Summary:	After answering a call about a neighborhood prowler, Detective Mare Sheehan shoulders her chief's directive to revive an unsolved missing person's case amid increased community pressure. Later, while her loved ones celebrate her ex-husband Frank's engagement, Mare attends a celebration for her legendary high school basketball win and connects with Richard, a professor who's new in town.

The episode begins with Detective Sergeant Mare Sheehan receiving a call from Miss Carol early in the morning. Annoyed and cold, she shows up and listens as she discusses a "ferret-looking man" lurking about.

According to her, he was wearing a hooded jacket and watching her granddaughter from the garden opposite. Mare agrees to look into this down at the station and takes off.

Ignoring a call from Frank, Mare arrives at the station to polite applause. That's not for her though, but instead for the new recruit Officer Trammel, who joins their ranks.

Mare is called into the Chief's office, where news has broken with the media surrounding Katie Bailey. She's been missing for a year and it seems the police have given up. Although Mare has chalked this up to a drug-induced runaway, there's undoubtedly a lot of pressure on the police. So much so in fact, Mare is forced to revisit this case from the very beginning.



Meanwhile, single Mum Erin hands over her child to Dylan, following him outside. There's obviously no love lost between Erin and Dylan's new girlfriend, Brianna, with the latter even promising that Erin will "get it" later on down the line.

Things aren't easy for Erin, especially when her Father shows and gives her the cold shoulder. He's not happy about the perceived financial burden having a child is having on the household. Despite Erin's best intentions, she can seemingly do no right by her Dad. Thankfully she still has her friend Brendan, whom she

messages and promises to meet later in the day.

Officer Trammel rings Mare with news of a burglary. Given how beloved Mare is to everyone in this town, she heads over to Beth's house to help. On the way she finds Freddie Hanlon, the man who broke into Beth's house and trashed the trophy cabinet. Mare chases the man over a fence but injures her foot in the process.

Trammel eventually catches up, where Mare takes charge of the situation and takes Freddie out in handcuffs. Beth arrives and despairs, seeing her ex partner in such a state and wondering when enough is enough.

This mantra of "enough is enough" is something Mare carries with her when she returns home. Hopping over to the table, she immediately ices up her foot. That dull, throbbing pain continues when she speaks to her Mother.

It turns out her ex Frank has arranged a meal for them all, with news that he's engaged to a girl called Faye. Given Mare and Frank used to be together, this is a tough pill for her to swallow. After a quip about her cooking, Mare's cousin jokes, admitting that Frank hadn't "met the right woman" until now. Just to add salt in the open wound, Frank and Faye happen to live in the house directly opposite to hers.

Mare's daughter Siobhan heads over early and begins singing with her band, celebrating Faye and Frank's recent announcement. Mare hangs back though, deciding against showing as she has a reunion of her own. She's clearly not one for big shows and the reunion at the basketball court forces her to try and play along, struggling to smile.

After, Mare heads to the local bar. There, she gets talking to a man named Richard. He's new in town — and a Professor no less. He's also someone she can vent to.

The small town mentality definitely doesn't suit Mare, and you can't help but shake the feeling that she's playing out this "big fish in a small pond" trope. After hooking up with the Professor, Mare stumbles home at 3.30am, where her Mother immediately casts a judgmental eye.

Things are about to be shaken up for Mare and the town though. Erin shows up to meet Brendan, encouraged to head out to Bridge Point. Unfortunately Brendan is a fabrication invented by Brianna to get revenge on her. With Dylan filming, Brianna strikes Erin several times across the face.

Thankfully Siobhan shows up and saves her, as Erin walks away alone and struggles to hold back tears.

As the episode closes, we pan across to a new day where Erin is lying dead and motionless on a stack of rocks. A gash across her head seems to indicate she was struck — or maybe she fell? Mare inevitably receives the call and prepares for a big murder investigation.

Summary:	Mare visits a grisly murder scene before informing the victim's enraged father. As a video from the night of the crime surfaces, Mare questions suspects in the case and gives an icy welcome to County Detective Colin Zabel, who's been called in to assist. Later, Mare bumps heads with locals and airs concerns about her grandson Drew in light of her late son's mental health struggles.

The episode begins with our quaint, small town rocked by the death of one of their own. Mare drives up to examine the scene, where she sees the grisly details first-hand. A jogger came across Erin early in the morning, which happens to be the person who called in the death.

Mare examines the body and realizes Erin has been there for a while. To do the amount of damage done to Erin, the culprit would have had to have been face to face. Given the severity of this case, Mare is given a partner — a man by the name of Colin Zabel.

Before he arrives, Mare has the detectives do a grid search. They check to see if anything out the ordinary but right now it doesn't seem so.

With Bill and John by her side, Mare heads up to visit Kenny, intent on breaking the bad news to him. When they tell him about Erin, Kenny is genuinely shocked and begins knocking things over, screaming to the heavens.

When Kenny calms a little, Mare asks him who could be responsible. According to him, it's Dylan. The boy resented Erin for having a baby and right now seems the most likely candidate. Kenny also claims to have an alibi for that night; he was at home.



Mare interviews Dylan next, who admits that things were tense between him and Erin. He then tells Mare he didn't say anything to his ex that night. Mare is not so sure. When Brianna calls, Dylan becomes flustered but intentionally avoids answering. Eventually he decides to leave.

Back at the station, Mare meets Colin for the first time. She gives him an icy reception, refusing to shake his hand and completely blanking the man. However, they get a ping on a video from the night before — which happens to be the clip of Brianna assaulting Erin.

With Siobhan there too, Mare immediately gets to work. She calls her daughter,

leaving a message and telling the girl to get in touch asap. Stressed and impatient, Mare eventually succumbs and allows Colin to tag along with her.

Together, they head straight to the restaurant Brianna is currently serving as a waitress at. Colin watches in shock as Brianna is grabbed and arrested for assault right in the middle of her shift.

Mare takes Brianna to the station and immediately starts grilling her. Brianna keeps calling for a lawyer though, eventually rasping that she's not surprised Mare's son killed himself. This statement rattles Mare too, eventually seeing her dive head-first into this case and relentlessly pursue it.

Mare checks in on Frank next, who makes a passing comment that Erin's home life isn't good. Mare wonders how he knows this but her ex simply shrugs it away, claiming it's intuition.

When Mare returns home, she questions Siobhan over what happened the night with Erin. Apparently she asked the girl if she wanted a ride home. Erin refused and wandered off into the woods alone. Mare is not happy but leaves the girl in peace for now.

Next up, Mare arrives at school where she's encouraged to refer Drew to a neurologist. The doctor also thinks Mare should see someone about what happened to her son. She refuses, and heads back to the station.

After the hostilities earlier in the season, Colin and Mare both decide to try again, with another handshake and greeting. The kids from the party are brought in and asked questions about the night. All of them confirm they didn't hear a gunshot. However, one of the boys does recall Erin's bike missing. This is definitely important, as the two officers finish over 40 witness statements and start to piece together fragments from that night.

Given how tightknit this community is, Tony confronts Mare at her house while she's about to head out with the Professor. Mare holds her own but it's clear this investigation could turn ugly. It doesn't get much better at the book signing either, as Mare wrestles with her own frustrations. Richard entertains a group of ladies and she's left stuffing food down the sofa. Richard does eventually catch up with her though and apologizes.

That evening, Dylan heads out to get some things from the store. When he gets back in his truck though, Kenny happens to be there waiting. With a gun pointed at the boy, he orders Dylan to keep driving. Kenny eventually shoots Dylan in the back.

Back home, a sobbing Jess speaks to her Mother, admitting that Erin told her a secret and made her promise not to tell anyone. This sees the pair head over to see Lori. It turns out Dylan isn't the real Father. According to her, it's Frank Sheehan.

Later, Kenny and Mare face the consequences of their misguided attempts to protect their families.

The episode begins with Mare and Colin working together, collecting clues to work out what happened to Erin.

According to the coroner, Erin was killed between 12am-2am and thankfully there's no evidence of her being sexually abused. However, bruises across her body are consistent with being beaten and the missing finger seems to be hinting toward a bullet wound too.

Mare and Colin leave, going over what they know so far. Well, they both realize that Erin was killed somewhere else and then brought back to the woods. It seems this was all orchestrated to throw them off the case.

Johnny arrives to find Kenny passed out by the river. He smirks, proudly proclaiming that he killed Dylan. This inevitably sees him brought into the police station where he admits that he's killed the boy. Only... Dylan is actually still alive. He's unlikely to walk again though, and if he hadn't have been brought in when he was, there's no way he would have survived.



Back home, Mare and her Mother come to blows. It's an incredibly well-acted scene, with both characters coming to blows and talking over one another. Eventually this sees Lori arrive with even more bad news. She confirms what she heard last night — Frank could well be the Father to Erin's baby.

Hotheaded and enraged, Mare charges over to Frank's house and bursts in the front room. When she mentions Erin, Frank is eventually led outside. She's unhappy with being lied to and brings up the rumour about him being the Father to this child.

Frank sternly looks at her and claims he never had sex with Erin but did help the girl out with buying baby supplies. After Kevin died, he felt sorry for her and wanted to do what he could to help. Given the small town vibes in Easttown, it's perhaps unsurprising to find rumours spreading like this. Just to be sure, Mare talks to Dylan's parents and confirms that she's going to run a DNA check to be sure.

Frank heads in to the police station with Faye, with the former filling out his statement. He goes on record and confirms that he never killed Erin. After a DNA sample is taken, he's allowed to go. While he does, Mare heads into her office and begins looking through Erin's cellphone records. The last call she made that night was to Deacon Mark Burton, a priest at Saint Michael's Parish.

He definitely seems a little suspicious, especially when Mare and Colin talk to him about what happened. He casually confirms to them both that he's definitely been alone with Erin before. It's certainly odd that she would choose him to talk to at 11pm though, despite links to his youth club. Even stranger still, Deacon never bothered to tell the police any of this. However, he does comply with his cellphone being handed over though.

Out by the park, Mare and Colin go over the evidence, with Mare convinced there's a bullet nearby. She encourages Colin to bring in the county dogs to help find any fragments in this half-mile radius. While the dogs don't find anything out the ordinary, Mare most certainly does.

There's a ricochet mark by the building, and using the trajectory Mare finds the bullet wedged up in the tree. This would explain why the dogs weren't able to see it. In terms of suspects, they're left with Dylan and Kenny. The latter, of course, has a firearm and we know he isn't afraid to use it.

Deacon Mark is still a suspect but for now he's on the backburner. That's perhaps the wrong move though, especially when we see him dropping Erin's bike in the river later at night.

As the day draws to a close, Mare and Colin both end up in the same bar. Colin is drunk though and he too is going through some personal issues. After telling her about his ex, she apologizes to him. Colin tries hitting on Mare too after calling her a good Mother, but that's quickly shut down. There's no way Mare is mixing business with pleasure — and thankfully Colin's friends arrive to take him away.

In the morning, Mare is greeted by the chief with stern news. Mare confronted Carrie Laydon in her drunken state and planted evidence on her. Because of this, the chief is forcing her onto administrative leave — and counselling. Mare is forced to hand over her gun and badge, and watch as the Chief drives off.

At work, Zabel struggles to hold back his disappointment that Mare isn't on the case anymore. However, there's more important matters to attend to. The DNA results are back and it turns out Frank Sheehan isn't the baby's father... and neither is Dylan. So who could it be?

Well, Zabel heads over to see Deacon Mark since he's been avoiding calls for the last few days. This is only made more suspicious given Mark was accused of sexual misconduct at his previous parish. He's not exactly helpful to Zabel's questioning either, and eventually drives away.

With Missy now being held captive along with a very much alive Katie Bailey in a mystery man's makeshift prison, Mare investigates her disappearance, chatting up a former hooker who had seen Missy around before. Mare also gets dolled up for a dinner date with Colin... but she only wants to talk about the latest developments in Erin's case, and when Colin complains, she walks out on him. (We also learn that Erin's friend Jess has been lying to the cops, and she and Dylan steal and burn Erin's old journals — although Jess pockets a photo first.) Mare and Colin talk with another teen hooker

who was almost strangled by a client, but fought her way free. She says the guy was white, he smoked Winstons... and she even got part of his license plate.

After Mare apologizes for ditching their date and Colin admits he didn't solve the big Upper Darby case himself (he impulsively kisses her, too!), they start checking out matches on the license plate. They end up at the door of a guy named Mr. Potts, who runs a bar out of his house... and has Katie and Missy locked up in his attic. As the detectives enter, they spot a pack of Winstons on the table, which leads Colin to get his gun ready. The captive girls overhear them talking and start banging on the pipes, and Mare notices video cameras posted everywhere. As Colin starts to draw his gun, Potts pulls his first and shoots Colin in the head before turning and firing at Mare. He hits her in the hand, but she manages to run upstairs and find the girls trapped in a room; she texts the cops while she bandages her bleeding hand.

Potts follows her upstairs and, thanks to the cameras, sees where she is. He fires wildly into a room, but she's crouched out of the line of fire. When he turns around, she cracks him over the head with a heavy-looking tray and sprints downstairs. He manages to get up and fire more bullets after her as he follows her downstairs. She runs to Colin's dead body and picks up his gun, whirling around and firing just as Potts appears, hitting him dead in the chest and killing him. She slumps down, bleeding and exhausted, as the cops pull up. One mystery down, one to go.

Elsewhere in "Illusions": Mare talked about her depressed father in therapy, who took his own life, adding that she's afraid Drew will end up like him and Kevin; a tearful Deacon Mark admitted to Dan that he saw Erin the night she died, but stopped short of confessing to her murder; Lori's son Ryan told her that his dad John is seeing another woman again; poor Mrs. Carroll had a heart attack and died in a car crash... and then Mr. Carroll announced at her funeral that he'd had an affair with Mare's mom Helen!; and Mare's friend Billy revealed he actually took in Erin to live with him for a couple months after her mom died.

The episode picks up right off the back of that shocking climax to last week's episode. Colin's death hangs heavy in the air and Mare awakens to find herself in hospital. The family gather around to check up on her.

Amidst this misery is a small glimmer of happiness in the form of Katie being returned to her Mother. The abduction storyline now resolved, her reunion with Dawn is a touching respite before the attention turns back to Erin. Specifically, Erin's bike being found in the lake. This, coupled with Father Dan ousting Deacon's whereabouts that night, cause him

Mare returns home and speaks to Lor, who believes John is having an affair. However, she can't bring herself to leave him. This is true, as it turns out, but apparently he's ended things.

Mare can't sit still though and heads up to see Colin's Mother, gushing about the detective and telling her he was great at his job. However, Mare receives several slaps to the face for her troubles. Zabel's Mother blames Mare for what happened, forbidding her from coming back to the house again.

The next day Mare returns to the station and speaks to the Chief. He confirms outright that the two cases aren't related, and that Wayne Potts didn't kill Erin. He was in Altoona visiting his Mother that weekend. With Hauser out, Carter puts his trust in Mare and tells her she's getting the case (and her badge) back.

Mare speaks to Dylan again, trying to figure out if he could be responsible. There's a definite black mark on his record and Dylan senses that Mare is closing in on him. He asks for a lawyer, which only makes him look more suspicious.

Mare can feel herself slipping, and she heads to therapy and admits as much. This time though she opens up about what happened with her son. It's an emotional, distressing segment, one that sees Mare find him up in the attic hanging from the rafters. As a Father of two, I can't even imagine the pain and anguish in seeing this.

To make matters worse, Mare still lives in the same house but hasn't been able to go into the attic ever since.

Mare heads home but runs into Beth, who waves down her car and asks for help. She's been trying to contact Freddie for three days now but he hasn't been answering. Mare eventually breaks in and finds Freddie dead — and a bag with Erin's clothes.

It's a tough blow, but one that's followed up by Siobhan returning home drunk. Mare sits down with her daughter, who tells Mare she hates her for being the one to find her brother. Mare holds her daughter and apologizes as she sobs. It's a tender moment, one that's unfortunately ended a little prematurely given we cut to the next scene soon after. Personally, I would have liked the show to have held that moment a little longer.

Elsewhere, John's Father sits his son down and admits that he found Bill that night in the laundry room, covered in blood. The next morning, Erin was found — is Bill the culprit? This, coupled with his erratic behaviour, puts him as a very likely suspect.

We don't have to wait long long, as Bill admits as much to John later on. He, in turn, approaches Lor and tells her they need to keep this from Mare.

However, Dylan rocks up next to Jess while she's walking, revealing that she was the one who took the journals and claiming that "the three of us are joined together forever."

Dylan winds up chasing her and grabs Jess while she's hiding, holding a gun up to her face and claiming she needs to be quiet to make sure she doesn't have her face blown up "like Erin".

Meanwhile, Carrie falls asleep while Drew is in the bath, waking up to find him face-down in the water. Apparently he was just playing but when Carrie sees him, it's enough to jolt her into submission and she breathes heavily.

Later that day, John and Billy decide to pack up their things and head out fishing. Tellingly, Billy notices a gun tucked away in his brother's gear. While they're gone, Mare heads over to Lor's house and admits she has suspicions. Well, Lor can't lie anymore and she breaks the truth about Erin to her. Billy was the one who killed her, having panicked after Erin threatened to reveal to everyone that he's DJ's Father.

While Mare races up to the fishing lake to stop Billy and John, Carter receives a visit from Jess who has a photo of... something. We don't see what it is though, but it spooks Carter enough to urge his associates to ring Mare immediately.

The episode begins with Jess admitting that she burnt Erin's journals because she believed this is what Erin would have wanted. She was just trying to honour her friend.

While everyone frantically tries to contact Mare, down by the docks John holds the gun up to his brother and contemplates whether to fire. The two wrestle, with Billy pleading with him to pull the trigger. Mare shows up just before he does, serving as a distraction as the two brothers fight. Mare pries them apart, prompting an end to this skirmish.

Back at the station, Mare's shown the obscured photo from the end of the previous episode. Here, it shows Erin and John together. Using a hairdryer to dry up her cast, she prepares to interview our suspects.

John admits that Erin called him out to the woods that night, angry and asking for him to pay for DJ's ear surgery. His whole story sounds pretty credible, but for one glaring detail. The gun. We'll get to that in a minute.

Just before John faces a lengthy stint behind bars, he asks Lori to look after DJ. She begrudgingly agrees, clearly carrying the weight of the world on her shoulders. She even manages to sort out DJ's ear surgery too.

Mare however, has found peace with her daughter. She allows Siobhan to head off to college, while her daughter touchingly retorts that Easttown is better with Mare sticking around.

In terms of Drew's parental rights, Carrie has started using drugs again. It's not so much an "I told you so" from Mare's perspective, especially when Carrie tearfully admits she only started it again to stay awake. This is, of course, a direct reference to the bath incident.

This also means that Mare gets to keep custody of Drew after all. It's a hollow victory at best though, especially as it shows Carrie broken and in need of help. Mare admits that she knows she loved her son.

Things are better between Frank and Mare too, with Mare mellowed out and no longer as hostile as she once was all those episodes ago. Sitting with her Mother, she admits that she took out a lot of her anger back then on Mare, for which she's forgiven herself for. Helen suddenly starts crying, telling Mare she should forgive herself for what happened too.

Part of that healing comes from the wedding which Siobhan sings at. Faye and Frank have their special day and Mare causes no drama. In fact she even dances with Richard too. Unfortunately this is tinged with a bittersweet taste. Richard is called away for a year's contract to another college.

When Mare catches up to say bye, he admits that she's one of the best things to happen to him and promises to return. The two kiss; a passionate, tender show of love before parting ways.

With the case all wrapped up, Glenn Carroll throws a serious spanner in the works. Remember the gun incident earlier on? There's another twist here waiting to unfold.

Glenn casually mentions to Mare how things have been going missing for a while — including his Colt Special pistol. Now, the Colt pistol is the same weapon that was used to kill Erin. Somehow it turned up several days later, but with two rounds missing from the chamber. There's only two people who have access to the shed — Glenn... and Ryan Ross.

Mare immediately races inside to check the CCTV, noticing Ryan leave the shed in dark clothes. Struggling to hold it together, she heads up to the High School, realizing that he's the real suspect from the way he rushes home. Mare's voice breaks as she calls it in to the station.

John took the fall for his son, which explains why he was unable to actually describe the weapon, while Mare heads up to Lori's house with the other officers, preparing to arrest Ryan.

In the station, we hear the true version of events from that night. Ryan admits that he knew about his Father's relationship with Erin. He promised to hide this if he ended things with Erin. Only, that night when everyone was over at Frank's, he noticed John leave and on the phone to Erin. He sent a message from John's phone, telling Erin he'll be there before grabbing the gun and heading to the park to wait for her.

Ryan only meant to scare Erin but the pair fought over the pistol, eventually leading to several gunshots ricocheting through the air. This explains the chips up on the wall too and why Erin was killed. Ryan realized what he did and put the gun back after getting nervous that it could link back to him. John and Billy sorted everything out to hide and protect Ryan. It also had nothing to do with John's affair with Sandra Elliot either.

In finding out the truth and solving the case, Lori is distraught and takes her grief-stricken frustration out on Mare. It takes a while but eventually Mare heads over to see her friend. She doesn't say anything, instead letting their actions speak louder than words as she embraces Lori and lets her get her grief out.

Speaking of which, Mare finally allows herself to face what she's been afraid of for so long, heading up to the attic as the scene fades to black.
