Childhood best friends Lizzy and Luke decided long ago that if they were both single at 30, they'd start a family together just not the old fashioned way. Lizzy is a lesbian and Luke is straight. "We may not be everyone's idea of a traditional family," Lizzy says to the pharmacist providing her pre-prenatal pills, "but my point is we're still good people with solid values."

With parenthood a positive pregnancy test away, Lizzy asks Luke if he's ready for such a commitment, especially since he never even lets his dates spend the night. Luke proves he's ready to be a dad

when he pulls out a onesie and a pair of baby socks. More importantly, Luke's been taking care of Lizzy for most of her life, including knowing she was gay before she did. Alas, Lizzy's pregnancy test turns out to be negative.

To remedy their disappointment, Lizzy and Luke head to a bar where Luke meets a beautiful British brunette named Prudence. Luke attempts to impress her by suavely jumping over the bar but instead falls flat on his face. Despite the misstep (and a possible concussion), there's no denying the chemistry between Luke and Prudence. When she asks him to dance — something Luke normally never does — he allows himself to be dragged to the dance floor. Lizzy, her sister Leisha and Leisha's husband Roy watch the whole thing unfold, including Luke's unsightly flailing, but Lizzy remains confident Prudence is no different than any of Luke's other conquests.

You can imagine Lizzy's surprise then when the next morning she finds a completely naked Prudence in her kitchen. Two things happen at once for Lizzy in that moment. On the one hand, seeing a beautiful woman nude is a pleasant change of pace for the longtime single. But Lizzy's inner control freak wins out when she sees Prudence sit on a stool with no bottoms on, and she loses her cool. Even more perturbing, Lizzy learns that Luke actually asked Prudence to spend the night.

But Luke's not done there: he invites Prudence to his place of work, the bowling alley he inherited from his grandfather where he works alongside pal Marcus. There, Luke and Prudence learn they both love sci-fi and reveal they love each other, too. To keep Prudence from leaving, Luke offers to pay to extend her trip, but Prudence reveals it's not that simple: she's being deported. Meanwhile, an irritated Lizzy waits for Luke at the paint store so the two can pick out

a color for their living room accent wall. Unfortunately, Luke, completely smitten with Prudence, has forgotten their plans.

Or at least he's forgotten Lizzy's part in the plan because when Lizzy wakes up the next morning, she finds the wall painted red, instead of her preferred gray, at Prudence's behest. Having hit her limit, Lizzy and Luke go into the kitchen and have it out over Luke's bewildering love affair, as Lizzy calls it. Luke reminds Lizzy she's no expert in love and advises her to open up to people instead of immediately passing judgment. He promises there's more to Prudence that Lizzy hasn't seen, but Prudence's ill-timed walk past the kitchen, devoid of clothes, only undermines his point.

Over dinner with Leisha and Roy that night, Lizzy can't stop complaining about Prudence, prompting Leisha to point out Lizzy's jealousy. As Lizzy starts to defend herself, Luke and Prudence burst in with exciting news: they're married! Lizzy spirals with anger at the revelation, causing Leisha and Roy to try to calm her by repeatedly offering her wine. Lizzy rejects more and more forcefully until finally proclaiming, "I'm pregnant!" Luke is overjoyed that he's become a husband and a father all at once, but the news is too much for Prudence to handle. Not having been aware of Luke and Lizzy's plan nor wanting to be the third wheel in their burgeoning family, Prudence leaves, sending Luke chasing after her.

The next day, Luke tells Lizzy he and Prudence broke up. He declares that he made a commitment to Lizzy — their baby comes first. Seeing how much Luke is hurting, Lizzy realizes her best friend deserves to be happy and that she needs to learn to share him. To prove it, she takes a page out of a romantic comedy and heads to the airport to win back the girl... err, Luke's girl. Finding Prudence at security, Lizzy explains that Luke loves her and that she loves him, plus a family tree has many branches. Getting down on one knee, Lizzy asks, "Prudence, come be a branch and make the father of my unborn branch the happiest branch alive?" You'd be hard pressed to find anyone who could say no to a proposal like that.

Lizzy's grand gesture turns Luke's idea of the "one big happy" into a reality. She and Luke thought a baby would be their new addition; it turned out to be Prudence.

Getting Prudence and Luke back together was the right thing to do, but that doesn't mean Lizzy is happy about opening up her home to Prudence, especially after Prudence serves her a traditional English breakfast on a plate she doesn't recognize. Seeing an "outside plate" causes Lizzy to have a small freak-out, which leads to an even bigger freak-out when she sees all of Prudence's boxes containing her belongings from England scatted throughout the living room. Even more disturbing, the boxes aren't even labeled.

Luke reminds Lizzy it was her idea for Prudence to move in and she calms down,

somewhat, until Prudence suggests she take over the hall closet. When Lizzy loses it again, Prudence wonders if it's because that closet is the one she came out of. In reality, it's the closet where Lizzy stores all of her ex-girlfriend Erica's things. The couple split three years ago, but Lizzy hasn't moved on, despite, as Luke reminds her, that Erica dumped Lizzy on her birthday then hooked up with her Pilates instructor. Prudence offers to help Lizzy get over Erica, starting with cleaning out the closet, but Lizzy responds by running out of the house.

After some strong-arming by Luke, Lizzy finally gives in and actually admits it feels good to get rid of Erica's things. But soon, it's Luke who needs the calming down when Prudence finds her pair of marionettes. As Lizzy well knows, marionettes are the one thing in life that freaks out Luke the most, and now, he's going to be going to bed with them hanging above him. Seeing the progress Lizzy has made, Prudence encourages her to return Erica's things in person and get closure. Luke disagrees, saying Lizzy is too susceptible to Erica's charms, but Prudence counters that as long as Lizzy finds a neutral location for them to meet and stands her ground, it should be fine.

Prudence's advice might have worked had Lizzy not asked Erica to meet at the place where they said "I love you" for the first time. Oops. Lizzy's first attempt to return Erica's stuff is foiled when Erica mentions how beautiful Lizzy looks. Erica even tries to convince Lizzy to come back to her place, but Lizzy holds firm and reveals she's pregnant, which subdues Erica a little. But when Lizzy goes to leave, Erica kisses her. The next morning, Lizzy confesses she saw Erica — and did some other stuff, too — after Prudence spots a hickey on Lizzy's neck. Lizzy also admits Erica is coming over for dinner that night. Her revelation causes Luke to flip out, and he tells Lizzy not to come crying back to him when Erica breaks her heart. Lizzy retaliates by reminding Luke he's not handling his personal life much better and that instead of being honest with Prudence, he's been sleeping on her floor. Luke turns to Marcus for advice on how to tell Prudence he's afraid of the puppets, but Marcus assures Luke that if he admits he's scared, Prudence will no longer have sex with him. Instead, he encourages Luke to man up.

Back home, Lizzy is forced to share a romantic meal with Leisha and Roy after Erica stands her up. When Luke enters, ready to give Erica a piece of his mind, he finds himself having to comfort Lizzy. She admits that he was right and adds that seeing Leisha and Roy and Luke and Prudence together makes her feel alone. Luke wraps Lizzy in a hug and reminds her she's not alone, she has him, and then suggests a surefire way for Lizzy to move on: burning Erica's things.

As Lizzy tosses the last of Erica's stuff into the fire, Prudence says she shouldn't have meddled in Lizzy's life and will find a way to make it up to her. She gets her chance soon after when Erica shows up asking for a second chance. Lizzy nearly caves when she can't prove she's moved on, but enter Prudence, who passionately kisses Lizzy on the lips and declares she's Lizzy's girlfriend. Erica knows there's no going back to her now.

That night, as Luke lies awake in bed watching Prudence's marionettes hang above him, Lizzy hides nearby and whispers about the marionettes wanting to kill him. Completely freaked out, Luke finally comes clean to Prudence about his fear of puppets. To Luke's surprise, Prudence doesn't mind at all. In fact, she loves that he isn't afraid of being vulnerable. Lizzy, however, probably isn't as pleased by Luke's admission, especially when it leads Luke and Prudence to start going at it with her still in the room.

Lizzy's pregnancy gets off to a great start when Luke and Prudence return from the gym and announce that Luke scored Lizzy an appointment with "The Fetus Whisperer," Dr. Levine. Luke spotted the OB/GYN playing basketball with his doctor pals and managed to join the game. After he let Dr. Levine score the gamewinning shot, Dr. Levine returned the favor with an appointment. Ecstatic, Lizzy and Luke celebrate with a big embrace, but their affectionate moment leaves Prudence standing awkwardly to the side.

When the trio hits the gym together, Lizzy spies the cute brunette she's been

crushing on for months. Though she says "my business is closed for business" while pregnant, Luke and Prudence encourage her to make a move. When she ends up on the treadmill next to her, Lizzy strikes up a conversation with her dream girl, who admits she's had her eye on Lizzy, too. But as she goes to introduce herself — her name's Kate — she falls and goes sliding off of the treadmill. "This is amazing," Luke says. "She's more awkward than you."

Lizzy invites Kate to come bowling with her league. Truthfully, there is no league, but Lizzy's lie forces Luke, Prudence, Leisha, Roy and Marcus to tag along, too. When Kate arrives, everyone attempts to figure out if she is a lesbian based on her wardrobe, her preferences in sports and her answers to blatant questions like, "Did you watch The L Word?" While Lizzy is mortified, Kate understands and confirms she is gay and that she was hoping this was a date.

After a great evening, Lizzy is overjoyed by her romantic prospects and can't stop gushing at her appointment with Dr. Levine. But that quickly comes to an end when Kate walks in — she's Dr. Levine's nurse. With only one date under their belt, Lizzy had yet to tell Kate that she's pregnant or that Luke is the father. Despite her shock, Kate gets on with her job, which includes asking Lizzy about her weight and her bowel movements. The situation only gets worse when Lizzy accidentally knocks her urine sample onto Kate's feet.

In actuality, Leisha never asked for a hot dog, but Prudence needed the visual. When Lizzy walks away to speak to Kate, who asked to see her again, Prudence confronts Luke. He incorrectly assumes she's upset because he borrowed her underwear one day, which sends Prudence running off.

Lizzy's relief that Kate wanted to see her again proves short-lived when Kate admits Lizzy's situation is too complicated for her. Making Kate's point, Prudence and Luke walk by at that exact moment, with Prudence shouting at Luke about his treating her like the other woman and not his wife. Lizzy promises Prudence is just a phone call away from deportation, but there's another reason why they can't be together: Kate's not allowed to date Dr. Levine's patients.

Back at home, Prudence and Luke have made up in their typically sexy fashion, but Prudence is glad they argued; it taught her to stand up for herself. Lizzy, meanwhile, is not so pleased. Luke and Prudence try to cheer Lizzy up by saying she and Kate can always date after the baby is born. Lizzy doubts Kate will still be single by then, but at her follow-up appointment with Dr. Levine, Kate gives her hope. As Lizzy, Luke and Prudence watch the sonogram and listen to the baby's heartbeat, Kate notes that there are only 238 days until Lizzy's not pregnant or a patient anymore.

Waking up and finding Prudence in her kitchen has become old hat for Lizzy, but what hasn't is seeing Prudence eat unappetizing British breakfast foods. In fact, when Prudence offers Lizzy toast with gooseberry jam, a phlegmy-looking spread by Prudence's own admission, Lizzy begins to dry heave. Luke, who gags anytime Lizzy gags, ends up dry heaving right alongside her. Prudence soon learns that when it comes to Luke and Lizzy, there is very little the two don't share.

Later that day, Prudence suggests go-

ing on an adventure by kayaking out into the Santa Monica Bay and watching the humpback whales mate. She is quickly overruled, however, by Lizzy and Luke's Sunday Funday tradition: going to their favorite farmer's market in Hollywood every third Sunday of the month. Disappointed, Prudence admits she's been craving excitement. After all, this is the longest she's stayed in one place since she volunteered to reform pickpocket monkeys in Morocco. While Luke is impressed by Prudence's travels, Lizzy is quick to point out she and Luke are no strangers to adventure. They once rented a minivan and drove all the way down to San Diego to clean out her aunt's apartment. Crazy stuff.

At the farmer's market, Lizzy further tries to convince Prudence there's no shortage of interesting things to do, like rocking out to two-man band Grains 'N Roses. Not buying it, Prudence finds a newspaper article called The Thrill-Seeker's Guide to L.A. and tries to convince Luke to come with her to a pub where you can play with snakes. Luke is intrigued, but Lizzy dismisses the idea, saying the line for the olive oil tasting is only getting longer. Torn between what to do — and most importantly, with whom — Luke makes the only sound decision he can... and runs away.

Marcus makes quick work of breaking down Luke's dilemma, saying that before, Luke had only Lizzy's happiness to worry about, but now there's Prudence to consider. And seeing as Prudence is Luke's actual wife, it's about time he starts putting her first. Lizzy, meanwhile, vents about her ruined time at the farmer's market to Leisha, who advises her sister to stop worrying about Luke turning into a different person. But as if on cue, Luke enters the living room then wearing a wingsuit. Lizzy predictably freaks out and tries to talk him out of going wingsuit flying, saying he's about to be a father. Luke counters that he's also a husband and that if he wants to keep Prudence, he can't let her get bored of him. Unfortunately for Luke, it's Lizzy who gets to say "I told you so" when he ends up in the hospital with a slight concussion and a dislocated shoulder. When Prudence arrives, dressed in her own wingsuit, she and Lizzy get territorial over who should be taking care of Luke. As they fight over how much to recline Luke's bed, passing the remote back and forth and causing Luke to flop around in the process, Prudence says Lizzy needs to let go of the reins. Lizzy argues that Prudence didn't do such a great job of looking after him since she's the reason he got injured; Luke only went wingsuit flying to impress her.

After coming home from the hospital, Luke tells Prudence he's still interested in trying new things with her, but Prudence says there are plenty of other things they can do, like sitting quietly around the city. When Luke assures her that just because he got hurt doesn't mean he wants to stop trying new things, Prudence asks why he's afraid she'll get bored with him. Shocked by her response, Luke wonders why Prudence thinks that, but soon realizes where she got the idea. He's not happy with Lizzy for betraying their confidence, but Prudence is even less pleased knowing Luke still confides in Lizzy over her.

When Luke and Lizzy make no progress in finding Prudence, who walked out after her fight with Luke, they settle into the backyard and have it out. Luke promises Lizzy he's still the same person but says that they need to include Prudence, too. Lizzy agrees and admits she feels bad for telling Prudence Luke's injury was her fault. To mark their two-month anniversary, Luke and Prudence return to Las Vegas and the chapel where they were wed, this time with Lizzy in tow. When they arrive, Lizzy can't help but point out that something doesn't look right. Turns out, she's correct. The woman at the desk reveals the chapel was actually a front for the mob and that none of the weddings performed there are legal. With her visa set to expire in a week, Prudence says she and Luke must get married as soon as possible if she's going to stay in the country. Luke suggests going to a chapel across the street, but Lizzy says she can

throw them a proper wedding in a week's time. Luke admits he would like to do some things traditionally, like asking Prudence's dad for his blessing or even properly proposing. Prudence agrees and happily accepts Luke's proposal, complete with a gummy-candy ring courtesy of Lizzy.

Back at home, Lizzy sets a high bar for best men everywhere when she surprises Luke by flying in Prudence's dad so Luke can ask for his daughter's hand in marriage. Luke heads into the living room and begins describing his love for Prudence to Martin Baines from Splitwick, England, but he's interrupted by Prudence's arrival. She gasps upon seeing Martin, and Lizzy explains that she's behind the surprise. But the surprise is actually on Lizzy: Martin isn't Prudence's dad; he's her ex-husband. In that moment, Lizzy and Prudence realize they might not be so different after all, and Lizzy agrees to talk to Luke on Prudence's behalf.

Luke, meanwhile, has been staying with Marcus, where he's punched a hole in the wall and cried while Marcus held him. Marcus hasn't minded being there for his friend, but now he wants something in return: for Luke to be his wingman. Luke is hesitant, but Lizzy arrives then, with Luke's wedding suit in hand. He tells her he can't marry Prudence when he's not sure he can ever trust her again. Lizzy understands but advocates for Prudence, which prompts Luke to question her motives. Lizzy has always wanted Prudence gone, and a part of him even thinks Lizzy flew in Prudence's ex-husband on purpose to sabotage his marriage. Lizzy is horrified by the accusation but doesn't back down. She tells Luke she knows he really loves Prudence — she saw the sex poems — but Luke's mind remains unchanged. Instead, he's going on a date tonight.

Back home, Lizzy rants to Leisha about Luke believing she ruined his marriage on purpose. Like a good sister, Leisha tells Lizzy she can be an evil monster. She reminds Lizzy of when they were kids and Lizzy purposely killed her pet, Rodney Danger-Fish, because she got to attend Paula Abdul dance camp and Lizzy didn't. Lizzy is once again appalled by the accusation but ultimately realizes Leisha is right. It's possible she did subconsciously break up Luke and Prudence. In order to get them back together, Lizzy takes a tip from Leisha, who says whenever she gets really mad at Roy, she just remembers why she fell in love with him in the first place. Her words inspire Lizzy to recreate the moment Luke and Prudence fell in love.

Luckily, Luke is on his double date with Marcus at the same bar where he met Prudence. He's not having any fun with his date, Jackie, a cashier at Target who's not the most mentally stable tool in the shed. But the night takes a turn for the better when he spots Prudence standing behind the bar, just like the day they met. Lizzy sneaked in Prudence and stationed her there, knowing that once Luke laid eyes on her again, he'd want to get back together. But what Lizzy didn't count on was Jackie, Luke's date, interrupting. When Prudence sees Luke has already moved on, she runs out.

When Luke and Lizzy get home, Prudence is packing. Luke explains he was only at the bar to act as Marcus' wingman and that nothing happened between him and Jackie. Prudence says she wants to make it work, but she doesn't know how if Luke doesn't trust her. Luke says he wants to and asks if there's anything else he should know. In one fell swoop, Prudence reveals she grew up an ugly duckling, that one of her ears is fake due to a trolley accident, that she was once arrested for stealing pickles and that she can't pronounce the world tadpole. After she bares her soul, Luke tells Prudence he loves her and she reciprocates. They're back together! And going at it in the living room until Lizzy separates them and sends Luke back to Marcus' apartment to change into his wedding suit. There's less than an hour to go until Prudence's visa expires.

Unfortunately for Luke, it's not just his suit waiting for him at Marcus': Jackie is there and she's not taking no for an answer. Despite Luke's best attempts to leave, Jackie manages to handcuff herself to him and throws Luke's cell phone out the window. Back at the house, Lizzy has transformed the backyard into a romantic wedding venue, and blushing bride Prudence is ready to walk down the aisle. But they're still missing a groom. With only 20 minutes to go before Prudence's visa expires, Luke is still handcuffed to a now passed-out Jackie and has no way of contacting Lizzy and Prudence. So, with no other options available, Lizzy agrees to marry Prudence. While it's not ideal, Lizzy says Luke is her best friend and he'd be heartbroken if Prudence had to leave. She admits she hasn't always liked Prudence but she has grown to love her. And with that surprising declaration, Lizzy and Prudence say "I do."

When Luke finally arrives, he sees Roy snapping wedding photos of Lizzy and Prudence. Jackie is still handcuffed to him (and dragging behind him), but Prudence quickly frees him by unlocking the handcuffs with a bobby pin. Luke is ready to make it official, but Prudence breaks the bad news: it's too late. Then, Leisha hits him with a bombshell: "My sister married your wife." Luke is touched that Lizzy would do that for him. His appreciation soon turns to shock, however, when Prudence says I love you and both he and Lizzy say it back. This one big family has finally become one big happy family.
