Summary: Years after they rose to fame as young crime-fighting superheroes, the estranged Hargreeves siblings come together to mark their father's death.



The episode kicks off in Russia on October 1, 1989. At noon on that day, 43 women all around the world who were not pregnant when the day began all gave birth at the same time. Eccentric billionaire and adventurer Sir Reginald Hargreeves attempted to adopt as many of those kids as possible and raise them under his tutelage. He ended up with seven kids. Thirty years later, this is their story.

Child #1 is Luthor. He has an abnormal amount of muscle and is physically bigger and stronger than the rest of the group. As the #1, he was trained from birth to be the leader of the group. Luthor

is stationed alone on the moon when he learns of Hargreeves's death.

Diego is quick and agile. His specialty is throwing knives. He lives as a vigilante and is breaking up a home invasion and robbery when he sees the news of Hargreeves's death on TV.

Allison is a movie star. She has the ability to make people do whatever she says, but she couldn't keep her marriage together, not custody of her child because she refuses to use her powers anymore. She is on the red carpet when word hit the press about Hargreeves's death.

Klaus is an addict who bounces in and out of rehab. When he's high and/or drunk, he's not haunted by his ability to see and commune with the dead. He's in the back of an ambulance after an overdose when he learns of Hargreeves's death.

The fifth child is simply Number Five. He has no name because Hargreeves never named the kids. They were subjects to him, not adopted offspring. Number Five disappeared just over 16 years ago when he was 13 years old.

Ben is dead. His grave is on the Academy's grounds. Episode 1 does not explain how Ben died, but he was both reluctant to use his powers—to turn into a tentacled beast—and at some point an exercise went awry, causing Hargreeves to send Luthor away to the moon to live in isolation. Perhaps the two things are related.

Vanya is the only one of the seven adoptees who has no super powers. As such, she was an outside among the kids. When the rest got matching tattoos to denote their team affiliation, she had to draw her own on with a pen. Vanya wrote a tell-all autobiography about living in the Umbrella Academy, which earned her scorn from the rest of the group.

The children, now 30 years old, gather together for the first time in the house they were raised in. Luthor suspects that one of them killed Hargreeves, in part because the old man's monocle is missing. The piece has no value, so someone took it as a trophy. Diego says that there are no signs of a struggle. Hargreeves was just a sad, bitter old man who died all alone in a big house after driving everyone away. Luthor wants Klaus to talk with their "father", but Klaus isn't sober enough to do so.

As the group prepares to say goodbye to the old man, a portal opens and Number Five is flung through. He has been gone for 45 years, having lived a full life, and now his 58 year old consciousness is back in this time in his 13 year old body. Upon arriving, he is concerned about the date. With Ben's graveside statue filling in, all are gathered together for the first time in year, along with Pogo the talking chimp butler and Mother, the robot who took care of the kids. The scene is hardly peaceful, resulting in the seven splitting up and going their separate ways.

Number Five heads to a donut shop for coffee, where he is tracked by armed men. Weapons drawn, they tell Number Five that he's to come with them. Instead, Number Five kills them all, jumping from portal to portal around the shop and getting the drop on the armed men. Number Five digs a tracker out of his arm and heads to Vanya's apartment where he tells her the whole story. When he first jumped into the future, humanity was wiped out. He never discovered what killed them, but he knows that whatever it is happens in 8 days. They need to stop the apocalypse, but he has no idea what it is.

Summary: After sharing the story of his time travel with Vanya, Five hunts for the owner of a fake eye. But two mysterious assassins are hot on his trail.



The episode opens with a flashback. The kids are sitting to dinner with Hargreeves when Five beaks protocol and speaks. He wants to try jumping through time. Hargreeves says absolutely not. It's too dangerous. There is no way to know the kind of damage time travel could cause to the mind and body. Furious, Five walks out, unexcused, and into the street, where he makes short jumps through time. His final jump takes Five into the post-

apocalyptic future he warned Vanya about. Five sees the Academy in ruins. In the rubble, five finds Luther holding a prosthetic eyeball. Five takes the eye, believing it to belong to the person who is responsible for bringing about the end of life on earth.

Diego heads to the donut shop crime scene, where he is caught by Detective Patch, a former police academy classmate and lover. Patch takes Diego in to the precinct and warns him that the next time he's caught sneaking around her crime scene she'll have him arrested. Diego tells her that they're on the same side and he can help her. He tries to convince Patch to quit the force and become a vigilante with him. She says Diego is trying to prove that the hero stuff he did as a kid was somehow worthwhile.

Diego mops the floor at a local gym in exchange for living in the boiler room. Luther sneaks in and cases the place while Diego is away, finding out that Diego was boxing the night that Hargreeves died. When Diego returns, Luther asks why Diego didn't tell him he had an alibi. Diego says he doesn't have to prove himself to anyone.

Allison misses her daughter. She calls her ex-husband, who gives Allison a hard time for missing a session to attend her father's funeral. Allison tells Luthor that she used to read Claire books about the moon and tell her that her uncle was up there protecting them. While Allison wanted to get away from the Academy, she didn't want to leave her siblings behind. Vanya tries to console Allison, but Allison pushes her away, saying that Vanya always separated herself from other people, including them. Vanya blames that on Hargreeves, but Allison says they're adults now. There's no one to blame for how they act toward one another anymore.

Vanya calls Pogo and asks him to check in on Allison. Pogo tries to help Allison by showing her the room where Hargreeves monitored and recorded the kids. He says he comes here sometime and watches the videos when he's missing the kids. Allison finds a tape with the label removed and plays it. When Luthor returns, contrite for having suspected Diego, Allison says that Luthor was right to suspect something amiss in their father's death.

Back at her apartment, Vanya's new student comes for his violin lesson. He's an adult, not a kid. He doesn't even own a violin. His father recently passed away, and he loved the violin. Leonard has come to learn the instrument as a way to try and understand his father better. He tells Vanya that he is a woodworker and that she should come by his workshop sometime. Vanya says she is busy, once again pulling back from interacting with another person.

Five finds the medical prosthesis company that manufactured the eye. Five is unable to get any information on his own, so he offers to pay Klaus \$20 to pose as his father. Klaus is game, since he is out of money after trashing the contents of the box he stole from Hargreeves's office and pawned the box itself for drug money. At the company's office, Klaus beats Five and himself in order to blackmail the manager into giving them the information they want. Unfortunately, there is no information. The eye with that serial number hasn't been manufactured yet. Five tries to convince Klaus that sometime within the next 7 days, someone will lose an eye, that prosthetic eye will be made and purchased, and that person will kill all of humanity.

Vanya has questioned whether Five actually saw the future or if it is time travel playing with his mind. Klaus doesn't seem to care. Back at the Academy, Luthor asks if there is anything he can do to help Five, but Five says they're all useless.

Two assassins, Hazel and Cha Cha, have traveled through time to hunt down Five. Mistaking the tow truck driver from the donut shop for old man Five, they torture Syd. From what he tells them, Hazel and Cha Cha discover that Five is in a younger body and that he is looking for Gimbel's department store. The two corner Five there, but lose him when the police arrive. At the store, Five reunites with a mannequin he named Dolores in the future, which helped him get through 30 years as the last person on earth.

Summary: Worried their mother is hiding something, Luther and Allison call a family meeting. Cha-Cha and Hazel catch a big break in their hunt for Five.



The episode opens five years ago. Vanya sees Umbrella Academy comic books in a pawn store window, along with a typewriter. She goes in and purchases the typewriter and writes her autobiography about life growing up in the Academy. All of her siblings read it, including the hurtful things she says about them. They were never a family, not really, and after Ben died they had no reason to stick together. The books was a success, at first, but like everything with Vanya, it turned out to be nothing special.

Allison shows Luther the tape of Mother visiting Hargreeves's room the night he died. Luther thinks that she poisoned him. The two question Mom the next morning at breakfast. Though she remembers things like the time of the sunrise on the day that Dad died, she can't recall visiting his room that evening.

Vanya decides to visit Leonard's woodworking shop. He lets her inside and shows her his real treasures beyond the restored antiques in the front. He has an uncanny skill for wood carving. Leonard carved a figurine of Vanya playing violin and gifts it to her. Leonard invite Vanya to dinner that night, and she accepts the invitation before Allison finds her and tells Vanya that she is needed at the Academy for a family meeting about Mother.

Five sneaks out of the house and runs into Klaus outside, going through the dumpster looking for the contents of Hargreeves's box. Five steals a van for a stakeout on the medical prosthesis

company. Luther finds Five and tells him he's needed at home for a family meeting. Luther knew where to find Five because Klaus stowed away in the back of the van. Luther tells Five it's important, but Five counters that Luther has no idea what's important right now.

Five stays instead of going to the meeting. Throughout the day, he carries on a conversation with Dolores the mannequin, suggesting that time travel might really have messed with his head. That evening, Five spots the manager exchanging a duffel bag for a manila envelope with a nondescript car that pulls up in front of the building.

Hazel and Cha Cha have had their pay docked because of the delay in finding and killing Five. Hazel is tired of the bureaucrats and the work. He's decided that as long as they're going to be here, he's going to indulge in normal life and find beauty in the ordinary, like TV and donuts. Hazel and Cha Cha question Agnes at the donut shop about the boy who was in the shop the night of the shooting. While Agnes doesn't know much, she does remember seeing the Umbrella Academy tattoo on Five's forearm.

Luther and Allison show the family the video. Diego points out that Mom didn't poison Dad, she just took his monocle, which Diego took from among her things and threw in the river? Why would he do that? Diego was protecting Mom from Luther's suspicions. Diego bonded with Mom as a child because she was the only one to show him kindness. Mom was programmed both to be maternal but also for protection. If Hargreeves's life was in danger, she would have intervened.

The group is split on what to do with Mom. It can't have been easy on her being in the house with Dad after they all left. If she's running down and malfunctioning, Luther suggests, then they should shut her off. Allison agrees. Diego and Vanya vote that they shouldn't shut Mom down. Klaus votes with Diego and says that if Ben was here, he would too, though Ben tells Klaus he agrees with Luther. They decide to do nothing until Five returns and votes.

Hazel and Cha Cha find the Academy and break in. Though the closest they get to finding Five is seeing his painting on the wall, which lets them know they are in the right place, they do encounter and fight with Luther, Diego, Allison, and Vanya. Klaus has headphones on to drown out the dead spirits yelling at him and misses the shoot out. Mom continues sitting beside the paintings and cross-stitching through it all. Though the siblings are able to drive Hazel and Cha Cha away, things are changed by the invasion.

Diego tells Vanya that she is a liability to have around because she has no powers. Vanya leaves and goes to Leonard's house because she doesn't want to be alone and has nowhere else to turn. Luther has his shirt ripped away when an iron chandelier falls on him, revealing his hairy, chimp-like torso to the others. Diego asks Mom whether she heard the fighting and discovers that not only did she not hear the fighting, but that she has stitched into her own hand and hasn't noticed. Struggling with sadness, Diego unzips Mom's arm and shuts her down.

Back at the hotel, Cha Cha is mad that Hazel left and went for donuts. He figured that since the kid never arrived, they'd regroup back here. Cha Cha is mad that the attack turned up nothing of value. Hazel says that's not true and shows her a bound Klaus in the trunk of the car.

Summary:	The story of Luther's transformation emerges. At the motel, Klaus puts Hazel and Cha-Cha's training to the test. Allison grows suspicious of Leonard.



The episode kicks off 7 years ago. Luther is the only one of the children who stayed. He is lonely in the big house without his siblings. Hargreeves sends Number One out on a mission, but without any backup, it goes badly. Luther is badly injured and dies on the table at the Academy. Hargreeves has Pogo hand him a serum, which Dad injects into Luther's burned chest. Luther is saved, but days later he discovers the cost of his survival. His body has become chimp-like.

Hazel and Cha Cha beat and torture Klaus for information on Five's whereabouts. Klaus doesn't break until the assassins begin trashing the drugs that Klaus had on him, including eating what they don't realize is Klaus's "special chocolate". Klaus tells them that since Five has returned, he's been acting strange—something with a prosthetic eye and the end of the world. Klaus tells them where Five has been holding his stakeout, and the two, high on special chocolate, torch the lab and leave a message for Five to come get his brother at the hotel on the van's windshield.

Sobering up at the donut shop later, Cha Cha understands that while they might be after Five for a breaking his contract as an assassin, Five is trying to change the timeline. If they kill him,

they'll be responsible for the end of the world. Meanwhile, Ben talk Klaus through withdrawal, memories of abuse at Hargreeves's hands, and the gathering of Hazel and Cha Cha's victims to help Klaus turn the tables on his captors.

Luther is going through Five's bedroom, looking for clues on where he might be. Five doesn't know about the attack. They have to warn him about the assassins looking for him. Luther and Diego go to the van to talk to Five, but he's not there. Diego finds a clue that leads them to the library. While searching for Five, Diego tells Luther that instead of asking why everyone else left, he should be asking himself why he stayed. The two eventually find Five drunk and passed out in a corner, getting cuddly with Dolores after Five watched the lab explode.

Vanya fell asleep at Leonard's place. She's out of her anxiety meds but also late for rehearsal. Leonard walks Vanya to the theater for rehearsal, then uses Vanya's keys to enter her apartment. Allison goes to Vanya's apartment and finds Leonard inside, who says he let himself in to use the bathroom.

Allison meets Vanya outside the theater and the two go for drinks. Allison tells Vanya that she doesn't trust Leonard. Back at the apartment, Vanya find a bouquet of flowers on her bed from Leonard. She calls him to thank him for the flowers and make a date for breakfast the next morning. What Vanya doesn't realize is that the flowers were cover for stealing Vanya's meds, which Leonard washes down the sink.

Patch is pulled further into the mystery by Diego, who spent the night after the attack on her doorstep. Diego tells her his brother is missing and asks for her help, but Patch says she can't do things his way. After the fire at the lab, Patch is the one to find the note to Five on the van's windshield. She goes to the hotel to find out more, but the clerk is no help. Patch calls the gym and leaves a message for Diego to come back her up.

After waiting, Patch decides to go in alone. She passes the door to Hazel an Cha Cha's room. Klaus bangs his head on a table to get her attention. Patch enters and frees Klaus, who scoots through the ventilation to escape, grabbing the briefcase Hazel hid inside the grate. Patch gets the drop on Hazel, but Cha Cha sneaks out and around the building and shoots Hazel from behind. By the time Diego gets the message and arrives, it's too late. Diego takes off before the cops arrive on the scene, swiping the receipt to the donut shop on his way out the door.

Klaus boards a bus with the briefcase. He unlatches the case, hoping it contains cash inside. When he opens the briefcase, he disappears in a flash of blue light.

Summary: Five lets Luther in on his secret, Klaus returns from a harrowing trip through time, and Vanya begins to feel different without her meds.



The episode begins with us following Five dragging Dolores in a wagon through a post-apocalyptic wasteland. We're with Five as a teenager in the desert, as an older man dragging his wagon through a blizzard, and as an older, grayer gentleman sitting with Dolores as plant life has retaken the ruins of civilization. It's here that Five meets Handler, a representative of The Commission. She is recruiting Five to become a time traveling assassin

whose job it is to protect the timeline by killing those who would try to alter history. Five agrees to a five year contract, using his time with The Commission to work out a way to go back and save his family and the rest of the world from the apocalypse.

Klaus returns to the present after serving 10 months in Vietnam in 1968. There, Klaus fell in love with another soldier named Dave. After Dave was killed, Klaus came back. In his sadness and fury, Klaus smashes the briefcase.

Diego is still mourning Patch. At first he blames Five for bringing them all into this mess with Hazel and Cha Cha, but in the end Diego blame himself. Diego heads to the donut shop to find Hazel and Cha Cha and get his revenge. Klaus goes with him, asking to be dropped off at the VFW hall on the way. There, Klaus starts a barroom brawl.

Diego and Klaus spot Hazel leaving the shop after spending time with Agnes over her lunch break. The two follow the assassins back to the hotel. Diego is spotted by Hazel, and the assassins escape, shooting out Diego's tires so he and Klaus can't follow them. Klaus steals the ice cream truck instead.

Five tells Luther everything about his life as a hitman for The Commission. Luther can't believe that Five would murder innocent people. Five says it doesn't matter because unless he can stop the apocalypse, everyone is going to be dead in four days, including the entire family.

Five begins working out the equation to determine the best way to stop the end of the world. He reduces it down to four names. Probability dictates that one of these guys might trigger the apocalypse, and killing them is their best chance of stopping it. Luther still believes that Five is good and wouldn't do this. Instead, Five comes up with another plan. He lures Hazel and Cha Cha out to a deserted road hoping to exchange a chance to speak with Handler for what Five tells them is the briefcase that Klaus stole.

Things break down when Klaus and Diego show up. Handler arrives and freezes time so that she and Five can speak alone. She offers Five a desk job as management for The Commission if he gives up trying to stop the apocalypse. Five agrees to do so on the condition that all of his siblings somehow survive the apocalypse to come. The deal is struck over a handshake and Five teleports away with Handler.

Vanya is feeling better than ever without her meds. Allison tries to research Leonard, but can't find much more than an address. When Allison tells Vanya, Vanya gets defensive. She's never had someone care about and believe in her like this before. Allison finds Leonard's house and breaks in, searching for something amiss. Before she can check the attic—where Helen's corpse rests beside Hargreeves's trashed diary—Leonard returns, forcing Allison to sneak her way back out before she is caught.

Vanya plays her violin at an audition for first chair after Helen suddenly stopped attending rehearsals. Vanya has never played without her meds before. As she plays and gains confidence in herself, she emits a force that enraptures those listening to her play. Afterward, she goes to Leonard's house to tell him the good news. She made first chair. Leonard tells Vanya that this is her time now. The two begin to make out on the couch, causing more of the waves to flow from Vanya.

Pogo restores Mother. Cryptically, he asks her if she remembers what happened. Mom says she does. Pogo asks if she understands that the children can never know. She does.

The episode shows us Klaus's time in Vietnam. After opening the briefcase, he teleports into a barracks under attack. In the midst of the fighting, no one questions his appearance. During their tour, Klaus falls in love with Dave. Klaus follows Dave to the front lines, where Dave is shot and killed.

Luther calls a family meeting. He tells Allison, Diego, and Klaus that Hazel and Cha Cha are after Five because Five is trying to change the timeline by preventing the apocalypse. Allison asks what exactly Five saw in the future. Luther says

that they banded together as a family and a team to stop whoever is responsible for the end of the world, but they died. Diego asks what Luther thinks is different this time. Luther says this time they have Five with them. Unfortunately, Five isn't actually with them, though.

The following events take place during this episode following the family meeting:

- Vanya learns that her mood controls things around her, like the weather, bending streetlights, etc. Leonard knew all about this dormant ability after reading about it in Hargreeves's trashed journal. Leonard is manipulating Vanya. Vanya finds the journal under Leonard's bed, reading her father's notes.
- Klaus has Diego tie him up so that he can get sober again in order to see Dave's ghost. After a rough night, Klaus sees his former lover.

- Luther learns that his four years on the moon were a lie. It was Father's way of giving Luther some sort of purpose, by making him think that he was on a mission.
- Allison confesses that she's judged every man against Luther her whole life. The two share a dance and kiss. Allison says that without the whole team to stop the apocalypse, she's going back to L.A. to be with her daughter to enjoy what time they have left and she invite Luther to join her. He accepts.
- Diego find Mom working again. She says that she would like to go to the park. Diego states that Father never let her leave the property. She says that he's no longer here. Diego walks with her to the park, where Mom reveals to him that she and Pogo have been lying to the kids all along.
- Hazel and Cha Cha receive order for each to kill the other. Neither can go through with it.

Five is shown around The Commission's headquarters, where he is assigned the role of case worker. Five is being watched carefully by Handler, who knows that Five will try to interfere with the apocalypse and save his family. Five learns who was assigned to his case. He learns the protocols for sending messages to hitmen throughout time. He discovers Handler's weakness of taking war trophies from throughout time, even though she isn't supposed to do so.

Five uses this information to put together a plan. He interferes with Dot's case of protecting the apocalypse. He intercepts her note to Hazel and Cha Cha to protect someone named Harold Jenkins. In place of that assignment, Five types and send the assignments to Hazel and Cha Cha to kill one another. When Handler confronts him, Five uses one of the grenades from her office to blow up Handler and the pneumatic tube station. Five grabs a briefcase and uses another grenade to blow up the rest of the briefcases.

When Five opens the briefcase, everything that happened while he was away gets wiped away. All of the decisions made, all of the secrets reveals and fantasies fulfilled did not happen. At the family meeting, when Diego asks what is different this time in their attempt to stop the apocalypse, Five teleports in. They have three days to stop the end of the world, and they're going to start by finding Harold Jenkins.

Summary: With a second chance at the day, the siblings team up to find the mysterious "Harold Jenkins." Leonard takes Vanya into the woods to test her powers.



The episode introduces us to Harold Jenkins. He was born on October 1, 1989, just like the 43 special children. However, Harold was delivered at 7am, not at noon. He was the product of a completely natural conception. He was regular in every way.

Harold's mother died immediately after delivery. Harold was raised by a father who drank to excess and beat his son. Harold wanted to be like the Umbrella Academy kids who shared his birthday. He even cosplayed as one of them and tried to get them to let him live at the Academy, but Hargreeves turned him

away. Heartbroken, when his father beat Harold that night, Harold killed his father with a hammer. He served 12 years before being released from prison. Still obsessed with the Academy, he was there the day that Klaus tossed out Hargreeves's journal, which Harold recovered, learning all about Vanya and her dormant abilities.

Hazel and Cha Cha relive most of the the erased day the same way they lived it the first time. Hazel is ready to quit the job when he gets the message to kill Cha Cha. Like Hazel, Cha Cha

refuses to kill her partner when Hazel talks about finding someone and settling down to live a simple life with. Cha Cha thinks he means her, and is furious when she uncovers that Hazel is in love with Agnes. She tells Hazel to just shoot her, otherwise she'll find and kill him and Agnes. Hazel still can't kill Cha Cha and walks away.

As before, Luther learns that his mission to the moon was a sham. Instead of Allison to pick him up this time, Klaus is the only one left in the house, who asks Luther to tie him up so he can get sober. Drunk, Luther lashes out at first, demanding to speak to Dad through Klaus, then falls into a sobbing depression. Luther says that he's a terrible #1 and he wants to be more like Klaus... wild and carefree.

Klaus, going through withdrawal, searches for Luther before finding him at a dance club. Luther is high and having a great time. Klaus is overcome by the temptation, the lights, and the sound. When a group of guys go to pick a fight with Luther for dancing with one of the girls, Klaus intervenes and is killed, if only for a moment.

In the afterlife, Klaus meets God as an angry little girl. She tells Klaus that "he's been waiting for you". Klaus thinks she means Dave, but finds Dad waiting for him. Dad says that his death was his plan to bring the kids back together to stop the end of the world. Before Hargreeves can tell Klaus what he needs to do, Klaus is resuscitated.

Five, Diego, and Allison head to the police precinct to find out if they have a file on Harold Jenkins. Diego is tipped to the fact that the police suspect him in Patch's murder. Allison recognizes from the file that Harold is Leonard. The three return to Leonard's house, where they find a "murder shrine" dedicated to the Umbrella Academy in the attic.

Five is bleeding from a wound he suffered in the fire at The Commission. Diego and Allison drag Five back to the Academy, where Diego sees Mom up and moving again. They place Five in her care while the two of them leave to check out the only other bit of information they have on Harold, his grandmother's address. Outside, Diego is arrested while Allison drives alone to the house.

Leonard takes Vanya to his grandmother's cabin in the woods to help her learn how to use her powers. Vanya is still not convinced that her dormant abilities are real, and Leonard becomes increasingly frustrated with her for not taking his training sessions seriously enough. That evening, while the two are in town for dinner, a group of drunk guys grab at Vanya and severely beat Leonard. Overwhelmed, Vanya lets loose a bubble-like blast that throws the guys away from them.

While Five recovers at home, the prosthetic eyeball sitting on the nightstand, Vanya visits Leonard in the hospital. His right eye is bandaged.

The episode opens and ends with Allison. In the open, we flash back to Allison telling Claire a bedtime story about the Umbrella Academy thwarting a museum heist. Claire asks why Aunt Vanya is never in the stories. Allison says that Vanya isn't like the rest of them. Claire wants another story and gets belligerent when Allison tells her no. To stop the tantrum, Allison uses her power to make Claire sleepy, which Patrick witnesses. Allison realizes that everything she's ever gotten in life has been because of her powers, which she refuses to use anymore.

Klaus calls a family meeting with Luther and Five. He tells them that he spoke with Dad last night, who revealed that he committed suicide in order to bring the family back together to stop the end of the world. No one believes Klaus until Pogo confirms the truth. Luther lashes out, saying that he wants nothing to do with any of this or any of them anymore.

Diego returns from jail and tells the guys that Allison is in trouble. They found out that Leonard is Harold and Allison went ahead to try and save Vanya. That's the catalyst that Luther needs to join his brothers and make the drive to the cabin to help Allison.

Leonard voluntarily checks out of the hospital. Vanya asks the nurse about the guys from the fight outside the restaurant. The nurse says that two died on site and one is in critical condition. Leonard is thrilled that Vanya used her powers. Vanya is horrified that she hurt and killed people. Leonard explains to Vanya that when her emotions are high, her body converts the

sounds around her into energy. Leonard helps Vanya focus her powers, growing frustrated when she chooses to practice her violin instead.

Hazel and Agnes get away from the city, but Hazel struggles both with the secret that the world is going to end in two days and knowing that Cha Cha won't stop until she kills them. Hazel drops Agnes off at a bed and breakfast and tells her he has to go back and finish something, then he'll be back for her and they can get away.

Back in the city, Cha Cha breaks into the closed donut shop. She finds a flyer for the bird sanctuary where Hazel and Agnes are heading. On her way out, Cha Cha blows up the donut shop.

Allison is caught in traffic outside the restaurant when she sees Vanya's scarf on the scene. The police officer working the scene recognizes Allison as a movie star. She convinces him that she is researching a role and goes with the officer to question the victim in the hospital. The victim says that Leonard paid him and his buddies to rough up Leonard in front of his girlfriend. They got drunk and took it too far, then all hell broke loose.

Allison rushes back to the cabin to warn Vanya about Leonard. Vanya won't hear what Allison says, saying that she loves Leonard and no one has loved her before like he does. Vanya reveals her powers to Allison, who realizes that Hargreeves manipulated Allison when they were young to make Vanya think that she was ordinary. Furious that Allison did that to her, Vanya uses her abilities to threaten Allison. Resigned to what she must do to save her sister, Allison starts to use her power one more time. Allison says, "I heard a rumor", but before she can finish, Vanya lashes out and cuts Allison's throat.

Leonard returns and tells Vanya she only did what she had to do. He grabs Vanya and the two get away. The guys arrive and rush in, but it's too late to save Allison. Luther cradles Allison as she dies.

The nanny tries to get Vanya to eat, but Vanya uses the sound of the whistling tea kettle to kill her nanny. After a series of different nannies who meet the same fate, Hargreeves builds Grace to serve as the children's mother.

The guys get Allison back to the Academy in time to save her life, but she's in need of blood. Grace is able to put Allison back together, but it is unknown whether Allison will be able to speak again. Luther stays by Allison's side. He

remembers how it felt to wake up alone to a world where you're no longer the person you used to be. He promises to stay by her side so that Allison doesn't have to wake up alone.

All of this is too much for Klaus. He looks for drugs to help him cope, even though Ben tries to talk Klaus out of it. Klaus gets a couple of pills in his mouth, but Ben punches them out of Klaus's mouth. Stunned, Klaus asks Ben how he did that. Ben says he didn't, Klaus did.

Leonard gets a shell-shocked Vanya back to his house and cleans her up. They need to pack their things and get out of here before the rest of the family comes after them. Vanya doesn't see that as a bad thing. She loves her family and wants to explain what happened to them. Leonard tells her that her family won't see it that way. They hate her. He's the only one who understands Vanya and accepts her for who she is.

Vanya finds Hargreeves's journal and confronts Leonard about it. She accuses Leonard of manipulating her. Leonard says that everything she has and has become is because of him.

Without him, she's too weak and pathetic to realize her strength. Leonard continues to taunt, belittle, and antagonize Vanya until her powers take over and she kills Leonard.

Diego, Klaus, and Five find Leonard's body. Five confirms that the prosthetic eye matches Leonard's remaining good eye. Apocalypse averted.

Hazel shows up at the Academy and offers to help Five stop the apocalypse now that he has something and someone to live for. Five tells Hazel that he was the last unaccounted-for wildcard. Now that Hazel is here, the apocalypse is cancelled. Hazel, relieved, returns to the bed and breakfast to find that Cha Cha has set up an elaborate system to boil Agnes alive in front of Hazel. The two assassins fight, with Cha Cha getting the upper hand and pulling the rope to kill Agnes. However, time pauses again. Handler enters the room with a briefcase and tells the two that they have royally screwed up.

Allison awakens and writes a note to Luther that Vanya has powers. When Vanya returns home to set things right, Luther embraces her, choking Vanya until she blacks out. Vanya awakens back in the soundproof chamber that Dad placed her in until he could control her. The rest, including Allison, tell Luther that this is wrong, but Luther doesn't listen.

With the end of the world no longer a concern, Diego tries to move on now that his name is cleared with the police. Klaus and Ben attempt to master Klaus's new ability. Five returns Dolores to the department store. Luther tries to comfort Allison, but she wants nothing to do with him after he locked up Vanya.

Vanya confronts her younger self in the reflection caught in the chamber's window. Her younger self tells Vanya that her family hates her and will leave her here for the rest of her life because they're afraid of all she is and all she can do. Using her heartbeat, Vanya gives in to her powers and blows the chamber apart.

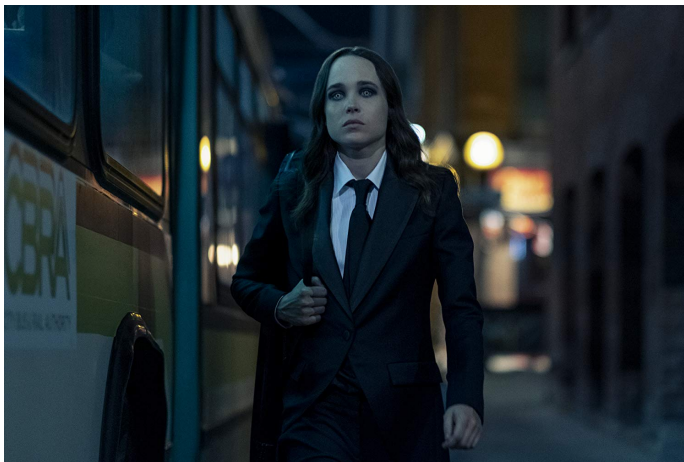

The episode opens with a younger version of Hargreeves and his dying wife. She asks him to bring her violin to her. She wants him to take it with him and give it to someone who will love it as much as she did. This is the violin that the young Vanya took up to show that she is extraordinary in some way. It's the violin she will play tonight to end the world.

Vanya walks through the Academy, bringing the building down behind her. The siblings scramble out, aided by Pogo who holds up Vanya. Vanya asks if Pogo knew about her powers and what her father did to her. Pogo admits that he did,

which leads Vanya to kill him.

The siblings get out of the building, but Mom was not so lucky. Diego and Klaus go to find her, but they are tripped up. As the ceiling collapses, Ben grabs Diego and drags him to safety. Klaus takes the credit for saving his brother's life.

Outside, Five produces tomorrow's newspaper. The headline hasn't changed. The apocalypse is still on for today.

Handler tells Hazel and Cha Cha that they've messed up, but they have one more chance to set things right. Protect Vanya and make sure the end of the world takes place. In exchange, Hazel and Agnes can retire to a simple life whenever and wherever they want. Cha Cha will get a new partner and be able to continue on the job. Cha Cha is eager for the opportunity, but Hazel sees through the offer. Handler is going to leave them to die.

Hazel gets rid of Cha Cha in a car crash, then heads back to the bed and breakfast. He shoots Handler, grabs her briefcase, and teleports away with Agnes.

The siblings meet at the Super Star bowling alley to discuss how to stop Vanya. Luther says that they need to be prepared to kill her in order to save the world, but the others argue that they have to save her, not kill her. Klaus comes clean about Ben saving Diego, but is unable to make Ben appear. Allison borrows Luther to call Claire and tell her that she loves her, which Luther uses as his chance to tell Allison how he feels about her.

Agents of The Commission arrive and shoot up the bowling alley in an attempt to stop the Hargreeves. The siblings escape down the lanes, past the pins, and out the back.

Everyone meets up at the Icarus Theater, where Vanya plays first chair violin. Additional agents arrive, pinning down the siblings as Vanya plays on. Klaus conjures Ben, who uses his tentacles to dispatch the agents.

The group has one last chance to stop Vanya. They agree to a suicide mission. They'll rush Vanya from every side, hoping that one of them can get to her and stop her. Vanya grabs the guys with her powers, allowing Allison to sneak up behind her with a gun. Instead of shooting her sister, Allison places the gun beside Allison's ear and fires, causing her to drop the guys and discharge her energy into space.

Unfortunately, the energy beam strikes the moon, causing chunks to slam into the earth. The apocalypse still happens. Five has one final idea. This will always happen unless they can all go back in time and fix the situation with Vanya. Holding hands, the Hargreeves teleport away with Five into the past as the world is consumed in flames.

Something innately more than platonic friendship.

Now, Diego is thrown in solitary confinement after his visit with Five. Diego, being Diego, seeks out a method of escape. He purposefully dislocates his shoulder so he can wiggle out of his straitjacket. We see the Scandinavian gunslingers storm the hallways of the mental facility. They are silent but quite deadly. And they appear to be hellbent on capturing Diego.

Then, we see Lila help fight off the silent gunslingers. Apparently, she learned to fight from her mother. We see Diego and Lila outrun the foes. In addition, they opened the doors for a facility-wide collective patient escape. Run free, my children!

Later, Luther hits up a gentleman's club, which is a nice way of saying strip club. He spots Five sitting in a front-row seat, enjoying the view. Five reveals that the world will be ending in 10 days and they must track down the rest of the gang. Team work makes the dream work, after all. However, much to Five's dismay, Luther basically tells him to eff off. So, there's that.

Additionally, Five finds a document from the Mexican Consulate in Dallas, so he pockets it for later use. Diego spots a man in a fedora fleeing the scene and decides to follow him.

Then, Five encounters a young Pogo. Aw, he's so cute! That is, until he lashes out at Five and leaves through a window. Bad Pogo! Diego and Fedora Man duke it out in the shadows. Our boy is throwing knives like the pro he is. There's lots of punching and kicking and such. That is, until Fedora Man stabs Diego in the stomach. We see it's a young Daddy Hargreeves... who just stabbed his own kid. Daddy Hargreeves leaves Diego to die. Pogo leaps out of seemingly thin air and joins hands with Daddy Hargreeves as they disappear in a cloud of fog. Diego goes limp.

Next, Vanya decides to pay Luther a visit while Five waits outside. Luther is still irate where Five is concerned. He refuses to go anywhere as long as Five is present. Suddenly, Luther's mafia boss comes storming in and promptly fires him. Apparently, he lost a ton of money when Luther

fixed the big match. So, now Luther is homeless and jobless. He punches a hole in the brick wall. As Vanya and Five drive away, Luther flips Five the bird. It's deserved. Vanya also decides to abandon Five.

Now, Diego and Lila read the piece of paper Five confiscated from Daddy Hargreeves' office. It's an invitation to a prestigious gala at the Mexican Consulate of Dallas. "The Majestic 12" will be present as well. Daddy Hargreeves is an esteemed member of said group.

Then, Vanya returns to the farm, much to Sissy's delight. Reunited and it feels so good!

Meanwhile, Klaus works up the nerve to talk to Dave. They initially talked in a paint store, but obviously young Dave didn't recognize Klaus. Now, our favorite prophet sidles up to Dave in a restaurant and urges the latter not to enlist in the military. Klaus knows that Dave will die in the Vietnam War — he bore witness to it.

Dave's uncle returns from the restroom and verbally belittles Klaus, calling him "queer" with not even a modicum of affection in his voice. He demands Dave punch Klaus to prove his manhood. Dave does as he's bid, albeit reluctantly. Embarrassed, Klaus flees the scene. Ben is under the impression that Klaus is only being selfish in trying to prevent Dave from enlisting. But Klaus reveals that he just wants Dave to live a happy life. Oh, my sweet summer child.

Later, Allison is aghast to find Raymond is hosting a meeting in the hair salon without her. He's still angry with her regarding the previous night's events. Raymond ushers her outside and attempts to elicit the truth out of Allison. He knows she coerced that officer to stop beating him. But it was something beyond human. However, Allison keeps mum on the ordeal. Raymond storms back inside the salon.

Meanwhile, Klaus puts the kibosh on his three years of sobriety by running amok in a liquor store. Commence bender! Klaus returns to his mansion armed to the gills with booze only to have his crazily devout followers chase him. With love, of course.

Then, we see Diego, Five, and Lila are lying in wait for the opportune moment to strike. Everyone is dressed for the occasion, save Five who perpetually rocks the Catholic schoolboy look. Allison and Luther reunite over mass quantities of food as the latter proceeds to eat his feelings... again. Allison had no idea about the apocalypse, so Luther fills her in. Of course, Luther is still upset that she's married.

Next, our infiltration trio are at the gala in the Mexican Consulate. Lila and Diego hit the dance floor while Five goes sniffing about for anything remotely fishy. Diego also runs into Mama Grace, who was accompanied by Daddy Hargreeves. And... wait for it... she's wholly human. Which makes Daddy Hargreeves' decision to craft a Grace robot all the more sinister. Naturally, she hasn't the faintest idea who Diego is.

Meanwhile, Sissy's son Harlan goes missing. Vanya and Sissy split up to search for him outside. Vanya approaches a pond. She notices a toy of Harlan's floating on the surface. Knowing he most likely drowned, she utilizes her gift to literally life the water out of the pond. All Moses parting the Red Sea and such. She spots him unconscious on the pond floor and quickly snatches him up before the water comes crashing down again. Thankfully, after a few moments of trying, Vanya is able to resuscitate the boy.

Later, Luther shows up at Elliot's door armed with bags and a desk lamp. Luther is clearly down in the dumps, so Elliot suggests they kick the pity party up a notch with some nitrous. Let's get high, fellas!

Then, we see Sissy and Vanya celebrating the successful saving of Harlan. Well, thanks to Vanya and her superpowers. The pair get intimate... really intimate. There's loads of smooching and touching. Finally! Vanya snags a lady! Klaus drunkenly shacks up with Allison, who's no stranger to the former's drinking benders. Luther and Elliot are high as kites on that good ol' nitrous.

Back at the gala, Five is hiding in a closet. He catches a glimpse of Daddy Hargreeves. The old man is in a meeting for The Majestic 12. Suddenly, Daddy Hargreeves spots Five and promptly concludes said meeting. Suddenly, the Swedes show up in the corridor, as per The Handler's orders, I'm certain. Diego is feverishly trying to fend off two while Five is duking it out with the other. Of course, Lila's orders are to protect Five at all costs. So, when two roads diverged in a wood, Lila took the road to a 58 year-old trapped in a 13 year-old's body. She saves Five by kicking the snot out of his opponent. Thankfully, Diego is able to handle the other two Swedes after a daunting struggle.

Then, the trio are outside watching Daddy Hargreeves and Mama Grace taking their leave. Before they depart, however, Five shouts out something in Greek to Daddy Hargreeves. However, the old man ignores it.

Later, in the present, Diego is having his doubts regarding Lila. He calls her out for not saving him and for choosing to aid Five instead. Five threatens to kill her if

they ever cross paths again. Diego flees the scene, leaving Lila behind. I don't like it when my parents fight!

Meanwhile, Klaus and Allison get their day drinking on, much to Ben's dismay. I'm really enjoying the close bond developing between Klaus and Allison. Speaking of revelry, Vanya and Sissy wake up from a night of glorious ecstasy. Vanya believes they should run away together. Then, they could spend as much time as they want sleeping in til 9am!

Next, Diego and Five return to Elliot's humble abode to find Luther is the newest resident. Luther delves into his latest interaction with Daddy Hargreeves. When he first arrived in 1962, he took a bus to NYC to the Umbrella Academy. He wandered inside to find Daddy Hargreeves

attending to a multitude of guests. Being the man of the hour, of course. Luther waltzes right up to him and declares he's Daddy Hargreeves' son from the future. That doesn't go over well. Firstly, Daddy Hargreeves insists that he despises children, so why would he adopt seven? Secondly, time travel is a touchy subject. Thirdly, Luther is in desperate need of a shower. Thus, our Number 1 was unceremoniously kicked out of his actual home.

After that, Diego delivers perhaps one of my favorite lines of the season — "He did worse... he shanked you in the heart." I think it's the delivery that had me in stitches. Of course, he's referring to Daddy Hargreeves openly ridiculing Luther at a party.

Oh, and remember that family gathering? We've got it here, folks! Vanya shows up to chat with Diego, Luther, and Five. She even apologizes to Diego for, you know, trying to inadvertently kill everyone in 2019. Then, Klaus and Allison join the party. The Hargreeves siblings hug it out. Klaus asserts that everyone got hotter over the years. True that. Ben is there too, in his ghostly way.

So, Five sits everyone down for a meeting. The apocalypse is mere days away, as is Kennedy's arrival to Dallas. Diego is still hellbent on saving Kennedy from assassination. Five fills those out of the know that Daddy Hargreeves was on the grassy knoll amid Kennedy's assassination. Thus, they believe he may have something to do with it. Well, more like Diego. After some extensive bickering, Diego storms out. Luther follows him.

Meanwhile, Vanya returns to the farmhouse drunk as a skunk. She confesses her deep love for Sissy. However, Sissy's back to sexing her husband Carl. While she does harbor love for Vanya, it's also 1963 and homosexuality isn't as widely accepted like today.

Now, the two remaining Swedes have a funeral for their fallen (exploded) brother. It's very Game of Thrones-esque. Klaus reticently returns to his mansion and embraces his followers. You know, in case the apocalypse will actually unfold. Allison returns home and decides to tell Raymond everything. The whole kit and caboodle.

The episode opens with Allison landing in the alley in front of Elliot's residence in 1961. Since Vanya slit Allison's throat last season, our rumor-has-it girl has been incapable of talking. In fact, she spent an entire year in the '60s mute. Shortly after she arrived, Allison was rejected from that "whites only" restaurant and chased down by a trio of white men. Thankfully, she found refuge in the hair salon that would soon employ her.

Fast forward a year late — Raymond asks her on a date around the holidays. In addition, Allison learns about the Civil Rights Movement and begins to take part in it. The rest, as we know, is history.

Back in the current timeline of 1963, Five has his foot to Lila's throat. The Handler urges Five to join her crew. Do her dirty bidding. Naturally, Five is reticent to accept said offer. After all, The Handler has tried to kill Five multiple times.

Meanwhile, Diego is attempting to persuade Vanya and Luther that they must attend Daddy Hargreeves' light supper as a cohesive team. Additionally, he feels they must ditch the "numbers" that their father bestowed upon them. From now on, they're "Team Zero." Boom! Fist bump! Or not...

Next, Klaus and Ben are discussing the best manner in which to disband the prophet's followers. Klaus is doing yoga in what's essentially a cloth adult diaper, so his opinions are obviously moot. Now, Klaus approaches his massive following and confesses a deep, dark secret — he's a fraud. Klaus tries to convince the masses that he's a false prophet. However, they misinterpret this to mean that one must admit they are "fraudulent" in order to ascend to a higher plane. His speech did the opposite of his intention.

Later, Allison finishes disclosing everything Umbrella Academy to her husband. Raymond wants her to showcase her abilities. Seeing is believing, after all. So Allison takes Ray to an upscale men's ware store. One that exclusively serves white folks. However, she "rumors" the proprietor to allow Ray to try on every piece in the store and buy as much as he desires. Bam! After an impromptu fashion show, Ray walks out armed to the teeth with fancy suits.

Then, he urges her to do the same thing for herself. The Chestnuts are bourgeoisie now! Our married duo waltzes into the restaurant wherein their sit-in took place. The nasty man proprietor attempts to shoo them out... again. But Allison "rumors" him into keeping his mouth shut. In addition, she "rumors" him to pour searing hot coffee on his hand. Repeatedly. We see the man trying to scream out in pain but physically incapable of doing so. The skin on his hand is severely burned. Obviously, Allison is irate regarding their treatment at his establishment. Raymond coerces her into stopping the show.

Meanwhile, Dave pays Klaus a visit at his mansion. Klaus is in the middle of bickering with Ben over whether the latter can take possession of his body. However, to the naked, untrained eye, it looks as if Klaus is praying. Quick! Act somewhat normal! The pair are now taking a walk through Klaus' opulent gardens. Dave is bewildered where Klaus is concerned. How does this strange fellow know him so well? Klaus begins rattling off private facts about Dave that only he would know.

Naturally, the poor boy is spooked. Klaus reveals that he knows Dave's going to die on the battlefield. But Dave is stalwart in his desire to serve his country. In fact, he already enlisted in the military. Klaus' plan to stop him didn't pan out.

Later, The Handler is sitting in a bath house with the Swedes. She starts conversing in Swedish with them. Additionally, she presents Diego as a viable target for them. She tires of her daughter Lila incessantly fretting over a boy. Stupid boys and their, um, charms.

Next, our six siblings are united for a light supper with Daddy Hargreeves. Diego is still insisting that Team Zero go in as a united front. Go team! Five asserts that he should do the talking, because everyone else sucks at it. Then, Five gives Daddy Hargreeves the rundown regarding who they are and why they need to speak with him. Daddy Hargreeves still refuses to believe that he'll eventually adopt seven children 26 years later. He wishes to see their abilities in action. Diego throws a knife that twists and turns in abnormal ways. Allison "rumors" Diego into punching himself. Five teleports. Even Vanya explodes a massive fruit bowl to demonstrate what she can do.

However, Daddy Hargreeves is wholly unimpressed. Diego accuses him of being involved in the assassination attempt on Kennedy. He proceeds to mock Diego for his "hero complex." We see poor baby Diego revert to his introverted, stuttering, and sensitive childlike state. Kudos to Castañeda for making that graceful shift between overconfident Diego and his sensitive counterpart. Oh, and Ben jumps into Klaus' body, very briefly possessing him. But everyone just assumes Klaus is being his drunken, messy self.

Then, after that disastrous sight supper, Daddy Hargreeves asks to speak with Five alone. Diego spots Mama Grace waiting outside for her boyfriend. He urges her to exercise caution around Daddy Hargreeves. He's not who he says he is. But she refuses to give Diego the time of day.

Meanwhile, Daddy Hargreeves tells Five that he seems like the most comprehensive of the bunch. Five explains that he can also time travel, and Daddy Hargreeves believes him. In addition, the old man offers Five some sage wisdom. Instead of trying to time jump decades, he should start on a smaller scale. Start with time jumping seconds, then minutes, etc. Five balks at Daddy Hargreeves' advice.

Next, Vanya returns to the farmhouse. She has a crucial chat with Sissy in private. They both confess their feelings for one another and proceed to smooch. However, they're not alone. Carl is observing them from afar, like a peeping tom.

Later, Diego and Luther return to Elliot's place to find their poor host was murdered... by the

two remaining Swedes. Brutally so. RIP to a real one. Additionally, the Scandinavian gunslingers left our heroes a message scrawled in Elliot's blood: "Öga for Öga." Whatever that means in Swedish.

Then, Five winds up in The Handler's lavish abode. He accepts her job offer. The job? Five must assassinate the Board of The Commission at The Lonely Lodger Inn... in 1982. So, what does he get in return? A chance to return to 2019 with his family sans apocalypse.

The episode opens with Five arriving in Wisconsin in 1982. The Board is hosting a meeting within The Lonely Lodger Inn. An upbeat Midwestern woman points Five in the right direction.

Next, after putting the smack-down on a malfunctioning vending machine, Five wanders into the meeting room wherein the Board are discussing top-secret stuff. Five proceeds to brutally murder every member save Fishbowl Head a.k.a. A.J. Fishbowl Head gives him chase, until finally Five also lays the smack-down him.

Additionally, he figuratively castrates Fishbowl Head by extricating him from his human body. Then, he pops the fish that was formerly Fishbowl Head into a small plastic bag. He's just a fish now. Just call this Mission: Successful!

Meanwhile, in 1963, Ben desperately wants Klaus to give him permission to commandeer the latter's body. Just for a while. Take it for a spin. After plenty of persuading on Ben's part, Klaus reluctantly acquiesces. Of course, there are concrete ground rules.

Later, Five hands over the fish formerly known as Fishbowl Head to The Handler. She's ecstatic — the Board is no longer and she reduced Fishbowl Head to just a plain old goldfish in a plastic bag. She gives Five a briefcase frequently used by Commission members to travel through time. Then, she gives the Hargreeves siblings 90 minutes to return home. Otherwise, the window

closes. Naturally, with The Handler, there's always a catch. Now, Ben must wrangle his siblings together. The same ones currently scattered all over Dallas.

Next, Diego and Luther attempt to decipher what "Öga for Öga" means. Those words were left in the wake of Elliot's brutal murder at the hands of the Swedes. The pair assume that it's a name — perhaps the person responsible for killing Elliot. They procure a handy dandy phone book and find the name "Öga Foroga," a Swedish woman in Dallas. Diego calls her up and puts on his most ominous, formidable voice ever. He threatens that this day will be her last.

That is, until Five reveals that "Öga for Öga" means "an eye for an eye" in Swedish. Diego quickly switches gears and claims he called the wrong number. That moment made me legitimately laugh out loud. That makes sense — the Swedes are under the impression that the Hargreeves are the culprits in exploding their other brother.

Then, Five reveals to the duo that they only have 90 minutes to gather the remainder of their siblings and get back to 2019. Clock's ticking! Meanwhile, The Handler is at Commission headquarters proffering a grand and eloquent speech regarding the mass murder of the Board. But, now that they've kicked the bucket, she's in charge. And grief counseling is offered, but it's not within their insurance network. Sorry!

Later, Ben is about to take Klaus for a spin. Ground rules have been enacted. It's showtime! Ben masquerades about as Klaus, really savoring the senses that come with being a tangible human. He tries fruit for the first time in 17 years. He's not a fan of fruit, as it turns out. Next, he tracks down a girl named Jill. Ben is quite sweet on her. Of course, she's under the impression that Klaus is hitting on her, even though it's really Ben. They make dirt angels while barefoot and laugh about rolling in the dirt. Because it's fun.

Meanwhile, Carl asks Vanya if she can drive him over to a friend's house. Hey, that's actually a responsible move if he plans on imbibing. However, he really wants to lay down the law with Vanya. He's aware of her tryst with his wife Sissy. Carl proceeds to not-so-subtly threaten Vanya to step off. In his homophobic eyes, no one of the same sex should be together. He orders her to move out by the end of that evening. Vanya isn't scared of him, though.

Next, Luther heads over to Allison's to inform her of Five's latest plan. They only have roughly an hour to say their goodbyes and get the hell out of dodge. 2019 awaits! Naturally, Allison is upset because she dearly loves her Raymond. Raymond learns of the situation and is also rightfully upset. Luther gives them space so they can say goodbye.

Later, Diego tries to persuade Klaus/Ben to tag along so they can go home. That's when Ben reveals that he's currently inhabiting Klaus' body. The pair officially reunite for the first time in several years. It's a lovely moment in an otherwise packed episode. However, Diego asserts that he has something in need of dire care. He vows to return to collect Klaus/Ben.

Meanwhile, Five runs into Vanya as she's driving back to the farmhouse solo. He gives her the lowdown. She refuses to go home with them unless she can bring Sissy and Harlan back. Five puts his figurative foot down, citing that Sissy and Harlan's presence in the future will affect the timeline in drastic ways. Vanya insists that they're insignificant, to which Five retorts that "no one is insignificant." It's a sweet thought, really. The two square off against each other and put their abilities on display. But, just when you think a fight is bound to break out, Five relents. He just urges Vanya to make haste. Time is of the essence!

Next, Diego is burying poor Elliot. What a thoughtful thing to do. Lila inexplicably appears. Diego wholeheartedly believes that Lila was merely using him to get to Five. Lila insists that her feelings for him are genuine, but her job was to protect Five. She was simply doing what she was supposed to do. Lila procures a flask and hopes they can let bygones be bygones with a drink. Suddenly, Diego slumps ground-ward and promptly falls unconscious. Lila spits out the drink she didn't swallow. She poisoned our Diego! Lila proceeds to drag him away.

Later, Allison and Raymond are bidding each other farewell. She asks him to join her in 2019. However, he knows his place is in 1963. He wants to contribute as much as he can to the Civil Rights Movement. While this shatters her heart, Allison understands. Then, the two Swedes show up on Allison's doorstep. Uh oh. That's not good.

Meanwhile, Vanya hurries home and urges Sissy to pack her things. Sissy grabs a coffee tin chock full of cash that she kept away from Carl's prying hands. She scoops up Harlan and the trio make their getaway. Klaus/Ben tries to feel the mansion but is caught by one of the prophet's most devoted followers. Now, the follower is in charge. Klaus/Ben leaves said follower with a bit of sage wisdom in the form of song lyrics — "Everybody (Backstreet's Back) by The Backstreet

Boys. As the song plays, we see Allison and Raymond fighting off the Swedes. Klaus/Ben running back to the alley to meet his family. We see Klaus is fervently trying to expel Ben, but the latter is hellbent on staying inside Klaus for as long as possible.

Finally, Klaus arrives to find Luther and Five waiting for everyone. He promptly vomits out Ben. Of course, the other two can't see Ben, but we see our ghost boy is slathered in Klaus' vomit. Yummy! In the Chestnut household, Allison "rumors" the lead Swede to murder his own brother. Said lead Swede proceeds to choke his brother, powerless to stop Allison's "rumor." Then, the lone Swede flees the scene. Now, they have a dead body on their hands. Just another day for The Umbrella Academy!

Unfortunately, the gang misses their window back to 2019, much to Luther and Five's chagrin. Diego wakes up in The Handler's office. Apparently, in her new regime, Lila is Head of Security. Diego, as "her boyfriend," is her underling. He'll make a fine addition to the security team at the Commission. Well, that's nice. Diego apparently doesn't get a say in the matter. He merely sits there, flabbergasted by the situation unfolding.

Meanwhile, Vanya, Sissy, and Harlan are driving to meet with the former's siblings. However, they're stopped dead in their tracks by a slew of police cars. Multiple officers emerge — one of whom happens to be Carl's brother. Hopefully meanness doesn't run in the family? Answer: it does. After Carl's brother threatens everyone, Vanya steps out of the vehicle and goes all Super Saiyan on their bums. She kills a multitude of officers in the process. Then, Vanya's knocked unconscious by Carl's brother. Sissy cries out and flees to her side.

Summary: A desperate Five concocts a risky plan to intercept another version of himself. The FBI tortures Vanya. Diego discovers what causes the apocalypse.



The episode opens with Vanya being interrogated by an FBI agent. If you recall, last episode Vanya unleashed her powerful abilities on a horde of highway patrolmen, subsequently killing most of them. This haughty FBI agent accuses Vanya of being a KGB agent. He even notes how her name is Russian. He asks her a question in Russian and she responds with perfect fluidity. Naturally, since she's still bereft of memories, Vanya is taken aback as to how she knows Russian.

Suddenly, Vanya's rage takes over. We see her utilize her power on the FBI agent. His features hollow out as his skin almost caves in. However, before she can enact any more damage, the nurse within knocks her unconscious.

Meanwhile, Five is a mite irate with his siblings for screwing up the time jump window to 2019. He storms off and Luther chases after him. The lone Swede, still mourning the loss of his two fallen brothers, notices that the missions he's been receiving can be traced back to The Handler. Speaking of which...

Back at the Commission, Diego has been enlisted to join Lila's security team. The Handler insists that Lila will be solely responsible for her little boyfriend. If he steps out of line, it'll be Lila's job to kill him. Standard operating procedure, folks. "Fall in line or die" sounds like the Commission's mission statement. Now, Lila must take Diego to his training day.

Then, we see Mama Grace is snooping through Daddy Hargreeves' office. DH barges in and questions Grace. Grace believes he's involved in something nefarious, but Daddy Hargreeves refuses to divulge anything. She's starting to find the truth in what Diego warned her about.

She repeatedly inquires if he's planning on doing anything unspeakable... like assassinate the president. However, he remains stalwart in his decision to not share. Grace, furious, storms out. Secrets don't make friends, Daddy Hargreeves.

Next, Five and Luther debate their next move. Five ruminates on whether he can find himself in this particular timeline. You know, find the older looking Five before he tried to jump back to 2019 last season. Before he botched up the math and remained permanently stuck in a pubescent body. Perhaps they can intercept the other Five and snatch up his briefcase. However, Five warns Luther that Paradox Psychosis could set in for either of them. Technically, you're not supposed to be in close proximity to yourself in the same timeline. Time gets all timey wimey and such.

So, what are the seven stages of Paradox Psychosis? Denial, itching, extreme thirst and urination, excessive gas, acute paranoia, uncontrolled perspiration, and homicidal rage. That last one's a bit extreme. Luther vows to help keep his brother(s) in check.

Meanwhile, the FBI agent decides to utilize electroshock therapy on Vanya. He starts out on a low voltage and for every question she refuses to answer he's going to kick it up a notch.

Now, Vanya appears to be perpetually stuck in her mind. She's donning her Umbrella Academy uniform. We see her enter the dining area at her curmudgeonly father's request. Her siblings are also sitting around the table.

Later, Five and Luther waltz into an Irish pub. They find an older looking gentleman sitting at the bar with a briefcase underneath his feet. The Fives come face-to-face. It starts to get sweaty. And itchy. Well, that's not good.

Then, Lila escorts Diego to his orientation. It's a six-hour long antiquated video on a projector. The minute Lila leaves, the supervisor on hand falls asleep. Diego seizes the moment to make his escape. He sneaks into one of the control rooms and begins curiously unplugging things, pushing buttons, etc. That's why training is important! Herb finds Diego mucking about and offers to help him... after some coercion courtesy of Diego's knife, of course.

Next, Herb finds footage from the Kennedy assassination. We see the presidential procession going through Dallas as normal. Suddenly, the FBI building explodes and is shrouded in blue light. Vanya emerges, levitating above the ground. Eyes glowing and such. Her usual apocalyptic self. That's when Diego realizes that Vanya tiggers the apocalypse. Kennedy may have been spared in this version, but now the US accuses Russia of incinerating the FBI building. Thus, World War III commences.

Meanwhile, Five and Five are at each other's throats. Our Five asks the other Five for his briefcase. In exchange, our Five will show the other the correct math so he can travel home in his own body. Luther plays mediator between the two.

Then, we're back inside Vanya's mind. Daddy Hargreeves is relentlessly ridiculing her in front of her siblings. Well, the other Hargreeves aren't helping things either by contributing. Each person has a brain on their dinner plate. Everyone eagerly digs in except Vanya. However, after some heavy coercion from Daddy Hargreeves, she finally takes a bite.

Later, Klaus arrives at Allison's and Raymond's house. He plans to help the couple dispose of the dead Swede. Diego and Herb arrive from the Commission. That's when Diego reveals to those present what he learned with the help of Herb. Allison attempts to quell Raymond's nerves. But now that she knows Vanya's the one behind this new (old) apocalypse, she has to tend to her sister. Allison, Diego, and Klaus make a break for the FBI building.

Next, Vanya takes an even bigger bite of the brain on her plate. We see Harlan, Sissy's son, is reacting to everything Vanya's encountering. Every jolt of pain she feels, he also feels in tandem. Almost as if they're linked somehow. After chomping on that brain, a rush of memories return to Vanya in full-force. She remembers everything, including that she was the one behind the apocalypse in 2019.

Now, Diego, Klaus, and Allison are at the FBI building. However, Vanya's powers are currently out of control. She instantly killed the FBI agent interrogating her and pretty much everyone on that floor. The Hargreeves trio are brainstorming on how best to get to Vanya without dying. We see Vanya's and Harlan's eyes open simultaneously. They're glowing white.

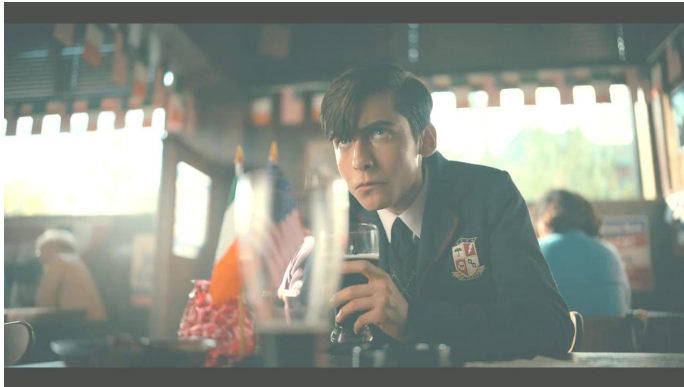

The episode opens where we left off — Diego, Allison, and Klaus are trying to figure out how to safely get to Vanya. Klaus chickens out and refers to himself as "sexy trash," and now I want to call myself "sexy trash." It's what the cool kids are doing nowadays. Each one of the three attempts to make their way toward Vanya. However, her massive Super Saiyan powers knock them backward. That's when ghost baby Ben swoops in to save the day.

Meanwhile, our Five, Luther, and the older looking Five are heading toward the

grassy knoll. The presidential procession is winding around the corner in Dallas. Older looking Five conspires with Luther regarding our Five. It's quite clear that the other Five wants to kill our Five. Even our Five surmises to Luther as much. Both Fives are suffering from Paradox Psychosis. Luther has fallen prey to their dual flatulence enough to know it's true.

Next, we see The Handler getting all snazzy for her inauguration. Lila is watching her mother primp. We see that The Handler has the fish formerly known as Fishbowl Head (AJ) in a bowl on her desk. While Lila and The Handler are chatting, the fish is spelling out the numbers "743" with pebbles. Herb waltzes in to report something and takes note of this. and is about to pull out of the drive. However, Sissy impedes his path with a gun brandished at the ready. Mama Bear protective instincts are kicking in!

Meanwhile, Herb discloses his findings to Lila, since this revelation pertains to her. As it turns out, it wasn't a simple robbery gone wrong that killed her parents... it was Five. Five was tasked with a mission to procure Lila and said mission was approved by AJ. Fishbowl Head!

Next, older looking Five procures a gun and points it over the gate. Kennedy isn't far from them now. Older looking Five and our Five start bickering, which leads to physical combat. Luther attempts to intervene but is promptly kicked in the gonads by both Fives.

Later, Ben wanders into Vanya's mind. Of course, her overabundant powers have no effect on him since he's incorporeal. He finds poor Vanya curled up on the floor. Depression in a nutshell. Tears are streaking down her face. However, when she spots Ben, her eyes light up slightly. Vanya feels awful now that she recalls everything. She killed Pogo, she almost killed Allison, and kick-started the apocalypse. That's a lot of fork ups. Ben reveals that he'll stay behind in her place. She must rejoin her siblings and help them save the world. Everyone still loves her. She's valued by her family. Nobody's perfect.

Now, Ben starts to slowly disappear. He's finally passing on. He asks Vanya if she can hug him while he goes, since he hasn't had a proper hug in 17 years. I'm not crying. Nope. I'm just inexplicably cutting onions while watching TV. This scene was so simple, yet so beautiful. To me, this is an accurate depiction of depression. Ben's ray of positivity is a representation of all the wonderful things we should say to ourselves. We should always remember our worth.

Also, prior to his departure, Ben asks Vanya if she can pass something on to Klaus.

Meanwhile, back at the farmhouse, Carl gets out of the car and taunts Sissy. He doesn't think she has the gumption to shoot him. Harlan scrambles out of the car and flits to his mother's side. The gun accidentally goes off, and Harlan's powers cause the bullet to bury itself in Carl's chest. He inadvertently killed his own father. To be fair, though, his father was a massive prick.

Next, Lila confronts The Handler regarding Five's mission to kill her parents. Of course, she makes herself look positively angelic in this narrative. However, we see a flashback wherein The Handler approved Five's mission, but she used AJ's name. Sneaky! After Lila leaves to get her revenge against Five, The Handler stuffs AJ into her mouth. Yes, she eats a goldfish in one gulp. Yummy.

Later, Luther has older looking Five's gun. Both Fives proceed to tell Luther who to shoot. Our Five orders Luther to shoot the other Five and vice versa. It's all confusing for our big gorilla man. Back at the FBI headquarters, Vanya emerges wholly herself. All memories intact. She's in a becalmed state. And while people did die, at least she didn't trigger the apocalypse! Success!

But, Diego realizes there's still time to save Kennedy. He leaves the others behind and makes a break for the presidential procession. Our Five proceeds to open a portal, with the briefcase in hand, to 2019. He promises to tell the other Five how to fix the math when traveling. Since this is before older looking Five attempted to travel home. Before he botched the math and wound up stuck in a teenage boy's body forever. Our Five agrees. He starts rattling off math terms that go far over my humble head.

However, the pair have one last struggle over the briefcase. There's tugging and pulling. Time runs out as the portal starts to close. Our Five quickly pushes the other Five through the portal. Luther is elated until our Five points out that the briefcase was torn in half. Now they can't use it to get home. Yay?

Meanwhile, Diego is sprinting across the road to a figure shrouded in black sporting a matching black umbrella. He believes it's Daddy Hargreeves. Diego proceeds to tackle this man. Unfortunately, it's not his father. However, this doppelganger does have a note for Diego from Daddy Hargreeves. "Told you so," the note says.

Next, Daddy Hargreeves shows up at a meeting with The Majestic 12. It's at the same restaurant wherein he had that disastrous light supper with his future children. He accuses the 12 for crossing the line. Kennedy wasn't supposed to get hurt, let alone die. Oh yeah — Kennedy still dies in this timeline. Daddy Hargreeves decides to quit the 12. But not before taking off his literal face to reveal a forking alien underneath. Then, he slaughters them all with his alien powers. I knew there was something off about the patriarch of the Hargreeves family. Daddy Hargreeves does come off very alien-like in his behavior in general.

Later, The Handler essentially enacts doomsday protocol. Back at the farmhouse, Harlan's powers grow increasingly out of control. We see the barn alight with blue. Clearly, Sissy took

Harlan inside the barn to protect him from the outside world.

The episode opens with a flashback. The year is 2006 and the Hargreeves siblings are holding a funeral service for Ben. Daddy Hargreeves, Mama Grace, and even Pogo are in attendance. DH proffers a terrible eulogy for Ben as far as eulogies go. I'd give it a 2/10. Mostly because he ends up turning the tables and insulting his children.

After the service, most of the Hargreeves head inside, save for young Klaus. We see young ghost Ben is with him. Young ghost Ben claims that he's

sticking around because of Klaus. Aw, that's nice. No "going toward the light" for him!

Later, we're back in 1963, right after Kennedy's assassination. We see our protagonists are being labelled as "terrorists" by media outlets. Luther, Vanya, Diego, Allison, Klaus, and Five are all in Elliot's hideout. Five and the others are hellbent on finding a way home. However, Vanya receives a phone call from a frantic Sissy explaining that Harlan is in danger. He's caught in the throes of his own powers — just like Vanya was earlier.

Now, Vanya makes her case for going to the farmhouse to assist Harlan. Her siblings agree in tandem that their top priority should be getting back to 2019, not helping some kid in 1963.

Vanya asserts that she needs her family now more than ever to pitch in. But since no one volunteers to join her, Vanya sets out alone.

Well, not actually. Klaus pops in the passenger seat, citing that he wouldn't dare let his sister go at it solo. Vanya relays the message Ben had for Klaus while imprisoned in her mind. Ben didn't stick around for Klaus — he was afraid. Fearful of what might happen should he follow the light. Klaus lets out an embittered laugh.

Suddenly, everyone else trickles into Vanya's car. Diego, Five, and Allison. Finally, Luther crawls into the trunk of the car because, giant gorilla man.

Later, our team arrives at the farmhouse to find Sissy brandishing a shotgun in their direction. Vanya insists that they're there to help out. Oh, and the strangers towing Vanya are actually her siblings. Small world, big family. Everyone makes their way into the barn. Poor Harlan is levitating while enveloped in a sphere of light. His powers are completely out of control. Vanya enters his light sphere and attempts to quell his rampant emotions.

Meanwhile, The Handler and Lila are standing some distance away from the farmhouse in a field. Diego, Five, Allison, Klaus, and Luther spot them. Diego and Five decide to greet them. Sniff them out for any nefarious, underhanded plans.

Now, The Handler and Lila are insistent on the Hargreeves' eradication. In short: they're gonna die today. Well, that's what they believe. The Handler snaps her fingers and a mass of Commission lackeys materialize. They're all armed with briefcases and various weaponry. Diego and Five decide to make a break for it. Suddenly, the lackeys surge forward en masse and begin firing upon our heroes. Diego and Five seek refuge behind a tractor. Luther, Allison, and Klaus all huddle behind farm equipment as well.

Bullets are whizzing by at a rapid pace — it's a wonder the Hargreeves are able to avoid them. Vanya emerges from the barn while levitating and manages to kill the Commission lackeys in one fell swoop. The Handler urges Lila to show off her abilities. We see her slowly levitate. A blue light emanates from her chest while her eyes glow. A burst of power launches forth, creating destruction all around the farmhouse. She possesses the same powers as Vanya. Diego goes flying, and a tractor falls on his leg, pinning him under.

Next, Lila takes on Five, mimicking his ability to teleport. She dispatches him rather quickly. Luther also tries to take her on, but her super strength appears to surpass his own. Then, she squares off against Allison. The pair physically duke it out. Lila "rumors" Allison into not breathing. We see Allison start to choke. Luther feverishly urges Allison to breathe.

Thankfully, Allison eventually starts breathing again. Success! Meanwhile, The Handler wanders toward Harlan inside the barn. Vanya was successfully able to calm him down. However, The Handler wants him to join her at the Commission. She'll help him understand his abilities. Don't do it!

Then, the Hargreeves help Diego crawl out from under the massive tractor. They mull over how best to take on Lila. She's quite formidable in the powers department. But, more importantly, she's also one of them — a person with immense abilities who was also born on October 1st, 1989. It would be prudent to convince Lila to join their side.

Next, everyone regroups in the barn. Lila approaches Five and reminds him of a certain night in 1993. The wherein he killed her parents. Five recalls that incident, but also mentions that he's killed a boatload of people over the decades. He does mention a tidbit that The Handler failed to mention — that she was the one who initiated the mission. The Handler approved it. Lila refuses to believe this. Diego tries to coax her into joining the Hargreeves family. He reminds her that she's not alone. That The Handler only wanted her for her powers, so she could bend them to her will.

Again, Lila is stalwart in her beliefs. She still wholeheartedly believes that The Handler loves her. Suddenly, The Handler shoots everyone, including Lila. They all die in tandem, save for Five. Five is critically (fatally) injured, but still breathing. Just as The Handler is about to put Five out of his misery, the lone Swede stealthily approaches her from behind. He fatally shoots her and she collapses. Five recalls his conversation with Daddy Hargreeves about starting out small with time jumps. Start with seconds, then minutes, and so forth. Five puts that into practice now.

Then, Five jumps back just enough so everyone is brought back to life, including Lila. Then, as The Handler is about to shoot everyone again, Five quickly snatches up her rifle. The lone Swede reappears and he instantly slaughters The Handler again. Just as he's about to kill off

the gang, Five rattles off "enough" in Swedish. The lone Swede acquiesces. He even agrees that enough is enough. That's when he flees the scene.

Meanwhile, Lila races to snatch up the The Handler's briefcase. Diego attempts to stop her, but Luther tackles him. Lila disappears with the briefcase. Diego confesses his love for her to Luther. Dude — she's tried to kill you, she's poisoned you, and kidnapped you. Take off the rose-colored glasses!

Next, Vanya sits with Harlan. He contracted her abilities whenever Vanya saved him from drowning in the pond. Thankfully, Vanya is able to take said abilities back from the young boy. All is well now. Sissy embraces her son.

Later, Herb appears in the field of slaughtered Commission lackeys. He tells Diego and Five that he's now in charge of the Commission since The Handler bit the dust. Oh, and the pair can take any briefcase belonging to a dead Commission worker. Time to go home!

Meanwhile, Sissy reveals that she's planning on staying in her timeline. Now that she knows about Vanya's explosive powers and the fact that villains pursue her on the regular, Sissy doesn't want to expose that lifestyle to Harlan. Vanya is, obviously, upset. However, she understands. The pair embrace and share some goodbye smooches. I'm not crying — you are. Raymond finds a letter that Allison left behind. She delves into her love for him, and how vital his work with the Civil Rights Movement is.

Then, we see Dave get on the bus bound for military boot camp. The lone Swede encounters the hippie bus that's chock full of Klaus' prophet followers. He decides to climb aboard and indulge in a more peaceful existence. Luther tries to reconnect with his former mafia boss, but there's no answer on the other line. Sissy and Harlan are driving in a car bound for sunny California. We see Harlan in the back seat toying with a wooden sparrow. Said wooden sparrow begins to levitate while in his hand. It would appear some of Vanya's residual powers latched onto Harlan.

Now, it's time to go home. Five arrives armed with a briefcase. Everyone clasps hands and forms a circle. Then... boom! Our protagonists are standing in the foyer of the Umbrella Academy. They're home! Huzzah! They wander into the dining area. Diego spots a painting of Ben hanging above the mantelpiece. That's when Daddy Hargreeves appears. He tells the gang that they're not supposed to be here. This isn't the Umbrella Academy — this is the Sparrow Academy! Uh oh. Our gang also spots a slew of powered up kids standing on the balcony above them.

Suddenly, Ben, fully formed and tangible, shows up. He asks his father a dire question in need of answering — "Who are these a**holes?"

Taking things right back to where it all began, we open with a flashback to October 1, 1989. Shining dust pours down into a subway car, and a woman mysteriously becomes pregnant and gives birth within seconds. However ... the story has changed slightly this time. Instead of the original 43, only 16 women around the world gave birth at the same time with no prior signs of pregnancy. Reginald Hargreeves gathered seven of them, and he created ... the Sparrow Academy: Marcus, Ben, Fei, Alphonso, Sloane, Jayme, and

Christopher.

Picking back up where season 2 left off, the Umbrellas have returned back to the current day, but they're confused to find that the future changed slightly while they were gone. Their house is now occupied by the Sparrow Academy, and both Ben and Reginald are alive, the latter of which remembers the Umbrellas from their meeting in Dallas in 1963 (and those events are what made him decide to adopt the children that would become the Sparrows instead, oops). Meanwhile, downstairs, a pulsing ball of energy forms in the basement.

The Umbrellas and the Sparrows begin to argue, and they decide that they'll need to settle things the old fashioned way — with a dance off to "Footloose." The entertaining scenes ends up

being nothing more than a hallucination in Diego's head, courtesy of Jayme's powers. In reality, Ben punches Klaus, and a wild brawl breaks out across the house. The Umbrellas have their work cut out for them as their counterparts show off their own special powers. The Umbrellas eventually retreat, but Five loses track of their time traveling briefcase in the process. Elsewhere, we see Grace carry it downstairs into the basement, and she pauses to look at the ball of energy.

No longer welcome in their own home, the Umbrellas need a place to lay down and avoid drawing any unnecessary attention. Klaus suggests what he believes to be the perfect place: the Hotel Obsidian. After pawning off Luther's watch to the unimpressed concierge, they manage to book two rooms. Diego is immediately itching to get back into the fray and figure out how to fix things, but Five beckons him to let him relax for a least a little while. They need a break from saving the world. In the other room, Allison and Vanya lament over Ray and Sissy.

Marcus and Vanya secretly meet up at a diner to chat and discuss their situation. Given that the Sparrows are the only superhero team in town, they don't want the Umbrellas to cause any issues for them. Vanya, confident that she can beat him in battle, threatens to show up and fight him in front of all of his doting fans (because she's ended the world twice, after all). He gives in, asking her what she wants, and she tells him that the Sparrows are in possession of something she needs ... and she wants it back. Outside, one of Fei's crows flies off and back to the Academy, and Fei tells Ben that Marcus is making a deal with the Umbrellas.

Five, Diego, Klaus, and Luther are eating in the lobby and discussing the fact that there are likely versions of all of them in this alternate universe. A knife discreetly lands in the back of Diego's chair, and he turns around and sees Lila. He chases after her, but she's not there to stay. She's just popped in to drop off their son, Stanley. Apparently Diego is a dad, which is news to everyone, including him.

While it's not entirely clear who he is at this point, it's worth noting that a man with a carefully packed suitcase and a briefcase full of cassette tapes is shown travelling on a bus after he leaves his small cabin home. Frustrated by the sounds around him, he puts a tape with the sound of bees droning into his cassette player.

Marcus walks into the basement and finds Grace drawing symbols on the floor in front of the pulsing ball of energy. She tells him that it's a message from God, and she's worshipping. Marcus reaches out to touch it, and a wave of energy shoots out; he disintegrates. Meanwhile, the concierge's dog at the Hotel Obsidian also disappears. Something is very wrong here.

Vanya finds a book in the hotel and flips to a page that refers to the Umbrellas as the Kennedy Six, a group of communists. She sees that Sissy died on October 1, 1989. She reflects back on something that Sissy said to her, "You don't even notice the box that you're in until someone comes along and lets you out," as she approaches the hotel barber.

In the lobby, Five, Klaus, and Diego are discussing Lila and Stanley when Vanya approaches with a new haircut. After casually correcting Diego when he refers to him as Vanya, he corrects him and says, "It's Viktor, [...] it's who I've always been." His brothers are all quick to accept the news supportively, and Viktor discusses his meeting with Marcus and his plans to get the briefcase back. However, Five isn't interested in messing with time anymore. There's finally no doomsday or apocalypse looming over them. He's retired.

Despite what Five may believe, trouble is certainly brewing in the basement of the Academy. Another pulse ripples out from the ball of energy, and the lobsters in the tank in the hotel lobby disappear.

Five and Klaus are baffled to find out that Stan's mother is Lila. Diego has a fresh haircut... and so does Vanya. Vanya corrects Diego and says, "It's Viktor. It's who I've always been." Viktor

explains that Marcus agreed to handover the briefcase, though his brothers aren't convinced it's actually going to happen that way. [Need to rewatch this scene]. Five makes a point that he's retired. They're done messing with time. Because there's finally no doomsday, no apocalypse. Another pulse ripples out from the pulsating ball of energy in the Hargreeves mansion (name for the house).

Despite the fact that she's still upset over Claire, Allison insists on joining Viktor when he goes to meet up with Marcus to get the briefcase. On the way, Viktor tells her how being with Sissy opened up something in him and showed him that he'd never be free by hiding from who he really is. After losing her, he realized he can't live in that box anymore.

As they sit in the diner waiting for Marcus, Allison becomes overwhelmed by memories of her daughter. She steps outside for air and sees a man with a briefcase and headphones. When she notices that he's staring at her, she begins to follow after him, but she eventually loses him.

Luther wakes up at the Academy after being kidnapped by Ben, Fei, Sloane, and Christopher, and though he's initially on the defensive, he calms when he sits down to eat with the Sparrows. They all introduce themselves, and when Luther asks where Marcus is, he finds out why they took him. Marcus disappeared, and the Sparrows believe that the Umbrellas kidnapped him. Luther offers to go back to Hotel Obsidian to talk to his siblings and see what's going on, but they won't let him leave.

Despite the situation, Luther manages to settle in amongst the Sparrows quite comfortably. Given the difficult relationship between the Umbrellas, he enjoys how close the Sparrows are as a family. Sloane spends time with him and flirts with him, and while he likes the attention at first, he eventually becomes suspicious that she's trying to honey trap him.

The Sparrows eventually agree to let Luther go home (with a tote bag full of goodies). However, after he walks out, Sloane calls out to him and floats him up to her bedroom window. She apologizes to him for earlier and explains that although they were being watched by her family, she meant everything she said. Luther kisses her.

Lila tries to jump to Berlin, but she's furious to find that her briefcase won't work. After spying on the Sparrows, Lila copies Fei's powers and uses one of her birds to swipe the Umbrellas' briefcase from the basement of the Academy.

Diego talks Stan to the store to get ear drops, and they run into Alphonso and Jayme. He learns how Alphonso's powers work the hard way, getting injured himself for each blow that he deals against the other man. Stan tries to help him, but he gets hurt as well. Diego and Stan begin chucking random items at them in retaliation before they eventually retreat.

Five eventually gives in and agrees to join Klaus on a road trip, but he's not pleased when he discovers that Klaus has roped him into another scheme instead of a relaxing vacation full of odd and zany roadside attractions. They're going to Pennsylvania to find Klaus' birth mother, and he wants Five to be there for emotional support. Klaus found his mom's information in Reginald's office, and the address leads them to an Amish community.

Klaus asks a woman where he can find Rachel Herschberger, but a man approaches him and threatens him, forcing him to leave. He runs into the woman in the woods afterward, and she explains that Rachel died on October 1, 1989. The Amish end up finding Klaus again and chase after him. When he gets back to the car, he sees that Five has been drawing calculations all over the windows. The woman frantically finds Klaus again and shoves a book in his hands, telling him that his mother's death was unusual. And there were others. As they're driving away, Klaus is flipping through the book, and he finds disturbing news.

When they return to Hotel Obsidian, Five and Klaus share their findings with Diego, Viktor, and Allison. They explain that all of their mothers died on October 1, 1989 ... before they were born. When they jumped back to the future, they created a time paradox. A grandfather paradox.

The Umbrellas discuss the fact that things have been disappearing and the disturbing news about the deaths of their mothers, and Diego suggests that Reginald is probably the one that did it.

Five runs into Lila in the bathroom, and after fighting with one another, he informs her that the Grandfather Paradox is happening. He sees that she has not one, but two of the Commission's briefcases with her, and she tells him that neither of them work. The odds of both of them failing are astronomical, so they begrudgingly team up in an attempt to get to the bottom of things. Diego runs into them in the hallway, and though he tries to talk to her, Lila makes it clear that she's over it. There's no relationship between them anymore.

Five and Lila get to work in the hotel's utility room, doing their best to hotwire one of the briefcases, though it doesn't appear to be working. Lila gets an idea, and she mimics Five's powers. Together, they're able to jump start the case. They find themselves in a snowy wasteland, standing in front of the remains of the Commission.

Unaware that Lila has the briefcase, Allison, Viktor, and Luther try to figure out how they can resolve the Marcus issue with the Sparrows. Viktor and Allison meet up with Fei and Ben, and instead of telling them the truth, Allison lies and says that they kidnapped Marcus. Viktor tells

them about the Grandfather Paradox, and they agree to trade the briefcase for Marcus (although Grace already told them that "God is in the basement" and "Marcus isn't coming back" because "God took him.").

Klaus sneaks into the Academy and finds Reginald, demanding to know if he killed their mothers (he didn't). However, they're interrupted, and Klaus has to hide when Alphonso and Jayme come in to give Reginald his pills and force him to sign a paper. Reginald is hesitant, and Alphonso threatens to get Christopher. When they leave, Klaus sits down with his father and teaches him how to fake taking the pills that his children are forcing upon him. Later, Reginald falls asleep while they're watching television, and Klaus follows the sound of Grace's singing into the basement. He sees the pulsing ball of energy.

Sloane wakes up on the floor at Hotel Obsidian, and she runs off when she sees what happened to Jayme and Alphonso. Sloane runs off, and when Luther finds her, she attacks him, convinced that he set her up. Diego and Allison intervene. Allison uses her powers on Sloane to force her to tell them where the briefcase is, and they learn that the Sparrows didn't have it after all. Meanwhile, Viktor follows Harlan, who remarks that he hasn't aged at all — which would make sense, considering it's only been three days for Viktor since he saw Harlan. The older man explains that ever since Viktor saved him at the lake, he can hear people with powers ... like a tuning fork. He explains that he doesn't have control over his powers, though.

Five and Lila walk inside of the Commission to find that it's been ravaged by the effects of the Grandfather Paradox. After Five finds a recording of what happened just before the timeline collapse, Lila brings him the master handbook in hopes that they can find some information inside of it. They make their way over to the operations bunker, and Five is suddenly very itchy and farting uncontrollably. Oddly enough, the bunker denies Lila's biometric scan, but it accepts Five's. They enter the room, which is mostly empty besides an old man laying inside of a chamber resembling an iron lung. Five realizes that the man is him; he's the one who founded the Commission (and Lila is beyond amused). The room is paradox proof, which is why his paradox psychosis stopped once they entered. The older version of Five tells them that they must be there because of a Kugelblitz. If so, there's no way to fix it, and all that will be left ... is oblivion. He releases himself from the chamber to show the young Five what he has to look forward to, and he instructs him not to save the world. The old man dies, and Five cuts off the strange symbol tattooed on his chest.

Diego brushes Klaus off when he tries to tell him about the "blinding orb of light" that he found in the Academy basement, and he tells "Uncle Klaus" that he's babysitting Stan while he cleans the hotel in payment for destroying the lobby with a Molotov cocktail. The pair makes their way through the rooms, cleaning cart in tow as they dig into some heart-to-heart therapy while Stan tries to steal everything in sight. They find an intriguing room that's not on the list, the White Buffalo Suite, and they break into it, mesmerized by its odd décor. Unfortunately, the fun and games end when Stan accidentally shoots Klaus right through the chest with a spear gun.

Allison is still keyed up over everything that she's been through, so Diego takes her out for a drive and tries to get her to talk about what's bothering her. Knowing that she's in the mood for a fight, he parks in front of a rowdy looking bar with a Confederate flag hanging outside of it. A place that the two of them likely won't be very welcome. It's time to have some fun.

In a turn of events, Sloane accuses Luther of using her to get information, but he's able to convince her otherwise. Sloane joins Luther, Diego, Allison, and Viktor for a meeting in the lobby, and they debate what to do about Sloane and Harlan. Eventually, they agree to return Sloane to the Sparrow Academy, but in return, Ben demands that they hand over Harlan.

Harlan goes looking for Viktor, and he comes across the newspaper clippings with the Umbrellas' mothers. He demands to know why Viktor has them. We flash back to Harlan's meltdown after his mother died, and we learn that Harlan's outpouring of power is what killed them all.

Viktor, Luther, Diego, and Allison meet in the lobby (the latter two looking a bit rough around the edges after their wild night of bar fighting), and Five and Lila come tumbling back after their trip to the Commission. Allison realizes that they have the briefcase, but it doesn't appear to have survived the trip back. Lila hugs Diego, realizing that there's no time for her to hold grudges any longer. Diego spots Stan sneaking by the lobby with his arms full of supplies, and he follows him

back to the White Buffalo Suite, where his son shows him Klaus' dead body on the carpet; he was going to use the chemicals to dissolve it.

Putting their heads together for a brilliant solution, Diego and Stan roll Klaus' body up in the carpet and lug him down the hallway and into the elevator. The concierge barely bats an eye. Shortly after the elevator begins to move, Klaus comes gasping back to life, and Diego and Stan promptly lose their minds.

In the wake of the deaths of Jayme and Alphonso at Hotel Obsidian, Fei and Ben argue over what their next move will be. Fei wants to work together with the Umbrellas to solve their growing problem in the basement — because people all over the world are disappearing now — but Ben is more concerned with punishing Harlan first. Together, they join Grace in the basement and stand before the Kugelblitz, and they use her eye in an attempt to inspect it closer.

The Umbrellas sit at the hotel bar and discuss the Kugelblitz, which Five describes as the end of everything. Their best plan would be to go back in time and eliminate the paradox, but it's not possible considering the briefcase is kaput. Five doesn't want to risk using his powers to fix things, because we all know what happened last time he tried that. Another wave from the Kugelblitz comes crashing through, taking more innocent lives, and Five calculates that they have 4 to 5 days left until — you guessed it — the end of the world. They debate what to do about the Sparrows and Harlan, and Klaus finally takes it upon himself to mention the "big, bad, glow-y thing" in the basement of the Academy. So at least they know where the Kugelblitz is.

Viktor heads upstairs to talk to Harlan, and Diego and Lila send Stan off as they finally start to rekindle their relationship (not realizing that an odd, glowing door has opened up in the White Buffalo Suite). Meanwhile, Luther and Allison have a chat. They embrace, and Allison is under the assumption that Luther still wants her, but that's not the case at all. Angry that he's leaving to go after Sloane, she uses her powers and compels him to kiss her. Later, Allison catches Viktor sneaking Harlan out of the hotel. He wants to try to take back his powers so he can save him, and Allison agrees to help.

Klaus and Five are still sitting in the lobby, and when Five shows him the tattoo that he cut off of his older self, Klaus tells him that it's a symbol for a biker gang: the Mothers of Agony. Five immediately heads to the bar where the gang is located, and in the back room he finds none other than Pogo.

Unlike the Umbrellas, the Sparrow Academy is a Pogo-less institution. In a flashback scene, we discover that Pogo left after having an argument with Sir Reginald Hargreeves about his intentions for the children he'd become so fond of after watching a sparring match between Ben and Jayme. It's clear Reggie has had an ulterior motive for the superpowered kids all along, something about "the other side." We just don't know what... After the disagreement, Reggie kicks Pogo out of the Academy permanently.

Back in the present day, Five tries to jog Pogo's memory of their meeting in the 60s to no avail and follows him back to his camper in the woods.

There, he finally gets Pogo's attention when he reveals the tattoo he cut off of his older self back at the Commission. Pogo recognizes his work and the meaning of the sigils. Project Oblivion, the words jogging Five's memory of his dying 100-year-old self uttering the same word.

The pills Klaus has now weaned Reggie off of were from Pogo, a method of keeping the Sparrows safe from Reggie's Oblivion kamikaze mission. Pogo warns Five that if Project Oblivion has restarted, it means danger for everyone. And Five takes his first step towards his destiny, getting the sigil tattooed onto his chest.

Viktor meets Harlan and Allison at the drive-in theater and the two begin to strategize how they can rid Harlan of Viktor's gifted powers. Harlan has a much better grasp over his powers than Viktor does, explaining to him that it's all about sound. He just needs to listen to the energy

waves — every living thing has a distinct sound — and not the sounds that everyone else can hear. As Harlan tries to help Viktor see the extent of his powers, it's not going well and Allison steps in, her own powers not able to breach the energy field surrounding the pair. That is until she also finds an entirely new level of strength as she's brought into the energy field, knocking Harlan to the ground using her voice alone without even needing to utter her classic "I heard a rumor."

Harlan details to Viktor what it was like growing up with this power he couldn't control, naming it Marigold, and challenges Viktor to not listen with his ears, but his own Marigold. With the help of Harlan's trusty headphones, he finally begins to understand what Harlan means.

Meanwhile, Allison is hallucinating Ray. Thankfully, she knows it's a hallucination but it's not making it any easier. She knows that her Ray died nine years ago, but she still details to him the pain she feels from losing both him and Claire until she notices the effects of Harlan and Viktor as the world goes dark, electricity crackling in the background.

Harlan and Viktor are in the air, energy swirling around them, and Viktor finally completes his task and removes the power from Harlan, freeing him from the prison he'd put him in. As Viktor recovers, Harlan makes the mistake of telling Allison the truth about their mothers — that he accidentally killed them — setting Allison off. He's the reason Claire doesn't exist and the world is ending.

That's all the motivation Allison needs to kill Harlan to appease the Sparrows, bringing his body to their door, Luther in his new red suit standing outside with the Sparrow team.

In a shock to no one, Diego and Lila have misplaced their child and worry he might have been Kugelblitzed. A trail of Slim Jim wrappers leads Diego to a secret door in the White Buffalo Suite, a light tunnel of light behind it. The two venture after him and find themselves in White Buffalo Suite ... with a twist. Everything in the room is the backside of the one they've just left, including the buffalo ... its rear end now sticking straight out at them. And Diego never forgets an ass, so this is definitely a different place.

When they get down to the lobby that looks exactly the same as the one they're used to, they discover they're in Hotel Oblivion, and ringing the bell on the desk is strictly not allowed. Then, Lila reveals the truth. Stan is not their son. He's the son of a friend and technically she kind of kidnapped him.

As Diego tries to leave the hotel through the revolving door, he ends up right back inside. Something is definitely off about this place. So Diego, in all his well-thought-out glory, rings the bell that was explicitly stated should not be rung. A gong echoes, everything goes eerie and dark, and then they hear a chain clanging. It's a very large armored man with a scythe who takes two of Diego's fingers as a souvenir before the pair can escape back down the mystery tunnel. Thankfully, the two keep it from crossing over into Hotel Obsidian's White Buffalo Suite and then Stan walks in with a Slim Jim and slushy only to be obliterated by the Kugelblitz right before Diego and Lila's eyes.

Despite their best attempts to hide it, the Sparrows know they have a guest. Fei busts Sloane and Luther thanks to their shared wall and Sloane's squeaky bed and invites Luther down to the family meeting called by Ben.

Luther finally explains why the Umbrellas are so obsessed with Sparrow Ben, citing a Jennifer incident as the source of their Ben's demise, and that it's just because they all miss Ben. Their Ben. Their Ben who was the exact opposite of the Ben sitting before him. Luther hopes that maybe some of Umbrella Ben is still lurking beneath Sparrow Ben's rough exterior.

Then, he offers Luther a spot on the Sparrows, a shiny new red uniform and all. A plan of Ben's that was not run by Fei and she's none too pleased.

The White Buffalo Suite has left Klaus back to Reggie, who has a painting of a white buffalo above the mantle in his office. He knows it must all be connected. Klaus wants help discovering more about who he is and why his own Reggie treated him the way that he did.

Over and over Klaus gets hit by speeding car after speeding car until he manages to bring himself back to the world of the living in under two minutes. Now he's ready. But ready for what?

Now it's time for part two and Reggie takes Klaus to a cemetery where he's left to be chased by ghosts. Reggie motivates him to take charge, citing that Klaus' Reginald father did what he did to make Klaus doubt himself and feel small so he could be controlled.

He faces the spirits again and somehow banishes them away in a flash of light emitting from his body.

Loyal to his own family, and Sloane now, Luther is left in a tough place to unite the families for the common cause of solving the Kugelblitz. He and Sloane go and fetch Five, Diego, and

Lila as they argue about heading back over to Hotel Oblivion to bring them back to the Sparrow Academy.

At the Academy, Allison comes clean to Viktor about killing Harlan. Allison tells him that Harlan had told her the truth about their mothers and that she knows Viktor was lying about it. The two get into it, Allison is angry over how adamantly Viktor tried to save Harlan but has done nothing to try and bring Claire back, and that every bad thing that has happened to them can be traced back to Viktor. And somehow he never has to pay for that. Her new strengthened powers from Harlan's energy field return, sealing Viktor's mouth shut and rendering him unable to breathe with a simple command. Viktor heads to Ben's room upstairs after striking Allison across the face, and the planning continues.

They head downstairs to get a look at the Kugelblitz and Sloane and Five formulate a plan to trap it using Sloane, Viktor, Lila, and Christopher. They're using its own gravity to condense it and then Grace arrives to save "God," forcing the others to fend her and her flamethrower off until Five transports her upstairs and kills her.

They manage to get the Kugelblitz safely stored inside Christopher, the next Kugel wave coming out as a fart.

With the Kugelblitz safely contained it's time to party. Champagne is passed around the dancing heroes, but Luther is up on the roof seeing the reality of the destruction caused. The world is quite literally burning as a result of the Kugel waves. Sloane heads up to find him and they plan to visit Italy right before Luther asks for her hand in marriage with a handmade ring containing a rock from the moon. She agrees, and it's time to plan a wedding!

Lila also has a confession. She didn't only bring Stan here to mess with Diego, it's because she actually is pregnant and wanted to see how Diego would be as a father. She wants to be a family.

If there are any Hargreeves who can make a point and nail it home, it's Five. He finds Viktor in Reggie's office and tells him that there is no formula that makes up for the lives people like them — powerful people — take. You can't save so many people to absolve yourself for the lives you took. They're too powerful to be making decisions like this, especially alone.

He assures Viktor he's always here for him, no more going rogue, but if he lies to them again Five will kill Viktor himself.

Fei wants to kill the Umbrellas now that the Kugelblitz is taken care of, but Ben has made some kind of deal with Reggie that needs them. Fei is furious that he's gone and made this deal without anyone's input and she and Christopher decide that they'll no longer be following his orders.

That is until the Kugelblitz breaks free from Christopher, and sucks in Fei and everyone else in its path as he swallows the building, Five getting everyone else out in the nick of time. Back to square one.

They chase each other throughout everyone else's little pockets of paradise, ending with Luther finally getting through to Klaus, who agrees to try and get back to the others.

Five doesn't buy that the Kugelblitz got Klaus, but there's no time to argue it. They make their way to the lobby and fight over the bell, Diego knows what happens when that bell rings.

Five knows that Reginald killed Luther and Klaus, citing the way he got the family back together in the first place by killing himself. It's perfectly on par. He also knows Allison has a big part in this. Allison, however, had no idea her brothers' deaths were part of the plan. He assures her he had no part in it and that he'll hold up his end of the agreement as long as she does.

Step one is finding the sigil, after that, it's up to anyone's best guess. Not even Reginald knows, and the team is certainly not pleased about that. Allison, Five, and Viktor go one way, Sloane, Ben, and Reginald another, with Diego and Lila rounding out the groups. Reginald, of course, leaves Sloane and Ben alone.

Five confronts Allison about the deal, he knows, and now she's gotten Luther and Klaus killed. She won't admit to it and leaves, Viktor chasing after her, Five following but unknowingly passing through a portal to an entirely new area of the hotel.

The same things happen to Diego and Lila as well as Ben and Sloane, who are found by Five. He's figured it out, the hotel is virtually alive seemingly to keep them away from the lobby. A lobby where Reginald Hargreeves is found by Klaus back from the Void. He knocks him out cold and rings the bell. The battle is set to begin

There are actually four Guardians, and the teams take three of them out. Allison admits to her deal to Viktor but promises she had nothing to do with Klaus or Luther. When they all reconvene in the lobby, Klaus tells all of them the truth, Reginald owning up to it but promising them that the key to resetting the universe is in this hotel. And Five finds it moments before the final Guardian falls from the ceiling and slices his arm off, exactly like his 100-year-old self.

Sloane stands alone against the final Guardian until a familiar face returns. Luther. But he's not really here, it's Klaus transporting him here from the Void (finally giving Number 4 more of his comic powers!). Reginald tells Luther he did have a purpose outside of this mission, he had sent Luther to guard the most precious thing in the universe, most likely referring to Abigail on the moon. It's starting to feel like Abigail is why Reginald was so hellbent on getting to reset the universe in the first place. He disappears when Klaus can no longer hold on.

The sigil is on the floor, seven stars for each of them to stand on, but not Allison. And it's clear why, standing on the sigils is killing all seven of them, and Reg can't keep up his end of the deal with Allison if she's dead.

The hotel isn't actually a hotel, it's a machine meant to reset the universe, and the particles inside their bodies are the only things that can power it. A panel appears, allowing Reginald to program him what reality he wants to set. Allison stops him, slicing his head right in half, freeing her siblings in the nick of time. But the machine is set. Despite protests from her family, she pushes the button.

Allison returns home to find Claire and Ray, her dream come true. The others all emerge from the hotel to a brand new world in Obsidian Park, a memorial to Sir Reginald Hargreeves in the courtyard. All of them, including Luther, who now has his normal human body back, and Five's arm and Diego's fingers are also back intact. However, one is missing, Sloane. And so are all their powers.

Reginald was successful in resetting the universe. They all disperse, Luther to find Sloane, Klaus follows Luther, Ben grumpily stalks off, and Lila and Diego walk off into the sunset to live their lives.

Despite the memorial, Reginald is also alive and well in a skyscraper, Abigail at his side.

Summary: The family teams up to find a kidnapped Viktor while attempting to adjust to normal life. Lila and Five probe a mysterious group called the Keepers.



The episode opens six years after the Hargreeves family's arrival in AU 2019. We see Dr. Jean Thibodeau and her husband, Dr. Gene Thibodeau, smoking two brothers during a euchre tournament. A mysterious man pulls them aside with a suitcase of items from other timelines. Jean finds two DVDs for *Love on Loan 2*; however, both covers boast different actresses, one of whom happens to be Allison Hargreeves. Jean is ecstatic.

The man wants 10 grand for both DVDs, but the Thibodeaus can only do five grand. Jean reluctantly hands over an envelope full of cash. When the man turns around to leave, Gene shoots him in the head. Then, he scoops up their money.

Later, in Nova Scotia, Canada, a woman barges into a bar, looking for Viktor. Upon finding him, she tosses her keys. She's breaking up with him. After she departs, a bar patron pokes fun at Viktor, claiming he's slept with every woman in town.

Next, Luther calls Viktor to ask if he plans to attend Grace's birthday party. Grace is Diego and Lila's daughter. Viktor claims he can't leave; he owns the bar. Luther tries to persuade his brother to skip town for a few days.

After Luther hangs up, we see him take to the stage for a dance as "Spaceboy." He works at a strip club. However, he's not a very good stripper. Hey, at least one woman is really into his routine. Meanwhile, Diego is a delivery driver for RPS (Ready Priority Shipping). He urinates into a bottle while his supervisor tears him a new one over the phone.

Elsewhere, Lila chats with her parents while preparing for her daughter's birthday party. It's a stressful time for her. One woman stopped behind Lila blares her horn, which, naturally, garners a response from her. Our former assassin threatens to disconnect the woman's brain stem if she continues honking her horn. Old habits die hard.

Then, Ben finds Luther eagerly awaiting him after his release from prison. Allison shoots a commercial for laundry detergent. Upon realizing the shoot will run later than expected, Allison calls someone to pick up her daughter, Claire, from school.

We see Klaus escort Claire home. He's in hypervigilance mode, anxious about the perils that could befall them on their walk to Allison's house. Meanwhile, Number Five boasts a mustache and pretends to be Jerome at a meeting for the Keepers. It's a support group for folks who recall the other timelines.

There, Five speaks on his experience, from being trapped in a future apocalypse for 45 years to being present for JFK's assassination. He validates everyone's experiences, claiming that these other timelines are, in fact, real. Afterward, the support group leader asks Five to attend a party that evening with him.

Later, Five returns to the CIA headquarters. He removes his disguise and pays a visit to his supervisor. Five relays what he learned from the Keepers meeting. His superior orders Five to abandon this mission. He believes the Keepers are harmless.

Elsewhere, Luther asks Ben how he's been. They haven't seen each other in four years. Ben is going to live with Luther per his probation requirements, and he doesn't look too enthused about that. As for Luther? He's thrilled to have a roommate.

Next, Allison finds Klaus and Claire downstairs in Klaus's room. We learn Klaus has been sober for three years. As a result, he's developed a phobia of just about everything. It's clearly his trauma taking control — I'd love for my baby to be happy for once.

Klaus tries to persuade Allison to attend Grace's birthday party, but the latter states she has an important callback the next day to prepare for. However, he's free to go to the party with Claire.

Later, Luther takes Ben to Grace's birthday party against the latter's will. Ben reminds Luther that he lost his family — the Sparrow Academy. But guess what? You're stuck with the Umbrellas, dude. Lila finds Diego putting candles in the cake. She reminds him that the piñata comes first, then the cake. It's not precisely paradise in the Hargreeves-Pitts household.

Meanwhile, Five learns that Ben went to prison for crypto exchange. He insists the feds only pursued him because he's a maverick like Elon Musk. Ick. Five reminds Ben that he bankrupted 100,000 people, so that's kind of a big deal.

Allison drops off Klaus and Claire at the party. Klaus is wearing latex gloves, which he usually boasts when going out in public. He attempts to convince Allison to head inside with them, but she declines, insisting that nobody wants her there. At the same time, Diego asks Five if the latter's supervisor has reviewed his resume. Diego wants to join the CIA. His dickhead superior at RPS is making life difficult. Five lies, claiming Diego's resume is moving up the chain.

While Klaus reunites with Luther and Ben, Diego and Lila argue over Lila's whereabouts that morning. He notes that this piñata is from the East side, not the West side, as she claimed. Lila asks Diego to retrieve the soda, but when he refuses, she decides to do it herself.

Outside, Lila spots Allison in her vehicle, vaping weed. Lila pops in the passenger seat and takes a hit from Allison's pen. Now that they're both sufficiently high, the pair heads inside. Allison is paranoid, asserting that nobody wants her there. Lila insists on the contrary until she sees how awkward everyone is around Allison.

Allison and Luther reunite. It's an — you guessed it — awkward reunion. Remember when Allison used her powers to SA Luther in Season 3? I'm trying to forget that myself. I hope they address it, though.

After that, Diego vents about married life to Luther. It's not all it's cracked up to be. However, Luther adds that having a family is something he and Sloane always wanted. Realizing he was insensitive, Diego apologizes.

Viktor arrives at the party that evening. He encounters Sy Grossman, a man who wants Viktor to go for a ride in his van. That always ends well. When Viktor refuses, Sy tasers him.

Then, Luther goes ham on the piñata, inadvertently knocking the cake out of Diego and Lila's hands. Grace cries. Clearly, Luther has issues he must work through. Lila informs Diego about her book club, so she leaves for that.

Sure enough, Five and the Keepers' support group leader run into Lila at a party. Five is disguised as Jerome, and Lila pretends to be Nancy. Five pulls Lila aside and urges her not to blow his cover. Lila admits that domestic life has been quite the adjustment. I imagine the "assassin to wife and mother" pipeline isn't easy.

Lila and Five sit with the party attendees as Jean and Gene emerge. Lila whispers their names to Five. As it turns out, the Thibedeaus founded the Keepers. They present a slideshow on "The Umbrella Effect: A Practical Study of Contemporary Post-Modern Malaise and Timeline Purification." Jean explains they can return to a "restored and correct timeline."

The slideshow displays a series of artifacts from the other timelines, including figurines of our titular Umbrella Academy, photos of Reginald Hargreeves with his resurrected wife, Abigail, pamphlets from Klaus's '60s cult and strollers with the Umbrella and Sparrow Academy logos.

Jean and Gene claim that the Powers That Be, aka Reginald, are trying to cover up the truth about the other timelines. However, all will be remedied with the Cleanse. The Thibedeaus overhear Lila and Five talking. They ask the duo to stand up. Jean and Gene recognize Lila, aka "Nancy," while Five introduces himself as Jerome, who works in the Orlando office.

Five asks the Thibedeaus to explain the Cleanse. Gene reveals that some believe the Cleanse is the end, while others consider it a "great restoration." Five asks the married couple what they think. They evade answering, instead declaring they're preparing a lecture on the Cleanse. Gene urges Five and Lila to give out their information, and they will receive an invite.

After that, Lila and Five sit in a cafe. Five wonders if Reginald's timeline reset didn't work as intended, especially if all these artifacts from the other timelines are here. He urges Lila not to tell the family—not even Diego. Lila wipes food off Five's mouth, joking that Hargreeves men don't know how to eat. Sure enough, Diego spies this from afar, only seeing the back of Five's head. He assumes Lila is having an affair. Ugh, I hate this narrative choice.

Elsewhere, Luther and Ben arrive at home. Luther is squatting in the old Umbrella Academy building, although in this timeline, it's "Hargreeves Home for Wayward Boys." Ben's not a fan of the squatting situation. Luther finds a letter addressed to him, stating that Viktor has been kidnapped. The rest of the family arrives to discuss their next steps. Even though they're powerless, they still have to save their brother.

So, they all pile into Diego's van. They barge into Sy Grossman's dry cleaning establishment. Five leads the charge with his gun, keeping on the lookout for the kidnapper. The family finds Viktor bound to a chair. Sy emerges, also with a weapon. He admits this is his first kidnapping, hence why it's rough around the edges. Sy calls them the Umbrella Academy, a moniker they haven't heard in six years. He kidnapped Viktor in the hopes the whole family would come to his rescue.

Five insists the Umbrella Academy isn't real. However, Sy pulls out a newspaper clipping featuring our titular (formerly) superpowered siblings that proves otherwise. He informs the gang that said clipping was among a box of items in the trunk of his daughter's car. Sy's daughter, Jennifer, started attending meetings for the Keepers a year ago. One day, she stopped talking to him. Sy hasn't seen Jennifer in three months. He hopes our heroes can help find her. Sy admits he tried calling the authorities, but that yielded no results. He also believes he's in danger.

Five agrees to find Jennifer. He takes her belongings, undoubtedly artifacts from the other timelines. His siblings protest, claiming they no longer have their powers. Sy thanks the Umbrella Academy for their assistance. Five tells him they'll bring her home in 24 hours.

After this, Five procures a jar of marigold from among Jennifer's things. Why does she have this? The gang eats at a Japanese-style teppanyaki restaurant and discusses potentially consuming the marigold to regain their abilities. So far, everyone save Ben would rather remain powerless. Ben surreptitiously pockets the marigold for himself.

The siblings decide to part ways for the night, but not before Ben encourages them to drink sake shots (even sober Klaus partakes). Ben reassures Luther that he'll see him at home — he simply wants to enjoy some shrimp first. Ben pulls out the marigold and pours a little into a shot glass. He downs it.

Summary:	With their powers restored, the gang embarks on a mission to find Sy Grossman's daughter. But they soon encounter hostility in a seemingly quaint town.



The episode opens with Luther waking up the following morning after the Hargreeves agreed to find Jennifer Grossman. He feels awful and chalks it up to whatever he ate at the teppanyaki restaurant. Luther arrives at the club for his shift, taking the stage as Spaceboy. Suddenly, his hangover-like illness vanishes, making way for a burst of energy. We see his body expand to look more muscular, complete with lots (and lots) of hair. Yes, Luther has his powers back.

The ladies really get into his performance. However, once Luther removes his astronaut suit, they flee at the sight of his wolf-esque appearance. Luther screams when he sees his overabundance of hair. Meanwhile, Diego notices he can perfectly toss people's mail and packages onto their respective lawns/through mail slots. Diego cheers, realizing his powers have been restored. At the CIA, Number Five examines intel on Sy Grossman when he disappears, reappearing at a subway station. In a blink, though, he returns to the CIA.

Later, Luther, Five, Diego, Viktor, Allison, Lila and Klaus meet at the Hargreeves Home for Wayward Boys. Everyone admits that they feel sick with the return of their powers. Also, how did they get back their abilities? Suddenly, Lila opens her eyes, blasting two green laser beams through the room. She's now the Cyclops of the Umbrella Academy. Luther is upset because she ruined the sconces, and he just installed those.

Ben emerges with two tentacles protruding from his back. He admits that he dosed them all with the marigold from Jennifer's belongings. We flashback to the night before at the restaurant when Ben encouraged them to take shots of sake. He secretly poured a bit of marigold in each shot. Klaus claims he feels fine; we learn that he didn't drink the sake. Klaus likes his new self. He doesn't want to ruin what he has now. Aw.

Viktor is irate and starts pummeling Ben. Ben vomits, clearly as sick as the rest. The gang decides to visit Sy's dry cleaning establishment to question him. Unfortunately, he's not there. Our heroes find a map with New Grumpson, Maine, marked on it. That could be Jennifer's location. They all decide to go on a road trip to Maine. Diego is excited as hell. Lila reminds him that they have three children, but hey, the in-laws can watch them, right?

While on the road, the fam is subjected to "Baby Shark" on a loop. Diego claims he can't change it. He's in his dad(dy) era, and I love it. Everyone is still quite sick. Suddenly, Lila, Five and Allison start vomiting in the van. Viktor's powers "explode" from him, smashing the van windows. Diego pulls over and orders his passengers to stop fighting and puking. Then, Diego tries to resist the urge to vomit. Side note: Diego initially refusing to pull over because they're "making good time" is such a dad thing.

Later that evening, Diego slaps himself on the face to stay awake while he drives. Everyone else is asleep save Five. Diego confesses to Five that he believes Lila is cheating on him. He saw her sitting in a cafe with some Greek dude with an awful mustache. Five keeps mum, refraining from admitting that it was him. He advises Diego not to blow up his life. So many people would kill for what he has — a family. Diego thanks Five for his wisdom. We see Lila open and close her eyes, having heard Diego and Five's chat.

Finally, the gang arrives in New Grumpson, Maine. Five looks up Sy and Jennifer Grossman, which doesn't bear fruit. Luther snaps a photo of his family to commemorate the trip. He's such a dad, too. Ben storms off in a huff, deciding he can't handle all of the Hargreeves together. Our crew heads into town and decides to split up to search for Jennifer.

It's Christmastime, and New Grumpson is in full holiday swing. Ben wanders into the local diner, where he meets Rosie and Gary. He isn't very friendly to Gary, the Head of the Rotary Club and New Grumpson's sheriff. Ben asks to speak to Rosie's manager, thinking she's rude. Plot twist: Rosie is the manager and owner. Having worn out his welcome, Ben storms off.

Meanwhile, Luther finds new sconces for his dilapidated home in which he's squatting (which also happens to look like his childhood home from another timeline). Allison and Viktor catch up. Allison wonders why Viktor never called her. He reminds her that a phone (and relationships) work both ways. He also acknowledges that they aren't friends anymore, and that's okay. Sometimes, friendships end.

Elsewhere, Diego throws axes to win stuffed animals for his three kids. I love Daddy Diego. Klaus, relegated to getaway driver since he doesn't have powers, sits in the van. He passes the time by drawing tarot cards. He picks up the Death card, believing it spells doom. However, that card usually means transformation, not literal death.

Then, Klaus grabs the jar of marigold from the glove compartment. He seems to contemplate partaking before shoving it back in said compartment. Later, Rosie sees Ben sitting at the bus stop outside the diner. She knocks on the window, urging him to come back inside. Ben joins her at a booth. Rosie recognizes him as the "SparrowBit" guy. Hey, Ben truly believed his crypto thingie would take off. They exchange childhood sob stories — both come from families without parents. Well, biological ones, at least. Rosie adds that Gary is her step-uncle and all she has left.

The proprietor of the antique shop, where Allison, Viktor and Luther lurk, emerges. Allison asks her if she knows Jennifer Grossman. The woman admits she doesn't before whispering in the ear of a man who approaches her. Sketchy. Meanwhile, Five tries to "blink," but he fails. No teleporting today, son. Lila thanks Five for not outing them the night before with Diego. Suspicious of Lila, Diego asks what she and Five are talking about.

However, our trio has bigger fish to fry. They notice the townsfolk won't stop staring at them. Viktor, Allison and Luther encounter the same issue. Suddenly, the denizens of New Grumpson turn on our visitors, whipping out guns and firing on them. Diego and Lila take cover while bickering over who should save the day. Lila's been having trouble summoning her laser beam eyes, so Diego believes he should be the hero. After all, his powers are more reliable.

Next, Five finally manages to blink. He returns to the subway station. Five notices the strange

symbols on the signage. Also, the announcer is speaking backward. He hops into a car. At the diner, Gary and the patrons turn on Ben. His tentacles burst out of his back. Of course, he hasn't told Rosie that he has powers. Gary urges Rosie to go with him where it's safe. However, she decides to stick with Ben.

Then, Five gets off at a subway stop and emerges from a platform that leads into New Grumpson. He notices it's the exact same location, day and time as where he was ... only he's in another timeline. Five gets back on the train.

Diego rushes out in front of the murderous New Grumpson residents. They fire on him. Diego spins through the air, the bullets ricocheting off him. Those bullets turn back on the residents, killing them. A man dressed as an elf approaches Diego from behind, his weapon raised. Thankfully, Lila lasers him in half. You always gotta one-up the spouse.

Meanwhile, a woman runs toward Klaus. He exits the van to meet her. She claims she needs him to take her someplace safe. Klaus asks the woman if she's Jennifer. She confirms this. Ben and Rosie run toward Klaus, as do Diego and Lila. All of them order Klaus to start the van. The woman turns on them, holding Rosie at gunpoint. We learn that Rosie's real name is Jennifer — she's Jennifer Grossman. Oh, and she doesn't know who Sy is. Unfortunately, the fake Jennifer shoots Klaus in the chest before holding the real Jennifer hostage.

Ben kills fake Jennifer with his tentacle as Diego shouts that Klaus is bleeding out. They carry him into the van. Then, they speed into town to pick up the others. Luther shields Viktor and Allison, taking the townfolks' bullets in the back. Five reappears beside them. Viktor releases a burst of energy to send the New Grumpson denizens flying backward. Allison's eyes flash white, as do the eyes of those attacking them. One man shoots his fellow townsfolk before shooting himself.

Suddenly, a Santa Claus with two assault rifles barrels toward them, sending bullets raining down on them. Thankfully, Diego plows him over with the van. Luther, Allison, Viktor and Five pile inside the vehicle, but not before Luther notices that all the townfolk are wearing Hargreeves gear.

Our fam sees that Klaus is dying. In a last-ditch effort to save him, Allison pours the marigold into Klaus's bullet wound. It flows into his system.

Everyone holds their breath as they wait. Thankfully, Klaus starts coughing back to life. However, he's unhappy about his family giving him the marigold without consent.

As if the Hargreeves weren't already having a bad day, Dr. Jean and Dr. Gene Thibedeau slam their car into the side of the van, sending it toppling end over end. We see the gang move in slow motion. At one point, Ben and Jennifer's hands touch, creating some kind of energy burst that looks like the marigold.

After the van stops rolling, Gene scoops up Jennifer and takes her back to his car. Jean spots Lila, who she knows as Nancy, and shakes her head. Jennifer reaches out for Ben, asking weakly for his help.

The Keepers drive away.

Summary: The group splits up to find Jennifer. Later on, they pay Reginald a visit, confronting memories that hold critical clues to their mission.



The episode opens with a news segment from 1995. Two fishermen caught a massive squid. A journalist proceeds to interview them on camera. Suddenly, a young girl, clearly Jennifer Grossman, emerges from said squid. Jennifer only mentions one thing to the journalist: "The Cleanse." How ominous. We see Reginald watching Jennifer in the background.

Later, in the present, our titular heroes stand outside Diego's busted van. Ben can't believe his new fam would botch a "simple rescue mission." Diego

asks Lila why Dr. Jean and Dr. Gene Thibedeau called her "Nancy." Lila avoids answering the question. Instead, Five reveals the Thibedeaus are the founders of the Keepers, an extremist group who believe they have memories from an alternate timeline. Ben asks what they wanted with Jennifer, but Five can't answer that.

Meanwhile, Allison notices that Klaus seems down in the dumps. He's upset because Allison gave him the marigold without his consent. That seems to be a prominent theme with Allison and her powers — consent. Klaus and Allison argue in front of the family. Then, Klaus proceeds to name everyone's issues. However, when he gets to Lila, he acknowledges that she's pretty self-actualized. Klaus pushes Allison to be honest with him. Is he just her project? Someone she can save?

During this argument, we learn that Ray left Allison. Getting Ray back was part of Allison's deal with Reginald in Season 3. Klaus makes digs at her acting work, stating that she's been struggling to get jobs. Ouch. Allison notes she's not thrilled to have a grown man living in her basement. Klaus storms off, deciding not to partake in the next step of this adventure.

Later, Diego gets his van fixed. Luther reminds Ben to check in with his parole officer. Luther also tells the group about what he saw in New Grumpson—everyone wearing Hargreeves-branded military gear. Why did Daddy Hargreeves build a town to imprison Jennifer? Viktor suggests they pursue the Keepers or talk to their father and learn what he knows. Diego, Lila and Five split to investigate Jean and Gene. Ben leaves to find Jennifer himself. Viktor, Allison and Luther decide to visit Reginald.

On their way to Jean and Gene's place, Diego confronts Lila about what he saw in that cafe the other night. She laughs loudly, realizing Diego didn't recognize his own brother. Lila reveals she and Five have been going undercover and attending Keepers meetings. Diego must be relieved she isn't having an affair; however, he's still upset that she lied about book club. Insert GIF of Jeff from Yellowjackets saying, "There's no book club?"

Meanwhile, Ben's not having a great time. He notices red scales on his forearm. They glow and pulsate. We switch scenery to a farmhouse in the middle of nowhere. Jennifer, whose forearm glows like Ben's, wakes up in a quaint bedroom.

Jean and Gene pop up with fresh clothes for her. They joke about dominant and recessive genes, which doesn't garner a chuckle from Jennifer, but it did from me. They claim they saved Jennifer from the Umbrella Academy. Gene asks if they can call anybody—mom, dad, friend. Jennifer realizes they're all gone. Jean comforts her, vowing they'll take care of her.

Then, Diego lets Viktor drive Wanda, his van, to Daddy Hargreeves' house. After that, Diego, Lila and Five search Jean and Gene's apartment. At one point, Lila grabs Five's arm, and they wind up at that peculiar subway station with the unrecognizable symbols on the signage. Five reveals how he took the subway in New Grumpson and wound up in the same place but in a different timeline. They find a map, which Lila tries to read. When that proves impossible, she drags Five onto an approaching train.

Later, Klaus breaks into Allison's house and starts scooping up items to sell. He breaks Claire's money jar and steals the cash. Claire walks in to find her Uncle Klaus in theft mode. It's sadly apparent he's started using again. Claire tries to calm him down, asking him to sit with her so they can talk. He claims it's too late for him. Then, he yells at her to move out of his way. I hate seeing Klaus like this, but damn, Robert Sheehan kills it on this episode.

Elsewhere, Diego digs through a dumpster to find something on the Thibedeaus. He sees a course letter from when Jean taught at Golden Mesa Community College. Then, he finds a file on the "Jennifer Incident," with "The Cleanse?" written on one piece of paper in pen.

Then, Lila and Five get off at one stop. Five notes their surroundings so they can track when (and where) they are. They ascend the staircase to the outside world. They discover what's left of Jean and Gene's apartment. Five remarks that this is the original timeline—his apocalypse, wherein he spent 40 years trying to survive. Five spots Delores, his mannequin partner, and himself. The other Five starts firing on Five and Lila.

Next, Lila and Five return to their timeline. Diego reveals his findings, deducing that Jennifer and Ben are inexplicably linked. Why? The file is dated October 14, 2006, the day Ben died in the original timeline. The CIA is sorely regretting not hiring Diego now. That's my lil Sherlock Holmes. Meanwhile, Ben runs into Sy Grossman, who asks if he's found Jennifer yet. Ben admits that the Keepers kidnapped Jennifer. Also, Jennifer doesn't know who Sy is.

Sy evades answering that question, instead urging Ben to find Jennifer. She's in danger. He adds that she and Ben are connected. Ben experiences flashes of memories, from young Jennifer climbing out of the squid to present-day Jennifer seeing the alpaca outside her room at the Thibedeaus' farmhouse. The red, glowing patches appear on Ben's face and on Jennifer's, who we see moments later. Jean and Gene usher her into their barn to show her the artifacts from the other timelines they've collected.

Jean and Gene insist that this is the wrong timeline. They hope the Cleanse can return them all to the original timeline. We see more Umbrella Academy figurines, a nod to dear Pogo, Hazel's mask, Viktor's white violin and more. Jean and Gene want to learn more about the Cleanse. They hope Jennifer can share what she knows about it. More than that, though, they want her to bring about the Cleanse. However, she seems bewildered by it all.

Jennifer calls them crazy, grabbing one of (presumably) Diego's knives and brandishing it. In response, the Thibedeaus unveil their grandest artifact yet: the massive, dead squid from which Jennifer emerged. She looks terrified. The Thibedeaus lock her in the barn, hoping the reminder of a traumatic time in Jennifer's life will change her mind (or jog more memories).

At the same time, Allison, Viktor and Luther head inside Reginald's home. They meet Abigail Hargreeves, who's playing the piece Viktor performed in Season 1 on the violin. Talk about a blast from the (apocalyptic) past. Abigail stops and introduces herself. She claims that Reggie has told her so much about them. Abigail invites them to sit with her while they wait for Reginald.

Next, we see Klaus levitating while sitting cross-legged. That's a new ability for him. Quinn, a dealer who's a member of the Mothers of Agony, approaches Klaus. He thought Klaus was dead, but hey, he's just floating now. Quinn reminds Klaus that the latter owes him money—40 grand, to be precise. Klaus reminds Quinn that he doesn't have that kind of cheddar. He urges Quinn to kill him, reaching for the dealer's gun himself.

Klaus slaps Quinn, angering him. He whips out his weapon and shoots Klaus in the head. However, Klaus is only dead for a few minutes before coming back to life.

Meanwhile, Abigail asks Viktor, Allison and Luther about their careers. She seems genuinely sweet. She thanks Luther for watching over her on the Moon. Then, Reginald arrives. Reggie scolds them for wreaking havoc in New Grumpson. He notices they now have their powers after Viktor almost erupts on him. Reginald claims he wasn't holding Jennifer prisoner but protecting her from the Umbrella Academy. He adds that she's nothing like them. She's more powerful than all of them combined. Even Viktor?

Next, Klaus wakes up in a strange room. He's hanging upside down, the logo for the Mothers of Agony on the floor beneath him. Quinn enters. He plans to torture Klaus for the money since he can't kill him. At the same time, Diego, Lila and Five arrive at Reggie's mansion. Diego presents the files he found at Jean and Gene's home. The gang tries to recall what they know about Ben's death. "It was a tragic accident," they all say, reciting some nothingburger of a statement. Of course, Viktor and Five weren't on the mission that day, so they don't know anything.

They confront Reggie about this. Did he tamper with their memories? Reggie admits that he's played around with that stuff in the '60s. The Reginald in the original timeline might have altered their memories. Thankfully, he has a machine that can return what was stolen.

Then, we get a diegetic moment in the episode, with Jean and Gene performing a dance routine to Cher's "Gypsies, Tramps and Thieves." Ben arrives at the farmhouse, killing all the security guards outside with his scary tentacles. He barges into the barn to free Jennifer. They crawl through a hole in the back wall while two other guards fire on them. Jean and Gene slink up behind said guards, shooting them in the head. The Thibedeaus let Jennifer escape. They claim that shooting Ben and Jennifer would've "ruined everything."

Later, Reggie sets up his memory-restoring machine, strapping in Luther, Allison, Diego and Viktor. Lila decides to spectate. She chats with Diego beforehand. He makes her promise not to keep any more secrets. She claims she wants a break from their marriage. Suddenly, Reggie switches on the machine. We see flashes of images from over the seasons. Restoring their memories will help them remember how Ben died and potentially how Jennifer is involved.

Summary:	After learning the truth about Jennifer, the crew sets out to find her and Ben. Klaus hustles to escape his plight. Five and Lila try to change the past.



The episode opens with a flashback to October 14, 2006 — Ben's death day in the original timeline. The Hargreeves siblings, who are teenagers, assemble in the sitting room of The Umbrella Academy (sans Viktor, who didn't have powers at this point). Reginald preps them on a new mission. A Moldovan arms dealer has acquired a deadly new weapon. Our titular heroes must locate the weapon in a nearby storage facility and destroy it before a deal is struck. Oh, and don't open the container.

Then, Pogo flies the team to the storage facility. Aw, I've missed him. Inside the facility, Ben installs a device to blow up the weapon. However, he finds Jennifer inside. As it turns out, Jennifer is the "deadly new weapon." Ben moves to pull her out. The skin-to-skin contact emits a reddish-yellow glow when they touch hands, like from the marigold. After Ben frees Jennifer, Reginald shoots both teens in the head. The Hargreeves siblings stand there in shock after their father kills their brother. Reggie warned them not to open the container.

Next, in the present (and alternate) timeline, Viktor, Luther, Diego and Allison emerge from the memory machine in a rage. They turn on Reggie, rightfully accosting him for what happened to Ben. They explain what they saw to Lila and Five. Reggie insists he had nothing to do with

Ben and Jennifer's murders; that was his original timeline counterpart. Abigail rushes to defend her husband.

After that, Abigail explains that it's her fault. She synthesized a new element, the essence of the universe—marigold. However, a second particle was created from that. Reggie calls it "durango." When marigold and durango interact, it causes a volatile, explosive reaction that spells the extinction of everything. That's why Reggie kept Jennifer from the Hargreeves. He hoped to avoid the apocalypse.

Unfortunately, Ben and Jennifer are together. So, it's only a matter of time before they touch. Speaking of these two lovebirds, we see them walking through the woods after Ben helped Jennifer escape the Thibedeau farmhouse. Jennifer believes they should part ways. Why? Ben has killed several people since they met 36 hours ago.

Ben claims he only murdered those people to save her. He declares that they're inexplicably connected. They should find a place to rest and talk this out. Figure out what this connection might be. Meanwhile, Luther stress eats pastries while explaining that he let Ben leave to find Jennifer. Reggie grabs his gun. It's hunting season, after all. This culminates in a confrontation between Reggie and Viktor, who glows with fiery rage. He's ready to annihilate Daddy Hargreeves with his immense powers.

Viktor lets Reggie have it — he tells the latter what a sh*tty father he is. Abigail pulls Viktor off the ledge, persuading him to calm down. Elsewhere, Klaus begins the process of paying back Quinn. Quinn is holding Klaus captive in the basement, having him run a business as a medium. He'll connect customers to their dearly departed loved ones for a hefty fee.

Quinn introduces Loretta to Klaus. Loretta wishes to commune with her late husband, Richard, aka Dick. Initially, Klaus prepares the space in the most theatrical way possible, aiming to fake the session for cash. However, the spirit of Dick genuinely appears. Klaus has still got it. And guess what? Loretta and Dick want to jump each other's bones one last time.

Klaus admits that the fleshy stuff is tricky. However, Quinn told Loretta that Klaus can provide this service. Of course, this puts Klaus in a bind. Once again, he can't truly give consent. Klaus pauses before adding that this service is 500 dollars, and the ATM is in the lobby. Later, Dick's spirit enters Klaus's body, and he and Loretta have sex.

Later, the Hargreeves siblings head to the Thibedeau farmhouse, where the CIA investigates the series of grisly murders outside (courtesy of Ben). Lila finds an arm with the inverted Umbrella tattoo (to represent "The Umbrella Effect"), so they know the Thibedeaus were here. Lila pulls Five aside and proposes they hop on the latter's time choo-choo, go back to the original timeline and stop the impending apocalypse. They'd have to return to the original "Jennifer Incident" and prevent Ben from interacting with her. Easy peasy, lemon squeezy.

Five reluctantly agrees to this idea. Diego wanders over, asking to speak with Lila alone. Diego addresses her remark about them taking a break. He wonders if she loves him anymore. Lila clearly does, but she needs a break from him. Diego complains about his job day in and day out, and she's tired of it. "If you're not in it, then what's the point?" she asks.

Next, Five asks his boss to give Diego and Luther a tour of the CIA headquarters. His boss wants Five to solve the case of the "Texas Tentacled Massacre." So, in exchange for Five's absolute focus, he'd like his boss to keep an eye on his brothers. The CIA boss reluctantly agrees to these terms.

Meanwhile, at Reg King, this universe's answer to Burger King, Jean and Gene pull into the drive-thru. Jean recites a passcode to the drive-thru employee. After asking Jean to drive to the next window, the employee asks Jean a peculiar question, which she answers with a riddle-like response. Then, the Reg King gives its customers the boot, transforming into the Keepers' headquarters.

Then, Allison calls Claire to ask about Klaus. When she arrives home, Claire encourages her to "look at her side of the street." If Klaus is so sick, why does Allison keep letting him back into her life? It's time for Allison to take care of herself.

Speaking of Klaus, our new medium informs Quinn that he made quite a bit of money from his first customer. Klaus should be able to pay Quinn back in no time. Quinn takes the cash and counts, allotting specific portions to rent, food, etc. Klaus doesn't get back a dime.

Later, Sy Grossman introduces himself to Jean and Gene as Denny Muntz from the Red Deer chapter. He wants their help. Denny claims he wants to discuss Jennifer, who the Thibedeaus are currently trying to track. Meanwhile, Ben and Jennifer find a motel in which to stay. They

sit in separate, neighboring rooms. They talk to each other through the wall. Ben admits he has intense feelings for Jennifer. He's never felt this way about anyone. Jennifer confesses the feeling is mutual.

Jennifer tells him about being pulled out of a squid in 1995. Ben feels it must be fate — he has tentacles for powers. Ben takes this as a sign that they're meant to be together. Ah, the yearning.

Elsewhere, Lila and Five arrive at the timeline-hopping subway station. They plan to take the train to the original apocalyptic timeline and then warp back to 2006 to curb the Jennifer Incident. Lila finds a map before a train pulls into the station.

After this, we see Loretta return to Klaus for round two. Klaus tries to call upon Dick, whose spirit leaps into Klaus's body again. Loretta isn't as friendly this time. She asks Dick about the money. Where is it? Loretta grabs the family jewels and squeezes. After Dick departs, Klaus sees a vision of where Dick's fortune lies. Loretta doesn't know this yet and claims she isn't paying for this session.

Klaus states he'll tell her where Dick's money is hidden if she promises to help him escape. Loretta agrees to this. Klaus orders her to give him her brooch first. She doesn't, but when Quinn pounds on the door, Klaus discloses that the fortune is stashed in the First National Bank of Zurich. The password is "Thunderbolt." Loretta hands over the brooch.

Next, Luther and Diego arrive at the CIA headquarters in their finest suits. Diego has a pep in his step again. In the original timeline, Five and Lila wade through the apocalyptic wasteland. Five spots Delores. They blink to October 14, 2006, before the other Five arrives to fire on them. Five verifies they have landed on the correct date.

However, something is amiss. Lila and Five spot members of the Umbrella Academy and the Sparrow Academy marching forward together for the mission. They learn they're in the Phoenix Academy. So, this isn't the right timeline. Five and Lila teleport to the subway station. Lila consults the map as another train arrives. They hop onto it.

Meanwhile, Klaus utilizes Loretta's brooch to escape his prison. He makes a beeline for the cemetery. Klaus digs up the grave of Dick's beloved dog, Thunderbolt. There, he finds a bag filled with cash. Jackpot! Unfortunately, Loretta and her crew arrive, guns raised. Loretta knew Klaus was lying, so she watched him flee the Mothers of Agony and tailed him. Klaus tries to negotiate a finder's fee for him, but she wants all the money.

Before she can shoot Klaus, though, Quinn enters the scene. Klaus ducks into the open grave as a shootout commences. He emerges in the aftermath to find everyone dead. Well ... except Quinn. Quinn grabs him and takes the money. This will cover Klaus's debt.

Quinn punches Klaus, who falls into the empty wooden coffin. The door inadvertently closes, locking him inside. Quinn proceeds to bury Klaus alive. If I had a nickel for every time a Robert Sheehan character was buried alive, I'd have two nickels. Which isn't a lot, but it's weird that it happened twice. Save me, Barry!

Viktor and Reggie have dinner together. Viktor shares his plan — he can remove Ben's marigold. He's done it before. Reggie assumes this doesn't come without risks. He wonders why Viktor would want to help his siblings. They all seem to hate one another. Viktor admits they quarrel a lot, but they'll do anything for each other when the chips are down.

Then, Jennifer barges into Ben's room and starts kissing him. The hot and heavy makeout sesh turns into sex. Naturally, Ben's marigold and Jennifer's durango collide, creating an Earth-shattering, explosive reaction. The front desk employee projectile vomits black liquid. He falls back into his seat, his eyes two black pits. The black liquid oozes from his eyes and mouth. He's dead.

The episode opens with Lila and Number Five on the timeline-hopping subway train. A montage plays out, featuring the duo hitting every timeline spot on the confusing map Lila found a few episodes ago. Years pass as the pair fails to find the original timeline for October 14, 2006, the day of OG Ben's death and infamous "Jennifer Incident." Then, we see six years have passed. Five and Lila have grown closer during this ordeal.

Meanwhile, in the AU timeline, Klaus lies in Thunderbolt's wooden coffin after

Quinn buries him. He flicks on his lighter. He uses it to find the secret stash of drugs in his boot. Hey, you might as well pass the time somehow.

Next, Viktor and Reginald take a little father-son road trip to find Ben and Jennifer. They quietly fight over who controls the radio, as family does. Reggie doubts they can locate Ben in time to remove his marigold. The Cleanse is inevitable at this point. They arrive at the motel in which Ben and Jennifer stayed. Viktor and Reggie see dead birds on the ground and the black liquid-covered, dead front desk employee. Reggie states that the Cleanse is already in action.

Later, Ben and Jennifer stop at a gas station. They makeout a lot. Ben believes they should hightail it out of here — maybe someplace warm, like Miami. Ben admits he has money stashed

in the Caymans that the feds didn't seize. He also proposes marriage. Damn, after one roll in the hay? He's got it bad, folks. Ben leaves the car to get gas. Someone watching them in Reggie's employ informs the latter that he's got eyes on the two runaways.

So, Viktor calls the pay phone at the gas station. He urges Ben to listen to him. Viktor tells Ben to get as far away from Jennifer as possible. Otherwise, the world will end in 24 hours. Of course, Ben ignores his brother's pleas and hangs up the phone.

Later, CIA Deputy Director Ribbons shows Diego and Luther around the CIA per Five's wishes. Ribbons takes them to the bottom floor, where all the formerly good agents are put to pasture. Diego is convinced this is Covert Ops, but Luther knows what this is: legs and eggs. He compares it to when his boss moved him to Sunday brunch at the club. That's where the "bad" dancers go. Legs and eggs, folks.

Then, Lila and Five eat their zillionth cooked subway rat. They've gone to the ends of the Earth, timelines-wise, to find the right October 14, 2006. Unfortunately, they've come up short. Five proposes they take a few days of respite at that greenhouse in the peaceful timeline. Lila asserts this isn't them giving up, but she would strangle a kitten for a hot bath. She agrees to the idea.

Meanwhile, at Reg King, Jean, Gene and Denny sit together and chat about Ben and Jennifer. Denny knows the Thibedeaus lost them, but that's okay. He has people hunting down the duo. Denny adds that Ben is the missing piece of the puzzle — he's the lock; Jennifer's the key. However, Ben also has a family; if they find the pair before the Keepers, the latter are in trouble.

Next, while buried alive, Klaus encounters the ghost of Thunderbolt, Dick's precious dog. He urges Thunderbolt to find a human above ground to help him escape. Elsewhere, Allison and Claire search for Klaus. Sure, he gives Allison grief, but he's her brother. They stumble upon the Mothers of Agony headquarters. Allison uses her updated powers to knock the door down — literally. Inside, she locates Klaus's old quarters, where he worked as a medium. Quinn barges in.

Quinn wants Allison to replace Klaus after seeing she, too, has powers. He strikes her so hard on the head she must have (at least) a minor concussion. Thankfully, Allison gains the upper hand, using her telekinesis to throw him against the wall. She orders Quinn to tell her of Klaus's whereabouts. When Quinn resists, Allison uses her mind to squeeze his family jewels so hard that they burst. Ouch. Also, he deserves it.

At the same time, Diego learns the truth about where Ribbons put him and Luther. It's a pencil-pushing job, not Covert Ops. Legs and eggs, baby. He tries to call Lila's family to speak to her; however, he learns she's not with her family. Speaking of Lila, we see her with Five in the greenhouse. They've been there for a while now. After some flirting, they kiss. Ugh. This moment. I felt the narrative building to this point, but I still despise it. Lila and Diego are so good together. Plus, the real-life age gap is off-putting, to say the least.

Later, at Reg King, Gene pulls Denny aside and orders him to leave. Denny's getting too close to Jean. Gene even points a pistol at Denny. Sure enough, his threatening is successful: Denny departs.

Next, Luther snoops around the CIA for files on the Keepers. Once inside an office, he starts rummaging through filing cabinets. Unfortunately, Luther breaks a few of those cabinets due to his inordinate strength. Ribbons confronts Luther after finding the latter in search mode. We see an inverted umbrella tattooed on his wrist. Ribbons is a Keeper. Ribbons escorts Luther to the bottom floor, but on the elevator, he sends them up. Some agents get on with them and proceed to attack Luther.

Thankfully, by the time Luther arrives on the bottom floor, he's prevailed, beating the snot out of said agents. An injured Ribbons calls for backup. Diego and Luther fight off the horde as the backup barges into the room. As expected, Diego boasts a tearaway suit he borrowed from Luther, our favorite professional dancer. This moment cracks me up. Luther is also free of his tearaway pants. They successfully defeat the CIA agents, proving they'd be more than capable on the field. (Of course, not without the help of the office-bound former agents and a good needle drop.)

Later, Five returns from the outside with a gift for Lila: a bracelet. She loves it. At the same time, Ben and Jennifer are bound for Florida. Jennifer isn't looking so hot. She's hearing a resonance frequency, and the red, glowing patches intermittently pop up on her face. Five scours the subway station for more clues that could lead to the original October 14, 2006. He discovers

a journal he wrote (although he doesn't remember/hasn't done it yet). The journal contains codes and the key to finding the correct timeline and getting home. However, when Lila arrives at the station, Five pockets the journal, keeping it from her.

Next, Allison and Claire arrive at the pet cemetery where Klaus is buried. Klaus starts banging on the lid to indicate his location. Allison hears a dog barking (Thunderbolt's ghost). The pair finds Thunderbolt's grave, and Allison starts digging. Finally, Klaus punches through the wooden lid and emerges into the sunlight. He embraces Allison and Claire. As they leave, he thanks Thunderbolt's spirit for his assistance.

While Lila and Five have dinner (more strawberries!), he finally shows her the journal. Five confesses he's kept it from her for five months. Lila realizes this is the key to getting home. Lila prepares to leave. Five tries to persuade her to stay, claiming there might not be a home to go to. The Cleanse could've wiped everything out for all they know. Lila believes their romance is a mistake. After all, she's married to his brother with three kids. What they did resulted from abject loneliness after being stuck together for six years. Lila tells Five he can stay, but she's going home.

Then, Viktor and Reggie stop after spotting two overturned, burning vehicles blocking their path. Suddenly, they're beset by, presumably, Keepers from the Thibedeaus (or Denny's crew). Viktor orders Reggie to head to their car. He uses his explosive powers to fight off their attackers. At one point, Viktor takes a bullet in the arm. He scrambles back to the car after blasting away the baddies. More enemies fire on them, but our duo speeds away. Reggie compliments Viktor, stating the latter is more of a hero than his siblings. OG Reggie was wrong to mistreat Viktor. Aw. Viktor's healing his daddy trauma.

Elsewhere, Ben pulls up to a department store and helps Jennifer inside so she can lie down. An agent of the Keepers reports on their location to the Thibedeaus. Ben tries to call for an ambulance, but Jennifer vanishes into a fitting room. He lies down on a cushion with her. They embrace. Jennifer tearfully admits she's scared as the red, glowing patches resurface on her face. Ben's face also glows similarly.

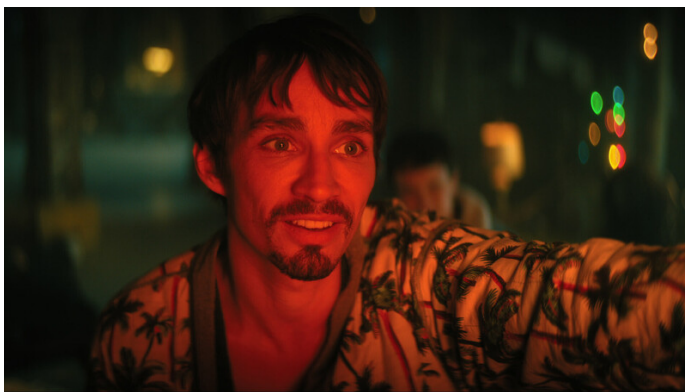
Later, Gene grabs his gun when he sees Denny return to Reg King. However, before Gene can fire on Denny, Denny stabs him with a tentacle. Denny's face vanishes, and Abigail Hargreeves appears in its place. She's been Denny this whole time. After killing Gene, Abigail takes on his face. Fake Gene heads inside with mint chocolate chip ice cream. Jean admits her surprise — typically, mint chocolate chip gives Gene the runs.

Next, the Keeper/Reg King employee discloses that one of their teams has found Ben and Jennifer. Gene tells Jean, "It's time to put out the call." Jean orders the RK employee to "play the song." How ominous.

Summary: With Ben and Jennifer in peril and the Cleanse underway, the family unites for one last fight to save the world—and end the infinite devastation.



The episode opens with Dr. Jean and Gene Thibodeau in Reg King, giving the okay to play the song to rally the Keepers. As it turns out, it's a Muse song. Regular folks near and wide grab weaponry and congregate outside the department store where Ben and Jennifer hide. The Thibedeaus deliver a motivating speech to the masses as they show off their Umbrella Effect tattoos. They plan to protect Ben and Jennifer so the Cleanse can go off without a hitch. We see Ben's eye poke through a hole in a wall, watching the

growing crowd.

Viktor and Reggie arrive on the scene. Viktor believes they should talk to the Thibedeaus first before getting to Ben. Meanwhile, Diego and Luther get off a bus near Diego and Lila's home after their battle at the CIA. They congratulate each other on a job well done. They kicked ass. I love

my two adorable idiots who share one brain cell. That said, they did put those Keepers in their place.

Diego reunites with his kids while Lila's parents help Luther find clothes. Elsewhere, Viktor and Reggie try to talk sense into Jean and Gene. Gene starts taking digs at Reggie — personal ones, at that. Of course, we know Gene is really Abigail in disguise. When the Thibedeaus refuse to spare Ben from the inevitable Cleanse, Viktor resorts to Plan B. After that conversation, Jean scolds Gene for losing his cool with Reggie and Viktor. Gene turns on Jean, killing her. He insists to the crowd that Jean wasn't committed to their plan. What a sad underuse of Megan Mullally.

Later, Lila and Five arrive at Diego and Lila's home. Lila is nervous about reuniting with her family. Diego opens the door and embraces Lila, stating that he missed her. Diego insists that things will change from now on. He'll do better. Lila embraces her children — perhaps a little too hard. Of course, they don't know she spent seven years bouncing between alternate timelines with Five.

Allison, Klaus and Claire arrive for Christmas. Lila eagerly embraces everyone, naturally confusing them. Meanwhile, Viktor and Reggie learn that Gene killed Jean. Reggie states that Viktor's plan failed, so he urges one of his security team to shoot Ben. Viktor counters that he saved Reggie's life earlier. He owes Viktor the chance to talk to Ben. Reggie gives Viktor 15 minutes. Viktor claims he needs a Sharpie and a tire iron.

Next, we see Viktor with a drawn-on inverted umbrella tattoo. The tire iron is supposed to be a weapon, of course. He pretends to be one of the Keepers. However, Viktor sneaks into an alley nearby when the crowd doesn't let him into the department store to use the bathroom. Someone catches Viktor attempting to climb through a department store window, so he uses his powers to blow their head off. Once inside, Viktor sees Ben, now a red glowing blob, and Jennifer, who looks the same.

Later, at the Hargreeves-Pitts house, Luther reveals the intel he learned at the CIA—Five's boss is a Keeper, as is some of his team. Five seems unconcerned. The gang notices how quiet Five is. When Five does speak, it's to trash-talk Diego. The pair starts to bicker, but Lila defuses the situation. That's when Diego notices Lila's bracelet, remarking that she doesn't like bracelets. He asks Five if the latter gave it to Lila. Five admits that he made it for her.

Lila explains they were bouncing between the same moments on alternate timelines, trying to find their way home. They were stuck like this for seven years. Thinking they'd never go home, they turned to each other. Luther, Allison and Klaus watch this drama unfold like they should have popcorn in front of them. It's hilarious. However, before Diego can truly process that his wife and brother had an affair, the gang sees Ben on the news. They also notice the mob of Keepers with weapons guarding the department store.

Then, Viktor tries to talk sense into Ben. Ben and Jennifer's physical connection will destroy the world. Ben needs to get away from her, but he insists he must protect Jennifer. He knocks Viktor unconscious. Meanwhile, our titular heroes barrel toward the department store in Diego's van, Wanda. "Baby Shark," everyone's favorite song, plays as Diego tries to pull the van into an alley. Unfortunately, the brakes aren't working. When the mob spots the Hargreeves, they open fire.

Lila persuades Five to teleport them all into the department store. Once he does this, they reunite with Viktor. Viktor touches Ben, attempting to use his powers to draw the durango (the element from Jennifer) out of Ben. Viktor has a vision of a picturesque, utopian-like park. Jennifer reaches out behind Ben and tries to touch him. At the same time, Reggie and his shooter have a clear view of Ben. Reggie dithers about taking the shot.

Finally, he orders his man to shoot Ben. We see the bullet whizz through the air in slow motion. It looks like it's about to hit Viktor, but Ben pushes his brother out of the way, taking the bullet in the chest. Jennifer cradles Ben, who looks like he might die. However, she absorbs Ben into her body, which seemingly revives him. They morph together to form a massive red blob, emitting the glow of both the marigold and the durango.

The Keepers outside realize the Cleanse is already underway. Five blinks himself and Lila to the upper level of the store. He urges her to use her laser eyes to blow up the tanks beside Ben/Jennifer (Bennifer!). She does this, but it causes little damage. Allison drags an unconscious Viktor behind a counter. Klaus flies himself and Luther upstairs. He can fly now. Allison tries to take on Bennifer, but they push her away. Debris falls on top of her.

Oh, and what are Diego and Five doing now, you ask? Fighting over Lila. Diego proceeds to

pummel Five, and rightfully so. Luther tries to be the hero by punching Bennifer, but his hand gets stuck in their ass. Regardless, Bennifer is the Cleanse, so yeah, that's happening. Anyway, Lila can still mimic people's powers, so she and Viktor shoot light beams at Bennifer so Luther can free his hand.

Bennifer grows large enough to burst through the building. Like Godzilla, the blob destroys the department store as it moves through the town, crushing people under its feet. Gene sits beside Reggie on the bench. Reggie realizes it's over. Gene removes his face to reveal Abigail. It was Abigail all along. She thwarted Reggie's efforts to keep Jennifer away from the Hargreeves siblings. Why? Because the Cleanse is good. They need it to happen for reasons. Reggie compliments his wife on a job well done as Bennifer eats them.

Meanwhile, Five blinks out of the store, leaving his siblings behind. The gang finds Allison is still alive, so they scoop her up and retreat to a safe place to brainstorm their next move. Five sits on the timeline-hopping subway, looking emo. He gets off at a stop and sees another version of himself. Five follows the other Five to a '50s-style diner. Inside, Five sees that said diner is occupied by other Fives.

So, Five sits with himself and asks what all this is about. This goes back to 1989. The marigold infected the Hargreeves' birth mothers. Then, when they were born, the original timeline shattered into multiple alternate timelines. Those timelines aren't supposed to exist. That's why one Five created the Commission — to clean up the other timelines and restore everything to the original timeline.

Anyway, the Hargreeves are doomed to avert the apocalypse and save the world in every timeline in perpetuity. When they save one timeline and wind up in another, the cycle repeats. All these Fives have traveled the timeline-hopping train, hoping to find answers to fix this infinite loop. However, there's only one true solution to all this.

Next, Five reunites with his siblings at the dilapidated Hargreeves Home for Wayward Boys. He relays what he learned from the Fives at the diner. The only remedy to this problem is for them to merge with Bennifer. Their marigold will cancel out the durango. They must rid the world of the marigold — that's how they break the cycle, destroy the alternate timelines and return to the original one. Unfortunately, if the Hargreeves merge with Bennifer, they'll cease to exist. Nobody will remember them.

Naturally, everybody hates this solution. Diego orders Lila to get their children and family onto the timeline-hopping subway. Allison urges Claire to join them. She and Klaus bid farewell to her daughter. Admittedly, this moment made me weepy. Luther notes that Lila will need to merge with Bennifer, too. She has marigold inside her. Otherwise, the cycle will repeat itself. Diego counters that it's Lila's decision. Lila leaves with her family, mimicking Five's teleportation powers.

Five arrives at the station to persuade her to return home. When you think she plans to get on the train with her family and Claire, she hops off as the doors close. Lila promises her children she'll see them soon. As the train speeds off, Lila collapses in Five's arms, sobbing.

Then, Lila and Five reunite with the others. It's somewhat fitting that our heroes meet their demise in the place where it all started — the Umbrella Academy. We see Bennifer, aka the Cleanse, wreaking havoc outside, destroying buildings and rampaging.

Luther, Diego, Allison, Klaus, Five, Viktor and Lila stand in a circle as Bennifer looms above the building. The Cleanse breaks through the ceiling, looking like gooey red lava. Lila apologizes to Diego, who forgives her. Everyone tries to mend fences—well, except for Diego and Five. They're essentially marching toward their deaths without making up, which I despise. Klaus tells his family he loves them, but they're all a**holes.

We see the marigold glowing inside each Hargreeves sibling as the Cleanse consumes them, climbing up their bodies until we can't see them anymore. They've become one with Bennifer.

After this, we see the picturesque park Ben tried to show Viktor. It's the original timeline without the Hargreeves and the marigold. We see familiar faces: Grace with a baby, The Handler on the phone, Hazel walking with Agnes, Herb and The Swedes. Diego and Lila's children, Allison's daughter and Lila's family. Some narration explains that August 8, 2024, was a perfectly ordinary day where nothing bad happened.

The Hargreeves never existed.

In a post-credit scene, marigolds blossom underneath a tree, emitting golden spores of energy from their petals.
