Summary: Sterling and Blair seem perfect little angels — 'til they crash into bounty-hunting Bowser. But Sterling's halo slips.



The episode begins with Sterling proposing sex with her partner Luke in a car outside Willingham Academy. Her boyfriend is religious and starts talking about his virginity and marriage. Sterling starts talking in Bible phrases and puts a condom on him and they have sex — afterwards, Sterling tells her boyfriend that love covers a multitude of sins. In the other car, Blair is giving Jennings a handjob and asks for a review after. Sterling and Blair are twin sisters.

In the car ride home, twin sisters talk about their virginities and Sterling reveals she has just lost her virginity to Luke. The news shocks Blair and they end up in a car accident.

They approach the other car and there's a man inside who is apparently evading bail. Sterling approaches him with a shotgun and asks the man to get out of the car — we were not expecting such ferocity from these characters so early on. Another car drives up and a man gets out and tells them to not steal his bounty and offers his share of the prize; he thinks the twins are bounty hunters — they need the money to fix their father's truck.

The man (now known as Cayden) from the accident suddenly runs away so the twins run after him. They manage to catch him and agree to half of the cash with the bounty hunter.

At Willingham Academy, Sterling is chosen as the year's Fellowship leader. Sterling stands up and talks about God's presence and how she looks forward to leading everyone to Jesus. Luke congratulates her and she is very awkward with him. The teacher tells Sterling about abstinence and the importance of it.

Sterling tells Blair that she cannot be Fellowship leader because she's had sex but Blair disagrees and tells her to be a "lying sl*t".

April, a student who is clearly jealous, congratulates Sterling for the leadership but when Sterling drops her bag, April sees the condom wrapper and walks off — Sterling is mortified. She's been figured out by her arch-enemy very early!

Blair texts the bounty hunter (named Bowser) to collect the money but Sterling is fretting. Bowser works at a Frozen Yoghurt cafe. He takes them to the back in his office to get the cash. He gives them the cash and Sterling asks Bowser how much it would be to fix the truck. When he says \$5k, Sterling asks if there are any more bounty hunter jobs. Bowser's next bounty is for a John Stevens. The twins realise that John Stevens is April's father and they offer to help capture him at The Men's Parlor. They raise how the Parlor is very racist so Bowser agrees to the partnership on this one.

The twins walk into The Men's Parlor and they are caught by Miles, their friend. Blair seduces Miles to get information on where John Stevens is. They find the room where John Stevens is and overhear a group of men talking. They find out that John Stevens did not do the crime — he was protecting his business partner. They return to Bowser and lie, stating that their target was not inside.

The twin's parents find out about the car and they are fuming. The parents give them a dress down — they are told to pay for the repairs or they'll be going to a public school. So now the characters have a reason to bounty hunt — they desperately need the money.

The twins meet Bowser and ask for work and explain they have power in the community. Bowser says he wants John Stevens but the twins question his innocence. Bowser reveals he knows they are not bounty hunters as he did his research, including looking at their TikToks. As he kicks the twins out, Bowser gives the evidence that John Stevens committed battery on a prostitute. The twins now want to find him.

The twins approach April and lie that her father has offered to sponsor their field trip to the soup kitchen — they ask her where he is. April knows they are lying and calls them little tramps — she also threatens to reveal that Sterling has lost her virginity... and so the war begins...

Sterling creates a fake social media profile to try and find April's father — they follow John Stevens so they can tag his address. Episode 1 shows how resourceful these teenagers are.

The twins head to the address where John Stevens is and skirt around the mansion with their pistol and shotgun. Blair says that the adventure makes her *****. Sterling approaches John Stevens and hits him with her gun. They capture him very casually.

The twins now work at the Yoghurt cafe but secretly they are bounty hunters. Bowser tells their parents that their daughters do a good job.

The twins try and negotiate with Bowser. He tells them they have no leverage to negotiate if they want to work with him.

Summary: The girls buckle down to bounty hunter basics while working on relationship pressures.



The episode begins with the twin sisters practicing their bounty hunter flair. Blair criticizes Sterling's approach. The characters seem to be taking on this new life rather well. Suddenly, both women panic as they have to get to Church in twelve minutes.

They manage to get to Church. The pastor does an adult-themed sermon and talks about sex. He issues a challenge to the married couples; to have sex every day. Blair whispers to Sterling that she's already doing the challenge.

At work, Blair is frustrated that her sister beat her to sex as she hasn't sealed the deal with Jennings yet. Sterling reveals she and Luke are in love which is why they had sex. Blair wants to fall in love very quickly so they can have sex — there's no way you can just fall in love though which makes it funny.

Bowser wants a story of how they met for Yolanda, the woman that gives them bounties — the story clearly doesn't work. The next assignment is Kenneth Chu, a counterfeiter. The twin sisters reveal they have wigs for different missions — Blair starts to pretend to be Russian to try to prove her point. Bowser tells them that they cannot have this mission but they can ride with him. He's easing them into this slowly.

While out and about with Bowser, Blair talks of how she and Jennings need to have sex. Bowser reveals that they are at their last known address of Kenneth. He asks them to enter the care home and pretend to be offering services from the Church. When they get inside, they let Bowser in from the back exit.

There is a Linda Chu at the care home and she says she hasn't seen her son Kenneth for a year. Afterward, Blair realizes Linda called him "Tookie" so she finds his social media account. Blair suggests they do a stakeout. Bowser agrees to this stakeout but without phones. He's clearly not enjoying the generations before him that cannot stop being on social media.

Sterling leads her first Fellowship group and gives them all religious advice. The teacher gives Sterling her parking space. While in prayer, April returns and claims her father is in Tokyo (when he's really in prison) — the twins play it cool.

And then it happens... April shows Sterling the torn condom and asks her to resign as leader of the Fellowship by Friday. To stop April's blackmail, Sterling and Blair spread a rumor that a dropped condom was found on the floor at the Fellowship and it spreads around the Academy like wildfire. The sisters have foiled the blackmail.

Blair continues to try fall in love with Jennings by asking him soul mate questions from a lifestyle website. However, the questions are not working and they are not falling in love.

The stakeout begins and Blair tells Sterling she's dying of horniness. Blair gets impatient and enters a waxing establishment to find Kenneth Chu. She asks the woman who waxes her questions about her boyfriend Kenneth Chu but she catches on to what's happening and the woman flees. Bowser is angry and states that if he doesn't get paid, they don't get paid.

Jennings tells Blair that they aren't in love. They start sharing things with each other; the pair admit they don't like each other either and break up on the spot. This was one of the quickest, most cutthroat break-ups in history.

April is not giving up on her blackmail and tells Luke that she knows he has strayed with Sterling. Luke is flabbergasted. Sterling approaches April about her threat to Luke — April tells Sterling to resign or she will oust both her and Luke. They talk about her father briefly and April is upset about what her father did to the sex worker, stating that sex workers deserve to be safe.

The twins head to the drug store to get a new heat pad for their father. When they try to pay, the cashier tells them the notes are fake — they got the cash from the change at the food stand at the care home. They alert Bowser and say Kenneth Chu must have been there. The mission is back on so they need to think of a new alibi for their parents. The twins promise not to tell anyone about their bounty hunter life.

With Bowser, the twins head to the care home — he tells one of them to kick down the doors. They finally find Kenneth Chu in one of the rooms and then chase after him. Linda Chu sees what is happening and sounds the alarm. They catch him and the twins have the money to pay back their parents.

The twins talk about catching the Pastor buying cigarettes at the store. Sterling wonders if that means she can own her sins at the Fellowship just like the Pastor did.

At the Fellowship, Sterling tells everyone that she and Luke are having sex and the condom wrapper was hers. Everyone laughs, thinking it's a joke. April stands up and says they are telling the truth and shows the ripped condom. The others believe the condom belongs to April but Sterling stands up and admits it is her condom. She states that she's a good person and God loves her as the room goes quiet.

An upset Sterling tells Ellen that she wants to stand down as Fellowship leader. Ellen applauds her for self-care and going after her desires.

Summary: In between tracking an elusive bail jumper, Blair goes on a date with Miles, and Sterling searches for friends beyond her Fellowship group.



The opener shows how a Confederate statue's head has been cut off and it's the talk of the town with police everywhere. In terms of Sterling, she's dreading going to school after the "sex reveal" in the Fellowship but Blair reassures her. When she gets to Willingham Academy there's an eeriness around her. April tells her she cannot join the Fellowship because others are processing the news of what she did. Luke also feels humiliated after his golf team oust him — they've taken away his captainship.

Bowser tells the twins about their next target — a woman arrested for cutting the head off a Confederate statue. The twins think the woman is a badass. Bowser says they need to figure out which statue she's going to get next — there are 174 confederate statues in Atlanta. The twins ask if Bowser is comfortable with capturing this woman as she's clearly doing it for anti-racism. Bowser explains that his job is to capture bounties.

The twins and the family join their grandparents for lunch. The grandmother has memory issues that raise concerns on the table. The twin's father is trying to impress the grandfather by talking about bringing in more business. He wants to be a partner in the family business.

The grandfather talks about how he is disgusted about the Confederate statues being taken down; Blair cannot help herself and states it is a brave political statement — the grandfather leaves the table.

The twins and Bowser meet a Confederate museum owner to try and find some logic of where Clea is going to go next. They figure that Belwood Park will be the next target but they aren't entirely certain.

Sterling tries to find a new group of friends at school. The new group she tries to join are devil worshippers but she finds it a conflict of interest, obviously. Meanwhile, Blair sees Miles out of his work clothes and in his own clothes. She suddenly finds him very attractive and makes it into a proper date at Bargain Hole — she purposefully dressed down to try put him off but this has obviously backfired now. Miles brings up a college party he needs to go to and she wants to go. Blair rings Sterling about the college party and announces that "Miles is hot". And the new romance for Blair starts from here.

The twin's parents argue about getting more involved in the family business. The mother just wishes that the man she married stood up for herself more — "I miss that man". Later on, the father sticks up for himself and tells the grandfather that he quits the business. He then kisses his wife after his bravery.

Blair enters the college party looking her best self and Miles is impressed. She wants to look cool and chill and tells Sterling to calm down. The twin sisters clearly don't know how to act cool.

Bowser ends up teaming up with a group of racists as they vow to protect the statue and "get her good" which concerns him. He realizes that the statue is made out of granite and texts the twins that there is no way that Clea could cut the head off with a metal saw.

The party continues and the twins seem to be enjoying themselves. Another girl is trying to hit on Miles and Blair doesn't know what to do — the other girl is black and is talking about the statues and her theories. Blair tries to fit in by stating that she supports Clea. It ends up in an argument where Miles calls her out for thinking all black people need to have the same opinion. He then points out that Blair didn't want to date him at first. She has no time to resolve the issue as Sterling drunkenly shouts she knows where the next statue is going to be and throws up everywhere.

The twins leave the party and Sterling rings Bowser with the location of the next statue. Bowser leaves the racists behind and they find Clea cutting off the head of the statue. Blair says she's cool and tells Bowser to let her go but he states he's just doing his job. Bowser tells Clea to finish cutting off the head before taking her in.

Sterling asks Clea why she cuts off the heads of Confederate statues near schools — Clea explains that she doesn't like children walking by every day, looking up to men who loved owning people.

Blair meets Miles while he's at work and wants to pick him up for a real date — she asks him for a chance as she didn't realize he was hot. At least she was honest...

At school, Sterling is still lonely and now she's been judged for partying which was seen on Instagram. She manages to turn it around and she says she was brought back by the lord and she finally has the attention again from the Fellowship — April is not amused at all.

When Sterling gets home her mother is mad that she's been drinking at a college party. The mother says that if she wants to live under this roof there's no drinking. She sends Sterling to a tent outside.

Luke and Sterling wake up together outside in the tent; Sterling is fretting that her mother will find them together (wait until she finds out that she isn't a virgin!). Luke quickly departs like a mad man. At breakfast, Sterling's mother is still angry about her drinking. Sterling apologizes but her mother isn't accepting it.

Blair and Miles are already smitten with each other. They call each other "mad sexy". She tells Sterling that Miles "Gets her". Blair feels like he is grounded. Sterling doesn't want to talk about Miles,

she wants to be back in the house. The sisters are at odds with each other for the first time — one is smitten while the other one feels out of place.

The next target given to them by Yolanda is Kendra Saint John who is a scammer who throws jewelry parties; the items are fake. They need to find a way to lure Kendra in "Basically Pluto".

At a book club, Sterling serves the guests for her mother to try and earn brownie points and it seems to be working, a little bit. The issue is that the other mothers keep on talking about Sterling's drinking and her mother has to keep defending her. Miles shows up as the valet and Blair is mortified that her mother hired him — she needs to rearrange her bedroom. She's also worried that her soon-to-be boyfriend has shown up to her rich house when he thinks she's grounded.

Bowser calls the twins and says they believe Kendra is outside the house for the book club. However, when they get outside it's not Kendra, it's a man named John Slack who says she couldn't make it. The twins' plan to lure Kendra has failed. The twins update Bowser and he asks them if they've ever interrogated anyone. John Slack has started selling already to the book club. The twins start interrogating him and pretend it's an interview for an article they are working on.

Blair gets to the point and asks about Kendra — it's funny how she cannot help herself. John states that he and Kendra are a team. Blair tries to make out that bosses are manipulative which scares John off.

Blair leaves John with Sterling and goes outside to give Miles some food and she acts super weird around him. Meanwhile, outside the cops get involved and want to know what Bowser is up to. They want his paperwork so he reluctantly shows them. The cops raise how Bowser was the man who shot officer Atticus in Florida.

Sterling's mother finds out at the party that Sterling had sex with Luke (awkward!). All the mother's eyes look at Sterling. Her mother ends the book club early as she's shocked and upset at the news. Luke's mother raises how she's disappointed in Sterling but Sterling's mother says it takes two to tango before walking off. Sterling's eyes fill with tears.

As for John, he's leaving the party and Blair is trying to stop him from leaving. She accuses him of covering up for Kendra and John runs off. Eventually, she manages to get John to the ground; she asks him to refund the credit card transactions from the book club and give information on Kendra.

Blair is still acting weird with Miles. He asks what's going on with her as she's been strange all day. She tells him to not show up unannounced like that. Miles apologizes. Blair says that he told her he likes her because she's down to earth and then shows up at her rich house. Blair imagined Miles coming to her house for the first time as her boyfriend. The pair are starting to recognize each other as a couple.

When Blair drops Miles off at his house, she learns he is also rich — his parents have high-paying jobs. They both agree they are now boyfriend/girlfriend.

Sterling and her mother finally speak. Her mother doesn't know how to feel. Sterling doesn't understand how something that feels so good can be so wrong, especially when she's in love. Her mother hugs her as she cries. Sterling admits she was never going to tell her mother and her mother states that breaks her heart — "You are my whole world". The mother and daughter have a heart to heart and the mother is relieved that she used condoms.

Afterward, Luke plays Sterling his guitar on video call before he is accosted by his mother.

Both sisters lay in bed together after a difficult day. Yolanda calls and asks to meet them in a diner. Bowser tells them he was in jail for 47 minutes and that he was arrested for colorful language — he reveals he used to be a cop and one day he was at a pride parade and he was assigned to protect Shelita Pancake — Florida's number 1 drag queen. He heard a car backfire and thought it was a gunshot; he explains he got his gun out too quick and shot Officer Atticus in the nose — it was a horse. Every squad laughed at him so he quit the police force — he has a bad experience with the police.

The twins state they can still get to Kendra and take a trip to Knoxville — that's where she apparently is. Bowser walks out and tells them to forget it. Yolanda tells the twins to give him space. Sterling wonders if God put them here to fix Bowser.

The opening of the episode sees teacher Mr Koontz get on with his life. While eating his lunch on a park bench he chokes to death on a sandwich. At school, Sterling says she misses Luke now that she cannot see him in her spare time. Blair tells Sterling she plans to lose her virginity with Miles and both sisters are excited.

Over the intercom in class, it's revealed that substitute teacher Mr Koontz died. Blair has no idea who he is. The sisters realise this is the first time someone

has died in their life apart from pets. Luke tells the twin sisters that Mr Koontz is agnostic so he won't go to heaven.

Sterling asks Ellen and April if they can do a memorial for Mr Koontz but Ellen says they can't have a service for someone who isn't strongly tied to the school. Sterling stays she will help plan the memorial and April suddenly wants to be involved. April, Sterling and Luke will be planning the service together. The rivalry between April and Sterling continues...

The sisters go to Bowser's place and are surprised by how little he has in his small place. He wants them to move the yoghurt toppings from his apartment to the shop. The sisters want to continue to help Bowser to improve his wellbeing. Famous bounty hunter Terrance Coin is getting an assignment from Yolanda and Bowser isn't too happy to see him. Sterling and Blair are so excited to see Terrance and find him inspiring.

Afterwards, Bowser calls Terrance a d*ck for asking about his eating regime. Yolanda gives the group a new assignment — Cherry Grigio — an exotic dancer who owns 15 grand in parking

tickets. Bowser calls her a "slippery stripper". He's captured her before and doesn't want to again because she's caused too much stress on his life.

Blair believes there's something spiritual happening since Mr Koontz has died and rings Miles about it. Miles recommends praying and then the pair talk about the date night they have planned. When Blair gets home, she says a prayer for Mr Koontz and asks God to let him into Heaven. She accidentally sets her Bible on fire and apologises to God.

The planning for the service begins and April goes into control mode. Sterling warns everyone that the memorial needs to be respectful — "It needs to be a simple memorial for a simple man". April irrationally quits and reminds Sterling she needs to do a eulogy. Luke and Sterling look at Mr Koontz's history for some inspiration.

Sterling suggests that the burning Bible could be a sign that Mr Koontz has been allowed into Heaven. The sisters head to the strip club with Bowser to get Cherry Grigio — Bowser reminds them again that she's slippery.

Blaire and Sterling are impressed by how sexy the strip club is and how comfortable women are in their own bodies. They see Cherry Grigio and Bowser suggests triangulating her. Cherry wants to get her stuff but Blair doesn't fall for it. Suddenly, Cherry is handed her baby and Bowser realises how complicated it is all of a sudden. Bowser asks Cherry to find child care before they take her in.

Sterling gets emotional looking at Mr Koontz's Instagram and Blair sees her dead teacher by the pool tables. Blair believes she has failed to usher Mr Koontz into heaven. She tells Bowser that he could die any moment and she's worried two ghosts will torment her. Blair is having a crisis it seems, coupled with the prospect of losing her virginity to Miles.

Bowser tells Blair to consider that Heaven and Hell are constructs and that they may not exist. He continues and says there's no certainty with life and death so advises that she doesn't fret over it. This was wonderful advice and well-written into the show.

While Cherry Grigio waits for her sister to pick up her daughter, she has a set to do on the stage. She dances on the poles and then dances on Bowser — he likes it. Suddenly, Bowser believes the other strippers are trying to help her get out and splits up the routine. The crowd boo him. There's another obstacle as Cherry has a space cake — he can't take her in if she has drugs in her system. Bowser tells the sisters to go home and he will wait 12 hours.

The memorial starts and Luke is impressed. April shows up crying and making a scene. She's being extra. Sterling walks out and starts the memorial. Luke comes on the stage and does a song with his guitar — the song is about Sterling more than Mr Koontz. You can tell Sterling is irritated by Luke's attempt to be romantic — the memorial means a lot to Sterling.

Blair leaves the memorial and Miles shows up worried about her — she tells Miles she's not sure about sex and he reassures her that there's no rush. Blair talks of how the uncertainty of everything is playing on the mind, especially with life and death. Miles tells her he just wants to be with her.

Luke finally finishes his song and Sterling sarcastically thanks him. She then does the eulogy and uses what she saw on Instagram for her speech. Everyone loves her speech.

Afterwards, Luke calls Sterling amazing. Sterling tells her it isn't about her or them. She tells him they are only together because of circumstances and that she's not sure she wants this relationship anymore. Luke is devastated as Sterling breaks up with him. She wants to learn about herself before her life is planned out. She wants to be alone.

Bowser has handcuffed Cherry Grigio in the car, waiting for the edibles to wear off. She admits to having a crush on Bowser and then leans in to kiss him. As she does, she pulls out a gun but Bowser is one step ahead of her — he removed the bullets. Bowser tells her she should change and that he was never going to fall for it. As the episode ends, Sterling enjoys time alone. Blair and Miles have sex; Blair says she's happy. Miles is caring as she loses her virginity to him.

Summary: After demanding the truth from their mom, the twins face a troubling night filled with heartbreak, hardened criminals and shocking revelations.



In the car, the sisters are still angry with each other. They get home and their parents are saying they were worried sick. Blair cuts to the chase and starts listing things about her mother and the church she belongs to in Nandina, and the most shocking part — she is a fugitive for first-degree arson. The sisters demand the truth.

Debbie admits she hasn't been entirely truthful about her past as she was trying to protect them; in her past, she ended up in the wrong extreme crowd and

acted out of hate — she set fire to an abortion clinic. She regrets it and was acting under the influence of persuasive people. Debbie assures them she has protected them since and worked very hard to give them this life.

The sisters ask if they are safe; their parents say they have lawyers and a plan. Debbie seems relieved and wants her daughters to enjoy themselves to go to a lock-in. You just know that it isn't over from here — and you also know there are more twists to come.

Bowser asks the sisters to go to come to the Yoghurt shop. He asks them why they work for him. He shows them the picture of their mother on a most wanted poster. The sisters try to argue that they've just found out but he isn't buying it. Bowser states that working with the sisters has made him soft — he fires both of them.

They ask if he's going to turn in their mother and says no, but because of them, he's had to give up his ethics and \$90k. Bowser is mad understandably and he's loving his new circle very quickly.

Blair is upset because she feels rejected again. She opened up to Bowser so it's another blow. The sisters then talk about their argument in Nandina — Blair thinks it sucks that Sterling is right; she makes the drama so life feels bad because of her actions. Blair doesn't want to go to the lock-in, she wants to be with Miles — she thinks she loves him.

Sterling thinks she may be in love with April but she's not sure. Blair tells her sister that she doesn't care that she's gay.

Sterling goes to the overnight lock-in with her PJs and she learns April is running is late. April finally turns up. Ellen the teacher is very excitable about it.

At the lock-in, April hasn't saved her a spot and her sleeping bag is now next to Luke. Sterling is frustrated and asks about the scavenger hunt but April isn't showing interest.

Blair goes to Miles' house and looks for Miles. She interrupts family dinner and asks if she can speak to Miles. He says no so Blair gives her speech in front of the whole family. She tells him that she feels like she belongs to him — "I love you, Miles". Miles' mother asks him who Blair is. Blair is upset that Miles didn't tell his family about her.

He runs after Blair and says he is sorry and explains his mother is mid-campaign and that Blair is the daughter of Republicans. Blair realises Miles was ashamed of her but he refutes that idea, saying he had to fit in with his family. The pair argue about what Blair wants. Blair walks off telling him he's going to lose out.

At the lock-in, Sterling plays the playlist she and April created and she sees April crying in the distance. She walks but, of course, it's a lock-in so she can't leave. Sterling breaks down next to a door so April grabs the keys and unlocks it.

April stops Sterling and asks to sit with her. She tells Sterling she doesn't want to come out yet and she changed her mind. Sterling tries kissing her and she's rejected — this was painful to watch as you can feel Sterling's world collapse at this moment. April is worried about her father — he got cleared of his charges and he's not a fan of the LGBTQ+ community. Sterling is shocked that her father is out and thinks it will come back to bite him.

Luke tells Sterling he saw her crying and that he is here for her as a friend. He seems to have matured. He asks Sterling if she can ask April out — with tears in her eyes, she says he can and then she kisses him. Suddenly, her mother shows up and tells her to get in the car.

At home, Blair says she's going to pick Sterling up because she's not having a good time at the lock-in. She gets a text back that she's with her mother. But... Debbie is at home with Blair. Debbie drops her plate.

In the car, Sterling notices things that don't seem like her mother and she panics. Sterling asks a test question and screams when the woman she's with gets it wrong. It's her mother's twin sister Dana. Back at home, Blair thinks it's insane that her parents kept this secret from them. Back in the car, Dana explains she did something that people didn't like so she had to lay low for 16 years — it was Dana that burned down the abortion clinic and Debbie and Anderson made sure she was financially okay but recently she's become dangerous again as they haven't provided everything that Dana has demanded.

Back in the car, Dana throws Sterling's phone out of the car. At home, Blair is mad that they lied. Despite Debbie not wanting to, Anderson states they are calling the police.

Bowser visits Yolanda and tells her he is leaving town for a little bit and that he's going to Florida. Yolanda reminds him that he left Florida for a reason. Yolanda clearly doesn't want him to leave but Bowser believes it's a dead-end staying here because she's with somebody, referring to Terrance.

In the car with Dana, Sterling rants about how she wants to urinate so Dana pulls over. Sterling uses her debit card to get loads of Sour Patch sweets from a vending machine and empties one of the bags on the floor. She then goes to the bathroom and prays to God and asks for help.

Bowser is helping Blair find Sterling. She sees her bank transaction and they track down the vending machine. Blair sees Sour Patch sweets on the floor — Sterling hates them but Blair loves those sweets. They go to the bathroom and Sterling has left a message about Dana and the man she's meeting — Levi.

Blair has managed to recruit Bowser to help out. Bowser rings Terrance and asks about Levi; he looks in a database and finds an address. Debbie rings Blair and she tells her mother to trust her. At home, the police are being sceptical. Debbie secretly tells Anderson that she knows where Dana might be heading and they sneak away from the police.

Dana and Sterling get to Levi's place. Levi states this was not part of the plan but with the new scenario, he's going to ask for more money from the family. He tells Dana to put Sterling in the bathroom. Sterling tells Dana to leave Levi and be a good Christian because she's just a kid. Dana is tempted but states it's easier said than done and gags her.

Blair talks to Sterling using their telepathic powers (it's a twin thing apparently) and gives Bowser the situation. The telepathic powers are put to good use.

Levi starts shooting his gun towards Bowser and Blair. Meanwhile, Sterling kicks down her bathroom door. Dana grabs her and says they have to go. Bowser manages to get a shot on Levi's leg. Dana puts Sterling in the car but then Debbie shows up and puts a shotgun on her and tells her sister to put the gun down. Sterling is saved.

Debbie looks at her sister Dana and tells her they gave her everything she asked for — "I would never let you take my daughter from me".

Dana and Debbie suddenly telepathically talk to each other and Dana has a smile on her face and says, "You gonna tell her or should I?". Season 1 ends with another good twist — Debbie telepathically says she's done everything for her and tells her not to say anything. Dana tells Debbie that she can hear the sirens and this is it for her while she goes back to living her perfect little life — "Then let me have this one last moment of truth".

Dana turns to Sterling and tells her she is her daughter. Blair and Sterling look at each other in despair. Does this mean they are not twins?
