Summary: When a former Princeton music professor stumbles into choir practice

at a small-town church, he finds singers that are out of tune in more ways than one. Despite their differences, he and his new cohorts may

just help each other reinvent.



Arthur grieves his wife and feels anger over the denial of her final wishes to be buried at a large church in her hometown. He sits outside a much smaller church where she has been laid to rest. Arthur is lost without her and seeks meaning for his life. When he hears the choir butchering the "Hallelujah Chorus", he runs inside the church to set them on the right course. A tumultuous relationship ensues between the choir and Arthur.

The choir wants Arthur's help. Arthur does not want to help. Arthur agrees to help for the wrong reason. Arthur helps

the choir but offends its members. The choir dismisses Arthur as director. Arthur finds another way to help. The choir invites Arthur to return.

Arthur is not the only one who pokes fun. Ginny, who is desperately trying to hold the choir together and help her young son, manages to squeeze in a basketball joke. Arthur has retired from the music department at Princeton. When Ginny introduces Arthur to the choir, she praises Princeton for being a really good school despite their performance in the NCAA basketball tournament. This is clever joke considering the church is in Kentucky, which is known for its success in college basketball.

Ginny also has a running gag with the famous biscuits at the diner where she works. On Arthur's first visit, the diner runs out of biscuits and Ginny offers him toast instead. After interfering in Ginny's personal life, she withholds the biscuits from Arthur. Finally, when he redeems himself by identifying dyslexia as the source of her son's trouble at school, she gladly offers the biscuits to Arthur.

Initially, Arthur only helps the choir out of spite. One particular church traditionally monopolizes the choir competition and also denies late wife Jean's wishes to be buried in their cemetery. The pastor of the same church also brags to Arthur that he was Jean's first kiss.

Arthur starts out doing the right thing for sort of the wrong reason. Ultimately, while he still wants to defend his wife's honor, he opens his crusty heart to the choir members and truly wants to help hone their talent.

In between the laughs, there are some very sweet moments where we learn that Arthur's late wife was the "fun one" in the relationship. The choir pays attention to details Arthur shares about his wife, her love of butterflies and a cute story about the song "Eye of the Tiger". The choir incorporates both butterflies and "Eye of the Tiger" into the mashup they sing at the competition. The performance earns them the trophy for "Most Improved Choir".

While the choir cannot fill the void of a lost spouse, they do return some fun and personal connection to Arthur's world.

When Arthur yells at pig farmer Jerry Blevins about stopping his truck in the road, it throws a wrench in the choir's plans for singing at the popular festival.

Jerry responds to Arthur's rude behavior by giving the choir a bad time slot for Fork Fest. Arthur tries to smooth things over by sharing a meal with Jerry at the diner. All is well until Jerry spies

Arthur scrubbing his hands with sanitizer after shaking the pig farmer's hand. Jerry then pulls the choir from Fork Fest all together.

Ginny is upset about not performing at Fork Fest, but that is not the only thing troubling her. She is worried about being bombarded with questions about the divorce at the festival. Some poor advice from friends results in Ginny's friends thinking she cheated on Wayne.

Did I mention that Wayne likes to boast about his physique? He tells the crowd, "my arms are so jacked they blew the sleeves off my shirt".

Wayne's declaration in the middle of Fork Fest begins to set the ex-spouses on a more amicable path. Of course, Wayne pushes things a little too far when he tries to move in for a French kiss.

We know that Reverend Jax's parents used movies to share lessons about life. The reverend ends up giving Arthur some good advice by sharing a bizarre story about Conley Fork's namesake.

Arthur is at a metaphorical fork in the road having just lost his wife and trying to make a life in small town he never imagined. We learn that long ago a man named Eustace Conley came to an actual fork in the road in town.

Eustace laid down instead of choosing a path. He ended up being mauled by a bear but amazingly not to the point of death. I'm not quite sure this really explains why the town was named after Conley, but Arthur recalls the story at a pivotal moment.

Arthur decides to embrace Fork Fest by entering the greased pig contest. He is failing miserably when he collapses and lays down like old Eustace Conley. Just as Arthur surrenders, the pig comes to him. Everyone cheers for Arthur's clever victory and his willingness to succumb to the mud.

The town sees that Arthur may not be quite as uptight as they thought. And Arthur learns to be more accepting of his new surroundings.

Jerry reinstates the choir and they finish with another moving and fun performance.

Even though Ginny is plagued with fear of doing a solo, the audience gets to enjoy not one, but two amazing performances from Ginny this week. One is performed alone. The second one starts out as her alter ego Darlianna Woodbeam but ends up being all Ginny. Ginny realizes she must face her anxiety when son Cash suggests he will give up on his dyslexia treatment just like she avoids doing a solo. Arthur knows she can perform solo when he spies her singing "9 to 5" at the diner when she thinks she is alone. Ginny

reveals that she could do that because she pretends she is Dolly Parton. Arthur suggests that she adopt an alter ego to suppress her fears and "Darlianna" is born.

Ginny takes Darlianna on the road to Conley Fork's local open mic night. It's not a smooth trip to the mic, however. Ginny hilariously slips in and out of her people-pleasing Ginny persona and the bold, brash personality of Darlianna when she cannot help but offer to get Arthur a drink

As Ginny's turn at the mic approaches, she offers to let someone else go next. Arthur calls her on the delay tactic and the pair begin exchanging insults. When Arthur accuses her of letting down not only herself but also Cash, Ginny retreats to the ladies room. Arthur follows her telling her she cannot hide because he can see her big hair over the stall. Ginny lashes back calling Arthur "Mr. Fancy Professor". Arthur corrects her with "Dr. Fancy Professor".

Ginny claims Arthur doesn't understand about "feeling like dirt". Arthur shares a poignant reminder that he struggles to get through every day without his late wife. He explains that music is the one thing that keeps him going. Ginny realizes that they need one another and decides to perform a powerful solo rendition of "Here You Come Again" on stage.

The performance is so moving that Wayne understands how Dwayne is so taken with Ginny. The best friends reconcile.

Summary: When Arthur is faced with a choir rebellion, he decides – against

Ginny's advice – to take on Adams, the group's alpha, at their annual deer hunting trip; Wayne takes Cash on his first hunting trip to

teach him how to be a man.



Hunting season has commenced. The choir takes a break from rehearsals for the regional choir competition to go hunting. While most are hunting deer, Dwayne has his eye on truffles. Ginny, on the other hand, is seeking reconciliation between Arthur and Adams who have offended one another.

Adams is offended when Arthur deems the choir's talents "good" instead of "great". Thus begins a standoff of epic proportions between the two strong personalities. While Ginny always wants ev-

eryone to get along, she has another reason to try and keep the peace. Arthur has been volunteering to help Cash with his dyslexia exercises. If Arthur gives up on the choir, he will not be around to help Cash. Ginny cannot afford to pay a tutor.

Meanwhile, recently reconciled friends and roommates Wayne and Dwayne have a skirmish in the woods. Wayne is not happy when first time hunter Cash prefers looking for truffles with Dwayne over aiming a bow at a deer. Wayne has very specific ideas about this being a father and son event. He sees it as a rite of passage for Cash, one that he wants Cash to share exclusively with him.

It's not just arrows flying in this episode. Arthur and Adams, especially, are firing insults as well.

Adams calls Arthur "Angry Santa". She also corrects Arthur when he suggests that noise will scare the deer. She reminds him that scent is more important and suggests that a "whiff of [Arthur's] overpowering male arrorgance" will do more to scare the deer away.

Arthur fires back by insulting Adams' pitch when she sings to focus on her prey. Arthur's comments throw off her concentration and she misses her target. Adams complains that Arthur has now destroyed two things she loves, singing and hunting.

Arthur retorts saying that Adams does not own the woods, but it turns out she does own the woods and the mineral rights below ground.

Wayne is so excited about taking son Cash on his first hunting trip. He also welcomes friend Dwayne along despite his buddy's preference for gathering truffles. In fact, Wayne tells Dwayne

that he would not want to be with anyone else. Then he recalls one exception, Dale Earnhardt, Jr., and proclaims, "I think that dude would be such a cool hang."

Wayne, Cash and Dwayne are enjoying their day until Cash chooses Uncle Dwayne's concept of gathering over aiming at an innocent deer. Wayne's confidence as a father is shaken. He could not be the husband Ginny wanted. Now he fears not being the father that Cash wants.

Wayne's insecurities get the best of him and he challenges Dwayne to a fist fight. Just as Wayne hurls himself at his much larger friend, the ever peaceful Dwayne uses Aikido to dodge Wayne's assault. Finally, Dwayne reminds Wayne that there is more than one way to express one's masculinity. He reminds Wayne that he was the one who accepted Dwayne when Dwayne's own father dismissed him for not hunting and playing football.

The two friends make amends and Wayne even helps gather mushrooms after the failed deer hunt. Of course, the mushrooms are not truffles, nor are they edible. Hey, at least Wayne tried something new.

Arthur gets lost on his way back to the car. When Ginny discovers that Arthur has not reached his vehicle, she tells Adams that they need to look for the gruff choir director. Ginny calls loudly for Arthur. Adams barely makes a peep.

Meanwhile, Cash wanders off while Wayne and Dwayne are bickering. Cash stumbles upon Arthur and they ponder their situations. When Arthur tells Cash that he had been fighting with Adams, Cash says he "can guess who won that one". Arthur thinks he's countering by saying it was actually Adams who won. In a very funny turn of events, Cash confirms that Adams is the one he was thinking of.

Arthur is feeling defeated and considers moving back to New Your. Just then Cash uncovers a woodland creature, a skunk. Arthur shrieks and the rest of the gang comes running. Adams takes aim at Arthur saying, "Look who's the soprano now." Dwayne attempts to comfort Arthur by saying the spray is just "an oily compound they spray from their anal glands" when Arthur gets some in his eye.

Everyone is gearing up for Singles Night/Afternoon (the elderly crowd insists on an earlier start time!). Reverend Jax has chosen Arthur's photo for the event flyer, which angers father-in-law Tinsley in the recent wake of Jean's passing. Ginny is avoiding Dwayne because she feels awkward about his proclamation of affection for her in episode 1. Cash tries to score points with a cute girl but struggles to keep up with the "Electric Slide".

We may have a classic case of "will they or won't they" with Ginny and Dwayne. Dwayne reveals a romantic in-

terest in Ginny in the pilot episode. Wayne struggles to accept the idea of his best friend dating his ex-wife. Over time the two best friends reconcile, but that does not mean Ginny is open to the idea of dating Wayne.

Ginny is not ready to consider a romantic relationship with Dwayne. She tells Arthur it is a timing issue and uses a pickling analogy to express her hesitation. Ginny does not want to sacrifice her friendship with Dwayne for for the possibility of something more.

Ginny finally gets up the courage to tell Dwayne that she is not ready to date. Before Ginny can share her thoughts, Dwayne confirms that he "had" feelings for Ginny but thinks they should focus on their longstanding friendship. Dwayne has been seeking a dance with Ginny to relive their younger dancing days, not to woo her. The friends resurrect some crowd pleasing choreography to "Whoomp There It Is".

Ginny may be relieved that Dwayne also wants to be friends right now. Or, is she is also a little jealous when she sees Dwayne kissing new gal pal Georgia at the end of the dance?

Arthur and father-in-law Tinsley are at each other's throats. They are arguing over ownership of the houseboat. Tinsley fusses at Arthur being on the Singles Night flyer (even though that was Reverend Jax's idea because Arthur fits a "demographic sweet spot" appealing to multiple age groups, ha!) Arthur criticizes Tinsley for not visiting Jean's grave earlier.

The truth is they are both mourning the loss of Jean. They open up about their feelings at Jean's graveside. Tinsley discovers that Arthur has been the one sending him care packages from the church. Tinsley reveals that his absence stems from how difficult it is to face his grief. The two grumpy guys are able to "find some common ground" as Ginny suggested.

Wayne describes the impressive prowess of Arthur's father-in-law to Reverend Jax and Dwayne. Wayne calls Tinsley "as lethal as I'd be if I still had my Bowflex". We can only imagine, Wayne!

Wayne aims to impress by timing a football pass to Cash with the arrival of a bus of incoming singles from a neighboring church. The problem is he keeps mistaking other vehicles for the bus. Poor Cash is running back and forth to recreate the pass. Take it easy, Wayne! Let Cash save that energy for the dance floor. When the bus finally arrives, Wayne misses it completely.

Wayne continues to entertain with his unconventional parenting methods. Cash is struggling to keep up with a cute dance partner during the "Electric Slide". Wayne adjusts the music to slow down the tempo of the song and create a more suitable dance opportunity for Cash's dance moves.

Ginny has a fun Halloween night planned at the diner complete with a costume contest and festive food like "monster mashed potatoes". A large crowd soon gathers requiring a minimum of three to a booth. Arthur manages to get a seat with Dwayne and Georgia who are sporting Samson and Delilah costumes. Only caveat is that he is not allowed to talk. Ha! As if that ever stopped Arthur before.

Georgia and Dwayne share their excitement over the \$1000 prize for the best costume. Ginny realizes she has made a mistake on the flyer. The prize is only \$100. She scrambles to figure out how to

avoid losing \$1000 on her first night managing the diner. Ginny asks Arthur to come up with a great costume so he can win but not actually take the \$1000.

Arthur goes home to get his opera costume complete with tights and a feather in his hat. He barely makes it out the door before getting egged. Now he has to find another costume. Reverend Jax does his best to entertain the kids with church-themed party activities. There is a "flaming sword of unselfishness" (minus the flame) and a reverse game of bobbing for apples. Cash expresses disappointment over missing out on collecting candy and egging houses.

Later, Dwayne and Georgia arrive at the Halle-boo-ya festival. Dwayne offers a lame prank to Wayne, the old fake cam of nuts with a fake snake that pops out. Wayne feigns surprise. Georgia is anxious to leave and refers to Wayne as a baby. Wayne gets upset and the three of them bicker. Reverend Jax intervenes asking them not to argue in front of the children.

Church of Perpetual Praise, Arthur resolves to sound better than ever to spite him. Ginny spirals when Arthur adds a new singer from her

past to the choir.



The Second First choir members see a commercial for the Church of Perpetual Praise (CPP) and are reminded how that choir has dominated the choral competitions for so long. They decide to scope out the rival choir by attending service there. The choir attempts to go unnoticed by all wearing camouflage hats, except Arthur who has a personal disdain for both camouflage and tie-dye patterns.

Magnus of the much larger church spots Arthur in the congregation and suggests that Second First perform at CPP next week. Arthur has unresolved anger towards Magnus who would not allow

Arthur's late wife Jean to be buried there. Arthur's choir begs him not to take the bait, but he still agrees to perform at CPP next Sunday. That's only a week to prepare! Getting personal

Dwayne's family still attends CPP while he has moved to the Second First Church of the Cumberlands. Dwayne's family no longer associates with Dwayne after he became a pacifist and vegetarian. When Dwayne sees his father and two sisters at the large church, they tell him they will not come next week to watch him perform.

Arthur is feeling the pressure of next week's performance. He decides to go for a younger looking haircut from Kimmy Bell, Ginny's longtime nemesis. Kimmy has opened a salon right next to Adams' diner where Ginny is moving up the management chain. Arthur gets a sample of Ginny's singing voice and is blown away with her talent. He invites her to join the Second First choir.

Kimmy is always trying to "one up" Ginny. She even brings biscuits, a specialty that Ginny is known for, to the choir practice. Ginny becomes unhinged when Kimmy joins the choir and takes Ginny's solo. She almost serves Kimmy toilet water before Arthur stops her. Ginny explains the root of her anger towards Kimmy saying Kimmy gave her the nickname "Ginnorreah" when

she returned home from camp one summer. Arthur says Ginny cannot prove it was Kimmy that started the nickname (and subsequent rumors). Ginny is hurt that Arthur is not more sympathetic to her situation.

Meanwhile, Reverend Jax struggles with jealousy over the fancy kiosk at CPP that allows you to order coffee and much more. The reverend assembles a makeshift kiosk at Second First using an old television, PC and speakers on a cafeteria cart. He plans to use it as a prayer hotline. but sadly it does not function. True colors

Arthur goes back to Kimmy's salon for some hair color. He brings up the obvious rivalry between Ginny and Kimmy. Kimmy says it can't be a real rivalry comparing herself to University of Kentucky and Ginny to Eastern Kentucky. She reveals that she gave Ginny the nickname in their youth. Dwayne begins his solo performance of Titanium (by David Guetta) with a rousing backup from his fellow choir members. The congregation is moved to give a standing ovation. Even Dwayne's sisters and father ultimately stand and clap for him.

Reverend Jax gives a final word saying, "Second First Church. We're weird, we can't afford a commercial, but we'd love to have you." Mic drop. (Yes, Reverend Jax literally drops the mic.)
