Summary: Retired Marine sniper Bob Lee Swagger returns to the line of fire. In the opener, Swagger is recruited by his former commander to prevent an assassination of the U.S. president. Meanwhile, FBI agent Nadine Memphis investigates potential assassins.



Bob Lee Swagger is the most skillful marksman in the history of the Marine Corps, but is now living a quiet life with his wife and daughter in Washington state. One day he gets a visit from a former Corps buddy who appeals to his patriotic duty when he asks Swagger to help prevent an assassination attempt on the President. But Swagger's good deed goes horribly wrong and puts him in the crosshairs of some very powerful, very determined people.

Bob Lee Swagger has a sharp nickname to go with his Corps history, but he is a family man, a doting father to six-year-old Mary and husband to Julie. He knows the power of the weapons he uses and is responsible with them, even lecturing fellow hunters who don't respect the sport. His daughter's bedtime stories are all (presumably very G-rated) versions of his overseas missions.

Swagger is carrying around the guilt of losing his spotter, Donnie, on a mission in Kandahar. Under the command of Isaac Johnson, they had gotten the green light to go after the infamous Chechen sniper, T. Solotov. Even though there'd been no sign of Solotov for a week, Swagger was on guard. Still, he ended up leading Donnie right into the sniper's path. Swagger was hit first in the hip when Solotov miscalculated the wind, but his second shot killed Donnie. Swagger puts the people and country he cares about first and remembers his friend each year by sending flowers to Donnie's mother.

One day when Swagger is home with his daughter, Johnson comes to ask for his help. Johnson is now leading up the President's Secret Service advance team and says they have a credible threat. Ten days ago a CIA agent was killed by a sniper in Virginia from 1,400 yards away and a note was found saying the President will be executed at an upcoming Seattle appearance. They think it's Solotov. Johnson, along with Agent Payne of Homeland Security, want Swagger's help figuring out how Solotov will take his shot.

Payne sends Swagger a replica of Solotov's rifle and Swagger does recon on all the possible hides for the shot, settling on three options. One is an apartment building almost three-quarters of a mile away, but Swagger rules it out because a giant flag will be hanging in the sight line. He settles on a small shed from across the water.

FBI Agent Nadine Memphis wants out of her field office in Seattle. She is driven and determined, and still paying the professional price for once shooting a hostage, which, as it turns out, is not good for career advancement. She meets Johnson and Payne after they get in the way of her operation with a Russian source. He had claimed to have intel on something big that is about to go down in the Ukraine. After stealing her source, the FBI sends over a stack of low-level threats against the president to be cleared — Swagger's file is among them. Memphis thinks Swagger's inclusion is odd, given his decorated career, and mentions it to her boss, who blows her off. But Memphis isn't one to let something go.

Johnson cautions Payne about Swagger, telling him the R-rated Kandahar bedtime story: Swagger and his spotter saw the Taliban approaching a girl's school while out on a mission. Even though they were alone and hugely outnumbered, they took on more than 200 Taliban for over 46 hours, just moving and shooting; they didn't sleep, didn't eat, and had 51 kills. To this day, the Taliban stays away from the school because they think it's cursed.

The day of the president's visit, with his recon complete, Swagger and his wife head to the site of the president's speech. But Payne radios that Solotov isn't where Swagger expected. In the next few moments, Swagger's life changes forever. First, he realizes Solotov is going to blow the rigging on the giant flag — the first option Swagger scouted and dismissed. Swagger races to the first option hide — an apartment. He finds the sniper rifle set up for the shot, but the room is empty. At that moment, a shot rings out at the president's location.

Inside the apartment, Payne confronts Swagger and draws on him. Swagger jumps from three stories up as Payne fires on him. He crashes onto the roof of a car but survives. Agent Memphis finds him and draws on him. Our hero insists: "My name is Bob Lee Swagger; I did not kill the president."

Summary: Bob Lee tries to protect his family while incarcerated; and Isaac aims to silence him. In other events, Nadine contacts Bob Lee's wife, Julie, who's dealing with the backlash against her family.



We start to learn more about the conspiracy against Bob Lee Swagger, which traces all the way back to Russia. A CIA Agent named Hugh Meachum appears to be running things and the fact that Jack Payne missed his chance to kill Swagger is proving inconvenient for everyone. In prison, "protective custody" proves to be anything but for Swagger.

Swagger is surprised to learn that the U.S. president is fine – it was the Ukrainian president who was killed. Julie Swagger cites this supposed miss as evi-

dence her husband couldn't have taken the shot, noting his unfailing accuracy, but agents are already confiscating all of Swagger's research and camping out with Julie at her sister's.

Swagger keeps his mouth shut once he's in custody in the hospital. He asks for his attorney, Sam Vincent, an old friend of his father's. Knowing they're being listened to, Swagger writes just two words for Sam to look into: Isaac Johnson. Johnson and Swagger ran 53 missions together, including one in which Swagger saved his commanding officer's life, but Swagger knows that he's now a loose end for whoever set him up – as is his family.

Swagger is moved to protective custody in federal prison, where being caged just makes him an easier target. Payne uses a dirty guard to rig a carbon monoxide leak, forcing Swagger to be moved into general population, where the guards conveniently leave him alone with the wolves. A group of inmates come after him, but are called off by a powerful Russian inmate named Alexander Rosovich, who shows his appreciation for Swagger supposedly killing the Ukrainian president by offering him protection and the use of a satellite phone.

After a chewing-out by her boss, Special Agent John Renlow, for "missing" an email Swagger supposedly sent demanding the Medal of Honor, Agent Nadine Memphis starts to think things

are hinky. She visits Julie to confirm her growing skepticism of Swagger's guilt. Julie suggests if an old friend visited Swagger, he would have left a way to get in touch. Memphis thinks there's a connection between the fact her source wanted to get her intel on a situation in the Ukraine and the assassination of the Ukrainian president. Memphis shares some of her concern with Johnson, who doesn't see her as a threat – yet.

CIA Agent Hugh Meachum appears to be running the conspiracy on behalf of the Russians. Swagger calls Johnson and offers to confess to protect his family, but that's not good enough for Meachum, who wants Swagger dead to get the Russians off his back. Meachum clearly has reach, not just into prison, but into the evidence lock-up to snatch the business card Johnson left at Swagger's — a loose end, tied.

In prison, a crooked guard lets a giant convict into Swagger's cell, offering to split the bounty on Swagger with him. But Swagger takes out the inmate and then the guard, proving he's not just deadly at a distance. Swagger takes the guard's uniform and thumb to get past biometric security, and hitches a ride out in a prison laundry van. Swagger goes to his late spotter Donnie's mother's house. She knows how her son felt about Swagger and is happy to help. She gives him cash, a motorcycle, and Donnie's field gear – and then a head start when Johnson tracks him down via credit card payment for annual flower delivery in Donnie's honor. Swagger finally calls Julie, knowing the feds are listening. His plan? Swagger promises, "I'm going to do what I do best: I'm going to hunt."

Summary: Bob Lee reaches out to Nadine while evading his pursuers; and Isaac juggles his double life while trying to find Bob Lee.



Bob Lee Swagger starts to make good on his promise to hunt, putting Isaac Johnson firmly in his crosshairs (literally) and taking a big risk trusting Agent Nadine Memphis. As he works to uncover who set him up, Swagger also takes steps to protect himself and his family.

After a close call, being recognized at a convenience store, Swagger calls Isaac Johnson, watching him through his rifle scope from nearby. Swagger warns him that the only reason he's still alive is to ensure his family's safety, and if they get

hurt, Johnson gets hurt. Swagger promises he'll uncover the truth. To drive home his point, and remind Johnson who he's dealing with, Swagger shoots Johnson's cell phone right out of his hand.

Johnson works the situation from both angles, telling the FBI task force that Swagger is paranoid and unstable. Then he gives his co-conspirators a frank assessment, warning them that if Swagger lives long enough, he'll try to take them all out. Swagger can hide in plain sight, he's patient, committed, and fearless. Johnson knows that Swagger's only weakness is his family and he's prepared to use them as bait if necessary.

Julie shops for ingredients for lasagna night and gets a call from Swagger while she's in the store. Two agents trail her as someone spills coffee on her. She goes alone to the restroom to clean up. Swagger is waiting there for her. After a brief happy reunion, he gets down to business, warning her not to mention Isaac Johnson's name to anyone. He tells her bluntly that if she talks, they'll kill her. He's working on getting her and Mary out of the country. He asks Julie to mention the story of Musa Qala, Afghanistan to their daughter if she doubts her daddy. Julie tells Swagger that she trusts Agent Memphis, so he suggests Julie tell her to look into Kyle Timmons, the police officer who supposedly shot him, and see what Memphis does with it.

Swagger calls "Kasper," a woman Alexander Rosovich mentioned might be able to get his family out of the country. She asks for \$100,000, and that's the hero rate.

Swagger goes to a VA hospital to see Ron Perkins, the director of rehabilitation and prosthetic services. Ron initially brushes his friend off, angry about the negative public perception of vets that Swagger is adding to, but he changes his mind, giving Swagger the item he asked for. Perkins mentions that he changed the serial number, but we don't know yet why that's important. Yet again, Swagger slips through a police barricade.

After Julie mentions Timmons to Memphis, she takes the name to her boss, Agent John Renlow, who encourages her to continue trying to get Swagger to trust her. Is it possible Memphis isn't the ally she seems? She sidles up to Timmons in a bar and tries to get him talking, then turns to interrogation, mentioning his less-than-stellar record and the fact he wasn't supposed to be working the day of the assassination. He warns her off, but she's starting to believe Swagger.

Memphis comes home at the end of a long day to find Swagger in her living room. He found Kyle Timmons' body; Payne killed him but staged it to look like suicide. Swagger asks Memphis for her help. He tells her the truth about Isaac Johnson and how he was set up. She wants to believe him, but notes he has no evidence. Swagger points her in the direction of a journalist named Kalina Ordenko, who was working on a story about dealings in Ukraine but hasn't been heard from since the assassination. When Memphis asks Johnson about her later, his vague answers don't satisfy her curiosity.

As Johnson is scrambling to fend off Swagger, Payne is not making his job any easier. He tells Johnson their supposed boss, Meachum, blames Johnson for Swagger getting away. And there's a key piece of evidence missing. Payne leaves a flash drive in a dead drop at a church, then bails when Johnson sends him after Swagger.

Swagger hides out at a friend's cabin, hunting deer, and rigging a bomb. He draws Johnson and the FBI to him by going out in public. Johnson threatens Julie with arrest to get the name of Swagger's friend with a cabin in the area. SWAT teams find the house empty, but once Johnson and Memphis are inside, Swagger starts shooting at them. He misses, which is not like him. Johnson waits for his moment and shoots back into the woods. There's a giant explosion.

The team finds body parts everywhere and the remains of a suicide vest. There's so much gore, it's hard to tell what they're looking at, but we've been paying attention and remember Swagger killed a deer earlier. Then they find a titanium hip like Swagger's, and Perkins' comment about altering Swagger's record to match also suddenly makes sense.

After seeing news reports of Swagger's death, Julie tells her daughter that they have to have faith in him. She asks Mary about the story of Musa Qala. Mary remembers that her dad saved Isaac's life. But, she says that wasn't the best part of the story: daddy had to be a ghost. Julie understands and is relieved.

In the cabin, Memphis finds Swagger's evidence board before Johnson can get to it. Her phone rings, it's Swagger. He's trusting her with his life and asks her to trust her gut and keep digging. She remembers the last time she trusted her instincts, someone got killed. "Then the good news is I'm already dead," Swagger says.

Summary: In a flashback to their time serving in Afghanistan, Bob Lee and Isaac clash with opposing ideologies. Nadine investigates the Ukrainian connection, putting herself on the conspirators' radar.



In flashbacks to Afghanistan, Isaac Johnson is revealed as a straight arrow who begins to lose his way with persuasion from a familiar face. We see what really happened in Musa Qala and that the decisions made by Johnson and Bob Lee Swagger spoke to the character of each man and even laid the groundwork for the conspiracy to come. Meanwhile, Agent Nadine Memphis continues to try to unravel the mystery and ends up putting a target on her back.

While providing cover on a mission in Afghanistan during a flashback, Swagger sees something that doesn't look right and ignores Johnson's order to abort. Swagger's defiance keeps him in place to protect 12 Marines on the ground but, as Johnson points out to him later, the extremely difficult shot Swagger makes also confirms to the enemy that the Nailer is in town. The bounty on Swagger stands at \$600,000 and Johnson cautions him to be more careful.

Still in the past, the unit gets word that Mullah Abdul is in Musa Qala. He's wanted for many atrocities, including beheading several UN doctors. Because he's a high-value target, they're getting special help – Agent Hugh Meachum from the CIA. Johnson gives Swagger and his spotter Donnie Fenn orders to infiltrate at night and provide cover for him when he goes in the next day. Then Meachum has a private talk with Johnson to convince him to go against orders and help the CIA capture Abdul while reporting he's been killed. Meachum argues that the intel they could get from Abdul could save American lives.

In the present, Ron Perkins and Donnie's mother Susan Fenn come to Swagger's funeral, which is attended by fewer than a dozen people, but not his daughter Mary. Watching from across the street, Johnson shares his doubts about Swagger's death with Meachum. But Meachum only cares that the Russians think he's dead, as Meachum promised. To further cover their tracks, Meachum orders Johnson to kill Mrs. Fenn, calling her a broken window because she helped Swagger and believes him. Johnson hates the idea but knows if he doesn't, someone else will. When he visits her, she isn't surprised by the purpose of his visit, and declines his offer to let her run. Johnson chokes her to death and buries her in the woods, not feeling particularly good about his choices.

After Swagger's funeral, Julie's sister Anne is alarmed when Mary says her daddy is still alive. Julie tells her sister the truth, but asks her not to tell her judgmental husband Jim.

In an Afghanistan flashback, Johnson goes along with Meachum and changes Swagger's orders so that he won't be in position to kill Mullah Abdul. Swagger recognizes how out of character the last-minute change is and figures out something is up. Johnson urges Swagger to see the big picture. Swagger goes along to the spot as Johnson orders, but reminds Johnson he has no shot. Johnson orders him: "Do your job." Johnson and his translator Captain Rahim arrive in Musa Qala to try to convince the villagers to turn over Abdul, but things quickly go off the rails. Rahim wants the bounty on Swagger and grabs a bazooka and blows up the shed where Johnson ordered Swagger and Fenn to set up. Johnson is taken hostage.

After disposing of Mrs. Fenn, Johnson seems worn down by his role and tells Meachum he'll be unreachable for a few days. He goes home to his wife, and turns out to be fluent in Mandarin.

Memphis is still trying to figure out what happened to her Russian informant who claimed to have intel on something in the Ukraine. Jack Payne visits her, introducing himself as Matt Simms with Homeland Security. He claims that after his team scooped up Dimitri Voydian, he was returned to Russia and killed by their intelligence service. Memphis doesn't buy it and wonders if there's a connection to Swagger. Pointing to the articles Swagger left in the cabin, she argues the Russians had the most to gain from the assassination. When Memphis asks about the connection to Graznyole in the Ukraine, Payne doesn't lie fast enough and she sniffs him out as CIA. He promises to try to bump up her security clearance so he can discuss it with her, but urges her to keep her questions to herself. We know that Memphis has just put herself in a very dangerous spot.

Flashing back to Musa Qala, Mullah Abdul reveals himself and is about to kill Johnson when Swagger takes him out from a distance. He had moved from the position where Johnson ordered him. Swagger quickly takes out the enemy forces around Johnson, much to the frustration of Meachum, watching via video back at the base. Johnson orders Swagger to leave the translator Rahim alive for interrogation, but Swagger disobeys him and finishes him, too.

Back at the base, Meachum tells Johnson he failed the test of his leadership by not controlling Swagger's hero impulses. He promises Johnson he won't get a chance to command troops in the field again and says he needs to learn about lying to his men to protect the greater good. Later, Johnson tells Swagger his report will say that Johnson allowed himself to be ambushed to draw out Mullah Abdul for Swagger to kill, and Captain Rahim, the traitorous translator, will receive a commendation posthumously and die a hero. Johnson insists he's protecting the greater good.

Payne is already waiting for Memphis with coffee when she arrives at a café, thinking she's gotten security clearance to hear the truth about her informant. Payne tells her that Voydian was running protection for a mining company in Graziowa but the water got poisoned and hundreds of villagers were killed. Memphis thinks it could be what the missing reporter Karlina Ordenko was writing about. Payne says the Russians wanted to prosecute Voydian, so the CIA handed him over. But Memphis doesn't just accept the story. She picks at it, noting that the Russians wouldn't care about the mine because it was in the Ukraine. Payne's lie fails. "You've gone to an awful lot of trouble to try to throw me off track, I must be right about a thing or two," Memphis says. Payne argues that no one will believe her. Memphis takes her coffee and leaves. She makes it to her car before the drugs Payne put in it kick in. She comes to, tied up on her couch with Payne preparing to inject her with alcohol and stage her suicide.

Before Payne can act, Swagger comes to Memphis' rescue. He and Payne fight viciously all over her apartment, with Swagger ending up with a pencil through his shoulder and Payne taking a few hits. Payne eventually gets the advantage and is choking Swagger when Memphis frees herself and gets a gun. She seems to hesitate shooting and Payne runs.

After the attack, Swagger asks Memphis to go back to work and pretend like nothing happened and keep digging. They agree to work together. "You're the most famous dead assassin in history and I'm a semi-disgraced FBI agent, we're not exactly Butch and Sundance," she says.

"Definitely not Butch and Sundance – they both died in the end," Swagger says.

Julie Swagger manages to sneak off to meet Swagger at yet another remote cabin, for some much-needed time to reconnect. She had set up an email address so they can communicate and appears prepared to be separated from her husband for the long haul while he works to prove his innocence.

Swagger goes back to the Science Center where the assassination took place to calculate where the real bullet could have ended up. The feds have the one that was planted, but he's figuring that, in the

chaos after the shooting, nobody had time to collect the real thing. Comparing trajectories and photos from the day, Swagger realizes the bullet hit a police car. He texts Memphis for help finding the car.

Memphis comes in to work the day after her attack by Jack Payne and finds roses on her desk – from Payne. She immediately dumps them in the trash. She also pulls all her files on her informant, Dimitri Voydian.

Swagger goes to the police garage. He scours the car from the scene for the bullet and finds a dent in a wheel well. He's trying to get the bullet out from behind the tire when the manager notices him. Swagger talks and walks in circles staying a step ahead just long enough to remove the bullet and run. He meets up with Memphis. He recognizes the bullet as master armor work, and illegal. Memphis calls a guy with ATF, David Hall, who has a crush on her. Hall says the ATF thinks similar bullets are being made by a 2nd Amendment group called Tree of Liberty outside of Spokane.

After telling Isaac Johnson that Meachum has ordered more "wet work," Payne consults Memphis' files and heads to a Russian restaurant. When Memphis stops by later with a partner to check up on all of Voydian's connections, she finds a blood bath inside and a body with a single red rose on it – just like the one Payne sent her.

Swagger rides out to the Tree of Liberty compound, where he pretends to sympathize the militia's cause. They are only too happy to listen to his talk of the conspiracy against him, until

he pulls out their red bullet. But it turns out it isn't theirs. A man in Idaho makes their bullet materials for them, but they won't say more. Swagger notices bags of fertilizer being loaded into a van.

Johnson follows Swagger's trail from the police garage to the Tree of Liberty, where he heads into the woods with his rifle and camouflage. Inside, Swagger gives a 17-year-old named Joey a few tips on long-range shooting and swipes a cell phone. When he sees Joey getting picked on, Swagger stops to encourage him to find his own path. Then Swagger slips away to poke around and finds the van is rigged with ammonium nitrate, Oklahoma City-style. The group has dangerous plans. Swagger calls David Hall at ATF and pretends to be a disillusioned follower. Joey finds him and holds a gun on him, but they're called by the leader. They caught Johnson in the woods and have him strung up. Swagger prevents them from killing Johnson on the spot, saying they should use him for target practice.

Payne gets Memphis alone in the FBI garage and taunts her from the shadows, lobbing various threats at her, including that he'll hurt Julie and Mary Swagger. Memphis visits Julie to warn her that Payne is getting bolder. Memphis wants them to hide, but instead Julie marches outside her front door to the waiting news vans and holds up Payne's picture, saying the FBI believes he might be the real shooter. She urges people to call Memphis with tips and Memphis is caught totally flat-footed and can only say "no comment."

Acting on Swagger's tip, the ATF arrives near the compound and launches a drone. Back in the compound, Swagger walks Johnson out to a tree a mile away and quietly explains he can't let the militia go through with their bombing plans; he's stalling. But he isn't about to let Johnson go, given that Johnson came to kill him. Swagger misses his first shot and lets a militia man take the second, which comes up short. When Swagger lines up to take another one, instead he shoots the ATF drone out of the sky. Johnson uses a rock to cut his ropes and escape. Joey jumps in the van with the bomb and starts to drive off, but Swagger shoots out the tires and stops him. He lets Joey go, laying down cover fire as the ATF storms the compound. By way of thanks, Joey tells Swagger the name of the man in Idaho who made the bullet before he runs. Swagger recognizes it as Rathford O'Brien, but we have to wait to see why it's familiar.

At FBI headquarters, Renlow calls Memphis on the carpet for Julie's news stunt, making clear that Memphis is alone in her belief in the conspiracy. Memphis goes to collect herself at her desk, but is shocked when Payne waltzes right up to her. He's quickly put in cuffs.

Summary: Bob Lee tracks down his former instructor, who he hopes will help him find the shooter; Nadine interrogates Payne; Isaac realizes that he's in over his head; and a reporter makes Julie an offer.



Swagger stops running and spends a quiet afternoon in the country with his wife Julie and daughter Mary. As wonderful as it is for Swagger to see Mary for the first time since the assassination, when Julie tells him Donnie Fenn's mom is missing, Swagger realizes he can't chance meeting up with them again. Julie brings him a stack of guns and ammo magazines. Swagger is hoping the bullet-maker might be selling his wares in them.

Following Payne's dramatic appearance at FBI headquarters, Memphis sits

down with him in interrogation. She lays out all of the collateral damage from the conspiracy, including Dimitri Voydian, Voydian's contacts at the restaurant, supposed hero cop Kyle Timmons and Susan Fenn. She shows him the IV bag he was going to use to stage her suicide and warns him they're closing in. She toys with him, getting in his face and under his skin, until he blurts out: "Annex B."

She keeps on him, but getting through to him is a challenge (given that he's basically a sociopath). But ultimately, he gives her Hugh Meachum's name.

Swagger goes to Idaho to track down Sgt. Major Rathford O'Brien. His property is booby-trapped and remote. Swagger is conducting recon when O'Brien sneaks up on him. O'Brien is gruff and not happy for the company. He denies the sniper's bullet is his, saying his are designed to splinter on impact so they're untraceable. Eventually, O'Brien admits he remembers teaching Swagger how to shoot in the Corps and starts to help him.

Johnson and Meachum aren't happy to hear Payne is in custody and talking. Johnson is even less pleased that he doesn't know what Annex B is – and Meachum won't tell him. Johnson visits an old army friend, Justin Singer, to get access to top-level clearance info. He finds that Annex B is a program using private military contractors to handle off-book black ops, which is unconstitutional. He sees the name Anhur Dynamics linked to Meachum – the same men he saw with Meachum earlier. As he and Singer are looking at the file online, their clearance is revoked. Someone knows they were looking at it, which can't be good.

O'Brien demonstrates how his heavy bullet flies differently than other bullets by setting Swagger up to miss – which is no small feat. Then he explains that there are only four guns in the world strong enough to fire his bullet: Black Kings. O'Brien has the King of Spades. O'Brien suggests Swagger track the gun, not the bullet. But that's all he can offer. O'Brien doesn't know anyone besides himself or Swagger who is skilled enough to make the shot that killed the Ukrainian president.

Julie goes to an ATM and is surprised to find her bank account is empty. A man sticks a camera in her face and says ugly things about Swagger. Another man intervenes and tells Julie he's writing a book about Swagger and claims he believes he's innocent. He gives Julie his card in the hopes she'll talk to him.

After his demonstration, O'Brien tells Swagger about losing sight of why he was killing in war and starting to like it too much. It cost him his wife and son. As they're talking, O'Brien gets a CB call from his friend at a diner down the road who sees black SUVs heading in their direction. O'Brien and Swagger re-rig the booby traps and get ready to take on the private contractors heading their way.

Memphis discusses her interrogation of Payne with her boss, Agent John Renlow. They had looked up Meachum and found him listed under Department of Defense, which they figure means he's CIA. They're talking about him when Meachum himself strolls into Renlow's office. Meachum calls Payne "deranged" and says they found him unfit for duty. Memphis doesn't buy it for a minute and mentions Annex B and the assassination. Meachum dismisses her as "the girl stupid enough to get caught in a press conference," but Renlow defends her.

The mercenaries make their way onto O'Brien's property, but aren't smart enough to avoid his many booby traps. O'Brien and Swagger pick off the ones that make it through, firing from far away and changing positions when they can. As O'Brien is running to his next shot, he takes a hit in the leg, and falls. He puts on a tourniquet but is exposed and out in the open. Swagger provides cover for O'Brien until someone lobs a grenade in his direction and he has to bail.

The grenade blast temporarily knocks Swagger out and we pick up from the opening scene of the episode. Swagger wakes up with two mercs charging him, but he takes them both out. Then he picks off another merc closing in on O'Brien and runs to help his former teacher. Swagger helps O'Brien to his feet. "You couldn't have gotten them before I got shot?" O'Brien asks. Later at his cabin, O'Brien is back on his feet with the "bug bite" bandaged up. Swagger tries to help, but O'Brien brushes him off. He insists Swagger take his Black King and gives him the remaining bullets, urging him to go find the real shooter. Then retire.

At FBI headquarters, Memphis is angry when she sees army MPs escorting Payne away, on orders from the Secretary of the Army. Renlow hits the phones but all they can find out is that it was official military orders, someone other than Meachum. Renlow grudgingly admits he believes Memphis is right about the conspiracy.

Johnson and Meachum meet up, neither of them knows where Payne has been taken. But they know Swagger took out ten mercenaries sent after him. Johnson feels he's gotten dragged into something other than what he signed up for. He thought he was helping prevent a war, but now he's wondering if they're just covering up one Meachum already started.

Summary: Bob Lee travels across the country in order to find the shooter; Julie deals with a family betrayal; Nadine contacts a Ukrainian reporter who can explain the conspiracy; and Isaac questions his allegiance.



After being taken from the FBI by army guards, Jack Payne is not rotting in a military prison. Instead, he is taken to a private mansion. A mysterious man named Lon Scott tells Payne his cover is blown and it's time he retire. Instead, Payne demands \$10 million or he'll release the microdrive he took from Dimitri Voydian's body, which includes video of graves and the classified Annex B file. But Scott calls Payne's bluff and cuts him loose, daring him to go to the feds. Payne realizes he's lucky to be alive and slinks off.

Hugh Meachum tells Isaac Johnson that because he brought his friend

Colonel Justin Singer into things, Johnson has to be the one to deal with him. "You dug his grave when you asked him to help you, now you've got to fill it," Meachum says. Johnson is defiant and protective of his childhood friend, but Meachum insists. Later, Johnson goes to see Singer, who knows enough to be concerned. But Johnson urges Singer to trust him and says he doesn't have anything to fear with him. We think Donnie Fenn's mother would disagree.

Julie's brother-in-law Jim sees an open email from Swagger on her tablet. Later, Jim asks her point-blank if Bob Lee is still alive and tells her the sooner they get everything behind them, the better. He continues hounding her about it and we understand why Julie didn't want her sister to tell him the truth.

Swagger searches online for Black Kings and finds an ad for a gun show. At the show, he chats up a seller named Paul Helling, using his good ol' boy charm to get Helling to show him his Black King. Each one is marked with a playing card; Helling has the King of Clubs. Swagger asks about anyone skilled enough to shoot it and Helling shows him a recent YouTube video of the man Jack Payne just met with, Lon Scott, making six shots from 1,500 yards. As Swagger

is talking, one of the other gun sellers recognizes him and prepares to be a cowboy. As Swagger is making his way out, the man stops him with a loaded weapon. Swagger effortlessly kicks the gun and the man shoots himself in the foot. Swagger leaves calmly in the ensuing chaos.

Nadine Memphis pays Kasper the Russian crime boss a visit asking questions about Karlina Ordenko and showing off her Russian. She wants Kasper to find the missing reporter and set up a meet. When Kasper doesn't feel like cooperating, Memphis calls in SWAT. They can take their pick on what to charge Kasper with, she owns three beauty salons for money laundering, an illegal casino, two brothels and the entire Russian drug trade in the Pacific Northwest.

Swagger calls Memphis and tells her the shooter is Lon Scott. She recognizes him as the CEO of Anhur Dynamics – the company the mercenaries who came after Swagger work for. He's on his way to Anhur headquarters in Virginia. Swagger mentions the "little jam" at the gun show in Bozeman and asks if she can help clean it up. She quickly learns what Swagger was referring to when Agent Renlow calls her into his office about the shooting. He tells her to warn Swagger to be more careful. She starts looking into Lon Scott, but can't find a home address listed.

Swagger is pulled over on a remote country road by a motorcycle officer for a broken tail light cover on the truck he stole. He tells the cop he left his wallet back in the motel. He's playing everything cool until the country cop says he's going to call it in. Swagger opens his door quickly into the cop to knock him over, grabs his radio, then backs up over the motorcycle so he can't be followed. The cop is unhurt.

Swagger steals a new car from a church parking lot, pausing to stuff cash in the donation box before he speeds off. He spray paints the car in the woods and removes all the identifying marks.

Kasper comes through with Karlina Ordenko, who is in hiding in Russia. She contacts Memphis via Skype. Ordenko tells Memphis the information that Voydian had for her was much worse than just a poisoned town. "They" wiped out entire villages and she saw burning bodies and babies crying for their mothers. "What they did was inhumane. No government can stand in their way," Ordenko says. She explains that the missing microdrive had classified information including files on US involvement and Annex B. The internet connection starts to go out and Memphis catches only snippets, including the word "CIA." Then Ordenko screams and Memphis can only watch helplessly as masked men burst into the room and beat Ordenko to death. One of them looks into the webcam and says in Russian: "See you soon, Agent Memphis."

Johnson goes to Montana on Swagger's trail. After talking to Helling about the Black King, Johnson calls Meachum and tells him that Swagger has tracked the shooter. Meachum confirms it's Lon Scott. "The CIA hired a private contractor to assassinate a foreign national on American soil," Johnson says. "This thing started out as bad, now it's gotten worse."

Meachum visits Scott, who cavalierly admits he purposefully exposed himself in the YouTube video, to lure Swagger to him. "The trick is to make him think he's in control, now he does. So the video worked," Scott says. Then he tells Meachum about Jack Payne's extortion attempt, and suggests Meachum pay him the \$10 million for the Annex B files. We still don't know much about Scott's motivation, but we do learn one interesting attribute: he's missing a leg.

Swagger arrives at Anhur Dynamics corporate headquarters in Virginia, and poses as a delivery driver with something he insists is for Lon Scott personally. Johnson has tracked Swagger there and watches from outside, then coolly intercepts Swagger on his way out. Swagger notices that Johnson is alone and calmly walks with him to the parking lot, where the two men pull guns on each other, careful not to make a scene. Johnson says he doesn't want anyone else to get hurt, but Swagger is disgusted that Johnson killed Donnie's mom and thinks he's now only trying to save himself. Johnson warns him the mercenaries in Idaho were just a fraction of the firepower at Scott's disposal. But Swagger isn't convinced of his motives. "Just because you realized you're expendable, doesn't make us partners," Swagger tells him.

"It doesn't mean we don't need to be," Johnson says, then he holsters his gun and walks away.

Memphis is surprised at work when Julie Swagger's brother-in-law Jim drops by. After he leaves, Memphis calls Julie to warn her he sold Swagger out, promising his info won't go anywhere at the FBI. When Julie hangs up she storms into the kitchen and confronts Jim, holding a knife to his throat like she knows how to use it. She warns him that if he ever puts her daughter at risk again, she'll bury him in his own backyard. She suggests he leave on a "business trip" and not to come back until things are over. Julie assures him that if his wife Anne knew what he did, she'd help Julie dig the hole.

Johnson calls his friend Justin Singer who, we're are relieved to see, is not dead. Instead, Johnson got him a one-year assignment in Afghanistan. It isn't exactly a gift, but it's better than death. Then Johnson calls his wife and gives her a coded message. She drops everything, grabs a packed go bag, and walks out of her house with the teapot on.

Memphis learns from Kasper that someone named Grigory Krukov is behind things, which scares Kasper enough to leave town. He's a high-ranking member of the FSB. His diplomatic cover is as a senior member of the Russian Ministry of Trade, which is connected to Anhur Dynamics, as is Payne, according to his bank statements. Swagger calls Memphis and asks her to join him in Virginia. Memphis asks Renlow for a favor – she needs him to suspend her, and trust her.

The receptionist at Anhur hands off Swagger's package to a driver who takes it to Scott's mansion, Swagger follows the car there. From a lookout outside Scott's mansion, Swagger calls Anhur Dynamics and asks for Scott, giving identifying himself as Bob Lee Swagger. Swagger watches inside the house through a scope as Scott looks inside the package: the red bullet Scott used to kill the Ukrainian president. Scott answers Swagger's phone call. "When you set bait, it's important to clear your own smell," Swagger tells him, "otherwise even a starving animal will know it's a trap."

Just who's hunting who now?





## Red on Red

Swagger sets up surveillance outside Lon Scott's house to learn his security schedule. Agent Nadine Memphis meets him there, following GPS coordinates. She tells Swagger about the thumb drive Jack Payne has that could exonerate Swagger and suggests he doesn't need to kill everyone, as he's apparently planning. He agrees to try it her way, but if it fails, he says, they're back to Plan A.

Agent John Renlow tells Memphis that an Anhur Dynamics private jet flew to Virginia from near Seattle shortly after Payne was taken away. Also, diplomatic clearance was recently issued for flight

out of Russia to an Anhur private airfield 30 minutes away from Scott's house. Memphis and Swagger follow Scott to the airfield. A private jet lands and Hugh Meachum gets out and shakes hands with Grigory Krukov, the FSB officer. Swagger gets close enough to eavesdrop and hears them discussing what to do about Payne, who is still demanding \$10 million in diamonds for the files. Scott tells Krukov to pay Payne what he's asking.

Everyone starts scheming. Swagger plans to turn the conspirators against each other like he did in Afghanistan, red-on-red. Isaac Johnson finds Meachum at a restaurant and asks for money to disappear. Meachum agrees, if Johnson finds Payne and the Annex B thumb drive. Later, Johnson tracks down Payne to his old Leavenworth cellmate, and holds a gun on him, demanding the thumb drive. But Johnson's threats are empty; Payne's no good to him dead.

At Krukov's hotel, Memphis and Swagger bust into his room and take out three guards – one gets a fork in the chest from the room service tray – but miss one, who holds a gun on Memphis. Swagger puts his gun down and offers to clean up Krukov's entire operation by killing Payne, Meachum and Lon Scott. Memphis promises she's suspended and isn't wearing a wire, they empty their pockets. Krukov tells Memphis to call her boss and ask for his file. If she gets it,

Krukov'll know they're lying to him. When she calls, Renlow can tell something is off and rejects her request, reminding her she's suspended. Krukov is satisfied. Swagger asks for Payne's \$10 million. Krukov agrees, in exchange for his co-conspirators' heads and the file. Swagger tells him to set up a meet at the airport, where he can get clear shots. He reminds Krukov that if he doesn't leave the money, Krukov is dead, too.

Swagger puts Memphis through target practice because his plan requires her to make a shot from 600 yards. Thanks to a good teacher, she's ready to go when they set up outside Scott's house at night. Swagger rigs the guardhouse's fuses to dim, leading to a chain reaction that gives him a window to strike. Memphis lines up to take her shot at a propane tank, like she practiced, and nails it. It goes up in a giant fireball. She watches through her scope as the lights flicker in the house and the guards scramble. Inside, Swagger sneaks up on Scott in the dark. Then he puts his gun away and plays Scott a recording of Krukov agreeing to pay Swagger for killing Scott. (Memphis wasn't wearing a wire, the recorder was in a key chain.) Scott is unimpressed and egotistical, bragging to Swagger that he's the better shooter. Swagger explains the difference between shooting in a warzone. "I'm the sniper; you're just a marksman. You shoot pumpkins. Come to the meet and watch a real sniper work. You'll see the difference," Swagger says.

After getting a call from her husband saying it's almost over, Julie packs up with Mary and leaves to meet Swagger at the remote ranger station. For her own safety, she doesn't tell her sister Anne where she's going. The reporter Simon Porter snoops around and sees a ladder over the wall in back. He calls Lon Scott to report that Julie is gone. At Scott's direction, Porter returns later with a man claiming to be an attorney with an offer for a book deal for Julie. Anne lets them in and they clone her phone.

Scott tells Meachum about Swagger's visit and his plan to shoot the Russians at the meet. He knows it might be a set up, but Scott is too eager for the chance to take Swagger out himself. Meachum is worried that killing the Russians means their deal would fall apart, but Scott figures they can just make a new deal. Meanwhile, Krukov meets secretly with Johnson, and asks him to kill Swagger after Swagger kills the others. Johnson agrees in exchange for the diamonds.

At the airfield, everyone shows up expecting Swagger to shoot – but they all think he has different targets. Memphis sets up from a distance to provide cover. Swagger reminds her to keep Payne alive until they get the thumb drive. Swagger sets up with the Black King as Krukov, Meachum, Scott and Payne meet. Someone gives Payne his bag of diamonds. Then Swagger notices Johnson set up on a long gun from in the back seat of a car. Swagger has to move locations. Memphis starts shooting. Scott pulls out his Black King but can't find Swagger, so he hops in his car. Payne drives off, followed by Scott and Meachum in another car. Krukov is left standing on the tarmac, wondering what happened. Johnson demands the tracker on the diamonds and leaves. All of the major players are unscathed, but some of Scott's men are down.

Payne goes back to his cellmate and picks up the thumb drive he was holding for him. But Swagger climbs out from Payne's trunk and accosts him. He stomps Payne a few times, crushes the tracker, and takes the diamonds and thumb drive. Meachum and Johnson show up a short time later and are not pleased with Payne, but what else is new?

Swagger meets up with Memphis later. She realizes he had planned to kill everyone but stopped when he saw Johnson. She's angry that Swagger lied to her about his intentions and put her in the position of having to kill people at the airfield.

At the ranger cabin, Julie hears a noise and tells Mary to hide under the bed. Julie grabs a gun and goes to investigate. Mary hears shots and sees strange men come in. We hear screams. Swagger calls and is concerned when he can't reach his family. He finally has what he needs to clear his name, but has he lost the upper hand?

Swagger calls Isaac Johnson and demands a meeting. Johnson is with Jack Payne and Lon Scott – who are apparently over the betrayal and extortion that came between them. A van carrying Julie and Mary pulls up. Johnson goes to meet Swagger and Memphis, who keeps a gun on Johnson just in case. Scott wants the Annex B files in exchange for Swagger's family. Johnson says he wants to atone and agrees to help Swagger.

Back at Scott's mansion, he and Krukov share a polite evil chuckle over

the fact that they both made deals with Swagger to let him kill the other. Neither is mourning Meachum after Krukov dispensed with him. With Payne guarding the Swagger ladies, they turn their attention to Johnson, who returns from negotiating with Bob Lee Swagger. Swagger sets up on the long gun outside Scott's mansion and watches the windows for Johnson's signal that they have a deal. As much as he wants to take out the men who have ruined his life, he resists, not wanting to put his family in more danger.

Johnson, Swagger, and Memphis meet in an empty FBI front building. Memphis traces the number as Swagger calls Payne and talks to Julie and Mary. The trace leads to a warehouse that Anhur Dynamics owns. Johnson thinks Swagger is jeopardizing the deal by involving the FBI, but Swagger reminds Johnson that he doesn't get a say in the matter. If everything goes the way Swagger intends, he gets his family, Memphis gets the evidence, and Johnson can take the diamonds and disappear. "One way or another, this ends in blood," Swagger says.

Payne reports to Scott that Swagger "took the bait" and was on the phone long enough to run a trace. Scott reminds Payne to lead Swagger to the right room. Scott packs up his Black King. He agrees to Krukov's request to send some of his men along. Scott doesn't really care about the Annex B files, he's blind to everything but the idea of proving he's a better shooter than Swagger.

Swagger asks Johnson to requisition equipment from the FBI, including a thermal scope and .50 caliber gun. Outside the Anhur warehouse, Memphis uses the thermal scope to ID guards as Swagger and Johnson make their way into the building and up to the top floor, where Memphis sees heat signatures of 10 guards, but not Swagger's family. As Swagger and Johnson take

out the guards, Scott sets up on his Black King from the building across the street. He gets impatient and shoots one of the guards through the window, tipping off his position to Swagger and Johnson, who realize they've been set up. Swagger is stuck behind a partition, but uses one of the dead guards as a decoy to draw Scott's fire. After Scott shoots the guard, he has no shot while Swagger runs for the exit.

After the failed trap, Krukov tells Scott his obsession with Swagger is clouding his judgment. Krukov calls Payne to vent about Scott, but Payne knows he's lucky to be alive and isn't in the mood to cross Scott again.

Memphis, Johnson, and Swagger regroup back at the FBI front building. Swagger furiously makes bullets as they argue over what to do next. Memphis wants to call in the FBI but Swagger and Johnson agree that would mean Swagger never sees his family again. Swagger says has another plan.

Swagger walks up to Scott's mansion unarmed and announces himself. The guards put him in zip-ties and march him in. Once inside, Swagger kicks out a guard's knee, grabs another's gun with his hands behind his back, and shoots the guards in their Kevlar vests, knocking them down. He cuts the zip-tie on a decorative sword. He tells a scared secretary he'll be in Scott's office. When Scott joins Swagger there, he takes the opportunity to brag about his skill again. He gives Swagger a phone and lets him see video feed of Mary and Julie. Finally, Swagger makes Scott an offer he can't resist: once Julie and Mary are safe, Swagger will stay put and let Scott take shots at him.

After everyone confers, they head for the golf course and hostage exchange. Swagger waits near a fairway for Payne and his family, with Johnson providing cover from a rooftop on the .50 caliber long gun and Memphis trying to act as spotter. But Swagger knows Scott could be set up from a mile away and she'd never see him. Memphis notices a van pull up alongside an SUV out front, and goes to get a look. Doors open and close but she can't see what's happening. Then Payne drives the van onto the golf course and texts Swagger to come out.

Only Julie is inside the van; Mary was switched to the SUV. Payne has rigged a shotgun, hanger, and lots of duct tape to his hand, and he puts the hanger noose around Julie's neck – if he's shot and falls over, his dead weight will either shoot her or strangle her.

Swagger demands to know where Mary is as Scott lines up to take a shot at Swagger from thousands of yards away. Swagger and Payne hear a shot whiz by them. Scott realizes his rifle has been fiddled with (flashback to Scott's office and Swagger messing with his Black King before Scott arrived). As they all stand out in the open, Julie pleads with Swagger to leave and find Mary, but he urges her to trust him as another shot zings past. Swagger waits for a third shot – instead, there's an explosion.

Flashback to Swagger in Scott's study, not only messing with the Black King, but replacing Scott's ammunition with a bullet he made. Scott's gun explodes in his face when he pulls the trigger, taking half his head off. Lon Scott is no longer a threat. But Payne still has Julie. Swagger waits for Johnson, then watches as Payne's arm is shredded from the .50 caliber shot, severing the hand taped to the shotgun. Swagger grabs the shotgun rigged around Julie's neck and frees her as Payne falls to the ground gripping his stump. Julie grabs the shotgun from her husband and aims it at Payne, demanding to know where her daughter is. Payne doesn't take her seriously, laughing that she's just a housewife. "I'm a Swagger," she says. Then she shoots him.

Johnson joins the Swaggers on the golf course. Julie is furious to see the man who framed her husband, but he assures her he's trying to make things right. Memphis calls. She followed the SUV that drove off carrying Krukov and Mary, but she's gone as far as she can. Krukov took Mary inside the Russian Embassy.

The group executes their plan to rescue Mary, which begins with Julie making a scene at a cocktail party attended by the Russian ambassador. As Julie publicly accuses the ambassador of holding her daughter, Johnson uses his badge to get in and "drag" her away before the Russians do. The Russian ambassador leaves the party to demand answers from Krukov. Meanwhile, Krukov gets a visit from the National Security Adviser, who bluntly tells him to release Mary Swagger. She knows about Annex B but is more

worried about the bad press from the Russians kidnapping a child. The Russian ambassador returns after chewing out Krukov over the phone and strolls into the embassy followed by his security detail, which includes Swagger. But Swagger is stopped by building security and told to wait.

Inside, the ambassador orders Krukov to move Mary. Krukov promises he's handling things and it will all be over soon, then he'll wrap everything up by killing the Swaggers. The ambassador is not happy Krukov has involved a child. After Krukov leaves, the ambassador notices security hassling Swagger for not having ID. He barks at them for stopping his man, but as soon as Swagger's through, he drops the act, having recognized Swagger. He checks that Swagger hasn't hurt his regular security guard (he's waking up on the floor of a car) and says he had nothing to do with taking Mary. He gives Swagger the key card to the safe room where Mary is and asks Swagger not to kill anybody.

Swagger navigates the hallways to the safe room, narrowly avoiding Krukov. He knocks out the guard, then opens the door and scoops up his daughter. He puts something on her cot as he carries her out of the room. He commends her for being a great "mini-Marine" and tells her their mission is to get out of the embassy. When he has to take out a security guard, he distracts her by asking her to stand lookout. He rigs a fire in the kitchen and picks up Mary and runs for the exit as people stream out of the building.

Swagger meets up with Julie and reunites her with Mary, but he has to say good-bye one more time. He gives Julie the diamonds and the key to a prepaid motel room. She doesn't want to leave, but he knows Krukov won't stop coming for them. He promises he'll be back by midnight, after he knows they're truly safe. Then Swagger calls Johnson to relay his location to Krukov, and tells Johnson he can still have the diamonds. Johnson tells Krukov to kill Swagger, then jumps in his car to go help Swagger. But Agent John Renlow and Memphis stop him in the lot. Johnson had a deal with Swagger, not them.

Back at the embassy, the ambassador tells Krukov he's being called back home. But Krukov isn't done yet. He mentions GPS trackers so small someone can eat it without even knowing and we flash back to Mary eating a cookie in the safe room.

Out in the woods, Swagger sets up on a hill and prepares to hunt. Krukov and his men show up in the woods and Swagger picks them off like flies, but he can't get them all and a dozen still come after him. Swagger switches check points and sets up on the Black King. The Russians use a smoke bomb to try to cloud their positions, but Swagger still manages to hit a few. Memphis, Johnson and Renlow arrive and hear the reports of fire and shots. Johnson pleads with Memphis to let him help Swagger and finally she frees him, promising him: "If you try to run, I'll leave you on that mountain."

Julie and Mary reach the motel Swagger rented for them, which is off a highway next to the forest. Krukov tracks them there and starts shouting from outside, demanding the Annex B file. Julie tells Mary to hide in the bathtub just before Krukov blasts a hole through the front door.

In the forest, Johnson takes out one Russian before another one shoots him in the arm, then hits Memphis. Swagger is pinned behind a tree and announces he's coming out and gives up his gun. He turns to face a Russian from about 15 feet away, then whips a knife from his back and flings it into the Russian's throat before he can fire. He races to help Memphis. Her vest takes the bullet; she's okay. Swagger picks up a gun and holds it on Johnson as he limps away. Johnson turns and tells Swagger he's truly sorry for everything. Swagger takes out the bag of diamonds and tosses them to Johnson, telling Johnson he never wants to see him again.

Julie calls Swagger from the motel, where Krukov is blasting holes through walls. Swagger races to his original check point and sets up on the Black King. He looks through the scope to the motel below, a mile away. He tells Memphis to shoot at Krukov's car to draw him out. When Krukov turns to inspect the blast, he steps perfectly into Swagger's sights, and the man who tried to set up the world's best sniper gets a deadly reminder of his skill. Krukov falls to the pavement, dead from distance.

Down at the motel, Swagger is reunited with his family again. He promises Julie it's finally over, but their moment is short-lived as Memphis has to take Swagger into custody. She's not happy about it, but he's still the number-one suspect in the assassination of the Ukrainian president.

Later, Memphis, Swagger and his lawyer, Sam Vincent, are taken to the CIA headquarters to talk to the NSA director Gregson, who is sitting next to a tactical rifle. She has cleared out the ground floor of the building for the occasion and wants one thing: the Annex B files. Memphis suggests she ask Hugh Meachum for it, but Gregson says he's recently retired, which is a nice euphemism for "killed by Russians." She promises Swagger his life back if he turns over the file. He notes that she advises the president on which leaders to meet with, which means she put him in Seattle on a stage next to the Ukrainian president. She asks Swagger about the rifle next to her, which he recognizes as one used in the assassination. She loads a bullet in the chamber and turns it to face him, demanding the Annex B file. She pulls the trigger, but nothing happens. Gregson explains that someone shaved the firing pin down so it couldn't fire, and therefore it couldn't be the murder weapon. She tells Swagger he's exonerated and asks for Annex B again. He suggests she check with the Russian ambassador and see if he found anything in the room where they were keeping his daughter. (Flashback to Swagger placing the thumb drive on the cot.)

After conferring with Gregson privately, Vincent tells Swagger and Memphis that the story will be that Lon Scott and Grigory Krukov cooked up a war from which they'd both profit, and Scott took the shot and framed Swagger. They found evidence in Scott's house. They'll say that they had a falling out so Scott killed Krukov at the motel then killed himself. The Russian ambassador will back the entire story. No one knows where Isaac Johnson is. Memphis asks Swagger if he knew the rifle Gregson had wouldn't fire. We flash back to him in his shed working on the weapon,

but he leaves her question unanswered. Bob Lee Swagger finally rejoins his girls, just in time for lasagna night.

Gregson sits down with Johnson in a conference room. He's angry that he nearly got killed. She reminds him he volunteered and says that Krukov and Meachum were the tip of the iceberg. The real problem is about to reveal itself, she says, handing him a phone. But he says he's done. "Don't send anyone after me," he says.

"I won't have to," she says.

The episode begins in Frankfurt, Germany, where Bob Lee lauds his friend Kevin "Doc" Campbell at a Silver Star ceremony in a fancy hotel ballroom. Suddenly, the ceremony is interrupted by attackers dressed as policemen, who spray the room with bullets. Bob Lee dives over Julie to protect her, then kicks into action, tackling one attacker and neutralizing him. The attackers are all wearing bomb vests. His friend Rodriguez takes a bullet in the arm but the attackers are soon overpowered. Swagger tracks the last one to the lobby and shoots him, but with civilians nearby, Doc Campbell approaches the fallen man to disarm the vest. Something catches Swagger's eye and, in an instant, Campbell is swallowed up as the bomb explodes.

**3 Days Earlier** — In Frankfurt, a man picks up a woman at a bar, telling her he'll be in town for a few weeks then back a lot since he just got the territory. The next morning, he wakes up at her place — which has a perfect line of sight to the banquet hall. In Texas, the Swaggers say good-bye to Mary and leave on their trip. Memphis, now a senior special agent with the FBI, is stationed in Washington, D.C. but is frustrated to be behind a desk in the Office of Personnel Management. But she seems to have a good casual thing going with a senator's aide, whom she meets when their schedules allow (don't call it a "nooner"). She gets a call from former NSA director Patricia Gregson, who then tracks Nadine down with a vague job offer. In Bangkok, Johnson has settled

in nicely, with a training routine and regular noodle vendor. But on his way home one day, he thinks he's being followed.

The night before the ceremony, Swagger's unit and their wives and girlfriends cut loose in a bar, swapping old war stories. When someone asks Bob Lee if he has seen Johnson, Swagger lies and says no. Across the street, the mystery man runs surveillance on the group.

The next day, the mystery man coordinates the attackers then sets up on a long gun from the woman's apartment. After the attack begins, the man waits for someone to be flushed into the lobby, and into his sights. When his hook-up returns unexpectedly to her apartment, the man coolly shoots her in the head then turns his attention back to the hotel. From the hotel lobby, Bob Lee sees the bullet milliseconds before the vest donates and kills Campbell.

Julie is understandably freaked out after the attack and just wants to get home to Mary, but the airports are closed as a security measure. She and Bob Lee agree he should stay to accompany Campbell's body back to the States. Bob Lee surveys the scene in the lobby, suspicious that he saw the window glass broken by a bullet before the bomb went off. He snapped a photo of nearby apartment buildings and sees one that had the curtains open. He and Dobs go to check it out. He sees tiny holes around a window and paint chips and concludes the shooter was there and hung a screen to take his shot. Then they find the dead woman in the bathroom, poorly staged to look like a suicide.

Julie is a wreck and desperate to leave the city, and reaches out to Memphis in D.C. for help, but Memphis is persona non grata and her boss shuts her down. A short time later, Memphis gets a call from Gregson, who somehow knows she's trying to get Julie out of Frankfurt. She asks Memphis to meet and arrives with instruction that will let Julie leave Germany on a military plane. Memphis is angry that she didn't do anything wrong and is still paying a political price for helping Swagger. Gregson encourages her to accept that she's going nowhere at the FBI and come work for her.

In Bangkok, Johnson sees the news of the shooting in Frankfurt and that Bob Lee was involved and wakes his wife up in the middle of the night, announcing it's time to go. "They're cleaning up, it's not safe for us anymore," he says. The next day, they come under fire on a busy market street and although he's able to take out their attackers, his wife is hit badly in the leg. She insists she'll be OK and says they need to keep moving.

Back in Germany in the destroyed banquet hall, they find a seating chart on one of the attackers and learn that they were specifically targeting Swagger and his unit. Rodriguez is in the hospital recovering from his arm wound when is told he's being transferred. His ambulance driver is the mystery man. The man pulls over and injects Rodriguez with something before he can fight back, killing him. Swagger and Dobs arrive at the hospital too late. Rodriguez's body is found in the ambulance a short time later. Hospital surveillance shows the mystery man wheeling him out, but he's careful never to let the camera see his face. "This wasn't terrorism — it was murder. We're being hunted," Bob Lee says.

### Helmand Province, Afghanistan, 2012

— Swagger and his unit head into a town on a tip and come upon a massive stash of heroin. After capturing the village in a firefight, they prepare to take the body of the local mullah with them over the objection of his wife and son. They are debating what to do with the drugs when they get word of hostiles approaching. Swagger sets up on overwatch while Colin Dobbs offers cigarettes to the men they found guarding the heroin. He skips the one who fought back, Waheed Zakeera,

but drops his matchbook and the Waheed grabs it. Later, Waheed is angry with the Americans and asks them why they're going to destroy the drugs, saying: "We work for you!"

**Present time** — Angela Tio helps Dobbs and Swagger follow up on the attackers. They were Turkish but had passports from Malta. Those are easily bought, so Swagger is looking for answers. After learning the Maltese Consul is leaving the country, he wants a chance to talk to him first. He and Dobbs stage an abduction, in which they fake shooting the ambassador's aide to learn who bought the passports. He gives them the name "Golden Crescent." Before they can leave, they're interrupted by armed men – and Nadine Memphis. She's there on special assignment to bring Swagger home. He tells her about the Golden Crescent and asks for time to run it down. She gives them until her flight leaves at midnight.

In the ballroom crime scene, the mystery sniper poses as a German investigator and learns two Marines are MIA. Later, Memphis finds the man going through Swagger's things in his hotel room. She's suspicious, but mentions the Golden Crescent to him. He explains they're a crime syndicate and he gives her a cell phone number to trace. When he leaves the room he makes a call, warning someone to clear out a warehouse immediately. So when Tio, Dobbs, and Swagger arrive there a short while later, it's completely empty. They find evidence that the bomb vests

were made there, and also a matchbook from the Black Wolf bar in Austin, TX. Dobbs recognizes it immediately as the one he dropped in Helmand.

Julie is back home with Mary and the nanny Estella in Texas, but she's still not recovered from the overseas attack. She's anxious and badly bruised from diving to the ballroom floor. To make up for biting Mary's head off over nothing, he takes her out for breakfast for lunch, in their PJs. The quality mother-daughter time seems to help, but Julie is very aware that they're exposed without Bob Lee around.

Isaac makes plans to get his wounded wife attention. He stops by his gym to pick up their passports and money, while she waits in the car outside. Inside, Johnson is jumped by an assassin. He's on the wrong end of a chokehold but manages to get the man's gun and kill him to escape. He races back to the car, but is crushed to find his wife has been murdered in the short time he was gone.

Memphis traces the number the sniper gave her to Lashkargah Bank in Frankfurt, but she calls Swagger with the info before the man she believes was local law enforcement. Meanwhile the sniper heads to the bank to meet with the man who hired him – the man from Helmand, Waheed. The shooter doesn't seem terribly concerned with pleasing the man who hired him.

**Helmand Province, Afghanistan, 2012** — In flashback, we learn that Waheed's mother had told Swagger's unit whom the drugs belong to: Hugh Meachum, with the CIA. Swagger and Johnson decided to burn the pile just the same and take Waheed's mother with them for questioning.

**Present time** — Swagger, Dobbs, and Tio bust into the bank under cover of darkness and find bodies everywhere. Swagger finds Waheed, barely alive and strapped to a chair with a bomb vest on. Swagger recognizes him and then has seconds to dive for cover before Waheed explodes.

**Helmand Province, Afghanistan, 2012** — Swagger is picking off the advancing enemy as fast as he can but finally there are too many and they pack up for exfiltration. Back at base, Johnson and Swagger try to make sense of what they just stepped in. Johnson knows the intel to hit the town came from Meachum, who apparently was cleaning house. "We burned \$100 million of CIA dope. You don't think there's going to be some blowback?" Johnson says.

**Present time** — After losing his wife, Johnson decides it's time to stop running and return to the States. He's stopped by Customs at the Canadian border. There's an Interpol notice on him saying he's a threat to national security. Johnson isn't in the mood to explain himself and instead looks into the security camera and says only: "Patricia Gregson."

On the U.S./Mexico border, the sniper uses a coyote to cross onto U.S. soil, then kills his transport. The fight that started on foreign ground is coming home.

**Spain, 3 Months Ago** — Solotov is relaxing at home cooking dinner when he sees an assassin approaching out of the corner of his eye. His chef's knife becomes a weapon of defense. One of his attackers says that Solotov has to go because the Marines saw his face and a reporter is asking questions. Solotov dispatches with his attackers and leaves dinner on the stove as he bugs out.

**Present time** — Isaac Johnson gets the visit from Gregson that he demanded, but she's no longer interested in his services.

He's looking for revenge, she's looking for a clean break. Johnson heads to Texas and reaches out to Swagger, who isn't exactly happy to see the man who set him up for murder and put his family in danger. Johnson wants to work together to find whomever is hunting them, but Swagger isn't feeling so trusting and tells him no. Johnson is driving away from the meet when a car forces him off the road. The driver gets out and draws on Johnson, but before he can fire, Swagger charges down the road in his truck and runs the man over.

Memphis does research on the Golden Crescent and finds that a Post reporter named Jeffrey Denning wrote about them and the heroin trade. She goes to see Denning's editor, Charles Broadwell, to try to learn more about the Golden Crescent and an international terrorist ring with ties to the U.S. government. She drops Gregson's name and Broadwell tells her Denning is on sabbatical.

In a flashback to Afghanistan, Johnson has been told to keep the mullah's wife in custody, but he doesn't know why. He's summoned to Kabul for a meeting that turns out to be with Gregson, then-Deputy Director of the Defense Intelligence Agency. It's their first meeting. She knows about Hugh Meachum's CIA drug trade and wants Johnson to help stop him. She won't take no for an answer. With Johnson off base, Swagger is in charge. A group of American tough

guys that Swagger suspects are CIA stop at the base claiming car trouble. He thinks they're after the mullah's wife so he hides her.

Solotov requests a meeting with his boss Addison Hayes, but goes wearing a bomb vest, just in case. Hayes gives him two weeks to deal with Swagger and company. Swagger and Colin Dobbs have the man who tried to run over Johnson and start working him over for answers, but he's not talking. They find a Maltese passport on him with visits in the last week to Brazil, Egypt, and Thailand. When Johnson hears Thailand, his patience evaporates. He realizes the man must be the one who killed his wife, and shoots him without hesitation. Swagger is angry he killed their only lead, and sends a text from the man's phone to meet with whomever he's working for. Solotov reads the text, then calls someone to meet with Swagger at the diner, telling him to be sure Swagger brings him out front. He'll be waiting.

Johnson and Swagger sit down at a table while Dobbs stands watch. A man arrives to meet them and tries to get them to go outside, but Swagger's sniper sense tingles. The man takes a waitress hostage and the diner erupts in panic. Swagger does the math, then quickly pulls out his gun and shoots the man in the shoulder, saving the woman.

Memphis comes home to find her boyfriend Harris Downey standing in his underwear while police tear her place apart. Having made her point, Gregson arrives and ends the search. She's trying to intimidate Memphis and scold her for using her name with Broadwell, but Memphis isn't impressed. Gregson knows Swagger is being hunted and it goes back to the Afghani heroin, but she's not interested in the press knowing that. Memphis forgets her boss' words a short time later when Denning texts and Memphis says she still wants to meet.

After the shooting at the diner, Johnson makes himself scarce while Swagger talks to the sheriff. The attacker is wheeled out on a stretcher to an ambulance. Solotov slips into the crowd that is gathered and tosses a firecracker as a distraction. He climbs into the back of the ambulance and injects his own man with something, killing him, without anyone knowing he was ever there.

Swagger and Dobbs head back to Swagger's house, where he starts grabbing weapons. He wants to stand watch, but Dobbs is ready to head home. Julie is also ready for answers. Dobbs hits the road, but pulls over when he sees he's being followed. He pretends to fix his tire, waiting to see what the person's intentions are. When they get out with a gun, Dobbs opens fire, killing the attacker. Dobbs is looking around to see if there are any more people after him when he is hit in the chest and goes down.

Back in Afghanistan, the CIA guys aren't happy when they discover Swagger is hiding the mullah's wife. The two groups of men stare each other down until guns are drawn, but Swagger doesn't back down and the men leave. When Johnson returns from Kabul, he lies to Swagger about his trip, downplaying it like it was nothing. Swagger doesn't tell him about the CIA visit.

At the Swagger ranch, Bob Lee finishes telling Julie what's going on. She's angry and distraught that he doesn't have more information or a plan to stop what's happening. They're interrupted by a late night visit from Sheriff Brown. He breaks the news that Dobbs was killed. He says it looks like a robbery, but Swagger knows otherwise. In flashback, we see the shooter: it's Solotov.

Summary: Bob Lee and Isaac learn the world's greatest assassin is in the U.S. Flashbacks to a mission in Afghanistan reveal his identity: Solotov. Nadine comes to Texas with suspicions of a conspiracy.



In a flashback to Afghanistan flashback, the Marines have been ordered to accompany a UN escort to transport the mullah's wife, Gabina, off base. They're joined by a man introduced as Dr. Wydra with the UN – it's Solotov. They drive through the desert without incident until they reach a suspicious truck stopped in the road and what appears to be an injured man. Solotov stays in the car with Gabina with his finger covertly on a detonator while Johnson gets out to inspect. Johnson realizes it's an ambush seconds

before Solotov detonates the blast.

At the Swagger ranch, Julie is anxious. She sends Mary off to school, concerned for her safety. On his security feed, Swagger sees that Johnson is outside. He lies to Julie and sneaks out to the barn to talk to him. When Julie comes to check on him moments later, she is livid to see who he's with and that her husband lied to her.

In Afghanistan, the convoy comes under heavy fire and is surrounded by men coming down from the hills to attack. Solotov hunkers down with Gabina in the transport, pretending to protect her, then he quickly stabs her in the neck. He opens the door, claiming she was shot, and pulls her to the ground, where he makes a show of helping her as he surreptitiously squeezes the life out of her gaping wound. After the fire fight, Donnie is suspicious of Solotov and doesn't buy his story that Gabina was hit by bullet, saying there was no incoming fire at the time. He grabs Solotov's UN badge with his picture on it and won't give it back. Everyone is frustrated, and Kirk Zehnder complains that they never should have burned the heroin.

Back in Texas, Solotov is hiding comfortably in a mobile home, while he whips up a pressure cooker bomb. At her house, Julie goes through the guns in Bob Lee's safe and Estella the nanny worries about her. She thinks Julie might be suffering from PTSD and suggests she talk to someone. Julie insists she's fine, but she, too, looks ready to explode. When she gets buzzed by

a delivery driver she asks them to leave the package at the door. We can't help but wonder if the package is Solotov's bomb.

Memphis goes to meet with the reporter Jeffrey Denning in a parking garage. She confirms that rogue CIA agent Hugh Meachum was running a heroin ring in Afghanistan, and asks Denning to keep Swagger's name out of the story in return for the info. Denning insists the story is bigger than Meachum, and the operation is still running, even a year after Meachum's death. Denning tells her about a rare earth mining company called Gravity Metals and shows her pictures of Waheed Zakeer, who exploded in Frankfurt last week after a visit from Solotov. Denning suggests it's odd that he was transferred there by his company from the desert of Afghanistan two months ago. She suggests Memphis find out why.

Reluctant partners Johnson and Swagger stop by the sheriff's station looking into Dobbs' murder. The Sheriff Brown isn't inclined to pursue it himself, but sends them to the cartel that runs the area. Johnson and Swagger pull up to the cartel house in a neighborhood. Swagger sets up on overwatch while Johnson goes in to talk, asking where the cartel stashes assassins when they come to town. Despite Swagger's directive not to pull his gun and the fact he's outnumbered, Johnson gets impatient and draws his weapon. From afar, Swagger can see the situation is about to go sideways. He shoots a gun out of one man's hand and shoots another in the hand. The gangsters tell him about the man they brought across the border who killed their people. Johnson gets directions to the trailer park.

Memphis heads to Gravity Metals where an office punk named Toby gives her a lot of attitude and no information. Suffice to say, it does not seem like Gravity Metals is really in the mining business. When Memphis returns later with Denning and a warrant, the place is completely cleaned out. Denning seems to believe Memphis is trying to help and shows her a picture of his source. Memphis is stunned and suggests Denning lay low for awhile while she talks to someone.

Johnson and Swagger set up on a hill over Solotov's trailer in the mobile home park. Swagger wants to take their time and plan an approach before rushing arguably the best shooter in the world, but Johnson has no such patience. He runs up to the trailer firing, with no regard for his own safety. He blasts away, standing out in the open with only vengeance on his mind.

At home, Julie brings the box that was delivered inside. In the park, Solotov sneaks out a hole in the floor of the trailer and crawls away. Julie opens the box – but it's just full of paper towels. Swagger yells at Johnson to get away from the trailer right before it explodes. Swagger checks on Johnson then runs into the trailer, and right into Solotov. The two men fight and Swagger breaks Solotov's wrist, but he manages to get away to his car and drive off wildly through the trailer park. Suffering from the effects of being knocked out by the explosion and filled with rage, Johnson stumbles after the car firing wildly, ignoring Swagger's shouts to cease fire. Finally, worried about the civilians around them, Swagger shoots Johnson in the chest.

In Afghanistan flashback, over a late night drink, Johnson admits to Swagger that he believes Donnie was right that Solotov killed the mullah's wife. And Solotov the "UN doctor" has now disappeared. Johnson is struggling with how to write up his report, knowing it's political dynamite. But Swagger sees things more clearly, believing the truth matters.

Julie stops by the church late at night, where the priest tries to get her to open up. She admits she feels on edge all the time and is struggling. Meanwhile, Johnson wakes up in the back of Swagger's car, aching from where Swagger shot him in his chest plate. Swagger accuses him of being completely out of control.

Solotov races away from the trailer park, nearly blinded by pain from what Swagger did to his wrist. He stops at a seedy motel. In his room, he goes about fixing his wrist by slamming it in a dresser drawer to get the bones back into place, taking swigs of vodka to numb the pain. He makes a call to someone, saying he'll be staying a little longer.

Swagger brings Johnson home with him and finds Julie sitting down with Memphis in his living room. Memphis catches them up to speed, telling them that Denning's source is Kirk Zehnder – who supposedly dead. They know that Zehnder had mental health issues but his initial information to Denning seemed to check out. He supposedly sent Denning corroboration in a file by courier, but the courier never showed. A week later, Zehnder committed suicide. Memphis tells Johnson and Swagger about the man she found going through Swagger's hotel room. She shows them a sketch. Johnson recognizes him as the UN doctor and Swagger recognizes him as the man who attacked him in the trailer: Solotov. Memphis learned Zehnder has a storage facility under a false name and wants to look into it. Swagger suggests Alexi Prosovich, the Russian

mafioso who protected him in prison, might have info. They wonder how much Patricia Gregson is involved, but for the moment, seem to think someone else is calling the shots.



# The Man Called Noon

**Afghanistan flashback** — On the base after the disastrous transport, Zehnder is fired up that Johnson isn't going to look into Donnie's suspicions about Solotov's involvement in the mullah's wife's death. He wonders who ordered them to hit the mullah and who Johnson told about the wife's transport. He grabs the tossed copy of Donnie's report. The other members of the unit are resigned to moving on from the whole affair.

**Present time** — Far away up on a hill, Solotov does recon. He meets with two lo-

cal fighters and tells them to broadcast his name on the radio for the Marines to hear. They do, but still end up dead. Johnson reports on the legend of Solotov, a Chechen whose nickname is "the ghost." His kill count is over 400, but nobody has heard from him since 2009. The Russians wanted him so badly they bombed an entire town of civilians to get him, but he got away. Johnson won't let Swagger leave the base as long as he's Solotov's target.

Memphis breaks into Kirk Zehnder's storage locker and is looking around when she's attacked. She gets tossed around but fights back, incapacitating her attacker. She's shocked when she finally sees his face: it's Zehnder. When he wakes up, he explains that he's been hiding out for awhile, pretending to be dead to stay safe. Memphis promises to protect him in exchange for whatever he was going to give to Denning. To prove she's on his side, she calls Swagger, who's with Johnson and Yusuf Ali in Seattle to talk to Alexi Rosovich, who is out of prison and in a nursing home. Zehnder is anxious and insists they keep moving.

Inside the Seattle care facility, Swagger, Johnson, and Ali find it's a front for a bustling casino with roulette wheels and beautiful women. Rosovich denies he's dying, saying a little poison could never hurt him. They show him the Golden Crescent diagram and he takes them to meet a fellow Russian gangster, saying he'll have answers. But once at the bar, Johnson, Swagger, and Ali are stunned spectators as Rosovich lays into his rival for running an online child pornography operation and shoots him through the gut. With that business taken care of, Rosovich explains that he used Swagger for back-up because his target was untouchable by Russians. But he

makes good on his offer of help to Swagger, taking the key to the dead man's safe and showing the men a kilo of heroin with the Golden Crescent mark on it.

On the road with Memphis, Zehnder tells her about a group called Atlas that's supposedly running everything behind the scenes. As Zehnder babbles, he works on taking his cuffs off in her backseat. When Memphis takes out her phone to call Bob Lee, he grabs her phone and tosses it out the window, saying he's ready to take her to his evidence now.

Rosovich gives the Marines a history lesson on Solotov, saying he went to work for some dark organization named Atlas after the war. But no one knows what the members look like, secrecy is their first priority. Johnson thinks that explains why Solotov went after Donnie – because Donnie took Solotov's UN badge with his picture on it. Ali tells them about Zehnder keeping Donnie's report. The pieces start to fall into place. Swagger was always bothered that Solotov let his name be broadcast on the radio back in Afghanistan, but he realizes Solotov was faking a sniper versus sniper thing when Donnie was the real target. Now they're being targeted because Denning was on the story and had Zehnder's copy of the report. Swagger tries Memphis but her phone is laying by a Texas road somewhere.

Earlier in Texas, Bob Lee tried to convince Julie to leave town with Mary, but she was dead set against it. Julie heads to the firing range, where some sleazeball hits on her. She shuts him down and he calls her names. When she takes offense, another man comes to her defense. He introduces himself as Travis and explains that his arm is in a cast because his young daughter accidentally shut it the car door, so he's learning to do everything left-handed: it's Solotov. He chats up Julie, appealing to her as a parent. He walks her to her car and says he's in town selling farm equipment. When he asks for a recommendation of a good church, she tells him about St. Francis. He asks her to email him the info and gets her to take out her phone.

On the road, Memphis and Zehnder are bonding over shared conspiracy theories when Memphis notices a car following them in her rearview. Meanwhile, Swagger returns home from Seattle to find Julie in a good mood after chatting about life with Solotov. Back in his hotel room, Solotov listens as Julie quotes something he said about marriage to Bob Lee. He has turned her phone into a listening device. Then Memphis calls Swagger and tells him about their tail. Swagger formulates a plan for her to lead the tail to a refinery by his house. Solotov hears everything.

When day breaks, Swagger, Johnson and Ali are all in place as Memphis leads the car into Swagger's sights at the empty refinery. He stops the car with a bullet to the tire and Johnson and Ali rush the driver. But when they reach it, they see it was rigged and no one as at the wheel. Johnson cries ambush and they turn and start shooting as the local guns Solotov hired come out blazing. Memphis leaves Zehnder in her car but he gets anxious after the firefight breaks out and takes it and drives off. After a relatively easy fight with inexperienced gang members, Swagger, Johnson, Ali, and Memphis try to make sense of things. Memphis mentions Zehnder's allegation that Atlas shares a banker with the cartel. Swagger worries that the fact Solotov left underlings to handle them means he was really after Zehnder.

Zehnder goes back to his storage facility and retrieves Solotov's fake UN ID from its hiding place in his microwave. When he walks back out, he calls Swagger. But he doesn't get far before he takes a bullet in the chest. Solotov walks up on Zehnder and finishes him then picks up the phone. He explains to Swagger on the other end this will be over when everyone who has seen his face is gone. Solotov says: "I'm not tying up loose ends, Swagger. I am burning the rope."

Swagger is brought to the local sheriff's station for questioning about the four dead Las Fantasmas cartel members at the refinery. Sheriff Brown isn't terribly concerned about dead gang members, but suggests Swagger watch out for retaliation. He mentions that no matter what they do, the cartel's trucks of drugs leave Mexico and return full of cash every day. Swagger takes this intel back to Isaac Johnson and Yusuf Ali and suggests they follow the cartel's money back to their banker, which they know is connected to

Atlas and, therefore, Solotov.

Ali buys drugs off a Las Fantasmas member and he and Johnson watch as a courier picks up the cash. They follow it through various handoffs and locations until it ends up in a truck yard. Swagger sneaks into a semi truck and finds palettes of money. He hides as the truck hits the road. After the semi is out in the middle of nowhere, Swagger orders the couriers to pull over and lets them go. Ali is tempted by the massive piles of cash and takes a couple stacks. Swagger and Johnson rig the rest of the cash and wait for the man in charge to show up. When he does, the Marines order him to call his boss. Swagger gets on the phone and asks if he's Solotov's banker. Swagger lists all the cash warehouse locations and threatens to blow them up to get the Fantasmas coming after the banker. When banker doesn't answer Swagger, takes it as a yes. They release the hired hands but take their boss across the border.

Nadine meets with the reporter Jeffrey Denning and tells him that Kirk Zehnder wasn't dead, but is now. Denning has heard of Atlas, but can't prove the group is real. Nadine thinks they're being watched. "Atlas exists, and they're coming," she says. She calls her ex-boyfriend Harris Barnes, who works for the head of the Senate Intelligence Committee. He reluctantly meets with her and Denning to try to scare them off chasing what he says is a "ghost story" that people trot out when they need budget money. When Harris leaves, Nadine calls in the Marshals.

Back at the ranch, Solotov watches and listens to Julie, Mary and the ranch manager Estella as they load into the car and head to church for a food drive. The priest, who has a steer head

tattoo on his arm, checks in on Julie, who says she's doing better. Later, Solotov shows up to the church food drive as Travis and chats up the Swagger ladies. He gets a call that something is wrong.

In Mexico, Ali, Johnson, and Swagger scope out the banker's compound to plan their assault. With their hostage driving, Ali and Johnson ride in the truck up to the gate. They come out shooting with Ali providing cover from the hills. Inside the house, the banker races to finish a transaction on his computer. When Swagger busts in, he orders the banker to bankrupt Solotov to get his attention.

Back at the firing range, Bo Winnick, the annoying man who harassed Julie last time, is there and gets in her face again. When he steps in front of her to take her lane, she goes into a controlled rage. With her gun still in her hand, she raises it behind his head – and fires. Right past his ear. On purpose. The blast bursts Bo's eardrum and she walks away calmly as he yells in pain.

Denning packs up his things where he's been staying, but Memphis notices telltale shadows of feet on the other side of the front door. She and Denning hide in the closet. The attackers come in and are steps away when they get radioed that the Marshals are pulling up. Denning wants to wait for the Marshals, but given that Memphis' call to them brought killers, she knows they're on their own now. Later, Memphis visits Barnes to warn him that she's being followed and he should be careful. She and Denning find an airbnb for the night.

Expecting Solotov to show up soon, Swagger heads for the hills to set up on overwatch, while Johnson stays in the compound with the banker. Outside the compound, Swagger radios Ali but gets only silence. Then Solotov responds. Ali is badly wounded in a truck pulling up to the compound. Solotov jumps out and as Swagger races down the hillside to the truck with Ali trapped inside, it explodes. Swagger goes in the house and finds that Solotov has already killed the help. Solotov rigs the AC in the basement to gas the house. Outside, tanks and Federales pull up. Solotov reaches Johnson and the banker, but Johnson uses him as a shield, and Solotov doesn't want to lose his money. When Swagger busts in, Solotov jumps out the window and escapes. Swagger orders the banker to open his safe and finds a ledger. With the Federales closing in on them in the office, Johnson grows impatient and shoots the banker.

Later, Julie visits her priest to tell him about the guy at the range. Solotov enjoys listening to her story through her tapped phone.

After they escape, Swagger is angry that yet again Johnson seems to be making things personal and killing when it isn't strategic. He thinks they could have gotten more info from the banker, but Johnson is satisfied that at least Solotov can't get his money from him. They ride in angry silence back to the border, but come around a curve and run directly into a Federale road block with no escape. They're outgunned and know that opening fire would mean death. Swagger cuts open his seat and stuffs their phones and passports and the ledger. Then Swagger and Johnson slowly get out and surrender.

Summary: Bob Lee and Isaac must team up to escape a Mexican prison before Solotov finds them. As Nadine digs deeper into Atlas, the cover-up points back to Bob Lee's unit. Julie has problems with the law.



After being stopped by the Federales at gunpoint, Swagger and Johnson are almost relieved to be subject to a shake-down and not handed over to the cartel. Instead, they're taken to a prison where Acevedo, the warden, wants money, but doesn't yet know who they are. Once in lockup, Johnson is spoiling for a fight and decks the first inmate who gives him attitude. Swagger is angry, pointing out he just gave up any tactical advantage they might have had in people not knowing they could defend themselves. The close

quarters leads the men to relive the events of last year, when Johnson set-up Swagger.

After a trip to his banker's house in Mexico, Solotov turns his attention to trying to access his money. Unfortunately, the man he used to access it through is dead and a dozen calls to international accounts gets him nowhere without the banker's ledger, which Swagger has.

Julie heads to the firing range, but the manager tells her that he can't allow her to shoot after she fired her weapon near Bo Winnick's head. Julie is frustrated, but turns to leave. Solotov as "Travis" just happens to be in the parking lot. She invites him to Mary's first communion at the church on Sunday, saying that Bob Lee will be there.

In prison, Swagger is disturbed to hear Johnson's obvious lack of respect for human life. Johnson says he stopped caring when they killed his wife. Swagger insists nothing makes killing arbitrarily acceptable, then proves it by stopping a shiv attempt on Johnson by another inmate, while leaving the attacker wounded but alive. Johnson takes the opportunity to try to clear his conscience a little, telling Swagger he didn't agree with the call to send someone to kill him in prison last year. Johnson claims he feels bad every day about killing Donnie Fenn's 70-year-old mother, but insists Jack Payne would have tortured her if he hadn't. He knows it was wrong and isn't looking for redemption.

When Jeffrey Denning shares Zehnder's discharge papers with Memphis, she notices something off. The papers include his psych evaluation, which wouldn't have been released for privacy

reasons. There's a signature of the person who released the papers, but it's redacted. She suspects someone, possibly Johnson, was trying to discredit Zehnder by faking the eval. They head to visit Angela Tio, hoping for help.

Swagger and Johnson are plotting their escape when the guards come for Swagger. Acevedo has seen the alerts for them in connection with the death of the banker, Carlos Cruz. He's after the contents of the banker's safe, which Swagger stuffed in the truck seat when they were pulled over. Acevedo offers to let Swagger go if he turns it over, but Swagger plays dumb. When he returns to the yard he tells Johnson that he's in the Federales system, which they both know means Solotov will be coming soon.

They start a fight and try to sneak out in the chaos, but run into the gangster that Johnson punched, who isn't inclined to help them leave. The warden is out of patience when neither Marine is willing to give him the ledger, so he locks them in small upright wooden boxes (think: standing coffin) in the hot Mexico sun. With nowhere to go, Swagger asks Johnson again why he set him up last year. Johnson thought he was doing important work with Gregson and wanted to know what it was like to be in charge. He claims he saw setting up Swagger as a mission and took his emotions out of it, but they both know that's a lie. Swagger passes out briefly in the heat and when he comes to, Johnson is gone. Acevedo tells him Johnson agreed to his deal but won't give him what he wants until he sees Swagger go free. Swagger briefly fights back as an excuse to get slammed to the warden's desk and swipe something. He slips it to Johnson as they pass on his way out, saying he'll see him soon.

Julie is shopping by herself in a hardware store when a man runs into her cart then makes it clear he's a friend of Bo Winnick. Another man shows up and soon Mary sees Bo himself, with his bandaged ear from her gunshot. The men try to intimidate her. Winnick has learned about Bob Lee and thinks he's good for a payout, but Julie isn't in the mood for a shakedown and threatens to sic Bob Lee on him instead, warning him to stay away.

In the back of a Federale car, Swagger understands the driver and his friend as they discuss where to kill him. Luckily, he has loosened the screen separating him from the front cab and easily kicks it out onto them, getting a gun. He pulls over and learns the location of the car impound lot and that Acevedo plans to kill Johnson, too.

Tio reluctantly agrees to access Zehnder's records for Memphis and Denning, to confirm that someone altered them. Tio goes inside the record room, but takes too long to come back. When Memphis follows her trail, she discovers that Tio, and the box of records, are in the wind. They stop by her barracks, which has been cleaned out except for a book with a photo of her with a man inside. Denning thinks it looks like the man is in hospital scrubs, but Memphis recognizes them as something else.

In his box at the prison, Johnson works on the screws with a coin Swagger slipped to him. Acevedo comes for him, wanting to know where the ledger is. He tells him it's in Swagger's truck. The guards throw him back in a box, but it's a different one and he's back to square one with the screws. Meanwhile, after hearing through Julie's tapped phone that Swagger is in Mexico, Solotov finds Johnson in the Federale database and shows up at the prison, posing as an ATF agent ready to bend the rules. He bribes Acevedo, who takes him to the wooden boxes, but Johnson's box is empty. Acevedo has outlived his usefulness, so Solotov steps behind him and shoots him in the head. After Solotov walks away, Johnson emerges from another box where he was hiding and helps himself to Acevedo's gun as he goes.

Tio comes home in Columbus to find Memphis and Denning waiting for her. Her brother gets out of prison in nearby Mansfield in four months, on a reduced sentence. Someone paid off the house right around the time she heard the name Hugh Meachum. She agrees to tell them everything, but worries who else might be after her.

After retrieving the ledger from the truck at the impound lot, Swagger buries it and the safe contents in the desert and heads for home. Meanwhile, Johnson makes his way to freedom outside the prison, but he has a long way to go. Swagger returns back to Texas in a harried and disheveled state and only has long enough to tell Julie that Ali is dead and he doesn't know where Johnson is before Sheriff Brown shows up. But he's not there for Bob Lee — Bo Winnick filed a complaint, the sheriff is there for Julie.

Summary: Bob Lee tries to draw Solotov into the open, but realizes the Chechen holds the upper hand. Flashbacks reveal the origins of Solotov, while Isaac is courted by his creator in the present.



**Chechen-Russian Conflict, 2005** — Surrounded by carnage in the midst of war, Solotov protects dozens of people hunkered down in a warehouse. He takes out every attacker he sees, but he's no match for the sarin gas. He collapses. Moments later, Addison Hayes makes his way through the gas clouds, in a suit, naturally, and gets help dragging an unconscious Solotov away from the gas. He injects him with adrenaline *Pulp Fiction*-style and Solotov sputters back to life. "Welcome back, welcome home," Hayes

says.

**Present time** — At the Swagger ranch, Bob Lee tries to understand why Julie would blow out Bo Winnick's ear. She tells him she hasn't felt right since before Frankfurt. He listens to her, validating her stress and assuring her he's on her side. But he wants her to leave town so he can deal with Solotov. She refuses, especially since Sheriff Brown has said she can't leave the county, and Mary's First Communion is tomorrow.

In Columbus, Ohio, Tio tells Jeffrey Denning and Memphis that everything Kirk Zehnder was claiming was true. The CIA was selling heroin in Afghanistan and Atlas sent in someone posing as a UN doctor (she doesn't say who) to kill the mulah's wife because she knew too much. Tio is only still alive because she took their money. When Zehnder started talking, they ordered her to discredit him so Denning wouldn't have a reliable source for his story. Memphis makes plans with her office to transport Tio to safety at a regional office in Dayton, although Tio is terrified and sure Atlas can get her anywhere, anytime.

Swagger picks up a satellite phone he got from the banker and pushes redial. Hayes answers. When Swagger says he wants to talk to Solotov, Hayes tells Swagger to hang onto the phone and Solotov will call because he wants his money. Julie finds Bob Lee packing up to go out on

overwatch in the dark. He's bothered that she didn't tell him she was having problems, but she points out he kept information from her, too, about the threat when they got back from Frankfurt.

At the border, Isaac Johnson swims across the Rio Grande and into Texas. Militia men find him walking through the tunnel. He puts his hands up and informs them he's American and armed. The good ol' boys throw some racist threats his way and Johnson can tell he's not safe. When one is close enough, Johnson grabs his knife and stabs him in the foot. Johnson is relieved when actual law enforcement shows up and arrests him. In jail, Johnson gets a visit from a guard who tells him that Patricia Gregson denied knowing him and he's being extradited to Mexico for killing a man – and it's all on video.

Hayes finds Gregson, wanting to be reassured that everything went as planned at the border. They have clearly known and been working together for years, even if they aren't friendly.

Swagger is on overwatch outside his house when Solotov finally calls. He's set up a few hundreds yards away. Solotov asks if his boss hesitated before selling him out, Swagger says no, but Solotov still won't give him Hayes' name, saying he's more dangerous than Swagger knows. Solotov claims that he let Swagger live in Afghanistan because he felt kinship with him after watching him for weeks, but Swagger thinks he just missed. The two snipers analyze each other's positions in the hills, deducing where they might have set up. Solotov makes clear that he's nearby and can take everything that matters to Swagger.

A car comes for Johnson, but they're clearly not Mexican Federales. It's Hayes. "I'm sorry Ms. Gregson was so unaccommodating, but I do think I'm much more suited to help you than she is," he says. Hayes explains things to Johnson in a scene that mirrors his talk with Solotov in Bucharest, Romania in 2005. Both men are without family or resources and Hayes told both they had to set aside their emotions to work for "the invisible hand that maintains order in a chaotic world." Hayes says now that Solotov forgot that invisibility is essential to their success. He claims Solotov killed Johnson's wife, Lin. Back in 2005, Solotov saw he didn't have much choice but to work for Hayes, and Johnson sees the same as Hayes orders him to kill Solotov. Later, as Johnson selects his weapon from the Atlas armory, another member cautions Johnson that once he's in, there's no getting out – that was Solotov's mistake.

Julie goes to Bo Winnick's house and gives him one of Bob Lee's guns as a peace offering. She says her family has been through hell and going to jail would break her and Mary. Bo scoffs at her gesture and says she's lucky it isn't loaded. Prepping for his own fight, Solotov listens as Bo rages at her and all Swaggers.

Swagger studies Solotov's tracks outside his house and notices markings different from a typical long gun set-up. He researches in guns and ammo magazines and finds a kind of tripod that would make the marks he found – the kind of thing a man with a broken arm would use to fire from distance! On his way to Mary's communion later, Swagger drops by the firing range to find out if he's sold any equipment that could be used to prop up a long gun, like something someone might use if they had an injured hand. The range owner asks if Swagger's inquiries have anything to do with Julie's friend with the broken arm. Swagger's ears perk up and he races out after hearing the man's build generally matches Solotov.

At the church, Julie is recording Mary's First Communion when Bob Lee calls. Solotov is sitting in the back of the church. Swagger races there, calling Julie frantically, but she's not answering. Meanwhile, Johnson does recon outside. Swagger pulls up outside the church and grabs a handgun, which he wraps in his blazer jacket. He sits behind Solotov in the church and threatens to kill him right there. Then Solotov reveals the bomb vest under his jacket and says there's another at the front of the church and he's holding a dead man's switch, so if Swagger shoots him, the bomb detonates and they all die.

On the road in a neighborhood, Memphis and Denning are forced to slow down when a homeless woman's cart of stuff is overturned in the road. Memphis notices it seems too clean and they speed off, trying to avoid a set-up. But Tio gets anxious and jumps out of the car. She races to a nearby bus and gets on, bumping into a woman in a suit. The woman keeps walking to a car and reveals the syringe in her hand. Memphis catches up to Tio on the bus but she's already convulsing with blood frothing out of her mouth. With her dying breath, she tells Memphis: "Hayes is Atlas."

In the church, Solotov explains that he wants all of Atlas' money, not just his own. Swagger calls it revenge; he calls it justice. In the front of the church, as angry as Julie is that Bob Lee is late, she notices something off between her husband and the man she knows as Travis. Swagger

gives Solotov his gun and offers to leave with him if he doesn't detonate the bombs. Solotov agrees and they leave together out the front door. They're not clear of the church when Johnson steps out and yells at Swagger to get down. Swagger shouts "no" and dives in front of Johnson's bullet to prevent Solotov's bomb inside the church from detonating. Johnson's bullet hits Swagger in the back and he goes down. Solotov fires back. Solotov helps Swagger into his SUV and tells him to tell Johnson not to fire. Johnson watches as Solotov drives off with Swagger.

In Washington, D.C, a supremely pissed off Memphis barges into her ex Harris Barnes' office, but she's not there to see him, she's there for his boss: Senator Addison Hayes.

Back at her house, Julie packs up frantically but notices the barn door is open. She takes a gun out of the safe and goes to inspect. She finds Johnson inside. She holds her weapon on him as he explains what happened outside at the church. When she explains how she knows Solotov and that she invited him, Johnson asks if he ever got close to her phone. Johnson smashes it, realizing it's why Solotov has always gotten ahead of them. Johnson points out that, because Swagger is injured, they're on the clock. He asks if she can handle a gun and she assures him she can.

In the back of his truck, Solotov pries the bullet out of Swagger's side and closes him up with a staple gun. Swagger is in excruciating pain and incapacitated, but alive. "When I have what I need, Swagger, then you can die," Solotov says. "Until then, we are bound together."

Summary: Bob Lee Swagger is kidnapped by Solotov. Julie and Isaac team up to save him. Nadine confronts Hayes about Atlas. New information about Bob Lee's father Earl Swagger sets off a new mission.



Bob Lee Swagger is badly wounded and being held by the Chechen sniper T. Solotov, who only needs Swagger alive long enough to tell him where he hid the bank ledger for Atlas, Solotov's former employer. Meanwhile, Isaac Johnson, who recently agreed to start working for Atlas, and Julie Swagger, who is just trying to save her husband, are on their tail. In Washington, D.C., FBI Agent Nadine Memphis confronts Sen. Addison Hayes for his role in Atlas. In the desperate race to save Swagger, memories of the past

and hints of the future indicate that there is more to Atlas than we know.

**West Texas, 1988** — Late at night, Sheriff Earl Swagger pulls up next to a barn and windmill and calls out for a man named Jimmy Poole, who has escaped from prison. Earl tries to convince Jimmy to drop his weapon, but he opens fire. Earl is hit before Jimmy falls. Earl makes it to his car to radio in for help. But before he can give his position, he's felled with a shot to the heart.

**Present time** — Bob Lee Swagger wakes up in Solotov's car and promptly jumps out of the moving vehicle. He's badly wounded and handcuffed, but he stumbles over uneven ground, ripping the staples from his side until he collapses. Solotov finds him easily. Swagger explains that with his staples out he figures he has 20 minutes until he bleeds out, and they're nowhere near a hospital so Solotov isn't getting the ledger. Solotov knocks him out and takes him to a nearby veterinarian. As he fades in and out of consciousness, Bob Lee remembers the day his father died. They went hunting and his dad stressed the importance of not racking a bullet until he had the shot, making him repeat "if it ain't loaded, it ain't lethal." They were interrupted when now-Sheriff Brown told them about Jimmy's escape. Swagger wakes up on the veterinarian's table.

The vet distracts Solotov and tries to run, giving Swagger a chance to put a horseshoe under the car tire. The vet doesn't get far before Solotov cuts him down. To convince Swagger to give him the ledger, Solotov sets up on sheriff's deputies and prepares to take aim. Swagger finally agrees, to ensure no one else gets hurt.

In his office, Nadine Memphis confronts Sen. Hayes about running Atlas, which he flatly denies before leveling veiled threats. Later, Memphis meets up with Hayes' aide and her ex Harris Downey, who confirms Hayes called Patricia Gregson, the deputy director of the Defense Intelligence Agency, after she left. Memphis takes Harris to see Jeffrey Denning but they find him hanging in his apartment. Harris finally believes his boss is what Memphis says he is.

Isaac Johnson and Julie Swagger toss Solotov's hotel room and find GPS coordinates, which led them to an empty house and an ambush. They take out the handful of Atlas guns waiting for them. Later, Johnson gets a call from Hayes, telling him where Solotov is headed.

Swagger remembers his parents fighting the day his dad died, with his mom not wanting his dad to go after the escaped con on his day off. But Earl insisted he had to because it was Jimmy. Out on the road, Solotov and Swagger encounter a roadblock. Solotov speeds up to blast through it, betting that the deputies won't fire with Swagger in the car beside him. Swagger tries to stop Solotov, but he opens fire and they speed around. Fading in and out, Swagger remembers his father talking to Jimmy's wife, who relays a message that it's a big misunderstanding and Jimmy wants to talk to him by the windmill. Out on the road, Solotov's car sputters to a stop. Swagger intervenes to keep Solotov from killing a man in a pick-up who stops. When they reach the campground where the ledger is buried, Solotov again warns Swagger that if he doesn't get the ledger, Julie and Mary die. As they walk the few miles to the buried book, Solotov claims that he and Swagger have a common aim of wanting to destroy Atlas. When Swagger says he doesn't care about Atlas, Solotov brings up Earl Swagger's death, and the fact he wasn't alone when he died. We flash back to what turns out to be another of Bob Lee's memories from that day — from the back of his dad's patrol car, where he stowed away to be near his dad. Bob Lee saw his father murdered.

Memphis confronts Hayes at a hotel where he's waiting for his mistress. Harris watches as Memphis taunts his boss with the news that the ledger is missing and he's broke. Hayes remains calm, but does manage to fire Harris. As he waits for his car later, Hayes tells a mysterious man the mission is still a go.

Solotov tells Bob Lee that the Swaggers and Atlas have been mixed up since the beginning, and it wasn't luck that Johnson framed him. Johnson and Julie arrive at the campsite parking lot as Swagger and Solotov reach the ledger. Swagger warns Solotov that it's booby trapped, but Solotov doesn't buy it and starts digging. He finds the ledger buried with a gun. He takes both out and raises the gun to shoot Swagger. But Swagger is ready. He breaks out of his zip tie and charges Solotov, who squeezes the trigger, only to find it wasn't loaded. Swagger goes for Solotov's broken wrist and the two fight for their lives until Swagger finally gets the upper hand by cracking Solotov's head on a rock. With Solotov beaten, Swagger picks up Solotov's gun and says of his own, "if it ain't loaded, it ain't lethal." Then he pulls the trigger on Solotov's, which most certainly is, and finally finishes off the Chechen sniper. As he fades out in the desert sun, Swagger remembers Sheriff Brown being there after his father was killed. He got Bob Lee out of the car and told him that no good could ever come of anyone knowing he was there that night. Julie and Johnson wake Swagger. Johnson takes the ledger, promising he's going to go finish things.

More than a week later, Hayes is surprised but pleased to find Johnson waiting for him in his hotel room after making his way across the country undetected. Hayes likes that Johnson told Swagger his family is safe as long as he forgets about the ledger. "It actually serves my purpose to let him think we have a deal," Hayes says, as he pours himself a Scotch. When Johnson asks about his plans for Memphis, Hayes says he's having her and Gregson investigated. He reaches for the ledger but Johnson holds onto it. Then Hayes starts to get woozy. Memphis walks out. Hayes starts sputtering. Memphis explains to Hayes that he's having a heart attack. He falls to the floor, telling them "this changes nothing." As Hayes dies, Johnson announces to Memphis: "This is who I am now. Are you sure you want to go down this road?" Memphis says she used to believe in the rule of law, but she sees that laws won't stop Atlas. "I quit the FBI this morning," she says. "Time to start my new job."

In a small basement apartment filled with computer screens, "The Jackal" sits down and sees

the news about Hayes' death. He opens a locked case and makes a secure call, giving a code and asking how to proceed. He answers: "Yes, but I'll still need the card."

Summary: Bob Lee visits a local prison for answers about his dad's murder. Julie takes a job helping the family lawyer. Nadine and Isaac grab Harris Downey, who knows more about Atlas than he realizes.



Bob Lee Swagger is trying to heal and move on, but the fact that Solotov knew details about his father's murder doesn't sit right with him. He starts digging with the help of Sheriff Justin Brown and quickly runs into people who would like Earl Swagger to remain buried in the past.

Swagger visits the Wilson penitentiary, where Jimmy Poole escaped from 30 years ago. The warden Rick Culp is evasive and Swagger is suspicious when he sees provisions from the Bama Cattle

company everywhere; he remembers hearing they were hiring undocumented labor and cut a deal with the Feds. The warden abruptly wraps things up, then calls Bama Cattle to report Swagger was poking around. Next, Swagger meets Sheriff Brown at the now-closed bank that Jimmy Poole robbed the day he escaped. Poole's case file only leads to more questions, like where did he get the gun he used, and why did he shoot a security guard on his way out when he already had the cash? Even stranger, he left the money in his stolen car then walked down the street and ate a cheeseburger as the sheriff's deputies closed in. Brown suggests Jimmy was waiting for a gunfight, but left when Earl didn't show up. But Swagger thinks he was waiting for a ride.

Nadine Memphis and Isaac Johnson pressure Harris Downey into using his security clearance to get access to Hayes' office safe. While he's cleaning out the top secret files, the police arrive and arrest him. But it turns out Team Swagger staged the arrest to sneak the files past Atlas. Going through the contents of the safe later, they find a kill list with all of their names on it, plus Solotov, Martin Jacobs, and Carlita Cruise with the Department of Agriculture. Johnson and

Memphis visit Cruise's apartment and find it empty. Memphis finds her "go bag" under the sink and accidentally sets off the flash bangs at the bottom of it. Memphis is dazed but OK. They've found another member of Atlas. Meanwhile, "the Jackal" visits Hayes' office on the trail of the files.

Swagger pays a visit to the Poole farm. Jimmy's mother Adele and nephew Johnny aren't Swagger family fans. Bob Lee wants to know why Jimmy would run if he only had two weeks left on his sentence. His mother says he had a job lined up at Bama Cattle. They tell Swagger that Jimmy's wife, Edie, ran off after he was killed. On his way out, Johnny's teenage daughter Suzy tells Swagger her aunt sends her a birthday card every year. He notices the bruises on her arms. On his way home, Swagger stops to fill up his car and hears gunshots coming from inside the station. He investigates and sees second gunman covering the entrance. He goes around back and has a clean shot at the first robber, and hits him in the hand. He tackles the second robber, demanding to know why the man was waiting for him. When Sheriff Brown arrives later, he tells Swagger the men worked for Bama Cattle. Swagger thinks the hold-up was a set-up for him.

The next day, Swagger barges into the office of Red Bama Jr. at Bama Cattle and confronts him about the hold-up. Red plays dumb. Swagger isn't having it. "When I hunt, I like to look at my prey up close, to see what I'm dealing with," he says. After Swagger's visit, Greg starts doing lines of cocaine and freaking out. He wants to gas up the jet and leave, but his henchman Bert lets him know his dad is on the way and gave strict orders for them to proceed as if everything is normal. Greg is clearly afraid of his dad.

When he comes home, Swagger finds Sheriff Brown waiting for him. Red Bama filed a restraining order against him. When Swagger says he won't quit 'til he knows the truth, Brown brings him back to his office and plays him a tape of his dad's radio from the night of the murder. The final shot doesn't sound right to the sniper's ear. The shot report comes over a full second later, which means it couldn't have been Jimmy, who was only 20 feet away. There was a second shooter. Swagger visits his lawyer Sam Vincent, with Brown and Julie backing him up in his request to exhume his dad's body. As they stand over the gravesite later, Bert observes from afar. Before the excavator starts digging, Swagger realizes they're in the wrong place — his dad was buried next to veterans. They Earl's headstone was moved, but they find the right spot and dig. After examining the body, the coroner reports he found three bullets and a patch with an eagle and stars and stripes on top of the body. The bullet he found in the chest wound was a rifle round. "My dad was killed by a sniper," Swagger says.

Bob Lee Swagger continues digging into his father's past while babysitting Harris Downey so that Nadine Memphis and Isaac Johnson can keep shaking the Atlas tree. Swagger tries to turn up the heat on Bama Cattle, but only manages to poke the bear. Red Bama Jr. gets a thoroughly emasculating visit from his father, Red Bama Sr., who chastises him for going after Swagger and missing. It turns out Sr. is Undersecretary for the Department of Agriculture for the past three administrations, and it can't be a coinci-

dence that's where the missing Carlita Cruise worked.

After Memphis and Johnson deliver Harris to Swagger in Texas for safekeeping, they visit another address for Carlita Cruise in Baltimore, Maryland. She's waiting for them. She tries to convince them she wants to help, noting the only way off an Atlas kill list is to kill Atlas. She explains that half the agents in Atlas don't even know who they work for, so to get anywhere up the Atlas chain they need access to a cleaner who has more direct contact with the bosses. She proposes using herself as bait.

In Texas, Swagger drags Harris along to rattle Rick Culp, the guard who was on duty the day Jimmy Poole escaped, now the warden. Culp stumbles out of a bar early in the morning and after a brief confrontation, they follow him to directly to Bama Cattle, where he tries to shakedown Red Bama Jr. for more money. Senior ends the negotiation with a knife to Culp's neck. He's concerned about staying on schedule. Driving away, Harris is bothered that Swagger knew what might happen to Culp and didn't intervene, but Swagger says Culp made his choice 30 years ago. They follow the Bamas to their country club. Swagger strolls up and asks about Atlas and why Sr. paid Culp to let Jimmy Poole walk out of prison. Sr. insults and taunts Swagger, but gives up

nothing, other than a sly suggestion that Earl Swagger may have had a relationship with Edie Poole, Jimmy's wife. Sr. does a double take when Swagger introduces Harris, but Swagger gets nowhere before they're thrown out.

Johnson and Memphis stake out Carlita as she does an Atlas drop. They follow her as she is followed by an agent, then exchange gunfire with him while Carlita doubles back to get the cleaner following them all. She grabs his secure phone and demands to know where Rousseau is. When the cleaner won't talk, she shoots him and disappears. Johnson and Memphis head back to Carlita's safe house and are barely surprised when she's not there. But they find she left them her passcode generator to go with the secure phone as a lovely parting gift.

In a series of flashbacks from Earl Swagger's files, we see that after a particularly heroic mission, a man named Rousseau recruited Earl for something he promised would lead to a better life. In the Intelligence Program training, Rousseau reveals that Earl Swagger is there for his leadership abilities, the way men follow him without question. For part of that training, Earl and his men, including one named Colby, were held in bamboo cages in the blistering sun without water to test their resolve. Earl passed and is eventually welcomed to "the family." Colby quit, but his name is the only one in Earl Swagger's file, so Harris and Bob Lee pay him a visit. (While walking up to Colby's house, Harris suggests they try a "Simon & Simon" approach — a winking reference to the 1980s detective show that starred Gerald McRaney.)

Colby recognizes Bob Lee immediately and tells him that after they got back, Earl came to him asking about the men running the unit. He was killed two weeks later. They're interrupted when an SUV pulls up and Bama Cattle men pour out shooting. Colby and Swagger fire back but Colby is hit. He tells Downey to grab his shadow box of medals, and points them to a trap door exit before he dies. Outside, Swagger barks at Downey to run for the car, but Downey gets brave along the way and tackles one of the gunmen. They grapple for his gun while Swagger goes hand to hand with Bert Sallinger, with Swagger finally finishing him. Downey manages to get the gun and fires, killing the man and ending up covered in blood. Swagger points out the men were coming for Downey, too; he must know more than he thinks.

Red Bama Jr. joins his father in his office, gloating that it's not so easy to kill Bob Lee Swagger. His father does not appreciate his tone, and grabs his son by the neck, telling him Sallinger is dead because of his mistake. "Don't you go peacocking around me again or I'll feed you to Swagger myself," his dad snarls. Meanwhile, back at the Swagger ranch, Bob Lee notices a Phoenix program patch in Colby's shadow box. It matches the one buried with his dad. Then Downey remembers that Sen. Addison Hayes used to meet with a bunch of old Phoenix guys once a month. They realize that Phoenix became Atlas, and Earl Swagger was one of the founding fathers.

Bob Lee Swagger approaches Red Bama Sr. again with questions about Phoenix and Atlas. Bama suggests that Earl Swagger was having an affair with Edie Poole and the Pooles killed Earl for it. Bama offers to leave Swagger alone if he turns over Harris Downey. Instead, Swagger puts Downey on a bus to Dallas, but Bama doesn't give up that easily.

When the secure Atlas phone rings, Nadine Memphis and Isaac Johnson split up to cover the possible locations of the next target, an arms broker named Lee.

Memphis grabs Lee before Atlas can get to him and leaves him in a hotel room with Johnson to go collect Downey from Dallas. Memphis is outside the bus station on the phone with Downey as he gets off the bus, but she never makes it to him – he's snatched up. When Johnson hears the news, he hangs Lee off the hotel balcony. Upside-down Lee names the places he's set up explosives for Atlas, including a place in Missouri called Five Mile. This means something to Johnson, but he doesn't think very highly of Lee's occupation. He drops Lee to the ground below.

When Swagger rolls up, Johnny Poole thinks he has come to cause trouble for their opioid operation. While Swagger is distracted, another Poole knocks him out with a stun gun and he wakes up tied to a chair with Johnny throwing darts at him. Johnny's daughter, Suzy, tries to intervene, and gets hit in the head for her trouble. Swagger is more annoyed than worried about his situation. He quickly cuts himself free and tackles the bigger Poole to the ground, twisting his arm and demanding answers. The man insists that if a Poole had shot Earl, they never would have kept quiet about it. Swagger is about to leave when he hears them yelling at Suzy, so he doubles back to throw the Poole men around and let them know he'll be watching if anything happens to her. When he reaches his car, there's a note saying "Daley's feed and saddlery." Swagger remembers his dad taking him there to see Edie.

At Red Bama Sr.'s farm house, Downey is offered a job in exchange for an item that Hayes had in his safe. Bama Sr. says it belonged to him and shows Downey a picture of something

he calls the "god box," a small white thing that looks like a thick keycard. It was made by a German mathematician and can decrypt something. Downey tells him truthfully that he's never seen anything like it.

Johnson, Memphis, and Bob Lee Swagger make plans to rescue Downey. Johnson initially holds back, but then confesses that he's been to the Five Mile location where Lee sent explosives. It's owned by the Department of Agriculture, meaning Red Bama Sr., and Johnson went to a meeting a few years ago with CIA Agent Hugh Meachum. It's where they decided to set up Swagger.

The next day, Swagger sneaks up to the remote property. He takes out one guard and watches as Bama has Downey taken away to a mineshaft entrance. In the dark tunnel, Downey babbles for his life and then remembers Swagger's self-defense lesson and fights back. When the wounded guard returns to Bama with a bleeding face, Bama orders him to blow the mine. Swagger hears the order over the radio and finds Downey in the dark. Above ground, Memphis tries to tackle a gunman – instead of shooting him – and is losing when Johnson arrives and shoots him. Before Johnson can lecture her on needing to be more ruthless, she recovers her gun just in time to kill the man sneaking up on Johnson. The ground starts rumbling with the explosion and the mine entrance shed is blown to smithereens. A few moments later, Swagger and Downey come sputtering out of another exit — smoky but unscathed.

Julie Swagger, who is feeling shut out by Bob Lee, reveals that she paid Edie Poole a visit. Edie told her it was all true. It started as pen pals while Earl was in Vietnam and developed after Earl arrested Jimmy a decade later. Julie gives Bob Lee a stack of Earl's letters that Edie gave her. In the Swagger's panic room, Johnson and Memphis take stock of what Bama Sr. was looking for. They realize that if they don't have the "god box" keycard from the safe, then Patricia Gregson must.

Red Bama Sr. gets in his car outside his house, but instead of his driver behind the wheel he finds Atlas operative Jack Long, who is impatient over the delay in the return of the decryption card. Long lets Bama know he's on the clock.

Still looking for Phoenix/Atlas answers, Swagger remembers his dad mentioning a man in his squad named Ramon Gutierrez. Swagger tracks him down through the VA and pays him a visit at a rundown apartment building. Gutierrez remembers Earl Swagger as the nicest

man he ever met, which doesn't sound like the Earl that Bob Lee knew. And when Gutierrez tells the wrong story about how he hurt his leg — Earl told Bob Lee the real Gutierrez accidentally shot himself — Bob Lee knows it's a set up. Another operative busts in and tries to take on Swagger but it doesn't go well. Swagger throws them both around the apartment.

Nadine Memphis and Isaac Johnson decide the way to get to Red Bama Sr., and Atlas, is to get the thing he wants. They grab Patricia Gregson from her office and explain they want to draw out the other Atlas members by dangling the decryption card, and she's going to get it for them. Later, Gregson approaches Bama with an offer: the card — and Memphis and Johnson on a platter — in exchange for a seat at the Atlas table.

Armed with an address in D.C. that he got from interrogating the fake Gutierrez, Swagger goes home and packs a bag. Julie struggles to understand his fixation on his father's death all these years later and asks him to think about the family he has now. Swagger remembers his dad shut him out the same way he's shutting out Julie now.

In D.C., after the Atlas front Gutierrez gave Swagger proves to be a bust, Memphis makes a pitch that they, along with Harris Downey, work together. Even if their reasons are different, they all want Atlas. They know not to trust Gregson, but Swagger and Johnson meet her at

a high-tech storage facility. She leads them through many layers of security and retrieves the card where she hid it after swiping it from Hayes' safe. Then the guns come. Swagger shoves Gregson to temporary safety inside the bulletproof double doors on the way out and takes out one gunman, while Johnson dispatches another. A third man comes at Gregson from outside and she's trapped inside the doors, unarmed. Finally, both doors open at the same time and Swagger shoots through to save Gregson.

Unfazed by the Atlas attempt on her life, Gregson calls Bama to keep the meet at Hayes' memorial. At a university the next day, Harris and Gregson go inside to meet Bama with Swagger, Memphis and Johnson staking out the outside. The place is lousy with security. Gregson approaches Bama inside and once she shows him the decryption card, he tells her he'll round up the other Atlas members and meet her in a room. Swagger spots Jack Long brushing into Bama and follows him into the basement, but is cut off by another operative in the kitchen. They grapple back and forth amid pots and pans and Swagger takes him out, then gets just a second to catch his breath before another man comes at him.

Outside the ballroom on the ground floor, Memphis prepares to take on two approaching Atlas operatives, but she doesn't have to. Carlita Cruise jumps out and takes out both men, saying she still hasn't managed to get clear of Atlas. They find Harris, who tells them Gregson went to meet with Atlas. Johnson goes to the room, but it's empty. Meanwhile, Gregson goes down a dark hallway, utterly exposed. Jack Long finds her. "Tell Red he has me to thank when he realizes how screwed Atlas is," she says. Long shoots her then looks for the card. It's not there.

The group finds Gregson's body and can see they're too late. They regroup at the bunker. Since Harris was the last to see her alive, he tries to recreate their interaction and remembers her straightening his jacket. He finds the decryption card in his pocket. Gregson figured out how to sacrifice for something bigger than herself after all.

Later, as Swagger prepares to head home, Johnson tells him he understands if he never forgives him, but he still needs to work out whatever he's fixated on now so it doesn't eat him alive. Bob Lee calls Julie and leaves her a message, promising to stop shutting her out. Swagger is on his way out of D.C. when his phone rings. It's the real Ramon Gutierrez. "Patricia Gregson said you wanted to talk to me," he says.

Carlita Cruise and Nadine Memphis prep Harris Downey for an ostensible dinner date with an old college friend of his, Rebecca. She works at Titan Incorporated, the company name on the decryption card and happens to be a dead ringer for Memphis. Harris makes small talk in the restaurant then brings out the card. Rebecca is alarmed he has it. Atlas operative Jack Long watches from across the street as another operative makes a move in the restaurant with a syringe for Harris and Rebecca. Cruise comes from nowhere to

fend off the attacker and hustle the couple out.

Gutierrez explains that Atlas killed Earl Swagger because he was going to expose them and how they made money. As Phoenix, they got orders from a shadow faction inside the Pentagon represented by a woman named Katherine Mayfield. Earl taught her how to plan more effective missions in Vietnam, knowledge that she put to use for the next 40 years for Atlas. One night, with Earl's input, their unit targeted a man who was supposedly a Viet Cong general, but once inside his house, Gutierrez could tell the man wasn't military and hesitated. So Earl shot the man and then a woman who ran. As Gutierrez wrestled with guilt, Earl warned him that collateral damage was part of the deal and he'd better keep his mouth shut. Instead of being complicit, Gutierrez shot himself in the leg on purpose and Earl signed the paperwork to say it happened during the mission. Gutierrez went home. Years later, he learned the "general" was actually a drug smuggler who wouldn't share his routes and the woman was a prostitute. Gutierrez suggests they talk to Mayfield, who retired abruptly from the Pentagon years ago. She's committed to a mental institution, likely for protection.

Julie receives a summons for Bob Lee to be interviewed about the disappearance of former prison warden Rick Culp, the man on duty when Jimmy Poole walked away years ago. She starts

digging and discovers that Red Bama Sr. is footing the bill – which is ironic, given that he killed Culp. Julie visits the Bama ranch, and realizes that by pointing questions at Swagger, Bama has set the Culps up as likely suspects if anything happens to him. She also finds out that three months after Earl died, Red got a sweetheart deal for 2,000 acres of government land and within a year was appointed undersecretary of the Agricultural Department. Later, Julie gets an unwelcome visit from both Bamas at Sam Vincent's office about the wrongful death suit Sam is filing. Senior threatens to make Julie sorry if she proceeds.

Back at the bunker, Rebecca explains that the card decrypts a government communications network, but you have to access Titan's internal system to know which one. She rejects Memphis' offer of protection and leaves – but not before Carlita swipes her Titan access card. Later we see that leaving was a bad call: Jack Long is waiting for her at her house. Later, Memphis poses as Rebecca and goes into the Titan offices and up to the secure seventh floor. She uses the decryption card to get into the computer and is able to access evacuation routes for the president and other high level officials. She takes pictures as Harris and Carlita wait outside. But when she's ready to leave, she finds the door is locked.

In the Titan offices, Jack Long gets by security as police pull up outside. Swagger and Johnson arrive just in time. They realize the police outside are really Atlas, so Swagger calls in a bomb threat to 911. An alarm overrides security and Memphis is able to leave the locked room. Swagger rushes in posing as Homeland Security. Long makes it to the computer room and sees what Memphis was looking at. From the parking lot, Carlita sees Long leave the building and knows the Atlas playbook of sending agents in followed by an extraction team. Inside, Memphis sneaks across a cubical farm as an agent searches for her.

Outside, Johnson and Cruise take out Atlas operatives posing as police while Memphis continues to try to escape. As she passes through the kitchen she grabs a knife, going for his knee. Swagger tries to find her inside and they end up on opposite sides of a cube farm. Swagger is about to take out the Atlas agent tracking Memphis when a squad of real police arrive. But Memphis see an Atlas operative approaching her, with nowhere to run, so she throws up her hands and surrenders to the real police. Back at the bunker, Team Swagger tries to come up with a way to rescue Memphis, knowing that Atlas will be all over her. Inside the jail, two guards come for her and knock her out. They carry her out of the jail and throw her in the back of a waiting SUV.

Memphis wakes up in the back of an SUV and is brought to an empty airplane hangar by Margo, from the Department of Justice. She knows just enough about the exploits of Team Swagger to think they're criminals. She points out Memphis doesn't have Patricia Gregson (Beverly D'Angelo) to protect her anymore. She wants something.

Memphis rejoins the team in the bunker and explains that the card accessed top secret evacuation routes for every VIP in D.C., more than 2,000 people.

From his sniper training, Bob Lee Swagger (Ryan Phillippe) sees the implications, someone could drop a bomb then pick people off as they run. But they have no way of knowing when or how an attack will come. Later, Memphis privately tells Swagger about Margo, and that she could easily build a case against them. "We've been off the reservation so long we forget what this might look like through a legal lens," Memphis says.

Red Bama Sr. (Gerald McRaney) meets with a fellow Atlas member, Andrew Gold, wanting to delay their plans. But Gold points out the confirmation is already on the calendar. Then Bama tells him that Earl Swagger's evidence might be in play, too. But for now, the decryption card is the priority.

Swagger and Isaac Johnson (Omar Epps) visit former Atlas mission planner Katherine Mayfield at Armstrong Psychiatric, where she has been lying low with Atlas' tacit permission. Their visit upends that. As soon as they pass security, the front desk guard sends a secure message about their visit to Bama. A short time later, Jack Long comes through security with a forged ID badge and plastic gun made using a 3D printer. Mayfield tells them Hayes was going to pick a chief justice of the Supreme Court that would serve Atlas and be the swing vote for decades to come. They're trying to convince her to come with them when Long arrives and shoots Mayfield. Swagger and Johnson run for it and narrowly escape.

At Margo's urging, Memphis sneaks into Gregson's house to find the burn drive where Gregson kept all her gathered dirt on Atlas. She gets it, but Bama Sr. sees Carlita Cruise waiting nearby on the surveillance footage from the house. He calls Gold and asks for a small army to go after Cruise at the bunker.

In Texas, Julie gets a call to come get Sam Vincent (David Andrews) at the courthouse, where he's raving to see a judge that's been dead 15 years. Once he calms down and is lucid he explains that he has a tumor and is dying. He also mentions that Bama Jr. came to see him and he has it all on tape. Then he starts talking about dying on his terms, which Julie does not like the sound of.

Back at the bunker, they figure Atlas is planning to attack D.C. then take out the senators opposed to their Supreme Court pick as they flee the city. But before they can make another move, they see Bama Sr. and his small army arrive. The attack team rigs the door with explosives as Bama gives them a chance to turn over the card without a fight. Cruise answers by detonating a land mine near Bama. Bama launches the attack and detonates an explosion that takes the bunker apart. Inside, Swagger stays to dig through the rubble for the decryption card and the rest try to find a way out. Johnson grabs a sledgehammer and starts bashing the cinder block to create an exit while Cruise and Memphis fight off the onslaught. Swagger finally finds the card and makes his way through the labyrinth of tunnels in the bunker as Johnson and company make it through the cinder block. They all escape.

Memphis and Swagger meet up with Margo from DOJ while Cruise and Johnson sit on overwatch. Margo tells them that Gregson was helping her boss in the DOJ investigate Atlas but it was completely off-book. After Gregson died, her boss disappeared. Margo is the one who encrypted Gregson's Atlas dirt files that Memphis just recovered. She pulls up the files and shows them names. The first one is Andrew Gold, the man that Bama Sr. was colluding with earlier. He's chief of staff to the President. As they talk, Jack Long listens in on surveillance.

In his office late at night, Sam records notes to himself. He's interrupted by Red Bama Jr. strolling in with a baseball bat. Earlier, Junior tried to buy Sam off as his dad had directed, but Sam laughed it off. Junior starts trashing the place. The recorder stays on as Junior shouts that he wants Earl's evidence, then he starts beating on Sam. Julie arrives just in time and grabs a nearby lamp to go after Junior. He fights back and throws her onto the desk then the floor. She fights him off and he runs. Julie rushes to check on Sam, who is bloodied and battered. She calls an ambulance.

Bob Lee Swagger returns to Texas, furious after Red Bama Jr. put Sam Vincent in the hospital. Swagger heads to Bama Cattle with a plan. He sets up on his long gun and gets Junior in his scope, but instead of firing he takes out his phone and makes a call saying someone is about to die. Then he strong-arms his way inside, takes out Junior's protection and starts wailing on him. He gets Junior to spill that Earl had evidence against Atlas. Bama Sr. busts in armed and Swagger stands down. Sheriff Brown arrives just

in time, responding to the anonymous call. Bama Sr. tries to have Swagger arrested, but Brown points out that would come with questions about what happened to Sam.

Back in Washington, D.C. Team Swagger decides to go after Andrew Gold, the President's Chief of Staff. After a press conference, Harris Downey approaches Gold and mentions a white nationalist group that Downey alleges Gold supports. Gold recognizes the intel from "Gregson's famous gossip files" but laughs it off and tells him he sucks at blackmailing. Carlita Cruise decides she's on the wrong side and sets up a covert meeting with Jack Long, offering him the decryption card if he gets her off the Atlas kill list. She's only on it because they're worried she saw something when she ran protection for Red Bama at the Department of Agriculture, but she says she didn't. She wants 48 hours to get the card.

In the hospital, Julie and Bob Lee notice the recorder in Sam's stuff and hear the audio of Junior attacking Sam and asking about his evidence. Later, Sam confirms that Earl made a video confession, but he has no idea where it is. Swagger is talking to Sheriff Brown later when Julie notices a suspicious orderly injecting something into Sam's arm. She questions him and

he attacks her then runs. Swagger chases after him but the operative escapes outside. Later, we learn that while the poison didn't reach his bloodstream, Bob Lee's surrogate father has still taken a turn for the worse.

Bama Sr. takes Junior to the Atlas campus, a ranch disguised as a nuclear waste facility. Head Atlas honcho August Russo, is there and is not thrilled about Junior's tangles with the Swaggers. He reminds Senior that the Swaggers have always been trouble, including when they tried to frame Bob Lee for assassinating the Ukrainian president. Later, Senior tells his son that he was invited to join Atlas as the 11th member after he personally took out Earl Swagger. He warns his son that if he's in, he can't protect him, but the young pup is just thrilled to be given a chance. Later, Russo puts Bama Sr.'s words to the test, when he tells him Junior has to for telling Bob Lee about Earl's evidence. He thinks Red should have known when he brought Junior to campus that things would go this way. Russo offers to have someone else handle it. But Red Bama Sr. has never minded getting his hands dirty. He brings his son a special malt to toast his acceptance into Atlas. As Junior drinks deeply he earnestly thanks his father for always believing in him. His father hugs him tightly and tells him he's proud of him. Later, Senior buries his son — hands dirty once again.

Swagger reviews his dad's old notes with Sheriff Brown and notices one in which he underlined a name three times, for a routine traffic accident. Earl always made Bob Lee repeat things three times to remember them. He thinks it's a clue. Swagger and Brown travel to the Department of Records warehouse to check it out. They find the evidence box for the accident file—with a VHS labeled "Phoenix" inside. Then the building lights go out. Knowing they're about to be under Atlas assault, Brown and Swagger split up and creep through the dark cavernous space. Swagger takes out the assailants and the men get out while they can.

In flashbacks, we see the contents of Earl Swagger's recorded video testimony, which he made for his wife and son and to set the record straight. He feels guilty for ever having been part of Phoenix, which became Atlas. He recounts an operation Katherine Mayfield sent him on, supposedly to attack a weapon supply line. A new major named Raymond Brooks, with special forces, arrived to lead it, and the mission never felt right. Once in Cambodia, they stopped a truck and interrogated the villagers driving it. Earl was angry to find it contained not guns, but drugs. But he was angrier still when Brooks shot two of the people in cold blood. He decked Brooks across the temple, digging a gash that would leave a scar, and left him in the jungle. We see that Ray Brooks still bears the mark... when he's introduced by Andrew Gold as the President's nominee for Chief Justice of the Supreme Court. Earl saw it coming in his affidavit decades before, in which he traced Brooks' journey on the bench up to Attorney General of Utah then Federal Court. He says it reeks of Atlas. "Whatever it is they're planning, it won't end til someone stops them," he says.

Back in Texas, Bob Lee Swagger beats the tar out of Red Bama Jr.'s associates looking for leads while ignoring calls from the rest of the group in Washington, D.C. A group of Bama Jr.'s loser pals direct Swagger to a white pride march in D.C. Swagger goes home to pack up, but Julie is so angry at him bailing on Sam's funeral that she demands he explain himself in front of their daughter. Swagger doesn't and leaves, prompting Julie to later do some serious soul-searching about her marriage. Meanwhile, Andrew

Gold meets with Red Bama Sr. to thank him for sacrificing his son for the cause – and deliver the news that August Russo has tapped Bama to take over the operation. They want to take Swagger out. Bama reveals he has people in Texas feeding Swagger just enough information to draw Swagger to him, without Swagger knowing he's being led.

When Swagger arrives in D.C., he won't listen to cautions that walking into the Gold-funded white power Alpha Boys might not be a good plan. Nadine Memphis is most concerned with stopping the attack and confirmation of Ray Brooks, and they think that while Earl's tape would be unfairly discredited if they went public, it might work against Brooks in private. Isaac Johnson wants to take a second run at Gold, who he believes is responsible for his wife's death. Carlita Cruise, who is plotting to steal the decryption card and betray them, tries to warn Memphis off the Gold meet seemingly out of concern, with no luck.

Swagger goes to the troll headquarters and gets an earful of racist garbage but no Junior (because he's dead). They tell him it's fight night and whoever wins gets to fight Junior. Swagger sneaks into a storage closet and finds dozens of tiki torches rigged with explosives. He stays to no-rules fight a guy who isn't the Navy SEAL he claims to be but still packs a punch. Swagger comes out on top, but is battered in the process. It makes him easier for the Aryans to grab and hold for Bama Sr.

Jack Long sneaks into Cruise's hotel room to relay news that Russo says she can come off the kill list and back to work in exchange for the decryption card. It seems they have a familiar

history, but Long says that won't stop him if she doesn't bring the card next time. At the office space they're using as headquarters, Cruise brings Harris Downey a shot and gets him chatting. Whatever she laced it with works quickly and he takes a nap, giving her the opening to steal the decryption card. When Long comes back to her hotel, she hands it over and goes with him to see Russo.

Memphis and Johnson meet Gold on a Metro platform and play him the Earl video, threatening to go public. He's not intimidated and gives the signal to take them out, but they evade the fire of the operative nearby. Johnson gets a head start chasing after Gold and Memphis follows, worried that Johnson might kill him as payback for his wife's murder. Her fears prove well-founded when Johnson slits Gold's throat just as Memphis reaches them. Memphis thinks the city will go on lockdown but Johnson is confident Atlas will clean it up. Sure enough, Jack Long takes care of it, staging Gold's body in his car and setting it on fire.

Back at their new office building headquarters, Memphis gets Swagger's text photo of the tiki torches full of explosives. She worries because she can't find Cruise or Downey and can't reach Swagger. She calls Margo at the DOJ and asks for a tactical team at the Alpha Society to follow up on the explosives. Margo knows about Gold's death, which is being spun as a suicide. Meanwhile, Red Bama Sr. shows up at the Alpha Society and relishes being able to beat on a bound Swagger. He relays the news that his son is dead, a "casualty of war." "When my own flesh and blood put my country at risk, I didn't hesitate," he says. Swagger is stunned. Bama continues working Swagger over, yanking his shoulder out of its socket as he's tied to a chair. Swagger asks if Bama killed his father, but Bama denies it. Downstairs, Isaac Johnson draws a crowd when he walks in and asks to join the Aryan group. He's quickly followed by Memphis and a tactical team. They head upstairs and find Swagger alive and Bama Sr. gone.

Later, with Swagger at the hospital, Margo reports that they didn't find the explosives so she can't get anywhere with an investigation. Memphis and Johnson decide to go after Brooks directly. Swagger calls Julie to say he probably won't make it home in time for Sam's funeral. She's not surprised. But she is done. She tells him not to bother coming home until he's ready to stay, leaving him bruised, reeling, and alone in D.C.

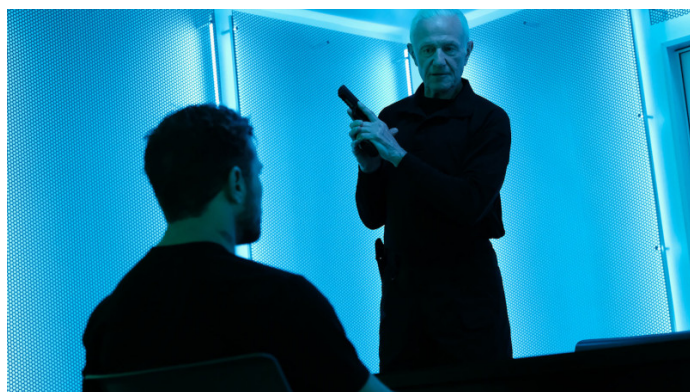

At cubicle farm HQ, after finding Carlita and the decryption card missing, and Harris in the closet with a nasty sedative hangover, they notice a military grade GPS tracker beeping. Carlita is wearing it as she rides with Jack Long on the way to the Atlas campus. Once there, Carlita sits down with August Russo for a debrief. She relays that Swagger hasn't forgiven Johnson and she thinks they can turn them against each other—and she made sure they'd come looking for her.

Swagger and Johnson follow the tracker to outside the Atlas compound and approach on foot. They walk through a deserted town that looks ripe for an ambush and soon run into one. But something about their approach doesn't seem right to Swagger. He takes out an assailant and discovers his gun is firing blanks; Carlita lead them into an Atlas training ground.

In flashback to Carlita's Atlas recruitment by Jack Payne, we see him telling her she could be one of them if she "submits." On a 2008 training mission on the Atlas campus, Carlita meets analytical Jack Long, who argues the purpose of their training is to identify true believers. Then he trips an arrow and gets spiked through the leg. Carlita helps him to treatment, earning an earful from Payne for diverting from the mission. Back in the compound, Russo lectures Carlita again about keeping emotion out of missions, then electrocutes her. On the other side of the glass, Payne tests Jack Long by forcing him to watch Carlita in pain. Then he forces Long to electrocute Carlita himself, as part of the mission. Long doesn't hesitate.

After surviving the first ambush, Swagger and Johnson have nowhere to run when a Humvee intercepts them. They're shot with tranquilizer darts and wake up in psy-ops rubber rooms. All of Johnson's misdeeds and kills are plastered on his walls and Swagger is forced to listen to audio from his home back in Texas. Russo joins Swagger and offers to tell him who killed his father if Swagger kills Johnson. He reminds Swagger that Johnson is the source of all his misery, dating

back to when he buried the report with the Marines in Afghanistan. He gives Swagger a gun and Swagger appears to contemplate it, then turns on Russo and fires. But it's not loaded. Swagger follows up with a crack across Russo's face, then throws a chair at the man who comes in the door. Swagger uses a table to break through the wall. Russo is counting on Swagger's heroism to sink him as he goes after Johnson. In another locked room, Long comes for Carlita and tells her to run. She invites him to come with her, but he won't give up the mission even, she knows, if it eventually means killing her.

Downey and Memphis buy all the tickets to a fundraiser to have time alone with Ray Brooks. He tells them he thought he was doing the right thing in Vietnam and regrets crossing the line and has been trying to make up for it ever since. He doesn't believe he's an Atlas pawn and refuses to withdraw as a nominee. They threaten to release Earl Swagger's video if he doesn't.

Back in Texas after Sam's wake, Julie finishes Mary's bedtime story but is alarmed when her teddy bear interferes with the baby monitor. Julie finds the listening device inside then sweeps the house and finds four others. The next day she and her sister Anne make a show for the recorders, saying they're off to Yosemite. Instead they're going off the grid.

Swagger finds Carlita, who has located the only live ammunition in the compound. She reveals that she set explosives there a long time ago as a contingency. Carlita and Swagger bust in on Russo trying to get in Johnson's head. Left alone with Carlita, Russo scoffs at her. But she does not appreciate being put on his kill list after a decade of service. He's still doubting her when she raises her gun and shoots him through the head. In the basement, Swagger and Johnson find file cabinets and a server. Swagger grabs his dad's file and finds a mini cassette recorder with audio from the night his father was killed. It reveals the shooter was Ray Brooks. They race to get out before a giant series of explosions tears the compound apart. Swagger takes a minute to tell Johnson he's ready to put things in the past. Carlita emerges from the ashes and joins them. Elsewhere, Jack Long stays focused on the mission, prepping a school bus.

At cubicle HQ, Harris digs up a court case involving Anhur Dynamics, Lon Scott's Atlas-front company. They're claiming a national security exemption from discovery and if they lose, all of Atlas' dirty laundry will become public, which is why they need Ray Brooks on the court. Swagger returns in time for a Brooks' press conference on TV, in which he claims he's been blackmailed but is innocent. When Swagger shares what he's just learned about Brooks, Memphis asks what he's going to do. Swagger replies: "I'm going to kill him."

Swagger approaches Red Bama Sr. who urges him not put his family at risk. Bama follows the veiled threat with the news that Swagger's family is in Albuquerque, cautioning him to stand down. Swagger races to call Julie and is disturbed to learn that Bama was telling the truth. He warns Julie that Atlas is tracking her. He knows she's on her own until he can get to her.

Back at cubicle HQ, Nadine Memphis and Isaac Johnson have limited intel following the explosion of the Atlas campus,

so they make a pitch to the three Atlas operatives they captured. Two demand payouts to switch sides, one, Parada, just wants his freedom. After Margo with DOJ tells them the smoldering compound isn't proof of the planned attack — she wants a body and a smoking gun — they go back to the recruits and let Parada go, betting he's a true believer because he couldn't be bought and will run straight to Atlas.

Swagger drags Harris Downey to Brooks' hotel where Harris chats up the staff to learn that Brooks has been holed up in the presidential suite for three days. Swagger swipes a keycard to gain access and takes out Brooks' security guy. With no clear plan, Swagger grabs Brooks and drives out into the woods. Harris is alarmed when Swagger takes a shovel out of the car. He calls Nadine, who warns him Atlas is likely tracking Brooks.

In Albuquerque, Julie, her sister Anne, and Mary head to the pool to try to pretend everything is normal. When Mary forgets her towel Julie heads back to the room to get it, interrupting the Atlas agent who's rifling through their things. He hides in the closet but she sees him and fakes a call to Bob Lee as she grabs her gun and backs out the door. She collects Anne and Mary at the pool and hustles them into the car.

Trailing Parada, Memphis peels off to go help Swagger while Johnson follows him to Bama Sr. They're discussing the fact Team Swagger knows about the bomb when they're interrupted by news about Brooks. Bama sends Parada after him. Out in the woods, Swagger confronts Brooks, who claims Earl Swagger was no better than he was and was running black ops before he ever came along. But Bob Lee realizes the real difference between them, and the reason Brooks is alive and Earl Swagger isn't: Brooks is a murderer. Earl wasn't. And neither is Bob Lee. Harris finds them and they head for higher ground as Parada and the kill squad arrive and close in, with Swagger using Brooks as a shield. Swagger is low on ammunition, so Harris gets a bolt of bravery and draws fire as Swagger tries to pick off the attackers. But Parada finds Harris and trains his gun on him. Swagger walks out with his weapon at Brooks' head, as Brooks yells at Parada to take the shot. Swagger is outgunned with no options, but is saved when Memphis and Margo appear with an FBI team and order Parada to stand down. He does at first, but then goes for his weapon, and earns a hail of bullets that take him to the ground. Swagger turns his gun over to Memphis, telling Brooks the FBI will soon be connecting Parada's gun to him. Brooks grabs a gun off an FBI agent and put it to his chin, proclaiming: "This is how a patriot dies!" Then he shoots himself.

Johnson follows Bama Sr. after his meet with Parada and sees him get into an SUV and Jack Long get out the other side. Johnson decides to follow Long and ends up at the warehouse. He send Memphis a message with the location then breaks in. He's snooping around when Long finds him and knocks him out. He douses Johnson in gasoline and lights it, walking away as the building burns with Isaac in it. Red Bama Sr. breaks protocol to call Long and tell him Brooks is dead and check in on their operation. Johnson wakes up and manages to stagger out of the warehouse before the fire reaches him, but he doesn't leave empty-handed: he lifted a medallion off Long.

Out in the woods, Swagger is feeling relieved he didn't kill Brooks and is ready to rejoin and protect his family. But his relief doesn't last long as the FBI takes him and Harris into custody, over the objections of Margo and Memphis. With Brooks out of the picture, Atlas' decades-long plot is thrown into chaos, but they aren't ready to give up yet.

Red Bama Sr. casually drops by the Oval Office to talk frankly about next steps following Brooks' death. But Alvarez doesn't feel like dealing. He says Brooks killing himself saved him the embarrassment of not being confirmed. Alvarez plans to pick his own nominee without input from Atlas. Bama tries to intimidate him by saying he won't get anything done without Atlas' help and that many presidents before him have thought they could function without Atlas and been wrong.

Nadine Memphis gets a call from Isaac Johnson, who is wounded and wobbly after being attacked by Jack Long. Memphis stitches up the gash on his head. They take the medallion Johnson lifted off Long to a crime lab, where Memphis steps away to get a soda and two men with guns approach her. Harris is at a bar waiting for a friend with possible information on Atlas when he sees two unfriendly looking men coming up to him. He makes a break for it and hides in a nearby parking garage but they grab him. Both Memphis and Harris are relieved when they're brought to see the president in the Oval Office. He knows an attack is imminent and asks for their help. He wants them to get Swagger to help, but knew Swagger would fend off any Secret Service agents he sent after him. Memphis agrees and starts by telling the president to take all evacuation plans offline.

After asking her sister to take Mary to stay with Edie Poole, Julie arrives in D.C. and goes to Bob Lee's hotel room. He has wine and roses, but she's in another place entirely. She says she's done being scared and alone and not feeling connected to him. She thinks he's always waiting for something to happen so he can run off and be a hero. He ignores a call from Johnson and tries to make excuses, but has to admit he likes the thrill. She wants him to stop trying to save

the world and come home. He hears her and they are finally reconnecting and making plans for a long-overdue honeymoon when Memphis and Johnson arrives and ask him to save the world again. They found explosive traces on the medallion from an area school, St. Agatha. Julie sees what her husband will choose and says good-bye, saying that Mary needs at least one parent.

Johnson and Swagger pay a visit to St. Agatha school looking for Jack Long. They're describing him to the nun when he returns to his room in the basement. When they say he might be strange and keep to himself she recognizes the longtime handyman, who comes and goes as he pleases and has worked there for years. She leads them down the basement as Long is getting ready, arming up and dressing as Secret Service. He sees them coming and makes a run for it through the school's cafeteria, rigging a door with a grenade. In the time it takes for them to safely detonate it, Long gets away. But Swagger thinks it's odd that the nun said Long could fix anything but still took the buses to a mechanic. They head to the garage. They find bomb making materials and evidence Long was in a massive rush. Earlier, Long used forged documents to get into a Homeland Security office, where he tapped into the computer and tried to run the Titan decryption card, but got nowhere. This means the plans to send high value targets scrambling and pick them off with the stolen evacuation routes won't work. On to plan B. Swagger and Johnson realize the attack is today. Meanwhile, a bus load of students boards for their field trip to the Supreme Court.

Team Swagger works through Long's next move. With Atlas needing votes in the Anhur Dynamics Supreme Court case that will expose them, they could still win the case with a 4-3 vote. They realize Long must be going after a sitting Supreme Court justice. Meanwhile, outside the Court, Long gets near enough a bomb dog to put baby food on its snout so it can't smell the explosives when it checks the loaded bus. Team Swagger arrives shortly after the bus has passed inspection. With no buses marked St. Agatha, they scratch off paint until Memphis finds the St. Agatha logo painted over. When a police officer interrupts them, they don't have time to explain and knock him out. Swagger calls in a bomb over the cop's radio and they start shouting for an evacuation. Swagger finds the re-stapled seats and the bricks of explosives inside. As Harris tries to warn people away outside Swagger tries to defuse the bomb and discovers quickly that he can't. As the detonator powers up he and Johnson race for cover outside. At the last second, Memphis throws herself over a girl who is too close to the bus as it goes up in a giant fireball. With his ears ringing and the bus smoldering, Swagger races off to protect the justice that Long is going after. Johnson finds Memphis on the ground, where she is dazed and bleeding profusely from shrapnel in her neck.

In the White House everyone is heading to their evacuation points and Red Bama Sr. is informed by security that he's been taken off the list to evacuate with the president. In the Court, Secret Service agents are securing justices when Long calmly joins a group leading an evacuation, putting him right next to his target, Justice Gibson.

After the explosion at the Supreme Court, Johnson goes to the hospital with Memphis. Harris Downey helps Swagger get access to the court building, where they find Justice Gibson's driver, bound and gagged in the bathroom. Gibson is evacuated to Arlington by Jack Long with a gaggle of other dignitaries. Swagger steals a cop car and hightails it to Arlington. When he arrives, he fights his way into the house, where Gibson is ushered down to a locked bunker in the basement. Long retrieves an explosive belt from his car.

He attacks a security guard inside, then fires on Swagger, but misses as he advances. Long creeps down to the basement and hacks into the bunker door control, but one dignitary whacks him with a fire extinguisher, giving Swagger enough time to close the ground to Long. Gibson and the dignitaries run upstairs as Swagger and Long grapple at the bunker entrance, with Swagger getting a piece of his ear. With Long off balance, Swagger gives him a final shove into the now-empty bunker and slams the door shut just in time for Long's explosives, and Long, to detonate safely behind the blast doors.

With Atlas' final mission over, Team Swagger moves on

At the hospital Memphis is stable and lucky; the bullet grazed her carotid artery. Johnson waits at her bedside for her to wake up, then tells her he wants to help shape things by taking over Atlas, good guy-style. The last time Memphis and Johnson saw eye to eye on methods was

when they conspired to kill Atlas figurehead Sen. Addison Hayes, but they again find common ground for the greater good. Swagger drops by the hospital and declines their job offer, saying he's going to focus on saving his marriage instead of saving the world. Meanwhile, Harris Downey has started a new job as the president's deputy chief of staff. One of his first acts is to hand Red Bama Sr. resignation papers. Bama blusters and threatens, but Downey points out Bama's fresh out of Atlas allies.

Bob Lee comes home to find Julie in the middle of moving out. He assures her it's all over, but she's not sure how to trust him. Still, Julie and Mary accompany Bob Lee as he says a graveside good-bye to both his father and Sam Vincent, the two men who raised him. The Swaggers are heading to their car with Sheriff Brown when Red Bama Sr. pulls up. He tells Swagger he's selling the cattle company and leaving, but he wants to make sure he won't have to spend his life waiting for one of Bob Lee's bullets. Swagger tells him to leave Texas, then turns to rejoin his family but finds they've left without him. Back at the house, Julie is halfway out the door. Bob Lee tries to talk to her. He swears he's done, but she thinks he's itching to go after Bama. She wants a break, but not necessarily a divorce. He suggests he'll leave so she and Mary can stay in the house. He insists he be the one to talk to Mary, so she doesn't think anything is her mom's fault.

In D.C., Johnson and Memphis set up the new incarnation of Atlas, which they're calling Prometheus. She'll handle politics; he'll handle the missions. They're surprised to find a gift box waiting for them containing the hard drive from the Atlas campus. It looks like Carlita Cruise made it out alive.

At Bama Cattle, Red finishes signing the paperwork to sell his company then transitions seamlessly to talking to an assassin about a contract on Swagger. Bama insists on no witnesses. Swagger is getting ice cream with Mary and trying to explain the separation when Sheriff Brown calls to warn him a helicopter just landed near his house, where Julie is. Swagger leaves Mary with her aunt, then grabs a rifle from a parked car, leaving cash, and races home as a team of six assassins closes in on his house.

Inside the house, Julie sees a laser light on her chest and drops just before the windows and walls explode in a hail of gunfire. She crawls to the gun safe and gets her weapons as Bob Lee pulls up down the road and the assassins approach. He gets in position and takes out one from distance, closing in. Julie hits one from inside as he passes by the window and Bob Lee gets another as he reaches his house perimeter. Julie hits another as he enters the front door, but she takes a bullet in the shoulder. The man she hit at the door has a bulletproof vest on and stands up and looms over her. He is reaching for his gun when Julie pulls out a handgun and shoots him in a private part not covered by the vest. Bob Lee races across his front yard to his house as a series of explosions detonate inside, chasing Julie down the hallway until she safely dives into the tub. Bob Lee finds her there, rattled, but alive. They're both full of apologies and tears, grateful to be safe and together. They're making their way toward the door when we see Red Bama, set up on a hillside looking through the lens of a long gun. He's targeting Bob Lee, but when Bob Lee turns to grab his father's gun in the rubble, Julie is left standing in the crosshairs. Bama's bullet cuts her down instantly and Bob Lee's world comes crashing down around him as he screams and cradles his wife's body.

**Three months later** — After Julie's funeral, Mary is still staying with her aunt and no one has seen Bob Lee. Harris pays Memphis a visit at Prometheus headquarters with a new haircut and a top-secret file on a Nazi who's helping ISIS. The President wants Prometheus to deal with him so it won't have U.S. fingerprints on it. Memphis keeps it to herself.

Out in the snowy wilds of Savage Lake, Canada, Bama is in hiding at a remote cabin when he gets a call from Swagger, ready to make good on his promise. Swagger reminds Bama that he warned him he'd come if anything happened to his family. The time has come. Swagger lines up on the Black King and takes his shot, ending things with Bama, once and for all. He walks away from the snowy hilltop, about as isolated, but free, as a man can be.
