Summary: Stranded on a sinking boat, carefree Luffy begins his journey in search of a pirate king's lost treasure. But first, he'll need a crew, a ship and a map.



The episode begins in Loguetown 22 years back. The Marines, on behalf of the World Government, have been striving to keep the common people safe from the villainous pirates. Gold Roger is the so-called King of the Pirates and he's been captured, ready to be executed in front of everyone. He's made an example of in front of a huge crowd that have gathered to see this happen.

Vice-Admiral Garp declares the man's life forfeit but just before killing Gold Roger outright, Gold Roger speaks up and

declares his treasure free for anyone to find and that they should all take to the seas. As a result, Roger becomes a martyr as the crowd disperses and the man's final words change the world and bring about the Great Pirate Era.

The One Piece treasure is still out there... but where?

Fast forward to the present day and we're introduced to Monkey D. Luffy on his little boat, intent on becoming the King of the Pirates and finding the One Piece treasure. However, as the boat begins sinking, Luffy scrambles into a barrel and lets the ocean take him. Unfortunately, it takes him right into the heart of a big fight between Lady Alvida and her crew onboard their pink pirate ship, and another formidable band of pirates.

Lady Alvida comes out on top and Luffy's barrel is brought onboard. In doing so, we're introduced to Koby, the young man who becomes Luffy's first friend. Anyway, we're getting ahead of ourselves here! In the depths of the ship, Koby and Luffy meet. Koby is convinced that all pirates are scum and thieves, but Luffy gives a knowing smile and tells him this is wrong.

We then jump back 10 years to Windmill Village, catching us up to our current timeline. Luffy is an orphan but a determined one. He wants to be a fearsome pirate and embrace the freedom that it brings. To prove himself, he cuts his face with a knife in front of pirates in town, including their leader Shanks.

During these flashbacks, Shanks gets Luffy cleaned up but amongst the pirate's possessions, Luffy finds the Gum Gum Fruit, which he naturally gobbles up completely. This is what gives Luffy his special abilities. There's a pretty accurate sequence to the manga here as Shanks decides against fighting some mercenaries that show and stir up trouble. Luffy is not happy with Shanks not fighting back, calling him a coward. Shanks tries to explain that there's more to piracy than fighting all the time. When Luffy tries to leave, Shanks grabs his arm and Luffy shows off his abilities. Shanks is not happy.

We then cut back to Alvida's ship as Koby and Luffy are brought before the leader. Luffy encourages Koby to speak up and have some courage to tell Alvida what he really thinks, but the latter loses her temper and begins swinging her spiked mace around like she's Negan from *Walking Dead*. When it strikes Luffy, we see that he's no ordinary pirate. He's seemingly indestructible and has stretchy skin. He uses his signature Gum Gum Pistol move to knock Elvida clean off the boat.

We then cut to Sixis Island, where we're introduced to the mysterious Mr 7. He wants to recruit Zoro to his organization, known as Baroque Works. Zoro rejects the call to action, but Mr 7 is not happy with this. However, it does lead to a decent sword fight between Zoro and Mr 7, allowing us to see Zoro's skills first-hand. It ends with Mr 7 cut clean in half.

Elsewhere in the East Blue, a strange redhead called Nami washes up next to a pirate ship. She begs them for help and tries to hide a large chest. The two pirates scramble aboard, hungrily looking to open the chest which happens to hold... nothing. Nami is a tricky one, as she ends up duping them and taking off with their ship for herself, heading out with her map for parts unknown.

Back with Koby and Luffy, we learn that the former wants to be part of the Navy, which is his dream. They arrive at Shell Island, intent on finding a crew and sailing out of there. Before getting inside the base, the pair stop for some food. Whilst there, they run into Zoro who shows up with the deceased body of Mr 7. There's also Nami kicking about here too.

When a cocky Marine shows up looking like a Targaryen right out of *House of the Dragon* (Helmeppo), Zoro shows his skills in combat again, easily dispatching all the guards in quick succession. Helmeppo happens to be the son of Captain Morgan, who's in charge of the Marine division here.

Despite liking Zoro's skills, Morgan points out that assaulting a Marine officer need to be punished. And for that, Zoro is tied up out in the yard for 7 days. Nami sees all of this take place and poses as a marine, having earlier grabbed a uniform from one of the men at the bar. When she's spotted, it leads to her taking him out.

Elsewhere, Luffy sneaks into the courtyard through the grates leading under the base. Zoro explains he let himself be captured but Luffy knows that he's a good guy and should join his crew. Zoro naturally refuses.

On his way out, Luffy notices Nami in the basement and sees straight through her façade. He also promises to take her map for the Grand Line as well. This map belongs to Morgan, and he decides to just walk up and ask him. Well, luck be on their side as they stumble across him in the hallway.

Nami manages to talk her way out of suspicion, and during their chat Nami manages to steal Morgan's keys to open his office. She also refuses to join his crew when Luffy asks, pointing out that she hates pirates and will never join his crew.

Inside Morgan's office, they find a secret contraption leading to the desk sliding out the way to reveal a safe on the floor. Unfortunately the alarm rings not long after as their cover is blown. Luffy decides to use his abilities to straight up pull the safe out the ground, eventually seeing the pair tumble out the window and to the courtyard below, completely unharmed. Luffy and Nami

fight their way out of trouble, and with Zoro now free, he decides to join in rather than walk away.

Eventually this all leads to a stand-off between Captain Morgan and the team of Luffy, Nami and Zoro. Naturally, the trio come out on top and take a ship, back out onto the high seas again. The Vice-Admiral catches wind of what's happened in Shell Town, and learns that the map to Grand Line has been stolen. News of this also reaches the strange clown pirate, Buggy, as Luffy now seems to have a target painted on his back!

Summary:	Luffy, Zoro, and Nami find themselves imprisoned on an island overtaken by the deranged clown pirate, Buggy. Koby joins the Marines and proves his mettle.



The episode begins with more flashbacks, as we see Luffy practicing his powers in the bar. He's warned to be careful with his abilities by Makino, who points out that each Devil Fruit holds a unique ability but seawater can take it away just as quickly.

Shanks shows up and Luffy once more asks to join the crew, but he refuses, pointing out that when he leaves, he's not coming back. Luffy is crushed.

More flashbacks reveal Luffy being saved by Shanks out on the open sea, los-

ing an arm but managing to stave off a massive sea beast in the process. After, back on land, Shanks hands over the straw pirate hat to the young boy, promising to be back for it once he becomes a great pirate. "Be good, Luffy," He says, as the pair part ways.

Back in the present, Luffy enthusiastically points out that they have a good crew and he's impatient to open the safe they've gathered. Nami starts to lose her patience but they do manage to open the safe eventually. Inside they bring out the Grand Line map. There's no gold or treasures here, but the map itself is incredibly important.

Nami is an excellent navigator, and she explains to Luffy that the sea is divided into four different quadrants — East Blue, North Blue, West and South. The thin strip of land that circles the globe is called the Red Line. However, the band across the middle is called the Grand Line.

This is a treacherous stretch of ocean with much bigger islands, cities and pirates to contend with. This is where the One Piece could be hidden but Nami is convinced that it's a myth and it doesn't exist.

Just then, a giant red flare smashes overhead but the smoke knocks them all out. Thankfully, Luffy manages to swallow the map before they all pass out together. When they wake up, the crew find themselves captured. They believe they've been taken by Marines but Luffy is convinced that it's actually pirates. And we soon find out that it's the latter.

When the box opens, the trio find themselves right in the heart of a circus. The lead pirate here is called Buggy, and Luffy excitedly chirps up how he's a wanted pirate and everyone knows who he is. Buggy takes offence though, believing Luffy is making fun of his nose.

Buggy wants the map for himself and points out that he's destined to bring in the One Piece treasure. He wants to be the Pirate King too. Zoro has heard enough and he steps forward, threatening Buggy and his crew.

Before things escalate, Nami decides to show off Luffy's skills, throwing his hat in the air and letting Luffy reach for it, using his abilities in the process. When Nami rushes outside, she notices the entire town has been completely destroyed, and she's captured and brought back in again while she stands in shock.

Luffy is stretched out by Buggy in front of the chained crowd in attendance (who happen to be the poor townfolk forced to watch) and tortured over where the map is. As for Zoro and Nami, they're both kept in the back, with Zoro tied to a pinwheel and Nami in a cage.

Buggy switches up his questions and points out that he knows who Shanks is. He was apparently betrayed by Shanks and points out he's not a great idol. When Buggy decides to torture a kid afterwards, it's one step too far for Luffy who busts out of his restraints and confronts Buggy, using his abilities to knock his head clean off.

However, it turns out Buggy has eaten a Devil Fruit too, the Chop Chop Fruit. This allows him to take off and replace his limbs at will, using them as dangerous weapons. He's definitely more formidable than Captain Morgan, and he quickly knocks out Luffy. When he awakens, he finds himself in a glass tank being filled with seawater. Of course, sea water means Luffy's powers are rendered useless so there's no way of stretching out of there.

Meanwhile, Koby starts his marine training but notices a much more formidable man standing beside Morgan, that being the Vice-Admiral of course. He wants the pirates apprehended and is happy with Koby's progress, deciding to take him under his wing and train him up.

Garp is not sure where Koby's loyalties lie though, pointing out that his story doesn't fully add up. He was seen with Luffy at the local tavern and unfortunately he's forced to reveal all. Koby mentions Alvida and how he was saved by Luffy. He didn't tell anyone about this because he didn't want his dream of being a Marine to disappear and be taken away.

Garp believes his story, especially when Koby says he owes no allegiances to Luffy, and he's allowed to hunt the pirate down, while Morgan is taken care of.

Back with Buggy and our crew, the tank continues to fill but in the process, Nami and Zoro bust out of their cages, defeating the clown goons and heading into the main circus area. Buggy shows off his powers to them after Luffy gets out his tank, moving his different limbs around to take them out. In order to stop Buggy, Luffy teams up with Nami to trap each of his limbs down into different crates. All that's left is his head, hands and feet.

Luffy uses his Gum Gum Bazooka to take out Buggy and hands the map over, which he earlier spat out, to Nami. Luffy also frees all the townfolk from their chains, pointing out that he's a different kind of pirate from the ones they're used to. After bidding the townfolk goodbye, our crew head back on the high seas again, bound for the Grand Line.

As the episode closes, Nami heads into the back in secret and puts a strange conch in her ear. She communicates with an unknown person, revealing that she has the map.

Summary:	Luffy, Zoro, and Nami land in Syrup Village, where they meet Usopp, a local who introduced the group to Kaya, a sickly shipyard heiress under the care of trio of overbearing house staff. With the help of Koby, Vice Admiral Garp, a powerful marine, sets off in search of Luffy.



The episode starts with another flashback, this time in Syrup Village 7 years back. Alarm bells ring as a young boy called Usopp charges down from the battlements declaring that pirates are coming. The streets are cleared and villagers scramble inside. However, no pirates show.

This charade goes on for years, and after a while Usopp is ignored by everyone else in town. Elsewhere, Luffy excitedly chirps to Nami that he's finished creating his masterpiece, a brand new pirate

flag. Neither Zoro nor Nami are happy with the outcome though.

They're distracted by something leaking in the back, which in turn destroys Nami's comms device. The group decide to head out to the Gecko Islands and try to get a new boat, but once there Zoro is not happy when he notices there's a big bounty on Buggy's head. 15 million Berry to be precise. Zoro is down heartened but Luffy believes it's all the more reason for getting a fresh start in the Grand Line.

Meanwhile, Buggy manages to get his limbs back together again, but he's interrupted by a new visitor, a goon that works for a guy called Arlong. Buggy tries to fight his way out of this but one stiff punch knocks him clean out.

Back on the island, the group contemplates their next move re. getting a ship. Nami suggests they steal one and bust out quickly, but Luffy refuses. He wants to find the perfect ship for their needs and acquire it the right way. Luffy is immediately taken with a beautiful ship in the shipyard.

Usopp, the kid from the start of the episode, pops up and explains that this ship is the fastest in the East Blue but it also doesn't belong to him. In fact, it belongs to his friend, who also happens to own the entire shipyard. He's convinced they can strike up some sort of deal.

When Luffy and his friends arrive at Kaya's, they don't exactly get a warm welcome from the hired help. Kaya is a little more warm toward him, but her husband, Klahadore, is not. He tells

Usopp he needs to stop showing up unannounced like this. Kaya invites them all for dinner, given it's her birthday, and Klahadore begrudgingly agrees. However, the crew need to bathe and change before dinner.

Usopp sneaks into Kaya's chamber and hands over a present for her birthday. It's a giant pearl, which Usopp spins into a fantastical tale of swashbuckling heroism. Kaya's laughs turn to coughing as she points out that she's sick and has been for a while.

Elsewhere, Luffy, Zoro and Nami get dressed up ready for the big dinner. While eating, Nami tries to learn more about Kaya's financial situation, although it becomes clear what's going on during an earlier chat between Kaya and Klahadore. Kaya's parents are dead and it seems Klahadore has weaselled his way into the family in an effort to inherit the fortune for himself.

During dinner, Luffy upstages the entire birthday, talking to Kaya about his plans for commandeering the ship out in the yard he's taken to. He goes on to reveal how passionate he is about his dream to become King of the Pirates, and pleads with her to allow this to happen. However, Kaya starts coughing and Klahadore gets involved, berating the pirates for making her sick. Kaya manages to speak up and allows them to stay the night.

In the middle of the night, Klahadore approaches the butler, Merry, who points out how he's concerned over Klahadore intending to turn the estate and finances over to him. Unfortunately, it now becomes clear that Klahadore is not who he seems, and he kills the butler outright, revealing several blades that he's been keeping concealed.

Elsewhere, Buggy is tied up and finds himself face to face with Arlong. He points out that he runs things in the East Blue and he needs to remember his position in the grand scheme of things. Buggy tries to talk himself out of this and points out that Luffy is the one he wants to go and take out. Arlong is intrigued.

Meanwhile, Koby hops aboard the marine ship with Garp, and the pair grow closer together. They both play a game of Go together, with Koby actually coming out on top. Koby is shocked and this proves to be a valuable lesson for him to learn how to be decisive and take out any foes (see: pirates) that come their way.

During one of their Go games, the group head to Gecko Island, with Koby put to the test by being tasked with capturing Luffy and his crew, whose flag has washed up nearby.

Back at Kaya's place, Usopp contemplates over Luffy's story and wishes he could go too. However, he's loyal to Kaya and needs to stay for her sake. Usopp points out that she's his best friend and wants to be there for her. As for Kaya, she feels the same way about Usopp.

Zoro heads down to the basement with Usopp to find more wine, given there's not much in the kitchen. In doing so, they stumble over the butler and Zoro notices five blade marks from his chest. Klahadore shows up, and Zoro points out that this guy's name is Kuro, and he's captain of the Black Cat Pirates.

Zoro is blindsided from behind and knocked out, while Usopp slips out the window. Kuro is not bothered by Usopp, believing he's not going to be believed by anyone and he's not much of a threat. Naturally, Usopp rings the bells and nobody comes running, with the townsfolk telling him to stop.

Nami is unaware of all this, and she gives some words of advice to Kaya in her bedroom, telling her not to let anyone boss her about and that Kaya is stronger than she thinks. When Nami leaves, she drops off the pillowcase full of gear she intended to steal back on the mantelpiece.

Zoro and Merry are thrown down the well and disposed of, while Usopp collapses on the ground in town. "Why won't anyone believe me?" He bemoans. And just like that, Koby comes up with the other marines, admitting that he believes him and he's here to help.

The episode starts with us back at the bottom of the well. Zoro wakes up and finds himself very much alive and (no pun intended!) well. It's a miracle those swords didn't pierce him though, eh?

Anyway, as he gathers his gear, Zoro creates a makeshift grappling hook and prepares to climb. As he does, we jump back in time to Shimotsuki Village, 7 years back. Here, we see more of Zoro's backstory, including how he was trained to be the excellent swordsman that he is now. Of course, that's not how he starts,

given he's bested by Kuina, who's the real swordsman here.

The pair duel again, this time with real katanas, and Kuina accepts the challenge. She points out that Zoro needs to be ready to fight to the death. Kuina wins again and again, prompting Zoro to eventually give up. Kuina points out that Zoro is going to best her soon, given she's only small and will grow weaker over time, while the men (like Zoro) will get stronger.

Zoro though talks her up and makes a promise to train up and best Kuina eventually. They keep the vow to one another and make a promise to become the best swordsman (or woman) in the world.

Unfortunately, an accident occurs and Kuina ends up dead. In the manga, she falls down a flight of stairs but here, we don't get an explanation. Anyway, Zoro uses this motivation to press on and work harder than before, determined to be the best swordsman in the world for her sake. And as he trains, we cut back to the well and see Zoro slowly climb out.

Elsewhere, Koby goes on the hunt for Luffy and Kuro; the pirates on the island. Usopp, unaware of their intentions, leads them right up to Kaya's mansion. Luffy is completely knocked out though after eating that strange goo from the slow cooker last episode. It's not Koby who finds Luffy though, but it's actually Kuro's goons. Sham and Buchi begin bickering, until Kuro stops them and demands answers. Luffy eaten the entire batch of soup he was brewing specifically for Kaya, and believing him to be dead, decides he should be thrown in the well.

Nami overheard all of this while hiding in the kitchen cabinet. However, the door suddenly rings and the Marines show up. Kuro answers and points out that Usopp is mentally ill and he

gains the fortunes of the soldiers through his helpfulness, especially when he agrees to give them Luffy. Usopp tries to talk his way out of this but without any proof that Kuro is a pirate, Koby's hands are tied.

Koby knows more than he's letting on of course, and before he goes, a loud clang from the kitchen sounds and alerts him to something else going on. This is Nami's doing, and she knocks out Sham when she has her back turned. While this is going on, Usopp sneaks up to Kaya's bedroom and warns her about Kuro's true intentions and how he's killed the butler. Kaya is having none of it though and slaps her old friend in the face, telling him this story is not fun and she's not in the mood for games.

Usopp refuses to be swayed though and decides to sit on the sofa, telling his friend that he's going to stick around until she's safe.

As the time chimes midnight, Kuro sneers evilly and reveal that the girl has come of age and they no longer need her now, especially as they can inherit her fortune for themselves. Kaya's sickness is as a result of these pirates, who have been slowly poisoning her over time, making her sicker so they can take her fortune for themselves. Nami manages to convince Kaya of the truth, and they sneak through the hidden passageways to get away. Unfortunately, Kaya begins coughing while they're moving and she gives away her position. Kuro is right on the other side of the wall though, and after a few swift jabs with his blades, begins properly going after her.

Luffy projectile vomits out the blue soup and regains consciousness. When he does, he weakly tells Koby to do the right thing, given Kaya is innocent in all of this. Helmeppo has heard enough and brandishes a gun. Before he can fire though, Zoro poops up and gets involved. He knocks out Helmeppo and the pair part ways, with Luffy vowing to Koby not to stop him trying to save his friends.

Back in the mansion, Zoro and Luffy show and split up, intending to track down and stop Kuro from his murderous rampage. However, it's Usopp who gets involved with his slingshot, distracting Kuro long enough for Luffy to turn the tables. Down in the main atrium though, Zoro ends up fighting both Sham and Buchi.

Kuro taunts Luffy, moving around the room and slashing him with his knives. Kuro also boasts that he's the man with a thousand plans... but he doesn't have a plan for Luffy smacking the guy right in his face from behind a pillar. As the fighting continues, Luffy uses his Gum Gum Bell attack to smash Kuro right in the face and send him flying through the window, knocking him out and besting the guy once and for all.

With all the pirates gone, Kaya agrees to give the Straw Hat Crew their very own ship. He names the ship the Going Merry, in memory of Kaya's faithful butler, while Luffy and the gang allow Usopp to hop aboard, given his selfless nature and excellent sharpshooting skills. Just before he leaves, Usopp and Kaya share a kiss.

Koby returns to the ship and bemoans his efforts. However, Garp points out that he always had a back-up plan, and that was to flush the pirates out. Mission accomplished on that account, as Luffy and his gang sail out and hit the open seas... and immediately come under attack.

As Luffy looks out at the approaching ship through his telescope, he's shocked to discover he knows who's following... it's his grandpa! Wait, wait?!

The episode picks up with the military in hot pursuit of Luffy and his crew. Flashbacks flesh out more of Luffy's backstory here too, including his brief ties with Garp. As a kid, Luffy tried to create his own pirate ship but instead, Garp snatched him up to train him to be a better man.

Back onboard the ship in the present, Luffy organizes the troops but they're not exactly combat-ready. Usopp spills the cannon balls, but it's Garp who uses his unbelievable strength to throw one over

at the crew. Luffy makes his body huge and bounces the cannonball back at the Admiral's ship, destroying one of the sails.

As a result, the Straw Hat crew manage to slow down their pursuers, allowing the group to disappear into a conveniently approaching thick fog.

The ship has minor damages, but with thick fog surrounding them, they need somewhere to lay low. Thankfully, Luffy can sniff out food and with his inquisitive sense of smell, they navigate through the fog to the other side, where they happen upon the Baratie, a beautiful ship that's been turned into a restaurant.

Usopp and Luffy's attempts at rolling charisma don't work with the concierge (little D&D joke there guys, apologies) but Nami slips some cash his way and they manage to get a table. Now, it wouldn't be an anime without beautiful shots of cooking and food right? Whilst the group eat, we're introduced to a charismatic fighter/chef by the name of Sanji. He immediately piques the interest of the Straw Hat Crew.

There's some welcome comradeship between the group as they sit together and prepare to eat here, and they certainly have a feast on their hands! After eating, Luffy toasts to their victory against the Marines. Nami doesn't see it that way and tries to speak plainly to him, and about the elephant in the room. That is, of course, being that the Vice Admiral Garp is Luffy's grandfather.

Meanwhile, the Vice-Admiral calls in Mihawk to hunt down Luffy and bring him in alive. The guy is called right in the middle of a huge battle, given he's a sea lord but his skills are impressive, using his huge sword to cut a ship from afar in half without breaking a sweat. Mihawk is a bounty hunter and given instructions to bring in Luffy alive, by any means necessary. Koby overhears this and begins to question his allegiances, telling Garp as much later on in the episode.

Back at the Baratie, Luffy tries to wave off the bill for his food, promising to pay it off with interest in the future. The head chef, Zeff, is not happy with this and instead, calls Luffy in to clean all the dishes until his debt is completely paid off. While there, Luffy tastes some of Sanji's food and his face lights up immediately.

Luffy points out that Sanji's food is amazing, and learns that the guy's dream is to find the All Blue, an unknown location that has rare spices, seaweed and fish that have never been tasted. He wants to cook them up and become world renowned but right now it seems impossible. Luffy though, tells him never to give up.

When a weak pirate shows up, desperate for food, Sanji agrees to feed him and saves his life. Luffy realizes that he's a good man and offers Sanji a way out and to come and cook as part of his crew. This pirate though happens to be part of a huge armada that was lost on the seas, having been swallowed up by the sea off the back of sailing the Grand Line and trying to find the One Piece. When he hears what Luffy intends to do, he warns that out of 50 ships and 5000 men, he's the only survivor.

Elsewhere, Nami decides to split and seeks passage to the Conomi Islands from a shady guy at the bar. She offers up the fee of 6000 Berries to pay her way and decides to go alone. She's told to be ready by dawn at Slip 22. Before she goes though, Nami and Zoro share drinks and feed little nuggets of information to one another.

When Mihawk shows up that night, Zoro challenges him to a duel to the death at dawn. Nami and Usopp are shocked by this play and immediately warn Luffy. Given Mihawk is a warlord of the sea, Nami is worried that Zoro is going to get killed. Given he made a promise to Kuina in the past, he intends to make good on that and try to live up to his dream.

Luffy realizes he can't stand in the way of his dream and allows him to duel. Nami points out that they're friends, but Zoro pushes her away, telling the navigator that she has no friends, and said as much herself.

At dawn, Nami heads down to the dock and contemplates leaving but gets cold feet and sticks around after all. Elsewhere, Zoro shows up to fight against Mihawk. The pair trade blows. However, Zoro ends up stabbed in the heart for his efforts. "Why don't you retreat?" Mihawk asks. "I can't. Or my dream will be lost forever," Zoro replies.

Mihawk appreciates Zoro's courage and decides to bring out his best sword for this. As he does, the pair trade blows again, this time with Zoro losing two of his swords, which are sliced to bits. With Zoro bested, he allows Mihawk to slice him right across his chest and knock him down.

Luffy is angry and vows to become the King of the Pirates. This courage prompts Mihawk walk away, deciding that the world could do with a few more wildcards. He encourages Luffy to come back and find him later on in the game, with Zoro himself passing out on the ground, vowing to never lose again.

Sanji is resourceful, and he tries to ration his food as best he can. By day 25 though, things are looking bleak and he takes refuge under a rock. A ship on the horizon awakens Sanji in the middle of the night. Unfortunately it sails right past them. Day 30 sees Sanji continue to ration the food, eating little bits at a time.

Day 70 rolls by and Saji starts to suffer from awful stomach cramps, and a relentless thirst to get the food from Zeff, over on the other side. However, it turns out Zeff doesn't actually have a bag of food. His is full of treasure. He gave all the food to Sanji and he's been eating his own leg to get by all this time. It's a surprising act of kindness.

Zeff explains that he did this because he's been searching for the All Blue all his life and shares the same dream as Sanji. He's convinced that the All Blue is true and he enlists the young kid to live out his dream for him. After 85 days in total, they're finally found and saved.

Back in the present, Arlong shows up at the Baratie demanding food. He's also after Luffy too, and threatens Zeff with killing other customers unless he gets what he wants. Nami hurries up and warns Luffy over what's happening and encourages him to run and get away from them. Luffy refuses, although Nami is persistent given he has the highest bounty in the East Blue and he's dangerous. Luffy instead decides to fight back.

Luffy eventually shows up and confronts Arlong, who reveals the severed head of Buggy in his possession. His ear was actually caught in Luffy's straw hat and he's heard everything, including how the entire gang don't know what they're doing, and that Luffy has a map of the Grand Line. Luffy refuses to bow to Arlong and agrees to a fight.

Zeff makes the first move by firing at Arlong, but his goons are quick to take the head chef out. Sanji gets involved too, eventually leading to Luffy jumping in as well. A big fight breaks out between the two men, spilling out onto the dock.

With the crew back on the high seas, there's a clue everyone has overlooked surrounding Arlong's location. And that clue? None other than Buggy's severed head, which Luffy presents to everyone.

Elsewhere, Nezumi is brought before Vice-Admiral Garp who questions him about Coco Village and the issues with Arlong running wild. Back inside though, Luffy manages to goad Arlong into destroying the foundations of his base, which starts crumbling and cracking apart. The pair continue to trade special moves, until the entire building collapses on top of them both. Luffy naturally comes out without a scratch, while Arlong is buried under all the rubble and presumably killed.

With the pirates defeated, everyone celebrates with some good food and drink. Usopp naturally tells his tall tales, but unfortunately their celebrations are short-lived when Garp arrives with Koby and the rest of the Marines show and decide to arrest Luffy and the Straw Hat Pirates. Koby and Helmeppo aren't onboard with this but their opinions mean nothing in the grand scheme of things.

The Vice-Admiral demands they give up but when Luffy refuses, the pair end up duking it out. Luffy is no match for his grandpa though, who makes swift work of Luffy and continues to knock him down.

Garp will never break his spirit though and seeing him laugh maniacally, the Vice-Admiral realizes he has more in common with Gold Roger than he thought. Realizing what a martyr he turned into, Garp reconsiders and decides to call off the attack. "I know who you are boy," He says, as it becomes clear that he's been testing him.

As the Vice-Admiral leaves, the crew are left in peace once more. Nami pays her respects to her mother. Koby shows up to see Luffy and shows off a wanted poster that's been drawn up for him. It's the highest bounty in the East Blue, which is precisely what he wanted. The pair say their goodbyes, as they both leave on the silent promise that they'll see each other again in the future.

As a result of this bounty, every hunter is going to be coming for Luffy and his crew. And with his wanted poster doing the rounds to all the people we've met over the season, the promise of more danger and threats are on the horizon. In fact, Buggy and Alvida both happen to be together and may well form an allegiance.

Helmeppo and Koby are allowed to come back onboard as Marines but they're now going to be trained to become stronger and more capable than before. And while they train, Mihawk shows up to see Shanks and his crew, showing off the Wanted poster and agreeing to have a drink with them.

Back onboard their ship, Luffy brings on some orange trees to memorialize Nami's mother, while the others have a brand new pirate flag for Luffy to marvel over.

During the post-credit sequence, Luffy's Wanted poster is burned by someone holding a cigar. This fight is far from over but we'll have to wait and see what's in store for our characters next!
