

Summary:	(Erika's Mother), Brad Bergeron (Damon Filipello), Lesley Mirza (Pre- natal Nurse), Grace Gouwens (Clinic Volunteer), Alexandra Khan- Anselmo (Dorothy Ward) Dr. John Watson resumes his medical career as the head of a clinic dedicated to treating rare disorders six months after the death of his friend and partner, Sherlock Holmes, at the hands of Moriarty.



The episode starts with us jetting off to the Reichenbach Falls in Switzerland. There, our titular character Dr. John Watson rushes through the trees where he finds Sherlock in a scuffle with Moriarty. Several gunshots go off, leading to the pair tumbling into the rushing water. Although Watson dives in to try and help his friend, he ends up tumbling over the edge, sporting a bloody head and a concussion.

Thankfully he's found and brought to the hospital, where he's looked over by a

man called Shinwell Johnson. He reveals the bad news that Holmes has passed away and Moriarty is lost, presumably dead too. However, it turns out Holmes was actually loaded and had a fortune. He had a vision of Watson going back to medicine again and practicing.

Along with a brand new clinic, Watson is also given his own pick of medics to work alongside, and Johnson is being paid to be Watson's right-hand man and confidant through all of this. So I guess it's time to check in to the Holmes Clinic.

Fast forward six months and Holmes is running his clinic after recovering. Here, Watson is joined by his comrades, the nerdy Dr Sasha Lubbock, who was adopted after living in China and brought into a wealthy family before working her butt off to make it in medical school.

There's also computer whizz Dr Adam Croft and his brother, Stephens. They have identical DNA and the same background. Oh and Adam is also obsessed with eggs too.

There's also Dr Ingrid Derian, who's apparently the best neurologist in the state and works closely with Watson and the team.

Now, Watson is still suffering from amnesia and can't remember the weeks leading up to his accident in Switzerland. He is starting to remember more about Moriarty though, including that his two fingers have been fused into the M shape.

His latest patient happens to be someone called Erika Filipello, whose vision is obscured and she keeps seeing bizarre fragments in her mind's eye, as if she's dreaming while awake. Well, that may not be that far from the truth given there's a familial history of fatal insomnia and she hasn't been sleeping for a while now. In fact, since being admitted to hospital, she hasn't slept a wink.

Watson shows up to see Erika, who's erratic and convinced that she has FFI. Given she's also 23 weeks pregnant, she doesn't want her child to die, and pleads with Watson to keep her alive until she gives birth.

The gang get to work coming up with a proper diagnosis, with all the doctors gathered to discuss the symptoms. It would appear the family have a 50/50 chance of actually passing on FFI and along with doing some research on her father, Watson eventually discovers that Erika does not have FFI. So what's going on with her?

While he's talking to Erika, he explains the choice he made back in London and how he chose Sherlock over his partner, Dr. Mary Morstan. The thing is, she happens to be outside the door, having checked his office and seen the work they're currently doing. There's no getting back with Mary though, as she's moved on and is currently living with her new partner.

When Erika awakens the next morning, she finds that her vision has gone completely and she's blind. It would appear, given the sores around her mouth, that she may well have angular cheilitis. Dr Lubbock believes she needs a bone marrow transplant as a result. The only match though could well be his brother, Damon Filipello. The guy hasn't been seen for a while so Watson decides to get Gregson to help. For those unfamiliar with the Sherlock universe, this is an Inspector over at Scotland Yard.

Damon is brought in for a bone barrow transplant... but there's a problem. Turns out Autumn, Erika's cousin, is also sick. The rest of the gang bring her in but they treat this as a possible infection and take precautions accordingly.

It doesn't take long before they figure out that Autumn has something called Songbird Fever. Erika though? She doesn't. With Autumn struggling and becoming resistance to antibiotics, Watson realizes he needs to try and get to the bottom of this mystery.

Through all of this, Watson continues to suffer from flashes and struggles to keep it together. He's got a whole cocktail of pills he's taking to keep his symptoms under control. It does the trick and Watson eventually discusses their current case with the team to figure it all out.

It would appear that we're looking at two inherited diseases. One is called Two-three syndactyly and the other, orbital hypertelorism. These two traits have flowed down from Erika to her brother Damon and then eventually Autumn. The biggest revelation here though is that Erika and Autumn aren't just cousins... they're also half-sisters too.

This helps to find a solution and treatment is run on them both. However, Watson needs to figure out his own past and find a purpose going forward.

As the episode closes out, we learn that Moriarty is actually still alive, having survived the fall, and he speaks to Shinwell inside a cable car. Shinwell hands over a briefcase of samples the good doctor wants, and leaves him to it.

The episode begins with a look at a man called Andrew Tanner, who returns to his house to find the door ajar. His partner, Karine, is gone and a gunman appears. He shoots, and as the gunshot echoes in the air, we ominously appear to have our patient this week.

Meanwhile, Watson and the gang discuss a patient with uncombable hair syndrome. Dr Derian is pretty standoffish though through all of this, especially as Watson appears to know she's holding back and lying. A lot of this stems from

Watson's character analysis of her last week.

When she leaves, Shinwell arrives and expresses his concerns regarding Watson's mental state, especially given his brain injury. Our titular character shrugs it off, claiming that he's fine, but there are obviously doubts here.

Our new case this week falls into Watson's lap, where he heads to the hospital to examine Andrew Tanner. The man works as a re-enactment officer, playing the role of Patrick Ferguson, a captain in the Third Regiment. He's obviously survived a gunshot to the head, but when Watson first speaks to him, Tanner is convinced that he's never met his family. He appears to have shifted across to this Ferguson persona.

The most noticeable diagnosis that the gang come up with is that this is something relating to the nerves inside his brain. Watson though, thinks it goes deeper than that. The bullet is wedged inside his brain, so they need a very skilled surgeon to try and get it out. That falls to Dr Brody Davis-Emerson, or B.D.E as everybody seems to call him. However, he's not going to play ball.

Instead, it's time for round 2 with Tanner. Watson shows up with the gang to his bedside, but this time he comes armed with a document full of facts about Patrick Ferguson. In asking

his questions, Tanner's eyes begin darting from side to side. His accent also wavers, seeming to indicate that he's lying. He may just be putting on an act.

Furthermore, Tanner also has the tremors in his right hand, which he's been disguising all this time. We soon learn that he's been holding a ball under the covers in the hospital. As we soon find out, this is because he has Huntington's Disease.

Meanwhile, Shinwell receives a visit from someone on behalf of Moriarty. He's got a task for Shinwell, and it involves switching out the pills Watson currently has for identical ones.

Shinwell wrestles with the morality of all this, while Watson and Dr Lubbock head to Andrew's place to look around. They notice that there were two shots fired, with the second occurring abut an hour after the first. Furthermore, the liquor cabinet was opened and whiskey has been drunk.

Watson deduces that everything was staged as a way of getting his family some insurance money, rather than dying from Huntington's and leaving them with nothing. Watson calls Tanner out for this and manages to stop the man from jumping off the hospital roof too. While talking though, Tanner suddenly starts seizuring. They have no choice but to operate.

The man for the job is Dr Niles, someone whom Dr Derian has had ties with in the past. Its been 7 years since these two have known one another, and apparently Derian is responsible for his exile. He agrees to operate but only if Derian admits the truth. While she initially says yes, when it comes crunch time, Derian maintains her innocence and betrays her old friend.

The surgery is a success but Dr Niles refuses to work with the gang again, pointing out that Dr Derian is dangerous and they need to be careful.

As the episode closes out, Watson appears to take these new pills — in a blue bottle I may add — which throws question marks over exactly what this may mean for him.

The episode begins with us in Bloomfield. A woman called Molly Jones steps up to do a comedy routine on stage. Midway through her routine, she starts to lose her hearing and she eventually blacks out.

Meanwhile, Watson starts to notice something is up with his pills. His TBS is getting worse and he's struggling to concentrate. He's got the gang off doing errands but Shinwell shows up. He realizes that Watson has been spying on Mary, who's off at a local coffee shop just down the road. He wants to catch a glimpse of

her and her new fella but he hasn't, as of yet. Shinwell is also here to let him know he has a new case — the redhead, Molly.

Watson explains to Molly that he needs her to be part of the "Redheaded League", which is his own personal long-term study he's been doing. Molly has epilepsy but neither of her parents had it. However, mid-examination, Watson suddenly passes out on the floor.

Watson needs stitches as a result and despite not finishing the initial exam, he agrees to let the team take Molly on as their Case of the Week. He shrugs off the collapse as him just slipping and falling, and lets the team know of the news. Turns out Molly may have lied about the cause of her mother's death, and that could indicate something bigger going on here. First things first, they need an accurate family history.

Watson hasn't let any of his team know about his symptoms though, nor has he figured out that the pills are a problem. Shinwell is conflicted in all this and meets with Moriarty's associate that night. There's some cryptic chatter about following orders and quite what the villain is up to is being kept secret from us.

While this is going on, Dr. Derian is prepping to try and get into the Spinal Signal Project. Watson notices her and it doesn't take long for her broach the subject of his collapse. She knows he's lying but they're interrupted by the twins, who have big news.

Turns out Molly has duplicated records. One set belongs to Molly and the other to someone called Linda Mancini. It would appear that she changed her name. The reason being that her

mum, Felicia, was actually sentenced to 60 years behind bars for drowning her twin toddlers. Molly was the only survivor of this horrific act.

When Watson speaks to Molly about this, she appears to have a seizure. Only, her brain scans don't show any activity linking to epilepsy, so there's clearly something else going on here.

The gang split up, with Watson taking the twins (who continue to engage in banter this episode about a double-date) to the State Correctional Facility in Titusville. This is where Felicia is currently being held.

Watson takes one look at Felicia and immediately susses that she didn't kill her kids. He also, quite noticeably, manages to deduce that she has long QT syndrome. This is the same man, I may add, that can figure out a diagnosis this fast but can't figure out that his pills have been tampered with.

Anyway, this long QT syndrome can cause the heart to play up and it would seem that the kids quite literally were "scared to death". However, it's now up to Watson and the team to treat her. They do so, installing an ICD in her heart and Molly is eventually stabilized. Furthermore, this new diagnosis also means that justice can be served for Felicia too.

Watson though, is far from okay. His recent outbursts, including confronting Mary at the coffee shop and spiralling out of control, is going down on his file. He hasn't told his team, of course, and he still hasn't figured out about the pills yet.

Speaking of which, Shinwell is given pills to switch for Watson, back to his proper medication as a way of evading suspicion. There's also an ongoing storyline here involving Dr Lubbock, who's been wearing an engagement ring. We find out at the end of the episode that she accidentally stumbled on the ring in a drawer, so it's hardly the romantic gesture she was expecting.

We then cut forward one week later. Watson speaks to Derian and he knows she was rejected from the Spinal Project. He offers to put in a good word for her but she sees through this and believes his actions are simply a way of silencing her from prying further into his erratic behaviour.

The episode begins with Watson introducing the team to his Signal-to-noise exercise. There are three cases for the gang to potentially deal with here — Ellen Samuelson (who has no fingerprints), Vaughn Timms (who is suspectable to multiple fractures) and William Betancourt (who has an inflamed tongue). They need to figure out which is of diagnosis interest and which are just noise. Well, they pick Betancourt and off Ingrid and Adam go to diagnose and hopefully cure this.

Betancourt though is a rather annoying busybody, who's more preoccupied with his work than with his health. While Ingrid informs him that he needs to give them a few hours for screening given how susceptible he is to cancer, he shrugs them off. While he's on the phone, Adam is quick to point out to Ingrid that she's clearly Watson's favourite because she keeps him on his toes.

Preliminary checks ring alarm bells when they do check out Betancourt, given it confirms Watson's suspicions that he has Cowden Syndrome, so he's brought into the ER for an operation. Whilst there, Dr Lubbock watches on in concern. Flashbacks flesh out a little bit of why this case is so personal for her, and this stems from her own past. As a fresh-faced med student, she handled a case not dissimilar from this one.

Watson picks up on her apprehension and contemplates whether they could use this to do some real good. Specifically, in tracking the patient that Lubbock dealt with decades ago during med school. Given her demeanour and how meticulous she is, Watson knows she still has her notes from that time too, and has the twins check it out.

Together with Ingrid and Lubbock, Watson shows up at the lab to look for clues. There, they meet Brenda who apparently remembers absolutely everybody who's come into her lab, including the two ladies here. However, Watson would like to see the confidential ledger but when Brenda

scoffs and laughs incredulously at that suggestion, our protagonist instead decides to sweeten the deal with a bribe.

Here we learn that the lab processes 80 bodies a year but they're looking for their cadaver within a two-year window, which narrows things down. Furthermore, Watson wants to rely on Lubbock's incredibly unreliable memory from the past and to pay attention to small details therein. Well, it works and they manage to use Lubbock's random memories from that time to narrow down their patient. Only, it turns out the entry in the ledger is accompanied by a coffee stain.

Lubbock's trip down memory lane continues as she winds up finding an old flame called Micah. He's got his own art gallery and along with numerous sketches of Lubbock herself, who is obviously his muse, he also has a few old drawings of their cadaver and it would appear that he has a tattoo.

This eventually brings them along to discover the man's name is Jacob Hochstetler. He's Amish and they need to find his immediate family — including his sister. She's recently got married and doing some searches online, Ingrid and Adam track down her address but it would appear that Rachel's son may be vulnerable so they need to run some tests.

On the way up to the lab, Rachel explains that she's a single mother as the father skipped out, but there's a bigger problem. Watson's marriage mediation with Mary is due to take place but Watson is obviously busy with the case. They have to rush though as Amos, Rachel's son, winds up with a respiratory issue. Thankfully, the gang know what to look for and they manage to heal him when he's rushed into the lab.

Meanwhile, Shinwell receives his next set of instructions by Moriarty's handler. He's given a phone which includes programming for the lab's robot. It'll upload samples and genomes for all of Watson's patients. Just before he heads back inside, Shinwell drops a tracker on her car. And not very subtly either. Anyway, he follows her out to a hospital where it would appear she has a son who has cancer.

Back at the lab, following all the drama, Adam speaks to Lubbock about the Cowden Syndrome. They've managed go track down 12 people from the community in total, who all know to get early screenings thanks to her quick thinking.

However, Ingrid is far more direct. She speaks to Lubbock at the gallery about the secrets she's keeping. She's figured out that Lubbock is not engaged, given her ring is bogus, and despite saving so many people in the past, she's having a hard time.

Given this Micah is obsessed and still drawing her after decades, these are genuine feelings of love rather than what Lubbock is experiencing with her current partner, who appears to be stringing her along.

Meanwhile, Watson heads over to Mary's place and informs her that he's not going to hire a divorce lawyer after all. He's not contesting the divorce as he wants her to be happy and have the life she wants.

Meanwhile, Ingrid struggles to get her sister admit- ted to her spinal project.



The episode starts in 2016 with Taryn Quintyne giving a speech for valedictorian. However, she suddenly starts coughing uncontrollably. This regime of heading to the doctors continues all the way through to 2024, where we see that Taryn has Sickle Cell Disease. Insurance doesn't cover it though, which is putting a strain on her finances, and it seems her condition is worsening every year.

At the lab, Lubbock questions Ingrid over her aggressive emails. She's working with the Spinal Signal Project and is Lead

Neurologist. They're vetting candidates but the Chairman is rejecting her ideas surrounding adding young people into the trial. Step forward Lubbock, who manages to save the day with her passive-aggressive tone, much to the admiration of Ingrid.

Meanwhile, the titled "golden chest" is actually a surgeon by the name of Hobie who has experimented on himself to give him a glowing chest. The team don't believe Watson and think this is some sort of test until they receive a picture. Hobie is a pretty talented surgeon, and naturally, he wants the next step in this glowing project to be his genitals.

It doesn't take long for the team to get hold of Taryn's case though. Watson is confident that he can fix her but that's not what Mary Morstan is asking when she catches up to him. Instead, she brings up how she wants Watson's team to figure out why the Sickle Cell disease is worsening, fix her up as best they can and pass her back to Mary ready for a clinical trial to help her symptoms.

Watson speaks to Taryn, whose vision has gone blurry because her eyes are bleeding from the inside. Furthermore, she reinforces here that her attacks have been getting worse all year. Thankfully, Taryn has been writing everything down about her treatment and all the doctor visits over the years, which could be an invaluable tool.

Watson is determined to get Taryn this cure, despite the steep \$3 million cost, and has the team on alternate paths to get this nailed. Lubbock is to check through her diary, while the twins

are to supervise a liquid chromatography test. Taryn is in a lot of pain and Watson is a man on a mission to make her better, no matter what.

He speaks to Shinwell in the lab and reveals that he intends to bypass Mary and the FDA, wanting to cure Taryn outright. Part of that includes surgery, so Watson cycles through some names they can use to get this done. And guess who comes up? Yep, it's Hobie.

Part of the cure would include correcting the mutation causing the Sickle Cell disease in the first place. It's different to the current cures on the market right now but of course it would ruffle a good number of feathers in the medical department too. It's also never been tried before and isn't an approved procedure. Watson could lose his job.

The team are a little more cautious surrounding this move, and contemplate whether to report Watson outright. They're worried that this may jeopardize their own careers and the blowback could be massive. Watson is content that he's done the right thing for his patient, given how abhorrent it is that there's a cure easily obtained and Taryn can't get it. The others discuss it and eventually decide to trust their team captain.

The procedure is hidden under the guise of having a mole removed, and Watson shrugs off Mary's concerns when she questions this. After the procedure, Taryn is called back in again after another bad attack. Ingrid speaks up and decides they should use anti-clotting medication to cover their tracks but Watson shuts her down, deciding they need to figure out why she's got an embolism.

When Mary learns about this, she confronts Watson. She knows that he's cured her of the Sickle Cell and even has numerous vials of blood that will prove her right. That night, Ingrid writes up a timeline of the base repair editing procedure, while Adam shows up at his AA meeting, where he celebrates 5 years sober. As the episode closes out, Mary decides to throw away the blood samples.

He offers to help her but it's unclear if the clinic is going to take on more clients right now.

Back at the lab, Shinwell speaks to the team about how they're launching Project Zero, which means they need to whittle

down their client list all the way to zero by the time the sun goes down. There's some banter while the group work here, mostly from Ingrid's snidey comments toward Lubbock who continues to prod her regarding her birthday.

Stephens comes to Watson with his concerns regarding Porsche, but he's also concerned that the rest of the team are going to rip into him for this. However, this is serious. They need to find her before she potentially dies but they need to go Sherlock Holmes on this one and track her down using what's in her cam picture.

The attention does turn to Ingrid's past in the middle of this, specifically how she's got back. As they track down the mailing address, Stephens, Adam and Watson head out to Lawrenceville. The real-time shots of Porsche are not encouraging. She appears to be getting worse and they figure out they only have 4 hours left before she could pass away. Time is of the essence.

Watson has some encouraging words for Stephens, who's obviously embarrassed about his whole camgirl affair, but they find Porsche's dog show up in the picture and manage to track down the name of her dog, which is Brutus. The dog knocks the camera slightly, allowing them to use the ol' "magnification" trick on some envelopes to figure out her new alias of Kathryn Patricio.

The group make it to Patricio's apartment just in time and rush her to the lab. They need to know more about her though and alongside her real name of Annie Wilson, and a farm over in New Mexico with rabbits, it's just enough to go on for now to find her.

While Stephens sits with Porsche, Watson points out his own guilt and struggles dealing with his mentor's death. Although it's not entirely the same, he uses this as a reminder that Stephens needs to stop blaming himself for what's happened.

As we soon learn, Annie was bitten by a rabbit while down in New Mexico that seems to have been carrying the Black Death. Or at least some mutant variant of it. With a treatment confirmed, Stephens works on administering a cure for her.

Meanwhile, Lubbock gets Ingrid a cake for her birthday, after asking her most of the episode what she wants. Ingrid immediately throws it back in her face (figuratively of course), pointing out that she's just trying to sweeten her up and eventually control her. She scathingly retorts that Lubbock needs to sort her own life out before attempting to fix Ingrid's. So she heads home and decides to break up with her partner.

Meanwhile, Shinwell speaks to Watson and explains that Sherlock killed himself thanks to his vanity, and Watson isn't responsible for that. However, it's unclear right now if he's switched over the pills as requested by Moriarty's goons.

This is very obviously Moriarty's doing, and it's a pretty serious threat.

Speaking of serious, a woman called Ginny heads into ER, shocked and sporting a cut across her abdomen. However, she's also got short term memory issues and keeps forgetting the doctor who

shows to see her. In fact, Ginny eventually just up and leaves, prompting a Code Green to be issued across the hospital. She winds up heading into Watson's office next, where Shinwell is switching the pills.

The team get on the case, where Lubbock times Ginny's memory losses. It would appear that it resets every 3 minutes and 8 seconds. She's self administering her own drugs, courtesy of clocks in her journal confirming the times, but Watson wants to get to the root cause of this.

Given her journal, it would appear that Ginny has had a number of different appointments, all of which have come to an abrupt end 4 weeks back. There's only one dentist appointment listed, but she's also lost her baby 4 weeks back too, which seems to explain the sudden drop-off of appointments.

The twins do some research online and notice that Ginny was in Machu Picchu on some sort of retreat a week back. There's also the subject of her break-up, along with a recurring psychotic episode where she believes something is eating away inside her. Could any of this hold a clue?

In the midst of the diagnosis, Watson starts to trip and hears violin music. He also hears Holmes' voice too. This appears to be a side effect to the pills Shinwell has switched over, and it affects his diagnosis and way of treating Ginny.

Watson susses there is something up with his pills and he speaks to Stephens about it outside. He knows that Shinwell is behind it, partly thanks to the logo actually reading "Shinwell". Yep, that'll do it!

The only solution here, as Shinwell realizes he's coming to an end of his tirade, is to try and take the full blame himself. If Watson learns about Moriarty, his family could die. Of course, the robot in the lab also has all the info on the different cases Watson and co have been working on, so even if Shinwell is outed, there's still the recorded audio.

As for Ginny, Watson does some tests and finds out that she has a tumor. Specifically, ovarian teratoma. Essentially this is a tumor "with teeth". This explains why she's been so erratic and he remembers Holmes' words in order to come up with this assessment.

While Ginny is worked on, Watson speaks to Morstan, who points out that she was initially pregnant with their child but when she lost the baby, she couldn't tell Watson about it.

That night, Shinwell looks set to tell the truth to Watson until a random pharmacist called Lloyd busts into the office and reveals that he's been switching the meds over. He doesn't elaborate too much further though as he winds up collapsing on the floor and then foaming from the mouth, dead.

Ginny is stabilized, while Watson realizes that Moriarty is still alive. Well, he reveals himself to Ingrid that afternoon, pointing out that he knows a lot about her, including something that happened down by a pond including a dead body.

The episode begins with our titular character taking out the team to look for medical cases at the nearby mall. However, they're interrupted by the arrival of Irene Adler. She and Watson go way back, to the days of Sherlock to be precise, but the real reason she's here is because her son, Angus, is sick.

Now, Irene used to be a scammer back in the day but she claims she's done with that line of work now. Back at the office, Shinwell gives a suitably frosty welcome to her, clearly distrusting that she's

turned a new leaf.

Watson does agree to check Angus over but while he seems okay, he suddenly spaces out and struggles to stand up. As fate would have it, Angus is actually Sherlock's son! This explains why he's a little medical detective and why Watson warns to him so quickly.

With all this knowledge, Watson splits the team in half to search for more clues and figure out exactly what's wrong with Angus. Derian decides to grill Irene over Angus' symptoms, and apparently his first episode occurred while he was playing football. As we later find out, Angus also appears to be gasping in his sleep too.

While Angus helps out Watson in the lab, he helps deduce that the hair our titular character is trying to examine through a microscope... is actually a dog's hair. So they'll need to check again in the morning. Irene allows Angus to stay with Watson that night, given he has a spare room, but having spoken to the kid, he's more convinced than ever that this is definitely Sherlock's son.

Shinwell expresses his concerns about getting too close to Angus, while the team work on finding Sherlock's brother, Mycroft. Watson believes this is the best way of confirming the diagnosis and that stems from getting Sherlock's DNA to run a test.

Watson sends Shinwell to London, needing to talk to Mycroft. He also has no love lost for Irene, and he hands over a trinket of some description to Shinwell.

Elsewhere, Croft uses his "super secret" contacts to discover Irene has been linked recently to multiple cases of charity fraud. He deduces that she's using Angus' illness for profit. With this knowledge, the team confront Watson but apparently he already knew. Watson had sussed that Angus' symptoms were faked to gain Sherlock's DNA, which is what Shinwell picked up from London. And the very same DNA which Angus and Irene take off with that afternoon.

Irene designed all of this from the start in order to gain Sherlock's DNA, sending Watson on the run-around. However, they still have an opportunity to catch up, thanks to Shinwell leaving a tracking device on her. Watson catches up to her and Angus at the airport, where we learn that it's actually Irene that's sick, not Angus. She's got incurable cancer and intends to try and find a solution, regardless of how slim that may be. Irene thought that by selling Sherlock's DNA to a rich accomplice she could have made a pretty penny, with the true end-goal here being to guarantee Angus taken care of when she passes.

Despite the deception, Watson offers Irene a faint glimmer of hope. There's a treatment centre in Texas that might be able to cure her cancer. She accepts, with Watson also agreeing to take Angus under his wing should she pass away. Oh, and in the midst of this we also learn that Angus is not actually Sherlock's kid.

That trinket Shinwell picked up from Mycroft? Well, it turns out to be a ring; a family heirloom that Sherlock wore when he kicked his brother's ass. As Watson sits with Shinwell that afternoon, he drops it in his whiskey and the episode comes to an end.

Fast forward to the present and Ingrid receives a call from her sister, begging her to come home. The rest of the team are worried as Ingrid races out the building, where she finds Gigi is in a rough way. She's in pain but Ingrid is loathe to take her back to UHOP. She doesn't want anybody to know this is her sister but she eventually concedes when Gigi promises not to tell anybody about their connection.

Gigi is part of their Spinal Signal Project, but Ingrid lied to get her foot in the door. She pleads with her sister to keep up the façade, which includes reverting to her Gigi persona. It seems she changed it somewhere along the way and if the truth is unveiled here that Ingrid and Gigi are related, she could be kicked out the program and Ingrid will likely lose her job too.

Gigi doesn't get any better though and she continues to struggle. Given Ingrid is working with the top doctors who specialize in House MD cases, Gigi pleads with Ingrid to let her be seen by Watson so they can get to the bottom of this and find a proper cure.

While the rest of the group mess about with dogs and dating profiles, Mary shows up at the lab. She takes Watson out and explains that she's got a reservation for Valentine's Day. She could

do with a friend and Watson is her back-up date. He eventually agrees and the pair have a good time.

Midway through the date though, Ingrid eventually concedes and agrees to let Watson help, calling him to confirm as much. As the group contemplate what may be up with Gigi, Ingrid keeps important details from the group regarding her sister's diagnosis.

Watson figures it out quite quickly and speaks to Dr Derian in the lab about it. In the past, Ingrid was specializing in neurology when she studied in Europe but knew that Ingrid would never get into the studies given it would be a conflict of interest, as we know. As a result, Ingrid created a brand new identity and then pushed through the application.

So who is Ingrid risking it all for? Well, it stems from what happened in the past with surgery. Mary was taking the lead on the surgery, agreed to by the family but not the head surgeon, intending to try and help her regardless of consequence.

Unfortunately, the lead surgeon, Moynihan, found out they were going to operate on Gigi and a big fight broke out between him and Mary. They had to stop the surgery, despite getting permission, and it left Gigi paralyzed. Now, Gigi had an incomplete spinal cord injury and while surgery would have helped her, Moynihan was determined to destroy Mary's career had she gone ahead and defied him.

Turns out Gigi actually has a mutation to her RYR1 receptor. When Ingrid initially administered succinylcholine to treat this, along with ECT after, she made Gigi vulnerable to malignant hyperthermia. Ingrid didn't make things better, she made her sister worse.

With dantrolene prescribed to make her better, Mary speaks to Ingrid and reinforces that she's dangerous. She also gives her several months to find another job otherwise she'll be fired. Watson knows Ingrid is good at her job but he's certainly not going to stand in the way of her consequences.

Speaking of consequences, in the past we see what happened to Ingrid's father in the aftermath of the surgery. She took him down to that spot by the lake (where we saw her contemplating and speaking to Moriarty last episode) and here we see why it's so significant. Eight surgeons have turned him down so far and Watson reinforces gently that he's unlikely to find someone that will agree to this. As Shinwell shows him out, he crosses paths with Moriarty's agent. She takes one of Shinwell's hairs for a

specimen but also wants him to collect DNA on the rest of the team too. Why? Well, that's a question for another time.

At the lab, Dr Derian is still trying to save her career but before he can press on with this any further, Cameron Phipps is rushed to the ER after burning himself with hydrochloric acid. Apparently he never wanted to do this but it's the hand that acted independently. This is enough to pique Watson's interest and he gets the team involved to find a solution.

Watson suggests a partial amputation to grant Cameron some mobility. Basically it would target and "deaden" the nerves in the hand, but of course it's touch and go because the disease is so rare.

After the injections though, it doesn't seem to make a difference as the hand starts choking himself once he mentions his father. Unfortunately, he pushes his brother in front of a bus.

Lubbock struggles to get through to Derian in the midst of this, reinforcing that they're friends and trying to get through to her but struggling. Derian isn't doing much better though, given she's being blackmailed.

Speaking of struggling, Cameron's case does not look good, but Watson is confident he can fix this before the trial, given they have a Dr Choi flying in for surgery. Choi intends to conduct something called Selective Peripheral Topographic Neurolysis. While this looks set to go ahead, Cameron's mum shows up and admits that his father has been admitted to the ICU with heart problems. With the case solved, Derian eventually opens up to Lubbock and reveals that her father has gone. She's kept a lot of this a secret for 15 years and also tells her about the blackmail too.

Shinwell drops off the DNA that night to Moriarty's agent, leaving everything hanging in the balance.

Lubbock and Derian are tasked with heading over to Dean's place while this is going on. Whilst there, Lubbock talks to her friend about the lack of agency she has, and how Derian needs to try and get that edge back into her work.

During their snooping, they find a trunk full of Army stuff, and it appears Dean has been keeping track of all his workouts. But why is all this hidden? Well, it turns out he's trying to pass the Army fitness test as he wants to re-enlist.

Back at the hospital, the one place Watson and co. never bothered to check was the roof. That's precisely where Dean is, stopping a helicopter from landing.

When Dean loses consciousness and is set up on intubation, Watson realizes what's going on. It would appear that Dean has Acute Intermittent Porphyria. It's a disorder where the body can't produce enough heme, which is a crucial component to the red blood cell. It's hard to diagnose because it largely stays dormant until something triggers an attack. That attack appears to be linked to Dean's extreme exercise regime.

The gang treat Dean with hemin and it seems to do the trick. When Dean regains consciousness, he decides not to re-enlist and try to discover who he is instead. Furthermore, he also has the contact details for the woman he helped in combat, Ramiza, and she appears to be nearby too, in Missouri.

Watson facetimes with her in the office and catches up, while Moriarty's agent meets with Shinwell and decides that he's not needed anymore.

The episode starts with the group handling a new patient who happens to be suffering from side effects to a black mould infestation in the building. The pair are working through these cases methodically, and it leads into more interpersonal drama along the way. Specifically, in the double date that the twins head out on. Adam seems to be experiencing strange symptoms whilst there though, acting forgetful and not quite with it. Stephens is shocked as it would appear his brother could well be having a

relapse.

Back at the lab, Watson has cause for celebration. Every patient that passes through their doors willingly donates a sample of DNA, and now, with the extensive amount of DNA they've collected, Watson has decided to begin the "Watson Database of Human Mutations". He's got a paper about to be dropped in a science magazine called New Scientist about it too, so he knows they're going to be very busy.

However, they're all thrown a curve-ball when Moriarty shows up in the office. Watson doesn't recognize him, so Derian decides to talk to him privately. Apparently, he's here to set her free. Specifically, with one final mission for him.

This mission includes sabotaging Watson's DNA gig by spiking the adeno-associated virus that he's using for experiments. Everything after this will be easy, and he continues to taunt her all the while, claiming that he's doing this to make her see the real version of herself.

Stephens is concerned as Adam admits that the results are going to come back positive for hydrocodone. He has been relapsing and right on the verge of being engaged and having a book come out too. He shrugs it off though, reinforcing that addiction has no logic or reason. However, there could be something else going on here, something under the veil of addiction that's causing his symptoms to worsen.

Adam shows up in the surgery room not long after and he seems completely delirious. He has a childlike wonder, and he also has insatiable hunger too. Watson deduces that he may have Kluver-Bucy Syndrome. It seems this has advanced from a simple Herpes diagnosis, so a couple of weeks on antibiotics and he should be good as new. Only... he's not. Not only does Stephens wind up infected in the process, but it seems the twins are also resistant to the antidotes too. Turns out whatever they have has been genetically modified.

Shinwell shows up and confirms as much, and having been absent for a few days in the lab, he arrives just in time for an exposition dump with Watson. Turns out Watson's research has made the Croft twins sick. Shinwell breaks down everything that's transpired over the last 12 episodes, including how Moriarty has been pulling the strings all along, and Shinwell has been doing his bidding all this time.

All that DNA that Watson is keeping downstairs has been used against those very people inside the lab. Watson is not happy but when he learns Shinwell has been blackmailed into submission along the way, he's not quite sure how to process this information.

The silence speaks volumes though and Shinwell eventually decides to leave. Outside in the parking lot, Shinwell suddenly sports a burn across his neck. Has he been infected too? This is a serious problem because Watson's DNA lab is, right now, a weapon that Moriarty could use at any time to kill anybody.

Watson explains all of this to the group, before they get down to brass tacks and figure out how to cure the twins. The others in the lab — including Mary, Derian and Lubbock — set out to find a cure for the twins before it's too late. They find a SNORA31 mutation which is essentially a needle in a haystack situation. This could be exactly what they're looking for. In order to sort this, Derian bargains her position back in the lab in exchange for continuing to find a solution. Mary doesn't have much of a choice and agrees.

Time is very much of the essence though, as Adams falls into a coma as his condition worsens. This is all very sketchy territory and Watson creates a new enzyme to target the virus. In order to administer it though, they need to drill into Adams' skull and things seem to be going well... until they're not. Turns out Derian sabotaged the cultures after all.

With weeks needed to grow more, the Croft twins will be dead by then. However, Watson manages to rustle up enough to create one vector. The trouble is, this single dose means they need to make a choice. Do they save Stephens or Adam? They need to make their choice and time is ticking.
