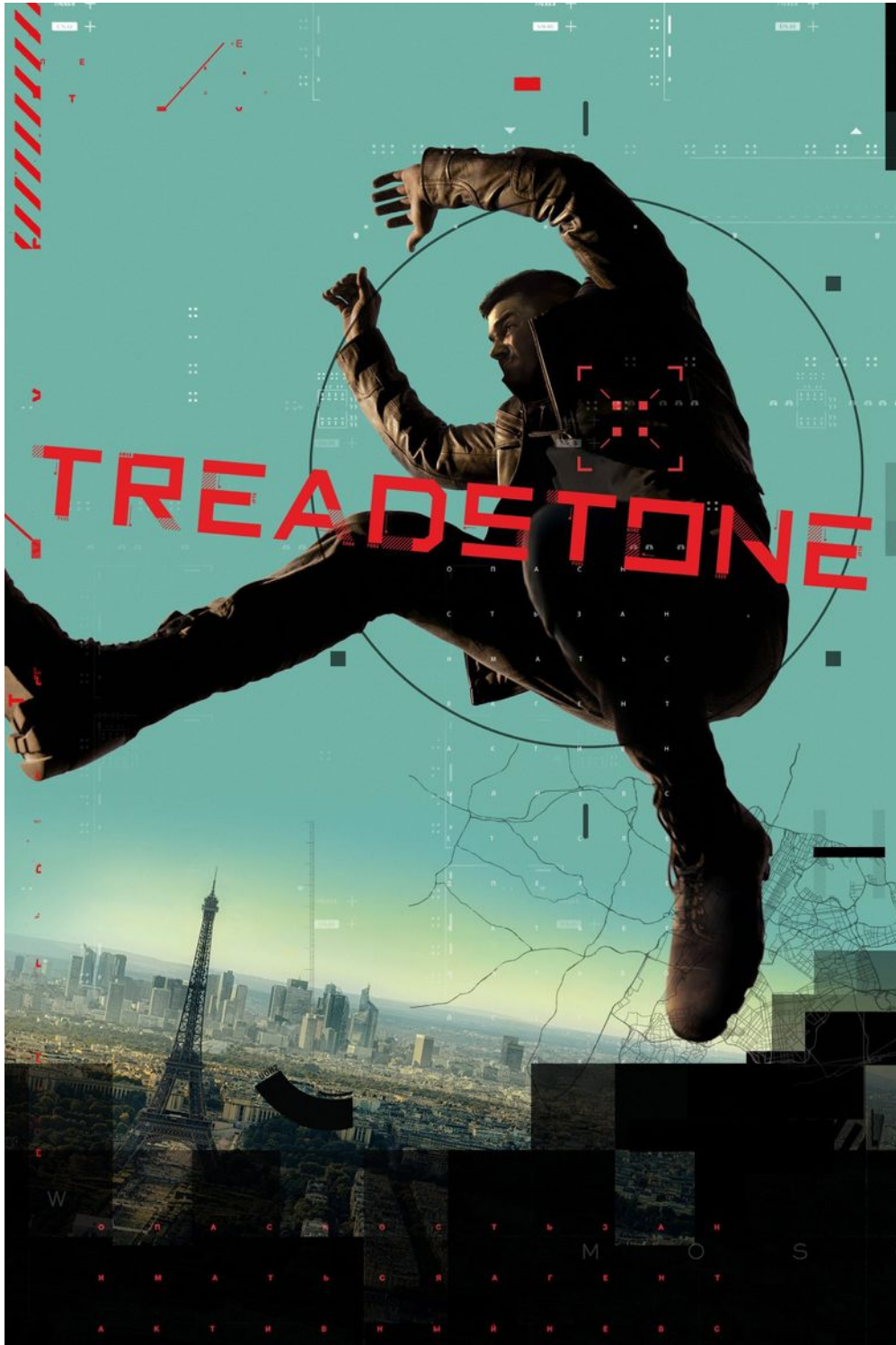

Summary: In 1973 East Berlin, captured CIA operative John Randolph Bentley escapes a Soviet behavior modification program named Cicada. In present day London, North Korean general Kwon tells Tara Coleman, a former journalist, that the "cicadas" are being activated—with these events being linked to the deactivated Treadstone program, and a missing Cold War nuclear missile—but he is killed by Soyun Pak.



In 1973, William Randolph Bentley, a CIA Officer imprisoned by the Soviet Union, is being used as a test subject for his captors, including Doctor Meisner and a mysterious Redheaded woman. He is being put under severe mind-control tests, and, upon hearing an ominous rendition of "Frere Jacques" by the Redhead, he unwittingly executes three people in a white-tiled room as he hallucinates that the killings were part of his past in the Vietnam War. Just when Meisner and the Redhead start to think that their tests

have succeeded, Bentley makes his move — he stabs Meisner in the neck with his own reading glasses and begins to fight his way out of the facility. Fighting the impact of the drug cocktail that he's been given, Bentley makes his way past Russian soldiers and eventually the Redhead before making a daring leap off the roof and running off into the East Berlin night...

In the present day CIA, Ellen Becker receives a message from a North Korean General named Kwon, who wants to speak to a disgraced former investigative journalist named Tara Coleman in London. Moving quickly, Becker guides London-based agent Matt Edwards as he prepares to engage Tara, with Becker's superior Dan Levine overseeing. Under the guise of being a rider, Edwards gets in the taxi that Tara is now driving and soon reveals his true motive — Edwards needs Tara to speak with Kwon about a missing missile from the former Soviet Union, called the Stiletto Six, the same missile that cost Tara her career as a journalist when she was the only one who believed in its existence. When Tara goes to meet with General Kwon in a hotel, Kwon sniffs out the audio surveillance she's under, and reveals to Tara that she can't trust the

CIA, because the former program Treadstone is now being restarted. With Becker and Levine scrambling to troubleshoot after losing audio, Kwon tells Tara that North Korea has raised the funds to purchase the Stiletto Six launch codes from a Russian man named Yuri Leniov. Kwon appears to know that his days are limited as a North Korean traitor, and he tells Tara to find his daughter in Paris and to take her to the Ecuadorian Embassy — only then will Kwon's friend at the Embassy give Tara the information she needs to intercept the launch codes...

In Pyongyang, North Korea, a piano teacher named Soyun picks up her son, Jin Woo, from school. Jin Woo is nervous about something, and he finally reveals that someone had planted an American video game device in his locker at school, which could endanger Jin Woo and his parents if found. Just as Soyun takes the GameBoy, her husband Dae opens the door and tells her that they need to prepare a dinner, as they have high-ranking guests. Dae works in the North Korean Nuclear Missile Program, and he has just found out that he may be in line for a promotion amidst big developments for the program. While preparing dinner, Soyun examines the device she took from Jin Woo, which suddenly starts playing "Frere Jacques" as she finds a small syringe and a photograph hidden inside. Something unknown washes over Soyun's face...

Later, Soyun is back to her piano lessons, but something is different about her. As her student plays, Soyun leaves the apartment and crosses to a neighboring building on a cable many stories up. In the neighboring apartment, we finally see Soyun's target... General Kwon! Kwon seems to know that Soyun is there to kill him and Soyun suddenly realizes that she can speak English. Suddenly, Kwon lunges at Soyun, and after a brutal fistfight, Soyun strangles Kwon to death.

In a remote oil town in Alaska, Doug McKenna, his friend Mike, and their coworkers are unexpectedly fired after their oil company sold the rig to Russia. Doug and the rest of the laid-off American workers go to town to drink away their sorrows, but they are angry to see that their new Russian replacements are there as well. Doug has a seemingly innocuous conversation with a woman named Carol at the bar just before an aggressive Russian assaults Doug. Doug starts taking a beating before he suddenly catches an incoming punch in mid-air, then unleashing a furious counterattack on the Russian aggressors, shocking both himself and everyone else in the bar with his physical capabilities. After the fight, Carol convinces Doug to go back to her office to nurse his wounds, where Doug tells Carol how he hasn't been feeling like himself. Just then, Carol begins to hum the tune "Frere Jacques," and something happens to Doug. Doug drifts off into unconsciousness as we wonder what in the world Carol has planned.

The next morning, Doug wakes up in the middle of the icy tundra away from town, a bag of drugs in the snow next to him, a crumpled mugshot of an unknown woman folded in his bloody hands...

At a remote farmhouse in Russia, an old, stern woman named Petra scolds her husband Oleg for spending their money on a hearing aid for himself. Oleg is unconcerned and is over the moon about his recovered hearing ability. Oleg's elation turns to curiosity, though, when he starts to hear an odd buzzing sound through his hearing aid. Petra uses this as an opportunity to snatch the hearing aid from him and tuck it in her bra. Later that night while Petra sleeps, Oleg sneaks the hearing aid back and begins to follow the buzzing sound to an unknown trapdoor in their barn. The trapdoor leads to a dark tunnel below ground, when he finds a locked door next to an old electric circuitry box which has been causing the buzzing. Just then, Oleg turns around to see Petra holding a scythe, and, before Oleg can react, Petra suddenly swings the scythe into his heart. As Oleg dies, Petra looks to what's beyond the door, revealing the long-lost Stiletto Six that she has been guarding on this remote Russian farmhouse. We also tilt down to reveal that Petra has a pinky finger that has been cut in half and scarred...

Flashing back to 1973, we see the injured pinky finger on the previously unnamed Redhead's finger from her fight with Bentley, finally revealing the identity of this mysterious Redhead woman. As past and present storylines are connected, Bentley evades Petra and her men and races through the streets of East Berlin to reunite with the CIA.

Summary: Bentley returns to CIA. Tara travels abroad. Edwards digs deeper. Doug has nightmares.



At the West Berlin CIA Headquarters, Bentley struggles as the realization sets in that he might have lost more of his memory than he thought during his time in Soviet captivity. Ferguson reluctantly tells him his mother has been informed that he's dead, and then eventually tells Bentley he's been missing for nine months, not the weeklong captivity Bentley had thought.

Bentley goes in front of West Berlin Station Chief, Dennis Kohler, and answers Kohler's questions to the best of his

ability, which isn't saying much. His memory from his captivity is fuzzy, but he does remember there was a woman with red hair, who we know to be Petra, who made him feel more whole, more complete. When he realizes how this makes him sound, he tries to assert that he completed his mission and killed Dr. Meisner, but Kohler isn't buying it... Backed against the wall, Bentley snaps and disarms the nearby guard, training his gun on Kohler and using Ferguson as a hostage to enable Bentley's frantic escape from the CIA Headquarters.

Doug dreams feverishly about a brutal training session in which he must kill another trainee to save himself from drowning, but then he wakes up to find that he's on the plane back home from Alaska with his friend Mike.

After landing, Mike drops Doug off at home where Doug surprises his wife Samantha. She's so surprised that she greets this unexpected visitor with a pistol in hand, but they reunite passionately once she gets over her shock. Doug has to break the news to Samantha that he got laid off at the rig, but she's optimistic and comforting. Later that night, Doug wakes up from a nightmare involving the mysterious Carol from Alaska and pulls out the mugshot of the unknown woman he had when he woke up in the snow. He searches the address written on the back and finds that it matches with a place called Clonie's Bar.

Becker tells Edwards that Kwon is dead, and Edwards tells Becker about the lead that he has on a "behavioral modification" specialist who may have been connected to the Treadstone assets.

Edwards makes his way to Atlantic City, where a hypnotist named Dr. Martin Wells performs a peculiar show in front of a sparse low-end crowd. Edwards approached Wells following the show and questions him about Treadstone. Wells reveals that the program ran deeper than Edwards thought, then is surprised to hear that Dr. Wells already knows that former assets are being woken up. As proof, Dr. Wells shows Edwards a grainy security video of a man named Stephen Haynes murdering four people in a shooting spree, then Wells points out to Edwards how this seemingly random shooter has all of the indications of a Treadstone asset. Off this bombshell, Edwards tells Wells he needs his help talking to Haynes.

In the present day, Petra attempts to code in from her farmhouse following the Stiletto Six missile being remotely accessed in the hidden silo on her property, but she is dismayed to find that her contact number is no longer active. Out of options, Petra buries her dead husband Oleg and boards a train to Moscow. Upon her arrival in Moscow, Petra surprises her old friend Max with a call and tells him that she needs to meet with both him and Yuri.

Meanwhile, back in 1973, Young Petra gets berated by her KGB Major Yuri Leniov over losing Bentley; however, their relationship is revealed to be more intimate than the rest of their comrades know when they are later seen in bed together.

After the brutal fight with General Kwon in Episode 1, Soyun tries to get to the bottom of who put the game console that activated her in her son Jin Woo's locker. Reluctantly, Jin Woo reveals that it was given to him back an unknown man at school. Later, Soyun feels out Dae's interest in fleeing North Korea just as Colonel Shin, who she had previously seen watching her, shows up at their house and tells Dae that he's getting promoted. Just as Soyun is struggling to hide her panic at Shin's appearance, her world is rocked when Jin Woo tells her that Shin was the man who gave him the game!

After Dae returns home from drinks with Shin, he reveals to Soyun that he was promoted because he had found out that Kwon was a traitor and exposed him. Soyun has to hide her surprise at this connection to the man she killed, and Dae tells her she can never speak of leaving the country again.

As Tara arrives in Paris and attempts to make contact with General Kwon's daughter Jang-Mi, she is surprised to get a call from Edwards back in Washington, informing her that Kwon is dead and that a kill team is on its way to Paris from North Korea, presumably to take out Jang-Mi. Tara is able to track Jang-Mi to Versailles, where she approaches Jang-Mi and her boyfriend, Dimitri. Jang-Mi is dismissive of Tara's attempts to speak with her, until Tara reveals a Silver Baptism Medallion that Kwon had given Tara. Tara tells Jang-Mi they need to go to the Ecuadorian Embassy, and Jang-Mi realizes this means that they are going to see Kwon's old friend Hector. As Tara drives a shaken Jang-Mi and Dimitri to the embassy, they are suddenly cut off by a black SUV, with two armed North Koreans inside! Tara attempts to drive them to safety, but Dimitri takes a bullet to the head and the cars both lose control and crash, leaving Tara and Jang-Mi in a precarious position just next to two North Korean assassins.

Summary: Bentley searches for answers. Edwards meets an asset. Doug gets a visitor. Soyun gets a mission.



Following the car crash at the end of Episode 2, Tara and Jang-Mi continue their escape from the North Koreans on foot. Evading the assassins through the streets of Paris, Tara and Jang-Mi narrowly make their way to the Ecuadorian Embassy. After meeting General Kwon's old friend Hector, Tara has an emotional moment with Jang-Mi as they say their goodbyes. Then Hector gives Tara a flash drive which serves as an encryption key to access \$500 million in cryptocurrency that Kwon had hacked from the North Ko-

rean government, that Tara is to use to purchase the launch codes. Tara then checks in with Edwards as he's in the middle of interrogating Haynes. Tara reveals that she knows about Treadstone, and that she is now going to Ghana to get to the bottom of Stiletto Six, as she has a contact there who can point her in the right direction.

In India, we meet a lean, intense woman named Nira Patel as she receives a kill order for a man named Johan Lang, a 25-year-old heir to a large German pharmaceutical company. Nira stalks Johan through the streets of Dharamsala before making eye contact with him. Johan then notices that Nira has dropped her scarf, and when he goes to return it, Nira ambushes him and sprays a cloud of aerosol into his face. Johan gets disoriented and we later learn that Johan dies within a matter of minutes.

At home, Dae hides his top secret files labeled "Stiletto Six" when Soyun enters, and he tells her they've been invited to a party that night with some high-ranking VIPs. When Soyun goes to drop Jin Woo off at her mother's house, she is approached by Colonel Li. Li reveals that he

has evidence fingering Soyun as General Kwon's killer and tells Soyun that Shin is a traitor and she is going to help Li expose Shin. In exchange for Li's silence, he demands that Soyun replace Colonel Shin's SIM card with a duplicate and deliver Shin's actual SIM card by midnight or else her mother and son will be taken to a labor camp.

At the party, Soyun struggles to hide her anxiety as she searches for an opportunity to replace Shin's SIM card. As the clock nears midnight, Soyun gets her chance but fumbles the duplicate SIM before being pulled away to play piano for the party. She starts to play, her fear and anxiety bleeding over into her music, until she suddenly stops — and runs out of the party.

After arriving in Moscow, Petra enters her old apartment from the 1970s — if it looks like the apartment is stuck in time, that's because it is: nothing has been touched here since Petra left. As Petra attempts to fix the light switch, her neighbor Yulia offers to help, and Petra lets her into her apartment. Out of nowhere, Petra attacks Yulia — she had already sniffed her lie from the beginning! After a fistfight, Petra gets the upper hand and kills Yulia.

Petra then ambushes her former comrade named Max Schneider and grills him about why Yuri wants her dead. Max reveals that Yuri had a change in his belief systems, and realized that he could use his power to get rich. Max gives Petra a clue as to Yuri's current whereabouts just before she slices his wrist.

Becker is having lunch with her husband, Tom, when Edwards calls to tell her that he's outside the shooter, Haynes', apartment in Salisbury, Maryland. Both Edwards and Becker are on high alert as they investigate this new shooting spree that could be linked to a former Treadstone operative. After hanging up, Edwards and Dr. Wells sneak into the apartment of the shooter and they see evidence suggesting that Haynes locked himself up as he started to lose control over his mind.

Later, Becker meets with Levine as they try to get their heads around new developments in the Haynes case. Levine mentions the death of Johan Lang in India, but Becker doesn't connect the dots, eager to discuss Haynes. Becker tells her colleagues that one of Haynes' victims was a former employee of Expo Oil in the Arctic, and that she was about to go public as a whistleblower with proof of labor violations. Furthermore, Expo's biggest ally on Capitol Hill is a Senator named Eamon Wray, who sat on the Intelligence Committee for the Blackbriar hearings, which could connect the dots to Treadstone.

Meanwhile, Edwards and Wells arrive at the county jail to interrogate Haynes again. After some initial resistance, Haynes agrees to let Wells hypnotize him again, and, in his hypnotized state, Haynes' previous identity as a Treadstone agent starts to come through, and he reveals that he was given kill orders by a woman when in training. Haynes starts to lose control and, just as Edwards is demanding to know who woke him up, Haynes starts foaming at the mouth and loses lucidity.

Back in 1973, Bentley searches for clues to fill the holes in his memory. He returns to the Psych Ward that he escaped from in Episode 1, only to find that it's different than he remembers. He sees a Red-Haired Woman that could be Petra and nearly attacks her before he sees her face and realizes it's just another red-haired Cleaning Lady. Shaken, Bentley goes to leave, but not before finding the gold necklace that Petra lost in their fight when Bentley escaped. After leaving the facility, he contacts Ferguson and asks for his help tracking where the Soviets went after leaving the facility. Ferguson agrees to meet, but the evidence he brings shows Bentley that he actually killed three CIA agents when under Soviet mind control. Just when things seem as though they couldn't get worse for Bentley, Kohler steps out and Ferguson apologizes for betraying him. However, Kohler turns his gun on Ferguson and shoots him dead before giving Bentley a new directive: find Petra and bring her in.

At home, Doug gets a call from his friend Mike who offers Doug work with some sort of illegal activity, and Doug declines just as Samantha walks in. Doug suggests they go do some day drinking and they head to Cloonie's Bar. At the bar, Doug and Samantha dance together before Doug starts to inquire about the woman on the mugshot. Little do they know that they are being watched by a mysterious man named Lowell from across the bar...

At the end of the night, Doug and Samantha return home, only to find Lowell waiting for Doug. Lowell tells Doug that he botched his job in Alaska, and that Doug needs to come with him. As Doug struggles to make sense of what Lowell means, he sees a window to attack Lowell and they engage in a brutal fight in Doug's living room. Just when it seems that Lowell has the upper hand, Samantha appears with a pistol... and shoots Lowell dead.

Summary: Doug solves a problem; Edwards has a breakthrough. Soyun embarks on a dangerous journey.



The episode picks up where we were left off, the moment after Samantha shoots Lowell dead on the floor of her and Doug's living room. Both husband and wife try to navigate the situation while delicately tip-toeing around the lies and half-truths they've been telling each other. Doug reveals to Samantha the full extent of his wild night in Alaska, and they eventually conclude that they need to get rid of Lowell's body without alerting the authorities.

They soon find themselves in the Daniel Boone National Forest, digging a grave to hide Lowell's body. While Samantha seems to be uncannily knowledgeable about how to dispose of a corpse, she chalks it up to her time as an ER nurse, and shifts the attention to Doug's memory of Alaska. Though Doug struggles to recall many specifics, he does remember that she sang an odd, nursery rhyme of a song. Samantha struggles to maintain composure as she starts to fear the worst.

They return home, physically and emotionally spent, and Doug finds Lowell's briefcase still in their house. Before she can stop him, Doug opens it and sees a folder with his name on it, as well as building blue prints, a photo of the same unknown woman from the mugshot Doug woke up with in the Arctic, and a time and place. Samantha cannot contain her reaction, as she knows that her worst fears have been realized — Doug has been reactivated. She has to tell Doug the darkest secret of their marriage — Doug was an asset in the past, and Samantha was his trainer. Doug is reeling over this new information as he realizes the implications that none of his life as he knows it is real, it was all a cover story, and that his loving wife Samantha has been actively working to keep him unaware of his real history.

As Doug stewes over these new revelations, Samantha has no choice but to approach him as there's more work to be done — she knows that the information that Doug has been given is

intended to be a kill mission. The woman pictured in the mugshot and in Lowell's briefcase is Doug's target, and, if Doug doesn't complete the mission, the CIA will continue sending people after Doug, continuing to put him and Samantha in danger. Head spinning and emotionally burdened, Doug and Samantha drive back to Cloonie's Bar, where Doug is approached by a mysterious man named Spencer. Spencer seems to know that Doug is there to be part of a job, and Doug suddenly finds himself in a van with five men he doesn't know, armed to the teeth, on their way to do a job.

Soyun makes it back to her mother's neighborhood following the events of that night's party, empty-handed after failing to replace Colonel Shin's SIM card. She sneaks up on Colonel Li and his men and skillfully dispatches them, but just then, Colonel Shin shows up! Shin executes his rival Li, then turns to Soyun, who has to complete another mission for him in order to keep her family safe.

Soyun returns home with a heavy heart following the events of that evening, but fortunately, her loving husband Dae is understanding and compassionate about the events of the party that ended with Soyun running off the stage mid-song. The next morning, Soyun has an emotional goodbye with her son Jin Woo as she needs to go off on another mission, one that she's not sure where it will lead.

Later that day, Soyun finds herself at a remote village called Sakchu, and she meets an Old Man who has been waiting for her. He gives her a wad of cash and a sealed envelope, then a smuggler shows up and tells her that he'll help her get the rest of the way... to China.

Edwards and Dr. Wells go back once again to the county jail to continue their hypnosis of Haynes, who is starting to remember more and more of his past life, including that he has a daughter. When Haynes goes back under, he starts to get clearer recollections of his daughter, but those memories are soon invaded by another woman, the mysterious woman who was his handler when he was a cicada. Dr. Wells starts to lose control over Haynes and finally the experience becomes too much for Haynes — he lunges and his restraints snap! Haynes unleashes his aggression on Dr. Wells and then knocks Edwards unconscious... a Treadstone asset is now on the loose.

As they wonder about the progress of Edwards, Becker attempts to convince Levine of more mysterious connections between Senator Eamon Wray and the recent events surrounding Treadstone. A recent trade agreement sponsored by Wray has been approved by the Russian Kremlin. The connections are still loose, but where there's smoke, there may be fire...

Edwards regains consciousness to a chaotic scene — alarms ringing and Dr. Wells dead body on the floor next to him. As the local cops mobilize to hunt down Haynes, Edwards uses the details that Haynes recalled about his daughter to head in a different direction.

Becker is lying down for a quiet evening with her husband Tom when Edwards calls and gives her the news that Haynes has escaped. As Edwards takes off towards the park where Haynes recalled spending time with his daughter, we see none other than Carol, Doug's mysterious woman from Alaska, watching him in the shadows. She is on the hunt for Haynes as well.

In the woods, Doug sees someone in a Maryland State Trooper uniform, only to find that it's Haynes! Edwards has the drop on Haynes, and he offers a deal: help Edwards expose whoever has been waking Haynes up, and Edwards will help Haynes get to his daughter Lilah.

Doug and Spencer's crew arrive at the processing plant, and Doug, having studied the blueprints for the plant, is immediately on a different agenda than the rest of the group. After leading the crew onto the main floor, Doug finally spots the woman from the mugshot that he's been looking for since Episode 2.

After the crew is spotted, mayhem erupts, and Doug, having set up Spencer and his crew as a diversion, launches into full attack mode, using all of the skills that have been hiding inside him for

years. As he disables the guards, Doug makes his way up to where Patty Vernon, the local drug pin and woman from the mugshot, works.

With Spencer and his team reeling at this unplanned one-man wrecking crew, Doug is shocked to find none other than his friend Mike working with the drug runners in the warehouse. Doug reacts in a split second and shoots one of Spencer's crew members, saving Mike's life, then he gets to Patty Vernon and finally executes her, fulfilling his mission.

Doug later returns home later to Samantha, who has been waiting fearfully in hopes that he would return. Doug tells her that he did his job, but it was like it was someone else who took over his body, and he fears that he's turning back into a monster.

Tara finds Meghan, an old friend from her previous life as a journalist, at a funeral procession in Accra, Ghana. As they catch up, Tara starts to fill Meghan in on her new investigation of Treadstone, then reveals to Meghan that she's there to see another old contact, Sebastian, with whom Tara has a complicated relationship.

Tara soon finds herself at a Ghana prison where Meghan's cousin, Kofi, helps her gain access to see Sebastian. Sebastian is a charming weapons dealer; while his romantic past with Tara is

hard to resist, his charms may not work as well on some of his fellow inmates who seem to have it out for him. Though Tara is there to get information about her current investigation, Sebastian keeps trying to bring up their past. When Tara reveals that she's there to discuss the story – the same Stiletto Six story that she had obsessed over for years – Sebastian dismisses her. As he tries to walk away, Tara tells Sebastian that Yuri Leniov is selling the Stiletto Six launch codes on the black market, and Tara needs Sebastian to grant her access to Yuri. This draws a reaction from Sebastian, but he refuses to help Tara chase down her old obsession.

Later in the day, Sebastian waits to get back into his cell when Kofi discretely passes a home-made shiv to an inmate. The shiv makes its way through the inmates until finally one uses it to stab Sebastian in the back! As the ambulance carries Sebastian away from the hospital, Sebastian regains consciousness to find Tara holding his hand. She sheepishly reveals that she had someone stab him in order to get him out of the prison, then she paid off the ambulance driver and Sebastian's helicopter pilot, who is now waiting to take Tara, Sebastian, and Meghan off to find Yuri Leniov.

We pick up on Bentley's 1973 storyline after he was given a new ultimatum from Kohler at the end of Episode 3. Bentley is in Budapest on the hunt for a missing Field Agent named Donald Matheson. He begins his search in a local bar, where he's surprised to learn that the bartender recognizes him and knows him as a violent threat. Bentley is studying Matheson's files when the bartender reappears with a gun aimed at Bentley's head, and there are several men moving in. Bentley springs into action, disarming the bartender and cutting the lights out before disabling four locals who have beef with Bentley. Fortunately, one of the men knows where Bentley lives, or used to live, presenting Bentley with a new lead in the search for his lost memories.

Bentley makes his way to a ratty apartment building where the manager, Karoli, remembers Bentley from his time living there, though Bentley still has no recollection. As he makes his way into his old room, Bentley starts to get faint recollections, and he rips away the wallpaper and finds that his name has been written repeatedly on the wall under the wallpaper. His emotions boil over at his past self's obvious attempts to keep hold over his true identity, and he throws a chair into a mirror, which shatters to reveal a small observation room with a chair and a tripod. He follows this room to an attic, where he sees a small chair, TV, and tapes. When he plays one of the tapes, he's horrified to see his nemesis from the bar being tortured in the apartment. This gets worse, as he sees that the torturer is himself, and he's enjoying it. As Petra encourages him, Bentley's torture moves on to his former fellow-CIA agent Matheson, who is currently missing — on the tape, Matheson gives Bentley the names of the CIA agents who Bentley has realized he killed when under Soviet mind control. Bentley is torn away from the video footage when Karoli appears and tells Bentley that the KGB used the building to torture men from the city, and that Bentley was truly enjoying himself when he was living there as one of the enemy.

At the end of his wits, Bentley finally calls home to speak with his mother, but he can't bear to talk to her and hangs up. With no more leads, Bentley stops at a dive bar for a drink, where a young woman named Katya approaches him and tells him that he needs to let go. She takes him to an underground night club and introduces him to her method of letting go — Katya is going to guide Bentley on an acid trip in hopes of regaining who he once was.

The North Korean smuggler leads Soyun to his row boat and instructs her to keep out of sight underneath his boxes. The ruse is up almost immediately, however, as a North Korean border guard approaches the boat and make the smuggler's papers out as fakes. After the smuggler attempts to draw a weapon, the border guard shoots him, and Soyun bolts from her hiding spot and knocks out the guard, then starts rowing herself to China. After arriving at the Chinese border, Soyun boards a covered truck containing other immigrants fleeing for China.

In Beijing, Treadstone asset Nira exits a bus and finds a storage locker containing a duffel bag with a rifle, a pistol, several blades... and a picture of Soyun as her next target.

In Eastern China, the truck driver tells Soyun that she needs to get out, and she follows a flashing light down a dark road where she finds none other than Nira Patel waiting for her. Nira demands that Soyun hand over the envelope that Soyun has brought from North Korea, and when she's about to hand them over, Soyun recognizes them as the missile plans from Dae's lockbox in their house. Realizing that this handoff will implicate her husband, Soyun attacks! In an epic, hand-to-hand fight between two Treadstone assets, Nira finally gets the upper hand then shoots Soyun in the side and takes the envelope, leaving Soyun for dead.

Doug pays a visit to Mike to make sure he'll keep quiet after they came face to face at the raid on the pill factory, and Mike reveals to Doug that one of the men who was killed was a cop. As Doug proceeds, he sees a silhouette outside the house — Mike has betrayed Doug already. Doug leaps out of the house and finds his motorcycle, leading to an epic motorcycle chase through the neighboring woods. Doug evades a number of SWAT men, but then gets rammed and crashes in an unconscious heap.

Doug awakes to find himself bound and the dangerous Spencer from the pill raid standing over him. A man named Leo Biller shows up and, out of nowhere, shoots Spencer straight in the head. Biller interrogates Doug about Lowell, who is unreachable (because Samantha killed him). Doug springs to his feet, takes control of his gun and shoots Biller. As Doug frees himself and speeds away, we see that Biller is still alive... When Biller speeds away, we see Doug hiding in wait to follow him, having grazed Biller with the bullet intentionally.

Doug follows Biller to a hotel in Louisville, where he tracks Biller as he speaks with a woman we'll come to know as Anna Collier. Doug quickly rigs a homemade listening device and overhears Biller and Anna talking about continuing with their plan and cutting off all the loose ends, including Doug and Samantha.

As Young Petra and her KGB comrades, including the ruthless Dragunov, pick up the trail of Bentley, Bentley and Katya dive deep into their LSD trip at the Budapest nightclub. As Katya guides Bentley, our hero experiences an acid-induced flashback to his time at a prison in Poland — he sees his former partner Ferguson and the moment when Bentley sacrificed himself to allow Ferguson to escape, then he flashes back to the beginning of his torture that Petra administered

as a means to break Bentley's mind. As Bentley continues to remember the brutal sleep deprivation and electroshock therapy that he was put under from Petra and Dr. Meisner, he starts to remember some of the gentler moments with Petra that connected him with her while he was being tortured. There was a bond that they established while Bentley's mind was being broken, leaving him to wonder how real that bond actually was.

As Bentley goes deeper into the flashback, he hears the "Frere Jacques" activation song, and he plunges into a series of memories of his training in the midst of live rounds being fired at him. He gets better and better, showing his true potential as an agent and a potential weapon for the Soviets, and then he sees himself torturing Matheson, with no knowledge over who he is and where his real allegiances lie. When he is just about to kill the three agents that he executed in the opening scene of Episode 1, Katya wakes him up in the real world and tells him that they are being raided by the KGB!

Still in the midst of his acid trip, Bentley stumbles onto the streets of Budapest to see cars streaking past like comets and Dragunov chasing after him. Bentley gets cornered by Dragunov before his defensive instincts kick in, and he incredibly fights off the KGB in the midst of his altered sense of reality before he is finally hit by an oncoming car. He slips away into unconsciousness, but the last thing he sees is Petra standing over him.

After her fight with Nira, Soyun musters the strength to drag herself to a nearby village, where she collapses and then wakes to a local doctor patching her up, having already removed Nira's bullet. Soyun ignores the doctor's advice to rest and pulls herself up to return home to her family.

Soyun returns home, physically hurt but emotionally stronger, to find her nemesis Colonel Shin waiting in her house. He tells her that her family is at work, under Shin and his men's supervision, and that Soyun will get another mission soon. Furious at the betrayal, Soyun trails Shin's envoy of SUVs and sneaks into the trunk of one of them as they drive through the night to Seoul, South Korea.

Edwards is now working with Haynes to help him find his daughter in exchange for information about the woman who woke Haynes up. When they finally make it to the house where Lilah lives, Haynes points out to Edwards the black sedan on the same street and reveals that he knows that the woman who activated him is in the car, and that he knew they would come to this house. Haynes then advances on the car, and, with Lilah watching from the house, Haynes and Edwards get in a fight with the two men in the car with Carol. A life-or-death struggle ensues, and Haynes finally gets his hands on Carol and strangles her to death. In a heart-wrenching moment, Haynes sees his daughter, who doesn't recognize him, looking out at the destruction he just caused.

Edwards checks in with Becker to send him the photo of Carol's face in hopes of gleaning more information about her. Becker reveals that she worked at a company the CIA has used for cover identities in the past, but Edwards is going way out on a limb, and Levine is starting to pressure Becker to rein him in or else they're going to have to resort to more extreme measures.

As Edwards comes to trust Haynes and his desire to help the cause, he calls Becker to give her the good news, but she has other ideas. Becker tells Edwards that this has gone too far, and it's time for Edwards to "clean it up." Edwards argues against a direct order from Becker, and Levine is already mobilizing to send in a team and take them both out.

and Haynes drive down an abandoned highway, then suddenly they swerve off the road into the adjacent fields. When the CIA team recover a visual on the car, there's only one man inside. As they hasten to regain a visual on Haynes, Becker is surprised to get a call from none other than Matt Edwards. Edwards tells Becker and Levine that he wants to come in, and that Haynes is in hiding with Edwards' AR-15. When Levine and Becker agree to bring Edwards in, Haynes emerges from the woods, hands in the air. As the team brings Edwards in, another group of agents takes Haynes off the side, perhaps to do away with this malfunctioning former asset.

Edwards finds himself at a debriefing room in the CIA Headquarters. Back at his computer, Edwards tries to dig deeper on Carol just as his account is frozen, and Levine orders his subordinates to start surveilling Edwards immediately.

In Moscow, Tara gains access to Nolan's hacking headquarters. Tara presses Nolan for answers about Treadstone, and he tells her that there's a connection between Blackbriar and Treadstone, both programs created to enhance soldiers. Then Tara tells Nolan she needs to know everything she can about Yuri Leniov, and Nolan gets his hackers to work...

When Nolan's hackers turn up information that Yuri once worked on a program called "Cicada," Tara recalls something that General Kwon said to her in Episode 1 about the "cicadas waking up." Unfortunately, further information on the Cicada Program is analog, meaning it's in a restricted room in the Russian State Military Archive (RSMA).

With Nolan and his team supplying faked credentials, Tara walks right into the front of the RSMA. She makes her way to the restricted access room and uploads images about the Cicada program to Nolan. Nolan's team cross-references Cicada names with those in the Stiletto program, leading them to none other than Petra, and an address for her husband in the Russian countryside. Tara has a new lead.

Tara puts a call into Edwards for the first time in a long time — they are both getting closer to the truth. Edwards is closing in on an organization called the Fair Trade Fellows Board, which lists both Yuri Leniov and Senator Eamon Wray on its Board of Advisors. For her part, Tara has just reached her new lead, and she hangs up the phone as Petra opens the door to her farmhouse and invites her in, smiles on her face, pistol hidden behind her back...

She makes her way to the VIP area where she sparks a conversation with none other than Yuri Leniov, who is there to meet with Colonel Shin. She leaves the listening device next to Yuri and overhears them discussing the transaction of the funds to buy the launch codes in Berlin, which were taken from Tara. Then, she hears something that shakes her to the core — her husband, Dae, is the man they've chosen to take the fall, and Soyun herself is their cicada. This new information means that there is less time that she thinks to stop the missile transfer and save her husband, and Soyun attacks in full force. A brutal fight ensues in the middle of the VIP section and now we finally see the full fury of Soyun's physical abilities. Shin barely escapes before Soyun runs off into the night.

At this, Petra leads Tara down into the missile silo below her property, where Tara finally sees the missile that's been haunting her for years and years. More troubling is that Petra informs Tara that the nuclear payload has been taken by Yuri, meaning the missile is still in play

In Vincent's apartment in Washington DC, Samantha gives Doug a crash course in becoming the asset known as Vincent. He has to study a multitude of subjects and intricate details that match up with Vincent's cover story — incredibly, Doug passes these tests with flying colors. They share an intimate moment over the moment when they met after Doug's time as an asset and how they came to this very place, then they prepare to go their separate ways. The next day, Samantha gives Doug a bottle of pills that will keep his impulses at bay, and tells him they'll be communicating through a dating app.

Samantha uses analog means to signal to a former contact that she wants to come in. Just before they split up, Doug realizes that they're going to send "Vincent" another target to take out, and they share a loving goodbye as they both realize that it's going to be a long time before they see each other again.

Samantha is finally contacted by Leo Biller, the man that Doug intentionally left alive in Episode 7. She nervously gets in the car and Biller drives off.

Back in Vincent's apartment, Doug gets a text message that shows him his new kill order, a man named Padre Vicuna in Colombia. Now completely transformed into Vincent, Doug exits to follow this new lead.

Still in Budapest after escaping together, Bentley and Petra prepare to meet with Yuri with the plan that Bentley is going to act like a still-brainwashed killer that Petra is bringing in as a way to find Matheson and save him. Before they leave, Petra gives Bentley an address for a café in Venice where they are to meet up after the mission, and Bentley is nostalgic about his happy place in Hocking Hills, Ohio.

They arrive at a hotel and come face to face with Young Yuri, who kisses Petra while Bentley remains in stoic character. Then, Yuri decides to sadistically test Bentley by making Petra strike him while Bentley stands still.

While Yuri takes Bentley away, Petra goes to their old movie theater hideaway... but something's off. She makes out the strange men keeping their eyes on her and she engages them in hand combat, then is forced to surrender when suddenly surrounded by armed men, and she is led into their old bedroom to see none other than Dennis Kohler, the man who killed Ferguson and told Bentley he needed to bring Petra in. Kohler tells her he wants to know everything about the Cicada program.

Meanwhile, Bentley is transported to a prison in Bucharest, where he is brought face to face with none other than Dr. Meisner, complete with new stitches on his neck after Bentley's attack in Episode 1. Bentley is drugged and ushered into a holding room where he sees his fellow agent Donald Matheson... When Bentley informs Matheson that he's here to get Matheson out, Matheson, brainwashed, calls the guards in who start beating Bentley unconscious.

When he comes to, Bentley continues trying to convince Matheson to believe him. But then, Dr. Meisner walks in, and puts a disassembled pistol and a single bullet down on the table. Matheson attacks Bentley! They fight it out and Bentley gets the upper hand, but just as he's about to be forced to execute Matheson, Matheson calls him Bentley, triggering his memory kicking back in. It is time for them to escape this prison.

In Washington DC, Edwards catches a glimpse of a surveillance team that's been assigned to follow him as he enters a mosque. Edwards then covertly sneaks out the back and dials a former contact named Marten Van Room, working for Interpol and stationed in Amsterdam. Without wasting a second, Edwards reports to Van Room there are members of the CIA operating a global criminal syndicate, and that he's heading to Amsterdam to discuss.

When he hangs up, it is revealed that Levine has been listening in on his conversation! The episode begins with Haynes, previously presumed to be dead, as he's strapped into a chair watching a montage of disorienting images. This is Haynes being reconditioned to return as a Treadstone asset.

In Amsterdam, Matt Edwards has arranged to meet with his friend in inter-pol, Van Roon, to blow the whistle on the CIA's illicit Treadstone operation. However, Levine has been tracking Edwards' movements, and, as Becker watches on in horror, Levine gives the go-ahead for agents on the ground to subdue Van Roon and take him into custody.

As Edwards arrives at the rendez-vous and looks for Van Roon, he sees a far less welcome sight: Stephen Haynes, reprogrammed, heading straight for him. They both take off in a foot chase through the streets of Amsterdam before they come hand to hand and fall into the river. Edwards pleads with Haynes as Haynes gets the upper hand and starts to drown him, but just at the last moment, none other than Tara Coleman appears out of nowhere, shooting Haynes dead.

Following her shocking activation at the end of Episode 9, Tara is sent a kill mission for Yuri Leniov. She leaves Petra's farm to find Yuri, just as Levine sends his strike team to Cyprus, on the intel that Soyun had given him, to recover the nuclear payload of Stiletto 6 once and for all. The walls are closing in on Yuri.

Tara arrives at Yuri's mansion and immediately goes on the offensive, taking out one set of guards after another with brutal efficacy. She finally comes face to face with Yuri and engages in an intense fistfight with the Russian operative, who finally is able to knock her back and escape to his garage. Tara takes a moment to regroup, then turns around and jumps out of the window!

She lands on the roof of a car and gets a clear shot lined up at Yuri who's in a car heading straight towards her — she gets off a couple shots before the car bowls her over. Tara takes a moment in which it appears she might finally give up, but then she hops in a car and speeds off, heading to Amsterdam to save Edwards from his trap.

Now impersonating the dead Treadstone asset Vincent, Doug travels to Columbia to take out his/Vincent's next target, Mamo Luis, in hopes of keeping his and Samantha's lie alive. He makes his way through customs when a man stops him and tells him he has 24 hours to complete his mission. Then, Doug arrives at the remote village called the Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta in the countryside of Columbia, where he meets his target, Mamo Luis.

Meanwhile, Samantha has turned herself in at Treadstone under the guise that her husband went AWOL. Biller interrogates her, then gives her the bad news that Doug has been killed. Samantha pretends to cry while secretly hiding her excitement that their ruse seems to be working. Then, Biller gets a visit from his colleague, Anna Collier, and through them, Samantha learns that Doug has not yet completed his killing of Mamo Luis in the time needed, and Treadstone is sending other assets after him. Samantha secretly composes a note to Doug telling him that he's out of time.

From the jungle, Doug receives the message and moves to take out his target. He finds Mamo Luis praying by the river, and is about to move in when two commandos approach and start beating up Mamo Luis for not complying with their company's desire of abandoning his speech. Doug cannot hold himself back, and he approaches the commandos before a fight breaks out! Doug gets stabbed before scaring the commandos off, and he starts bleeding out with the injured Mamo Luis regaining consciousness next to him.

In 1973, following their breakthrough in Episode 9, Bentley and Matheson fight their way out of Meisner's prison in Bucharest. Just before they are about to escape, none other than Meisner shows up, taunting Bentley to kill him and claiming it's part of the plan. Bentley is concerned, but Matheson takes the opening and shoots Meisner dead. After their escape, Matheson questions Bentley about his relationship with Petra, claiming he'd shoot her immediately if given the chance, and wondering whether Bentley would do the same.

Having cleared his name, Bentley returns to the CIA a hero... of sorts. Kohler approaches him with feigned congratulations, but Bentley rebukes him, saying that he's going to expose Kohler for killing Ferguson in Episode 3. Kohler tells Bentley that he is a key to the next phase of their plan, along with the CIA's new valuable prisoner...

Kohler shows Bentley to Petra's prison cell, telling him he wants Bentley to break her mind, just as she did to him. Bentley and Petra have a heated exchange, ending in a physical tussle, but, when they are separated and Bentley removed from the cell, he realizes that Petra passed him a note during the scuffle: "Remember Hocking Hills".

After her adventure in South Korea that led to the Stiletto 6 payload being recovered by the Americans in Cyprus, Soyun is told by Levine that her family will have asylum in the United States if she helps the CIA kill Colonel Shin. She arrives at home to find her husband, Dae, and her mother, Yumi, in her apartment. After they confront her about her recent disappearances, she demands to see her son, Jin Woo. Soyun is dismayed to learn that Colonel Shin got Jin Woo accepted to a "special program," which is the same one that Soyun went to as a child that turned her into an asset. Soyun now has to go save her son.

Although Tara had gotten a good shot at him, Yuri Leniov survived her attack. He is now on his heels, and he orders the death of the man responsible for this failure, who turns out to be the CIA's Levine. Nira shows up at Levine's house and executes him with one shot.

Following Levine's assassination, an emotionally wiped Becker is told to meet with Senator Wray, and she arrives to find a room full of powerful men awaiting her.

After Tara saves Edwards from Haynes' assassination attempt in Amsterdam, the newly discovered Cicada, Tara, and the former CIA operative, Edwards, strategize together. In order to end this corrupted program, they need to disappear together and regroup.

Doug wakes up from the fight with the commandos to find a recovering Mamo Luis by his side, and he admits to Mamo that he was sent to kill him. Doug tells Mamo that "he wants to

wake up” and they are clearly going to fight this thing together.

Meanwhile, Samantha enters into a conversation between Biller and Anna, where she finds out that “Vincent” (Doug) accomplished his mission. Doug had sent a picture of a dead-looking Mamo Luis. Samantha is temporarily relieved, but now Vincent is going to be sent back on another mission. Samantha requests that she be the one to control Vincent.

In present-day, Hocking Hills, Ohio, Petra speeds down the country road in a convertible, music blaring. She gets out of the car and approaches a small cabin, takes a bear... and knocks on the door. A man answers, his back to us, and Petra regards him for a long moment, then smiles... “Bentley.”
