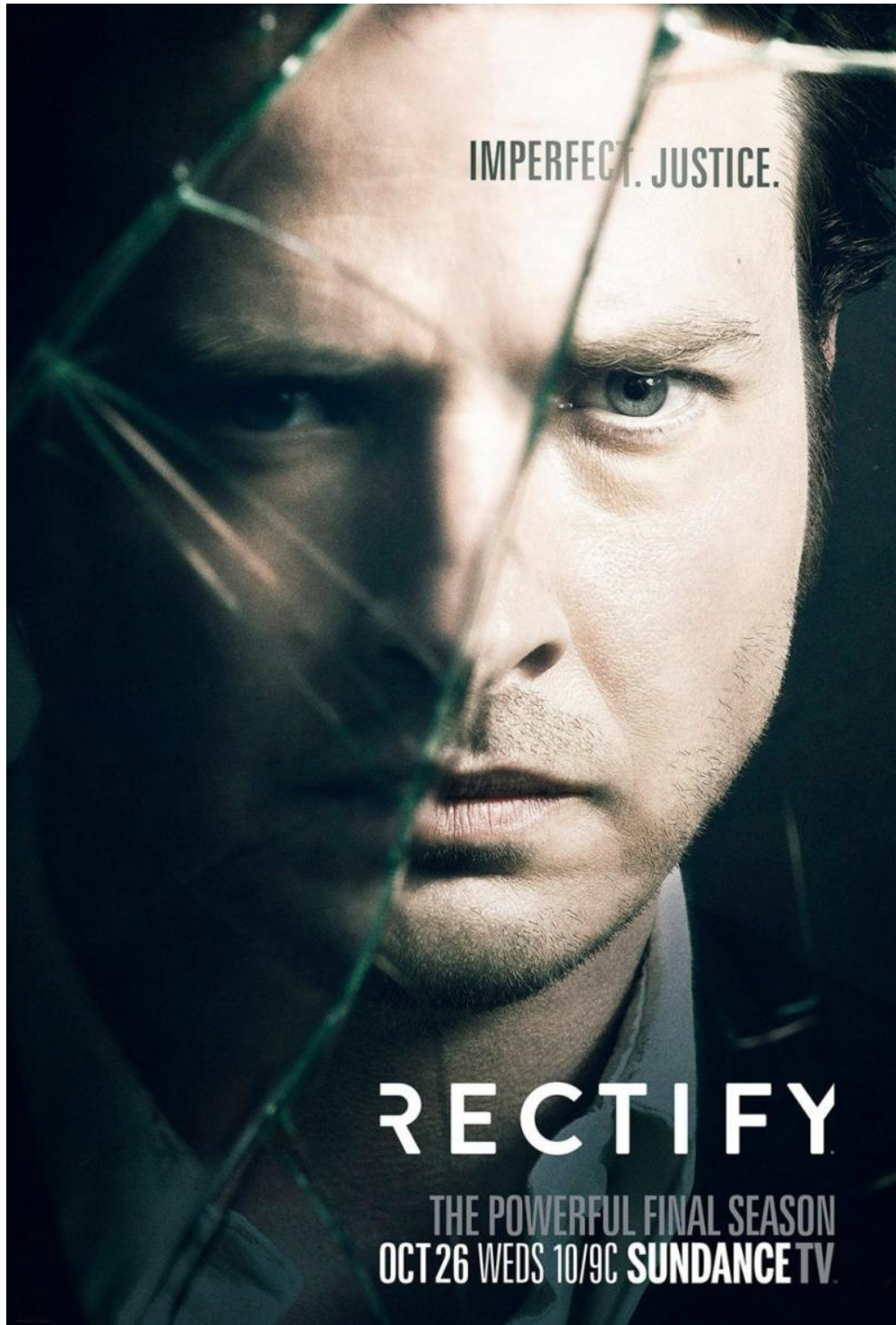

Summary: A convict who spent 19 years on death row is released on a technicality and returns to his Georgia hometown, where a senator wants to reopen his case, and his sister worries about his safety.



Daniel Holden, met by lawyer Jon Stern, mother Janet, sister Amantha, stepfather Ted, stepbrother Ted Jr., and Ted Jr.'s wife Tawney, leaves a Georgia prison after 19 years on death row. New DNA evidence implies that 18-year old Daniel was not solely responsible for the rape and murder of his 16-year-old girlfriend Hanna, as had been alleged during his trial. Senator Roland Foulkes says Daniel hasn't been exonerated and will still be pursued by the law. Later, Roland meets local officials, including Sheriff Carl Daggett, and tells them to track down the primary witnesses. The original prosecutor remi-

niscises how Daniel was found holding Hanna's hand and speaking gibberish. He also recalls that two witnesses, George and Trey, both testified that they saw Daniel placing flowers on top of Hanna's dead body. Sister Amantha drives Daniel around town and younger half-brother Jared tries to bond with Daniel. A flashback introduces a Death Row inmate in the cell next to Daniel's, Kerwin. The two develop a friendship though they can't see one another. Two witnesses, George Melton and Trey Willis, meet in the woods. After Trey leaves, George shoots himself in the head.

is going to live at home; she says she doesn't know. Amantha tells Jon they have to leave the bar and nervously tells him the man is Hanna's brother, Bobby Dean.

Summary: Trey Willis is questioned by the Sheriff about a missing witness, while the media turn Daniel and Janet's day in town into a circus.



A bird flies to its death by striking a window, and Daniel and his mother both observe this event separately with barely a reaction. Daniel gets glasses and goes shopping with his mom and expresses amazement at yarn and flip flops. Daniel's mom gets easily freaked out by a TV crew that approaches their car. Daniel's lawyer Jon talks to the state prosecutor, who says just because Daniel is freed doesn't mean he is exonerated. Sheriff Daggett talks to Trey, the other witness in the original Daniel trial. After hesitating, Trey establishes that he saw Daniel go into the woods with Hanna, but that only George testified that he actually saw Daniel rape Hanna. Trey also reveals that he and other people including an alleged adult had sex with Hanna. At a seminar out of town, a buddy talks to Ted Jr. about getting out of the nickel and dime tire business and doing government contract work because the "whole game is rigged" and he is also frustrated that online ordering services are able to cater to minorities in his store's area. Daniel visits Tawney at her church, where she expresses shock that Daniel did not contemplate the afterlife instead of just preparing for the moment of his death. Daniel takes Tawney off guard by referring to multiple books and philosophers. Tawney pretends she understands Daniel's references and turns the conversation back to her faith in god and asks Daniel if he will get baptized. Daniel ends the conversation by hugging Tawney awkwardly. Later back at home, Tawney gets a call from Ted Jr., who asks her what she's wearing. His wife awkwardly talks to him and then hangs up. On his walk home from Tawney's church, Daniel is looking at books inside a closed store and has a flashback of when prison guards confiscated his books. A female acquaintance that knew Daniel before he was sent to

prison engages him in conversation and offers him a free hair cut and tells her she had planned to offer her body to him if she saw him again, but now feels foolish. Daniel says he would have accepted her offer and she closes the store's blinds.

Summary: Daniel feels he is losing his grip on reality and takes a late night ride of odd circumstances. As he grows closer to Tawney he agrees to a baptism and Ted becomes more jealous.



In a flashback to his prison days, Daniel sees an inmate deliberately crash his bloody head against a window on his cell door while leering at Daniel. Back in his room at his mother's house, Daniel climbs out his window at 3:00 am to embark on an odyssey. He first visits Hanna's home and watches the house, seeing Hanna's mother wandering inside. Daniel proceeds walking until a truck with a trailer picks him up. The person driving the truck asks Daniel to help run an errand, and the two go to a locked

barn and put a passel of goats in the trailer. The driver drives to a house and tells Daniel to wait inside while he goes inside with one of the goats. Daniel falls asleep until daylight, and the driver is watching him. He asks Daniel if he wants to see something strange. After leading Daniel through a forest, the driver shows Daniel a statue of two females embracing, with the body of goats. Daniel and the driver then wrestle each other until the driver wins. The pair return to the truck, where the driver tells Daniel that he is about to go full circle and that beautiful things hurt the most. Daniel sees an Airdancer and tells the driver to stop and let him out of the truck. As the driver pays Daniel for his help, Daniel asks the driver if the driver is real. The driver laughs and drives away, but notices the trailer is no longer attached to the truck. The airdancer is in front of the family tire store. Daniel goes inside and talks to Ted Sr then wanders to his old high school, where his half brother Jared and school officials come to check on him since the school knows who he is. Meanwhile, Ted Jr. gets back home from a tire convention and grabs Tawney. Ted Jr. gets mad when Tawney tells him that Daniel is going to get baptized. He goes to his stepmother's house and tells Amantha and Janet that Daniel is going to get baptized. After his baptism, Daniel tells Tawney about the goat man incident, and then he tells her he is not sure about his belief in God because he doesn't know what is real right now, which distresses her, and then Daniel inappropriately asks her if he can kiss her. Ted Jr. is drunk at the tire store and walks outside

to turn off the airdancer, where he sees Daniel staring at it outside. Daniel asks him to leave it on and Ted Jr. agrees and invites him inside the store for coffee. Ted Jr. confronts Daniel about coming on to his wife, and tells him to stay away from both of them. Following this he questions Daniel's reasons for getting baptized, and asks whether or not Daniel resisted attacks during showers at prison. Daniel replies by saying that it's complicated and that there are things that Ted Jr. doesn't know. While Ted Jr. is making coffee, he begins to insult Daniel under his breath, which Daniel hears. Daniel suddenly appears before him and puts him in a choke hold until he passes out.

Summary: Ted Jr reconnects with Tawney in the wake of his encounter with Daniel. Sen Foulkes pressures the DA for a new trial to put Daniel in jail again. Meanwhile the tension among the townspeople escalates and Amantha moves in to her own apartment. Daniel continues in his struggle to find peace with his freedom and faces the wrath of some locals.



Ted Jr. wakes up from the choke hold on the floor with his pants around his ankles and coffee on his backside. Daniel makes his way back to his mother's house and is in the kitchen with his mom and step father when they hear a loud explosion. Someone blew up the Holdens' mailbox. After gathering outside with the responding police, Daniel's sister Amantha yells at the local sheriff for suggesting that Daniel leave town. Amantha's boyfriend, lawyer Stern, suggests Amantha gets a gun for protection from local townspeople

that may wish Daniel and the Holdens harm. Tawney ignores Daniel's phone calls. Daniel goes to Amantha's house and asks if they can go to the pecan grove where they used to go with their father. When they arrive, it is the same area the goat man took Daniel to, only there is a different statue there. Amantha suggests they leave the small town behind, and Daniel admits to Amantha that he does not know what happened the day Hanna died. Daniel's sister tells him he was high on mushrooms at the time of the incident. A flashback to Daniel's time in prison has Kerwin getting picked up for his death sentence. As they take Kerwin out, he asks to speak to Daniel one last time, and he demands Daniel look at him. Grudgingly, Daniel looks out and Kerwin says he knows Daniel didn't kill Hanna. Daniel asks Kerwin how he knows, and Kerwin says he just does. Prison guards escort Kerwin to his death and afterwards clean up Kerwin's cell. Trey, the surviving witness from Daniel's trial, returns to where he met George a few days prior (in Episode 1). Trey discovers George's dead body. He takes George's wallet, and then pushes George's body

into the creek. Daniel visits Hanna's grave while listening to Hanna's mix tape. Two cars pull up behind him and several men get out. They beat Daniel and the leader removes his mask, revealing his identity as Bobby Dean, Hanna's brother. While Daniel is laboring to breathe, Bobby urinates on Daniel and leaves. While Tawney listens to a voice mail from Daniel that apologizes for his behavior and tells her Daniel plans on leaving town, medics load an injured Daniel into an ambulance.

Summary: Daniel's family fears he won't recover from his injuries and his attackers will escape justice. Judy Dean shows Bobby some unexpected affection. Ted, Jr. hides a shameful secret from his wife. Sheriff Daggett investigates Daniel's beating.



Daniel is visited by the ghost of Kerwin, who tells Daniel to wake up.

At an Atlanta hospital, Amantha and Janet panic as Daniel struggles to emerge from an induced coma. Nurses rush in to put him back into the coma.

While at the scene of Daniel's attack, Lid tells Carl that a witness saw a blue truck leave the cemetery. Carl insists on finding the attackers despite Lid's warning that it will hurt his reelection chances.

In the hospital waiting room, Tawney asks Amantha and Janet about Daniel's condition. She tearfully wonders why God would do this to him.

At the police station, Sen. Foulkes tells Carl that the attack against Daniel might complicate their case against his exoneration. Carl warns Sen. Foulkes that he plans to track down the attackers.

Bobby Dean arrives home to find Judy Dean watching a news report of Daniel's attack. "I love you, baby," she says.

Tawney visits Daniel's hospital room, where Janet asks Tawney to pray for Daniel. Noting Daniel's affinity for Tawney, she reminds her that Teddy loves her more than anything in the world.

During a flashback to death row, Wendell bangs on the wall to wake Daniel, who has fallen into a depression since Kerwin's execution. Wendell disrobes and tells Daniel that he was one of the men who raped Daniel in the shower, and continues to masturbate as Daniel screams.

At the tire shop, Ted Sr. tells Teddy that Janet is upset that he hasn't visited Daniel and orders Teddy to pay a visit.

Carl stops by the shop to speak with Ted Sr. Teddy inquires about a tire bid, but Carl says they lost out because of Daniel's association with the shop.

In Daniel's hospital room, Amantha opens the present that Daniel left in her car before the attack: It's the ceramic mechanic from the tire shop. A nurse announces a visitor.

Amantha finds Melvin in the waiting room. He gives her a chocolate turtle for Daniel and tells her she's too smart to live in Paulie.

Carl and Lid visit Jake Johnson, Bobby's friend and owner of a blue truck. Carl claims a witness saw Jake and Bobby leave the cemetery. Jake says nothing.

Lid photographs Jake's truck and deduces that Jake saw through Carl's bluff about the witness testimony. Carl asks Lid if he interviewed the boys who had been at the crime scene, and Lid says their mothers wouldn't permit it.

Trey enters his shed and opens a locked metal box. Inside is George's wallet, pistol and cell phone.

At home, Teddy examines the area of his neck where Daniel choked him. Tawney catches him inspecting his neck and asks him to hold her. He briefly embraces her then leaves for the hospital.

Flashing back to death row, Daniel refuses to leave his cell. Guards storm the cell and force him into handcuffs.

Teddy reluctantly visits Daniel at the hospital and spots the ceramic mechanic on a table. He grips it tightly while glaring at Daniel. Amantha catches him mid-glare and they share an icy exchange.

Daniel tells Kerwin he got off death row but admits his first week of freedom has been difficult. "Everything out here is just so complicated," Daniel says. "There's so much pain and hate." Kerwin, overjoyed at Daniel's release, encourages Daniel to appreciate his new life.

Summary: With Daniel still in an induced coma, Janet and Amantha await news of his condition; Teddy's business plans take a hit; and Tawney delivers some unsettling news to him.



In a death row flashback, Daniel receives a brochure of DOC mental illness guidelines. He angrily recites "proper prisoner behavior" as he hurls and shreds his books.

In Daniel's hospital room, Janet remarks how friendly the hospital staff is. Amantha reminds her they're not in Paulie, where everyone wants Daniel dead.

At the Talbot residence, Teddy proposes a plan to increase the tire shop's declining revenue by renting out tire

rims. Ted Sr. balks at the upfront investment costs. Teddy then brings up the elephant in the room: What will they do if Daniel becomes a vegetable?

In his room, Jared listens to Daniel's birthday mixtape on headphones. He replays Hanna's message, "I love you, Daniel." Teddy interrupts to announce dinner is ready. Sensing Jared's kinship with Daniel, Teddy divulges that Ted Sr. saved the tire shop after Daniel's reputation drove it into the ground.

At a Life Group meeting, Tawney's friend Kate commends Tawney for loving Daniel "like Jesus would." Kate admits to judging Daniel but acknowledges that she doesn't even know him.

Tawney visits Teddy at the tire shop, where he's working late, and asks him to come home. He angrily explains that he's working on an important business proposal and frets that Daniel's condition is worrying Ted Sr. to death. Tawney leaves him alone.

At the hospital, a doctor tells Amantha and Janet that they're ready to wake Daniel from the coma.

Bobby drunkenly stumbles out of a bar. Jake corners him and yells at him for endangering their anonymity during Daniel's attack by removing his mask. He orders Bobby to get his act together.

Carl asks Debbie Wages if he can interview her son, Stevie, who witnessed Daniel's attack. She refuses.

Jon visits Hollis, a client who's about to be executed after DNA proved him guilty. Jon offers to stay with Hollis for his last meal.

At home, Tawney admits to Teddy that Daniel had wanted to kiss her and that she had feelings for Daniel. "Will you forgive me?" she asks. Teddy kisses her on the cheek but leaves without answering.

While waiting for Daniel, Jon tells Amantha and Janet that all bets are off with D.A. Person if they push back too hard on the plea deal.

Tawney drops Daniel off near Paulie. Daniel asks if she loves him. "I'm married," she replies. As he leaves, she declares that she can't do this again.

At home, Jon informs Daniel about the plea deal and estimates he can negotiate the term from 10 to five years. Amantha points out that Daniel would have to plead guilty. Daniel leaves the room to take a bath.

Daniel lies in the tub. In a death row flashback, Wendell accuses him of being afraid to live.

Daniel rejoins his family in the living room and rejects idea of doing any more time. Jon warns that the D.A. will probably kill the plea deal.

Tawney greets Teddy at home as she prepares dinner.

After dinner, Daniel privately asks Jon for a copy of his taped confession.

Ted Sr. tells Jared that Daniel is discussing a plea deal with Jon. Jared asks why Daniel would admit guilt if he didn't kill Hanna. "It's a way to move on," Ted Sr. explains.

Over dinner, Teddy inquires about Tawney's whereabouts that day. She claims she ran errands. Jared stops by with news about the plea deal. Upon hearing the news, Tawney excuses herself to lie down.

In the backyard, Teddy and Jared sit in front of a fire. Jared wonders if Bobby will hurt Daniel once he learns of the plea deal. "You're nothing like him," Teddy says. Jared clarifies that he's not worried about being like Daniel.

In the kitchen, Ted Sr. counsels Daniel on the plea deal, saying Janet would be very happy to have Daniel "in the free world, forever and always." He steps out to take a call from Sen. Foulkes, who asks to meet right away.

Jon leaves a voicemail for D.A. Person, rejecting the plea deal.

Jared hides in Bobby's yard and sees Bobby drunkenly sob in his mother's arms.

At the tire shop, Sen. Foulkes tells Ted Sr. about Daniel's assault on Teddy. Ted Sr. goes home and stares at Daniel's bedroom door.

Teddy sits alone in front of the fire while Tawney lies awake in bed.

In his room, Daniel arranges a homemade dummy on the floor while listening to his confession on headphones. He strangles the dummy then abruptly pulls back.

At home, Janet unpacks a bag of takeout food for dinner. Ted, Sr. advises against inviting Teddy and Tawney to dine with them and Daniel.

That night, Ted, Sr., Janet and Daniel gather for a lonely dinner in celebration of the plea bargain. Janet tells Daniel that the food is from Willy D's, which she believes to be his favorite BBQ restaurant. When Teddy stops by for an unannounced visit, she awkwardly realizes that it's Teddy's, not Daniel's, favorite BBQ joint. Over dinner, Teddy tells Daniel about the miscarriage.

Tawney dines alone at a diner and calls Miss Kathy to ask if she can visit for a few days. Miss Kathy suggests the following week instead.

In private, Teddy accuses Daniel of telling Tawney about the assault so that he could put his own positive spin on the story. He threatens to press charges if he finds out Daniel is with Tawney.

At the coroner's office, Carl shows George's corpse to D.A. Person and tells her he will not be conferring with Sen. Foulkes during his investigation into George's death. He speculates that

George may have committed suicide. D.A. Person reminds him that they must first find the gun that killed George before jumping to conclusions.

Ted, Sr. finds Daniel sanding the old kitchen cabinets late at night and asks Daniel to refrain from using the sander at such a late hour. He requests that Daniel tell Janet what he did to Teddy and firmly suggests Daniel find another place to stay for the remainder of his time in Georgia.

Divers dredge the river where George's body was found but fail to find the gun that killed George.

Over breakfast, Janet asks Ted, Sr. if he's seen Daniel. Ted, Sr. says no.

Tawney stays at her friend Beth's house. Beth confides that she and her husband saw a marriage counselor after experiencing two miscarriages. Tawney doubts Teddy would see a counselor.

At Thrifty Town, Wynn introduces Amantha to Peanut, who is back from maternity leave. As Peanut resumes her post at Amantha's cashier station, Wynn asks Amantha to stock the shelves.

Carl tells D.A. Person that he found George's wallet and cell phone in the trailer, even though records show the cell phone was used six weeks ago in Paulie. He also reveals that Daniel and Trey were recently at the trailer. D.A. Person orders Carl to dispatch a colleague to the scene and forbids anyone from entering the trailer. She also prohibits him from pursuing any further investigations without consulting her.

Daniel paces around Amantha's living room in search of something to do.

At the tire shop, Ted, Sr. informs Teddy that Daniel moved in with Amantha. "Just thought you might want to know," he says, looking at Teddy with concern.

Jon looks for Daniel at Janet's house and learns that he is now living with Amantha.

Daniel runs into his old friend (and Amantha's landlord) Melvin at the apartment complex. Melvin kindly offers to show Daniel how to do a load of laundry.

Jon urges Janet to help Daniel, who has yet to find a new city and state to live in. He tells her about the New Canaan Project, a non-profit organization that offers career and psychological counseling for ex-offenders.

Teddy stops by Beth and Mitch's house to drop off laundry for Tawney. Mitch intercepts him outside and offers to give the laundry to Tawney when she returns. Teddy grows short with Mitch and stalks off.

Carl tells Mr. Melton about George's death and asks if George might have killed himself. Mr. Melton says it's possible but doubts George would have done it with a gun. He suggests Carl investigate Trey, who was recently looking for George. "Something about it smelled," he says.

Amantha stops by Janet's house to ask why Daniel left. Janet refuses to discuss it.

In an attempt at being productive, Daniel tries to buy groceries at a mini mart but comes up short in cash. The cashier suggests he would get "more bang for his buck" at a grocery store.

With the house to himself, Teddy drinks beer and blasts country music. Jared drops in for a visit, surprising Teddy.

Amantha arrives home to find Daniel listening to classical music and preparing dinner. He insists she relax while he cooks.

While eating the barbecue leftovers meant for Tawney with Jared, Teddy proposes they go for a car ride. He grabs beers from the fridge and tosses his car keys to Jared.

Over dinner, Daniel tells Amantha that he got a job painting the swimming pool for Melvin. Amantha briefly smiles but is quickly overcome by the stress of the day. "This is all very thoughtful, Daniel, but I just can't pretend that I give a shit," she says, leaving the table.

Teddy guzzles beer and instructs Jared to drive to Beth and Mitch's house, where they park and watch Tawney through the dining room window. He tells Jared that he once pressured a girl into having sex with him and urges Jared never to do the same. Jared assures Teddy he would never do such a thing. Teddy recalls telling Jared that he was nothing like Daniel. "You ain't like me, either, and that's a good thing," he says. Jared sits uncomfortably as Teddy insists on watching Tawney just a little while longer.

Daniel vacuums the pool to prep it for painting. Melvin asks if he has picked a place to live and suggests he at least pretend to pick a place. "I'm not used to deciding on anything. Postponing is more my strength," Daniel says, unable to entertain Melvin's inquiry.

Tawney stops by the house to pack some clothes. Teddy surprises her in the bedroom, despite telling her he would be gone. He agrees to see Beth and Mitch's marriage counselor but loses interest when Tawney reveals that she's already begun seeing the therapist on her own.

Marcy visits Sen. Foulkes at the hospital, where he's recovering from the stroke and barely able to speak. She makes an effort to help him, and he holds her hand. But she gently removes it and leaves.

Sheriff Daggett summons Trey to his office to ask him the color of his truck. He "casually" mentions that George's semen was found on Hanna's underwear and gauges Trey's reaction. In response to an earlier question about Daniel's attire in Florida, Trey says that Daniel had

been wearing a jacket.

Amantha meets Jon at a BBQ joint and learns that he's staying in Paulie to help Daniel.

Daniel's probation officer visits him at the apartment complex after she's unable to reach him by phone. She warns him to take his probation seriously, starting by keeping his phone on him at all times and submitting his overdue housing form by 5 p.m.

Tawney listens to a voicemail from Carl, who asks to speak with her about Daniel. She meets Teddy outside Rebecca's office and they enter together.

In therapy, Rebecca asks Teddy to talk about himself, starting with his childhood.

After telling Amantha about George's death, Jon says that George's old testimony against Daniel gives Daniel a strong murder motive but adds that Trey, too, seems to be a suspect in Carl's investigation. Amantha thanks him for helping Daniel.

In therapy, Teddy explains that his addict mother left his family when he was young. When asked if he's close to Janet, he says they were close until Daniel returned. "Her real son came back and things changed considerably," he explains. Teddy accuses Tawney of thinking about Daniel and implores her to tell the truth for once. After Tawney admits to having doubts about their marriage, Teddy expresses relief that he wasn't imagining her ambivalence.

Daniel stops by Thrifty Town to have Amantha sign his housing form. She insists he take her car in order to meet the 5 p.m. deadline.

After therapy, Tawney tells Teddy about Carl's voicemail. She reveals that she picked Daniel up in Florida — near George's home, Teddy quickly realizes. In a panic, she seeks Teddy's advice. He counsels her to simply tell the truth.

Daniel arrives at the social services building minutes before 5 p.m. As an officer escorts him down a hallway, Daniel has death row flashbacks to being escorted down a prison hallway in shackles.

The probation officer takes the form from Daniel and says she'll see him next week.

At the station, Tawney tells Carl that she and Daniel solely discussed "spiritual matters" when she picked him up in Florida. "I feel any sin he has committed is far surpassed by the sins committed against him," she says. She also tells Carl that Daniel was not wearing a jacket, contrary to what Trey had told the sheriff.

Daniel stops by the empty Talbot residence and takes some clothes that Janet recently bought for him. He wakes up from a short rest to find Trey in the house but is unsure whether Trey is real. As Trey leaves, he remarks that Daniel will never get his lost prison years back.

Teddy meets Tawney outside the police station. She reassures him that nothing will ever happen between her and Daniel. He offers to drive her around until she's ready to return to Beth's house.

D.A. Person tells Carl that only seven kids were interviewed on the night of Hanna's murder even though a much larger group had been rounded up. She also says she procured the warrant for George's trailer. Carl reports that George's last credit card purchase was a round-trip bus ticket to Paulie. He surmises that Daniel did not kill George but notes that Trey's behavior is suspicious.

Janet asks Ted, Sr. if he ever questioned Teddy about his own role in Daniel's assault. Ted, Sr. defends Teddy and refuses to apologize for being protective of him.

Amantha arrives home to find Daniel sitting forlorn on his bed. Daniel says he once thought he was in love. "I thought she was my savior," he says, referring to Tawney.

Janet tells Ted, Sr. that she's going to sleep in Amantha's room.

Teddy pulls up to Beth's house and comforts Tawney as she cries. She kisses him then gently pulls away.

That night, Daniel stares despondently at the empty pool. He drags out the paint to finish the job but then intentionally knocks a can of paint all over the pool. Tears fall down his face.

Teddy goes to therapy without Tawney, who has left Beth's house without telling him her whereabouts. He shares his fear that he's not right for Tawney. Rebecca reminds him that Tawney had a very difficult childhood and is still figuring out what's right for her.

Tawney helps out in the kitchen at Miss Kathy's house. While speaking to one of Miss Kathy's foster girls, Tawney discloses that her mother abandoned her as a child.

Daniel scrubs the pool clean. Melvin insists on paying for the new paint and additional labor, even after Daniel admits to creating the mess.

Janet visits Murphy's Diner. As Marcy serves her coffee, Janet explains that her late husband used to love eating at Murphy's.

Sheriff Daggett visits Chris Nelms to question him about George. Chris admits that George called two months ago with concerns about Daniel's release from prison — but claims not to know what specifically worried George. Daggett requests a DNA sample from Chris to compare with DNA from Hanna's underwear. Chris refuses to speak further without a lawyer.

Janet bonds with Marcy and formally introduces herself.

Miss Kathy urges Tawney to get an education so that she can be self-sufficient. She offers Tawney a spare bed and comforts her. "You always did feel things hard," she says.

Sheriff Daggett summons Daniel to the station to ask more questions about his trip to Florida. Daggett explains that George's DNA was found on Hanna's underwear and surmises that Trey, Chris and others raped Hanna that night. He reveals that George tried to confess years ago and

might have been killed by Trey when he threatened to confess again. Knowing that he is no longer a suspect, Daniel starts cooperating with the system in a new way. Daniel lets his guard down and tells Carl that Trey brought a bag to Florida.

At home, Janet checks in with Jared and encourages him to vent. Jared complains that no one tells him what's going on within the family. She promises to tell him everything once Daniel settles into his new place.

As Daggett takes notes, Daniel recalls that Trey waited until he was asleep to bring his duffel bag into George's trailer. Trey then went into George's bedroom, where Daniel found George's wallet the next morning. Daggett asks if Daniel saw Trey with George's cell phone. Daniel remembers it being on the coffee table when he woke up, to which Daggett responds, "Are you sure?" Daniel corrects himself, remembering that the phone was also in George's bedroom, aligning him with Daggett's facts, and the truth.

After the interview, Daniel walks out of the station in a daze.

Teddy calls Tawney and offers to move out of the house while she figures things out on her own time. He swallows his disappointment when she turns down the offer. "You're not alone, Tawney," he says.

Amantha informs Daniel that he must leave the apartment by midnight. Daniel tells her that he's no longer a suspect in George's death. His spirits lifted, he vows to finish the pool before midnight.

As Ted, Sr. and Teddy work on the kitchen renovation, Janet announces that Daniel is coming back to live with them. "I understand," Ted, Sr. says. Janet tells Teddy that her heart breaks whenever she thinks about what Daniel did to him. She goes on to say that she is going to help Daniel, who, while damaged and sick, is not a bad person. Stunned that Janet and Ted, Sr. know about the assault, Teddy nods in silence and avoids his father's gaze after Janet leaves.

As Daniel finishes the pool, Jon informs him that Tennessee approved his transfer. Janet and Jared join Daniel, Amantha and Jon for poolside beers. Janet is thrilled to hear that Daniel is no longer a suspect in George's death.

Carl shows up at Trey's house with a search warrant.

As they stargaze by the pool, Daniel tells Janet he wants to leave Paulie the next morning. He proposes a mother-son road trip. "It's over, mother," he says. They tear up.

Trey watches TV with his family as Carl's officers search his home. The search team enters the backyard shed and opens a metal box that hides keys and a scrunchie.

Janet tells Ted, Sr., that she's taking a road trip with Daniel. She mentions that Teddy will be staying at their house and tables a discussion about their relationship until she returns.

Janet meets Daniel and Amantha at Jon's motel, where Daniel spent the night. Amantha playfully runs off with a box of fritters when Daniel jokes about Janet stealing them.

At the station, Chris explains that Hanna asked them to keep the rape a secret from Daniel—then looked curiously "pouty" when they promised to stay quiet as long as she stayed quiet.

Trey sits in the hallway after being summoned to the station by Sheriff Daggett. He waits, unaware of who or what is holding up Sheriff Daggett.

Chris says Trey came to his house the morning after the rape and instructed him to call the sex consensual should Hanna end up telling other people. Chris was then called to the police station but was sent home, along with other kids, without being questioned. D.A. Person speculates that Trey was unaware of Hanna's death when he visited Chris.

Daniel says goodbye to Amantha and Jon, then gets in the car with Janet.

Tawney returns home after taking Teddy's offer to have the house to herself. Teddy says he'll stay at Ted, Sr.'s house while she's there and mentions that Daniel left town for good. Tawney asks Teddy to change the house locks and is surprised when he agrees without a fight.

On the road to Savannah, Daniel reminisces about a restaurant from his childhood. After refusing to "Google" to find out if it's still open, Daniel suggests a side trip to their side trip.

Sheriff Daggett interrogates Trey. When Trey dodges all his questions, Sheriff Daggett reveals that he listened to the voicemail that Trey left for Chris.

Amantha thanks Jon for all his hard work. Jon says they would have been better off with a less distracted lawyer.

Daniel gazes upon his prison from the middle of a field. Back in the car, he admits to Janet that he sometimes wants to go back to his "cocoon."

Sheriff Daggett tells Trey that Chris admitted to the rape. Trey guesses that Sheriff Daggett made a deal with Chris and insists the sex was consensual. Sheriff Daggett lays out all the evidence: Trey was spotted at a gas station near the Flint River, where George's body was found, on the same day that George arrived in Paulie. George's wallet and phone then appeared in George's trailer after George's death. Trey finally comes clean and tells Sheriff Daggett that George killed himself.

At the beach, Daniel shares a warm exchange with a little boy. Daniel then proclaims he must go to "the source" and heads out into the water, reveling in the sensation of waves crashing against his body.

Daniel enters the prison visitation booth to find Tawney across the glass. Daniel realizes this can't be a memory and Tawney confirms that it's a dream. She tells him that she thinks God no longer exists. He comforts her, telling her God is everywhere. Tawney starts to cry, confessing she is lost and saying she was happy until he told her too much. The glass between them disappears and as they lean in to kiss, Tawney awakes—the owner of this dream.

At Senator Foulkes house, Jon tells the wheelchair-bound senator that Sheriff Daggett is arresting Trey for George's murder—and wonders if Trey silenced George in order to cover up another crime. "The one thing I'm sure of is you are dirty," he says, vowing to expose the senator and exonerate Daniel.

To her surprise, Amantha finds Teddy reading in Daniel's bed. He suggests they eat.

While dining at a restaurant, Janet gives Daniel a checkbook and ATM card.

Over Chinese takeout, Teddy tells Amantha that he and Tawney are separated. She in turn reveals that she and Jon are no longer together. Bonded by their relationship woes, Teddy challenges her to a game of Gin Rummy.

Trey insists to Sheriff Daggett that he found George's body, tossed it in the river, then took George's wallet, phone and gun and planted them in George's trailer to throw them off his trail. Sheriff Daggett agrees to visit the site of George's alleged suicide, saying a bullet could forensically prove that George was killed by his own gun.

Jared arrives home to find Amantha and Teddy involved in an intense game of Gin Rummy. He asks to play, and they say no. A much lighter sibling dynamic has returned to the Holden-Talbot household.

The next morning, Trey brings Sheriff Daggett to the site of George's suicide. Unable to find the bullet that killed George, Sheriff Daggett arrests Trey for George's murder.

Janet and Daniel arrive at the New Canaan house.

As Teddy and Ted, Sr., install the kitchen stove, Ted, Sr. brings up Margaret, Teddy's biological mother. Teddy says he always felt responsible for her leaving and that he was always afraid Tawney would do the same. And then, she did. Ted, Sr., explains that he was partially to blame—revealing that he emotionally cheated on Margaret and then didn't try to repair the marriage. "I just hope you do all you can to save yours," he says.

As he gathers his bags, Daniel asks Janet to forgive herself. "You did the best you could under the most unusual of circumstances," he says. He walks inside his new home.

Daniel takes a bus to his job at a warehouse, where he pulls inventory items for shipment orders.

Daniel's boss suggests Daniel leave work early after he finishes his tasks with time to spare. Daniel deposits his paycheck at an ATM.

Daniel returns to New Canaan and walks by a classroom in which Avery, one of the counselors, teaches ex-offenders the importance of securing a job and

keeping it.

Maggie, a New Canaan counselor, coaches Brittany, an ex-offender, on job interviews. Daniel drops off his pay stub with Maggie, who introduces Daniel and Brittany to each other. Maggie calls Daniel a model New Canaan client.

Daniel listens to a voicemail from Janet, who updates him on the family.

In his room, Daniel looks at a letter addressed to him. Jesse informs him that their group counseling session is about to begin. Daniel puts the unopened letter aside.

Daniel attends the group counseling session with his housemates Pickle, Nate, Tyros and Jesse. Avery checks in with each housemate's progress in the outside world. Pickle talks about the difficulty of being judged at job interviews. Tyros shares his frustration with gauging whether people are messing with him or not. Daniel briefly describes his day but shares little else. Avery thanks him.

Daniel sees Jesse sneak out of their bedroom in the middle of the night.

At work, Daniel's boss explains that one of their biggest customers is returning a large order due to an error. Though Daniel insists it was not his mistake, his boss nevertheless tells Daniel

and a co-worker, Earl, to stay at work until they've refilled the order. Earl grumbles. The lights go out.

Daniel's boss informs the employees that a transformer blew out and will not be fixed for at least another hour. Daniel declines Earl's invitation to grab lunch with other employees.

Daniel goes for a walk and sees a woman carrying a bird sculpture into a warehouse. His curiosity piqued, he follows her inside and learns that she is part of an artist cooperative. As Daniel studies the sculptures, the artist, Chloe, invites him to help out with their upcoming Art Mingle. The power turns back on. Tears stream down Daniel's face as he gazes at the art. He leaves abruptly.

Daniel returns home after working late and finds Pickle, Nate and Tyros waiting for him. Avery informs Daniel that Jesse's urine test came back dirty and that he left the house in the middle of the night. Daniel says he knows nothing about it. Reading the expressions on everyone's faces, Avery says anyone who doesn't want to be in the house is free to leave. "A divided house will fall," he says. He emphasizes that, despite their assumption that Daniel is protecting Jesse, Daniel probably doesn't know anything about Jesse.

Pickle, Nate and Tyros enter Daniel's room and warn Daniel that when he doesn't talk to people, they may start to think he doesn't like them. Nate says Jesse may have fared better at New Canaan if he'd had a roommate who showed interest in him. "Whatever he needed and didn't get in this house, that is on us," Pickle says. Daniel explains that he's uncomfortable around other people and worries that he is not up to the task of supporting them.

Daniel visits Avery the next day and explains that he lived in isolation for 20 years, unlike his housemates, who socialized with other inmates while they were in prison. Daniel tearfully describes how he lost his sense of self while in prison and worries that he's unable to speak truthfully about his past because he doesn't even remember whether he killed Hanna or not. Avery urges Daniel to learn to live with the uncertainty and perhaps, for once, try living as though he may not have killed Hanna.

Daniel returns to the artist cooperative and apologizes for his behavior the previous day. He informs Chloe that he just got out of prison. She responds to his disclosure with a kindhearted joke.

Daniel arrives home to find Pickle, Tyros and Nate playing cards. Daniel quietly watches from the sidelines but Pickle insists he join them. Daniel takes a seat and shares that he used to play rummy with his sister. They resume the card game all together.

Janet leaves a voicemail checking in with Daniel — the voicemail he listened to in the previous episode.

Jared patches holes in a tent that he pitched in the woods.

Amantha, who has been promoted to manager at Thrifty Town, introduces an official schedule to employees. Alesha, an employee, asks for Thursday off so that she can study for exams. Amantha says Peanut needs the day off for a doctor's appointment but nevertheless grants Alesha's request.

Jon begs Bernie, his boss, to let him strengthen the case for Daniel's innocence. Bernie points out that Daniel is free, thanks to the plea deal, and says they don't have resources to spend on a client who's not even in jail.

Tawney meets Teddy at a restaurant for a date. She shares her excitement about taking college classes but feels guilty for living in their house while Teddy lives with Ted, Sr. Teddy reminds her that the topic of their living arrangement is off-limits on date number nine and says she won't be able to figure out what she wants for herself if she's feeling guilty.

Amantha watches the sun set while smoking pot inside a satellite dish. Jared watches the sun set from his campsite.

Tawney works at a nursing home. A colleague informs her that it's her turn to care for Zeke, one of the more difficult residents. Tawney checks in on Zeke, who gruffly asks her to retrieve a work plaque from his house so that he can have it when he dies. As Tawney leaves, Zeke grumbles that she's just like the rest of them.

Amantha drives home at night. She loses control of the car and veers off the road. Amantha calls Ted, Sr. to ask for a lift after walking half a mile for cell phone service. He offers to pick her up at her car.

As Amantha walks back to her car, a man slows down in his truck and offers to help. Amantha coolly declines. The driver, Billy Harris, recognizes Amantha from high school. Billy examines Amantha's car and refuses to abandon her until Ted, Sr. arrives. Amantha apologizes for giving him attitude.

Teddy arrives home and finds Janet baking a cake to send to Daniel. Janet asks how his date went. Teddy admits that the therapy is working for him.

After picking up Amantha, Ted, Sr. suggests she stay the night to lift Janet's spirits. He explains that Daniel hasn't returned many of her calls.

Jared reads in his tent. Thunder crashes and rain starts to pour. Jared looks at his patchwork with concern.

Janet visits Amantha's room at 3 a.m., worried about Jared. She mentions that Trey is out of jail and seethes that he gets to see his family. Amantha assures Janet that he'll be okay. "Who?" Janet asks. "Jared," says Amantha.

The next morning, Ted, Sr. asks Teddy about his date. Teddy bristles at Ted, Sr. for inquiring about his personal life. Ted, Sr. informs Amantha that the car repairs will be prohibitively expensive. Janet walks in with Jared after picking him up from the campsite.

The family sits down for a pancake breakfast. Janet suggests Amantha temporarily move in with them to save money for a car down payment. Amantha worries the house would be too crowded but thanks Janet for the offer. Teddy drives Amantha to work.

Janet declares to Ted, Sr. that she's going to Nashville to see Daniel. "I have to see him, make sure he's real," she says.

Teddy inspects Amantha's apartment as she gets ready for work. He proposes that they swap homes: He stays in her apartment while she lives with Ted, Sr. and Janet. She agrees to consider the idea if he covers her rent. He agrees.

Janet calls Daniel during his work break and tells him that she's going to visit him for a day. After hanging up, Daniel studies the brochure for the clinical psychologist.

At home, Jared takes photos of Furbies in the attic and looks up Furby prices online. He quickly stows them away when he hears a car pull into the driveway.

She asks Ted, Sr. to refrain from telling Teddy until she has time to process the information. She promises that she will not sell the store unless everyone agrees to it.

At group therapy, Daniel tells Avery and his housemates that he's attending a fundraiser for the artist cooperative. Manny brazenly offers to tag along so that he can meet women but is met with awkward silence. Nate suggests that Daniel may want to attend by himself. Manny acts out. Avery reprimands Manny's outburst and points out that Manny hasn't even been out of jail for two weeks.

In Amantha's apartment, where he now lives, Teddy researches Kurry Morris and Associates online and learns that it's a commercial investment real estate firm. dozen other kids were at the sheriff's office the next morning. Jon notes that only seven of the kids were officially interviewed, not including Chris.

Mrs. Pickens walks up to Jon and tells him that C.J. is not going to speak with him. She goes back inside.

Teddy and Bobby drink beers at the kitchen table. Bobby explains that George Melton used to come by his house after Hanna's death and grew close to him and Mrs. Dean. When George decided to stop coming by, Bobby asked him why. "Trey went back," George told him. Bobby asks Teddy to apologize to Daniel for beating him up at Hanna's grave.

Jon stops by Sheriff Carl Daggett's home after Carl invites him over. Carl tells Jon that he's stepping out and encourages him to browse some reading material on the kitchen table. He explains that he quit Justice Row and is considering filing an IAC (Ineffective Assistance of Counsel) to dismiss Daniel's guilty plea, on the grounds that he was sleeping with his client's sister.

Daniel takes Janet to a tourist site and urges her to let him go. "I can't abandon you," she says. He implores her to be "free of bondage."

Ted, Sr. reads a Nashville tourism book at a location where Patsy Cline nearly died. He spontaneously asks his taxi driver to drive him 90 miles to the site where Cline died in a plane crash.

Evermore (Sheriff Carl Daggett), Autumn Gruber (Dotty Nelms), Joshua Mikel (Peyton), Markice Moore (Tyrus), Rachel Mae Moore (Restaurant Patron), Laura Palka (Newscaster), Lucie Carroll (Tourist), Billy James (Trucker Restaurant Patron)
Summary: Daniel begins to appreciate his progress as he realizes what his new life may look like. The old life is quickly disappearing for Teddy, who knows change is unavoidable. Jon debriefs Janet and Amantha on what he has learned about Daniel's case.



Flash back to the day of Daniel's release from prison: Janet laments the time that Daniel has lost. Amantha accuses Janet of being incapable of happiness and implores her to appreciate Daniel's homecoming.

In the present, Janet apologizes to Amantha for abandoning her over the years. Amantha reasons that Janet was simply depressed. Janet urges Amantha to live the life she wants and calls Amantha her "hero."

Daniel calls Chloe from work. He leaves a voicemail letting her know that he's stopping by later.

Julian pulls Daniel aside and offers him a raise to \$8.00 an hour.

Sheriff Daggett stops by the tire shop and informs Teddy that the D.A. is willing to knock his gun charges down to misdemeanors, as long as he attends an anger management class, firearms safety course and AA meetings. Teddy asks Sheriff Daggett if he still believes Daniel killed Hanna. Sheriff Daggett admits that he now believes Daniel is innocent.

Jon visits Janet and Amantha and updates them on the new developments regarding Chris and Roger Nelms. He says that D.A. Person has submitted a request with the Georgia Bureau of Investigation to open a new inquiry into Hanna's murder. He says he will drive to Nashville to update Daniel.

Daniel arrives at Chloe's apartment and finds it empty. Peyton, an artist at the co-op, tells Daniel that Chloe doesn't like goodbyes then gives Daniel a painting and a book that Chloe left for him. Daniel sits and meditates on the painting.

Amantha walks Jon to his car. "Nothing will rectify what's happened," she concludes. "It won't bring back Hanna or my dad or my 18-year-old brother." They hug.

Daniel calls Amantha from Chloe's apartment and thanks her for sending him letters. Amantha explains that Jon is coming to see him.

Daniel rides the bus home with his painting.

In group therapy, Daniel expresses his sadness over Chloe's departure. Avery points out that she and Daniel both made the right decision. "Sometimes you just wonder is that what we're doing here. Keeping our expectations so low that we'll never be disappointed," Daniel responds. Pickle tells Daniel that his feelings of disappointment are ultimately positive because it means he's at least capable of hope.

Daniel looks at Chloe's painting in his room then starts to read the book that she gave him.

In the kitchen, Janet asks Ted, Sr. if he's ready for his last day at the tire shop. They kiss. Jared walks in. "Let's do it," says Jared. He leaves with Janet.

In therapy, Daniel explains that listening to his rape account still traumatizes him. The therapist assures Daniel that it's not unusual for therapy to take a year. Daniel decides to revisit Kerwin's execution and describes the silence on death row as the guards came to take Kerwin. "Because I know you," he says, quoting Kerwin's last words to him. "He wanted me to believe in myself."

Jared and Bobby Dean chat in the Dean backyard. Inside, Janet and Judy Dean sit in Hanna's room. Judy tells Janet that she no longer believes Daniel killed Hanna and doubts that finding the real killer will make a difference to her. "I understand," says Janet.

At the New Canaan house, Jon tells Daniel about D.A. Person's request to open a new investigation. Daniel admits it would be nice to visit home and thanks Jon for his sacrifices over the years. Daniel explains that he used to feel guilty when people tried to help him but that he now wants to fight for his life.

In a prison flashback, Kerwin tries to lift Daniel's spirits by pretending they're driving a car around New York City. Daniel indulges the fantasy and laughs.

At the tire shop, Teddy introduces Ted, Sr. to Melvin, who purchases their last tires. Tawney stops by with monkey bread. Janet, Jared, Amantha and Billy arrive as Ted, Sr. shuts the doors.

At the Paulie County Courthouse, D.A. Person holds a press conference to announce that the Georgia Bureau of Investigation is opening a new investigation into Hanna's murder after new details raised doubts about the validity of the original investigation.

Janet, Amantha, Teddy, Ted, Sr., Billy and Melvin watch the press conference at the shop. D.A. Person declares that her office will try to set aside Daniel's conviction if it becomes clear that he is innocent. Amantha tears up. Janet and Ted, Sr. hug.

Sheriff Daggett visits Trey to tell him they're dropping George's murder charge against him. Figuring that he is now a suspect in Hanna's murder, Trey tells Sheriff Daggett that he visited Chris Nelms the morning after the murder and that Chris told him, "Bitch should have kept her mouth shut and none of this would have happened." He explains that Hanna had been high on mushrooms and having sex with multiple partners until Chris got on top of her, at which point she put up a fight. He says Hanna bit Chris' hand and that Chris hid his injured hand at the police station the following day. Sheriff Daggett tells Trey the investigation is out of his hands and leaves.

At a diner, Daniel, Pickle, Tyrus and Nate celebrate Pickle's new job.

Janet, Amantha, Tawney, Teddy, Ted, Sr. and Billy laugh while eating takeout at home. Janet takes a phone call from Daniel. Teddy gets on the phone with Daniel and says that Daniel can have his father's ceramic mechanic. Daniel insists Teddy have it. Teddy agrees to leave it at the Talbot house for the time being. Teddy hands the phone to Tawney. She and Daniel briefly catch up and say goodbye.

Daniel lies in bed and stares at the ceiling.

Daniel walks in a meadow with Chloe and her baby. He cradles the baby and smiles.
