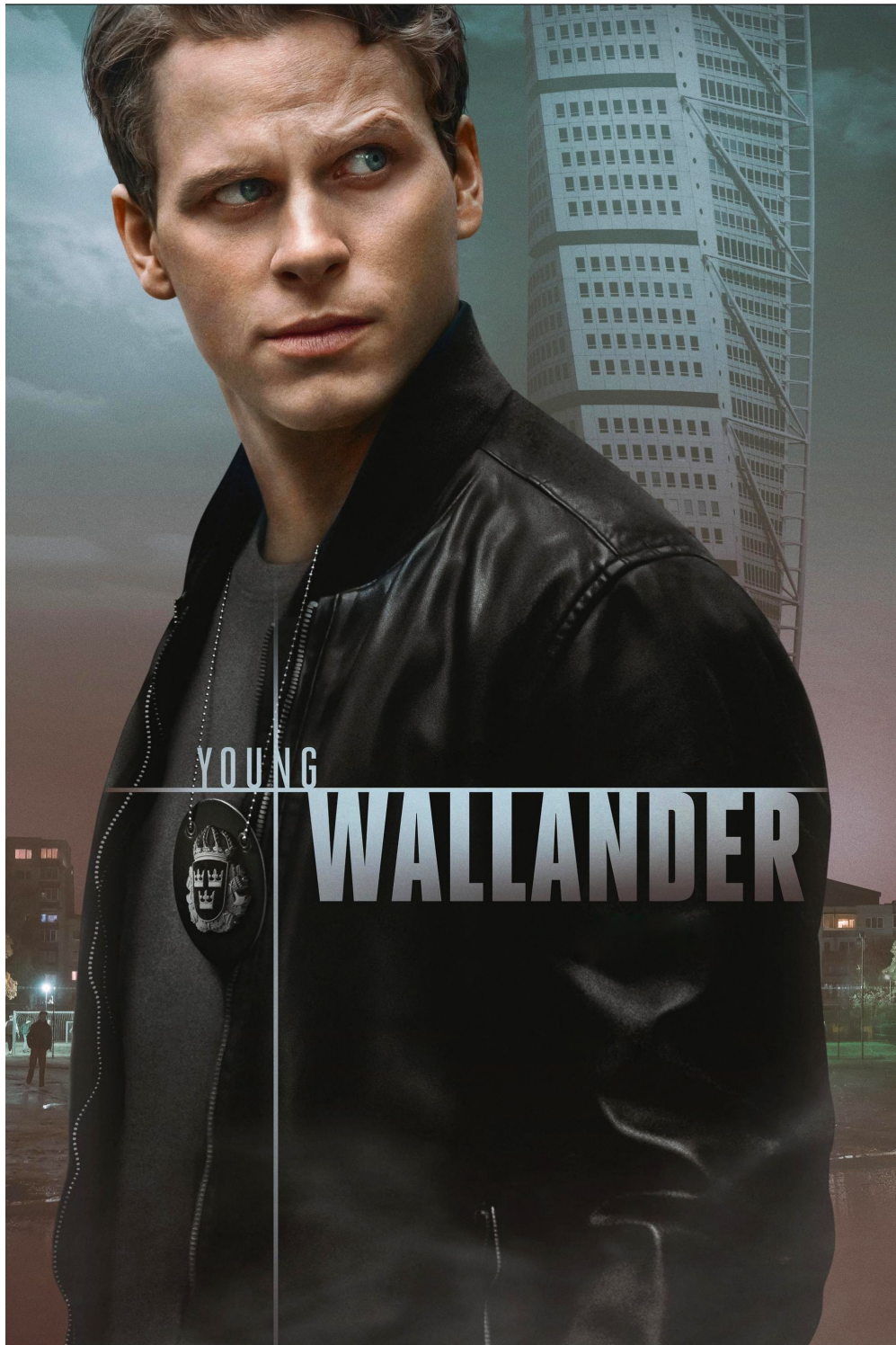

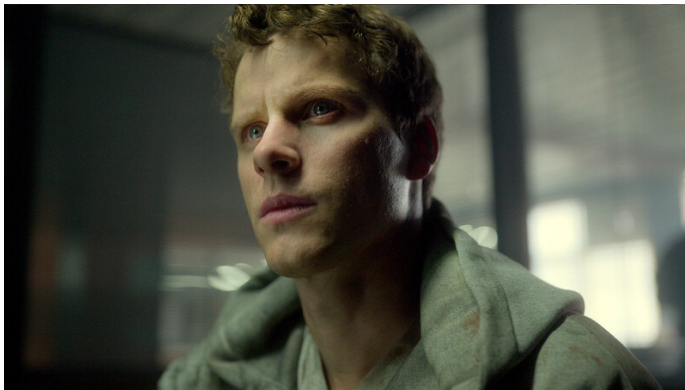

Summary: Rookie cop Kurt Wallander stumbles into a hate crime in his own neighborhood. As he hunts the killer, the incident fuels anti-immigration anger.



The episode begins in a suitably bleak fashion. With a slow building mystery and a strangely all-British cast, Young Wallander is a patchwork of influences that actually works quite well.

It's not perfect, and the setting and dialogue is definitely miscast here but the crime is enough to keep watching.

As rain hammers to the ground, episode 1 of Young Wallander begins with a police car crawling down the street toward a house party. As the bass echoes down the road, Kurt Wallander heads in-

side. The party host is cocky — too cocky in fact. Wallander suspects he's on drugs and takes him down to the station for a test.

Later that evening, Wallander heads home after wishing his associate Reza well with his big promotion. However, Wallander awakens in the middle of the night to an alarm wailing.

With smoke pouring out a maintenance room, Wallander calls in back-up and extinguishes the flames. Only, that's not the only crime.

A Swedish boy called Hugo stands tied up against a fence. After removing his gag, a grenade explodes sending everyone into a frenzy of shock.

In the wake of this, Frida Rask brings Wallander in for questioning. After revealing all he knows, he's unable to relax at home. Instead, he heads out to the bar to see his "booty call" Lena.

His attempt to woo her and ask her out for a date is completely shut down though. Given he saw someone die, she recommends he get some therapy instead. Oof, what a rejection.

At the station, Wallander learns someone has been arrested in connection with the crime. That boy? Ibra. Hugo's parents understandably want justice but Wallander is not sure he's the type to commit something like this.

While Wallander listens from the next room, it turns out the duo had an argument that night. With bullets found there too, the police have just enough to arrest this boy.

Just before he's charged, Kurt takes him aside and Ibra reveals he wasn't involved in this.

Wallander's big reveal about him being a police officer doesn't go down well with the boys in the estate. They've all but given up on Ibra and for now, they refuse to give up any information.

On the back of this, the news report there's going to be an Anti-immigration march on Saturday. Millionaire Gustav stirs the pot too, speaking his mind regarding the hate crime.

Later that day, Wallander finds a strange vehicle parked in the estate. Rask heads over to investigate with Hemberg. While they don't turn up anything significant, Wallander is promoted to the position of detective... at the expense of Reza. While his friend smiles and brushes this off, it's obvious this isn't the idea scenario.

The march goes ahead and, predictably, Hugo's death has caused some serious anger to flare up in the streets. As the mob turns violent, the police struggle to contain the volatile crowd.

Wallander chases after a man down into the subway but unfortunately just before arresting him, he turns and stabs him in the stomach. As the hooded figure leaves, Wallander crumbles to the ground in a heap.

Summary: Promoted to detective over his best friend, Reza, Kurt joins Hemberg on the case. Clues lead them to a notorious smuggler and a popular nightclub.



The episode begins with a weakened Wallander waking up in the hospital. He immediately phones Reza and leaves a message, telling him about the man in the black hood. Unfortunately he hasn't received that message as he too is in intensive care.

It's a grim start to the case following the anti-immigration riots. At the station, Wallander's forced to give the details over what happened to Hemberg. With Ibra refusing to talk, Wallander is their best shot given his access to the neighbourhood.

It's here he gets his first taste of police corruption, reminded that whatever he says will conveniently come up short.

Not long after, Wallander returns to the scene of the crime alone. There, he heads inside the church being used to house refugees. As fate would have it, he finds the girl who berated him at the rally. Getting nowhere with Mona, his oozing wound is enough to bring her around and help patch him up.

The next day, Hemberg and Wallander head out together. With no leads to follow, the pair turn their attention to the parents. The pair are less than helpful, to say the least.

Struggling to hide his visible pain from the knife wound, Wallander eventually manages to see Hugo's room. Despite not getting many answers, they do learn that Hugo snuck out that night. This brings them to his friend Isak.

This boy was also a football enthusiast and currently at football training. Isak is sketchy — to say the least — but does confirm that Hugo didn't know Ibra. A cube tattoo on his wrist certainly draws Wallander's attention, especially given this relates to the nightclub of the same name.

At hospital, Wallander is forced to explain himself to Jasmine. Teary eyed, he apologises to her for what happened to Reza. As she walks away, Kurt does manage to get his note translated. "Bala Chaara Nishta" actually translates to "no choice". Now we're getting somewhere.

Next up in the station is Miriam, who's interviewed over her movements that night. While the police can't confirm exactly what happened, her slip-up does confirm that Ibra is hiding something.

Hemberg and Wallander head back out, this time to a power plant. There, they meet the commissioner. It turns out the grenade may well be linked to the import/export business. As they soon learn, the grenade was part of a big shipment coming in.

Even more alarming, there's another boat coming into Malmo — this time in the form of C4. If the wrong people get their hands on this, it's going to cause a pretty massive explosion.

With this intel hanging over them, Wallander is briefed by Rask over the name of Dodovic. This guy has been on their radar for a while but he's always slipped through their fingers.

On their way to meet Dodovic and "ruffle some feathers", Hemberg and Wallander learn that Hugo had ketamine and GHB in his system. The latter was a pretty hefty amount too — enough to knock him out. If he bought it at The Cube, that could be what led to his demise.

Wallander dives into the nightclub head-first in a bid to try and find a dealer that could be the ticket to all of this. While looking around he finds Bash and the two talk.

Wallander pleads with him to speak to the police and admit that Ibra was with him. When he refuses to budge, Wallander threatens Bash and tells him that if Ibra goes down — he will too.

Unfortunately on his way out, the bouncers hold the door shut and beat him down on the back of him asking for drugs.

The episode begins with Kurt Wallander awakening in the middle of a field. As he stumbles back to town, he heads into the church again to get patched up by Mona.

His visit there actually warrants another motive. The second is to question her over the immigrant and the translated tongue of "no choice."

As he heads out, Wallander sits with Hemberg and the duo discuss the case. Ibra is about to go down for this crime but Wallander is concerned. Arriving back at the station, he implores Ibra to defend

himself and give up the code. Unfortunately blood is thicker than water and for Ibra, these boys are his family. He's not budging.

In Hemberg's office, Hemberg tasks Rask and Hugo to head out together to interview Gustav. She's less than enthused about the gig. However, she bites her tongue enough to get the job done.

Once there, Gustav becomes very interested in the case. He wants to be brought up to scratch on what's happened but Rask is less than pleased with this outcome.

Just before they leave, Gustav reveals that he knows Wallander has been speaking to Mona. "Next time you need something, make sure it's through me." This guy is definitely suspicious but for now, they get the address and head off to sniff out some clues.

The interviews go ahead and Wallander works his way through the exhaustive list. However, they're rudely interrupted by Hugo's father causing a disturbance down at the football ground.

He suspects Andersson (the football coach) is the one responsible and has gone down to attack him. He senses Andersson is the one who's taught him these bad habits. Thankfully Wallander manages to diffuse the situation and takes the man home.

That's not the only thing diffused either. Bash decides to speak up and provide an alibi for Ibra. This selfless act prevents Ibra from receiving jail time.

When Wallander finds out, he tries hard not to smile through the relief. On the back of this, he heads out with Mona and the two share food together.

Later that day, Wallander helps out Jasmine. Midway through loading the car up, she receives a call from the doctor confirming Reza has woken up.

Furthermore, Wallander also learns the man who committed the crime against Reza is in the station. A man by the name of Otto Norlen.

As Wallander does some digging, he realizes the crime against Hugo definitely is part of something wholly larger. He suspects the crimes were used to rile up the immigration rallies and cause unrest in the community.

As the plot thickens, Wallander learns that a pregnant immigrant called Yara failed to attend a hospital appointment. On top of that, he also finds a receipt confirming her location that night.

That location, as it turns out, isn't far from where Wallander currently is. With back-up inbound in ten minutes time, Wallander heads out alone to investigate.

In the woods, he keeps a distance as Yara meets a man and walks off hand in hand with him. When Wallander presents himself, the man (later referred to as Zemar) brandishes a gun. It's here Wallander realizes this is the man who stabbed him.

Wallander has Yara translate for him in order to diffuse the situation. When Hemberg arrives, he immediately berates Wallander for the way he handles the situation as Zemar is taken back to the station in handcuffs.

As they step out the car ready to take him inside, a sniper shot whistles through the air and hits Zemar.

The episode begins with Wallander and Hemberg heading out together to try and track down the sniper.

Scrambling through the hallways of the high-rise, they head up to the roof and corner the man responsible. The one who fired? Hugo's Father, Rickard.

Back at the station, they learn that Zemar is dead following the gunshot. They deduce that Rickard being part of SAPO was what led to the intel being leaked.

Before they can deep dive into this, they bring Yara in for questioning. She

wants justice but not against Rickard, she wants the man who threatened Zemar originally.

Whoever this man was, he took advantage of Zemar and offered him a driving job. Unfortunately the job terms changed and Zemar returned one night enraged and flustered. He had to drive someone from the nightclub to a warehouse. This someone being Hugo.

At the warehouse he was given new instructions. His boss threatened to deport him if he didn't hurt Hugo. Now the pieces are starting to slot into place.

On the back of this interview, Wallander learns that Migration Authority are taking over. He's convinced that Zemar had a boss but Hemberg is not so sure. Given how emotionally involved Wallander is in the case, he's forced to take a few days away from everything to cool off.

On his way back to the estate, Wallander spies Ibra being given something by Bash. However, the gang refuse to give up any information. Back home, more misery is piled on this detective as he learns the case has been closed and Zemar will be charged.

The next day, he meets Mona. He apologises profusely for what happened and this apology soon turns to more as they kiss and spend the night together.

In the morning, Wallander heads back to see Reza who's now home and recovering. When Jasmine leaves them in peace, Reza bolts upright and the pair decide to team up to investigate further.

As they start putting the pieces together, Rosengard and the church are both Munck Foundation projects. Furthermore, both attacks may well have been planned to maximize the issues with the riots. Both of them suspect someone is pulling the strings.

But who? Who would try to stir the pot? Well, Gustav has the power, money and influence to do this. As Wallander checks out photos, he notices that very same tattoo of a cube on his forearm.

This brings Wallander round to Isak's house for clarity. Although Isak is out with friends, his father does allow him to take a peek at his room.

Within the shoe-boxes dotted around, he finds a whole stack of baggys and a weighing scale. It seems he may actually be the dealer.

When Wallander heads home, he finds out Ibra has lost his gig at the club and is on the verge of being recruited by a rival gang.

On the back of this, he heads outside and apologises, speaking to Bash about the situation. He's convinced though that Ibra is loyal.

In the morning, Wallander arrives at the station and tries to sweeten up Rask. He shows her the photos — with particular emphasis on the tattoo — and reveals that Isak is missing. After some convincing, she agrees to help out.

Predictably, this leads them to Gustav. When they get there though, they learn the company is going through its own problems. There's been a death threat against Gustav — a far-right message.

Wallander valiantly tries to push through and ask questions about Hugo and Isak. Despite only having a brief encounter with him, Gustav is clearly hiding something.

When the pair leave, they get confirmation that Isak has been found. In a run-down high rise, Wallander heads up to find him. It turns out someone is after the boy and after a short foot-chase, Wallander catches up to him.

The boy is scared to death and some of this stems from the fact someone killed his dog as a warning. Only, the method of death is identical to Hugo — a grenade in the mouth.

As he continues on, Isak confirms the name of the host for this party — Gustav Munck.

The episode begins with Wallander meeting Hemberg and discussing the case.

Given Gustav knew Hugo before he was killed and Isak's dog was offed with the same heinous grenade method, he certainly seems suspiciously involved.

Wallander wants to bring Gustav in for questioning but Hemberg is not so sure. He instead tasks him with some good old fashioned espionage work to get close to Gustav. Or, preferably, someone close to him. Someone like... Mona perhaps?

Conflicted over what to do, Wallander

meets up with Mona and steers the conversation toward Gustav. It turns out the pair had a romantic fling in the past.

That evening they drive down to a party at the Munck Estate celebrating Gustav's Father, Leopold's birthday.

Inside Gustav takes Mona aside while Wallander admires the paintings on the wall. As he returns to the party, he spies Mona and Gustav getting pretty hands-on with each other.

Approaching her, Leopold gives a rousing speech about his brothers, and in particular how impressed he's been with Gustav recently. Hmm.

On the back of this, Wallander seizes his opportunity and confronts Gustav outside. Only, this is less than an ideal time and Mona soon figures out why he's tagged along with her. She berates him for using her and soon drives off, leaving him stranded at the estate and forced to get a taxi home.

With Isak back in the station for questioning, Wallander shows him a picture of Marcus Lindholm. He's the same bouncer that threw Wallander out of the car and worse, also has ties to Dodovich too. This is all starting to tie together now and it seems like Dodo is front and centre of this operation.

He may well be the ringleader surrounding Zemar getting involved and the one pulling the strings for this whole operation. Wallander remains convinced that Gustav is part of this story but right now it's not clear how.

Wallander continues to dig and finds pictures confirming Dodo entering the Munck Building for some sort of deal. Alongside this are some pretty nasty photos of beatings that weren't reported to the school.

This eventually brings Hemberg and Wallander to Dodo in a bid to get the truth. He confirms that he was at Munck for "business" but promises to throw them a bone. He was actually there to finalize a shipping contract.

Not long after, Wallander heads out and tracks down Von-Rosen, one of the boys beaten at the boarding school. As he relives his ordeal, one boy was left behind with a crowbar.

He was sadistic and watched Von-Rosen suffer. That man? Karl-Axel Munck. So it was a red herring after all!

The episode begins with our trio of investigators talking. His motive stems from Leopold changing the will into Gustav's name.

Only, how does this link to the grenade and the C4 shipment? Time for some more surveillance work.

Wallander eventually makes his move and heads in to see Leopold. He apologizes for the party and starts buttering the man up. It doesn't take long before he gets down to brass tacks.

Specifically, Wallander brings up the subject of the inheritance. Leopold scoffs at this but there's clearly some bad blood in the air.

As Wallander heads back to the scene of Hugo's crime he gets thinking. Tellingly, the fence he was blown up on happens to have a sign for Munck construction. This shot clearly isn't a coincidence.

Back at the station, Wallander learns that Leopold has gone to the police. However, our young detective holds his own in the face of being berated.

Gustav's reaction after the explosion wasn't great and no one else knows Gustav better than his own brother. It all fits — the puzzle pieces slot together but there's something missing. Some of the actual pieces remain hidden from view.

In order to try and find them, Hemberg and Wallander head out to try and get some answers (and a DNA sample) from Karl-Axel.

Sitting with him, Hemberg mentions the shipping deal and a silence descends over the room. Just before things turn awkward, Hemberg suggests they leave. It turns out he already has the evidence needed in the form of a pen.

Wallander races off to get the DNA tested. Not long after he meets Mona who confirms she's going to leave the Munck Foundation after this gig and search for greener pastures.

Wallander heads back to the estate and confronts Bash about his involvement with the Muncks. He asks about the explosives but Bash refuses to spill the details. Both of them are compromised and right now it's not a great environment to be bringing these questions up.

Instead, Wallander makes a deal and promises they'll be done once he finds out the details of the meeting. It turns out their deal is going down sooner rather than later — today in fact.

With time ticking, Wallander races off to the homeless shelter, believing the C4 is inside. Despite scouring the area with sniffer dogs, they find nothing.

Wallander struggles to hide his disappointment but one good thing does come from this — Mona and Wallander sort their personal issues out.

There's another twist in the tale to come though. When Hemberg arrives they soon learn that the deal to change the inheritance actually went down a week prior.

As they race down to the docks, Wallander and Hemberg just so happen to find the white car they're after and follow from afar.

This brings them to an abandoned warehouse. The duo work together and clear the area, believing the explosives are inside and Gustav's life is in danger.

One of the men evacuated happens to be dressed as a builder and very familiar. It's Marcus — the bouncer from *The Cube*. Unfortunately Wallander's too late to stop the bomb going off, which blasts Hemberg into smithereens.

On the back of this, Wallander and Rask bring Karl-Axel in and break down exactly what happened. As they discuss Gustav and toying with his emotions, both Rask and Wallander take it in turns to go through the entire case piece by piece.

All of this is laid out in meticulous detail but Karl shrugs off the charges and walks away. Wallander follows him out, promising retribution, before watching him drive off with his Mother.

On the back of this, Wallander decides to quit the force after Hemberg's death. The bells toll in honour of him while Wallander sees news reports that Gustav has officially taken control of the Munck company.

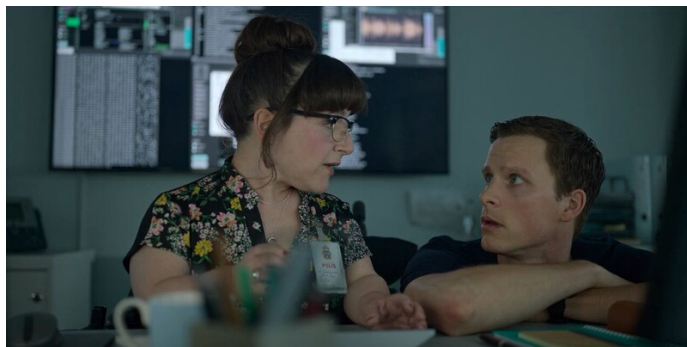
Nora meets Wallander outside and the pair head inside together. Just before they do though, Ibra reveals he's got a new lease on life and a 2 year contract at the club.

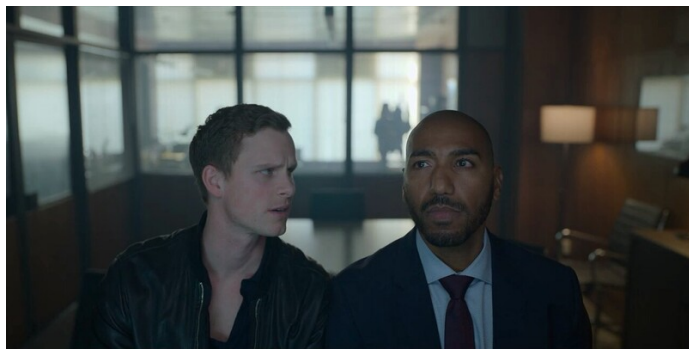
