

Summary:	Lemieszewski (Sethi 1st), Leon Lopez (Sete), Alexander Lyras (General Yuya) Controlled for nearly 10 years by the powerful Vizier Ay and the formidable General Horemheb, Tutankhamun is determined to wrest control of his kingdom.



The show opens to a young Tutankhamun watching his father Ankhenaten condemn a prisoner and his family to death for being polytheistic during a time when they were only allowed to pray to the sun disk, Aten.

Ankhenaten wants his son to kill the prisoner's little boy, but Tutankhamun is too sweet and is unable to kill a child.

The Pharaoh is furious because he's dying from poison and wants a strong heir to take his place.

His last decree is to have Tutankhamun marry Ankhesenamun in order to keep the bloodline pure and Vizier Ay promises to help the young prince be a good ruler.

Ten years later, it is obvious that Tutankhamun's advisors want him to stay ignorant about politics so they can have all the power.

On a whim, Tutankhamun sneaks out one night and mingles with the commoners.

Not only does the young Pharaoh meet a pretty young woman named Suhad, but he also catches the eye of a soldier named Lagos too.

After Tutankhamun saves Suhad from a nasty customer, Lagos forces him into a stealth mission to find three Mitanni spies.

The Pharaoh in disguise and the soldier discover the spies' camp and kill them so the Mitanni king will not be able to garner new information about Egypt.

Tutankhamun also learns that General Horemheb has been lying to him and confronts his advisor during a meeting.

Needless to say, Horemheb is not thrilled that the Pharaoh accused him of lying and now wants to lead the army into battle himself.

Meanwhile, Vizier Ay meets with the High Priest, who wants Tutankhamun to stop asking so many questions.

Although the Vizier tries to control the Pharaoh, he is also subtly maneuvering events so that his stepson Nakht will one day take the throne.

A few days later, Tutankhamun declares he is going to be at the head of the army when they fight the Mitanni and even forces General Horemheb to changes his plan of attack.

Tutankhamun's plan to defeat the Mitanni army works but he's badly wounded during the battle and Lagos is captured.

Horemheb makes a half-hearted effort to find the king's body and returns to Thebes declaring that the Pharaoh is dead.

Vizier Ay immediately takes action to secure his stepson's position but even though Tutankhamun's wife Ankhesenamun is in mourning, she insists on marrying Ka.

Apparently, she has been in love with her husband's best friend for years and feels he will make a worthy Pharaoh.

Horemheb then orders his soldiers to look for Tutankhamun in the small chance he's alive and warns them to lie about their mission.

Thankfully, Tutankhamun escaped the battlefield and is nursed back to health by Suhad, who saved him from the General's soldiers.

He then reveals his true identity to the young woman and admits that he wants to save Lagos.

Since Suhad's grandmother was Mitanni, she knows the secret path to enter the city. They sneak in and manage to rescue Lagos, who was the only Egyptian soldier left alive.

The three of them then steal a chariot and head back to Thebes, since Tutankhamun knows his troublesome advisors have likely taken advantage of his so-called death.

Summary:	While the Mitanni continue their plot to conquer Egypt, Tut must con-
	tend with an illness spreading throughout the kingdom and a betrayal
	from his most trusted inner circle.

Tutankhamun, Lagos and Suhad return to Thebes just in time to see Ankhesenamun try to marry Ka.

The boy-King is furious that his friend would turn traitor in order to marry the woman he loves and stabs Ka in front of the crowd who had gathered in order to see his coronation.

Tutankhamun then announces to his people that he has "risen from the dead" and it is clear from his chilling look that he's planning on wresting power away

from his advisors.

His first order of business is telling the High Priest of Amun that the commoners don't have to give tribute anymore, which makes the man suspicious that Tutankhamun will soon revert back to the heretical worship of the sun disk, Aten.

The young Pharaoh then wants to kill General Horemheb for being a traitor, but he winds up escaping from his guards.

Although Tutankhamun tried to pacify the Mitanni king by offering him a peace treaty and a new wife, his plan didn't work.

The young bride Tutankhamun sent was killed and the Pharaoh was forced into an alliance with his traitorous General.

To further add to the drama, a mysterious plague is ravaging Egypt and decimated many of the soldiers in the army.

As Tutankhamun prepares for war with Mitanni, Ankhesenamun realizes that she's pregnant with Ka's child and gets revenge for his death by passing it off as her husband's.

Tutankhamun's second wife-to-be Suhad is also pregnant and Ankhesenamun attempts to have her killed.

Horemheb and Vizier Ay convince their Pharaoh to try and stop the plague by quarantining the sick so they can be burned alive.

After yet another miscarriage, Ankhesenamun tells Suhad that her parents are at an inn waiting to see her.

When Suhad arrives and sees the people sick with plague, she realizes she has been tricked. The General then sets the entire area on fire and Suhad struggles to survive.

Unfortunately, the smoke from the flames is too much and she passes out on the ground while trying to enter a house.

While Suhad fights for her life, Tutankhamun and Ankhesenamun reconcile as they watch the town burn.

Summary:	Tut sets out to achieve final victory against the Mitanni, and must destroy the last of his enemies within the Palace to secure his place in history.



The young Pharaoh of Egypt needs to figure out a way to destroy the Mitanni king, but his army has been severely weaked due to plague.

He allows Mittani prince to visit Egypt and offer terms.

However, Tutankhamun's enemy boasts that he will take Thebes and allow the inhabitants to become part of their empire, if they so wish.

Needless to say, Tutankhamun is furious and tells the Mitanni prince that he

will burn Egypt's crops himself before he ever allows the enemy to take over the capital.

After the prince leaves, the Pharaoh confers with his advisors and comes up with a plan.

He pretends to give the Mitanni prince a peace offering, but Tutankhamun knows the secret entrance to the Mitanni capitol and makes the decision to lead his army in a sneak attack.

While Egypt prepares for war, Tutankhamun orders Lagus to find Suhad.

The soldier discovers her unconscious body in the quarantine area and brings her back to the palace, where the physician warns that she could die due to her lungs being scorched.

Tutankhamun leaves for war with the Mitanni and the minute he is gone from the palace, the High Priest of Amun starts planting the seeds of revolt in the minds of his followers.

The High Priest is mad that the Pharaoh won't allow the commoners to pay tribute to the temples and that Tutankhamun threatened to bring back the heretical worship of Atenism too.

The High Priest of Amun gathers his followers and pretends to fall into a trance. On the steps of the temple, he orders his fellow priests to kill Tutankhamun during the feast of Ra in order to save the country from the worship of Aten.

Meanwhile, Suhad finally wakes up and Ankhesenamun is desperate to cover her tracks.

First, she kills the guard Sete and sends Ay to figure out what the new queen-to-be knows about the assassination attempt.

Suhad realizes that Ay is lying to her and pretends she has amnesia, but she mistakenly trusts in Nakht by asking him to send a message to the Pharaoh.

Ankhesenamun realizes that Suhad knows what happened and strangles the young woman while she is sleeping in order to ensure that she will stay Queen of Egypt.

Over in the battlefield, the Mitanni soldiers are drinking heavily and don't notice the explosives hidden in the wagons.

Using the secret path Suhad showed him, Tutankhamun has his archers ignite their arrows and set the explosives off in the middle of the army's camp.

He then leads a small band of warriors into the Mitanni palace and winds up killing their rulers, which earns him the respect of General Horemheb.

Unfortunately, the Mitanni prince broke Tutankhamun's leg in battle before he was killed and the Pharaoh is grievously wounded.

Instead of tending to his injury, Tutankhamun orders Lagus to return to Thebes at once.

Sadly, Tutankhamun's homecoming is filled with sadness after he finds out Suhad was killed by Ankhesenamun. He imprisons his sister right before he takes on the High Priest of Amun.

The Pharaoh conspires with Horemheb, Nakht and Ay to kill the priests during the festival of Ra.

With the High Priest's supporters dead, Tutankhamun enters the temple and kills his greatest threat.

However, Tutankhamun's leg is badly injured and infection has already set in.

On his deathbed, the Pharaoh makes peace with both Ankhesenamun and Ay. They reassure him that he will be remembered for all eternity right and that he was a good ruler.

The miniseries ends with the new rulers Ay and Ankhesenamun burying Tutankhamun in a tomb meant for another person before the sands of time sweep over the site.


