The episode begins with a series of different people heading to a retreat called Tranquillum, deep in the heart of Cabrillo, California. These guys and gals are spending 10 days there, trying to fix up their lives through some much-needed R&R.

There's a litany of different problems these people are dealing with, and in episode 1 we only really taste a fraction of that.

Francis is stressed about her book deal, Napoleon and Heather have rela-

tionship problems which are a little better disguised than the Gen Z couple of Jessica and Ben. Their big drama comes from needing to hand over their phones — which seems like the end of the world for Jessica.

There's also Tony, who winds up most of the folks onboard for the retreat, while Lars is a little more restrained and sceptical. In fact, he reads through his contract and has a lot of questions regarding blood taking and the lack of advertising for the resort.

It turns out Lars has his own secrets, smuggling a phone out in the woods which Zoe just so happens to see while out wandering alone. With so many characters to play with, the one who's sort of overshadowed here is Carmel, who's allegedly there for weight loss but we'll circle back to that one later on.

With the wellness program beginning, "warden" Masha arrives to meet everyone individually. First up is Francis, who's clearly carrying around a lot of demons. She sits on the bed and starts sobbing, but abruptly stops when Masha shows and gives her some words of encouragement. She watches everyone on a series of monitors too, acting incredibly creepy.

Given the no-phone rule, all of our players make their various final calls to reveal they're going off the grid. Just as they do, rumours are abound as to what Masha's purpose is and what they need to do.

Masha eventually brings them all together and promises to help all 9 of our strangers to leave Tranquillum as better people. However, none of them are particularly pleased with Masha taking things from their bags — including wine and chocolate. Masha, as we soon find out, is actually from Russia. She was apparently shot dead in a parking garage but was revived by Yao, one of the workers at Tranquillum.

Masha wants to bring the same cathartic release for everyone else, to allow them to die (metaphorically I hope!) and become better people. And how will Masha do that? Well, as she tells Heather, she intends to "f*ck with them."

The episode begins with Francis heading off to catch up with Zoe, who ran out of the session last episode. It turns out the family are dealing with a big loss in the form of their son Zack. He died 3 years back and it soon becomes clear that this is a black cloud hanging over the family. When Heather shows up, Francis does her best to try and help but the woman simply walks away.

Back in the heated therapy room, all the different residents turn on Masha. Given she only accepts 10% of applicants,

it's clear that these people have been chosen because they're damaged and are there for a reason.

It's here we learn a little more about Tony. He's divorced, a drug addict and also has two kids as well. His relationship is pretty estranged but Tony believes Masha is using this as a weapon against him. He's clearly not happy with his life and eventually gives in, allowing Tony his vodka and pills back.

As he settles back into a destructive state, Masha reminds him she just wants his secret and to make him feel better.

Given Jessica is such a fan of Francis' work, the two have a nice chat down by the pool. Francis reminds the girl not to use her novels as love advice, especially given how romanticized and fantastical some books can be. It's clear these two were chosen for a very specific reason, and it seems that their connection with Francis' books may be why.

Outside, Masha gets taking to Yao. Apparently Delilah gets jealous a lot as Masha kisses Yao's legs and tells him they're inexplicably bound together. There's clearly a lot more than meets the eye here but for now, it's being kept under wraps.

Anyway, today's big session involves our 9 strangers digging themselves a grave and lying within, reflecting on their life's choices. It's all laid out in a big semi-circle as Masha arrives and gets them to control their thoughts.

With chimes echoing through the air, she tells them all to step out their graves as new people. In doing so, Francis heads back to the spa for some acupuncture. There, the workers at Tranquillum take blood samples.

The one person whom this grave task seems to work for is Jessica. She heads off for a one to one with Masha afterwards, telling her she wants to transform her life. Jessica wants to transcend beyond her simplistic life and actually be someone. Masha sees through this façade though and claims that a lot of Jessica's drama stems from Ben. She thinks the love has gone but won't admit it to herself.

Tony and Francis end up having some hilarious interactions down at the pool. With Francis noisily snoring, Tony throws a grape straight into Francis mouth. Although she starts choking, Tony jumps in to help the girl out. The pair actually have really good chemistry on-screen, with Francis admitting she's still reeling from a past relationship with a guy called Paul.

When the conversation turns to Francis' latest book, she learns the critics have given it bad reviews. She's not happy and eventually walks away.

Off on the hike, all the gang get involved in their trust exercises. Heather however, turns away from the group and stands precariously on the edge of the cliff-face, looking out at the drop below. Napoleon holds her shoulders but Delilah warns him off, telling the guy to back up. It's clear Heather has a lot of demons and although she's talked out of jumping, it's still an alarming moment.

On the back of her despair, Francis shows up to see Masha. She's worried that as a novelist she's a one-trick pony but Masha turns that metaphor around, telling her she's a car that's run out of gas.

When Francis leaves, Masha turns back to her monitors. Interestingly, Tony decides to get back in his grave to find relief while Zoe and Napoleon hash it out in the woods. With everything bubbling up, and the group not fully detoxed yet, Masha makes the decision to "start the protocol."

The episode begins with all our guys and gals waking up after an eventful few days. While Jessica and Ben end up lovemaking — Heather is not in the mood for the same from Napoleon. Speaking of which, Napoleon has a one on one session with Masha coming up and he's surprisingly upbeat about it.

Delilah is concerned about the project though, believing their candidates aren't ready. Masha brushes that aside though and sets to work getting ready for day 3. This includes a smoothie for breakfast.

While they sit at the table, Lars lives up to his branded nickname I've given him of "spoon", stirring up a whole pot of issues with the different residents. First up, he probes the marital issues between Ben and Jessica.

Well, Yao has just the ticket to cut out all this tension. There's a potato sack race coming up! Lars does his best to rile up the group further, bringing out Carmel's pent-up rage following a particularly crude suggestion.

Speaking of which, Tony clearly has rage and grief build-up himself and his drug addiction is certainly not doing him any favours. Flashes to the past reveal troubling revelations, including a football match where he's taken off on a stretcher.

As we come to find out later on, Tony is actually a pretty famous player but no longer going under his alias of "Smiley". It's a pretty ironic nickname in truth, given what we know about him now.

After the sack race finishes, Napoleon shows up to see Masha during his one on one. Here, we learn Zack took his own life and that has obviously affected Heather very badly. Napoleon meanwhile, is very standoffish, deciding to look at the facts and not allowing himself to feel the pain. Although he remains scientific and detached from the situation, his body language shows something very different.

Masha encourages Napoleon to close his eyes, where he ends up seeing his son. Napoleon lies about it though, and eventually skips away from the session. It's clear he needs to face his grief but it doesn't seem like the right time to do that.

In order to help "feel" the land, Delilah encourages the girls (who have been kept separate to the guys this session) to get into the river naked. Only Heather does this though, while the others are way too self-conscious to get involved. On the shore though, tensions flare between Carmel and Jessica, especially when the former lashes out at Jess for her Insta profile.

Things do eventually simmer down while in the hot spring (there's definitely some poetic irony there) as the girls discuss their sex life. It's very awkward for Zoe, especially when Heather admits it's been 3 years since she and Napoleon made love. It's not the same anymore and obviously after Zack, it's difficult for her to feel that same level of intimacy with her husband.

The guys meanwhile, are off with Yao and trying to forage for food. The attention turns from Tony across to Ben, as Lars probes him over he makes his money. Apparently he won 22 million dollars in the lottery but in doing so, his whole life was upended and completely changed. Lars though? Well, he just continues to lash out and belittle the others.

Well, that is until the guys all rally together and manage to hunt and kill an animal. Given they were supposed to be living off the land, they've certainly done what they set out to do but for Masha, there's more going on here behind her strained smile when she finds out.

Although she congratulates them, she hurries back into her room and begins breathing heavily. Yao shows up to see her though, telling the woman he's sorry for her loss.

Day turns to night and all our strangers start dancing by the fire. Things have definitely changed, and Lars can sense this too. He hits out at Delilah, given more things have been taken from his room, but that's soon brushed aside in favour of the big goat banquet.

Napoleon stands up to say a few words and eventually opens up, admitting that it's his fault that Zack passed. If he hadn't snoozed his alarm and gone in to see Zack when he should have done, Heather wouldn't have gone through this trauma.

It's a cathartic release, one that eventually sees Napoleon face his grief head-on — which is exactly what Heather wanted. During the moments of silence that follow, Heather turns to Masha and asks if they've all been medicated. The wry smile back confirms just that.

Meanwhile, we see a few little bits of history about Lars. He's going through a breakup with Ray and his devout Christian upbringing means he's handling a lot of pressure. He talks to Zoe about this too, who is also in denial regarding her depression with Zack's death.

The day's task revolves around anger, and after Francis makes her feelings felt, Carmel is encouraged to let hers out too. With a dummy set up, Masha reads out all of those horrible things Carmel's partner said about her. Carmel completely unlashes her anger, smashing the dummy repeatedly.

The others watching this though are pretty scared, including Napoleon and Tony. When Tony skips out, Francis follows and tries to get through to him but he's clearly erratic and suffering quite badly.

It turns out Tony had a fight at a bar in the past and this resulted in the man being taken to hospital with a bleed to the brain. This same guy then died 6 days later. This is the big drama surrounding Tony and his metaphorical black cloud hanging over his life. He's got nowhere else to go and this dummy beat-down is precisely why he's acting this way.

As day turns to night, Delilah confronts Masha but she waves away her protests. However, things take a turn for the worst when Masha heads into her apartment later that evening. A smashed plate on the ground and a note up on the wall reading "It's good to die" hint that someone at the resort has it in for her.

The episode begins with Masha reflecting back on the painful memories from her past. With her daughter riding a bike, she's struck down by a speeding car, sending Masha into a deep spiral of grief. Carmel snaps Masha back to reality though with a stiff punch across the face.

With blood staining her face, Yao jumps in and manages to strap Carmel down. As they rush her out of the area, Frances begins to freak out. Tony senses this and suggests they just get away from the place together. As he begins spouting

out prose from her book, Tony suddenly changes to sport long hair and white robes. Yes, all of this is a big vision as the treatment starts to spiral out of control.

Following their run-in with Zack earlier in the season, both Heather and Napoleon entertain the idea of being with him — even if the whole thing is a hallucinatory lie. Napoleon is still torn over the big reveal with Heather though, which — if you may remember — included her lying about the pill bottle and the side effects therein.

Lars trails off from the group and takes Masha aside. It turns out the guest who died was a guy called Aaron Connolly. He died on the premises too, explaining the visions of Masha and Delilah giving CPR to the kid. Masha though chalks it up to a heart attack and nonchalantly brushes aside Lars's concerns.

However, it turns out Lars is actually on the island to get to the bottom of this and investigate Connolly's death. His mother is the one who hired him to get involved in this project.

As things start to become unraveled, Masha pushes the Marconi family to "increase the odds" with their encounter with Zack. She promises that they'll see beyond their wildest dreams, pushing them to up their dosage. This whole plan that she has in mind was successful for only one guest previously. Any guesses who that may be? Yep, it's Aaron.

Of course, Lars jumps all over this and confronts Masha about why she's doing this. He knows about her history and believes Masha is crossing a line with the Marconi family to try and use them to somehow see her own daughter again. Essentially the guys and gals in this project are just guinea pigs for Masha.

Delilah has had enough and refuses to see another disaster on the resort. Her attempts to try and get through to Yao fail, and she eventually packs her things and leaves alone. Or at least tries to anyway. The gates are locked and the place is on lockdown. Well, it doesn't stop her from driving through a fence and leaving anyway, much to Masha's horror.

With less manpower, Frances wanders off on her own, sitting on the cliff edge and looking out at the water. When Masha catches wind of this, she postpones her plans with the Marconi's to make sure she's okay.

Interestingly, it's this conversation that allows us to learn more about Masha and what drives her. Since the death of her daughter Tatianna she's been struggling to feel happy and leading an unfulfilling life.

With nothing going to plan, Masha doses the Marconi family and tasks Yao with bringing them to the forest, given that's where they've been seeing Zack the most.

Meanwhile, Masha visits Carmel who's having second thoughts and wants to leave the facility. Masha tries to convince her otherwise, but as Carmel turns and looks at her, she sports two different coloured eyes. More visions of Masha's past hint that the gunman who shot her in the parking lot had the exact same condition.

Well, this comes in the form of locking her away in a sensory depravity tank. There's warm water half-full and with the tank both light and soundproof, anyone with claustrophobia is sure to absolutely love this. And Carmel is one of those people.

Anyway, she begins to panic and struggles to stay calm. This whole experiment seems to be a way of allowing her to connect to the past, which Carmel actually begins to do, seeing flashes of the past.

Masha continues to flirt the line of insanity though, and when she reaches the Marconi family outside she unravels. Lars has told them all about Masha's daughter and what she plans to do, including how she's using them as "test pilots" for her own journey. As Napoleon and Heather question Masha, she admits that she's consumed by grief and loss.

With Masha stuck just as much as the Marconi family, she decides they should all meditate and go on this journey together. Lars films the whole affair while the gang hold hands.

Blood oozes out of Napoleon's nose as the family gather together and begin chuckling incredulously. Zach shows up before them, seeing all three question him over why he commit suicide. Zach admits there's no rational reason why this happened. According to him, it's just "something that happened" and there's no explanation.

Napoleon continues to hear his alarm clock ringing, which he interprets as a "game over" of sorts. Despite being named an exemplary teacher, he's consumed by guilt and grief, believing he's failed Zach as a parent. Zach though interprets that sound as Napoleon needing to stop mourning his suicide.

As Zoe and Heather approach too, the gang hug it out and believe they've come to an understanding together. Zach tells them they need to separate the day from him, and try to move past the grief threatening to swallow them whole.

Meanwhile, Frances approaches Tony while he's in the pool and apologizes for her actions. She admits that she tends to babble when she's nervous and that is most certainly the case regarding their time in the sauna.

Tony forgives her and decides they should leave the facility together, head off to a Four Seasons and go for dinner. As they pack up and get ready to leave, they quiz one of the workers about Carmel and her treatment.

Believing her to be okay, the duo head down to the garage. Only, all the cars have gone. Jessica and Ben are there too (remember them? Yeah they've just disappeared these past few weeks) and they too are shocked to find the place stripped bare.

Heading back inside, they run into Lars. He reveals what Masha and the Marconi family are up to, divulging their whole plan. With most of the big players out in the woods, the rest of the patients confront Masha about locking up Carmel. Unfortunately, all the other characters are guided toward Carmel's room and locked in themselves. If that wasn't enough, the room begins to heat up and some of them can smell fire. It seems like the facility is about to go up in flames.

Inside this stuffy room, Lars opens up and admits he was in love once. He gave up that opportunity though and since then, has been ruing his opportunity. This helps to open up the floodgates for the others to reveal their own problems and insecurities too, including how they're going to try and change it.

It's Yao who eventually opens the doors and lets them out though, admitting that they simulate the smell of fire to provide a visceral near-death experience. This close to death it allows people to open up and break down barriers. None of them are particularly happy about this though and after cursing him out, they walk away.

Masha's flashes soon manifest into snowflakes falling in the bright sunshine. There's no clouds though so this is definitely a vision. Zoe can see it too and she guides Masha to try and let go of the pain. As the snow subsides, she sees her daughter Lapochka standing, silently waiting for her. The two embrace, just like they did that fateful night of her death.

Having called the police, Delilah shows up with several police cars ready to arrest her. As the other patients gather together, they watch as Masha is taken away for questioning. However, she's managed to find peace with herself in the process and smiles at each of them warmly.

With the Tranquillum situation behind them, the gang all head back to their daily lives. But things have changed. Yao is off doing charity work with Delilah after apologizing to her back at the facility. Lars finally embraces family life with Tom and their baby.

As the camera pans across though, his article is the front-cover of The New Yorker, labelled "Psychedelics to the rescue." This seems to confirm that Masha is not being put away for an extended period of time.

Elsewhere, Frances and Tony go for dinner together. While Frances feels inspired to write, Tony decides to facetime his daughter.

Carmel finally forgives herself too and decides to project that knowledge back across to other victims of abuse too. So what of Ben and Jessica? Well, they've decided to take over Tranquillium in Masha's stead.

The Marconi family have now managed to patch up their differences too, driving back home but now able to finally move past the situation with Zach and what it's done to their family. And Masha? Well, she's free and still seeing visions of her daughter in her life. Everyone is now ready to move on with their lives, safe in the knowledge that they've managed to exorcise their demons.
