

The episode starts with us whisked away to this magical world, where we're updated on the story thus far. It starts with a recap of the Willow movie, with Sorsha pointing out that they managed to free the Kingdom from its curse and they all lived happily ever after... or did they? Unfortunately, Willow ended up having a vision about an ancient evil arriving and destroying the future Empress. In doing so, this is supposed to herald in a new dark age. So they hid Elora away, her true identity concealed — even from herself.

And so we start our new tale with two women fighting atop a cliffside, dueling. Kit is arrogant and claims how amazing she is after besting her training partner, Jade, going on to mention how she wants to explore the world and adventure. However, as the day is drawing on, she heads back to the palace. Whilst there, she reunites with her brother Airk, who has a reputation for being a player. He's been having a fling with the kitchen maid, aptly nicknamed Dove, but he can't even remember her name.

Kit is not happy about having to take orders from her mother, including wearing a nice gown for the ball. She scoffs at her, claiming she's not six anymore, but gets dressed all the same despite how uncomfortable she obviously is. Jade is also dressed up but she's only doing it for her friend.

At dinner, the pair gossip about Graydon Hatur, the Prince of Galladoorn. There used to be two Princes but one fell out a tree. The GUY left behind is the one Kit is destined to marry. Graydon's father is slightly arrogant though, which is the direct opposite of Graydon, who happens to be rather dull.

Sorsha steps up and gives a big speech, pointing out they've maintained a peace between Tir Asleen and Galladoorn for now but that's about to be taken to the next level. The Prince and Kit

are about to be wed and in doing so, would fully unite both realms. It's a great political move but Sorsha is not happy about her daughter being forced into a loveless marriage but knows there's no other way.

Things for Kit are made worse by Jade revealing that she's leaving. Specifically, she's been recruited to train as a Knight of Galladoorn at the Shining Legion. She's heading south after Kit's wedding. Annoyed, Kit immediately tries to break the peace between the two realms and confronts the Prince. Kit points out she wants to make her own choices and even holds the Prince up at knifepoint.

Sorsha immediately takes her aside and points out what a petulant child she is. Thankfully, Airk shows up and deflects the attention away from her, with Sorsha calling him useless. Late at night, Kit decides to leave the realm completely and step out beyond the barrier. She kisses Jade and tells her she's going to be a great Knight before heading off.

However, just before she does a fog descends over the entire realm as dogs attack, followed by a monstrous troll. With the Kingdom under attack from these creatures, a foul voice on the air suddenly causes the creatures to stop attacking and leave. According to Graydon, a hawk showed up and took Prince Airk away. Sure would have been nice to see that on-screen though!

Kit decides to leave and search for Airk by heading west. It seems the wedding has been put on hold for now. Sorsha allows this to happen, with Thexus leading the party forward, Jade in attendance as a knight in everything but title, and several others including the Prince of Galladoorn and the released prisoner Boorman. They also need a sorcerer too.

As the group set out to track down Willow, marching across the beautiful countryside on horses, they're followed by Dove, who wants to find Airk, believing it's true love. Kit and Jade immediately scoff at this but she manages to prove her worth as a cook for the party.

In the morning, the party set off and find more trouble. While Dove attempts to go it alone, trying to cross a fallen log to the other side of a chasm (which she's successful in doing), she comes face to face with the magical barrier protecting the realm. She steps forward and through to the other side, and away from the protection she once had.

Meanwhile, the rest of the party find her in the distance and eventually catch up. Unfortunately, Bone Reavers arrive and kill one of their own (not Kit, unfortunately) firing arrows at the group. They manage to make it to safety, inexplicably jumping off a chasm and using the ancient phrase "Hsu-Gala" (which means stop) to make it to the bottom of a cliff-face and to the other side of this shallow sea.

Kit learns a bit of humility when they get dry and continue on, as Graydon accepts Kit's apology for being so hard on him originally. Kit shows up along with the others to the Nelwyn village and find Willow, who points out that Airk is still alive. Furthermore, he's been taken by the Gales and is a prisoner of the Withered Crone.

The four who showed up at Tir Asleen actually happen to be the Crone's servants, explaining their presence. However, the Crone is situated beyond the Shattered Sea and they need to travel further than they ever have before. However, it turns out Kit is not actually the Chosen One as we expected. She's not Elora.

The Chosen One is actually Dove! She's the future Empress and High Priestess, and the last hope against the evil!

The episode starts with a flashback showing Willow returning to see Sorsha, pointing out the barrier cannot keep their enemies out forever. And of course we know that, given they came through and attacked last episode.

Anyway, the crux of the issue here stems from Madmartigan's quest. Sorsha sent him out a while back as they found a clue in the ancient scrolls regarding the whereabouts of the Kymerian Cuirass. He rode out with a squire 9 days ago but since then, hasn't been heard from. Ap-

parently, only Elora can defeat the Crone and Willow wants to train her. Sorsha though is quick to dispel his confidence, telling him he's not a great sorcerer... and never will be.

With it now revealed that Dove is Elora, we jump back to the present as she's introduced to Mims, Willow's daughter, along with all the other villagers in Nelwyn. Of course, Kit is not happy and isn't in the mood to open her mind and learn more about these people, obnoxiously claiming she doesn't care about this and only cares about Airk.

Kit wants this expedition to be moved up, while Willow intends to try and train Elora. Given she's the Chosen One, the Nelwyns want her to do the "Finger Test".

When Elora fails, we cut to Kit who smiles in a satisfied way. Elora also doesn't want to stick around though, believing time is of the essence and wanting to find Airk.

Meanwhile, Sorsha keeps Elora's identity a secret but unfortunately the Crone has already made her move. Given the Lich (that magical creature we saw last episode) has stabbed Ballantine, he's controlled and sent out to track down Elora. Ballantine soon shows his true evil and strikes out at the others in his party.

With evil stirring and making their move, Mims convinces her father to follow Elora and keep her safe, showing off a sorcerer's wand. At the same time, we cut across to Kit, who's not best pleased about Elora being the Chosen One. Now that she's not the most special person in the room, she's got the hump. In fact, she proposes that Willow planted the mark on her arm. Jade does put Kit in her place, telling the arrogant, petulant child to do what she wants while the others try to find Elora. As Kit rides off, Elora is found down by the river. Willow finds her first and realizes she's afraid. Eventually the pair come to an agreement to head over to Immemorial City beyond the Shattered Sea.

While the caravan head out, they catch up with Kit who's still not humble, isn't called out for her behaviour beyond Willow's put-down and she hasn't even apologised for abandoning everyone either. She looks utterly bored when Willow brings up the lifeforce in the world and how there's magic around them too.

There's some amusing dialogue as Elora attempts to practice the incantations but the more they do it, the further away from the exact words she gets.

Ballantine shows up at Nelwyn and immediately asks where the caravan is. Mims lies and claims they've gone back to Tir Asleen, but wagon tracks lets them down. Ballantine immediately heads back out again on the ride, intent on tracking them down.

Unfortunately, time is of the Essence as Elora is still struggling to conjure any of her magic. Kit believes it's a waste of time and she questions why they're even doing this. Graydon however, is much more accepting and sits with Elora in confidence. She points out that she's ordinary and nothing special. Graydon is quick to scoff at that, claiming that she's actually extraordinary but she's just not seeing it.

This bit of moral guidance allows Elora to properly focus and say the words over and over again. That is, until she's knocked out and taken by Ballantine who appears out of nowhere. However, in her place happens to sprout a plant. It seems the magic was a success after all!

Meanwhile, an unawares Willow tells Silas that his vision is a horrifying one, something that sees him wake up on a battlefield with Elora dead. Willow points out that the only way to save the world is for Elora to die. But can fate be changed?

The episode starts with Boorman telling a story to Kit about Thuul, the Rightful King of Kymeria, riding out of the city gates to meet his tyrant brother and 2000 Death Dealers. However, Kit rudely interrupts and calls this story boring.

The group soon realize that Elora has been taken, and the group head out to try and find her. It's Jade who finds Ballantine, who has tied up Elora to the back of his horse. She knows he's not himself but just before they fight, Willow arrives and puts a stop to this. That is, until a whole

bunch of soldiers appear and help out Ballantine. Willow eventually gets involved and tries to use his magic but it's not enough, Elora is taken away and they all disappear.

As the caravan ride on, a big storm in the distance begins brewing, with the Crone's voice on the wind. Silas ends up getting stabbed and passes away, prompting Willow to get involved and use his magic to ward off their foes. Unfortunately, Graydon has actually been stabbed in the skirmish and it appears he's on the verge of being turned. As they continue on, Nockmaar happens to be in the distance, and the episode ends with an absolutely atrocious female vocal version of Enter Sandman by Metallica.

The episode starts with our motley group arriving at Nockmaar. Willow warns that thy need to keep their wits about them, given it plays host to the most brutal tyrant of her age, Bavmorda. Apparently this is Kit's grandmother, which could go some way to explain why she's so evil and despicable in this series.

The group hide out at this cursed castle, with Graydon becoming weaker by the minute. Willow warns that in the small hours of the night he's going to lose control, while Kit suggests they do "what

must be done." In her words, killing him. Elora pleads with Willow to do something to prevent this. Well, he may have just the solution — the Malatrium. This happens to be a special book and as they look over it, they just so happen to uncover a spell that's dangerous and could be just the alchemic solution needed. However, they need to be careful not to touch Graydon or get infected. Oh, and to stay out of the High Tower too.

Kit complains the whole time — about fetching the ingredients, about doing something for others, and potentially killing Graydon. When Kit eventually walks back down, with a jar in hand, she ends up distracted by The Crone's voice, which echoes through her head. She ends up burning a banner up on the wall but eventually makes it back into the main chamber with what's needed.

Jade's also complaining too this episode, standing with Boorman up on the castle rafters. She bemoans how difficult it is being a knight and how her dream isn't exactly how she expected it to be. Boorman gives some solid advice, and in fact it prompts Jade to hug him.

After, all our characters end up separated inside the castle, with Jade seeing frightening visions of her own, along with a skull-faced knight — General Kael — coming at her. Elora also sees visions, seeing ghostly apparitions depicting her mother being killed by a knight.

When she heads back into the main chamber, he finds a sickly Graydon up and about, claiming that he's never been stronger but he's still possessed. Willow shows and berates her for heading into the High Tower. However, a possessed Graydon points out that Willow didn't defeat him alone, and as Kit and the others burst into the room, Boorman begins hitting Graydon after Willow blasts him with magic.

Instead of killing him though, Elora decides to suck the evil out of Graydon, lying above the Prince and taking the evil energy out of him. It passes through Elora and seems to float away. However, she also sees a vision of Graydon becoming possessed and pushing his brother out of a tree.

With the gang surviving the night and Graydon back on the mend, the group head off and continue on their journey to the Immemorial City. The episode begins with Airk being encouraged by The Crone to come and join him. Instead, he nopes out of there and decides to leave. However, he finds himself staring at an endless desert. Despite that, he walks on and tries to find a way back to the Kingdom.

While Airk is just lackadaisically captured, the same can't be said for Willow and Kit. After the surprise Troll attack out of nowhere last episode, the pair find themselves being taken to their labyrinthian home, complete with hang-

ing cages and rooms carved out the side of the rock.

Willow and Kit have been separated from the others, where they learn that Christian Slater is actually playing Allagash, Madmartigan's friend who knows where Madmartigan is. Two Trolls show up who evidently don't know out characters, especially when they call Kit "nice". Inexplicably, it seems the other Trolls didn't bother with the rest of our motley band of misfits, who happen to be outside staring up at their headquarters.

One of the Trolls, going by the name of Lord Sarris, shows up to see Kit, who cracks jokes while sitting in a torture chair. They're actually after Elora, but of course if they'd actually done their due diligence at the party, they would have found her nearby. Anyway, they needn't worry too much because she's actually inside the Troll City, Skellin, now working their way past the very, very light security.

Elora's wand goes a bit haywire, enticing the Trolls to come and show up, while Scorpia decides to leave, realizing Jade has her own family now so she doesn't need to stay with the Bone Reavers anymore. At the same time, Kit and Allagash manage to free themselves, given the Trolls just left them all alone.

Elora loses her wand in the process of navigating a wobbly wooden pathway while Kit's group decide to try and find Madmartigan. Allagash gave the wrong name on purpose to keep the Trolls from looking for the real hero.

Eventually the two sets of characters end up reunited together, with none of the particularly bothered that Graydon is down in the lower levels. Allagash and Boorman end up fighting until Kit jumps in and stops Boorman. The group find a secret doorway leading to a riddle, which Elora solves. In doing so, they end up finding a treasure room full of trinkets which Boorman and Allagash fight over. As for Kit, she heads in and finds a sword. She hears Madmartigan's voice, asking for help. However, the whole place starts to come down.

Allagash has gone, having taken the Lux with him. And I may add, through this entire scene no one has even bothered to ask about Graydon. Thankfully, Graydon helps himself and he reunites with the others with absolutely no aplomb. No one even bats an eyelid that he just shows up, while our group fight off the Trolls and kill them. We haven't had much of insufferable Kit today so of course she makes it up to us late on, when she confronts Elora.
