praising him for his sacrifice and telling him she still loves him. Attached to the letter: divorce papers.

Trudy visits Hap outside and defends her deception, pointing out that she gave him every possible opportunity to join the cause instead of making himself and Leonard its enemies.

The next morning, Hap and Leonard wake to find Chub snoring behind his shotgun. The two sneak off the porch, still duct-taped together in a pair of lawnchairs, but Paco quickly foils the escape, sitting guard on the lawn nearby.

The gang takes Hap and Leonard along on their big coke buy, no longer trusting Chub to watch over them on his own. On the way, Trudy and Howard reveal that they've only brought

\$5,000 as a "deposit", since they don't yet know if they can trust the dealers. A horrified Paco insists they go back for the full amount, pointing out that the funny business could lead to violence. Trudy and Howard stay firm and the gang continues on to an abandoned warehouse.

Angel meets the gang out front and welcomes them inside, where Soldier is waiting. Soldier puts the gang on edge with his psychotic demeanor and purposely antagonizes Chub when he defends Leonard against Soldier's casual racism. As Chub gets agitated and the scene gets increasingly tense, Paco surprises everyone by blowing Chub's brains out. Paco reveals that there was no actual drug deal planned: he was working with Soldier from the beginning, planning to rip Howard, Trudy and Chub off. Soldier threatens to kill the whole gang unless they take him to the money and shoots Howard in the foot on a whim to prove he's serious.

On the ride over, Soldier harasses Trudy, interrogating her as to which member of the gang she's sleeping with. Paco tells Soldier she's been with both Hap and Howard and that Leonard is gay. Soldier seems delighted by all the information and continues to harass Trudy until she snaps at him. Soldier gets deadly serious and sticks the gun in Trudy's face, but she refuses to plead or cower. Howard tries to convince Soldier not to hurt her. A police roadblock appears up ahead.

Soldier seems to be trying to pass Howard's obvious injury off as an accident and tell the cops the gang's on the way to the hospital. When an officer asks Paco for his license and registration, however, Soldier, Paco and Angel ruthlessly execute the police and drive on.

Summary: Soldier and Angel force Leonard to dig up the money but a surprise awaits them; Trudy stands her ground while Hap and Leonard seek a way out.



In a flashback, a young Hap attends an amateur minstrel show with his father before coming across the stranded black motorist stuck in the rain (shown in a previous flashback). Hap's father reluctantly gets out to help get the other man's car running. A passing driver swerves dangerously toward the side of the road while Hap watches, with his dad tinkering under the stalled car.

Back at Leonard's, Soldier orders the gang out of Howard's van. Trudy tries to appeal to Paco's loyalty but he immediately reveals the money's location. Soldier makes Leonard dig the box up. Everyone is surprised to find it empty. Soldier threatens Howard, demanding to know what happened to the cash. Eventually Trudy can't take it any more and admits she moved the money.

Soldier takes Trudy aside and offers her the \$5,000 "deposit" back along with her freedom in exchange for the money's location. She scatters the money to the wind in defiance. Soldier asks Angel to make him some breakfast before he starts torturing Trudy.

Soldier mocks the group's idealism and tries to demand the information from Trudy verbally once more. She remains defiant despite Hap and Howard's pleas, even as Soldier and Angel prepare to nail one of her hands to Leonard's kitchen table.

Soldier drives a nail through Trudy's hand. She screams. Hap leaps up but is quickly stopped by Leonard. Trudy sobs but continues to refuse to talk.

Hap warns Soldier that torturing her won't work. Howard agrees, and suggests torturing Hap instead. Soldier gives Howard the hammer and tells him to hit Hap in the mouth with it as hard as he can. With Trudy continuing to refuse to talk, Howard reluctantly takes a swing. Leonard catches Howard's arm and stops the blow.

Hap screams out that he knows where the money is, having spotted a clue on Trudy the previous night. Hap assures Soldier he can lead him to the cash and, convinced, Soldier executes Howard.

Hap and Leonard lead Soldier and Angel to Leonard's dog pens, Hap claiming he spotted the animals' crap on Trudy's shoes. Hap lets a dog out, ostensibly to start digging up the pen, and Leonard sics the well-trained attack dog on Soldier before striking Angel with a shovel. The pair

flee into the woods, still handcuffed together, as Soldier and Angel fire shots after them. Each takes a bullet in the side but they don't slow down.

Meanwhile, Trudy manages to loosen the nail from the table through excruciating effort and surprises Paco standing guard. She drives the nail, still stuck in her hand, into Paco's remaining eye, blinding him, and the two fight in Leonard's kitchen. Trudy takes a few hits but ultimately forces Paco onto the gas range and lights the stove.

Out in the woods, Hap and Leonard hear Trudy scream. Hap insists on going back and an extremely reluctant Leonard consents.

Paco runs out of Leonard's house blind and engulfed in flames. Soldier shoots Paco dead.

Angel breaks into the house through a window, surprising Trudy, and starts dragging her outside. Hap and Leonard show up at the last second and shoots Angel in the neck with Paco's crossbow. Soldier sends a spray of bullets through the window and hits Leonard in the stomach.

Hap removes the nail from Trudy's hand.

Outside, Soldier removes the arrow from Angel's neck and comforts her with visions of their future living off the loot in Acapulco.

Inside all realize that they need to get the gut-shot Leonard to the hospital as soon as possible. With the phone lines cut by Soldier and Hap chained to Leonard, Trudy is the only hope of getting help.

Trudy recovers the keys from Howard's body and makes it to the van, Soldier and Angel nowhere to be found. As soon as she starts the van, Soldier emerges and starts firing at it. Trudy speeds away from the house and manages to escape as Soldier screams in rage.

Summary: Hap and Leonard must fend for themselves; Trudy makes a confession to Hap; Hap makes a discovery.



Hap looks through the wreckage of Leonard's house and commiserates with one of Leonard's dogs, saying he misses Leonard too.

Hap threatens a canvasser off of Leonard's property when the young man tries to plant some signs for local politician Beau Otis's campaign.

Flashing back to the end of last episode, Soldier taunts Hap and Leonard, still in siege inside the house. He kills some of Leonard's dogs, which briefly re-

duces Leonard to tears, then tests the mens' faith by theorizing that Trudy's probably on her way to Mexico, having betrayed Hap once again.

While Soldier distracts Hap and Leonard with a speech about Eskimos, Angel sneaks back inside, throat bandaged, and tries to kill Hap and Leonard with an axe. Though she comes close, Leonard ultimately manages to snap her neck. As Hap and Leonard celebrates, Soldier shoots Hap in the shoulder.

Soldier enters the house, kisses Angel's dead body while drawing a second handgun. He corners Hap and Leonard in the workshop, but at the last second all hear a car speeding toward the house. Soldier turns in the vehicle's direction, firing wildly, but Trudy crashes through the wall in the van and hits Soldier, seriously injuring the criminal.

Trudy reveals that she, too, has been shot in the shoulder region. Hap levels a gun at Soldier but ultimately decides not to kill him. As Soldier mocks Hap's reticence, Trudy pulls a gun of her own and shoots Soldier dead.

Hap and Trudy help Leonard into the van and the three hit the road. On the way, Trudy tearfully confesses that she killed their pet bird, hoping to exorcise his haunting presence, but that it didn't work and that she still loves him. Looking back, Trudy finds Hap and Leonard both out cold. Shortly thereafter she slips into unconsciousness herself, from exhaustion or blood loss, and the van gently drifts off the road into the woods.

Some time after that, Hap half-awakens in a hospital bed to a vision of Trudy, looking angelic in a crown of flowers and a white dress. She kisses him and bids him goodbye before leaving the hospital with another man, also in wedding-wear, whose face is not shown.

Revisiting his childhood flashback once more, a young Hap watches a driver crash into the car his father is working on in the rainstorm and mortally injure his dad. Hap races out to see what's happened. In the backseat of the stranded motorist's car, a young Leonard looks out in horror and meets Hap's eyes.

In the present, Hap watches over Leonard as he wakes for the first time in days. Hap tells Leonard that Trudy disappeared and he didn't find the money.

FBI agents question Hap about the carnage and ask him to give them a call if he hears anything that might lead to the money. Hap plays it cool and agrees.

Back at Leonard's, Hap searches every nook and cranny. After discovering some shreds of cash in Leonard's surviving dog's droppings, Hap finds the money hidden in a bag of dog food and contemplates the FBI agent's business card.

Hap divides the cash, hiding half of it inside one of Leonard's country records (a box set) and mailing the other half to a children's charity in Trudy's name.

Hap visits Leonard again but finds his friend asleep with Raoul watching over him. Raoul tells Hap to leave Leonard alone for a while for the sake of Leonard's health. Hap agrees and asks Raoul to give Leonard the box set.

Continuing Hap's childhood flashback, police let the young driver who caused the accident off because of his powerful father's local influence. The boy's name: Beau Otis. The young Hap brings the young Leonard comic books and candy, gifted from sympathetic cops, to share.

In the present, Leonard surprises Hap by showing up at his house. Leonard thanks Hap for the "records" and Hap reveals that he's working the rose fields once again.

Leonard tells Hap his uncle has died and asks him to accompany him to the funeral. As the pair walk away from the coffin, Leonard tells Hap he's the only family he's got left.

Hap and Leonard visit Leonard's uncle's apartment and find it stuffed with the late hoarder's possessions. They decide to spend the night and go over Uncle Chester's property in the morning. The two look forward to "no more drama for a while."

As Hap and Leonard fall asleep, we sink down beneath Chester's floorboards to reveal a human skeleton sprawled on the ground in the basement.

At Uncle Chester's house, where Leonard now lives, Leonard sees his neighbor, Melton, urinating on his rose bush. He punches Melton and urinates on him. MeMaw, the neighborhood matriarch, laughs at the scuffle from her porch.

Back inside, a floorboard buckles under Leonard's weight. Leonard peers through the hole in the floor and discovers the boy's skeleton.

Leonard calls Hap over to his house and shows him the body. They crawl under the house to investigate. Leonard picks up the boy's red sneaker and sees the letters "B.B." written in marker. Hap urges Leonard to report the dead body to police. Leonard refuses.

A boy named Ivan breaks into Hap's car and steals Trudy's ashes. Hap chases Ivan through the neighborhood. Ivan tosses the box into a passing garbage truck. Leonard chases the garbage truck down and retrieves the ashes.

Officer Sneed nabs Ivan but Hap decides to let Ivan go. Leonard reluctantly tells Sneed about the dead body.

That night, police swarm Leonard's house and remove the body. Hap and Leonard watch the police activity from MeMaw's porch across the street. Sheriff Valentine Otis arrives on the scene and speaks with Detective Charlie Blank. Detective Blank asks Hap and Leonard to come to the station.

Down the street, a man watches watches from a van then drives to a remote shack. Inside are newspaper clippings of missing kids, including that of a 12-year-old boy.

Sheriff Valentine watches as police photograph the body at the station.

Detective Marvin Hanson interrogates Leonard about Uncle Chester while Detective Blank questions Hap in a separate room. Leonard and Hap eat breakfast with McMaw and her other grandson, Reverend James Fitzgerald, a pastor. Leonard and Rev. Fitzgerald have a tense discussion about homosexuality in the Bible.

Leonard returns home and finds Ivan staggering down his stairs. Ivan collapses.

Someone nabs Ivan in the street.

Melton picks Leonard from a police lineup and identifies him as the man he saw with Chester.

At the station, Florida tells Leonard that he's a suspect in the boy's murder

and asks where Leonard was on the night of Sep. 9, 1986. Hap guesses that Melton is Leonard's accuser.

In the lobby of the police station, a group of black women clamors for an update on the dead boy. Officer Peg tells the women, who are all mothers of missing boys, that investigators are still trying to identify the body.

Hap and Florida speak to the mothers and learn that Chester already questioned them about the boys' disappearances. Afterwards at a bar, Florida wonders if Chester was a child predator.

Hap drunkenly returns to the station and tries to sweet-talk Officer Peg into letting him see Leonard. She orders him to leave.

Officer Sneed beats Leonard in an interrogation room and asks if Leonard and Chester liked little boys. Detective Hanson discovers them and orders Officer Sneed to stop.

Hap stops by Sunday services at New Hope Church, knowing that Florida is in attendance. Reverend Fitzgerald welcomes Hap.

Raul checks on Leonard's wounds at the hospital while Detective Hanson guards him.

Reverend Fitzgerald speaks to his congregation about police negligence in the missing boy cases. Sheriff Valentine, accompanied by his son, Beau Otis, drops by and promises to seek justice for the dead boy. Afterwards, Otis hands out campaign materials to congregants. Hap refuses to shake Otis's hand.

At the station, the man who took the lunchbox from Leonard's house distributes books to prisoners. He places pennies and salt around Leonard's cell to offer voodoo protection and hands Leonard a book that Leonard instantly recognizes from his childhood. Leonard finds a petrified chicken foot inside the book.

At Leonard's arraignment, Otis denies Leonard bail and sets a trial date without hearing Florida's entire defense. Florida threatens to report Officer Sneed's assault but Otis says Leonard's injuries were officially due to a "fall."

Hap corners Otis in the men's room and tells him that his father and Leonard's father were killed by Otis in a drunken incident years ago. He presumes that Sheriff Valentine paid someone off to conceal the accident and threatens to expose Otis's secret if he doesn't grant Leonard bail.

At the diner, Hap and Florida beg Leonard to skip town until everything blows over. Leonard insists on clearing Chester's name but eventually agrees.

Hap packs food for Leonard at his house and notices pennies on the window sills. Upstairs, Leonard finds his broken cowboy figurine and decides to continue his investigation instead of skipping town. When Hap brings the pennies to Leonard's attention, Leonard remembers the man from jail. Florida recognizes the man as Illium Moon.

Hap and Leonard drive to Illium's house and find Illium waiting for them.

Melton holds Ivan prisoner in his attic. He orders Ivan to return to Leonard's house and plant a cigar box inside a mattress.

Illium tells Hap and Leonard that he found the dead boy's body in his pond but didn't kill him. Hap asks Illium to tell the police that Leonard is innocent. Illium refuses to talk to the police but agrees to let Hap and Leonard investigate his pond the following day. Illium gives Leonard the lunchbox, which contains items from Chester's investigation: newspaper clippings, a journal filled with names of missing boys and a necklace with the initials "B.B."

Back home, Leonard finds Ivan watching TV in his living room. Ivan refuses to divulge where he's been. He retreats to his room and removes the cigar box from his mattress.

On McMaw's porch, Hap informs Florida that Chester and Illium were investigating the missing children together. He adds that Leonard has an alibi for the night of the boy's murder: a double feature that they both attended at a movie theater. Florida doubts whether they can prove the alibi.

Worried that Hap will bring police to his home, Illium flees his shack in the middle of the night. He hallucinates the dead boy while driving and veers off the road, straight into his pond.

and his van to the bottom of the pond. They discover the iron gate that was used to anchor the dead boy's body, with the boy's skeleton hands dangling off the gate. Hap and Leonard stow the gate at Fernie's.

Florida confronts Beau Otis at the diner and insists he recuse himself from Leonard's case, given his history with Leonard. Otis refuses.

Hap pores over Uncle Chester's evidence in the missing boy cases.

Detective Hanson shows up at Leonard's house with a search warrant as Leonard and Ivan eat breakfast. Ivan sneaks out of the house and tosses the cigar box onto Melton's roof. Officer Sneed and Melton see Ivan flee.

Leonard visits with MeMaw while police search his house.

Florida urges Hap to speak with Illium again, but Hap implies that Illium can no longer help with the case.

Hap stops by MeMaw's house to take Leonard to Cooperstown.

Florida tells Detective Hanson that Illium Moon, not Leonard, was Uncle Chester's associate. Detective Hanson agrees to consider her evidence.

As they drive to Cooperstown, Hap explains to Leonard that four of the missing boys' names began with B and that they all lived in Cooperstown. Hap suggests they look for a fence without a gate. Ivan pops out of hiding after falling asleep in the truck flatbed. He offers to take them to the gate.

Florida and Detective Hanson look for Illium at his shack. Detective Hanson finds Illium's water-logged book by the pond and guesses that Illium is dead.

Ivan leads Hap and Leonard through the streets of Cooperstown. A group of concerned Cooperstown women tracks their movement, worried for Ivan's safety.

Ivan takes Hap and Leonard to the wrong gate. They turn their focus on interviewing the missing boys' mothers. As they make their way back through the neighborhood, the women surround them and take Ivan under their wing.

The Cooperstown women take Hap and Leonard to Stella, the community leader, at her salon. Hap explains that they're investigating the dead boys and shows her a photo of the gate. Stella instantly recognizes it and shows them an old wedding photo of her grandparents, Pastor Moody and Daisy, standing beside their church — right next to the gate. Stella cries for her dead son. Hap comforts her.

Leonard drops Hap off at the garage then drives to a supermarket with Ivan. Leonard guesses that Ivan ran away from home and urges him to go back.

Otis stops by Fernie's and orders Hap to check his oil and fill his gas tank. He guzzles beer and threatens Hap for meddling in Leonard's case. Hap quietly punctures Otis's radiator hose.

Leonard leaves Ivan in the car while he shops. When he returns, Ivan is gone.

Otis waits on a deserted roadside after his radiator busts. Hap arrives in a tow truck and menaces Otis with a crow bar. Otis keels over from a seizure. He later flees while Hap fixes his car.

At the diner, Sheriff Valentine warns Florida to watch her step, along with Hap and Leonard.

Leonard barges in on Officer Sneed as he takes a bath at home. He threatens to electrocute Sneed unless he tells him where Ivan is. Sneed says he took Ivan to Melton's house and admits that Sheriff Valentine asked his department to pin the boy's murder on Leonard. Sheriff Valentine meets with Hap and offers to release him and Leonard if Hap

promises to forget the past and leave Otis alone.

Leonard tells Detectives Hanson and Blank that he did not burn Melton's house to the ground. Leonard points out that they still haven't figured out who took the dead boy's shoes.

Leonard joins Hap outside the station. They ruefully agree it would be best to end their investigation.

Hap asks Florida why she didn't show up to represent him at the police station. Florida coolly explains that she can't help clients who've burned down a house and assaulted a county judge.

In the bathroom, Hap fantasizes about Florida kissing him.

At home, MeMaw snaps a Polaroid photo of Leonard and Ivan then asks Leonard to place the photo on her wall. Leonard sees the 1928 photo of Pastor Moody and his Sunday school class — including MeMaw as a girl — standing by the same gate he and Hap found in the lake where Illium died.

Leonard asks MeMaw about the photo, which he learns was taken at the Old Hope Church. MeMaw explains that the KKK burned the church down the day after the photo was taken. Leonard asks MeMaw where the church was located but MeMaw does not remember.

Hanson and Blank sneak into the morgue to re-examine B.B.'s body. They hear a noise.

Sheriff Valentine secretly places the red shoes in B.B.'s body bag then tells the coroner to send the body to the crematorium. Hanson and Blank witness the exchange from an adjacent room.

Hap loads the gate onto his truck at the garage and suddenly recognizes an angel symbol on the gate. He goes to the New Hope Church and spots an identical angel symbol in a stained-glass window.

Hap stops by a New Hope boxing fundraiser to ask congregants if the church ever had a fence around it. Reverend Fitzgerald invites Hap to spar with him. From the ring, Hap notices a boy wearing a "New Hope Boxing Club" sweatshirt. Reverend Fitzgerald knocks him out.

Leonard researches the Old Hope Church at the library and tracks down the address. Meanwhile, Hap asks congregants if they know where the Old Hope Church was located. They point toward the location.

Hap and Leonard visit the ruins of the old church. In the basement, they discover a room of pine caskets containing dead boys — each casket marked with years dating back to 1977. From MeMaw's window, Leonard sees Officer Sneed watching his house from the street. Leonard orders Ivan to stay with MeMaw while he and Hap go to the carnival.

TJ drives past Officer Sneed with Hap and Leonard hiding in the back seat.

Hap and Leonard join a crowd of carnies while the carnival boss hands out work assignments. Hap and Leonard get assigned to cleaning duty.

Hap and Leonard study the carnies in search of potential killers. Hap gets tackled by Judy, a contortionist and an old flame. She invites them to eat lunch with her.

At the lunch tent, Hap and Leonard notice that the cook, Brick, has a 13-stripe tattoo on his arm. They surmise that the 13 stripes represent the 13 dead boys. Leonard makes eye contact with Brick.

Hap tells Judy that they're looking for a carnival employee who is hurting children. Judy offers to steal her boss's employee files.

Leonard sneaks into Brick's trailer.

In her trailer, Judy presents Hap with a box of files on every carnival employee. She tries to entice Hap into sex but he gently turns her down.

Brick finds Leonard snooping around his trailer and comes onto Leonard. Leonard keeps him at bay by asking about his tattoo. Brick explains that the stripes represent his years of sobriety and points to more stripes on his leg.

Ivan sneaks out of McMaw's house to attend the carnival.

Florida looks for Hap at Fernie's Garage then breaks into the stock room. Hanson and Blank follow her to the garage and see her enter the stock room. Inside, Florida discovers the news clippings and photos from Hap and Leonard's investigation. Hanson and Blank follow her inside and presume from all the evidence that Hap is the killer. Hanson orders an all-points bulletin on Hap.

At the carnival, Sneed shows photos of Hap and Leonard to the carnival boss. The boss tells Sneed that Hap and Leonard are at the carnival. Meanwhile, Reverend Fitzgerald arrives at the carnival with a bus load of church kids, including Ivan.

Hanson and Blank dispatch a team of cops to find Hap at the carnival.

In Judy's trailer, Hap shows Leonard the files of nine potential suspects. Feeling overwhelmed, they decide to call the cops for help.

Hanson, Blank and Florida search for Hap at the carnival.

Leonard warns Reverend Fitzgerald that something bad is about to happen. The Reverend asks Leonard to help gather the kids and meet him by the stage.

Florida finds Hap and warns him that the police are looking for him. They hide in the Monkey Maze. Hap tells Florida that they found 13 dead boys at the old church and that he and Leonard are looking for the killer. Hap locks her in a room to prevent her from telling Hanson about their discovery.

Reverend Fitzgerald tells Leonard that Ivan is missing. Leonard runs off to find Ivan.

Hap finds Leonard and informs him that the cops are looking for him. Leonard refuses to abandon Ivan and continues his search.

Reverend Fitzgerald tells Leonard that one of the kids saw Ivan getting into a car in the parking lot. Hap predicts that the killer is taking Ivan to the crypt. Hanson and Blank corner Hap. Leonard gallops up on a horse and escapes with Hap on horseback.

Hap and Leonard arrive at the old Hope Church and find TJ standing by a car. TJ tells them Ivan is in the car and is "going to be in heaven real soon." Reverend Fitzgerald sneaks up with a gun and confesses to killing boys who he has deemed are "lost souls." Hap grabs the gun from Reverend Fitzgerald. TJ attacks Hap on the reverend's orders. Hanson, Blank, Florida and a host of cops arrive. Reverend Fitzgerald shoots himself. Blank shoots TJ dead.

Leonard rouses Ivan in the car.

Florida and Hanson watch as police uncover the bodies in the crypt. Hanson comforts Florida and leads her out of the crypt. Outside, Florida punches Hap for locking her up.

The next morning, Hanson pulls up to McMaw's house to deliver the bad news. Leonard insists on telling her himself.

Leonard tries to console McMaw in her dining room. She cries then quietly dies in her chair. Meanwhile, a news reporter on McMaw's television announces that Judge Beau Otis won his reelection bid.

At the funeral, Sheriff Valentine mourns the dead boys and offers his sym-

pathies to the congregation. He thanks the police for solving the case.

Outside, Stella thanks Hap and Leonard and assures them that everyone in the community knows it was them, not the police, who solved the case. Hap watches as Hanson escorts Florida to her car and kisses her.

Leonard returns home to find Raul waiting with Ivan's father. Ivan tells Leonard he decided to go back to his family. Leonard gives Ivan his cowboy hat as a parting gift. After Ivan leaves, Raul kisses Leonard.

Florida packs up MeMaw's belongings. When Hap asks why things didn't work out between them, she admits she always saw herself with a black man. Florida comments on the black angel figurines that TJ painted every autumn for the Feast of Archangels. Hap realizes the angels represent the dead boys and counts 14 figurines — leaving B.B. unaccounted for.

At home, Chester's spirit tells Leonard that his work isn't over. Hap runs in and tells Leonard that Reverend Fitzgerald didn't kill B.B.

Hanson strides into Sheriff Valentine's office and places B.B.'s red shoes on the desk. He demands an explanation.

Hap and Leonard visit Detective Blank at home to ask what happened to B.B.'s red shoes.

Hap and Leonard stake out Sheriff Valentine's house, determined to prove that he killed B.B. They follow Sheriff Valentine in his car.

Hap and Leonard observe Sheriff Valentine as he watches boys play catch at a baseball diamond. They sneer with disgust at the sheriff's seemingly predatory nature and follow him to his next destination.

Hap and Leonard sit at the Armadillo Diner while Sheriff Valentine eats at the counter. The sheriff confronts them about being followed but insists they all learn to get along. He invites them to a party at his house and leaves. As Miriam serves tea to Hap and Leonard, they notice a B.B. necklace around her neck.

Hap and Leonard visit Miriam at home and show her the B.B. necklace from the boy's body. Miriam breaks down in tears and screams for her dead boy. Inside, Miriam tells Hap and Leonard that B.B. had been missing for two years. Leonard sees a photo of B.B. in a tree near the old church. Miriam says it was his "hideaway." Sheriff Valentine screams at Beau, who finally admits he killed B.B. because he was jealous. Sheriff Valentine pushes Beau into an empty swimming pool, killing him.

Hap picks up Leonard in his freshly painted truck. They return the iron gate to the Old Hope Church and drive off. The ghosts of B.B., McMaw and the dead Sunday school children watch them leave.

Down the road, a woman hangs KKK robes on a clothes line. A noose swings from a tree in her yard.

Perfectly hilarious conversation follows.

"You think bear dicks get swelled up in a knot like dog dicks do?"

"I don't know, Cletus. I never finished my degree on bear dicks."

"Oh, Hap, stop lyin'. Now you're just being modest."

When Dt. Hanson turns up, he tells Hap he's worried about Florida. She's gone down to Grovetown, and he's getting suspicious. Things seem strange. Florida sounded scared when she called Hanson on the phone. And where's this headed? The cop wants Mr. Collins to go looking for her, seeing as how he's back with his wife again. "This ain't police business," Hanson tells Hap. Plus, it'll help get Leonard out of a cell.

When Leonard gets home he finds an intruder in his house; two, in fact. They were guarding the crack house. Good thing they've got pizza, or Mr. Pine might not have been so careful with the cleaver he picked up to use for self defence. Things work out well now that Leonard needs somebody to watch HIS place while he and Hap go off on their latest job.

Bad dreams. In a motel, Hap wakes and immediately he's on edge. He nearly puts a bullet in Dt. Charlie Blank. Lucky these two are buddies, or else that could've really caused some shit. Hap mentions Sneed was down in Grovetown, too.

When Hap and Leonard found their car spray painted and beat to shit it was none other than Sneed who showed up on the call. Officer Sneed has Officer Reynolds with him. Neither of them are too concerned with the racist hate on the car. And no matter how bad Hap wants to make it an issue, sadly Leonard knows they should let it go for now.

In Grovetown, things are real nasty. We see an old man called Bacon called in to work on the dead body of a young black man. They tell the old man he's "your kind," and so nobody else wants to work on him. No autopsy done, either. No need, they say. More like they don't care enough.

At a local radio station, Sonny Knox hosts his show and rambles to his listeners. He gets a visit from Hap and Leonard inquiring about Ms. Grange. Florida had come down to work on a deal with the grandson of L.C. Soothe, Bobby Joe; the young lad found a "long lost" recording Soothe. However, Bobby Joe turned up hanged from a bridge, and Florida hasn't been seen since. Oh, and that house that burned down where the boys met the Chief? That was Sonny's place.

If it weren't for Hap's quick talk there might be more trouble at the diner when they stop to eat. He manages to convince people at the counter that he and Leonard are actually exterminators, and Leonard's name is "Dr. Macumba." Hilarious moment as they both play along.

After the diner, the boys find their little bike's being dragged behind a truck. They hop into the back. But soon the men inside stop and attack. Hap and Leonard are able to kick a good deal of ass instead of being shotgunned or beaten to death with a baseball bat. Merry Christmas, assholes!

Dt. Hanson is driving behind a truck full of Christmas trees when a tarp flies off, sending him into the trees. Nearby, a sole frog croaks on the road. Just like the one we saw the Devil caress in the first episode of Season 3. 'Cause the Devil, he's a-watching.

Skip to Hap in bed next to Florida, waking up to one another as it rains lightly outside; a romantic, beautiful moment. "I thought I'd lost you," he tells her smiling. But it's just another dream. He's not physically close to Florida, yet Hap

will remain spiritually close to her, perhaps forever. And those dreams, they become waking nightmares, as well. On top of it, he has Officer Reynolds sniffing around with her racist and homophobic ass. She has a thing for him, verging on sexual harassment. Either way, the cop is taking Hap to meet the Christmas tree kingpin of East Texas, and head of the local Ku Klux Klan, Truman Brown.

Leonard is off on his own, down on the South Side of town looking for information — set to the fine music of Sister Wynona Carr. In the meantime, the guys watching his place are jamming to Frankie Smith's "Double Dutch Bus" while perfecting a few dance moves.

On the South Side, Leonard finds a church. He goes to see Bacon and they have a frank, tough conversation about what they each came back to after their respective tours of duty — Leonard in Vietnam, Bacon in various places in Europe during WWII. Unfortunately, the old man believes the Klan has killed Florida.

At the Christmas tree farm, Truman discusses the "problems" Hap seems to have brought with him down to Grovetown. He talks about Florida stirring things up there, and Hap doesn't

take any of it lying down. Brown is an unabashed racist, whose whiteness clashes hard with that of Hap's, whose life has revolved around equality, in various ways. Stark contrast of two men who grew up in the same places, and how two people such as that can diverge so widely. Hap understands that racists are simply trying to tear the place apart, they aren't concerned with building anything back up; they just don't want the current system because it involves non-whites. A nasty fact of this world.

Over at the police station, Hap goes to see Chief Cantuck about Brown and his gang, believing they killed Soothe, and then Florida, too. It's not exactly easy to try getting the Chief to listen, he's another casual racist believing he's upholding the law when he's only serving to perpetuate the damage of whiteness against people of colour — "Just racist enough to turn the other way."

We get a bit more info on Belinda. She disappeared a while, then returned from out of the woods. She wanders around town a good bit, and she doesn't talk anymore, either. Hap wonders if she might know things about Grovetown; important things. Hap and Leonard meet up again, and the latter tells his buddy Bacon did see Florida at a place called Blind Tillie's before she disappeared. At the same time, later in the night, the Chief heads up to the Brown farm where he starts poking around. Is there a possible hope that this old white man might come around? Or is he a totally lost cause? He does at least tell Truman: "You ain't above the law."

At Blind Tillie's, Hap stays outside, as Bacon takes Leonard inside where rhythm and blues play loud and proud. Before heading inside Hap gets a visit from Belinda, and she has a lipstick belonging to Ms. Grange.

When the music slows, Blind Tillie herself sits around with Hap, Bacon, and Leonard chatting about what she knows of Florida. She saw the woman in her bar. But nothing much else, except she was looking for those Soothe tapes. Tillie's sure that Grovetown has all the answers, behind the ugly, racist curtain.

On the road, Hap and Leonard are crashed into by a truck. They wind up next to the railroad tracks, jammed up against a moving train. They manage to get out, but the Brown gang are firing rifles at them as they run through the woods. Truman is determined to solve his problems with more violence.

They go back to the police station, and the cops automatically assume it was Soothe who attacked her. There's a sweetness buried inside Sneed; deep,

deep down, under a lot of racist bullshit. But he's not a good man, yet.

Meanwhile, Bobby Joe's left dealing with Reynolds, whose racism is even more overt, and twice as ugly. Best thing about Reynolds is she's this superficially pretty blonde lady, and underneath she is a rotten, hideous white supremacist. She, and others like her, are proof the nastiest things come in pretty pleasant packaging.

Out in the woods at the present moment in time, Hap and Leonard are fumbling around in the woods. They've run up on the Brown farm. Not a great place to be, y'know, considering Truman is the head of the Ku Klux Klan in Grovetown. They head on out, then tumble into a ravine. It's there they find Florida's car covered in leaves, hidden away. Not a good sign.

They find her purse, and inside is a tape recorder; its contents don't point to anything positive. It's more than likely, sadly, Florida was killed. Still, Hap and Leonard push on, listening to more of the tape.

A nice cut takes us to Florida herself. She's over to see Sonny Knox about the Soothe recordings. They're waiting for Bobby, who'll likely not turn up because he's being hanged. In the meantime, Sonny thinks he's doing well with Florida, even after referring to "CP time" (a.k.a. coloured people time) and then talking about being an "endangered species" as a Jew in the South as compared to a black woman in the South. A crack up of a scene, for all the wrong reasons.

Later, Florida calls Dt. Hanson, asking if he'll contact the Grovetown PD in case something's happened to young Soothe. He warns her about how things are down there, and asks her to leave. Of course, she refuses. She sits for a cup of coffee in the diner just as Truman shows up as disgusting as ever. This is right about the time Bobby Joe's found hanging from the bridge.

Florida goes to the scene, telling the cops this is a "federal case" seeing as how a black man's been strung up. You can bet that Chief Cantuck doesn't have much time for her. She keeps pressing, knowing he didn't commit suicide. Bobby Joe's body is beaten, he was clearly tied up, and it's obvious there was foul play. Beyond obvious. Cantuck clearly lied to Hap and Leonard concerning what he knew about Florida. With the pair now listening to Florida's secret tapes, they're discovering more and more.

Jump back again. Florida goes over to see Tim Garner, so she can see Bobby Joe's room, and get her own for the evening. She has a look through Soothe's things, finding the L.C. recordings gone. Over at the diner, she runs into Belinda, where she gives the girl her lipstick. She also runs into Truman, too. He tries to casually run her out of there, and Florida stands her ground as a lawyer and a black woman. Afterwards, she's literally driven to the edge of town by the cops, as well as Cantuck. An official escort out of town. She also lets the Chief know she knows it was him who took the tapes from Bobby Joe's room.

So, if Florida left town, what happened? She didn't leave, she turned right around and went back into Grovetown. She had Tim drive her around in his truck, undercover. She's waiting to see if someone will try selling the recordings to Knox. When she goes over to the radio station, it's a mess, and Sonny's had the shit kicked out of him. Cleavon from Blind Tillie's was there looking for the tapes, because he's owed money by Soothe. Tillie herself knows exactly "what killed Bobby Joe." Any black person in Grovetown knows.

On the road Florida sees a truck behind her. The Klan is coming. We see a brief glimpse of someone later carrying Florida, putting her in the trunk of a car.

Hap and Leonard are getting some shut-eye in Florida's abandoned car. Until Hap starts seeing Florida, dressed all in white, asking him to follow her. Then he sees the Ku Klux Klan dragging Leonard away. The ground at his feet are frogs, sucking him under like quicksand. Lucky it's all a dream.

In the morning, Belinda shows up. Hap tries getting more information out of her about the lipstick case, however, the girl doesn't talk to anybody anymore. So, Leonard gives it a shot by trying "cha-

rades" — at least that's what Hap calls it, instead of sign language — and this prompts the girl to start helping.

On the walk, Hap and Leonard get to talking. Leonard talks about being in Vietnam and having to call in the "steel rain" (cluster bombing). He talks about being terrified, watching young men beside him die, but pushing through to try saving some of them. All in all, it relates to Florida's situation: "dead or alive," the lads are going to get her back home.

Officer Sneed lets Chief Cantuck know he saw our boys in Florida's car headed back into town, so this sets them all off. Meanwhile, Hap and Leonard get back over to the motor inn. It's right around the same time Dt. Hanson's car turns up, towed from out of the ditch where he ended up. But no sign of the detective himself.

A little later, Hap tries to get in touch with Charlie Blank except they're interrupted after Truman Brown and his white supremacist pals turn up. Things get nasty, too. Bacon doesn't shy away, either; he makes sure his Klan resistance is well known. Thus ensues a brawl between Hap and Leonard and the KKK boys.

Except everything gets worse after a bunch more of the Klan get there with weapons, circling our lads. All Hap and Leonard can do is try to make it out in one piece. They make it out, but barely in one piece. Afterwards, Hap dreams of Florida — it's sad and poignant because

he mentions how it's 1989, and in "ten years" people won't care about race, sexual orientation, class, et cetera.

In an alleyway, Hap and Leonard are beaten mercilessly by the KKK, especially the latter simply for being black. Truman then decides he'll cut off Leonard's genitals, as Hap is made to watch it all. At that moment, Dt. Hanson and Bacon come around the corner — Hanson's toting a shotgun. Conveniently Sneed gets there, as well. A Mexican standoff in Grovetown. Suddenly, Sneed turns his gun on Truman and tells him to leave.

Officer Reynolds is a dirty racist. She intercepts the location of Hap and Leonard for Truman. This leaves our lads and their few friends in Grovetown a bunch of sitting ducks. Bacon's doing a fine job taking care of Hap and Leonard. Yet neither he, nor Sneed, nor either of our lads know what's headed for them.

In the meantime, a few interesting things. Hap's beginning to finally, wholly resent all his activism in the '60s, seeing as how it, ultimately, did nothing. Either way his idealism is slipping a bit. Then there's Bacon's realism. He knew all the hippy shit wasn't going to create lasting change. And Sneed — we discover his father killed a black man and went to prison where he later died.

But again, more interruptions. The Klan's back, and they've brought guns. Shots go off. Bacon takes a bullet, though not a fatal one. Cantuck gets there and sends Truman's boys scattering, along with Charlie, too. Although it's not entirely settled, at least Hap and Leonard are getting out of Grovetown alive. The Chief promises to find Florida, which you can take with a grain of salt. It doesn't matter what Cantuck plans on doing, anyway. After everyone leaves, Officer Reynolds puts a bullet through the Chief's head.
