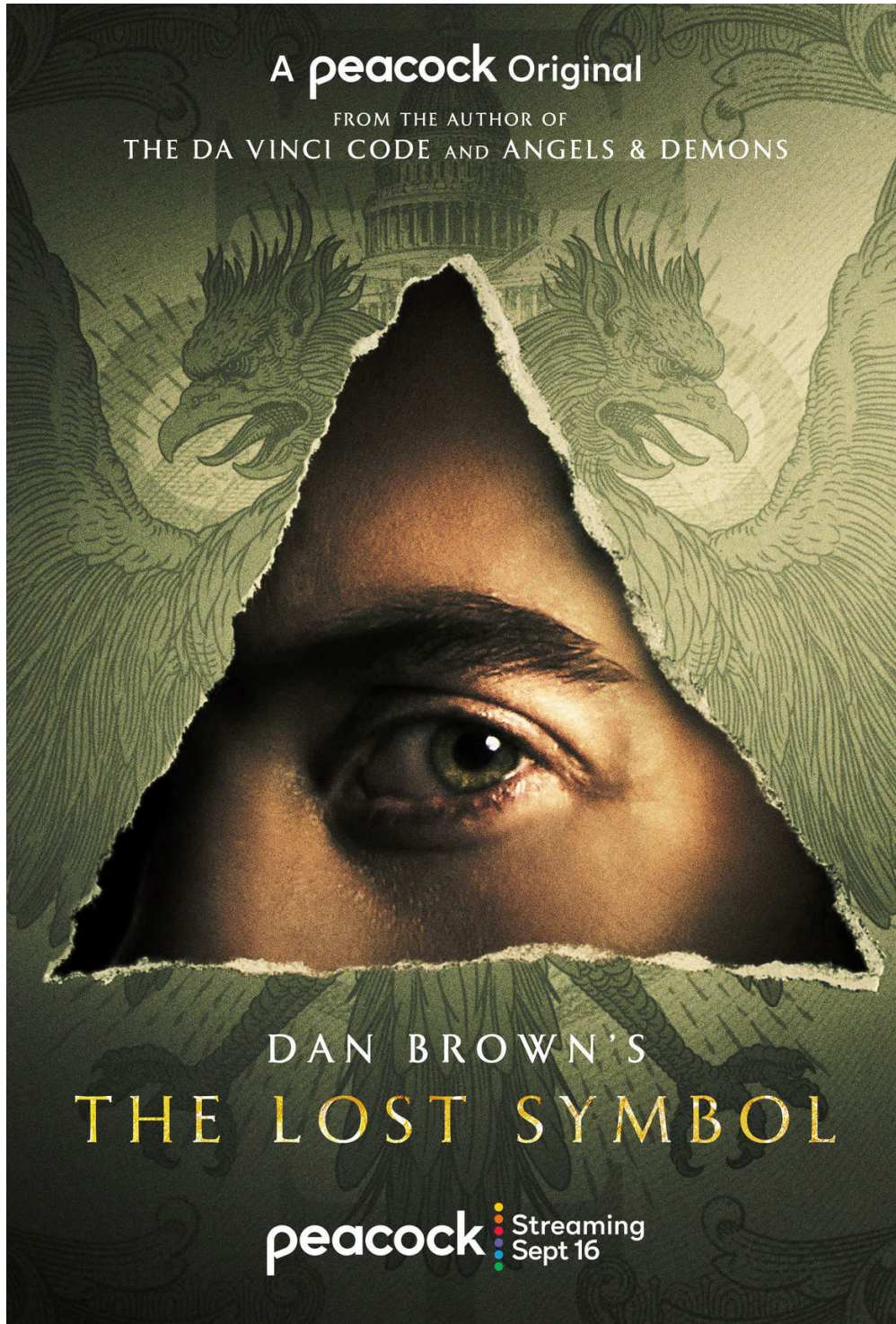

Summary: Promising young Harvard professor Robert Langdon finds himself pulled into a complex mystery when his former mentor, Peter Solomon, is kidnapped. Armed with knowledge of history, symbols, and dead languages, Langdon must work together with Peter's daughter and other allies to find the Lost Symbol. . . or lose the man they both see as a father.



The episode begins with a prisoner — presumably American — being tortured by the guards in a facility in Ağrı, Turkey. The narrative then shifts to Robert's class at Harvard, where he speaks to his students about how the same symbols are interpreted differently in the course of history and how that interpretation can lead to violence.

He receives a call from a man claiming to be the assistant of his mentor, Peter Solomon, asking him to come to Washington, D.C., to deliver a speech at the Smithsonian gala at the US Capitol. Although it is last minute, Robert accepts,

knowing how Peter operates. However, when he gets there, he discovers that Peter has been kidnapped by the same man who called Langdon and pretended to be his assistant.

The kidnapper wants Langdon to find "an ancient portal buried within the city." He tells Langdon to locate and unlock it. As a clue, he leaves Peter's amputated hand, which Langdon recognizes by the ring that's still there, in the middle of the Capitol Rotunda. Langdon recognizes the tattoos on each finger of the hand as the symbols of the Hand of the Mysteries.

Later, with the help of CIA operative Inoue Sato and uniformed Capitol policeman Nunez, Langdon gains access to Peter's secret Masonic altar. There, he finds a pyramid with incomplete inscriptions on it, hidden behind a wall. Meanwhile, after learning about her father's abduction from Langdon, Peter's daughter, Katherine, visits her father's office and finds an envelope with a leviathan cross in a compartment.

Peter's kidnapping triggers the plot, bringing every character where they are supposed to be. By the end of the pilot episode, we have an idea about who has taken Peter. The character is

called Mal'akh, a muscled and tattooed individual who is a master of disguise. Using concealer, he hides his tattoos and infiltrates the Capitol to leave Peter's severed hand.

Later, he sends in one of his men dressed as a janitor, who kills a CIA officer and seriously injures Nunez before telling Langdon to escape from the CIA custody and find the portal if he wants to save Peter's life. Mal'akh wants Langdon to find the capstone of the small pyramid that he, Sato, and Nunez found in the secret room that houses Peter's Masonic altar.

In the book, Mal'akh is revealed to be Peter's son Zachary, who makes an appearance in the flashback scene involving dinner at the Solomon household. Although Mal'akh claims that he killed Zachary, this is later proven to be false as he himself tells his father the truth. It will be interesting to see whether the show keeps true to the source material or takes creative liberty. Jolliff doesn't portray Mal'akh in the series, American actor Beau Knapp does. But this can be a simple misdirection on the writers' part to make the audience believe that they are aiming for a different ending from the book.

As Nunez points out to Sato, it's the FBI that generally handles kidnapping. But this seems to be a special case as the CIA gets involved. Langdon briefly wonders whether Peter worked for the CIA, but that turned out to be not the case. Zachary worked for the CIA in Ankara, Turkey, until he was arrested for trafficking drugs and sent to the prison in Ağrı. He is the prisoner getting tortured at the beginning of the episode. The CIA believes that Zachary is dead, and the person responsible for it is now coming after Peter. Towards the end of the episode, Sato sends one of her subordinates to find out what really happened to Zachary.

A leviathan cross has the symbol of infinity at the bottom and two mismatched crosses above it. The Knights Templar created the symbol of the leviathan cross. When Anton LaVey established the Church of Satan, he began using it as one of its symbols. The infinity reportedly represents the endlessness of the universe. To certain sects of Satanists, the leviathan cross represents the idea that people can find balance and truth within themselves and don't have to look for them in any deity.

Robert sees a leviathan cross on a utensil placed on Peter's altar and is surprised by it, as he believes that it doesn't belong there. But considering that the leviathan cross is also the symbol for sulfur in alchemy — and he, Sato, and Nunez smelt sulfur when they entered that room — things are likely connected. This is further reinforced by Katherine finding the envelope sealed with a leviathan cross mark, which her father told her is more important than his life.

Summary: Reeling from the day's events, Langdon and Katherine get help and shelter from an old friend while they attempt to decipher the most recent clue. Meanwhile, amidst visions of his past, Peter attempts an escape.



The episode begins with Langdon and Katherine trying to evade their CIA pursuer. Langdon breaks the seal on the envelope and finds a page from the Old Testament describing the Judgment of Solomon. Suddenly, Katherine receives messages from an unknown source, telling them to toss their phones, pass the wayfarer, and find the wolf. Langdon follows the instructions and escapes the CIA agent with Katherine by entering into a secret compartment that leads to an expansive system of underground tunnels. They find Bellamy is waiting for them. Katherine, who has known Bellamy since

her childhood, makes the introductions.

In the flashback scenes, it is revealed that after learning about Zachary's incarceration in Turkey, Peter decided to leave him there for a while to teach him a lesson. This decision apparently caused a rift between him and his wife and led to their divorce. It also had an impact on Langdon and Katherine's relationship, which got caught in the mess. When Katherine finally got the chance to visit her brother in prison, she was horrified seeing how much physical and emotional torture he had endured.

In the present, Langdon escapes with Katherine from the CIA agents after the agency deduces that Bellamy must be helping them. He gets a call from Mal'akh, who knows that Katherine is with him. Mal'akh tells Langdon to leave Katherine behind. Otherwise, he implies that he will send someone to assassinate Katherine.

Parts of the episode depict Peter's attempt to escape from his captors. The show leads the audience to think that Peter will be able to find a way to get out from wherever he is. After all, he is the one who taught Langdon everything. But then, Mal'akh seems way too confident that Peter will not be able to go anywhere. Throughout the episode, Peter tries to locate the exit from the facility. He finds a cremation urn with his son's name inscribed on it in the middle of a room.

Inside it, there is a key, which eventually opens a door that leads outside. He tries to stop a car but loses consciousness. When he wakes up, he discovers that he is in a car, and the driver looks just like him.

The entire experience Peter has in this episode is part of an elaborate dream. His actual body is being carefully monitored by Mal'akh. When Mal'akh tells Langdon that Peter is in "Araf," he likely means he is in a clinically induced coma. According to Islamic theology, the "Araf" is a realm between heaven and hell, where entities that are neither good nor evil reside. In the same way, Peter is trapped in limbo, and Langdon's actions will determine whether he survives or dies.

In 'The Lost Symbol,' the Leviathan Group is a small, secret sect within the Freemasons that believes the ancient wisdom must stay hidden until the world is ready. In this case, ancient wisdom seems to be the portal's location that can transform a human into a god. The pyramid and capstone are parts of a map to that location. The two pieces have always been kept separate so that no member of the Leviathan Group will be tempted to find the portal. However, coded information was still maintained on the whereabouts of the other piece.

Both Peter and Bellamy are part of the Leviathan Group. Bellamy reveals to Langdon and Katherine that the page of the Old Testament they found in the envelope was the coded information about the capstone's location. They realize that Peter's ring is the key to that code. With Nunez's help, they retrieve the ring from the Capitol police's evidence room. They discover that the only unique sign on that ring is a Pi symbol. Using the number the symbol represents, they try to decipher the code, only to realize that they are missing certain steps. Just then, the CIA arrives, and Langdon and Katherine have no choice but to escape.

Summary:	With the CIA hot on their trail and Mal'akh demanding they split up, Katherine and Langdon turn to Nuñez for help. Sato interrogates Bellamy and takes on pressure from her superiors to produce answers for the growing number of questions regarding this case.



Nunez finds Katherine and Robert at his home after he returns, and he and his wife let them stay there. Katherine tells Robert that she can help him decipher the Biblical page, adding that his knowledge about symbolism is all there in his brain, but he can't seem to access it for various reasons. As ever, Langdon is quite skeptical about Noetic Science but still agrees to undergo the procedure.

With Trisha's help, Katherine acquires the necessary equipment. Meanwhile, Mal'akh decides to teach Langdon and

Katherine a lesson. He disguises himself and locates Trish. He then drugs her and seemingly abducts her. After the Noetic session, the clues that Langdon and Katherine find lead them to a cemetery to search for the grave of a 19th century Freemason, Ezra Dove. While they are there, a man in a hat and mask comes after them. Langdon finds an old film reel and takes it with him as he and Katherine escape. Sato convinces Bellamy to tell her everything he knows about the Leviathan Group. The episode ends with Nunez finding out that Trish has been killed, and her body has been left in the middle of a symbol.

After Trish's death, Katherine decides that it will be best for her and Langdon to split up. Reluctantly, Langdon agrees to the proposal. Meanwhile, Sojani discovers crucial information about the man who probably killed Zachary and contacts Sato. Langdon finds a hidden message in the film reel and goes to speak to Bellamy.

Together, Langdon and Bellamy figure out the location of the quarry of Pierre Charles L'Enfant, the architect who developed the foundational plan of the US capital. Sato tells Katherine about Samyaza, the mysterious convict who potentially killed Katherine's brother and abducted her father. Katherine makes a deal with Sato. In exchange for Zachary's letters from prison, Sato will get the "head remote viewer" of a secret CIA psychometry project to Katherine's lab.

Using Noetic science, Katherine tries to find her father through the remote viewer. Despite some initial positive results, the remote viewer loses his connection with Peter and concludes that he has died. Elsewhere, Mal'akh and Nicholas successfully revive Peter, and Langdon finds the capstone.

Summary: When Mal'akh sends a disturbing video of Peter, Langdon has no other choice but to reunite with Katherine and team up with Sato for a bold move. Nuñez follows a hunch.



Bellamy meets Jonathan, an executive of what seems like an arms and defense corporation and a fellow member of the Leviathan Group. It is revealed that Jonathan was the one who came after Katherine and Langdon at the cemetery. Reminding Bellamy about why the Leviathan Group exists, he asks Bellamy what Langdon has found out about the portal. At Nunez's home, Langdon and Nunez deduce that certain inscriptions

on the capstone's box refer to German Renaissance artist Albrecht Dürer's 1514 engraving *Melencolia I*.

Peter wakes up after spending days inside the Araf, and Mal'akh forces him to make a recording, in which he tells Langdon that the latter must find the truth about the portal or he will be killed. Using the magic square from *Melencolia I*, Langdon figures out that the symbols inscribed on the pyramid mean "one true God." Nunez goes to the Janitor's wife and discovers that she is a fanatic follower of Mal'akh just like her husband. Before killing herself, she declares that Mal'akh will never let Peter go as he is the instrument for the final stage.

Langdon reunites with Katherine and tries to rescue Peter with Sato and Adamu's help. He reaches out to Mal'akh and pretends that he has solved the mystery of the portal when he hasn't. They arrange a drop that doesn't go according to the plan after other operatives of the CIA show up, and Mal'akh manages to capture Langdon. The episode ends as Mal'akh threatens Langdon, telling him that he will kill both him and Peter if he fails to locate the portal.

In the episode Sato is not only removed from the case but also forced to take early retirement. This doesn't put a stop to her involvement with the case. She begins helping Katherine in a personal capacity and reaches out to Jonathan. In exchange for information on Sophie, she tells him that she will get the pyramid and the capstone back to them. Later, Sato confesses to Katherine that she had turned Zachary into an asset and inad-

vertently caused his death. Elsewhere, a Leviathan member finds where Sophie is and gets the information he needs before killing her.

Meanwhile, at Mal'akh's hideout, Langdon discovers that the capstone's box contains certain inscriptions that can only be seen in the light. He convinces Mal'akh to place Peter with him, and together they try to find a way to run away from their captors. They unlock the box with Peter's Freemason ring, and it turns out to be a Rose Cross.

Langdon and Peter pretend to have an argument. The former throws a chair at the camera, apparently in anger. When the Janitor rushes to the room to stop them, Peter knocks him out. As Peter and Langdon try to escape, they encounter Mal'akh outside. It is then that Mal'akh reveals that he is Zachary. Sato soon gets there with the police, and the Janitor sacrifices his life so Mal'akh can get away.

In this episode the audience is finally given explanations as to how Zachary turned into Mal'akh and how Langdon and Katherine's relationship fell apart. In the Turkish prison, Zachary meets a large and imposing man who indoctrinates Zachary into his belief by performing what seem like miracles. As Zachary reveals to him who his father was, the other man instructs him to return the power stolen from this land (indicating to

the portal).

Meanwhile, having seen Zachary and realizing what the prison has done to him, Katherine pleads to her father to bribe the correct officials to get her brother released. But Peter still holds onto his principles and refuses. By doing this, he inadvertently begins the dissolution of his marriage. When Peter finally visits his son, it's too late. He asks for forgiveness and tells Zachary to return home for his mother and sister.

Later, Zachary's teacher informs him that they will escape from prison that day. While his family receives the news of his death, Zachary confines himself in a house in the middle of nowhere. He later undergoes plastic surgery, develops muscle mass, and gets tattoos all over his body. In the US, Katherine ultimately breaks up with Robert. Back in the present time, Mal'akh escapes from the Leviathan group and seemingly kills Sato.

In the episode it is revealed that Sato has survived the attack. The members of the Leviathan Group find out that Mal'akh intentionally got caught, knowing that his captors will try to crack his phone to find information about the pyramid and the capstone. When they did that, the phone sent out a virus, granting Mal'akh access to Leviathan's internal server. He then shuts the members out of everything on the server, including the archives and the

central fund. As Peter and Jonathan plan a meeting of the members, the word "Cascade" appears on the group's computer screens.

The subsequent discussion doesn't go as Peter thought it would. Most of the other members decide to accept Mal'akh's demand and give him Cascade, which is a "long-range acoustic technology" that can potentially be used for crowd control and troop repulsion.

Meanwhile, Langdon and Katherine visit the latter's mother, Isabel, who has been struggling with mental health issues since Zachary's apparent death. Katherine tries to tell her mother that Zachary is alive and what he has done, but she refuses to listen. Desperate to protect her mother, Katherine decides to stay there, and Langdon stays with her.

That night, Langdon and Katherine make love. Later, Langdon finds a check that Isabel issued for her son. She has known for a long time that Zachary is alive. Katherine makes her mother understand that Mal'akh is not necessarily her son but something evil and dangerous. Isabel gives them the pyramid and capstone that Mal'akh apparently hid in her house and tells them that she already called Mal'akh, and he is on his way. When Katherine urges Isabel to come with them, the latter refuses, claiming that it is her choice. When Mal'akh arrives and learns what has happened, he seemingly kills Isabel.

The episode begins by revealing that Mal'akh has indeed killed his mother. In the penultimate episode of the season, he builds a funeral pyre and paints his mother's skin with symbols before performing her last rites. Nunez comes to check up on Isabel, but before he can go into the house or realize what has happened, he sees Mal'akh and decides to follow him. The former arrives at a bridge and turns on Cascade. Suddenly there is

enough pressure on Nunez's eardrums and brain that he loses consciousness.

Meanwhile, by working together, Langdon, Katherine, and Peter figure out the location of the wisdom. They reach out to the CIA for help but don't give them the complete information, knowing that the agency will ultimately double-cross them. With the CIA's help, they seemingly lure Mal'akh to a designated location, where he is supposedly apprehended. But it is later revealed that the captive is just an imposter.

The clues Langdon, Katherine, and Peter find from deciphering the grid at the bottom of the pyramid lead them to the House of the Temple, where they finally deduce that the wisdom is buried under the Washington Monument. As Peter becomes busy dealing with the security guard, Mal'akh arrives, knocks Langdon out, and confronts his sister.

In the episode the full scope of Mal'akh's plan is revealed. Langdon and Peter learn exactly what Mal'akh meant when he spoke about a sacrifice, which will put them in a dilemma. Now, the sacrifice can be either Katherine, Peter, or even Mal'akh himself. After all, the tattoos on his body supposedly represent his connection to a higher plane of existence.

When Katherine learns what Mal'akh has done to their mother, the remnants of her sympathy for the brother she once knew and loved will be replaced with rage. Meanwhile, Sato and Nunez try to figure out how Cascade works and how they can stop it from doing further damage. Elsewhere, Blake and the rest of the CIA apparatus do not cease their attempt to gain the wisdom even after the setback with Langdon and Mal'akh and search for the two of them all over Washington, D.C.

In the end, he is proven categorically wrong. While Mal'akh is busy with Katherine and Peter, Robert discovers what the Freemasons and the Leviathan Group have guarded as their most precious treasure: a copy of King James' Bible. It frustrates Mal'akh to no end. He has sacrificed too much to get to where he is now, only to realize that no great source of power had been waiting for him at the end of the road. The wisdom was always metaphorical, to be sought out within one's self.

However, Peter seems to have a different opinion. He believes that the Bible and all other religious texts contain an ancient wisdom encrypted in their pages, and that's why they have endured the test of time. People can sense that immense power, even if they can't access it, and even if they have stopped looking for it. In his parting words to Robert, Peter observes that it's never too late to start looking for the wisdom again.

During the climactic scene of the season, Mal'akh reveals to Peter that the dagger he has been carrying is the one with which Abraham was supposed to kill his son, Isaac, to prove his obedience to God. But he never had to go through with it as an angel or a messenger of God stopped him. The dagger is made from a meteorite and touched by God Himself. His explanation makes it quite clear that Peter was never meant to be the sacrifice. Mal'akh believes that if he

dies in his father's hand, God will accept him as a sacrifice and let him be reborn with God-like powers.

As Mal'akh/Zachary Solomon prepares to sacrifice himself for a chance to become a God, Langdon appears and tells him the truth about the so-called ancient wisdom. Mal'akh snaps, refusing to believe that the Freemasons placed so many safeguards just to hide a Bible. This is when Nunez destroys one of the Cascade units, effectively stopping the entire operation. An enraged Mal'akh tries to attack Robert, but Katherine fatally stabs him on the back with his sacrificial knife. Mal'akh subsequently dies in his father's arms.

Robert and Katherine are together and have resumed their relationship at the end of the first season. Robert's experience with Freemasons, ancient wisdom, and Mal'akh have thoroughly changed him and how he views the world. He is still a skeptic, but he has also learned to appreciate faith. More importantly, he has developed a newfound appreciation for Katherine and her field, Noetic science. They part ways as Robert goes back to Harvard, but only after promising her that he will return two weeks later.
