Summary: A criminology expert on death row in the U.S. and a vicar in a sleepy English town: how are they connected? When a journalist from England goes to interview the criminology expert, she tries to uncover what's going on with the vicar in England.



The episode starts in the London Underground. A lascivious-looking young lad stares at a young girl, Beth Davenport, sitting opposite him. He is emboldened by her silence and moves further into her private space.

Another woman takes a picture of him, which he sees. He confronts the lady, takes her phone, deletes the photo, and throws it in disdain. But he is not going to get away with it, for Janice is in attendance. She feigns making a live stream of the incident on Facebook and

other women swiftly join in. The man is apprehended at the next station and Beth goes up to Janice to express her gratitude.

She turns down an invitation by Beth to do an interview with her about subjects like these. They do exchange numbers and plan a coffee together sometime. We jump to a different place in a different country, the USA. In federal prison, two inmates, Dylan and Jefferson meet with a Senator for an "appointment". It is not the inmates who have requested the meeting but the Senator himself. Jefferson is a professor of criminology convicted for murdering his wife. In fact, both men are on death row and have no intention of avoiding it. Dylan is a serial killer and has murdered 14 women, the fifteenth dying of an infection she contracted while in the hospital getting treated for injuries, he caused. The Senator looks tense and begins narrating his problem.

Before he can, Jefferson interrupts him and says that he raped two women as part of his campaign thirty years ago. The Senator denies that and continues with his problem. It is a peculiar one, amusing both the inmates. Every time he makes love to his wife, \$253.55 are deposited in his account. Jefferson refuses to help him and Dylan is curious as to how he solved

the case so quickly. We jump back to England, where Harry, whom we saw picking up Janice earlier, greets his congregation.

He is a popular Vicar in the local church. One of the men under his tutelage, 36-year-old Ed, rushes in to give him a flash drive. He says it contains porn and that his overbearing mother Hilde will beat him if she finds it on him. The Vicar reluctantly takes it, greets Hilde, and assures her Ed is on the path to recovery. After his departure though, Hilde's tone changes and she takes on a threatening one, where she beats Ed and demands to know the location of the drive. The Warden informs Jefferson that Beth, from the tube, has requested to meet him to write about him. Jefferson initially refuses but eventually agrees to meet her.

It turns out that Janice is a tutor for Harry's son, Ben. Harry picks her up from the station for the appointments. Harry's wife Mary is friends with Janice as well. While keeping the keys to the car in its place, Harry inadvertently keeps the drive with it. When the house's internet doesn't work, Janice requests something from Ben to transfer the slides she has prepared for the session. He gives her the drive. Harry is too late to stop her from opening the contents and she is shocked.

Her utter repulsiveness draws on her face like a heavy hush. The discomfort grows and Harry dismisses Ben from the room. Although she seems to think it is Ben's, Harry takes the blame for it and does not reveal that the drive belongs to Ed. The drive has actual photos of children being abused and photographed for pleasure, something Janice rightly says should be taken to the police. They debate the same, but it looks like that Janice will take it to the police, ignoring Harry's pleadings.

The Vicar panics and stops Janice from leaving, even holding her hand aggressively. She makes a run for it from the other side and trips on the carpet. She breaks her phone and hits her head on the table, cracking open a bleeding cut. Janice fears Harry and keeps backing off. She mistakenly opens the door to the cellar and trips on the stairs. Harry is shocked but locks her inside.

Faisal, Ben's friend comes to pick him up. Although Harry had refused permission earlier, seeing the changed circumstances, he allows him to go. Beth meets with Dylan and Jefferson to potentially write an article about his case. Her attitude is contemptuous toward Jefferson, something he notices and points out while explaining his single criteria while taking on clients: moral worth.

He wants to do good with the little time he has left. He is not apologetic for killing his wife, saying "Everyone's a murderer: you just have to meet the right person". Beth leaves disappointed but intrigued. Dylan nudges Jefferson about liking Beth but the professor is coy. He finally explains how he cracked the Senator's case. He says that Celina Cadiz, one of the two women the Senator was guilty of raping (although it was never proved; it seldom is *sigh*), works at his office. She was able to meet the Senator's wife and she inadvertently got to know about Senator's dirty deeds. As a form of penance, she visits the therapist every time they make love. Celina is made to pay the amount by the wife, and she sends it twice mistakenly, once from the company's accounts as well. The amount that reflects in the Senator's accounts is a mistake.

Mary and Harry discuss the next step of what to do with Janice. She is livid with him, saying that Janice will go straight to the police if they free her, and the fact that they have no option but to. They have until Ben to decide. Harry takes takeout menus to Janice, who is sitting deep within the cellar, confident she is the one in control of the situation. She has hidden all the tools Harry has down there and even left her blood all over the cellar. She also has scheduled a video call with her sister the next day and her calendar is marked with Harry's house as the last tutoring appointment. Harry is stuck indeed.

It is revealed that Beth had actually received a cryptic photo from Janice just before her phone got busted. Beth keeps trying her cell but to no avail. She requests the warden to arrange another meeting with Jefferson and present her case. The Professor agrees to do so and quips Dylan about what it could possibly be.

Summary: How far is maths tutor Janice Fife willing to go to make her escape? On death row, journalist Beth Davenport finds herself running an errand for the wife killer Jefferson Grieff. And vicar Harry Watling confronts his verger about a dangerous secret.



Jefferson meets with Beth but offers her a tough choice: he allows Beth to sit in on his next case, record it, and then publish it without any alterations or censorship. But for that to happen, she can never mention her friend Janice again.

Jefferson will not be taking her case. He does so to test her moral fortitude: her friend or her career, what will she choose? Beth does what any sane person would do and chooses the latter. The reward in that option is too skewed to even think about it twice. Jefferson has a smug smile but

honors his commitment. He calls her back in another hour for the case to be heard in person.

The Vicar takes bedding and gives a pair of handcuffs to Janice. He asks her to chain herself to the pipe but also says he doesn't want it to be unpleasant for her. Ben will be back soon and that is why he does not want to leave anything to chance. He once again pleads with her to believe that the flash drive isn't Ben's, but Janice certainly doesn't seem to think so. She throws her faeces in a polybag to him and asks for more plastic bags and loo paper. But a moment later, she angrily rattles the cuffs and demands to be let out. Anyway, the Skype call is her time to get out and she is confident of it.

Mary actually googles "how to kill a person", despite the Vicar making it clear nothing will happen to her. The discussion shows how tense she is and how dire the situation is. She says that Janice will not be let out of the house in any case. That will destroy their family's reputation and any chance of them living a normal life. Harry says he will talk to Edgar and ask him to confess. The husband-wife pair is quite united in this struggle. Jefferson's case is up, and it is about a missing husband and father. A real estate agent wins an award and after accepting it, just vanishes from the face of the earth. Jefferson asks some questions to the wife, like "what time was it in the day", and remarks like "a husband and wife often love each other".

Well, Jefferson says he knows where the missing man went but where he now remains a question he cannot answer. The family is desperate for any answers that the professor can give

them. He asks Beth to take Hanna's, the wife, hand as he tells her an inevitable possibility. He might be dead and asks if she is ready to accept whatever he finds while investigating. Beth asks how Jefferson came to his findings, to which the professor replies that she needs to take a closer look at the video. He sends her on the road to do "Research" for him.

The Vicar goes to Ed's phone and Hilde answers the door. She says he went for drinks with his friends. He confronts Ed in the bar with the flash drive and secretly records the conversation, waiting for the confession. Harry presses hard but Ed denies any knowledge of it, quivering and crying at the same time. Edgar leaves under the pressure and Harry chases after him. He asks Ed to come with him to the church, as Mary looks at a golf club and contemplates what she might have to do to keep her family safe. Beth has been sent toward Glanville. Jeff is on the phone with her throughout. He asks her to make a stop at Barney B's, a mechanic's stop. Barney gives Beth an envelope. He also tells her to tell Jeff that "the subject is meant to make a Skype call the next day at 9 pm". Beth does not. Jeff is secretly pursuing Janice's case. We later see her Facebook profile open on Barney's laptop.

Mary takes the club and a bottle of whiskey downstairs. She offers Janice the whiskey and the two women talk heart-to-heart. Janice anticipates that Mary will kill her and asks how she will get away with it. She offers her a way out. She tells Mary about the Skype call and says that Janice is the only person who can help Mary in getting away with her own murder.

Her plan is that once she gives Mary the password to sign into her account, she can cancel the call and send an apologetic email to her sister. Janice then suggests Mary can say that she went on a walking trip, where she does not contact anyone for an entire week. And that is how they get away. But surprisingly, she asks Mary to make her an offer — give something in return.

Janice then lashes out saying that she has everything to give in return — her life and freedom. Mary is sent away by Janice as she mulls over the options. Ben's home and sees his mother lock away the cellar. He asks why but Mary is able to divert him. Ben casually remarks that Janice is home as he sees her handbag still there by the coat stand. He says he will be the one to contact Janice and leaves a voice mail for her.

In the series' best scene yet, we see Edgar being confronted by Harry in the church with the fear of God his lash. He tries hard, so hard that Edgar falls to the ground, crying and squirming, asking for his death from God. The Vicar looks around at God's symbols in the church and throws away his phone. He realizes his moral duty to God and instead picks up Edgar to take to his chambers.

He gives the drive to Ed and his laptop. He asks him to hide away the photos in an obscure place to make it look like they belong to him and not Ed. It is a sacrifice he must make to protect Ed and do God's work. Jefferson's conclusion is this: Conor, the missing man, left for the Glanville train station right after the awards and at the same time, the opera's symphony also finished, which is audible in the video.

The reason why he was not seen by anybody was that he mixed in with the crowd of musicians wearing tuxedos leaving the concert. He then sends Beth to take one of the trains and go to Conor's house. Beth gives Conor's wife the envelope. It is a photo of the award that Conor received that night with some dust photoshopped over it. The wife quickly leaves from the backdoor, to which Jeff deduces that she herself murdered him because he was cheating on her.

Harry drops off Ed at his house and demands that he does not repeat this feat again. He has given up his own life to save Ed's and he must make the most of his chance. Janice just gives away the password to Harry when he visits her downstairs. He takes the information to Mary. But she is surprised.

She says if Harry goes ahead with it, this will be the end for them together. But Harry remarks that at least Ed is safe, and he has held his standards up to God. In the next scene, we see Hilde going up to Ed's room and finding that he has committed suicide. With his body is a note that the Vicar is not a paedophile and the police are not to believe him.

Summary: As Harry's dilemma worsens, the fate of his family hangs in the balance — but he's determined to do the right thing. Meanwhile, Beth Davenport meets one of Jefferson Grieff's helpers in the outside world, who delivers a chilling warning. In the cellar, Janice's desperation grows. In her battle for survival, is there anything she isn't prepared to do?



The moment Jefferson was waiting for has finally come. The Warden, who is a good friend, arrives to inform him that the date for his execution has been decided.

Three weeks from the day, Jefferson Grieff is to be hanged to death. And now, the Warden must explain about the Execution Protocols from the thick binder he has brought with him, but Jefferson asks him not to go through the trouble. The only detail we get is that he will be moved to a holding room, the "death house", as they call it, one day before the execution.

Harry contemplates the future on the last morning of him as a free man. Mary too hasn't been able to sleep and comforts Harry.

They sit outside where Harry says he was up all-night printing images of the pornography on the drive to make it look more believable. Mary once again pleads with him to rethink his decision as doing so would destroy the family. But he is stout in his decision and thinks this is the best way to protect Ben.

A phone call arrives, and Harry finally learns of Ed's suicide. The police are visiting at 2 on the day to discuss his name being mentioned in the letter. He goes straight to Janice, ignoring Mary's vague and shock-induced suggestion that Harry had something to do with it.

Harry strikes a deal with Janice or at least intends to, that he will let her go if the letter that the police bring proves that Ben isn't a paedophile. He is ready to go to jail for assaulting her but will not see his son hurt if that is true.

Janice is a smart cookie and sees Mary standing near the door, trying to listen in. She purposely mentions some kind of "agreement" between Harry and her, trying to sow seeds of doubt in the couple to take advantage. Mary, of course, can listen to the conversation.

She confronts Harry when he comes up, but the Vicar pleads his innocence, something that Mary only half believes. Ben says that he will stay over at her girlfriend's after school to "study" and asks about Janice. Harry panics and doesn't realize her handbag is kept on the kitchen countertop, although not readily visible to Ben. But he did notice that, unbeknownst to Harry.

Morag, one of Jefferson's accomplices, greets Beth as she comes back. The journalist initially believes Morag is a police officer because she showed a badge, but it turns out, she is herself a criminal. Dylan reveals to Jeff that he was not executed on his scheduled date as he demanded a Buddhist be present when he "passes on". But, there was no legislation allowing one to be there and his execution date was deferred indefinitely.

Jeff asks Morag to explain to Beth how he mutilated his wife after strangling her. He wants an impression of himself as a monster in Beth's eyes. And he was on the phone all along to listen in. Morag has been sent to keep Beth safe. She is fed up with Jeff's games and intends to go to the police.

The professor puts up a great reason to convince her to stay on. He also says that Janice is an extremely smart person who understands people. She lets on more than what people can see and would be potent in a situation where her back is against the wall.

And we see an example in the next scene itself. Harry explains their idea to Janice of sending Mary down with a phone to listen to the police. She cleverly asks him not to gag her as it would be too traumatic for her, and the walls are soundproof anyway. But right in the next moment, she bangs her head against the pipes to make it look like one of them injured her. Both will now think the other injured her, thus, an advantage to Janice.

The police arrive and Mary takes her position downstairs. Janice asks Mary to gag her, saying that she might have an uncontrollable reaction to the police's revelations. Oh, because she is such a delicate flower. Boom, conspiracy.

But Mary understands her. The conversation with the two detectives is quite awkward. They know the Vicar, obviously, but for some reason feel he has something to hide. They show him the note and he reads it out loud, leading to Janice signaling to Mary that she is about to shout — when she really isn't — forcing Mary to gag her.

The two detectives are less than convinced of Harry's story and now he is suspiciously looked at as someone protecting a pedophile. It is an exquisitely edited scene where both the simultaneous spaces are intercut to make the tension palpable. Professor confesses to Dylan that he is scared and uses his tactic to delay his execution. He then says to the Warden that he will be willing to tell the location of his wife's severed head if his execution is delayed.

Ben turns down his girlfriend for the day and says he is going back home. But he doesn't tell his parents. Mary is not willing to take chances and sends the email from her laptop. She also warns Harry to stay in his senses and not believe whatever Janice says.

Janice feigns a great act and gives the impression that Mary wants to kill her. Harry is convinced by her story and promises he won't allow her to be killed. Mary goes into the garage where they have kept their old heater. But the problem is that it leaks.

In a closed room, that machine turned on would be fatal. "She will be warm, and the death will be painless", quips Mary to Harry. A defeated feeling resonates in her voice. Ben takes the keys from the drawer and uses them to make his way into the cellar.

Harry agrees with Mary's idea and locks the house from the inside, not knowing that Ben is in there. He asks Mary to take a drive somewhere and let him complete the deed. He puts the heater in the basement, but Ben doesn't jump out. Janice gets worried when Ben says the door is locked from the outside, fearing that this might be it.

Harry seals off the cellar with tape and puts on Beethoven to keep the horror of the cellar at bay. Ben keeps knocking in vain and Mary incessantly calls Harry to let him know the email was a trap. There perhaps is no meeting scheduled.

Summary: As events spiral out of control, Jefferson Grieff prepares to face execution, and time is also running out for Janice Fife in the cellar. An increasingly desperate Harry Watling struggles to do the right thing, but can he stay on the side of the angels and still keep his wife and son safe?



We get yet another teasing explanation of Janice's location from Jefferson: he explains it all to Beth over the phone, sans the location of the course, and Dylan keenly listens on.

Jeff instructs Morag to take Beth to a safe house. She goes out to pick veggies and reveals that the house is actually someone else's. She is a housebreaker and leaves Beth inside. Jefferson has a meeting with an important criminal, his ticket out of execution. Gordon, Jeff's father-in-law, is perhaps the only

one who can stop the inevitable from happening to Jeff. He has got long arms and deep connections within the bureaucracy.

Gordon wants to know the location of the head, but Jeff is less than forthcoming. Unbeknownst to both, the Warden is recording their entire conversation — both audio and video. There is something he is anticipating because the guards on duty are also not at the doors. As the conversation proceeds, Gordon gets antsy. He looks at Jeff with bloody eyes and starts beating him mercilessly. The prisoner's hands are tied, and he just sits there and takes it. The Warden stops any intervention but looks on with a smile on his face.

Harry too is getting anxious, waiting around for the heater's emissions to take effect. The way he plans to kill Janice is through carbon monoxide poisoning. The internet says it takes approximately two hours for the person to experience fatal symptoms and he sets a timer for the same. Janice lies in the cellar and watches Ben hit the door with a hammer in a bid to get out. Her mind wanders and goes back to the first meeting she had with the couple and Ben. He was a smart kid who didn't want to work hard. Probably, he could ace the tests by studying at the last minute but Janice wanted him to take the shortcut by doing the work beforehand. In the exchanges, we see how Janice was indeed a stout woman. She wasn't easily influenced and hardly let Harry get anything over her. If she wanted tea and Harry had made coffee, she would almost order him to make on.

Janice wasn't too polite to make herself uncomfortable. Another interesting thing we glean from them is the friendship between Janice and Ben. The former tries to convince the latter that he must spend time away from the screen, as she does, and try not to think about how others see him. In the present, she tries to convince Ben that Harry did all the damage to her. It is an unusual mix of care and connivance in her eyes. She seems conflicted about Ben because she does care for him but can't decide which way to go. The Warden shows Jeff the evidence he has gathered in his support, and he is quite happy to see that.

When Ben's phone rings, Janice asks him not to answer it. The phone is running low on battery and his trust in her is fading. She asks him to phone and police and then makes phony promises that she will protect him. Ben knows even if the police believe his story, his father will go to jail and is hesitant to comply.

He increases the heating on the heater as he begins to suffer the effects of the gas. Gordon sees the video and The Warden threatens to release it to the FBI. He asks the criminal to follow Jeff's directions and then get his execution cancelled. Mary is finally able to get through to Harry and explains her theory to him. She is right about how Janice tricked them both. They decide to place the laptop back in Janice's house.

Harry gives her purse and the laptop through the window, denying her entry into the house. They have a heart-to-heart conversation, where Harry reaffirms his devotion to Ben. He will not back down, and Mary understands. She desperately wants to go to the bathroom, but Harry doesn't allow her in. Ben receives the voicemail that Harry sends him and is even more worried. Part of his annoyance also comes from the heater. He calls his father from down there but does not tell him he is in the house. Instead, he repeatedly asks about Janice and the flash drive. He asks again and again if Harry is telling the truth and is heartbroken when his father doesn't accept the lie.

Mary makes her way outside Janice's apartment. Beth is on the phone with Jefferson who makes the shocking revelation that she is in fact sitting inside Janice's apartment. Because she was never there before, she doesn't recognize it. Mary decides going against into the restaurant next to the apartment to relieve herself and finds Beth sitting on the pot in the bathroom. Both are equally shocked to see each other. They confront one another with a nervous energy that is almost comical. Mary even picks up a butter knife to wade off Beth, who laughs at her until she gets a cut with it. Mary gets a distressing call from Ben, who reveals he is in the basement and asks her to tell him the truth about Janice. Mary panics and rushes toward her home when Harry doesn't pick up. She backs up towards the road as she screams at Beth and gets hit by an oncoming vehicle. She dies on the spot.

When the timer on Harry's clock buzzes again, he opens the door to the cellar. He finds a bloody Ben holding a knife and Janice, lying on the ground motionless. Ben became too crazed due to the fumes that he just wanted Janice to stop talking after she threw a hammer at his leg to switch off the heater. Harry puts Ben upstairs, opens the doors and windows, and says that he will tell the police Harry killed Janice. Beth, who had picked up Mary's phone from the pavement, rushes toward the house with Morag. Ben runs outside in disgust as Beth arrives at the house. Morag chases after Ben, while Beth goes inside to Janice.

Harry phones the police and confesses that he killed Janice. Suddenly, Janice starts moving: she isn't dead, yet. Harry sees this yet reports her death as he is afraid, she might rat out Ben and Mary. As he is about to finish her off, Beth intervenes. Harry lets out a frustrating rant about how he has done nothing wrong and yet is taking the blame for everything when he sees contempt and fear in Beth's eyes. The police shortly arrive, and he is taken in.

Sometime later, he and Jeff have a chat. Jeff, who gave the wrong location to Gordon, is about to be executed in two weeks' time. He is the one who has called Harry and explains that because he didn't file a missing person's report, Jeff knew Janice was at his house because he would have been the last person to see her alive. And then he says how he and Harry are alike. They're the "inside men", forced to confront the terrifying person that lies beneath us all. All we need is a bad day and anyone is a murderer.
