Summary:	Flight attendant Cassandra Bowden wakes in her hotel room in Thai-
	land, hungover from the night before and with a dead body lying next
	to her. Afraid to call the police, she continues her morning as if noth-
	ing happened, joining the other flight attendants and pilots traveling
	to the airport. In New York, she is met by FBI agents who question her
	about her recent layover in Thailand. Still unable to piece the night
	together, she begins to wonder if she could be the killer.



The episode introduces us to Cassie Bowden, a flight attendant who enjoys hardcore partying, drinking, and sex between flights.

On an average workday, Cassie's coworkers, including her best friend Megan, ice queen Jada, and frequently sarcastic Shane, take bets on how late she'll be to her shift. She's a little messy and often puts having fun in her jetsetting lifestyle over substance. However, as we discover throughout the first episode, Cassie isn't a bad person — she loves rescuing animals, comforts scared children on bumpy flights, and appears

close with her brother Davey — she's just flighty, probably lonely, and prone to bad decision-making.

We get to see the start of her downfall before the opening credits sequence rolls for the first time. During the flight to Bangkok, Cassie was charmed by the man in 3C, a businessman named Alex Solokov.

She and Alex flirt heavily, to the point that all of the other flight attendants notice and tease her about it. After a brief mile-high hookup in the bathroom, Alex gives her his card with his personal number scrawled across the back of it.

Once at the hotel, Cassie changes into a gorgeous gold dress and immediately meets up with Alex. From there, the night goes down in a romantic haze of alcohol and sightseeing. The pair share a wild night together, and come morning, Cassie is ready to embrace the day and perhaps spend more time with Alex. Unfortunately, their time together is cut short when she discovers that he's dead in the bed beside her with his throat slit and blood everywhere.

Understandably, Cassie completely panics and immediately calls her friend and lawyer Annie. She doesn't tell her what happened but babbles about Amanda Knox and the potential similarities in their stories. Annie uses the Find My Friend app (which Cassie forgot to turn off — the result of yet a past drunken escapade) to figure out that Cassie is in Bangkok and warns her not to get arrested there since the country has "byzantine" laws.

That conversation sends Cassie into further hysterics, so she does probably the worst things she could do. She cleans up the crime scene and leaves without contacting the authorities and telling them what happened. She doesn't scrub the entire scene, but she gets rid of a broken wine glass, which could have been the murder weapon, and tries to remove all traces of evidence that she was ever in the hotel room. Then she puts on a pair of sunglasses and wraps her head in a scarf while racing back to the airport to try and leave Bangkok as quickly as possible. If there are security cameras and footage is pulled, she's going to look mighty suspicious.

It's immediately obvious to Megan that Cassie is acting weird on their flight to Seoul. She panics over an arbitrary delay and mistakenly serves the air marshall onboard vodka instead of soda, in addition to being paranoid that he's been watching her the entire flight.

By the time they land, Alex's body has been discovered after a mysterious woman makes a phone call to the hotel and asks that they send housekeeping to check on him. When Cassie and the others land in Seoul, the news is already out there that Alex Solokov was murdered. They wonder how Cassie feels about it since it was obviously the man in 3C. She pretends not to know what they're talking about and tries to make them all believe that she never saw Alex after their flight landed.

That night, Cassie is more interested in taking refuge in her hotel room than hanging out with her friends. Alone, she tries to pull herself together and embrace the fact that she's out of Bangkok and moving on. But then she realizes that her ID card is missing, and she has Alex's copy of the book Crime and Punishment in her purse. If she left her ID card in Alex's room, she's screwed.

Her foibles start catching up with her when FBI agents Kim Hammond and Van White ask Megan, Jada, Shane and Cassie to stay behind after their next flight for questioning since they were the flight attendants working Alex's section on his final flight. Cassie, stupidly, decides it would be a good idea to try and evade the interview altogether by feeling the area. The airport security catches up to her, and she immediately gets off to a weird start in her own interview with the FBI agents.

They want to know if Cassie saw Alex after his flight landed if she can give them more intel on what he was doing in Bangkok.

Summary:	Rattled by her own lies and under pressure from the FBI, Cassie goes against Annie's advice to lay low and tries to find some answers by dig- ging into Alex Sokolov's work life — with bizarre and shocking results.



The episode title fits in with two threads: one is the giant statue that Cassie knocks over while attempting a bit of ill-advised investigatory work — more on that later — and the other is because of some vaguely sinister flashbacks Cassie keeps having to her childhood. It appears she had something traumatic happen to her as a child, even before the waking-up-toa-dead-guy-in-her-bed thing.

The first episode also had a few glimpses of Cassie appearing to hunt a deer with a man I presume was her father. Instead, Cassie is determined to get to the bottom of this "Miranda" business.

Realizing she still has Alex business card (with the help of hallucination) she visits Unisphere to try and learn more about his business associate Miranda.

All she ends up doing is making a lot more people suspicious. At Unisphere, Cassie goes by the name Alessandra Ricci. When she mentions Miranda, the receptionist Sabrina immediately reacts, but the head of HR, Jean Miller maintains her poker face as she guides Cassie into a meeting room to discuss her ties to Alex and the company.

When Jean presses Cassie for more information on her relationship with the company, she lies and says she was an investor on the Stalwart's account, something she remembers from her night with Alex. Jean excuses herself and Cassie sees her meeting with two big scary guys from the opposite side of the glass-paneled building. As Jean brings them to meet with Cassie, she decides fleeing is her best option and that's when she busts the rabbit statue on her way out the door.

Later, Agent White reaches out to Cassie to bring her in for questioning again. This time, she contacts her lawyer friend Annie and tells her the whole story from beginning to end. Annie agrees

to become Cassie's lawyer but is shocked by all of her bad decision-making thus far, especially her visit to Unisphere. She tells Cassie to get some rest and the next morning she'll accompany her to her second FBI session. There, Annie will be in charge of which questions Cassie should answer and which she should plead the fifth too.

But Cassie being Cassie, she doesn't go home and rest. Instead, she goes out partying with Shane and Jada to escape the quiet solitude of her apartment. She meets a cute, out-of-work actor named Buckley and goes home with him. The next day, reeking of booze and late, as usual, she shows up to her meeting to an irritated Annie.

The FBI doesn't actually have much on Cassie. The surveillance footage for 12 hours during the time Alex was killed was mysteriously scrubbed. All they have is a single picture of Cassie in her weak disguise from Bangkok. The more damning evidence is an obvious photograph of Cassie at Unisphere, although it's still not proof of anything.

Agent White gets ahead of himself and shows her a shocking image of Alex's dead body which retraumatizes Cassie and pushes her to reveal the truth — or at least most of it. She admits to going out with Alex, getting super drunk, and having a one-night-stand. But then she claims when she left he was still very much alive. She also mentions Miranda, although admits she doesn't know much about her.

As an aside: After the meeting, Agent Hammond gets to lay into Agent White for being so bold as to show Cassie the crime scene photos. He's arrogant and hard to like and his comments about being as good at the job as Hammond despite her being there much longer than he has leave a bad taste in my mouth. However, it was nice to see Hammond give him a perfect verbal takedown as she comments that he's a white, male, Yale alum whose attitude is tolerated because he fits the perfect FBI image, whereas she, as a Black woman, would never be able to get away with a stunt like that. So no, his "attitude" isn't something to be proud of, nor has he earned his massive ego.

After the meeting, Annie scolds Cassie for going off-book and revealing more than necessary to the feds. She's further implicated herself in the situation. However, they also both realize that Cassie likely did try to leave Alex earlier and didn't make it home. Annie comments that it would make sense, and is likely the only reason Cassie is still alive. Someone probably killed him in that small window when she drunkenly stumbled out of the hotel room. But then she later returned, crawled into bed with a dead guy, and fell back asleep.

Despite Annie's advice that Cassie tries to carry on as usual by going on her next scheduled flight to Rome, she can't help but meddle even further as she remembers Sabrina's visceral reaction to Miranda's name. Cassie tracks Sabrina down and coyly encourages her to share a drink in honor of Alex. After they're both a few cocktails in, Cassie gets Sabrina to spill everything she knows on Miranda Croft. According to Sabrina, Alex and Miranda were dating but then he broke things off with her. Sabrina thinks Miranda is the crazy jealous type, so maybe it's feasible that she killed Alex.

While we don't yet know if Miranda is the real murderess here, she is undeniably involved. We meet Miranda in the flesh this episode, played by the always-amazing Michelle Gomez. Miranda scopes out a bar Cassie previously visited and sneakily gets Cassie's personal information. She later breaks into Cassie's apartment while she's not home and follows her around town. At the end of the episode, Miranda stalks down the street with a butterfly knife in hand, seemingly going in for the kill.

The episode begins in a tense moment that looks like it could be the end of the line for flight attendant Cassie Bowden. Miranda comes dangerously close to her with a knife, for what I can safely assume has murderous intentions. At the same time, an oblivious Cassie chats with Annie on the phone, filling her in on her conversation with Sabrina. Annie pleads with Cassie to let her do the lawyering from here on out.

Annie thinks she might be able to track down Miranda and convince Sabrina to go to the FBI with the same story she told Cassie. "When you get back from

Rome, things might look very different." Just as it looks like Miranda might hone in on Cassie toward the tail end of this phone call, Cassie happens to get into a taxi, and Miranda looks on in frustration.

On the flight to Rome, Cassie is still tense and nursing from a mini vodka bottle. She notices an article on the front page of a newspaper with her Bangkok picture. The headline reads that the authorities are searching for the mysterious woman potentially connected with Alex's murder.

Shortly after arriving in Rome, Cassie's Google alert pings. Alex's memorial service is being held soon at his family's house in Westchester. "It just feels so sad," she tells hallucination Alex.

At the hotel in Rome, Shane is rallying the troops for a night out at a discotheque, but Cassie says she'd prefer to be alone. We've heard this story before, and yep, right on cue, Cassie leaves her hotel room behind on a path to self-sabotage. She finds a local bar and meets with a charming barista inside who she obviously has had many a fling with in the past. He fixes her "usual" drink, but Megan interrupts before their flirtation can go any further.

She'd been having a few glasses of wine inside already. She apologizes for saying too much about Cassie and Alex to the FBI and admits she doesn't have many friends. Oh my god, Cassie, if you don't hug Rosie Perez right now! Megan also claims she's been keeping "so many secrets" that it's nice to talk about something else. Cassie questions what she means by secrets, but Megan swiftly moves on to another topic.

Back in the states, Annie catches up with Sabrina and asks her to retell the story she told Cassie, well, "Alessandra," over drinks. Sabrina claims she doesn't know her. "It's a very bad idea to lie to me," threatens Annie. Sabrina rethinks her statement. She says she does know Alessandra. She had an emotional breakdown in her office and broke an important piece of art — but she never had drinks with her, and she doesn't know who "this Miranda" is. Annie stares coolly at her as she walks away.

Cassie and her Roman beau walk back to the hotel with a very drunk Megan. After she goes to bed, Cassie admits to the guy that she can't have sex with him like they usually do because she's met someone. That night she hugs Alex's copy of Crime and Punishment to her chest and thinks back to their night together. She recalls a conversation they had about siblings. Alex was an only child and said his mom was super controlling. He always wished he had a sibling to exert some of her attention instead of him all the time. She hated his last girlfriend.

Upon her return from Rome, Cassie immediately notices that someone has been in her apartment so she immediately goes to Annie's and runs into a naked man named Max claiming to be Annie's boyfriend. Annie says Max is not her boyfriend, something about not believing in labels. Cassie tells Annie about the break-in. She wonders if Miranda did it to leave her some kind of terrifying message — well, she's not far off! She wants to know how Annie is coming along on the Sabrina front. Answer: Not well.

Cassie thinks they should report it to the FBI anyway to see what happens, but unfortunately, Annie gets connected to Agent Van White. He thinks Annie is just scrambling to find alternative theories at this point since Sabrina didn't pan out as a lead when they questioned her. Annie calls her FBI source, who she has in a precarious situation due to a pending, tenuous legal charge. What's the latest on the Bangkok murder? It's not good.

They found what they think is the murder weapon: the broken bottle. They're going to digitally reconstruct it and pull prints, which might mean they connect it to Cassie when she cut herself on the glass. Cassie starts freaking out, thinking she will end up in jail, but Annie assures her that won't happen. It's clear Annie doesn't entirely believe that herself. Things aren't looking good for Cassie. For now, Annie tells Cassie to stay at her apartment while she continues digging into Miranda and Unisphere.

But as we know by now, Cassie isn't going to give up and let Annie handle everything. She revisits her hallucination room with Alex and recalls the meeting from earlier in the episode about his mom. If his last girlfriend was Miranda, then that means his mom can confirm Miranda is real. But how is she going to get Alex's mom? Crash his memorial service, of course! Cassie enlists Shane to accompany her for emotional support. On the way there, she gets a call from Buckley, who wants to meet up with her again, but Cassie blows him off with a lie.

Okay, so in this next scene, Megan meets with a businessman at a coffee shop, and we learn a massive piece of information. But not all the clues are dropped right away here. Let's rewind to the last episode. When Cassie snuck into Unisphere, Jean escorted two men to meet her. We later briefly met Megan's husband, Bill. At the time, I thought Bill was one of the men from Unisphere but didn't call attention to it because it didn't seem relevant in the last episode, and I wasn't sure where the storyline was going just yet.

Well, in The Flight Attendant Episode 3, we learn Megan is caught up in some corporate espionage. The flash drives she acquired from Mason in Episode 2 are to download files from Bill's computer. The mysterious coffee shop man tells Megan the company isn't treating her husband well, so she shouldn't feel guilty for this little bit of sabotage. Now it seems very likely that Bill works at Unisphere, especially as the coffee shop man tells Megan that if anything got "sticky" or they were caught, his company in Seoul would step in and clean things up. So now it looks like Megan is inundated in Cassie's conspiracy, although it's not clear what capacity she's involved in yet.

Back at Annie's, she hits a brick wall when digging into Unisphere and Alex Sokolov. She coaxes her criminal, not-boyfriend Max into hacking into the Stalwart's account and company for her.

Cassie and Shane arrive at the memorial service. As if going to the memorial wasn't a stupid enough decision, Cassie doesn't even tell Shane the truth about it being Alex's memorial. He's not cool with that and ditches her to flirt with the caterers instead. Meanwhile, Cassie is left to roam the house, searching for Michael's mother, Janet.

Oh, and Agents White and Hammond obviously staked out the memorial service. White thinks Cassie is an idiot for showing up and is also convinced that Cassie is the murderer — despite not having enough evidence, this guy is so annoying. Hammond is more interested in doing things the right way, i.e., doing the legwork so they can extradite a U.S. citizen from the Thailand police.

During the memorial service, Annie relentlessly calls Cassie to warn her that Max discovered something big about the Sokolovs and Unisphere. The Sokolov family owns the entire company, it's a front for a money-laundering scheme, and they launder money for some very scary people. Some of whom are Annie's clients, and she knows they tend to get violent when need be. After learning Cassie is in the lion's den at the memorial, she warns her friend to leave the house ASAP, but Cassie refuses to leave until she talks to Janet and learns more about Miranda. "If she f—king dies, I'm going to kill her." Same, Annie.

While all of this is going on, Megan swiftly does some subterfuge of her own to steal files from her husband's computer and download them to the flash drives. Once finished, she delivers them to her contact, Mr. Hak. At the drop-off, Megan leaves Cassie a voicemail. She wants to get on the next Tokyo-Seoul flight and asks if they are still bid buddies for their flights.

The memorial triggers Cassie's memory of her father's wake. Alex shows up in her head and notices her sitting on the couch at the wake. "What are you doing in my childhood memories!?" She freaks out because she tries hard not to think about her childhood and starts drinking everything in sight at the memorial. It doesn't work. We go back to Cassie's childhood, where she's sneaking a beer out of the fridge while adult Cassie and Alex watch. Young Davey takes the beer from Cassie to keep her from drinking it. "Your brother has the right idea."

In the present, Cassie is basically having a panic attack, especially as she keeps seeing the same guy around the house — earlier, she thought he followed her and Shane off the train. She runs into a waiter, knocking a plate of food onto the floor, and continues draining every glass of champagne.

Again we see young Cassie. She's taken refuge in her room and drinking from a flash in the aftermath of her dad's death. "My dad used to only give me beer. That was my first sip of hard alcohol."

Rushing through the house, Cassie accidentally stumbles on Alex's mom while alone. She jumps at her one opportunity to ask about Miranda and is shocked to learn from Janet that Alex supposedly never dated Miranda. In fact, Janet is offended that Cassie even brought her up.

"If you never dated Miranda, then what the f-k is going on?"

Janet goes upstairs to take a phone call, and Cassie follows her to eavesdrop. The guy she's been seeing all over the house definitely follows Cassie upstairs. On the phone call, Janet tells the mysterious person on the other line that she was accosted by a strange woman asking about Miranda and that she will not let "Victor, Miranda or Lionfish" use her son as a scapegoat. She then asks her assistant for the files on Lionfish that Alex left behind, and he assures her they've been shredded.

The guy following Cassie through the house works with the FBI. He tells White and Hammond that she's drinking heavily and made a public spectacle of herself at the service. They're interrupted by Janet, who isn't happy to see a "federal battalion" in her driveway during her son's funeral.

Left to her own devices, Cassie tries to track down the paper shredder, bypassing a room where Shane and cater-waiter Michael are hooking up. She finds the shredder and balls up the trash bag, quickly tossing it out the window. It's a good thing, too, since several men with guns come in after her, followed swiftly by Janet. Alex's father assumes Cassie is one of Alex's "good-time girls," but Janet thinks she's one of "Victor's incompetent field mice" since she asked questions about Miranda. Cassie is genuinely clueless as to what that means. So yes, Alex's family is genuinely terrifying.

But then Janet leaves the room to talk to someone, and when she comes back, she says Cassie is free to leave. She grabs Shane and the shredded paper. They make their exit, but not without a spat. Cassie finally apologizes to Shane for making some offhanded remarks about the cater-waiter and for being crazy enough to come to the memorial in the first place. She asks Shane not to tell anyone she was there. "I can keep a secret, Cassie."

Toward the end of The Flight Attendant Episode 3, on the train ride home, Cassie finally texts Annie that she's safe. From the conversation Annie has with Max, it sounds like Annie called in a massive favor with one of her clients, and that's why Janet let Cassie leave scot-free.

Since Cassie can't go very long without booze and she can't seem to stop reliving her childhood traumas, she goes looking for the bar cart and on her way finds — MIRANDA! She immediately recognizes her as the woman from that night in Bangkok, and all Miranda can say when she sees Cassie is, "F—k."

The episode kicks off right where we left the third episode, with Cassie coming face-to-face with Miranda on the train. Her first impulse is to literally kick her shoe off of her foot and fling it in Miranda's general direction — which makes for a very GIF-worthy moment. Beyond that, Miranda chases Cassie through the train, but just as Cassie reaches the police, Miranda vanishes.

Cassie makes it back to Annie's in one piece, albeit barefoot, wearing Shane's socks over her stocking-clad feet. Cassie and Max are way more excited about the paper shreds than Annie is, and they stay

up all night piecing together the files related to Lionfish. Come morning, they have a few papers pieced together.

One is of particular interest as it relates to one of the Sokolov companies, Minute Jet. Each day a jet departs New Jersey and flies to Maine at 3:00 p.m., stops at 4:55 p.m., and then leaves Maine to return to New Jersey at 5:11 p.m. Why would they fly an hour just to refuel and turn

around? They also notice a name that starts with "MI" on the passenger list. Cassie wonders if that could be Miranda.

If Cassie wants to find out, she'll need to pull a favor with Nate, who moonlights for Minute Jet. He gets her on the flight crew for that day in return for some cold hard cash to ease his gambling debts.

Before she can board the flight, Cassie is set to meet her brother and his family at the aquarium. For the most part, they spend a normal day together, although Cassie does drink vodka and guzzle mouthwash beforehand. Then there is a small discrepancy regarding stuffed whales at the gift shop. Both girls want one, but Davey says no.

He and his husband are trying to teach their daughters that just because you want something doesn't mean you need it. Cassie sneaks back into the gift shop later to buy them anyway and tells the girls to keep their gifts a secret from her brother. Then she leaves to catch her flight, promising to meet Davey for dinner later.

On the Minute Jet flight, Cassie learns there are no passengers on the flight despite the roster listing eight. When she asks Nate about it, he says that he sees eight passengers on the plane, doesn't she? Yes, they fly an empty plane every day, but he's getting paid too much money to say anything about it.

Cassie notices men loading cargo onto the plane at the pit stop and sneaks off to get a peek inside the crates. She thinks that these mysterious plane rides were some kind of weapons smuggling ring that both Miranda and Alex were part of based on devices she finds — which are used to power rocket launchers.

Surprisingly, Cassie does make it to dinner on time, and Davey is the one who shows up late. Alone. He found the whales in his daughters' backpacks, and he's not happy with Cassie for buying them behind his back and undermining his parenting. He's really not okay with her telling his kids to keep a secret from him.

For Davey, the instance brought back all the bad memories of their childhood. Davey and Cassie's dad was an alcoholic who constantly belittled Davey and called Cassie the "son he never had." He was obviously an emotionally abusive man, and he's the one who got Cassie into alcohol at such a young age. Davey also knows that Cassie was drunk when she went to the aquarium because she smelled like mouthwash, just like their dad used to.

Davey accuses Cassie of editing her memories to look better than they were. She recalls a time when she and her dad were doing an egg-and-spoon race. In her original memory, it looked like a fun day between her and her dad. In reality, their dad was drunk and shoved Davey to the ground so Cassie could win. In many of Davey's memories, Cassie would laugh at him and do what their dad said, so Davey often felt like it was them-against-him.

But the problem is, Cassie was a kid, even younger than Davey. So, while I understand Davey's frustrations at adult Cassie, a lot of his anger toward her in this scene felt unwarranted. He gaslighted her into feeling guilty for things she did as a young girl who was also abused by their father, and that's really not okay. Both of them were obviously traumatized by their dad, and it doesn't sit right with me that Davey blamed Cassie for things she did as a literal child. Cassie even points out that Davey left the second he turned 18, leaving her alone with their dad and making her feel like he abandoned her.

All of Davey's grievances from when they were kids were really toward his father, not Cassie. So there's obviously misplaced blame there because their dad died before Davey could confront him or settle his issues with him.

Well, the massive fight with Davey triggers another panic attack for Cassie, and she desperately calls all of her friends to find someone to hang out with so she doesn't have to be alone. No one answers, so she finally takes Buckley up on his offer to hang out again and goes to his apartment.

After sleeping with Buckley again, Cassie regroups in her hallucinatory hotel room with Alex. She realizes that the next person she needs to talk to is Sabrina. She's the only person who might have information on the Minute Jet thing. The bad news is, Miranda is thinking along the same lines.

Earlier in the episode, we finally meet the mysterious Victor. He surprises Miranda by ambushing her in her apartment. He's not pleased with her sloppy work as of late. It seems confirmed that Miranda did kill Alex, but letting Cassie go was her first huge mistake. The public train chase didn't help matters. Victor decides to bench Miranda and tells her to get on a plane back to London. As mentioned above, he says they have a contingency plan in place to clean up her mess.

Miranda argues that it's her mess to clean, and she wants the chance to fix it, but Victor is adamant she leave and not get obsessed with this. Also, funnily enough, Miranda seems to think Cassie is a spy of some kind and not just a flight attendant who accidentally stumbled into a huge conspiracy. Cassie's movements are making her look suspicious to everyone.

But Miranda is already obsessed with this situation, Cassie included. She visits Sabrina. By the time Cassie arrives, it's too late. She hears a scuffle behind Sabrina's apartment door and starts screaming for her to open it. Cassie runs outside to call 911. Moments later, Sabrina plummets to her death, her body landing directly in front of Cassie.

Two other subplots in this episode are important to note. Megan continues working with the Seoul guys. She accepts her first significant payout from them in a mall food court exchange. Later, her husband suggests that her eBay dealings on his computer have given him a virus. Megan claims it was porn — either from their son or him — that is likely slowing the computer down. She's not bad at coming up with lies to hide her shady dealings off the cuff.

Elsewhere, Annie meets with her boss, Diana Carlisle. Remember that favor she called in to save Cassie in the last episode? Diana warns her that now she will have to return it, and it will probably be unpleasant. When she gets the call, Diana doesn't want to know anything about it. She just wants Annie to take care of things, to clean up her mess.

Ironically, Annie is getting pulled into bed with the Seoul guys against her will while Megan is all gung-ho and ready for bigger and better action. These two characters are two sides of the same coin and opposites in many ways, which is fitting as they're two significant characters in Cassie's life.

The episode begins with Cassie remembering the day a jet crashed near her house. She tells hallucination Alex that the day the crash happened was the first time she remembered wanting to be a flight attendant because she wanted to help people. In the memory, we see a young Cassie sprinting toward the crash site.

In the present tense, Cassie is being questioned by Agent White as a witness to a potential crime. Annie is in lawyer mode, but Cassie ignores her to snap at White and call him out for not knowing anything. She has a point. The FBI agents

don't seem to be doing any real investigating beyond tailing Cassie. You'd think by now they'd realize something bigger is going on. But as of the end of this episode, they're convinced Cassie is some major schemer. Cassie tells them that without her, they would have no clue that Lionfish is using jets to smuggle weapons and that the Sokolovs are laundering money through Unisphere.

Annie leads her away from the agent — and she's also pissed Cassie just said a bunch of stuff she found out via illegal means to an FBI agent. Cassie apologizes to Annie for it before she bursts into tears. Cassie might make a lot of dumb decisions, but the poor girl has been through a lot. Annie is too, though, to be fair, and she's doing a lot independently.

At her apartment, Annie leaves to start her dirty work for the Seoul guys while Max and Cassie stay behind. Cassie is determined to fix things because she blames herself for Sabrina's death and wrecking Annie's life. She could get disbarred for some of the things she's done to help Cassie, nonetheless, what she's about to do.

Her next brilliant plan is for her and Max to break into Alex's apartment and see if he has a computer with any incriminating documents. She remembers a conversation she and Alex had where he talked about his doorman, always staring at the giant Vessel sculpture. That makes it pretty easy for them to track down his building, and Cassie lies to the doorman about being Alex's sister to get into his apartment. She also brings a little Hello Kitty flash drive to transport any important intel they find.

There, she remembers seeing a sticky note with a 4-number code on it beneath Alex's name in the Sokolov house in Westchester — we saw it too in Episode 3. I love when shows put cool clues and foreshadowing in like that, and this show has lots of it.

Inside Alex's house, they quickly find his computer and even the password, but Alex has a twofactor authenticator on his computer. They'll need a second code to get into it. Max recommends they find a key fob in the house, as that's likely where the code will arrive. They scour the entire place. Cassie finds a lot of strange things in her search, including a collection of vintage Playboys.

In her brainscape, she and Alex fight over how she's judging and perceiving him based on things she's found in his house out of context. Alex does the same thing with his apartment and calls her an alcoholic, like her father. It cuts deep.

Also in the closet, though, is the key fob. However, before she and Max can use it, Miranda shows up at Alex's house. After killing Sabrina, Miranda reaches out to a contact in the company she works for named Cecilia, who warns her that they could both be killed if Victor finds out she didn't leave the country as he ordered. "You know how agitated I get if something is unfinished." Miranda tells Cecilia that Sabrina told her about Cassie's alias "Alessandra Richie" and that Alex has a private workstation in his house. So that's where she heads next.

Miranda gets into Alex's computer as easily as Cassie and Max did, but when she can't get the code, she destroys the entire thing — all while they're locked in his closet. When she leaves, Cassie is frustrated that Miranda has wrecked the computer, but she finds mail from Lionfish with the official company address stamped on the envelope. Cassie realizes they don't need his computer.

Of course, not long after leaving the apartment, Cassie and Max run into Buckley. I know this guy is involved in everything; the timing is too suspect. Cassie promises to text him back later as they rush off toward the mysterious address. They find a mostly empty warehouse, except on the second floor is a unit of high-tech servers. Max hacks into the server, and they find out that Alex transferred \$250 million from Lionfish into an offshore account — unclear where.

Cassie wonders if Alex was killed over the money or if they think she knows where it is, but while she's spiraling, Max shows her a bunch of IDs. Cassie's is among them, and it's labeled pending. Miranda's is also pending — and her real name is Elena King. The IDs seem like a hitlist of some kind. Some are listed as "closed," meaning dead. So how many people want Cassie dead? She starts freaking out that a sniper might get her right then, and Max assures her that won't happen — until the server kicks him out.

He realizes someone knows they're there and is likely on their way right now. Cassie grabs the flash drive, and they take off running. But a car veers toward Cassie while they cross the road. Being the good guy he is, Max pushes her out of the way, getting hit in the process. Cassie rushes toward him and tries to revive him, but it looks hopeless. Is Max really dead!? He was so charming. I hope not. Also, who wants to bet Buckley was driving that car?

In the final moments of the episode, Miranda gets another call from Victor. He obviously knows she didn't return to London, but she lies to him and claims she did. It doesn't look good for her.

At the end of The Flight Attendant Episode 5, we return to the memory from the episode's opening. This time, hallucination Alex tells Cassie that she's lying to herself. She says she wants to help people, but really she's just attracted to disaster. Looking at the face of young Cassie sprinting toward that crash site — she didn't look sad or determined; she looked excited at the prospect of ruin.

While Cassie and Max are out playing detective, Annie is called to meet with the Seoul guys to figure out how she has to repay her debt. They give her a small brown envelope and tell her to sneak it into the prison and give it to one of her firm's clients. Annie doesn't want to do it, but they tell her that her next task will be more difficult if she denies it, so she accepts.

She tries calling her boss Diana to see if there is any wiggle room, but Diana just scolds her for talking bout any of this on an open phone line, especially when she explicitly told Annie she didn't want to know anything. Stuck without any options, Annie cleverly sews the envelope into her coat lining and goes to the prison. She sticks some electronics into her coat so that when it goes through the scanner and beeps, they just think she's forgetful and forgot to remove her phone. The security lets her in to see the client.

Annie slips him the envelope and tells him that his family will be taken care of — a message from the Seoul people. He opens it and finds two pills inside. We don't see him die, but I'm assuming the pills are for him to commit suicide. Annie is deeply troubled by what she's just done and calls Max after.

Getting his voicemail, she asks if they can just watch a stupid movie and eat leftover pasta together later so she can be distracted for a while. It's even more heartbreaking because the episode uses a split-screen to show Annie's call side-by-side Cassie trying to resuscitate Max.

Whereas Annie wants to get out of bed with the Seoul clients as soon as possible, Megan wants to get more deeply immersed in the criminal enterprise. She tries calling Cassie again to catch up, as they haven't talked in a while. But Cassie ignores her call. Instead, she calls the Seoul guys, but she does leave a voicemail for Cassie — potentially by accident — of her talking in Korean to the guys on the phone.

At the Lionfish warehouse with Max, Cassie listens to Megan's voicemail and hears her speaking in Korean. It'll be interesting if she revisits that later. As for Megan, she's ready for the next assignment. She agrees to meet with one of the Seoul representatives at a shady, low-rent motel, but Bill follows her there.

He says he happened to see her standing in the parking lot while driving from work. He thinks she's having an affair. Megan manages to divert quickly, claiming she was trying to set up a dirty roleplay scenario for his birthday the following week. He seems to buy it. After Bill leaves, Megan meets her contact and gets another huge wad of cash.

Annie reaches her threshold of tolerance for Cassie's bulls—t. She kicks Cassie out of her apartment and tells her in no uncertain terms that she's done and doesn't want anything more to do with the tangled web Cassie has concocted. To be fair, while Cassie has made many terrible mistakes and is in desperate need of rehab — not everything is her fault. The biggest problem is that Cassie lacks any proof, and many of her problems sound like the

ravings of a drunk, so Annie doesn't necessarily believe all of her stories or incidences like what happened at the warehouse.

The FBI doesn't believe Cassie either, at least, Agent White doesn't. Thankfully, Agent Hammond finally seems to be catching on that Cassie's isn't entirely out of her mind when they discover the empty Lionfish warehouse and link that, the Sokolov family and Unisphere to Cassie's confession outside of Sabrina's apartment from the last episode.

She starts to believe that maybe Cassie is onto something big, while Agent White remains adamant that Cassie is the sole suspect in Alex's murder, and that's all there is to it. Not only is that just poor detective work, but it's also narrow-minded and short-sighted. Then again, people like Agent White exist in our justice system, and while frustrating, it's a realistic part of our world. Let's hope Agent Hammond starts to figure out how to help Cassie before it's too late.

Losing Annie sends Cassie in a downward spiral that leaves her lonely, and we all know Cassie can't stand being alone for more than a few minutes at best. A desperate Cassie calls Jada and Shane, one of whom isn't interested in hanging out, and the other doesn't answer. Next, she

tries Megan, who does answer but immediately pings Cassie's fake enthusiasm. Cassie accuses Megan of being a hypocrite during their call since she calls her all the time and leaves messages — even one in Korean. That gets Megan's attention since she realizes she mistakenly recorded one of her secret conversations with the Seoul guys.

The only other option in Cassie's network is Buckley; the one guy she hasn't alienated, who I'm almost positive is working for Victor. She and Buckley meet up to have sex and get plastered. They end up going to a local bar that Cassie frequents, and there she can't help but sing along to a classic Dolly Parton song. I don't blame her. Who wouldn't jam out to Dolly?

The bartender streams Cassie's performance online, and Megan's son sees it, cueing his mother in on Cassie's location. Wanting to catch up with Cassie to delete the voicemail, Megan immediately makes a beeline for the bar. In disguise, she manages to sneak in, steal Cassie's phone, delete the message and return it to her and Buckley's table before anyone even notices that it's gone. Megan is getting pretty good at this espionage stuff.

Also, at the bar is the third main FBI guy who followed Cassie around at Alex's memorial service. Under the influence of lots of alcohol, Cassie gets bold enough to confront him. He obviously denies that he's following her, but he shoots off a quick text outside of the bar, confirming Cassie's location. Before he can do anything else, Miranda (or Elena, as we learned last week) sneaks up behind him and slits his throat.

Tumbling drunk and disorderly out of the bar, Cassie gets it in her head to confront Annie and try to salvage their friendship despite dream!Alex warning her that their friendship is dead. He's mostly right since Annie has no patience for Cassie waiting for her in her apartment with Buckley. Annie calls Cassie out on being a drunk, and Cassie calls Annie a liar. Both are true, Annie admits. She has things in her life she's kept from Cassie — Max being one of them. At the end of the day, Annie wonders aloud, maybe their friendship just doesn't work. And Annie is tired of cleaning up Cassie's messes.

Everything that Annie has done to try and keep Cassie safe has put her in a dark place. The visit to the jail where she inadvertently facilitated a man's death is a big part of that and weighing heavily on her conscience. To make amends, Annie submits her resignation to Diana.

Meanwhile, Cassie and Buckley decide to "do something crazy" in the aftermath of her fight with Annie. They steal a horse kiddie ride situated outside of a local convenience store. As expected, it ends badly when they stumble and send it careening into a parked car. The cops are called. Buckley and Cassie get arrested.

Alone in her jail cell, Cassie is left with no one but herself and dream!Alex for company. Throughout The Flight Attendant Episode 6, we continue to visit the dreamscape in her head as it becomes increasingly frenetic, and the dive into her traumatic childhood memories goes deeper. Left with her own thoughts, Cassie finally starts to see more and more of her edited memories for moments they really were — her father regularly abusing Davey — and her, for that matter.

Distraught, Cassie calls Davey using her single phone call and apologizes for the part she played in his humiliation as a kid. She tells Davey that it wasn't right, how their father treated him. And Davey tells Cassie that it wasn't right how he treated her, either! It's a nice scene that really makes up for their previous spat.

These are two siblings who were both emotionally and physically abused by their father. He turned them against each other and caused a lot of grief for them both. I'm glad that Cassie reached out. Hopefully, they can start to get on a better path from here on out. Davey tries to encourage Cassie to tell him the truth about what's going on, but she doesn't want to drag anyone else into her mess.

Shortly after the call, a guard visits Cassie to tell her that she made bail. She's surprised since there isn't anyone who knows where she is apart from Davey, and he's too far away to get here that fast. In the final moments of The Flight Attendant Episode 6, Cassie finds out that Miranda paid her bail. She steps outside and comes face-to-face with her long-time stalker, who pulls a gun on her. "We need to talk."

At the end of the last episode, Miranda held Cassie at gunpoint to try and get to the bottom of her involvement with the entire Alex situation. Miranda thought Cassie killed Alex over the money he squirreled away in a secret bank account. She wasn't the one to kill Agent Chavez, Sabrina or Alex, for that matter. All of those deaths were courtesy of Victor's "contingency plan," an agent named Feliks.

Cassie turns to Annie for help, hoping Annie can get Miranda into hiding in exchange for information valuable to the FBI about Victor and the entire operation. Unfortunately, Annie resigned. She and Cassie do make amends, though, and Annie tells Cassie and Miranda to go wait for her in a nearby hotel until she can make some calls. Despite no longer being employed, she still wants to try and help.

Davey also wants to help his sister, but Cassie doesn't want him to get hurt by becoming trapped in her tangled web. She tells him to stay put.

Miranda isn't impressed with Annie's lack of confidence so she advises Cassie to run away with her so they can disappear for good. To do that, they have to meet with Miranda's contact, at an Alcoholics Anonymous meeting. You can imagine how that goes for Cassie, who is still in denial about her drinking problem. The meeting triggers all kinds of bad memories and trauma for Cassie. She has a panic attack that sends her bolting out of the room.

We know Cassie's dad died, but we didn't know how until this episode. Through flashbacks, we learn Cassie and her dad were driving in his truck, chugging beers, and her dad crashed the car. Cassie blamed herself for his death because she was his "drinking buddy."

She tells dream!Alex that her dad only drank heavily around her, so therefore the fault lies with her. We all know that's not true. Cassie was a kid and a victim of an abusive, alcoholic father. This girl needs serious therapy to comb through all those years of childhood trauma.

After the crash, a young, scared Cassie ran away and has continued running ever since. Every time things get hard, she runs.

She doesn't want to do that anymore, so she asks Miranda if they come up with another plan to keep themselves alive. Miranda helps Cassie remember the copy of Crime and Punishment, which is still at Annie's apartment. They go to retrieve it. Miranda has a renewed sense of optimism after seeing that Cassie's theory bore fruit. With those codes and data, they can get the money, they have options again.

But just as they find the book, Feliks catches up to them. Miranda and Cassie run out the back and up the fire escape to the roofs where they have to jump across a sizable gap from one building to the next. In the process, Miranda drops the book on the ground as they go into hiding.

While hiding from Feliks, Miranda tells Cassie that he is a genuine psychopath that has murdered women and children. As a child, there was an incident where he killed and gutted five cats, hanging them from a tree after. OMG! Buckley told Cassie an eerily similar story, except in his version, he found the cats hanging there and it traumatized them — he conveniently left out the bit about him doing it himself. Cassie puts two and two together and sneaks a peek at "Feliks." Yep. It's Buckley!

Considering all of the time and intimate moments she's shared with him as of late, Cassie is understandably horrified. But this does give her and Miranda the upper hand. Yes, Buckley has possession of the book now, having picked it up after Miranda dropped it, but he doesn't know that Cassie is aware of his true identity. They start to formulate a plan of how they can trap him and get rid of him once and for all on Cassie's next flight to Rome. She's going to have to be bait.

Other important developments:

Megan — Bill is under investigation at work after Korean spyware is discovered on his laptop. He realizes that Megan must have done it since no one else uses his computer. Megan learns that Bill works with government contractors and seems to process the gravity of her situation. Up until now, Megan thought Bill worked in the tech industry.

The FBI — Agent White remains the absolute worst, refusing to consider any other option apart from Cassie being a stone-cold murderer — even if it does make less and less sense. Agent Hammond, however, is becoming more and more suspicious of this entire investigation, especially when Agent Chavez fails to show up for work.

Annie & Max — Max finally wakes up at the hospital and Annie tells him he loves her! He also wants to know how things are going with Cassie. Annie remembers the Hello Kitty flash drive and asks Max to tell her exactly where he got hit so she can go retrieve it.

The episode begins where we left off, with Cassie and Miranda getting ready to leave for Rome, hoping to ambush and kill Victor's enigmatic and psychopathic assassin, Felix, aka Buckley. Before they depart, though, Miranda calls Cecilia to let her know that she'll be made to pay for obviously being the one to tip off Victor that Miranda was still in New York. Panicking, Cecilia attempts to buy her safety by giving Miranda the time and location that Victor will meet his driver, providing an opportunity to take out not just the monkey but the organ grinder as well.

The FBI, meanwhile, is closing in. Van and Kim get the word that the bloody fingerprints inside the broken bottle are Cassie's, which Van thinks proves his theory, but Kim still believes there's more to the story. They also learn that Agent Chavez was dumped in an alley with his throat slashed, raising the stakes of the investigation higher still.

Using Cecilia's tip-off, Miranda is able to ambush Victor and hold him at gunpoint. Their conversation reveals that Felix had gotten a bit slash-happy during his encounter with Alex, killing him before confirming the location of the account numbers and encryptions, which were of course in the copy of Crime and Punishment that Cassie had taken. I can't help but wish we'd seen more of Victor throughout this season, or perhaps that he'd been left alive, but alas, he

draws his gun on Miranda and she's forced to fatally shoot him, although he does manage to nick her in the leg.

That leaves Felix, and thanks to the delay in going after Victor and the obvious wound Miranda has when she finally arrives at the airport, Cassie is left to deal with him alone. She first encounters him in the airport and fakes that he's attacking her to buy herself time to get to the hotel. Meanwhile, Miranda catches another flight and Annie provides Kim with a treasure trove of incriminating evidence and also recognizes Buckley on the hotel security footage from Bangkok, confirming he's obviously not who he says. Everyone is converging on Rome in "Arrivals & Departures".

Cassie, though, is already there, and with the help of Enrico is able to acquire a gun for protection that also prompts more flashbacks to the car crash that killed her father. Cuoco once again delivers great work in a scene in which Cassie comforts her guilt-ridden younger self, telling her how this incident won't define her for the rest of her life. Miranda has also made it to Rome and actually runs into Felix before Cassie does, fighting him in the hotel elevator. Miranda still rules, but the next Cassie sees of her, she's looking a little worse for wear in her hotel room bathtub, with Felix standing over her waiting to ambush his real target. Another fight ensues, during which Enrico gets stabbed and Felix gets shot, first by Cassie and then by, of all people, Shane, who arrives out of nowhere to save the day.

Shane, it turns out, is an undercover CIA agent who has been spying on Megan after her treasonous sales of proprietary technology to the North Korean government — and you thought flight attendants just told you where the exits were! Megan's on the run and is one of the few characters who doesn't get an ending in "Arrivals & Departures". In fact, she's one of the main threads that one imagines a second season would tug on. She leaves behind some cash, a note, and a flash drive for her son and husband, promising she'll fix what she's done.

Her latest mission takes her to Berlin, where she is told to simply observe and photograph a man in a hotel — nothing more. However, after a quick run-in with

coworker Shane (who drew her into the spy biz), things start to go wrong. Cassie's rival Jada is lead attendant on the flight, and she is not buying Cassie's new sober, making-better-choices attitude. Then she nearly blows her CIA cover with new colleague Grace.

Personal drama and such near-misses are the least of Cassie's worries. Arriving at a German hotel, she spots her mark but is interrupted by a seemingly random couple who claim to have

been on her flight. However, the two are not as innocent as they appear, as they clone Cassie's phone without her noticing. She then disobeys Benjamin's orders and interacts with her mark at the bar, discovering that he, too, is recovering alcoholic, and works as a courier.

Cassie of course proceeds to follow the mysterious man all across Berlin to his pick-up point, where he retrieves a manilla envelope. Cassie then tracks him to a different hotel, and finagles herself a bird's-eye view of the room he enters. There, she watches as he and a mysterious, blonde woman (who conspicuously has the same back tattoo as our in-over-her-head flight attendant!) engage in some hot and heavy BDSM.

Cassie is not the only voyer out in the town tonight. Right above Courier and Blonde Lady's room is a group of men who appear to be listening in on their activity. Cassie frantically tries to get photos of it all, but is spotted by the men in the higher room, who quickly close their curtains to conceal their operation. Courier then hands Blonde Lady the envelope he picked up earlier, exchanging it for a silver briefcase.

Cassie rushes out to follow Courier but is interrupted by a call from Megan, who appears to be hiding out in some sort of dive bar. But killing Hawk only gets the group in deeper trouble as we see them being chased by other North Korean agents.

As for Annie and Max, the two blondes invading Cassie's house plan to hurt the two even more if they disclose Cassie's location, this is irrespective of Annie insisting that Cassie is on a flight away. The torture seems to take hold when one of them finds a lead for Cassie in Iceland. Turns out the psychotic couple are after Megan and, not Cassie. As for the person impersonating Cassie, we see only a bloody knife in her hand. Presumably, she has murdered yet again.

Cassie, Megan, Charlie and Miranda escape their chasers with the help of a personal helicopter. Megan bids goodbye to Charlie and goes on to travel with Cassie and Miranda but, Charlie gives her a necklace, some bluefin bucks and poison mushrooms as the last token of love. Shane, whereas, is on the scene to investigate the crime Miranda committed and, sends out leads that Megan and Cassie are travelling together in a plane to LA. Miranda finds her way out of helping Cassie further but, not before she hands Cassie a little gift of safety equipment.

On landing in LA, Cassie watches the news about two dead bodies in Echo Park which she assumes is dropped by the woman impersonating her. She puts Megan at her sponsor, Brenda's house for one night to stay. Cassie meets Max and Annie at a restaurant and, gets to know the entire scenario. However, with the double murder at the lake, Cassie decides to go to the CIA as things are piling up one after the other. The episode ends with Cassie finding a drunk Benjamin at the CIA office and ending up blowing up her perfect life by having sex with him.

Annie finds Cassie hungover on the floor of the apartment. Cassie confesses about lying regarding her sobriety as well as how she has slipped back, making her a terrible person. Annie handles her best friend with logic and love and, asks her to go with Davey to New York for the forgiveness letter reading thing for her father. However, Benjamin knocks at Cassie's door as she and Annie are discussing their life problems and, Cassie sneaks out the door and questions him

from the back door to avoid Benjamin as Annie opens the door and questions him.

Cassie and David board the plane on their trip to read the forgiveness letter at their father's grave and help out their mother with clearing out things (as long as she isn't there in the house).
