Summary: As his American wife departs for a dance audition in New York, Israeli tour guide Segev finds his world thrown into chaos by a sudden tragedy.



The episode begins in prison. A fight breaks out in the yard, leaving Segev a bloodied mess. As the camera pans out, we cut across to Israel three weeks earlier.

Pulsating music and a really stylish dance number takes center stage, paving way for Danielle to revel in the rapturous applause. She's a talented dancer, working with her company for a number of years. She's also on the cusp of a big breakthrough too, with an audition in New York coming up in a few days.

Danielle is married to an Israeli tour guide called Segev, who prepares to say goodbye to his partner. Tellingly, Danielle receives a message from someone just before she goes, prompting her to take a detour to the dance studio before the airport. She greets her friend Syd and says goodbye.

While out getting coffees, she receives a message, "We need to talk." Distracted, Danielle hurries across the road just as a car ploughs into her and leaves the girl sprawled on her back.

Segev finds out about his wife and charges back (hey, what about the tour?) and races up to the hospital. Only, it's too late. Danielle's injuries are too great and she passes away in hospital. She actually passed away in the ambulance en-route but Dr Mendel and his team did their best to try and resuscitate her.

Segev breaks the news about Danielle to her father, Martin, who's understandably shocked. At the same time, police investigators start to look into what happened. Using skid mark prints

and CCTV, they learn that the plates for the car in question belong to a vehicle that was reported stolen that very morning. It's owned by Shalcorp, which in turn is owned by a guy called Rami Shalom.

This gives the police a solid lead to go on, and they inevitably keep tabs on Rami. Fronting this investigation are Tali and her partner Boaz. When Rami speeds away from the police, it's a solid sign that something untoward is going on. There's an exhilarating high speed chase that ensues from here, culminating in Rami captured and brought in for questioning.

However, he's certainly less than helpful with the investigation. As soon as investigators mention Rami's car being involved in this hit and run, his face twists into a scowl and he asks to see his lawyer.

Meanwhile, Tali visits Segev and breaks the news about Remi being brought in for police questioning. This gets Segev thinking, and he checks Danielle's phone, ringing the last known contact there. This just so happens to be a guy called Assaf. "Is everything okay my love?" He answers... as Segev questions just who he is.

Segev starts to spiral, and calls on Tali to help trace the call and work out just what's going on. Flashbacks sprinkled in here confirm that Danielle was having an affair with Assaf. He was the one who wanted to break things off, given the stress at work and his marriage falling apart, but Danielle was incessant in keeping this going.

That evening, a masked man breaks into Segev's house and attacks. The pair brawl across the house, eventually leading to Segev knocking the guy out. Searching his pockets, Segev finds a family picture and realizes that he's not safe. Sensing something very wrong, Segev grabs Ella and hurries out the house.

Dropping Ella off with her Mother, Segev rings Tali to hurry over to his house. Only, the assassin is gone.

Summary: Segev begins to question the nature of the accident as more clues emerge to Danielle's mystery caller and the car's driver.



The episode begins with Segev breathing heavily and stuck in the back of a police car. With no sign of the assassin, police have chalked up his behaviour to one of self-inflicted anger and handcuffed him for his own safety.

Tali quickly dispels that myth though, speaking to Segev privately and asking about the assassin. Dismissing the beat cops, Tali heads inside Segev's house and starts looking around. She doesn't find very much but given no money was taken from his wallet and everything else is in-

tact, she senses that Segev is telling the truth.

At the police station, Segev gives his statement. He's never heard of Rami but he's not so sure his wife could say the same. Still, police decide to conduct forensics on the gun he managed to grab from the assassin. Segev remains understandably concerned for Ella's wellbeing. He's also concerned about Danielle too, sensing that what he knew about her isn't the whole truth.

Anyway, Segev returns home to see his Father. This paves way for a really well-edited segment that cuts us back in time to more flashbacks between Danielle and Segev. Their love is clear to see but like Tali told him earlier in the episode, "people are complicated." Did Segev really know Danielle as well as he thought?

When Syd drops over Danielle's belongings from her locker, it only reinforces this feeling. A post-it note from Assaf, matched with the text messages, only reinforces the feeling that all is not well. Even worse, Danielle's parents aren't going to show up for the funeral either.

Back at the police station, Boaz has doubts about Segev's statement. Likewise, Tali has doubts about Rami being the real culprit. Given he was the one who reported his own car missing earlier on, it certainly seems like he's being framed.

Danielle's funeral goes ahead and Segev chokes up while reading his statement, leaving it to Ella to finish. During the wake, Tali approaches Segev and confirms that forensics have tested the gun he took from the assassin. They've run a check for fingerprints and DNA but found nothing. Furthermore, Tali confirms her doubts to Segev about Rami, believing there's someone else involved here.

Segev also learns about Assaf not long after too, questioning Syd about a shady guy wearing sunglasses and a jacket from afar at the funeral. She breaks the news about his ties with Danielle and reveals that the pair used to hang out at a bar called Hashoftim. According to Syd, Danielle and Assaf used to date before Segev came on the scene.

Assaf is very clearly jealous of Segev too but he gives absolutely nothing away when Segev shows up with a gun later than evening. He shrugs off Segev's threat and tells him he's got bigger problems to deal with. Well, so too has Assaf when he heads home. His wife Maya finds out the truth about his affair and immediately lashes out, throwing things around the room. When Assaf reassures her and confirms Danielle is dead, she seems to calm down a little.

Scouring through the CCTV footage brings up a breakthrough. Two men can be seen exiting the car and heading straight for the airport. These two men happen to be Hungarian nationals, Tomas Polgar and Boton Gunsberg. They flew across to Heathrow in London but quite why, still doesn't make sense.

Tali promises Segev that they'll get answers, but time is of the essence and Segev grows ever-more restless. That's only made worse by the fact the trail has run cold at Heathrow.

Segev heads out with Syd that night to the bar. Once there, he learns about a local drug dealer called Uri. Instead of taking a more civilized approach, Segev immediately takes chase, resulting in an exhilarating chase across busy roads and dingy alleyways. Eventually Segev catches up and demands answers. Apparently there were two Americans there that night, and we soon find out why.

It turns out the Hungarian cover was just an alias and actually both men are Americans by the names of Mark Posnner and David Chernik. When they arrived at London, the pair switched passports and flew across to New York. That's why they managed to evade capture, and also why the trail ran cold. They both have a record of petty crimes and it fits the profile for what's happening.

Segev has an idea over who's responsible, believing it could be an old nemesis called Isaac. He used to be friends with Segev back in Mexico after their time in the army. When he ended up in prison, Isaac blamed Segev for this.

Segev rings his contact Ron in New York and asks for help. Regardless of what he can do, Tali confirms to Segev later on that Mark and David have been brought into New York custody. Neither are talking but more importantly, they'll be extradited back to Israel for questioning.

However, there's still a threat in Israel. Segev narrowly avoids an attempt on his life, scrambling for cover when the house is rigged to blow from an IED. Both Tali and Segev survive but the latter makes a big decision in the wake of this. He's flying across to New York to investigate this further and find out what's going on.

This is all the ammo Segev needs to head out with Ron and track Benny down. This, in turn, allows them to get close enough to Isaac to hold him up at gunpoint and question what he knows.

Apparently Isaac has no idea about the bombing and the attack on Segev's life. However, David and Mike were hired to work a job for a woman in Israel. Isaac is convinced he's being set up and admits he doesn't know who hired the pair — Isaac is simply a middleman. If he knew it was going to be Danielle as the target, he would have made it much more painful.

After a brief scuffle, Segev forces Isaac to bring in the two drivers so he can question them himself. Well, this immediately goes awry as a shootout ensues across the club. This eventually ends with one of the men killed, after revealing that he was paid 20k for the job.

With the bodies in the back of the truck and Ron panicking, Segev drives up to Naomi's where they crash for the night. With everything subsiding for now, Segev checks out old footage from his phone and comes to a startling revelation. It turns out the assassin at his house was actually a man from his wedding.

Even worse, when he heads over to see Martin and the Wexlers, their house is actually owned by a completely different set of people. Was this whole wake fabricated to throw Segev off the scent?

The episode begins with Segev on the subway. But he's not alone. He tries hard to evade law enforcement, eventually double backing to the airport and out the front. With Tali keeping watch over Ella, she feeds back this sliver of good news to Segev. For now, his daughter is safe.

Segev manages to cleverly talk his way into snapping a photo with Martin's real wife. It turns out Martin's real name is actually Reece Wakefield too. When he receives the selfie from Segev, he contacts

Naomi and sets up a meet with Segev.

Elsewhere, Naomi opens up to Frank and reveals everything about Segev and what's been happening. Frank is understandably worried and tells her she needs to be careful sniffing around CIA activity.

With this in mind, Naomi sets up the meeting with Ron and Segev, reminding the latter that he needs to make sure Reece doesn't die. If he does then it could well be classed as treason.

Back in Israel, Assaf packs up his stuff ready to leave. However, he immediately heads over to Syd's place and frantically checks for recording equipment. Unfortunately he finds a spy camera and his worst fears are felt. He's been bugged.

After her antics several episodes ago, Tali is called in to her boss' office and subsequently suspended for using his computer. She immediately rings Segev and blames him for lumping her with the fallout from his antics. It's all too much for Tali to deal with and she ends up in hospital.

As the meeting begins, Naomi is forced to stall for time while Ron and Segev are attacked en-route by a couple of shady motorists. Ron is badly injured and subsequently dies from blood

loss. Because of this delay, Reece runs out of patience and leaves. Just before he does, he claims he doesn't know who Sophie Dreyer is.

Meanwhile, Segev mourns the loss of his friend while beating down one of the men following him. He claims Segev's wife was a traitor as Segev answers a call from his phone. He promises revenge, setting things up nicely for the remaining chapters.
