Summary:	A McCoy is murdered by a Hatfield and a forbidden love affair begins at the start of the legendary Hatfield-McCoy family feud, which nearly brought the states of Kentucky and West Virginia to civil war in the 1880s.



Devil Anse Hatfield of West Virginia and Randall McCoy of Kentucky are introduced as allies, fighting for the Confederacy during the Civil War. Early on, though, they separate: Devil Anse opts to abandon the lost cause and return to fend for his wife, Levicy, and their children; Randall continues to fight, and winds up in a prisoner of war. At war's end, Randall returns home to find his wife, Sally, and their children barely scraping by on their farm, while Devil Anse and his kin are operating a profitable lumber business.

Having fought on the Union side during the Civil War, Harmon McCoy is a pariah in his community. But he makes

things much worse for himself by insulting Devil Anse's hot-headed Uncle Jim — who kills the "traitor" and then, even though just about everyone in the area assumes he's guilty, successfully denies the crime. Harmon's family — especially his daughter, who grows up to be the beautiful but conniving Nancy McCoy — vows revenge.

Lawyer Perry Kline, Randall's cousin, attempts to press a case against the Hatfields in a dispute over timber rights. But Devil Anse uncovers proof that Kline has based his claim on forged documents, and more or less blackmails the lawyer into dropping his suit.

Kline is no more effective in his legal maneuvering when he encourages Randall to sue a Hatfield in a dispute over an allegedly stolen pig. Worse, the case leads to another killing: Bill Staton, a Hatfield employee, offers false testimony during the trial, then threatens to kill any McCoy who crosses his path. When two McCoy brothers slay Staton, the local justice of the peace — Judge Valentine "Wall" Hatfield, Devil Anse's brother — feels he has no choice but to accept a plea of self-defense.

William, Devil Anse's son, is injured in a logging accident — a splinter is stuck in his eye, leaving the eye forever clouded — and is thereafter nicknamed "Cap." There is nothing at all wrong with his other eye, however, and Cap develops into an impressively accurate — and lethally efficient — marksman.

Ellison "Cotton Top" Mounts, the mentally challenged illegitimate son of Ellison Hatfield — Devil Anse's good-hearted younger brother — is introduced as a sympathetic character who's desperately eager to prove himself capable of any responsibility.

Johnse Hatfield, Devil Anse's son, takes a shine to Roseanna McCoy, Randall's beautiful daughter. They drift away from an Election Day gathering to spend time together in the woods; when they return, they find everyone else has departed. Roseanna spends the night at the Hatfield home — much to the displeasure of Devil Anse and wife Levicy — and makes love with Johnse while everyone else in the household is sleeping. The next day, Roseanna returns to her home — and Johnse barely escapes being killed by her kin.

Pinkerton agent Frank Phillips — aka Bad Frank — is shot and left partially crippled while trying to arrest a Hatfield family member. Devil Anse decides not to kill the intruder — but does give him a tidy sum to leave the area. Frank is not happy, but accepts the payoff and departs. It's obvious, however, that we haven't heard the last of him.

Johnse is captured by members of Roseanna's extended family. They hold him prisoner in the late Harmon McCoy's old cabin, and plan to execute him at dawn. But Roseanna is tipped off to the situation, and in turn informs Devil Anse.

Part 1 of *Hatfields & McCoys* ends with Devil Anse, Uncle Jim and other members of the Hatfield clan racing against time to recuse Johnse — and, perhaps, further escalate the family feud.

Summary:	The Hatfields head out in search of revenge when the McCoys murder Anse's younger brother. Friends, neighbors, and community members join the feud, and full blown battle between the Hatfields and McCoys bring West Virginia and Kentucky to the brink of Civil War.

After being tipped off by Roseanna McCoy that members of her family are planning to kill his son, Johnse Hatfield, Devil Anse Hatfield and his kinfolk ride to the rescue and free the young man with a minimal amount of bloodshed.

Despite Roseanna's service to his family, however, Devil Anse refuses to let the young woman and his son continue to live together under his roof. Johnse proves too feckless — or just plain weak-willed — to defy his father, so Roseanna tearfully departs. Because she is pregnant, she winds up not living with her father, Randall McCoy, but rather with an aunt.

Nancy McCoy, Roseanne's duplicitous cousin, pretends to sympathize with the lovelorn Johnse — but lures him into her bed while he's drunk.

During an Election Day celebration, three of Roseanne's young brothers shoot and stab Ellison Hatfield, Devil Anse's peaceable younger brother. ("He put out fires," Devil Anse says in tribute to his unfortunate sibling, "that other people started.") The brothers are arrested. While they are being transported back to Kentucky, however, Devil Anse and his kin — including Uncle Jim — claim custody of the prisoners at gunpoint.



Sally, Randall's wife, travels to Devil Anse's home to plead for the lives of her sons, who are being held in Devil Anse's barn. She is told that if Ellison manages to recover from his wounds — a very unlikely possibility — the brothers will be freed to face Kentucky justice. Sally asks: What will happen to her boys if Ellison dies? "You'll get them back," Devil Anse cryptically replies. "That much I promise you."

Ellison dies, and the McCoy brothers are executed by a Hatfield firing squad. Even as this occurs, Roseanne gives birth to a baby. Neither mother nor child appears to be in healthy shape.

Given the, at best, dubious legality of the execution, lawyer Perry Kline, Randall's cousin, easily arranges for Kentucky authorities to swear out warrants for Devil Anse and his cohorts. Bounty hunters are drawn to West Virginia by the offer of rewards for the capture or killing of Hatfields.

Frank Phillips, the ex-Pinkerton with a grudge against Devil Anse, kills a Hatfield cousin — the aptly nicknamed Skunkhair — then takes a knife to the corpse so he can provide the dead man's distinctive scalp as proof when he claims the bounty in Kentucky. Randall is appalled by what he calls this "savagery," and demands that Perry Kline pay no future bounties to Phillips. Time passes, however, and Randall grudgingly accepts Phillips as a necessary evil.

In the midst of all this mayhem, Johnse is so dejected after he's unable to visit Roseanne and their ailing infant that he impulsively marries Nancy. Judge Valentine "Wall" Hatfield — Devil Anse's brother — presides over the union, which he views with no small amount of skepticism.

Raiding parties — both authorized deputies and free-lance bounty hunters — continue to venture into West Virginia to kill or capture Hatfield kinfolk. Disputes over jurisdiction intensify as the governors of Kentucky and West Virginia exchange harsh words over the matter. As Part 2 ends, Devil Anse vows to protect his family, no matter what the cost.

Summary:	After a series of raids the Hatfields are forced further into the mountains. Johnse sets his sights on another McCoy woman and the feud leads to an explosive New Year's Day battle.

Roseanna McCoy is making funeral arrangements for the child she bore by Johnse Hatfield — who's now married (albeit not happily) to Roseanna's duplicitous cousin, Nancy McCoy.

Frank Phillips — aka Bad Frank — continues to lead bloody attacks on Hatfield kinfolk in West Virginia. He kills some men, and brings others back to Kentucky.

To end the aforementioned attacks, Uncle Jim insists on launching a New Year's Eve assault on the secluded Kentucky farm of Randall McCoy and his family. Unfortunately, Devil Anse Hatfield is unable to oversee the assault, due to incapacitating illness. Even more unfortunately, the attack leads to collateral damage. As Jim tells Devil Anse after the fact, "It didn't turn out so well... Our foray against old Randall was interrupted by family members."



back in Part 1 — she doesn't hesitate to inform Bad Frank when she later learns of Jim's whereabouts. Nor does she hesitate to cheat on her husband with Bad Frank.

Bad Frank and his men kill Jim in a woodland clash. But William, Devil Anse's sharpshooter son, manages to escape capture during the melee.

Devil Anse suspects — with ample justification — that Johnse told Nancy (inadvertently or otherwise) where Uncle Jim and William (aka Cap) had been hiding. He seriously considers killing his son during a fishing trip, but opts to let the dangerously careless young man leave the area and seek his fortune elsewhere. Levicy — Devil Anse's wife, Johnse's mom — is greatly relieved.

Lawyer Perry Kline remains smitten with Roseanna, and offers to marry her. When she drops dead — evidently, she never fully recovered from a broken heart and a painful childbirth — he is deeply grieved.

After lengthy legal battles, some Hatfields who were arrested in West Virginia are brought to trial in Kentucky. Ironically, the only defendant given a death sentence is Cotton Top. For all practical purposes, the family feud is ended.

Randall dies in a house fire. Bad Frank is shot during a barroom confrontation while promoting his self-aggrandizing book. The closing credits inform us that Devil Anse lived to a ripe old age, and died in 1921 of natural causes.

Specifically: While Randall himself manages to escape, his son is mortally wounded — and one of his daughters is fatally shot by Ellison "Cotton Top" Mounts, the mentally challenged illegitimate son of the late Ellison Hatfield. Sally, Randall's wife, never fully recovers from the trauma of these tragic events, and is last seen being shipped off to an asylum.

While hunting another McCoy, Jim is impeded by Nancy, and angrily thrashes the young woman when she attacks him. Since Nancy already has cause to hate Jim — after all, he did kill her father way
