Summary:	Luke Ellis wakes up at The Institute, a facility that abducts teenagers with psychic powers; Ms. Sigsby, the place's charismatic director, claims they're saving the world; Tim Jamieson hides from his haunted past as a small-town night knocker.



As the episode begins, Luke Ellis is shown taking a test among other students. Luke raises his hand and surprises everyone when he says he's already finished. Later, a group of students approaches Luke to ask about his age. One girl gets upset that she got the answer wrong. Another asks Luke whether it's weird being him. At home, Luke plays basketball with Rolf. Elsewhere, Tim Jamieson waits to board his plane. Tim offers to give up his seat for \$600 and a cash refund for his ticket. He

calls Keith to say he's not going to make it to New York. A woman stops and picks up Tim. She offers to take him to Maine if he helps her unload all of her books. Eileen Ellis and Herb Ellis talk to their son, Luke, about MIT. Herb says they're talking about uprooting their lives here. Luke says there's so much to figure out that it makes him feel so small.

He goes on a rant about how he feels causing the pizza tray to flee from the table. Eileen says his brain is a gift. Herb reminds him the abyss will look back into him. Later, Luke researches MIT. Later, a group breaks into Luke's house to kidnap him. Tim helps unload boxes. He says goodbye to his new friend. Tim sees a flyer for the Dennison River Bend Police Department for a

nightknocker. He speaks to Chief John Ashworth about the position. John says he heard good things about Tim from the Boston Police Department. He was Officer of the Year in 2020. John mentions the incident at Westfield Mall. The guy he shot supposedly had an AR and 200 rounds. Tim says he was a 16-year-old kid and he hadn't shot anyone. John argues the kid drew down on a cop. Tim explains that he was off-duty at the time. He had been drinking. The Department made him resign or he'd be dismissed. John offers him the job. Tim accepts it and says he'll start tonight. Tim wakes up and looks around his room.

When he opens the windows, he is nearly blinded by the bright lights. He steps out of his room and finds himself elsewhere. Kalisha speaks to him. Someone watches them using a camera feed. Kalisha tells Luke they're not in Minneapolis anymore. She already knows a lot about Luke. Kalisha asks if he has telepathy or telekinesis. She reads minds. Luke admits things sometimes move around her. Kalisha says they've been recruited. Their parents can't know anything. Ms. Sigsby runs the place. The medical stuff is handled by Dr. Daniel Hendricks. It's mostly tests and lots of shots. Ms. Sigsby talks to Daniel and Trevor Stackhouse about Luke and his behavior. Daniel thinks they should consider the boy for the PC track if he's as smart as Sigsby says. She says they're not having this conversation against because the PC track is on indefinite hold. Trevor points out that Luke is talking to himself. Sigsby says he does that a lot.

When Luke looks at the camera, Sigsby says she thinks he's ready for her. Kalisha tells Luke it's really not that bad there. She urges him to do what they tell him before kissing him. Trevor interrupts and tells Luke to get changed. Tim gets his equipment and instructions from Wendy Gullickson. Wendy says Ed Whitlock used to make six circuits each shift. Wendy and Drew Reynolds work on a schedule and get two nights off each week. They may have to shift Tim if he sticks around. Tim asks Wendy if she has an issue with him. Wendy says time will tell. He's just some guy off the street. Tim says his grandpa was a night knocker and that's why he applied. Luke seeks the girl who was in his room on the night in question. Then, he's taken to Sigsby who says Trevor Stackhouse is the Chief of Security. Dr. Hendricks is the architect of the cutting-edge science they do there. Luke wants to know what's going on. Once they're alone, Sigsby congratulates Luke for being there.

She claims he's going to partake in saving the world. Luke flatly says he wants to talk to his parents. Sigsby says this isn't a negotiation. If their work doesn't get done, the world will cease to exist. She warns Luke that there are grown-up consequences if he breaks any of the rules. He is told to follow any order from the staff. He'll be given tests and injections. Luke is told to comply with them. When he comes to the end of his service, they'll wipe his memory and send him home. Sigsby says his parents are alive. When he's back, Luke won't remember any of this. Luke leaves moments later. Tim gets to work. He runs into Annie Ledoux who describes herself as an old weirdo. She is listening to George Allman. Annie asks if he has any fillings in his mouth. She says he was smart enough to get gold. She mentions where porcelain comes from. Tim asks if she thinks the Chinese government is bugging their mouths. Annie seems to know certain things. She tells Tim to start listening to George's Gems.

Trevor speaks to the kidnapper, Michelle, about her next recruit. He warns her that it might be more difficult. Michelle claims the Ellis snatch only went wrong because they were forced to rush it. Trevor says as soon as the MIT news broke the Ellis kid was going to get a bunch of publicity. She wishes they could come on the Ops sometimes and see the consequences of their decision. When Michelle leaves the complex, she gets a message from Kate asking if she's on her way. A car approaches the guard gate. The guard tells the driver it's an infectious disease lab. The man, Will, gets directions before leaving. Maureen asks Luke if Sigsby explained about the tokens. The tokens are a reward for being a good cooperator. They can be used to get treated from the vending machines. Luke is taken to the testing room where he meets Tony who says he's going to chip his ear. Luke doesn't want to cooperate.

Tony hits him. Luke agrees to behave and get his ear chipped. Tim speaks to Norbert Hollister who shows him his bearded dragon. Norbert wouldn't be caught dead working for the Chief. Tim approaches Annie who is returning from a resupply run. Tim tells her he's been staying at Hollister's hotel. He helps her take her stuff back. Michelle meets Kate at a pub. Kate reminds her she was starting to tell her about the place where she works. Michelle can't talk about that. Kate says she knew she was a journalist when they met. Kate admits everyone in Dennison has a theory about what's going on in those woods. They make out. Tim does his rounds that night. He runs into Michelle and Kate at one point. They go into the Stanton Hotel and Tim continues.

Kalisha tells Luke she's going to bring him to dinner. As they walk together, she tells Luke about reading people's minds. They end up kissing again. Kalisha says she might be contagious. If he catches it, he'll be in the front half a little longer.

They meet George Iles and Iris. George learns Luke is a TK negative. He can't wait to tell Nicky Wilholm. George says TK positive is rare. He manages to knock over a glass without touching it. The janitor yells at him to clean it up. Nicky arrives moments later. He says George wants to believe everything is going to be alright. He has an injured hand, but claims he just fell. Nicky isn't cooperating so everyone else has been helping with tokens. Nicky mentions Diana went to the back half three days ago. They talk about playing chess. Nicky smokes a cigarette. He says they get the kids by offering them all the grown-up stuff they've been denied for so long. They even have wine coolers. Bobby Washington is almost 19. He's the oldest they know of, but he went to the back half a week ago. The youngest might be ten. In private, George tells Luke not to let Nicky pull him into his stuff. He admits they know when they're lying. Michelle suggests she might have a story bigger than Kate could imagine.

Michelle tries to find out who she could give the story to. She worries she's spent her whole life on the wrong path and this could be the one shot at redemption. Kate shoots her in the head. Then, she calls Trevor to say he was right and that Michelle was unreliable. Trevor sends a cleaning crew to her location. Sigsby goes to her home on the complex. Luke exits his room and roams around. When he steps outside, Nicky asks why they keep the playground open at night but don't keep it lit. Nicky invites Luke to play chess, but Luke says he's not in the mood. Sigsby listens to Warren Zevon's Werewolves of London. Luke plays chess with Nicky. Sigsby eats and dances. She gets a piece of metal hot on the stove before burning her leg with it. Tim continues his rounds. Luke beats Nicky very quickly. Nicky questions how smart he is. He's trying to decide whether Luke is the kid he's been waiting for and whether he's smart enough to know they can't stay in this place.

Nicky admits even Kalisha is still trying to believe in it. He explains he grew up in group homes and foster care so he's learned not to believe in the stories. He also knows no one is coming to rescue him. Luke says the place would've been shut down if anyone knew about it. Nicky suggests they can get themselves out. He asks Luke how they do that.

Summary:	Luke bonds with the other Front Half residents and begins plotting his escape; Ms. Sigsby manages the fallout from a security breach; in town, Tim begins to look into The Institute, only to find himself caught up in a high-stakes standoff.



The episode begins with Ms. Sigsby waking Luke Ellis to tell him that he doesn't want to be late for the party. By the time he gets to the party, the group is singing goodbye to Iris. Kalisha Benson tells Luke that Nicky Wilholm said he was going to find a way to help him. Luke tells her he is going to try to help all of them. He then asks her if she and Nicky are together. She says she doesn't know what they are. Shortly after this, Iris gets called away.

Tim Jamieson is on his way out when the hotel clerk asks him for help with

cleaning his iguana's cage. Tim helps him, and during the middle of this, the clerk mentions Wendy Gullickson calling for Tim. Tim immediately uses this as an excuse to get out of helping him.

At the station, Wendy tells Tim that she got a flash from the Staties that morning, and they think a two-man stick-up crew is headed their way. He asks her if she called him down there just to warn him, because she could have done that over the phone. She says the chief wanted to know if he wanted to carry a gun until they catch these men. He tells her he is all set.

Sigsby and Trevor Stackhouse have a conference call with someone about the traitor. The man on the phone tells Sigsby the best way to fill the vacancy is by moving someone over from her staff. She says they are already undermanned as it is. He says he needs their snatch teams to be at full strength, or he might have to tell the committee that she was unable to handle the number of targets she was assigned. She says she can handle it and asks if Stackhouse's reporter can fill in until they find a permanent replacement. The man on the phone asks Stackhouse how he feels about that. Stackhouse says he will make it so. After the call, Sigsby asks Stackhouse if he really managed to turn a reporter. He tells her he got her the job three years ago just for this kind of eventuality. She asks him if he really thinks she would compromise this place. He tells

her he knows she wouldn't because she would be just as screwed as the rest of them if anything ever came out.

Tony Fizzalle asks Luke what he expects today as he escorts him to the testing rooms. Luke says he is surprised he cares, but he'll save him some time by telling him he can't use his ability on demand. Tony says they will just have to find a way to activate it then. Seconds later, Luke is introduced to Dr. Daniel Hendricks and undergoes several tests.

Annie yells at Kelly Sloane in the streets and tells her that Zoe needs her. Tim sees this and intervenes. He invites Annie to breakfast to calm her down, but before she can turn him down, Drew Reynolds pulls up. Drew gets out and tells Annie that she can't keep bothering the Sloanes. Annie continues to mumble about people being in trouble and needing to save them. She goes on like this for several minutes but ends up walking away. When she is gone, Drew and Tim argue for a few minutes before Drew tells Tim to make sure Annie stays away from Kelly.

Hendricks tries to get Luke to use his ability, but he can't. He gets Tony to give him another shot to help him along, and it works. Afterward, he ends up throwing up. After testing, Luke goes to get something to eat and runs into Nicky. They briefly chat before a withered George Iles comes in from the Dream Box. Nicky tells Luke that the Dream Box is the final test before getting sent to the Back Half.

While Sigsby and Hendricks meet for a secret rendezvous, Luke and Nicky talk about knocking out the cameras for their escape. Luke determines that the only way to get past the cameras would be to recruit an inside man. Nicky doesn't think it is possible. Luke says it might be with a super powerful TP to read inside the staff's minds. Nicky reminds him that when anyone develops any real powers, they get shipped out. The conversation is interrupted when Luke notices black smoke coming from the back building. Nicky tells him it happens every week or so.

Tim is at the station when Wendy comes in and says Drew told her about Annie and him calming her down. He tells her he has experience with that kind of thing because of his mom. He also tells her that his mother's delusions always seemed a bit crazy, but there was some grain of truth to them. She tells him about Zoe's death and how it seemed a bit strange. He says he didn't realize Annie was here back when Zoe died. Wendy tells him she wasn't, but she must have heard the story. Tim also tells her about Annie, knowing what his mother used to call him. Wendy says that Annie can say some mind-bending stuff sometimes.

Luke finds George at the vending machine using his ability to get free snacks. George tells him Dream Box sucks, but it has done wonders for his TK. Luke asks him if he was able to move the lights. George says he doesn't really remember. Luke then joins Nicky and Kalisha. They spend a few minutes talking about Maureen and the spots where the cameras can't hear them. Luke also tells them they are getting a new kid tonight named Avery Dixon, and from the looks of his room, he looks pretty young.

Late that night, Luke walks the perimeter of the Institute while Tim does his rounds in town. When he finishes with his rounds, Tim stops by to see Annie. Not long into their conversation, a gunshot goes off. Tim follows it to a local gas station. He identifies himself as a police officer, but the robber shoots at him. They fire several shots and get away. Tim goes inside to find Gutaale Dobira shot. He grabs some supplies and goes to work saving his life.

Stackhouse finds Hendricks leaving his office and asks if he is burning the midnight oil. Hendricks says he is setting up for tomorrow and thinks they are one session away with George. Stackhouse says that's good because they are going to need him with the keyholes coming up. Stackhouse then asks about Luke and says even a moderate BDNF score with his IQ makes him extremely unique. Hendricks says his job is to actuate and invigorate his TP to where he can contribute to them hum. Stackhouse says that in certain cases, the subject's true value might lie elsewhere. Hendricks says he isn't using his position to scan for PCs. Stackhouse says that's complete bull crap, but well said.

By this time, Drew has shown up at the gas station. Tim tells him to call Wendy and tell her to call an ambulance and put out an APB on a Jeep with North Carolina plates, starting with WTB9.

Sigsby speaks with her father on the phone about his caretaker. She also pretends to be a third-grade teacher and makes up a whole story about reading books to her class.

Now outside, Hendricks and Stackhouse continue their conversation about finding individuals with PC potential. Hendricks tells Stackhouse they may share the same perspective, but some who work for the Institute do not. Sigsby is briefly shown watching them from her room while

Stackhouse tells Hendricks there are several groups of people who will pay large sums of money for kids with PC abilities.

The ambulance and the chief show up at the gas station. The EMTs stabilize Dobira, and the Chief tells Drew he did a good job with the APB. The Staties now think they have them cornered on the highway.

Luke wakes from his sleep, goes outside his room, and finds Avery on the ground crying. It isn't long before George, Nicky, and Kalisha show up to help as well. Nicky asks him if he wants a Reese's, but Kalisha says he is allergic. When they ask how she knows, she says he told her. Kalisha tells him this kid is strong and she's never felt one so strong. This is where the episode ends.

Summary:	Luke begins to plan his escape while Sigsby is distracted trying to expose Stackhouse's disloyalty; Tim loses a friend.



The episode begins with Tony escorting Luke to Dr. Hendricks for additional testing. Once securely restrained, Dr. Hendricks administers an injection of a strange green liquid to Luke. As the substance begins to take hold, Luke grows dizzy and his heart rate spikes. Dr. Hendricks instructs Luke to keep his eyes fixed on a screen until told otherwise, warning that if he looks away, Tony will slap him, and if he does it again, he will receive an electric shock.

As Dr. Hendricks starts up the machine, he instructs Luke to tell him if he begins to see dots on the screen. Luke struggles to stay looking at the screen, so Tony slaps him and forces him to look forward. Luke starts to see colorful dots but doesn't tell anyone. Dr. Hendricks stops the machine and walks over to Luke, who is now convulsing. Luke passes out but wakes up after a while. When he awakens, he asks Dr. Hendricks if he can go to his room and lie down. But Dr. Hendricks won't let him because he has another test for him.

He presents Luke with various cards and asks him to describe what he sees. Although the audience can clearly see the images on the cards, Luke is unable to. Growing frustrated, Luke starts shouting out random answers. This enrages Tony, leading him to deliver an electric shock. Luke is then brought back to his room.

Later in the cafeteria, Luke, Kalisha, and Nicky get to know Avery better and begin to discover just how powerful his telepathic abilities are. Maureen is in the cafeteria as well, listening in on their conversation. She then reports back to Ms. Sigsby what she's learned.

Back in the cafeteria, Kalisha reveals to Luke that she saw dots when she was in the dream box, meaning that she's going to Back Half soon. Luke asks her if there is any way she can fight dream box, and Kalisha responds that if you try to fight it, you could possibly get an embolism. Suddenly, a humming sound can be heard throughout the Institute. Luke asks the others what the sound was, and Kalisha tells him that they sometimes hear the noise. She tells him that she thinks it's coming from the Back Half.

Later, Luke and Avery are strolling through the Institute's hallways when they come across Maureen mopping the floor. Luke is trying to find a staff member they can trust to help them escape the Institute. He asks Avery for his opinion on whether they can trust her since he can read minds. But when Avery reads Maureen's mind, he discovers that she's hiding a lot of secrets. He shares with Luke that Maureen actually hates working at the Institute, but she can't be trusted because she reports back to Ms. Sigsby with everything they talk about.

Later on in the episode, Luke, Nicky, and Avery are hanging out at the playground. A security guard walks by with a dog, and Avery just stares at him. Luke and Nicky ask him what's wrong, and Avery explains that he can see what the dog sees. He shares that through the dog's eyes, he's able to see another playground located by the Back Half. Luke then asks him if he thinks there's a way they can dig through the ground to get over there, and Avery responds that he believes they can.

Their conversation is interrupted when Kalisha stumbles through the doors. She doesn't look good because she just came back from dream box. Luke asks her if her experience was bad, and Kalisha replies that she connected to "the hum" while in the dream box. Unfortunately, she's about to graduate to Back Half now.

It's graduation day for Kalisha, but the mood is far from celebratory. She and the others are clearly upset about her transfer to Back Half. After the brief ceremony in the cafeteria, everyone takes a moment to say their goodbyes. While Nicky shares a heartfelt moment with Kalisha, Luke pulls Maureen aside. He tells her he knows she's unhappy with the Institute and urges her to help them before it's too late. Maureen brushes him off, telling him to leave her alone. But as Luke walks away, it's clear she's considering his words.

Luke, Nicky, Kalisha, and Avery sit back at the table and all hold hands. Ms. Sigsby and a few staff members soon take notice and approach, informing them that it's time for Kalisha to leave. Tony then escorts an emotional Kalisha to Back Half. While this is going on, Luke is having Avery see through Kalisha's eyes. Ms. Sigsby watches them from her office on the security cameras. Once Kalisha walks through the doors of Back Half, Avery is unable to maintain the connection anymore.

When the mysterious humming sound occurs at the Institute, Annie hears it from her tent at Dennison River Bend, Maine. While Tim is out on patrol later on, he checks in with her. Annie tells him about the noise, but Tim admits he didn't hear anything. Suddenly, Annie begins talking to herself, muttering that someone was killed. She says the official explanation blames the incident on pilot error, but she insists out loud that the real cause was telepathy. She believes someone or some people caused the pilot to read the numbers wrong by using telepathy. Tim just stares at her in confusion. Annie then tells him to stay away from Route 10, aka where the Institute is located.

Later in the episode, Tim unwinds at a local bar after his shift when Kate notices him and starts a conversation. As they talk, a news report on the TV catches Tim's attention. It's about a recent plane crash that claimed the life of a senator. Tim tells Kate about his earlier conversation with Annie, who believes some form of mind control is happening at the mysterious facility on Route 10. He also relays Annie's claims about telepathy being used to manipulate the pilot, causing the crash. Tim thinks Annie might be onto something, especially since the details she mentioned match the news report. However, Kate shuts down the idea, dismissing it as conspiracy talk. They talk for a bit more before Kate leaves the bar.

At the very end of the third episode, Tim goes to check on Annie again and finds her lifeless body lying in her tent. He looks over and sees an empty alcohol bottle and some pills. Could Kate have had something to do with Annie's death? It looks like it!
