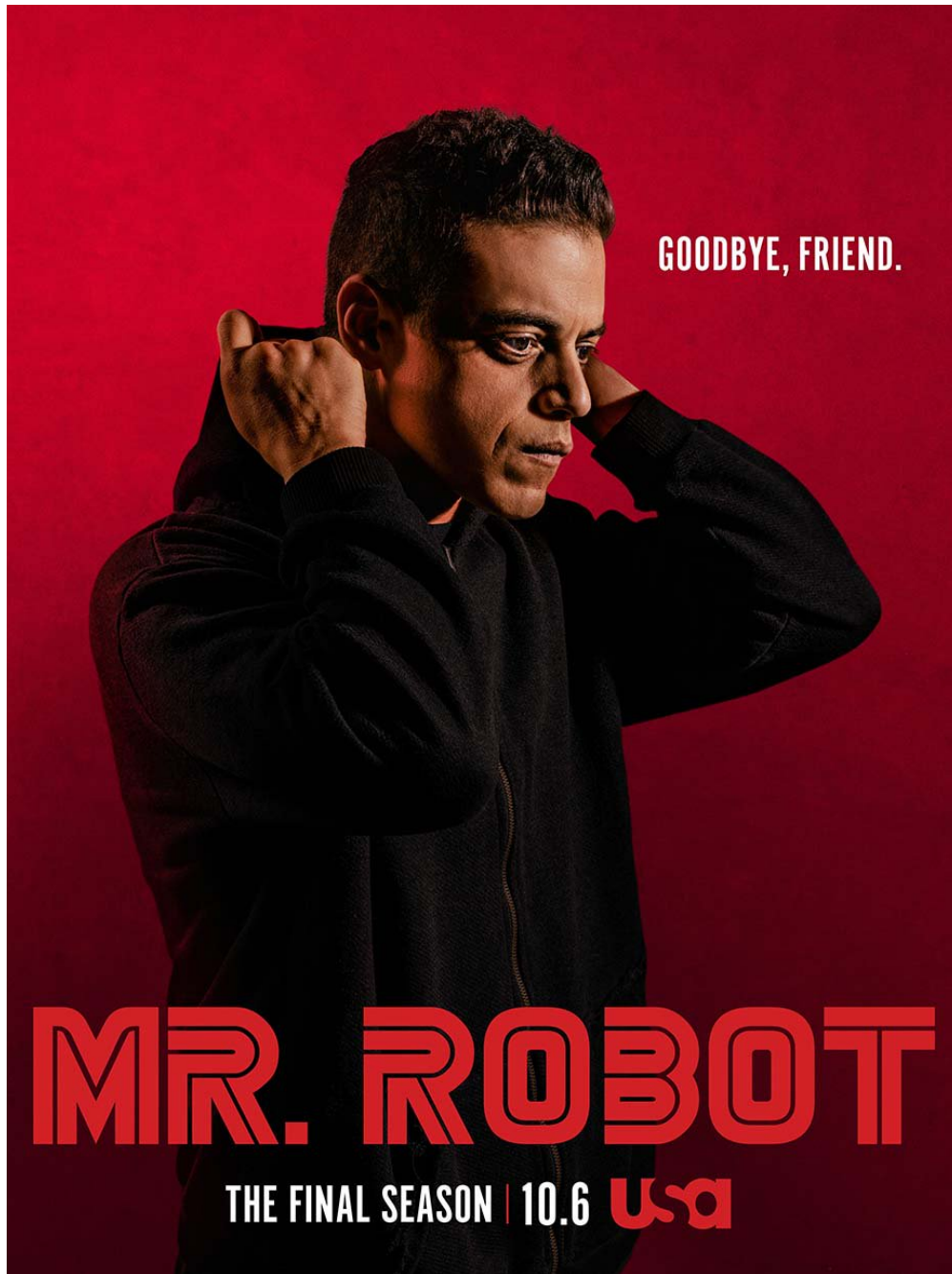

Summary: Elliot, a cyber-security engineer by day and vigilante hacker by night, is recruited by a mysterious underground group to destroy the firm he's paid to protect. Elliot must decide how far he'll go to expose the forces he believes are running (and ruining) the world.



The episode began with Elliot telling his imaginary friend that he believed that the world was run by a huge conspiracy orchestrated by the "top one percent of the one percent", whom he thinks is following him. He then told his friend that instead of going to his best friend Angela Moss' birthday party, he went to Ron's Coffee Shop and confronted the owner. He discovered the owner was distributing child pornography and despite being anti-social, confronted him in person before he was arrested.

On the subway, he saw the men in black who were following him, and a man, who talked to him.

The next day, at work, he agreed to look over the logs as their biggest client, a worldwide conglomerate he called "Evil Corp", whose account was managed by Angela, had been hacked. He then apologized to Angela for not going to her birthday celebration. He tried to interact with her boyfriend, who wanted them to be friends.

Afterwards, he went to see his therapist, Krista Gordon, who was dating a man named Michael Hansen, and as usual, didn't say a thing. However, he told Krista that he respected her as she truly didn't want him to be lonely. He then stalked them. While doing so, he discovered that the men in black, and the man on the train were following him.

Later that night, he tried hacking into Hansen's profile, and after crying out of loneliness, took some morphine and hooked up with his drug dealer. However, he was called over back to work, at All Safe, as Evil Corp had been hacked with DDOS attack which used a unique RootKit. After discovering that they were actually spreading the virus everytime they tried to shut it down and reboot the system, he and his boss, Gideon, flew to Dulles in order to shut down the system from the data server farm. There, he managed to stop it from spreading by isolating the infected server from the rest of the systems by redirecting the traffic. Afterwards, he discovered that the

attack was from somebody called fsociety, and discovered that they were asking him to leave it there. He then reconfigured the .dat file so that only he would have access to it.

Back at home, on the empty train, he saw the man on the train, who wore a Mr. Robot patch on his jacket. He told him to follow him if he didn't delete the file. Afterwards, Mr. Robot brought him to an abandoned amusement park arcade on Coney Island where the F Society hackers worked on a project.

Later that night, Elliot discovered that Mr. Robot had expertly hid all traces of F Society or himself online. After collecting some data on them. After burning the RootKit file onto a CD, he went back and told Mr. Robot that he was going to turn them in.

However, Mr. Robot told him that he wanted him to place the IP address of Terry Colby, the head of Evil Corp's technology division, into the .dat file to make it seem like the attack had originated from his terminal. He then told Elliot that this was the first step in tearing down Evil Corp and the conspiracy. He wanted to orchestrate a revolution- "the biggest wealth distribution" in the world, by crashing the financial market so that all the debts owed to Evil Corp would go up in smoke. The next day, Terry asked him to tell the FBI what happened instead of Angela, who became so upset at him that she didn't talk to him for a month. Elliot then gave them the packet that pointed to Terry as the culprit.

However, over the next nineteen days, as nothing was happening, and as Mr. Robot and F Society seemingly disappeared, he hacked Hansen and after discovering that he was cheating on his wife with Krista, forced him to confess everything to her.

Back at work, Elliot apologized to Angela. They then discovered that Terry had been arrested as the attack had seemingly come from his computer terminal. He then went outside and raised his arms in victory. He was stopped short after several men in black came and took him to a board room meeting of the power brokers in the world. Then, to his surprise, he was greeted by Tyrell, the Senior Vice President of the Technology Division of Evil Corp, who had befriended him during one of Evil Corps meetings with All Safe a month back.

Summary: Elliot is torn between accepting a job offer from an evil corporation and joining the fsociety hacker group.



Following the events of the first episode, Elliot is inside a conference room at Evil Corp (formally known as E. Corp) and is offered a job in their Cyber Security Division. However Tywell Wellick, now promoted after the arrest of executive Terry Colby, cannot offer Elliot directly due to a non-compete disclosure with Elliot's employer Allsafe. Stricken with confusion and disbelief, Elliot almost stutters in responding, "I'd have to think about it" despite Wellick's insistence of his qualifications.

Elliot returns home to find his neighbor and drug dealer Shayla outside his building and asks to score some morphine. Looking to get a step ahead, he begins hacking Wellick's emails. Without finding any incriminating evidence, Elliot gets paranoid and believes Wellick set him up for the hack and Elliot quickly dismantles and destroys his PC. His paranoia could become a disadvantage for Elliot in the long-run.

Elliot returns to Allsafe hoping to return to normal but feels guilty for defaming Colby's reputation. His Allsafe boss Gideon Goddard rewards him with a small raise in lieu of his saving E. Corp from a massive data breach caused by 'fsociety,' headed by Mr. Robot. Still in a fearful state, Elliot questions Goddard's knowledge of 'fsociety,' to which he shows him a YouTube video of the latest demands by 'fsociety' which include the release of Colby who they falsely claim as their own member.

Confused over 'fsociety's' intentions and wary of getting involved in illegal activity, Elliot attempts to sever ties with Mr. Robot. But before he could, 'fsociety' hacker Darlene stops by his apartment and convinces him to come to their Coney Island headquarters.

Mr. Robot briefs Elliot on their next phase: blowing up a natural gas plant in Albany, New York. Elliot realizes the plant is next door to Steel Mountain, the off-sight data storage unit for every S&P corporation including Evil Corp. that would data dump all their precious information. As Mr. Robot is excited for the anarchy that would ensue, Elliot objects to any human casualties.

As Mr. Robot does his best to recruit him, Elliot remains defiant and refuses to engage in his "revolution" if it means harming others and putting innocent people in jail. Elliot leaves their headquarters despite Mr. Robot's threat that if he leaves he is no longer invited back.

Elliot goes back to Shayla's apartment where he meets Fernando Vera, her drug supplier. As Fernando intimidates him, Elliot begins planning in his head to hack his emails in an attempt to turn him into the police for criminal behavior. However, as Fernando is Shayla's only supplier that means Elliot's drug use will be cut off. Once Fernando finally leaves, Elliot finds Shayla asleep in her bathtub. With a bruised face, Shayla has no recollection as to how she got in her tub.

Unaware that Fernando sexually assaulted her, Shayla maintains that she keep him as her supplier because of the good deals he provides, or as Elliot puts it, "the invisible hand controlling us, even if it pushes us past our thresholds of pain." Questioning that Fernando should be eliminated, Elliot risks having to quit drugs cold turkey if it means Fernando is no longer around to take advantage of Shayla.

While meeting with his therapist Krista Gordon he speaks vaguely about the choices he is faced with and the pain of not being in control of his life. As she brings up Elliot's father, who died from cancer attributed by his occupation, Elliot becomes upset.

Meanwhile, Elliot's co-worker and childhood friend Angela and her boyfriend Blake meet a street vender who offers his music demo in exchange for Blake promoting him. Back at their apartment, Blake tries to play the CD on his laptop but it doesn't work. Unbeknownst to them, the CD was actually a virus that allowed the vender to hack into their laptop camera and spy on them.

Elliot returns to Coney Island, meets with Mr. Robot and offers his own plan to create the massive data dump without causing an explosion and possible casualties. While sitting on a railing overlooking the beach, Mr. Robot asks Elliot to explain the truth behind his father's death. He reveals his father was a long time programmer at Evil Corp. but fired after learning he had leukemia. While trying to hide his illness, Elliot eventually broke the news to his mom. Angered, Elliot's father kept pushing Elliot away, to the point of pushing him out a window, which resulted in a broken arm.

Mr. Robot at first tries to console him in knowing what it's like in losing a parent, but asks Elliot if his father was right in pushing his son away for his betrayal. Mr. Robot then pushes Elliot over the railing onto the garbage-covered beach and remarks, "you didn't commit to the sacred pact you formed."

Summary: Elliot tries to lead a normal life, but can't escape fsociety. Gideon, meanwhile, grows suspicious; and Tyrell plays dirty.



After being pushed off a pier by Mr. Robot, Elliot awakens inside the hospital where he is being visited by his drug dealing neighbor Shayla and his therapist Krista Gordon. Elliot admits to Dr. Gordon that he refused an intake drug test because he's been using recreational morphine. His therapist suggests rehab, but he refuses.

Back at work, Elliot grows disillusioned with his day-to-day responsibilities. Questioned over his devotion to Allsafe, his boss Gideon Goddard grows sus-

picious of his life outside the office. When Mr. Robot shows up at Elliot's office, Elliot panics and agrees to meet with him at a nearby bar. Mr. Robot gives a half-a\*\*ed approach to apologizing for pushing him off the pier but his ulterior motive is recruiting Elliot: "without you there is no plan." In a brief moment, Elliot finally feels a sense of freedom.

Now that he's denying any cooperation with them, Elliot believes 'fsociety' is no longer active and tries to re-start his life which includes agreeing to meet with Gideon for dinner with a date in tow. Shayla is reluctant to be his date fearing Elliot doesn't know her well enough, but she shows him some creative fabric designs she created. Impressed, Elliot kisses her which she reciprocates. "When a bug finally makes itself known, it can be exhilarating. Like you just unlocked something."

This episode also delves into the freaky private life of Wellick and the lengths he will go to become the next CTO of Evil Corp. Wellick seems to get off on pain and adrenaline, which helps drive his desire for success. We also see that he is in fact married to a foreign wife who is carrying his child.

While getting ready for the day, Wellick rehearses his speech for a meeting in hopes of his impending promotion. Upon meeting with the hiring manager, he unfortunately learns they have

a different candidate in mind for the job. Disappointed, he makes his way across town where he pays a homeless man \$300 to allow Wellick to beat him up as a form of channeling his anger.

Later, Wellick dismisses his pregnant wife at home who is trying to comfort him. He goes to a club and tells a male acquaintance named Scott Knowles that he wants to take him home. When questioned for having a wife, the two soon embrace and kiss.

After seducing him, Wellick plants a bug into his phone while he's in the shower. It's assumed that Knowles is the candidate in line for the job and Wellick is looking to dig up some dirt on him. Wellick returns home to his wife lying in bed. He casually ties her four limbs to the bed posts and the two engage in some S&M foreplay.

Meanwhile, Elliot's co-worker Angela returns to her apartment she shares with her boyfriend Blake, who is now being blackmailed by an unknown hacker who was able to tap into his laptop. Gideon's dinner party includes Elliot & Shayla, Angela & Blake, and Gideon's boyfriend Perry. While watching over the grill, Elliot falsely covers his involvement in the initial Evil Corp. data hack to Gideon, which erases any suspicion Gideon had over Elliot.

After dinner, the group watches a TV news report indicating that hacked emails linked former Evil Corp. CEO Terry Colby to a toxic waste dump. The toxic exposure harmed two dozen Evil Corp. employees who later succumbed to leukemia, which happened to be the disease that claimed Elliot's father, an Evil Corp. employee.

Elliot suspects that Mr. Robot released the confidential emails to the press in order to make their fight against Evil Corp. more personal by directly linking Colby to his father's death. It's also revealed that Angela's father was also diagnosed with leukemia, which forged a bond between her and Elliot as children.

Upon learning of the blackmail against Blake, Angela's identity is also at risk of theft from using his laptop to login into her financial accounts. It turns out that the blackmailer targeted them as Allsafe employees in order to infect their employer. The episode ends with Elliot returning to the 'fsociety' headquarters in Coney Island, whereby he sits down at a computer and says, "where's the plan?"

Things at E Corp. aren't going so smoothly either, as customers of their bank express confusion over payment records. Susan informs Phillip Price over the latest ransom of \$5.9 million but if they choose not to pay, they risk suspending their entire banking system while they try to combat the hack. Another condition is for one of their chief officers to deliver the ransom, which Phillip immediately laughs off. Scott Knowles volunteers instead, wanting to face these people in person.

During the scheduled drop in Battery Park, Scott is wired with a security guard overseeing the transaction. When a man on a bike delivers a backpack, Scott ends up opening the bag against the wishes from security. He finds an 'fsociety' mask inside as well as a walkie-talkie, where a voice informs him to do as he says.

Scott hastily empties the bags of cash on the ground, pours a canister of gasoline and lights it on fire in front of a group of bystanders. The only purpose of the ransom money was for it to be destroyed. All the while Phil Collins' "Take Me Home" is a comforting soundtrack as the bystanders film the fire in silence on their phones.

In a repeat from the 2008 financial meltdown, E Corp. isn't having much luck after burning so much government bailout money while the rest of the country is hoarding cash. Phillip is

pressured to resign but in a last chance for saving his butt, Philip brings up FDR saving banks in the Great Depression and even admits to conning the American public. A powerful figure such as himself going down will not only ruin the "con" but the "confidence" of both the public and the economy.

Elliot receives a visit from his old boss Gideon, who informs him of the F.B.I. investigation accusing him of the hack. While Gideon asserts his innocence, Mr. Robot is just in the other room, slowly slicing an apple as he whispers to Elliot the truth that he was framed. Gideon already suspects Elliot due to his suspicious behavior the day of the hack. While Mr. Robot continues to taunt Elliot, he slices Gideon's neck from behind. Elliot reacts in shock but in reality nothing happened. Is Elliot's psychosis never going to heal?

We're later introduced to new series regular Grace Gummer as F.B.I. agent Dominique DiPierro, who is part of the hacking investigation and routinely questions a visibly shaken Gideon. However, for Gideon, while he's been blamed as a culprit by the Feds, he's seen as a patsy by a fringe group. When he is approached by a man named Brock at a bar who knows who he is, Brock insists Gideon is a patsy set up by the government. Right after identifying him as a crisis actor, Brock shoots Gideon in the neck, citing "this is for our country."

Angela is already settled into her new role in public relations at E Corp. despite the difficult task of handling the negative publicity with the press. She relies on listening to music on her headphones in between calls to quell the stress while remaining stoic when dealing with her superiors. Later at a bar, Angela turns down her old boss Antara Nayar for returning to the law firm, insisting she's happy with her current job.

But is Angela truly happy? At home alone in the dark, she watches a "positive affirmation" motivational video. She repeats the inspirational lines back, perhaps as the only way she can cope with her current situation. Pills and drugs might not work, but positive thinking seems to do the trick.

Back at the basketball court, Elliot meets Ray who seemed to already know Elliot through reputation. Elliot immediately rebukes that he still does whatever he's heard. Sure enough, Mr. Robot is just sitting on the back of the bleachers, continuing to torment his son's psyche.

Ray returns the next day to the court and insists they spoke the previous night. Confused, Elliot has no recollection of the conversation. Panicked, Elliot rushes back to his house and sees a gap in his journal from the night before. Apparently during that time, Elliot reemerged as Mr. Robot and his role as the leader of 'fsociety.' Elliot begins to maniacally laugh as he battles his split personality.

With Mr. Robot drawing a gun again to Elliot's head, he demands Tywell's location. Mr. Robot's bluff is called and he lowers his gun. Elliot grabs his journal and leaves, off to his routine church group meeting. As he returns home from the meeting, Elliot receives a phone call and hears Tywell's muffled voice on the other line.

In the episode both Elliot and fsociety detect an internal error that cannot fully recover. While Elliot deals with his Mr. Robot, the hacker group suffer a loss while the feds are a step closer. Meanwhile Angela tries to get a leg-up in E Corp. and we're teased with the return of Tyrell Wellick.

"It's good to hear your voice," a calm Tywell begins the conversation over the phone with Elliot. Unable to give up any information due to possible surveillance, Tywell gleefully recalls "the night we became gods." After Elliot hangs up, Elliot

begins arguing with Mr. Robot despite Mr. Robot following through with his promise to deliver Tywell.

Soon enough, Elliot hears from the television in the other room about his former boss Gideon Gordon's murder at the bar. Later, Elliot meets with Leon at the basketball court to score some morphine. "How do I tell him somebody I cared about died?" Elliot asks himself, resorting back to self-medication to deal with his loss. As Mr. Robot confronts him, Elliot reveals it's only Adderall. Elliot begins popping them in his mouth like Tic-Tacs. If this was the only way to rid himself of Mr. Robot, he was going to do it as quickly as possible.

As he makes his way down the street, he's confronted by a suited man and soon enough an SUV pulls up, puts a bag over his head and drag him inside. Did Gideon rat him out, Elliot asks himself. Taken to an empty warehouse, Elliot is tied to a chair and cement starts being mixed in a wheelbarrow by the unknown kidnapers. A funnel and tube is forced down his throat as he struggles but ultimately swallows.

Cut to Elliot forcibly inducing himself to vomit alone in his kitchen as he spits out the undigested pills along with other gooey stuff. "I have burrowed underneath your brain," Mr. Robot smugly tells Elliot while sitting at his desk. "You will cooperate, my son. I will make you because I own you." Upon seeing Mr. Robot again, Elliot hits rock bottom and digs for the pills and swallows them again.

In a flashback, Mobley and Romero walk the boardwalk of Coney Island where Mobley hopes to rent the abandoned arcade. Romero, who recently got out after six years behind bars, is reluctant to lease it considering Mobley's associate is "a little weird, but a genius."

Back to the present, Mobley stops by Romero's house to see him lying on the ground in a pool of blood in the back yard. When Mobley meets with Darlene on the subway, she reveals Romero was killed because he sold drugs, making him a liability if he was arrested. When they meet with Trenton, Darlene assures them the Chinese Dark Army were not the ones behind Romero's murder while they begin to worry about Elliot cracking given his current mental state.

While still mourning the loss of his friend, Mobley begins getting paranoid. "We just committed the crime of the century and they're trying to cover their tracks and right now, we're the tracks," Mobley tells Trenton after Darlene had left. Could society begin to unravel from the inside?

Over at E Corp., Angela meets with Phillip Price over which news outlets to reach out to in their latest press conference. After she insists meeting exclusively with Bloomberg News, Price changes the subject and asks her for a dinner date and finally agrees with choosing Bloomberg. Before the date, Angela starts repeating those life-affirming slogans from those positivity tapes we saw her watch in the previous episode.

However Angela is in for a surprise once she arrives at the restaurant to learn their dinner will feature two E Corp. acquaintances at the table. After the two others leave, Price reveals to Angela they were both involved in the environmental disaster alongside Terry Colby that affected her hometown and her father's health. Price then hands her a CD with incriminating evidence against the men.

"Whatever you're doing I don't trust it." Angela tells Price as he gets up to leave. "You're panicking right now, I understand," Price tells a visibly shaken Angela. "It's a big decision you're making because these men, their lives will be destroyed. But the minute you remove emotion from this, you'll do just fine."

"He's gone," Elliot delightfully tells himself lying in his bed after his first rest in three days. The Adderall is working for him. Mr. Robot is gone and he's fully aware of everything around him. While he remains content, it's Leon who is a little spooked as Elliot is too wired reciting a classic Seinfeld episode. Suddenly the basketball game, his church group, and washing dishes become a little too excitable.

"You're not buying any of this, are you?" Elliot asks us. All is not well. It's now been six days since he last slept. As he comes full circle, he realizes the sad truth. Without Mr. Robot, he just remains alone in his dark, silent apartment.

Elliot quits cold turkey, patiently waiting for the drugs to leave his system. "Mr. Robot has become my god, and like all gods, their madness takes you prisoner," Elliot tells himself while in the church group and realizing Mr. Robot is a necessary evil. When Elliot is called upon to share his life with God, he goes off on a rant about all the wars, hate, and death associated with Him. He ends it with condemning distortion of reality, equating organized religion with addiction. Realizing he just said that all out loud, Elliot makes an awkward exit.

When Elliot meets up with Ray, he's asked about the journal he's been keeping. Even if Elliot feels like he's controlling his life, the death of Ray's wife in a car accident proved that no one has true control. Ray tries to understand the man Elliot keeps writing about. "Keeping this inside isn't going to last," Ray tells Elliot before inviting him to play chess in the future. Suddenly we see Mr. Robot sitting idly by, staring Elliot down.

F.B.I. employee / insomniac Dominique DiPierro gets out of bed after another restless night and begins her day, including copious amounts of coffee. She's called to the crime scene of Romero's murder. They find his phone with the names of many F.B.I. agents as well as self-destructing desktop computer.

As we come to know Dominique, the career-driven woman doesn't lead an exciting personal life. It seems her best friend is Alexa, her Amazon Echo device. She stops by Romero's home again whom he shared with his mother. In order to gain access, she mentions her joint-rolling skills which impress the grieving mother. As she snoops around the home, she uncovers an "End

of the World” party flyer featuring “DJ Mobley” being used as packing material. Could this be the first clue to uncovering fsociety?

The episode begins with Darlene visiting her brother whom she hasn't seen in a while. She dons the mask 'fsociety' would adapt to their cause, which turns out is a prop mask from their favorite 1980's B-movie horror film *Careful Masquerade of the Bourgeois*. The two smoke up and watch the movie for old times' sake, or as Darlene puts it, "the root of all of our psychological dysfunction."

It is at this point in time we learn when Elliot started seeing his therapist Dr. Gordon. He was also just recently

fired for being too good at his job: finding weak spots in corporate security systems. When he proved to be able to hack anything, he sabotages his employer as an act of defiance. A judge rules he sees a therapist to deal with his "anger management."

It's a rare chance to see these two siblings interact somewhat lovingly as Elliot brings out his dad's old Mr. Robot patched jacket from his computer store. He puts on the jacket and the mask and upon assuming a new persona, he comes up with a plan to hack Evil Corp. Darlene, who has been supplanting her anti-corporate agenda into Elliot, is a little spooked to hear her brother actually plan an attack. As Elliot takes off the masks and stares at it silently, we see the exact moment he creates his alternate persona, the very same one he's come to battle against this season.

Back in the present day, Darlene comes to Elliot asking for help, looking to expand on the recent exploits of 'fsociety.' Clearly still in shock over his former boss Gideon's murder, Elliot

is unwilling to bring back "him," the digital leader he created. "Take the board, play yourself, practice," Ray tells Elliot during a game of chess. "Who knows, you might beat yourself." Ironic considering Elliot has been trying to defeat himself all along.

Sensing Elliot is hiding something, Ray suggests letting out his problems in strict confidence. As Elliot wrestles with coming clean to his new friend, Mr. Robot shows up and demands he keep his mouth shut. Ray could alert the authorities. The Dark Army could brand Elliot a turncoat and eliminate him. What's the right thing to do?

Now alone with Mr. Robot, Elliot's adversary suggests a winner-take-all game of chess. If Elliot wins, he can confess his sins and rid Mr. Robot for good. If Mr. Robot wins, he stays in control. He then tells Elliot that he wiped his own memory clean in the three days following the global hack simply for plausible deniability. Before he can decide to take the ultimate risk, he confides with Dr. Gordon about his struggle.

"Annihilation is not the answer," Dr. Gordon firmly tells Elliot regarding his alternate persona, to which he mentally disagrees with. In his routine meeting with Leon, he brings along his chess board and suggests he's playing against himself for "existence." Leon's sound advice is for Elliot to dream to find himself or simply fade out.

"How will my future unfold?" Elliot asks himself as he's lying in bed, contemplating on the dreams he desires. He imagines himself on a romantic date with Angela, witnessing Darlene being proposed to by a boyfriend, and making amends to those he wronged. While he dreams of everyone sitting down for a meal in the middle of the city, a corporate building is demolished in the background. "A world I've always wanted and you know what? I would very much like to fight for it," Elliot tells himself as he falls in a well-deserved sleep.

Upon coming across 'society's abandoned headquarters at the Coney Island arcade, Dominique "Dom" DiPierro tries to convince her superiors this will lead them to the perpetrators. Their investigation is tipped off to Darlene's Dark Army contact Cisco. After the two meet in a bar and a quickie love-making session in the bathroom, he discloses the F.B.I.'s involvement which is making the Dark Army nervous. This in turn makes Darlene worried and suggests getting out of the city, to which Cisco tells her any odd behavior will only make things worse.

Joanna Wellick has been paying off colleagues to stay quiet over her husband Tywell's involvement. Unfortunately her funds are running low as E Corp. has yet to start paying off Tywell's severance package. She later shows up in Scott Knowles' home demanding the money she's owed. Scott however is a little ticked considering he suspects Tywell in his wife's murder. Despite pleading that she needs the money for her young baby, Scott counters and suggests that Tywell's baby gets what it deserves: nothing.

While outside the E Corp. building, Angela listens to her positive affirmation audio files while witnessing an E Corp. higher-up arrested for an unknown charge. She later meets with her old boss Antara Nayar at a restaurant and discloses the evidence that her E Corp. superior Philip Price has willingly given her in the company's environmental negligence. Angela can only deduce that Price is doing this as leverage for an unknown favor he'd want from her.

She later meets with Price in the company's parking garage. She demands a new office as she uncovers the real reason she was promoted. She would be able to convince the class-action lawsuit to drop a charge given her personal connection to the case. While impressed, Price dismisses the demand and pleads with her to go home as he's picked up in his limo.

The life-or-death game of chess commences in a park against Mr. Robot. After a series of stalemates, the two continue while Elliot admits Mr. Robot doesn't exist, despite his father first teaching Elliot to code using a chess program. The strategy is to see multiple steps ahead of your opponent, which proves difficult when your opponent is yourself. No wonder these games can't declare a winner. It is then Elliot realizes that every battle will result in an impasse.

"When will you finally realize I'm here for a reason?" Mr. Robot asks Elliot. "I want to be here Elliot, with you." Perhaps Mr. Robot can serve a purpose as Elliot receives a desperate phone call from Darlene, worried over their current situation. When asked if she wants "him" or "you," Darlene answers she wants Elliot, the brother she knows.

Elliot then shows up at Ray's, suggesting he help him with his "computer problem." Ray mentions Moses and other prophets reporting to hear voices in their heads as well. "People like you, what you have... it can be divinity Elliot, if you let it." Once Elliot sits down at his computer, Ray's colleague Lone Star shows up to supervise, making sure Elliot doesn't see what he shouldn't in terms of Ray's online business.

While conducting the diagnostic test, Elliot enters a private 'fsociety' chat where he learns of the F.B.I. involvement and Romero's death. As Mr. Robot stands behind him, Elliot announces he's hacking the F.B.I. Is Elliot only endangering himself or will he be able to clear his name? And has he finally accepted Mr. Robot's importance? Will a truce finally happen between the two?

Dominique "Dom" DiPierro is growing more confident as the investigation is unfolding, sucking on a lollipop while throwing unauthorized E Corp. workers out of the crime scene.

The Feds head overseas to investigate the E Corp. back-up sites in China, where the team is met with the mysterious Whiterose, who seems to be head of

the facilities. As Dom's boss tries to skirt around the issue, Dom comes right out and asks to review their investigation with The Dark Army, the hacker group which aided fsociety in the 5/9 hack. With a smile, Whiterose agrees while trying to make the agents feel welcomed in their collaboration.

During a cocktail party put on by their Chinese hosts, Dom steps away and walks into a room full of clocks, from cuckoo clocks to digital ones. Whiterose happens his way into the room and the two start chatting. She lets him in that's she's a Jersey girl born and raised and was motivated to join the F.B.I. due to her disgust and fascination with the brutality of the world. She also reveals she abandoned the legal career path after backing down from her then-boyfriend's marriage proposal and wounded up in law enforcement.

The next morning as agents head down to the hotel lobby for breakfast, an ambush occurs as two gunmen enter, killing agents and bystanders as Dom takes cover. She's able to grab a gun from a fallen colleague and shoots out the leg of one of the gunman, who soon commits suicide after becoming immobile. As she hides behind a table, the second gunman continues shooting at her as she takes cover.

Darlene has popped in at Angela's apartment as she returns from work where she asks a not-so-simple favor: to hack the F.B.I. By planting a device in the E. Corp. building, the hack would wipe out every piece of evidence linking her and Elliot. Never the risk-taking type, Angela declines, citing she'll be fine in terms of maintaining no wrongdoing.

Darlene tries to get Elliot to convince Angela to help them out but he's ever-so protective of his childhood friend. He doesn't want to risk getting her involved, despite Mr. Robot standing in the shadows, insisting Angela is one of the few he could trust.

Angela meets with her ex-boyfriend and former AllSafe employee Ollie at a bar. While the two try to catch up, he hands over his resume in hopes of finding new work after his termination. He soon goads Angela into discussing the AllSafe hack as if she had something to do with it. She then uncovers his phone which happened to be recording the conversation. Shocked, she asks him if he's been talking to the F.B.I., which he admits he is. Claiming he didn't offer much information, she storms out.

She meets with Elliot at his home and begins weighing her options. Worst case scenario she loses her job and could plea bargain a lighter jail sentence. But she tells Elliot how much she misses him but disappointed that he kept pushing her away. Elliot recalls that day in the cemetery where he realized Mr. Robot was his deceased father. Believing she would never understand, he tells her that he's seeing his dead father right behind him. Instead, Angela vows that she can always be a person he can talk to.

That night, Angela takes the subway to the E Corp.'s employee's apartment where Darlene took over in the Season 2 premiere. There she meets with other fsociety members, one step closer getting into Elliot's secret second life.

Joanne Wellick is still struggling with her husband Tywell missing. She receives a mysterious package in the mail which turns out to be a baby rattle, possibly from Tywell but cannot determine who mailed it. She meets with a colleague Kareem who is increasingly paranoid (and later "taken care of" on her order).

Joanne seems to start inheriting her husband's controlling nature as a coping mechanism in his absence. She takes pleasure in the news that Kareem is no longer a problem. However, she's receiving phone calls where only breathing is heard on the other line. Convinced it's Tywell, she pleads with him to say something and heads out of her apartment believing he is nearby.

As Elliot continues to work on Ray's computer, he starts pining for the good old days as a kid hacking his local library's computer system and how his newfound talent got to where he is today: hacking F.B.I. phones and Evil Corp.

After calling upon Ray's IT guy who worked on the same computer, they're closely monitored by Ray's pal Lone Star. While the IT guy spots some fresh facial wounds, Elliot opens up a Notepad document to discreetly talk with the guy. While he tries to push Elliot away from any involvement, he points him in the direction of a secretive website with exclusive members. As he leads a login and password at his disposal, Elliot learns Ray is involved in a Dark Web marketplace, which includes teenage sex trafficking.

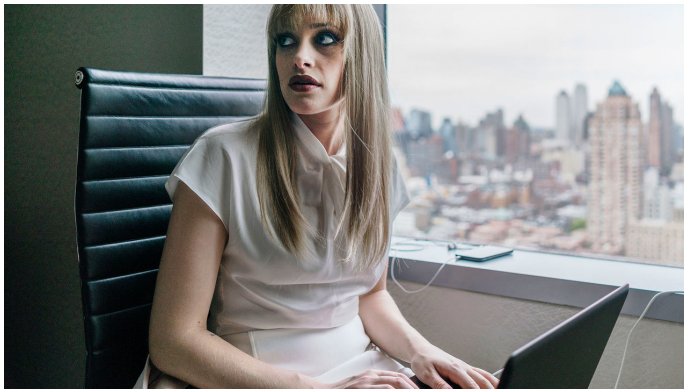
Perplexed, Elliot questions why Ray would be involved in criminal activity and why he seems interested in Elliot's talents. As he discusses his situation with Mr. Robot, Elliot wonders if he should take Ray down or instead try to help the victims involved. Mr. Robot insists they have other battles to fight while Elliot cannot deny the evil the site holds.

That night Elliot is abducted from his bedroom as he's sleeping by two large men and taken outside with Lone Star dropping the IT guy's bloody rat tail. Ray pops out of a car and tells Elliot, "I told you not to look" as Elliot is severely beaten up by the two goons.

Summary: Mr. Robot tries to show Elliot that he can be useful; and Darlene and Angela's plan doesn't go as hoped.



The opening sequence is pure nostalgia joy, especially for those who sat down and watched syndicated shows on the USA Network back in the 90's. In a satirical take on sitcoms, the Alderson family is on a road trip filled with a laugh track and the light-hearted treatment of Elliot's father's cancer. Even Darlene is playing on a first generation Nintendo Game Boy.

At a convenience store pit-stop, Elliot runs into Alf himself before he discovers Angela working behind the counter. Before he knows it, the Alderson clan starts

robbing the joint as Elliot's mom sprays mace into Angela's eyes and the family bolts out of there. All the while a bound and gagged man in a suit is trapped in the trunk. Elliot starts questioning his own sanity as the rest of his family pretend they don't hear his groaning.

After getting a flat tire, the family is momentarily stranded until an officer played by Gideon Goddard pulls them over to investigate. Before he finds any wrongdoing, Alf saves the day by running the officer over and the Aldersons quickly escape. Just as they get back on the road, their hostage breaks free from the trunk and runs off until he hits the green screen in the background projecting the outdoor scenery. "Believing it's real makes it so," Mr. Robot tells Elliot as his son almost has a breakdown. "Sometimes lives can help you, sometimes they can protect you."

Darlene gets ready to launch the next phase of 'fsociety's attack within E Corp. as they have recruited Angela. Mobley guides her through the steps, familiarizing her with each piece of hardware and software interface necessary to carry out the plan. Yet he has his reservations since no one can be taught how to hack in just a day. Darlene however is more than confident as her drive to complete the mission may overcome any realistic expectations.



Hoping it would help, Angela repeats those motivational slogans she's subjected herself all season but is reminded she can't be seen talking to herself while carrying out the plan. It is then they get a visit from Cisco, whom Angela instantly recognizes as the man who gave her ex-boyfriend Ollie a virus-infested CD that ended up corrupting the AllSafe company computers last season. While she's stunned at first, Angela only suggests that he looks like someone she knows.

As the plan gets rolling, Darlene sports a long blonde wig and dons sunglasses as she checks into a hotel room. We then follow Angela around her office as she communicates with Darlene and Mobley through her headphones, despite initial trouble in linking the script. When she's on another floor, she's approached by a young employee who doesn't recognize her. As he lays on the flirtation pretty thick, Darlene and Mobley quickly tap into his personal information as she agrees to a future meet-up just to get him out of the picture.

Through a brief television news report, we're updated to the Beijing hotel shoot-out from last week but no word on how many dead. Fortunately Dominique "Dom" DiPierro has survived unharmed however she's required to undergo a four-week psych leave due to F.B.I. protocol. Dom objects as she's closer than ever uncovering the Dark Army in China. Her supervisor refuses to believe a hacker group would stage a violent attack while Dom witnessed one of the shooters commit suicide after getting shot in the leg, possibly sacrificing himself in case of capture.

Darlene's plan hits a snag as she can't connect through Angela acting as a Wi-Fi hub. Back at her cubical, Angela is instructed by Darlene step by step on the interface. However, Angela is interrupted by Dom in her investigation. At first believing Angela was on a phone call, she lets her finish what she's doing. Angela, however, remains frozen as this could backfire and only dig her deeper into trouble. This is the sort of outcome Elliot wanted to avoid which is why he dismissed the idea of getting Angela involved.

Elliot comes to the realization that this whole family vacation delusion is an allegory for his lost youth. Mr. Robot guides him towards present day and escorts him to the hospital where he's currently being treated after the massive beating he took at the end of last week's episode. Elliot awakens in his hospital bed while struggling to breath. Ray is at his bedside lamenting over his dying dog. While Ray had no control over his dog's life, he has a newfound grasp over Elliot's.

While still recuperating, Elliot is abducted from his hospital bed by Ray's goons. They drag him to an abandoned building as Elliot quivers on the floor. He's approached by Mr. Robot who reminds him that he was with him as he took those punches. Elliot gets up and hugs his father, thanking him for the support. We flashback to Elliot as a kid with bruises on his face from a schoolyard fight as his father drives him home. It's a turning point in Elliot's life as his father admits his sickly diagnosis.

Despite losing his job, Elliot's father informs him his plan to open his own computer store. In a chance to bond with his father, Elliot is given the task of coming up with the name of the shop. Once they drive up to their new storefront, Elliot closes his eyes to think of the first thing that pops into his head. Once he's got it, Elliot excitedly opens his eyes.

Still held captive in an unknown location, Elliot continues to hash it out with Mr. Robot in order to reconnect his memory. Later Elliot sits down with Ray where he's instructed to get his black market site up and running. Any funny business will certainly result in another beating. Once the site is back in business with increased traffic and Bitcoin revenue, Elliot asks for one last game of chess with Ray.

During their game, Ray gets emotional recounting his dead wife but finding a new purpose in Elliot and his abilities. Elliot remains silent until Ray finishes but reveals that with response time for law

enforcement, chances they're surrounded by now. Elliot narrates his scheme where he opened the site's traffic to public view, allowing the F.B.I. to track unsecured searches to the site as well as emailing an anonymous tip. "When you see a good move, look for a better one," Elliot quotes chess master Emanuel Lasker as he finally break free from Ray only to be apprehended by the F.B.I.

Now free, Elliot becomes a pariah in the neighborhood as his friend Leon informs him of the growing resentment against Elliot for ratting out Ray and playing nice with the F.B.I. A group of men soon intimidate Leon in front of Elliot at the basketball court, angered by their loss of Bitcoins in the site's shutdown. That night at his church meeting, Elliot apologizes about his outburst at the last meeting to the group leader.

She instantly hugs him and thanks Elliot for his devotion to Jesus as evidence to witnessing Elliot talking with Him. While she assumes Elliot's one-side conversations were with the Lord, Elliot was merely speaking to Mr. Robot, who appears once the woman has left the room. Now free from Ray's clutches, Elliot feels incomplete as he has not finished his work with E. Corp. "People want to follow you son," Mr. Robot tells him. "Because you are a leader."

Tywell returns! Well, briefly in the form of a flashback as he and his wife Joanne head out to a company party back in their good old days of materialism and wealth. Cut to present day where Joanne is out on the sidewalk with her baby in a carriage as a woman throws red paint on her while yelling, "capitalist pig."

With her husband gone, Joanne is up to some peculiar stuff as she is seeing a new guy named Derek she met at an E. Corp. party. Their relationship is just as sadistic as she indulges in a choking fetish in the bedroom. After Derek is disappointed she didn't show up as his new girlfriend to his birthday party, she hands him his gift: her divorce papers to Tywell.

At E. Corp., we resume where we last left off from last week as F.B.I. agent Dom approached Angela. Recognizing her from a restricted floor occupied by the F.B.I., Dom asks Angela what she was doing there. Angela quickly responds that she was making plans with a fellow employee, whom she actually did just to get him out of her way. Sensing something is up with her, Dom asks for her to make a statement at a later time as Angela pretends to get back her heavy workload.

Given that this is her first time hack, Angela remains cool and confident as Darlene remains on her earpiece. That night when Angela reports back to 'fsociety' HQ, she remarks to Darlene that she's been putting together the masks from that terrible horror movie she was forced to watch with her and Elliot as kids (*The Careful Massacre of the Bourgeoisie*) and the masks associated with the 5/9 hack.

Angela is also maneuvering the current class-action lawsuit against E Corp. She's able to get one party to drop a contingency, which her boss Philip Price figures might be cheaper than a lengthy lawsuit as the corporation is hemorrhaging money. Angela uses this levity to ask to transfer to the risk management department. Puzzled over this, Price mentions that it's his actual birthday. In a moment where you can sense his loneliness at a time of a corporate crisis, Price asks Angela if she'd join him for dinner. After a quick "no" response, Price figures maybe next year.

Angela gets her wish and reports to risk management. Later at a meeting addressing the current lawsuit, Angela asks if she could have access to the files of previous lawsuits to discover a winning pattern. Of the past cases she mentions, she includes the Washington Township lawsuit which was involved her father getting sick. However her new boss knows she got her job as a favor to Price but remains suspicious over the transfer.

Elliot is later attacked and dragged into an alley by the same men from the court and demand their money back. After enduring several punches where we see Elliot visually switch back and forth with Mr. Robot, an unseen attacker begins slicing up the men. To our surprise, it's Leon who saves the day. "Going to get a letter on Tuesday, do what it says," Leon tells a stunned Elliot. Now it seems Leon is connected to Whiterose, who may or may not have been sent to protect Elliot.

In a surreal reveal, Elliot dons a Department of Corrections orange uniform while navigating parallel lives on the outside and in prison. Elliot admits the truth to us as he's been incarcerated since ratting Ray out. His church meeting, his latest visit from his therapist Dr. Gordon, and his interactions with others were all behind bars. Will his association with 'fsociety' come to light and land him deeper in trouble? Well, at least he has Mr. Robot for company in his cell.

As Trenton unhooks her, Susan starts insulting Trenton's Muslim faith and proceeds to slap her. However Susan slips on the wet floor and slams head first into the brick wall, causing her to blackout. As she's unconscious, the group tries to gain access to her personal email to dig up some dirt. Luckily for them, Susan carelessly wrote her Yahoo email and password down on a post-it note.

As Susan awakes she is still tied up, but Darlene frees her hands and offers her a cigarette. During a heart-to-heart chat, Darlene mentions her dead father while recalling first seeing Susan as a child. When Susan represented E Corp. and won their environmental case despite it contributing to Darlene and Elliot's father's death, Darlene had the vision of a smiling Susan burned into her brain. When Susan tries to come up with a compromise, Darlene instantly electrocutes her with a stun gun. Susan falls into the pool unconscious as Darlene just stares at her floating body.

When Darlene comes upstairs to reveal Susan's demise, Mobley gives a nervous laugh as he tells her of Susan's history of heart disease as revealed in the recovered emails with her doctor. Darlene tries to play dumb, insisting she didn't know of her medical condition. Cisco on the other hand has a look of disgust as he realizes the reality of Darlene's actions. Once Mobley and Trenton leave, Darlene sets up an auto-response email for Susan to bide their time.

At the subway station, Mobley and Trenton also try to cope with their situation. As paranoia and pressure begins to mount against 'fsociety,' their members are starting to worry about how to cover their tracks. Mobley is paying someone off to check his apartment for any bugs. Trenton tries to convince her father to move out of their home.

Unfortunately for Mobley, his worse fears come to light as he's apprehended at his apartment by the F.B.I. and brought in for questioning by Agent Dom. She tries to get him to cooperate as she brings up his recently murdered friend Romero. She reveals she found a flyer at Romero's home advertising Mobley's EDM gig from years back. Without giving anything up, Mobley asks for a lawyer.

Dom isn't having any breakthrough herself as she gets chewed out by her superior over her lack of direction in the investigation. In the wake of the leaked F.B.I. conference call that's casting a shadow over their investigation, Dom can't catch a break and much to her chagrin, Mobley is let go.

Angela is invited out to a karaoke bar on the nation's birthday by a young African-American man and comes across a friend of her father's named Steve. He plays nice at first, complimenting on her corporate ladder climb. But things turn ugly as he makes a sexual innuendo at her expense in a sign of disgust that she's working for a company that directly contributed to her father's ailing health. 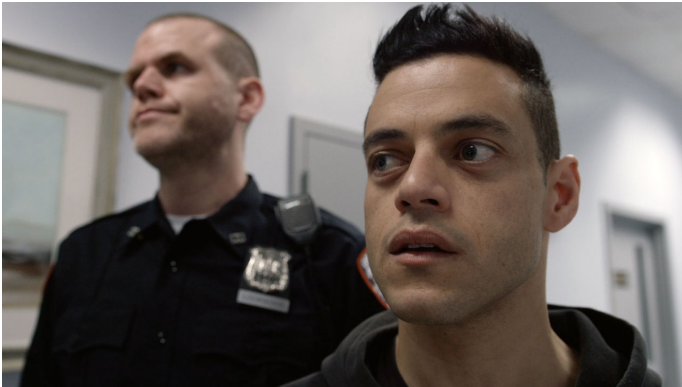

Turns out it has nothing to do with the 5/9 hack but when Elliot hacked his therapist's married boyfriend and stole his dog. Unfortunately it was a pretty expensive dog which made the kidnapping a felony. Despite Elliot's legal representative's advice, Elliot pleads guilty.

Now in jail, we get a better look at Elliot's life on the inside as it paralleled with

the first half of this season. Ray is the prison warden. Elliot's coffee shop buddy Leon is an inmate who shows him the ropes while professing his love of 90's sitcoms. And the women who represented Elliot's mother was a prison guard. While Leon can promise to get Elliot anything on the inside, Elliot's first request is a notebook. The daily routines, the church groups, the meetings with Leon... all done on the inside.

Now that we're up to speed, Elliot catches a break. Considering the 5/9 hack put a dent into the economy, prison budgets were deeply affected. Thus, a non-violent offender like Elliot gets released early after spending 86 days in jail. He's greeted by Mr. Robot upon release but really Darlene is there to welcome him back only to whisper something secretive into his ear.

In her quest to bring down E Corp. from the inside, Angela continues her office snooping, hopping on superiors' computers equipped with a flash drive ready to copy any incriminating files. In particular, she's after E Corp.'s connection to the real-life water contamination in Flint, Michigan.



She takes the evidence to the U.S. Regulatory Committee in D.C., hoping to blow the whistle. Uninterested in money, Angela simply wants to bring down E Corp. She later meets with Deputy Director Phelps yet Angela grows suspicious as Phelps begins questioning Angela's connection to the evidence. Angela never revealed she was an E Corp. employee nor was she willing to disclose her work with 'fsociety' in order to obtain the evidence. She makes a quick exit while Phelps has the peculiar look like the U.S. government isn't interested in prosecuting E Corp.

Now back at home, Angela receives a visit from a visibly cheerful Agent Dom who happens to bring along some delicious gyros. Dom tries to play the role of Angela's new best friend while Angela only remains emotionless. After an unprompted dream recollection of being choked underwater, Dom reveals that the F.B.I. interrogated Angela's old boyfriend Ollie Parker. He prompted the Feds to track Angela for the past two months and they even knew about her recent visit to the Regulatory Committee. Dom gives Angela the option of either cooperating with her later be thrown in a dark cell.

In drag, Whiterose along with a servant visit the grave of a former E Corp. CEO who was killed in a plane crash. Turns out the CEO stood in the way of a project Whiterose had planned. It's hinted the plane crash was retribution as Whiterose squats down to urinate on the grave, marking her territory on an old foe.

Whiterose now in his male persona takes a walk with Philip Price to which he's disappointed to hear the federal government will be taking over his Washington Township plant. Whiterose tries to instill some intimidation but Price is undeterred, as if he's replaced by a new CEO the government will still own the plant. While Price was unsuccessful in a government bailout, having plenty of cash on hand will allow him to purchase the plant himself. But the meeting ends on a hostile note as Price is willing to go down if it means taking Whiterose down with him.

On the subway, Darlene brings Elliot up to speed to the current crisis. Trenton is missing in action and the thought of The Dark Army making a move continues to stress her out. Much to Darlene's chagrin, Elliot lures her to their mother's assisted-living housing. Darlene decides to back out while Elliot enters his mother's room and holds a one-sided conversation. As much as he professes his love for his mother, she remains silent as she motionlessly stares out the window.

Soon, we're brought back to the ending scene of last week's episode as Darlene violently confronts Cisco over pictures of her supposedly sent to The Dark Army. As Elliot takes a long overdue piss by himself in the bathroom, Darlene questions Cisco over "Phase 2," to which he insists he's only out to protect her. From inside the bathroom, Elliot hears Mr. Robot interrupt the confrontation. He starts to flicker as it's actually Elliot who is assuming the role as moderator.

Intrigued, Elliot now wants information on The Dark Army's intentions. "Something's off, it's like we're overheating," Mr. Robot tells Elliot. As Elliot tries to take the lead on this investigation, he refers to himself as Mr. Robot to Darlene and Cisco much to their confusion.

Cisco escorts Elliot to the library where he routinely met with surrogates of the Dark Army. As the Chinese men balk at Elliot's presence and begin to walk off, Elliot exclaims that he demands to know who Whiterose is and the meaning behind Stage 2.

Now under surveillance by 'fsociety,' Darlene listens in as the Dark Army surrogates report back to their superiors and express confusion over Elliot's inquiry to Stage 2. "Stage 2 is his plan," the Dark Army says while Angela remains dumbfounded. Soon, she receives a knock on the door but we are left in the dark as to who is on the other side. Meanwhile, Elliot walks home to his apartment only to find Tywell Wellick's SUV parked outside. Confused as he admits Tywell is the only man he murdered, the window rolls down and we see Tywell's wife Joanna greet him hello.

Terry Colby re-emerges in the wake of his exit from E. Corp. and meets with Phillip Price. Looks like Colby is hoping to save his career with his new memoir and the two chat over potential Chinese imperialism in Central Africa that could benefit E. Corp. While Colby questions Price's intentions, Price responds with his ultimate goal, "to be the most powerful person in the room." With a World War I map of Europe hung behind his desk, Price remarks that as man was created in the eyes of God, "anything less is not worth lynch-

ing."

We're brought up to speed from the end of last week's episode as Joanna Wellick greets Elliot from inside her SUV. She brings him back to her place with Mr. Robot standing behind him. Elliot starts questioning if she in fact can see a personified Mr. Robot but she's really just looking for the whereabouts of her husband Tywell.

Internally, Elliot is convinced he killed Tywell whereas Joanna insists he's still alive after receiving anonymous gifts and phones calls with silence on the other end. She lays down a cell phone she says was from Tywell but cannot trace its origins. As Elliot declines to help and tries to leave, he's stopped by Joanna's bodyguard. Elliot can't help but stay as Joanna whispers in his ear that he could never say no to her.

Elliot is soon driven back to his apartment but on the way convinces the driver Mr. Sutherland to stop off at a computer store to pick up some hardware since the F.B.I. confiscated his possessions. As he fills up his cart with a new laptop, some pre-paid phones and some cords, Elliot receives a suspicious call on the cell phone Joanna slipped him and hears breathing on the other end. "Tell me you heard that too," Elliot says to the audience. "It can't be him, can it?"

When Elliot returns to his apartment with the driver, he constructs a wireless router using a make-shift Pringles can. Using his know-how, Elliot creates a mock request on behalf of the

NYPD to the cell carrier of the mysterious phone to fake an emergency in order to trace the blocked calls. After the fax, Elliot poses as an officer and asks the provider to ping the location. As Elliot determines the exact address on the Upper East Side, Mr. Sutherland remarks that Tyrell would never call from that location and leaves.

Darlene and Cisco try to figure out what to do with and bloodied and beaten colleague named Vincent as he struggles to breathe on Darlene's couch. Cisco grows increasingly paranoid fearing Vincent is either bugged or even worse that Trenton and Mobley are now dead.

In the hospital waiting room, Darlene lets Cisco in on her brother's supposed involvement in Phase 2. She remarks that Elliot has always had this hidden trait of being a leader, always knowing what he's doing, always protecting her. After an update on Vincent's condition, Darlene and Cisco have an hour to kill before they know the extent of the damage and go out for a late dinner.

Agent Dom and the F.B.I. are investigating the home of E. Corp attorney Susan Jacobs, which was the base of 'fsociety' operations earlier this season. A possible break in the case comes to fruition as Dom is handed surveillance photo of a suspect seen leaving a building a few doors down. Dom hands two composite sketches of Cisco from two witnesses to her boss. As she hopes to get closer, she insists that they don't go to the media. If Cisco's image is broadcasted, he could become a target of the Dark Army.

After pinpointing Cisco's apartment, the F.B.I. burst their way into the empty abode as we get a glimpse of his employee I.D. card revealing his real name: Francis Shaw. At the same time, the news is reporting the F.B.I.'s search for their suspect in the 5/9 hack just as a hospital employee recognizes the sketch as the man who was just in her waiting room. She later speaks with Dom and her supervisor after phoning in the tip. Yet Dom is concerned that her suspect will not return to the hospital if his face is plastered across the media.

After receiving a text from Angela, Elliot meets her on an empty subway train. Looking visibly shaken, she bluntly asks Elliot why he started 'fsociety.' After remarking that he didn't want to get her involved, Angela reveals an F.B.I. agent visited her at work. Despite Elliot vowing to fix everything, Angela tells him she plans on confessing her involvement but will not give up any names.

In a sign of introspection, Elliot feels responsible for putting the people he loves in harm's way by not protecting them from the beginning. As Elliot begins to depart at the next stop, he hugs her goodbye, telling himself never wants to leave her. The two share a kiss and he leaves in silence as Angela is soon approached by two unknown figures as the train begins moving again.

Dom deduces that the waiting room TV wasn't on the news when Cisco was there with Darlene, which could possibly mean he's not on the run and plans on returning. Dom scours the neighborhood looking for him and comes across the last open restaurant (where he and Darlene had been dining). She calls for back-up and enters the place.

Soon two people on a motorcycle arrive across the street. One gets off with an Uzi in hand and starts shooting into the restaurant. As everyone takes cover, Dom is able to shoot a few rounds from inside, wounding the shooter. Just as the police back-up is arriving, the shooter stumbles in the street before shooting himself in the head (much like the wounded shooters in the hotel ambush from the fifth episode). As Dom emerges unharmed, she's left stunned as to how much more of this she will have to endure.

After being confronted by two figures on the subway, Angela now finds herself locked in the back of a van. She tries to reason with her abductors about the crucial information she holds but that holds no leverage. They end up at a country house where Angela is escorted inside and into a darkened room. With the little light provided by a large fish tank and a desk with a 1980's-era computer, a little blonde girl walks in and starts up the computer and conducts a series of odd questions.

The girl starts asking if Angela has ever cried during sex. Confused, Angela demands answers. Unfortunately, the girl, who looks like a younger version of Angela, warns that their time is limited and if the interview doesn't proceed, she will be further abused. During the course of the vague questions, Angela is asked about a key in the room. As she claims ignorance, a call comes through on a red landline phone with a female robotic voice on the other end. What follows is a series of questions and answers reminiscent of point-and-click maneuver video games of the 1980s.

Angela seemed to have correctly guessed the right questions and in walks in Whiterose, who informs her that despite being in the room for the past four hours, she made no attempt to break out but proceeded with the line of questions. Whiterose admits to Angela that the signs of abuse of the little girl were a smokescreen yet proved Angela's empathy is what kept her cooperating.

F.B.I. Agent Dom is being treated at the hospital after the diner shoot-out. The doctor believes she's still in shock but Dom is determined to get back into the field. She insists the Chinese Dark Army was behind the shooting after the F.B.I. released the sketch of Cisco to the media. However, Dom learns from her superior that the Chinese bailed out E Corp with an unprecedented \$2 trillion bailout. The U.S. government wouldn't dare try to mess up the deal that could save the global economy.

Defeated, Dom asks only for her to perform the interview with the survivors, to which she's told to rest first. Once discharged and back at her place, Dom remains restless. Feeling alone, she retreats to her only loyal companion: an Amazon Alexa device. She confides with Alexa her own insecurities to the point of seeking comforting compassion from the smart device, to which it cannot reciprocate.

In the wake of the bailout, Philip Price is still paranoid about his company's future. With a financial advisor named Steve, he insists on promoting the E-Coin currency, which is seeing competition from Bitcoins dominated by Chinese miners. "Defeat can still be profitable," Price tells Steve as he is only looking for his own self-interests. Later in a media report, a TV anchor suggests that the E-Coin loan program stands to be more beneficial than the U.S. Dollar.

After her abduction, we learn Angela was targeted because of both her preferential treatment by Philip Price at E Corp. and her and Elliot's connection to the Washington Township environmental incident. Whiterose demands that Angela's internal investigation to be dropped, knowing that the incident is what shaped her and Elliot's roles in the world at the present time. Angela later visits the home of attorney Antara Nayar who was spearheading the Washington Township investigation and insists she no longer contact her anymore.

"What if I could be the silent observer?" Elliot wants to conjure up Mr. Robot again, whom he believes has been quietly watching over the recent events. Sleeping for an undetermined amount of time, Elliot awakens to find Mr. Robot in his apartment rummaging through papers. Now undetected to Mr. Robot, he observes him looking over a deciphered message on a take-out menu.

After performing a little detective work online, Mr. Robot deduces the numbers sequence translates to a phone number. Upon calling, a distorted voice instructs him to an address where a cab will pick him up. Elliot follows him to a Washington Square Park night-time market. After losing track of his own persona, Elliot re-orientes himself and comes upon the taxi.

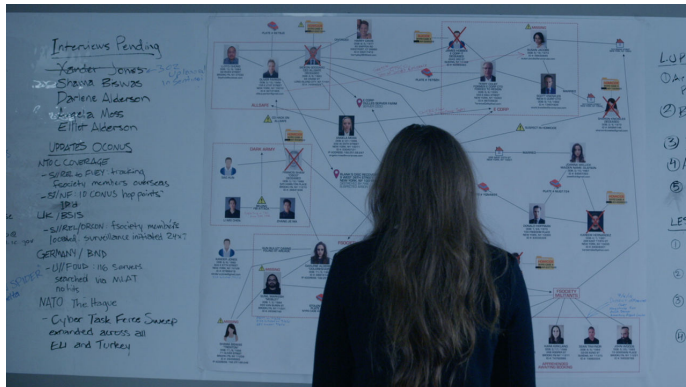
Initially hesitant, Elliot enters the taxi but unable to answer when asked for his destination. Before he knows it, Tyrell finally returns and hops into the cab and informs the driver of the address. In disbelief, Elliot has trouble coming to terms that Tywell is present given that he was convinced he killed him. Questioning his own sanity, Elliot demands the driver to answer if he sees Tywell in the backseat.

The commotion forces Elliot and Tywell out of the cab and on the side of the street. Here, Tywell informs Elliot that not only is Phase 2 imminent but that Elliot will be pleased with the results. The episode ends in the early morning streets as Tywell puts his arm around Elliot, reciting the "I think this is the beginning of a beautiful friendship" line from *Casablanca*.

In a flashback to the end of last season, Tyrell is in the back of his car with Elliot (who was originally envisioned as Mr. Robot). Gone is the quiet introvert we know of Elliot and his Mr. Robot persona comes full frontal. Tyrell pledges allegiance while Elliot suggests to not seeing "what's above you." Tyrell admits some daddy issues of his own, not wanting to become a representation of his father.

Now back to present day following Elliot and Tyrell's cab ride, the two walk into a building where a young Asian man

in a white radiation suit escorts them down an elevator. Unfamiliar with the base of operations, Elliot doesn't recognize the headquarters the Dark Army set up for Tyrell to hide out. Only his Mr. Robot persona was aware of the location and Elliot's slowly coming to grips with his role in the 5/9 hack.

As Tyrell shows Elliot some schematics on his computer, Elliot tries to piece together the next step that Mr. Robot, Tyrell and the Dark Army had planned. Just as Tyrell goes over the plan, Elliot learns that E Corp. is slowly rebuilding its database with their paper records. Across the country from their dozens of satellite offices, the paperwork is being shipped into a New York office building.

Now in police custody, Darlene sits in with F.B.I. agent Dom and we learn that Cisco perished in the shoot-out. As Dom tries to lay on some sympathy, Darlene repeatedly invokes her Fifth Amendment rights against self-incrimination. Dom's superior tries to break Darlene by insisting the Patriot Act will not protect her. Dom asks her to leave and later tries to reason with her, hoping their mutual Jersey upbringing will form a connection to get Darlene to spill some beans.

Darlene remains cold and elusive during her interrogation. Dom attempts to get information by hinting immunity but Darlene sees right through Dom's act, which she calls "sick and twisted." You know Darlene has been preparing for such a situation and while she's still in shock over Cisco's death, she's adamant over not disclosing any information. Dom laughs off Darlene's demeanor and lays down the evidence against her. The Bourgeoisie mask, video recording equipment from Cisco's home, and a recovered bullet casing where a previous one was found at the Coney Island arcade.

Nearly out of options, Dom's last chance for getting any type of confession out of Darlene involves taking her to an investigation room. Citing the "python approach," the F.B.I. had to sit back and wait as they gathered evidence. We learn that 'fsociety' member Romero's death was not a homicide but the receiving end of a stray bullet. Darlene remains silent as she sees the intricate web of connections the F.B.I. has made on their 'fsociety' suspects, including her, Angela, and Elliot. At the centerpiece, Tyrell is painted as the mastermind. "You've got to be f\*cking kidding me," Darlene says as she remains stunned.

Joanna Wellick makes a stop at the home of Scott Knowles, where it's revealed he's the one sending her gifts this past season. E Corp.'s Chief Technology Officer seemed to have picked up Tyrell's gift-giving habits and used it to make it look like Tyrell was behind the presents. Perhaps seeking revenge for the death of his wife at the hands of Tyrell (whom Scott suspected), Scott wants to lure Tyrell out for his own vengeance.

In a sad realization, the sonogram that Joanna received was not of her own baby, but of Scott's wife. Not only mourning the loss of his wife and unborn child, Scott wanted Joanna to know his pain. Feeling no empathy, Joanna confronts Scott and wishes he'd join his wife in hell. As Scott becomes enraged, he pins Joanna to the ground while she continues to taunt him. After choking and beating her, Scott relents and immediately regrets his actions. As Joanna struggles to breathe, Scott phones 911 for medical assistance.

Joanna returns to her new boyfriend Derek, who is livid after seeing her abused by Knowles. Promising to retaliate against Knowles, Joanna remains calm and recalls an E Corp. party where she met Derek. She asks Derek to lie and alert authorities that Scott Knowles in fact murdered his wife and that the delay in reporting it was fear from Knowles' wrath.

Elliot's memory catches up with him as he realizes that malware he planned to be executed will set off hydrogen explosions that could level the E Corp. building. If Elliot wanted to free the world, did Mr. Robot not care if it was at the expense of loss of life? Elliot and Mr. Robot begin to spar in Elliot's mind in front of Tyrell. Mr. Robot wanted to "go all the way," even if it involved reaching out to the Dark Army.

As Elliot wrestles with his mental self, he tries to shut down the malware attack which could kill others. Mr. Robot insists on carrying out the plan as Tyrell seems to be just as onboard. Confused over Elliot's change of heart, Tyrell pulls a gun on Elliot to get him to continue the plan. "You're the same," Elliot tells both Mr. Robot and Tyrell. In the midst of coming to terms with his reality, Elliot believes Tyrell is not really there pointing a gun. "It's time to take back control."

As Elliot goes back to the computer, Tyrell fires the gun into Elliot's abdomen. Seeing the blood, Elliot collapses. "You did this to yourself, Elliot," Tyrell tells him as he lies dying. Elliot had instructed Tyrell to get rid of anyone who got in the way. The last person Tyrell thought it could be would be his own leader. As Elliot remains stunned and bleeding, Mr. Robot starts to flicker in the background, where a bullet to the gut could signal the death knell to that persona.

Back in Angela's apartment, she receives a phone call from a frantic Tyrell. "You did what needed to be done," Angela tells him. Insisting that she needs to be the first face Elliot sees when he wakes up, both Tyrell and Angela profess their love for him. Soon after, we see outside Angela's windows that the entire neighborhood (or city) loses power.

In a post-credit sequence, Mobley and Trenton are having a lunch break outside an electronics chain store. Addressing each other as Frederick and Tanya, it looks like they assumed new identities to avoid authorities. Their conversation is interrupted by Elliot's former prison-mate Leon, who asks them for the time.

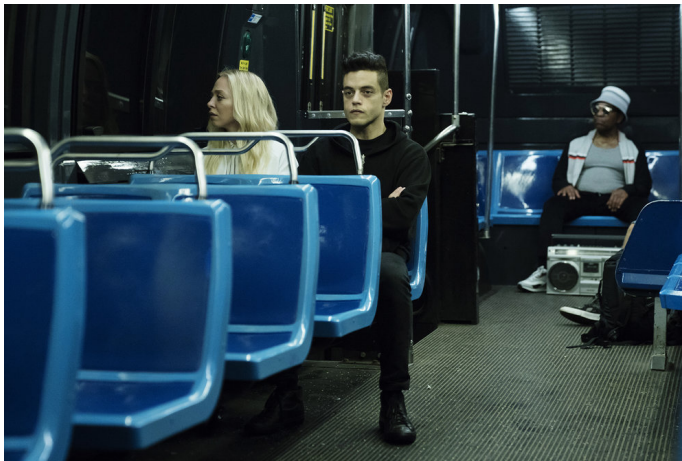

Is Irving a used car salesman or a Whiterose operative? Possibly both. But there's no doubt he's the guy who Tyrell calls after shooting Elliot with the popcorn machine gun (at the end of last season) to stop him from messing with Stage 2. Irving calmly assesses the bloody situation and arranges for doctors to save Elliot. Everything's going to be okay, Tyrell – just stop pushing down on Elliot's stomach.

Meanwhile, over at the ECorp Power Plant in Washington Township, Minister Zhang is not happy about this messy, unexpected development. Despite his dis-

pleasure, he tells his assistant that he wants to let Elliot carry out Stage 2, which his father (unknowingly) helped lay the groundwork for when he was alive. For now, Elliot must be their "guide" because he's got the "unadulterated, focused rage" to see it through. But after he completes his "great work," Minister Z says Elliot will suffer the same fate as his father.

When Elliot wakes up a week later in Angela's bed (though not with Angela), the electricity is still out and he doesn't know how he got there. Angela tells him a man brought him to her place the day before, but she doesn't know who he is. Since calling the cops is not an option, Elliot needs to find Tyrell to stop him from blowing up Evil Corp's Recovery facility, a.k.a. Stage 2. Wearing an embarrassing sweatshirt that Angela loans him (no offense, J-Grob), Elliot stumbles over to Confictura but the place has been wiped down and there's no sign of Tyrell or Mr. Robot.

Elliot heads for his apartment, where Darlene has been waiting for him. She's twitchier than usual – she almost died right along with Cisco and the FBI took her in immediately following the shooting. She demands to know what Stage 2 is, because guess what, Elliot? She's heard of it.

Elliot finally gives her the lowdown, but man, she's not happy that he's been planning this all along behind her back, no matter how adamant he is that it wasn't him. He realizes he can stop it by closing the backdoor (no, really) created by the femtocell she had Angela install. He just needs a working Internet connection...

Back in his signature black hoodie, Elliot and Darlene head over to a raucous hacker space. To free up a computer, Elliot helps them win their round in an international "Capture the Flag" tournament, while Darlene nervously looks over her shoulder at two suspicious guys who are clocking their every move. She goes to her favorite place to have a freak out, the bathroom, and then calls someone (we don't know who) for help because the Dark Army is there – with guns.

When she returns to Elliot, the two guys approach them and march them outside, instructing them to walk down a separate alley, where they are picked up by Irving, who's apparently a taxi driver, too! Not really, but he sure knows how to stop the FBI from tailing them while deftly handling New York traffic. Irving takes them to the newly opened Red Wheelbarrow BBQ, which makes Elliot think that Irving must be the guy who sent him the menu with the code.

Once Irving hears what Elliot is up to, he says their "employer will be disappointed" but hey, if Elliot wants to kill Stage 2, consider it killed. Skeptical that it could be as simple as that, Elliot wants confirmation from "her" but Irving cautions him to quit while he's still ahead. Darlene, of course, doesn't buy that they would let this go so easily, even if Elliot closed their access.

Realizing that Darlene is probably right not to trust them, Elliot returns to Angela's and asks her to get him a job at Evil Corp so he can figure out a way to fix all of this. His other request is that she lets Elliot know if he is ever "him" (meaning Mr. Robot) – because she's the only one who can tell. He kisses her but she pulls away, reverting to what he calls her "Power Saver Mode" because she can't love those who love her, only those who don't. She then says that there's a way to make it like none of this ever happened, including what happened to their parents, not just Five/Nine, but she doesn't say how. Upon her request, he stays the night.

Angela awakens to see Mr. Robot standing by the window and we learn that managing Elliot in order to coax back Mr. Robot was her plan – and her assignment – all along. Sure, they have to figure out how to get back onto the network and continue to redirect Elliot so he doesn't slow them down, but she's confident that she has it under control. And if that doesn't work, she tells Mr. Robot, the syringe she puts in her pocket "in case Elliot comes back" ought to do the trick.

Mr. Robot and Angela head out to meet Irving at the subterranean entrance to the new location of Confictura. Angela tries to reassure Irving that Elliot is safely gone but Irving thinks there's something fishy about all this. Once they get inside, a shaky Tyrell apologizes for shooting Elliot, even though he was doing what Mr. Robot instructed him to do. Then it's time for Mr. Robot to get back to work.

On the bus ride home, Mr. Robot presses Angela to find out what's in it for her because he doesn't really trust her. She wants the same thing as Mr. Robot, and whiterose helped her see that she had a way to bring about justice for her mother's death. Now that Angela has seen the light, the power starts to flicker back on all across the hobbled city.

Summary: Elliot is lit by his goal to undo five/nine; Darlene is caught between a rock and a hard place; and Mr. Robot sparks a panic.



Elliot has a new job as Security Analyst at Evil Corp. He plans to undo the hack by rebuilding the database and defending the fort while he does so. "New Sensation" by INXS plays in the background as Elliot presents his plan to digitize files instead of shipping them to the office. He also gets employee after employee fired to make the company a little less "evil." He's trying to make things right and cleaning out the crooks in the company effortlessly. For once, Elliot seems fairly satisfied with what he's accomplishing.

Despite the determined face Elliot puts on at work, he's feeling lonelier than ever. Mr. Robot hasn't surfaced since he stopped talking to Darlene. It makes sense that she's his trigger since she's a constant reminder of their childhood. When we see Elliot crying in his apartment, we see him as vulnerable as he's ever been. Later, when he meets with Darlene and has her crash at his place before leaving town, we see exactly why he kept his distance. Things don't end well and you see the horror in his face as he realizes what happened.

Elliot makes a couple of trips to see Krista in this episode. In the first one, he discusses his loneliness and tells her his dad pushed him out a window when he was a kid. He swears he had told her, but she says otherwise. He tells a story before that about making a snowman based off of Kevin from Home Alone. It's a touching story until the window incident. The second visit, they summon Mr. Robot so he can talk to the doc. Mr. Robot doesn't believe she's there to help either of them, but just there to get rid of him.

Joanna makes her return and meets her demise all within several minutes. Her appearance comes when she is a guest on Let's be Frank with Frank Cody, a talk show. This felt like the perfect way to bring her back because it absolutely felt like something she would do. On her way

home, however, a jilted lover brings her to her end. In a series of gunshots, he takes the driver, Mr. Sutherland by surprise and then shoots Joanna in the head. However, Sutherland isn't dead just yet and gets off a kill shot of his own. It's completely unexpected and I surely did not think Joanna would come back, just to be gone so soon.

Despite seeing Darlene last episode, we find out more of what she's been up to, which is helping the FBI in exchange for immunity. You can see how much she loathes what she's doing every time she's on screen with Agent DiPierro and her fellow FBI cohorts. They show her a video from F Society, but she doesn't think it's a real one from their people. Something felt off about it when they played it.

Darlene and Elliot meet up later even though Elliot knows it'll bring Mr. Robot out again. Darlene bugs his place when she stays the night and Mr. Robot knows something is up right away when she's wandering around in the early hours. This leads to a trick email being sent so that the FBI clicks on a link that they probably shouldn't have.

Elliot and Tyrell find themselves working together at the arcade when Elliot grabs the gun out of the popcorn machine. Tyrell shot him, so why not shoot him back? As soon as the gun is in his hand, he's Mr. Robot. When the gun jams, Tyrell laughs and then calls them Gods. Tyrell begs him to pull the trigger again and hugs him when he doesn't. It's an intense moment to start the show and gives us a good look at Tyrell's state of mind.

Irving shows up with questions for Tyrell. He asks for his keys and phone. Meanwhile, Mr. Robot has no clue who he is and doesn't get an answer when he

wants to know. Bobby Cannavale plays Irving so well in this instance. He's convincing and a jokester all at once. While Tyrell and Mr. Robot might not find it funny, it still is.

Over on Elliot's end, he's busy being arrested, which Whiterose is made aware of. In this moment, we know that we've gone back in time to see what Tyrell was up to while Elliot spent time in jail. Tyrell undergoes some strenuous questioning at the cabin and declares his loyalty to Elliot. He's then given instructions and the new op is "red wheelbarrow."

Cisco makes an appearance this episode, too, and reports to Irving after meeting with Darlene. So not only do we see what Tyrell was up to while Elliot was away, we learn more about just how involved Irving is in the whole process.

Tyrell takes a little walk while he's at the cabin, which triggers "We Ain't Going' Out Like That" by Cypress Hill to play as he walks. He's then spotted by a cop and he runs back into the woods. The cop plans to transfer him to FBI custody, but that's not what's in the cards for Tyrell. Agent Santiago takes him back to the cabin after shooting a cop, which he's certainly not thrilled about doing. His little rant to Irving later likely won't mean much in the long run.

Irving gets personal with Tyrell, talking about his wife leaving and taking his son with her. He thinks of himself as a good man, or at least got his wife to believe he's one. As it turns out,

Irving doesn't even have kids and cleverly just tells Tyrell what he needs to hear. He's quite the manipulative liar. Instead, he goes home and works on his book. Leon returns this episode, too, when Irving goes to visit him in jail. We know this is how he and Elliot met, but this is quite the new development.

Tyrell and Irving head to the warehouse which we see him in to start the season. Irving gives back the gun and we all know what that ultimately leads to. It's a clever way to tie everything all together. Elliot didn't need to be the focus of this episode because he's in jail, which I'm guessing is largely boring for him.

As soon as Tyrell's back in an apartment, he shaves and puts his suit on. The suit is a huge part of who he is and it feels like he really doesn't know what to do when he's not wearing it. From there, we see Tyrell hop in the cab from his perspective, rather than Elliot's, which we saw last season.

Things jump to Tyrell and Angela in a grungy building and she tells him about Elliot's alternate personality. The episode ends with a stare down between Elliot and Tyrell as Elliot flips personalities.

Darlene awakens in a subway car to find her wallet is stolen and deduces that of the few people around her, a lilac-haired girl impatiently waiting by the door is, duh, the pickpocket. Darlene gets the girl to produce the wallet but all Darlene wants is the Polaroid photo of we-don't-know-what that's in her wallet.

We return to the moment that Elliot enters the FBI safe house, but now see that he's in the downstairs apartment where Darlene has been staying, gathering data on who lives there. Darlene's purple backpack is a pretty big giveaway. Dom hightails it outside to tip off Darlene

before Darlene walks in the door. Putting on a voice protector device, Elliot confronts his sister. Her defense is that she hacked "him," not Elliot, because she's afraid of "him." Elliot asks her to go with him to his apartment so he can show her something. There, he tells her that she was right: Stage 2 has not been called off and he has the data to prove it. She calls his bluff: he could easily send in an anonymous tip to the FBI with all this information and walk away. But for some reason, he can't let go. Darlene asks him if he can go back to that place of wanting to stop it and if so, how can they find Tyrell. The plan: Darlene will hide out in Shayla's empty apartment and when Elliot turns into "Mr. Hyde" at night, she will follow him to Tyrell. At 1:48 am, Darlene hears Elliot leave his apartment from her hideout across the hall. She follows him outside, where she spies him talking to Angela and eventually taking off with her in a cab.

As Irving chomps on some ribs for breakfast at Red Wheelbarrow BBQ, he informs Angela that their plan is a go on September 29th, 10 days from now. Angela is concerned about making that timeframe with these shipping delays. Having "our guy" on the inside should help speed things up, right? he counters. She doesn't argue but wants Irving's assurances that the building will be evacuated before they execute, but his answer is less than convincing. Before they conclude their staff meeting, she asks Irving if whiterose ever showed him. He says yes. When she asks if he believes in it, he says anything is possible.

The FBI knocks down the apartment door of a man we haven't seen before, but looks like he could be the Iranian "origin" whiterose wanted Frank Cody to put in place for fsociety. After questioning him back at the office, Dom and her new partner from the safe house don't see eye to eye on this new player, Mr. Nouri, even though he eventually admits that fsociety is his leader. Dom is suspicious of how easy it was to find him, and still believes there's a connection to the Dark Army and whiterose. But her partner says whiterose is a "boogiemans story for the Dark Army." Although, she wonders, if the Dark Army did put Nouri up to this, it is strange that he didn't kill himself in lieu of getting caught...

At Confictura HQ, Angela tells Tyrell that she figured out that Elliot is responsible for rerouting all the paper records. Tyrell can't take the back and forth anymore, having Elliot undo everything they've been working on for the past six weeks. And on top of that, Angela has agreed to an impossible new timeline! Angela calmly explains her solution: they'll fly the west coast records to the facility and truck in the east coast ones over the weekend. In the meantime, she'll get Elliot's E Corp access revoked. Tyrell is not convinced that plan will work and directs his anger over at Mr. Robot, declaring that he, Tyrell, is in charge now. Mr. Robot does his classic throwing-against-the-wall-by-the-neck move but releases his grip when he starts to short circuit. Elliot reappears long enough to take in the scene until Angela plunges the syringe into him, curtailing Elliot's return.

When Dom and Darlene meet up at a bar, Dom's pissed because Darlene disappeared again except for sending one text saying that she "may have a development." Darlene says she's sick of a being a traitor and a social pariah, so now they're going to do things her way. She may have a lead but needs to go it alone without a wire. Even if she gets immunity, she knows she's going to lose her brother, so Dom owes her this.

When Tyrell complains to Irving about Elliot and that Angela's plan to ship paper records from 71 facilities over the weekend will draw too much attention, Irving reminds Tyrell that their boss is strict about her schedule. Seeing that Tyrell needs some stroking to get him over the finish line, Irving gives Tyrell a pep talk, which does the trick. Tyrell gets back on board as long as Irving can meet the following demands: 1) to see his baby, in person; 2) to be sent to the Ukraine, which is safe from U.S. extradition, with his wife and baby on Monday after the plan is complete; 3) the ability to engage the full force of the Dark Army in order to execute.

To keep things on track, Angela calls Price directly to get him to fire Elliot and ban his access. With that taken care of, she tells Mr. Robot that he has to stay in her apartment over the weekend to avoid any further mishaps. Then she gets a text from Irving: they'll be ready to go on Monday.

Darlene packs up her stuff from Shayla's apartment and stops in Elliot's, where she places the Polaroid – a photo depicting the Alderson family at Coney Island – back on his shelf.

The episode takes place in one queasy, tension-filled continuous shot on an anything but typical Monday morning at Evil Corp. Elliot tries to reconstruct the days he lost while Mr. Robot was in charge while Angela takes major matters into her own hands.

Against the backdrop of the UN vote on the annexation of the Congo scheduled for later that morning and an amped-up protest going on outside of Evil Corp's HQ, Elliot arrives at work, twitchy and unsure of where he's been for the last

three days. After discovering that he's locked out of his work account, he jumps onto his cube mate Samar's computer. The bad news: earlier that morning the Dark Army tried to run Stage 2. The good news: his patch stopped them – for now. Before he can figure out how the Dark Army is working around his patch, HR comes stomping down the hall, flanked by security. Darlene calls a couple of times to get him to meet her outside, but he can't leave the building yet. His only chance to stop the Dark Army is to get to the 23rd floor and retrieve the HSMs (hardware security modules, yo), which, he quickly discovers, is too hard to do with security on his ass and a deactivated card key. If he can't save the building, at least he can save the people. He manages to get outside, amidst the din of angry protestors, and calls in a tip to have the records building downtown evacuated immediately, claiming there's a bomb in the building, which for all intents and purposes is true.

Darlene appears beside Elliot and basically blurts out that she's working with the FBI. He's hurt and feels betrayed, even if the deal she made was for their immunity in exchange for Tyrell. Sibs are supposed to share this kind of stuff. She tells him that she watched Elliot like he asked and saw "him" sneak out of the apartment and meet up with Angela, who knew Elliot was "him."

Darlene suspects Mr. Robot and Angela have been working with Tyrell. How's that for betrayal? Elliot suddenly realizes that his "runtime error" was briefly seeing Angela and Tyrell together the other night.

Moments later all hell breaks loose when a protestor smashes a bottle over a riot cop's head, allowing the mob to rush the lobby and wreak anarchist havoc. A few rioters force their way onto the elevator and up to Angela's floor. While keeping a low profile in her office, she gets a call from Irving, who tells her there's a package for her at the reception desk on her floor. He explains that the riot is their distraction because there's been a hiccup in the plan, a.k.a. Elliot's patch. He needs Angela to get Elliot to make a copy of the HSM on the 23rd floor. The package contains all the hardware and instructions Elliot needs, including an ID to give him special security access.

So off Angela goes in search of Elliot... or so we think. Curiously, when Elliot calls her, she dismisses his call. An overzealous security guard almost thwarts her progress to get down to the 23rd floor but realizing that most of the rioters are there to give her cover, she yells out to one of them, who is more than happy to "take care" of the guard to get Angela out from under his thumb. She quickly follows directions to the HSM Server room, locking the doors behind her, protecting her from rogue rioters not on the Dark Army's payroll, and gets to work following the instructions inside the package. While she frantically searches for a USB dongle in the adjoining CSAT room, a woman named Lydia rushes in and slams the door. After sizing up Angela, Lydia doesn't buy her cover story but a rioter scares off Lydia before she can pursue her suspicion any further.

Angela completes the task at hand, cloning E Corp's HSMs to a mobile HSM. Before leaving the relative safety of those rooms, she disguises herself with the fsociety mask and a hoodie of the rioter who was felled by Lydia's strategic use of pepper spray. As she waits for the elevator, eyes burning from residual pepper spray, someone who looks an awful lot like Elliot darts by in the background...

Once she's on the elevator, she calls Irving to report that the task has been completed but that a woman saw her in the CSAT room. Hold the phone! Why was Angela in the room instead of Elliot?, Irving wants to know. Angela claims that she couldn't find Elliot amidst the overkill of his "distraction." Besides, Irving said that he needed it done immediately so she got it done. Interesting... but was she able to follow everything on that sheet of paper? She hesitates but then yes's him. Alrighty then. Next step: give the package to the deliveryman waiting at reception. Before she hangs up, she asks Irving if the building downtown has been evacuated and he says it's been done already. (Raise your hand if you believe him.) He just needs Angela to stay strong. After the handoff, she walks back to her office, visibly shaken. Her old friend Elliot is waiting by her door. Is there something she wants to tell him?

The episode starts with a flashback going back to when Angela was a kid. Her mom is sick and Mr. Alderson comes over to keep her company. They talk a bit and then Angela goes to tell her mom that the party is weird. One thing of note that Elliot's dad did say was that if he was ever not around, Angela should just give him a little push. She's certainly doing that in the present day, which we've seen quite a bit this season.

From there, the show picks up right where the previous episode left off. Elliot is freaking out while Angela just tells him to let today happen. Angela says her

mother and Elliot's father will be fine and Elliot is just trying to make sense of everything. Angela is in way deeper than he thought, considering he thought she was helping him this whole time.

Darlene gets a call from Elliot with an address of where Tyrell is. Dom and Norm go to their boss, but he shuts them down pretty quickly. As it turns out, the boss is in on it. He quickly texts Irving that the location is burned and to take care of Wellick. At this point, who isn't in on this crazy plan?

Whiterose chats with Phillip Price at the Mar-a-Lago Club. Price never looks totally pleased during the conversation. Whiterose is then informed that the location was compromised. Meanwhile, Whiterose remains completely composed and as always, B.D. Wong excellently plays the role.

Elliot makes his way to the build he had called in the bomb threat for. There's no bomb that the fire department or a bomb squad could detect, so he ends up sneaking his way in. Mr. Robot starts to take over and Elliot goes in and out of reality. He eventually makes his way to a computer and continues to feel Mr. Robot's presence. Elliot loses 5 minutes this time. He sees some semblance of success as he closes the gap for how long Mr. Robot takes over.

Elliot cleverly opens a text document to see if Mr. Robot responds to him that way. The struggle he's having is intense to watch. Elliot has a complete sense of urgency right now while Mr. Robot is fighting to keep everything going as planned. Both are struggling, but Elliot is the one who has to try much harder to win, especially when Mr. Robot does things like making him fall down a set of stairs or running into walls. The glitch effect fits perfectly with what Elliot's brain probably feels like and with the show in general.

While Irving is telling Tyrell that his trip to Ukraine isn't going to happen, Dom is at Red Wheelbarrow BBQ. She's looking for him but both her and Norm don't see anything suspicious. Dom peeks around and sees smoke coming up from under a door while we see Tyrell burning stuff in a trash can.

Whatever the plan is for the day, Agent Santiago calls his mom and tells her to stay inside. Meanwhile, Angela is under the impression that no one is going to die, even as she has a gun held to her head. These two instances send out mixed signals on what's going down.

The quick scene changes add to the intensity of the episode. Darlene bangs on Angela's door and once she's let in, it switches back to Elliot, then to Dom ordering coffee, and the scenes just keep moving quickly in the last few minutes of the show. We also see Tyrell running around outside like a maniac, which is entertaining in itself. Elliot let's Mr. Robot know that the paper records are not where they're supposed to be.

We already knew from the very (and we mean very) end of season 2.0 that the Dark Army had located Trenton and Mobley in Phoenix when Leon appeared, but not when that occurred in the timeline. Now we learn that the timing is that same fateful September Monday. Mobley's roommate lies dead on the floor, his throat slashed open, while Trenton and Mobley shake with fear on either side of a knife-wielding Leon. Leon reassures them that he's only there to "babysit," not kill them. Dumping the body in the trunk of what's likely a stolen Cadillac, Leon drives his two charges into the desert to

dig a grave. Mobley whispers that this must be happening because of the e-mail Trenton sent to the FBI, but she says she never sent it. However, she did set it up to automatically be sent to someone she trusts if she never makes it back to her computer. Even after their attempt to escape fails spectacularly, Leon claims to know nothing about the Dark Army's plans for them beyond the "immediate future."

Back in NYC immediately after the attacks, Elliot rushes over to Krista's apartment. Just as he's about to confess his part in the day's horrific events, Mr. Robot takes over. In his frustration with how Elliot "ignored his responsibilities," Mr. Robot blurts out the truth about him being the architect of Five/Nine. However, he and Elliot are not "the real string pullers," who swiped his ideas to serve their own financial agenda. At first, she dismisses his claim as delusional until he spells out "the math" for her. After he leaves, she calls her lawyer to ask him if she should report Elliot. He reminds her that she's bound by doctor-patient privilege and that she can't turn him in unless he stated he's going to do something in the future.

With a new (fake) fsociety video threatening yet another major attack in the next 24 hours, Dom and Santiago hash it out with Tyrell's lawyer. The lawyer's position is that the FBI has no hard evidence of his client being anything other than a pawn, but at least he's one who could lead them to the actual terrorists – in exchange for protection and immunity. After the meeting, Dom and Santiago are at odds once again. Dom believes they're being played by the Dark Army and should haul in the whole fsociety crew but Santiago thinks they have nothing to lose by making the deal. Guess who wins that showdown?

Over at Angela's, she flips through the wall-to-wall breaking news broadcasts on TV, numb with shock. Darlene, who had come over to confront her just before the attacks occurred, says she's going to grab her stuff and come right back. When Darlene returns, Angela replays the collapse of one of the buildings over and over. Even if there are more casualties or explosions, she explains, everything will be fine. See? When she rewinds the video of the collapse to the beginning, all the people come back.

At the FBI office, Agent Stancheck reports to Santiago that Wellick ID'd the two suspects, (aka Trenton and Mobley), which was corroborated by Sasan Nouri, their "fsociety video perp" (aka the fall guy hired by Frank Cody for whiterose). Now they can release a BOLO. When Santiago saunters into interrogation room, he turns off the video camera that has been recording Tyrell's questioning. He proceeds to crush Tyrell with the news that his wife is dead, shot at close range by a spurned lover, and his son is in foster care. If Tyrell is thinking of telling anyone about Santiago or veering from the plan, Santiago promises certain death for Tyrell and an unthinkably awful future for his son.

Mr. Robot tracks down Irving at Irving's Auto Square to register his WTF about the Dark Army going rogue. But before Mr. Robot gets too far, a masked Dark Army operative comes up behind him and knocks him out. When he comes to, Irving has driven him into the city to show him a fancy party taking place on a rooftop, the partygoers undeterred by the day's tragedy. Irving explains that Elliot and Mr. Robot's mistake was in thinking that their plan was a revolution, when in fact it was bankrolled by people like those at the party and allowed to happen for a greater purpose. Nothing can stop these "shindigs" – or the larger plan.

Still stuck at Mar-A-Lago after the attacks, Price confronts Zhang in the ballroom. Even with China finally having signed the Ecoin accord, Price says that now nothing will save his company. Zhang disagrees – Ecoin will help E Corp survive. But as Price begins to realize he himself was never going to survive the latest turn of events, he demands to know why. He always understood that the Five/Nine hack was a temporary global crisis to help Price pressure the administration to allow China to annex the Congo, but then everything went according to plan. Zhang explains that he's punishing Price for not doing the one job he gave him when he installed him as CEO: protect the plant, which meant controlling Angela and her lawsuit. But the real reason why Zhang needed to destroy so much: to teach Price a lesson because Zhang had to ask him twice. Ouch.

Leon returns Trenton and Mobley back to Mobley's house and into the hands of whiterose's assistant. The English lessons having clearly paid off, the assistant asks the duo to follow him into the garage and sit down at newly installed workstations. The computers have been set up to look like Trenton and Mobley have been plotting to hack air traffic control at major airports to crash planes. They beg for mercy, but to no avail. Though they have no future use to the Dark Army, their self-sacrifice and everything in the room will now serve an important purpose in telling a "story." The masked operatives move forward with guns... .

As Dom, her partner, Santiago, and others in the FBI office watch on monitors from afar, the FBI SWAT team moves in to the house in Phoenix, sweeping every room until finally entering the garage. But the Dark Army remains one step ahead of the FBI: the only people now left in the garage are Trenton and Mobley, on the floor bleeding from what is meant to look like self-inflicted gunshot wounds to their heads. As the SWAT team's cameras pan around, we see that the garage has been dressed with an Iranian flag alongside an fsociety one, a video camera and an fsociety mask. Santiago tells Dom even though they didn't get the suspects alive, at least the FBI prevented another attack. Stunned, Dom goes into her war room and crosses out Trenton and Mobley on her whiteboard. She scribbles out a name on a piece of paper and places it above Tyrell's position at the top of the matrix: whiterose. "You're actually going to get away with this," she says, her voice full of defeat and disbelief.

In a flashback, young Elliot is with his dad at the local movie theater for their usual movie night, but Elliot knows that the situation is anything but usual: his dad is sick, but won't admit it. Edward Alderson acknowledges that he's made some mistakes and asks for Elliot's forgiveness before collapsing on the lobby floor. As an indifferent Elliot picks up his dad's now infamous jacket and walks down the hall into the movie theater, we see that he's wearing a sling on his arm, likely a nod to when his father pushed him out the window.

Back to present day, Elliot is home, looking at the latest news on Trenton and Mobley online, knowing that everything being reported is a lie. He switches over to a folder where he has five subfolders for Shama Biswas (Trenton's real name) and for Sunil Markesh (Mobley's real name), seemingly the contents of their dossiers. He copies their information to CDs before deleting their files from his computer and starting a full wipe-down. Darlene arrives and tells him Angela's having a full-on breakdown ever since the attacks. But Elliot couldn't give two hooties about Angela after what she did to him. It becomes clear that he's still feeling mighty guilty for his part in the attacks, even if it was technically Mr. Robot's doing, as well as the deaths of two "good people." After she leaves, Elliot shoves the fried computer hardware and Mr. Robot's jacket into a garbage bag and dumps it outside. He seems intent on deleting Mr. Robot and by extension, himself.

After purchasing an entire pouch of morphine from what seems to be a new drug dealer for Elliot, Hard Andy, Elliot goes to see Sandesh, Mobley's brother, in the 'burbs. Elliot is there to pay his respects but Sandesh is irate: thanks to his brother, he's about to be fired from his law firm. Elliot tells him not to believe the lies about Mobley. Unconvinced, Sandesh says there's no way he's going to pay for a "terrorist's funeral." Elliot's next stop is Trenton's family's house,



outside of which her father is nervously packing up their belongings. Claiming that he went to school with Trenton, Elliot tells her father that she was a good person and that she's innocent. He thanks Elliot for saying nice things about her but he and his family are still leaving.

On the beach at Coney Island, Elliot takes out the pouch of "Miss Emma" pills when Mohammed, Trenton's younger brother, who followed Elliot there, comes up beside him. Mohammed, with his incessant questions, seems to sense something is up with Elliot and won't leave him be. So the two embark on an odyssey of sorts, with Elliot eventually agreeing to take him to the movies until Mohammed's parents return from Connecticut. As it happens, it's October 21, 2015, also known as Back to the Future Day, so the theater is having special screenings of the trilogy while fans watch, cosplaying as their favorite characters. Mohammed would rather see *The Martian*, but Elliot convinces him that *Back to the Future* is a much better choice for, like, obvious reasons, especially since the kid has never seen it. Despite his annoyance at being deterred from his plan, Elliot starts getting into it, even re-enacting the same movie snack ritual as he used to do with his dad – pouring M&Ms into a bucket of popcorn. But Mohammed takes off when Elliot turns away for one second. Elliot eventually tracks him down at the mosque. They have a somewhat intense exchange, with Elliot admitting that he wishes he were dead, and Mohammed sharing that he feels like his sister left because of him and her death is now his fault. Elliot consoles him by explaining that it wasn't Mohammed's or Trenton's fault. "It was mine." When Elliot drops him off at his house before curfew, Mohammed asks if he can see another movie with Elliot sometime. After some thought, Elliot agrees – to the movie and by extension, to not hitting "delete" on himself.

Afterwards, Elliot returns to Sandesh's house and mentions some shady memos he dug up in Sandesh's work email account. If Sandesh doesn't want those exposed, he better hold a funeral for Mobley and invite Elliot while he's at it. Then he hands Sandesh the pouch of morphine he bought from Hard Andy, who as Elliot knew from the beginning, was one of Sandesh's shady clients. Elliot suggests that Sandesh sell it back to Hard Andy in order to pay for Mobley's funeral.

#### Wishing Game

Elliot goes to Angela's apartment, but she won't open her door. Worried about her, he tries to figure out what to say to snap her out of her despair. While she listens from the other side of the door, he reminisces about the wishing game they used to play, when they'd close their eyes and wish for their heart's desires. Since their wishes never came true, he didn't get the point of the game at first, but she always said something before they opened their eyes to make it all better. Does she remember what it was? She sadly responds, "No matter what happens, we'll be okay."

As Elliot approaches his building, a van pulls up and dumps garbage on the sidewalk, coincidentally (or not) including the Mr. Robot jacket and the computer hardware he ditched earlier in the day, which he takes as another sign that deleted data can sometimes be recovered. He finally installs a new bathroom mirror to replace one he punched towards the end of the first season. After setting up a new laptop, he goes into his encrypted mailbox. There's an email from Trenton with the subject, "Don't Delete Me." When he opens it, the first line reads: "I may have found a way to undo the hack." Elliot then realizes that maybe there are still things left for him to do.

The episode kicks off with a little flashback to Allsafe, where Gideon is pitching the company to E Corp. It's also the first time that Phillip Price sees Angela. While there isn't much that comes of this flashback for the moment, it's interesting to see how the two first met.

Tyrell's anguish over his wife's death and the fact that his child is in foster care is immediately apparent as soon as he steps into his house. He was already in a bad situation and things just continue to get worse for him. "They own the FBI" is a message that Mr. Robot writes for EL-

liot on his bathroom mirror. Panic sets in when he realizes his computer was left unlocked. The two scenes are tied together when Mr. Robot let's himself in at Tyrell's place. Tyrell's anguish quickly turns into anger, but he's interrupted when Phillip Price comes by.

Romero comes up in this episode when Elliot and Darlene are at the arcade. At this point, Elliot and Darlene have few people they can trust. And that's not to say that either of them still fully trust one another. Elliot calls OnStar and sends the police to the car that Irving is in. Apparently, he's a car salesman in his spare time. Honestly, though, is it really that surprising? When he's not interrupted, it appears he is quite the salesman.

Darlene meets with Dom at a bar to give her some information. She mentions Whiterose, but before then, she hits Dom's FBI keycard with her bag. No badge numbers were found when Darlene goes to check the device in the bathroom. Her frustration spreads right onto the viewers. Things just don't feel like they're going right and not knowing what's going to happen can be extremely nerve wracking. She plays it off well when she makes an attempt to set Dom up with someone at the bar.

The thought of Darlene and Dom actually becoming friends and getting at least something out of all of this is pretty entertaining. Later, back at Dom's apartment, Darlene admits to liking



her and we can see she's just trying to get at that keycard. She later gets caught trying to take it from the safe. Looks like we won't see a happy little friendship between the two. It's a shame, too, because they're both people who could use a friend.

When Elliot finds Angela waiting outside his apartment, and she also mentions Whiterose. At this point, Angela just might be the most paranoid of everyone. She's still talking about her and Elliot getting their parents back, which is a whole delusion that just won't ever come true. She's in a hole so deep, it feels like we won't see her get out of it anytime soon. When she's talking to an imaginary person at her apartment, things feel dire. It truly is heartbreaking to see her like this. She quickly went from looking like she was in control to having none at all.

Leon makes an appearance at Elliot's apartment when he's with Angela. Leon plays everything so cool in this scene. Despite being a killer, he always acts so calm in comparison to the majority of the characters on the show.

Every time Agent Santiago is on the screen he's more paranoid and frustrated than the last. He's not the only one feeling that way. Whiterose makes an appearance with just a few minutes left in the episode. She's just throwing things about out of frustration. She's also in full form, which is something we haven't seen in a while.

Elliot sounds confident in his monologue at the end and talks about the fake stage three that he set up. The episode ends with him owning the Dark Army and with a looming threat of his death from the Dark Army.

Whiterose's assistant and his operatives kick in Elliot's apartment door but Elliot and Flipper are hiding out in Shayla's apartment. After they leave, Elliot proceeds to freak out. Even though he has infiltrated the Dark Army's network, he doesn't know what he's looking for and there's too much to comb through. Plus, he hasn't heard from Darlene and – with the Dark Army on his tail – it probably means they're on hers, too.

Over at the FBI, Dom starts to smell trouble when she can't find Santiago or Darlene. She tracks them down in the parking garage. Santiago gives her some

BS story about having to transfer Darlene to holding but Dom's not buying it. Knowing he's been caught, he chokes and punches Dom in the face, knocking her out. She comes to with her wrists zip-tied in the back of Santiago's car, next to a freaked Darlene. Dom has now put it all together: all the ways Santiago screwed her and their colleagues, Cisco, Trenton, and Mobley — not to mention the country – were because he's working for the Dark Army. He claims she would do the same thing in his shoes but she says she would never betray everything she stands for.

Irving goes to see Tyrell at his townhouse. Before Irving can tell him why's he there, Tyrell airs his feelings of hurt and betrayal by Irving. After artfully assuaging him, Irving asks where Elliot is – him finding Elliot first is probably Elliot's best option for survival given "all the scenarios in play." All Tyrell will say is that he gave Elliot sensitive information that he's "probably acting on."

At a loss for what to do next, Elliot goes up in the Wonder Wheel at Coney Island so he can talk to Mr. Robot face to face, as it were. After having a heart-to-heart about whether or not Mr. Robot knew about the 71 buildings (he didn't) and if he did, would he have gone through with it (he would've found another way), Elliot asks Mr. Robot what he meant by the note on his mirror. The FBI has a mole and his name is Santiago. While they root around Santiago's apartment, Irving shows up. Irving says that whatever scheme Elliot is trying to come up with won't change the inevitable so he strongly recommends Elliot go with him now.

Irving takes Elliot/Robot to the farmhouse where Tyrell famously chopped wood, cyber-stalked his wife and baby, and began executing Stage 2. They're the last to arrive at the party: Darlene, Dom, Santiago, Leon, and the requisite masked operatives are already inside the barn having a Dark Army hoedown on bales of hay. In full-on CYA mode, Santiago nervously says to a visibly pissed-off Irving that he knows he messed up by bringing Dom, but he thinks the situation is salvageable. "Uh-hunh," Irving says in typical fashion before directing Dom and Santiago outside with him to Tyrell's wood-chopping stump. As Irving removes his shirt and picks up the axe, Santiago, overcome by a too-little-too-late twinge of compassion, tries to convince Irving that they can flip Dom, despite her protestation to the contrary. But Irving knows she ain't flipping. Besides, it's not her head on the chopping block today. Irving heaves the axe into the air and lands it right in Santiago's chest (which Irving explains to Dom he did as a "favor" he owed a "friend," possibly his farmhouse buddy-slash-hostage Tyrell?). Ipso facto, Dom now has to step up as the new mole. Despite the high likelihood of death by axe, she refuses the job offer. Ever the convincing salesman, Irving deftly erodes her resolve by naming her family members and telling her to imagine that the additional swings of the axe he takes to finish off Santiago are for each of her loved ones. Terrified and broken, she weakly agrees to her deal with the devil.

Meanwhile, Angela's anxiously waiting for her audience with whiterose in a large country estate, which she believes to be whiterose's. But no. It's Phillip Price's manse. When Price arrives, he explains that she's there because he was worried about her. Angela insists that she needs to be with whiterose to help her carry out her plan. Ah, whiterose's plan... Of course Price has known about it for years but dashes Angela's hopes by telling her it's a delusional fantasy. Oh, and by the way, Price tells her the only reason she was involved in any of this was so that she would drop the contingency from her suit. So why did Price bother protecting Angela? Because... that's what you do for your daughter.

That's right, friends: Phillip Price is Angela's bio-dad. He met Angela's mother years ago when they both worked at E Corp. He loved Emily but was exceedingly cruel to her. When she got pregnant, she would not let Price have anything to do with the child and soon after, she met and married the man Angela has known to be her father. Price never planned on telling Angela until he learned what whiterose had done to her. Whiterose's project stems from some obsessive psychotic denial of reality, for which she has murdered countless people. But Angela won't give up the belief that there was a higher purpose to all the death as a result of the cyber bombing, which she's convinced are her fault. Yeah, no. That one also wasn't about you either, kid. "It was a dig at me," he says. But no matter what her new daddy says, Angela is going to hang in there, just like the kitten on the branch, so she can see her mother again, because, you know, whiterose promised.

When a blood-splattered Dom re-enters the barn like a zombie, Leon says it looks like she just got her initiation. Now what? Elliot thinks that they should chill because it feels like they're waiting for someone "important" to come. Cue: the arrival of whiterose's assistant, who first meets with Irving outside the barn. Wiping the blood from his hands, Irving reports that he took care of everything as instructed but bad news: he had to kill the FBI mole. But the good news is they got a better one. And now, he's off on his much-deserved sabbatical in Barbados, which he earned after being whiterose's "assistant" just like "Doll Face," who now has to fly without the safety net that is Irving.

Doll Face enters the barn and before he can say anything, Elliot, playing to the surveillance camera that he knows whiterose must be monitoring, immediately admits that there is no Stage 3. However, Elliot does own every single system that the Dark Army has ever compromised. So, if they hurt Darlene or him, the entire Dark Army history will get leaked. To prove he's not bluffing, Elliot starts rattling off their various operations, including using Price to annex the Congo from China. He suggests that now they have an opportunity to leave with what they both want. The assistant says he knows Elliot wants to reverse Five/Nine but the Dark Army couldn't care less about that as it has already served its purpose. As has Elliot.

Just as the assistant gives the nod to Leon to take aim at Darlene, Elliot shouts that he has a plan to help them move their project in the Washington Township plant to the Congo. But the assistant doesn't like being one-upped by Elliot and the operatives grab him. However, instead of shooting Elliot, Leon shoots the operatives after receiving what must've been revised orders from whiterose via text during this exchange. Just then, the assistant's phone vibrates. It's whiterose calling from the bathtub! She chides him for letting his jealousy continue to blind him to "Mr.

Alderson's value" and gently informs him that their time has come to an end. Grant drops the phone, tells Elliot to take care of her, and then shoots himself in the head.

Leon hands Elliot a laptop and tells him it's time to make good on his offer, which, in this case, he wasn't bluffing about having. Now it's time to undo the hack. Dom logs into Sentinel to give Elliot access to Romero's files. But to be clear, she's only doing it because if her life as she knows it is over, she wants at least one good thing to come out of it. But Romero didn't export the keys. Mr. Robot did, because it's what Elliot would've done in case their plan failed. And just like Dorothy in *The Wizard of Oz*, Elliot learns he has always had the power to go back.

The unmarked CD in his collection contains the necessary seed data and algorithm to regenerate the keys! This news, combined with Darlene's revelatory clarification that their dad didn't push Elliot out the window on the snowman day when they were kids (Elliot jumped after some kind of fit of rage), helps Elliot see Mr. Robot in a whole new light. So when Robot says he wants them to be a team and keep talking no matter what happens, Elliot is down with that plan. As soon as Elliot gets home and finds the photo that contains the data, he copies it into an email addressed to the recovery team at E Corp and hits send.

But wait! There's a bonus scene after the credits, because of course something wicked must this way come. As Darlene arrives at Elliot's door, four guys approach her. One of them speaks to her, cryptically identifying himself only as "a brave traveler who's finally come home." And who might that be, pray tell? None other than Fernando Vera. Cut. To. Black.

Summary:	During the Christmas season, Elliot and Mr. Robot make their return. Darlene deals with real trouble. Tyrell is bored. Dom becomes paranoid.



Newly revealed father and daughter are still at the estate where Price made his big (daddy) confession at the end of last season... but no matter how much Price tries to convince Angela that she shouldn't seek revenge for what whiterose manipulated her into doing, Angela refuses, even after she sees that the Dark Army has arrived. (Yeah, they're having their convo outside, but of course Price has been wearing a wire so whiterose could listen in.) After telling Price to go, Angela sits down and accepts her fate (a bullet to the back of the head and another for good measure). Price is pissed—at Angela for

not relenting, at whiterose for being so ruthless and at himself for not doing a better job protecting her, as whiterose so incisively points out.

Whiterose has a new assistant—Wang Shu—and she's out for blood. "Mr. Alderson's" blood, to be exact. Even though Elliot has an expiration date—namely by the end of the year after he helps get the project shipped to the Congo—Wang Shu secures whiterose's permission to remind Elliot who's in charge.

Lawyer Freddy Lomax is having a great time harassing his female staff at the firm holiday party and, let's say, "immersing himself" in a video chat with an underage girl until he gets a

special delivery from Mr. Robot: instructions to archive his email inbox and deliver it on a thumb drive to Robot/Elliot at Grand Central. If he doesn't, Mr. Robot will send Freddy's little video to his family and the FBI. With the info that Freddy supplies, Elliot quickly susses out that Zhi Zhang (aka whiterose) is not only a client, but also has been using Freddy and his firm to move big money around via a shell company. But just as Elliot zeroes in on the info he needs from Freddy about John Garcin, their liaison at the foreign bank, the Dark Army tracks them down. Elliot and Freddy split up and run with the plan to meet up on the street. But once Freddy realizes that Elliot can't protect him from the Dark Army, Freddy takes out the gun he pulled on Elliot earlier and offs himself outside the station.

Over at E Corp, Tyrell seems miserable even though he's widely considered as the hero for the Five/Nine reversal and resulting economic upswing. If they only knew... .

Despite the Freddy-suicide setback, working out of Allsafe's old office, Elliot figures out John Garcin's address and wants to move on it right away. Mr. Robot, however, thinks that Elliot is being too hasty and has lost sight of the bigger picture because he's grieving Angela. Not so, says Elliot. Stopping whiterose is the big picture. They have found the "heart" of whiterose's operation—the money pipeline—and Elliot believes they have no time to waste stabbing her right through the middle of it. After fielding persistent reach-outs from Darlene, they let her meet them at Elliot's apartment. She's freaked (and tweaked) that she has seen Angela wandering the streets in her bathrobe. Darlene believes that she's still alive, which is why they never found her body. Instead of showing her the photographic evidence that proves otherwise, Elliot advises his sister to stop feeling guilty because Angela brought this on herself. In response, Darlene accuses him of shutting down. Later Darlene's doing every drug available at a party she's "hosting" at Angela's apartment, which is the exact same as Angela left it, with her homage to the 9/29 victims. When Darlene hears some catty women trashing whoever must be the occupant of the apartment, she kicks everyone out and collapses on the bed clutching Angela's ballet slippers.

A sleepless Dom has been hiding out at her mother Trudie's house in the 'burbs of what seems like New Jersey, avoiding work and keeping watch over her family. Trudie has invited her friend Janice over for dinner. Sensing that her mom is trying to fix them up, Dom gently quashes the idea once she and Janice are outside. Then Janice says something that stops Dom in her tracks: "You better get your rest because you have your interview about the Santiago case in the morning. You've put it off for weeks. It's starting to look suspicious." Then comes the threat: unless Dom goes to work tomorrow and cleans up Santiago's mess, Janice is going to be forced to do something really bad to Dom's mother. Let's just say it would involve Janice's skills as a taxidermist. As Janice drives off, Dom notices two white vans parked on either end of the street.

With Mr. Robot reluctantly following him, Elliot hightails it over to John Garcin's apartment. An open door, thick dust everywhere and a copy of Sartre's *No Exit* (in which one of the main characters is named Joseph Garcin) all point to one conclusion: They're standing in a honeypot. Two Men in Black appear at the apartment and drag out Elliot. They take him back to his apartment where a third black-cloaked man injects him with heroin. The men leave Elliot writhing on the floor, struggling to reach the phone, with tears rolling down his face as scenes from happier days flash by before his eyes. As his eyes close, we fade to black.

After being shot up with what threatened to be a fatal dose of heroin, Elliot has been saved from the jaws of death by Mr. Evil Corp himself, Phillip Price. Phillip pays Elliot a visit at Allsafe and has now seen his cards—meaning the matrix of Post-It Notes. Price fills in the gaps. Zhi Zhang is the mastermind controlling the most powerful and wealthiest people in the world under the ruse of Deus, which was originally pitched as an investment group to leverage the world's growing reliance on connectivity. By the time the members figured out they were working for him, not with him, it was too late for

them to bail. With Zhang's earnings, he clandestinely built his billion-dollar mystery machine under the Washington Township nuclear power plant—Zhang's singular purpose all along.

Price claims that the Deus Group, which funds both whiterose and the Dark Army, is impenetrable and that Elliot's little "heist" is impossible. Not to mention, the E Corp liaison for Cyprus National Bank has been missing for several months. Can anyone guess who? How about Susan Jacobs, the E Corp General Counsel who Darlene zapped with a stun gun while Elliot was in prison (something that neither Elliot nor Mr. Robot knows)? So even if he wanted to, Price couldn't help Elliot get access to the bank, especially with his ousting looming. Not taking "no" for an answer, Elliot forces Price's hand: this is Price's only chance to avenge his daughter's death (of course Elliot dug up Price's true connection to Angela). But the bar for success is high: Elliot has to track down Susan Jacobs and Phillip has to somehow gather together all of the Deus members in the same room in the next eight days—and it's almost Christmas. When Price leaves, his commitment to the cause is unclear, but as Elliot points out to Mr. Robot, Price wouldn't have saved Elliot if he didn't want in.

Darlene calls Elliot to tell him that their mother has died. Even though Darlene hasn't visited Magda in a few years, she's more torn up about it than Elliot, who is annoyed about the interruption. But Darlene needs her brother, so he reluctantly spends the day handling the post-death details with her. He softens a bit when they come across an old cassette recording of him, Darlene and Angela wishing Angela's mom a happy Mother's Day, though it's curious why Magda had that tape at all.

Over at the FBI, Agent Horton is interviewing Dom about Santiago's disappearance. Horton asks her if Santiago did anything suspicious before his disappearance, such as... I don't know... "erase garage security cam footage before dropping off the face of the earth"? Oh, that. On the brink of tears, she confesses that she thinks Santiago was a double agent working with some "dangerous people." Who, pray tell? The Trujillo Drug Cartel. Horton seems to buy the cover story, or at least, that's what she tells Janice after the interview. But you know who isn't convinced that Horton was 100% convinced? Janice. And we all know how whiterose feels about absolute certainty so... Agent Horton meets an untimely end later that day. "Next time it needs to be 100 [emoji]," Janice texts to Dom. Roger that.

Price goes to see Zhang to resign. Zhang says that's unacceptable because the project has not yet shipped and besides, the Deus Group must all agree on his successor in person. With nothing left to lose, Price is like, great, do it, even though it pisses off Zhang. After, Price calls Elliot to tell him he played his hand and now all they can do is wait.

The Aldersons' Day of Sibling Togetherness yields an unexpected yet vital benefit in addition to thawing their tension. After seeing that Elliot has been trying to hack Susan Jacobs' Ecoin wallet, Darlene lets the truth about what happened spill out. At first Elliot is irate—Jacobs is dead?! And Darlene is responsible?!—but then he realizes that Darlene has control over Jacobs' digital life, which is what he needs more than Jacobs alive. Despite Elliot's protests, Darlene convinces him to let her help him.

On her way out of the funeral home, Darlene mentions she thought maybe Elliot's secret project had something to do with Vera. It freaked her out, she says, when Vera showed up at Elliot's building a couple of months ago but when she told him, Elliot apparently blew it off like it was NBD. Elliot and Mr. Robot exchange a look like "holy crap." After she leaves, Elliot goes off on Mr. Robot about not telling him about Vera. But Mr. Robot promises that Darlene never told him. So if it wasn't Elliot, and it wasn't Robot, then who the heck did Darlene tell?!

The episode ends with a flashback in the same E Corp boardroom from the last scene of the very first episode in season one. This time, Elliot is a young boy, spinning in a chair. His mother comes in and says she's been looking all over for him and he shouldn't be sitting there because it's not his seat. When he asks why, she cryptically answers, "They're not ready yet. We need to wait... for him." When young Elliot asks, "You mean, Mr. Robot?" she says no. "Elliot?" "No. The other one." They leave and the door shuts on us wondering who the heck "the other one" is.

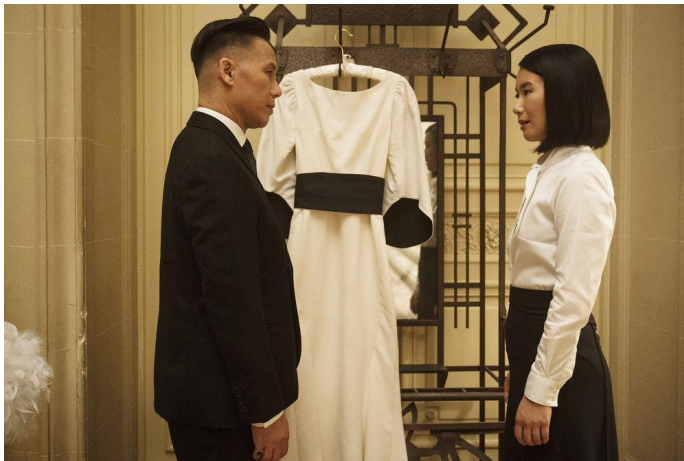

In a flashback to 1982, a young "Director Zhang" lands a major deal with IBM for them to build their first facility in Asia—and basks in the glow of a secret love affair with his male translator. After the meeting, the clandestine couple has a private celebration in their hotel room. His translator-lover thinks that Zhang is a shoe-in as the next ambassador to the United States, which means they can move somewhere where they can be their true selves. While his lover goes downstairs for another next meeting, Zhang hangs back "to prepare reports." When he returns, Zhang is wearing one of his

mother's evening gowns, a wig and makeup, revealing his "true self" to his lover for the first time.

The second part of the flashback shows Zhang's translator as nervous wreck prior to his wedding... to a woman, whom his father is forcing him to marry. Zhang tries to calm his lover but when Zhang tells him about being offered the position of Minister of State Security, which would keep them in Beijing, his lover breaks down. There's no life he wants in China. In response to Zhang asking him to be patient, he says, "You should know by now. If someone is asking for your patience, they are asking for your surrender." Zhang promises to find a way to make this world better, for them. As Zhang leaves, his lover says this world will never be good enough for him, grabs a knife and slits his throat, spilling blood all over the WHITE ROSES that Zhang bought for him. Boom. Now we know!

Back in present day, Zhang tells Wang Shu that he'll be wearing that very same gown from the flashback the day his project ships. Wang Shu says for him to hold his horses on the celebration since it seems like Elliot is up to something. Not to mention, it's probably not a coincidence that



the timing of Lomax's suicide has coincided with Price trying to resign. At first Zhang says to refuse Price's request but then after recalling that exchange with his former love about patience, he decides to not only grant Price's request to gather the Deus Group members but also to make it happen the next day, a.k.a. Christmas Day, thereby forcing Elliot's hand. Zhang will just install Tyrell Wellick as Phillip's replacement. Wang Shu is like, whaaat? But OK. She'll let Tyrell know the "good" news.

With a paranoid Mr. Robot looking over his shoulder, fearful of a sneak attack by Vera, Elliot bumps into Krista on the street. She makes it crystal clear that she doesn't want any further contact with him at all or she'll be forced to take legal action. He's sad because he just wanted to thank her. But what neither of them realize is that someone has been watching their interaction...

At Allsafe, Darlene has found out the name of Susan Jacobs' contact at Cyprus National Bank. Olivia Cortez is the bank's only U.S. account manager, so she's their way in. From having hacked some of her personal info, they deduce a few salient details about this woman, such as she's divorced and has a delicate custody situation subject to her getting randomly drug tested. But they can't access anything CNB-related without getting physical access to her laptop. Seeing that Olivia has plans to be out that evening on an OkCupid date and the ex has their kid for the night, Elliot starts heading out. He refuses to let Darlene handle it or come with him, though, which sends her into yet another funk.

In Olivia's apartment, Elliot and Robot find pretty much everything they need, except for her two-factor authentication device so that he can log into her CNB account, which she must have with her. (Elliot has also found a bottle of Oxy in the bathroom but that isn't useful... at the moment, at least.) Their only option is for Elliot to crash her date and swipe the fob. When they get to the bar, they see that Olivia has been stood up. Elliot's plan is to blackmail her about the bottle of Oxy he found in her apartment. Mr. Robot, however, thinks a softer touch will work and convinces Olivia to have a drink with him. Elliot spies the fob hanging from her bag. The awkwardness between them dissipates as they share some personal stuff, so by the time the missing date arrives, Olivia wants nothing to do with him. When she bolts to get away from the blind date, Elliot runs outside and kisses her. They go back to her apartment. After she falls asleep, you know, after, Elliot removes the fob, goes into the bathroom and texts Darlene the 2FA code so she can log in. Olivia joins him on the bathroom floor where they divulge their innermost thoughts, discovering they have more in common than Elliot ever could've anticipated.

Just as Mr. Robot has been worried about, Vera is in fact circling—or at least having his henchman circling—but not to flat out kill Elliot. He's been biding his time doing small-time drug deals (hidden inside fresh chickens) out of the kitchen of Adalina's Restaurant, but Vera's bigger ambition is to be "King of New York" and in order to do that he needs a "brilliant architect." Vera's clearly inept associate, who has very few salient details to share, just wants to put a gun to Elliot's head and make him do what Vera wants. But Vera wants Elliot to be a partner, not a prisoner. "A visionary like him don't work like that." Vera's henchman finally produces a photo of Elliot with Krista on the street, but gives Vera no context. Annoyed that a little kid can read more into the photo than his associate can, Vera shoots his guy in the gut. Then he studies Krista's photo more closely.

Elliot notices that a white van has been following Mr. Robot and him since they got out of the subway. It must be Dark Army. Mr. Robot is immediately suspicious that whiterose could be on to the fact that they have a plan. Elliot suggests that they show her they don't have one by going back to Elliot's apartment instead. However, the door has clearly been forced open. Elliot slowly walks in to find Tyrell, who excitedly starts telling Elliot that they want him to be CEO. Elliot shushes him and writes, "They're listening" on a piece of paper as the camera pushes out the window to the van parked outside.

Picking up from the previous episode, Tyrell is in Elliot's apartment, but we're now hearing their conversation from inside the van. As the Dark Army operative listens in, the conversation quickly changes to a benign topic and then becomes distorted by static. When the operative opens the van doors to fix the antenna, Tyrell knocks him out with a hammer, ostensibly killing him. Tyrell tells Elliot to wipe the logs and make sure they weren't sent to the Dark Army. They then drive the van upstate to the boonies so they can torch it and the body. They stop at a gas station in the middle of nowhere.

But when they come outside after paying for gas in the store, the van is gone. Guess the Dark Army op wasn't dead after all... .

Darlene leaves Elliot a long message letting him know that she has gotten into Olivia's CNB account but Olivia isn't authorized to transfer anything. Plus all of the authentication for the bank goes through a proxy, which means they're going to have to break into Virtual Realty and get onto their servers. Since the Deus Group meeting is tomorrow, she's scouting it out now. As she talks, she gets increasingly angry that he hasn't been answering her calls and didn't meet her at Allsafe as they planned. She goes to his apartment and sees the note Elliot had written to Tyrell ("they're listening") and her internal alarm bell goes off. She immediately starts tracking his location and sees that he's upstate.

Dom is home alone on Christmas Eve, unable to sleep. She tries to, shall we say, comfort herself by watching Darlene's interrogation video. Unsatisfied, she turns to a sex chat room and starts up a conversation with a former male chat partner, who suggests they meet up IRL. When Dom declines by explaining she's exclusively into women, "Henry" reveals that he is really a she. Dom invites her over. The two kiss. Dom excuses herself to the bathroom, which is filled with tons of red candles and red rose petals floating in a full bathtub. Her date appears in the doorway in a Dark Army mask and proceeds to drown Dom in the tub, urging her to stop fighting and give up control to make it easier on herself. Then Dom wakes up with a start in her bed. The whole thing was just a bad dream. But not, since her life has become a living nightmare.



Because the internet in the gas station mart is down, their phones have no signal, and the cashier has recognized Tyrell, Elliot, Mr. Robot and Tyrell head off down the supposed shortcut towards the nearest town but promptly get lost in the dark, snow-covered woods. Soon they're hearing eerie sounds and bickering with each other. Tyrell loses hope with every step, convinced that they're not going to get out of this situation alive and losing heart because he believes that Elliot never truly cared about him. They eventually make it out to the road but are still far from town. Tyrell wants to stop but Elliot explains that even if they're dead meat, they have to keep going so he can try to warn his sister. It's the least he can do after being such a "horrible brother" (his words) to her.

Darlene tries to steal a car but gets caught by its owner, Tobias, who's blotto and wearing a Santa suit. She convinces him to let her drive him home, which happens to be in the direction she believes Elliot has gone, in exchange for him letting her borrow his car for a "quick errand." As they drive, Elliot's location doesn't update (because he has no signal in the woods). When Darlene and Tobias pull into his driveway, he realizes that his car is sitting right there, which means they're actually in a stolen car. Oh well! Following Fake Santa's advice to worry about herself, not just her brother, she starts driving back towards New York City, only to pull over and slam the steering wheel in frustration, torn between saving Elliot or herself.

Elliot, Mr. Robot and Tyrell come upon a dead deer in the road. They turn the corner and see the white van crashed up ahead. They slowly approach the van from either side. The Dark Army operative shoots at Elliot, but he ducks just in time. After firing more rounds, the operative shoots himself in the head. In the melee, Tyrell has been shot in the abdomen. Mr. Robot says they have to get him to a hospital, but Tyrell says that if they do that, the Dark Army will find them. Tyrell says he's done and that Elliot should burn the van and all the evidence. Before he walks off, his parting words are, "Make sure you take care of whiterose." As Tyrell stumbles back through the woods, the weird sound comes up again. He finally spots its source, something that seems to be emanating a blue light, and heads towards it, getting up close enough to see what it is (though we don't) before the scene appropriately fades to white.

As Darlene pulls the stolen car into the same gas station at the location she last had for Elliot, she sees the smoke billowing over the trees. She drives toward it and stops the car, mouth agape. Elliot casually knocks on her window to unlock the door. Here Darlene utters the first of only two instances of dialogue in the whole episode: "It's cool, dude. We don't have to talk." She blows through a

traffic light to get them back to the city ASAP. They still have to break into Virtual Realty to get access to Cyprus National Bank before tonight's Deus Group meeting.

Back in his apartment, at first Elliot struggles a little to stay on task in the aftermath of the previous night's events. But he washes the blood off his hands (literally and figuratively) and gets Dolores Haze's Virtual Realty ID ready while Darlene transforms into her alter ego with a jet-black wig.

Just as Dom is dumping her store-bought sugar cookies into a storage container to make them appear homemade (#holidayprotip) for her family's holiday gathering, she gets a Signal message from her pal Janice sending her up to Pike's Hollow to investigate the operative-torched-in-a-van sitch. When Dom arrives, it's a full-blown cop scene. The coroner is already zipping up the DA op in a body bag. So she gets in her car and as she drives, she notices the camera on top of the nearby traffic light—a.k.a. the same one Darlene ran in the opening scene. She purposely drives through the red light and it flashes, as if taking a picture of her car. Dom hangs at the

local police station to see if she can be there when they go through the red light reports but with the holiday, no one seems to be moving so fast. She secretly puts a LAN Turtle on one of the officer's computers so she and Janice can watch the officer's screen remotely. Dom sends Janice a message that since she didn't have authorization, she hacked the local police department's network. Janice now should have access and should look for incoming red light camera reports. Janice responds with a thumbs-up emoji. While Dom hangs in her car in the station parking lot, she gets an email from Agent Amy Hartman saying that the "lucky Irish bastard" has been released, meaning Deegan Maguire, the mobster whose specialty is "disappearing people" whom she interviewed in episode 402.

At 11am, "Dolores" walks into Virtual Realty and tries to swipe her ID card, while Elliot waits outside. With the main security guard, Dolph Lawler, distracted by Darlene, Elliot, donning black medical gloves, slips inside and down the stairs. First order of business is getting Dolores Haze in the employee registry so Dolph will let her in. Then he forces a firmware update that will take out the security camera screens for 40 minutes, setting his phone timer accordingly. During her interaction with Dolph, Darlene covertly gets a clean print of his fingerprint on the screen protector of her phone. She picks up Elliot in the elevator and they head to the 7th floor to KraftWerks 3-D Printing. There they scan Dolph's fingerprint, make a mold of it and then push Silly Putty into the mold to create an imprint. Meanwhile Dolph is trying to figure out why the cameras are down. Downstairs he sees the firmware update happening on the monitor. However, he can't cancel the process. The siblings head to another floor within Virtual Realty to create a Smart Access ID badge for the server machine. But the clock is ticking... .

Phillip's Christmas morning is spent at a restaurant waiting for details about the Deus Group meeting. Elliot sends him a message saying that Tyrell won't be at the meeting tonight. The waiter delivers the first set of instructions: to go to E Corp and give \$20 to the trombone player on the plaza, which he does, sighing, instead of ho-ho-ing, all the way. The trombone player doffs his cap revealing a ticket for Murnau's Dry Cleaner's, located on 2nd Avenue. Having picked up a suit at the dry cleaner and taken it home, Phillip finds a note card in the jacket pocket indicating the location: The Brentano at 9pm. He texts Elliot to let him know that he has the time and location of the meeting, whether or not Wellick can attend.

Over at Virtual Realty, Elliot and Darlene make it into the server room with barely six minutes to spare thanks to Dolph's thumbprint. Elliot deletes Dolores' profile from the directory while Darlene gets on a console, looking for the CNB SSL server that runs authentication. But, uh oh, Dolph has noticed the open fire panel on the elevator and heads to the server room floor: the only floor requiring badge access. He suspects the server room has been recently accessed so checks an app on his phone and sees that his fingerprint was used for entry. He texts the other security guard to call the cops while Dolph goes into the server room. Darlene has finally found the correct CNB server but time's up and she isn't done. Only a moment after the security cameras come back online, Elliot has figured out how to cut the lights in the server room, buying them a little more time and cover. Darlene gains access to the bank's SSL proxy server just in the (saint) nick of time and adds herself as an admin so she can maintain remote access. They bolt. With the cops outside and Dolph about to nab them, Elliot runs past the guards and the cops so they chase him. Darlene improvises another disguise—as a gym rat coming out of the fitness studio within the same building—and cruises right by them. They barely glance in her direction. She gets into her stolen car and tracks Elliot, who is being chased all over Central Park and beyond by the cops. Run, Elliot, run! Backed into a corner, Elliot jumps over a railing, falls down a very high embankment and tumbles to stop next to Darlene's car. Limping, he gets in. She peels out and Elliot places his hand over hers. All she ever wanted for Christmas, apparently.

After the DiPierro holiday meal, Dom takes the family dog for a walk and sees a white van parked outside. Back indoors, she writes down the license plate number and its location on a pad of paper. Dom doesn't notice the news on the TV with a story about some "yuletide mayhem at Central Park" because her phone buzzes with a message. Janice needs Dom to track down a couple of "troublemakers." Her text says it's a "911 scenario, so chop chop" and she includes a photo of Elliot and Darlene captured from the red light camera.

Krista is all ready to meet up with her new beau Jason so she can introduce him to her family for the first time when she decides to blow them off and make dinner with just him. She heads to the same grocery store where she ran into Elliot in episode 403 and doesn't realize she's being trailed by a woman in a red puffer jacket. When she arrives at her door, she recognizes the

woman in the red jacket from the store standing across the street and fumbles with her keys, which causes her to drop her groceries. Red jacket woman picks up her fallen ice cream and Krista turns to see Vera, who utters the only other dialogue in the episode: "It's time we talk."

Vera has a Christmas tale for us, about a "bully" and a "little bitch." The bully would constantly beat on and steal from the lil' bitch. Then everything changed their relationship. The bitch loved baseball, and on one Christmas morning under the tree there was an "Easton Magnum aluminium baseball bat." The lil' bitch when out to play with his new bat. When he was approached by the bully he smashed him with it. There was blood everywhere. Because "lil' bitch saw the truth." He saw the secret purpose behind things, such as the bat. A creepy way for Vera to explain to Krista she has a purpose, too. He'll use her as the bat that'll break Elliot.

The Virtual Realty hack worked, so Darlene has an eye on things. She and Elliot are preparing for the Deus Group's meeting. She's still got Angela on her mind. She doesn't want to lose anybody else, least of all her brother— again. But she has other things to concern herself with right now, such as a woman pointing a gun in her face. Elliot's busy meeting with Leon. They haven't seen each other in a while, but our hacker doesn't have time for walking down memory lane. You can bet we'll see Leon again at some point. Noteworthy is, in the background right as Elliot walks out of frame you can get a quick glimpse at a truck with a caricature of Trump as a pile of shit with flies swarming around it. Elsewhere, Mr. Robot's continually trying to talk Elliot out of "crossing a line" that can't be uncrossed. That line was crossed a long time ago, though.

Darlene is face-to-face with Dom again. Another meeting long overdue. Except it's not a better one like Leon seeing Elliot again. This is Dark Army nastiness. Dom calls up eerie Janice to say she has Darlene captive, but that the brother's in the wind and sister isn't giving over any info. Not sure what the taxidermist is going to do. You can bet your ass it's nothing nice. The Dark Army don't care about Darlene. They want Elliot.

Elliot's off worming his way deeper into Olivia's life, getting into her apartment with cups of Christmas coffee. He starts off by mentioning her clients at the Cyprus National Bank. Suddenly she doesn't want to hold hands anymore. She's feeling an invasion of privacy. It gets more intense once he's talking about the Deus Group and all the various horrors they've been behind. Olivia

wants to know the truth, so Elliot says simply: "I hacked you." He's trying the honesty route now, asking her to make a call to her boss so he can swipe the guy's credentials. She kicks him out of her apartment. What will he choose to do now? He mentions her "custody battle" and suggests things might go bad if she's drug tested at work. That's why he brought her the coffee. Devious shit, man. Particularly knowing the terror of addiction. On top of that, they had sex. Terribly rotten what he's done. Shit goes horrible when Olivia cuts her wrists open in the bathroom.

Over the phone, Janice orders Dom to kill Darlene— she's not useful to them. It's easier for the Dark Army to be done with the sister. This leaves Dom in a horrifying place. She'll either have to kill Darlene or her whole family dies. Could this actually be the end of the line for Darlene? Can Dom bring herself to actually kill her? Looks like it. She puts Darlene on her knees in the bathtub. Dom won't listen to anything, even as Darlene pleads with her to let them take down the Dark Army. She doesn't shoot, but she pistols whips her hard, knocking her unconscious.

Vera keeps drilling Krista for something deeper than the basic therapist-patient relationship. He believes they had a "special relationship." She says the hacker scared him after all the threatening things that occurred. Vera's sure that Krista has feelings for the hacker. Probably not an easy thing to try psychological games with a woman whose entire profession revolves around psychology. All the same, Vera IS an intimidating, unpredictable dude. The rest of his bully story's no less creepy. He believes him and Elliot are connected on "a spiritual plane." Eventually, Krista succumbs and tells Vera a little about Mr. Robot.

Elliot helps stop the bleeding from Olivia's wrists. He tries apologising to her, though she's not willing to believe any of the shit that comes out of his mouth. All he can think to do is give her the phone again. She asks about one of the massacres the Deus Group helped happen, which is how her mother died. Elliot insists, again: "I can stop them." And it finally convinces Olivia to help him. She still thinks he's a "monster" and worse than those in the Deus Group, because he doesn't realise it.

When Darlene comes to in the bathtub she finds Dom still sitting there. The rogue FBI agent only wants the location of Elliot's phone to track him. Darlene recounts their night together, which is just painful for Dom to remember. She doesn't want to die with Dom believing she only used her as a means to an end. But time's up, and the Dark Army will be here soon. Dom orders Darlene out of the tub and decides she'll sacrifice herself: shoot her, run, and nothing will happen to her family. She wants to die, to be rid of all this burden. They get interrupted by Janice and a couple Dark Army operatives. Darlene buys time by wiping her phone, leaving her useful to them— for the moment.

Elliot soon gets a frantic call from Krista. She's only drawing him in for Vera. He's quickly abducted into a trunk right off the sidewalk.

When they remove his gag, Elliot demands to know why he's there. Vera does meth as he excitedly launches into a story about his recent revelations down in the "DR," where a shaman helped him discover his true

calling, a.k.a. to be King of New York, which can only come to fruition with Elliot's help. Mr. Robot paces, muttering to Elliot that they need to figure out how to escape. Elliot is adamant about not leaving until he knows Krista is safe and if so, freed. Elliot tells Vera he isn't just going to sign on as his partner because Vera had some "master vision" about it. He first needs to see with his own eyes that Krista is alive. Vera finally agrees but says then he wants his own "special introduction."

Vera takes Elliot in to see Krista, who is still tied up on the other side of the wall in her office. In exchange, Vera wants to meet Mr. Robot. Elliot resists but Vera's threat to allow Javi to do not nice things to Krista forces Elliot and Mr. Robot into complying. Mr. Robot comes out hot, repelling Vera's efforts to get inside their head. Mr. Robot points out that Vera should be the one interviewing to be Elliot and Mr. Robot's partner, not the other way around. "I'm not someone you push around with a gun... I am the gun," Mr. Robot tells him. After Vera explains his various ambitions, Robot handily shoots them all down. But what he does offer Vera is an boatload of money, which they can supply after their hack that night. That still isn't enough to convince him to free Krista, the only thing Vera has over Elliot's head at this point, by Elliot's own admission. Damn. Elliot takes back control over the conversation with Vera, telling him that he can show him the whole plan if they bring him his laptop in his backpack.

While Vera, Peanuts and Javi giggle like little kids over all the zeroes on the laptop screen, Elliot reaches into his backpack for the gun he retrieved from the Dark Army op (in 405) and pulls it on them. He gets up the nerve to shoot and... click, click, click. Javi has removed the bullets. First amused and then pissed, Vera sees that he has to go next level. He reloads the gun and places it to Krista's head. Growing desperate, Elliot says he'll not only give Vera all the money they steal but will also be his partner after the heist. But that's not enough to restore Vera's trust. He demands to know why he shouldn't just kill Krista. Elliot screams, "Because I need her! She helps me." Vera's like, oh, I get it now: she's your shaman. He realizes he has been going about this the wrong way. Mr. Robot isn't the one with the answer... .

Vera forces Krista and Elliot into an impromptu therapy session at gunpoint. Not ideal circumstances to say the least. Krista is terrified and resistant, but after Vera shoots the floor by her

chair and they have a superficial conversation about the recent death of Elliot's mother, they get down to business. Vera hits a nerve when he reveals that Krista said that Elliot has a secret and the only way to unlock it is to find out why Mr. Robot exists. He starts reading from Elliot's file. Mr. Robot is getting antsy and nervous. They need to get out of there because Krista sold them out. But Elliot now wants to hear what's in the file. What does Krista know that Elliot doesn't? It all comes back to the window incident when he was a kid. Krista presses on the memory and why he doesn't remember much about it, only what Darlene told him:

He and Darlene were building a snowman. Afterwards they went up to his room to get a camera. They couldn't find it. But Darlene told him they heard their dad coming and Elliot told her to hide in the closet. His dad walked in and Elliot grabbed his baseball bat and started smashing everything in the room and then he jumped out the window.

Krista suggests that Elliot doesn't remember that event himself because Mr. Robot was protecting him from something. What was Elliot afraid of? Elliot can't remember but Vera answers for him: "His father." Mr. Robot is now losing it, begging Krista to stop before she hurts Elliot irreparably. "He's not supposed to know!" At first Elliot is like no way, my dad was my friend, my only friend. Robot gives up, saying he can't protect Elliot anymore if he continues down this path. Eventually Krista leads Elliot to uncover that he swung the bat and then jumped out of the window to protect himself from his father... because his father had sexually molested him. Elliot's crying, Krista's crying and even Vera is crying.

After the revelation, Elliot understandably freaks out, screaming at the raging storm outside. How can he go on with this knowledge? Why did his father do this to him? Vera tries to comfort him. He knows Elliot's pain: his mother used to pass him around to her friends while she would go out to get high. Vera claims that this isn't a death. Elliot has been reborn! "Once you've weathered a storm like yours, you become the storm!" Vera cries as lightning flashes and thunder rattles the window behind him. "And it's the rest of the world that needs to run for cover." Elliot struggles to believe him, because he has every reason to remain suspicious that Vera will use this knowledge to bend Elliot to his own delusional will. Tired and sad, Elliot says he just doesn't want to be alone anymore. Vera responds, "You're not alone. I see you now." Suddenly Vera starts wheezing. When he stands up, we see that there's a knife in his back—the same one his brother supposedly used "on" Shayla—and Krista standing behind him, covered in blood. He collapses to the floor. The lights on the "stage" go out one by one, blanketing the scene in darkness as Vera breathes his last breaths.

Flashback to 1995: Young Elliot and Young Angela are playing hide-and-seek in the Queens Museum, Elliot's favorite place to escape the traumas at home. Young Elliot sneaks back into the bowels of the building to the storage area—where the remains of Electro the Smoking Robot from the 1939 World's Fair is kept—and hides something deep in a crevice in the brick wall. He explains to an unseen presence that this is something he has to do because it's going to help "them."

Standing over Vera's dead body, Krista tells Elliot that they need to go to the police before Peanuts and Javi come back.

But Elliot seems to be in shock from the revelation that his father sexually abused him. Instead of responding to Krista, he stares at Young Elliot in the corner. Krista manages to get him down the fire escape and into a taxi before Peanuts and Javi re-enter the apartment. In the cab, an E Corp holiday greeting video featuring Tyrell plays on the screen. When they arrive at the station, Elliot says that he can't go inside. He wishes he could go back to forgetting but Krista says that he never really forgot; it was just buried in the back of his mind. She offers to help him through this but Elliot apologizes for involving her in any of this. Just then, he sees Young Elliot across the street and follows him into the subway.

At the DiPierro home, a group of masked gunmen break down the door and bind the hands of Trudie and the entire family at gunpoint.

Janice now has Dom and Darlene with their hands and feet bound sitting in front of her in Angela's apartment while two Dark Army ops hover in the shadows. Darlene's phone has in fact been wiped but Darlene refuses to give up Elliot's location. To break the stalemate, Janice exploits the unacknowledged bond between Dom and Darlene by taking out one of her taxidermy knives and stabbing Dom in the chest, puncturing a lung. Dom becomes a new ticking clock: Darlene has about fifteen minutes to decide whether or not she will give Janice what she

wants in exchange for getting Dom medical attention before it's too late. Dom whispers to Darlene not to do what Janice asks, which Janice overhears. To up the stakes, she starts making a call to her surveillance team guarding Dom's family's house to give them the go-ahead to start killing off family members. Darlene finally relents and Janice backs down.

Elliot follows Young Elliot to the Queens Museum. By the panorama exhibit of New York City, Elliot breaks down, apologizing to his younger self for not doing more to stop their father from hurting them. Young Elliot leads Elliot to his hiding place in the storage room, but Young Elliot struggles to remove what's inside. Elliot reaches in and pulls out a coin pouch that contains a skeleton key with an E as the bit, which Elliot recognizes as the key to his childhood bedroom (and that he dreamed about in episode 104). Young Elliot explains that it was their father's key so they took it from him and hid it in the museum. If their father didn't have the key, then maybe he couldn't hurt them anymore. Young Elliot tells him, "You weren't running away from him," which makes Elliot realize that he did fight back.

A Dark Army op reports back to Janice that he has found Elliot's phone at Krista's house, but not Elliot. Janice is not amused and thinks that Darlene must have another way of finding Elliot. To put her hunch to the test, Janice dials her guys guarding the DiPierro household but no one picks up. She tries again; same thing. Dom asks if her men are answering, which makes Janice suspicious. Dom recommends that Janice direct her questions to "him," who has probably been trying to reach Dom. Janice returns one of fourteen missed calls on Dom's phone from "Lucky Irish Bastard," who turns out to be Deegan. Janice learns that Dom hired Deegan to kill the Dark Army ops guarding Trudie's house and then kidnap her entire family to take them to a safe house.

After Deegan hangs up on Janice, Dom pulls the knife out of her chest, cuts the Achilles tendon of the Dark Army op nearest to her in order to fell him, grabs his gun, and shoots Janice and her guys one after the other, killing them all. Dom calls the FBI to send help and urges Darlene to leave so she can find Elliot and take down the Dark Army once and for all.

Elliot's trying to complete the hack at Allsafe when Mr. Robot appears. Elliot gives him the rundown on how the rest of the hack will go down, but Mr. Robot wants to talk about what just happened and to know why Elliot let him back in. Mr. Robot is remorseful for so many things, including for not doing a better job of protecting him and not having told Elliot sooner. "I understand if you can't forgive me or need to shut me out for good just as long as you know that I am not your father. I never was." Elliot says that's why he created him, because he was the father he needed, not the father he had. Elliot knows that this painful experience has shaped Elliot into the person he now is and if it hadn't happened, he wouldn't have Mr. Robot. But now he doesn't think he can go through with the hack. Mr. Robot holds Elliot by the shoulders as he begins to weep. "I can't do it," Elliot says over and over again.

Mr. Robot meets Magda and Young Elliot in the same conference room from episode 402 (where Magda and Young Elliot talked about "the other one") to discuss Elliot and whether or not they should tell him "everything" now. Mr. Robot argues for waiting until the hack is done to "show him what he did." If that doesn't work, Darlene may be able to help them get through to "him"—since he "woke up for her" when she spoke to "him" two months ago.

Given that Elliot is still "mired in conflict," Mr. Robot joins Darlene in the hotel room across the street from where the Deus Group is scheduled to meet to keep the plan moving forward. Price unexpectedly shows up with a favor: he (probably not realizing he's talking to Mr. Robot) wants Elliot to destroy whiterose's "machine" after the hack is done. Price hands him a USB drive with everything Elliot needs to know about her project. After Price leaves, he watches the front steps of the hotel where the meeting is supposed to take place from the window. Oddly, Price is the only one who enters the building—none of the other members have arrived. Is whiterose onto their plan?

When Price enters the meeting location, whiterose, presenting as Minister Zhang, is seated at a table in an empty ballroom with a few masked Dark Army ops stationed nearby. Whiterose would've allowed Phillip to finish out his life in retirement, but now she's angry that he didn't leave well enough alone. She demands to know Elliot's plan. For that information she will kill him painlessly instead of making him die a painful death. Price says that he can't believe whiterose cancelled the meeting at the last minute for a "half-cocked conspiracy theory." But the meeting is still taking place, just at another location, whiterose tells him. And she's fine with being late because Tyrell Wellick can hold them over until she arrives. Phillip is like, hate to rain on your parade, but Wellick isn't showing up.



Mr. Robot tries to channel what Elliot would do once he saw that the Deus Group members were not showing up. If whiterose thought something was up, she would've told the other members, including the guy she was having the meeting for. So Mr. Robot and Darlene use Tyrell's credentials to log into his calendar and voila, the location of the meeting has been changed to Cipriani Downtown. But clearly Price wasn't told, which must mean that whiterose is across the street and not yet at the meeting. They settle on a new plan: Darlene will go downtown to capture the Deus Group's phone numbers and Mr. Robot will stay behind to capture whiterose's.

Wang Shu lets whiterose know that they've been searching the tri-state area for Wellick but there's been no sign of him. Price says he has no idea whether Wellick is alive or dead. Whiterose calls off the search. Wang Shu urges whiterose to get down to the meeting to warn the Deus Group before the situation goes from bad to worse. In her opinion, today Elliot has beaten whiterose. They should just find another way to move their project. But whiterose refuses to "listen to reason," so Wang Shu quits.

Downtown, Darlene can't get a clear line of sight into the party because of all the barricades and security guards. She then sees a billboard for "Shift+Control," a TV show that seems to be inspired by fsociety and gets an idea. Meanwhile, Mr. Robot calls Price's phone and whiterose answers. Whiterose asks Mr. Robot to get together to talk in person but Mr. Robot's says nah, I'm good. Whiterose tries making a deal: if Mr. Robot stops doing what he's doing, she will share very valuable information about Angela. Whiterose claims that despite the evidence to the contrary, Angela is still alive and whiterose can take him to her. Moved by the idea of Angela being alive and the prospect of "resetting" to live in a world he deserves, Elliot appears on the other end of the call. For a moment it seems like he's being drawn in, until he realizes that this is exactly how whiterose trapped Angela and used her. Elliot sees a message from Darlene to turn on the TV immediately so Elliot hangs up on whiterose. The news is broadcasting a new video message from fsociety (Darlene in the mask) exposing the members of the Deus Group, their heinous actions and their location. Afterwards, Darlene explains to Elliot that her video was the only way she could smoke out the members so she could capture their cell numbers. Though Elliot spoke directly to whiterose, he did so on Price's phone, which means he still needs to get access to the nearby cell towers to get whiterose's number.

Whiterose is unable calm the members who have called her. She asks Price if outing the Deus Group is his "big move." But Price is as in the dark about fsociety doxxing the Deus Group as whiterose is. She orders for her car to be brought around front—she doesn't care if the area outside hasn't been secured yet. Price's apparent amusement at her expense is just making "Old Sport" angrier.

Having been alerted to the fsociety video, the Deus Group members call for their cars and start heading for the door. But between Darlene jamming the signal so that the barricade to the parking garage can't be lowered and several outraged members of the public showing up to cut off the Deus Group's access to the street, they are stuck outside, giving Darlene the perfect opportunity to grab their numbers. She quickly gets 99 out of 100 numbers matched to Cyprus National Bank accounts. Everyone except whiterose. But it takes Elliot a bit longer to get access to the cell tower and then when he does, to send Darlene the file to have her scan all the numbers to find the one that matches a bank account. Once she does, she starts activating all the bank transfers.

Flanked by Dark Army ops, Whiterose and Price leave the hotel where they had their private meeting. Then whiterose's cell phone blows up with several "Account Overdrawn" notifications from CNB. Whiterose is like what the hell is this and Price responds, "If it's what I think it is, we're all broke." Whiterose seems incredulous. "Where's my [bleeping] money?" "Gone," Price says. "I warned you a long time ago that I rather see you lose than win myself. Your dream of another world is as good as dead."

Just as Mr. Robot and Elliot are leaving the hotel across the street, they see whiterose pull a gun out of an op's holster and shoot Phillip. While the ops hustle whiterose into a car, she catches a glimpse of Elliot walking down the street, hoodie up. Mr. Robot narrates, "And like that, Rome falls. No more Deus Group. No more top one percent of the top one percent. No more controlling every piece of our lives. No more playing God without permission. We took them down. All of them."

It's midnight, Christmas 2015 is over. The FBI arrives at Zhang's residence with a warrant. As whiterose finishes applying her makeup in her bedroom, she looks at herself in the mirror and

folds her hands. She is dressed in her mother's gown. We hear the FBI agents break down the front door to her house, followed by sounds of shouting, things being smashed and gunfire as the credits begin to roll.

Even though Dom can't see her family or know where they are, she gets herself released from the hospital despite medical advice to the contrary so she can just go the hell home.

The first two things Dom does when she gets home is to move her bureau in front of the door and take a painkiller. The next thing is to make a grilled cheese sandwich while Alexa shuffles Faith Hill songs. Darlene shows up and wants Dom to start packing her bags to hightail it out of Dodge with her and Elliot. They've got new identities, safe transport and plane tickets. But Dom refuses. She has family and responsibilities. Darlene is worried that if Dom stays, the Dark Army will kill another person she cares about. Dom replies that the FBI has her back. But Darlene points out that they have her under investigation—not the same thing. Darlene finally gets Dom to "snap out of it" by smashing her Alexa device—which, newsflash, isn't a person—on the floor.

The cab drops off Dom and Darlene at the motel where Elliot has been looking over the documents Price gave him on the drive the night before. Darlene immediately knows that Elliot is staying behind. He explains that he needs to go to Washington Township but she can't come.

She's like no problem; this was her last shootout at the O.K. Corral. She hands him her phone and asks if he wants to do the "honors." All the money has been passed through multiple crypto tumblers and shell accounts. Now that it's completely untraceable, it's ready to go out. But he says that since this is her win, she should do it. They hug goodbye.

Dom is shocked when she enters to motel room and finds Leon sitting there rolling a joint. He doesn't seem to remember her until she jogs his memory of the horrible day they met in the barn. Dom is freaking until Leon puts her mind at ease: he's no longer Dark Army. He's a free agent helping out his boy Elliot and his sis. Darlene comes in and apologizes for her whoopsie of not giving Dom the head's up that Leon is working with them now. Soon they're in Leon's Lincoln taking the way back roads to Logan Airport in Boston. Can't be too careful in Connecticut—there's a lot of Dark Army around because of the RWA's—Rich White A-holes—he warns. Dom looks at her new passport. Say hello to Jackie Doublehorn, a Hall & Oates-loving pastry chef from Illinois, everybody!

On a bench outside at a busy park where they've made a pit stop, Darlene decides it's the perfect opportunity to complete the last step of their heist. Darlene starts running the Python scrip and within seconds, the transfers are complete and all wallets have been updated. She and Dom watch as the phones of everyone milling around the park start pinging with alerts. People are elated by what they see on their screens. Dom wants to know what the hell Darlene just did. Well, all the money that whiterose and her cronies were stealing for decades has just been evenly dispersed into everyone's Ecooin wallets. Given E Corp's insistence that Ecooin stay separate from the U.S. dollar, it's impossible for them to reverse the transaction. Even Dom has gotten a fresh infusion to her bank account. Dom is appalled. This is stealing! There are laws! This isn't justice! Darlene argues that the people in power wrote the laws to benefit themselves and banked on everyone trusting the system. She and Elliot and even Dom stopped them and now they have this moment—the greatest redistribution of wealth in history! In her opinion, this is justice. "We just Robin-Hooded those evil mother-effers" she says before throwing her hands in the air and woo-hooing.

Leon dutifully drops Darlene and "Jackie" at the airport in Boston. He tells Darlene that if she's ever looking to get into some stuff when she gets back, "adventures or whatnot," he's got some stuff for her. With her skills, she could be a boss. She says she'll think about it.

Inside the airport, Dom wanders into a newsstand and sees a display of hardcover books called, "Beach Towel," written by... Irving! And then Irving appears in the flesh. Dom is frozen in place by the second encounter in a day with yet another former Dark Army op who has haunted her every waking moment for the past few months. Acting like they're long lost friends, Irving autographs a copy of his book for her. She begs him not to hurt them. Hurt them? Darlene did a bad thing, he says, but word around camp is that the Dark Army doesn't care about them or Dom's family anymore. "They've picked up and skedaddled off to something more important." When she asks where, he says he can't tell her. If they wanted to get to Darlene and Dom, he'd know about it. Dom says, "But I saw you butcher Santiago with an axe when he got out of line!" He says, "Yeah, that was fun." Take care! Buy the book!

Darlene can hardly believe her ears when Dom tells her who she just ran into. Dom is relieved because now they don't have to run. For Darlene, it starts to seem less about running and more about going—with Dom—to Budapest, which Darlene chose in homage to Cisco. Dom says she can't do it, even if they go somewhere else. Darlene can't do it alone, she gets these panic attacks... but Dom is resolute. Darlene says, "No wonder you can't sleep. You hold onto a lot and tight. If you leave this airport you're going to go back to the grind like everyone else. I'm talking about giving yourself a break." They embrace and cry. Dom gives Darlene the number of a friend at US Cyber Command for when she's "ready to grow up." They part. But just as Darlene is about to board the plane, she feels a panic attack coming on. She runs down the hall into the bathroom where she leans on the counter while she hyperventilates. A woman asks her if she's okay. After holding her own gaze in the mirror and taking several deep breaths, Darlene manages to move herself back away from the ledge. "I got this. I can take care of myself."

Meanwhile, Dom has had a change of heart, and run-limps back to the gate and boards the plane in the nick of time. But the seat beside her is empty. She has one last chance to get up and disembark before takeoff but she sits back down and fastens her seatbelt. Wheels up and Dom's finally fast asleep for the first time in weeks.

Just then, whiterose's watch beeps and the plant alarm system starts going off. She explains that her machine is pulling all the power from the plant, which will cause a meltdown. That's why it needed to be moved to the Congo. Elliot's "little exploit" was installed too late to stop it. Elliot will soon see that all those lives that have been lost will be found again once the world around them transforms into a parallel world where they were meant to be all along. She's going to show him what she showed Angela. Whiterose then pulls a gun out of the box on the desk and points it at Elliot. "All I ever wanted, Elliot, was your belief." She tells him that he "gets to decide" and then she turns the gun to her head and pulls the trigger. She collapses on the floor.

Elliot is still locked inside while the alarm continues going off. Elliot sees Angela in a wedding gown on the boardwalk. He follows her into the abandoned fsociety arcade. She tells him that he isn't Elliot. He's the "mastermind." Then the scene glitches and Elliot is forced out of the building. Elliot chases Mr. Robot. There's yet another glitch and Elliot is out on the boardwalk but everyone looks like Mr. Robot. Then Tyrell is there with a gun, and shoots him as he hears Tyrell say, "Bon soir, Elliot." Another glitch and suddenly it's night and Elliot is sweating and grunting while he tries to crawl across the sand but someone pulls him by his legs and throws him into a large ditch. He hears Darlene's voice begging him to wake up.

Again, a glitch, and Elliot finds himself on Krista's couch, not wounded. But she's not really Krista. Since Elliot trusted Krista so much, "the others" thought it would be better if she tried explaining the truth to him. He wants to talk to Darlene but Krista says she's out in the real world trying to wake him. Krista explains that Elliot's connection to Darlene is so strong that she became his only link to reality. By design she was removed from "this fantasy." "Without Darlene," Krista explains, "it was your best chance at trapping him here." Elliot tries to leave but keeps being forced back while Krista waits patiently. Finally he sits so she can explain Elliot's dissociative identity disorder.

She walks him through Elliot's various personalities. Mr. Robot—the first, the protector, and the father replacement—was created when Elliot jumped out the window. Later, he created Magda, "the persecutor, blaming Elliot for the abuse, insisting that he needed to pay for it." Next he created "his own family of sorts": Young Elliot, Magda and Mr. Robot. Aha! Elliot says to himself that Krista must not know about "you" (Friend) but she can somehow now hear his inner voice, and she knows all about them too: "the voyeurs who think they're not a part of it despite being here for all of it."

But there's another personality, Krista explains, that came about not too long ago to protect Elliot's future and save the entire world. This new personality hid "him" in a fantasy that was an endless loop to keep him safe until this new personality fixed everything. Krista admits she never figured out that she hadn't been talking to the real Elliot. Instead she was talking to this version of Elliot, created to carry the real Elliot's rage, "the vigilante hacker Elliot always imagined being, the one that sought vengeance, the personality that had gained so much control... that he forgot... he was only just another personality. You're not Elliot. You're the mastermind and now it's time for you to give that control back to the host: the real Elliot." But this Elliot doesn't want to give up his life! Another tremor causes the ceiling to fall in and then we cut to...

... Elliot in a hospital bed, some cuts on his forehead. Darlene is asleep in a chair until he says her name. He grabs her hand and asks her if this is a dream. She promises it's all real—fsociety, their hack on E Corp, Five/Nine, him going to prison, the Cyber Bombings, the two of them robbing those mother effers after what they did to Angela. Romero, Trenton, Mobley, Shayla...they're really gone, too. It's not in his head. She tells him that he stopped the meltdown but there was still an explosion, which he survived because the room he was in had some sort of advanced shielding. Whiterose is finally gone, along with her machine. The world is safe again. When he admits to her that he's not "him," Darlene says she's known that since she came back and he didn't remember her when he started fsociety. But she never said anything because she liked how close they were getting, since she felt so guilty for bailing on him when he needed her most. She then asks if "he" is okay and says that she misses him. She leaves to get the nurse and he closes his eyes as we fade to blue...

He addresses "Friend" again, admitting that he never gave himself a name either. He was "just a guy trying to play God without permission." The blue dissolves, revealing Hoodie Elliot standing beside Magda, Young Elliot and Mr. Robot in the same conference room with a view of the New York skyline we've seen before. Magda and Young Elliot leave the room, followed by Mr. Robot. Elliot tells us that changing the world is actually about being here, just showing up no matter what. If we don't just fall in line, then "just maybe the world can't help but change around us." Like Mr. Robot said, we'll always be a part of Elliot Alderson. "And we'll be the best part, because we're the part that always showed up, the part that stayed, the part that changed him. And who wouldn't be proud of that."

Elliot leaves the room and enters a glassed-in hallway bathed in blue light. He walks down the hallway to a red door. He looks at us and says, "This only works if you let go, too." He opens the door and joins Mr. Robot, Magda and Young Elliot in the movie theater. The projector goes

on behind them. The camera moves into the light of the projector, which turns into abstract kaleidoscope of scenes from Elliot's world over the past several months. Then the projector light resolves into an eyeball brimming with tears. We hear a door close and then we see Darlene re-enter the hospital room. She looks closely for a second and then leans in with a smile. "Hello, Elliot."
