Summary: With his retirement from the CIA eminent, Luke prepares for his next adventure, but revelations at home and an urgent matter at work upend his plans.



The episode starts in Antwerp as Luke Brunner burns a dumpster and heads out, communicating with Barry in comms, who helps him infiltrate the fire brigade and head into the diamond district. All of this is a ruse, given Luke's real objective is to slip underground and break into the vault from below. The objective here is to break out a bunch of diamonds, which Luke takes and manages to hightail it out of there without being spotted.

This whole diamond gig is actually a ruse to bring in a top diamond seller and figure out who his boss is. While Barry organizes a strike from afar, it becomes clear that Luke Brunner is actually a CIA agent. He makes it out the base in one piece, completing his final mission and finally retiring from the CIA, with plans to return to the US as a hero and a retired agent.

We then cut forward to New York, where Luke returns home with a gift for Emma (which happens to be a Kitchen-Aid). He also has a gift for his granddaughter, Romi, whom he gives one of the stolen Congolese warlord's diamonds, which he kept hold of. Barry is not happy, pointing out that this is evidence.

There's a recurring joke about an ice cream Cake in the middle of this, which is pretty funny, but it's thrown into the midst of an awkward family situation. Luke is divorced, and he seems to be a bit of a loner, and without Tally by his side, he believes that a ticket over to a big ship is just the ticket to get her back.

Before he can return though, Barry is in with big news. They're about to lose one of their operatives, who has a codename of Panda. She's been in Guyana for a while and is seemingly wrapped up with Omar Polonia's son, who has decided to pick up his father's mantle and now has over 400 members helping to distribute illegal arms. Oh, and he also has a suitcase nuke too.

Boro is the man's name and he intends to hold an auction, where all the biggest and baddest criminals are going to converge and try to get the weapon. Unfortunately, Troy (Boro's right-hand man) has figured out Panda is a planted agent and given they've lost communication, they have 36 hours until Troy is back in Guyana and exposes Panda. They need someone Boro trusts... and that calls for Finn Hoss.

Finn happens to be Luke's codename and given the orders have come from HQ, he's torn over wanting to try and patch things up with Tally, but she's already dating a guy from work called Donnie, which Luke is not happy about.

In Guyana, Luke meets Cain, Boro's first lieutenant. He's pretty distrusting of him but after patting him down, he shows up in Boro's camp. After being shown around, Luke is shocked to find Danielle DeRosa in the ring fighting for money. Dani is actually his daughter Emma, and she's right in the thick of all this.

Emma shows her skills in the ring, as it becomes clear that she's actually Panda, part of the CIA and apparently she has the strongest skills, her recall, problem-solving skills and IQ are completely off the charts. She was born to do this and took the job after college. Three years they've been in this and the CIA created a "Chinese Wall" to keep her and her father separate.

Luke is not happy that his daughter has been lying, and while she walks away, there are bigger problems afoot. They have until 4am before Troy lands and need to try and resolve this issue before it's too late.

During the party, Luke is encouraged to "go to Dani" by Boro who insinuates that he has experience with her. Grinning awkwardly for now, Luke is slipped a note by a guy called William, who knows that he's a plant. He wants Luke's help in getting his family to get out; he's terrified.

Emma believes that this is a trap and that they should be selfish, but Luke is not so sure. Either way, given Emma has been here longer, she's the one in charge for now.

At the airstrip, Emma and Luke end up arguing and don't realize that they completely run over their guy down there. We then cut across to the next morning, where Emma points out that she's the best shot in the compound... but then there's a super awkward moment when Emma has her lipstick vibrate across her desk.

Emma is furious at Luke for being responsible for the divorce and claims that her situation is not the same, given she's perfect at everything and doesn't have a family. Luke tries to make amends but they end up coming unstuck when the bodies Emma decides to dump down at the rice paddies, wash upstream. The vertical slit on their throat is identical to Luke's trademark, and their cover is blown.

Luke and Emma manage to grab the nuke suitcase after faking an accelerated countdown, and with Will and his family grabbing a ride, they head down to the airstrip together. However, they're surrounded by Boro and his men at the last, while Barry is nowhere to be found.

The episode starts where we left off. Boro and his men show up and demand to know who Luke and Emma are working with. With William's daughter threatened with a gun, Luke buys them precious time by discussing Boro's father's last moments.

A helicopter flies overhead, with bullets raining down on the foes. However, Boro manages to get away unscathed, while Emma saves Luke's life by killing one of the goons herself, smugly retorting that she has the highest scores in marks-

manship.

24 hours later, CIA director Dot decides that Emma and Luke are going to have to work together for the future case to bring in Boro given they've both been working on this. Dot points out that Emma's hot-headed nature and cockiness could have resulted in officers being killed. Remember Panda's comms going down? Well, Dot tells Luke in confidence that Emma actually chose to turn it off herself, given she was close to getting the nuke back.

Emma and Luke naturally come to blows, with the former telling her father not to screw up this case like he screwed up their family. It leaves him with no choice but to head back to Barry and hack into Donnie's laptop to learn more about the man trying to date his ex wife. After Luke amusingly misuses the word cuckold, he also learns that Donnie is investing in his son's MyAisle app too.

A briefing at work is called, and after being introduced to an analyst on loan from the NSA, Tina Mukerji, Boro's daddy issues mirror that of Emma and Luke. The group soon learn that Boro is still alive after trying to fake his death, and appears to be en-route to somewhere in eastern Europe or Asia. His auction is still on so it seems like he's going to create another nuke briefcase.

The group later learn that Boro is off in Kazakhstan, where he intends to move a tanker-worth of Cesium 137 which is being transported in a Maglev train. The only play is to try and stop the train, suck the waste into a tanker truck and take off. Everyone is heading in undercover.

As for Luke and Emma, they're forced to attend mandatory therapy sessions with the operational psychologist, Dr Louis Pfeffer. He's the in-house analyst, and it causes even more drama between the daddy/daughter duo when Luke is the one who's in charge of this case.

There's a hilarious family dinner that night, ending with Luke leaving in disappointment and Barry's Ice cream cupcakes, brought in by Donnie, is thrown into the bushes. This is followed up by therapy, which similarly doesn't go entirely to plan!

9pm hits and the group prepare to head out. Luke gives a rare compliment to Emma for spotting an inconsistency with his gear, while Emma feels the strain of lying to her boyfriend about being on another mission.

Given Luke is supposed to be a professional, in a busy train carriage he touches his ear, speaks to Barry and talks about Operation Don. I mean, could he be any more obvious? Anyway, Emma shows up and points out inconsistencies with the different passengers, including someone eating pork. However, Luke decides she needs to stand down and wait for now.

Before the chokepoint, Luke jumps in all guns blazing when a helicopter arrives and begins to take the Celsius 137 from the air. Emma though is more annoyed that the BLT guy in the corner happens to be a plant, something she alluded to earlier in the episode.

Luke and Emma decide to speed up the train in order to stop Boro, who's in a helicopter above. Unfortunately, Barry ends up miscommunicating with him given he's still spying on Donnie. This misunderstanding leads Luke to speed up the train way too much, with the pair en-route to disaster.

The episode starts with Emma deciding to warm up the magnets with nuclear sludge. Luke decides to use their magnetic suits to help, the ones from their therapy session last chapter. With both Luke and Emma on either side of the carriage, they finally listen to one another and work together to bring the hose in and warm the magnets. It works to slow the train down and they breathe a sigh of relief

Boro manages to get away given his plan is foiled, but Emma and Luke do

take a massive step forward given they've learned to work together. Emma is still struggling with balancing her work and lying to Carter, but promises him a wild night.

Remember William? Unfortunately, Boro has him held captive and demand he tell them everything about Luke and Emma. With the threat of torture on the cards, William sobs and tells him that all he knows are two words — violin and Emma. Unfortunately, his leg is cut off all the same, despite giving this intel. Boro takes this info and launches a cyber manhunt for bringing Emma to him. And the prize? 1 million dollars.

On the Tally-Ho (Luke's ship he intends to use as a gesture to get Tally back), Tina is there too, the woman from the NSA. It's clear that Barry has a crush on her, but Tina is more fixated on work right now. She's set up a bot alert on her phone to ping whenever anything about the radioactive material (and by extension Boro) pops up. Well, a story about a Moldovan scientist being kidnapped shows up just then, and that seems to be their next play.

Emma has another moment with Carter back home when he mentions kids, which certainly spooks her. Thankfully, Luke is on hand to take Emma away but en-route to the office, he mentions how he's on board with her "no children" policy.

Luke is not sure that Carter is the right guy for her, given she needs to be challenged and stimulated by whoever her partner is. He doubts that Carter is that guy. Given Luke had a

moment just before this with Tally, practically begging her to hop about his boat in front of Donnie, he's maybe not the best judge of character!

Back at the CIA, Dot briefs the team over their next play. The Moldovan applied physicist is called Dr Karl Novac and he was in Ireland on a goodwill plan. He actually authored a paper on how to extract and augment fissile nuclear material from nuclear waste. They don't have much to go on but it does play into Boro's hands, given this is what he's after.

Similarly, Aldon is put into play as the "pooh bear" of this operation, serving as the honeypot to trap Nika Stalinovich, a mid-level manager with low self-esteem who also happens to have Novac's files on her computer. Emma isn't exactly happy with this honeypotting, believing it to be an excuse for frat boy behaviour. However, it turns out Aldon doesn't like it either and he opens up to her later in the episode, admitting that he's never been in a real relationship and sometimes feels awful about what he has to do.

As fate would have it, it turns out it's not Nika after all but actually Nik A. As a result, Aldon is out and Emma will need to be put in place, especially as he's not gay. So Emma heads in to do her best, with Aldon watching on. In the truck happens to be Roo and Luke, who work out where his house is. As they get into place, Emma is invited back to Nik's place.

Tina and Barry work to get rid of the faraday cage that limits comms inside the building, but there's an awkward moment when Emma drops her phone while kissing Nik. He picks it up and notices the mobile game, the same one used to decrypt the data from Nik's laptop. It's touch and go for a while, as Luke manages to fix the connection, and the group download the data.

Emma goes all-in with her honeypotting, as they take things into the bedroom where she severs her communication with the group and proceeds to start spanking Nik, given that's one of his fetishes. Emma finds the safe and breaks in, taking the hard copy of the research papers. A click of a gun prompts her to turn slowly though, as Nik wakes up and points a gun at her.

All of this was a switch and bait, and Dane actually wants to go back to prison, realizing that this is what's best for his children. He doesn't want to be on the run for the rest of his life. With inspections beginning, it's touch and go before they can make the switch. Barry though, does manage to hold his own against a guard, whom he actually kills before switching places with Dane and bagging himself a date with Tina and the admiration of Luke.

Thankfully, there's that diamond from episode 1 that should do the trick, and it's enough to convince Kyle to play ball.

While this is going on, Dot calls a meeting to discuss what they should do with Boro. They could keep him indefinitely if that's what it calls for, and they know that he has ties to various different terrorist organizations across the globe and could help unlock all of this and do great work. Emma and Roo are in favour of torture, but the others most certainly are not.

When Emma and Luke head in to question Boro, our antagonist comes up with an ulterior plan. He wants a house arrest order in Bora Bora, complete with a waterproof ankle bracelet. It's still a prison but a nice one. Should Luke and Emma refuse this offer, it would also mean they leave without the buyers either. On their way out the room, Boro notices that Emma has a ring on her finger.

Dot stops Boro from being tortured at the last second, confirming to Emma that an extradition order has come down from OFAC. They lose custody of Boro in 48 hours, while Dot reminds Emma that not everyone can fly off the handle and curse their superiors like she can. Dot lays down the law, reminding her that if she continues in this manner, Emma will have a choice between tech support and unemployment.

Luke heads in to see Boro before he's carted off, following a chat with Dot regarding the scar on her face. It wasn't an IED that caused it after all, it was actually torture.

In the meeting room though, Boro points out that he communicates with his buyers via the dark web. They're pinged once he uploads an authentication video to confirm he has the bomb and it's operational. They have a state-sponsored satellite all ready to go to trace the bomb's unique signature and once they sort everything, there will be ice cube emojis sent, and will ultimately open up a big list of all the potential buyers.

When they show up together, Carter happens to be there and he starts to exhibit doubts over Emma's story. In fact, he confides in Luke and asks for advice. Luke actually does him a solid and suggests that he work on trying to fight for her.

At the hospital, the Fitness bros send Tally the video they shot that night of Kyle being wheeled into Merry Fitness and tortured. After watching it, she confronts Luke and asks how he managed to pay off Kyle. He confirms that he managed to change his mind, which causes Tally's face to immediately drop.

Luke decides Emma needs to have a day off from work and suggests they go on a family day together to help get her head back in the game. However, Emma is against the idea as she thinks a better use of her time is to hang with Carter.

Dot calls a meeting for everyone at work, and after some sketchy side-eyed glances between Luke, Aldon and Emma, the team are briefed on where they are right now. Dot believes that Boro is going to have his weapons ready for sale in ten days or less. Their play though is a high-stakes card game occurring in the next couple of days. Boro's right hand man Cain is going to be there.

Cain is their target, and given all the phones are locked away during the game, it's the perfect opportunity to smuggle some operatives in and use planted mobiles to extract Cain's GPS data which should, in theory, allow them to learn where he's been and Boro's exact location too. Given Cain knows some of the operatives, it limits those able to head in. This means it's Barry and Tina who need to head in. But without any experience, how are they going to do this? Well, it comes from a special AI algorithm, a planted card shuffler and special glasses.

Tally speaks to Luke about the video she's been sent by the Twinning Formula guys and asks for the truth. Well, Luke lies again, believing that the best course of action is to pretend that they

just spooked Kyle, and Aldon was hired for just this gig. Although Tally believes him, it doesn't dissuade her curiosity, as she wants to see the company books to stop the Formula guys from sniffing around Merry Fitness. Even Tally knows there's something shady going on. So naturally, Luke lies once more and decides that Barry is actually a big gambler with a serious problem and they've been fiddling the books to quell that.

While Tina and Barry get set up for the big card game, they need to get rid of two players who would have been in their place to make all of this legit. And that comes from the married couple of the Biryukov's.

There's a new mission in place to break into their heavily guarded mansion, and taking their spots in the game. While Aldon and Luke head off to look around the mansion, Roo and Emma take their eye off the ball, losing the couple. It turns out the Biryukov's aren't quite so innocent as we thought, and as a result of a scuffle, everyone ends up locked in a fallout bunker.

Roo (whose actual name is Ruth) starts to get worried, until they come up with a convoluted plan to speed up the CPU on the old computer there to clock the date through to 2000 and open up the doors.

Whilst they wait, secrets are spilled as Emma is shocked to learn Luke told Carter the truth about her cheating. As she begins to kick off, Roo gets involved and puts everyone in their place. Things are exacerbated further though when Aldon speaks up and admits that for him, the kiss meant a lot more. He's liked her ever since their mission in Moldova.

At the game, Barry is tasked with posing as a Nigerian, while Tina is a suave French woman. Together, they drop off their phones and prepare for the game. However, Boro shows and it changes the mission drastically, with Barry and Tina needing to kill our big boss. Well, they decide to poison Boro with a special alcoholic drink that'll kill him in 30 minutes... the same length of time they have until the data is extracted from the phones, so it's pretty touch and go.

Everything is thrown into chaos when a Russian big boss called Volek arrives in the middle of the game, admitting that he has a mole planted within the CIA. This mole, codenamed Songbird, can help find out who Finn and Danielle really are. In exchange, Volek wants the auction cancelled and the nuclear weapons kept for himself.

As they come to an agreement, there's chaos with the cards as a drink is spilled and it disrupts the shuffler, which short-circuits and leaves the CIA in the dark. Even worse, the drink for Boro is taken by one of the card players, Dimitri, who decides to drink it himself.

Back in the bunker, Luke admits that he managed to convince Tally to hop aboard his ship where they "got together", while Emma lets slip that she's the one who played matchmaker with Donnie after her parents broke up. She saw how Donnie looked at Tally so Emma helped him take Luke's place. She actually ends the conversation with a pretty nasty retort about his parenting, admitting that she regrets her parents ever getting together. Everybody ignores Emma when the bunker doors do finally open.

The card game finishes while the poisoned Dimitri is framed as a cheater by Barry and Tina, who buy the group just enough time to make it until the end of the game without being outed as spies. Dot though, is as sharp as she is intelligent, and she confronts Luke back at the office. Remember the pet lizard in the Biryukov house earlier on? Well, Luke actually smuggled it out after the mission and into shipments with the Twinning Brothers, who have their assets frozen and their business left in tatters.

Speaking of tatters, the team itself is also in pieces. Emma tries in vain to apologize to Luke, while Luke decides he's going to invest in his son's MyAisle app after all. It's a really nice moment and arguably one of the best of the season, as he finally does something nice for his son.

In the group meeting, Dot is despaired when she learns all the group issues that are currently unresolved. She bemoans them, shaking her head and calling them kindergarteners.
