Summary: Nick Fury learns of a clandestine invasion of Earth by Skrulls.



In an alleyway, Everett Ross tells someone on the phone not to move. He tosses the phone away. Then he pulls a gun from an ankle holster and cocks it before tucking it into his jacket. In voiceover, Agent Prescod says to imagine a world where information isn't trustworthy. "Society starts to fray." We can only trust those close to us. But what if those we trust aren't who we thought they were?

Prescod posits that five global terrorist strikes were actually all false flag operations by Skrulls to sow worldwide dis-

cord. He recaps the role Skrulls played in Captain Marvel, set 30 years earlier. Carol Danvers and Fury promised the Skrulls a new planet. But Prescod says now the Skrulls want Earth.

Ross says there's only a handful of Skrulls on Earth, so they couldn't undertake an operation of that scale. Prescod insists there could be tens of thousands and Ross wouldn't know. Ross confirms some of Prescod's facts but remains skeptical. He says Skrull contact comes through Fury, so they're allies. Fury's on S.A.B.E.R., and Ross needs evidence to bring him to Earth.

Prescod offers Ross a tablet and says it's the attack that will set the world on fire. He paces as Ross reads it. Prescod says he doesn't know who to trust anymore. Ross says he'll give the information to Fury. But after a tense moment, Prescod jumps him.

Ross shoots Prescod in the chest. He leaves the building and heads down an alley. He calls Agent Maria Hill and requests an extract. Hill directs him to a location six blocks east. But an armed figure begins pursuing Ross through the streets.

Ross is struck by a car but keeps running. The pursuit leads to the rooftops. Ross attempts to jump across an alleyway but doesn't make it. Injured, he crawls across the ground. Hill arrives just as Ross's pursuer does.

But the pursuer reveals himself to be Talos. "Ross" dies and is revealed to be a Skrull. Hill says, "He was one of you." Talos replies, "No, he's one of them."

A dark forest is interrupted by a descending beam of light. A figure emerges from the light. This is revealed to be Fury. He watches his shuttle ascend. Then he tests the ground with his boots. He's illuminated by headlights. It's Hill. They embrace.

The pair arrives at an apartment. Fury meets Talos upstairs. He's standing beside a plant from the Skrull homeworld. His wife Soren brought it everywhere with her. The plant has adapted along the journey. Fury says he's sorry about Soren to Talos. Talos says Soren worried it would take something like this to bring him back, and she was right.

Talos tells Fury the Skrulls have been helping him to ensure he'd help them. But since the Blip he's been different. He's disappeared. Furthermore, Talos and Soren's daughter G'iah also disappeared. Talos explains she's young and angry about not having a home. Further, Talos was kicked off the Skrull Council and exiled. Meanwhile, Gravik took Fury's disappearance personally.

Gravik is the newest member of the Council. Hill explains he preys on the rage of young disenfranchised Skrulls. Because Skrulls are immune to radioactivity and the country has many abandoned nuclear plants, many of them are hidden in Russia. The catch is that the plant locations aren't on a map. Hill found Prescott's evidence on "Ross": schematics for a dirty bomb. The bomb will be used for a false flag operation, ostensibly carried out by an American anti-Russia group. Prescott's theory is that the Skrulls are attempting to start a war. It's an existential threat to humanity. Fury says he's going for a walk. Talos states he'll stand out walking in Russia at night.

At the White House, James Rhodes informs U.S. President Ritson that Fury has left S.A.B.E.R. The President says that's unacceptable. They pass portraits of Richard M. Nixon and Ronald Reagan. Rhodes says they intercepted a message from Hill to Fury. While it hasn't been decoded, they know the pair are friends. Since Rhodes can't reach them, they're AWOL. The President tells Rhodes to deal with it.

In Moscow, Fury receives increasingly paranoid stares from other pedestrians. They speak untranslated Russian. Then, Fury is shoved into a van by several thugs. In the next scene, his hood is removed to reveal Sonya Falsworth and a room filled with ticking clocks. She dismisses the thugs. While she offers him a drink, she only gives him the cheap stuff in retaliation for "destroying her flat."

Sonya asks what Fury is doing in Moscow. He replies he's trying to stop the Skrull invasion. She points out he knows the rebel leader and Fury corrects that he knew him. Sonya asks if he came down from S.A.B.E.R. because he feels responsible. Fury asks her about a heist at a black market weapons storage facility in Kazakhstan a few days prior. She says she hasn't heard about it, and he says she's lying.

But she counters that the Snap changed him. Undermined his confidence. Fury points out that he has 30 years of experience with Skrulls. Sonya asks if he's trying to partner with her. She says the fact that her mediocre bagmen caught him proves he's not up for it. She offers to have the thugs drop him off and he says he can walk. He's left a spy camera in her office.

A figure approaches a gate. He's hailed by two guards. A vehicle pulls up. G'iah gets out of the car and tells him to take his "natural form." He's revealed to be a Skrull and granted access. She welcomes him to the secret Skrull settlement.

In the car, she asks him if he's hungry and offers him some Skrull food. She says they grow Skrull food, drink Skrull wine, and wear Skrull skins. She says whatever dangers he weathered to get there, they were worthwhile. They arrive at the settlement, which is close to an abandoned nuclear power plant. It is filled with over 500 Skrulls of all ages, with only some with human appearances.

Not everyone is a warrior, but those who do get to leave while the others remain on the compound. The warriors keep human forms to decrease the likelihood they're spotted. G'iah

enters a door, behind which she says is "victory."

Inside, the room is filled with lab equipment. A Skrull swears allegiance before taking the appearance of a human soldier. Then the soldier is locked into a device that allows the Skrull to "take his mind."

The camera in Sonya's office broadcasts to Fury in his apartment. He makes popcorn as he agrees with Sonya that he wouldn't have come back to Earth without good cause. Sonya postulates that a certain individual will provide the bomb. Fury says they should visit the broker, incapacitating the MI6 operatives if necessary. Fury says they're not just in a war with Gravik but also with Sonya. She favors a scorched Earth policy.

In a canteen, Gravik puts sugar cubes into his tea. A soldier informs him that Fury is back on Earth. Gravik says they "go tomorrow" and won't stop until Earth is theirs. The soldier gives G'iah money and instructs her to deliver it to the bomb maker.

G'iah arrives in Moscow. The streets are decorated with statues of Russian nesting dolls. G'iah dodges MI6. Meanwhile, Talos incapacitates an agent. G'iah reaches the broker. 136-year-old Talos uses his strength to rip a lock off a gate.

The broker tells Talos and Fury the entrance is on the main street. Talos says they aren't customers. Fury says they want answers. On the street, Hill spots G'iah. She initiates a foot pursuit. Meanwhile, Fury calls the broker in a lie. He says not to lie again.

The broker pretends not to know what the phrase "dirty bomb." But instead of Fury shooting him, Talos begins fighting him. The broker demonstrates considerable strength. Fury aims at the broker but Talos says it's his fight and calls Fury off. Talos asks where the bombs are and the broker accuses him of betraying his own people. The broker gets the upper hand but Fury shoots him. The dead broker returns to Skrull form. Talos tells Fury, "I said no," and Fury leaves.

Elsewhere, Hill pursues G'iah. Hill follows her through a door at the end of an alley. Inside she is confronted by G'iah and they begin to fight. G'iah incapacitates Hill but Talos arrives and takes up the pursuit. He corners G'iah and Talos identifies her as his daughter. He tells her to give him the bombs. Talos says this isn't what her mother would have wanted. G'iah says her mom doesn't know what she wants. Talos reveals Soren is dead.

G'iah asks how. Talos tells her to ask the people she works with. He says he'll protect her if she turns over the bomb. But she says he can't protect anyone. She escapes to the streets and collapses in an alleyway to cry.

Fury arrives at a bar and is told to wait. He's seemingly recognized. Fury orders a round for himself and the man. Then he heads to Hill's table and tells her the Cold War didn't go hot because of spies like him buying shots. Hill says it's good to have Fury back. She asks why he abandoned Earth. He says he was building out S.A.B.E.R.

Hill says they traditionally tell the truth during their chess games. Fury concedes he had a crisis of faith. Hill asks why he came back, and Fury says it followed him up there. He says he owed it to Talos. Hill asks if he's sure he isn't talking about someone else.

Hill asks if he's going to move and Fury says he hasn't decided. But Hill says he's worried because he used to always be three steps ahead. Fury says she called him. Hill says only at the request of Talos. His radio silence sent a message. Hill says he isn't ready for the threat that's out there. She says he was never the same after the Blip. She says his uncertain footing is going to get someone hurt.

Later, Fury lies in Bed and remembers dying because of the Snap. Elsewhere, Gravik looks out a window. G'iah enters a room and hands the bombs to the soldier. G'iah says someone was waiting for her. She suggests postponing the strike. The soldier tells her that thanks to her, they have the bait. G'iah looks distraught.

A blonde woman hails a cab. When the cab arrives at its location, the passenger is revealed to be G'iah. She has agreed to a secret meeting with Talos. G'iah is angry about Soren's death. But Talos underscores that Soren died while G'iah was working for her killer. Talos says she has one chance to save herself. G'iah says the attack is planned for tomorrow, Unity Day. She says Gravik knows they'll be there. Talos tells her Soren would be proud of her for meeting him. G'iah says there will be three couriers, but she'll mark each bag with infrared spray. Talos shares the intel with Fury and Hill.

The next day, Hill, Talos, and Fury track the couriers' bags with infrared scanning assisting. However, they miss the pass. They begin to chase. The crowds render the task difficult. Fury

follows a familiar girl with a rainbow ball. But it turns out to be the man from the bar — or rather, a Skrull.

Fury continues to pursue. The Skrull in question is Gravik. Meanwhile, Hill discovers the backpacks are decoys. Gravik clicks the device and sets off explosions. Panic envelopes the crowd. Fury aims his gun at Gravik but his quarry escapes into the crowd.

Then "Fury" approaches Hill. He hails her and then shoots her as she approaches. The real Fury aims at Skrull Fury, but the imposter escapes. Fury holds Hill as she dies. Someone pulls him off the body. A lingering shot of the corpse suggests she wasn't a Skrull.

Summary: Fury grapples with past and present.



Talos (in human guise) addresses the group. He acknowledges how difficult the situation has been for the Skrulls. He says those who braved the journey to Earth did so for Fury. Fury steps up and tells the assembled Skrulls that if they will pledge to take care of his home, he and Carol Danvers will work to find them a new home.

The Skrulls present begin taking human form, with Soren going first. "You keep your word, I'll keep mine," Fury says. A shot of young Gravik cuts to

present-day Gravik. He's in the midst of the chaos in the wake of the Unity Day attack. Gravik and G'iah get into a vehicle together. A man pulls Fury off of the corpse of Maria Hill and puts him in a van. The man is actually Talos.

A train chugs through the Russian countryside. A pair of soldiers knock on the door of a cabin occupied by a woman. They hold up a picture of Fury and ask if she's seen him. The woman expresses her incredulity at the idea of a Black American on the train. She uses her appearance to smooth the situation over and they leave. Inside, she is revealed to be Talos. Fury emerges from the bathroom at his signal and asks if Talos has heard from G'iah yet.

Fury tells Talos a story about taking childhood train rides with his mother from Alabama to Detroit. He says they had to ride in the colored car. The conditions were bad. Further, they

weren't allowed to use the dining car. Fury says he and his mother would play a game called "Tell me something I don't know." His mother used the game to uncover information he didn't want to share.

Fury asks Talos if he wants to play a few rounds. So Fury says "Tell me something I don't know about the destruction of the Skrulls." Talos says the million Skrulls left after the Kree invasion fled. Fury asks about the Skrulls that fled. Talos says that they're here. One million Skrulls are on Earth. Every Skrull that isn't in Emperor Dro'ge's colony answered the call of Talos.

Talos says it was his only choice. He accuses Fury of abandoning the Skrulls to which he had made commitments. Talos says he didn't think Fury would come back. And when he did come to Earth, he just wanted to leave again. Fury says that Talos knew how to get in touch with him, but didn't, because he wanted Fury to remain on the station.

Talos says he hopes that with Fury's help, humans and Skrulls can coexist. Fury says that humans can't coexist with each other. "There is not enough room or tolerance on this planet for another species." The train has reached a station. Fury throws Talos out of the compartment.

In London, Hill's coffin arrives. It is met by Hill's mother, Elizabeth. As Hill's coffin is loaded into a United States plane, Elizabeth crosses the tarmac and confronts Fury. She asks how it happened. Fury says it happened quickly. Elizabeth tells him not to give her platitudes.

Fury tells Elizabeth that Hill died in Moscow. He says someone set a trap. They wanted to hurt Fury, so they hurt Hill. Elizabeth accuses Fury of being the reason Hill's going home in a box. She says that Hill would have followed Fury to the gates of Hell and back. She says not to let Hill's death be for nothing.

A montage of international news report clips discusses the Unity Day attack. An anchor reports on impending retaliation from Russia. U.S. President Ritson calls "bull" on America being involved in the attack. He says the attack has "false flag" written all over it.

In Moscow, G'iah and Garvick are driving. G'iah asks how he knew Fury would be there, and Garvick says he'd only hoped. He says Fury is a shadow of himself, and he could have killed him. But this would have only given him what he wanted. Garvick says he wants to get to the Council meeting. Once they've arrived at the door, G'iah is forced to wait outside. Gravik leaves her with a gun. And instructions to shoot the guard in the head if he isn't out in an hour.

Inside, Gravik greets the Council. Members include the U.S. President, NATO Secretary General, the Italian Prime Minister, and several others. Gravik accepts an invitation to sit. He mocks them for acting human. Gravik says he prefers dogs to humans. He has compelling supporting arguments.

A councilmember says Gravik doesn't seem to care that he's caused so much destruction and by extension endangered the Council. Gravik says Fury has betrayed his word and therefore Gravik owes him nothing. He says he will take the Earth himself. He declares war and says he isn't going to lose this one. Gravik says there are no innocent humans anyway. He further states he has considered the possibility that the Avengers return.

The Prime Minister supports Gravik. She nominates him to the post of Skrull General. The NATO Secretary General blusters but quiets after a throat punch from the PM's guard. All on the Council but Shirley Sagar submit to Gravik. She says they did not end up homeless refugees because they were unwilling to wage war, but because they were too willing.

Gravik sends Shirley away in peace and says she won't be harmed. She passes G'iah and leaves. Outside, she contacts Talos and informs him of the developments. Talos says to set up a public meeting between him and Gravik.

Gravik leaves. G'iah follows him. They return to the compound at the abandoned nuclear plant. Gravik is greeted as a hero. G'iah continues to follow him. He enters the secret lab seen in the first episode. Inside, a scientist argues over a failure to execute a "harvest." There's some talk about limited DNA samples. The soldier questions Gravik's leadership. The scientist dismisses him. G'iah watches as an experiment begins.

Colonel James Rhodes attends an international emergency security summit in London. Rhodes says he's aware of allegations that Fury and Hill were in Moscow. He notes that would be in their capacity as private citizens, if so. Rhodes is questioned on the photos of Fury and Hill they have. He says they can't trust the authenticity of Russian-supplied images but would be willing to have U.S. experts examine them. The summit is skeptical of his responses.

Rhodes says he's at the summit as a courtesy. He says the President is busy running the U.S. And while the U.S. is sensitive to their concerns, he says, they have no evidence. So sensitivity is

all they get. In the lobby, Fury calls his cell and proves he has eyes on him. Fury wants to meet. Rhodes says they can get a drink after he's done cleaning up Fury's mess.

Fury arrives at the bar and is frisked by the security detail. He sits down at the table with Rhodes. Rhodes says he's tempted to turn him over to the Russians. Fury says he was there trying to stop the attack. Rhodes says Fury's involvement both set the stage for WWII and flipped their allies to "Team Russia." Fury asks how well Rhodes knows his security detail. He suggests they could be Skrulls.

Rhodes has known about the Skrulls for fifteen years. The Pentagon was concerned they might invade from inside. Fury says the invasion is happening. Rhodes suggests calling "our friends" and Fury says that would result in them getting duplicated and turned into terrorists. Fury says it is his war. Rhodes says he's not doing it.

Rhodes says they protect the planet by protecting their seat at the table. Fury asks if Rhodes forgot who helped get him that seat. Rhodes asks if Fury's suggesting Rhodes owes him. Fury says they owe each other. "Men who look like us don't get promoted because of who our daddies know," Fury says. "Every ounce of power we wrestle from the vice grip of the mediocre Alexander Pierces who run this world was earned in blood. So let's make the power mean something. Help a brother out."

But Rhodes tells Fury to get in the car outside and go to the airport. Fury asks if he has travel plans. Rhodes says he made them for him. He continues to imply that Fury is deluded to think he can take on the problem himself. "You should know better than most," Rhodes says. "The reason we wrestled this power from mediocre men who don't look like us was not simply to turn around and hand it to mediocre men who do." The point of power is to be uncompromising and unsparing and to be able to unreservedly fire someone he admires.

Fury throws back his drink. He is incredulous that they sent Rhodes to fire him. Rhodes says he volunteered. He says he earned the consequences because of his actions in Moscow. The guard begins to take Fury away. But Fury disarms the guard. Rhodes says, "And you wonder why you're out." Fury replies, "I'm Nick Fury. Even when I'm out, I'm in." Outside, he collapses on a bench in anguish.

Sylvia arrives at a butcher shop. The locked door poses no problem for her. She heads to the cooler in back, where Brogan is being tortured. The man doing the torturing asks who Sylvia is. She hands over a phone. The person on the line convinces the torturer to command his men to leave and turn the prisoner over. Sylvia cuts off one of the prisoner's fingers and it reverts to Skrull form.

Elsewhere, G'iah accesses a computer. It seems to be a DNA data bank. There are records of DNA for Doctor Dalton, Groot, Frost Beast, Cull Obsidian, and Extremis, all gathered on Earth. Gravik asks what G'iah's doing. She changes to a different subject and says she's checking on the status of their newest recruit. Gravik calls G'iah's father a coward. Then he says their man on the inside has located Brogan. He says they should go.

Meanwhile, Sylvia tells the prisoner that everyone starts to talk when their blood boils at 160 degrees centigrade. She injects him with the substance. He soon begins to feel (and visibly display) the effects. Elsewhere, Gravik gets in a vehicle and departs. Sylvia demands to know the location of Gravik's compound. The prisoner says Gravik keeps everything a secret.

She asks what secrets he doesn't keep. The prisoner says Gravik's building a machine. He thinks it's to make them stronger. She asks who is helping him by leading the science. He says it's a married couple. She demands a name. He finally gives the name "Dalton." Outside the previous torturer's crew begins to get shot. Gravik has arrived with backup. Sylvia says it sounds like the prisoner's lift has arrived.

G'iah leaves the new recruit in the car. Gravik takes out the opposition. Sylvia escapes through the hatch. Gravik's guard extracts Brogan. Brogan says he told her nothing but lies. But he's lying. Gravik says to take him to the car.

The Skrull crew is gathered in the car. Authorities have located their safe house. Gravik wonders how they found it. Brogan whimpers in the backseat. In the forest, Gravik orders G'iah to pull over. The soldier opens the door and tells Brogan they're almost home. Pete takes Brogan a small distance from the road and executes him. Then he returns to the car. Gravik observes G'iah's reaction.

Elsewhere, Fury arrives at his own safe house. He gets in a vehicle stored there and begins to drive. He arrives at a suburban house. Inside, a Skrull is cooking. Fury uses his keys to unlock

the door and enter the house. The books on the shelf are organized by color.

Fury enters the kitchen. The Skrull has adopted the guise of (or is) Priscilla Fury. She asks if Fury is forgetting something. He retrieves a wedding ring and puts it on. She says it's almost better. The pair embrace and begin to kiss.

Summary: Fury uncovers a rebel Skrull plot.



The episode opens with three Skrulls preparing for a mission at their base. Beto expresses some doubt, but his associate assures him they're fighting for the future. They each receive a dossier with a picture of a soldier on it. Meanwhile, Gravik takes in his machine. He's joined by the other members of the Skrull council. Gravik explains he sent three officers to infiltrate the Royal Navy to and execute a strike on a U.N. target. This will inevitably summon Earth's heroes. Gravik states that to counter them, the Skrull

must become super themselves.

Gravik says they no longer just change faces but also change powers. He describes them as "Super Skrulls" and says they'll be weapons of mass destruction. With the humans at war with themselves, the Skrulls will take over. Gravik invites them to join in the extinction of the human race.

Nick Fury arrives at a diner in the rain. He orders a Black coffee. A woman in a booth is revealed to be Varra, AKA Priscilla "Cilla" Fury. He asks whose face she has adopted. She says that depends on where this goes. Fury says they can't be involved romantically because of their profession. She counters that they don't officially exist.

In the present day, Chris Stearns is on TV. The right-wing news program warns viewers to stock up on guns and bottled water because it looks like WWII. Cilla turns it off and asks how Fury can watch it. Fury says a broken clock is right twice a day. Cilla asks what transpired to bring him to Earth. Fury claims he retired but may take up revenge. He asks if she's been in touch with Gravik. He says he needs to know who she became in his absence. She says that she became a widow and became herself.

Her phone rings, and she answers it. Cilla says she doesn't have that information at hand. Fury asks if it was important, and she says no. As soon as she leaves the room, Fury looks at Cilla's phone.

At the Skrull base, Gravik wakes G'iah. He wants to talk about Brogan and how the cops knew about the location. Brogan didn't know. G'iah suggests Brogan made a desperate educated guess. She says in his position, she would have lied. She's a good liar. Gravik seemingly accepts this and then tells her he'll see her early tomorrow. He says she's coming with him.

Gravik and G'iah get off a plane. Then they begin traveling by car. Gravik says her father Talos called for a parlay. He says Talos wants to talk about her. They arrive at the location, and Gravik gets out. G'iah inputs a coded message into a cell phone. Soon, Gravik and Talos are meeting among the portraits. Gravik discusses 1930's Statesmen of World War I by Sir James Guthrie. He says it highlights the difference between statesmen, whose stories are told in ink, and soldiers, whose stories are told in blood. Gravik says he chooses blood all day long.

Talos says it isn't just Gravik's blood, and Gravik agrees. Soon they're seated at a table in a crowded restaurant. Talos says he wants him to stand down and stop murdering innocents. The conversation turns to G'iah. Gravik says Talos should be grateful he hasn't sent her back in a body bag. Talos lunges at him. As he does so, every other patron transforms into Gravik.

Talos says Gravik will take their people to the edge of extinction. Gravik says to look at how humans treat each other. Talos says humans are at their most formidable when threatened by a common foe. Gravik asks if he's forgotten how Skrulls work. Talos says he'll reveal Gravik's intent to humanity's leaders. Gravik says this will make Talos the author of Skrull extinction. Talos says the humans will recognize not all Skrulls are "infected."

Gravik says G'iah stays with him, then. Talos stabs Gravik's hand with the knife and chokes him. He says G'iah's name should stay out of his mouth going forward. After Talos leaves, Gravik heals his hand with a healing factor.

When Talos gets outside, he bumps into a stranger. A phone falls to the ground. The stranger hands it back to him. Gravik returns to the car. Soon Talos is eating in a pub. He's approached by Fury. Talos says Fury has a lot of audacity to ask for his help after their interaction the preceding day. Fury says he has a line on a rebel Skrull who is high up in the government and currently in London. Talos asks what Fury wants from him. He makes Fury say, "Help me, Talos. Because I am useless without you."

Soon the pair are traveling in a car. Talos explains that G'iah handed off info to him using a burner phone. Fury identifies "Neptune" as a British submarine. He contacts Sonya Falsworth and tells her the Skrulls plan to use it to attack the U.N. delegation and start WWII. Falsworth wants an apology for the bug he placed on her owl statue, now named after Fury (and with an eyepatch). She says she's trying to figure out who leaked information about the butcher shop interrogation in the previous episode. However, Fury does get the Neptune captain's name, photo, and location.

Robert Fairbanks lives near Naval Command HQ. In the car, Talos questions the relationship between dogs and humans. Fury says he's been cleaning up after Talos for decades. Talos sees it differently. He says Fury didn't begin ascending the ranks until Talos and nine of his people became his spy network. Talos takes credit for Fury's information and successes at S.H.I.E.L.D.

Fury and Talos infiltrate the base but are very quickly made. They dispatch several soldiers. Talos passes a room where a child is occupied with a video game. Fury gets a call from Talos over the radio, calling him to the end of the hall. But because Talos calls him Nick, Fury knows it's a trap. He arrives in the room with the kid held hostage. Talos is being held hostage by Fairbanks.

Fairbanks says he'll release Talos when Fury releases the child. But Fury says it isn't a negotiation. The hostages are released. Fury asks Fairbanks what he's working on. A map shows a U.N. plane crossing the Atlantic. Under the ocean, Neptune is moving into range. The crew is incredulous at the order to attack U.N. Flight 819.

Fury and Talos try to talk Fairbanks out of the attack. Fairbanks says Talos is a shell of his former self. Fury asks why Talos doesn't call in a missile strike. Talos says only Fairbanks knows the code. Fury shoots Fairbanks in the thigh. On the Neptune, they prepare to launch. Fairbanks asks if G'iah is the "spineless traitor." Talos kills Fairbanks with a bullet to the chest.

Talos calls G'iah and says he needs the launch termination password for Fairbanks. G'iah subsequently knocks out two guards as she breaks into the area where the Skrulls keep their

prisoners. G'iah reaches the real Fairbanks. A screen shows the subject's memories. G'iah gives the code to Talos. He instructs her to run. The launch is aborted.

G'iah seemingly escapes on a motorcycle. Fury asks Talos why he isn't with Gravik when he agrees with him. Talos says he isn't with Gravik because he's with Fury. G'iah's escape is interrupted by a vehicle driven by Gravik. G'iah claims she has to extract the soldiers from the failed mission. Gravik says it wasn't a failure, as the objective was identifying the traitor. He pulls a gun on G'iah. G'iah asks if he's a leader of Skrulls or their worst enemy. Gravik shoots her, and she apparently dies, returning to Skrull form.

Back at her house, Cilla pulls keys from a jar. She seems to be watched and followed as she takes a train. Soon a banker opens a lock box for her before giving her some time alone. Inside the box is an envelope containing a gun. Her phone rings, and a voice instructs, "St. James Church, one hour." She says she needs to speak to Gravik, but the voice says she's talking to him.

Summary: Fury must make some hard sacrifices.



G'iah lies in the woods after being shot by Gravik. In flashbacks, she uses the machine to steal the thoughts of Doctor Rosa Dalton. Then G'iah sets the Super Skrull machine to "Extremis." In the woods, G'iah is healed by the Extremis. She gets up from the ground and resumes her human form.

Paris, 2012 — At a bar Fury reunites with Varra, aka Priscilla "Cilla" Fury. She references a newspaper cover about the Battle of New York from *The Avengers (2012)*. Cilla suspects Fury was involved,

which he implicitly confirms. The pair share a tender moment over the poem "Late Fragment" by Raymond Carver.

Present day — Cilla is seated in the back of St. James Church. She is approached by "James Rhodes". Cilla says Fury was fired, possibly by President Ritson. Rhodes claims credit. Then he orders Cilla to kill Fury. Meanwhile, Fury uses electronic surveillance to eavesdrop on the conversation. Rhodes says either Fury or Cilla will be "catching a bullet today." Cilla claims the "old Fury" is gone and argues for sparing his life. Rhodes threatens her before leaving.

Elsewhere, Gravik and his soldiers load a plane with supplies. One of them questions G'iah's absence. Gravik states that she was the mole and has been taken care of. He underscores the importance of making the impending operation resemble a Russian attack.

Talos sits beside G'iah on a park bench. G'iah asks Talos about his strategy for finding the Skulls a home. Talos advocates for continuing to serve as an ally to Fury. He believes the "model behavior" will eventually pay off. G'iah asks if he doesn't want to live in his own skin. Talos doubles down. G'iah calls him delusional. She says that's now who they are, and it's now who she's become. Then, she leaves.

Cilla arrives at her house to find Fury's wedding ring still in the vase under a wall decorated with theatrical masks. Fury is in the kitchen preparing tea. The pair share a tense conversation. They each place their pistols on the table between them. Cilla reveals where she gained the visage she adopted. Doctor Priscilla Davis had a secret congenital heart defect and was about to die.

Varra explained the situation to Davis. In exchange, Varra made three promises to the dying originator: to bury Davis at sea, to continue to be a daughter to her parents and never to hurt

Fury. Fury and Cilla exchange the lines from "Late Fragment" and then fire their weapons at one another.

However, they both aim wide, sparing each other's lives. Fury says they'll be coming for her. She says she's a big girl and can take care of herself. Cilla asks if Fury would have loved him if she'd been her true self. Before leaving, Fury says he guesses they'll never know.

The Rhodes Skrull, Raava, takes a shower, resuming the form of Rhodes afterward. When "Rhodes" leaves the shower, Fury waits at the table for him. Fury offers Rhodes a drink of expensive liquor, Pappy Van Winkle's 23-Year-Old Family Reserve Bourbon. Fury makes a big deal out of it. Then, he brings up the Skrull infiltration of the U.S. Government again. Rhodes is dismissive. Fury asks for his job back.

In response, Rhodes reveals he has a video of Gravik (in Fury form) murdering Maria Hill. Fury says that's really Gravik. Rhodes mocks the idea of Fury using "the alien defense" at trial. He takes the liquor from Fury and tells him to get out before he has him thrown out the window.

Fury and Talos sit in a car outside the hotel where Rhodes is staying. It is revealed that the liquor was actually a liquid location tracker. Navigating around the protesters, Fury and Talos follow Rhodes. Soon, Rhodes welcomes Ritson to the United Kingdom. Rhodes begins coaching Ritson. However, Ritson smells the liquor on his breath and calls him out for it. The Presidential motorcade departs with Rhodes a few cars behind Ritson.

As the motorcade travels through the countryside, Rhodes reports the location of Ritson to Gravik. Soon a pair of helicopters attack the convoy. Ritson is trapped in an overturned car. The helicopters are joined by vans full of Skrull soldiers who open fire on the convoy. The motorcade shoots down one helicopter, but the resulting crash is destructive. Fury and Talos arrive in their vehicle. Fury states they must rescue Ritson. He and Talos remove weapons from the car. Fury uses one to take out the second helicopter. The wreckage stops just short of the car containing Ritson.

One of Gravik's soldiers spots Fury. Gravik uses Groot Super Skrull abilities to take out a Secret Service Agent. U.K. reinforcements arrive. They help Fury and Talos reach Ritson. Talos begins using his strength to punch through the bulletproof glass of Ritson's vehicle. Talos is shot by opposing forces. He begins to lose human form and return to Skrull form. One of the reinforcement soldiers nearly shoots him. Fury is able to stop him in time. Talos eventually shatters the glass.

Talos fully returns to Skrull form. Fury frees Ritson from the vehicle. Before carrying Ritson to his car, Fury tells Talos to hang in there. The reinforcement soldier begins carrying Talos. After Ritson has been deposited in Fury's car, Fury realizes what's going on. When the soldier refuses to put Talos down, Fury fires at him. The soldier is revealed to be Gravik. Gravik stabs Talos, who collapses. Fury shoots Gravik several more times, but he can heal himself with Extremis abilities. Gravik escapes by motorcycle. Fury departs with Ritson. Talos remains, lying on the battlefield.

Summary: Fury gathers his allies. Gravik deals with unrest.



Fury follows the gurney of U.S. President Ritson as it heads into the operating room. He tells the President it was not the Russians. Fury further emphasizes not trusting "James Rhodes" before he is locked out for lack of clearance. On the television screen in the lobby, the presence of Talos is used to link the attack to the Skrulls. Fury pulls up a chair and guards the hospital door with a gun.

Elsewhere, a vehicle carrying Gravik and several of his Skrull soldiers arrive at the abandoned nuclear plant where the

Skrulls have built their secret society. He orders his officers to be assembled. Pagon claims the death of Talos as a victory. Gravik states the President was the target. Pagon questions why Fury continues to live. According to Gravik, Fury knows the location of the Avengers' DNA samples. But the locations they've checked so far have been inaccurate. Pagon asks whether Fury ever trusted Gravik and, by extension, questions whether Gravik is worth trusting. Gravik uses Super Skrull powers to kill Pagon. Gravik blames Varra, AKA Priscilla "Cilla" Fury, for Fury's presence at the attack. He dispatches a team to kill her. Beto looks concerned.

Gravik contacts "Rhodey". Raava is on the way to the hospital to kill Ritson. But Gravik orders Ritson to be kept alive. He further states that Raava should ensure Ritson knows it wasn't Russians but Skrulls responsible for the attack. Raava arrives at the hospital and orders it to be locked down. Fury soon has her at gunpoint. But she reveals that the footage of Fury killing Maria Hill has already been leaked to the media. Raava promises this is just a preview of what will come if Fury comes within 100 feet of Ritson again.

In London, Sonya Falsworth enters the office of Director Weatherby. He asks her if she really thinks Skrulls could be everywhere. She puts a gun to his head. She asks the location of Doctor

Rosa Dalton. Weatherby gives her lip, so she shoots him in the thigh. When security enters with their weapons drawn, she states she's showing his "true colors." His hand returns to Skrull form. Falsworth threatens him by pointing out that the S.I.S. has no official policy on killing Skrulls. She advises him to start talking.

At the Skrull base, Gravik's soldiers question his decision to kill Pagon. Gravik takes a call from Raava, who reports Ritson is out of surgery. Raava says he'll send confirmation of the strike once he's awake. After the call is terminated, Gravik is attacked by his soldiers. They attempt to kill him. However, Gravik's Super Skrull abilities allow him to prevail. Gravik kills one of the soldiers in front of a crowd of civilian Skrulls.

Fury arrives at a locked location but finds it compromised. Inside is G'iah. It's the location where episode two, "Promises," opened. Fury explains the location survived the WWII Nazi attack on London and became a refuge for immigrants from the West Indies. He says, "The path of struggle is steep. I feel a lot of strength when I'm over here." Fury brings up Talos. G'iah says she ran away from Talos because she knew he would lose. Fury says Talos chose a life of struggle and did not lose. However, Fury knows that G'iah survived being shot by Gravik. G'iah states that Gravik has a few DNA samples, but not what he wanted: "the harvest."

G'iah says she has to bury Talos. Fury says to bring the body to Cilla. Police lights outside signal it's time for Fury to leave. He asks if G'iah will be alright. She replies that she'll put on a good face. Fury states he's going to Finland. He asks if G'iah will be okay, and she says she'll "put on a good face."

Elsewhere, the "Daltons" find Falsworth looking through their microscope. She immediately identifies them as Skrulls. She goes on to offer them "cake or death": either friendship or force. They refuse to yield until her concealed soldiers have them at gunpoint. Falsworth presents the plans for the Super Skrull machine. Soon the lab is being torched. The masculine Dalton breaks out of cuffs and puts a gun on his feminine counterpart's head. Falsworth summarily dispatches him.

In a van, G'iah mourns over the body of Talos. She approaches Cilla's house. After getting no answer to her knock, she breaks the locked doorknob and enters. Inside, she draws a gun and calls for "Professor Davis" but gets no response. She turns a corner and finds Cilla in the kitchen, also with a gun. Cilla asks if Gravik has sent G'iah to kill her. G'iah surrenders and says Fury said Cilla could help bury Talos.

Raava approaches a recovering Ritson. According to Raava, they can confirm the attack was of Skrull origin thanks to corroborating evidence from Falsworth. Raava shows Ritson the Skrull base at the Russian nuclear plant and states that they must neutralize the facility. Ritson says an attack on Russian soil is tantamount to WWII. Raava claims a preference for war over extinction, which is what a Skrull invasion will mean.

Gravik contacts Fury by phone. According to Gravik, he'll call off the U.S. attack on Russia if Fury brings him "the harvest." He further advises Fury to bring iodine pills. After terminating the call, Fury gets on a plane. On board, Rick Mason gives him new credentials and reveals that the Helicarrier has been mothballed.

In the forest, Cilla and G'iah prepare a funeral pyre for Talos. G'iah says he deserves a military procession. Cilla states Talos wasn't much for pageantry. She asks if G'iah has the offering. G'iah places a ring on the sheet-wrapped body. She states that it belonged to her mother. Since G'iah doesn't know the prayer, Cilla recites it. G'iah tells her father to travel well to the beyond.

Back at Cilla's house, G'iah laments telling her father he was a failure. Cilla shares her last statement to Fury pre-Snap with G'iah. The pair seem to be bonding until G'iah offends Cilla by asking whether or not Fury ever felt comfortable when Cilla was in Skrull form. However, their conversation is interrupted by incoming bullets. The pair fall back and pull on backpacks filled with weapons. Together, they overcome the attacking soldiers.

At customs in Finland, Fury's image and information are posted at each station. An old white man passes through customs without trouble. Outside, the man is revealed to be Fury utilizing the Widow's Veil disguise. He gets in a car driven by Falsworth. When hip-hop begins playing after she starts the car, Fury asks if they're really doing this. Falsworth confirms that they are. In another car, Cilla tells G'iah to be careful.

294 km from the Russian border, Fury asks Falsworth why "Rhodey" is in charge of the operation. Falsworth says as active head of the S.I.S., she had the authority to do so. Fury reveals Rhodey is a Skrull. Falsworth asks who isn't these days. She wonders why Gravik would blow up

his own people. Fury states that its leverage, with the attack to be called off if he surrenders "the harvest." He further explains that nearly every Avenger spilled blood during the battle of Earth in *Avengers: Endgame*, even Carol Danvers. Skrull agents were secretly sent in to collect DNA samples. Gravik led this team. Fury believes this is where he got the idea for Super Skrulls to begin with. Falsworth states Fury is responsible for "all this," and Fury says that's why he came back.

Fury and Falsworth abandon the car and continue to a gravestone marked "Col. Nicholas J. Fury." Falsworth asks why Fury hasn't called any of his "special friends." Fury says it's personal and thinks they can't keep depending on superheroes to swoop in and save the day. Falsworth says she thought Fury had another grave. Fury confirms he has several. He blows on the gravestone, which illuminates before rising and revealing a vial: the harvest.

Fury proceeds inside a nearby mausoleum. He pulls his leather jacket, eyepatch, and gun from a device concealed inside. Then he calls someone (presumably Gravik) and says, "It's time. Let's finish this."

Summary: All hope for humanity rests on Fury's shoulders.



Varra AKA Priscilla Fury is at her home. The bodies of the Skrull soldiers killed by her and G'iah in the previous episode litter the floors. She answers a call on her cell from Fury. She says it's the first time he's called in years. He admits he's dialed many times but hasn't been able to bring himself to hit "send." Varra asks his location and Fury says he's too far to turn back. Varra tells him he doesn't have to go if he doesn't want. Fury terminates the call.

A car pulls up to the Skrull compound, located at an abandoned nuclear plant in Russia. The two guards fire upon the rolling vehicle. After shooting it, the soldiers find the car is empty. Fury shoots both of them.

In London, "James Rhodes" and an Admiral meet with United States President Ritson. Ritson is sitting in his hospital bed. "Rhodes" argues that Ritson should retaliate against Russia. But the Admiral states that they need confirmation that it was indeed the Russians behind the crash. "Rhodes" continues to insist that the Skrulls are working with the Russians.

An assistant enters and brings "Rhodes" real-time surveillance footage that shows Russian tanks taking position on the borders of Finland and Ukraine. "Rhodes" tells Ritson he's prepared remarks for Ritson. He indicates satellite footage of the nuclear plant and provides it to Ritson as proof of the Skrull invasion.

At the power plant, Fury finds many dead Skrulls. He coughs. He consults a beeping Geiger counter, which beeps wildly. Then he works his way deeper into the nuclear plant. Meanwhile, "Rhodes" gets a call from Sonya Falsworth. She tells "Rhodey" to get the President out of there, as Fury is on his way. Falsworth states Fury has lost it, and tells "Rhodey" to move the president. At the nuclear plant, Fury works his way deeper into the property, finally arriving at the Super Skrull machine.

Fury concedes that he failed. He says after a few years of searching he knew there was no other planet for the Skrulls. Fury says his part of the bargain was to build them a home. But

he says it's easier to save the lives of eight billion people than it is to change their hearts and minds. "Even for Nick Fury." He further admits that he felt relief as he died during the Blip. Fury continues that Gravik was the youngest Skrull on his team, and he feels that he should have taught him never to give up. He continues that since he failed them he will give Gravik his desire: the Harvest. He just wants Gravik to leave Earth.

Gravik suggests the radiation is eating Fury's brain. Fury gives him the Avengers' DNA samples. Then Fury collapses, coughing. At the hospital, Ritson takes a gun from a Secret Service agent. Elsewhere, U.S. military forces hand off a "classified document." At the nuclear plant, Gravik takes the Harvest and tests it, revealing DNA from many of the parties involved in the climactic battle from *Avengers: Endgame*.

At the hospital, Falsworth holds a gun to "Rhodey's" head and states that he really is a Skrull. She takes his gun. Meanwhile, Gravik boots up the Super Skrull machine (with Fury still in it) and steps in. Soon Gravik has all the powers of all those Avengers (and other superpowered characters). He begins to beat on Fury, but Fury stops his fist. Then Fury's arm becomes the Hulk's and he punches Gravik through the wall and into a smoke stack. Fury is revealed to be G'iah.

At the hospital, the real Fury appears. Fury states that "Rhodey" is the Skrull. At the nuclear plant, the two Skulls "shift arms." We see Groot arm, Korg arm, and even Drax arm. G'iah uses Ghost powers to avoid a car Gravik throws at her. Gravik has Abomination ears. At the hospital, Fury tells Ritson that "Rhodey" is a Skrull. Fury reveals Skrulls have kidnapped many world officials (and other key players) and are keeping them in pods beneath the Skrull compound. At the nuclear plant, Gravik and G'iah continue to clash. Elsewhere, a U.S. missile prepares to launch. Fury tells Ritson he must not let the Skrulls win. At the nuclear plant, Gravik and G'iah use "Captain Marvel powers" to take their battle into the clouds. G'iah uses Mantis powers to put Gravik to sleep. He falls.

G'iah and Gravik continue to battle. Fury tells Ritson if he's wrong about delaying the nuclear strike, Fury can be sent to prison and Russia can be flattened. At the nuclear plant, Gravik says G'iah is just like her father, and just like "them." G'iah blasts Gravik through the heart and he dies. At the hospital, "Rhodey" takes Falsworth's gun. But Fury shoots "Rhodey." The corpse returns to Skrull form. Ritson asks for a phone and Falsworth hands it to him.

At the nuclear plant, G'iah releases the many humans being kept imprisoned by the Skrulls. They include the broke from episode 1, Doctor Rosa Dalton, the real Colonel James Rhodes, and Everett Ross. Ross asks Rhodes how long he's been held. G'iah helps the human survivors leave the building.

In London, Ritson prepares and delivers an address that is internationally broadcast. Ritson speaks about the presence of the Skrulls. He says all off-world-born species are now classified as enemy combatants. He states, "We know who you are. We know how to find you. And we will kill every last one of you." Elsewhere, Fury arrives at Varra's house and puts on his wedding ring. Fury apologizes to Varra for not being there. Varra says she can handle herself. She says she knows who she is when Fury isn't there, but Varra says she knows who she is when he's not there. Fury asks for one more chance and says he's leaving that night. Varra says this is goodbye. Fury returns the ring to the vase and says Varra knows where to find him if she needs him.

Meanwhile, Falsworth approaches G'iah in an alleyway. Falsworth says she hasn't come for a fight. She says the Skrulls need a leader. Falsworth says that she'll give the Skrulls the resources they need to weather the coming pressure from Ritson. G'iah asks if she's doing it from the kindness of her heart, and says her father made a similar deal. Falsworth says, "Let's not repeat the mistakes of Talos and Fury and keep love and friendship out of this. I will use you, and you will use me, and together we will make our planet safe for both our people." Falsworth and G'iah depart together.

Elsewhere, Fury arrives at a dark and empty field. He calls Ritson. Fury says he was relieved Ritson made it out alive "until I saw you make that hateful-ass speech you made." Meanwhile, Falsworth shows G'iah even more humans who are unconscious and under Skrull captivity. Falsworth says, "This is how the enemy got so good." Meanwhile, Fury tells Ritson he took a bad situation and made it worse, classifying this as "real one-term President stuff."

As Fury speaks to Ritson footage shows humans shooting "Chris Sterns" on the set of his show. Another shooting takes place, and a human woman in a leadership position is murdered.

Fury states Ritson has alienated the Skrulls who would support them and led to the death of more innocent humans to boot. Another scene shows Shirley Sagar fighting soldiers. Fury tells Ritson to call off the war. Ritson says that there's only one way this ends and the "old Fury" would have known that. He tells Fury to get the Skrulls off his planet.

Fury crosses a dark field towards a beam of light. Varra arrives. She approaches Fury. When Fury calls her "Pricilla," Varra says she wants to use her birth name. Fury says the Kree are prepared for peace talks. Varra says she never would have expected it. Fury tells Varra he needs her help at the peace summit. Fury says they're better together.

Varra says her work is on Earth. She returns to Skrull form. Varra tells Fury she loves him. Fury and Varra kiss. Then they both board the ship.
