Summary: Led by Majors Cleven and Egan, the 100th Bomb Group arrives in England and joins the 8th Air Force's campaign against Nazi Germany.

The episode begins in a bar, introducing us to two of the main characters. Major Gale "Buck" Cleven and Major John "Bucky" Eagan are best buddies. Not only that, but the duo also serve in the US Air Force. They are shipping out with the 100th Bomb Squad the next day to England. Well, Eagan is flying out a few weeks before Cleven. The former has been promoted to General Air Executive, which means that he won't fly the bomber planes in missions. Eagan's job profile would be more administrative, on the ground.



But given his innate desire to contribute, Eagan has procured the position of an Observation Pilot and will be a part of a couple of missions. The spring of 1943 brought along an intensification of the Second World War. The 100th was shipped off to England to help the 8th US Air Force in its aerial duel with Nazi Germany. Their unit is made up of four squadrons, one of which is headed by Major Clevon. Each plane has six to eight members.

Their initial landing in the South Greenland base is bumpy. However, the unit is highly trained, if not experienced.

The basic flying training is no comparison to what they will face in the coming weeks. Real war is a different ball game that will test their bravery and character. Almost everyone in the unit is from different places in the US. Major Harry Crossby, a navigator in one of the planes, is the narrator who guides us through the various events that the unit was involved in.

The unit had to fly from Greenland to the Thorpe Abbots Air Field to begin their missions. However, the plane that Crossby was part of got diverted toward France — majorly due to his own mistake. The cloud cover also hindered their visibility. They landed right in the middle of the action but were able to slip out of the dangerous situation. Even their landing was problematic as one of the flaps didn't open. They had to crash land, which attracted the attention of CO Harold Huglin.

Eagan is summoned and warned about maintaining order in the unit. He pleads to be demoted to a Squadron Commander. It is highly unusual but Eagan's desire to fight is strong. Huglin, though, rejects his request. He also has another battle to fight as right after Eagan leaves, Huglin vomits blood on his table.

Finally, on 25 June 1944, the unit gets their first mission. The squads assemble in the morning, hardly prepared for the task ahead. The target for the mission would be Bremen, where the bomb squad will be hitting the German U-boat pens, which are basically bunkers to protect them from air attacks.

It is vital that these boats be neutralized as almost 70 cargo ships until now belong to the Allies have been downed in the sea. The 350th will be led by Clevon, while the 349th will be led by Major Wheeler. The importance of remaining together in a tight formation is emphasized. Otherwise, the German fighters could pick them off one by one. Beyond the counter moves in the air, the unit will also have to brave ground artillery that will try to stop them in their paths before they hit the pens.

The weather conditions are once again unfavourable. There is dense cloud coverage that makes it difficult for the planes to have visibility. In fact, even before the mission starts, two planes almost bump into each other from the two divisions. Once the Germans are alerted to the planes, artillery fire is started. A few of the planes are hit but they are able to manage. Huglin, who is also flying with the 349th, makes a big decision by "scrubbing" the mission, owing to the poor visibility.

They cannot see the pens from the open air and hence, cannot accurately bomb them. The message is relayed, bringing disappointment to the unit. As soon as the air clears from the artillery fire, the unit knows what's coming next — the German counter in the air. This does some significant damage to the unit, taking down three from the Air Force unit. While 19 planes flew from the British base, only 16 flew back. The alarm is sounded and a full interrogation is undertaken. All the excitement and build-up ends with no bombs being dropped on the Germans, as Clevon remarks. No one expected such brutality in the air... but perhaps this is the new normal for the 100th bomb squad.

Summary: The 100th bombs German U-boat pens in Norway. With the help of Lt Crosby's navigating, a damaged B-17 struggles to get back to Britain.

The episode begins in the grim aftermath of the unit's failed air mission. Due to lack of visibility, CO Huglin scrubbed the mission, preventing the US planes from dropping even a single bomb. The unit suffered sizeable casualties. The assault from the much superior German jets also wreaked havoc. A lot of men are pounded and rendered unfit to serve in the immediate future. Bosser and Dickie suffer from frostbite, which will keep them from being on the planes as well. Besides the damage in the air, some men also suffered on the ground from a different kind of struggle.



Lt. Curtis Biddick is invited by Major Egan for an alcohol blowout in the wake of the mission. Egan is pained that he couldn't be a part of it and contribute with his leadership skills. He laments the one who fell during the mission, also revealing that he is set to meet the new Commanding Officer, Colonel Harding, due the next morning (which Curt reminds him is in a couple of hours).

Harding is a little different than Huglin in his approach. He has a more laid-back attitude but is better at man management. The result of the meeting is that Egan is "demoted" to the position of

Squadron Commander of the 489th, meaning he will fly in the next mission. When he breaks the news to Gale and Jack, he learns that the former met Harding before Egan did. Jack is disgruntled because it means he will now take Egan's position. But the newly demoted commander is ecstatic.

Three weeks pass and the dust has already settled. Our narrator begins the briefly forwarded timeline with a note of recognition for the ground crew. Washed of all glory due to the nature of their work, the crew is an important cog in enabling these high-risk missions. Repair work and planning are essential requisites for the "masters of the air" to work their magic. We are also introduced to Crew Chief Ken Lemmons in this narration, 19 years old but arguably the best at his job among the chiefs.

However, the attention quickly shifts to yet another tragedy. One of the planes crashes in the fields nearby, pegging the unit another man down. Reinforcements from Podington will not arrive until a few weeks from now, establishing an acute shortage of combat aircrewmembers in the unit. On a night of revelry, before an impending mission order is dictated, we see men from the US Air Force clash with a few officers from the British RAF.

Despite being allies in this fight, they are at loggerheads in the heat of the discussion on the missions. While the Brits maintain that night missions are safer for the force, the Americans bemoan the lack of precision and clarity in that choice. The day missions result in more casualties on the side of the Americans, whereas the night missions produce more casualties on the targets. This snowballs into a "friendly riffraff" between the two factions, all in good humour but clearly establishing their differing philosophies.

The day of the mission soon arrives, promising loads of action ahead. The targets for the mission are submarine pens in Trondheim, Norway. Egan will lead the formation of the 100th. But his plane suffers a casualty even before they hit the air. Master navigator Joe Bubbles is rendered unfit due to sickness. Our narrator, Crosby, has to take charge instead. He isn't ready but Bubbles has already set the maps, plans, and directions for the mission. With a lot of hesitation and trepidation, he boards the plane... and the planes go wheels up.

Crosby's air sickness continues as he falls behind on navigational cues. But he recovers admirably to guide the formation into enemy territory. This time, the unit is able to drop the bombs successfully with a few setbacks. German artillery pulls a lot of challenges for the unit but they sail through smoothly, all except the plane piloted by Curt, which suffers multiple engine failures. It is clear they won't be able to keep up the speed with the rest of the unit.

German fighter jets are aware of the situation and try to pick them off. But Egan and Clevon ensure that they aren't left behind. They intentionally lower their speed to match the wounded plane. Crosby stumbles through the navigational instructions to bring the unit back to safety. It is his brevity and quick action that allows Curt's plane to land safely on the hills somewhere in Scotland. The others fly back to home base, safely marking a successful mission.

Crosby enthusiastically narrates to Bubbles the ordeal he suffered. He will surely be back for the next one but Crosby has made his mark. His antics have impressed Harding, ensuring his transfer to Major Everett Blakely's crew full-time as the navigator in the tail. The success of the mission is celebrated by the unit with a night of drinking, dancing, and merrymaking, with Egan leading the charge.

Curt informs Egan and Cleven that the crew is safe in some good samaritan's home, who also happens to share a dislike for the Brits. The soldiers are in the middle of an impromptu bike race in the officers' mess when the air sirens start ringing. They take shelter as we see the city of Norwich, located nearby, being bombed by the Germans. Egan and Cleven fear they could be next, although the former is the more hopeful of the two. Their resolve to lead the men through the tough times remains strong.

Summary:	The group participates in its largest mission to date — the bombing of vital aircraft manufacturing plants deep within Germany.

The episode begins with the promise of the biggest air strike ever attempted in modern warfare history. Colonel Harding briefs the unit with the mission that aims to land a telling blow to the Germans that will take them months to recover from. On this occasion, the 8th Air Force will be targeting several ball-bearing production lines in three German cities. These small yet significant instruments go into every machine; without them, they cannot function.

Harding drills home the point that given the tempting upsides, the mission has as much risk. The 8th will be divided into three task forces, each playing a distinct role in achieving this goal. The first task force will be targeting the factory in Regensburg. One of the 100th will lead the charge. However, this task force will also have to face the heaviest brunt of Kraut resistance.



The chances of casualties will be high. But the 418th will have to endure the onslaught to allow the other two task forces to fly deeper into German territory and hit the factories in Schweinfurt and Frankfurt. Another surprise for the boys is the last leg of the plan — the return home. There will be no coming back to Abbots and Thorpe because the 8th will be flying further South to Telergma in Africa. Harding also informs the boys, to their utter disappointment, that they will be flying Tail-end Charlie, meaning that they

will be the most exposed to enemy fire in the air.

Egan will fly this mission as a reserve command pilot in Major Crookshank's fort. This confuses Clevon who unsuccessfully enquires about it from Egan. What compounds the difficulty levels for the mission is the dense fog that envelopes the base later that day. It delays the unit's take-off quite a bit. The crewmen are anxious to get in the air. All of this nervousness vanishes when Harding gets instructions from central command to go wheels up... without the second and third task forces.

Harding is taken aback by the order. He knows the instruction will lead the first task force straight into enemy territory without support. But he has little agency to act otherwise and relays the order to the planes. Mid-air, the unit realizes they are on their own. The German Flaks are very light and easy to navigate, indicating that the German fighters are preparing to bombard the task force. And it soon follows suit. The fighters go straight for Clevon's fort. The Germans take out the entire second element, leaving Clevon and the plane further exposed.

The task force is able to negate a few German fighters as well. But the damage to the Americans is telling. A visual from the control room reveals that the unit is still almost three hours away from the IP. This mission is headed towards being a colossal disaster and there is very little that can be done to avert it. One plane after the other goes down fighting. In the midst of it all, Curt's plane is also damaged beyond saving. Dickie, his copilot, is hit around the neck area. But he is still breathing, barely.

Curt doesn't want to abandon him but is reminded by Ewan that there is no choice. We see other crewmen facing similar situations and the entire perspective of the men in the air becomes crystal clear for the viewers. It is a losing battle, one that makes them feel powerless and without hope. Although Curt had promised to follow Ewan, he stays in the cockpit and is killed when the plane crashes. News finally breaks that the other two task forces have crossed the English channel, marking a giant five-hour delay.

Clevon's plane also faces a similar fate as Curt's after getting hit in the fuel tank and one of the engines. However, he makes it clear to the crew that they will continue flying and won't bail until the plane is still in the air. What's left of the 8th finally reaches above the IP as the German planes return to refuel. The crewmen finally breathe a sigh of relief as they destroy the factory. The mission is successful, although only ten US planes remain in the air. Clevon's plane desperately falls back in the pack.

He still isn't ready to bail out. Clevon instructs the crew to dump everything not bolted to the plane in order to stretch its range a little further. With no more German fighters to endure, the first task force of the 8th finally makes it to Africa. Only nine planes remain in the group. Quinn, who had bailed and landed somewhere in France, is confronted with the choice of either surrendering and becoming a prisoner of war of the Germans, or escaping back to England and risking his life.

All the airborne planes land safely; Clevon's is the last. Egan greets him and the rest in a jeep. However, one from Clevon's crew, Norm, didn't make it. Clevon and Egan discuss with the others that they might have lost but believe that Curt would have made it safely somewhere.

Summary: Lt. Rosenthal joins the 100th just as one of its crews reaches a milestone. The U-boat pens at Bremen become a target for the second time.

The episode begins in Teleghma, Algeria, where the remaining crew of the 100th bomb squad rest. It is not exactly a time for reflection, even as the missions prove to be the Air Force's costliest battle yet. But it is time to go back to England. Meanwhile, we learn Quinn's decision. He chooses to risk his life and escape back to England. Along with Bailey, a familiar face from

the 100th, Quinn is tested by two Belgian men about their knowledge of American culture. There is a third man as well but he ends up being shot by the two men, who point out that he was a German spy.



The calendar turns to September of 1943. Crosby, our narrator, remarks that 25 is the "magic number" around the base. Those many missions successfully completed mean that the crew can go home. Captain Glenn Dye and his crew are close to achieving that feat. Everyone awaits the crew's return to base. Lo and behold, Dye's men make it back and the base has a little party in the wake of their heroics.

The reaction is mixed. While generally, everyone is happy that at least one crew isn't going back home in a box, undertones of speculation also exist. Why celebrate this feat in the middle of the Great War? Now that a crew is going back, another is replacing them. Remember, there are only 12 crews left out of 35 who flew to Greenland a few months ago. The 100th needs more pilots.

Majors Cleven and Egan greet them, welcoming them to the squad. Rosenthal, Nash, Speas, and Lewis express their gratefulness at being afforded the chance to contribute in combat. Nash strikes up an intense chemistry with Helen, one of the female volunteers part of the canteen unit. CO Harding and Major Cleven are in the midst of the merrymaking as the soldiers rejoice some time off from the horribleness of the war. Egan takes a leave of absence, just for a weekend over in London. He meets a Polish woman at a bar and they share the night. Among other things, they foremostly discuss the cost of war and how it is distinguished from "senseless murder."

But while Egan certainly benefits from the night off, he misses out on another go at the Bremen U-boat pens. The 100th once again rises to bomb the facility and land a heavy blow on German ambitions in the sea. With some last-minute adjustments by Chief Lemmons, Cleven and his crew join the rest of the units in the air. Meanwhile, Quinn and Bailey are given a guide, Michau, to help them navigate the hustling German checkpoints in Paris. She is a woman of a few words but damn great at her job.

The boys are instructed to follow blindly everything she asks them to do. As they are approaching the station, Michau leaves to relieve herself. Quinn and Bailey discuss the fate of the former's crew. Both knew Baby Face, whom Quinn desperately tried to save in the previous episode. Bailey's vote of confidence for Quinn's decision to leave Baby Face certainly helps his confidence. However, they run into trouble when the French ticket checker enters the cabin and asks them for their identification papers.

Michau arrives just in time but Quinn panics. Michau explains that both men are deaf and Quinn got scared with the checker's haranguing. Manon, an associate of Michau who has been standing outside the cabin all this while, intervenes. She grabs Quinn by the collar and tells him what to do. Bailey and Quinn will be taken to Spain from France and then finally back to England. Although we do not see the visuals from the Bremen mission, we learn next that around eight planes were lost. Those include Cleven and Nash's planes.

Rosenthal, who made it back, informs Helen about the tragedy. Despite the unfortunate losses, the next day's papers confirm that the Bremen mission was a success. The Americans have successfully destroyed the U-boat pens. Egan reads the news after taking the Polish woman's leave, who makes it clear that she cannot have her heart broken again by a "dead pilot" (since her erstwhile husband was also one).

He immediately calls Bowman via telephone, who informs him about Cleven's demise. Egan looks away in heartbreak. He asks if there will be another mission the following day, and Bowman confirms there will. Egan emphatically tells him that he will come back for that mission, leading the formation in the lineup.

Summary:	Rosie's next mission signals a significant shift in the 100th's bombing strategy. Crosby receives a promotion, but it comes with a high price.

The episode begins with some good news. As expected, Egan is back at the base. So are some other crewmen from the deadly Bremen mission. The trio of Crosby, Berkely, and Douglas also arrive back at the base. Everyone is surprised to see them. The emotions are mixed because the crewmen learn that some of their brothers didn't make it back. Cleven's presumed demise has everyone talking.

He was the undisputed leader of the pack for the 100th. Crosby even mentions that Cleven was considered invincible. Egan is eager to get back at the Germans and waltzes in the mess area. His presence suggests that the 100th will be flying yet another mission that day — that is two in the space of as many days. Crosby is given good news by Bubbles — he is going to be the new group navigator for the unit. This means that Crosby will be replaced in the plane by Bubbles, while he handles the navigation from his office.



The episode introduces a moral conflict as CO Harding lays out the specifics of the mission. The unit will be targeting the railroad workers stationed near the city centre in Munster. This is an attempt by the US to disrupt Germany's industrial transportation, which will land them a heavy blow. However, the target's proximity to civilian areas gets many soldiers concerned. Cruikshank is one of them but is quickly shot down by Egan, who only has revenge on his mind.

He still hasn't processed Clevon's death and this mission is probably the trigger to get him past it. Only 17 ships from the 100th fly out with escort formations to guide them closer to the target. Four mechanical failures make it 13. German flak bombs also do a lot of damage and as they subside, it is the turn for German fighters to cross paths with the 100th. Egan's plane is badly injured after two rounds of heavy bombarding. He still insists on dropping the bombs and somehow, they manage to empty the bay of the plane.

But there is no salvaging it and the crew abandons the ship. Egan lands somewhere in a field in Westphalia in German territory. Meanwhile, the action shifts back to the air where almost eight US bombers are able to destroy the target successfully. However, the incoming fire from German fighters takes a heavy toll. After their onslaught is done and they turn back to refuel, the 100th has lost all but one plane: the one manned by new recruits Rosenthal and Lewis. They are dumbfounded at what they see around them. The crew does not have enough time to process these inexplicable sights as stubborn German bogeys return to finish the job.

The plane is hit but is still in a flying condition. Although they take down several German planes, the crew find themselves in dire straights, facing an uphill task to make it out alive. Americans back at the Thorpe and Abbots base eagerly anticipate the arrival of the planes. They spot an RAF plane that flew with the 100th on the mission due to enormous repair works still incomplete from the previous mission. They communicate to Harding that none of the other planes made it back, bringing a despairing look on everyone's face.

Finally, the one manned by Rosenthal and Lewis is spotted in the air. Rosenthal immediately calls for an ambulance and brings the plane to a halt. As the crew is heading for interrogation, one of them angrily throws his helmet to the ground and exclaims, "This is the last time I am up in the air." It encapsulates all the frustrations that the men in battle, who can tangibly feel its brunt on the field, go through. During the interrogation, Crossby learns that Bubbles' plane, "She's Gonna," blew up before anyone could get out. It is the same fate for most of the planes in the 100th.

Cross reads the letter that Bubbles had written for Jean, Cross' wife when he was presumed dead. It is the most affecting moment in the episode that puts into perspective the fickle nature of war.

Summary: Rosie and his crew are sent to rest at a country estate. Crosby meets an intriguing British officer at Oxford. Egan faces the essence of Nazi evil.



The spirit of the boys is down following the Munster mission. But it is Rosenthal's crew — who have completed three gruesome missions in as many days — that are the focus. They are sent for a five-day relaxation trip to Coombe House. Rosenthal is himself sceptical of the idea. He wants to go back to the base but Dr Huston, a flight surgeon looking over the men, asks Rosenthal to try and process the events of the past three days. On the second night, Rosenthal, who cannot sleep, encounters Huston in the living room downstairs.

The two men get to talking. They disagree about human nature and the need for a war. Rosenthal exclaims that this relaxation trip has "broken his rhythm." The next day, while playing cards, one of the crewmen recalls how Rosenthal's humming gave them hope during the Munster mission.

Germany — Egan tiptoes around the wilderness in Westphalia, hiding from Germans. However, he runs into a group of children, who, despite his mercy of not killing them, rat him out. Egan runs but is taken into custody by civilians, who then hand him over to the military. He is being transported to a Prisoner of War (PoW) Camp in Frankfurt. However, en route, along with other Americans and guarding German soldiers, he runs into an angry mob. Their neighbourhood has recently been bombed by the RAF and the mob is livid.

They attack the Americans, killing all of them bar Egan, who is lucky to escape a bullet. He regains consciousness the next day as two civilians take the bodies on a cart to bury them in the forest. Egan tries to run but is badly wounded. Exhausted, he falls unconscious on the ground, to be discovered later by German soldiers. He is brought to the Dulan Luft in Frankfurt, where he is processed into commitment. His interrogating officer is quaint. He doesn't act like a German at all.

He tries to comfort Egan and talks about the Yankees and the World Series. It is a subtle way to manipulate Egan. To provoke him, the officer brings up Cleven's disappearance. That is followed by the bottom line: since there is no record of Egan on the mission, he is deemed a spy. Egan refuses to indulge in the officer's plea to identify himself and discuss further American plans. Egan is thrown into jail.

The next morning, Egan is transported with the rest of the captured Americans on a train. While leaving, they see a train of Jews being taken to a concentration camp to be gassed. However, we get a positive ending as Egan and the others are taken to Stalag Luft III in Sagan, Germany. They meet up with other PoWs, most of whom are part of the 100th. Egan's eyes light up when he sees his old friends, but seeing Cleven by the wayside "takes the buck."

Balliol College, Oxford — Out of the 35 crews that originally left with the 100th for England in 1943, only 3 remain. Only a few months have passed but the number has dwindled significantly. CO Harding and the other superiors are trying to take care of their men. In line with this initiative, Captain Crossby was sent to Balliol College in Oxford to attend a symposium. Many other speakers from the Allies will be there as well. Crossby shares a room with Subaltern Alessandra Westgate, a female officer.

The two instantly begin a friendship and learn about each other's personal lives. Over drinks, late at night, Crossby talks about Bubbles and how his death was his fault. He feels responsible for the planes going down but Westgate shuts him down. She rightly puts things into perspective by blaming Hitler, alleviating Crossby's burden.

The duo roam in the city the next day, even going to a party. However, their companionship is shortened when Westgate receives an urgent message from the base. In the episode's epilogue, Crossby remarks how the soldiers pulled themselves back up from setbacks and went into the cockpits and planes again each time.

Summary:	The prisoners of Stalag Luft III attempt to connect with the outside world. Berlin becomes the 100th's primary target. Rosie makes a crucial decision.

The American PoWs are being kept in the Stalags controlled by the Luftwaffe. Since the Americans have also got their German counterparts in such camps, Egan and the others are treated fairly. Although it is nothing to write home about, American bravehearts from the 100th and beyond are surviving the war. They are keeping constant tabs on what's happening.

Europe's invasion is imminent and the Allied powers haven't been able to gain too much ground. Egan, Cleven, and a few others from the 100th are found out during a standard German search of the cabin, leaving them with no contact with the outside world.



Cleven proposes to make an impromptu crystal radio to bring back the communication lines. As the men are taking in the bombing of Berlin — which is audible because of the distant explosions — one of them is shot by a German soldier. Upon enquiry, they explain that Harry was out of his quarters when they were all supposed to stay inside. But no one is buying it. Egan frustratingly confesses that the Germans will find any opportunity to pick them off.

The best friends are at odds as to their next course of action. While Egan believes they should try to escape, Cleven is of the opinion they should stay back. One night, while reading a letter from Marge, Cleven reveals to Egan that he proposed to her and she has accepted. At the time, Cleven didn't know if Egan was alive or not. But now, he makes Egan promise to be his best man at the wedding. Cleven's persistent efforts finally pay off as the radio becomes operational.

On the night of 24 March 1944, the Americans learn that 80 British PoWs in the North Compound of the Stalag have escaped. They used tunnels that they had been digging for over a year to get away. General Simoleit calls a few of the American PoWs to his office. He explains that as a result of these escape attempts, the Stalags may be shifted under SS and Gestapo command, subject to ongoing discussions. Simoleit discourages them from reprising these acts, while also hinting that Jews among their ranks will be separated. The Americans, however, do not stand for this and reject the call for segregation.

Crossby's voiceover reveals that the 100th bomb squad has suffered so many casualties that the replacement crew have also been replaced. This has prompted some men to refrain from making new friends as getting too attached in this fickle environment would be heartbreaking if they were to go down.

Quinn and Bailey, who were being smuggled through Spain by French and Belgian allies, are finally back. Under the governing rules, they are all set to go back home because, in the event of their capture, those who helped them and the escape routes would be exposed.

The central mission for the episode is the bombing of Berlin. Despite the scale of some of the other missions like Munster and Bremen, this is the most ambitious one till now. It is also the most dangerous given that the Americans will be attacking Germany at its heart. Rosie's crew are on standby for this one. They are at 24 successful missions now. One more and they get to go home.

On the day of the mission, the Americans are handed a huge setback. Crosby narrates that the day of the mission came to be known as Black Monday. The 100th lost another 15 planes and crews.

The Germans even shot down those who exited their planes in parachutes. The ones who made it back are in dire straits. It is chaos all around... but the dust will also settle on this as well. For now, the men need something to distract them from the war. Its repercussions on Crosby are clear as we learn he has started an affair with Sandra Westgate, the British Subaltern.

The men have hardly recovered from the Berlin mission when the Brass sends yet another invitation to repeat it. Everything is exactly like the previous mission including the routes. There is discontentment among the men, who feel that the ones giving the orders don't care if they live or die. Colonel Bennet has temporarily taken over as the CO of the 100th. To boost the morale of the men, he leads the wing formation on the mission. The target for this mission is the ball-bearing factory in Ernst.

One difference from the previous mission was the introduction of a fleet of P-51 Mustangs, who escorted the B-17 bomber planes into German territory. These new planes were the best fighters in the sky, even pipping their German counterparts in terms of speed and manoeuvrability. The mission is a flying success as the Americans bomb the factory and only lose one bomber plane. Rosie and his crew are among those who have made it back. It is time to finally go home and the rest of the ground crew couldn't be happier for them.

However, at the celebratory party, the other crew learn that the Brass has upped the ceiling of

successful missions to 30. Although Rosie and his men are not impacted by this rule change, he still feels heartbroken. Others, including Major Shoens, are also demoralized and the sentiment of discontent grows. In the wake of this new development, Rosie decides to stay back. He shares an intense and frank conversation with Bennett about his intentions.

Rosie feels that instead of refreshing the 100th with new crewmembers, it would be wiser for the old crew to stay back for as long as they can and finish the war. Bennett also remarks that Rosie will be the new CO for the 350th squadron in the 100th.

Summary: Crosby prepares for D-Day. The POWs wonder how the Allied landing will affect their fate. Tuskegee pilots attack targets in Southern France.

The episode begins with the introduction of the Tuskegee Airmen. The renowned group played a significant role as part of the 15th UAF flying numerous air missions with unmatched precision and success. We primarily focus on three airmen — Second Lieutenant Robert Daniels, Lieutenant Alexander Jefferson, and Richard Macon. They formed the 99th Pursuit Squadron, which was tactically one of the best units in the Air Force. The Tuskegee flew missions from bases in Italy, primarily the Ramitelli base.

Their missions into Europe came much later but it was the Tuskegee who escorted many missions for the 8th in their blistering P-51 fighter jets. Meanwhile, at the Stalag III, eight months have passed since Cleven and Egan were captured. Egan is getting impatient with the waiting. He grows anxious every day that the Americans in the prisoner camps do not fight back. But Cleven asks him to bide his time. They are fast approaching the moment to seize their destinies and break out from under the Germans.



At the Thorpe and Abbots airfield, Harry Crossby narrates the three-day period when he would have almost no sleep. The calendar has turned to 3 June 1944, 72 hours away from D-Day. This is, of course, when *Masters of the Air's* timeline overlaps with *Band of Brothers*. The Normandy landing was only made possible due to the stunning support from the air. Cross narrates that apart from the Normandy mission, the 8th also had to fly further inland and destroy the German communication lines and railroads.

As Group Navigator, Cross had to chart out all the routes on the maps. He

explains that during this period, he had to handle missions running into hundreds as the war reached its twilight. During this montage, we also learn that Sandra Westgate is a spy with the British intelligence agency, currently running a mission in Paris. Although Cross had gone non-stop for almost 64 hours, his body couldn't take more and he collapsed, waking up three days later.

CO Bennett is replaced by Colonel Jeffrey, who will oversee this testing period. The invasion of Europe will be the make-or-break point in this journey. On D-Day, we learn about the victory of the Allies through two perspectives. One, from the Stalag, and the other, from the field. The former is more stretched out as Cleven, Egan, and the rest of the prisoners prepare an escape plan. They very well know that once the Allies invade Germany, the SS can as easily execute them all as march them across harsh terrains.

It is Rosie who greets Cross when he finally wakes up, informing him of the Normandy landing and a telling blow to Germany's hopes of winning the war. We jump two months after D-Day when Germany is fighting a two-front war. Presently, the captured Americans think that instead of executing them, the Germans might move them deeper into Germany to use them as leverage. As for the Tuskegee, their air missions are almost suicidal in nature. To ensure that Operation Dragoon was successful and Allied forces could land in Southern France, the Tuskegee airmen would fly missions at these landing sites.

Their targets are in Marseille, Toulon, and Saint-Tropez, where they destroyed German detection radars. It is similar in nature to what happened in Normandy but the odds are bleaker. As SL Macon rightly points out during the prep meeting, the airmen will not have enough fuel to return back to base. They most probably will have to make it to friendlier territories or land in German territory as well. Although the mission is successful, Macon, Jefferson, and Daniels are caught in Toulon after their planes go down.

These three men are taken to Stalag, where they meet up with Cleven and the others. The two factions are planning escapes on their own accord, awaiting the right moment to make their moves. Jefferson and Cleven bond over their experience as fighter pilots. Cleven discovers a map Jefferson drew by memory, which intrigues him as it could help in their plan. This is when the two plans are merged into a larger attempt to escape the Germans.

Summary: Nearing the end of the war, POW's endure a harrowing journey across German territory while Rosie uncovers a shocking discovery.



The episode picks up in the aftermath of the Normandy invasion. The timeline jumps a year ahead into early 1945 when the Allies were firmly in the driver's seat. The Allies were invading Germany through the West, the Russians closed in from the East, and the 8th UAF flew uncontested in the skies: a true and absolute defeat awaited them.

This is what compels the SS to force the Stalag prisoners into marching deeper into the country. We see the American prisoners being marched toward a

forced brick labour factory in Muskau. The weather is unyielding and completely averse to anything living. Yet, the American prisoners march on with the SS hounding them from all sides.

During the opening scenes, we see the 8th flying through German skies unopposed. Rosie is once again leading the formation as lead pilot as the Allies destroy all German lines of communications and transport.

However, in an unfortunate accident, the plane becomes inhabitable. Rosie and his copilot make the decision to bail. He is cognizant of their position over the German territory, thereby ensuring that he waits long enough to be in no-man's land. This is right by the Eastern side of the Oder River where the Soviets and Germans are involved in heavy gunfire. Rosie, unsure of who's who, takes out his pistol and buries himself in a ditch. When soldiers approach him, Rosie communicates his identity to them as he realizes they are Soviets.

After leaving Stalag III, the cries for an escape become firmer. Subconsciously, everyone is thinking about it but the SS officers sense that. The weather conditions make it harder for Egan's plan to materialize. He still tries to convince Cleven to make a move but to no avail. Many prisoners and officers get sick en route. When they finally get to the factory, the prisoners clamour for some warmth. They stay the night inside but Cleven believes they will be taken via train further near Bavaria.

He is proved right as the Germans load the prisoners onto trains to take them to Nuremberg. This city is at the heart of Hitler's evil Nazi regime and extermination plans for Jews, forcing Solomon, a Jewish American pilot, to cry out for his life. Cleven and the others calm him down as the prisoners are taken to another Stalag.

Back at the Thorpe and Abbots base, Croz and the others lose their calm on many occasions. Although it is likely that the Allies will win the war, the number of casualties is so high that they do not want to lose more men.

Rosie is informed by a Soviet general that he will be boarding a flight to Moscow shortly. From there, he will be transported back to England and the air base. En route to the Soviet camp, the entourage stops near the Zabi Kowo Camp. Historically, the site was used as a gas chamber for Jews and a prison camp during the war. Mostly Polish and Soviet prisoners were brought to the camp, tortured, and killed. Rosie gets down to inspect the camp and cries out in horror when he sees the dead bodies lying around in the place. He forgets about the smell as his mind tries to comprehend the unspeakable atrocities on these people.

The focus on this brutality of the Germans continues well into the next few scenes where Rosie talks to a Jewish man saved by the Soviets. He tells of the difficult circumstances under which his family was killed and how he had to bury them.

For the American prisoners in Stalag XIII, the journey ahead gets more difficult. Come April in 1945, the Allies were in the driver's seat to win the war. The SS force them deeper into Germany with another night march. This time around, the weather isn't as bad. Egan, Cleven, and two others make a plan to escape the march. However, as they are in the midst of their plan, one of the officers spots them.

Egan is left behind, allowing the other three to escape successfully. They aren't able to get too far from the march before running into more hostile Germans. While sleeping in the woods, children dressed in the army's uniform and carrying their weapons attack the men. One of them, Neithammer, is killed. Cleven spares their lives and carries on with the other soldier.

At the T&A Base, Rosie is given a rousing welcome. The real-life hero is the most decorated

American pilot during WWII, having flown record missions and continuing to stay back for his men despite winning a ticket home. He reconnects with Croz at the base, where it is revealed that Jean, Croz's wife, is pregnant.

They also discuss the vanity of war and lament the number of lives lost. But there is also the question about the necessity of having to fight back against unjust rule like Hitler's.

Cleven and the other soldiers make it to a safe haven. Cleven flies back to the T&A Base, welcomed with enthusiasm by Croz and Rosie. The US is flying supply missions for Dutch populations caught in the midst of war. Cleven is asked to join and he happily accepts, even with the added risk that the Germans might release flak in the air, despite a ceasefire agreement.

Victory awaits the Stalag prisoners, who find themselves in another camp in Moosburg. They overpower the German officers and raise the American flag to secure their independence. The Germans keep their promise as Cleven and the others successfully fly the supply missions.

As they are landing, Egan gives Cleven the clearance, surprising him. The two friends are ecstatic to see each other, and so are the others at the camp to see Egan alive and hearty.

Finally, on 8th May 1945, the WWII ended with the surrender of the Germans. The 100th, whatever remained of it, packed up shop at the T&A Base and flew back home.
