Summary: In the beginning and eleven years ago, two immortal beings decide that it might not be time to start an Apocalypse.



The episode opens at the beginning of time, as our God, voiced by Frances McDormand, narrates the first days on Earth. We swoop down to the Garden Of Eden with Adam and Eve. Two other-worldly beings, demon Crowley and angel Aziraphale, watch as the first two humans walk into the choked desert, having been banished from Eden thanks to the infamous apple incident. At this point, they discuss God's great plan and joke about morality and His divine plan.

After bragging about his exploits on Earth, Crowley is tasked with bringing about Armageddon by Hell while Aziraphale eats sushi in a nearby restaurant, blissfully unaware what's about to transpire. Meanwhile, a woman goes into labour and as she reaches the hospital, the sisters are briefed on what to do. They need to switch the babies and make sure the couple in question are given the prophesied Antichrist. The sisters, as it happens, work for Crowley and as he arrives, he re-emphasizes the importance of switching the babies.

With everything seemingly going according to plan, Crowley calls Aziraphale and they meet in St. James' Park to discuss the coming apocalypse. Refusing to help Crowley thwart the big plan, the demon reminds his friend they have 11 years until Armageddon is upon them. With the babies switched and Aziraphale having second thoughts, they decide to band together and be the child's Godfathers, raising him to be normal in a ploy to stop Armageddon.

We then jump forward 5 years to find Crowley posing as a nanny and Aziraphale as a gardener. They try and influence the boy as best they can but he appears very normal for now. They report in to their head offices before we jump forward again to present day (6 days before the end of the world to be precise) with Warlock preparing for his birthday and Aziraphale discussing with Crowley what to do next. He suggests killing the boy which the angel scoffs at until he realizes it could just work.

Before they can get that far however, it turns out they have the wrong boy. In the great switch, all of them were deceived. The real Antichrist (Adam) is in the woods playing with his friends somewhere in rural England where the scheduled hell-hound shows up, just in time for his 11th birthday. Calling it dog, Adam's new pet reverts to a small dog and the two hit it off immediately. Crowley catches wind that the dog has found its master and realizes the end of the world is finally upon them.

Despite several time jumps and a slightly confusing narrative, Good Omens soon settles into its role and delivers a thoroughly enjoyable episode to start this 6-part drama. The comedy is on-point throughout and the nicely worked twist at the end does well to keep things interesting. With our characters realizing they have the wrong boy, Good Omens sets the stage nicely for the episodes to follow.

Summary:	Having followed the wrong boy for years, Aziraphale and Crowley must now try to locate the whereabouts of real Antichrist. Perhaps the story of Agnes Nutter and her famous prophecies will hold the answer?



The episode begins with head office checking on Crowley's progress with the Antichrist. Informing them there's nothing to worry about, he hides the fact he may have been following the wrong child for the last 11 years. Aziraphale fears as much, lying to his superiors around what's happening with the boy too. With only 2 days remaining until Armageddon, things certainly do hang in the balance.

We then cut back in time to see a Witch Hunt take place for a woman named Agnes Nutter whose prophecies

stand the test of time, right through to present day where they wind up in a Malibu home in California. This prophecy revolves around finding the heart of darkness and destroying it. Could this be linked to the Antichrist? Anathema thinks as much, as she packs her things up and heads for Britain.

Meanwhile, Crowley scolds his houseplants in one of the most memorable moments of the episode, before joining Aziraphale and tracking down the real Antichrist. Adam, however, walks

through the woods playing British Inquisition, unbeknownst to him that Anathema arrives and greets them in passing. She continues on her way, oblivious to Adam's importance while Aziraphale and Crowley arrive at the property.

After switching paint balls for real bullets, Crowley comes across one of the Nuns from 11 years prior and asks her about the baby swap. It turns out one of the demons, Hastur, has burnt all the records from that night. As they drive off in search of the Antichrist, they hit Anathema in the woods, prompting Aziraphale to hastily offer her a lift. After dropping her off at the village, she accidentally leaves her book of prophecies in the car which Aziraphale finds and hastily takes it with him inside his book store. As it happens, the prophecy inside is actually intended for himself and as he reads the words, he realizes he holds the key to finding out who the Antichrist is.

The numbers 6 "threescore" 6 show up in the words of the book. "It's can't be that simple... can it?" he ponders before reaching for the phone to find out. The number rings and a voice answers; lo and behold, he gets through to the right house for the Antichrist.

Summary:	We follow Aziraphale and Crowley's friendship across the ages. Meanwhile, in the present day, Agnes Nutter's descendant Anathema arrives in Tadfield on her own mission to save the world.



Taking a slight break from the ongoing Apocalypse saga, Good Omens jumps back in time to show Crowley and Aziraphale's relationship through the years, from the Great Flood and King Arthur through to Shakespeare and the Nazi's. This section works well too, breaking the episode up sufficiently while deepening the complicated relationship between our Angel and Demon. It's a great way to start the episode too and a good chunk of the run-time is dedicated to showing this, which works surprisingly well.

Back in present time, Aziraphale contemplates his next move while Anathema smashes up pots and curses her recklessness with losing the book of prophecies in the back of the car. However, she gets talking to a passing Adam who invites her in to her house. Breaking the curse hanging over Dog, Adam commands his pet into the house too and we see the horse-shoe above the door, the protection against evil, dim from the angry shade of red it adopts. They get talking and she explains she's an occultist but can't explain why she can't see his aura.

Meanwhile, Aziraphale calls on the help of his witch-hunting friends to investigate the town of Tadfield where he believes the Antichrist is. Deciding to stick to the side of Good and help

them win the upcoming war, he severs ties with Crowley despite their tight bond over the years. Begrudgingly, he walks away from them while Aziraphale watches on, trying to convince himself he's done the right thing.

The episode then ends with the Adam heading to bed where voices coerce him into letting his dreams become reality. We then cut to a Nuclear plant where it's revealed the nuclear reactor has turned into a sherbet lemon, signalling the start of the apocalypse.

Summary: Aziraphale and Crowley's friendship is tested to the limit as their superiors catch up with them. Armageddon starts in earnest, with the Antichrist's powers wreaking havoc across the globe.



After the last episode where we saw more of the relationship between Crowley and Aziraphale, Good Omens returns to show the two horsemen preparing to ride. Aziraphale pleads with Gabriel to discuss matters with God while Atlantis rises from the ocean depths. However, Angel Michael uses the back channels to investigate Aziraphale further, given his links with Crowley. Armed with photos in hand, Michael rushes off to find out more.

With Pestilence retired from horsemen duties, the third horseman, Pollution, takes over and joins Death as they ride out to join the other two horsemen. With the apocalypse in full swing, the Demons prepare for Armageddon in the depths of Hell, awaiting the arrival of Warlock. Of course, as we know he happens to be the wrong Antichrist, with the real one, Adam, continuing to conjure up his heart's desires courtesy of the voices in his head. "Make it happen, make it so" They murmur, as Adam flexes the reach of his powers, saving the whales by unleashing the Kraken which hungrily devours ships at sea.

Finally realizing he's been duped by Crowley, Hastur and Ligur arrive at his apartment, looking for the demon and ready to unleash vengeance. Tricked by a bucket of holy water, Ligur is burnt alive, leaving Hastur slightly hesitant to come closer to Crowley. After a brief stare-down (and a history lesson into the physic-bending properties of Demons), Hastur follows Crowley into cyberspace before our demon escapes and traps the Duke Of Hell within.

Meanwhile, back at Tadfield Anathema attempts to maintain control of the situation while Adam conjures up a tornado and the whole town begins to succumb to Adam's rule. With things looking bleak, Aziraphale demands to speak to God, managing to get through to the Metatron — the spokesperson for God. He tells him they want to win, not avoid, the war on Earth and proceeds to tell him a multi-nation nuclear war will be the end of civilization. Before he can protest, Shadwell appears, confusing him for a demon. Crowley falls into the circle and winds up ascending to Heaven before a candle tips and burns the bookstore to the ground, including the book of Prophecies.

Summary:	Aziraphale and Crowley race towards Tadfield airbase as they attempt to prevent Adam and the Four Horsemen from beginning the apocalypse. But one has been disincorporated and the other is trapped in a flaming motorway. Will they get there in time?



The episode picks up where it left off from before for its penultimate episode, with Crowley arriving at the burning wreckage of the bookshop. With him firmly in the bad books with Hell, especially after killing Ligur, Crowley heads off to bury his grief in alcohol while Adam continues to live up to his prophetic fate.

Back up in Heaven, the troops are being prepared for war but Aziraphale demands to be put back on Earth. Despite the angels telling him it can't be done, he steps over to the giant globe and touches

England; disintegrating into the globe and back to Earth. Only, he appears as an apparition where he tells Crowley to head to the airfield where the end of the world is supposed to take place. After joking about sharing a body together, he fades out in search of a host.

With 1 hour 43 minutes to go until the end of the world, Aziraphale manages to inhabit the body of Tracey while Crowley gets stuck in the biggest traffic jam ever seen. Ironically, this jam happens to be his own creation. While our demon sits stewing in traffic, Hastur manages to escape from the telephone and appears next to Crowley in his car after killing all the telephone operators, grinning and telling him it's all over.

Aziraphale, still inhabiting Tracey's, tells Sergeant Shardwell all about the Antichrist as he arrives at the house. Speaking of, Adam himself manages to scare away his friends and dog, with the voices in his head telling him he doesn't need them anymore. Adam realizes what he's done though and launches himself into the sky. With an almighty roar, he turns back into Adam again and presumably shakes free of the menacing grip the hell demons had over him. He grabs Dog and the others, telling them it's not over and they need to go to the end of the world and stop it with him.

All our characters then converge at Tadfield airfield where the end of the world is scheduled to start. The four horsemen arrive first and they firmly take control of the apocalypse starting, causing the electrics to go haywire and prepping the launch of nuclear warheads the world over. Adam then arrives and rides into the airbase while Aziraphale waits patiently at the gates with Shardwell. Having disposed of Hastur, Crowley arrives in his flaming car, making a grand entrance as the four horsemen catch wind of the Antichrist's arrival.

Summary: Can Adam, Crowley and Aziraphale work together to fight the powers of Heaven and Hell and prevent the apocalypse? And what fate awaits them if they do? The story reaches its conclusion, and it might just be the end of the world.



The episode begins at the end — with Crowley on trial in Hell for his crimes and sentenced to death. Before we can get there though, we jump back in time to the moments prior to him arriving at the airbase.

With a gun in tow, they hurry to stop Adam before it's too late. Aziraphale readies himself to shoot the Antichrist but Tracey takes control and stops him at the last second. Adam watches the blast spiral into the sky before deciding they should be two people again and they turn

back to normal. Despite the antagonisms from the four horsemen, Adam's friends step forward and intellectually challenge them, defeating their physical prowess with wishes while Anathema stops the nuclear launches with some ingenious engineering.

However, despite everything being resolved on Earth, Gabriel and Lord Beelzebub arrive from Heaven and Hell, telling Adam he must re-launch the Apocalypse. Adam refuses and as things

look set to become more serious, Aziraphale steps forward and asks if the plan they're referring to is the Great Plan or the Ineffable Plan, explaining they can't really know God's ultimate plans. Realizing that the rogue Angel may have a point, they instead tell the Antichrist's father what's happened. His real Father that is; Satan.

Aziraphale, Crowley and Adam are all whisked away to a desert plain where the two otherworldly beings advise him to try and change the world for the better. Offering him words of wisdom, they're all dropped back on Earth where Adam rejects Satan. Unable to contain his rage, Satan looks set to destroy everything but Adam is defiant, stepping forward and denying his real Father given his absence from his life, causing him to fade from existence. At this point, Adam essentially changes the world, re-writing the past and present. Aziraphale's bookshop returns, un-burnt, as does Crowley's prized car. However Adam himself is grounded by his real parents.

All seems well until Crowley sees Death while in the park, booming the word "ineffable", resulting in Aziraphale tied up and taken away by the angels while Crowley himself is taken by the demons. They're sentenced to the worst death for their treachery — hellfire for the angel and holy water for the demon. However, in an interesting twist of fate, both of them wind up unscathed from their punishments, having seemingly transcended beyond their forms. With both Heaven and Hell letting them go for now, they return to Earth and wait until no one is watching before switching back to their original forms, having fooled everyone.

The episode, and series, then ends with Adam chasing after his friends after having initially let them go, waving at Anathema on the way who burns the last of the prophecies.

Yep, humans are the centre of existence with the universe and its stars being a fancy wallpaper for them to gaze upon. Crowley is not happy and hopes to make a few suggestions. When Aziraphale

warns him about questioning God, Crowley wonders what the worst can happen. However, they enjoy the view with Crowley covering Aziraphale with his wing as stars are born.

It cuts to present-day London with landlord Aziraphale foregoing rent from Maggie, who can barely keep her record shop afloat, in exchange for some records. Elsewhere, Crowley is reading a newspaper and berating about how pointless life is while being visited by Shax. She hints that something is up, in Up and for him to let her know if he knows anything about it. He brushes it off.

Maggie is getting quite friendly with the coffee shop owner Nina who knows her as a regular. Their conversation is cut short as they and the rest of the street notice a naked Gabriel with a box walking towards Aziraphale's bookshop. Aziraphale is shocked not only to see that he is naked but that the archangel doesn't seem to remember him.

In a roundabout way, Aziraphale finally gleans out bits and pieces — something terrible was to happen to Gabriel so he left, he has a box that is important and he thinks Aziraphale can help. The box which was left outside in the confusion seems to be empty except for an insect which Aziraphale doesn't notice.

Meanwhile, Archangel Michael has declared that anyone found helping Gabriel will face 'extreme sanctions'. Crowley is trying to show Shax the ropes who not only calls but also teleports to give him news. Gabriel is in trouble and Crowley is delighted.

Do you know who is not delighted? Aziraphale, who is trying to get answers out of an amnesiac Gabriel, who is simply fascinated by hot chocolate. Aziraphale decides to hide him by giving him the name Jim and calling Crowley for help. The duo meet at Nina's cafe and she asks Aziraphale about his naked friend which has Crowley confused.

With Aziraphale acting weirder than usual, the demon guesses that something is up. They head back to the bookshop and Crowley gets a jumpscare as he spots a naked Gabriel covered in just a blanket. While Aziraphale wants to help him, Crowley doesn't want anything to do with the archangel who had tried to kill them. They part ways as Aziraphale refuses to let Crowley dump Gabriel somewhere.

Just as Nina is closing for the night, Maggie arrives with a record for her. But when the cafe owner doesn't show any enthusiasm, Maggie is awkward and apologises. Nina also lets it known that she has a partner, Lindsay who doesn't like it when she's late and doesn't text back.

Outside, a furious Crowley is unable to check his anger and explodes. The consequential lightning accidentally blows out the power in Nina's cafe and she and Maggie are locked in while their phones are dead.

Upstairs, Uriel and Michael are having a face-off on who should replace Gabriel as the supreme archangel. A lower-rung angel, Muriel brings a clue — a matchbox that has a Bible verse by Job. While there is nothing else special about it, it gives one big clue. It has something to do with Gabriel and he is on Earth.

As for Crowley, Beelzebub pays him a visit and takes him back to hell. The demon offers a proposal — bring Gabriel's in exchange for a hefty promotion. He also lets it known that Heaven is not too happy and if anyone is seen helping Gabriel will face 'extreme sanctions' aka erasure from existence. Poor Crowley panics for his friend and rushes back to the bookstore.

A stuck Maggie and Nina try to bond as the latter cannot understand why Maggie runs a records shop in this day and age. Maggie reveals that the shop was her family's and was part of the Fell Bookshop because of which Aziraphale is always kind to her. Nina, on the hand, drinks and worries about Lindsay who is probably annoyed by her tardiness. They spot Crowley and call out to him for help. He simply brings the power back and they are shocked.

Back in the bookshop, Aziraphale plays hard to get and wants an apology dance from Crowley. When he refuses, Aziraphale points out all the times he had to do it (Cromwell's rise, French Revolution, World War II — did Crowley predict these moments and Aziraphale refused to believe him?). Crowley gives in and bursts into a little song and dance and the angel is satisfied.

Back to business, they come up with a plan to hide Gabriel. They each are to do half a miracle to hide the archangel from Heaven and Hell and no alarm bells will supposedly go off in either of their sectors. While they think they have succeeded, Heaven is blaring with alarms and the archangels have noticed that Aziraphale has performed a half miracle. Michael deduces that he knows something.

The episode begins with Demon Crowley being sent to the Land of Uz to destroy Job's lambs. Aziraphale shows up ready to stop him and they catch up as he is surprised to see Crowley. But as they go back to business, Crowley refuses to stop the destruction as he has a permit from God!

Aziraphale is shocked and goes to Heaven to recheck. He is aghast at learning that God has made a bet with Satan. Satan claims that Job, God's favourite human is a strong believer because God

is kind to him. So God has allowed Satan to take away his prized possessions aka Job's trials. If Job's faith doesn't waver, he will be rewarded twofold including double the children. Oh, but his old existing children that he loves will stay dead.

Back in present-day London, Gabriel is trying to help by arranging the books in order of the first letter of the book's sentence. Tired, Aziraphale lets him be till he hears Gabriel singing a song. Elsewhere, Shax shows up and threatens Crowley unless he helps Hell. She also reveals that an archangel-scale miracle took place at the bookshop and so Crowley must know something.

Back at the bookshop, Aziraphale decides to ask Maggie about the song but she is too busy crying over Nina. She narrates how she made a fool of herself the other day and that she is in love with Nina. Aziraphale hopes to help but he has run out of miracles and she further beats herself up for telling him about her tragic love life.

On to the song, she says it is the 1957 song 'Everyday' by Buddy Holly. Aziraphale asks for a record and she pulls out tons of them. Turns out, she has a tie-up with an Edinburgh pub, The Resurrectionist (the very same pub whose name is written on the matchbox found by Muriel). Unfortunately, every single record she has sent has ended up magically playing 'Everyday' and so they have sent it all back to her.

Before Aziraphale can look into it, he feels archangels on Earth. He rushes back in time to see Saraqael, Uriel and Michael in front of his bookshop. As they ask about Gabriel, the amnesiac

archangel welcomes them in and introduces himself as Jim, the book-seller assistant who is also sometimes called Gabriel.

But they don't find anything amiss as Crowley and Aziraphale's miracle holds — they don't recognize Gabriel. They declare that an archangel-worthy miracle took place and Aziraphale tries to cover up by saying it was just him helping Maggie and Nina fall in love. They state that they will send someone to verify the love miracle and leave.

Following some research, Aziraphale calls Crowley to a pub next door. He immediately regrets it as he is swept into hosting a monthly get-together for the local traders and shopkeepers association. Crowley wonders why they couldn't just meet at the cafe and Aziraphale says the cafe owner is part of the problem. He explains how he needs to get Nina to fall in love with Maggie and Crowley fails to see how it is their problem.

Aziraphale reveals how he messed up and now the archangels are going to send someone to verify his 'love miracle'. They then get to discussing how to fix it with Crowley suggesting Richard Curtis' move of having two people taking shelter under torrential rain and falling in love. Aziraphale, on the other hand, wants a Jane Austen moment and Crowley is surprised to hear she is the same person as an iconic female thief he knew back in the day.

Anywho, they head back to the bookshop and ask Gabriel about the song. He cannot seem to remember but when he tries extra hard, he gets back a memory from way back. His eyes go purple and he says a phrase before panicking and saying he should not remember those memories. As he goes to rest, Crowley points out that Gabriel just said the same phrase that God told Job.

We are finally shown what really went down during Job's trial. Crowley heads to the mansion to kill Job's children. Aziraphale tries to stop him when he suddenly notices that the crows are bleating. Turns out, Crowley never killed the goats but disguised them as crows.

Aziraphale is over the moon upon learning that Crowley is siding with him. When they finally meet the kids, the eldest two are annoying and Aziraphale almost worries that Crowley may go back on his word. But he simply turns them all into lizards.

The next day God finally speaks to Job. God keeps asking him if he knew how God made the world, ostriches and whales. When he returns, his wife, Sitis is confused by the turn of events. At that moment, Gabriel, Michael and the other angels appear before them and reward them with double the cattle. The couple only cares about their kids, and the angels say they will get new children.

Before Sitis can curse them all, Crowley shows up, pretending to be an old acquaintance, Bildad the Shuhite and claims he is a midwife. He and Aziraphale tell her to play along and declare that she is ready to give birth. With Gabriel only having seen Eve's birth, they pretend that Sitis has pulled out 3 of Job's ribs. As they hug, the fake bones disappear and Crowley turns the children back into humans.

Michael wonders why they are not babies and Gabriel claims kids probably come in all shapes and sizes like Eve. Of course, the annoying son, Ennon keeps insisting that they are all the old children. Michael and Gabriel almost catch on and turn to Aziraphale for an answer. Crowley looks at him knowingly, and after much hesitation, Aziraphale swears that the kids are the new children. The matter is solved and the archangels are happy.

Back in the present, Crowley leaves while Aziraphale wonders about the record. Outside, Crowley runs into Nina who asks him about his powers and he just brushes it off. He asks her how she feels about sheltering under torrential rain and looks at Maggie. Nina thinks he is insinuating that she and Maggie are a thing, and she vehemently refuses, going as far as to say that getting locked together was a terrible day for her. Ouch.

They move along only for Crowley to now be interrupted by Aziraphale. With his 90-year-old driving license, the angel wants to take 'their' Bentley to the Edinburgh pub to investigate while Crowley is to look after 'their' bookshop and Gabriel. The demon tries to refuse but who can refuse Aziraphale?

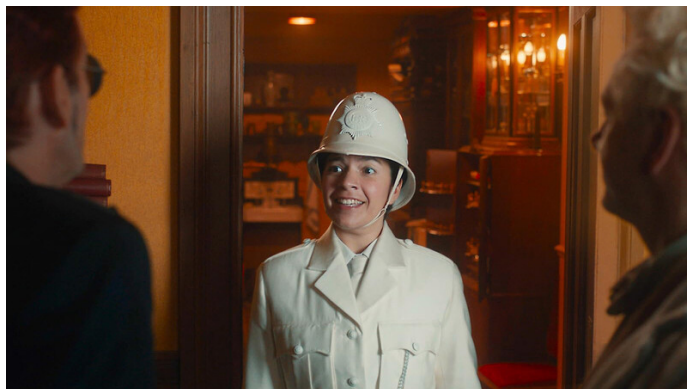
We get one last flashback to explain why Crowley has such a strong bond with him. After Job's trial, a crying Aziraphale goes to Crowley and says he is ready to go to Hell. Crowley doesn't understand and Aziraphale thinks he is going to hell for lying.

Crowley says he won't tell anyone if Aziraphale doesn't. Aziraphale is just an angel who goes along with Heaven as far as he can just like Crowley listens to Hell as long as it works for him. They accept that it can get lonely and sit together while looking at the horizon.

Summary: In 1827, Aziraphale learns that good is sometimes evil and evil is sometimes good. In the present, the angel drives to Edinburgh to check out his Clue.



The episode begins with a regular commenting that her coffee is bad whenever Nina is in a fight with Lindsay. They notice Muriel dressed up in an all-white police uniform heading to the Fell Bookshop.

Muriel announces that she is a human police sent to keep an eye on Aziraphale while Crowley grumbles about the angel taking his car to Edinburgh. The duo are amused as they mess around with Muriel who keeps trying to pretend that she is a 200-year-old human whose name is In-

spector Constable. They promise to tell her everything Aziraphale does and she falls for it.

Alone together, they deduce that she has been sent to verify the 'love miracle'. They tell her that humans take time to fall in love and even send her to do some recce with poor Muriel point-blank asking a confused Nina about her love life. As for Crowley, he needs to run the bookshop but not sell any books, look after Gabriel and worry about Aziraphale ruining his car as he heads to The Resurrectionist pub.

In a flashback, we see that the duo is in Edinburgh being surprised by an eerily accurate statue of Gabriel at a graveyard. They spot a girl named Elspeth digging up bodies to pay for food. Aziraphale is scandalised as Crowley helps her. The angel goes on and on about the wrongs of stealing bodies and Elspeth's friend, Morag agrees. But both Elspeth and Crowley point out that being paid for the body which can then be used for food and shelter trumps righteousness.

In the present, Aziraphale has a swell time with the Bentley that he has completely changed. Classical music plays on the radio, he is going below the speed limit, honking at other cars and has turned the car yellow. Crowley feels the changes and his voice comes through the radio as he threatens Aziraphale to step on the pedal otherwise he will start selling books.

Beelzebub is having an existential crisis as she wonders what it feels like to be appreciated for doing a good job. Gabriel is fascinated by gravity and keeps hounding Crowley with questions. They notice a fly and he points out how flies are an exception to gravity. Crowley could care less as he is more interested in Operation Lovebirds and how to get Nina and Maggie to fall in love.

In Victorian Edinburgh, Aziraphale disapproves Elspeth's cadaver hunting and sabotages it. They show up at a Mr. Darlymple's establishment with the body that has turned into soup courtesy of Aziraphale's miracle. Elspeth stomps out while the Aziraphale decides to learn a little bit more about the graverobbing to stop it at its root.

Darlymple points out how studying dead bodies can help save lives more effectively and recalls a young boy with cancer that he failed to save. This moves the angel. He goes back to Elspeth and declares that he has changed his mind and she has his full permission. Morag, however, is still uneasy about it but agrees to help them dig up a new body.

It goes awfully wrong as Morag is scared by a dead body and is fatally shot by a trap set up by rich people to stop grave-robbing. The duo is surprised by Elspeth's callous reaction of taking Morag's body to Darlymple who underpays her. She steals some laudanum and decides to kill herself and join Morag. While Aziraphale tries to reason with her, Crowley simply drinks the laudanum.

He starts behaving drunkenly and ends up shrinking and growing like a giant. The other two are confused till Aziraphale realises that Crowley is trying to scare her. The giant demon declares that suicide is a sin and the only way out is for Aziraphale to give all his money to Elspeth and use it for good. She promises to live a good life and leaves, now a rich woman.

Aziraphale is impressed with Crowley's quick thinking who just blames it on the laudanum. The angel also worries as it might have alerted Hell. Before Crowley can cast away his fears he is sucked into Hell for his punishment.

In the present day, Aziraphale heads to the pub to see that it is an ode to Darlymple. He asks the bartender who recognizes Gabriel's picture and reveals that the archangel used to frequent the pub with another acquaintance. He heads to the graveyard and borrows a phone from two menacing people.

He calls Crowley to fill him in on his new findings. With Aziraphale not actually having any new information, Crowley cuts the call on spotting Maggie and Nina together. While Maggie confronts Nina for giving her the cold shoulder, Crowley calls forth rain. The girls take shelter under a clothed roof with Nina apologising as she was actually angry at Lindsay for thinking she was having an affair with Maggie.

Nina offhandedly comments that she is probably not Maggie's type but Maggie says she is. As they lock eyes, Crowley cheers from the shop. However, at that moment the clothed roof breaks and they are drenched in the rain. Shocked and annoyed, Nina stomps off with Maggie rushing to catch up with her.

But the moment is definitely gone and Crowley tells Gabriel his tempest failed. This triggers Gabriel who relays a dark prophecy on a tempest and of the dead rising. When the trance breaks, Gabriel has no idea what he just said.

At that moment, Shax pays Crowley a visit and announces that Hell is close to declaring war on Aziraphale as they have discerned that he is probably hiding Gabriel in his bookshop. Crowley brushes it off and curtly shuts the door on her. However, he is actually worried for Aziraphale and tries to threaten Gabriel but sees it is futile as the archangel has no idea what is going on.

The episode begins with Aziraphale taking up a hitchhiker who ends up being Shax. She wonders why Crowley is risking his neck for Aziraphale by hiding Gabriel for him. She comments that Aziraphale isn't Crowley's type but remembers hearing a rumour a while back that they were an item.

She didn't believe it back then especially since following up on that rumour had led to a demon Furfur being demoted for not being able to bring evidence. Aziraphale keeps trying to deny that he is

the very same Aziraphale but she just asks him to let her out.

She tricks him into revealing Gabriel's location by thanking him for telling her that he is in a bookshop. Aziraphale asks how did he tell her and she catches him. He never did, but his response gave it away that her guess of the bookshop was right.

It cuts to London 1941 when Crowley demonically intervenes and a bomb explodes in the church where he and Aziraphale are meeting with 3 Nazi spies. However, the spies don't die immediately and overhear Aziraphale thanking Crowley for his help. The demon even offers him a ride back to town as he has some work at a theatre.

Down in Hell, the Demon Furfur is tired of having to process the newly killed. Shax comes up with a proposition. She can help him get promoted to the Temptations Department if he alerts her of any angel-demon collaborations. Uh oh!

Back to work, Furfur is busy processing the newly-killed 3 Nazis — Greta, Glozier and Harmony. They keep grumbling as the bomb was never meant for the church but East-End London. Harmony blames Crowley and Furfur's ears perk up. They state that someone called Aziraphale and Crowley worked together to cause a demonic intervention in a church.

Meanwhile, Mrs. Henderson of the Camelot Theatre is furious to see that the whiskey Crowley was smuggling in for her has been smashed due to the bomb. She is fed up with the constant problems as they don't even have a magician any more. With Aziraphale wanting to thank Crowley for his help in the church, he offers his services as a magician.

As for Hell, Furfur comes up with a deal — the 3 Nazis can either rot in Hell for eternity like their commander or go back to Earth as zombies. All they need to do is find evidence of Aziraphale and Crowley canoodling. Then alert him through a ring and he will arrive with a camera to capture evidence.

Since Furfur has a miracle blocker, the duo won't be able to perform any miracles and get away. The only catch is that the Nazis need to eat human brains or they will get super hungry. The trio agree and end up on Earth. After feasting on a scavenger at the church, they head to the pub opposite the bookshop to spy on the duo.

Inside, Crowley is sceptical while Aziraphale is over the moon as he has studied under a famous magician and even performed for Nefertiti. Crowley humours him and asks for a practice trick. At the pub, Harmony tries to lip-read Aziraphale only to say gibberish like banana, fish, gorilla, shoelace with dash of nutmeg and his compatriots are annoyed.

Crowley doubts Aziraphale's trick of replacing a farthing with a penny and tries to help by taking him to a magic shop. The 3 zombies follow them with Glozier disguising himself with props and entering the shop. The owner and Crowley are worried for Aziraphale who keeps fumbling and messing up the props while declaring he is to perform at the West-End theatre.

Aziraphale suddenly spots a magic rifle and bullet and his heart is set on it. The owner does his best to stop him as he says Aziraphale needs a trusted confidante who will shoot the rifle at him and a license. The angel simply looks at Crowley and is assured that he has the right man as he tells the demon to trust him. With Aziraphale having a license and even a gun, the owner has nothing left to do but sell the rifle.

In the back, Glozier is busy playing with the props and when the zombies outside signal him to alert Furfur, he ends up twisting a prop ring which squirts ink. With the duo leaving, the zombies just decide to eat the owner and then head to the theatre.

It is showtime and Aziraphale is suddenly nervous. The zombies are finally able to call Furfur who activates the miracle blocker which will work for 30 minutes. Aziraphale tries to perform a miracle for a warm-up magic trick and when it fails even Crowley gets nervous and starts diligently going through the manual. Mrs. Henderson urges them to get on with the main trick and Aziraphale hands Crowley the rifle.

The trick is for Crowley to shoot the bullet past Aziraphale's ear with the angel revealing a second hidden bullet in his mouth and claiming that he caught the bullet that was shot with his mouth. Of course, that is when Crowley offers to reveal that he has never shot a gun. The two start sweating and shaking with even the audience getting nervous for them.

Furfur takes a photograph of the two and then enjoys the show as he knows that if Crowley fails, they cannot perform any miracle to clean up the mess that will be the angel's face. However, after much suspense, Crowley shoots, the bullet whizzes past Aziraphale and the excited angel reveals the hidden bullet in his mouth. The crowd goes wild and everyone cheers.

While the duo celebrates backstage, Furfur arrives to gloat only to be disappointed that Crowley doesn't remember him. However, the plan is still on as he shows the duo the photograph of Aziraphale handing a rifle to Crowley. A nervous Aziraphale hands the photograph back to Furfur but Crowley is not worried.

Furfur being the demon he is, loopholes out of his deal with the zombies and says they had never mentioned anything about going back to being living human beings. The zombies consider it a win anyway and leave.

So does Furfur as he hands the envelope with the photograph to Hell's council. They open to find that it only contains a pamphlet of the Camelot show. Turns out, Aziraphale pulled one last magic trick, by replacing the photo with the pamphlet, which indeed involved saying the words 'banana, fish, gorilla, shoelace with dash of nutmeg'.

They drink together with Aziraphale commenting that he knew Crowley would come through. The demon simply says that it is because Aziraphale asked him to trust him. Aziraphale points out that he isn't as evil as he paints himself to be. The demon not only accepts it but says that while Heaven sees things in black and white, he prefers to blur the edges. They toast to shades of grey.

In the present, Shax informs Beelzebub that she knows Gabriel is in the bookshop. The senior demon simply acknowledges it and Shax pushes further, asking to lead an army. Beelzebub points out that they cannot enter unless invited and Shax tells her not to worry. Pumped up, Beelzebub agrees to give her an army.

Aziraphale returns to London and spots Nina who is still having a tiff with Lindsay. He hasn't found any other new information but Crowley is sure he will. He updates him that his rain and kiss plan didn't work so now it is Aziraphale's turn. He has just the right setting as the angel plans to host the shopkeeper and traders association monthly meeting.

Summary: Aziraphale tries to bring Maggie and Nina together. In Hell, Shax is determined to launch a full scale attack on the bookshop. Nina's heart is broken, as is a bookshop window. Gabriel has a close encounter with Mrs. Sandwich.



The episode begins with Aziraphale trying to recruit all the shopkeepers and traders on Whickber Street for the monthly meeting turned ball while Crowley tags along to watch his antics.

No one is interested but Aziraphale bribes them all with rare books such as a Doctor Who original manual for the pianist who is a Doctor Who fan. Crowley just plays around with a red fez cap and is amused with Aziraphale trying to speak French with a French cafe owner who speaks English fluently.

Meanwhile, Shax is trying to get Furfur to give her 10,000 demons to launch her attack on the bookshop. He just laughs and offers her 100. The number will keep going down if she insists. She agrees and hosts a meeting with a bunch of stragglers she calls her legion.

The Demon Eric keeps interrupting her as he points out that they are just 1/75th of a legion, there is no huge lift to take them up to Earth and that fighting angels can be dangerous. Frustrated, she just burns him.

While Crowley and Aziraphale bicker about how well the angel does or does not know French, Nina enjoys the show. Aziraphale takes the opportunity to invite her to the meeting and she agrees only because she has some strong words to say about the Christmas lights being used on the street. Delighted, Aziraphale leaves. Nina and Crowley share a conspiratorial glance as they joke about Aziraphale never hosting a meeting ever.

With Crowley looking at him, Nina asks how long they have been together or if the angel is his sidepiece. Crowley is suddenly adamant that nothing is going on between them and that Aziraphale is an angel. Nina seems to relate as she asks why their love life is not as straightforward as other people and Crowley is left thinking about it.

Aziraphale spots him drinking at the French cafe and asks why he doesn't wait at the bookshop. Crowley says he doesn't like it but Aziraphale believes otherwise. Crowley then brings up the amnesiac archangel who tried to kill him and wonders if Gabriel is just pretending to have lost his memories. Aziraphale says maybe they should talk it out. Meanwhile, Lindsay dumps Nina over a text message for being too self-centred.

Crowley approaches Gabriel and starts taking out his anger on him. He is furious that Gabriel tried to kill Aziraphale, his only friend. The archangel is sad and offers to do anything Crowley wants. The demon tells him to jump off the window and Gabriel heads to the window.

Stunned, Crowley tells him to stop just before he can jump. He is frustrated and tries to get answers out of Gabriel who says he feels like an empty house that cannot remember where the furnitures are but has an inkling. He tries to remember and recalls taking his memories and putting them in a matchbox.

Said matchbox is in Heaven with Muriel reporting to Michael and Uriel. They are frustrated that she couldn't learn of the duo's plan because she had given them privacy. As for news on Gabriel, they almost catch on that Aziraphale does not have a book-seller assistant and wonder who Jim is.

Gabriel and Crowley end up bonding with the demon bringing him a hot chocolate. Gabriel compliments him that he is nice and Crowley warns him not to tell anyone as no one would believe him anyway.

Downstairs, Aziraphale is busy turning the bookshop into a ballroom. He sends Crowley out to make sure Maggie and Nina are attending and the demon can't help but look at Aziraphale in a new light. Mrs. Sandwich arrives and we see that her casual outfit has turned into a gown the moment she enters. Everyone is dressed for a ball and is talking as if they are in a Jane Austen novel.

However, Operation Lovebirds almost fails as a brokenhearted Nina wants to go home. Crowley suddenly notices something is off and orders her to go to the bookshop as it is the only safe place. Inside, Nina finds something is off and while she is supposed to be angry and sad she cannot feel it. It seems that everyone is in a trance but no one cares.

One of the discussions is between Ms. Cheng and Mrs. Sandwich about the latter's profession. She cannot stop saying that she is a seamstress and after she describes her job we learn that she is a sex worker (in the 19th century, seamstress was code for prostitutes).

While Maggie heads to the bookshop, Crowley suddenly notices dozens of strange masked people following her. He stops them and takes off their masks to see that they are all demons after Gabriel. Confused, he scolds them for breaking the rules and rushes in. He is as surprised as Maggie and Nina as everyone is dancing and socialising.

Maggie asks Nina for a dance and while they enjoy it, they also seem to be aware of the trance that everyone is in including them. They are confused about the ballroom dancing and everyone's *Pride And Prejudice*-type speech. Frustrated, Nina lets it slip that Lindsay has broken up with her probably cause she is hard-work. Maggie says she doesn't mind it and the two lock eyes.

Gabriel is having the time of his life being a waiter dressed in a bedazzled blue suit while Mrs. Sandwich and the rest fawn over him. Crowley tries to tell Aziraphale about the danger outside but the angel pulls him in for a dance. As they dance, Crowley tries to get Aziraphale to take the danger outside seriously. Suddenly, Shax throws a rock through the window with the etching 'Surrender the Angle'.

Aziraphale tries to threaten the demons but Shax points out that he is an outcast and she can just keep killing humans till they give Gabriel. Crowley makes up a fake rule that they need to give time to evacuate humans as per the laws of battle. Gabriel sees that the fuss is being made over him and offers to go outside much to Aziraphale's chagrin.

But when Gabriel steps outside, no one recognises him and Shax keeps berating him to tell the duo to send out Gabriel. Confused, he heads in and Crowley realises that their miracle has ruined Gabriel's surrender.

They quickly line up the guests in a row with Crowley leading them away from the demons. Maggie and Nina decide to stay back to help Aziraphale who doesn't look too worried as he tells them Crowley likes rescuing him. Nina just cocks an eyebrow and wonders why he doesn't make his own rescue plans for once.

Outside, once the humans are away from the horde, Crowley spots Muriel and tells her to arrest him and take him to Heaven. She is dumbfounded that he saw through her human disguise

and wonders if he is tricking her. He points out that she has arrested him and she nods and takes him to heaven.

Summary: Crowley becomes a Heavenly bee and learns the truth about the Armageddon sequel. Aziraphale defends his bookshop from Shax's army. Maggie and Nina become warriors. Crowley and Aziraphale get to the bottom of the mystery of the Matchbox.



The episode begins with Aziraphale, Maggie and Nina defending the bookshop after Maggie accidentally invites the demons in. As they strategise, Nina asks about the Jane Austen-esque ball only to hear Aziraphale set it up to matchmake her and Maggie. Fire extinguishers and encyclopedias are thrown at the demons with Aziraphale even opening a gate to Heaven which burns up the demons.

Meanwhile, in Heaven, Muriel realises that Crowley has tricked her. He dresses up as an angel so no one catches him and

tells her that since she is anyway in trouble she should just pull out Gabriel's record. She doesn't have clearance to open it and is shocked when he does — he was after all a high-ranking angel who helped create the universe.

They see the recording of a meeting with the higher-ups planning an armageddon 2.0. However, Gabriel refuses. Saraquel catches Crowley but says since he is halfway through he might as well see the trial.

The other angels want to cast down Gabriel at his trial. Metatron points out that if multiple angels are cast down it will look like there is an institutional problem. Hence Gabriel will just be demoted, his memory erased and his tailored suits taken away. Gabriel accepts it and tells them he will be back after taking off his suit and clearing his desk.

The CCTV footage shows Gabriel taking off his suit, putting something in the matchstick, putting the matchstick in a box but then dropping it when he writes on the bottom of the box. Naked, he heads to Earth while the archangels wait for him in the trial room. Michael suddenly realises that Gabriel doesn't have a desk. Saraquel tries to erase his memory but sees that it is missing.

Back on Earth, with the demons gaining at them, Aziraphale burns the demons except for Shax with his halo. Alarm bells go off in Heaven as Saraquel states that this is an act of war against Hell. Exasperated, Crowley heads back to Earth with the archangels and Muriel tagging along.

At that moment, Beelzebub, Furfur and Dagon arrive ready for war. Crowley stops them all and asks for the box Gabriel brought. They see that he had written that he is in the fly. Beelzebub notices the only fly in the room. It has been hanging out at the bookshop since Gabriel's arrival with the box. It must have fallen out of the matchstick and into the box.

She gives it to Gabriel after Crowley convinces everyone that the bumbling book-seller Jim is unrecognizable because of their half miracle which apparently can be as powerful as an archangel's if a demon and angel work together. Turns out, Gabriel put all of his memories in the fly before Saraquel could erase them. The fly goes into Gabriel's eye and he gets all his memories back.

He had met with Beelzebub after the season 1 armageddon had flopped and planned an armageddon 2.0 before changing their mind. Even though they have no reason to meet, they keep on meeting whether it is to pretend to drink beer or listen to music.

Beelzebub likes 'Every Day' by Buddy Holly and Gabriel tweaks the jukebox at The Resurrectionist pub to play that song forever. She gives him the fly which works like a Tardis — a container that is bigger on the inside and he is moved as no one has given him anything before.

Everyone is shocked to hear that Gabriel had meant to go to Beelzebub and not Aziraphale. The archangel and the demonic overlord hold hands and hint at their feelings for each other. Maggie finding it romantic has Michael wanting to turn the humans into salt.

Crowley quickly ushers the humans outside and Nina accepts Maggie's help with the cafe as the line of customers is huge. Metatron orders a cup of coffee and also comments on her shop's name — Give Me Coffee Or Give Me Death. He asks if anyone has asked for death and says it is predictable when Nina says no.

While Crowley is heading back to the bookshop, he notices and smiles at the clamour inside and how Aziraphale shushes everyone. Hell wants to punish Gabriel and Beelzebub for being traitors while Heaven wants to order the punishment of sending the traitors to Hell.

Crowley suggests fleeing to Alpha Centauri and the traitorous duo agrees. Shax cannot seem to let them go but Beelzebub tempts her by passing on her title of Duke of Hell to Shax. She and Gabriel leave and now Michael reminds Aziraphale of 'extreme sanctions'.

At that moment, Metatron enters and shushes them as Michael has no such authority. He sends them all back to Heaven except for Muriel who is trying to make herself as inconspicuous as possible. He asks Aziraphale for a walk and as the angel looks expectantly at Crowley, the demon shoos him out. Metatron drops his smile as he stares at Crowley before exiting.

Crowley talks about wanting some 'us time' and an alcoholic breakfast at the Ritz with Aziraphale to process things. Muriel thinks it includes her and he very clearly says no and sends her out as well by giving her a book by Iain Banks.

He cleans up the space and keeps looking at the watch while waiting for Aziraphale. Maggie and Nina arrive and give him a stern talk down about not pairing up people even if they had good intentions. Nina says she will not treat Maggie as a rebound and hopes Maggie will wait for her when she is ready. It is the same as Crowley who never trusts anyone while Aziraphale is like Maggie. The humans say that he and Aziraphale need to talk as well.

As they leave an excited Aziraphale enters. The talk gets to Crowley and he is ready to confess something but Aziraphale stops him. Metatron has come up with the most brilliant proposal — he can appoint Aziraphale as the supreme archangel and give Crowley back his angelic status. Crowley is surprised that Aziraphale didn't say no as Heaven did try to end the world. Aziraphale believes he can run things differently and Crowley is frustrated.

Instead of getting into a fight, he decides to say what he wanted to say in case he never gets a chance again. It starts off as an awkward but romantic proposal as Crowley states that they have always relied on each other and never needed anyone. Heaven and Hell are toxic and he wants to run away with Aziraphale just like Gabriel and Beelzebub did.

Aziraphale asks him to come with him to Heaven and Crowley points out that the angel cannot leave his bookshop. Aziraphale says nothing lasts and a disappointed Crowley agrees. Aziraphale says they can be together as angels and that he needs Crowley. The demon sighs and points out

that no nightingales are singing. He looks sad as he says it could have been just the two of them together and Aziraphale looks away.

Crowley suddenly walks up to him and kisses him. Aziraphale is stunned and it looks like he is going to say something but he doesn't. Instead, he says he forgives Crowley and the demon scoffs and walks away. Aziraphale tries to compose himself while touching his lips.

Metatron enters and doesn't look surprised that Crowley rejected the offer. Aziraphale is torn and asks about his bookshop. Metatron states that Muriel will take care of it and they head to the elevator to Heaven, as Crowley watches them. Metatron is excited as he has big plans such as the Second Coming which has Aziraphale stopping in his footsteps. He looks at Crowley one last time before stepping into the elevator.

Crowley looks at Maggie and Nina and then drives off in his car. 'A Nightingale Sang in Berkeley Square' plays on the radio but Crowley instantly stops it.
