Summary: CIA analyst Jack Ryan uncovers a series of suspicious transactions that take him and his boss James Greer out from behind their desks into the field to hunt down a powerful new threat to the world. Hanin begins to question her husband's affairs after he brings a mysterious outsider into their home.



The episode begins with what seems like a normal day in Lebanon in 1983 until destruction hits. When we first see Jack Ryan, he's rowing in Washington D.C. and later makes his way to his day job at the C.I.A. James Greer nearly runs over Jack only to have the two of them in the same conference room. Jack introduces himself and winds up talking more than anyone really wanted him to.

We briefly visit Al Mnajeer, Syria, where we meet Sheikh Al Radawan. He leaves Anzor Dudayev at Sheikh Suleiman's compound. His wife, Hanin, isn't all too happy about that, but she

doesn't fuss over it much because you can tell that she knows it's pointless. Later, as she brings the guest some tea, we get a closer look at the weapons state inside the compound.

Back at home, Jack gets a call from his old boss, Joe. He wants to meet up in person to discuss a particular matter. We see some of what he went through as he has trouble sleeping and there's a large scar on his back. He goes into work early and when he presents Greer with

what he's found, he's told he doesn't have enough. However, it looks like Greer is inclined to believe him about the intel he's found.

Jack gets a little help from the treasury department to go around Greer. Greer gets a call from Pete Cortwright about the email that had just been sent without his approval. Pete calls back after we see an op in Yemen where two men are grabbed.

Jack shows up at Joe's fancy backyard birthday party. He wants Jack to give him some information and isn't thrilled when Jack won't give it to him. Jack then bumps into his daughter Cathy. Jack's cover is that he works for the State Department and the party is interrupted by the Coast Guard coming to pick him up. He meets Greer at the airport and the two fly to Yemen together.

The two men who were captured were Omar Rahbini and his bodyguard, Sufjan. His number matches the one that made the transfers. Jack ends up talking to Sufjan and learns a little more about him by giving him food and water. He asks him about the name Suleiman and Sufjan mentions that it's a common name.

The base is infiltrated by a man who was passed off as a head body. He had a rifle stashed on one of the men who was actually dead. A bomb goes off at the front gate, which triggers the alarms. Omar is noticeably terrified when he hears the gunfire. The troops are losing a lot of men and Jack is left behind with Sufjan.

The man who snuck in kills Omar and wants to be taken to Sufjan. Instincts kick in for Ryan even as he takes a pretty bad beating himself. He grabs a grenade and pulls the pin on it to threaten killing them all. Jack puts together that Sufjan is really Suleiman just before he escapes.

The end of the episode takes us back to the bombing from the opening scene. A young Suleiman got the scars on his hands by living a piece of fiery wood off of his brother. We then see the two in the present day, so we know it's his brother who helped him escape.

In a meeting with Nathan Singer, Jack discusses how he'd get to Suleiman. Singer wants him to be the in-house point person with the task force that they're putting together. While he's mulling it over, Suleiman returns home to his family.

Jack goes back to work trying to figuring out the 8-digit passcode when Greer returns. He tells Jack that he's going to pack up, but he notices something on the video before he does. Greer

notices that Suleiman had been locked up and some point and they find out that he was in jail and his passcode is his prison number.

Suleiman's phone had four numbers in it and they're all from Paris. Jack and Greer are sent to Paris to pick him up, but Singer isn't all too happy with the choice Jack makes. He sticks with Greer and won't do the op without him.

Back in Yemen, Yazid was eyeing Sara during their meal and later, he finds her looking around. Her brother thankfully walks up and gives her a chance to get out of the situation. Hanin tells her that she won't let anyone hurt her. She talks to her husband about it later and he doesn't seem too concerned about the men having around.

Jack and Greer show up in Paris with Matice, who says his name is Garth and Jack gives him a look as he does so. The local authorities have been tracking the number and they all suit up to go after Suleiman. The location that they head to is where Suleiman's brother is and he gets everyone cleared out of the apartment. He then holds up a vest full of explosives and one of the women volunteers to wear it.

Things are a bloodbath in the apartment as lives are lost on both sides. Jack notices the brother leaving and follows him out of the building by himself. The final scene is the bomb going off up in the apartment and we're left not knowing the status of anyone inside, including Greer.

Summary: Drone pilot Victor struggles with the immense responsibility attached to his job. Jack and Greer join French Intelligence officers on a mission to track down Suleiman's brother. Hanin is forced to make a dangerous decision for the sake of their children.



The episode picks up where the second left off. The aftermath of the explosion is being dealt with. We then travel to Braideej, Syria where we see a father and son praying together. The father leaves and winds up being blown to pieces by a drone. The authorities find out that Ali is Suleiman's brother. Greer isn't too pleased when he finds out that Jack chased him out and didn't shoot him.

Hanin gets passports for her and her children from Fathi, but Yazid was lurking nearby. Meanwhile, Ali is resting up and he had gone to someone he knows for help instead of a hospital. We see pic-

tures of his past and it was him and his brother in those flashbacks to 1983.

Victor Polizzi, the drone operator from earlier, has 107 kills based on the number he puts on his latest dollar bill. He then takes the money to a casino. He places a risky bet after a few bets at the roulette table that gets him \$29,400. Although, he doesn't look thrilled about it. He takes a couple that he meets at the casino back to his place where the husband watches his wife have sex with Victor and then he proceeds to beat him up. Victor wants him to take the money, but he won't.

Ali communicates with his brother through a video game to let him know that he's with Omer and that both the French and American authorities are looking for him. They have a rendezvous

point set up and he's told to leave no witnesses. The look on his face tells us that he knows he should do it but really doesn't want to.

Jack and Greer follow a lead. Greer heads into a mosque to ask if anyone has seen Ali. He finds one of the boys who was at Omer's place and they find him and his boys still alive. It's nice to know that Ali at least has some humanity left in him.

Suleiman is enjoying being home with his family, even if Hanin doesn't feel the same. He tells the kids about how he proposed to her. Sara and Hanin trade looks as he tells the story and they speak volumes about how each of them is feeling. The story leads up to him knowing about the passports, which is no surprise since Yazid was lurking earlier. He throws them in the fireplace.

Omer is questioned by the cops and tells them the truth about helping Ali since he was a doctor. The boys argue over the game and mention that neither of them like it, so Jack figures out that Ali was using it for a reason other than just playing a game. Ali took Omer's car and that's the only real new information we get from him.

Hanin decides to leave without the passports and isn't able to get Samir to come with them. He runs and tells his dad, who isn't thrilled with Fathi for them being able to just leave. He wants him to go track them down. However, their car breaks down and they need to walk the rest of the way to the nearby town.

Jack and Greer are at DGSJ Headquarters when they find Ali by tracking Omer's car. Jack insists that they follow him instead of snatching him. This will allow them to get whoever he's meeting up with, too. It's a smart move in order to get more out of their efforts.

Hanin and the girls make it to town, but Yazid and Fathi come looking for them. Things get messy when Yazid shoots Fathi just after Hanin tell him to kill Yazid. It's an unfortunate event, but Victor was watching the whole situation and disobeyed orders to save Hanin from being raped by Yazid by blowing up the area once Hanin gets herself away.

We get a look at Cathy's work life and she tells one of her co-workers about Jack asking her out. She's clearly conflicted about it since he isn't her usual type. Plus, he used to work for her dad and aside from the helicopter ride apparently seems pretty ordinary to her.

While Jack and Sandrine get gas, Lt. Cluzet and Greer find Ali's car. They realize that he's switched vehicles and the

one he stole is at the gas station. Ali sees Jack looking into the vehicle and takes a shot just as Sandrine warns Jack. However, Sandrine gets shot and Jack goes to follow Ali. Ali gives Jack no choice other than to shoot him. When he gets back to the gas station, Sandrine is already dead.

When Jack and Greer get back to D.C., Jack goes out with Cathy. He knows the guy who runs the restaurant, Buster. He introduces Cathy to him and tells her a story about drinking his first beer there. She remembers his lengthy fake job title (something I can't even do) and he tells her that the job is pretty boring. Jack goes back to Cathy's place, clearly taking Greer's advice to not take his work home with him.

In Syria, we learn that Suleiman has been recruiting militia. However, he ends up taking the Americans and Al Radwan's men, too. He hadn't paid them in month's, so Suleiman easily buys

them off. He takes the prisoners back to his compound and beats Al Radwan in front of everyone including Samir.

Back in Paris, we see the funeral for Father Joseph, who was stabbed in the alleyway, and the church is completely packed. Intertwined with that is footage of the gas being put together to release and it looks like the church is the target for the attack. Three men walk out and trigger the devices. Chaos ensues and people start dropping like flies in the final scene.

Summary: After the horrific Paris church attack, Jack and Greer discover a deeper strategy behind Suleiman's actions, forcing Jack to suggest an unusual trap for him. Hanin faces new challenges in her quest for freedom.



The episode picks up with the church scene that closed out the previous episode. We see a video that Suleiman sent out saying that he didn't approve of women and children being killed. Jack blames himself for not getting the information out of Ali, even though it was unlikely he would've spilled the details anyway. Greer tells him that it's irrational and narcissistic to blame himself for the attack.

Jack figures out that the funeral was a set up and goes to Greer with the information. He and Greer find themselves in another meeting, this time about the church attack. During the meeting, Jack notices another connection to the game

that Ali contacted Suleiman with and wants to act like they're Ali.

Jack gets a call from work when he's on a date with Cathy. Later, when he's back at work, he starts playing the game to communicate with Suleiman. Suleiman bites and they feed him an address where he sends his other men. Ibrahim is the first to question whether or not it's actually Ali and starts backtracking the IP address, but the CIA has that covered.

However, Suleiman figures out that it is Jack talking to him and can't help but ask about Ali. He tells him that Ali is dead and he knows that Hanin left him. He does this to confirm that the woman at the camp in Turkey is in fact Hanin and it works like a charm.

In Nevada, the drone pilots get new targets and Victor is informed that the guy on the Vespa was a misidentified target. He takes it hard, but there's nothing he can do about it now. You can tell that the job is wearing him down day by day, though, and I imagine we'll see that explored further with the remaining episodes.

Victor and Ava go to a diner and he tells her that he's been told to take leave. Victor doesn't think it will solve anything and he reveals that he was in the top 3% for becoming a pilot and he was sent to the drone program. Ava tells him to get his mind right so she can be confident that he has her back.

After not seeing Hanin and the girls for an episode, we see them arriving in Turkey. The man Hanin speaks to tells her that they can't take anymore refugees. She sees her husband on the news before heading to their tent assignment. Meanwhile, Suleiman has combat training going on at the compound. He notices one of the men, Ismail, looks like he hasn't worn clean clothes in who knows how long. He tells him to clean himself up since they have water. We then get a flashback to him interviewing for a job back in 2001.

In another flashback to 2001, we see Mousa (before he was just known as Suleiman) and Ali together. Mousa takes a beating to keep him from going down on a gun charge. Prior to the flashback, Suleiman has a chat with Dr. Nagler, one of the prisoners. He tells him to make a list of what they all need and Dr. Nagler suggests a different treatment for Samir's diabetes.

Hanin finally talks to someone who will listen and she tells him who she is and why she needs political asylum. She then goes to see Mr. Sadik in his big fancy tent. She was sent there by Rifaat, her neighbor, to talk to him about getting to Europe. She gives him all of her jewelry to get her and her daughters out of there.

We then learn in a flashback to 2002 that Suleiman found God while in prison. Ali is surprised by this change of events, but it explains a lot about who he is now. That's the moment when everything first started for him and led to his status now.

Back in Turkey, we find out that Yazid isn't dead. He asks Mr. Sadik where they are and the last thing we see is Hanin and the girls in the back of a truck and then the truck drives off.

The episode starts with a scene in Liberia from six months earlier where a body is being dug up and we see an ebola sign. Whoever the person is, Ali and Suleiman had their reasons for digging them up. We then jump back to Hanin and the girls making their trek to Europe in less than pleasant conditions.

In Turkey, Jack and Greer are taken to the camp and we see Victor cross right in front of them as he gets in a cab to Syria. Hanin and the girls get to a stopping point where they only have 15 minutes to use the outdoor bathrooms. However, Yazid is there as well and when he

goes after them, Hanin knocks him into the pit that bathrooms dump in to.

Back in D.C., Cathy is looking into an ebola case from Liberia, which ties into the flashback we saw in the opening scene. She hops on a video call and we learn that the person whose case she was looking at is the one from the flashback earlier when Suleiman and Ali dug up the grave.

Lance takes Jack and Greer to a man named Tony who can help them locate Hanin. Tony has a hefty price for the information, however, Greer isn't afraid to negotiate down on his price. Jack

isn't thrilled to be doing business with him, but Greer tells him to go along with it. He does so in his own way on the drive to the stop.

At the stop, they learn that Hanin and the girls took off on foot. We see her and her daughters walking and she gets upset with Rama for wanting her dad there with them. Tony, Jack and Greer run into a little trouble taking Tony's shortcut. Jack takes it out on Tony and Greer takes charge to get the two back on track.

Victor's hefty taxi fare gets him to Syria and he finds the father of the man he killed on the scooter. He tells him what he's done and he's still invited inside. He wonders why he's being let inside. Victor goes to hand him money, but he doesn't take it and pours him some tea. The boy walks in with dozens of eggs and Victor pays them everything he has for them.

Hanin and the girls make it to the coast, but Yazid is there and spots them as they head to the boat. Yazid calls Suleiman and he only wants him to bring his daughters back. However, Tony, Jack and Greer show up just as they're getting on the boat. When Yazid let's go of Hanin, Greer shoots him in the head and gets all three of them.

Back at the Air Force base in Turkey, Jack informs Hanin that in order to stay in America, she needs to help him. She didn't know about the attack on the church, but she still knows about the compound's location. Jack tells her that he's going to do everything he can to get Samir back for her. That's what pushes her to give him the location.

Greer tells Jack about what happened to him in Karachi and how it all went wrong. It led to him being send back to HQ, but he's still found a way to get back into the field. He tells Jack that there has to be compromise and Jack won't accept that. Greer admits that he felt the same way once, too.

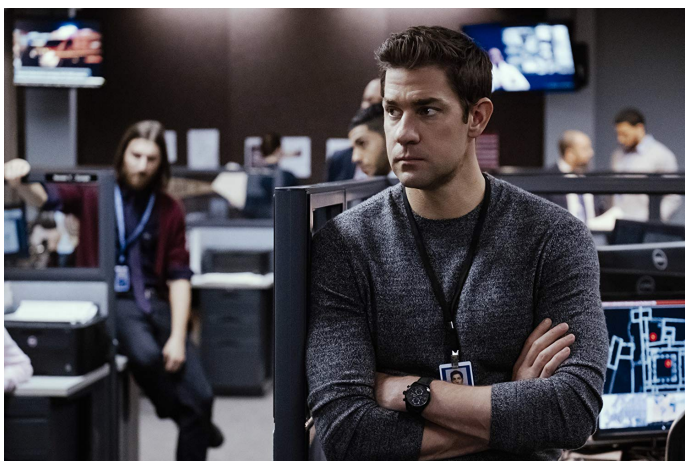

He definitely doesn't want to lie to her and it's actually nice to see him opening up about his past now. The boy he was trying to save is the one who took the helicopter down.

Suleiman and Samir make their way into the United States by way of Canada. Just after they arrive, we see the worker who finds the one container that was left behind by presumably Suleiman's men.

He dies shortly after getting to the hospital from the radiation. Meanwhile, Cathy stops by Dr. Nadler's room before going to check up on the President.

Jack figures out the Suleiman might not want to kill thousands of people. Instead, it is similar to the attack in Paris where he killed one man in order to kill the others. As of right now, though, it isn't clear how the Ebola and the cesium are connected. Knowing Jack, he's likely on the right track with his theory.

Samir is snooping around the warehouse when he finds a couple dead bodies and freaks out a bit. Suleiman is in an EMS uniform, which can't be good for anyone. Meanwhile, Jack asks Hanin about the cesium and tells her that Suleiman knew they were coming. Ibrahim walks into a pizzeria in Georgetown and lets off a bomb that he left behind in his bag. He didn't use the cesium, but we see Suleiman waiting to join the rest of the EMS crew. Jack realizes that the target is the hospital that Cathy works at since the President is there. Due to the chaos, Suleiman and his men are able to just slip right on in.

Just like Ali did before, the men hid what they needed inside the dead bodies that they brought with them. The plan is to release the cesium into a giant vent and it should reach the President within 30 seconds according to Ibrahim. However, they didn't account for Jack and Greer showing up and informing Secret Service of a threat.

Cathy pulls the fire alarm after seeing the text from Jack about getting out. Greer sees one of the men and he ends up in the elevator with Cathy. Thankfully Greer gets to the fourth floor in time to shoot him.

The episode begins with a ship in the South China Sea. It launches what looks like a missile.

24 hours later in Moscow, we see Jim Greer staggering across the city. He meets a Russian man, and gives him a new ID for his son, but claims he needs more intel. Jim wants to know more about the ship, believing it's sending an unregistered satellite over Venezuela. When he heads back to the street, Jim collapses.

And then we finally get introduced to Jack Ryan. He's a man with heavy stubble. Life looks to have taken its toll slightly. Jack is delivering a lecture on different perspectives in the media and hints that Venezuela has massive resources. Jack also mentions that Gloria Bonalde is running for President and may fix their issues. This scene was purely created to set the story. After his lecture, his friend, a Senator named Moreno, throws him a surprise party. It's his birthday.



Jack has a hunch and he raises it to the department heads alongside Moreno. Jack raises that Russia is secretly selling weapons to Venezuela, but he is brought back down to reality for not having enough evidence. Jack is tasked to visit Venezuela and asking President Reyes directly about the shipments.

We learn that Jim has a heart condition and he is lectured by his boss about his health. But Jim ignores the warning signs and continues gathering intel; he learns the ship he has been tracking was not Russian. He also learns that Jack is tracking the same vessel and immediately asks for reassignment to Venezuela. Our two characters did not take long to be

back together.

Jack and Moreno arrive in Venezuela and speak to President Reyes. Predictably, he denies all knowledge of Russia providing arms by shipment. In a side scene, a man, unknown by name, is asking about time frames and he receives keys to some storage units.

After a failed conversation with President Reyes, Jack is getting eyed up by a woman at the bar, but he is soon sidetracked by Jim. I have to raise that Jack looks ridiculously irritated that he cannot pursue the woman — he has one thing on his mind, just like last season. Both characters learn they are looking at the same ship.

Jack finally meets up with the woman giving him the "come to bed eyes" at the bar. She is called Lena and knows many languages. They soon sleep together, but after, while Jack is asleep, Lena (I assume that is not her real name) sneaks around his room and looks at the photos of the shipments. She bugs his room.

The episode concludes in tragic circumstances; Jack and Moreno's convoy is attacked, with explosives almost killing the entire crew. The unknown man from earlier is sniping them, with the risk of death imminent. Jack manages to escape the car, but Senator Moreno is sniped and killed. Jack is shaken, and traumatized, and has the task of ringing Moreno's wife.

Summary: The U.S. Special Activities team lands in Venezuela where Jack's intel leads them to a militia guarded compound. Deep in the jungle, Jack's search for answers puts the whole team in danger. President Reyes' opponent, Gloria Bonalde, proves to be a real contender in the upcoming election.



The episode begins with Marcus arriving at MacDill Air Force Base. He parks his truck and puts on a chain with his father's Navy ring on it. Then he grabs his pack and meets up with Maticce aka Not-John-Clark on the tarmac as they're loading the boat onto the transport plane. Marcus asks if they're going to Central or South America. Maticce says who said anything about either, and Marcus reminds him that he'd asked him how his Spanish was — it's a little rusty by the way. Maticce says he'd better get on board if he still wants a window seat.

Once under way, Marcus meets the other two operators — Coyote and Disco. Coyote asks Marcus what his call sign is,

and Marcus says "Black Mamba." Coyote's like, "oh, you mean like Kill Bill?" and Marcus is like, "No, like Kobe." But Coyote says the name sucks and comes up with a new one — since he's the driver, they'll call him "Uber." Marcus hates it and looks like he's already thinking of bailing.

With the obligatory rock-n-roll music playing, the plane approaches the drop zone. Maticce checks Marcus' parachute and does a terrible job at calming his obvious nerves. The other guys get themselves all psyched up with the stereotypical "Woo's!" and "Let's go muthaf\*\*kahs!" as the plane gets dropped first. Then the green light goes on and the guys all jump — except for Marcus,

who hangs back, still nervous. But then he kisses his Dad's ring and finally jumps, catching up with the other guys at the boat.

They get on board and start inspecting their gear — only to find several inches of water in the boat and their electronics (including the radios) ruined by the water. Marcus — who Coyote insists is still "Uber" despite Marcus' protests — checks it and says there's a crack in the fiberglass, but he can fix it. Not-John-Clark asks how long it'll take and Marcus just tells them all to get off the boat. They're all like, "Seriously?" But when it comes to the boat, he's in charge, Uber or not. So back in the water they go.

Meanwhile, at the embassy, Jack, Greer and November watch a press conference with President Reyes, displaying the 2 captured militia guys and their signed confessions to the murder of Senator Moreno. Ambassador Calabrese makes nice for the TV cameras, shaking Reyes' hand.

Jack says November can't possibly buy Reyes' BS story, and November agrees — a hit on an American senator isn't even close to the militia's "style or skill set." So he's disregarding the memo he's gotten from DC to stand down on the investigation. He says he's also got people checking the hospitals for any man coming in with an eye injury.

They head to the back of the embassy where they meet up with November's assistant, Jose and another guy who are going to escort them to the port. November says Jack getting jumped by the South African guy, Jost Van Der Byl definitely warrants further investigation.

Meanwhile, we finally get our introduction to Pres. Reyes' opponent, Gloria Bonalde, who's making lunches for her kids, Ily and Carlos. Ily complains about having to eat yet another ham sandwich — and before Gloria can even say anything, Carlos jumps in and says she should be grateful they even have ham, since so many other people in the country are starving.

They all rush out to the cars and Gloria hands out more ham sandwiches to all the drivers. She gets in her car with her assistant, Valentina, who tells Gloria the good news. Their numbers are up and several newspapers in neighboring countries are reporting that they have a real shot — something that the press in Venezuela won't cover because they're controlled by Reyes.

Down at the port, the guys all get badges, vests and hardhats and get waved in. In the back-seat, Jack finds a pill bottle on the floor — it's Greer's. Jack hides it and doesn't say anything. Once they park, Jack walks ahead as November asks Greer how Jack's doing. He's concerned that Jack's too personally involved. Greer tells him it was Jack who ran Suleiman down and killed him. Not sure that really answered the question, but November seems to be satisfied.

So they break in to the office of Cinco Palmas, only to find it's been thoroughly cleaned out — Greer remarks that even the floor's been swept. Jack says everything must've gone upriver with the shipment. As they head back to the truck, Greer says the SAD (Special Activities Division) guys are standing by at the mouth of the Orinoco River. Greer says he'll meet up with them and head upriver. Jack says he's going too, and November tells them he wants sit-reps at least every couple of hours.

Meanwhile, Marcus has the boat fixed and the bilge pumps working. He asks Not-John-Clark if he can be "Black Mamba" now and Coyote jumps in, saying they'll upgrade him to "Uber Select." To which Marcus replies by romping on the gas and nearly knocking them all overboard.

At Miraflores, Gen. Ubarri asks Pres. Reyes how he found out about the surveillance. Reyes says his head of security, Mateo Bastos told him, and from Ubarri's reaction, it's clear he doesn't think much of him. Ubarri asks again why Reyes didn't tell him about Sen. Moreno, and Reyes just says again that he didn't kill him. Ubarri then asks why the coerced confessions from the militia guys who obviously had nothing to do with the ambush? But Reyes just deflects by saying perhaps Ubarri thinks he can do a better job. Isn't that what he and his wife were saying on the recording?

Ubarri says he was upset that Reyes didn't seem to value his counsel anymore. Reyes says that he doesn't have the luxury of being self-righteous. Then Ubarri de-escalates the argument by talking about when they were both kids growing up in the Catia barrio — how Reyes caught Ubarri stealing food and made him give it back. Ubarri says Reyes always felt responsible for Venezuela, even back then. And Reyes says he'll continue to be — always.

Gloria Bonalde and her crew arrive at a rally where she's to give a speech. She's met by lots of fans and she greets them all, shaking hands and even posing for a selfie. But when she gets to the balcony where she's to speak from, she's stunned and even a little rattled when she sees the size of the crowd and how amped-up they are. But then she puts on her game face and goes out to thunderous applause.

Gloria talks to the people about how she originally decided to run for President as a protest, on behalf of her missing husband, who disappeared a year earlier. She says Reyes doesn't really want the revolution he keeps talking about and doesn't care that the people of Venezuela are suffering. But, she says, no matter what the people will be free. And the crowd goes wild. Little does Gloria know that Bastos is down there in the crowd too, watching and listening disapprovingly.

As they drive to the rally point, Jack asks Greer if there's anything he should know about. Greer says nope. So Jack then pulls out the pill bottle and Greer just snatches it back. He says if there was something Jack needed to know, then he would tell him.

As they wait for the boat, Jack complains about the mosquitoes and notes that they're not bothering Greer. Greer says he's a Louisiana boy and Jack says Greer originally told him that he was from Cincinnati. Greer just remarks how gullible Jack is. Jack says it shouldn't matter anyway — that mosquitoes are drawn to carbon dioxide, not place of origin. Greer just says the mosquitoes don't bother him because they know the deal — that he'll bite back.

Not-John-Clark and his crew finally arrive in the boat — and despite the circumstances, it's clear that he, Greer and Jack are all glad to see each other again. Maticce razzes Jack about being the doctor of economics who never gave him any stock tips. Jack replies that he just needs to get a good S&P 500 index fund. Maticce looks at him like, seriously? And then he starts complaining about the mosquitoes too. Greer hands him a bottle of bug repellent and Jack says, "oh, you bite back, huh?"

Maticce introduces everybody and Greer goes over the op — ISR (intelligence, surveillance, reconnaissance) only — "no cowboy stuff." They'll open up a few of the shipping containers, look for the weapons and Jack will check for anything radioactive. They'll take some photos of what they find and then they're out — no one will ever know they were there. Greer then adds that they have no air support — the boat is their only way in and out.

While having dinner with his wife, Cassandra, at a fancy Caracas restaurant, Ubarri tells her that their house is bugged. She asks by whom and he says that Reyes says it's the Americans — but he's not sure what to believe. Cassandra asks what they should do and Ubarri says they should just act normal. But they will have to make sure their daughter, Maria, doesn't say anything bad about Reyes. He doesn't want her to become a target. Cassandra says she would never be a target since Reyes is her uncle — but Ubarri doesn't look so sure.

Flashback time — we see a lovely dinner party at the Bonalde's place, back before Sergio went missing. Everyone's happy and buzzed on wine — and listening with rapt attention as Sergio speaks out about the government. Later, they're all sitting around drinking more wine and singing — and Sergio and Gloria dance together, very much in love. Then we cut to the present day, where Gloria sits in that same room, now empty, with nothing but photos and her memories.

Then it's nightfall on the Orinoco River as the team arrives at the cargo drop-off point — only to find that the containers have already been moved inland. They pick a spot to park the boat and Maticce lets them know that the radios are kaput — but they do have infrared beacons for everybody. As they head on shore, Maticce tells Marcus he's going to have to be ready to go as soon as he sees them coming.

The team then heads inland and soon comes across the militia camp and the containers. Greer says they'll search the ones on the outer edge of the camp. They sneak in and Jack grabs a set of bolt cutters out of Maticce's pack. He snaps the lock on one of the containers and they go in. Jack uses the Geiger counter, but there's nothing radioactive. There aren't even any weapons — just some major drilling equipment.

It's looking like a bust, but Jack says they need to keep looking. The camp guards are coming too close and Maticce says they need to leave. But of course, Jack just ignores him and goes for another container. This one has crates of ammonium nitrate fuel oil. Jack manages to snap a few photos on his phone before he's caught by Jost Van Der Byl — who recognizes him and asks if he's still looking for those coffee beans before he kicks Jack in the nuts.

Luckily, Maticce comes up behind Van Der Byl and they drag him away for some questioning. Van Der Byl won't say anything, so Disco and Coyote say they should just kill him and get the hell out. But Jack says Van Der Byl's an unarmed combatant and they can't do that.

So Greer jumps in and takes over, grabbing the bolt cutters and snipping off one of Van Der Byl's fingers. Yikes. Greer tosses the finger at a stunned Jack, saying now they have his DNA so they can identify him. Then they gag and hog-tie Van Der Byl and take off.

Back at the boat, Marcus hears a militia patrol approaching his position. Then he breaks the cardinal rule set down in *Apocalypse Now* — that is, "Never get out of the boat." He grabs his rifle and jumps out. And meanwhile, the militia guys have found Van Der Byl and are in pursuit of the team, with Van Der Byl saying they can't let them get back to the river.

As the guys are hauling a\*\* back to the boat, Greer's bad ticker starts acting up again. Jack has to push him forward so he's not lagging behind. Van Der Byl and his guys catch up and the shooting starts. Coyote takes a minor hit and goes down, and Jack goes back to grab him up. Matice gets to the boat first, only to find Marcus gone. He fires up the engine as everybody else jumps in.

Marcus hears the noise and starts back to the boat — but the guys already have the engine running and the lines cut. Matice says they'll come back for Marcus as they pull away from shore. And Marcus gets back just in time to see the boat racing away. He's officially stuck.

Back at Miraflores, Bastos updates Reyes on Gloria Bonalde, saying how she has the people's support and the latest polls show her numbers are up. Reyes sends him away as Ubarri comes in — and Reyes asks Ubarri to be honest with him and tell him if Bonalde can win. And Ubarri's reluctance to answer is the answer.

On the boat, Greer asks Jack what the hell he was doing. Jack says they were there to search the containers, and that's what he did. Then Greer finally admits to his heart condition and says the prognosis isn't great. He says it's why he had to leave Moscow. Jack asks who else knows, and Greer says other than him, just the COS in Moscow. Jack then asks what he's going to do about it — and Greer just says he doesn't know.

eliminate the team. Why? Because it has become too dangerous to continue. A cold war mentality in 1969. What is the project's name? Sokol.

Jack Ryan is now undercover, meeting an asset. Her name is Zoya, and he lights her cigarette. She immediately hands him a small chip that looks like it could go inside any smartphone. Zoya knows Jack is investigating the Sokol project, and now we learn why. She tells him it is a nuclear weapon developed to be undetectable by radar. As we read above, the project was scrapped in 1969 but has now been reactivated. Jack relays the information to James, who appropriately busts his balls in the process. Jack has a new boss who doesn't like heroes. Her name is Elizabeth

Wright, and she likes things done by the book. That's not Jack's style, as he went alone on an unsanctioned mission to meet Zoya.

Another subplot is the president of the Czech Republic, Alena Kovac, has meetings behind the scenes preparing for peace talks with the Russian Minister of Defense, Dmitry Popov. She is about to meet with them during the meeting of NATO and is between a rock and a hard place. Why? Because she is caught between pacifists and hard-liners. Yet, it turns out that she is being used as a pawn when she continues talking with Popov and escorts him to the biggest football match of the year.

A beautiful blonde woman sits at a bar for a while, waiting for a date that will never come. The bartender hits on her and sees an opportunity to make his move. It happens she has two tickets to the soccer match and was going to surprise the guy with him. So, he pours her a drink then and invites himself. When they arrive at VIP parking, he runs out, exclaiming how they can see the field from here.

That's when the woman attacks him from behind with a stun gun. While he sleeps, the woman's partner gets next to the car setting up his sniper rifle. A few moments later, he puts a bullet in Popov's head while talking to Kovac. When Kovac's security detail arrives where the shot was sent, the bartender is awake, is having trouble moving, and the agents leave the rifle in his hands. The agent puts two bullets into him. Something tells me he is also part of the assassination plot.

Jack has gotten word that Sokol is being delivered on a Russian freighter and has a SOG Team escort. In a great scene, they come on the ship with their SDV (Seal Delivery Vehicle), fire up some harpoons that stick the landing, and take a full 90-degree walk up the massive ship. However, a scientist named Yuri is inside when they locate the cargo. (Jack sees a small breathing tube coming out of the cargo).

They manage to get him off this ship, but barely with our hero having to jump off the ship after holding off a Russian attack. They arrive on the beach with an extraction team waiting for them. Jack then begins to question the scientist. Yuri has worked on Sokol for four years. The weapon is tiny, and he was part of the team working on reflection admissions. So yes, it's invisible to any radar. He refuses to answer questions further until he is granted asylum. That's when what we can only imagine is a Russian kill team shows up. They take out the entire team except for Jack and Yuri.

And that doesn't last for long. When they get into Greece, they are chased again, and when they abandon the car, Yuri is shot in the back when they try to find cover inside an apartment building. Jack drags him up the stairs and safely escorts a father and son from the floor. That's when the assassins show up, kill Yuri, and Jack runs for his life. As he shoots terrible guys, jumps from rooftops, and through windows, he accidentally shoots a police officer. However, he still reached the safehouse where Elizabeth told him to go, but when he arrived, he spotted a couple of people watching the place. What is going on?

The episode opens again with The General's second in command, Luka, looking over the dozens of dead bodies inside Matoksa. We now know that Luka is the same older man we saw in the first episode. A soldier questions the validity of these killings. Luka tells him they were traitors, but why did The General call them heroes? The young soldier tells him he will not forget about it after Luka tells him he will be able to. Luka slowly walks up to him and tells him he will.

Later, Luka travels around the room, collecting one personal item from each person and placing them in a wooden box. When he delivers them to the families, he tells them there was a terrible accident. Each family member cries, another accuses him of the murder, and one woman does not react after losing her husband. (Luka hands her the man's wedding photo). This is curious, so he demands to come in and finds the scientist hiding in the bedroom with their two children. Luka smiles.

James is in Italy. He stops at a local bakery and hands a woman five thousand dollars in an envelope, in which she gives him coffee and a pastry. I think he overpaid, but apparently, she is a courier who can deliver money to Jack in need. He leaves, throws the pastry out, and meets his boss at the airfield, who busts his balls for not being there sooner. James makes it clear he does

not like her. She tried to burn him years ago, and now she burns Jack. The difference between agents like them and this desk agent is her decisions not made in the field and not under a microscope.

Jack Ryan is loose in Greece and tracking the blonde hitman who killed Yuri. He follows him, takes a picture of him, and catches our guy from the corner of his eye. At first, I thought this was a setup by Ryan to capture the man somehow since it was such an awkward setup, and he wasn't necessarily running for his life. However, he gets a couple of bullets to zing by his head, manages to escape, and sends the picture off. He later finds the broker and retrieves the money from Greer. Ryan sends off a message, which I am sure is a car dealership front for the CIA. There is also a note to go to the address where Jack meets a new friend — Tony! The last time we saw him was in the first season.

This is a con game, as Greer sent Jack there. When Greer and Elizabeth approach, Greer plays the bad cop, and Tony plays the cocky criminal. They spot the blonde hitman in the distance. They sit at Tony's place when they leave and watch the police raid Tony's shop. Luckily, Tony hides him in a secret compartment under a car. Jack takes Tony's truck a few hours later and meets an old friend at an airfield — Mike November! He flies Jack out to a location unknown.

Now, the Russian president, Surikov, visits with their intelligence, and Luka tells the new defense minister, Alexi Petrov, something is going on and thinks it wasn't the Americans. We later see Kovac's head of security, Radek, who shot the patsy in the first episode, look guilty, and she notices. Kovic tells him it wasn't his fault, but little does she know he is about to meet the assassin in a junkyard. The man looking for payment is completed with two bullets in the chest. He then calls his contact and tells them it's done.

How do we find out who ordered Popov's murder? The man pulling the strings? For that, we must find out who was on the other end of the phone call. Any guesses about who is on the other end of the line? It was Petrov, the new defense minister of Russia! But hold on, what about the woman who hand-delivered the patsy? Keep that in your back pocket for now.

Of course, Luka is now a fool, and he knows that they are behind it. However, when Petrov brings him in, he says he has no problem with Popov being eliminated, but it was handled poorly. Petrov respects his opinion but wants his help. With what? After catching the American, Jack Ryan has a red notice on his head.

Radek takes her to a location that is unclear at first. While Kovac is scared, Radek ensures her that he is her friend and she is his President. He is doing this for both of them. He needs the help of a local United States Army officer to intercept it. The plan is to block the truck's path in an underground tunnel. They also kill the lights. If they can get the bomb to go off in this area, it will contain the blast. The play goes according to plan, but the two officers use their truck to block the path and run out of the tunnel for their lives.

There was not enough time for them to make it, so Jack drove an Army Jeep into the danger zone to give them a lift. He manages to get the vehicle towards the end of the tunnel, but Sokol goes off when the enemy drives the bomb right at the Army truck blocking its path. Vova confesses he asked too many questions and was told he had to do the deed. Greer shows him mercy and doesn't put a bullet in his head.

Summary: Jack, Greer, Wright, Alena and Luka all work in concert to prevent the start of a third world war.



Greer, November, and president Kovac are now headed to the Kremlin Tunnels in Moscow. Elizabeth is in the situation room with the President, trying to convince him to let her back into the conversation. And Jack is trying to land on a heavily armed United States Navy ship in the Baltic Sea. At the same time, Luka is headed to the destroyer, where his former soldier is commanding.

Jack gets a ride from some Army Rangers on a helicopter trying to get on board the Naval Warship. The United States Commander of the vessel will not

let Jack onboard. So, the Ranger asks Jack how important it is that he gets on that ship. Jack's response? "Life or death," he says. So, the Ranger tosses him into the sea. Now, the ship's Commander, Bennett, is required by law to pick him up. When Jack gets aboard and puts some dry

clothes on, the officer doesn't want to hear about any conflict, nor does he want Jack to tell him not to pick a fight with Russia. Jack's response? The Commander's argument has nothing to do with Russia at all.

That's when a petty officer tells them that a Russian ship is headed their way. The officer wants to know why that concerns him, so Jack tells him. The unauthorized coup happening in Russia intentionally escalated tensions in the Baltic. Before more information comes out of her mouth, Jack tells him it's a lone ship called the "Fearless," and the coup is counting on the ship's Commander to follow his standard rules of engagement. Jack also lets him know that the coup has a psychological write-up on him and knows he can easily anticipate his every move.

Meanwhile, Luka is on that Russian ship being commanded by his old soldier, Antonov. He is armed with a pistol, and when he enters his target's quarters, he is also sitting there with an armed guard. Luka is then taken into custody. Petrov arranges a sitdown with the cabinet to vote Surikov out of office. Greer enters the Kremlin illegally, memorises a number on a sheet of paper before burning it, and then intentionally puts the wrong passcode into a security door, signalling for the Kremlin officers to arrest him. Finally, November and Kovac are taken through a back entrance to meet the Russian President.

This is all a coordinated effort to stop the coup known as "Crossbow," and the final piece is Jack Ryan. The man guarding Luka is the executive officer, the only person on the ship who has the power to question and overrule Antonov. He comments don't you find that strange? Greer is taken to holding at the Kremlin, and Petrov walks in. Greer tells him he knows about the coup and is here to offer him asylum with an apartment in New York City or Miami to stop the madness. At the same time, Kovac and November are in the Russian President's office playing the recording of Petrov talking about the plan to overthrow him and bring Russia back to its former glory.

This triggers a chain reaction. A Kremlin agent comes in and tells Petrov the President would like to see him. He now looks worried, walks out, and after going up a small flight of stairs, he sees Surikov's protective team from both sides. He grabs a gun, but before he can fire, he is shot dead. Luka is let out of his cell, and the executive officer accompanies him to the bay where Antonov is starting to fire upon the United States warship. Antonov cannot explain to anyone why he would be starting this action without command center directives. Antonov overrules his second in command and fires on the ship. Bennett fires countermeasures to pick off the armed missile.

This leaves the United States no time to defend itself, so they must shoot now, and the President has permitted them to attack if fired upon. Ryan pleads with Bennett not to take the bait but refuses to listen and has his orders. Finally, Antonov is taken into custody, the second in command takes over the ship, and Luka can communicate with the Warship that Antonov has been arrested. Ryan makes sure to ask Luka pointedly, is Russia at war with the United States? Luka responds that is up to you. Bennett takes a moment and decides not to fire upon the ship known as Fearless.

Summary: Jack, given the task of cleaning up the CIA, makes difficult decisions that have immediate consequences. A cartel operator moves in the shadows to organize an important meeting.



The episode begins in the country of Myanmar (formerly Burma), where guys in black drag a man with a hood over his head into a dungeon. The guys in black suspend him crucifixion-like and pull off the hood — it's Jack! He looks like he's already been beaten up, but then the guys in black pull out a car battery and jab him with the jumper cables, electrocuting him. Yikes. Now there's a way to start.

So how did we get to that? Well, we start three weeks earlier in Lagos, Nigeria. A special ops-looking team scours the

wall of the Presidential Palace while another man in some undisclosed location watches them from a small tech suite. The team takes out the guards and enters the building while the tech guy directs them to a bedroom. The team shoots the President in bed and takes a photo of him.

As they're taking a blood sample, the alarms go off. The team attempts to escape but gets surrounded. A firefight ensues and they call out to the tech guy for help. But he just shuts everything down on his end and leaves the suite, in an office labeled "Biz Hub." A receptionist calls him Mr. Walters on his way out the door. Once in the elevator, Mr. Walters makes a call saying simply, "DNA pending, target eliminated."

At a casino back in Myanmar, the man on the receiving end of the call, named Chao Fah, then makes a call saying simply, "The Lagos shipping lanes are cleared."

Back in D.C., Jack and Elizabeth Wright, who's now Acting Director of the CIA, take a meeting with President Bachler regarding the incident in Lagos. Jack and Wright tell the Prez there's not much to go on as far as who's responsible for the assassination. One of the team was captured though, and his equipment was all American. Uh-oh. Wright tells the Prez a rival warlord is the most likely culprit, but given Lagos' valuable natural resources, it could be anyone.

The Prez warns Wright and Jack about how they're now responsible for any actions taken by the former CIA Director, Miller. We all remember that schmuck, right? Anyway, confirmation hearings to approve Wright as the new CIA director are about to begin. The Senate Intelligence Committee wants a briefing on Lagos ASAP, which falls on Jack. The Prez makes a witty remark about Jack being ready for politics, to which he replies, "God forbid."

Meanwhile, in a church somewhere in the Yucatan in Mexico, a man stands over an ornately decorated box. Any Tom Clancy aficionados and anyone who saw the trailer for this season will recognize him as fan favorite Domingo "Ding" Chavez. He takes the box to the home base of the Perez Cartel, where a party's going on and follows the cartel's head to his bedroom. And before the drug lord can get busy with a couple of barely-clothed models, Ding walks in with the box and just says, "Hola."

Back on Capitol Hill, Jack sits before the Senate Intelligence Committee. The Senator in charge, Henshaw, asks Jack if the CIA was involved in Lagos' President's assassination. Jack says he has no reason to believe the CIA was involved, but at the moment he has no concrete answers. Sen. Henshaw asks if that concerns Jack, and he replies, "No ... it terrifies me."

Jack elaborates, saying that the CIA is in very real danger of becoming more easily controlled by interests both foreign and domestic — interests that would use the agency for their own gains. But President Bachler has chosen him and Wright to stop this from happening. And that he and Wright believe that the CIA cannot and should not exist unless its only interest is that of the American people. Which is a very Jack Ryan kinda thing to say.

Then another senator, Jennings, starts grilling Jack about his actions in Russia. Jack just replies that he doesn't report to them and doesn't see the point in bringing it up. Sen. Jennings says his actions indicate that he may very well be part of the problem and not the solution. She asks Jack that if going rogue is his way of handling things, why should they expect anything to change? And Jack replies they shouldn't. Not yet.

Meanwhile, back in Mexico at the base of the Marquez cartel, Ding meets up with his cousin, Rodrigo Marin, who also works for the cartel. He takes the box to Marquez, and we finally get to see what's in the box — Perez's severed hands, including his ring, which Marquez takes a photo of.

Ding and Marin do a walk-and-talk and Ding asks why they took the photo. Marin says Perez's hands are the keys to Southeast Asia — to the Silver Lotus Triad, which they will now control. Marin says he's been invited to something called "The Marketplace" to meet their contractors. With Perez dead, the Marquez cartel is the last one standing, and the Triad's way into the United States.

Back in Myanmar, Chao Fah oversees the production of what looks like computer equipment. An older colleague, named Tin Tun walks in and asks Chao Fah about the timeline. Chao Fah tells Tin he's missing the point. They're creating an invisible network, something new and unique that will open the floodgates of America and the rest of the world. Tin says yeah, whatever, as long as they're making money. Chao Fah tells Tin he has no vision, and Tin says he's survived the game a lot longer than him.

Back in D.C., Jack arrives home, and who should open the door to his place but Cathy Mueller. Yep, Cathy's back, and from the look of things, she and Jack have been together for a while. Over wine and takeout, Cathy says she's going to be taking over as a keynote speaker at some World Health Organization (WHO) conference and there's some big foundation interested in a partnership. Info dump complete; remember that for later. Cathy says Wright's lucky to have Jack, but given how the hearing went, Jack's not so sure.

Then Greer shows up, and he's just as surprised as we are to see Cathy back. She takes her leave, and the guys sit down to scotch and shop talk. Jack jokes that when he gets fired, he and Greer should open their own PI agency. Greer talks about former director Miller, and how he scrambled his files with some weird code that only he and his staff knew. But fortunately, Greer knows how to figure it out.

Back in Myanmar, Chao Fah and his brother-in-law/assistant Soe Wai go to his office. Chao



puts a media card into his phone and sees the photo of Perez's severed hands. Chao leaves telling Soe they're going to Mexico.

Back in Mexico, Ding arrives at a divey beach cantina and talks to a police lieutenant, Morales. Morales warns Ding that his superiors want him to seize the Marquez operation's lab. Morales then demands double his usual payment to stay away. Ding agrees, but also warns Morales that when he gets too greedy, he'll "chop your head off in front of your f\*\*\*ing family." Yow.

In Myanmar, Chao Fah arrives home and does an info dump with his brother-in-law about how they're going to Mexico to inspect the lab and see how a shipment goes through. Chao tells Soe that they have to be careful with everything changing and that the only thing that matters is family. But Chao needs to see Marquez in person, to look him in the eyes, to know if he'll be strong enough to handle the new partnership.

Once inside the house, Chao's wife, Kyi Fah, comes out and just says, "Now?" and Chao just replies, "Now." Okay.

Back at CIA, Jack and Greer muddle through Miller's files, but Greer says there's an extra layer of coding going on that he can't translate. Jack says there are nine operations that they know about, but no evidence of their existence. Jack says the only common denominator is a company called Mainland Renewables. Suddenly realizing he's late, Greer excuses himself to go to his ex-wife Jasmine's house for dinner.

At the awkward dinner table with Jasmine and his two grownup kids, Ashley and James Jr., Greer tries to get the small talk going about school, but Junior isn't having any of it and leaves. With dinner officially over, Greer thanks Jasmine for trying and both agree it was good to see each other.

Jack calls Wright late that night and tells her how they can't figure out which one was involved in the Lagos President's death. Jack says the only way to find out is by cutting off the money to all of them. Wright gives her approval.

Back in Mexico, Ding says a few prayers and then meets with the rest of his team. He shows them where the meeting with Chao Fah is happening and where they'll all be. Their mission is to grab somebody and get the hell out quickly.

Ding then gets in a car with Marin, who tells him he should've told him he was changing the plan. Ding tells him the Triad can't be underestimated, how their pirate way of doing things has made them one of the most powerful forces in the world. Meanwhile, Lt. Morales logs into his bank account expecting to see the payment from Ding but instead finds the account shut down.

On their way to the meet, Chao Fah sends a text to his wife asking if she's there yet and she says almost. Chao and Soe arrive at the port and meet the cartel guy who takes them through the lab and explains how they're using an organics company to hide their dealings. He also says how glad they are to have the Triad's high-quality product. Chao Fah doesn't seem all that impressed.

Ding and Marin arrive at the dock and introduce themselves to Chao Fah. As Ding's team moves into position, Marin tells Chao that Marquez will meet with him alone at his hacienda. But just then, Morales and his guys arrive in a couple of police boats and start a shootout with the cartel guys. Chaos ensues, and everybody scatters. Ding and Chao Fah get separated, and we realize it's Chao Fah who Ding and his team were there to rescue.

Ding's guys tell them they have to abort, and after one of their guys gets hit, Ding reluctantly agrees. He runs off one way with the team and Chao Fah and Soe go the other, jumping into one of the other vehicles and speeding off. Chao texts his wife as they escape, just as she and their daughter are about to board a plane. He tells them the plan's changed and to stay put.

The next morning, Jack's out rowing the Potomac. When he brings his boat back in, Wright shows up and tells him about the port shootout in Mexico. That night, Wright, Jack and Cathy go to a gala fundraiser for the Nigeria Foundation.

Wright finds her way into an ongoing conversation between Zeyara Lemos of the Lemos Foundation and a suave lobbyist named Ade Osoji. They politely argue about the status of Lagos and how the assassination of the President has emboldened another local warlord. Wright challenges Osoji about what the right thing is to do, and he only says "to not look away" before excusing himself. Lemos tells Wright Osoji is one of her advisors.

Meanwhile, Sen. Henshaw meets Jack at the bar and hints around about the shootout in Mexico, saying he hopes Jack and Wright are really the "change" that the agency needs. Wright meets up with Jack and Cathy and introduces them to Lemos, who briefly rubs shoulders with

Cathy, saying how great the WHO's support is and that she'll be at the relief conference where Cathy will be speaking.

Then Jack and Cathy go back to his place, where Ding appears and points a gun to the back of Jack's head. He warns him that he has 24 hours to turn Operation Pluto back on.

Jack shows up at work at Langley and recruits a tech guy from his old office at TFAD (Terror Finance and Arms Division). They go back to Jack's office, and he has the guy mine through old files to find anyone involved in Operation Pluto.

Apparently having found his way back to Myanmar, Chao Fah and Soe Wai go to see Tin Tun to find out what to do and get into a pissing contest over who's got more power. Chao is the new blood; Tin is the old. Tin orders him to stay put, but Chao insists on going home since his wife has

no idea he's still alive after the Mexico shootout.

Jack and the tech guy find a profile for Ding Chavez, and Jack tells him to pull everything they have on him. Then he leaves and runs into Wright, who wants his help on her opening statement to the Senate Committee. Jack says he has to take care of something else first. He gets in his car and finds a newspaper with "Fork Park" written on it.

Chao goes home and warns his wife Kyi Fah not to talk, implying that the house is bugged. Chao gives his little daughter Bennu a plush bunny she can tell all her secrets to. He tells her that if anyone asks, they didn't go to the airport; they went to the doctor because she was feeling sick.

Jack shows up at the ballfield at Fork Park and meets Ding. Jack tells him the money for Operation Pluto is gone. Ding goes to leave, saying he has no use for him then. But Jack asks about Miller, and if he reported to him. Ding says they were run by a guy named Walters who he thought was CIA, but apparently wasn't. Jack says Ding's probably the most dangerous operator the CIA's ever had and needs his help to figure out "how deep Miller's rot goes." Ding suggests they grab a bite.

Chao Fah goes to see their local doctor and tells him to say that Kyi Fah and Bennu came to see him because Bennu was sick. Chao vaguely threatens the guy before taking a phone call and tells whoever's on the other end that he's going to talk to Miller.

Ding tells Jack about Chao Fah, the Silver Lotus Triad, and how he embedded himself in the Marquez cartel with the help of his cousin, Rodrigo Marin. Ding says whoever was running their team in D.C. was in the Triad's pocket. Ding also tells Jack about Chao Fah and how he's trying to get himself and his family out. But Ding has no way of contacting him. Ding says he's going to get to Miller to find out what's really going on.

Jack tells him to let his guy take care of it instead — his guy, of course, being Greer. He finds Miller hanging out at a bar somewhere. Awkward small talk leads to Greer asking about Operation Pluto, at which time a spooked Miller takes his leave. He says if Greer brings it up again he'll make sure he and Jack "take the fall for it."

Meanwhile, at a place called only "Undisclosed Location," our ol' buddy Mike November is trying to see how long he can stay underwater at some hot springs-type place. While the locals are all weirded out by his awesomeness, Mike answers his "Ride of the Valkyries" ringtone to take Jack's call.

Meanwhile, the mysterious Mr. Walters is in the middle of his granddaughter's recital when he gets a call from Miller, who tells him about Jack and Greer looking into Pluto. Walters coldly warns him not to call again "until it's official."

Miller goes home and logs into some foreign banking site, where he takes down the numbers of a bunch of transactions which turns out to be a code. He calls Chao Fah who's all like, what the hell's going on? Miller says Chavez has gone dark. Chao says he was nearly killed in Mexico and that the Triad thinks he's responsible. Miller says it was Jack who shut the operation down. Chao says to turn the op back on or get out of there.

Just as Miller says, "I don't even know if Chavez is alive," Chavez answers from behind him, "I am." Ding takes a swig of Miller's scotch and shows him the dog tags of his dead men, telling Miller he's the one who killed them. At the WHO conference, Cathy finishes giving her speech and meets up with Zeyara Lemos, who wants to set up a lunch meeting. Cathy's giddy with delight.

Jack meets with Wright and tells her about Ding. She says they have to let someone else know — President Bachler. They tell him about Ding, Pluto, Miller and how he's an asset to the Triad. Jack tells him that Miller was using Ding's team to eliminate the Triad's competition. And that the Triad plans to use the Marquez cartel's infrastructure for their own benefit.

Jack says that the Triad's plans are far worse than drugs. They're after convergence — fusing the cartel with a terrorist organization. Wright says the Triad's creating an open market, where with their resources and the cartel's access to America, they can move anything and everything, from weapons to suicide bombers.

Jack says their best bet is to get Chao Fah on their side. But in the meantime, if anything about the operations gets pinned on Wright, Jack says for the Prez to blame him instead. The Prez then talks to Wright privately about meeting with the new president of Lagos to send the "right message" that the CIA director no longer sits in "an ivory tower."

Jack gets a message to meet Miller that night and Jack tells Ding, who says he won't go because if he does he'll kill him. Meanwhile, Wright calls Ade Osoji and asks if he would join her on the trip to Lagos as an advisor. He coyly says he'll think about it. Wright just as coyly says sure, I'll give you a few hours. She then heads to the confirmation hearing and gives her speech, talking about her growing up in multicultural Queens and being in the middle of conflicts that she wanted to be able to mediate.

Meanwhile, Jack's at the park meeting with Miller, who tells him to turn Pluto back on. Jack says he won't put Ding right back where he was. Miller says he was promised results if certain targets were eliminated — bigger busts, lower crime rates. And those results were delivered. Miller asks Jack who it is he thinks he really works for, and when he responds, "the American people," Miller looks like he's ready to puke.

Jack says he can help him, just put him in contact with who's really in charge and Miller's like, yeah right, I'd be dead as soon as I made the call. Jack refuses to turn the op back on and says that whoever's in charge if it goes as high as Miller says, is probably already watching them. Somehow not realizing this already, Miller takes off. Ding calls Jack and says since his way didn't work, he'll try his way.

Meanwhile, Wright's voice talks about how the CIA is a "weapon of peace" which she'll wield through transparency and honesty. She says the cynicism and greed that are taking over the world are trying to do the same at the CIA and she promises, "Not on my watch."

A spooked Miller goes home and starts packing up only to be choked out by Mr. Walters, who forces him to swallow a bunch of pills and booze before injecting him with some drug. By the time Ding gets there, Miller's dead.

Wright finishes her speech by promising that there are those like herself, who will not give up and work tirelessly to keep the American people safe.

Jack and Greer get to Miller's place only to find Ding there, saying they're too late. "Now they're gonna come for me," he says and then walks off.

Summary: Jack's team heads to Mexico to get answers. Wright attempts to smooth things over in Nigeria, hoping to find some resolution of her own.



The episode starts on a news story covering the chaos in Nigeria resulting from President Udo's assassination. The report says a warlord by the name of Ekon Ameh and the death squads supporting him are unleashing havoc. Ameh's expected to try and oust the new president, Okoli.

Turns out it's Acting Director Wright watching the news story while on her way to Lagos with lobbyist Ade Osoji. Osoji says he appreciates being invited though it's not a typical CIA kinda thing to do. Wright agrees but says that she needs to

have someone with her who understands the country as well as President Okoli. Osoji quickly corrects her and says, "Better than he does." Wow, conceited much?

Wright asks about his background. He says he was born in Lagos, in extreme poverty. He saw his father killed and almost became a soldier. But then Mormon missionaries came and helped restore the village and made it possible for him to go to school.

Osoji tells Wright that President Okoli feels he must carry on President Udo's objectives of regaining Nigeria's resources for its people. But Okoli's blind to letting the country evolve. Osoji says Nigeria isn't just a country, it's a strategic hub that all world powers would like to possess. Then Wright gets a call informing her that former Director Miller is dead.

In Myanmar, Chao Fah also gets the news about Miller. His brother-in-law Soe Wai comes in and says the new shipment's in. Chao tells him to handle it, but Soe says Tin Tun wants Chao there. Chao's ready to blow it off, but Soe says he thinks Chao had better go.

Back at Jack's place in D.C., Greer is there and asks Jack what he's gonna tell everybody about Miller. Jack says he has no idea. Greer looks at the newspaper saying Miller committed suicide and everybody seems okay with running with that for now. Just then, Mike November shows up with coffee for everybody, and Greer's literally like, WTF is he doing here?

Jack says they need the help, especially now that they know the convergence theory isn't just a theory. They need to find Ding Chavez. Greer's like, yeah, right. He has known guys like Ding his whole career. He won't be found if he doesn't want to be.

But Jack's confident since he thinks he already knows what Chavez is up to — he's going to find Chao Fah. So they need to find him too. Jack asks them to wish him luck on the way out the door. Then we cut to San Luis Obispo, California, where Ding shows up at his uncle Enrique's to grab some guns and money he has stashed.

In Myanmar, Chao and Soe arrive at the port to meet Tin Tun, who says the "powers that be" have requested that Chao inspect the shipment. Turns out the shipment is a group of women. Trying to hide his disgust as they prepare to use a firehose on them, Chao says he won't do it there. When Tin Tun asks why, Chao coolly covers with, "because sometimes they catch a chill and die."

At the White House, Jack meets with a frazzled President Bachler, who's understandably upset about Miller. Jack says Miller wasn't a spy, he was more of a puppet. The Prez wants to know who for, but Jack doesn't know yet. And then he tells him the only way he'll be able to find out — is to quit.

Of course, the Prez is like, what, now? Jack says that the Senate Intelligence Committee has their sights set on him and he needs to step away in order to protect Wright. The Prez is like, so I'm supposed to just leave that position open? And Jack's like, don't worry, I got you a perfect replacement.

Cut to perfect replacement Greer showing up at his son's football game. Junior's pleasantly surprised to see him there, but then Greer gets a call from the Prez no less and of course, has to leave. So he's just messed up another opportunity to make things right with his son as Junior watches his dad take off.

Wright arrives at the Presidential Palace in Lagos and meets President Okoli, who says he watched her speech. He says if she's sincere, she'll be the most enlightened director the CIA's had since its inception. He asks Wright what it's like to be a black woman in her position in America. She simply and eloquently replies, "Empowering... stressful... isolating."

Just then, warlord Ekon Ameh walks in, and Wright's taken way off guard. Ameh says he's there to let her know his hands are clean. He didn't kill President Udo, and Wright says, "Neither did we." Okoli says that's the real reason she's been called there — to find out who did.

Back in Cali, Ding's getting ready to leave when he senses somebody behind him. He whirls around, gun trained — on Mike November, who's got a gun on him too. Mike says Jack sent him, and Ding's like, how'd you find me? Mike says Jack told him about a tattoo on Ding's arm. He did the research, which led him to Uncle Enrique. Ding's impressed. Mike's like, yeah, I know. I'm an impressive guy.

Back in Myanmar, Chao Fah and his wife Kyi talk outside where the bugs can't pick them up. Kyi asks when Chao's gonna contact Ding to get them out. Chao says he doesn't even know if Ding's still alive. Even if he is, everyone is watching them, including her brother. Chao says he needs to convince Tin Tun that he isn't a traitor but isn't quite sure how to do it yet.

Wright calls Greer, who's now at Langley settling into his new gig as Deputy Director. Wright tells him one of President Udo's assassins had a burner phone on him and to find out who it belonged to. Then she congratulates him and tells him to stop calling her "ma'am." Greer drops his tough-guy façade long enough to say how honored he is to have the job.

Wright meets with Okoli again and warns him about following President Udo's path, saying that he might be the next in line for assassination. She says perhaps compromise might be the best way forward, and he asks if that's how she attained her position. But she says she hasn't yet attained her position.

Back at Langley, tech guy Patrick tells Greer about one phone number that keeps popping up in the burner phone's records — Biz Hub. Then Jack walks in to congratulate Greer and gets a call from Mike, saying he found Ding. So Jack dashes back out, on his way to Cali.

Greer goes out to Biz Hub in Bethesda and talks to the receptionist guy. He finds out that Biz Hub is just one of the offices in the flex space, which houses a bunch of small businesses. Greer gets a list of the offices and leaves — and who should be watching him but the mysterious Mr. Walters, who calls somebody asking what should be done.

Jack arrives at the Chavez's place and meets Uncle Enrique, who asks if Jack will keep his nephew safe. Jack says he was hoping it would be the reverse, actually. Jack tells Ding they



need to talk but Ding's like, later. He wants to enjoy the evening, since he may not get another chance to have a nice evening. So have a beer and shut up, Jack. The next morning, Jack finds Ding out doing some target practice and tells him the Prez has charged him with stopping the convergence threat.

Jack says Chao Fah is the only way to do it, and the only way to him is through Ding. Ding says he has no way to contact Chao directly, so they'll have to send a signal. Jack asks what kind of signal and Ding's like, well, I figured I'd climb the Triad's operational ladder and burn every rung all the way to the top. Ding also says his cousin Marin knows about The Marketplace, where he first met Chao Fah. So they'll have to go to Mexico. Jack calls Cathy on his way to the jet but can't reach her.

Cathy's in the middle of her lunch meeting with Zeyara Lemos, who talks about the casinos in Myanmar, how they launder money for drug dealers and human traffickers, and how drug usage is ruining the country. Lemos says if only someone like Cathy was around when her mother was young, what a different life she would've had.

Lemos says the WHO (World Health Organization) is the only organization willing to risk its safety to help, and asks Cathy if she would be that help. Cathy says she's learned that "risk isn't the downside of a relationship. It's the foundation," and agrees. Hmm. Think maybe she was talking about Jack?

Back in Myanmar, Soe drives Chao Fah out to a wooded area and tells him he knows he's trying to get out with Kyi and Bennu. Chao asks what he plans to do, and Soe says he'll let him go. Chao's like, "let me go?" And Soe's like, yup. We'll go to work like usual and you just leave. Chao's like, what about my family? And Soe's like, they'll stay in Myanmar with him. Chao offers to take Soe with them, but he's like, nope.

So Chao agrees to do things his way — and then shoots him.

Meanwhile, Ding arrives at that same dive cantina in Mexico to meet Lt. Morales and drops a duffel full of cash on the table. Ding tells Morales he needs him to get to Marin. They go to the police's warehouse where Jack and Mike are waiting. Morales gets them uniforms and weapons, so they look like police officers. Mike's psyched, saying he always wanted to be a Federales. Jack's like, oh, so CIA was second on your list? Mike's like, fourth. Ah, the awesomeness that is Mike.

In Lagos, Wright has a drink with Osoji, and he asks what she's willing to sacrifice to get her confirmation. And he suggests that the reason she's there is to show the world how she's different. Wright says she's different because she faces the world without pretense. She says it's not a sacrifice, it's realism.

Tech guy Patrick finds Greer waiting for him at his favorite coffee shop and tells him he needs him to decipher Miller's secret code. He also says he needs to find the connection to Biz Hub — oh, and for Patrick to switch to decaf.

Back in Mexico, the cops blast their way into the port and Morales confiscates everything. Then a very unhappy Marin shows up and demands to know WTF is going on. Morales leads him to a room where Jack, Mike and Ding are waiting. Marin says Ding's a traitor to the memory of his father and Ding's like, yeah, well, all the memories I have of my father are bad ones.

Then Jack asks him about The Marketplace, and Marin's like, who the hell are you? Jack introduces himself and Marin has no idea who he is. But then Mike snaps a photo and Jack's like, I don't think the cartel will like seeing you hanging out with the CIA.

Marin plays dumb about The Marketplace, so Ding grabs him and shoves him into a machine that wraps his head in plastic. After nearly suffocating to death, Marin gives up the location — Dubrovnik, Croatia. Ding thanks him and then asks for the password to his phone. When Marin hesitates, Ding flicks out a knife and says he could just take off his thumb instead.

Meanwhile, back in Myanmar, Chao Fah shows up at Tin Tun's place and dumps Soe's dead body on the floor, saying "I found your mole." Yikes.

Back on the plane, Jack calls Wright and tells her they're headed to Dubrovnik to find Chao Fah. Wright says she won't be able to help him since he quit, and Jack's like, I know.

Greer tries calling his son, who's understandably pissed. Greer apologizes for leaving the game but his son's like, whatever, and hangs up. Then there's a knock at the door and who should it be but the mysterious Mr. Walters, who pulls a gun on him and tells him simply, "Stop." Greer's about ready to launch himself at him, saying how you dare come to my house. And Mr. Walter's like, dude, I know this isn't your house and I know where your family is. So just stop already. Then he leaves. And all Greer can do is fume.

Summary: Jack, Chavez, and November pursue their Croatia lead to an unsettling affair. Chao takes a mandatory trip to Geneva to speak with his boss. Greer works on connecting the two shell companies.



Starting with a sweeping view of the beautiful Croatian coastline, we follow Jack, Mike November and Ding Chavez through the streets of Dubrovnik. They arrive at a house and Mike shows the doorman a card which grants them entry. Supposedly the place is a hotel, but the guys can't help but stare as a hot blonde in lingerie walks by.

Then the receptionist welcomes Mike back. Mike asks for Katerina and says to tell her it's urgent. Jack's like, "Welcome back?" and Mike's like, dude, when I got

fired from CIA, I took it hard. Don't judge.

Katerina shows up and brings the guys up to her room. Mike tells her he needs to get to a gangster and all-around great guy named Josip Olafsky. Katerina's like, yeah, right. That's only sort-of impossible. Jack tells her they're looking for someone working for the Mexican cartel. Katerina tells him Olafsky isn't a drug dealer. He deals "in dreams." That's what The Marketplace is all about — buying experiences. And Katerina says it's impossible to get in without Olafsky's invitation. She shows them the door, but Mike tries again, saying they're trying to stop him from hurting anyone else.

Katerina says the other girls have invites, and she's surprised his friend didn't tell him. Mike's like, what friend? She says his crazy friend who's been living in the harbor on this huge yacht. And Mike's like, oh, that friend. He meets the guys outside and says he knows who has an invite — and it's somebody Jack knows too.

Back at the CIA, awkward Patrick goes to Greer with a huge stack of paperwork. He's gone through all the businesses that have gone through the Biz Hub space and there's only one that

might be a lead, a company called Southwest Petro. Greer's like, so? And Patrick reminds him of what he said: that CIA has no imagination when it comes to naming shell companies.

Greer brings up Mainland Renewables, which the recently deceased Miller used for Operation Pluto. Greer's not seeing a connection, but Patrick says the dissolution of Southwest was filed the day after Miller left CIA. And the articles of incorporation name someone called Dominic Sanderson, in Bethesda. So guess where Greer's headed.

Back from Nigeria, Wright meets with Senators Henshaw and Jennings. She tells them they've got a temporary peace between President Okoli and warlord Ekon Ameh. Henshaw asks what the price was, and Wright says she's helping them pursue a common enemy. The Senators tell her that "some of the committee members" believe Wright's distracted by all this, and not concentrating on the confirmation hearings. Wright says national security takes priority. Which makes sense of course, but Henshaw says it also means she's basically another Jack Ryan.

Wright says, "High praise in my world," and Henshaw replies that they're not talking about her world. They're talking about his. Ooh. Henshaw says she must understand that a lot of the committee members are up for re-election (including himself). And that their constituents are unhappy about the United States' over-involvement in other parts of the world.

Wright's like so, what, we're just supposed to forget about our allies? And Henshaw's just like, I'm just letting you know how Senators think. He tells her that getting rid of Jack was a good start, but he's left a big trail behind. One that she needs to avoid if she's going to be confirmed.

Afterward, she walks-and-talks with Jennings, and Wright's like, you didn't think I could handle that on my own? And Jennings says she was there to show Henshaw just how many committee members want to see Wright approved. But Henshaw's fear is real — fear of change. Wright asks what she should do, and Jennings says for her to do "what's necessary for the country... but also for yourself."

In Myanmar, Chao Fah's in Tin Tun's office, waiting as he's on the phone with "the powers that be." He gets off the phone and tells Chao they want to see him in Geneva, Switzerland. Tin Tun will be going to Dubrovnik instead. Chao remains cool, though this really screws things up for him. He asks how long he'll be there. Tin Tun's like, well, there are two options — and "both require you pack light." Oof.

At a marina in Dubrovnik, we see Ding acting drunk, stumbling his way around. He tries getting on one of the yachts, but the two heavies with guns suggest he turn his butt around. Then Jack and Mike come up behind them, also with guns. Ding's like, it's my boat now, b\*tches!

The guys search the posh-as-hell yacht and find none other than Levan Zubkov in the middle of some naughty S&M fun with some hookers. You might remember Zubkov from last season, the goofy arms dealer guy. He sees Jack and Mike and is literally like, NOOOOOO!

Later, while still in his undies and leash and collar, he tells the guys there's no way he's helping them because Olafsky's insane. Mike's like, really, man? Given what happened last season you'd think you would've learned your lesson, but no. You're right back in the arms dealing racket. Zubkov's like, nope, I don't do that anymore.

Ding's patience runs out and he steps up to Zubkov, puts a knife to the inside of his naked thigh and says, "One minute." Zubkov's like, huh? And Ding's like, "You'll be dead in one minute." Zubkov looks to Mike for help, but Mike just shrugs. Ding pushes the blade in deeper and Zubkov admits he's basically a pimp for Olafsky. And Ding's like, so you'll get us in to The Marketplace then.

Back in D.C., Greer heads to Bethesda and talks to Dominic Sanderson's mom, who thinks Greer's a football coach looking to recruit him. Greer goes along with it, saying he'd just like to see how Dominic's doing. And Mrs. Sanderson's like, wait, what? Her attitude completely shifts, and she tells Greer to get the hell off her porch before she calls the cops. He does, but also makes sure to steal some of her mail before leaving.

In Dubrovnik, the guys (including Zubkov) meet up with Katerina, who's agreed to help if CIA helps her and her girls "disappear forever." She points to Zubkov and is like, he knows more than he's telling. She knows that he knows about the big, big, high-level deal that'll be going down. She says Zubkov can take one of them on his invite and she'll get the rest of them in.

Back at CIA, Wright has a meeting with Ade Osoji. Knowing he's got experience as a political strategist, Wright says she needs some advice. He's like, oh, Henshaw. Wright confirms that Jack has vacated his position, but that even though they're "very different creatures," they share the same mindset. "If I'm thinking it, he's out there doing it," she says.

But she also admits that Jack's big, bad reputation is still making things problematic for her as far as getting confirmed. Osoji tells her that her getting the job of Director will "shake this whole place to its core." But he also guesses that Henshaw has already given her some advice. And he says that his advice — is to follow that advice.

Back in Dubrovnik, the guys do some recon on Olafsky's place. It's an old monastery that has a cave system underneath. Zubkov says even if they get in, they'll never find their way out. Zubkov tells Mike he's being stupid, and Mike's like, yeah, well, the only reason you're breathing is because you're now a CIA asset. Oh, and you're welcome, by the way.

While Chao Fah arrives in Geneva, Tin Tun arrives in Dubrovnik. While Tin Tun gets into one of a fleet of shiny Mercedes, Chao gets led to the office of the power that is. And who do you think walks in to meet him? None other than Zeyara Lemos!

Jack takes a minute to do the touristy thing, snaps a photo of the gorgeous Croatian coast and sends it to Cathy. She's about to get on a plane but says she wants to hear all about it when he's back. Then Chavez calls and says it's time to go.

Back in Bethesda, Greer arrives at a long-term care facility where the bill he stole from Mrs. Sanderson came from. A nurse points him to Dominic's room, where he finds a comatose young man on life support. Curiouser and curiouser. But as Greer leaves, who should be watching him but the mysterious Mr. Walters. He makes a call to somebody saying he's leaving the hospital.

Back in Geneva, Zeyara tells Chao that Tin Tun thought both he and the now-deceased Soe Wai were "inadequate." But she knows Tin Tun is visionless, which is why she chose Chao to design the Triad's network. She says that both she and Chao, people who've come from nothing and survived horrible things, are the only ones suited for power. She says she sent Tin Tun to handle The Marketplace deal because "it's a simple task backed by violence." That's what Tin Tun's good at. But Chao is ready for more — as in, he's taking over the whole Myanmar operation.

As a spiffed-up Jack and Ding board the yacht, Ding says how much he likes Mike. Jack's like, yeah, he likes you too. Not sure that's a good thing. He then asks Ding if he thinks Chao's intel is good enough to prove that they're right about the whole convergence thing. Ding's like, you gotta let that go, man. It's not about being right or wrong. It's about surviving. And he knows Chao's intel is good because Chao's risking his life to save his family.

Greer calls awkward Patrick and tells him about Dominic. He tells Patrick to give Wright the general rundown while he tries to find out more. But just then, Mr. Walters rear-ends Greer's car on a bridge. When he gets out, Mr. Walters stabs Greer in the gut. Yow. But Greer shows him what a bad MF-er he is when slashes Walters right back and makes a run for it. Before Walters can get a shot off, Greer actually hops the guardrail and jumps into the water. Hard. Core.

Mike and Zubkov arrive at The Marketplace, and Mike tells a visibly nervous Zubkov he needs to calm down. Zubkov's like, you're gonna get me killed. And Mike's like, yeah, hopefully. They head upstairs where Mike sees all manner of drugs, weapons and women on display and available for purchase. Truly horrifying.

Meanwhile, the yacht arrives down below and Katerina rounds up the girls. As the security guys pat them down, Ding and Jack spring up and shoot them. Katerina gets the girls back in the boat and Jack tells her to go anywhere they want. Katerina just says for him to get Mike out safely.

Tin Tun and his security posse show up. Mike spots them (but he thinks it's Chao) and radios Jack, who's on his way up through the caves with Ding. Mike follows the posse and Zubkov reluctantly gives up his passkey to get past the huge security guy. They get inside the private room and Mike overhears that Chao isn't actually there.

So the deal Tin Tun is making with Olafsky is for five "triggers" that have already been assigned their "destinations." So you can probably guess what that's about. Then Mike swoops in and tries grabbing one of the triggers, and everybody's like, WTF?

Mike's just like, well, these are for sale, right? I mean, it is The Marketplace after all. Olafsky looks at Zubkov like, you know this guy? Back in Bethesda, Greer's recovering from that nasty stab wound. He gets a call from awkward Patrick, who tells him they've got a hit from the blood on the tanto knife. The guy who stabbed Greer — who we knew as the mysterious Mr. Walters — is actually named Bill Tuttle. Greer tells Patrick to get him all the info as he texts his sulky son, asking for a ride. He tells Patrick he's checking himself out of the hospital, like now.

At Chao's compound, Kyi Fah and little Bennu get a surprise visit from Tin Tun. He asks about her stuffed bunny and she says her dad gave it to her. Tin Tun asks whether Bennu got it when she was "sick," as he casts a suspicious look at Kyi, who's unable to hide her anxiousness.

Meanwhile, Chao meets with the guys. Jack shows him the trigger, saying there were five. Chao says, "Five ... for America." Oof. So there are way more of them, and Chao says that Olafsky's just one of many buyers lined up. When Jack asks who else, Chao's like, look, dude. Americans look at everyone as either good or bad. But the rest of the world is "full of hurt," and some people will go to any lengths to make things "right."

Chao then hands out keycards and lays out the plan to retrieve the rest of the triggers, which are being stored in the casino vault. Chao also has a carload of weapons and other goodies for them to use, which Mike and Ding are pretty psyched about. Then Chao lets Jack in on the news — Cathy's in Myanmar. The episode begins at the confirmation hearing for Acting Director Wright. As Senator Henshaw calls for the votes, we cut to poor Jack in Myanmar, getting dragged into the dungeon where we first saw him. Wright gets a standing ovation and flashbulbs galore as she's officially confirmed Director of the CIA. But all Jack gets is a hello from big bad Zeyara Lemos.

Meanwhile, Ding and Mike are still on that rocky beach in Thailand, with Mike sporting a lovely gunshot wound to the

shoulder. Ding says they need to start walking, but Mike says he thinks he knows where they took Jack — same place where he picked up Cathy.

Back at Langley, Greer welcomes the mysterious Mr. Tuttle back to CIA. Yep, Tuttle's a former spook. Before that, he was an Army Ranger — which Greer says impresses him. "Those are some bad mother\*\*ers." Greer says he's surprised they've never met before. They've both been posted all over the world. Then Tuttle says, oh, yeah, Karachi. I heard what you did there. Ooh, an unpleasant callback to season one for Greer. And he's not amused.

Greer's like, ain't no Miranda rights in this room, so what happens is up to you. So tell me where Jack is. Tuttle's like, oh, yeah, him. Miller really hated that guy. Greer doesn't appreciate Tuttle's lack of conversational skills, so he's like, let's skip to the bombs then. Where are they? And Tuttle's like, hmm. Depends on what time it is.

Then Greer gets a call from Cathy, who's at Andrews Air Force Base with Kyi Fah and daughter Bennu. Cathy says Kyi didn't know anything about any passwords or intel from her now deceased husband, Chao Fah. She asks about Jack, and Greer gives her the bad news that he's been taken.

Back in the dungeon, Zeyara warns Jack not to black out, as he definitely won't like what they do "to wake you back up." They lower his feet into a tub of water, and they bring out the car battery. Zeyara asks what the now-deceased Chao Fah told him and Jack's like, he didn't tell me anything and then you killed him. ZAP!

Then Zeyara asks about the remaining packages, and Jack admits that Chao told him they were going to the States. Zeyara confirms it, saying it's a "first round." But she also says that it's not really about the bombs. It's about "proof of concept" — about proving that America is vulnerable to attack. She's just proving it to the rest of the world. Jack says she'll never get away with it. ZAP!

Back in Thailand, Ding and Mike do a little shopping. They manage to get a rusty knife, a spear gun and a skiff. Then Ding tells Mike he's not going because his shoulder's packed with banana leaves and will definitely get infected if he doesn't get it taken care of. Mike's like, great, so what do I do? Ding's like, get us a plane.

Back at Langley, Ade Osoji shows up with flowers for Wright. She's like, gee, thanks. Then Greer shows up behind him, grabs the flowers and tosses them in the trash. Ha! Wright shows Osoji the security feed of Tuttle in the interrogation room and they tell him they know about Dominic Sanderson.

Osoji's like, so I helped a kid in need. So what? Wright's like, so it's just coincidence that Miller used those badly-named shell companies of yours to fund black ops? Osoji's like, that's classified above your pay grade. Classified above the Director of CIA. Wow. What a d\*ck. So then he says he's willing to make a deal for immunity, to which Greer succinctly replies, "F\*\*k you." What does he have to offer? Ah... Jack's location.

Wright says she can't authorize that herself, she has to go to the Attorney General. Osoji's like, so get the phone and once I have it in writing, I'll tell you where he is. Back at Andrews AFB, Cathy talks to little Bennu, who tells her how Chao gave her the bunny and she could tell him all her secrets. Cathy feels the bunny's belly and finds a hole that's been stitched up. She calls Greer and tells him she found a flash drive in it. Meanwhile, Ding arrives back in Myanmar and gets himself a car while Mike shows up at an air force base in Bangkok and asks to use the phone. Of course, the guards are all like, whaaat?

Back in the dungeon, Jack wakes up and finds himself chained to a table. Zeyara's henchmen rip Jack's shirt, exposing his back. She touches his surgery scar and is like, so you know pain. But whether you talk or not, the infrastructure's already in place. And Jack's like, yeah, but it's untested. If your proof of concept doesn't work, all your buyers will disappear.

Zeyara's like, if my buyers disappear, your loved ones die. Then her henchmen pour boiling water on his back. Yikes. Zeyara warns him again to talk, but he still won't. So they throw salt on the burn. Oh, man. So much ouch. Not a moment too soon, Ding arrives, scaling the wall while he sends his burning car down the ramp to distract the guards.

Greer goes back to Tuttle and shows him a coded message that indicates where the bombs are going. Greer says, decode it. Tuttle's like, what do I get in return? Greer's like, nothing. He follows the sound of agonizing screams and finds himself right above where Jack's being held. Ding tosses a grenade outside to distract the guards. Zeyara sends her henchmen out while she stays with Jack.

Thinking she knows who it is, she starts talking through the door to Ding (not realizing he's actually above her). She says it's too bad they haven't met before now. But that if Ding will simply walk away, she'll make sure to "fill the bank accounts" of the families of his fallen men. But if he doesn't, she'll just find the families. Ooh. Wrong thing to say.

Ding drops in from above and tells her to tell him the names of his men. If she can name one, he'll let her go. Well, of course, she can't — so he shoots her. Ding-dong, the b\*tch is dead. Ding lays a gentle hand on Jack's arm, and all poor Jack can do is cry with relief, exhaustion and suffering.

Mike calls Greer and gives him the good news. Greer then hurries to Wright's office — but it's too late, Osoji's just signed his get-out-of-jail-free card. So Greer has to reluctantly let Osoji pass

by, but not without a death stare. Then he and Cathy meet the plane when our weary heroes arrive.

Senator Henshaw calls Wright to congratulate her on getting Jack home safe, and how the Committee is looking forward to hearing all about it. Yeah, okay. Meanwhile, the guys are going through the massive amount of info that awkward Patrick dug up on the whole operation. Mike laughs and calls Jack "obsolete," and Jack just tells Patrick an earnest "nice work." And Patrick's like, low-key yay, me!

Greer comes in with the cipher for Tuttle's code — a Mormon Bible. Ding tells them Miller had one too. So the operation stretched from Myanmar to the U.S. through Lagos. The whole reason President Udo was assassinated was to defend the port there. Greer and Jack meet up with Tuttle, who reiterates that he doesn't know where the bombs actually are. That was Osoji's department.

Tuttle also says they made contact with him through snail mail, which ensured no digital footprint. But he hasn't received anything. Jack says the shipment was expedited and Tuttle's like, well, sh\*t. Then it's probably already too late. They take Tuttle on a field trip back to Biz Hub, where there's a bunch of mail piled up on his desk.

Tuttle finds the package and hands it to Greer, who's like, screw that, I'm not touching that thing. So he hands it to Jack, who opens it to find several sets of car keys. The carrier driver lays on the gas and hauls butt, ready to ram his way through — but a CBP armored vehicle takes out the driver and the carrier crashes.

As our heroes move in on the wreck, more bad guys jump out of their vehicles and start shooting, causing total chaos. And all Wright can do is watch as the news covers the shootout from their helicopters. Then Wright discovers that the authorization for the trucks came from none other than — Senator Henshaw! Gasp!

The shootout finally ends with all baddies down, of course. Then Jack, Mike, Ding and Greer all jump in the vehicles on the car carrier, checking to see which ones are the hot ones. The computer in the truck Mike's in makes noise and the guys check beneath the truck and find the bomb. Of course, there's no time to wait for the bomb squad, so Jack just grabs the cable connecting to the computer and — cut.

Nothing blows up. Yay! Terrific! Now they just have to do that a few more times.

Later, Wright shows up at a bar where Osoji's busy lobbying. He approaches her and gives her the whole "nothing personal" line. He truly cares about her, and says she has such potential. He goes on to say that the era of heroes and villains is gone. Wright needs to understand "what justice actually looks like today" if she hopes to stop the Zeyara Lemoses of the world.

Wright's still impressed by his ability to spin golden words. But then she asks him what missionaries were the ones that helped his village? Mormons, he says. Right... Mormons. Wright digs into her bag and pulls out the Bible Miller had. And Miller definitely wasn't a Mormon. Oh, wait — what's that sound? Police sirens.

Osoji's like, uh, immunity, remember? And Wright's like, well, with CIA, sure. But not with D.C. homicide. Probably shouldn't have killed Miller. And Wright says, "One by one... without compromise." Osoji has no clever comeback for that, so he walks off in police custody.

Then, at the next hearing of the Senate Intelligence Committee, Jack walks in as star witness. After he's sworn in, Senator Henshaw makes a speech about how, even though they're all relieved

that the imminent threat has been eliminated, "the American people deserve answers as to how we got here."

Jack wholeheartedly agrees, saying it was his job to eliminate any compromised operations left behind by Miller. And he reminds everyone about his belief that CIA should not exist if it serves anyone other than the American people. He says that he wanted to prove that "our system of government could once again be trusted."

But, he says, he failed. And he realized that when he and Ding, Mike and Greer were putting their lives on the line to neutralize the biochemical weapons that had gotten into the country. He says that Zeyara Lemos gained the confidence to attempt her plan because of the weakness in our system.

Henshaw attempts to divert by pointing to Jack's disregard for protocol. Jack's like, yeah, okay, I used any means necessary. But I also discovered that my own people were working against me. Then Jack holds up a copy of the authorization letter Henshaw signed for the trucks. Ooh. And as Henshaw does his best to be ignorant and indignant, Jack just goes off on a total verbal beatdown. Turns out Osoji's lobbying included getting lots of money for Henshaw's reelection campaign. Even bigger ooh.

Jack finishes by saying he hopes that Henshaw really didn't know what Zeyara's endgame was. That he didn't know he was putting thousands of American lives at risk. But if he did know — then he's just as guilty as if he set the bombs off himself. With that, and a final "the people deserve better" line, Jack walks out, and the rest of our heroes follow suit.

Jack meets everybody outside, and Wright's like, you know the President's gonna want you to run for office, right? And Jack's like, uh... no. In fact, hell, no. Ding says, hey, should we get back to work then? Jack sees Cathy waiting and is like, I quit this job, remember? I'm taking a break. Wright says she'll see him around campus. And Jack just looks at them all like, wow. "Helluva team photo." Then he walks off with Cathy into the gray, wintry D.C. sunset. The end.
