He is beaten so severely, he may be beyond recognition.

Almost.

Reacher gets off the bus during a sunny and warm morning with the ground freshly covered from a Georgia

rainstorm. He walks past a "Welcome to Margrave" sign. When he sits down in a diner, he can't finish his first bite of peach pie in the peach state because two local cops arrest him.

Reacher walked over the underpass right around when the body was discovered. The Chief of Detectives Oscar Finley thinks he has their man, but a gigantic mass of a man quickly tells him why he was wrong. Oscar knows that his prime suspect used to be military police. He loves blues

music and stopped at Margrave to learn about Blind Blake. He is unusually perceptive. Oh, and he never got to finish that slice of fine peach pie.

Oscar and his deputy, a whip-smart blonde female named Roscoe Conklin, leave Reacher and head out to a possible suspect or witness to the crime. The man's name is Hubble. His number had been pulled out of the witness's shoe. While being questioned by the police, he sees an ominous-looking car outside.

He confesses to the crime immediately, even though Oscar proved he could not have done it because he took the bait and said he killed the man with a shotgun blast to the face. It's also revealed that Hubble was at a party during and well after the witness died. He could not have done it.

Of course, Finley doesn't find this out until later. Well, Roscoe doing due diligence gets him released from prison. What's that now? Oh, yes, Finley sends Reacher and Hubble to the local jail for safekeeping. Except the correctional officer puts them in the general population. Hubble won't leave Reacher's side for protection. The giant former MP is now wearing a pair of sunglasses, and Hubble does not have his standard eyewear.

Why does this matter? Because they are immediately jumped in the shower room. The leader says, get the guy with the glasses. They jumped the wrong guy, you see. They were supposed to kill Hubble. Instead, in the bone-crunching scene, Reacher defeats the group of eight prisoners. He breaks their arms, ankles, legs, and noses. He even gouged one of the inmates' eyes out. (Remember, as Reacher said, he started it). Eventually, the guards show up, Reacher's prison scrubs are covered in blood, but no matter. He takes a much-deserved nap in isolation.

Officer Roscoe finds a tape of Reacher on a bus during the murder. This gets him released, but what about Hubble? You know, since he confessed to it? Well, everyone knows he is lying so those are the breaks. Just after Reacher announces that he will leave town, Roscoe invites him to her place to cook him dinner. He says yes practically immediately.

This is another incident of why Reacher is no fool.

The Chief of Detectives doesn't like Reacher, but he goes through personal problems. He came to Margrave because he had just wrapped up a divorce. Yet, he still wears his wedding ring. Deputy Roscoe gives him the details on Reacher. It's a military greatest hits album if there ever was one. He is a graduate of West Point. He received numerous medals, including two Silver Stars, the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star, the Army of Commendation Medal, and the Purple Heart. The guy even saved six soldiers' lives after a bombing at a barracks, carrying two soldiers out at a time.

Oscar attempts to build trust with Reacher by letting him go on his investigation. Reacher knows what he is doing and gleefully lets him know about it.

So, when he is about to get a shave and a haircut from a local barbershop owner named Mosley, he sees KJ pull up in his truck in the town square. This young punk is the son of Kliner Sr., a man who brought big business to Margrave that's allowed freshly manicured lawns, flower beds, painted gazebos, and a polished town statue. Everyone in town now has a job.

He walks right up to KJ, with shaving cream still on his face and neck, and looks danger right in the eyes, asking him if he wants to dance. Of course, KJ takes the lead. We get a taste of Reacher's backstory. He read that Major Jack Reacher had charges against him dropped and disappeared about an incident in a small village outside Baghdad. Now, for the first time, Reacher looks like he has lost his train of thought.

However, another body has popped up. This man was killed 40 feet away from the first John Doe discovered. While talking to the medical examiner, Finley asks if they have identified the first victim yet. They have not, he tells them. That's because the fingerprints can not be scanned because of a dermatitis reaction.

This sends Reacher's head swimming. He remembers what Finley said to him about deciding if someone else looks just like Reacher on that tape walking around Margrave. Reacher grabs the computer monitor to turn it around. He reads off the report. The victim was allergic to latex, and the shooter wore a protective suit to prevent DNA from transferring. The victim broke his arm. In Berlin, Reacher says. The victim had his tonsils taken out. In Seoul, Reacher says aloud.

When they reach the body in the morgue and pull it out, Reacher grabs the left hand and tells a story of how the scar of the body's wrist was caused by them wrestling and pinning the hand to the hot stove that was just turned off without them knowing. He turns to Roscoe and Finley to tell them this one thing: That's how my brother got this scar.

Just after Roscoe tells Reacher not to beat up a man half his size because he has kind eyes, they drive back to the police station. He tells both of them this one other thing. He is going to find out who killed his brother and kill every last one of them.

As soon as Finley, Roscoe, and Reacher reach the police station, the new visitor to Margrave gets out of the back seat immediately. He walks away looking determined, angry, and ready to squash anything that gets in his way. Finley tells his deputy to follow him as they watch him walk away. "Why?" she asks. Because he listened to her before. And most importantly, when he was upset.

Roscoe catches up to Reacher, and he jumps in her police cruiser. They head over to Hubble's house. The pair find that he isn't there, but they find his wife, Charlie, and their children. While Roscoe

plays the good cop and the carrot, Reachers plays the bad cop and the wandering stick. He goes upstairs and looks through Hubble's personal belongings. He finds an oddly pointed pair of shoes.

When Reacher arrives at the police station the following day, he finds Roscoe heading out and tells him there has been another murder. The Police Chief Morrison has been killed. He is the third person murdered this week in the small Georgia town. They find him nailed to the wall like the big JC himself. Naked, blood everywhere, and two out of his three essential pieces of manhood are now gone. Reacher knows precisely where it went. He tells the medical examiner they'll find it in his stomach.

Reacher and Roscoe head over to Hubble's house to gather Charlie and her kids. Finley is arranging for an old friend in the FBI to take them into protective custody. 

Reacher ends the conversation by telling him that he has had better slices of peach pie.

The last scene shows Reacher burying his mother's service medal in the ground near the underpass. He says, "It takes bravery to solve the world's problems too, Joe." He then walks down the road, on his way to solve the next small town's problems.

Summary: Reacher and Neagley investigate the murder of a member of 110th, a

group of Special investigators assembled by Reacher, only to realize

the whole unit may be at risk.



The episode starts in the Catskill Mountains, NY, two hours north of Manhattan. A helicopter flies above and drops a man out of it. He lands on the ground, dead.

Murfreesboro, Arkansas — Jack Reacher is in a thrift store. He hands the shop assistant his clothes, tells her to wash them and sell them, and gets ready to buy the new ones he's wearing. She says it'll cost him \$20, but he points to a sign that says 50 percent off, so it's \$11. She says her boss forgot to take the sign down, so he tells her he'll go to an ATM across the

street and get cash out to pay the remainder.

Reacher waits in line at the ATM. There's a woman in front of him all battered and bruised, anxiously withdrawing cash. Reacher spots a minivan across the street and figures something is up. He tells the woman "Don't turn around, I can help you. You've been carjacked right?" She says yes, and reveals her child is in the backseat, and the guy has a gun.

"This won't take long," Reacher tells her. He approaches the car and smashes the window through with his jacket used to soften the blow of the smashed glass. He beats the guy up, slamming his head in between the car door, and takes his gun off him, removing the bullets from it. The mother is reunited with her son. Reacher tells her to call the cops and to give them the bullets. She asks who he is, but Reacher leaves and tells her he doesn't want to get involved.

Reacher gets a receipt from the ATM, and he studies it in detail. He returns to the thrift store and gives the shop assistant \$30. He says he needs a new jacket as the other one has blood on it. He also asks to use the shop assistant's phone, as he's got a message from a friend.

Reacher then calls Frances Neagley, who is a former member of the 110th MP Special Investigations Unit, which was led by Reacher. The ATM receipt revealed a distress call from her that prompted the call. She tells him one of their former team members, Calvin Franz, has been murdered, and Reacher needs to come to New York. Without questioning it, Reacher says "I'll let you know when I land." He then leaves the shop, handing the phone back to the shop assistant on the way.

Flashback — Rock Creek Virginia, several years earlier — Reacher is in army uniform, and Calvin Franz arrives to see him and is curious why he is here. Reacher tells him he spotted him sort out an issue between two men and figured he had a decent head on him and would fit well in his team.

Reacher and Franz enter a run-down room that is the headquarters of the 110th MP Special Investigations Unit. The unit are together, bantering and playing games. We see Frances Neagley and a man called David O'Donnell amongst others. Reacher admits the room they have is a bit of a dive, so he tells them all to move their asses and sort the room out.

Back in the present day — Williamsburg, New York — Reacher enters a coffee shop and joins Neagley, who is waiting for him. She has ordered him a hot drink and food, as she tracked his flight and planned his arrival. She is a P.I and shows Reacher the files on Franz's murder. She tells him he went missing from his home a week ago. Angela (Franz's widow) called to tell her what happened. Turns out, they had a son too. Reacher looks at the photos and says Franz was tortured and thrown from a helicopter. Neagley asks what the next steps are, as she's tried ringing other members of their team but can't get through. Reacher says they don't want cops handling the case of their friend's murder, and suggests they go see Franz's widow.

When they leave the coffee shop, Reacher notices a black Sudan car parked nearby and is suspicious of it. A bald man with a notepad is introduced, spying on them from the black Sudan.

There's another nefarious-looking man in a car watching on, who is called Trevor Saropian. He makes a call to someone, saying "She just met up with the big one" (meaning Reacher, obviously). Neagley and Reacher try to call David O'Donnell from their car. They leave a voicemail asking him to call them back.

Reacher and Neagley are at Franz's widow's house. Her son Mikey is watching television. His mother tells him to go and do some drawing in the kitchen. Reacher asks her to walk them through the timeline of what happened. Turns out, Franz was a P.I. He was away on a job, and she came home to find their house ransacked. They ask if she was aware of any cases he was on, but she says he never brought work home. He'd apparently stopped doing the dangerous jobs. She suggests there's maybe something in his office to give them clues. She gives Reacher the keys. Before they leave, Mikey pipes up with "You do not mess with the special investigators." Neagley asks Mikey if his dad taught him that! Reacher notices the black Sudan parked outside the house.

Saropian is coming out of a hotel on the phone with a man called Shane Langston who asks him if the manager talked. He says no, but he pays off the concierge, who reveals that Neagley checked into this hotel under the name Sarah Connor and ordered adjoining rooms. Saropian asks Langston who Sarah Connor is. He replies that he doesn't give a s**t.

Reacher and Neagley arrive at the Franz's Three Rivers office. They find it ransacked, but Reacher thinks it's an act of frustration as they didn't find what they wanted. He finds a picture of the 110th altogether. Neagley asks Reacher for the key chain. She insists Franz was sharp, so he probably put his very important items in a safe deposit box. She spots The United States post office opposite the office and sees Franz has a mailbox key on his chain. Reacher comments on how smart Neagley is. She knows it! They are outside the United States Post Office, and it's after 5 p.m., so it's shut. They plan to come back tomorrow.

Reacher and Neagley are back at the hotel. They play cards and catch up. She says she's doing well and has had two promotions in her job. Reacher says he's tried everyone again but with no answer. Neagley asks if he tried Dixon and implies that she and Reacher had a thing for each other. He insists nothing happened as it was not appropriate since they worked together. Reacher decides he's going to bed when he loses the game of cards. He tells Neagley he'll pay her back for the room when his pension deposit comes through.

Flashback — The gang is in a bar drinking. A uniformed man comes over to tell them they aren't supposed to be drinking in uniform. He tells Neagley she doesn't belong here as she's a junior and this is an officer's club. He threatens to drag them all out if she doesn't leave. Reacher

stands up and asserts himself. The man says, "We got 12, you got 9." Reacher quips, "That's a shame, 3 short." Moments later, a guy goes flying out of a window, and a fight breaks out between both sides.

The team is sat by a campfire, drinking, playing guitar, and dancing. Reacher tells Neagley they all learned a lesson tonight: "Do not mess with the special investigators." He says he now knows they can all work together because of how they all stuck together in the fight and admits he planned it to see how they would all react. They take a picture together as a team. There is a weird dream sequence of sorts where Franz approaches Reacher all bloodied and bruised and says "They tossed me from a helicopter Reacher, what you gonna do about it?"

A well-dressed man is at LAX airport and tells customs he's here to sightsee and has nothing to declare. In the bathroom, he burns his passport. (We will find out later this was an alias.)

Reacher and Neagley are back at the post office. They hatch a plan to find Franz's deposit box. Reacher will start with the big boxes, but Neagley acts as a distraction by engaging the clerk claiming to be a hardcore stamp collector. Reacher puts the key inside lots of different boxes, trying to find the right one. An old lady alerts the clerk of the peculiar activity, but Reacher finds the right box just in time, retrieves the mail and they leave.

They find a flash drive though can't check it because Neagley's laptop doesn't have the right port. Reacher says he needs a gun before anything else, and he needs to stop off at a church first.

At a church in a rough area, he asks the priest for some help looking for his cousin, who has a bad drug problem as he's living on the street, and asks where he might be. The priest gives him a location but tells him he has a death wish walking through there on his own.

Reacher finds the street, hits a junkie with his car and headbutts him. He kicks another guy, steals his money and his gun, and drives off. He returns to the church and gives the drug money to the priest for the outreach program.

Back in L.A., the smartly dressed man meets two guys who give him new passport aliases. He then kills both men because they know too much now. He slits one of their throats and stabs the other one in the stomach and leaves.

Reacher arrives back at the hotel. He sees Neagley, and they both enter the room to find it's been ransacked. O'Donnell is there and catches Reacher by surprise. He confirms he found the place like this. O'Donnell is angry about Franz's death as he "loved that kid," and says, "Who we killing over it?"

Reacher, Neagley and O'Donnell try to guess Franz's password to get access to the flash drive. They don't have long to guess, as time is running out. O'Donnell says it could be "Reacher" because he was Franz's hero. It's correct, and they are in!

The smartly dressed man gets booked on a flight to Denver under the alias of Andrew McBride. This name appears on the list that the team gets off the hard drive. There are 10+ names all with the initials A.M. They decide they need more manpower for the investigation and decide to track down a man called Swan who was part of their team.

The episode ends with Reacher, Neagley and O'Donnell tracking down Swan's house and knocking on his door. No answer, so Reacher breaks in and the team searches the place. They find his dog dead of dehydration, and Reacher says Swan wouldn't let a dog die of thirst and deduces Swan is likely dead. They can't get hold of other team members and with Franz confirmed dead and Swan likely dead too, O'Donnell asks Reacher what he's thinking.

Reacher says, "I'm thinking there's someone hell-bent on taking out the special investigators and they're coming after us. Good." $\frac{1}{2} \int_{\mathbb{R}^{n}} \frac{1}{2} \int_{\mathbb{R}^{n}} \frac{$

Summary: The investigation into Franz's murder takes Reacher and the surviving

members of his former Army unit to Atlantic City where the mystery

deepens, danger awaits, and an old flame is rekindled.



The episode starts with Reacher, Neagley and O'Donnell leaving Swan's house and pondering why the bad guys haven't found them yet. Reacher and O'Donnell are hard to get hold of, and they figure they haven't gotten around to Neagley yet. They figure they should try and warn the others, so they try calling Sanchez and Orozco again.

The black Sudan Reacher saw in the previous episode is waiting outside Franz's widow's house. Reacher says he's going to introduce himself, wanders over

and kicks the front of the car, and the airbag releases in the bald man's face. The man gets out of the car, and Reacher headbutts him and beats him up. Unfortunately for him, the man is an NYPD cop by the name of Gaitano "Guy" Russo.

The group flees in their car. Reacher assumed the cop he sucker-punched was involved, but Neagley reminds him that assumptions kill. Turns out, Russo is the investigating officer in Franz's murder case. They consider getting out of town and decide to head to Atlantic City to look for Sanchez and Orozco, as that is where they are based.

Langston is on the phone with Saropian, who tells him about the Reacher and Russo incident. Langston tells Saropian to stay on their asses.

Reacher and the group spot Karla Dixon, a former member of the 110th, who has returned to help after finding out the group was trying to track her down. She was on an undercover job involving a corporate embezzlement case. They ask her to use her fake ID to rent a car, as the others can be tracked. Reacher tells her Franz and Swan are dead, and Sanchez and Orozco are missing.

Flashback — Reacher and Dixon are discussing a case in the 110th involving missing aviation in Afghanistan. Reacher comments on Dixon's good work (she is a master with numbers). She

asks him out for a drink to celebrate, but he says he's got to keep working on his reports, but maybe next time. The chemistry between them is obvious.

The group consisting of Reacher, Neagley, O'Donnell and Dixon is in the hire car, heading to Atlantic City. Dixon is looking into the case and the files they got from Franz's flash drive. They figure it could be a grudge against the 110th.

Saropian is on a call to Langston, who tells him when he gets to Atlantic City, "Take them out." Saropian tells him he needs some local talent to back him up, which Langston agrees to, but he wants them dead by tomorrow.

Atlantic City, New Jersey — The group checks out Orozco and Sanchez's office, and it's been ransacked. Reacher says they are wasting their time here, as whoever did this got what they wanted. He picks up a picture of Sanchez and a woman at the Lucky Lounge bar. It's framed, and clearly important, so they decide to head there.

Reacher and Neagley go inside the Lucky Lounge, but Dixon and O'Donnell stay outside to keep cover. They show the bartender the picture and they reveal they are friends of Sanchez. He says he'll get a guy to show them the books out back. He then tells a woman in the bar to take her stuff and get out of there. (It's the woman from the picture.) The woman flees.

Reacher and Neagley are heading off with a guy to the back of the bar when he says, "This is as far as we're going. Stop messing with our friends," and a fight breaks out.

O'Donnell and Dixon track the woman down in the car while the fight is going on, and they all congregate around the back of the Lucky Lounge.

They sit down with the woman and she says she's sorry and wouldn't have run if she knew who they were, and the other guys were just looking out for her. She reveals a guy had previously come in looking for Sanchez, but he had gone dark by this point.

Turns out, Franz was working a case with Sanchez and Orozco with Swan also involved. The woman also says she heard something about 650 and 100k each before he left.

In the casino, the group considers it maybe isn't someone with a grudge. Sanchez and Orozco provided freelance security for the casino so they figure it could be tied to gaming. A waitress comes over and Reacher demands she get him the casino director of security now.

The group meets with the director of security. He says he has no reason to believe Sanchez and Orozco might be dead, as he just saw them last month, and asks how he can help. They ask him if 650 and 100k means anything to him. He says it could be linked to a 650-million-dollar gambling scam.

He offers to comp them a room while he looks into it. The group gets settled in the rather swanky suite. Dixon gets caught counting cards in the casino, and Reacher finds her just as she wins big. Security isn't happy and offers her concert tickets to leave. Reacher helps her with her winning chips and they move from the table. Saropian is looking on at the pair from the bar.

Reacher and Dixon have a late-night walk and realise they are being followed. Two guys are behind them, with a car in front. They make a run for it over a fence with Saropian getting out of the car to chase after them along with the two henchman. They approach a warehouse that appears to be getting work done to it.

Reacher is stabbed by one of the henchman, but he beats him up and throws him off a ledge after stabbing him. Dixon kills the other henchman, but Saropian comes along and tries to shoot her. Dixon uses the henchman as a shield before Reacher dives on Saropian and fights him. He breaks his leg and puts his head in a pool of wet cement, killing him.

They search Saropian's car and find files on all of the 110th. They find his phone, and Reacher calls the most recent number. Langston picks up and asks, "Is it done?" He tells Reacher he's messing with the wrong guy, but Reacher says he's the one who sounds scared. Langston hangs up. Dixon suggests tracing the number but Reacher figures they both would've been using burner phones. He says they should've left one of them alive to get more information, as they have nothing to go on. However, Dixon finds a parking lot pass belonging to Saropian for "New Age Technologies." It's a clue! They bury all three dead bodies in the cement and Reacher says to Dixon, "I'm thirsty. Wanna get a beer?"

Reacher and Dixon are in the hotel room, and he's bandaging up his injuries. Dixon reveals she has a piece of shrapnel stuck in her so Reacher tends to it. She takes her top off and they end up kissing and having sex.

Twenty miles outside Denver, Colorado — a car is driving through snow in a wooded area. It's the A.M. alias man, and he meets with a man who says all 650 will be in the truck and that there

are two good ambush points on the route, and seeks reassurance that the truck driver won't be harmed. A.M. reassures him, and the man walks off.

The next morning in the hotel room — Dixon and Reacher tell O'Donnell and Neagley what happened last night. There's a knock on the door; it's the head of security, who he tells them Atlantic PD told him two more bodies had been found in upstate New York near where Franz was found and had been there a while. It's Sanchez and Orozco. The wounds match Franz's, and they confirm this is very much a New York case, and not based in Atlantic City.

The episode ends with Reacher announcing he's going to need more guns for the fight ahead!

Picture Says a Thousand Words

Summary: After more of his friends fall victim, Reacher forges an uneasy alliance

with a dogged detective, and their only clue in the case leads the 110th

to a troubling discovery.



The episode begins 10 days earlier. Langston is watching on as two of his henchmen beat up Franz. Langston says the beating ends now if Franz tells him what he figured out and who else knows it. He also informs him he got a beat on his buddies in Atlantic City (Sanchez and Orozco), so he isn't saving them by not talking. Franz spits blood in his face and has nothing to say. Langston smashes his legs and tells the henchman to get him ready.

Langston and his henchman are in a

helicopter with Franz tied up. Langston offers him one last chance to talk. Franz just laughs in his face and says, "I'm just thinking about what the big guy is gonna do to you." They throw Franz out of the helicopter. Langston turns to his henchman and says, "Big guy? Who the hell was he talking about?"

Back to the present — Reacher is in a gun shop and tells the shop assistant he wants 3 burners and a bunch of guns. The assistant says he has a 7-day waiting period or he can just get a firearm. Reacher pays him off to avoid "a lot of hoops" and leaves with the guns he wants.

In the hire car, O'Donnell moans about the Glock 17 Reacher has got for him. O'Donnell likes his own Glock 17, but Reacher reminds him it needs to be a gun that can't be traced. The group are figuring out a place they can hide out, but are interrupted by a cop car pulling them over. Reacher says, "Wake me up if something happens" and has a nap. He knows he'll be arrested but figures it'll take a while. Russo turns up and orders Reacher to get out of the car. He tells Dixon and Neagley to handle the New Age parking pass query, and gets O'Donnell to con his way into coming along with him to the station as his lawyer (He went to law school apparently!) .

Dixon and Neagley head to New Age Technologies. They speak with the director of operations, Marlo Burns, and they tell her there's been three confirmed murders, another missing person (Swan), and a person of interest (Saropian) found with a parking pass on him that was issued to him from New Age Technologies. Marlo says there are over 1000 employers, so there's no way of tracking it.

Reacher and O'Donnell are in a police interview room with Russo, and Reacher wants to know why he's here. Russo says they are interfering with the investigation and reassures him they all want to solve the murders. Russo finds it strange that the 110th all had multiple calls to each other, but nobody called Reacher. He confirms it's because he doesn't have a phone, but Russo is suspicious. He asks him what he knows about the 110th all being killed off. Reacher says if they share information with him, Russo better have something for them.

Marlo Burns tracks down the pass registered to Saropian and claims they didn't hire him, but they have a resume on file with his address, which she hands over to Dixon and Neagley.

Back in the police interview room, Reacher accuses Russo of being dirty, which he reacts badly to and insists he is as clean as they come, and reveals the police have a suspect. In Franz's office, they found a memory card intact with information about a weapons broker called Mahmood. Turns out, Sanchez and Orozco dug up information on him for Franz. The name Mahmood appears on the same list of aliases they found on Franz's flash drive-A.M.! They figure they need to flag all aliases with the initials A.M. and think it's something to do with terrorism.

Dixon and Neagley are looking over a sheet with random numbers that they obtained in their investigation. There are seven sheets. Dixon figures out each sheet has 26 or 27 numerical tabulations. If you run them all together you can fit it all onto one page instead of seven. All the pages have 26 except for one, which has 27, but why? There are days and months with each page being a month and six days a week. 26 or 27 days, and they start or end on working days. The last seven months something was supposed to happen 9 or 10 or 12 or 13 times a day. The numbers are pretty good in month one, but they become abysmal in month seven. What kind of somethings were they counting? Neagley is confused by Dixon's workings-out, but trusts her judgement. But it poses the question: What exactly is going on?

A.M. has booked a flight from Denver to JFK, so they figure as soon as he checks in, they can get him. However, A.M. is smart, and when he arrives at the airport he figures something is wrong. He knocks over a suitcase of someone he thinks is watching him, and there's nothing in the suitcase, which confirms his suspicions. He leaves the airport and calls Langston to tell him he's been delayed, but he'll still close the deal, it'll just take a bit more time. A.M. asks Langston "Have you ever done a deal like this before for the product purchased?" Langston confirms he hasn't and asks how A.M. is getting into New York without an ID. A.M. says he'll handle it.

Reacher calls Saropian's neighbour and claims he found his wallet on the sidewalk and is just making sure he still lives at the address the group has for him. She informs him he does, and the group decides they will go around to have a look, but Reacher insists on going by the hardware store first. The group led by Reacher turns up at Saropian's house and throws a pipe bomb into his hallway, which causes an explosion, and one of the henchmen waiting there to kill them comes out on fire. So that's why they went to the hardware store! They enter the house, and a shootout breaks out with the remaining henchmen. They take out all the henchmen. Dixon runs out of bullets when fighting one of them, and O'Donnell saves her by shooting the man before he can take her out.

Reacher spots a car driving off from the location and chases after it. He can't catch up to the car, but he gets creative when he comes across a barbeque and throws it onto the oncoming car. It comes to a halt. Reacher catches up to the car and pulls out a heavyset man from it. He shouts, "Who sent you? Who do you work for? New age?" He finds his ID, and his name is Bryan Collins. The man has a heart attack and dies before he can tell Reacher anything. Reacher goes back to Saropian's house and tells the group what happened, saying they need to "get the hell out."

Back at the motel the group is staying at, Russo turns up and storms in. He is incensed that Reacher used a pipe bomb in Suburban Queens. Reacher reveals they were being set up by New Age.

Reacher says there's two possibilities here — Hitmen could've gone to New Age to canvas a target. In this case, the address they found could've been fake, or Saropian could've gone to New Age because he was working for them as a hitman for hire and had an assignment to track them down. Either way, someone wanted them to check out the address as a trap to kill them.

Russo tells Reacher and the group they can't go rogue anymore. He also tells them A.M. didn't show up at the airport, but the plan appears to still be in motion. They are getting a warrant to access New Age Technologies headquarters. He tells them to back off until they hear from him. Reacher gives Russo a number to keep in contact with them, and Russo warns "No more cowboy

 $s^{**}t$." Russo then leaves. Reacher announces, "Saddle up, we got a whole lot of cowboy $s^{**}t$ to do."

The episode ends with Reacher and the group getting in a car and heading off to New Age Technologies headquarters. Reacher tells them to get what they can in two minutes but not to wait for him if he is late coming out. They all put balaclavas on and smash the car through the barriers into New Age Technologies. They grab what they can from there and load it all into black sacks.

Before leaving, Reacher grabs a framed picture of the New Age team on the wall. They hear sirens just as Reacher is the last one to come out. They begin to leave, and Reacher jumps in the car just in time. They stop off and torch the balaclavas and Reacher lays out the picture he found at New Age on the car. They spot Swan in the picture at New Age. He has Langston and Marlo Burns on either side of him in the photo. Reacher announces, "He was working at New Age with the people who have been trying to kill us."

The episode begins with Reacher, Neagley, Dixon and O'Donnell going through all the information they obtained from the robbery at New Age Technologies. They discuss the possibility of Swan being dirty due to his involvement at New Age. It turns out he's the assistant director of security at the company. Shane Langston's name comes up, and Reacher thinks this could be the guy he has been speaking to on the phone who tried to have them killed. Reacher says they should go through every employee one by

one to find out what's going on.

Elsewhere, Gus Russo is being shouted at by his boss for allowing the 110th to break into New Age Technologies and cause chaos.

The group is having a conversation about the music playing at the diner they are in. It's "Road to Nowhere" by Talking Heads, which Reacher objects to, as it sums up their case. The conversation turns to the revelation that Swan and Marlo Burns would talk about music as code in their emails. Reacher deciphers the email to figure out it's a reference to a program New Age is working on for the Department of Defence, called Little Wing.

Reacher notes there's a senator called Malcolm Lavoy who wants to give the go-ahead for Little Wing. Dixon makes a connection between the corrupt officials at New Age Technologies and the Little Wing-related bill that Malcolm is pushing for. She concludes that they need to get to the senator and find answers. O'Donnell thinks getting to a senator will be near on impossible, but getting to the legislative director might be the next best thing, as they know about the laws being passed. Reacher gives O'Donnell the go-ahead to use his dodgy methods to get the name of Senator Malcolm's legislative director.

Flashback to the 110th seizing a massive amount of heroin during a drug bust, and one of the bags of heroin couldn't be accounted for, and it looked very much like Dixon had stolen it. Back

in the present day, Reacher still insists Swan isn't dirty and not involved in whatever is going on at New Age.

A.M. visits Dr. Elzogby to steal his identity and kills him by stabbing him in the neck. The group discovers more about a man called Daniel Boyd, who is Senator Malcolm Lavoy's legislative director. O'Donnell discovers that Boyd will be attending the symphony in Boston, giving the group the opportunity to question him about the Little Wing project. Reacher answers Russo's call, plays dumb about the New Age break-in, and then proceeds to assign him a task to run background checks on all of the people working with Shane Langston. He then tells him he's off to the Boston Symphony and hangs up.

Neagley and Dixon check in on Marlo Burns at her home, but nobody is there, and it appears she left in a hurry. It's revealed she has a daughter called Jane. There is a big bag of money left behind, which makes them question what kind of person goes on the lam without taking a pile of money.

Reacher and O'Donnell attack a drug dealer and take his drugs and a gun. The reason for this will be discovered later on. The group get dressed up smart to attend the opera, and banter naturally ensues between them for their less-than-regular attire. At the theatre, Dixon acts confused about her seats to get an "in" with Boyd, who suggests she sit with him for the performance.

Reacher and O'Donnell sit in a diner outside the theatre going through the data they got from Franz's flash drive. Reacher figures out the numbers in the documents are actually a tally of some mystery material. If the ratio is 13 out of 14, then that means that 13 out of 14 units of a certain object have been acquired, etc. Reacher says the number of "missing" units or unsuccessful attempts at acquiring something actually adds up to 650. Franz's last words to his girlfriend were, "650, \$100k each." Franz was pointing at 650 items, each of which was worth \$100k.

Dixon and Boyd head to a car, and inside the car, she offers him drugs, which he gladly accepts. There is a knock on the window of the car. Oscar Finlay is back, and he arrests Boyd for drug possession. He lets Reacher and O'Donnell into the interview room, and they pretend to be special agents and question Boyd about Little Wing. He refuses to comply, but when O'Donnell threatens him with the drug charges, it causes Boyd to break. He tells them Little Wing is a codename for anti-missile software. It was originally meant to protect commercial aircraft from attacks, but New Age Technologies got hold of it and made some modifications to it, making it portable and paving the way for anyone to become a surface-to-air missile launcher.

Boyd assures them that this technology is in safe hands because New Age is a reputable company. Reacher and Finlay part ways with the promise to help each other in the future and keep in touch. Reacher tells Dixon and Neagley to head to Denver and look into New Age Technologies' other office, which Boyd told them about. Reacher and O'Donnell knock on Homeland Security's door and use Reacher's dead brother Joe's connections to get more information on the Department of Defence's connection to New Age Technologies.

The episode ends with the group stopping off at a local diner to change out of their smart clothes, but they are attacked by a biker gang, and a fight ensues. The group overpowers the much larger biker gang, and Reacher retrieves a phone from one of the bikers' bodies and calls up Shane to inform him he's coming for him. Langston offers to give him whatever it is he wants to back off, to which Reacher says, "I want to throw you out of a helicopter."

Summary: Neagley and Dixon discover shocking information about an old friend

in Denver while Reacher and O'Donnell learn more about the nefarious

and mysterious A.M.



The episode begins with O'Donnell going back home with Reacher to tell his wife and children they'll need to go somewhere safe while the group deals with Shane Langston and his henchman.

Neagley and Dixon are at the Denver branch of New Age Technologies, pretending to be representatives of the Defence Contract Management Agency so that they can investigate their missile shipments. They discover they are too late because all 650 of the missiles have already been shipped.

A group of assailants pretending to be truck drivers stop New Age's truck, kill the driver, and then inform A.M. that they've got hold of the missiles. Neagley and Dixon catch up to the henchman and a brutal gunfight takes place between them. Neagley and Dixon shoot down most of the men, but 1 of them drives away with the shipment. Neagley and Dixon run away before the police arrive at the scene.

Meanwhile, Reacher and O'Donnell chat with a pair of Homeland Security agents, who worked with Joe Reacher previously. They reveal A.M. is a wanted individual, and they've been trying to track him down with little success. Reacher says that if he gets to A.M. before them, he is going to kill him.

Neagley and Dixon tell Reacher and O'Donnell about the truck hijacking, revealing that Swan has signed off on the shipment. Reacher doesn't want to believe it.

Flashback to the 110th using heroin they acquired from a drug bust to catch a dealer. Neagley, Franz, Orozco and Sanchez are waiting in a van, and Reacher and Swan are talking to the drug dealers. One of the drug dealers' personal delivery boys recognises Swan, forcing the 110th to kill the criminals. Swan takes a bullet for Reacher.

Back in the present timeline, Reacher is picked up by Senator Lavoy's security detail for a private conversation with him at the Smithsonian National Zoological Park. Lavoy and Boyd wind Reacher up for pretending to be a "special agent" and remind him about his time in Margrave. However, Lavoy wants Reacher's help. He reveals he did greenlight the Little Wing project for national security reasons and to make some money on the side, but now wants to make amends after realising domestic terrorism is on the cards. Lavoy wants the 110th to ensure that the missiles aren't used to kill anyone.

A.M. has a conversation with Langston while driving through Indiana, where they talk about the shipment and the attack from the 110th. Langston reassures A.M. that the missiles will be ready for use by the time he arrives, and has organised another attempt at killing the 110th.

Reacher, O'Donnell, Neagley, and Dixon attend Franz's funeral. Russo is seen comforting Franz's wife and child, and that annoys Reacher because Russo doesn't have any connection with Franz or his family. Reacher argues with Russo, with Reacher again accusing Russo of being a dirty cop. Russo insists he's there for Franz's family because he has been in the child's position when he was younger. Russo also says he did a background check on New Age's employees, revealing they are all former dirty NYPD cops from the 3rd precinct. The only exception is Swan, who Russo insinuates has been hired for his military experience, proving useful to the terrorists.

The episode ends with 2 snipers shooting at the funeral to kill the 110th. Neagley kills one of them, while the other one runs away. Reacher tries to chase him down on foot, but the shooter gets in a car. Russo picks Reacher up in a car and they chase him. They cause a crash, track him down and Reacher interrogates him. The henchman reveals Swan hired him to kill the 110th. They take the sniper to the place where he was supposed to get his fees. As soon as he steps into the building, the place blows up.

The episode begins with the 110th debating what led to the explosion that killed the sniper, who was the only person linked to Swan. Russo comes by and gives the group a lead on the direction Marlo Burns is heading in. Turns out, she's going to Portland. Reacher and the rest of the group reach the car that was being tracked and find out it had been dumped near a convenience store.

They go through the CCTV footage to get an idea of where Burns and her daughter might've headed next. Neagley

notices Burns' daughter playing on a Nintendo Switch and comes up with a genius plan to figure out her gamer tag in order to locate her. Elsewhere, A.M. kills a police officer for trying to do a background check on him.

The 110th are in Marlo's house, and Neagley gets a hold of Jane's gamer ID because she failed to log out of it on the TV. Neagley just needs to play the games that Jane plays from her own ID until she surfaces online. Reacher decides to get a nap, and Dixon joins him in bed.

Russo goes to his superior, Marsh's house, and confronts him, telling him he knows he's the one who sold out the 110th to Shane Langston because he is working for them. Marsh lectures Russo about how he has known Russo and how well he knew Russo's dad, and reveals he is working for Langston and New Age because it's the "smart play." Marsh tries to get Russo to join his side, but Russo refuses and warns him to never bring up his father ever again.

Reacher and Dixon are in bed, and Reacher is worried that if they find out Swan is guilty, someone has to pull the trigger, and he isn't sure if he could do that. Dixon assures him that he doesn't have to do it because if it comes to that, she'll do it.

Neagley gets a hold of Jane's location, and Marlo and her daughter are an hour away from their location.

Marlo is at a friend's house, called Chad. Reacher lures Chad out of the house by setting off his sprinklers and then takes him into the garage. He tells him to call Marlo to the garage without causing any kind of suspicion that something is up.

Chad refuses, but as soon as Reacher crafts a makeshift silencer for his gun with a water bottle and some duct tape, he agrees. Reacher reveals that it's a hoax, and a water bottle and some duct tape can't do the work of a silencer. Marlo enters the garage, and Reacher tells her they aren't going to hurt Jane, who is busy playing online with Neagley. They proceed to confront Marlo about everything they've been through because of New Age. Marlo says that she didn't know about the ambush at the house and was told to just give them the address. O'Donnell mentions Swan's involvement in all this, and Marlo says Swan is innocent. Marlo says Swan was the one trying to take down Shane Langston and New Age by working with her after realising a manufacturing defect in a chip-making process wasn't actually a manufacturing defect after all.

Just like the stolen missiles, New Age was showing a false negative for several batches of chips so they could be sent for "repair" and instead fitted into the missiles meant for warfare. Swan brought in Orozco, Sanchez and Franz to investigate. Marlo tells the 110th she doesn't know where Swan is. Marlo also claims she was forced to take the bag of money to cover everything up.

Reacher tells Marlo to give Langston a call and tell him to meet her somewhere so the 110th can ambush him and kill him. Reacher asks Russo to take care of Jane while they take Marlo to meet with Langston. Russo reluctantly agrees and tells Reacher about Marsh being dirty. He says he is skipping town to stay with his cousin on Staten Island and will take Jane along with him. However, Russo's car gets attacked by Langston's henchman after Reacher and the 110th along with Marlo leave for the meet with Langston.

Marlo botches the mission to box in Shane and his men by revealing the fact that the 110th is there. Reacher orders the 110th to take Marlo out of there and get to Russo, while he hangs back in the bus and truck yard and deals with Langston and his goons. He shoots out the tyres of Langston's cars meaning he can't escape that way. He opens the doors of a bus and waits for them. Reacher takes them down in brutal fashion. Reacher confronts Langston but a chopper shows up out of nowhere and rescues him, preventing Reacher from killing him.

The episode ends with Russo and Jane cornered in an alley. He tells Jane to make a run for it, and he manages to take out 2 of the shooters but is shot in the process and drops to the ground. The third shooter gets to Jane, but Neagley turns up in time to take him down. She rushes over to Jane, but the team notices Russo is lying on the road, so they call 911 while Neagley holds onto Russo's hand as he dies.

Dixon suggests a place in Buffalo to send Marlo and Jane to hide until they deal with Shane Langston. Reacher and Neagley head over to Marsh's home to confront him about Russo's death.

Reacher demands the information he needs and tells Marsh to hand himself in. Marsh reaches for his gun, but Reacher pushes the desk into Marsh's thigh and

traps him. Marsh is in extreme pain but claims he knows nothing about Langston's big plans, saying a man called Grant who was part of the team that attacked Russo and Jane might know more than him. Reacher shoots him in the head, takes the money from Marsh's stash and settles up with Neagley. At the motel, O'Donnell and Dixon send Marlo and Jane Burns away to hide, and the team prepares for their next steps.

Reacher and Neagley go to the hospital where Grant is being treated, dressed up in disguise as nurses in scrubs. Reacher grabs Grant by the throat and they begin torturing him until he talks. Grant talks and gives Reacher and Neagley some information about an exchange between Shane and A.M. Reacher kills him after gaining the information and tells him it's a gift from Gaitano Russo. They make moves to escape the hospital but they come across one of Langston's men, who has come to kill Grant. They catch up to him, and a brutal fight ensues. Reacher kills him but is annoyed with himself because he wanted to question him.

Reacher calls Langston, and he reveals he killed his man, but in return, Langston has kidnapped O'Donnell and Dixon and threatens to kill them if Reacher and Neagley don't surrender. To protect Neagley, Reacher lies and says she is dead, and he will surrender on his own. Reacher calls Senator Lavoy and demands reinforcements to take down Shane Langston and his team of goons. Lavoy agrees to help.

Reacher and Neagley are scouting the warehouse where Langston is holding O'Donnell and Dixon. Neagley says that it's near on impossible to get in there without getting themselves killed. Reacher says he'll surrender and catch Langston by surprise. He gets an idea from some unruly teenagers causing trouble outside the warehouse. Elsewhere, A.M. meets his driver and inspects the missiles.

O'Donnell and Dixon are getting tortured by Langston's men in the warehouse, but as expected, they aren't giving up any information. Reacher and Neagley are sat in the car outside the warehouse getting ready to exact their plan. Reacher exits the car after a speech about inevitable death, with Neagley worried this could be the end of the 110th.

The episode ends with Reacher walking into Langston's headquarters while Neagley looks on from a distance. Langston comes out to meet Reacher, his men search him, and he gets proof of life on O'Donnell and Dixon as they are wheeled out on stretchers.
